A total of 15 basketball teams are taking part in the tournament.—MNA

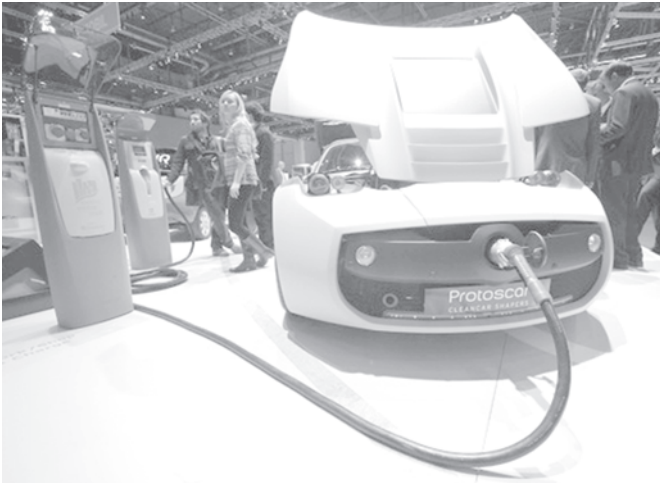
Winners of Myanmar ICT Awards 2009 contest announced

Russia test launches missile from submarine

Moscow, 5 March — Russia on Thursday successfully test-launched a *Sineva* intercontinental ballistic missile from a submarine.

The missile was launched at 07:50 a.m. Moscow Time (0450 GMT) from the Tula submarine in the Barents Sea, a Defence Ministry spokesman said.

The *Sineva* already in service is a liquid-propellant submarine-launched ballistic missile, designed for Delta IV-class submarines, according to the RIA

Novosti news agency.

The *Sineva* is seen as a rival to the troublesome Bulava, a three-stage liquid and solid-propellant ballistic missile designed for deployment on Borey-class submarines.

By now, seven of the 12 test-launches of the *Bulava* missile have been reported as unsuccessful.

Further development of the missile has been questioned by some legislators and defence experts, but the military insisted there was no alternative to the *Bulava* and

pledged to continue testing the missile until it was ready to be put into service with the Navy.

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev said last September one of the most important issues for the Russian Armed Forces was to rebuild the Navy in the coming decade.

He also said last March the armed forces would undergo comprehensive rearmament beginning in 2011.

Pakistan arrests another Afghan Taliban leader

ISLAMABAD, 5 March — Pakistani officials said Thursday that another Afghan Taliban leader had been arrested.

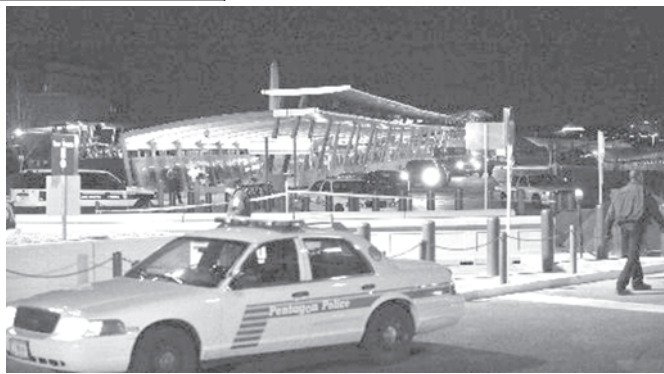
Agha Jan Mohtasim was arrested in the southern port city of Karachi, they said on condition of anonymity. No further details were given.

According to earlier reports by the private TV ARY News, Mohtasim, who is a son-in-law of Mullah Muhammad Omar, the prominent Afghan war lord, was captured on Thursday as intelligence agencies, acting on a tip-off, conducted a raid on a house at Ehsan Abad area of the city.

Mohtasim is the former

chief administrator of the Taliban regime in the late 1990s. He is also believed to be the Taliban's political and military strategist.

Pentagon shooting suspect in custody, second person suspected

WASHINGTON, 5 March — One suspect was taken into custody after a shooting incident at Pentagon Thursday night, and police suspected there is a second person involved

in the case.

The suspect's nationality is American, Pentagon Police Chief Richard Keever told reporters at a news briefing near the crime scene outside the

sprawling Pentagon building, without giving other details of the person's identity.

Two police officers sustained non-life-threatening injuries in the incident.

The police chief said the suspect showed no emotion nor distress as he approached the police officers at around 6:40 p.m. local time (2340 GMT) in the Metro station outside the Pentagon building.

The person "looked very cool" and didn't speak a word, said Keever.

When police asked for ID, he reached for his pocket, but pulled out a gun before shooting the officers.—Internet

Bomb attacks kill 12 as early parliamentary voting begins in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 5 March — A spate of attacks near polling stations in Baghdad killed at least 12 people and injured dozens despite tightened security as Iraq began an early voting on Thursday across the country for Sunday's parliamentary election.

More than 800,000 Iraqi soldiers, police, hospital staff and prisoners cast their votes in the voting which began early morning on Thursday, as they will not be able to go to the polls on the election day due to work.

