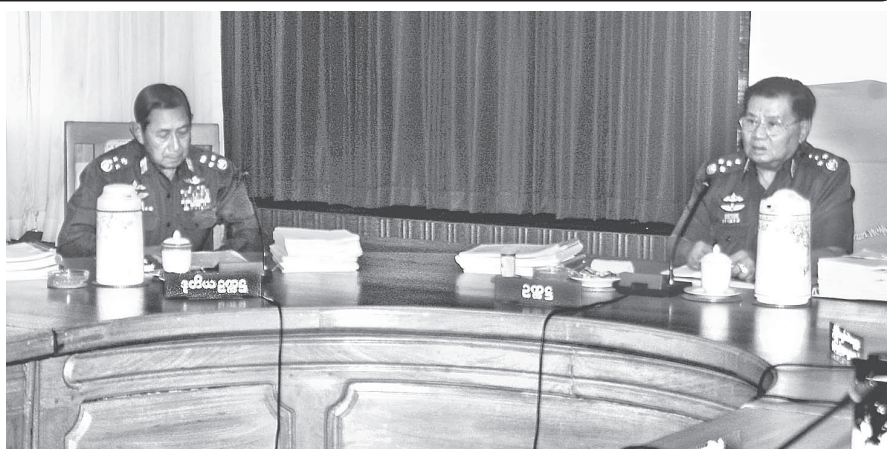

Special projects to be completed ahead of schedule to achieve national goal of building modern, developed nation

NAY PYI TAW, 17 Aug—The Special Projects Implementation Committee held its meeting 2/2010 at the Office of the Commander-in-Chief (Army) here yesterday, with a speech by Chairman of the Special Projects Implementation Committee Chairman of the State Peace and Development Council Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Than Shwe.

Thiha Thura Tin Aung Myint Oo, the Commander-in-Chief (Navy), the Commander-in-Chief (Air), senior military officers, ministers, deputy ministers, heads of department, and officials.

Minister for Electric Power No. 1 U Zaw Min reported on hydropower plants and ongoing hydropower projects under the ministry, and two more projects to be launched soon.

Of them, Mawlaik Hydropower Project will

be launched over the river Chindwin, about 20 miles northeast of Mawlaik in Sagaing Division. It is of rock-filled/concrete dam type. On completion, the project, with a generation capacity of 520 megawatts, will be able to generate 3310 million kilowatts hours a year. Besides Mawlaik Hydropower Project, Htamanthi and Shwesaryay hydropower projects will be implemented over the river Chindwin.

Suicide attack kills 60 in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 17 Aug—At least 60 people were killed and more than 125 others wounded on Tuesday in a suicide bomb attack on an army recruitment centre in Baghdad, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua*.

“The explosion occurred at the centre at Bab al-Muazem area in Baghdad, now 60 people were dead and more than 100 others were wounded,” said the source on condition of anonymity.

The death toll could

continue to rise since many army recruits were badly injured, he added.

This was the bloodiest attack in the past weeks in Iraq, according to the casualty numbers.

Motorbike bomb kills two, wounds eight in Afghanistan

GHAZNI, 17 Aug—A motorbike bomb rocked Ghazni city, the capital of Ghazni Province, in south Afghanistan on Tuesday killing two persons and injuring eight others, an official said.

“The terrorists planted explosive device on a motorbike and exploded by remote control in Ghazni city this morning as a result two persons, both civilians were killed,” senior police officer Ghani Khan told *Xinhua*, adding that 8 others including one police and seven civilians were injured.

He put the attack on the enemies of peace, a reference used against Taliban militants but the outfit has not made comment yet.

Meantime, doctor Ibrahim Zai, the head of hospital in Ghazni city, confirmed receiving 8 injured including a police constable to the hospital.

On the other hand, witnesses at the site said that 10 persons were killed, some others were injured in the blast occurred in the morning rush hour.

Taliban militants have intensified their activities in Ghani Province over the past one year. Bomb attacks and rockets fired by insurgents claimed the lives of over a dozen people mostly civilians elsewhere in Ghazni Province over the past one month.—*Xinhua*

Al-Qaida leader killed by airstrike after attack on Afghan police station

KABUL, 17 Aug—The International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Monday confirmed the death of Abu Baqir, a dual-hatted Taliban sub-commander and al-Qaeda group leader.

