Maintain tube-wells for long-term supply of potable water

The Ministry for Progress of Border Areas and National Races and Development Affairs organized the 18th cash donation ceremony for supply of clean drinking water to rural areas, at Mount Pleasant Hotel in Nay Pyi Taw Ottarathiri on 10 August.

In April 1999, the Head of State gave guidance to supply potable water to all villages of Sagaing, Magway and Mandalay Divisions by implementing the 10-year plan.

As the rural region clean drinking water supply 10-year plan commenced in 2000-2001 financial year, the government, the Development Affairs Committees, wellwishers, social organizations and international social organizations contributed funds.

As part of effort to supply potable water to the rural regions, every village has been equipped with one tube-well each as the first priority. Moreover, two to three tube-wells were sunk at some villages based on population of the villages.

At present, a total of 8,042 villages in Sagaing, Magway and Mandalay Divisions and 15,183 villages of other States and Divisions have access to potable water by cent per cent. So far, a total of 23,225 villages in all States and Divisions have been provided with potable water.

At the 18th cash donation ceremony, altogether 111 wellwishers donated K 243.43 million to the funds for implementing the clean drinking water supply project.

Water is a gift of nature. It is valuable and essential for all the human beings. In response to goodwill of the government and noble deeds of the wellwishers, the people are to harmoniously join hands with the government in maintaining the tube-wells and contributing to sinking more tube-wells in the regions in need of clean water.

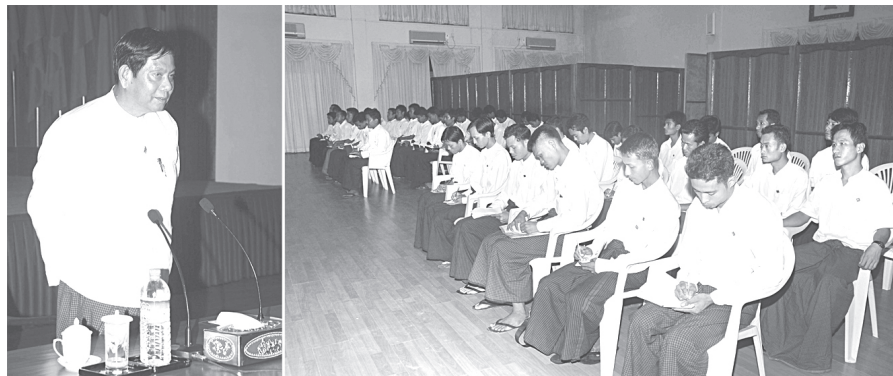

2 soldiers killed in Iraq's violence

BAGHDAD, 13 Aug — Two Iraqi soldiers were killed and five security members wounded in three attacks, including a suicide car bombing, in central and northern Iraq on Thursday, the police said.

A suicide car bomber struck an Iraqi army checkpoint at night outside a military base in the village of Zaidan in

Abu Ghraib area, just west of Baghdad, killing a soldier and wounding two others, a source from the operation command of Anbar province told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity. Also in the province, two policemen were wounded in a roadside bomb explosion near their patrol in an area south of Fallujah City, some 50 km west of

Baghdad, the source said. In Iraq's northern province of Nineveh, a soldier was killed and another wounded when gunmen attacked their checkpoint in western Mosul, the provincial capital city, some 400 km north of Baghdad, a provincial police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Three cops killed, wounded in Falluja

FALLUJA, 13 Aug—

An officer was killed and two policemen were wounded in two separate incidents near Falluja, a police source said.

"Unknown gunmen opened fire on a police captain inside his car on the Baghdad-Fallujaroad, eastern Falluja, killing him instantly and damaging his car," the source told Aswat al-Iraq news agency.

"A roadside bomb went off near a police vehicle patrol in Jabel region, eastern Falluja, injuring two policemen and damaging their car," the source said.

Falluja, Anbar province, lies 45 km west of Baghdad.

US military deaths in Afghanistan at 1,123

BAGHDAD, 13 Aug— As of Thursday, 12 Aug, 2010, at least 1,123 members of the US military had died in Afghanistan as a result of the US invasion of Afghanistan in late 2001, according to an Associated Press count.

The AP count is six more than the Defence Department's tally, last updated Thursday at 10 am EDT.

At least 903

military personnel have died in Afghanistan as a result of hostile action, according to the military's numbers.

Outside of Afghanistan, the department reports at least 94 more members of the US military died in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Of those, 11 were the result of hostile action.

The AP count of

total OEF casualties outside of Afghanistan is two fewer than the department's tally.

The Defence Department also counts two military civilian deaths.

