Myanmar prepares for geotourism launch at Mt Popa National Geopark

T is under preparation to launch geoparkbased tourism in the Mount Popa National Geopark, which will become the first of its kind in Myanmar, according to Ko Tin Ko Min from Maha Giri Community-based Geotourism Services.

The group said the tour package would be sold before the end of July.

"Geo-based tourism has started. But we haven't got all the data yet. We need to give training inside our group this month. We plan to sell one package in the second half of this month. It is expected to be in the last week," he said.

By attracting public interest moderately as a new kind of tourism, geotourism activities will include an excursion to the volcano, as well as a biodiversity study tour and knowledge sharing with guests, he said.

"Some designated areas are quite far. Among them, some easily accessible places are chosen and sharing about them is considered. We expect more youth and children from private schools to visit. For other people, there is a mountain climbing programme," he explained.

The Maha Giri group currently provides Mount Popa climbing services, cares for Popa Langur conservation, and expands its services into geotourism. At the same time, it plans to conserve Mwaypway Tettu (Popa cyrtodactylus) and flying geckos, which are rare species in the Popa area. — MT/ZN

ACCORDING to the (19:30) hrs MST observation today, the water level of Ayeyawady River at Bhamo has exceeded by about one inch (two centimetres) above its danger level. It may continue to rise from the present water Level by about one foot during the next one day and may remain above its danger level.

MNHRC Statement in honour of Myanmar Women's Day Statement No 7/2024

- 1. The date of establishment of the Myanmar National Committee on Women, 3 July, was designated as "Myanmar Women's Day" by the State. More than half of Myanmar's population are women, and they are valuable human resources for the nation. Women have equal rights as men and are entitled to participate in political, economic, social, civil, and cultural spheres without any discrimination.
- 2. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) states that women are entitled to equal rights as men. Likewise, the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar (2008) guarantees women's rights. As Myanmar respects and recognizes women's rights, it acceded to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), which is one of the international human rights conventions, in 1997 and has been fulfilling and protecting women's rights.
- 3. The Myanmar National Human Rights Commission, in its human rights promotion activities, incorporates the rights of pregnant women, disabled women and girls. Furthermore, the Commission, in accordance with the Commission Law, protects women's rights in handling complaints, conducting inspections of prisons, labour camps, police detention centres, court detention centres, homes for the aged, vocational training centres for women, training schools for the girls, women development centres, and send recommendations to relevant departments.
- 4. Since the theme of International Women's Day 2024 is "Invest in Women: Accelerate Progress", the Commission urges for the enhancement of women's participation in all sectors for the socioeconomic development of the nation while the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission honours and welcomes Myanmar Women's Day, which falls on 3 July.

THE Ayeyawady River water level has risen due to heavy rainfall, causing floods in the wards and villages of Myitkyina Township.

Regional Tatmadaw members, the Myanmar Police Force, the Fire Brigade and departmental staff evacuated the residents and provided the recuse Northern Command inspected recuse processes and provided foodstuffs to flood victims.

Similarly, the water level of the Chindwin River in Sagaing Region increased due to heavy rainfall. The water level reached 1,535 centimetres in Khamti yesterday, and it exceeded 175 centimetres, which is more than

MSWRR issues warnings on disaster preparedness in advance

THE Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief, and Resettlement has issued warnings and advised on disaster preparedness for natural disasters commonly encountered during the rainy season, particularly in July and August each year, which include flash flooding, mountain collapses, landslides, besides regular floods, and river flooding.

The ministry issued the warning aiming to mitigate harm from hydrometeorological disasters and promote cooperation for disaster preparedness, as the country faced 144 floods nationwide in the 2023-2024 financial year, resulting in deaths of people and animals, as well as damage to 279 houses.

In the warning, the ministry advises people to check the struc-

tural integrity of their houses and the potential for disasters in their area, to designate an emergency relocation site and plan evacuation routes and family rendezvous points, to store water-sensitive items in dry, elevated locations, to monitor and record nearby alarming water levels, to gather drinking water ahead of time, and to keep visible signs of dangerous places in case of flooding in areas such as low-lying areas, valleys, and drainages. In addition, people are also advised to prepare emergency and life-saving equipment in advance.

The warning advises people, upon receiving a flood warning, to continuously listen to weather updates from the relevant government department, follow their advice, and share it with others; to be aware that heavy rain in upstream regions and mountainous areas can lead to flash floods downstream; to prepare emergency supplies including food and important documents; and to keep a contact list with names, ward or village, and phone numbers to use if family members are separated. It also encourages people to promptly inform and organize all family members to move to the designated safe location upon receiving instructions from the government.