The ISAF said in a press release that a coalition force airweapons team engaged Baqir's truck in Kunduz Province on Sunday, killing Baqir and

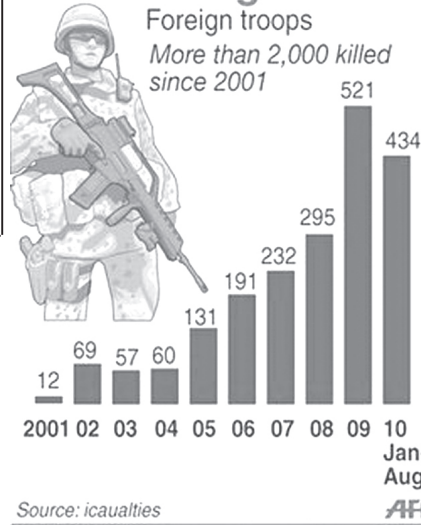
another insurgent.

The airstrike occurred after the insurgents attacking a local police station, said the press release.

The strike also wounded several other insurgents, said the ISAF press release, adding that security forces detained two of the injured insurgents at hospital.

Afghan bombs kill three US service members, two Afghans

KABUL, 17 Aug—Bomb attacks killed three US service members and two Afghan civilians in Afghanistan on Tuesday, officials said.

The deaths — in eastern and western Afghanistan — were a reminder that the Afghan war continues to be violent far from the southern Taliban strongholds currently targeted by a surge of US troops. Recent months have been particularly deadly for both NATO forces and Afghan civilians nationwide.

Two of the Americans were killed in a bombing in the east, while the third was killed in the west, NATO said. It did not provide details on where or how they were attacked. Including these deaths, 15 US service members have been killed so far this month.

Blast at funeral kills five Afghans

KANDAHAR, 17 Aug—An explosion hit a funeral killing five mourners and injuring 20 others in Helmand Province in southern Afghanistan, spokesman for provincial administration Daud Ahmadi said on Monday.

“A group of mourners were busy burying a relative at a graveyard in Sarwan Qala village of Sangin District on Saturday when a bomb went off suddenly killing five on the spot and injuring 20 others,” Ahmadi told *Xinhua*.

He blamed Taliban insurgents for carrying out the blast, saying the village is in Taliban control.—*Xinhua*

Troops detain several insurgents

KABUL, 17 Aug—only that these Taliban Afghan and the NATO-led forces have captured several Taliban insurgents including their commander during an operation in Paktika Province in eastern Afghanistan, a statement released by the alliance said on Monday.

Scientists successfully use human induced pluripotent stem cells to treat Parkinson's in rodents

WASHINGTON, 17 Aug—Researchers at the Buck Institute for Age Research in California have successfully used human induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSCs) to treat rodents afflicted with Parkinson's Disease (PD), according to a research published on Monday in on-line edition of the journal *Stem Cells*. The research can be used to manufacture the type of neurons needed to treat the disease and paves the way for the use of iPSC's in various biomedical applications.

Researchers used human iPSCs that were derived from skin and

blood cells and coaxed them to become dopamine-producing neurons. Dopamine is a neurotransmitter produced in the mid-brain which facilitates many critical functions, including motor skills. Patients with PD lack sufficient dopamine; the disease is a progressive, incurable neurodegenerative disorder that affects 1.5 million Americans and results in tremor, slowness of movement and rigidity.

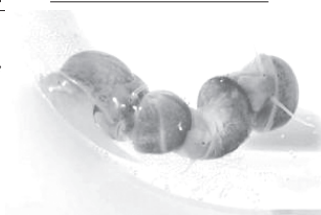

Scared snails opt for single parenthood rather than wait for a mate

DURHAM, 17 Aug—Solitary snails in search of a mate put off parenthood as long as possible in the hopes that a partner will appear. But when *Physa acuta* snails smell predators, they don't wait as long for a mate. Scared snails settle for single parenthood much sooner than their calm counterparts, says a new study by biologist Josh Auld of the National Evolutionary Synthesis Centre in Durham, NC.

They can't wait for a mate indefinitely — especially if the risk of mortality is high," said Auld. A brown speckled snail found in rivers, lakes, and streams, the hermaphroditic snail *Physa acuta* has everything it needs to reproduce — each snail is both male and female at the same time. Because each snail can produce sperm as well as eggs, they have more than one option when it comes to having kids — they can either find a mate, or they can fertilize themselves.—Internet



US astronauts install spare pump on space station

WASHINGTON, 17 Aug—A pair of US astronauts installed a spare ammonia pump module on the International Space Station on Monday, reviving a disabled cooling system on the station during the third spacewalk in 10 days.

The spacewalk, conducted by Expedition 24 Flight Engineers Doug Wheelock and Tracy Caldwell Dyson, ended at 1:40 pm EDT (1740 GMT), NASA said.

The 780-pound spare pump module was removed from an external stowage platform by Wheelock. The module was successfully installed on the S1 Truss after Wheelock attached four bolts and Caldwell Dyson mated five electrical connectors.

Ground controllers confirmed the module was in healthy condition when it began receiving power. After a pressure check and more fluid cable connections, the module was filled with ammonia.

