Early Warning For Weather Events During Pre-Monsoon Season 5/2025

Issued on 1 May 2025

1. During the period of Pre-Monsoon Season (from May to before the onset of Southwest Monsoon into Myanmar), isolated rain or thundershowers are likely in the afternoon or evening accompanied with strong wind, hails, thunder and lightning, due to the convective cloud by gradually rising day temperatures in the whole country. Surface wind speed in strong wind may reach 40 miles per hour to 50 miles per hour.
2. Public is advised to take necessary awareness with the weather events during the Pre-Monsoon Season (from May to before the onset of Southwest Monsoon into Myanmar) and domestic airlines and cruises are also advised to take precautionary measures. — DMH

BAY INFERENCE: Weather is partly cloudy to cloudy over the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal.

FORECAST VALID UNTIL NOON OF 1 May 2025: Rain or thundershowers will be scattered in Taninthayi Region and Kachin, Rakhine States, fairly widespread in Sagaing Region and Kayin, Mon States and widespread in the remaining Regions and States with likelihood of isolated heavyfalls in Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon, Mandalay, Bago, Magway and Ayeyawady Regions and Shan State. Degree of certainty is 100 per cent.

THE CONDITION OF CUMULONIMBUS CLOUD: The cumulonimbus clouds are developing in Nay Pyi Taw, Bago, Taninthayi Regions and Kayin State. The area along the cumulonimbus clouds movement, the weather phenomena such as strong winds accompanied with rain, thunder, lightning and hail may occur and therefore it is recommended to be aware in advance these phenomena.

STATE OF THE SEA: Sea will be moderate in Myanmar waters. Wave height will be about 5-8 feet off and along Myanmar Coasts.

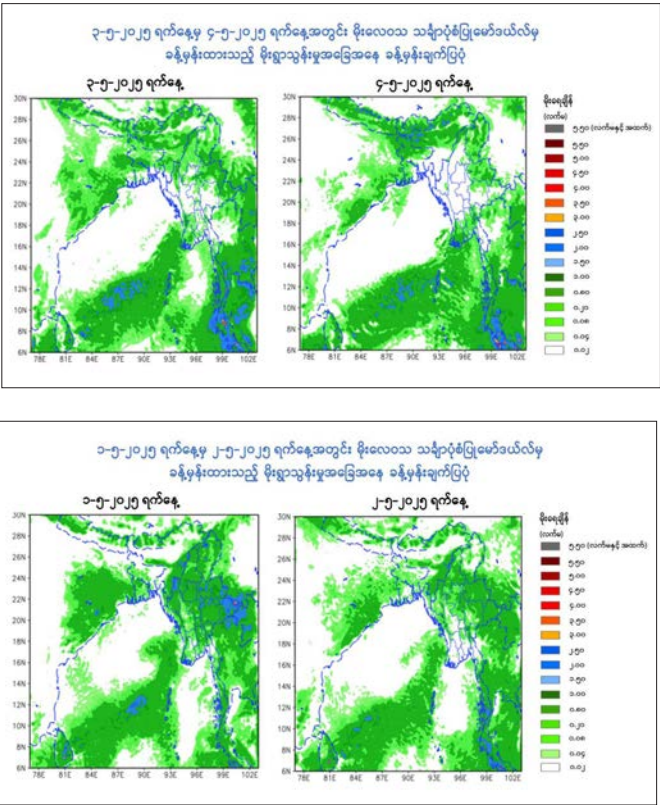
Untimely Rainfall Warning 29

On this occasion of Workers' Day, I extend my heartfelt greetings and best wishes for good health, peace of mind, and all-round prosperity to all the people, including the esteemed workers who are contributing their physical and intellectual strength — with perseverance, diligence, effort, and goodwill — to the development of the nation and the betterment of socioeconomic life.

The government is working to promote the State economy and improve the socio-economic well-being of the people by enhancing agriculture- and livestock-based production industries, and by supporting and promoting Micro-, Small-, and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs) based on locally available natural materials in different regions. At the same time, efforts are being made to develop other economic sectors. On this occasion, I would first like to respectfully honour and recognize the hardworking labourers who are contributing to national development.

Esteemed workers,

The government is promoting MSMEs (Micro-, Small-, and Medium-sized Enterprises) to increase domestic employment opportunities, reduce the unemployment rate, enhance domestic production, substitute imported goods, and enable the export of surplus local products.

The government, employers, and workers are continuing to collaborate to enhance the socioeconomic life of labour forces that play a vital role in national development, as well as to promote the development of human resources. Efforts are ongoing to upgrade vocational training schools to improve the skills of the workforce, open more training schools, open more training programmes that provide greater employment opportunities, and produce skilled workers who can compete not only locally but also internationally.

Esteemed workers,

To strengthen the role of workers in tripartite collaboration among the government, employers, and employees, the 2011 Labour Organization Law grants freedom to establish employer and worker organizations. As a result, 3,116 labour organizations and 28 employer organizations have been formed. These organizations contribute not only to increased production and national economic development but also to the protection and promotion of workers' rights.

