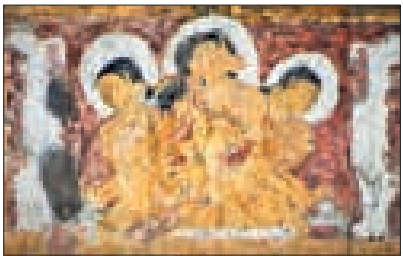

Bagan, Inwa-era murals at Apeyadana, Culamani unharmed by quake

THE earthquake hit Bagan, and the mural paintings of the Bagan and Inwa eras of Apeyadana and Culamani pagodas were not seriously affected, according to the Archaeology Branch of the National Museum Department.

“There is no heavy damage at the Bagan pagodas after the earthquake, but there are only minor impacts. After the earthquake, the relevant organizations managed



the situation per the directives of the departmental heads. The maintenance group also inspected the groups, and the mural painting groups also examined whether the paintings were destroyed or not. Among them, the historic Thanaka wearing paintings at Apeyadana and Culamani pagodas were not affected. We are so glad as they are not affected as they are not replaceable and are precious Myanmar cultural heritages,” said U Min Zaw Htwe, assistant director of the department.

There are 3,822 UNESCO-recognized pagodas and temples in Bagan, and most of the pilgrims visit Shwezigon, Arnanda, Alotawpyae, Thatbyinnyu, Htilominlo,

Gadawpalin, Hngetpyittaung, Bu, Maha Bodhi, Culamani, Dhammayangyi, Shwesandaw, Mya Zedi, Lawka Nanda, Dhamma Razaka, Tooth Relic and Pyathetgyi, which were not hit by the earthquake.

Although the Bagan region encountered damage due to earthquakes and continuous rainfalls in the past, quick repair works were conducted. Therefore, the local and foreign travellers can study the cultural heritage of the Bagan era. After the earthquake on 28 March, the historic Thanaka wearing paintings of 11th Century AD at Apeyadana and Culamani pagodas were not affected, and are now preserved carefully. — Nyein Thu (MNA)/KTZH

Residents Urged to Prioritize Public Safety Amid Armed Terrorist Threats

ARMED terrorists have been launching attacks by using residential homes and administrative buildings in towns and villages as cover, where they have forcibly settled. They aim to shield themselves from Tatmadaw counterattacks while also persuading temporarily displaced persons to return to their native areas and recruiting new members. That enables terrorists to use civilians as human shields. Tatmadaw is committed to safeguarding the sovereignty of the State and will respond to these threats based on intelligence and prevailing conditions. Therefore, residents in areas where terrorists have taken control must prioritize their safety and protect themselves from being exploited by these groups.

New political party applies for registration under election law

Chinese ship delivers 17,000 tonnes of Octane to aid quake
recovery in Myanmar

This marks the 12th donation from the People’s Republic of China to support rehabilitation efforts following the major earthquake that struck Mandalay.

The handover ceremony for the 17,000 tonnes of Octane 92 took place yesterday morning. Attendees included Yangon Region Chief Minister U Soe Thein, regional ministers, officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs’ Strategic Studies and Training Department, officials from the Ministry of Energy, representatives from the Myanma Port Authority, and officials from the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement’s Disaster Management Department. Additionally, officials from the Thanlyin District Administration Body, the Kyauktan Township Administration Body, and

Improve the socioeconomic life of farmers

As the global population continues to grow, experts estimate that the current population of over eight billion will reach nine billion by 2050. Consequently, the role of farmers will be crucial in cultivating crops and producing sufficient agricultural output to meet the needs of the increasing population.

Disasters related to climatic conditions are occurring with increasing frequency around the world. Among the affected sectors, agriculture is the most vulnerable to the adverse impacts of natural disasters. According to records, over 11,000 extreme climate events and flash floods occurred globally between 1970 and 2019, resulting in losses and damage affecting more than two million people and amounting to US\$3.64 trillion.

The World Meteorological Organization has reported that droughts, storms, floods, and extreme heat rank among the top ten worst natural disasters. Whenever such disasters occur, the affected areas inevitably suffer extensive loss and damage. Therefore, it is crucial for everyone to consider how best to mitigate the harm to lives, property, and the long-term consequences of these adverse impacts.