Due to time constraints, ground teams and the crew decided not to attach a power cable extension from Quest to a cable on the Unity module.

Call to improve password security

WASHINGTON, 17 Aug—The growing use of graphics cards as surrogate supercomputers could spell trouble for users of short passwords.

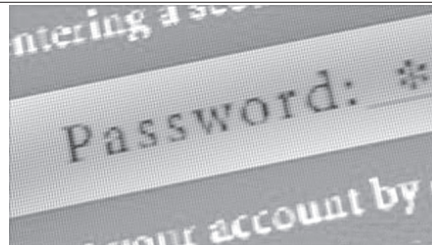
Researchers say the growing number of processors on graphics cards will soon make it trivial for them to crack short passwords.

A password of seven characters or less will soon be "hopelessly inadequate" they claim. The researchers suggest passwords should be at least 12 characters long to be safe. A team led by Richard Boyd from the Georgia Tech Research Institute has been investigating what effect the number-crunching power of modern graphics cards could have on the crackability of passwords.

Many graphics cards employ hundreds of so-called stream processors working in parallel to render images. Many scientists now use the basic arithmetical properties of these processors to help crunch through data generated during experiments.

The number crunching abilities of graphics cards are now comparable to the multi-million dollar supercomputers built about a decade ago, said Mr Boyd. The parallel processing systems inside graphics cards are very good at carrying out so-called "brute force" attacks that effectively try every possible combination of letters and numbers until the right one is found.

Longer passwords take longer to crack and offer better protection, say the researchers. "Right now we can confidently say that a seven-character password is hopelessly inadequate," said Mr Boyd, "and as GPU power continues to go up every year, the threat will increase."—Internet

Vodafone backs down in Android row

NEW YORK, 17 Aug—Phone giant Vodafone has backed down in a row with customers over software updates for Google Android phones.

Last week, many customers who own HTC Desire smartphones were prompted to download a software update which they believed was an upgrade to Android. Instead it installed irremovable Vodafone-branded apps and bookmarks, including links to dating sites.

Following a raft of complaints, the firm has backed down and will now offer an update without the applications. The software will upgrade users to the latest version of Android, as many had expected the original upgrade to do.

A spokesperson said the software - known as Froyo or version 2.2 - would be ready in the next seven to 10 days. The firm's apps - known as Vodafone 360 - will be offered as an optional download, a spokesperson said. —Internet

Facebook 'dislike' scam warning

NEW YORK, 17 Aug—Facebook users are being targeted in a scam that offers them a chance to install a "dislike" button.

The scam tricks users into allowing a rogue application to access their profile page, which then posts spam messages.

It also attempts to lure people into completing an online survey, for which the scammers are paid money. The social network already offers a "like" button that allows people to rate other user's comments and posts.

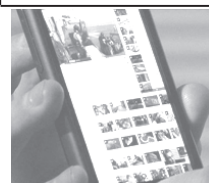
Graham Cluley of security firm Sophos said it was the latest in a series of

"survey scams" that included links to a video purporting to show an anaconda vomiting up a hippo. "One thing we commonly see is that the message starts 'OMG, shocking video'," he said.

"And they appear to come from your Facebook friend, giving it a ringing endorsement." The dislike button scam prompts people to download an application with the message: "Download the official DISLIKE button now."

When users click on the link it prompts them to install a rogue application, which does not function as a dislike button. Once a user has given it permission to access their profile, it updates the user's page with a link and a message: "I just got the dislike button, so now I can dislike all of your dumb posts lol!!!"

Cancer is the world's costliest disease

WASHINGTON, 17 Aug—Cancer is the world's top "economic killer" as well as its likely leading cause of death, the American Cancer Society contends in a new report it will present at a global cancer conference in China this week.

Cancer costs more in productivity and lost life than AIDS, malaria, the flu and other diseases that spread person-to-

person, the report concludes.

Chronic diseases including cancer, heart disease and diabetes account for more than 60 percent of deaths worldwide but less than 3 percent of public and private funding for global health, said Rachel Nugent of the Center for Global Development, a Washington-based policy research group.

Home care after hip surgery may aid survival, study says

QUEBEC, 17 Aug—Providing home care to elderly people after they've had hip surgery improves their chances of survival, finds a new study.

Canadian researchers looked at 11,326 men and women age 65 and older in Quebec who had partial hip surgery between 1997 and 2004.

Those who received home care after leaving the hospital were 43 percent less likely to die within three months after their surgery than those who didn't receive home care. But the study, published on 16 Aug in the *Canadian Medical Association Journal*, found that home care was given to less than 16 percent of the elderly patients who were discharged home after partial hip surgery.

