Myanmar to fight against TB through new means with greater potency

NAY PYI TAW, 24 March — Myanmar observed the World TB Day 2010 here this morning with a resolve to find new drugs, diagnoses and vaccines through research to combat the deadly disease that is on the rise again.

According to annual report, the country was able to find and cure a total of over 130,000 TB patients in 2009, meeting the millennium goal as discovery rate reached 94% and treatment success rate 85%, said

Minister for Health Dr Kyaw Myint at the ceremony.

“However, the discovery rate has not meet the target in southern Shan State, Chin State and some other townships”, the minister stated, pointing out the need to search TB patients in those regions and remote places, border areas and rural areas.

New means to control the disease also cover the task of finding persons suffering from TB, providing therapies with greater potency, promoting

the anti-TB campaign with the cooperation of partners, fighting TB through primary health care with the help of health staff at basic level and disseminating public health knowledge.

The TB elimination programme covered the whole country in 2003 with the assistance of primary health staff, Dr Kyaw Myint said.

To prevent drug tolerance, fixed dose combination is being applied and treatment is through single-quota

patient kit system, he noted.

According to WHO 2009 TB Update, 40% of the world's 9.4 million patients could not undergo treatment as they were beyond the reach of health departments, the minister said.

WHO acting resident representative Dr Leonard Ortega also read out the message of the head of WHO Southeast Asia region at the ceremony co-sponsored by the Ministry of Health and the WHO.

Four killed in Baghdad shootings

BAGHDAD, 24 March—Four people were killed, including two policemen, in shootings in Baghdad on Monday, Iraqi security officials said.

In the overwhelmingly Shiite Sadr City district, two city councilors were gunned down by men who sped off on a motorbike, Baghdad Operations Command said in a statement.

"Iraqi security forces cordoned off the area, in search of the criminals. 'They arrested three suspects, and seized a motorbike, silencer pistols, kalashnikovs and one IED (improvised explosive device),' " it said.

In a separate statement, the operations command said two policemen were shot dead in a watchtower in the south Baghdad neighborhood of Radhwaniyah. It gave no further details.

Violence has dropped dramatically across Iraq since its peak between 2005 and 2007, but attacks remain common in some areas, especially in Baghdad and the main northern city of Mosul.

Pre-mature explosion kills two would-be suicide bombers in W Afghanistan

KABUL, 24 March—Two would-be suicide bombers were killed as their device went off prematurely in Afghanistan's western province of Nimroz on Monday, police said. "Four Taliban fighters were busy in planting mine on a road in Khashrod District this morning but the device exploded prematurely, killing two and injuring two others," provincial police chief Abdul Jabbar Purduli told *Xinhua*.

Taliban militants who largely rely on suicide attacks and roadside bombings to target security forces have yet to make comment. —*Xinhua*

Two killed, 16 wounded in Iraq violence

BAGHDAD, 24 March—Two people were killed and 16 others wounded in separate attacks in Baghdad and Iraq's eastern Diyala Province on Tuesday, the police said.

In Diyala, an Iraqi soldier was killed and seven others were injured in a bomb explosion near their patrol in the town of Jalawla, some 150 km northeast of Baghdad, a provincial police source

told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Also in the province, the leader of a local anti-Qaeda paramilitary group was killed when a roadside bomb struck his motorcycle in the town of Baladruz, east of the provincial capital city of Baquba, some 65 km northeast of Baghdad, the source said.

Three more people, including a child, were wounded in another roadside bomb explosion near their car in Baladruz, the source added. In Baghdad, four people were wounded when a roadside bomb went off near the Elwiyah Hospital in eastern the capital, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In separate incident, two people were wounded in a roadside bomb explosion near the Babil Hotel on the eastern side on the Tigris River which bisects the Iraqi capital, the source said. —*Xinhua*

Fire in old Calcutta building kills six, injures 20

CALCUTTA, 24 March — A fire raced through the upper floors of an old, six-storey building in Calcutta on Tuesday, killing six people, including two who jumped to their deaths as onlookers began to crowd the area.

Thousands of people gathered in a busy section of the eastern Indian city to watch firefighters use ladders to rescue dozens of people trapped inside the office-and-apartment

building while dense smoke and fire billowed from the fourth floor upward.

About 20 people were injured.

Police were investigating the cause of the fire, which was believed to have started in an elevator, police officer Javed Shamim said.

Nearly 100 firefighters spent several hours to control the blaze.

Two people jumped to

their deaths while four succumbed to burn injuries in a hospital, State Home Secretary Ardendu Sen said. Five of the 20 people hospitalized were in critical condition, Sen told *The Associated Press*.

The nearly 100-year-old building lies on Calcutta's busy Park Street, which is lined with offices, apartments and restaurants.

India to launch first carrier rocket with indigenous cryogenic engine

MUMBAI, 24 March—India will launch its first powerful carrier rocket with the homemade cryogenic engine to propel a satellite into geosynchronous orbit next month, said an Indian space official on Tuesday.