According to the Global Climate Risk Index 2018, Japan, the Philippines, and Germany were the countries and territories most affected by weather-related loss events in that year. For the period from 1999 to 2018, Puerto Rico, Myanmar, and Haiti ranked highest in terms of cumulative impact. Therefore, it is important to prioritize and strengthen the agricultural sector in Myanmar, given its vulnerability to climate-related events.

Around 50 per cent of domestic workers are employed in the agricultural sector, which supports approximately 70 per cent of the rural population. Although Myanmar currently has food security, internal instability, climate change, natural disasters, labour shortages, poverty, and low incomes continue to impact the socioeconomic conditions of farmers.

The government is striving to enhance the lives of farmers, develop the agricultural production system, and produce agricultural and livestock products that can compete internationally. It also aims to increase farmers' incomes and improve the socioeconomic well-being of rural communities. Now is the time to accelerate efforts to improve the socioeconomic conditions of farmers, develop the agriculture sector, and ensure food security.

As the agriculture sector contributes 30 per cent of the nation's Gross Domestic Product, improving the lives of farmers is essential. The socioeconomic conditions of farmers will only improve when the government and relevant authorities address key issues such as the high cost of agricultural inputs, insufficient water supply, low crop prices, and burdensome loans.

Advanced Learners' Independent Study

To think about it candidly, everybody is a permanent learner. We will have been learning until our last time. Students and teachers are included in a type of lifelong learning process. In such lifelong learning, learners, especially students, should practice independent study. What is independent study, then?

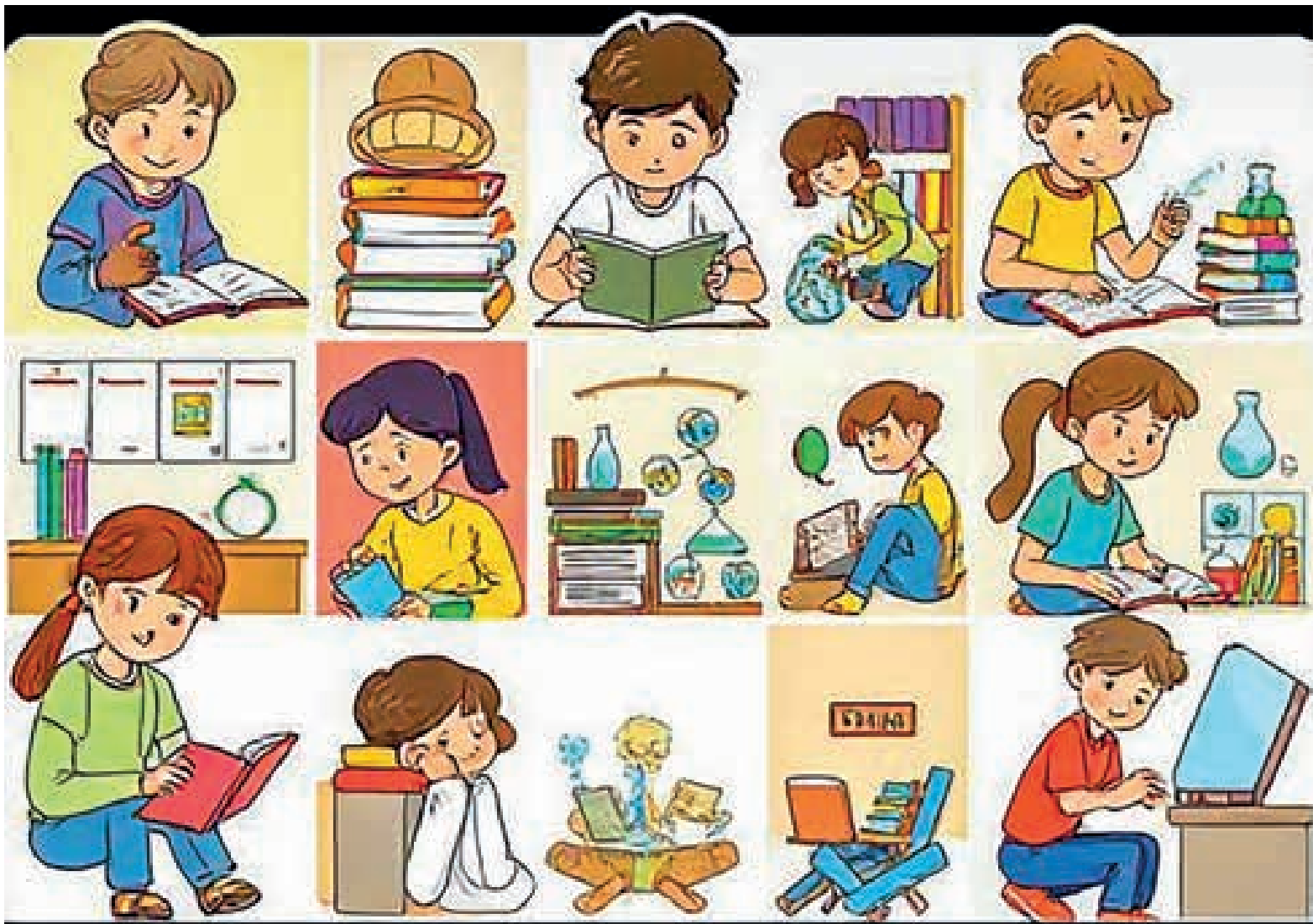
Of course, independent study is any kind of school-related assignment where students do more or less alone, mainly guided by information-processing and behaviouristic theories. For example, reading, writing a composition, rehearsing words for a spelling test and preparing a report are independent study. By the time students are thought to be 'working', teachers often envision them engaged in some kind of independent study or practice assignment. The purposes of independent study are to provide rehearsal or practice, to give opportunities to know how

