Minister for Electric Power No 2 inspects paddy husk-fired generator and gas engine factory, Yangon concrete lamppost factory

Yangon, 5 July — Minister for Electric Power No 2 Maj-Gen Khin Maung Myint and officials arrived at paddy husk-fired generator and gas engine factory of Myanmar Inventors Cooperative Ltd in Hlinethaya Industrial Zone on 3 July.

Chairman of the Cooperative Ltd U Soe Tint Aung reported on production process of paddy huskfired generators and arrangements for environmental conservation.

The minister and party viewed machines manufactured at the factory.

At Hlinethaya Township Electrical Engineer's Office, the minister heard reports on supply of power through six power lines and use of transformers at industrial zones by officials.

Secretary of Yangon City Electric Power Supply Board U Maung Maung Latt and Managing Director U Tin Aung of Electric Power Supply Enterprise gave supplementary reports.

At Yangon Concrete Lamppost Factory, Factory Manager U Min Thaw and Manager of Marga Concrete Lamp-post Factory U Toe Hlaing reported on endurance of the concrete lamp-posts against natural disasters.

They proceeded to the office of South Okkalapa Township Electric Power Supply Board at the corner of Parami and Thumingala Roads, Township Officer U Soe Kyaw Aung reported to the minister on supply of electricity and condition of power lines.

After hearing the reports, the minister stressed the need for meter readers to discharge their duties conscientiously and he urged officials to supply electricity to respective areas on schedule. — MNA

Heathrow terminal evacuated after suspect bag found

London, 5 July — Terminal 4 at London's Heathrow Airport was evacuated on Tuesday after a suspicious package was found, passengers said.

Officials at the airport confirmed a suspect bag had been found and said all passengers were now being searched.

"In response to a suspect bag in Terminal 4, secondary searches are now being carried out on departing passengers," BAA, which manages the airport, said in a statement.

A Reuters witness at

the airport said the whole of the departure area of Terminal 4 had been evacuated and passengers were being told to go to the arrivals section.

"Several thousand people are now out in the car park and security staff are saying that all baggage is going to have to go

through checks again," a passenger said.

After about two hours airport authorities began letting people back into the terminal but continued to carry out body searches.

"It looks like they are looking for someone," an eyewitness told Reuters.

UK bomb suspect, another doctor, seized in Australia

CANBERRA, 4 July—An eighth man — another doctor-suspected of links to the suspected al-Qaeda plot to detonate car bombs in London and Scotland was detained in the Australian city of

Hospital colleagues as a "model citizen", was seized by counter-terrorism police at Brisbane Airport late on Monday as he was trying to leave the country, Queensland State Premier Peter Beattie said.

"We understand that the man that had been detained at the airport last night has some connections to the incidents in the UK," he told reporters.

A second man who was employed at the same hospital south of Brisbane, was being questioned,

although he was not linked to the bomb plot, Beattie

In the four days since two car bombs loaded with fuel, gas canisters and nails were found in central London, seven suspects have been arrested in Britain, including at least two doctors.

The nationalities of the two men were not disclosed.

Beattie said the 27year-old had trained as a doctor in India. He was recruited to Australia from Liverpool, England, in 2006 through an advertisement in the British Medical Journal and started work there as an emergency registrar last September.

One of the seven held in Britain was detained in Liverpool.

Hamas, Jihad attack Israel with mortars, rockets

GAZA, 4 July—Both the armed wings of Hamas and Islamic Jihad (Holy War) movements claimed responsibility on Tuesday for firing mortars and homemade rockets from Gaza into Israel.

Izz el-Deen al-Qassam Brigades, Hamas' armed wing, said in a statement that its militants fired four mortar shells at Israeli Army posts stationed on the borders between northern Gaza Strip and Israel.

Saraya al-Quds, Jihad armed wing, said in two separate Press statements that its militants fired three mortar shells at Israeli Army posts to the east and south of the Gaza Strip. The group said it militants fired three mortars at an Israeli Army post, which was used to fire tank shells at central and northern Gaza Strip.

It added that another group of militants had also fired a Russian-made *Grad* missile at the Kerem Shalom border crossing on the borders between Israel and Egypt. Saraya al-Quds said attacks on the Kerem Shalom crossing were aimed to foil the Israeli plan to operate it while keeping close the Rafah crossing on the borders between the Gaza Strip and Egypt.