Since the start of US military operations in Afghanistan, 7,415 US service members have been wounded in hostile action, according to the Defence Department.—*Internet*

"Camp ECHO, 3 km west of Diwaniya, came under four Katyusha rockets, but no information were obtained about casualties or losses," the source,

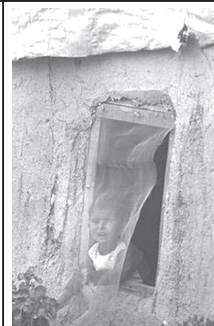
who declined to have his name mentioned, told Aswat al-Iraq news agency.

Police officer survives assassination attempt in Salah al-Din

SALAH AL-DIN, 13 Aug—A police officer survived an attempt on his life by a bomb blast on Thursday in al-Shurqat district, a police source said.

"A bomb, stuck to the vehicle of Colonel Ali Dakheel, from al-Shurqat police station, went off in al-Sahel al-Aysar region, injuring two of his guards," the source told Aswat al-Iraq news agency.

He did not give more details.

Al-Shurqat is 100 km north of Tikrit, the capital of Salah al-Din, which lies 175 km north of Baghdad.

IE9 beta coming on 15 September

SAN FRANCISCO, 13 Aug—Microsoft is inviting selected members of the press and “VIPs” to a 15 September event in San Francisco where it will launch the beta of Internet Explorer (IE) 9.



Company officials said in July that Microsoft would be launching the IE 9 beta in September, but didn't provide the specific date.

Microsoft's beta launch theme is about

developers and designers coming together to showcase the “beauty of the Web.”



Microsoft has launched four developer previews of IE9 since March 2010. Company officials haven't discussed the final due date for the latest, more-standards-compliant browser, but many of us are thinking it will be in 2011.—Internet



Mimicking the moon's surface in the basement

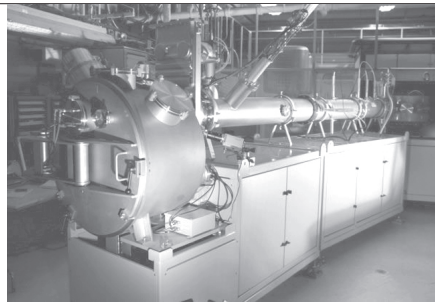
NEW ALAMOS, 13 Aug—A team of scientists used an ion beam in a basement room at Los Alamos National Laboratory to simulate solar winds on the surface of the Moon. The table-top simulation helped confirm that the Moon is inherently dry.

Many scientists believe that the Moon formed when a large object collided with Earth early in its formative stages, leaving behind a blob of material that became trapped in orbit around the nascent Earth. Because most of the water on Earth likely came from water liberated from molten basalts as they cooled, researchers have often wondered whether the Moon's geology contains similar concentrations of trapped water.

If the Moon were formed via cataclysmic collision of a foreign body with a fledgling Earth, it's reasonable to assume that lunar basalts would share a similarly soggy history as their earthen brethren.

India sets on 31 Aug deadline for BlackBerry info

NEW DELHI, 13 Aug—India's Home Ministry threatened on Thursday to block BlackBerry corporate e-mail and messaging services unless the device's manufacturer, Research In Motion Ltd., makes them accessible to its security agencies by 31 Aug.

Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates have also threatened to cut off popular BlackBerry services

unless they get greater access to user information. Like India, they've cited security concerns in pushing for access to encrypted information sent by the cell phones that gets routed through the Canadian company's servers overseas.

India has asked for encrypted BlackBerry communications to be made easily available to its intelligence and law enforcement agencies, saying that the services could be used by militant groups.

The 10 heavily armed gunmen who rampaged through Mumbai, India's financial capital, in November 2008, killing 166 people, used cell and satellite phones to communicate with their Pakistan-based handlers, according to Indian officials.—Internet

Google amplifies voice commands for Android phones



SAN FRANCISCO, 13 Aug—Just because mobile phones are becoming more like small computers doesn't mean you should have to do a lot of typing on them. That's the thinking behind the latest update to Google's popular Android software for mobile phones.

The latest version of Android 2.2, released Thursday, includes 10 new voice commands that can be used to operate phones without using a keypad.

The new tool, called “Voice Actions,” enables people to dictate their text messages and e-mails. The voice recognition tool automatically translates the spoken words into text.

Phone calls can be made simply by speaking the name of a person or business. Android already has been processing spoken requests for Internet searches and directions. Google Inc. says about 200,000 Android-powered phones are being sold each day.

Konica Minolta releases new monochrome laser printers for business

TOKYO, 13 Aug—Konica Minolta on Monday released two new printers for business. The new bizhub 20 is a multifunction printer (MFP), while the new bizhub 20P is a single-function printer.

Both the 20 and the 20P are monochrome laser printers with a print resolution of 2400 by 600 dots per inch (dpi). Rated by the company at 32 pages per minute (ppm), the printer has a 150-sheet

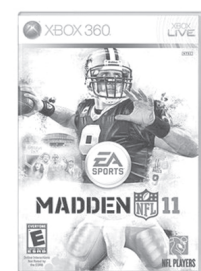
paper tray and fast ethernet and USB 2.0 ports.