The ministry also informs people that they can seek help from the ministry in case of natural disasters by contacting the 24-hour hotline at 067 3404666 or 067 3404777. — TWA/TH

40 villages launch smart village digital tech project

ACCORDING to the Department of Rural Development under the Ministry of Cooperatives and Rural Development, a smart village project will be developed to enable the use of digital technologies in 40 villages, spending K2,400 million. this financial year. If approval is received for the selection and approval of the villages where the project will be implemented, the project will start in the relevant villages.

With the widespread use of modern digital technologies in model villages, the necessary infrastructure construction work will be carried out to further develop the daily lifestyles of villagers.

The project will cover 40 villages in 40 townships in the rest of the states and regions except Kayah State, Chin State and Sagaing Region, and each village will spend K60 million. — TWA/KZL

1,570+ food companies, factories apply for GACC in 2.5 years

A total of 1,574 Myanmar food processing companies and factories submitted over 3,160 applications to the General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC) over the past two and half years, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

According to GACC Decree 248 and 249, GACC registration is mandatory for food exporters starting from 1 January 2022.

Those individuals executing edible oil, oilseeds, stuffed pastry products, edible bird's nest and related products, edible grains, grains milling industrial products and malt, fresh and dehydrated vegetables, dried beans, plant species, nuts and seeds, dried fruits, unroasted coffee and cocoa bean, special dietary food excluding milk-based formula, functional foods, bee products, aquatic products including farm products, animal products and animal feed and livestock animal businesses need to apply for GACC license in order to place their goods in China's market.

The relevant authorities for the registration with GACC are the Agriculture Department, the Livestock Breeding and Veterinary Department, the Fisheries Department and the Food and Drug Administration.

Between 1 December 2021 and 28 June 2024, 3,161 applications by 1,574 factories have been forwarded

to the GACC through the Agriculture Department (3,004 applications), the Fisheries Department (134), the Livestock Breeding and Veterinary Department (14) and the Food and Drug Administration Department (nine).

Exporters can directly access China International Trade Single Window through https://cifer.singlewindow.cn by creating accounts for those food groups that are not listed in the 18 groups mentioned above.

As of 28 June 2024, a total of 1,050 applications have been successful in registering with the GACC with the approval of the competent authority. Regarding the registration of the importing companies, the Department of Animal and Plant Quarantine under the GACC will check quarantine access for the imported grains (raw coffee beans, cocoa beans, vegetables, spices, edible grains, pulses, oil crops and herbal animal products and plant for their origins.

Companies cannot directly proceed with registration, and they need to carry out this step through competent authorities and departments concerned by sending an email to dapq@ customs.gov.cn or submitting a letter to the Chinese Embassy in Myanmar or the Myanmar Embassy in China. — NN/KK

MYANMAR'S distributors, buyers, importers and beauty professionals are invited to take part in the 2024 Beauty Trade that will be held in Seoul, South Korea, from 1 to 3 October 2024, according to the Myanmar Trade Promotion Organization.

South Korea's SMEs will exhibit their cosmetics at the 2024 Beauty Trade Show. About 150 businesspersons will showcase the cosmetics and daily-use products, although they are not famous brands in South Korea. The trade show will provide an actual marketplace as well as a virtual marketplace in which to explore markets and business opportunities.

The trade show expands its global presence by inviting buyers from China, Japan, ASEAN, North America, and Europe.

The list of Myanmar's business entities that import Korean cosmetics is to be sent the Seoul Business Agency (SBA) through the Myanmar Embassy in Seoul. The SBA will directly contact them and initially conduct a virtual meeting. The SBA will provide two-day hotel accommodation near Dongdaemun Design Plaza (DDP) to those invitees. Businesspeople from Asia will get US\$400 back for air tickets.

Today, organizations like the Myanmar Maternal and Child Welfare Association and the Myanmar Women's Affairs Federation work tirelessly to uplift the socioeconomic status of women and the general population. Throughout history, women have independently championed the interests of their families, communities, and nation, standing shoulder to shoulder with men. Significantly, women can apply their creativity in relevant arenas rather than men.

Women are now at the forefront of national reforms aimed at societal improvement. They hold high-level responsibilities across legislative, administrative, and judicial sectors, as well as in politics, economics, social affairs, arts, defence, and security, showing off their brilliant capacity. Maintaining and building upon these achievements is crucial for the continued progress of the nation.

