Premier of the State Council of the People's Republic of China Mr Wen Jiabao is an ethnic Han and born in September 1942 in Tianjin. He joined the Communist Party of China (CPC) in April 1965 and began working in September 1967. He graduated from the Beijing Institute of Geology, majoring in geological structure and postgraduate education in Engineering.

From 1960 to 1965, he was a student in Geological Surveying and prospecting of No. 1 Department of Geology and Minerals at Beijing Institute

of Geology. From 1965 to 1968, he was a postgraduate majoring in geological structure at Beijing Institute of Geology.

From 1968 to 1978, he was a technician and political instructor of the Geo-mechanics Team under Gansu Provincial Geological Bureau and head of its political section and became a Member of Standing Committee of CPC Committee of the Geo-mechanics Team under Gansu Provincial Geological Bureau and deputy head of the team from 1978 to 1979.

From 1979 to 1982, he was a Deputy Section Chief Engineer and Deputy Director-General of Gansu Provincial Geological Bureau.

From 1982 to 1983, he was a Director-General of the Policy and Law Research office of the Ministry of Geology and Mineral Resources and member of its Leading Party of Members' Group.

From 1983 to 1985, he was a Vice Minister of Geology and Mineral Resources, member and Deputy Secretary of its Leading Party Members Group and Director-General of its Political Department.

From 1985 to 1987, he was a Deputy Director, Director of the General Office of the CPC Central Committee.

From 1987 to 1992, he was an

alternate member of the Secretariat of the CPC Central Committee and concurrently Director of the General Office of the CPC Central Committee, and Secretary of the Work Committee of Department under CPC Central Committee.

From 1992 to 1993, he was an alternate member of Political Bureau of

CPC Central Committee and member of the Secretariat CPC Central Committee, Director of General Office of the CPC and Central Committee and secretary of Work Committee of Departments under the CPC Central Committee.

Applications for registration of political party scrutinized, passed

NAY PYI TAW, 1 June — Of the parties that have been allowed to form as political parties, the Union Solidarity and Development Party submitted the application for registration of political party to the Union Election Commission today.

Of 32 parties that submitted applications to register as political parties, the commission has found the following parties to be in accord with the Political Parties Registration Law and Rules, and thus the commission granted permission to them to register as political parties today. They are as follows:-

- (2) Chin Progressive Party
- (3) Inn National Development Party
- (4) Rakhine Nationalities Development Party

Up to date, there are 42 parties that submitted applications to form or to continue existence as political parties. Al Qaeda top leader killed, reports

BEIJING, 1 June— Al Qaeda's top leader has been killed in a missile strike in Pakistan-Afghanistan border area, *CNN* reported on Tuesday.

Al Qaeda announced the death of Mustafa Abu Yazid without detailing the circumstances of Yazid's death. But it did say his wife, three of his daughters, a granddaughter and others were killed, according to the Maryland-based SITE Intelligence Group.

Yazid, an Egyptian national, is believed to be a financial manager for al Qaeda, as well as a co-founder of the terrorist group, according to SITE.

Most recently, he announced that Al Qaeda took responsibility for a 30 Dec attack on a base in eastern Afghanistan that killed seven CIA officers and consultants and a Jordanian army captain, *CNN* reported.

LAHORE, 1 June— At least 12 people were reportedly killed in an on-going terrorist attack at the Jinnah Hospital in Pakistan's eastern city of Lahore, which started at around 12 o'clock (local time) on Monday night.

The 12 people killed included 4 policemen. At least three to four unknown gunmen were involved in the terrorist attack. The gunmen attacked the emergency ward of the Jinnah Hospital where several injured people of the Friday attacks in Lahore as well the terrorists arrested under injured condition of the Friday massacre were admitted.

Local media reports said that the hospital attackers held patients, attendants and hospital staff hostage while firing back at the police who arrived at the spot shortly after the attack was launched.

Latest reports from *Xinhua* sources in Lahore said the attackers have run away after a brief crossfire with the police. —*Xinhua*

At least 12 shot in Chicago

CHICAGO, 1 June — At least 12 people were shot and three of them died from their injuries after separate shooting incidents throughout the city between Sunday afternoon and Monday morning, the *Chicago Tribune* reported.