Inspections and regulatory measures are being taken at factories, workplaces, and departments to ensure that workers receive the entitlements granted under labour laws and to promote occupational safety

and health. Furthermore, to enhance workplace safety and health standards, the Social Security Board under the Ministry of Labour has established a national-level Social Security Board. In collaboration with both local and international organizations, Myanmar has been a member of the ASEAN Occupational Safety and Health Network (ASEAN-OSHNET) since the year 2000.

Esteemed workers,

Since Myanmar is a member state of the International Labour Organization (ILO), it has been implementing and adhering to the conventions and recommendations prescribed by the ILO in accordance with the country's existing laws. Likewise, Myanmar has been cooperating with the ILO in addressing complaints related to forced labour issues.

Following ILO Convention No 182 on the Worst Forms of Child Labour, Myanmar is taking protective and preventive measures, as well as awareness-raising activities, to eliminate the worst forms of child labour. These efforts are being carried out under the National Plan of Action for the Elimination of Child Labour, in line with existing laws.

The relationship between employers and workers should be good, ensuring a peaceful work environment and resolving conflicts in a fair and just manner. This will allow workers to quickly and fairly enjoy their rights. Therefore, the establishment of 2,982 Workers' Coordination Committees, 325 Township Coordination and Mediation Groups, 15 Conciliation Teams, and one Conciliation Council plays a significant role in facilitating resolution. By providing awareness programmes at factories and workplaces, not only can the relationship in the workplace be improved, but it will also contribute to increased productivity.

The social security plan is being implemented to ensure the social and health security of workers who are the main productive force of the country. Under this plan, insured workers from a total of 126 townships are entitled to medical treatment and financial benefits. Moreover, during the COVID-19 pandemic, insured workers were provided with social security benefits amounting to K71.856 billion. Furthermore, a total of 3,394 insured workers who were affected by the flooding due to Typhoon Yagi received assistance amounting to K266.297 million. For those insured workers affected by the severe 7.7 Richter-scale Mandalay earthquake on 28 March 2025, financial assistance for family support related to natural disaster risk is being planned, with an estimated amount of K21.703 billion.

Esteemed workers,

Due to the shortage of workers in the country caused by the migration of workers abroad, it is necessary to focus on creating job opportunities within the country, where there is a safer and more secure living environment, rather than encouraging more migration. Therefore, job fairs are being organized in some regions and states, where employers collaborate to provide a one-stop service for job placements. The Labour Exchange Management System has been developed to offer effective employment services and is available on the website. In sending Myanmar workers abroad, priority is given to countries with good wages and benefits. By comparing the number of workers who return after completing their contracted period with the number to be sent, efforts are made to create employment opportunities both domestically and abroad.

To ensure that Myanmar workers have access to overseas employment opportunities, to protect workers' rights and prevent the loss of these rights, to systematically apply the experiences, knowledge, and skills gained from abroad for domestic use, and to contribute to the country's development through remittances sent by Myanmar migrant workers to their families via official channels, workers are being sent abroad under the law. To safeguard Myanmar workers abroad, labour attachés have been appointed in Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, and Thailand, while in countries without labour attachés, the relevant Myanmar embassies and consulates-general provide protection and support.

In conclusion, the government is implementing the Five-Point Roadmap and nine objectives set to foster the economic development of the country and improve the socioeconomic lives of its citizens. The role of workers is substantial in enhancing the manufacturing sector by efficiently utilizing internal resources and helping the country to become an exporter, transformed from an importer. The performance of the workforce is critical in achieving this goal. As such, I urge the workers to collaborate with the government to the best of their abilities, to serve the interests of the nation and the people in honour of International Workers' Day.

DPM & MoTC Union Minister tours Nay Pyi Taw-Ela Railway, inspects Pyinmana Station and staff

DEPUTY Prime Minister and Union Minister for Transport and Communications General Mya Tun Oo inspected the Nay Pyi Taw-Ela railway section, quake-hit Pyinmana railway station and temporary camps for the staff yesterday.

The Deputy Prime Minister first arrived at the operation site where the rail track strength was being examined using Automatic Lining, Levelling and Tamping Machine (ALLTM) machinery at the down train rail and Pyiwin railway station yard, and made proper instructions.

On arrival at Pyinmana railway station, General Mya Tun Oo reviewed quake-stricken buildings and inspected the repair work.

The General proceeded to temporary camps for the staff and families and inspected the accommodation and healthcare services.

Moreover, he also proceeded to the Myanmar Posts and Telecommunications owned land area in Dekkhinathiri and inspected temporary shelters, healthcare services and other matters for the staff. — MNA/KTZH

UNION Minister for Religious Affairs and Culture U Tin Oo Lwin, accompanied by officials from the Department of Religious Affairs, visited several historic religious structures in Mandalay Region that were damaged by a recent earthquake.

On the morning of the visit, he inspected the damage to the Nanmyo Sutaungpyae Pagoda, the Mandalay Palace walls and the Mahamuni Bud-

dha Image. They also observed repair work to broken bricks of many other religious buildings and restoration of tilted spires and wooden tiered roofs. The works are carried out by Tatmadaw personnel, Myanmar Police Force members and staff from the Department of Archaeology and the National Museum. The inspection included other affected religious landmarks such as Ananda Pagoda, Phayani Pagoda, Ayeik

Mahwet Pagoda and the damaged convocation hall of the State Pariyatti Sasana University in Mandalay. The Union Minister provided instructions for the proper implementation of necessary restoration and maintenance tasks.