The Role of NSPAW as a Road Map

In Myanmar, the National Strategic Plan for the Advancement of Women (NSPAW) will provide support to improve the situation of women and to fully enjoy their rights in accordance with the features of the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar (2008). Women and girls hold a special place in society, with priority accorded to them across various domains. Recognizing the disparities in physical strength, men often empathize and assist women in tasks requiring physical prowess. Within the household, while the husband traditionally assumes the role of family leader, it is the wife who exercises control over family matters, reflecting the longstanding customs of Myanmar society. Consequently, it is imperative to empower women to manage affairs at different levels, drawing upon their extensive experience within their families.

Moreover, the National Strategic Plan for the Advancement of Women 2013-2022 (NSPAW) was a pivotal framework designed to elevate the status of women in Myanmar across a broad spectrum of areas. Phase II of this strategic plan, spanning from 2023 to 2032, has been crafted to encompass 12 priority areas aligned with the 1995 Beijing Platform for Action (BPFA). These areas include livelihoods, education, health, violence against women, economics, decision-making, implementation mechanisms, human rights, media, environment, girls' issues, and armed conflict. Myanmar boasts a population of 55.8 million, comprising 26.7 million men and 29.1 million women, according to estimates from 1 October 2022. It is obvious that women and girls

The Myanmar National Committee on Women (MNCW) has assumed a leadership role in implementing the National Strategic Plan for Advancement of Women (NSPAW). To achieve these aspirations, relevant ministries and organizations are asked to prioritize gender mainstreaming in conjunction with projects related to the 12 priority areas outlined in the strategic plan. This collaboration among work committees is imperative because comprehensive societal development can only be achieved when women are empowered. The empowerment of women is a linchpin in constructing a prosperous society. As a result, both genders can progressively reduce disputes, contentious issues, conflicts, and friction between them. That will undoubtedly lead to an upsurge in peace and the gradual resolution of problems, from the familial to the national level, contributing to

the overall progress of the nation. In fact, Myanmar recognizes the vital role of women and girls in society. By bolstering the National Strategic Plan, the nation aims to empower women across diverse domains, fostering a more equitable and peaceful society. This commitment to gender equality is not just an investment in women but a step towards a brighter future for all.

Comprehensive National-Level Review and Implementation of NSPAW

Comprehensive national-level reviews should assess progress made in implementation and identify challenges encounachievements, identify gaps and setbacks, and outline strategies for addressing those gaps and challenges.

According to the guidance of MNCW, Myanmar is implementing the Operational Plan of National Strategic Plan for the Advancement of Women, NS-PAW (2013-2022), in line with the Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW). The Four Technical Working Groups (TWG), Violence against Women TWG; Women Participation in Economic and Politics TWG; Women, Peace and Security TWG; and Gender Mainstreaming TWG are formed to implement NSPAW (2013-2022) effectively. The operational plan (2020-2022) has been developed to implement the rest of three years of NSPAW effectively.

The NSPAW (2023-2032) includes indicators and a results framework to address the weaknesses identified in BPFA +25. To strengthen the ownership and responsibilities of the respective departments, the steering committee for developing this strategic plan (2023-2032) is organized with the Deputy Ministers. The working committees are also organized according to the twelve priority areas, and the **Directors-General undertaking** as the chairs, the Directors from the respective departments as the secretaries and the gender mainstreaming process regarding the respective sectors are included.

connection number, "1566". Case managers who are well-trained by the Department of Social Welfare are addressing the complaints of gender-based violence in accordance with the standard operating procedures on social case management

Department of Social Welfare organized seven One Stop Women Support Centres (OSWSC) and provided support to a total number of 330 women in One Stop Women Support Centre from 2017 to May 2024. Guidelines were developed and contributed to OSWSCs.

Department of Social Welfare is addressing complaints from the Helpline of States and Regions DSW Offices and Myanmar National Human Rights Commission. It provides support to the survivors of Gender-Based Violence. From April 2017 to May 2024, it can provide financial as-

viding livelihood skills and other necessary community-based vocational training courses at 11 Schools for Home Science and IDP Camps; hygiene kits and dignity kits are provided at the IDP camps for the women.

Myanmar upholds the zero-tolerance policy against any form of sexual violence. A Joint Communique of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and the United Nations on Prevention and Response to Conflict-Related Sexual Violence was signed in December 2018. To implement this Joint Communique, the National Committee on Prevention and Response to Violence against Women in Conflict, its core group, and its working committee are organized, and a one-year national action plan has been extended and implemented as follows according to the permission of State Administration Council-

- (a) (10-11-2021) to (10-11-2022) - National Action Plan (first year)
- (b) (10-11-2022) to (10-11-2023) National Action Plan (second year)
- (c) (10-11-2023) to (10-11-2024) -National Action Plan (third vear)

During the reporting period of the first year, quarterly reports were submitted to the United Nations General Secretary's Special Representative Office through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, according to the permission of the State Administration Council Office. For the second year and third year, bi-annual reports are to be submitted.