The shootings took place in the south, southwest, west and north parts of the city, the newspaper said on its website.

A 27-year-old man who was shot in his chest multiple times at his residence late Sunday night in the 6100 block of South Bishop Street was pronounced dead at midnight at a local hospital, police said.

An 18-year-old man who was shot in the chest

Sunday night in Chicago's Brighton Park neighborhood was pronounced dead minutes later.

Another man, described as being in his 20s, suffered multiple gunshot wounds early Monday morning in the 2600 block of South Ridgeway Avenue, police said. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Early Monday morning, a person was shot in the leg on the North Side in Chicago's Uptown neighborhood.

There were several other shooting incidents in other parts of the city between Sunday afternoon and Monday morning. No suspect has been arrested for any of the shootings.

Indonesia hosts international conference on palm oil

JAKARTA, 1 June— Indonesian city of Yogyakarta hosts International Oil Palm Conference (IOPC) that commenced on Tuesday, scheduled to last through Thursday, attracting more than 1,000 people from 23 countries.

"The enormous number of participants in the conference shows appreciation and attention of international community towards the development of palm oil industry," said Witjaksana Darmosarkoro on the sidelines of the opening ceremony, who is the head of Indonesia's Palm Oil Research Institute (PPKS), the co-organizer of the conference. Participants of the conference are scheduled to discuss 63 researches conducted by palm oil plantation experts from across the world, including palm oil enrichment, palm oil management, the palm oil business issues and product certification. —*Xinhua*

BRUSSELS, 1 June—Jobless rate in the 16-nation Eurozone hit 10.1 percent in April, reaching new record high since 1998, European Union statistical office Eurostat said on Tuesday.

Sexual, urinary health boosted in exercisers, nonsmokers

RALEIGH, 1 June—For people who need more reasons to start exercising and steer clear of smoking, new research finds that moving around and rejecting cigarettes can improve urinary health in women and sexual health in men.

In one study, researchers surveyed more than 2,000 Finnish women, aged 18 to 79, about smoking and their

urinary health.

After the investigators adjusted the statistics so they wouldn't be thrown off by factors such as medication use and lifestyle, the researchers found that former and current smokers were 1.8 to 2.7 times more likely to need to urinate urgently, and 1.7 to 3.0 times more likely to need to urinate more frequently compared to

those who never smoked.

In another study, researchers examined surveys taken by 178 healthy men at a VA medical center in North Carolina.

Even after adjusting their statistics for factors such as age and race, the study authors found that those who exercised more often reported better sexual function.

NEW YORK, 1 June—A good night's sleep is essential for good health, but certain conditions can keep you from getting the sleep you need.

The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention describes common sleep disorders and their characteristics.

Insomnia, which involves difficulty falling asleep, staying asleep or waking up too early.

Narcolepsy, which involves extreme sleepiness and sudden muscle weakness during the day, or suddenly falling asleep during the day.—Internet

Risk of miscarriage linked to antidepressants

OTTAWA, 1 June—Women who take a certain class of antidepressants during pregnancy may increase their risk of having a miscarriage by 68 percent, Canadian researchers report.

Antidepressant use is common during pregnancy, with up to 3.7 percent of women taking the drugs during the first trimester. Stopping treatment can lead to a return of depression and other symptoms, and previous studies of the medications' effects on the fetus have been small and had contradictory results. But the Canadian case-control study on more than 5,000 women found that by controlling for other factors associated with miscarriage, taking antidepressants known as selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs) during pregnancy led to an increased risk of miscarriage.—Internet

Soaring costs force Canada to reassess health model

TORONTO, 1 June—Pressured by an aging population and the need to rein in budget deficits, Canada's provinces are taking tough measures to curb healthcare costs, a trend that could erode the principles of the popular state-funded system.

Ontario, Canada's most populous province, kicked off a fierce battle with drug companies and pharmacies when it said earlier this year it would halve generic drug prices and eliminate "incentive fees" to generic drug manufacturers.