According to Konica Minolta, the printer's toner cartridge has a 8000-page yield, while the drum unit has a yield of 25,000 pages.

Poultry fingered as No. 1 food poisoning culprit

ATLANTA, 13 Aug—Cooking chicken on the grill this summer? Be careful. Poultry is still the leading culprit in food poisoning outbreaks, health officials said on Thursday.

Chicken, turkey and other poultry accounted for 17 percent of the food-borne illness outbreaks reported to the government.

Salmonella and other kinds of bacteria caused about half of the outbreaks, the CDC said. Viruses —like norovirus—caused about 40 percent, mushroom toxin or other chemical agents were blamed for 7 percent. Parasites accounted for 1 percent.

Several things can cause an outbreak. For example, an infected person might contaminate the food while handling it. A contaminated food may be left out a room temperature for hours, allowing bacteria to multiply. It may not be cooked enough to kill the bacteria.

The CCD counted more than 21,000 illnesses in about 1,100 outbreaks in 48 states and Puerto Rico. There were 18 deaths from food poisoning.

An estimated 87 million cases of food-borne illness

occur in the United States each year, including 371,000 hospitalizations and 5,700 deaths, according to an Associated Press calculation that combines a CDC formula with recent population estimates. In Thursday's report, the CDC only counted instances in which one food — like grilled chicken — was clearly to blame. That was the case in about 45 percent of the outbreaks. Outbreaks involving multiple ingredients — like chicken salad — were not part of that accounting.—Internet

GM reports 1.3 billion profits in Q2 before IPO file

CHICAGO, 13 Aug—General Motors Co on Thursday reported net income of 1.33 billion US dollars in the second quarter—its second consecutive three months in the black—as it prepares to offer a public stock sale by year's end. The company's performance was up from the first quarter when it reported 865 million dollars in net income. That was GM's profitable quarter since 2007.

The automaker is expected to file paperwork on Friday for a public stock sale.

The Detroit automaker's revenue in the first half of the year grew to 64.7 billion dollars, up from 45.5 billion dollars. GM earned 2.2 billion dollars in the first six months of 2010, compared with an 18.9

billion dollars loss in the first half of last year.

GM is the last of the Detroit automakers to report second-quarter results. Ford Motor Co made 2.6 billion dollars, its fifth straight quarterly profit. Chrysler Group LLC, which got 15.5 billion dollars in federal aid, narrowed its second-quarter loss to 172 million dollars.

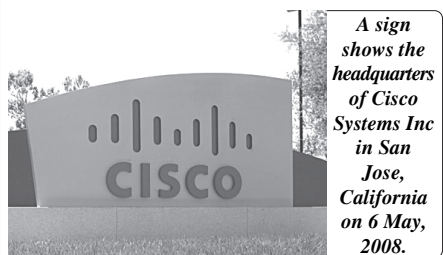


The General Motors logo is seen outside its headquarters at the Renaissance Center in Detroit, Michigan on 25 Aug. 2009.

Cisco 4Q profit up, margins fall

SAN FRANCISCO, 13 Aug—The world's largest computer networking equipment maker Cisco Systems Inc reported on Wednesday that its net income in the fourth-quarter increased by 79 percent although its margins fell.

For the quarter ended on 31 July, Cisco posted a net income of 1.94 billion US dollars, up 79 percent from the 1.08 billion in the same quarter last year, the San Jose, California-based company said in a press release. In May, Cisco projected its fourth-quarter net sales would increase by 25 to 28 percent. Although strong earnings were reported, the numbers were still lower than Wall Street expectations.

"We are very pleased with our results for the fourth quarter, achieving a total revenue increase of approximately 27 percent year over year at the upper end of our guidance, alongside the exceptional quality of our earnings," said Cisco Chief Financial Officer Frank Calderoni in a statement.

Analysts said Cisco's sales could be affected by the sluggish corporate spending as it heavily depends on large corporations and government agencies.—Xinhua

HK goods exports volume up 23% in June

HONG KONG, 13 Aug—The volume of total goods exports recorded a year-on-year increase of 23.1 percent in June, said Hong Kong Census & Statistics Department on Thursday, while that of total goods exports in the first half of 2010 rose 21.4 percent.

The department said the volume of goods re-exports grew 23 percent over a year earlier, while that of domestic exports rose 28.6 percent. Concurrently, the volume of goods imports increased 24.1 percent.

The price of goods re-exports during the month rose 3.7 percent over a year earlier, while that of domestic exports grew 6.7 percent. Taken together, the price of total goods exports increased 3.8 percent. The price of goods imports rose 6.8 percent.