Gender Mainstreaming and Gender Equality

Since gender mainstreaming and gender equality are becoming the generation of the present, the empowerment of women and girls plays a crucial role. Best practices, experiences, and challenges regarding the national mechanisms for the advancement of women are to be advanced in all three pillars. Since Gender mainstreaming is a cross-cutting issue and with the support of ASEAN, we can have a fuller understanding and more precise picture of Gender Mainstreaming. The following emerging issue is Resilience. Towards climate change, disaster resilience, mass displacement of insecure areas (like in the present) and domestic violence and their impacts are

to be aware and try to ease and settle. In this regard, it would enhance the safety and protection of women and girls.

Towards Resilient Community for Women

It is noted that "Resilience" empowers women to navigate the challenges of balancing work and family life, leading to greater economic independence and security, which also encourages persistence in the face of job rejections or workplace discrimination, enabling women to climb career ladders and break glass ceilings. Since it is the in ner strength that enables women to navigate through difficulties. overcome barriers, and emerge stronger, it is not just a personal trait but a societal necessity, influencing families, communities. and workplaces. The importance of Resilience in women can be seen in psychological well-being economic empowerment, social change, leadership and many others. Resilience is fundamental to women's mental health as women are the ones who face unique stressors, including gender discrimination, societal expectations, and caregiver responsibilities. To foster a positive outlook, they should be aware and have proper training.

Challenges and Way Forward

Since a culture of regional Resilience characterizes the ASEAN, it is committed to respecting the different cultures. languages, religions and peoples of the ASEAN region. For the spirit of" unity in diversity", ASEAN also emphasizes the common values, fundamental freedoms. gender equality, promotion and protection of human rights, and social justice.

Women empowerment helps improve the standard life of women in rural and cities, preventing crimes against women, reducing domestic violence, bringing lots of social and economic gains, solving societal issues like poverty, unemployment and birth control, and achieving comprehensive growth in every sector of society. It can help in the nation-building process by joining in defense forces. social service, politics, education and corporate levels. In the implementation of NSPAW (2013-2022), a 24-hour Helpline service for violence against women from different areas of Myanmar was started in November 2016. Survivors can complain not only from the Helpline but also from Facebook and Messenger by sending short messages beginning in January 2022. Now, to easily memorize the Helpline number when making a complaint to the 24-hour Helpline Service, the Department of Social Welfare has arranged a special

sistance of over 143.55 million for 1,370 survivors who need legal help and over 174.964 million for 594 survivors who need livelihood beneficiaries from the government budget. Starting from the 2019-2020 financial year to May 2024, financial assistance of 14.878 million is supported for 48 single mothers or women-headed households who are at risk of violence.

FOR those who passed EPS-TOPIK in construction, agriculture and livestock sectors and service sector Group 2, the skills test has been scheduled to begin from 28 July to 1 August, said the Public Overseas Employment Agency (POEA-EPS). It said the venue, date, and time for the skills test will continue to be announced. Further announcements on venue, date, and time for service industry group 1 and manufacturing industry (first batch) will be continued as well. According to the results of the 16th TOPIK released on 5 June, 513 passed the agriculture and livestock and construction sector, and 3767 passed the service sector Group 1 and Group 2.

Myanmar workers have been sent to the Republic of Korea through POEA under the EPS system. EPS-TOPIK and Skills Test are held for those who want to work in manufacturing, agriculture, livestock, construction and service sectors.

In the 16th TOPIK test, recruitment of Myanmar workers will be extended in the Republic of Korea's service industry, and women who completed basic high school level were also allowed for the first time. There were many women candidates in the service industry. — MT/ ZS

Counter-argument to false information

Probe reveals true cause of inmate's death, Khit Thit media falsely accused Mandalay Prison

THE subversive Khit Thit media falsely reported on 26 June that Mandalay Prison authorities had killed inmate 'Htet Yan Naing'. A responsible officer from the prison clarified that measures are taken against drug smuggling within the prison, and the authorities regularly inspect the wings of the prison daily.

Upon investigation, it was found that the prisoner, Htet Yan Naing, became depressed after his brother died of a heart attack, which led to hallucinations and insomnia. On 20 June, he punched fellow inmate Aung Thura Lwin twice without any reason and was subsequently sent to the disciplinary office and was put in leg irons with a brace.