The carrier rocket *GSLV-D3* with the indigenous cryogenic engine is in the final stage of the assembly, said an official of Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO).

The official said, "so far, we had been using Russia-made cryogenic engines for satellite launchings."

After lifting off from the ground next month, the huge *GSLV-D3* will carry an advanced communication satellite into geostationary orbit, he added.

Six killed by mine blast in northern Yemen

SANAA, 24 March—Six Yemenis, including three children, were killed and three other children were wounded in a landmine blast on Tuesday in the northern Yemeni province of Saada, the Seyaj children's rights organization said.

The blast took place during a recess at a school in al-Mazarik refugee camp for displaced people during a six-year conflicts between the government troops and Shiite

rebels, the Sanaa-based Seyaj said in a statement.

The three injured children have been taken to a hospital for treatment, while the police launched an investigation into the explosion, according to the statement.—Internet

Earthquake of 6 magnitude shakes south of Peru

LIMA, 24 March — An earthquake measuring 6 on the Richter Scale shook on Tuesday the Nasca Province, 480 kilometres south to capital Lima, without reports of victims or material damages to the moment. According to the Peruvian Geophysics Institute (IGP) the epicentre was located 40 km southeast to Nasca with a depth of 40 km.

The earthquake was also felt in nearby cities like Palpa, Acari in Arequipa and Puquio in Ayacucho.—Xinhua

Two earthquakes jolt Tibet

BEIJING, 24 March—Two earthquakes measuring 5.7 and 5.5 magnitudes on the Richter Scale struck southwest China's Tibet Autonomous Region within an hour on Wednesday, said the China Earthquake Networks Centre.

The first 5.7-magnitude quake occurred at around 10:06 am and the second 5.5-magnitude one came 38 minutes later, both in northern Tibet's Nyainrong County, Nagqu Prefecture.

The quake hit a sparsely inhabited mountainous area with an altitude of more than 4,000 meters, said Zhu Quan, director with the seismological bureau of Tibet.—Xinhua

Bleak budgets force schools to consider closure

KANSASCITY, 24 March —In a neighbourhood dotted with boarded up homes, trash and gang graffiti, McCoy Elementary has been an oasis.

Now that the 94-year-old school is closing, residents are fearful that the neighbourhood could become even worse, attracting drug dealers and vandals when the children are gone.

McCoy is among the roughly half of Kansas City district schools expected to shut down before class resumes next fall, part of a wave of school closures across the country.

"When it does close, it's going to get bad around here," said Virginia Stanley, standing outside her home with her husband, her 22-year-old granddaughter and her two young great-grandchildren, who live with them.

Superintendents of struggling districts are winning praise for confronting budget woes by shuttering half-empty and underperforming schools, a move often blocked by local politics in the past.

In many cases, the schools have been declining for years, but were never closed because

residents and local advocacy groups fought to keep them. Now school leaders have an argument that trumps any parent outrage: The struggling economy makes these schools a luxury that districts can no longer afford.

About 6 percent of districts closed or consolidated schools this year, compared to about 3 percent in 2008-09, according to a survey conducted by the American Association of School Administrators.

About 11 percent are expected to consider similar moves in 2010-11.

Somali pirates seize Turkish ship

NAIROBI, 24 March—Somali pirates had hijacked a Turkish-owned ship on Tuesday with 21 crew members on board, a regional maritime official has confirmed.

Andrew Mwangura, the East Africa Coordinator of Seafarers Assistance Programme (SAP), said the Malta-flagged *MV Frigia* was seized early Tuesday in the pirate-infested waters of Somalia. "The Turkish ship was hijacked this morning with 21 crew members on board over 1,000 miles east of Somalia's Harardhere. The ship has 19 Turkish and two Ukrainian," Mwangura told *Xinhua* by telephone from Mombasa.

He said the 35,300 dwt ship was seized in an area some 400 nautical miles outside a shipping corridor protected by an international naval fleet.—*Xinhua*

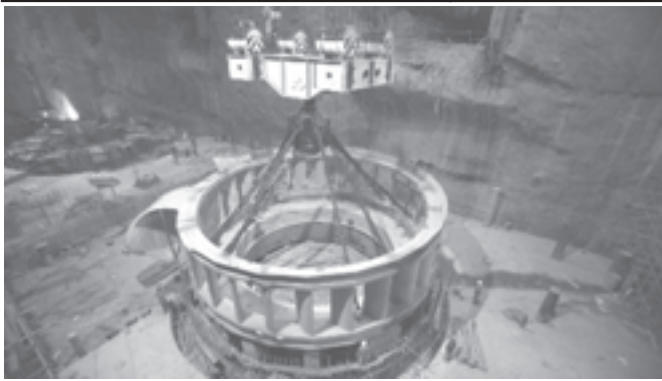
Somali pirates seize Bermuda-flagged ship

NAIROBI, 24 March—Somali pirates have hijacked a Bermuda-flagged cargo ship in the Gulf of Aden with 25 crew members on board, a regional maritime official confirmed on Wednesday.