British Columbia is replacing block grants to hospitals with fee-

for-procedure payments and Quebec has a new flat health tax and a proposal for payments on each medical visit—an idea that critics say is an

illegal user fee.

And a few provinces are also experimenting with private funding for procedures such as hip, knee and cataract surgery.—Internet

Frequent urination at night linked to raised death risk

SAN FRANCISCO, 1 June—People who wake up frequently during the night to urinate are at an increased risk of death even after accounting for chronic conditions that are known to cause the problem, two new studies show.

The findings, scheduled to be presented Sunday at the American Urological Association's annual meeting in San Francisco, suggest that

frequent urination at night, or nocturia, is a predictor of mortality in adults of all ages rather than just the elderly, and that other unrecognized medical conditions may be contributing factors.

In the first study, researchers at the New England Research Institutes in Watertown, Mass., examined the health records of nearly 16,000 men and women aged 20 and older, and found that those who

woke up to urinate two or more times a night had a higher risk of mortality than those who made less than two nighttime bathroom trips. The association between nocturia and mortality remained even after adjusting for coexisting conditions, such as diabetes and cardiovascular disease, and was stronger in those aged 20 to 64 than it was in those aged 65 and older.—Internet

'I thought I was too young for a blood clot'

PORTSMOUTH, 1 June—When teenager Billie-Jo Twigg felt a pain in her leg she thought she had sprained a muscle. Even when the pain became sharp and shooting and her leg swollen she was unconcerned. It was not until her biology teacher, Caroline Morgan, urged her to get her leg checked, that she took it seriously.

But within hours doctors had found three clots in her leg and Billie Jo feels lucky to be alive.

The 19-year-old, from Portsmouth, had believed that at her age she could not have had such life-threatening clots. What's quite scary

is that I was due to go on a college trip to Iceland a couple of days later, and so the blood clots could have got a lot worse or moved while I was on the plane," she said. "Caroline telling me to go to a doctor literally saved my life." But others are not so lucky. Statistics obtained from the Office of National Statistics (ONS) show for the first time that blood clots in the under-40s have

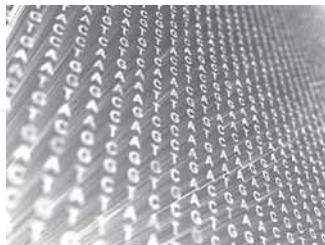
claimed 1,075 deaths over four years (2005-8) - 60 of these deaths were aged 20 and under.

Powerful genome barcoding system reveals large-scale variation in human DNA



Genetic variation on the order of thousands to hundreds of thousands of DNA's smallest pieces — large swaths varying in length or location or even showing up in reverse order — appeared 4,205 times in a comparison of DNA from just four people, according to a new study.

WASHINGTON, 1 June—Genetic abnormalities are most often discussed in terms of differences so miniscule they are actually called “snips” — changes in a single unit along the 3 billion that make up the entire string of human DNA.

“There’s a whole world beyond

SNPs — single nucleotide polymorphisms — and we’ve stepped into that world,” says Brian Teague, a doctoral student in genetics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. “There are much bigger changes in there.”

Variation on the order of thousands to hundreds of thousands of DNA’s smallest pieces — large swaths varying in length or location or even showing up in reverse order — appeared 4,205 times in a comparison of DNA from just four people, according to a study published on 31 May in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*.

Those structural differences popped into clear view through computer analysis of more than 500 linear feet of DNA molecules analyzed by the powerful genome mapping system developed over nearly two decades by David C. Schwartz, professor of chemistry and genetics at UW-Madison.

Faster computers with nanotechnology

GOTHENBURG, 1 June —The silicon transistors in your computer may be replaced in ten years by transistors based on carbon nanotubes. This is what scientists at the University of Gothenburg are hoping — they have developed a method to control the nanotubes during production. Silicon is subject to certain limitations, and industry is looking for a

replacement. The electronics industry has net annual sales of over USD 200 billion, and this means that the development is being fuelled by powerful forces.