During the first half of 2010 the price of goods re-exports rose 3.4 percent over a year earlier, while that of domestic exports increased 4.7 percent - thus the price of total goods exports grew 3.4 percent. The price of goods imports increased 5.2 percent.—Xinhua

Bangladesh to import 80,000 tons of food

DHAKA, 13 Aug—The Bangladeshi government on Thursday decided to import 80,000 tons of food, despite the country had a bumper crop production this year, spokesperson of the Food Ministry said.

SM Golam Kibria, the spokesperson, told Xinhua that the decision came at a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on

Public Purchase with Finance Minister Abul Mal Abdul Muhith in the chair. Kibria said the committee approved the proposals of the Food Ministry to purchase 50,000 tons of wheat and 30,000 tons of rice. He said the wheat import will cost the country 12 million US dollars at the rate of 241 US dollars per

ton and the rice will cost the country 13.78 million US dollars at the rate of 459.27 US dollars per ton. The spokesperson could not say from which countries the wheat and the rice will be imported and when. The country produces around 27-28 million tons of rice annually, against the requirement of around 30 million tons of rice. The country's 162.2 million population require around 5 million tons of wheat against the production of around 2.5 million to 3 million tons.—Xinhua

British, Danish PMs meet on budget deficit, Afghanistan

LONDON, 13 Aug—British Prime Minister David Cameron met with Danish Prime Minister Lars Lokke Rasmussen on Thursday at the Downing Street No. 10.

The two prime ministers held an "excellent meeting" where they refreshed and renewed the strong relationship between Britain and Denmark.

The meeting focused on their "shared outlook" on Europe and tackling their budget deficits.

In a press conference following their meeting,

Cameron said that the EU budget could not carry on rising at a time when member states were having to take tough action to get their national finances in order. He said: "As we reduce our deficits, I think it is very important that we both argue to make sure that the European budget is, over time, reduced rather than increased. We cannot ask our members of the public to pay more in Britain and have to pay more in Europe as well."

The two leaders also

discussed the situation in Afghanistan where Danish troops are fighting alongside British soldiers in Helmand Province.

Cameron said that both countries were "absolutely aligned" in their commitment to building up the Afghan army and police to enable to take responsibility for their own security.

Cameron and Rasmussen will next meet at the Autumn European Council meetings.—Xinhua

Sara Lee back to profitability but shares slip

PORTLAND, 13 Aug—Sara Lee Corp returned to fourth-quarter profitability, but investors were wary of the food maker's future as it faces rising commodity prices and said it expects fiscal 2011 profit at the low-end of analyst expectations.

The company's shares fell 2 percent by midday Thursday. The moves appeared to pay off as the company reported net income above Wall Street expectations. It earned \$187 million, or 28 cents per share, for the quarter that ended on 3 July. That's up from a loss of \$14 million, or 2 cents per share, a year earlier, when a large tax charge cut its profit.

Excluding one-time items, Sara Lee earned 19 cents per share, while analysts surveyed by Thomson Reuters on average forecast 16 cents per share. Sara Lee said lower prices on some items and higher marketing costs dragged on its results, but it made important gains — increasing market share for key units and selling off noncore lines like body care.

For the full year, the company earned \$506 million or 73 cents per share. That's up from \$364 million, or 52 cents per share, the prior year. Excluding one-time items, it earned \$1.08 per share for the year. Revenue fell less than 1 percent to \$10.79 billion. Shares of Sara Lee fell 29 cents, 2 percent, to \$14.18 in midday trading.

Emergence of fourth white elephant, an omen of good future

Today is the time of great importance for the Union of Myanmar for multiparty democracy elections, the fifth step of the seven-step Road Map, will soon take place in which the people have to elect public representatives capable of seeing to democratization process.

On such auspicious occasion, the good news has been issued that there emerges one more white elephant.

That white elephant was caught in Maungdaw Township, Rakhine State on 26 June 2010. It arrived at the precinct of the Uppatasanta Pagoda in Nay Pyi Taw on 9 August 2010. The same day, Anantarayika Mingala (safeguarding mangala), Gehapavesana Mingala (house warming mangala), Bhattabhanjana Mangala (feeding mangala), Ravindudassana Mangala (mangala of exposing to sun and moon), and Namakarana Mangala (naming mangala) were held in line with the Myanmar traditions.

Now, the white elephant titled "Bhaddawady" is kept in the pagoda precinct with her shed mates.

These days, the whole world has come under a variety of natural disasters, whereas Myanmar is free from such catastrophes. There is a common belief among the people that the emergence of the white elephant is a good omen of national peace and prosperity and further flourishing of the Sasana.