Andrew Mwangura, the East Africa coordinator of Seafarers Assistance Programme (SAP), said the Virgin Islands-owned cargo ship *MV Talca* has 23 Sri Lankans, one Filipino and one Syrian.

"The 479,800 cbm reefer *Talca* was hijacked in Gulf of Aden on Tuesday afternoon. It's a cargo vessel, Bermuda flagged and managed in Britain," Mwangura told *Xinhua* by telephone from Mombasa.—*Xinhua*

China tables four-point proposal to cement ties with Africa

YAOUNDE, 24 March—China's top political adviser Jia Qinglin has put forward a four-point proposal aiming at fully advancing relations with Africa.

The proposal, which was made on Tuesday and was part of Jia's key-note speech at National Assembly of Cameroon, covered political trust, economy collaboration, cultural exchanges and global issues.

"Under the new circumstances, China will work

with Cameroon and other African countries to enhance the traditional friendship and grow the new type of China-Africa strategic partnership," Jia said. The speech, entitled "May the Flower of China-Africa Friendship Grow More Splendid," reaffirmed China's commitment to boosting the ties between the world's biggest developing country and the continent with the largest number of developing

countries.

"Both sides should remain committed to deepening political mutual trust," said Jia, chairman of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC), the country's top advisory body. Jia highlighted the importance of high-level visits, intergovernmental, parliamentary and party-to-party exchanges and cooperation.—*Xinhua*

S Korean space foods receive certification from Russian laboratory

SEOUL, 24 March—South Korean food products designed to be consumed in space have received certification from a Russian laboratory, the state-run Korea Food Research Institute (KFRI) said on Wednesday.

A total of 10 types of specially manufactured food products, including traditional dishes like fried Kimchi, hot pepper paste, bulgogi or beef stew, and bibimbab, a bowl of mixed rice and vegetables, have won the certification by the Institute of Biomedical Problems of the Russian Academy of Sciences (IBMP) last week after passing extensive testing, the KFRI said in a statement.

All food products were adjusted to fit the European astronauts' different tastes, and were specially repackaged to have longer shelf life, according to KFRI, as they were produced under high pressure and heat with below-five percent moisture content.—*Xinhua*

India, US consider holding training drill in nuke, chemical and biological warfare

NEW DELHI, 24 March—India and the United States are considering holding a joint training exercise in nuclear, chemical and biological warfare at a US proposal, the Indian newspaper *The Tribune* reported on Tuesday.

The exercise featured on the agenda of the 14th meeting of the Army Executive Steering Group, comprising top Indian and US army officers that began at Headquarters Western Command near Chandigarh in north-western India on Tuesday, said the report.

The four-day meeting is due to review the Indo-US military cooperation in the past year and work out programme for this year, said the report.

The report quoted unnamed sources as saying that the Americans put the proposal forth first and the Indian army is yet to decide on the modalities and unit that might join it.—*Xinhua*

Bird flu detected in mid-western Nepal

KATHMANDU, 24 March—Bird flu, the Avian Influenza H5N1 virus, has been detected in four places of Banke district in mid-western Nepal.

According to Wednesday's *nepalnews.com* report, district livestock services office of Banke, some 365 km west of Kathmandu, confirmed the prevalence of bird flu in the district on Tuesday, after it received a report from the central laboratory in Kathmandu.

It had sent samples of poultry products to the laboratory after over 150 chickens and ducks died in a short span in Binauna, Kohalpur, Phattepur and Nepalgunj.

Authorities have started taking special measures to control the virus from spreading.

The Prime Minister said that for years the Pyay-Paukkaung-Toungoo mountain road across the central Yoma was not safe to travel due to the danger of insurgents and the existence of many up-and-down sections.

Tatmadaw in perpetual charge of national defence duties

Junior, you fell in action in a frontline more than a couple of decades ago, but you are still deep in the heart of all of the family members of us. Your fall is, indeed, the very loss of a brave, loyal soldier for the country, as well as loss of a good son for the family. You upheld the oath "I solemnly take a vow to sacrifice my life for the country, the people and the Tatmadaw". So, your premature demise is a noble sacrifice in a holy battle to defend the mother country.

The Methawaw Battle, in which you engaged, was a decisive battle not only for the military field but also for the political field of the nation. While the unrest reigned supreme the whole nation due to the 1988 unrest, KNU insurgents waged Methawaw Battle to get the nation into military and political crises.

That day, enemies approached in bulk Methawaw military base under the control of the Tatmadaw, and opened fire with artillery and assorted small arms on the outpost where a platoon was deployed, at dawn. Enemies vastly outnumbered your platoon. Normally, no way you were able to repulse their attack. However, you showed your lion heart to confront the enemies although you were helplessly outnumbered, because you servicemen adhere to the four oaths and Our Three Main National Causes.