Scientist Johannes Svensson from the Department of Physics at the University of Gothenburg has investigated the manufacture and use of carbon

nanotubes in his PhD thesis. I don’t believe that it will be cheaper to build transistors from another material than silicon, but carbon nanotubes can be used to produce smaller and faster components. This will also result in computers that consume less energy” says Johannes Svensson.

S Korea firm to put cable TV on Internet

SEOUL, 1 June—A South Korean cable television company said it launched a service on the Internet on Tuesday allowing viewers to access their favourite shows anywhere.

CJ HelloVision said the “Tving” service offers 53 live channels plus video-on-demand, a service similar to that offered by US cable operator Comcast.

Tving at first will only be accessible on devices such as desktop computers and laptops but the company also plans to introduce a version for mobile

devices.

Users will pay 3,500 won (three dollars) a month for full access, much lower than for conventional cable TV services which range from 8,000-31,000 won.

“Tving has better quality and convenience than original Internet protocol television and more mobility than television,” CJ HelloVision spokesman Kim Hae-Young told AFP.

Kim said the N-Screen strategy — offering cable television programmes on numerous platforms such

as mobile phones and the Internet — is gaining importance within the business.

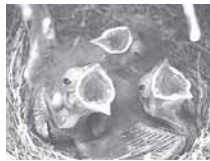

Natural selection for moderate testosterone surprises scientists

BLOOMINGTON, 1 June —A field study of the relationship between testosterone and natural selection in an American songbird, the dark-eyed junco, has defied some expectations and confirmed others.

Scientists from Indiana University Bloomington, the University of Virginia, Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis, and the University of Southern Mississippi report in the June issue of *The American Naturalist* (now online) that extreme testosterone production — high or low — puts male dark-eyed junco at

a disadvantage in both survival and reproduction outside their semi-monogamous breeding pairs. The results are based on a wild population of juncos

studied near the University of Virginia’s Mountain Lake Biological Station.

“Our goal in this study was to characterize natural variation in testosterone production in the wild and to learn how that relates to natural variation in survival and reproductive success,” said Joel McGlothlin, a Virginia postdoctoral fellow who conducted the project as an IU Bloomington PhD student. “We learned there are far more complex things going on here than we expected.”

Animal study reveals new target for antidepressants

NEW YORK, 1 June—University of Michigan scientists have provided the most detailed picture yet of a key receptor in the brain that influences the effectiveness of serotonin-related antidepressants, such as Prozac.

The findings, which appear online Monday ahead of print in the journal *Proceedings of the National Academy of*

Sciences, open the door to providing a more targeted treatment of depression and anxiety with fewer side effects.

Depressive disorders change a person’s mood, emotions and physical well-being and can co-occur with anxiety disorders and substance abuse.

“There are big drawbacks in the current

therapies for depression,” says senior author John Traynor, Ph.D., professor of pharmacology at the U-M Medical School and director of the U-M Substance Abuse Research Center. “Therapeutic benefits are delayed, there are unwanted side effects, and it’s not unusual for depressive symptoms to return.”—Internet

Particle chameleon caught in the act of changing

ROME, 1 June—Researchers on the OPERA experiment at the INFN’s Gran Sasso laboratory in Italy today announced the first direct observation of a tau

particle in a muon neutrino beam sent through the Earth from CERN², 730 km away. This is a significant result, providing the final missing piece of a puzzle that has been challenging science since the 1960s, and giving tantalizing hints of new physics to

come.

The neutrino puzzle began with a pioneering and ultimately Nobel Prize winning experiment conducted by US scientist Ray Davis beginning in the 1960s. He observed far fewer neutrinos arriving at the Earth from the Sun than solar models predicted: either solar models were wrong, or something was happening to the neutrinos on their way.

Indonesia expects extra \$74 mln from oil production

JAKARTA, 1 June—Indonesian government expected to book additional state revenue of about 74 million US dollars a year from the change in a crude oil-to-gas swap agreement between two energy giants Chevron Pacific and ConocoPhillips, local media reported here on Tuesday.