Weight-loss surgery cuts diabetics' costs

CHICAGO, 17 Aug—Three-fourths of obese diabetics who had weight-loss surgery were able to quit taking diabetes drugs within six months of their operation, US researchers said on Monday, citing a new study.

They said the surgery may eliminate the need for chronic medications to treat the disease and reduce overall healthcare costs, providing a strong argument for insurance companies to pay for the procedures.

Once developed, diabetes and obesity are rarely reversed, Dr Martin Makary of Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore and colleagues reported in *Archives of Surgery*, a medical journal.

"Until a successful non-surgical means for preventing and reversing obesity is developed, bariatric surgery appears to be the only intervention that can result in a sustained reversal of both obesity and type 2 diabetes mellitus in most patients receiving it," they wrote.—Internet

Lowe's 2Q profit rises 10 pct; cuts sales outlook

NEW YORK, 17 Aug—People bought more air conditioners and grills at Lowe's Cos in early summer, boosting second-quarter net income 10 percent, but overall spending was hurt by hot weather and the weak economy, the home-improvement retailer said on Monday.

The No 2 home improvement retailer joined a long line of companies in sounding a cautious note about consumer spending and cut its yearly revenue guidance as worries grow about a stalling economy.

Lowe's CEO Robert Niblock said in an interview on Monday with The Associated Press that Americans are responding to programmes such as the federal cash-for-appliances rebates and sales but says 2010 is a "bouncing along the bottom" year.—Internet

China surges past Japan as No 2 economy; US next?

BEIJING, 17 Aug—China has eclipsed Japan as the world's second-biggest economy after three decades of blistering growth that put overtaking the US in reach within 10 years. Japan is still far richer per person after confirming on Monday that economic output fell behind its giant neighbour for the three months ending on 30 June. However, the news is more proof of China's arrival as a force that is altering the global balance of commercial, political and military power.

SINGAPORE, 17 Aug—The US dollar headed toward a 15-year low against the yen on Tuesday and Japanese shares slid as weak US data added to worries about a global slowdown.

Other Asian stock markets were slightly firmer although analysts said there was little reason for them to rise much higher given the weak sentiment.

"We are worried that some people are saying there is a 25 percent chance of a double-dip recession, and some people are talking about deflation," said Peter McGuire, managing director at CWA Global Markets in Sydney. The dollar slid as low as 85.11 yen in early Asian trade, within sight of a 15-year low of 84.72 yen reached last week. Traders said it is only matter of time before the greenback drops below 85.00 yen and threatens to pass last week's milestone due to the general mood of risk aversion.

The MSCI share index for Asia excluding Japan (.MIAPJ0000PUS) rose 0.60 percent following Wall Street's relatively flat finish. Last week the index lost nearly 2.9 percent on growing concerns about the global recovery, its worst performance in six weeks.

Heat stroke sends 31,000 people to hospital in Japan

TOKYO, 17 Aug— More than 31,000 people rushed to hospital due to heat stroke between 31 May and 15 Aug in Japan, the government said on Tuesday.

The number of people who died of heat stroke shortly after being hospitalized reached 132, according to the Fire and Disaster Management Agency's preliminary report.

In July alone, 17,680 people were taken to hospital for heat stroke, of whom 94 died — both record highs for the month since the agency started compiling relevant data in 2008, *Kyodo News* reported.

The number of people suffering heat stroke is continuing to move at high levels in August. By age bracket, 47.7 percent were aged 65 or over.

Central bank expects strong economic growth in Australia in 2012

CANBERRA, 17 Aug— The Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) on Tuesday said the bank was expecting inflation to remain under control before economic growth surges to above-average levels in Australia next year.

Releasing the minutes of its August meeting, the central bank said global financial market volatility made it "appropriate" to leave interest rates on hold.

The Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) also said economic growth would strengthen in 2011 and 2012 to "above-average rates" even though consumers are still cautious.

Like Treasury, the RBA sees an expansion pace of up to four percent by the middle of next year.

The experts saw this as a sign interest rates would remain on hold at 4.5 percent in the short term.

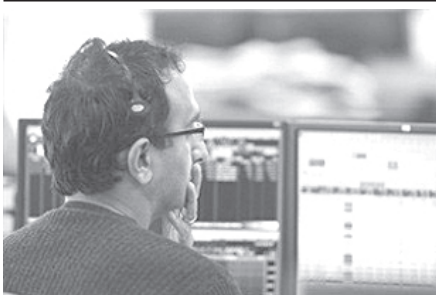
"It is clear that the Reserve Bank is unlikely to move on interest rates until more concrete economic data is available," Commonwealth Securities economist Savanth Sebastian said in a statement.

"No doubt the new era of consumer conservatism and weak trading environment for retailers would add weight to the argument for interest rates to remain on hold over the next few months."—*Xinhua*

A TSX floor trader reacts to markets recently.