to learn, to occupy students legitimately so that the teacher can perform other important tasks, and finally to foster continuous learning.

The characteristics of independent study include the type of teacher prescribed or student chosen, the teacher's role or the availability of the teacher to guide, and the context in school or at home. Good independent study learners believe that the purposes of independent study are valuable because they have confidence in students' ability to work alone and are able to demonstrate valence and challenge arousal or the ability to engender students with curiosity or enthusiasm and get them involved in the independent work, variety and challenge or the ability to identify and set independent study assignments that vary enough to be interesting and are challenging enough to maintain attention, wittiness or the ability to communicate to learners that

we know what they are doing even when we are not nearby or looking at them, which refers to the teachers who seem to have eyes in the back of their heads and wittiness is a kind of sixth sense, and overlapping, which means the teacher's ability to attend to more than one thing at a time and in a sense, it is akin to being a juggler.

Good independent study consists of three parts: preparation, delivery, and closure. The first part requires the teacher 1) to establish the general purpose and specific objectives, 2) to settle on the assignment's nature and type, and 3) to ensure that the assignment is within learners' interest and ability. The second part demands 1) students' attention, 2) the teacher absolutely clearly regarding the assignment's purpose and objective, 3) relating assignments to what has and will be learned, 4) making certain that they may get help and what to do if they finish early,



5) moving about to monitor and interact with learners, and 6) diagnosing students' progress and providing assistance when needed. The third part makes the teacher collect, assess and evaluate the work, giving learners

specific feedback and re-teaching when necessary.

Independent study is particularly beneficial to teachers who have strong needs for affiliation, recognition, play, and autonomy. It also helps teach-

ers to meet job-related needs for affiliation, control, student success, and time management. Furthermore, it is advantageous when the intention is that students either rehearse information or practise skills and when

they need to know how to learn. This study is too advantageous for students who have strong needs for achievement, autonomy, cognisance, construction, orderliness, and recognition. And it is beneficial when students feel

that independent study will help them achieve mastery or independence. However, the greatest drawback to independent study is not with the technique itself but with its intentions, conduct and assessment. If the intentions of this study are not clear or reasonable, students may resist the assignment or exert minimal effort. Not only that, when learners do perceive the task as meeting some need or having value, they will not honour it. In terms of conducting an independent study, it must be forewarned that the teacher had better monitor the study, provide feedback and help students see that the assignment is as valuable as other work.

So, when should independent study be used? Independent study ought to be used when learners need to rehearse or practice information or a skill to get it into long-term memory and when learners need to know how to learn independently. If students are assisted in knowing how to learn, they will no longer need schools or teachers. In other words, they are empowered by independent study. Many teachers are given to using this practice to keep students legitimately occupied so that they can work with other students in reading or math groups. Indeed, its sole intention is to keep students occupied.