Up to 458 polling centres were opened in Iraq's 18 provinces to receive the eligible people, most of whom were from the country's security forces, said Qassim al-Abboudi, a senior official with the Iraqi Independent High Electoral Commission.

Qassim Atta, spokesman of the Baghdad Operation Command, said that the Iraqi security forces have beefed up security for polling centres across Baghdad.

However, the voting was still overshadowed with three deadly bombings.

The first attack was a roadside bomb which detonated near a polling centre in Baghdad's northern neighbourhood of al-Hurriyah, killing five civilians and wounding 22 others. The polling center is ready to be used for Sunday's general elections.

In the afternoon, a suicide bomber struck a bus carrying Iraqi soldiers outside a polling centre in Baghdad's western district of Mansour, killing three soldiers and wounding 15 others.

Afghan police kill seven Taliban militants including their commander

KABUL, 5 March — Police during an operation in Helmand Province south of Afghanistan eliminated seven Taliban militants including their commander on Wednesday, a Press release of Interior Ministry said on Thursday.

"The operation carried out yesterday outside provincial capital Lashkar Gah led to the killing of seven Taliban rebels including their commander Mullah Bismillah," the Press release added.

It also added that some arms and ammunitions including four assault rifles were seized.

Poland's February unemployment rate at 13.0%

WARSAW, 5 March — Poland's labour and Social Policy Ministry estimates the February unemployment rate stood at 13.0 percent, Minister Jolanta Fedak said on Thursday.

"The pace of the rate growth is slower than in the same period of 2009. It is clear that the unemployment level stabilizes," she said, adding that the number of the unemployed people totals 2.1 million. According to the Central Statistical office GUS, in January the unemployment rate stood at 12.7 percent. In February, the number of job offers rose by 20,000 or 33.2 percent from January to 80,500.—Xinhua

French jobless in Q4 2009 reaches 10-year high

PARIS, 5 March—The jobless rate on the French mainland reached 9.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009, 0.5 point higher than the previous quarter and the highest since the end of 1999, according to data announced on Thursday by the national statistics bureau INSEE.

Some 2.7 million people were unemployed in the last three months of last year, accounting for 9.6 percent of the active population in metropolitan France, while the rate was 10 percent if overseas regions were included. More generally, 3.4 million people didn't have work or stable work, INSEE's report said.—Xinhua

EU grants 2.3 billion euros to energy projects

BRUSSELS, 5 March — The European Commission granted on Thursday 2.3 billion euros (about 3.15 billion US dollars) to 43 energy projects to ensure energy supply in Europe and create more jobs.

As the second batch of a 4-billion-euro economic recovery plan, the Commission will grant the money to 12 electricity interconnection projects and

and 31 gas pipeline projects over the next 18 months.

The projects chosen on Thursday will help deliver major investment projects which were at risk of important delay because of the economic crisis, according to the Commission.

The projects will serve the need of better interconnecting all member

states of the European Union (EU) and reduce the isolation of remoter parts, such as the three Baltic States, Ireland and Malta, the Commission said. "Never before has the Commission agreed such an important amount for energy projects," declared Gunther Oettinger, European Commissioner responsible for Energy.

Russia approves long-term strategy for auto industry

MOSCOW, 5 March—The Russian government on Thursday unveiled its long-term strategy for the development of Russia's auto industry until 2020, with state funds up to 20 billion US dollars.

Minister of Industry and Trade Viktor Khristenko told reporters after a government meeting that the estimated volume of Russian investments in the industry was revised down to 584 billion roubles (around 19.6 billion dollars).

The aggregate volume of investments in the industry until 2020 is expected to reach 1.2 to 1.8 trillion roubles (40.3 to 60.5 billion dollars), said the minister.

By 2020, the capacity of the car market in Russia will total 3.5 million to 3.6 million units annually, with the share of imported and exported cars at 20 and 8 percent respectively.

The strategy, which should be finalized by the end of this month, also

envisions demand stimuli, tax and insurance measures and support for domestic auto makers.

It also stipulates governmental encouragement on setting up research centres and technical innovation within the auto industry.—Xinhua

Mexico authorizes import of Japanese cars without taxes

MEXICO CITY, 5 March—The Mexican government authorized the entrance of 36,171 Japanese cars into the Mexican market free of duties from 1 April, 2010 to 31 March, 2011, the Mexican Economy Ministry said on Thursday.

This measure was taken as part of the Agreement for the Strengthening of the Economic Association between Mexico and Japan, the ministry said.

Under the agreement, Mexico will import, free of duty, Japanese cars that accounted for 5 percent of all the cars sold in Mexican territory.

Statistics from Mexico's Association of Automotive Industry indicated that in 2009 754,918 cars were sold in Mexico, a drop of 26.4 percent compared with 2008.

India expected to hike interest rate by 50 bps in April

MUMBAI, 5 March — Indian central bank Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will crank up key policy lending rate by 50 basis points at the quarterly policy review meeting on 20 April, predicted Indranil Pan, chief economist with Indian private

Kotak Mahindra Bank on Thursday.