If they had occupied your outpost, it would have been easy for them to infiltrate the Methawaw main base. So, enemies attacked your outpost to their utmost, but in vain since you Tatmadaw members are well-trained and experienced militarily. After all, they retreated from the battlefield with heavy losses. Therefore, the State Flag remained flying on the hill of your outpost. In the battle, you showed the 12 fine traditions of the Tatmadaw: a patriotic Tatmadaw, a self-disciplined Tatmadaw, a loyal Tatmadaw, a harmonious Tatmadaw, an efficient Tatmadaw, a Tatmadaw that makes self sacrifices, a noble-minded Tatmadaw, a brave Tatmadaw with capabilities, a Tatmadaw with tenacity, a diligent Tatmadaw, and a Tatmadaw that upholds Our Three Main National Causes. So, you were worthy of great honour. However, in the fierce battle, you made final sacrifice for the motherland together with Chin private Kyin Zakhok, Kayin private Saw Khu Maw, Mon private Naing Kyaw Tun, Kachin private Lun Khaung, Kayah private Bya Rai, Shan private Sai Lu, and Rakhine private San Shwe Maung.

Showing brilliant performance, the Tatmadaw undermined the KNU's plot to form a government and declare an independent region after occupying Methawaw, and managed to regain control of the whole Methawaw. In the historic battle, 12 officers and 245 other ranks sacrificed their lives for the country. It is a fine tradition of the Tatmadaw that Tatmadaw

members are ready to make final sacrifices if necessary for the mother country.

Junior, the Myanmar Tatmadaw is a patriotic one that came into existence according to the historical necessity and national necessity. In its very infancy, the Tatmadaw hand in hand with the people successfully accomplished a national duty of helping the mother country regain independence.

Tatmadaw members are those born of national people, so the Tatmadaw is a force of national brethren that always readies itself to defend the nation. In times of emergencies, the Tatmadaw stands by the people and defends the country. In that regard, in his speech to the Graduation Parade of the 52nd Intake of Defence Services Academy, Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Than Shwe said, "There are so many profound evidences in the course of the nation that the Tatmadaw stood firmly by the nation in times of emergency."

Junior, multicoloured insurgency came out in the nation in 1948, following independence, such as Communist (White Flag), Communist (Red Flag), Yebaw (White), Yebaw (Yellow), and KNDO that stuck to wrong concept and narrow-minded racism. At the time, the ruling AFPFL (Anti-Fascist People's Freedom League) government could rule only one region "Yangon" due to the nationwide raging inferno of the civil war. So, foreign media named the government Yangon government. Rural folks came under tortures and massacres of the multicoloured insurgents, while urban people were in a state of panic due to the sound of guns and cannons. Gradually, the multicoloured insurgency was leading to disintegration of the Union, and the nation was on the verge of loss of recently-regained independence. Therefore, the then prime minister entrusted duties to the Tatmadaw to put an end to internal armed conflicts, and ensure community peace. At that time, the Tatmadaw had only 10 regiments, but managed to suppress the nationwide armed insurgency and put districts and townships under the rule of the government. The storm of the internal armed insurrection abated to an extent and community peace and the rule of law could be restored owing to the operations the Tatmadaw launched at risk to life. Then, the Tatmadaw handed over the entrusted duties to the prime minister, and paid full attention to its original duty or national defence duty.

The internal armed strife was still active till January 1950, and since then Kuomintang troops intruded into Mongmao in Shan State, then Kachin, Kokang, Wa, Tangyan, Kengtung and Tachilek. Then, they infiltrated Mongmao, Mongyu, Muse, Kyugok and Pungpahkyem. Kuomintang troops posed grave dangers to the entire people by harming sovereignty of the nation.

So, the Tatmadaw had to open another front to suppress the attack by the Kuomintang troops. It launched operations "Kengtung", "Pharok", "Maw" and "Panlon" in 1950; Operation "Mogyo" in 1952; operations "Maha" and "Naganaing" in 1953; operations "Yuzana", "Bayintnaung" and "Hsinbyushin" in 1954, Operation "Yangyi Aung" in 1955; and Operation "Mekong" in 1960 to drive the intruders out of the nation's soil. In the operations, a large number of Tatmadaw members had to sacrifice their lives.

While the situations were running high, the ruling AFPFL government split into two factions namely Stable AFPFL and Clean AFPFL, vying each other for power. The ruling government was not capable of restoring stability and peace due to intra-party disunity, thus leading to group-wise clashes. Political parties founded pocket armies in order to

gain power, and leading role in the government. Taking full advantage of the terrible mess in the ruling government, insurgents accelerated their insurgency. Therefore, the people were going through the hell of stresses and strains sparked by political parties and pocket armies and insurgent groups. In consequence, the nation was again on the edge of collapse. Being incapable of restoring the nation's conditions, Prime Minister U Nu of the AFPFL government asked the Tatmadaw to restore State stability and peace as a caretaker government. On 28 October 1958, he handed over State power to the Tatmadaw. As the Caretaker Government, the Tatmadaw tried to restore stability and community peace, and then held a secure, free and fair election on 6 February 1960. Then, the Tatmadaw systematically handed over State power to the winning Pa-Hta-Sa government.