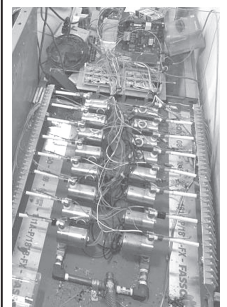

Oil hovers above \$75 in Asia amid economic worries

KUALA LUMPUR, 17 Aug—Oil prices edged up in Asia for the first time in five days Tuesday with gains tempered by signs of a slowing global economic recovery that could dent demand for fuel.

Benchmark crude for September delivery was up 14 cents to \$75.38 a barrel at afternoon Kuala Lumpur time in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange. The contract fell 15 cents to settle at \$75.24 a barrel on Monday.

Oil rebounded Tuesday after dropping from above \$81 a barrel early last week amid resurgent fears that the world economy may not grow as much as expected in the second half. —*Internet*

Influenza A/H1N1 vaccinations to run out in New Zealand

WELLINGTON, 17 Aug— Influenza A/H1N1 vaccine doses are expected to run out by the end of this month in New Zealand, according to local media on Tuesday.

Six deaths are being linked with the pandemic Influenza A/H1N1 this winter in New Zealand and 389 people have been hospitalized with the virus.

The deaths of a 22-year-old Hawkes Bay man, a 44-year-old Christchurch woman, a 48-year-old Tauranga woman, 51-year-old Northland man and a 38-year-old Wellington man have all been reported linked to the flu.

However, the New Zealand Ministry of Health is not offering comment on details of the sixth death.

Four of the six deaths are still being investigated by the coroner. Ministry of Health Director of Public Health Mark Jacobs estimated that there are only 6,400 vaccinations left in New Zealand and the ministry are looking at options for extending immunization while demand continued.—*Xinhua*

China finishes construction of first unmanned space module

BEIJING, 17 Aug — China has finished construction of its first unmanned space module, Tiangong-1, and it is testing the module's electronic, mechanical and thermal properties, a military source said here Tuesday.

The 8.5-tonne Tiangong-1 will be put into preset orbit in 2011, the source added. The space module is expected to carry out China's first space docking, with the Shenzhou-8 spacecraft, which will be launched in the second half of 2011 after Tiangong-1. The source said experts are currently building the Shenzhou-8 and testing the Long March II-F carrier rocket on which the Tiangong-1 is expected to be launched. Chinese astronauts, including two females, are undergoing training for the space docking, the source said.—*Xinhua*

New disaster warning device being tested for Pacific

WELLINGTON, 17 Aug—A new disaster warning device using radio transmission to alert and inform people in a mass emergency is being developed for possible use in the Pacific island countries, local media reported on Tuesday.

The Yellow Bird Alert uses a wake-up radio tone to activate a flashing light and siren and to turn on emergency broadcast information.

A former director general of Emergency Management Australia, David Templeman, has been involved in developing the prototype and presented to a meeting of disaster risk managers from around the Pacific, held in the Fiji capital of Suva last week,

according to Radio New Zealand International. Templeman said interest in the device, inspired by the canary in the coal mine was very encouraging.

"Whether it's bush fire, whether its flood, even the situation following tsunami, all those sorts of situations, it has relevance to every hazard. But more importantly, not only can it be dealt with and used in the context of warning people, this is an arrangement whereby we can get rapid information to people in a recovery situation," he told Radio New Zealand International. Templeman said he hoped to secure funding for trials in Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Papua New Guinea.

BILLINGS, 17 Aug—Hunger and internal parasites afflicted a grizzly bear that mauled three campers near Yellowstone National Park, but investigators said Monday those factors failed to explain such aggressive predatory behaviour.

The bear's late-night rampage through a crowded campground was the most brazen by a Yellowstone grizzly in a quarter-century. It left one man dead and two people with serious injuries.

But after an in-depth investigation, wildlife officials on Monday produced a 70-page report that left unanswered a crucial question: Why did the bear attack?

"The reality is grizzly bears are predators," said Warden Capt. Sam Sheppard with Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks, who helped produce the report. "You never know when they're going to revert to a predatory response."

Kevin Kammer, 48, of Grand Rapids, Mich., was killed and two people were hospitalized after the 216-pound grizzly tore into their tents in a nighttime attack on 28 July at the Soda Butte Campground near Cooke City.

There was no evidence of food left out by campers that might have attracted the bear. The grizzly was captured a day later at the same campground, then was euthanized. Its three cubs are now in a Billings zoo.

Over 1,400 patients treated with stem cells in Cuba

HAVANA, 17 Aug—Stem cell treatment was successfully applied to 1,478 patients in Cuba from 2004 to 2009, the government said on Monday.