Speaking at a seminar at Bombay Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Pan said RBI will not ad-

just up cash reserve ratio for banks this time, but will increase repo rate, which RBI charges for borrowings to commercial banks.—Xinhua

China to build industrial system of low-carbon emissions

BEIJING, 5 March—China will build an “industrial system” and “consumption pattern” with low carbon emissions, Premier Wen Jiabao said in the government work report he delivered at the parliament’s annual session on Friday.

China will work hard to develop low-carbon technologies as well as new and renewable energy resources to actively respond to climate change, Wen said at the session of the National People’s Congress, adding that the development of smart power

grids should be intensified.

Other measures to combat climate change include increasing forest carbon sinks and expanding China’s forests by at least 5.92 million hectares in 2010.

He promised that China would participate in international cooperation to address climate change and work for further progress in the global cause.

In his report, Wen also addressed energy conservation, environmental protection and the development of a circular economy.

“We will increase our

energy-saving capacity by an equivalent of 80 million tons of standard coal,” he said.

The daily sewage treatment capacity will increase by 15 million cubic metres and the daily garbage disposal capacity will grow by 60,000 tons.

For developing a circular economy, Wen said China will utilize mineral resources, recycle industrial waste, use by-product heat and pressure to generate electricity, and transform household solid waste into resources.

Indonesia to join int’l tourism exhibition in Berlin

JAKARTA, 5 March—Indonesia will join international tourism exhibition in Germany’s Berlin on 10-14 March to promote domestic tourism in overseas, especially in Europe, *Kompas* daily quoted an official as saying on Friday. For the country’s Ministry for Culture and Tourism, position of the International Tourism Bourse in Berlin is very

strategic to attract European tourists.

“Europe, especially Germany, is one of Indonesia’s main tourism markets,” Sapta Nirwandar, the ministry’s Director General of Marketing told Indonesian tourism association and industry here.

Sapta dismissed accusation that such promotion only wastes money, arguing that from such

bourses and exhibitions, Indonesia manages to attract bigger revenue.

“Take example in 2009 when our transaction got by tourism players from such exhibitions and bourses reached 180 billion rupiah (about 19.4 million US dollars), much more than expenses of 40 billion rupiah (about 4.3 million dollars),” he said.

50 ships stuck in Baltic thick ice

STOCKHOLM, 5 March—The Swedish Maritime Administration said on Thursday that about 50 vessels are stuck in the thick ice in the Baltic Sea off Sweden’s east coast.

Among the vessels, there are six large passenger ferries which are in total carrying more than 2,000 passengers, the administration said in a statement.

Two of the ferries, including the large Isabella passenger ferry carrying 1,322 passengers and crew, have been freed.

Four other vessels, including the Amorella, another passenger ferry with 753 passengers and 190 crew members aboard, are still stuck.

The administration has sent all the ice breakers in the area to free the ferries, but gale-force winds are hampering the effort. No one is hurt and there are no immediate plans to bring people off the ferries, but helicopters and military hovercraft are on standby in case evacuations become necessary, the administration added.—Xinhua

South Korea to enhance aviation safety with China

SEOUL, 5 March—South Korea has reached an agreement with China to enhance bilateral cooperation in terms of aviation safety and flight control efficiency measures, the government said on Friday.

Under the agreement, the two nations will have working-level talks annually aimed at improving air traffic control and opening new flight routes, as well as other measures in areas of mutual interest, the South Korean Ministry of Land, Transport and Maritime Affairs said in a statement.

Also, South Korea and China will hold workshops every year to share information on safety-related issues while boosting interpersonal networks between the two countries, it added.—Xinhua

Chile declares state of agriculture emergency in central, southern zones

SANTIAGO, 5 March—The Chilean government declared on Thursday a state of agriculture emergency in the regions of Valparaiso, O’Higgins, Maule, Bio Bio, La Araucania and Metropolitana, due to the devastating earthquake that shook the central and southern parts of the country on Saturday.

Agriculture Minister Marigen Hornkohl said the government took the decision on Thursday after having the first reports of the situations of the disaster regions.

The decision aimed to provide concrete aids to the peasants to minimize the impact of the earthquake and to facilitate the relief measures in the affected regions, Hornkohl said. Among the aids, the government will issue emergency coupons worth a maximum 150,000 Chilean pesos (some 300 US dollars) to each peasant to help farmers restore agricultural production.

The peasants will also receive additional coupons to repair or rehabilitate their watering and drainage systems.—Xinhua

Spanish fishing boat fights off pirate attack in Indian Ocean

MADRID, 5 March—A Spanish fishing boat from the Basque region, the Albacan, on Thursday escaped an attack from pirates while fishing in the Indian Ocean 350 miles off the coast of Kenya, local media re-

ported.

The captain of the ship told RTVE that his crew had been able to “repel the attack” and the ship “was now sailing freely.”

“When they (the pirates) were within range, they fired an incendiary grenade at us,” he added.

The Albacan was able to fight off the pirates thanks to the presence of three armed security guards on board.