In 1962, the nation encountered the danger of Federal Policy that posed great danger to the nation. Some chieftains who were unwilling to relinquish Feudal power and some faithless political

parties secretly contacted SEATO (South-East Asia Treaty Organization) under the influence of the West Bloc. And they flagrantly submitted Federal Policy and coerced the Pa-Hta-Sa government with the intention of seceding from the Union and joining SEATO. Their scheme was to secede from the Union whether the government gave green light or not. Again the nation was standing on the point of collapse into pieces. The then government was in no position to tackle the situation. In the end, the Tatmadaw saved the Union from disintegration by restoring the State's sovereign powers on 2 March 1962.

In 1988, the people took to the streets because of general crises and discontent with the ruling Myanmar Socialist Programme Party. Internal and external subversive elements fueled the situations and generated public outrage into a wholesale unrest that dragged the image of the nation through the mire. The then government was completely unable to control anarchic disturbances that were strife across the nation. In addition, the government's whole administrative machinery came to a halt. So-called protest leaders, demonstration union leaders, public leaders and even the person, who claimed himself to be forever legal prime minister could do nothing to control and prevent the anarchic demonstrations. Old and neo-colonialists were waiting and seeing what sorts of changes would happen to seek their interest. A fleet of naval vessels of a power had intruded into the nation's waters. The entire people were totally helpless. The nation was to fall into the abyss. On 18 September 1988, the Tatmadaw saved the nation from the collapse by assuming State responsibilities.

According to the historic events I have said to you, no one can deny that the Tatmadaw stood firmly by the people and safeguarded the country in times of emergency that posed dangers to sovereignty and integration of the Union.

Junior, since 18 September 1988, on which it unavoidably took State duties, the Tatmadaw has been upholding Our Three Main National Causes and carrying out nation-building tasks the length and breadth of the nation. As a result of the Tatmadaw's earnest efforts, the whole nation, hilly and plain, enjoyed rapid development. The whole nation has seen networks of roads and railroads, and bridges spanning rivers and creeks one after another. That ensured smooth transport and swift commodity flow. The government has been implementing the Border Areas and National Races Development Project, the 24 Regions Special Development Project, and the Rural Development Project for equitable development of all parts of the Union. Junior, despite a variety of disruptions caused by internal and external elements, the nation has enjoyed all-round development with stability and

peace in two decades due to the Tatmadaw government's all-out efforts. In its time, the Tatmadaw government has improved infrastructures to a certain degree for a better future of the nation. It has been implementing the State's seven-step Road Map to shape the nation into a peaceful, modern and developed democratic one. Free and fair elections will soon take place to complete the fifth step of the Road Map. The people will have the right to freely elect people's representatives who are capable of serving the national interest faithfully. After that, as the sixth step, parliamentary sessions will be held with the elected members of parliaments. Junior, as a result of the hard work the

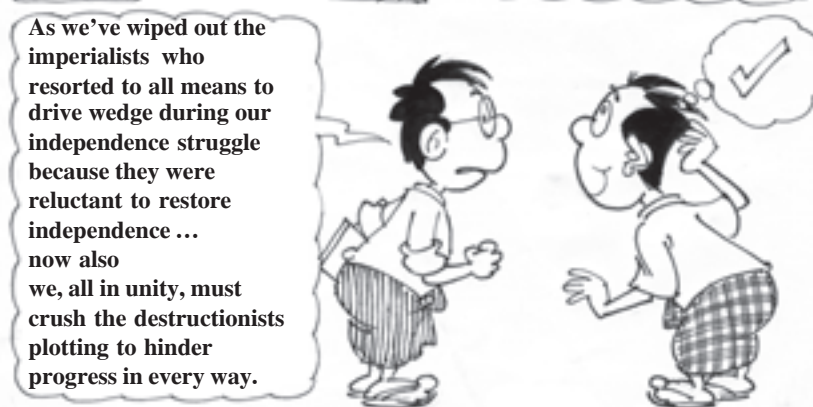

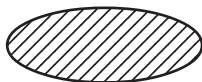

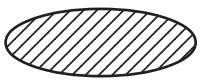

British aircraft crashes at Crete acrobatics show with no casualty

ATHENS, 24 March—A British aircraft which took part in an acrobatics show by the Red Arrows group of the Royal Air Force crashed around 2 pm local time on Tuesday near the airport of Kasteli at Herakleion in Greece's Crete Island.

Both pilots survived and are in good health, according to Greek authorities, after they ejected from the airplane using the automatic system.

There was also no re-

port of injuries among people on the ground.

The rest of the eight British aircraft in the show are now grounded on the air force base of Kasteli, as experts already started investigating the accident.

According to earlier information, the aircraft that crashed had touched slightly the wing of another aircraft, thus losing its balance and control.

The second aircraft landed safely with only minor damage.

S Korea to develop DMZ into eco-tourism area

SEOUL, 24 March—South Korea is planning to develop the demilitarized zone (DMZ) that separates South Korea and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) into an eco-tourism area, according to local media.