Under the original swap agreement, as much as 50,000 barrels of crude oil per day (bpd) from Chevron's Duri field in Riau were exchanged for around 375 Billion British Thermal Units of gas per Day (BBTUD) from ConocoPhillips's Grissik gas field in Southern Sumatra. Chevron injected the gas into the Duri field to enhance oil recovery.

The government asked the companies to convert the swap agreement to a normal gas-sales agreement last year.

Under the new agreement, Chevron will buy ConocoPhillips' gas under a normal gas-sales-and-purchasing agreement.

With the change, which will begin on 1 Aug, the 50,000 bpd of oil previously swapped to ConocoPhillips' gas will be added to Chevron's crude oil production. It means that the government will receive a bigger share from the company's oil production.

"The agreement will secure a long-term gas supply, which is very critical for Chevron's operation," Priyono was quoted by the *Jakarta Post* daily as saying.

The final amount of the estimated 74 million US dollars revenue increase will depend on the actual sales price of the Duri crude oil, he added.

BEIJING, 1 June—China's manufacturing activity slowed in May, as the effects of government tightening measures to prevent the economy from overheating kicked in, official and independent surveys showed on Tuesday.

The HSBC China Manufacturing PMI, or purchasing managers index, fell to 52.7 last

month from a revised figure of 55.2 in April, an 11-month low, indicating the recovery of China's manufacturing sector lost some momentum, the bank said.

A separate survey released by a government agency on Tuesday showed manufacturing activity had dropped to 53.9 in May from 55.7 in April.

HSBC's results are based on interviews with purchasing managers at more than 400 companies, while the survey by the China Federation of Logistics and Purchasing covers more than 700 firms.

The government survey predicted the Chinese economy would continue to grow rapidly, but at a moderately slower pace.

Beijing has announced a series of measures to rein in bank lending to calm inflationary pressures and avoid a damaging bubble in the real estate market.

China's economy grew by a blistering 11.9 percent in the first quarter of 2010, fuelling fears the booming economy was at risk of overheating.—Internet

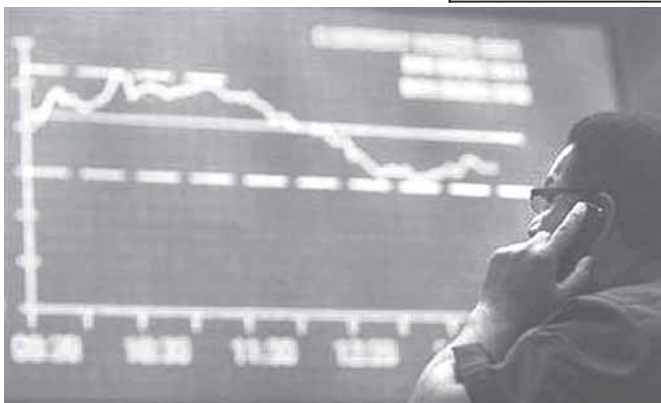

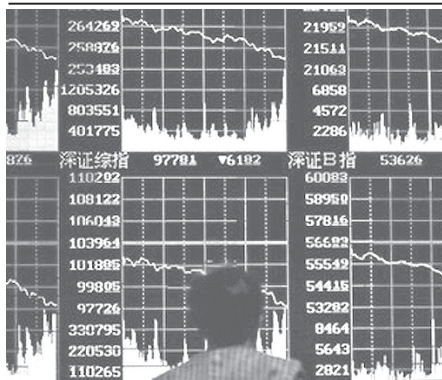

The 2688 feet long broad crest type Bala Min Htin Bridge on Myitkyina-Bhamo Road was commissioned on 14 November 1998. So far, Kachin State has seen 20 over-180-foot bridges. Ongoing project bridges in Kachin State are 700 feet long

Maunghmulon suspension bridge crossing Malikha River on Putao-Htawadan-Nawngmon Road, and 3215 feet long Katha-Bhamo rail bridge (Sinkhan Bridge) on Mandalay-Tagaung-Bhamo Road.

Daw Aye Aye Aung and her family moved from Mogaung, so they

named their restaurant "Mogaung Restaurant" after the name of the town they had migrated from.