Global aid pours into Myanmar as quake toll hits 3,795

AS of 8 May, 3,795 people died, 5,104 were injured, and 86 remain missing in six regions and states of Myanmar that were severely affected by the powerful earthquake that struck on 28 March.

Search and rescue teams from the Myanmar Fire Brigade, along with local and international rescue organizations, have been carrying out emergency operations in the affected areas without delay. So far, 653 people have been rescued alive from collapsed buildings, and the bodies of 797 deceased persons have been recovered.

Both local donors and philanthropic individuals have been providing financial aid and relief supplies to those affected by the disaster. Similarly, foreign governments, international organizations, and charitable donors have been offering monetary and material assistance.

Between 5 pm on 7 May and 5 pm on 8 May, various forms of international assistance arrived at Yangon International Airport. Instant noodles weighing 0.4 tonne donated by Lotus Charity Society through the Singapore Embassy to Myanmar, mosquito nets and ready-made meal boxes weighing 0.94 tonne provided by the Buddhist Tuchi Charitable Foundation based in Chinese (Taipei), and instant noodles and clothing weighing 0.494 tonne from Kri Sakthi Nyanaethira Kanimadam Yogi Ramsuratkumar Shiramam and Persatuan Renganut Devi Shri Karumariamman Temple through the Myanmar Embassy to Malaysia.

These relief items will swiftly be distributed to the affected communities to ensure timely support. — MNA/MKKS

82 Ethiopian nationals deported for involvement in telecom fraud

THE Government has continued its collaborative efforts with international bodies and neighbouring countries to eradicate telecom fraud and related crimes. As part of these actions, 82 Ethiopian nationals, who were illegally residing in Myanmar via border routes and involved in online gambling, telecom scams and other criminal activities in areas such as Myawady, Shwe Kokko, KK Park, and Kyaukkhat, have been deported through Thailand to their home countries.

This deportation was carried out on humanitarian grounds and in the spirit of friendly international relations, in full compliance with legal procedures.

To ensure smooth and systematic deportation, Kayin State Social Affairs Minister U Saw Htun Aung met departmental officials yesterday morning. He instructed them to verify the accuracy and completeness of documentation and data related to the deportation.

The official deportation ceremony was attended by Minister

U Saw Htun Aung, relevant officials, and Second Secretary Mr Wendwosen Melkamu from the Embassy of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia to India. Necessary documents were formally handed over to the receiving country's representatives.

From 30 January to 8 May 2025, a total of 9,059 foreign nationals who had entered Myanmar illegally were identified and detained. Among them, 7,795 individuals have already been deported via Thailand under the law, while the remaining 1,264 are ready for deportation and are currently held under proper care.

The Myanmar government reiterated its commitment to taking strong and effective action against foreign nationals involved in online scam centres and those orchestrating such networks from behind the scenes. It also pledged to actively cooperate in swiftly repatriating foreigners facing difficulties or those who have become victims of human trafficking. — MNA/KZL

Local, foreign experts conduct joint Mandalay building inspection

ENGINEERS from the Mandalay Region Construction Entrepreneurs Association (MCEF) and Engineering Ministries International (EMI) jointly inspected the strength of residential and public buildings in Mandalay, according to the association.

ing evaluations of their homes' structural strength.

Similarly, on 1 May, a team of construction experts, including officials from the Myanmar Engineering Federation and foreign construction specialists, inspected the main building of Mandalay University, which was damaged by the Mandalay earthquake, to initiate repair and reconstruction work. — ASH/TH

CBM pumps US\$710,000 into financial market on 7 May

THE Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) sold US\$710,000 on 7 May again.

CBM announced on 6 May that it would sell US\$33 million and 200 million baht to those engaged in the fuel oil industry. CBM sold 397,843 yuan on that day.