The plan was unveiled by the Presidential Council on National Competitiveness on Tuesday. In cooperation with nine government agencies such as the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism, the Ministry of Unification, the Ministry of Defence and the Ministry of Environment, it will create an ecological peace belt along the southern part of the four kilometre-wide, 248 kilometre-long zone, extending from the western island of Ganghwa to the east coast city of Goseong, Seoul's state-run broadcaster KBS reported.

Under the plan, bike roads, an ecological peace park and a vacation centre will be built in the area. Ten villages near the inter-Korean land border will be turned into cultural tourism villages open to visitors.

14 militants killed in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 24 March—At least 14 militants were killed and 17 others injured on Wednesday in a ground and air assault by security forces in lower Orakzai agency, Pakistan's northwest tribal area, private TV channels reported.

Security forces backed by helicopters shelled militants hideouts in lower Orakzai agency and destroyed five compounds in the bombardment.

A security personnel also was injured, according to the private TV Express. Military sources said

that the army faced no tough resistance and have secured important positions in the area, while the militants are escaping.

Pakistani military after ending its successful offensive in South Waziristan tribal agency last year shifted its focus to Orakzai agency, which is believed to be a global hub for militants.

The United States authorities have publicly praised Pakistan efforts to take on Taleban in the tribal region, which America considers as the center of Taleban and al-Qaeda remnants, from where they plot attacks against US and NATO troops in neighbouring Afghanistan.

Besides, US drones on Tuesday night fired two missiles at militants hideouts in North Waziristan tribal agency, killing at least six people, security officials said.

The theme of the summit will be "Maternal, infant and child health and development in Africa."

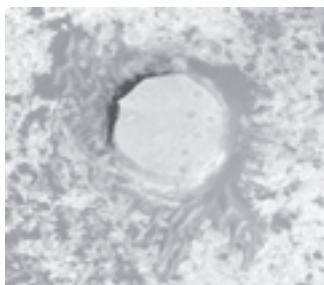
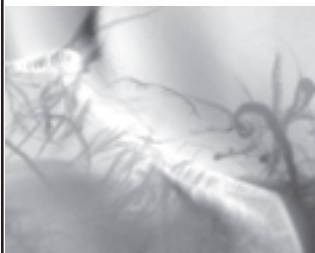

Attaching herself to an old and rusted pulley system she drops over the edge before plummeting at 40mph along a zip wire to the opposite bank half a mile away — a vertigo-inducing journey she has to take every day to get to school.

For the handful of families living in the area, 40 miles southeast of the capital Bogota, the 12 steel cables that connect one side of the valley to the other are their only access to the outside world.

5 million cigarettes stolen from truck in Germany

Thieves have stolen more than 5 million cigarettes from a truck at a highway rest area in western Germany as its driver slept in the cab.

Police said on Tuesday that the thieves spirited away the cigarettes at some point during the night — emptying about half of the vehicle's trailer.

They believe the booty was loaded onto other vehicles and driven away.

The 35-year-old Polish driver had parked his vehicle at a rest area on the A2 highway near Dortmund. Police said the stolen cigarettes likely were worth more than euro1 million (\$1.35 million).

They were traditionally made of hemp, but steel cables were installed with the advent of logging in the surrounding rainforest. When this was made illegal settlers turned their hand to farming and cattle raising.

Today, the cables are still the only transport available to those living in the area. Farmers use them to transport goods to and from the closest town and, for children like Daisy and her five-year-old brother Jamid, it is how they get to school.

Jamid is too young to safely ride the wire on his own, so she has to carry him with her in a jute bag, controlling their speed with a wooden fork.

Lectures, Exam for B.Ed Correspondence Courses Announced

Noscapine use for prostate cancer studied

SAN DIEGO, 24 March—US medical investigators say they have discovered noscapine, a cough medicine ingredient, can be used as a prophylactic treatment for prostate cancer.

The researchers from the University of California-San Diego, the Prostate Cancer Research and Education Foundation, also in San Diego, and the MedInsight Research Institute in Baltimore concluded noscapine administered as a preventive

measure might offer significant benefits in the management of prostate cancer, a disease that kills more than 28,000 men in the United States each year.

The latest research focused on pre-treating mice with noscapine before injecting them with prostate cancer cells. That, said the scientists, resulted in the tumor growth rate being two-thirds smaller in the noscapine group than the non-noscapine group.

At least 35 die in avalanche

KABUL, 24 March—The bodies of 30 people were recovered on Tuesday from the site of avalanche in a remote area of north-eastern Afghanistan, a police official said.

The remains of five other people lost in the snow slide that occurred two weeks ago have not yet been located, said police chief Aja Noor Kemtuz in Badakhshan Province. Police and rescue workers spent four days getting to the scene, he said.

Five houses were destroyed in the avalanche,

which occurred in the Arghang Khzakhka district north of Faizabad — about 30 miles (50 kilometers) south of the Tajikistan border. An estimated 500 cattle and other animals also were killed, he said.