Two journalists killed in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 5 July — Two Iraqi journalists working for a Sunni television network were kidnapped and killed separately last month, an international media watchdog reported on Wednesday.

The victims were | internet. Mohammed Hilal Karji and Sarmad Hamdi al-Hassani, both working for Baghdad TV which was owned by the Iraqi Islamic Party, headed by Vice President Tariq al-Hashimi, the Reporters Without Borders said in its report posted on the

Karji, was kidnapped outside his home as he was leaving to work on 8 June. His body was found in the morgue next day, the watchdog said.

Sarmad Hamdi al-Hassani, 43, was kidnapped in Baghdad's western neighbourhood of Jami'a on 27 June. His body was also found in the morgue the next day, it added.

Baghdad TV channel in western Baghdad has been a favoured target for insurgents in the past few months, in which several workers were killed or wounded.

The attacks had forced the channel to move to Sulaimaniyah Province in Iraq's northern Kurdish region.

NASA finds hydrocarbons on Saturn's moon Hyperion

Washington, 4 July —NASA's Cassini spacecraft has revealed for the first time surface details of Saturn's moon Hyperion, including cuplike craters filled with hydrocarbons that may indicate more widespread presence in our solar system of basic chemicals necessary for life.

Hyperion yielded some of its secrets to the battery of instruments aboard Cassini as the spacecraft flew close by in September 2005. Water

and carbon dioxide ices were found, as well as dark material that fits the spectral profile hydrocarbons. A paper appearing in

the 5 July issue of Nature reports details of Hyperion's surface craters and composition observed during this flyby, including keys to understanding the moon's origin and evolution over 4.5 billion years. This is the first time scientists were able to map the surface material on Hyperion.

"Of special interest is the presence on Hyperion of hydrocarbons combinations of carbon and hydrogen atoms that are found in comets, meteorites, and the dust in our galaxy," said Dale Cruikshank, NASA's planetary scientist, and the paper's lead author.

WWF says Russia gas field noise harms whales

July — Noise from a Russian gas field in the Pacific Ocean is driving the endangered grey whale away from one of its few feeding grounds, says the WWF environmental group.

The grey whale is one of the largest and oldest mammals on earth—it can grow larger than a city bus and the species is thought to be 30 million years old.

But environmen-talists say there are only 100 grey whales left off the Asian Pacific coast, with another 300 off the North American coast.

Now construction work at a Russian gas project is forcing them away from their natural habitat.

"I feel that a huge construction bulldozer is

SAKHALIN (Russia), 4 working near my tent. I feel the vibration and hear the low, hollow rumble," said Natalia Illarionova, who monitors the whales from a camp on the island of Sakhalin for the WWF.

She said the whales were disappearing from the area she monitoring because of the noise, putting more pressure on other feeding grounds.—MNA/Reuters

School bombing in Thai south wounds five policemen

BANGKOK, 4 July — A bombing at a school wounded five police officers in Thailand's far southern province of Narathiwat Tuesday morning, media here reported.

A remote-controlled bomb hidden in the ceiling of a teacher's room at the Bannamwon school in Narathiwat's Chanae District exploded, wounding five policemen guarding the school, according to Thai News Agency.

The school was closed immediately after the incident.

Schools and teachers have been frequently targeted in violent attacks that have been taking place on daily basis in Thailand's three southernmost provinces — Narathiwat, Pattani and Yala, where insurgent violence has prevailed in more than three years and claimed over 2,300 lives.

Thailand unaffected by strict US rules on tuna imports

Bangkok, 4 July — The strict American rule imposed on tuna imports will not negatively affect Thai tuna exporters as Thailand still maintains more than half the world's tuna export, Thira Sutabutr, Agriculture and Cooperatives Minister said Monday.


After meeting US congressman Eni Faleomavaega, Thira said Washington focused on food safety standards and harmful residues in food such as mercury

contamination.

Thailand affirmed to the American authorities that food safety is part of Thailand's national agenda, including agricultural products to be exported to the US which are certified by food standards agencies both to boost confidence among consumers and competitiveness in the world market.

Thailand is the world's largest canned tuna exporter, with over 50 per cent of total market share. The country earns 600 million US dollars annually. In 2006, Thai tuna exports to the US were recorded at 106,297 tons, worth 287.9 million US dollars.