Today is not the only period in which white elephants are valued and adored greatly. That tradition has been in force since the time of treatises relating to the Sasana. It is stated in Digha Nikaya Maha Vagga Pali Treatise that King Maha Sudassana Sakkja had seven types of gem: Sakkja gem, elephant gem, horse gem, ruby gem, queen gem, rich-man gem, and elder son gem.

According to treatises pertaining to life stories of the Buddha, the role white elephants played in Myanmar culture and history was very important. In Elephant King Hsaddan Drama of the 550 Dramas Treatise, for instance, Elephant King Hsaddan is portrayed as a white elephant.

Moreover, in the time of King Vessantara, one of the last ten lives of the would-be-Buddha "Gotama", the people were satisfied and happy with the king's acts of extreme generosity. However, the king faced public outrage when he donated the white elephant, which was revered by the people, in order to fulfil his perfections. After all, he had to relinquish his throne and renounced the world with his queen, son and daughter. It is

also mentioned in the treatise that just as the white elephant arrived at the country Kalingaraja, the country escaped from drought and saw enough rainfalls and prosperity again.

In the life in which the would-be-Buddha attained omniscience, Queen Maha Maya had a strange dream that a white elephant flied down from the sky into her womb on the right side, holding a branch of thabye (Eugenia) with his trunk. Court Brahmins (royal advisers) interpreted the omen that the queen was pregnant for a noble son. That shows the attributes of a white elephant.

In AD 1054, King Anawrahta occupied Thaton and conveyed sacred things belonging to King Manuha including Pitakats (treatises on the three repositories of Buddha's Teachings), Buddha images and Buddha relics to his royal city. Among the confiscations were 32 white elephants. White elephants played an important role in successive periods after Bagan Period in the course of Myanmar history. History shows that kings who owned or who were offered white elephants became more powerful; the people were prosperous; and the country enjoyed peace and prosperity.

Therefore, Myanmar monarchs took Hsinphyushin (king owning white elephant) title. If there were no white elephants in their times, every king asked another king else for a white elephant. And they searched white elephants if there was news that a white elephant emerged in their countries. In Pinya Period, King Thiha Thu took out of water a dead white elephant that floated down the river Sapon, in order to take Hsinbyushin title, and erected the dead elephant in Yatanaka and took "Tasishin" title. In late Bagan Period, King Uzana was assassinated by some unscrupulous people in Twantay Tawgyidan (now Dalla) while in search of the white elephant to get Hsinbyushin title after receiving the news there was a white elephant in it. Many events in the histories of Ceylon, Myanmar, Mon and Thailand showed that there caused friendship as well as battles due to rivalry for white elephants.

In fact, it is very hard to get a white elephant in a country in a period. Not one in every 1000 elephants is a white one. Even though an elephant is white, it can be designated a white elephant only if it has the characteristics of a white elephant.

In the Myanmar history, anyone who found a white elephant was responsible for informing the king in accordance with the law; if the elephant possessed the characteristics of a white elephant, they were awarded; a white elephant was designated at the position of a prince; and there were 315

principles a white elephant had to meet. Some of the characteristics of a white elephant are as follows:--

- (a) eye sockets and corneas are white and pink colours.
- (b) Oral cavity is pink colour.
- (c) Whitish / pinky whorls on both shoulders.
- (d) The skins around the roots of the tusks have the same colours, as that of the areas around the armpits.
- (e) Sexual organs are white / pink colour.
- (f) Toe nails are white / pink colour.
- (g) Furs are transparent in the light.
- (h) Complexion around toe nails, chest, and throat is paler than that around them.
- (i) Head produces fragrant liquid.
- (j) There are two sometimes four strands of fur and there can be four pairs of twofold strands of fur in a follicle.
- (k) Body is chestnut gray colour.
- (l) Body smells sweet.
- (m) With head to the auspicious direction while sleeping.
- (n) Soft snore while sleeping.
- (o) Complexion of a baby elephant is clear if mixture of ripe tamarind and water is applied on its body in early evening and it is given a shower in the morning.

King Anawrahta, founder of the First Myanmar Empire in Bagan Period, King Bayintnaung, founder of the Second Myanmar Empire in Toungoo Period, and King Alaungmintra, founder of the Third Myanmar Empire in Konbaung Period, were white-elephant-owning monarchs.

In times of those kings, the strength of the Union reached its peak; national races in the Union remained harmonious, led a peaceful life, and went affluent; and the nation stood tall with own monarchs and sovereignty and was held in high esteem by other countries.

Today, white elephants are emerging in the Union of Myanmar in the time of the State Peace and Development Council. Up to now, Myanmar has seen four white elephants.

Elephants, the largest land animals with greatest strength, inhabited in the northern hemisphere in ancient days. Now, there are only two species of elephant: African and Asian species of elephants that are descendants of those large elephants. African elephants live in jungles deep in Africa Continent. Asian elephants are also known as Indian elephants, and they are found in Myanmar, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Sumatra Island, and Malay Peninsula.