Later, Htet Yan Naing, in an abnormal mental state, shouted and struck prison guard Myat Min Thu in the prison clinic. When staff tried to control the situation, Htet Yan Naing ran to the male prison building No 5, hitting a lamp post, a concrete bench, and a waste tank in his disturbed state. Consequently, the prison doctor had to administer four stitches to the left corner of his head.

According to the prison doctor's report, Htet Yan Naing exhibited signs of mental disorder due to his head injury and was sent to Mandalay General Hospital for further treatment. It was determined that he died from lung and heart disease on 21 June, not from the head injury. The deceased prisoner's family was contacted and informed about the funeral arrangements.

Therefore, it is evident that Khit Thit media intentionally spread false news to mislead the public.—Wai Wai Phyo/TMT

Nationwide crackdown on illegal trade nets seizures worth about K464 million

UNDER the oversight of the Illegal Trade Eradication Steering Committee, efforts to combat illicit trade are effectively underway in compliance with the law. On 28 June, a combined team led by the Customs Department conducted inspections at Yangon International Airport, seizing 99 bottles of cosmetics valued at an estimated K900,000 from a passenger and one hand manual hydraulic stacker made in China (estimated value K2 million), which was not mentioned in the import declaration form at the Myanmar Industrial Port (worth approximately K2.9 million). The action was taken under Customs procedures. On the same day, a combined team managed by Nay Pyi Taw Illegal Trade Eradication Task Force seized 2.436 tonnes of illegal timbers (worth approximately K835,000) in Lewe Township. The action was taken under the Forest Law.

On 30 June, a combined team managed by the Shan State Illegal Trade Eradication Task Force seized nine kinds of smuggled goods (estimated value of K10.254 million), including 11 rotary hummers of Total brand and beside Kengtung Road near the Malyang checkpoint in Tachilek.

Again, on 30 June, a combined team managed by the Bago **Region Illegal Trade Eradication** Task Force inspected and seized 0.263 tonne of illegal timbers (estimated value of K231,968) in Taungoo District; 0.427 tonne of unlawful timber and 2.095 tonnes of hardwood (estimated value of K1,800,536) in Bago District; one unregistered Honda Fit (valued at K7 million) near Abyangatchaywin Village in Waw Township; two kinds of goods (estimated value of K13 million), including 300 pieces of 'Glory Deluxe' brand China-made mosquito nets that

were not declared in the Import

Declaration (ID) from a vehicle



seized one Nissan Diesel truck, one TT truck produced by the industrial zone, and one Mitsubishi Fuso truck (estimated value K75 million) carrying 11,960 gallons of illegal premium diesel at the Shwegyin checkpoint. The action was taken under the Import and Export Law, the Oil and Petroleum Product Law and Customs procedures.

On 2 July, a combined team managed by the Taninthayi Re-

travelling from Hpa-an to Yangon, and one Dong Feng tractor head (value estimated at K70,000,000) that carried those goods. The action was taken under the forestry law, import and export law and Customs procedures.

On 1 July, a combined team managed by the Mandalay Region Illegal Trade Eradication Task Force conducted inspections. Authorities seized a Nissan Condor van and an Isuzu Forward van (estimated value of K76 million) carrying two types of goods (estimated value of K52.5 million), including 10,000 kilogrammes of land crab seafood. The two cars were travelling from Myitkyina to Mandalay. In addition, authorities gion Illegal Trade Eradication Task Force conducted inspections. It seized a boat (valued approximately at K750,000) carrying 5.338 tonnes of illegal timbers (valued approximately at K1 million) in Kyunsu Township, Myeik District. The action was taken under the Forest Law.

The Illegal Trade Eradication Steering Committee reported that 19 arrests were made on 28 and 30 June and 1 and 2 July, with an estimated value of K464 million. — MNA/TMT

people. It is actually a social development as a whole. Empowering women to participate in and lead public and private institutions makes these institutions more representative and effective. Increasing women's and girls' education and access to resources improves the health and education of the next generation.

Self-reliance is a country's capacity to plan, finance, and implement solutions to its own development challenges. It also includes a commitment to see these solutions through effectively, inclusively, and with accountability. To be effective, individuals within societies must have equal access to opportunities, resources, benefits, and legal protection. In this regard, the role of Myanmar women and their ability to build community cohesion by playing the role of first responders and caretakers at home and in their communities is commendable.

This is also to train their Resilience, as past experiences in Myanmar resulted in exposing women to higher risks and greater burdens from the impacts of climate change. Women's empowerment and economic development are closely interrelated. While development itself will bring about women's empowerment, empowering women will bring about changes in decision-making, which will have a direct impact on development.