About 74 percent of those treated suffered from inadequate blood supply to the lower limbs and diseases of the blood and lymph vessels unresponsive to conventional therapy, said Porfirio Hernandez, coordinator of

the National Group for Regenerative Medicine.

There has also been an increase in stem cell treatments in orthopedics and traumatology,

he said.

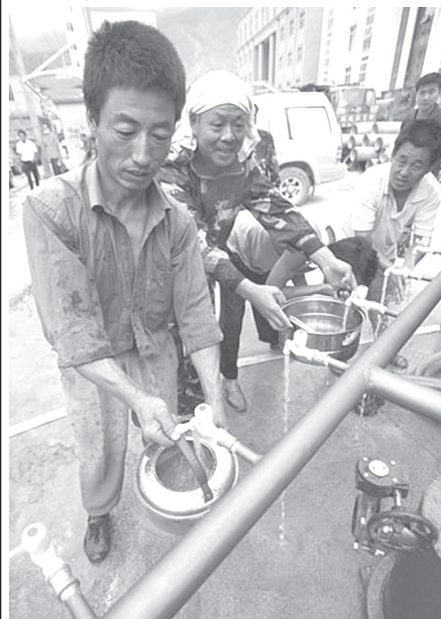

Ten killed, eight injured in road mishap in northern India

NEW DELHI, 17 Aug—At least 10 people were killed and eight others sustained injuries in a major road mishap in the northern Indian state of Uttarakhand's hilly District of Almora on Sunday night, a senior police official said on Monday.

"The 10 were killed when the bus in which they were travelling plunged into a gorge at Koofi in Almora last night, after the driver lost control of the speeding vehicle late last night. The bus skidded into the 450-foot-deep gorge, killing 10 on the spot," he said.

Study shows Australia's agriculture sector short by 96,000 workers

CANBERRA, 17 Aug—Australia's agriculture sector has a labour shortage of at least 96,000 full-time workers and 10,000 part-time workers, a new study showed on Tuesday.

The Australian Farm Institute on Tuesday released the study, which concluded that if the sector continues on a business-as-usual course the shortage will worsen, driving up labor costs and limiting future growth in the sector.

Executive director Mick Keogh said agriculture was competing with mining for regional workers, and he believed there was a generally poor perception of the farming sector among school leavers.

There was a lack of defined career paths for younger people and an "indifferent" attitude from employers towards helping workers with additional education or training, Keogh said in the statement on Tuesday.

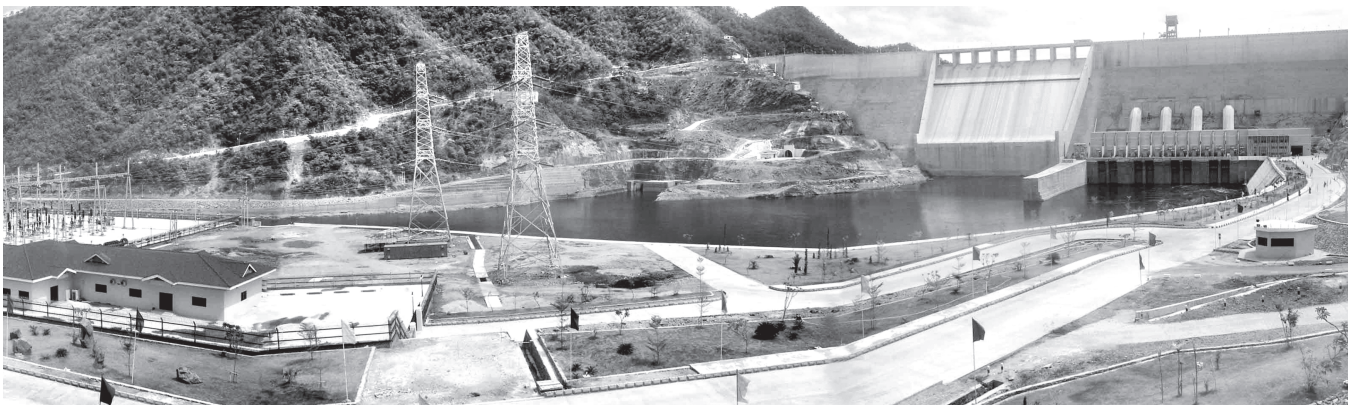
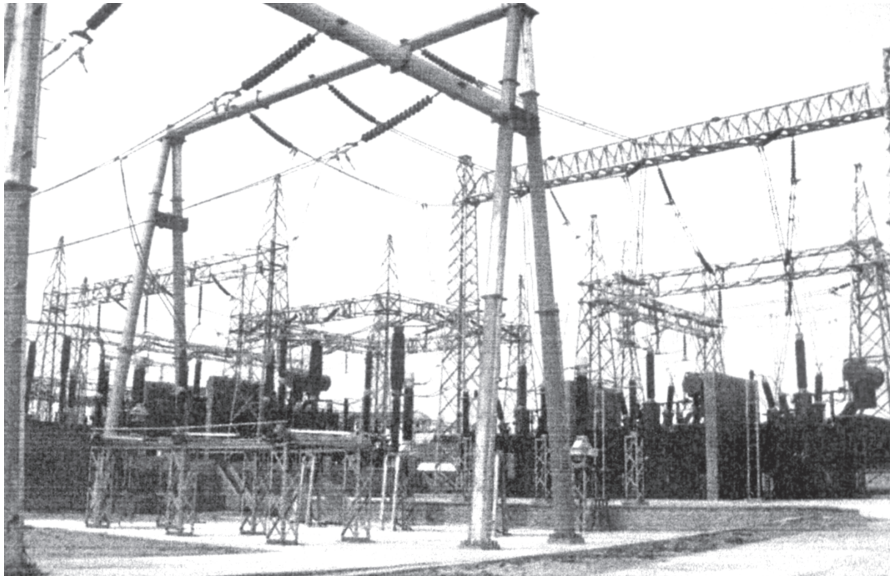