During the past five years, the US imported most of its tuna products from Thailand. However, the US tuna imports slowed in the past three years because health conscious consumers were afraid of mercury residue in canned products.—MNA/Xinhua

Foreign automobile brands penetrate French car market

Paris, 4 July — Foreign automobile manufacturers sustained their assault on the French car market, whose new car sales continued to fall in June with a new twofigure decline registered by the French auto-maker Renault, according to figures published on Tuesday by the French Automobile Manufacturers Committee (CCFA).

In June 2007, brand new car market registered a drop of 3.2 per cent compared with the same period in 2006. Foreign brands progressed by 3.2 per cent, while the French ones had an overall decline of 8 per cent.

Car sales by the Renault group stood at

13.5 per cent in June, while its flagship Renault brand recorded a decline of 15

PSA Peugeot Citroen group lost 1.4 per cent in June, after having registered an impressive recovery of 4.5 per cent in May. Over the first six months of the current year, sales of foreign vehicles progressed by 2.7 per cent

Venezuela gives MERCOSUR three months to approve membership

CARACAS, 4 July— Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez said on Tuesday that the Common Market of the South (MERCOSUR) must approve Venezuela's membership in three months or he will withdraw nation's application.

Speaking to government he said Venezuela is keen to join, if changes can be made to the elites and business groups operating within it.

MERCOSUR created in the heart of neoliberalism and ended up becoming one more way for elites and businesses to come together. The people's integration has been relegated to bottom priority," Chavez said.

"Until now there does not seem to have been a real willingness to make changes in MERCOSUR'S structure, and because of this, Venezueladoes not rule out abandoning one model of integration, which is not real integration," he said.

Venezuela was allowed in 2006, as a member with a voice, but without a vote, until the nation could agree on the adoption of a common external tariff, and the opening of its markets.

Argentina and Uruguay's legislatures have already accepted Venezuelaas amember, but Brazil and Paraguay have yet to do

"A year has passed since we signed the protocol of adhesion and right now there is no ideological, political, economic or any other reason that prevents us from being part of MERCOSUR," Chavez said. Chavez said that he did not rule out Venezuela's return to the Andean Community of Nations (CAN) even though he had withdrawn the nation from the bloc in April, 2006.

S Korea, Vietnam to cooperate commercial N-reactors

SEOUL, 4 July—South Korea and Vietnam agreed on establishing a joint committee to push forward the building of commercial nuclear reactors in Vietnam, South Korea's Yonhap news agency reported on Tues-

The agreement was reached at a meeting between Minister of Commerce, Industry and Energy Kim Young-ju and his Vietnamese coun-

terparts in Hanoi, the report said. The two sides also concurred on a plan for South Korea to provide nuclear policy training for Vietnamese experts this year, and to carry out joint research that can help Vietnam build parts for nuclear-related facilities, it

The bilateral committee will hold its first meeting in the later part of this year, in a follow-up to the nuclear cooperation memorandum of understanding(MoU)signed in 2006, the report said. In addition to the nuclear cooperation scheme, Seoul and Hanoi signed MoUs to expand ties in export insurance, industrial technology exchange, energy and agriculture, the report said.

Pakistan denies change in nuclear scientist's status

Islamabad, July 4 — Pakistan on Monday rejected a media report that restrictions on the country's nuclear scientist Dr Abdul Qadeer Khan had been eased.

"There is no change in his status, (and) he continues to live a quiet life with his family," Foreign Office spokesperson Tasnim Aslam told a weekly media briefing.

She was commenting on a media report quoting the US State Department that AO Khan network had completely vanished and that the Pakistan Government had eased restrictions on Dr Khan.

Seven bomb makers nabbed in Thai Muslim south

BANGKOK, 4 July—Thai police said on Tuesday they have arrested seven "top bomb makers" in the rebellious Muslim far south and charged them with terrorism."This raid has saved a lot of innocent people's lives," said Army spokesman Colonel Atthadej Mathanom after a joint police and Army raid on a religious boarding school.

Police said the men, aged between 16 and 34, were "top bomb makers" responsible for attacks on infrastructure and troops in Narathiwat, one of three provinces where more than 2,300 people have been killed in three years of separatist insurgency.

Five of the seven were on the wanted list, southern police chief Lieutenant-General Jetnakorn Naphitabhata told *Reuters* by telephone.