According to the statistics collected in 1994, Asia had about 17,000 elephants in it. About 80 per cent of them are found in Myanmar and India, and the rest are found in Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Malaysia, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos and China (Yunnan). However, I have never heard news that there are white elephants in any other country and region else, and any other race does not own white elephants.

18 injured in Colombian bomb attack

BOGOTA, 13 Aug— At least 18 people were injured when a car bomb exploded in Bogotá early Thursday, destroying the facade of local radio station Caracol Radio.

A total of 577 people were affected by the attack, which also damaged 11 cars, 49 shops and 333 houses.

Bogotá's Health authorities rescued seven people at the incident scene, three of whom are in stable

conditions while a bus driver was seriously injured. A woman had her eyes and face hurt and got an emergency surgery.

Most of the wounded were panicky and hurt by shattered glass pieces, according to the authorities.

The Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) is believed to be behind the attack.

British tourists safe after Costa Rica mountain ordeal

SAN JOSE, 13 Aug— Sixteen British tourists who were trapped overnight in a mountain pass in Costa Rica were evacuated, according to officials.

Rescue personnel used a police helicopter to reach the mountainous area of Santa Maria de Dota, southwest of San Jose, and were able to evacuate eight tourists, including a girl who had broken one of her legs, the Ministry of Public Security said.

"The other eight, who were in the Bethany Shelter (in the same area) were able to

come down from the mountain on foot," the ministry said.

The tourists were taken to the coastal town of Quepos, 150 kilometers (90 miles) west of San Jose, for medical test.

The group was climbing in the mountains around Santa Maria de Dota on a day trip when a girl in the group apparently broke her leg, delaying their ability to get out.

Heavy rains kept Red Cross workers from bringing out the Britons, the agency said.

Thousands of hectares of forest destroyed by fire in Cuba

HAVANA, 13 Aug— All together 5,711 hectares of forest in Cuba have been burnt down by fires from January to May, said official sources here on Thursday.

Economic losses inflicted by these forest fires are estimated at 7.6 million pesos (8.2 million US dollars), according to the sources.

Raul Gonzalez, chief of the Cuban national ranger corps, said the fires were mainly caused by "human actions, such as use of fire as an agricultural tool to clean land, negligence of smokers and sparks from vehicles and agricultural machinery."

Besides human errors, Cuban officials from the National Fire Department said risk of forest fires was increased by deficient rainfall in the months known as the drought season.

The drought also had an impact on Cuban agriculture and led to water rationing in Cuba.

Nearly 14,000 fires spotted in Brazil

BRASILIA, 13 Aug— 13,823 fires were spotted in Brazil on Thursday by the country's National Institute for Space Research (INPE) using satellites, authorities said.

Fires, most of them in the northern and midwestern regions, occurred both in forests and cities due to drought and relatively low air humidity.

Mato Grosso, a state in western Brazil, registered the highest number of fires, namely 4,284. —Xinhua

RIO DE JANEIRO, 13 Aug—A small executive jet crashed at Rio's domestic airport Thursday, but all three aboard were rescued without serious injuries.

A spokesman with the Brazilian government's airport authority said the aircraft landed normally in clear weather, "but for reasons that are not yet known, it was unable to stop and skidded off the runway into the sea."

The official spoke on condition of anonymity as he was not authorized to discuss the matter.

The Learjet was operated by the OceanAir air taxi service and was carrying only three crew members, according to a statement from the company. It said they suffered no serious injuries.

Government authorities and OceanAir are investigating the accident.

Television images showed the intact jet floating in the waters of the Guanabara Bay, just a few feet from the runway. Firefighters entered the water to secure the aircraft with ropes.

The Santos Dumont airport closed because of the accident, but was reopened in the afternoon.

Egypt finds 17 smuggling tunnels at borders with Gaza

RAFAH, 13 Aug—Egyptian authorities discovered 17 tunnels used for smuggling goods at borders with Gaza Strip, a security source told *Xinhua* on Wednesday.

The source said on condition of anonymity that the tunnels were discovered during a security campaign late on Tuesday at the border areas ahead of the holy month of Ramadan.

Huge quantities of ready-for-smuggling steel, cement and equipment have been seized during the campaign, but no arrest was made in connection with the tunnels, the

source added.

Egyptian police imposed a security siege on the tunnel openings until blocking them. The seized materials were confiscated and transported to governmental warehouses.

After Israel imposed a tight blockade on the Gaza Strip in 2007 and closed down all commercial crossings with the enclave, the Palestinians dug hundreds of smuggling tunnels under the Gaza-Egypt borders to use them in smuggling goods from Egypt into the besieged enclave.