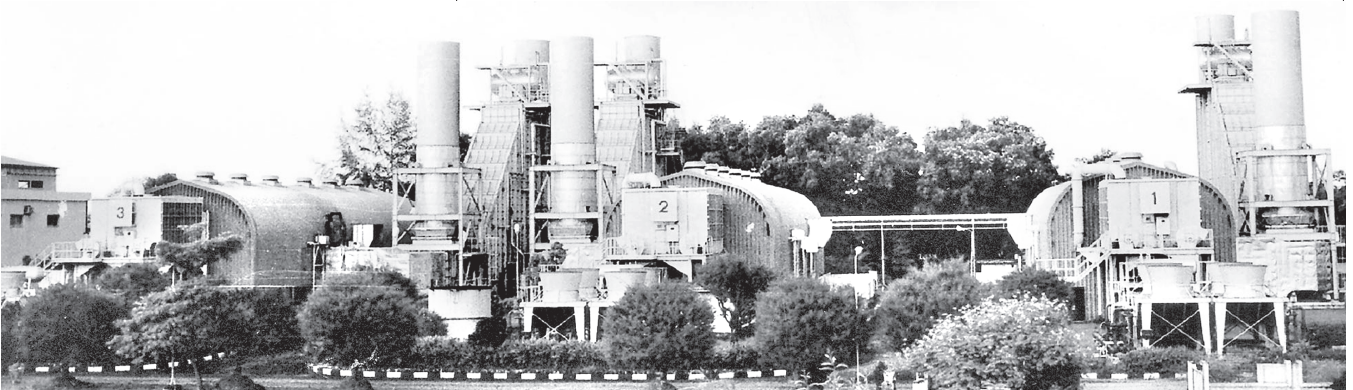

Employee opens fire on suspects during robbery

FAIRFIELD, 17 Aug—Gunfire erupted on Friday afternoon when two suspects attempted to rob a cell phone store in Fairfield and an employee with a gun opened fire in apparent self-defence, according to police. Officers responded to a reported attempted robbery at a MetroPCS store located at 2023 N. Texas St at around 3:15 pm, Fairfield police said.

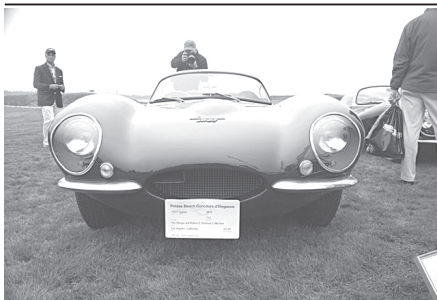

Another German tourist killed in San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO, 17 Aug—A bicyclist who was killed in a hit-and-run accident on Friday night in San Francisco has been identified as 21-year-old Nils Linke, who was a tourist from Germany, according to the San Francisco medical examiner's office.

Linke was riding southbound on Masonic Avenue near Turk Street at about 10:40 pm on Friday when a 1989 Mercedes-Benz also

"Craiglist Killer" Philip Markoff commits suicide in jail

BEIJING, 17 Aug—The American medical student jailed for the murder of a prostitute was found dead in jail due to apparent suicide, according to AFP on Monday.

Philip Markoff was found dead in his cell room in Suffolk County jail in Boston, said the police and the district attorney's office in a statement. The joint statement said that Markoff was kept alone in his jail room and it indicated that he committed suicide.

Markoff's "Craiglist Killer" was named after killing women who like to put erotic ads on the website Craiglist. He was also charged with stealing cash and credit cards from another woman, who also posted her services on the website.