The raid, involving 200 police and soldiers who took two hours to get through a cordon of 700 students around the school on Monday, found gunpowder, wrist watches, batteries, mobile phones and a gas tank, the likes of which are often used in bombs, police said.

The raid followed a report by a villager who found blood stains and shrapnel at his rubber plantation near the school after an overnight explosion, Atthadej said. MNA/Reuters

France suspects H5N1 bird flu virus in swans

Paris, 4 July—Three swans found dead in eastern France may have been killed by the deadly H5N1 bird flu virus, the French Agriculture Ministry said on Tuesday.

"The first results show a suspicion of bird flu. These tests are in the process of being confirmed at the reference laboratory of the French food safety agency AFSSA (...) to determine whether it was the highly pathogenic H5N1 strain," the ministry said in a

planning her first Chinese mainland statement.

It had already put protection measures in place in the surrounding area and the results of the tests were expected by Thursday, it said.

France, Europe's biggest poultry producer, had increased precautions against bird flu in June, saying the risk of the disease hitting the country had gone up after it was found in a number of wild birds in Germany.

The disease was also found in the Czech Republic last month.

Last year, some 13 European Union member states had confirmed cases of bird flu — Germany, Austria, Denmark, Italy, Greece, Britain, the Czech Republic, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, France and Hungary.—MNA/Reuters

US helicopter crashes south of Baghdad, two pilots rescued

BAGHDAD, 4 July—A US helicopter crashed in an area south of Baghdad after attacked by enemy fire on Monday, two pilots on board survived the attack, the US military said on Tuesday.

The two pilots received minor injuries in the crash and were rescued by another AH-64 Apache helicopter after "enemy fire brought down their OH-58D Kiowa attack helicopter south of Baghdad", the US military said briefly in a statement.

After evacuation of the two pilots, a US warplane dropped two large laser-guided bombs to destroyed the crashed helicopter, said the statement.

The exact location of the crash was not given out by the statement, which only said the investigation into the incident is underway.— MNA/Xinhua

12 killed, dozens injured in Egypt tour bus crash

Ismailia (Egypt), 4 July —At least 12 Egyptians were killed and 58 others injured when a tour bus collided with a bus carrying labourers on a highway near the Red Sea resort of Sharm el-Sheikh on Tuesday, a medical source said.

The buses crashed head-on along a dangerous bend in the Sinai Peninsula, the source said.

Reckless driving, lax traffic rules and poor road conditions cause many road crashes in Egypt. A series of road and rail accidents in the past few years triggered a public outcry over the government's handling of road and transport safety.

Car bomb kills at least 16 in Baghdad's market

Baghdad, 4 July—At least 16 people were killed and 35 other injured when a car bomb exploded in a popular market in northeastern Baghdad Tuesday evening, a police source told Xinhua.

"A car bomb ripped through a busy market in Shaab District in northeastern Baghdad, killing at least 16 people and wounding 35 others," the source said on condition of anonymity, without giving more details.

Earlier Tuesday, two people were killed and 10 others injured in a car bomb attack targeted police patrol in Kirkuk City, north of Baghdad, local police source said. — MNA/Xinhua



accord, contribute their voluntary services to all kinds of occasions, social and funeral, held in their wards and villages. By nature, they lead a peaceful life and remain unperturbed until their wards, villages and homes are harmed by others.

However, when their wards and villages are harmed and insulted, and stability and peace of their wards and villages come under threats, they protect and safeguard their communities with a sense of duty without being urged to do so by any other person.

These were evidenced by the fact that in the 1988 unrest when the entire nation saw mass demonstrations and internal and external subversive elements were attempting to break up the nation, young men set up fences and gates of the ward and street concerned for

One of the fine traditions exercised in the rural areas is that if a young man of a village wants to propose a young woman of other village, he has to approach the female or male chaperone of the village where the woman lives. And he is allowed to court the

woman who he falls in love with only through the approval of the chaperone. If the chaperone concerned considers the man of other village to be an unreliable one, the man is not bestowed with any opportunities to court the lady. And if a man from other village courts a lady of their village without having sought the trust and approval of the chaperon, the young men of the village where the lady lives would hurt and drive out such a man. Let alone a person of other village, local people ostracize a person of the village of their own who tries to harm community peace and tranquillity in collusion with some people of other village. If he has gone too far, he will be driven out of the village.