In 2025, the global community will mark the thirtieth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women and the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action 1995, as well as ten years of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals. Leading up to the anniversary, there should be a comprehensive national-level review process led by the government that involves all stakeholders. Reviews should be inclusive and mobilize all branches and levels of government, civil society organizations, the private sector, the entities of the United Nations system and regional and international organizations, academia, the media and other stakeholders. The challenges ahead are waiting for the advancement of women, and they call for collaborative efforts from the institutions and organizations related to Myanmar women.

According to the experiences of ASEAN and other countries and those of USAID which are doing for the advancement of women, here are some recommendations: to reduce disparities between women and men in access to, control over, and benefit from economic, social, political, educational, and cultural resources, as well as wealth, opportunities, and services; strive to eliminate GBV, which affects women's abilities to thrive and succeed, and mitigate its harmful effects on individuals and communities so that all people can live healthy and productive lives; to increase the capability of women and girls to exercise their fundamental and legal rights fully, determine their life outcomes, assume leadership roles, and influence decision-making in households, communities, and societies; to support strategies and activities that secure private-property rights and land tenure for women; and, to improve the access of women and girls to education, including opportunities for higher education

Last but not the least, to re-

call the World Bank President, James Wolfensohn, addressing the Fourth UN Conference on Women, who said: -

"Education for girls has a catalytic effect on every dimension of development: lower child and maternal mortality rates; increased educational attainment by daughters and sons; productivity; and improved environmental management. Together, these can mean faster economic growth and, equally important, wider distribution of the fruits of growth ... More education for girls will also enable more and more women to attain leadership positions at all levels of society, from health clinics in the villages to parliaments in the capitals. This, in turn, will change the way societies will deal with problems and raise the quality of global decision-making."

Egyptian taxi driver turns cab into mobile library to encourage reading

ON a street in northern Egypt's coastal governorate of Alexandria, several passers-by were checking a variety of books placed on a taxi. The taxi driver, Mohammed Azzam, has turned his cab into a mobile library three or four days a week to encourage people to read.

"I have loved reading since childhood, that is one of the reasons why I decided to launch a mobile taxi library initiative," 42-year-old Azzam told Xinhua, satisfied to see pedestrians being

Industry summit eyes strengthening China-Thailand cooperation in tourism

OVER 200 business leaders from the Chinese mainland, the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) and the Macao SAR gathered here from Monday to Tuesday to share their insights on strengthening tourism exchanges and cooperation with Thai partners.

Hosted by the Global Tourism Economy Research Centre (GTERC) and organized by the China Chamber of Tourism and the China Women's Chamber of Commerce, the China-Thailand Cultural Tourism Industry Summit convened on the same day when China and Thailand established diplomatic relations in 1975, serving as a warm-up event to welcome the upcoming 50th anniversary.

Pansy Ho, vice-chairperson of the All-China Federation of Industry and Commerce and president of the GTERC, noted during her opening speech that tourism has not only helped boost the two respective economies in a mutually beneficial way, but also

THE US dollar stayed strong in the mid-161 yen zone early Tuesday in Tokyo after hitting a fresh 37-year high overnight, as rising US Treasury yields reinforced prospects that the interest rate gap between the United States and Japan will

remain wide.

At 9 am, the dollar fetched 161.51-52 yen compared with 161.44-54 yen in New York after hitting 161.72 yen, its highest since December 1986, and 161.01-03 yen in Tokyo at 5 pm Monday.



The euro was quoted at \$1.0735-0739 and 173.38-46 yen against \$1.0735-0745 and 173.40-50 yen in New York and \$1.0754-0756 and 173.16-20 yen in Tokyo late Monday afternoon.

Tokyo stocks opened mixed as rises tracking overnight gains on Wall Street were offset by selling after a recent rally. In the first 15 minutes of trading, the 225-issue Nikkei Stock Average fell 133.60 points, or 0.34 per cent, from Monday to 39,497.46. The broader Topix index was up 1.92 points, or 0.07 per cent, at 2,826.20. On the top-tier Prime Market, decliners were led by pulp and paper, and metal product issues, while insurance and transport equipment issues led gainers. - Kyodo

New trade deal to benefit New Zealand's wood, wool

NEW ZEALAND concluded a groundbreaking trade deal with Costa Rica, Iceland, and Switzerland on Tuesday, which removes tariffs on hundreds of products that benefit sustainability and the environment.