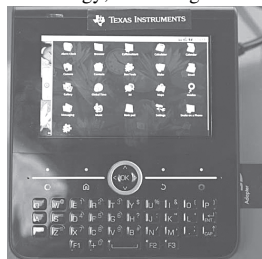

Oracle sues Google for patent infringement

BEIJING, 13 Aug—Oracle Corp has sued Google, charging that its Android phone software infringes on Oracle patents and copyrights related to Java applications.

In its complaint, filed on Thursday with the US District Court for the Northern District of California, Oracle said Google's Android operating system software consists of Java applications and its other technology, according to AP report.

"This lawsuit seeks appropriate remedies," Oracle spokeswoman Karen Tillman said in a statement.

Oracle, which makes database software and other technology, acquired Java through its 5.6-billion-USD purchase of Sun Microsystems earlier this year.

Java can be used as a platform for building applications for computers, websites and smart phones and other mobile devices.

Google spokesman Andrew Pederson said the company can't comment because it has not yet reviewed the lawsuit.—*Xinhua*

Sino-Swiss trade increase a delightful surprise

SHANGHAI, 13 Aug—Swiss President Doris Leuthard on Thursday said the rise in bilateral trade between Switzerland and China is a delightful surprise, as she seeks to expand economic cooperation with China through a free trade agreement. The trade increase was a surprise as it came during the economic crisis last year, Leuthard said.

In the first six months of 2010, Swiss exports to China increased more than 30 percent and Chinese exports to Switzerland increased more than 16 percent. After the joint feasibility study, the two sides will enter the final stage ahead of the signing of the deal, she added. China is Switzerland's second largest trade partner in Asia after Japan.

Quebec provincial officials said the four men had put up scaffolding and just begun repairs to the wall at the school in Ville-Emard neighborhood when it suddenly fell on them at 7:30 am, local media reported.

One worker is in critical condition with head and internal injuries at the Montreal General Hospital. A second suffered a head injury and is listed in stable condition, while the other two men are being treated for trauma.

Provincial workplace health and safety officials are investigating the accident at the school, where students are still on summer vacation.—*Xinhua*

Turkish group warns of Istanbul's vulnerability to earthquakes

ISTANBUL, 13 Aug—The Union of Chambers of Turkish Engineers and Architects (TMMOB) on Thursday warned of Istanbul's structural deficiencies and their vulnerability to any upcoming earthquakes.

The union noted during a panel at Istanbul Technical University that Istanbul's buildings are structurally unsound now as they were in 1999, when tens of thousands of buildings collapsed during the 17 Aug Izmit earthquake in which tens of thousands died.

TMMOB Istanbul Branch Director Cemal Gokce said, "The fact that not even 1 percent of

structures have been reinforced in the 11 years since the 1999 earthquake is a serious concern."

He said that the Earthquake Regulation that went into effect in 2007 called for concrete to be no lower a grade than 20 megapascals, but that Istanbul's concrete grade was around 8 megapascals.

"Istanbul's earthquakes have no security in case of an earthquake," he said, adding that 70 percent of structures in Turkey were not certified as habitable and 37

percent were not made with official construction licenses.

He said that there are around 2,000 schools without earthquake security, only 500 of which have been reinforced or demolished and rebuilt, adding that of nearly 600 hospitals in Istanbul, only three had been reinforced.

"In the case of an earthquake, between 150 to 200 thousand structures will be severely damaged," he said.

KINSHASA, 13 Aug—About 30 people were killed in a truck crash into Lake Tanganyika in the east of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DR Congo), a local official said on Thursday. The accident, which occurred on Wednesday, also caused serious injuries to 14 others, the coordinating official said from the city of Uvira in South Kivu Province. The truck was running from Fizi to Uvira when it fell down into the lake, the official said, blaming the crash on the overloading of the vehicle. Traffic accidents were frequently reported in DR Congo as a result of poor road or vehicle state, overloading and imprudence of drivers.—MNA/Xinhua

10,267 people form the world's largest human domino

BEIJING, 13 Aug—The world's largest human domino, comprising of 10,267 people, was formed on the grasslands in Ordos, the Inner Mongolia autonomous region, on Thursday, topping a Guinness World Record created a decade ago. The people were divided into more than 50 groups to form the word Ordos both in Chinese and English.

In a human domino, the person standing first falls backward, causing the row of people behind him to fall one after another. It took an hour for the domino to complete.

"This magnificent feat was very hard to achieve, but we were all confident we would rewrite history," said Liu Manshan, who was in charge of the event and head of the culture bureau

of Ordos' Dongsheng district. The last Guinness World Record of the largest human domino was created by 9,234 students in Singapore in 2000.

The crate, recovered from the Antarctic hut of renowned explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton after it was found there in 2006, was thawed very slowly in recent weeks at the Canterbury Museum in Christchurch on New Zealand's South Island.