Smooth transport is a fundamental requirement for regional development. With peace, Kachin State sees a growing number of roads and bridges. As a result, social, education and health care tasks can be carried out extensively even in border areas.

Tourists warned of Vanuatu volcanic eruption

WELLINGTON, 1 June— Airlines and tourists were being warned of the danger of ash and volcanic rocks erupting from Mt Yasur on Vanuatu's Tana island.

The Volcanic Ash Advisory Center in Wellington has reported an ash cloud, up to 1.8 km high and covers 340 sq km, which has the potential to stop flights from being able to land there, according to Radio New Zealand on Tuesday.

Vanuatu's government says tourists are not allowed to visiting the volcano.

The government was assessing ten nearby villages for the affects of gas and ash from the crater of Mt Yasur. Airlines said services to Vanuatu are not likely to be disrupted by a volcanic ash cloud from Mount Yasur on Tanna Island.

Air Vanuatu which operates both domestic and international flights, said it has been closely monitoring the situation. However, no flights have been canceled so far.

Air New Zealand said none of its services to Vanuatu are expected to be affected by the ash.

Abu Dhabi needs to double number of doctors, nurses

ABU DHABI, 1 June—Abu Dhabi, the largest member of the seven-strong federation United Arab Emirates (UAE), needs to double the number of doctors and nurses over the next decade to cope with its aging and rapidly expanding population, a local English daily reported on Tuesday.

The number of doctors would need to rise from 5,300 to as many as 10,700, The National said, citing a report released by the Health Authority-Abu Dhabi (HAAD).

According to the HAAD Statistics 2009 report, the number of nurses would need to increase from 6,900 to 13,900.

It also highlighted shortfalls of medical workers in such fields as pediatrics, gynecology and orthopedics.

Some 16 percent of doctors and 13

percent of nurses quit their jobs each year, the report said.

"If churn rates remain at their 2009 level, this will require some 1,600 doctors and almost 1,800 nurses to be recruited annually," it said.

The report also said due to an expected doubling of the expatriate population by 2019, hospital bed capacity must rise by 55 percent.

Abu Dhabi lags behind the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) in its provision of hospital beds. It has 1.3 beds per 1,000 people, compared with 2.7 in Bahrain, 2.5 in Qatar and 2.2 in Saudi Arabia, according to The National.

Earlier this week, the UAE National Bureau of Statistics said in a report that the Gulf nation's population has reached 8.19 million and is continuing to grow.

HONG KONG, 1 June— Hong Kong reported 101 cases of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) infections in the first quarter of 2010, the Center for Health Protection of the Hong Kong government announced on Tuesday. The new cases found has brought the cumulative total of reported HIV infections in Hong Kong to 4,544 since 1984.

Of the 101 HIV cases, which comprised 75 males and 26 females, 20 acquired the infection via heterosexual contact, 41 via homosexual or bisexual contact, four through drug injection, and one through mother-to-child transmission.

India, France to hold joint air combat exercise next month

NEW DELHI, 1 June— India and France will hold a joint air combat exercise next month, where six Indian Sukhoi-30MKI fighters, two IL-76 heavy-lift aircraft and a IL-78 mid-air refueler will take part, local media reported on Tuesday.

"The exercise will help to further enhance interoperability between the Indian and French air forces since pilots as well as the ground crew will get to see each other's operational, technical and administrative practices from close quarters," local daily *The Times of India* quoted an Indian Air Force official as saying.

The exercise, Garuda-IV, will be

held at the Istres airbase in France from June 14 to 25. It comes at a time when India and France are all set now to ink the around 100 billion rupee (2 billion US dollars) deal to upgrade the 56 Mirage-2000 fighter jets in IAF's combat fleet.

The first four to six Mirages will be upgraded in France, with the rest 50 being upgraded in India under transfer of technology.

India's defense ties with France are quite broadbased, including as they do the over 200 billion rupee (4 billion US dollars) project to build six French Scorpene submarines currently underway at Mazagon Docks.