Afterwards, the Union minister paid respects to the Rector Sayadaw of the State Pariyatti Sasana University (Mandalay) and donated offerings. — MNA/KZL

Global aid pours into Myanmar as quake toll hits 3,799 as of 30 April

AS of 30 April, the devastating earthquake that struck Myanmar on 28 March has left 3,799 people dead, 5,105 injured, and 106 missing across six states and regions that were most severely affected.

Search and rescue teams from the Myanmar Fire Brigade, as well as both domestic and international relief teams, have been actively conducting operations in the affected areas. As of today, 653 survivors trapped under collapsed buildings have been rescued, and the bodies of 778 deceased individuals have been recovered.

Local donors from across the country have been providing financial and material assistance to those affected. In addition, governments, organizations, and philanthropists from overseas have contributed aid in the form of cash

and essential supplies.

Between 7 pm on 29 April and 5 pm on 30 April, flights carrying a total of 66.442 tonnes of relief supplies, such as mosquito nets, blankets, solar lamps, tarpaulins, bed sheets, jerrycans, and ropes, arrived at Yangon International Airport. These supplies were sent via the International Organization for Migration (IOM).

Flights also arrived carrying 0.485 tonne of dry noodles, biscuits, blankets, mosquito nets, and clothes in cartons, donated by Kri Sakthi Nyanaethira Kanimadam Yogi Ram-suratkumar Shiramam and the Persatuan Renganut Devi Shri Karumariamman Temple from Selangor, Malaysia.

The relief supplies are now being promptly distributed to the affected communities. — MNA/MKKS

Online passport appointments to resume 1 May after brief hiatus

ACCORDING to the Myanmar Passport Issuing Office, the online appointment system for applying for Myanmar passports, which was temporarily suspended, will resume on 1 May.

The system had been paused for nearly a month due to damage to telecommunications towers caused by the recent earthquake in Mandalay. With the communications infrastructure now restored, applicants will once again be able to obtain QR codes through the online system starting from 1 May.

Those who had already secured QR codes before the suspension and have appointment dates scheduled through June may proceed with their appoint-

ments as planned. Passport issuance for these applicants is continuing as normal. Additionally, urgent passport applications related to health, education, and emergency matters are being processed through the Green Channel.

Furthermore, the passport offices in Yangon, Myitkyina, and Lashio have revised and rescheduled appointment dates to enable quicker processing for those with existing online appointments. The Myanmar Passport Issuing Office has advised applicants to check their updated appointment dates and visit the respective offices on the newly assigned dates for passport processing. — ASH/KNN

65 container vessels set to dock at Yangon Port in May

A total of 65 container vessels are scheduled to enter the Yangon Port in May 2025, the Myanma Port Authority announced.

Fourteen container vessels run by SITC Shipping Line, ten by Cosco Shipping Line, six by Maersk A/S Line, five each by CMA CGM Line and Samudera Shipping Line, four each by MSC Line, and Ti2 Container Line, three each by Ocean Salute Shipping Line, PIL Line, and RCL Line, two each by BLPL Shipping Line, Evergreen Line, ONE Line, and Land and Sea are scheduled to call at the Yangon Port next month.

Myanma Port Authority has arranged maritime trade channels to handle increasing imports to meet domestic demand, bolster exports, and improve port capacity for significant arrivals of ships. Myanma Port Authority notified that it will inform exporters and importers of ship arrival schedules promptly upon an extended schedule.

A total of 62 container vessels in January 2025, 53 in February, 58 in March and 62 in April arrived at Yangon Port.

Yangon Port handled 633 container vessels in 2024 and 629 in 2023. Thanks to the draft extension, the international ocean liners can access the inner port for now, according to the Myanma Port Authority's statement on 22 June 2022.

After the new navigation channel (Kings Bank Channel) accessing the inner Yangon River had been found, the draft extension work was accelerated. After that, the port can now handle larger ships. The container vessel MV SITC Zhaoming (185.99 metres LOA, 35.25 metres Beam, 29,232 GRT and 2,698 TEU) of Hong Kong-based SITC Shipping Line docked at Asia World Port Terminal for the first time on 22 June, which is the largest ship that AWPT Port has

handled.

From May 2021, the arrival of the ships at terminals in Yangon has increased again. Three new container vessels by

Maersk Line Myanmar (SeaL and Maersk) started to run to fulfil the seaborne trade requirements in 2021. Earlier, the larger ships had draft problems,

preventing sailing on the Yangon River. With the draft being extended up to 10 meters, the larger ocean liners can enter the Thilawa Port. — NN/KK

CBM sells over THB11M within two days

THE Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) injected over 11 million baht into the financial market within two days, with over 5.1 million baht on 28 April and 6.4 million baht on 29 April.

CBM announced to sell \$25 million on 22 April and then injected over 319,900 and 106,000 baht into the financial market on that day.

CBM announced on 16 April that it would sell \$55 million to fuel oil importers and distributors.