“The crew is in perfect state. They followed the protocol for these cases and were able to leave the pirate ship behind,” Inaki Latxaga, the president of the company that owns the Albacan, was quoted as saying by local newspaper *El Correo Vasco*.

Mokkha Dam will be built on upstream of Mokkha Creek in Minhla Township, Bago Division (West), and upon completion, the dam will irrigate about 1,000 acres of farmland. The dam will also help improve the living standard of local people

and greening of the region.

The third project is earthen-type Natkar Dam to be constructed by damming the Natkar Creek near Mae-dee Village, Pyawbwe Township, Yamethin District, Mandalay Division. On completion, the project will be able to benefit some 1200 acres of farmlands and help green nearby regions.

The fourth project is earthen-type Phayahla Dam to be constructed by damming the Phayahla Creek, about one and a half miles upstream Sangyi Thayetkon Village, Haingyigyun, Labutta District, Ayeyawady Division. On completion, the project will be able to irrigate about 800 acres of farmlands in Haingyigyun.

In the time of the SPDC, the Irrigation Department has constructed 231 dams.

Minister for Industry-2 Vice-Admiral Soe Thein reported on Solar Panel Project, the project to produce one-ton, 1.5-ton and two-ton electric vehicles, dredger factory project, the project to produce three to five-tons rice-milling machines, and Technical Institute (Magway) Project.

The Ministry of Industry-2 will implement the Solar Panel Project with advanced technologies in Yangon. Based on the demand, it will generate two megawatts a year.

The Electric Vehicle Project will be launched in Yangon, with a target of producing 200 units a year. Electric vehicles designed to reduce use of fuel are for factories, workshops, airports and hospitals.

The Small Dredger Factory Project is designed to produce high-capacity cutter suction dredgers and accessories.

The rice mills project will be implemented at Malun Factory in Minhla Township.

Upon completion, it will be able to produce 500 rice-milling machines a year, 6-inch rubber roll huskers, gravity grain separating screens,

empty roll rice whiteners and accessories.

The Technical Institute (Magway) Project is intended to conduct vehicle servicing course, vehicle producing course, and vehicle quality control course.

Minister for Construction Maj-Gen Khin Maung Myint gave a brief account of the projects being undertaken by the ministry. He also reported on follow-up programmes for the projects to construct Manaung Island ring road, Katha-Bhamo Road, Bogale-Mawlamyinegyun-Kyonmange-Myaungmya Road,

Arrangements are being made to upgrade Kyonkadon-Setsan road, the 8th road of Ayeyawady Delta Region Road Network Development Project, from earth road to gravel one. The 19 miles and one furlong long road will link Pyapon-Kyonkadon-Daw Nyein-Amar road to Bogale-Setsan-Htawpine-Amar road.

The 20 miles and six furlongs long Pauktaw-Minbya road will link Pauktaw to Minbya in Sittway District of Rakhine State. It will be upgraded from earth road to gravel one. On completion, the road will contribute towards better transport along Rakhine coastal region, thereby improving the living standard of the local people.

The 24 miles and seven furlongs long Myaypon-Minbya road which will link Myaypon to Minbya in Sittway District of Rakhine

State will be upgraded into all-weather facility. It will enable the local people to travel from Myaypon located near the mouth of sea to Minbya and Yangon through Pauktaw, MraukU and Sittway.

The 22 miles and six furlongs long Ponnagyun-Yathedaung road will be upgraded into the 14 feet wide gravel road and bridges will be built along the road. Upon completion, the all-weather road will improve the trading and socio-economic status of the people in Letwe Sartaik, Phatkya, Zadimyin and Kyaukthashae villages along it.

The 11 miles long Shwechaung-Anisakhan road will be built as a short cut in order to link between Yangon-Mandalay Highway (Kyaukse) and Mandalay-Lashio-Bhamo-Myitkyina Highway (PyinOoLwin). On completion, it will contribute towards better transport among plants and factories

in Kyaukse, Yeywa Hydropower Project, Kyaukse Industrial Region, PyinOoLwin, Yadanabon Myothit and Central Institute of Civil Service (Upper Myanmar).

Kongyan-Kawkyartu (Takeng)-Mawhtaik road was built to link Kongyan in Shan State (North), which stands at an altitude of 5000 feet, to Mawhtaik, which stands at an altitude of 7000 feet, through Kawkyartu (Takeng) jetty on the bank of Thanlwin River. Due to lack of proper maintenance for years, the earth road was damaged. Plan is underway to upgrade it. It will be upgraded to 14 feet wide tarred road on 34 feet wide earth road. On completion of 68 miles long road, it will become a major route of Mawhtaik region, upstream Thanlwin River, Monekoe-Phaungsaing region, Kyukok-Muse-Namhkam and Kaukkai-Kunlong region for border trade.

Tapa-Tarshwehtan road section, which is 12 miles long, is out of

Mongsei-Tapa-Tarshwehtan road section in the Shan State (North). It will be upgraded to 12 feet wide tarred road on 34 feet wide earth road.