Top political advisor calls for coordinated regional development

TIJIAN, 1 June — China's top political advisor Jia Qinglin has called for greater coordination between five north China regions — Beijing, Tianjin, Hebei, Shanxi and Inner Mongolia — in order to spur national economic development.

Jia, chairman of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC), told a forum for regional economic development Monday that regional economic development should be coordinated nationwide.

This could be done by improving innovation ability, advancing key sciences and technologies, and establishing more innovation centers and research transformation bases.

To promote regional development, efforts were also needed to optimize

industrial structure and layout, to develop cultural industries and to set up a modern industrial system characterized by high-end manufacturing and advanced services, Jia said.

Improved infrastructure and ecological environments, as well as modern transportation systems, were important guarantees to regional development, Jia said.

He called for efforts to deal with unbalanced regional development, by giving preferential policies and government support to rural and less-developed areas.

In addition, reforms in administration, finance, taxation and social management were needed for a more healthy development for private investment, Jia said.—Xinhua

Tobacco control needs stronger smoke signals

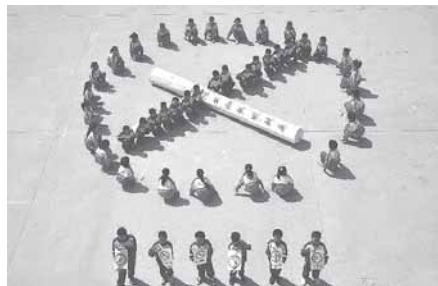
BEIJING, 1 June — China will report its progress on tobacco control to the member conference of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) next year, but many experts say that there is still a lot to be done.

"China is unlikely to meet the FCTC targets by 2011," Cui Xiaobo, professor of social medicine at the Capital Medicine University, a tobacco control expert, said ahead of this year's World No Tobacco Day on Monday.

Among its protocols the FCTC requires all member countries to implement a comprehensive ban on smoking in public places by January 2011. "We know the targets are challenging to all member countries, particularly China, which is concerned about the negative impact of tobacco control on its

economy," said WHO China Representative Michael O'Leary.

"But we believe China can achieve the targets when the message gets across to the government that the benefits of tobacco control outweigh the economic concerns." Currently, among the central government agencies only the Ministry of Health has met the requirements of the Convention, banning indoor smoking at all medical institutions and administrations across the country by the end of 2011.—Internet

Cabbie swallows device to avoid routine check in Shanghai

BEIJING, 1 June — A cab driver swallowed a small, taxi-meter device used to illegally cheat on fares after he was stopped for a routine check outside the World Expo site by the traffic authority in Shanghai. Huang Xiaoyong, official of the Shanghai Urban Communications Administration Bureau, yesterday said the driver, not identified, was taken for investigation.

If the driver had installed the device, he will be stripped of his license. The incident happened at a check last week outside the Expo Site in the Pudong New Area. It was recorded in a local TV news report.

When the driver was asked to get out his car for the check, he suddenly tore down the little motor on the meter and swallowed it, astonishing everyone at the scene.

Officers soon caught the man but failed to get the device out by holding him down. The driver even wet himself when caught by the officers, witnesses said. Wu Runyuan, a Shanghai traffic law enforcement team official, said the installation of a little motor on the meter was a common trick for cabbies to overcharge passengers.

With the little device the driver can easily cheat on taxi fares. But Wu said the practice was banned and that a cabbie's license will be revoked if caught.

**Skype 3G comes to iPhone**

BEIJING, 1 June — iPhone users can make calls over AT&T's 3G network since Skype has announced that it can provide free VOIP calling via 3G wireless, according to media reports. The new software, dubbed Skype 2.0, offers improved voice quality, a better call quality indicator, faster start-up time and access to the dial-pad from the iPhone home screen, according to the Luxembourg-based company.

It already features a range of free services, such as voice and video calls and instant messages to other Skype users. The internet calling service said the 3G calls will be free "until at least the end of August 2010, after which there will be a small monthly fee.—Xinhua

China supercomputer ranked world's second-fastest

BEIJING, 1 June—A Chinese supercomputer Xingyun was ranked the world's second-fastest machine, according to the TOP500 list.