CBM sold \$1.9 million on 10 April. CBM announced on 7 April that it would pump \$30 million into the fuel oil industry, and after that, it sold \$40 million and over six million baht on that day.

CBM injected 500,000 yuan on 4 April and over 2.35 million baht on 3 April into the market.

CBM injected over \$126 million, 320 million baht and 3.6 million yuan in March, over \$88 million, 7.5 million yuan and 161 million baht in February and \$124 million, over 13.8 million baht and over 4.8 million yuan in January. CBM aims to curb the instability in the foreign exchange market and currency devaluation. According to CBM's notification on 15 March, it has

been collaborating with law enforcement agencies to combat and prosecute those who attempt to manipulate the currency market under the existing laws. CBM allowed authorized dealers (private banks) to operate online foreign exchange trading freely as per the market rate, depending on supply and demand, starting from 5 December 2023. — NN/KK

AS SUMMER is now in Myanmar, daytime temperatures are on the rise. Generally, vapour comes out from water areas and wet soil, which absorbs rainwater during the rainy season. Such vapour spreads in the atmosphere, supporting the heat of the season. As such, all living beings, especially humans, suffer the extreme heat of the season.

Types of UV

For the time being, the ultraviolet radiation rate is also rising day by day. Everybody needs to know the nature of ultraviolet radiation. In this regard, Ultraviolet (UV) radiation is a type of electromagnetic radiation emitted by the sun and is classified into three types: UVA, UVB, and UVC. UVA rays can penetrate deeply into the skin and contribute to premature ageing. UVB rays are the main cause of sunburn and play a significant role in the development of skin cancer. UVC rays are absorbed by the Earth’s atmosphere and do not reach the skin, so they pose no danger to the average person.

As an advantage of UV, a small amount of exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays is beneficial because it helps the body produce vitamin D, which strengthens bones (about 15 to 30 minutes in the early morning or late afternoon). UV rays can also kill germs. However, too much exposure to UV rays can cause health problems.

Today, Myanmar places a growing emphasis on valuing the labour of farmers and workers, the two foundational

Dangerous impacts of UV

Ultraviolet (UV) rays can have the most harmful effects on the skin and eyes. UV rays can damage skin cells, causing redness, discolouration, wrinkles, dryness, and other skin conditions. In severe cases, they may even lead to skin cancer. Moreover, UV rays can also damage the eyes. They can cause inflammation of the cornea, eye infections, cloudiness, blurred vision, and in serious cases, eye cancer. Excessive exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays can lead to premature skin ageing, including rough skin texture, wrinkles, loss of skin elasticity, and the appearance of spots. It can also cause changes in the skin known as actinic keratoses, which are considered precancerous.

An important role of the UV index

Significantly, people need to consider the impacts of UV rays at different indices. If the UV index is between 0-2, everybody can move around freely outdoors without needing protection. When the UV index is 3 or above, it is considered a health risk, so appropriate protection is necessary. In such conditions, it is important for all to be cautious. If individuals are going outdoors under the sun without fail, they need to dress in a way that protects their skin from direct sunlight. Especially during the hotter parts of the day, it is best to stay in shaded areas.

People should protect themselves against UV radiation

When the UV index rises between 6 and 7.9, the level of UV radiation becomes high. In this situation, it is important to wear clothing that fully covers the body to protect from direct sunlight, use sunglasses, carry an umbrella or wear a hat, and apply sunscreen (Sun Protection Factor-SPF) in advance. It is highly recommended to avoid going out under the sun as much as possible. If the UV radiation index reaches 11 or above, it can be said that the UV radiation level is extremely high, showing very dangerous conditions. It is a condition where everyone needs to be especially cautious.

If necessary, individuals need to check the UV Index. It is because this can help them plan outdoor activities accordingly. Higher UV index readings indicate a greater risk of overexposure. Furthermore, people need to notice that some medications and cosmetics can increase sensitivity to UV radiation. In this regard, individuals with lighter skin and hair are more susceptible to UV

damage. As people reside in Myanmar, they can take advantage of Thanaka. Hence, they need to apply a thick layer of Thanaka or sunscreen with SPF 15+ to exposed areas such as the hands, neck, and shoulders for about 15 minutes before going out into the sun. Reapply the sunscreen every two hours after the initial application. And then, children are particularly vulnerable to UV damage and should be protected from the sun.

Protection against UV

Google mentions the key points on how to prevent UV rays. To prevent ultraviolet (UV) radiation exposure, individuals should seek shade, especially during peak sun hours from 10 am to 4 pm, wear protective clothing and a wide-brimmed hat, use sunglasses with 100 per cent UV protection, and apply broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher. Moreover, avoid indoor tanning and be mindful of UV reflection from surfaces like water, sand,