In accordance with the above-mentioned attitude and traditions of Myanmar people, ward or village dwellers prevent anyone who attempts to jeopardize stability and peace of their ward or village, and hand him over to the administrative body concerned.

Those who gathered a crowd and tried to incite a protest would face punitive action if they were charged for their acts in accordance with the law. However, the

government showed its benevolent attitude towards them and gave educative talks and let them go home.

The government after educating the perpetrators who tried to jeopardize peace and stability released them with goodwill. The people who appreciate government's goodwill and have witnessed or heard about the release of the perpetrators are saying that they (the perpetrators) who tried to put at risk of peace and stability are unemployed persons leading an easy life; that they after coming from different wards and regions gathered to heedlessly endanger national peace and stability under the deception and agitation of saboteurs; that actually, the government should have takeen severe action against them, but it acting like the parent has shown much patience, tolerance, understanding, forgiveness and released them; that if those perpetrators misuse the government's understanding and mercy towards them and intrude into wards again with sinister aims, the people will not tolerate such acts to jeopardize ward peace and stability, but will give them a telling lesson.

Al Gore's son busted for drugs in hybrid car

Los Angeles, 5 July — The 24-year-old son of former vice-president Al Gore was arrested for drug possession on Wednesday after he was stopped for allegedly speeding in his hybrid Toyota Prius, a sheriff's official said.

Al Gore III — whose father is a leading advocate of policies to fight global warming — was driving his environmentally friendly car at about 100 miles (160 kilometres) per hour on a freeway south of Los Angeles when he was pulled over by an Orange County sheriff's deputy at about 2:15 am.

A subsequent search yielded a small amount of marijuana, along with prescription drugs including Valium, Xanax, Vicodin and Adderall, said sheriff's spokesman Jim Amormino. There were no prescriptions found, he said.

Gore was arrested on suspicion of drug possession and booked into the Inmate Reception Centre in Santa Ana, about 34 miles (55 kilometres) south of Los Angeles, on 20,000 US dollars bail, he said.

It was not Gore's first brush with the law. He was arrested in 2003 for marijuana possession and in 2002 for suspected drunken-driving.

Gore was still in custody as of mid-morning and was sharing a holding cell with an unknown number of people, said Orange County Sheriff's spokesman Jim Amormino.

"There are no special privileges," he told *Reuters*. Gore cooperated with law enforcement as soon he was pulled over and quickly identified himself as the son of the former vice president, Amormino said.

A spokesman for the elder Gore said he was travelling and could not immediately be reached for comment. — MNA/Reuters

Russia says to respond if US snubs missile offer

Moscow, 5 July — Russia will take steps to ensure its security if Washington rebuffs its offer of cooperation on missile defence, local media quoted First Deputy Prime Minister Sergei Ivanov as saying on Wednesday.

"If our proposals are not accepted — and I cannot rule that out — Russia will continue to persistently and patiently explain its position on this issue," *ITAR-TASS* news agency quoted Ivanov as saying.

"But at the same time, we will take adequate measures to ensure security, we are already taking these measures, an asymmetrical and effective response has been found." Ivanov did not say what that response involved.

At a meeting with US President George W Bush this week, Russian President Vladimir Putin proposed an expanded plan for missile defence cooperation that would involve Russia and NATO sharing data about missile launches from "rogue states".

In an old neighbourhood of Behabad, the roofs of three houses collapsed and cracks appeared in the walls of dozens of buildings, a senior provincial official said. — MNA/Reuters



India, Pakistan agree to fight terrorism

New Delhi, 5 July — India and Pakistan agreed to take effective and sustained measures to combat terrorism and deal effectively with terrorists and criminals during the talks held between home secretaries of the two nations here, an Indian Government statement said here on Wednesday.

The statement said that during talks held on Tuesday, the two nations also agreed to enhance the cooperation between Indian Central Bureau of Intelligence and Pakistan's Federal Investigation Agency in the areas of human

trafficking, illegal immigration and counterfeit currency.

The talks were held in cordial atmosphere, the statement added.

Another issue that figured was that of fishermen. India and Pakistan agreed to release fishermen captured in each other's waters by 14-15 August this year.

On the issue of prisoners, the two sides said efforts would be made to reconcile the number and identities of prisoners in each other's jails.

Prisoners who have completed their sentences will also be released by both sides by 14-15 August.

Tornado kills 14, injures 146 in east China

Nanjing, 5 July — Altogether 14 people were killed and 146 others were injured in a tornado that hit two east China provinces on Tuesday, the local governments said.