China fireworks plant blast kills 19, injures 153

BEIJING, 17 Aug—An explosion at a fireworks factory outside Harbin in northeastern China killed 19 people and injured 153, state media reported on Tuesday.

The Xinhua news agency said five people were still missing after the explosion early on Monday in Yichun city. The blast caused a shockwave felt up to five kilometres (three miles) away and prompted the evacuation of more than 2,000 residents.

A downpour had flooded a warehouse at the site and the blast occurred when workers were moving fireworks out of the building, local authorities told China Radio International. The fire spread to a chopstick factory on Monday but it was brought under control. More than 2,000 residents were evacuated after the explosion shattered windows within a one kilometre radius of the factory.—MNA/Reuters

'Ninja' robbers steal \$US60,000 in brazen mid-day New York City diamond heist

NEW YORK, 17 Aug — Two ninja-like robbers dressed head-to-toe in black pulled off a brazen, mid-day heist at a New York City Diamond District store today, tying up the owner and his son and swiping \$US60,000 (\$67,000) in cash and jewellery before fleeing. The robbers, one of whom was armed, sprinted out of the Namat Inc store on West 47th St in midtown Manhattan before cops were called about 2pm — after the victims wiggled out of their binding in their second-storey shop, cops told the New York Post.

Though the cagey robbers disabled the store's surveillance, "There are lots of video cameras on the street," said one cop at the scene. Matt Hartley, 25, with girlfriend Macey Deleon, 22, of Westchester, said they often come to Midtown to window-shop on weekends.—Internet

Scientists flesh out research into synthetic blood

LONDON, 17 Aug—British scientists have turned stem cells from spare IVF embryos into red blood cells as part of a project to manufacture synthetic blood on an industrial scale. It is believed to be the first time that human red blood cells have been created from embryonic stem cells in Britain and it marks a milestone in a project aimed at producing blood for transfusions. The aim of the £3m (¥3.7m) project is to develop an alternative source of O-negative blood, the universal donor group that can be transfused into the vast majority of the population without fear of rejection.

The project has used more than 100 spare IVF embryos from fertility clinics to establish several embryonic stem cell lines that replicate continuously in the laboratory.

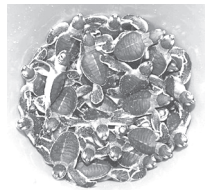

Rare 'princess' turtle returns to Malaysia

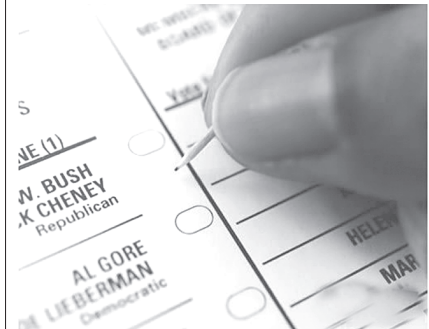
The leatherbacks — the largest of all sea turtles — were once a star attraction at Rantau Abang beach in Malaysia's northern state of Terengganu but overfishing, poaching and pollution caused the population to plummet.

The turtle, dubbed the "Puteri Rantau Abang" or Rantau Abang Princess and identified by special markings, returned last month to end a long dry spell of turtle landings which have been rare in Terengganu since the 1980s.

ing Sunday's race, in which he struggled most of the afternoon and was in no mood to discuss his Chase chances after his fifth consecutive finish outside the top 15.

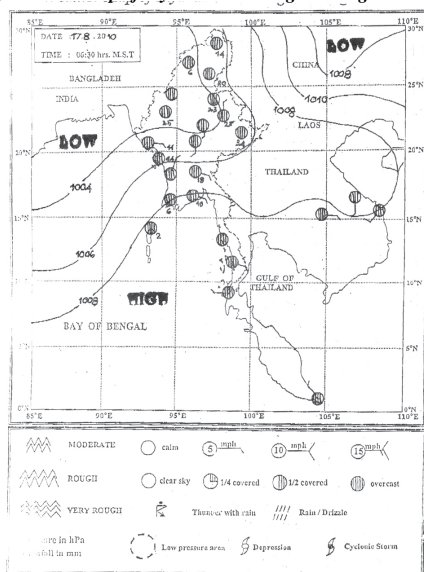

Resolving the Paradox of the Antarctic Sea Ice

SCIENCE DAILY, 16 Aug—While Arctic sea ice has been diminishing in recent decades, the Antarctic sea ice extent has been increasing slightly. Researchers from the Georgia Institute of Technology provide an explanation for the seeming paradox of increasing Antarctic sea ice in a warming climate.

The paper appears in the Early Edition of the Proceedings of the National Academy of Science the week of August 16, 2010.—Internet