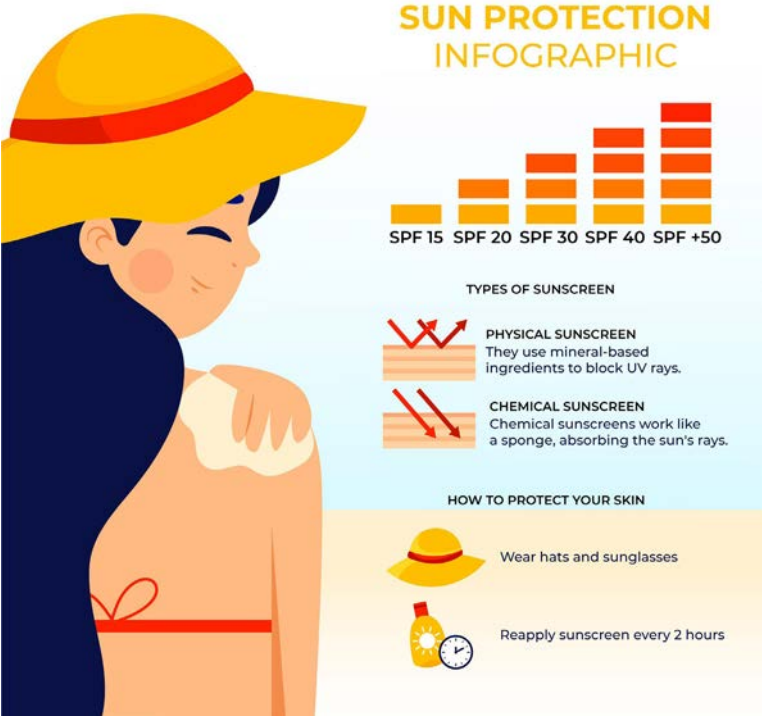

and snow.

Concerning a more detailed breakdown of UV prevention strategies, people need to seek shade and wear protective clothing. It

is because shade is one of the most effective ways to reduce UV exposure. Hence, people need to choose shaded areas like trees, umbrellas, or canopies, especially

during the midday hours when the sun’s rays are strongest. In respect of exposed skin, people need to choose long-sleeved shirts, long pants, and skirts for maximum coverage of UV radiation, and they have to consider Ultraviolet Protection Factor (UPF) clothing. UPF indicates how much UV radiation a fabric blocks.

When choosing clothing to protect themselves from UV radiation, it is crucial to select garments that are darker in colour and have a tight weave, as these fabrics absorb more UV rays compared to lighter colours and loosely woven materials. Essentially, denser fabric with darker hues provides better sun protection.

Awareness of UV reflection

Moreover, people need to be mindful of UV Reflection. Water, sand, and snow can increase exposure to UV rays, even when individuals are in the shade. Ultraviolet (UV) rays from sunlight can penetrate through windows and reach the skin, so even if individuals are not directly exposed to sunlight, whether they are staying at home or working in the office – they can still be affected by UV rays. That is why it is essential to apply sunscreen, even indoors. They have to know the advantages and disadvantages of sunscreen. Physical sunscreen contains mineral-based ingredients to block UV rays while chemical sunscreens work like a sponge, absorbing the

sun’s rays.

Young children and the elderly are more vulnerable to the dangers of ultraviolet (UV) rays, so special care and caution are necessary. Nobody takes children under one year old into direct sunlight. Adults or parents have to let children play only in shaded areas.

Support for the Ozone layer

The impacts of UV radiation can be lessened with the collaborative efforts of the entire population. It is necessary to support the strengthening of the Ozone layer, which is primarily located in the stratosphere, a region of the atmosphere that extends from about 10 to 50 kilometres (six to 30 miles) above the Earth’s surface.

The ozone layer plays a crucial role in protecting life on Earth by absorbing most of the Sun’s harmful ultraviolet (UV) radiation as a shield. Specifically, it absorbs UVB radiation. As oxygen emitted by trees can support the Ozone layer; environmental conservation activities can directly prevent UV radiation as well as protect the Mother Planet against UV and other harmful radiations, as part of saving the lives of the global people as much as possible. Hence, people should participate in the conservation of the environment, including growing trees, in all seasons to leave a healthier planet for new generations.

Less-thirsty rice offers hope in drought-stricken Chile

Innovative planting techniques have reduced water consumption by half compared to traditional flooded fields.

A COLD, dry part of Chile might not sound like the best place to grow rice, a famously thirsty grain that thrives in tropical conditions.

But a new strain of the world’s favorite cereal developed by scientists in the drought-plagued South American country has generated hope that rice can be grown in seemingly inhospitable conditions.

Using an innovative planting technique, Javier Munoz has been

trialling the “Jaspe” strain created by experts at the Agricultural Research Institute’s (INIA) Rice Breeding Programme.

It is one of several research efforts worldwide to come up with less resource-hungry crops at a time of increased water scarcity in parts of the world due to global warming.

Using Jaspe in combination with a growing method that requires only intermittent watering cut the Munoz family’s water

consumption in half in a country that has for generations cultivated rice in flooded fields, or paddies.

At the same time, yield rocketed, with each seed yielding about thirty plants — nearly ten times more than a conventional rice field.

Irrigating rather than flooding rice fields “is a historic step... towards the future,” Munoz, 25, told AFP at his farm in the region of Nuble, a nearly five-hour drive south from the capital Santiago.

Next year, he said, he hoped to increase his production area from one hectare to five.

Chile’s Maule and Nuble regions contain the southernmost rice fields in the world.

Typically grown in wetter, tropical areas, rice cultivation in Chile has been hampered by an unprecedented megadrought, now in its 15th year and driven by climate change, according to scientists.