Seven of the deaths were reported in Gaoyou, a city in Jiangsu Province, where the worst tornado in 50 years also injured 53 people in 11 villages and toppled 715 houses, the city government said on Wednesday.

It said 12 of the release. "High winds and

injured were in serious condition, and estimated the city's direct economic losses at around 55 million yuan (7.2 million US dollars).

"The tornado ravaged the Huxi areas of Gaoyou for about an hour," the government said in a Press release. "High winds and heavy rain cut off power and telecommunications, ripped roofs off buildings and uprooted thousands of trees."

Sixteen local companies were closed down after the tornado destroyed their workshops and equipment.

Russia says to blacklist some European airlines

Moscow, 4 July-Russia is to draw up a blacklist of European airlines it considers unsafe, an aviation official said on Tuesday, six days after the European Union imposed restrictions on ten Russian carriers on safety grounds.

The Russian blacklist was not intended as "revenge" on the EU but a response to serious safety problems detected in European aircraft, Gennady Loshenov, deputy head of Russia's state aviation agency, told reporters.

"Right now we are checking foreign carriers more intensively. Checks show that there are certain complaints, and serious complaints ... Among these are carriers from European countries."

"We need to create a so-called blacklist in which we will include those foreign carriers that have distinguished themselves the most," he said.

"These steps are not intended to take revenge on the European Union for halting our air companies." The EU's executive arm, the European Commission, on 28 June unveiled an updated blacklist of foreign carriers banned from flying in EU airspace.—*MNA/Reuters*



Malaysia introduces travel protection plan

Kuala Lumpur, 4 July The Malaysian Tourism Ministry said here on Monday that it has began to enforce the Basic Travel Protection Plan, requiring all licensed travel agents to offer travel insurance to their customers.

Malaysian Tourism Minister Adnan Tengku Mansor said the move was to ensure that all travellers, including inbound foreigners and outbound locals, are protected and covered by insurance.

The measure, which took effect from 1 July, advisably required travellers to take it up, but they also had the flexibility to refuse it, Adnan said.

Under the plan, travellers can expect a refund in such cases as that the participating travel and tour company is unable to render its services, due to abrupt business closure, Adnan said. Local media reported that the plan was endorsed by the ministry to ensure travellers to get the basic coverage and protection against travel risks.

It is managed via a joint venture between Timeless Vocation Sdn Bhd and Pempena Sdn Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Tourism Ministry, with Tahan Insurance Malaysia Bhd as the underwriter. Local or outbound travellers will need to pay 15 ringgit (4.3 US dollars premium for coverage while inbound travellers are required to pay 15 US dollars for which coverage is for the whole period of travel.

Study shows modified mushrooms may yield human drugs

Los Angeles, 4 July — Mushrooms could be used as "biofactories" for the production of various medicines beneficial to humans, a new study has shown.

This could be achieved by inserting new genes into mushrooms, said Charles Peter Romaine, professor of plant pathology at the Pennsylvania State University (PSU).

Romaine and his colleagues have developed a technique to genetically modify Agaricus bisporus — the button variety of mushroom, which is the predominant edible species worldwide.

One application of their technology is the use of mushrooms as factories for producing vaccines, antibodies, and hormones like insulin, as well as commercial enzymes, such as cellulose for biofuels.

"There has always been a recognized potential of the mushroom as being a choice platform for the mass production of commercially valuable proteins," Romaine said.

"Mushrooms could make the ideal vehicle for the manufacture of biopharmaceuticals to treat a broad array of human illnesses.

But nobody has been able to come up with a feasible way of doing that."


"Right now medical treatment exists for about 500 diseases and genetic disorders, but thanks to the human genome project, before long, new drugs will be available for thousands of other dis "We need a new way of massproducing protein-based drugs, which is economical, safe and fast. We believe mushrooms are going to be the platform of the future." Researchers point out that the process of producing biopharmaceuticals is potentially faster and cheaper with mushrooms than conventional technologies.

Unlike plants that have long growth cycles, "with mushrooms, we can use commercial technology to convert the vegetative tissue from mushroom strains stored in the freezer into vegetative seed. A crop from which drugs may be extracted could be ready in weeks", Romaine said.

A mushroom-based biofactory also would not require expensive infrastructure set up by major drug companies, he added.