CBM injected over \$42 million, over 20 million baht and 500,000 yuan in April,

over \$126 million, 320 million baht and 3.6 million yuan in March, over \$88 million, 7.5 million yuan and 161 million baht in February and over \$124 million, over 13.8 million baht and over 4.8 million yuan in January. CBM aims to curb the instability in the foreign exchange market and currency devaluation. According to CBM's notification on 15 March, it has been collaborating with law enforcement agencies to combat and prosecute those who attempt to manipulate the currency market under the existing laws. CBM allowed authorized dealers (private banks) to operate online foreign exchange trading freely as per the market rate, depending on supply and demand, starting from 5 December 2023. — NN/KK

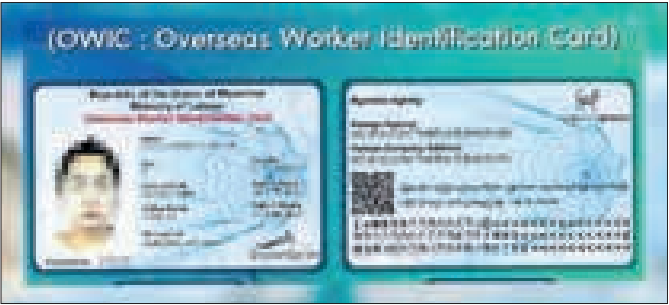

Incomplete OWIC applications: Official list published



Overseas Worker Identity Card (OWIC).

THE list of 59 overseas skilled workers on leave whose Overseas Worker Identity Card applications with incomplete documents was released on the Ministry of Labour's Safe Migration Telegram on 8 May.

Some were on vacation, and they would have to resubmit due to incomplete documents.

These incomplete applicant lists are being released daily on the Ministry's Telegram. As of 5 May, 192 workers will need to resubmit with complete documents. Among them, 29 were within the age limit, and cases include name discrepancies, visa requirements, expired work permits, COE requirements, lack of EC/DL, lack of airport entry/exit stamps, and the need for a leave letter.

Most of the cases were due to no visa and inability to check work permits. Currently, there are about 10,000 male and female workers who have signed EC contracts to work abroad and are waiting to obtain OWICs, according to licensed agencies.

Previously, applications for OWICs had been processed at the offices in North Dagon and 8-Mile Mayangone Township on the same day, but from 20 March 2025, its process has changed to send necessary documents by post to the Nay Pyi Taw Labour Office. — Htun Htun/ZN

S Korea returnees must note mandatory re-entry dates for safe migration

WORKERS who went to work in the Republic of Korea through the Public Overseas Employment Agency (POEA) and returned to the mother country on leave will have to wait until the date back to work at the Safe Migration under the Ministry of Labour.

A permit for leaving the country has been allowed on the waiting list corresponding to the date and time that they reported to the POEA.

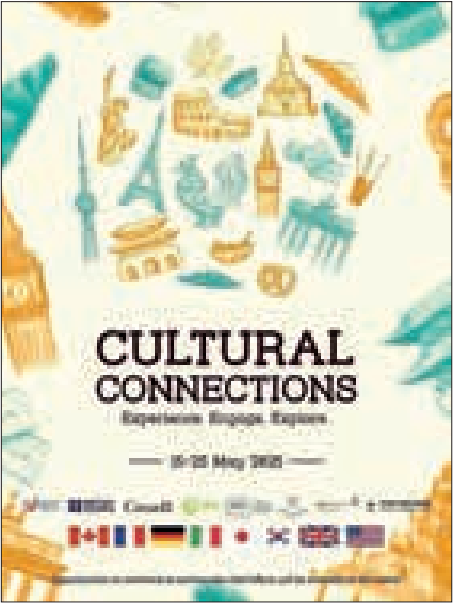

Emirates airline group announces record \$6.2 bln gross profit

DUBAI'S Emirates Group, which includes the Middle East's biggest airline, announced on Thursday gross annual profit of \$6.2 billion, its third record in three years.

The 18 per cent rise in profit, based on strong customer demand, slimmed to \$5.6 billion after the UAE's recently introduced corporate tax, which was applied for a full financial year for the first time.

"The Emirates Group has raised the bar to set new records for profit, revenue and cash assets," chairman Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum said in a statement.

The group invested \$3.8 billion in new aircraft, infrastructure and technology "to support its growth plans", the statement said.

Its workforce grew by nine per cent to an unprecedented 121,223 employees. — AFP

Swiss drugmaker to build new manufacturing facility in Shanghai

SWISS pharmaceutical giant Roche has announced plans to invest 2.04 billion yuan (about US\$283 million) in building a new biopharmaceutical manufacturing facility in Shanghai's Pudong New Area, strengthening its localization strategy in the Chinese market.

The new biologics manufacturing site, in Zhangjiang High-tech Park, will span approximately 35,300 square metres. It will specialize in producing Vabysmo, a bispecific antibody approved for treating eye diseases, in response to the growing demand for innovative medicines in China.