Russian, South Korean detained for illegal entry in Myawady

A Russian man and a South Korean man who entered Myanmar illegally were arrested yesterday in the Myawady-Kyaukkhat area of Kayin State. They crossed the border through Thailand and were involved in online gambling, scams and other crimes inside Myanmar.

After the arrests, Kayin State Social Affairs Minister U Saw Tun Aung met relevant officials and instructed them to maintain accurate records of all foreign nationals. He also emphasized the need to ensure the detainees receive basic care and are deported promptly and in line with procedures.

Between 30 January and 30 April 2025, a total of 9,045 foreigners were arrested for illegally entering Myanmar. Of those, 7,585 were deported via Thailand, while the remaining 1,460 are held in preparation for deportation and are currently under proper care.

The government says it is actively working with international partners and the public to tackle online crimes, including scams and gambling, which pose threats to national security. Local authorities across the country are also stepping up efforts to prevent and eliminate such crimes. — MNA/KZL

Myanmar worker repatriated from Iraq amid hardship

A Myanmar national who faced difficulties while working in Iraq returned safely to Myanmar, according to government sources.

Ma Wai Wai Khine left Myanmar for Iraq in 2024 for employment. However, she fled from her workplace after encountering problems with her employer and was later detained by Iraqi authorities. She spent three months at a detention centre while her case was processed.

Following coordination between the Myanmar Embassy, the Myanmar Consulate and Iraqi immigration authorities, arrangements were made for her repatriation. She departed Iraq on 30 April via the Bahrain-Bangkok-Yangon route and arrived in Yangon at around 6 pm the same day.

Ayeyawady Foundation restores quake-hit SunU Ponnyashin Pagoda

Fishing boats return to Yangon as offshore fishing season ends

THE fish breeding season is drawing near, and the sea fishing season was suspended starting from 1 May. The fishing boats and trawlers return to the jetties in Yangon, and the capture of fish and prawns is suspended for two months, according to the Sanpya fish market in Kyimyindine township.

Saltwater fishing was prohibited for three months from 1 May to the end of July, and the fishing ban season was changed from May to June to ensure the saltwater product security in the local market. Therefore, fishing was banned in Myanmar's waters starting from 1 May.

"The fishing ban season starts tomorrow, and all the fishing boats from the sea return to the Yangon jetties. Therefore, the jetties are crowded. All the fish and prawns captured from the sea will be sold at the jetty for two days, and the fishing boats will suspend their operations. There are over a hundred types of marine products. Today, the season ends and the boats bring over 20 types of marine products. The owners of boats, workers, employees and wholesalers are all in good condition this year," said U Tun Hla

Aung from Sanpya Fish Market's MMD Company.

The fishing boats and trawlers that return to the Yangon jetty bring over 20 types of marine products and resell them to the wholesale centres. They are also transported to cold storage facilities and resold within two months.

"Although all the entrepreneurs faced losses last year, all can make profits this year. The sales are in good condition, and the consumers can buy at fairer prices so it is a win-win situation for the business people and consumers. The fish prices are not very different as the products are available in every season. During the two-month fishing ban season, one tonne of platu and goldfish and so on are kept in cold storage, and we now save the products to resell. Although we want to store more, we can store about 100,000 tonnes due to the high cost of cold storage," said Daw Tin Nwe from the Kyimyindine Sanpya fish market.

Marine products are indeed captured in both the Ayeyawady and Taninthayi regions of Myanmar and distributed to fish markets across the nation. The products are also exported via the cold storage facilities. — Thitsa (MNA)/KTZH

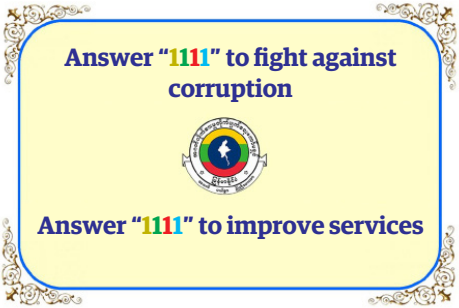
THE Anti-Corruption Commission has established corruption prevention units within ministries to curb corruption effectively.

370+ Japanese firms to hire 1,400+ Myanmar workers

OVER 370 Japanese companies will recruit over 1,400 Myanmar workers, according to the job offer list released by the Myanmar Embassy in Japan on 30 April.

The embassy is scrutinizing the demand letters sent by the Ministry of Labour through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In doing so, it is scrutinizing the documents and evidence to see whether

the Japanese labour supervision company and the recruiting factories and companies are legally established in Japan. The findings and comments are being sent back to the Ministry of Labour through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Demand letters are being scrutinized in order of the date of receipt from the Japanese companies, and the embassy released information on the 379 job offers received and reviewed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as of January 29. According to the announcement, more than 250 male and 1,100 female Myanmar workers will be recruited by more than 370 Japanese companies.

Rain gear in high demand

"Now, it was raining in Yangon, so the monsoon accessories trade has increased. Umbrella demand has been on the rise. People prefer UV protection umbrellas. Some parents have already bought kids' umbrellas, shoes and raincoats because the next academic year is also approaching," said a shop owner from Thakayta Township.