Upon completion of the road, people can travel to Mongsei-Monghaung-Mongya-Monekoer region, Laukkai-Konggyan-Mawhtaik region and Chinshwehaw-Kunlong-Hsenwi region, through Thanlwin River crossing bridge (Tapa).

Htilon-Tapaung-Patanabu-Aukbote road section is 57 miles and six furlongs long. It is a new alignment of Hpa-an-Kawkaik-Myawady road. Plans are under way to build 14 feet wide road on 34 feet wide road. After completion of the road, communications between Thaton, Mawlamyine, Hpa-an, Hlaingbwe, Myawady and villages along the road will be easier. It contributes not only to development of region's administration, economic, social, education, and health but also to ensuring peace and stability.

Ayeyawady Bridge (Nyaungdon) that links Yangon Division with Ayeyawady Division, on which motor road and rail road run parallel, will be built by spanning Ayeyawady River near Nyaungdon. The bridge

will be constructed like Thanlwin Bridge (Mawlamyine). It has 9382 feet long motor road bridge and 10,377 feet long railroad bridge. It comprises of 28 feet wide area for motorway, 14 feet wide area for railroad and three feet wide pavement on both sides.

Ayeyawady Bridge (Pakokku) is a bridge that links Letpanchepaw in NyaungU Township on the eastern bank of the Ayeyawady River with Pakokku on the western bank. It has two way lane motorway and one railroad like Thanlwin Bridge. It will be 14191 feet long 28 feet wide flanked by three feet wide walkway on each side and 21886 feet long and 14 feet wide railroad.

It is the longest bridge in Myanmar. Upon completion, there will be a rail network in the country helping facilitate all roads for development of the west bank of Ayeyawady River.

Spanning the river, Ayeyawady Bridge (Malun) will be built near Pahtanago and Malun to link Patheingyi-Kyangin-Pakokku railroad on the west bank and Pyay-Aungmye-Taunggyi-Magway-Chauk railroad on the east bank. It has 4695 feet long motor road bridge and 5510 feet long rail Road Bridge. It comprises of 28 feet wide area for motorway, 14 feet wide area for railroad and four feet wide pavement on both sides.

Ayeyawady bridge (Yadanatheinga) in Sagaing Division will be built to connect Kachin and Shan States through Sagaing Division. It will span Ayeyawady River near Kyaukmyaung in Singu of Mandalay Division and Shwebo of Sagaing Division. It has 2814 feet long, 28 feet wide two-way lane and three feet wide pavement on both sides.

There was only Inwa bridge on the Ayeyawady in the past. From 1988 to this date, the government built eight new bridges on the river. At present, five bridges - Sinkhan, Pakokku, Malun, Nyaungdon and Yadanatheinga - are under construction. So there will be altogether 13 bridges spanning the Ayeyawady.

Narcotic drugs seized near Wampon Village in Tachilek Township

NAY PYI TAW, 5 March — Acting on the information that a group of drug traffickers were operating near and around Wampon Village in Tachilek Township, Shan State (East), a local Tatmadaw column combed the area from 23 to 25 February and found 15 tents on an island of the Mekong River, where the smugglers stayed. Further search led to the seizure of 365 blocks of caffeine and 38 packets of caffeine powder in plastic containers buried by the seafloor, 878 (40) MM grenades of M-79 launcher, 162 Point-38 bullets, 1,500 rounds of M-16 magazines and five RPG grenades.

The group was from the gang of escaped drug trafficker Sai Naw Kham. Police Inspector Khin

Maung Yin-led anti-drug squad ran across the drug trafficking group while patrolling in the Mekong River on 20 February, and a skirmish broke out between them. Eight Police Force members and two militiamen were fallen and two Police Force members wounded. Moreover, three motorboat operators were killed.

The local battalion and Myanmar Police Force are working hard to make sure that there are no cases of drug smuggling, gunrunning and human trafficking along the border where Myanmar, Thailand and Laos meet. Besides, they are cooperating with the neighbouring nations in dealing with such incidents and transnational crimes.—MNA

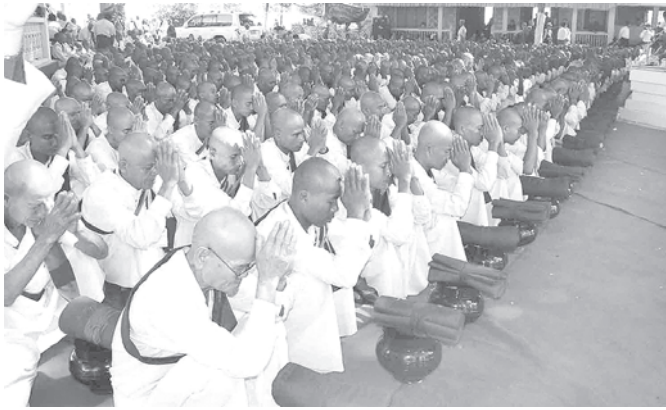

Penwegon-Kyaukkyi road services as a link between Yangon-Toungoo-Mandalay highway on the west bank of Sittoung River and Toungoo-Sittoung-Moppalin road on the east bank. On this link road there is a single bailey bridge that can be used only in summer when the water level is low. Sittoung Bridge (Natthangwin) an all-weather facility will be built on it. The 720-foot long bridge will have a 24 ft wide motor road flanked by three-foot walkways on each side. The government has already built Shwegyin-Madauk and Moppalin-Sittoung bridges across the river.