The facility is expected to be completed in 2029 and slated to officially begin operations in 2031. According to the company, this investment will strengthen its entire pharmaceutical value chain in China by enhancing its supply chain and local manufacturing presence. — Xinhua

Spurs star Maddison ruled out for rest of season

TOTTENHAM boss Ange Postecoglou confirmed James Maddison will miss the rest of the season ahead of Thursday's crucial Europa League semifinal showdown with Bodo/Glimt.

Maddison suffered a knee injury after scoring in last week's 3-1 first-leg win against the Norwegian club.

After undergoing tests on the problem, the England international has discovered he will not feature again this term.

The 28-year-old's absence is another setback in an injury-plagued campaign for the Premier League club.

Postecoglou is already without captain Son Heung-min due to a foot issue, although England striker Dominic Solanke has been declared fit for the second leg in Norway.

"Madders tweaked his knee in the first leg so he is out and will miss the rest of this season," Postecoglou told reporters on Wednesday.

"Yeah, disappointing for him because he's been a big part of this latter part of the season for us, particularly in Europe.

"He misses out but it has always been a constant of this season. Everyone else from the first leg travelled and is ready to go. — AFP

Olympics: Bach welcomes future Japan bid after Sapporo withdrawal

OUTGOING International Olympic Committee President Thomas Bach said Thursday that Japan is "very much welcome" to bid for another Summer or Winter Games, once issues such as corruption surrounding the staging of past events are addressed.

Sapporo dropped its bid for the 2030 Winter Games in October 2023 following bid-rigging and bribery scandals linked to the 2020 Tokyo Games, which were postponed by a year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, with the northern city subsequently unable to convince a skeptical public of the bid's merits.

"(A future hosting bid is welcome) if we can be sure on the IOC side that these Japanese business practices, this kind of corruption, is over and has been addressed," Bach, who will become the IOC's honorary president for life in June, said in an interview with Kyodo News.

"We understand what happened there within Japan because of the business practices of some Japanese business people...We also hope that this leads to a clarification and adaptation of Japanese business practices."

Bach said Japan remains a major presence in the Olympic movement, noting its continued role as host of various

international tournaments across sports, including the Asian Games next year, as well as the success of its athletes, who won its overseas record of 20 gold medals and 45 overall at the Paris Games last summer. — Kyodo

Swiatek makes fast start at Italian Open

IGA Swiatek dismissed Elisabetta Cocciaretto in just 52 minutes as she opened her account at the Italian Open on Thursday.

World number two Swiatek came to Italy on the back of a demoralising straight-sets defeat to Coco Gauff in the semifinals of the Madrid Open.

But the 23-year-old Pole dropped just a single game in winning 6-1, 6-0

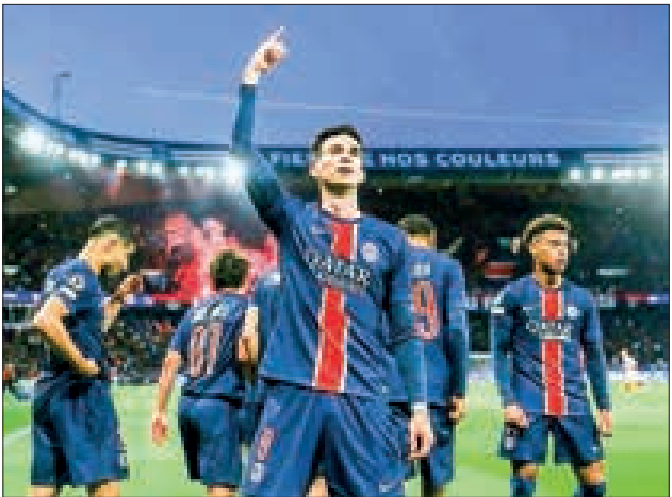
against Italian Cocciaretto to move onto a third-round meeting with either American Danielle Collins or Elena-Gabriela Ruse of Romania.

Swiatek is a three-time winner of the Italian Open and is using the claycourt tournament as a key step towards her defence of her French Open title, but she is yet to win a tournament this season.

In another second-round match, former world number one Naomi Osaka beat Swiss player Viktorija Golubic 2-6, 7-5, 6-1.