Further, parents have bought school accessories in advance such as notebooks, pencils and pens.

"We are a big family, and it has started raining, so I bought umbrellas. A quality umbrella costs around K20,000. In addition, I also bought school accessories. I saw other people buying these items on the day I shopped," said a woman. — MT/ZS

EV cars with regular prices can sell in the market

ACCORDING to the car industry, EV cars sold at regular prices are currently traded in the market.

"The current EV car trading situation is that if you sell at the market price, you can sell a lot. EVs were a little difficult to import. When the Foreign Exchange Supervision Committee allocated for EVs, the number of vehicles and companies was low, and when the exchange rate was high, some EVs were sold at more than normal prices. So, all cars above regular prices have almost stopped trading. Those who sell at regular prices can sell at a rate," said U Kyaw Swa Tun Myint, general secretary of the Myanmar Automobile Manufacturers and Distributors Association.

The current market does not completely halt, nor is it experiencing a surge in sales, but rather a normal situation. Branded cars are selling well based on

those who prefer them.

"Not everyone buys EVs. Those who prefer brand names are buying based on the brand. Sales do not either stop entirely or surge a lot," he said.

The most produced and most consumed EVs in the world are currently Chinese brands, and more than 90 per cent of EVs in Myanmar are these brands. — MT/ZN

Samsung Electronics posts 1.2% jump in Q1 operating profit

SOUTH Korean tech giant Samsung Electronics reported a 1.2 per cent rise in first-quarter operating profit, buoyed by strong smartphone sales, even as US trade tensions loom. The firm is the flagship subsidiary of South Korean giant Samsung Group, by far the largest of the family-controlled conglomerates that dominate business in Asia’s fourth-largest economy. The world’s largest memory chipmaker reported an operating profit of 6.68 trillion won (\$4.6 billion) for the January–March quarter, up 1.2 per cent on-year. Sales rose 10 per cent to 79.14 trillion won and net profit rose 21.7 per cent to 8.22 trillion won on-year, exceeding forecasts according to Yonhap News Agency, which cited its own financial data firm. The results comes as Seoul and Washington work to craft a “trade package” intended to roll back new US tariffs ahead of the 8 July expiration of a reciprocal tariff freeze. — AFP

Spanish oil giant Repsol's net profit tumbles as prices fall

SPANISH energy giant Repsol on Wednesday said its net profit plunged in the first three months of the year due to lower oil prices, mirroring results by its European rivals. The net profit of 366 million euros (\$416 million) posted in the first quarter represented a 62.2 per cent fall from the same period last year, the company said in a statement. “The geopolitical context, volatility, lower crude oil prices, and reduced refining and chemical margins influenced the performance in the quarter,” the statement said. Repsol’s results are in line with those of its main European competitors, with France’s TotalEnergies and Britain’s BP also reporting a plunge in net profits during the first quarter, mainly due to lower oil prices. — AFP

Trump eases impact of auto tariffs on 100th day in office

Automakers argued that the complexity of supply chains necessitated time to procure all parts domestically.

US President Donald Trump on Tuesday eased the impact of his new 25 per cent tariffs on the auto industry as part of efforts to help manufacturers relocate supply chains for car parts used in the United States over the next two years.

In another reversal of Trump’s extensive additional tariffs, the relief, allowing all American and foreign automakers producing vehicles in the United States to claim some reimbursements, was announced as he marked the 100th

day of his nonconsecutive second term.

“They took in parts from all over the world. I don’t want that. I want them to make their parts here, but I gave them a little bit of time,” Trump said in a speech to thousands of supporters at a community college north of Detroit, home to the American auto industry.

The temporary alleviation of some of the tariff burden came after automakers argued that due to the complexity of their supply chains it would take time to pro-

cure domestically all of the parts necessary to manufacture vehicles in the United States.

Along with consumers, the auto industry has voiced concern that Trump’s hefty tariffs could sharply raise car prices. Under the relief, a carmaker will be allowed to offset the tariffs for 15 per cent of the suggested retail price of an automobile assembled in the United States during the first year of the tariffs and 10 per cent in the second year.

French economy returns to thin growth in first quart

FRANCE’S economy returned to growth in the first three months of the year but the expansion was modest, held back by sluggish household consumption and stagnant investment, official data showed Wednesday.

Gross domestic product (GDP) expanded by 0.1 per cent between January and March in the eurozone’s second

biggest economy after a 0.1 per cent contraction in the fourth quarter.

In the first quarter, growth was restrained by the reluctance of consumers to reach deep into their pockets, with household consumption unchanged after growing by 0.2 per cent in the previous three months.

Japan to hold 2nd round of tariff talks with US

JAPAN’S chief tariff negotiator Ryosei Akazawa said a second round of talks with the United States over its higher duties will be held Thursday in Washington, as the Asian country seeks exemptions from the levies affecting autos, steel and other sectors. “I want to take even one or two steps forward by always keeping in mind how to create a win-win relationship” with the administration of US President Donald Trump, Akazawa, a close aide to Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba, told reporters Wednesday before leaving Tokyo.