The crate was care-

fully opened on Friday to reveal 11 bottles of Mackinlay's Scotch whisky. They were wrapped in paper and straw to protect them from the rigours of a rough trip to Antarctica for Shackleton's 1907 Nimrod expedition.

Food inspector Lindsay Gorishek says toads carry several diseases and that Turla had the toads in his mouth and then back in his hands on the prep table.

Restaurant owner Yidi When says he'll pay the ticket. He also says Turla is just a funny guy who needs some more training about restaurant sanitation.

Airlines grounds overweight staff

Turkish Airlines has grounded 28 flight attendants for being overweight and given them six months to slim down or face reassignment, a newspaper said on Saturday.

The employees, 13 of whom are women, are on unpaid leave until they lose weight, Haber Turk daily said, citing a statement from state-run Turkish Airlines.

All of them previously had been warned to shape up, it added.

"Weight and height are important factors at all airlines.

These criteria are important both in terms of appearance and the ability to move about," the statement said.

No one was available over the weekend at Turkish Airlines, Europe's fourth largest carrier by passenger volume, to confirm the report.

Izzet Levi, head of a cabin attendants' association who was among those furloughed, told Haber Turk he must drop 10 kilos (22 pounds) to reach 96 kilos if he is to return to his post.

Lohan's attorney, Shawn Chapman Holley, could not be immediately reached for comment.

Robison said Lohan's case will now be overseen by Judge Elden Fox, although no new court hearings are immediately scheduled in the case.

Lohan, 24, is currently undergoing a 90-day rehabilitation program at Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center. She served only 13 days of a three-month jail term behind bars for violating her probation in a pair of DUI cases.

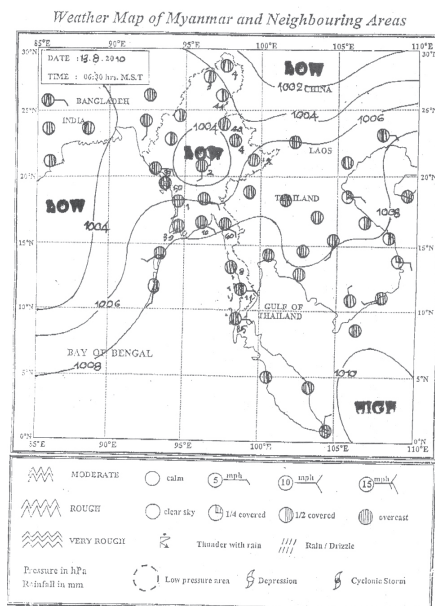

Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr. M.S.T. During the past 24 hours, rain or thundershowers have been scattered in lower Sagaing, Mandalay and Magway Divisions, fairly widespread in upper Sagaing and Yangon Divisions and widespread in the remaining States and Divisions with isolated heavy falls in Kayin State. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Thantagun (3.54) inches, Gyobingauk (2.76) inches, Kyaikamaraw (2.44) inches, Mawlamyine (2.36) inches, Hinthada (2.32) inches, Sittway and Theinzayat (2.24) inches each, Kawkaireik (2.17) inches and Taungdwingyi (0.87) inch.

Nay Pyi Taw Weather

Maximum temperature on 12-8-2010 was 90°F. Minimum temperature on 13-8-2010 77°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 13-8-2010 (93%). Rainfall on 13-8-2010 was (0.11) inch.

Yangon (Kaba-Aye) Weather

Maximum temperature on 12-8-2010 was 88°F. Minimum temperature on 13-8-2010 77°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 13-8-2010 (79%). Total Sunshine hours on 12-8-2010 was (Nil).

Rainfall on 13-8-2010 was (0.28) inch at Mingaladon, (0.39) inch at Kaba-Aye and (0.98) inch at Central Yangon inches each. Total rainfall since 1-1-2010 was (47.48) inches at Mingaladon, (54.88) inches at Kaba-Aye and (65.39) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum windspeed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (7) mph from South at (18:30) hours MST on 12-8-2010.

A new scan of the human genome has shed light on why people have such a variety of physical traits and disease risks.—INTERNET

Scientists identify DNA that may contribute to each person's uniqueness

SCIENCE DAILY, 13 Aug—Building on a tool that they developed in yeast four years ago, researchers at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine scanned the human genome and discovered what they believe is the reason people have such a variety of physical traits and disease risks.

In a report published in the June 25 issue of *Cell*, the team identified a near complete catalog of the DNA segments that copy themselves, move around in, and insert themselves here and there in our genome. The insertion locations of these moveable segments -- transposons -- in each individual's genome helps determine why some are short or tall, blond or brunette, and more likely or less likely to have cancer or heart disease. The Johns Hopkins researchers say that tracking the locations of transposons in people with specific diseases might lead to the discovery of new disease genes or mutations.—Internet