World number one Jannik Sinner will make his return to competition after a three-month doping ban by facing Mariano Navone on Saturday after the Argentinian beat Federico Cina 6-3, 6-3 on Thursday. — AFP

PSG finish off Arsenal to reach Champions League final

PARIS Saint-Germain booked their spot in the Champions League final with a 2-1 victory over Arsenal on Wednesday, sealing a 3-1 aggregate win thanks to goals from Fabian Ruiz and Achraf Hakimi in a pulsating night at the Parc des Princes.

Paris Saint-Germain clinched a place in the Champions League final as goals by Fabian Ruiz and Achraf Hakimi gave them a 2-1 win over Arsenal in the second leg of their last-four tie on Wednesday, securing a 3-1 aggregate triumph.

Ruiz crashed in a shot from the edge of the area in 27 minutes at the Parc des Princes after PSG had withstood an early bombardment from the visitors.

Already leading in the tie after Ousmane Dembele's goal in last week's first leg, PSG then saw Vitinha have a second-half penalty saved.

However, Hakimi put the tie beyond Arsenal when he scored in 72 minutes, even if Bukayo Saka did then pull one back for the visitors. — AFP



Xi urges safeguarding legacy of WWII victory

Xi emphasized that China and Russia will collaborate to safeguard the outcomes of WWII and oppose hegemonism, promoting a UN-centred international system.

CHINESE President Xi Jinping on Wednesday called for concerted efforts to defend the legacy of World War II (WWII) victory as the world is once again reeling from the specter of hegemonism and power politics.

Xi made the call as he arrived in Moscow for a state visit to Russia and celebrations marking the 80th anniversary of the victory in the Soviet Union's Great Patriotic War.

In a written statement issued upon arrival, Xi said China and Russia will work together to safeguard the victorious outcome of WWII, and resolutely oppose hegemonism and power politics.

China and Russia, both major countries of the world and permanent members of the UN Security Council, will join hands to firmly safeguard the UN-centred international system and the international order underpinned by international law, practise true multilateralism, and promote the building of a more just and equitable global governance system, he said.

Xi's visit comes at the invitation of Russian President Vladimir Putin. This marks his 11th visit to Russia since he became the president of China.

During his stay, Xi is expected to have in-depth communication with Putin on bilateral relations and cooperation, as well as major international and regional issues of common concern.

According to China's Foreign Ministry, Xi's attendance at the celebrations marking the 80th anniversary of the victory in the Soviet Union's Great Patriotic War is an important part of his visit. It will be Xi's second time attending Russia's 9 May Victory Day commemorations as Chinese president.

A massive military parade will take place in Moscow's Red Square on Friday.

Flags with the word "Victory" fluttered in the wind along the streets of Moscow, and the roads were lined with billboards and decorative windows depicting the history of the Great Patriotic War of the Soviet Union.

On the night of 8 May 1945, Germany signed the surrender document in Karlshorst, Berlin, marking the end of WWII in Europe. However, due to the

time difference, Moscow had already entered 9 May — the date the Soviet Union, and later Russia, commemorates as "Victory Day".

Meanwhile in Asia, China's final major campaign against Japan — the Battle of Western Hunan — reached its decisive phase. Japan's surrender aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay on 2 September 1945, brought WWII to an end. — Xinhua

India neutralizes Pakistani drone, missile attacks; targets air defence systems

AFTER India executed Operation Sindoor in which nine terror sites deep inside Pakistan were destroyed, Pakistan attempted to engage a number of military targets on the night of 7 May.

The military targets were engaged in Northern and Western India, including Awantipura, Srinagar, Jammu, Pathankot, Amritsar, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Adampur, Bhatinda, Chandigarh, Nal,

Phalodi, Uttarlai, and Bhuj, using drones and missiles.

These were neutralized by the Integrated Counter UAS Grid and Air Defence systems.

Indian Air Force S-400 Sudarshan Chakra air defence missile systems were fired last night against targets moving towards India. On Thursday morning Indian Armed Forces targeted Air Defence Radars and systems at a number of locations in Pakistan. — ANI

Sweden's King Gustaf to visit to Japan from Tuesday to attend Expo

SWEDEN'S King Carl XVI Gustaf will make a four-day visit to Japan starting Tuesday to attend the World Exposition in Osaka, the Japanese government said Thursday.