The minister in charge of economic revitalization plans to meet with US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and others during his three-day trip, where the auto and agricultural sectors are likely to be on the agenda. — Kyodo

Arsenal can win 'anywhere' says Merino after Champions League defeat by PSG

DEFIANT Mikel Merino says Arsenal have "proved we can win anywhere" and insists they can still reach the Champions League final after defeat to Paris Saint-Germain in the first leg of their last-four tie.

The Gunners face an uphill task after Ousmane Dembele scored the only goal of the game at the Emirates on Tuesday.

Merino had a goal ruled out for offside in the opening moments of the second period, though PSG went within inches of doubling their lead when they struck the crossbar towards the end.

"We have proved we can win anywhere, the Bernabeu (beating Real Madrid 2-1) and against any side in the Premier League, too, so that gives us a lot of confidence.

"The result (at the Emirates) changes nothing because the mentality of this team is always to win, even if we were three up going to Paris."

Merino reverted to midfield for the first leg, with Thomas Partey suspended. But with Partey available for the match in Paris next Wednesday, Merino could be moved back up front.

Both Arsenal and PSG are seeking to win the Champions League for the first time. — AFP

Spurs captain Son out of first leg of Europa League semi-final

SON Heung-min will miss the first leg of Tottenham's Europa League semifinal against Bodo/Glimt on Thursday, manager Ange Postecoglou said on Thursday.

The club captain has not featured for Spurs since a 1-1 draw with Eintracht Frankfurt on 10 April due to a foot injury.

Postecoglou had expressed hope last week that the South Korea forward could return for the visit of the Norwegian team.

Grand Vietnam parade 50 years after the fall of Saigon

For the first time, Chinese troops participated in the celebrations following Xi Jinping's visit to strengthen ties.

VIETNAM mounted its biggest-ever celebration of the fall of Saigon on its 50th anniversary Wednesday, including Chinese troops for the first time after Xi Jinping visited to portray Beijing as a more reliable partner than Washington.

A lotus-shaped float carrying a portrait of revolutionary leader Ho Chi Minh was near the front of the parade in the city renamed after him, AFP journalists saw, and fighter jets and helicopters carry flags flew overhead.

Thousands of people — many wearing T-shirts emblazoned with the Vietnamese flag — including families with young children and the elderly stayed out overnight in the streets, sharing food and waiting for the display.

The celebrations come half a century after tanks of communist North Vietnam crashed through the gates of the city's presidential palace, defeating the US-backed South and delivering a painful blow to American moral and military prestige.

"I am proud of having contributed to liberating the south," said 75-year-old veteran Tran Van Truong who had travelled — dressed in full military uniform — from the capital Hanoi to see the parade.

Around 13,000 people, including veterans, soldiers and members of the public, were to march down Ho Chi Minh City's Le Duan Street, a major thoroughfare which leads to the Independence Palace.

For the first time, more than 300 soldiers from China, Laos and Cambodia took part in the spectacle. — AFP

STRENGTHENING AI MANAGEMENT

China launches special crackdown on abuse of AI technology

CHINA'S top internet regulator has issued a circular announcing the launch of a three-month nationwide campaign to crack down on the misuse of artificial intelligence (AI) technologies.

According to the circular issued by the Office of the Central Cyberspace Affairs Commission and made public on Wednesday, the campaign will be carried out in two phases.

The first phase will focus on strengthening the management of relevant sources, including removing unauthorized AI applications, enhancing the regulation of AI-generated content and related technologies, and encouraging online platforms to improve their ability to identify and verify violations.

The second phase will target specific issues such as the use of AI to create and disseminate rumours, misinformation, obscene content, impersonation, and instances of "internet trolling." — Xinhua

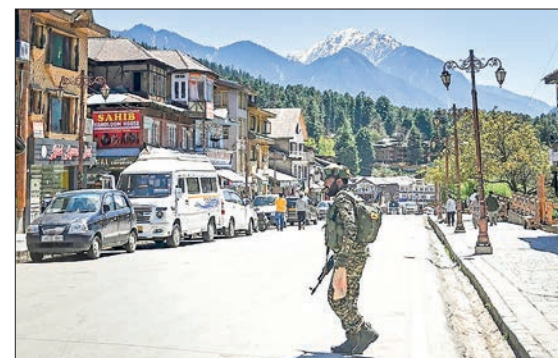
Panic in Pakistani leadership; Navy vessels on standby, airspace restricted as country expects Indian strike

AMID the ongoing stand-off between India and Pakistan over the Pahalgam attack in Jammu and Kashmir, the Pakistani military, it seems, has started preparing for Indian military action.

Sources in the country's military establishment said on Wednesday that Pakistani Navy vessels, including its frigates and submarines, have already positioned themselves in their respective harbours in the sea to be able to tackle any possible Indian movement. Meanwhile, the Pakistan Air Force has reduced flying operations by over 50 per cent, and only essential operations are being conducted to avoid confusion in the airspace, sources said.

Earlier, faced with mounting global pressure, a jittery Pakistan leadership resorted to accusations against India following the deadly Pahalgam incident that killed 26 people. The Federal Minister for Information & Broadcasting, Attaullah Tarar,

had issued a statement claiming that Pakistan has "credible intelligence" suggesting India plans to launch military action against the nation within the next 24-36 hours. — ANI