Local residents reported the avalanche in the village of Dood Daood. The road to the village is blocked by snow for several months of the year.

"They are very poor

people living in a very remote area," the police chief said. "From this village to another village is a three days walk."

In February, at least 171 people died in an avalanche at the 12,700-foot (3,800-metre)-high Salang Pass, the major route through the Hindu Kush mountains that connects the Afghan capital of Kabul to the north of the country.

Three zoo tigers escape in Spain, killed by police

MADRID, 24 March—A zoo in Spain's Canary Islands says three tigers escaped from their cage after a mistake by an employee and were later shot by police.

Cocodrilo Park on the island of Gran Canaria says a zoo employee cleaning outside the cage before opening time on Tuesday mistakenly pushed a button that opened the door of the cage.

The park says in a statement that four of the seven tigers inside the cage stayed put but three escaped. Civil Guard police later shot and killed them. No one was injured, and there were no visitors in the zoo at the time.

The park said the cleaning employee was the only person near the cage when the animals got out.

Macao police nab man for online bombing, death threats

MACAO, 24 March—Judiciary Police (PJ) of the Macao Special Administrative Region arrested a man for his alleged involvement in online extortion and threats, including threat of killing the SAR chief executive, the local *Macao Post Daily* reported on Wednesday.

The newspaper quoted a PJ spokesman as saying that the 38-year-old local suspect posted three threats in the online forum in January 2008, saying he would blow up the Judiciary Police Headquarters, Macao Tower, the office of the chief executive and the Bureau of Telecommunications Regulation, unless the government pays him 10 million patacas (1.26 million US dollars).

In May 2008, the suspect posted a threat in the forum again, saying that he would give 100,000 patacas (12,658 US dollars) to anyone who grabbed the Beijing Olympic torch on its tour of the nation, the spokesman said.

The suspect then issued another online threat in October 2008 that he would set the Judiciary Police Headquarters and a downtown bank alight.

According to PJ, the suspect also indicated in the forum between late last month and last Sunday that he would try to kill the chief executive and the director of Judiciary Police with an incendiary device.

The suspect was taken into custody at his flat in Taipa on Monday, following a year-long investigation which was hampered by the suspect's technical expertise when covering his digital tracks.

Four killed in chemical plant accident in NW China

LANZHOU, 24 March—At least four workers died and three others were injured after molten ore spewed from a furnace of a chemical plant in Gansu Province on Tuesday, the local authority said on Wednesday.

Ore being smelted in a huge furnace of the privately-run Huize Chemical Co Ltd gushed out at 4:20 pm on Tuesday as the top layer of materials collapsed, said an official with the work safety supervision administration of Jingyuan County in Baiyin City, the site of the accident.

A stream of molten ore quickly spread out, leaving seven workers at the site seriously scalded.

Four of the workers died in hospital and three are still being treated.

An investigation team headed by the director of the provincial work safety watchdog was heading to the site, said Gou Xiaodi, an officer in charge of chemical products control with the bureau. —Xinhua

Japan's export jumps 45.3% in Feb

TOKYO, 24 March—Japan's exports surged 45.3 percent from a year earlier to 5,128.67 billion yen (56.99 billion US dollars) in February, Financial Ministry data showed on Wednesday.

The rise is the third straight monthly expansion, confirming the export-oriented economy is recovering from the worst economic downturn in decades.

The overall trade surplus came to 651.0 billion yen (7.2 billion dollars) in the month, soaring from the year-before surplus of 70.8 billion yen. The surplus was bigger than market expectation.

By region, exports to China expanded for the fourth consecutive month, up 47.7 percent to 902.42 billion yen, with demand for passenger cars, auto parts and high-tech devices strengthening.

Imports from China, Japan's No 1 trading partner, grew for the first time in 16 months, up 54.3 percent to 926.98 billion yen.

With the rest of Asia, Japan's exports rose 55.7 percent to 2,775.59 billion yen.

With the United States, exports increased for the second month running, up 50.4 percent to 837.07 billion yen, as shipments of cars in terms of value ballooned a record 129.9 percent from a year ago.

Shipments to the European Union rose for the third straight month, up 19.7 percent to 588.02 billion yen.—Xinhua

Macedonia claims out of economic recession

TIRANA, 24 March—Macedonia's economy registered 1.2 percent growth in the last quarter of 2009, which indicates the country is officially out of recession, a senior official said on Tuesday.

Finance Minister Zoran Stavreski also told a press conference that the country's gross domestic product (GDP) contracted an overall 0.7 percent in 2009, news reaching here from Skopje said.

"These results, combined with reduction of unemployment, show that Macedonia has generally managed to overcome the crisis with the lowest possible impact," Stavreski said.—Xinhua

WTO issues final ruling on US-EU dispute over Airbus subsidies

GENEVA, 24 March—The World Trade Organization (WTO) confirmed on Tuesday that it had issued its final ruling on the US-EU dispute over alleged illegal subsidies provided to the latter's aviation giant Airbus.