A new 60-ton-load capacity Gyaing River Bridge (Kawkaeik) will be built on Hpa-an-Myawady road in Hpa-an Township, Kayin State, as the old one's load bearing capacity is dwindling due to old age. The new

bridge which will be a reinforced concrete facility will have a 24 feet wide motor road flanked by three-foot walkways on each side.

A new 2226 ft bridge will be built on Bogale River to upgrade Bogale-Kyeinchaung-Kadonkani road in Pyapon District, Ayeyawady Division, into an all-weather facility.

Mulashidee suspension bridge on Myitkyina-Sumprabum-Putao road in Putao District, Kachin State, will be substituted with a 560 ft all-weather bridge which will support a two-lane road in the future.

The length of roads built by and under the maintenance of Construction Ministry at present is 21361 miles up 7726 miles from 13635 miles in 1988. At present, 45 road projects and 10 bridge projects are under construction. Up to now, 236 over -180-foot-long bridges have been erected.

El Nino-related drought to drag on in Vietnam till May

HANOI, 5 March —The Vietnam Institute of Hydro Meteorology and Environment said here on Thursday that the country's ongoing drought, an aftermath of El Nino, is forecast to last till May of this year.

Accordingly, the drought would continue in majority of all localities of the country from March to May this year. However, it will be felt stronger in the country's northern provinces, said the institute.

The drought is creating negative impacts on the country's electricity sector as reservoirs are running out of water to feed hydropower plants, according to the state-owned Electricity of Vietnam.

El Nino, or El Nino-Southern Oscillation phenomenon, is a climate pattern. It occurs across the tropical Pacific Ocean on average every five years. When El Nino occurs, there are droughts, floods and other weather disturbances.—Xinhua

Italy starts testing first airport body scanners

ROME, 5 March— Italy began testing airport body scanners on Thursday in a move to enhance security measures following the failed Christmas Day bomb attack on a US flight.

Government officials inaugurated the first scanners at Rome's Fiumicino International Airport, reassuring passengers and citizens that the devices were both safe and convenient, state television Rai reported.

Health Minister Ferruccio Fazio was among the first ones to test the machine amid public curiosity.

"Our research has determined that the rays emitted by body scanners pose no health risks at all," he said.

The scanners, which use high-frequency electromagnetic waves to look beneath clothing for concealed bombs and arms, have stirred fears that they could cause cancer or be otherwise harmful to the human body.—Xinhua

GOES-P satellite successfully launched on weather monitoring mission

LOS ANGELES, 5 March — The Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite-P, or GOES-P, blasted off from a Florida base on Thursday, NASA announced.

The GOES-P was lifted off aboard a Delta IV rocket at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida, said NASA.

The satellite was launched at 6:57 pm EST (2357 GMT), 40 minutes later than planned, but still within the one hour launch window set by mission managers.

After reaching orbit, GOES-P will

become GOES-15.

The satellite will be used to monitor and predict weather, measure ocean temperatures, perform climate studies, relay communications and provide search-and-rescue support, according to NASA.

The GOES-P, launched for NASA by Boeing Launch Services, will be checked out by Boeing and NASA's Goddard Space Flight Centre before being turned over to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) for operational use.

British child kidnapped in Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 5 March —Robbers kidnapped a five-year-old British boy on Thursday in Pakistan, demanding a ransom of 100,000 pounds, local media reported.

A gang broke into a house in Jehlum, a town about 100 kilometres south of the capital Islamabad, stole cash and jewellery and kidnapped young Sohail Saeed into

a taxi to make their escape, police officials said.

The attack happened after the family opened the gates to let in a taxi they had called to go to airport at the end of a three-week holiday, visiting Saeed's grandmother with his Pakistani father.

Saeed's father Raja Naqqash Saeed said "they tortured me for several

hours demanding money."

Tahir Bashir, a senior police officer said the police was investigating the case.

The British High Commission in Pakistan told reporters that it was providing consular assistance to the family and working with local authorities to rescue the boy.

Judge Thomas Warriner said he agreed with a probation department recommendation to disregard Ferguson's prior convictions under the state's "three strikes" law and to sentence Ferguson to the upper term for petty theft with priors. Warriner credited Ferguson 825 days for the time he spent in jail while awaiting trial. He will be eligible for parole in less than three years.

**Qantas flight turned into a 'war zone'**

PERTH, 5 March — Qantas passengers have revealed the horrific moment they thought they would die in a terrifying plunge that sent travellers hurtling through the air, smashing teeth and bones and tearing ligaments. "All of a sudden the plane dropped like a brick," one passenger said. "It was like a hurricane inside the plane, like a war zone." "The plane fell again," said another. "I thought: 'I didn't think I was going to die in a plane crash, but obviously I am'".