On the list issued on Monday by US and European researchers, the Xingyun (Nebulae) system came in behind the US Department of Energy's Jaguar in Oak Ridge, Tennessee.

Xingyun is the server part of "Dawning 6000," jointly developed by Dawning Information Industry Co. Ltd, Chinese Academy of Sciences Calculation Institution, and the South China Supercomputing Center, which aims to meet the application demand of "cloud computing," or more

specifically scientific computing, intelligent Internet searching and DNA sequencing.

Experts say one second of its work may take a whole day for a dual-core personal computer.

The Xingyun is capable of sustained computing of 1.271 petaflops — or 1,271 trillion calculations — per second, according to TOP500. It is said the Jaguar was capable of sustained computing of 1.75 petaflops. Supercomputers are used for complex work such as modeling weather systems, simulating nuclear explosions and designing jetliners.—*Internet*

Formal talks of Russian, EU leaders begin

ROSTOV-ON-DON, 1 June—The official talks between leaders of Russia and the European Union (EU) at their 25th summit kicked off Tuesday at Russia's southern city of Rostov-on-Don.

Among the summit agenda are Russia's accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO), Partnership for Modernization as an initiative to deepen bilateral strategic cooperation, lifting of visa regime, a replacement pact for comprehensive Russia-EU partnership, as well

as international issues such as Iran, climate change and the financial crisis.

The summit themed "facing the future" will be attended by Russian President Dmitry Medvedev, European Council President Herman van Rompuy and European Commission President Jose Manuel Barroso, Vice President and High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy Catherine Ashton and Trade Commissioner Karel de Gucht.

Strong quake jolts Bangladesh, no casualty reported

DHAKA, 1 June—A strong earthquake, measuring 6.3 on the Richter scale, shook Bangladesh early on Tuesday morning, but no casualty and damage have so far been reported.

Farha Diba, a meteorologist of the Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD) told *Xinhua* that the location of the earthquake was near Andaman islands in India and the distance of the epicenter was 1,397 km south of the capital Dhaka.

She said the quake which struck at 1:51 am local time was felt in many parts of Bangladesh.

Fire service men said they did not receive any report of damage or casualty yet.

Experts said Bangladesh, which sits on the zone of earthquake, is prone to tremors.

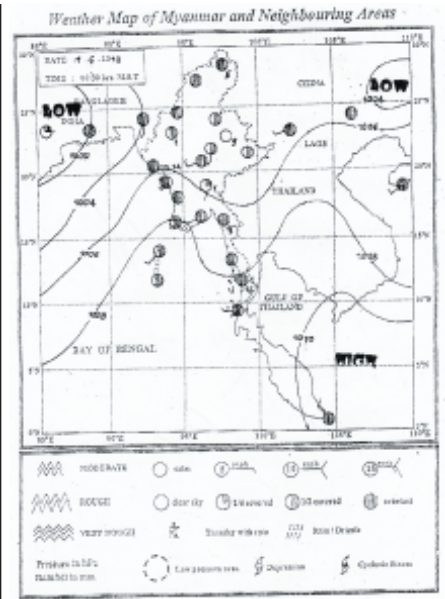
Brazil giant to explore NZ oil

Revealing the ancient chinese secret of sticky rice mortar



LONDON, 1 June — Scientists have discovered the secret behind an ancient Chinese super-strong mortar made from sticky rice, the delicious “sweet rice” that is a modern mainstay in Asian dishes. They also concluded that the mortar — a paste used to bind and fill gaps between bricks, stone blocks and other construction materials — remains the best available material for restoring ancient buildings. Their article appears in the American Chemical Society (ACS) monthly journal, *Accounts of Chemical Research*. Bingjian Zhang, Ph.D., and colleagues note that construction workers in ancient China developed sticky rice mortar about 1,500 years ago by mixing sticky rice soup with the standard mortar ingredient. That ingredient is slaked lime, limestone that has been calcined, or heated to a high temperature, and then exposed to water.—Internet