In a brief statement, the WTO said the expert panel responsible for the Airbus case had issued its final report to the two concerned parties, but the contents of the report re-

mained confidential.

According to some trade sources, the WTO ruling backed parts of the US allegations that European governments had unfairly subsidized Airbus. Airbus said, however, that some 70 percent of the US claims had been rejected.

Both sides can appeal the case.

The United States first brought the case to the WTO in 2004, alleging that

the EU had provided billions of Euros in various forms of subsidies to Airbus, including so-called "launch aid" to its A380 and other major aircraft models, which violated WTO regulations.

In the same year, the EU also brought a case against Airbus' American rival, Boeing, alleging that the US government had funded the company illegally.

KATHMANDU, 24 March—Nepal has targeted northern neighbour China as a second largest significant market for its tourism industry after southern neighbour India.

Nepal has projected China as its second largest market, at the time when country has launched a national tourism campaign "Nepal Tourism Year-2011 (NTY)" to attract more than one million tourists in an international level.

Officials at Nepal Tourism Board (NTB) said that they have outlined India and China a significant market due to their booming economy and closeness with Nepal.

At the time Nepal is preparing to greet one

million international tourists in the country, it is also mulling plans to allure 101,324 Chinese outbound tourists whereas it has estimated to welcome 262,588 tourists from India in the year 2011.

Financial regulator shuts GunnAllen; 400 lose jobs

NEW YORK, 24 March—The Financial Industry Regulatory Authority's move on Monday to close Tampa, Florida-based broker-dealer

GunnAllen Financial Inc has left more than 400 financial advisers searching for a new firm.

FINRA warned GunnAllen on Friday that it had fallen below its mandatory net capital requirements, a person familiar with the situation said. The firm is no longer permitted to trade in its client accounts and the assets continue to be held by the firm's third party custodian.

A FINRA spokesman declined to comment. As a matter of course, when a firm is shuttered by FINRA, the regulator launches an investigation.

According to Investment News, which broke

the story early on Monday, GunnAllen is facing a raft of investor lawsuits related to the activities of former GunnAllen adviser Frank Bluestein, who allegedly operated a \$250 million Ponzi scheme. Mindy Diamond, a Chester, New Jersey-based industry recruiter, said her firm has received a number of calls from GunnAllen advisers looking for a new home. But she said most have low production figures and their options are limited.

"Most of them aren't going to end up at a Wells Fargo or Raymond James. They're looking at second tier firms or lower," she said.—Internet

Budget airline easyJet is poised to appoint Carolyn McCall as its new chief executive, in a surprise move for the veteran media boss, reports said on Wednesday.

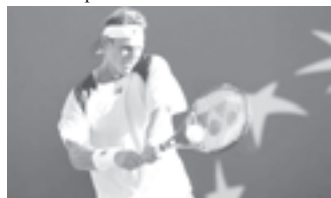

The 21-year-old Southern Methodist University sophomore was found dead in his dorm room on 22 Jan.

His sister, Brooke Baker, says her brother was prescribed the medications after suffering an injury.

Brazilian soccer player Love denies relation to drug traffickers

RIO DE JANEIRO, 24 March—The striker of Brazilian Flamengo's soccer team, Vagner Love, denied his relation to drug traffickers when he appeared on Tuesday at the 15th district of the Rio de Janeiro police department.

The athlete was summoned in order to clarify his activity inside of the Rocinha slum after photos were displayed of him alongside heavily armed men.

On February 27, Love was photographed inside of the slum, escorted by a fleet of armed men on motorcycles. For nearly 40 minutes, the athlete gave his testimony to officers Alexandre Estelita and Rodrigo Martesiano.

The authorities questioned his awareness of criminal behavior inside of the slum and his relationship with drug traffickers.

"I told them everything I knew and did not lie. I told them that I was in the slum to go to a funk party. But, I don't know any drug traffickers and am not connected to them in any way. Looking back, I can see how it was not the best idea at the time," said Love.—Xinhua

LONDON, 24 March—Wolves took a huge step towards securing their Premier League status with a 3-1 win away to fellow strugglers West Ham at Upton Park here on Tuesday.

Victory left Mick McCarthy's men seven points clear of the bottom three with seven games left but this defeat left the Hammers just three points above the relegation zone.

Kevin Doyle sent Wolves on their way before two goals in three second-half minutes from Ronald Zubar and Matthew Jarvis sealed victory.

Guillermo Franco came off the bench to score for West Ham in injury time but the result had long since ceased to be an issue.

Mini Generators Make Energy from Random Ambient Vibrations

SCIENTIFIC DAILY, 24 March — Tiny generators developed at the University of Michigan could produce enough electricity from random, ambient vibrations to power a wristwatch, pacemaker or wireless sensor.

The energy-harvesting devices, created at U-M's Engineering Research Center for Wireless Integrated Microsystems, are highly efficient at providing renewable electrical power from arbitrary, non-periodic vibrations. This type of vibration is a byproduct of traffic driving on bridges, machinery operating in factories and humans moving their limbs, for example.