These traumatic descriptions form part of a class action filed in the US

against defendants including airline giant Airbus, maker of the ill-fated A330-300 that plummeted twice in quick succession during the flight from Singapore to Perth in October 2008. More than 100 of the 301 aboard were hurt when a computer glitch caused the plane to nosedive first 650, then 400 feet (320m in total) over Western Australia.

Passengers suffered spinal, head, neck and chest injuries from being catapulted into the overhead lockers. Others lost teeth, tore knee ligaments and suffered serious cuts and broken ribs, feet, ankles and hands in the incident.—Internet

McDonald's to expand business in Turkey in 2010

ANKARA, 5 March—Global fast-food chain McDonald's plans to open 31 new restaurants in Turkey in 2010 as sales increased in the country, the semi-official *Anatolia* news agency reported on Thursday.

Nearly 76 million customers visited McDonald's restaurants in Turkey in 2009 and the company now targets 89 million customers this year, Hakan Serim, director of McDonald's Turkey, was quoted as saying. Last year, the company's total sales in Turkey grew 6.5 percent, with a turnover of 267 million Turkish lira (around 174 million US dollars), said Serim.

Clashes kill one in southern Yemen

SANAA, 5 March—At least one people was killed and two others wounded on Thursday in clashes between the Yemeni forces and a group of the Southern Movement in the southern provincial city of Radfan, a local security source said.

Dozens of protestors belonging to the Southern Movement tried to break into the government building of the local Council Authority in Radfan city in the restive southern province of Lahj, the source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

One protestor was killed and two others injured in a shoot-out with security forces who tried to prevent them from entering a state building.—Xinhua

Elephant research in Kenya 'washed away' by flash flood

NANYUKI, 5 March — Flash floods have washed away a major scientific research centre used to study Africa's wild elephants. This morning, flooding of the Ewaso Ng'iro River destroyed the research facility and associated camp located in Samburu National Reserve, Kenya.

The centre has unveiled pioneering insights into elephant behaviour, including how fences made from beehives can deter elephants from raiding farms. No-one is reported hurt but valuable research and data has been lost. As

well as the Save the Elephants (STE) research facility and Elephant Watch Safari Camp located in Samburu National Reserve, seven other neighbouring lodges were

completely destroyed.

Beds, tents, computers and vital research documentation were submerged in mud and strung up in the treetops.

Somali leader says Al Shabaab's WFP ban worsens hunger

MOGADISHU, 5 March—Somali President Sheikh Sharif Sheikh Ahmed on Thursday said the banning of the operations of the UN's food agency in Somalia by the insurgent group of Al Shabaab further deteriorates the humanitarian situation in the war-torn country. The Islamist rebel movement which is fighting Somali government forces late last month ordered the World Food Programme (WFP) to terminate its operations in Somalia ac-

cusing the agency of being "anti-Islamic".

"The hunger in many parts of the country is further made worse by the refusal of anti-government groups for aid to reach those in need," the president told reporters in a press conference at his residence in Mogadishu. The Somali leader also said the differences between WFP and the US over aid deliveries to Somalia would also obstruct humanitarian operation in war wrecked nation. The US says aid for the

displaced Somalis could go into the hands of Islamist insurgent forces controlling much of south and center of Somalia while WFP accused the US of "politicizing aid".

Speaking about the ships and their crews still held hostage by Somali pirates, the Somali head of state said the vessels and crews should be released "immediately and unconditionally", saying the piracy was "un-Islamic, immoral and criminal".

Seabed vents found between New Zealand, Antarctica

WELLINGTON, 5 March—American scientists said they have found evidence of hydrothermal vents on the seafloor between New Zealand and Antarctica. *New Zealand Press Association* reported on Friday. Hydrothermal vents spew heated fluids—often containing dissolved minerals such as gold, zinc, and copper—with the plumes from the vents influencing influence ocean chemistry and providing a source of energy for a complex web of organisms, *New Zealand Press Association* reported.

More than 220 vents have been discovered worldwide—many of them on the Kermadec Arc between New Zea-

land and Tonga. So far no one has found them in the rough and frigid waters off Antarctica, but the new research has narrowed the places to look.

Geochemist Gisela Winckler at Columbia University's Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory analysed thousands of oceanographic measurements to pinpoint half a dozen spots where vents are likely to be found on the remote Pacific Antarctic Ridge.

They are about 3,200 km from New Zealand, 1,600 km from the coast of Antarctica, according to the research published in the journal *Geophysical Research Letters*.—Internet

Niacin may help treat stroke

DETROIT, 5 March—US medical researchers suggest niacin—or vitamin B3—may be used to treat stroke in the future.

The researchers at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit gave niacin to rats with ischemic stroke—an obstruction within a blood vessel supplying blood to the brain.

The brains of the rats given niacin showed new blood vessel growth and nerve cell improvement that helped improve neurological outcomes.