The Agreement on Climate Change, Trade and Sustainability (ACCTS) is the first of kind New Zealand has concluded with these countries outside of the World Trade Organization, and is set to deliver new, high-quality trade opportunities while tackling climate and sustainability challenges, said New Zealand Trade and Agriculture

The ACCTS opens up commercial opportunities for New Zealand businesses by focusing on trade in sustainable goods and services, McClay said, adding it will see tariffs removed on New Zealand's key exports, including 41 wood products and wool.

It will also remove tariffs on hundreds of other products, including wool fiber, slag wool for insulation, recycled paper along with energy saving goods like LED lamps and rechargeable batteries, he said.

In addition, it supports New Zealand's renewable energy sector by establishing rules to prevent harmful fossil fuel subsidies; and sets guidelines for ecolabelling. "ACCTS will open new markets for New Zealand exporters and grow in benefit over time as more countries join," the minister said. — Xinhua



Philippines' Cebu Pacific says to buy up to 152 Airbus planes worth \$24 bln

PHILIPPINE carrier Cebu Pacific said Tuesday it will buy up to 152 Airbus planes worth \$24 billion in a deal it described as the "largest aircraft order" in the country's aviation his-

"The order is designed to provide Cebu Pacific with maximum flexibility to adapt fleet growth to market conditions, with the ability to switch between the A321neo and A320neo," Cebu Pacific chief executive Michael Szucs said in a statement.

The company said it had signed a binding memorandum of understanding with Airbus that covered "firm orders" for up to 102 A321neo aircraft and purchase rights for 50 A320neo. — AFP

Boeing to acquire Spirit AeroSystems

BOEING on Monday announced it has entered into a definitive agreement to acquire Spirit AeroSystems.

The merger is an allstock transaction at an equity value of approximately US\$4.7 billion, or 37.25 dollars per share. The total transaction value is approximately \$8.3

billion, including Spirit's last reported net debt, according to Boeing.

"We believe this deal is in the best interest of the flying public, our airline customers, the employees of Spirit and Boeing, our shareholders and the country more broadly," said Boeing President and CEO

Dave Calhoun. "By reintegrating Spirit, we can fully align our commercial production systems, including our Safety and Quality Management Systems, and our workforce to the same priorities, incentives and outcomes - centred on safety and quality." ---Xinhua

A cargo train left Beijing for the Russian capital Moscow on Monday, marking the launch of a regular China-Europe freight-train service from the Chinese capital.

The freight train carrying construction materials, household electrical appliances, clothing and other goods departed from the logistics hub

Beijing launched the first trial train last March. More preparations and improvements have since been made. Starting from Monday, the service will run at least once a month.

Biden blasts landmark Supreme Court ruling on Trump immunity

PRESIDENT Joe Biden warned Monday that the US Supreme Court's landmark ruling on presidential immunity sets a "dangerous precedent" that Donald Trump would exploit if elected in November.

The conservative-dominated high court ruled that Trump — and all presidents — enjoy "absolute immunity" from criminal prosecution for "official acts" taken while in office, but can still face criminal penalties for "unofficial acts".

"For all practical purposes today's decision almost certain-

ly means there are no limits to what a president can do. This is a fundamentally new principle, and it's a dangerous precedent," Biden said in a speech at the White House.

Trump is facing criminal charges over his attempts to overturn his 2020 election loss to Biden, but that trial had been put on hold while the Supreme Court considered his immunity claims.

The 6-3 ruling on Monday, split along ideological lines, is set to further delay proceedings in that case, almost certainly to

sometime after voters head to the polls in November.

"The American people must decide if they want to entrust... once again, the presidency to Donald Trump, now knowing he'll be more emboldened to do whatever he pleases, whenever he wants to do it," Biden said.

Conservative Chief Justice John Roberts, in his majority opinion, said a president is "not above the law" but does have "absolute immunity" from criminal prosecution for official acts taken while in office. — AFP

Flood situation in India's Assam turns grim as death toll reaches 35

THE flood situation in India's northeastern state of Assam turned grim on Tuesday as more than half a million people were rendered homeless after flood water entered their homes, said a state government official.

Major rivers in the state were said to be flowing much above their normal levels. According to media reports, as many as 35 people had died this year alone in the state so far in flood-related incidents. Nearly 19 out of the total 35 districts in the state have been affected by the floods.

Indian Air Force (IAF) choppers were pressed into service to rescue people stuck in the flood-affected areas. In one such rescue operation on Tuesday, a Mi-17 IV helicopter of the IAF rescued 13 marooned survivors from a small island in the flooded river Brahmaputra, north of Dibrugarh in Assam, said the state's Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma in a post on X (Twitter).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to the Assam chief minister on Monday and enquired about the flood situation. "He assured me of full cooperation from the Government of India in this hour of crisis," said Sarma.