The findings appeared Monday in EurekAlert, a website of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Hundreds of stolen relics found in Greece

ATHENS, 4 July — Greek police have found more than a thousand pieces of artefacts dating back to ancient Greece after raiding a suspect's house near the southern city of Corinth, police said on Tuesday.

A 58-year-old man, who was also found with a dozen of ancient and Byzantine period coins on his person, was arrested and will be charged with antiquities theft.

> "The suspect is

probably part of a wider group active in the Corinth area, as the artefacts seem to come from illegal digs in the region," police said.

"The confiscated artefacts are not very valuable as they are mostly small items, but all such activity is illegal."

Police confiscated more than 1,300 items including small ancient clay idols, urns, pottery shards and bronze rings, dating from between the 6th and 4th Century BC, police said.

A further raid on the suspect's house subsequently found excavation equipment and books detailing Mycenean and Classical antiques, police said.

Pair found alive after Cornwall sea cave rescue

London, 4 July — A lifeguard and a woman friend trapped in a sea cave in Cornwall for more than 10 hours were rescued after a major search, the Coast Guard said on Tuesday.

The pair were caught by rising tides on Monday as they explored the cave a few miles north of Newquay, the Maritime and Coast Guard Agency said.

A rescue helicopter, three lifeboats and two lifeguard jet-skis were sent out to search for the pair after the alarm was raised.

The lifeguard, from New Zealand, was pulled from the sea just before midnight after swimming in the darkness to the mouth of the cave where rescuers had been shining lights.

His companion was found at the back of the cave. She was taken by helicopter to hospital suffering from hypothermia.

"To hear of the successful recovery has been of great cheer to all the rescue units who have worked on this incident," said Ian Guy, Falmouth Coast Guard watch manager.

"We were very concerned for their safety given the rough conditions earlier yesterday afternoon."

UN calls for coordinated action on global warming

HAVANA,4 July — Director General of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Achim Steiner on Wednesday called for coordinated action to fight global warming.

"We should work as a family within the United Nations to tackle the technological and human challenges and fight climate change," he said.

He praised Cuba's **Environment Ministry for** its achievements in sustainable development and environmental education. Investment has been made in protected areas and measures have been set up to reduce the impact of

extreme weather phenomena in the country, he said.

Last Harry Potter book sets online pre-sale record

London, 4 July — The seventh and final book in JK Rowling's Harry Potter series has become online retailer Amazon's most pre-ordered product, with almost 1.6 million copies bought globally ahead of the book's release on 21 July.

Amazon said on Monday that demand for *Harry* Potter and the Deathly Hallows passed the previous record of 1.5 million copies ordered online before the release of the previous book in the series, *Harry Potter* and the Half-Blood Prince.

The retailer predicted that the number of orders for the seventh book would rise by "many more hundreds of thousands of copies".

The figures underline the huge international demand among readers for the final adventures of the boy wizard, which has been heightened by speculation over which characters Rowling will kill off at the end.

She has said that at least two characters will die in Deathly Hallows, but has been careful not to name

"They have become a major force again in Europe in recent years and I want to add something new to the club. They were the team I wanted to play for... but I hope that this will be an "hasta luego" (see you later) and that one day I will return."

The Spain international, a life-long Atletico fan who joined the club at the age of 11, said he was looking forward to the challenge of stepping into the shoes of Liverpool greats such as Ian Rush, Kenny Dalgish and Robbie Fowler.

Office-goers use boats in rain-ravaged Indian city

Kolkata (India), 4 July | -Office workers used life boats to cross flooded streets on Tuesday in India's eastern city of Kolkata as monsoon floods and storms ravaged parts of South Asia.

The death toll from more than a week of bad weather across India, Pakistan and Afghanistan approached

Torrential rains accompanied by strong storms over large parts of the subcontinent have brought down houses, uprooted trees and disrupted power to hundreds of villages. Floods have swamped cities and huge swathes of agricultural land.

In eastern India's biggest city, Kolkata, at least seven people died in roof collapses while train and flight services were disrupted because of flooding of rail tracks and poor visibility.

Thousands of people had to wade through filthy brown water to get to work,

with buses and cars staying off flooded roads.

A meteorological official warned of more heavy rains and advised fishermen not to venture out to the high seas.