"If this proves to also work well in our human trials, we'll then have the benefit of a low-cost, easily tolerable treatment for one of the most neurologically devastating conditions," Michael Chopp, scientific director at the Henry Ford Neuroscience Institute, said in a statement.—Internet

Orbiter surpasses 100 terabits of data

PASADENA, 5 March—NASA says its Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter—now ending its fourth year of operation—has surpassed a data-volume milestone of 100 terabits.

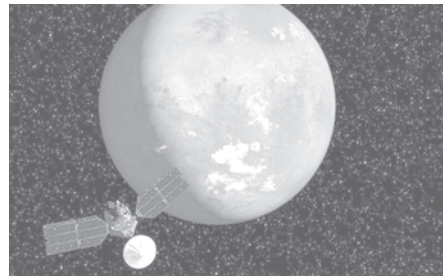
The space agency said that amount of data constitutes more than three times the amount of data from all other deep-space missions combined—not just the ones to Mars, but every mission that has ever flown past the orbit of Earth's moon.

The spacecraft entered orbit around Mars on 10 March, 2006, following on 12 Aug. 2005, launch from Florida. With a dish antenna 10 feet in diameter, NASA said the spacecraft pours data Earthward at up to 6 megabits per second from its three cameras, spectrometer, ground-penetrating radar and atmosphere sounder.

"The capability to return

enormous volumes of data enables these instruments to view Mars at unprecedented spatial resolutions," NASA said. "Half the planet has been covered at 20 feet per pixel, and nearly 1 percent of the

planet has been observed at about 1-foot per pixel, sharp enough to discern objects the size of a desk." The project is managed by NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif.—Internet

Fruit juice not linked to teen weight gain

HOUSTON, 5 March—There is no link between 100 percent juice consumption and weight gain in teens; in fact, the teens had more nutritious diets, US researchers found.

Lead researcher Dr Theresa Nicklas of the US Department of Agriculture/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine said the study found no association between 100 percent fruit juice consumption and weight status in the nearly 4,000 adolescents examined.

The study, published in the March/April issue of the *American Journal of Health Promotion*, also found those who drank more than 6 ounces of 100 percent juice a day also consumed more whole fruit and fewer added fats and sugars. Milk consumption was not affected by juice intake, the study said. Data for the analysis came from the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey, 1999-2002.

Apples, nuts, oats boost immune system

URBANA, 5 March—An apple a day may indeed keep the doctor away by reducing inflammation associated with obesity-related diseases, US researchers say.

Gregory Freund, a professor at the University of Illinois, says soluble fiber found in oats, apples and nuts reduces inflammation associated with obesity-related diseases and strengthens the immune system. "Soluble fiber changes the personality of immune cells—they go from being pro-inflammatory, angry cells to anti-inflammatory, healing cells that help us recover faster from infection," Freund said in a statement.—Internet

PALM BEACH GARDENS, 5 March — Alexandre Rocha nearly stopped playing golf last year, until two moves by the International Olympic Committee changed his mind. And that's just one tiny part of his unbelievable story. The world's 711th-ranked player — who needed to survive a

pre-qualifier, then a Monday qualifier, then a playoff, just to get into the field at PGA National this week — shot a 4-under 66 on Thursday, one shot back of Nathan Green and Michael Connell after the first round on a windy and unseasonably cool first day at the Honda Classic.

"I needed a day like today like, you have no idea," Rocha said. "And it was for nobody. It's for myself." The Honda is only his fourth PGA Tour event; the last was in 2003, and he's never made a cut. He lost his European Tour card last year and got status earlier this year on the Asian Tour, only after deciding that he wanted to continue playing golf for a living. —Internet

Accused doctor resigns from CFL's Toronto Argos

TORONTO, 5 March — A doctor accused of selling an unapproved drug has resigned as team doctor of the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts. Dr Anthony Galea resigned in early February after working for the team since 2003, Argos spokeswoman Beth Waldman said on Thursday. She said she doesn't know the reason for the Canadian doctor's resignation.

"Dr Galea resigned as our team doctor so we're no longer associated with him," Waldman said. Galea is facing four charges in Canada related to the drug known as Actovegin. The drug is extracted from calf's blood and used for healing. Galea's assistant also has been charged in the US for having HGH and another drug while crossing the border in September. —Internet

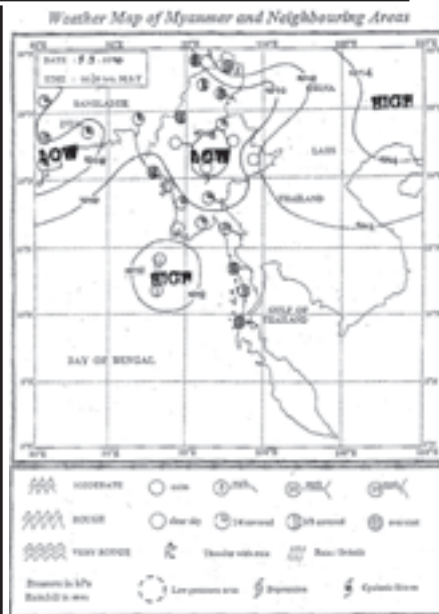