A report by The Indian Express newspaper said the floods affected 640,000 people from 1,275 villages across 19 districts in the state as of Monday evening. — Xinhua



At least 19 dead in drug gang clash in Mexico

AT least 19 people were killed, four of them Guatemalans, in a turf battle between two drug gangs in the southern Mexican state of Chiapas, authorities said Monday.

A cargo truck was found with 16 men shot dead inside, while three others were found dead outside the vehicle, the ministry of public safety said in a statement, after initially giving a death toll of 20.

The events occurred Friday in the municipality of La Concordia, near the border with Guatemala, where violence has been on the rise in recent years.

An initial investigation said the clash was between the Sinaloa cartel, one of the most powerful in Mexico, and another gang identified as the "Chiapas and Guatemala" cartel.

The ministry said in a statement that the two groups were battling over "criminal control of the border area".

The region is key for the trafficking of drugs, arms and migrants towards the United States, according to the non-governmental organization Insight Crime. – AFP

YEMEN'S Houthi group on Monday claimed responsibility for launching attacks against four cargo ships belonging to the United

"The first operation was carried out by several cruise missiles, targeting the Israeli ship MSC Unific in the Arabian Sea, and the hit was accurate and direct," Houthi military spokesman Yahya Sarea said in a statement aired by Houthi-run al-Masirah TV.

"The second operation was carried out by several ballistic and cruise missiles, targeting the American oil tanker Delonix in the Red Sea for the second time this week," he said, adding the third operation targeted the British ship Anvil Point in the Indian Ocean with several cruise missiles "accurately and directly".

"The fourth operation was carried out by several cruise missiles, targeting the ship Lucky Sailor in the Mediterranean Sea," he said, vowing to launch more such attacks until Israel stops its offensive in the Gaza Strip. – Xinhua

Iran, Türkiye warn against regional spillover of escalating Israeli offensive in Gaza

IRAN and Türkiye have warned against the consequences of Israel's prolonged strikes against Gaza and potential attack on Lebanon.

In a phone call on Sunday, Iranian Caretaker Foreign Minister Ali Bagheri Kani and Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan discussed the latest developments in Gaza, Israeli "crimes" against Palestinians, and bilateral ties, according to a statement released by the Iranian Foreign Ministry on Monday.

Bagheri Kani slashed Israel's "brutal crimes" against people in the Gaza Strip and Israel's threats against Lebanon.

He stressed that Lebanon's resistance was completely ready to counter the Israeli threats, noting that any act of aggression by Israelis against Lebanon would be costly for them.

The acting Iranian minister said nine months had passed since the eruption of the conflict in Gaza on 7 October and Israelis were still incapable of returning the situation to what it was before that.

He emphasized that Israelis should know any new mistake by them in Lebanon would lead to the unfolding of a new situation at the regional level against them, and they would not be able to compensate for their strategic mistake even by resorting to "crimes".

Fidan, for his part, praised Iran for its efforts towards resolving the issue of Palestine and condemned the Israeli "crimes" against Gazans, saying it is very important for Ankara and Tehran to continue cooperating on Palestine's issue and maintaining regional security and stability. — Xinhua

South Korea carries out live-fire drills near North's border first time in 6 years

South Korean army said on Tuesday.

"The firing drills, the first such exercise to be conducted on land after exercises were normalized following the government's complete suspension of the 19 September Military Agreement, focused on bolstering artillery readiness and response capabilities in the event of enemy provocations," the army was quoted by Yonhap, as saying.

The drills took place at front-line ranges in the South Korean provinces of Gyeonggi and Gangwon in a threemile distance from Military Demarcation Line within the Demilitarized Zone between the two Koreas, Yonhap reported, citing the country's military authorities.

The South Korean military reportedly fired 140 rounds using the K9 and K105A1 self-propelled howitzers in the course of the drills. In early June, North Korea said it had sent 3,500 air balloons carrying 15 tonnes of trash south in response to a hike in cases of South Korean activists sending anti-Pyongyang leaflets into the North. In response, the South Korean government approved a motion to suspend the 2018 inter-Korean military pact, which allows Seoul to resume military exercises near the military demarcation line, propaganda broadcasting towards North Korean territory as well as other actions described as hostile in the pact. — SPUTNIK

It encourages international cooperation and practical actions to help countries, especially developing countries, strengthen their AI capacity building, enhance their representation and voice in global AI governance, advocate for "an open, fair, and non-discriminatory business environment", and support the United Nations in playing a central role in international cooperation. — Xinhua