Flash floods leave 2,500 homeless in Sudan

KHARTOUM, 5 July — Flash floods in the Sudanese town of Rabak have made at least 2,500 people homeless with more rain expected, the Sudanese Red Crescent said on Tuesday.

"They have no shelter. There is a real risk of disease outbreaks," said Afaf Bukhari from the Sudanese Red Crescent. "They need tents, they need blankets and plastic sheeting. They need health units."

Hundreds of houses have been destroyed and the road to Rabak, south of Khartoum, was submerged due to heavy rains.

"The forecasts say that it is going to get worse," Bukhari added. "We are expecting more floods in many areas."

Reports of further flooding were already coming in from Sennar along the Blue Nile, Kassala in east Sudan, North Kordofan and Jazeera State south of Khartoum, Bukhari said.



Bay inference: According to the observations at (19:30) hrs MST today, the tropical depression over Northeast Bay is centred at about (90) miles Southeast of Kolkata (India). It is forecast to move North-Northwest wards, Monsoon is vigorous in the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal.

Special feature: According to the observations at (06:30) hrs MST today, yesterday's tropical depression over South China Sea has further intensified into a Tropical Storm "TORAGI" and is centred at about (200) miles Southeast of Hanoi (Vietnam). It is forecast to move Northwest ward.

Forecast valid until evening of 6-7-2007: Rain will be isolated in Kayah State and lower Sagaing Division, scattered in Mandalay and Magway Divisions, fairly widespread in Kachin and Shan States and widespread in the remaining States and Divisions with likelihood of isolated heavyfalls in Kayin, Mon and Rakhine States, Bago, Yangon, Ayeyawady and Thaninthayi Divisions. Degree of certainty is (100%).

State of the sea: Occasional squalls with rough sea will be experienced off and along Myanmar Coast. Surface wind speed in squalls may reach (50) mph.

Outlook for subsequent two days: Likelihood of increase of rain in the Eastern Myanmar areas.

Forecast foar Nay Pyi Taw and neighbouring areas for 6-7-2007: Isolated rain. Degree of certainty is (80%)

Forecast for Yangon and neighbouring areas for 6-7-2007: Some rain which may be heavy at times. Degree of certainty is (100%).

Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring areas for **6-7-2007:** Isolated rain. Degree of certainty is (80%).

3 NLD members, 1 expelled NLD member, 1 dissolved MDC member who tried to cause instability and unrest at expense of religion released after being educated

Nay Pyi Taw, 5 July—Authorities concerned today released three NLD members, and one expelled NLD member who were seized and handed over by some peace-loving people for their attempts to stir up instability and unrest at the expense of religion and one dissolved MDC member who staged a demonstration holding a placard with the intention of inciting civil unrest, after they had been educated.

The persons released today were organizer Win Myint and member San Naing (a) Maung San of Hlinethaya Township NLD, expelled Hlinethaya NLD member Phyo Wai Lin, member of Shwepyitha Township NLD Myint Kyaw Oo and member of dissolved MDC Thein Aung Myint (a) Thein Zan of Ward-2 in North Oakkalapa Township.

On 15 May, organizer Win Myit and member San Naing (a) Maung San of Hlinethaya Township NLD together with 10 persons including secretary Thant Zin Myo, wearing T-shirts bearing the portrait of Daw Suu Kyi incited public unrest at the Shwedagon Pagoda under the guise of saying prayers for the release of Daw Suu Kyi. However, they were seized and entrusted to authorities concerned by the peace-loving people of Ward-6 in Hlinethaya Town-

ship at Tadabyu bus stop at $8.20~\mathrm{am}.$

Similarly, on the same day, expelled NLD member Phyo Wai Lin and member of Shwepyitha Township NLD Myint Kyaw Oo incited unrest with an excuse for attending the prayer service at Kyauktawgyi Buddha Image to be led by NLD Su Su Nway, and they were held and handed over to authorities concerned by the duty-conscious people of Nanthagon Ward in Insein Township at the bus terminal on Railway Station Road at 10.30 am.

Likewise, at 9.20 am on 22 April 2007, the people of Ngamoeyeik Ward in Thingangyun Township wanting to live in peace arrested and handed over MDC member Thein Aung Myint (a) Thein Zan and a group of eight led by Htin Kyaw (a) Kyaw Htin (leader of dissolved MDC) to authorities concerned as they were staging a protest holding placards calling for protection of women and a stop in collection of unfair taxes in front of Sanpya Market.
