NAY PYI TAW, 24 Aug.—Prime Minister U Thein Sein, who was in Yangon, inspected monsoon paddy fields and arrangements for supply of irrigation water at Model Agriculture Special Zone in Yangon Region yesterday morning.

Accompanied by Lt-Gen Myint Swe of the Ministry of Defence, Chairman of Yangon Region Peace and Development Council Commander of Yangon Command Maj-Gen Win Myint, heads of department and officials concerned, Prime Minister U Thein Sein visited Model Agricultural Project of Dagon International Limited at Block No.1 of Model Agriculture Special Zone (1) in Dagon Myothit (East) Township yesterday morning.

At the briefing hall, Director U Kyaw Zaw Aung of the company reported to the Prime Minister on test growing of five new paddy strains sent by International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) of Philippines and three paddy strains commonly grown in Myanmar.

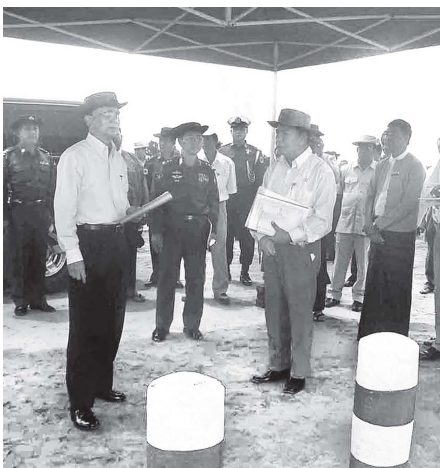

Spend Metta Sutta Day in contemplation of loving-kindness

Fullmoon Day of Wagaung, which falls today, is the Day of Metta Sutta. The Buddha "Gotama" delivered a sermon of Metta Sutta Paritta to 500 monks at Jetavana Monastery in Savatthi on Fullmoon Day of Wagaung.

In the time of the Buddha, one day, 500 monks altogether asked Him for the approach to Kamathana (meditation) and entered the Raining Season Retreat in a forest. Owing to the power of the high morality of the monks, some deities in the forest could not stay any longer in the trees, and they had to leave their residences. So, they used a variety of ways to frighten the monks. In consequence, the monks could not get on with their doing meditation any longer, and went back to Jatavana Monastery where the Buddha was sojourning in the retreat period.

Just as He got informed about what the monks encountered in the forest, the Buddha delivered Metta Sutta and exhorted them to take the might of Metta (loving-kindness) together with them to try again. Hearing the Metta Sutta recited by the monks who entered the forest, the deities came to admire and hold the monks in high esteem, and welcomed them. That is the result of reciting Metta Sutta.

As loving-kindness represents peace, we all should deal with each other and one another with a sense of loving-kindness.

The traditional flower designated for the month "Wagaung" is Khatta (land lilies), and the traditional festival, "Saryaytanme Pwe" (the festival of charity by casting lots).

On such a day of religious significance, Buddhists are urged to radiate loving-kindness, compassion, sympathetic joy and equanimity to each other and practise meditation in order to lead a peaceful life.

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Aug—Special Refresher Course No. 38 for basic education teachers was opened at Central Institute of Civil Service (Upper Myanmar) in PyinOoLwin District, Mandalay Region yesterday morning. Minister for Education Dr Chan Nyein, on behalf of Chairman of Myanmar Education Committee Secretary-1 of the State Peace and Development Council General Thiha Thura Tin Aung Myint Oo, addressed the opening of the course.

Also present were Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement U Maung Maung Swe, Chairman of Civil Service Selection and Training Board U Kyaw Thu, deputy Ministers and the Deputy Chief Justice (Upper Myanmar), the Chairman of Mandalay City Development Committee Mandalay Mayor, members of the CSSTB, heads of departments, the rector of the institute, pro-rectors, faculty heads, lecturers, course instructors and trainees.

Speaking on the occasion, Minister Dr Chan Nyein said that 30-year long-term national education promotion plan was focused on emergence of highly proficient younger generation human resources and enhancing talents of intellectuals and intelligentsias. The plan was drawn by well-experienced persons from education field across the nation.

He went on to say that the programme was phased over six 5-year periods and 2010-2011 academic year was the last year of the second 5-year period. In

establishing the future nation, basic education teachers were to cultivate their pupils to become moral, disciplined and educated citizens on which the nation can rely on.

Nowadays, global nations, he said, were enjoying positive effects of ever-developing science and technology and information technology, however, on the other hand, it had also caused adverse effects, i.e. the threat of penetration of alien concepts that conflicted with own national characteristics. Especially, youths of developing nation were to be fully aware of it.

He then quoted Senior General Than Shwe as saying, "Morale, discipline, and education are primary factors in pursuing education. Students are to be continuously trained since from primary education level to university level and it is the responsibility of teachers and personnel from education field."

So, teachers were to nurture their pupils since early stage in basic education sector while trying themselves to become qualified civil servants, he stressed. Teachers were noble persons who had devoted their whole lives to cultivating dutiful and educated citizens in other words the strength of the nation, he said. In conclusion, he called them for nurturing bright and polite citizens. Minister Dr Chan Nyein then cordially greeted the trainees. A total of 1,508 teachers are attending the five-week course.

Suicide bomber attacks Somali hotel, killing 31

MOGADISHU, 24 Aug—A suicide bomber and gunmen stormed a hotel in Somalia's capital on Tuesday, killing at least 31 people including members of parliament in an attack that set off an hour-long gun battle, a military spokesman and a witness said.

The assault comes after Somalia's most dangerous group, al-Shabab, declared a "massive war" on "invaders" — an apparent reference to the 6,000 troops from the African Union that protect the weak Somali government.

African Union spokesman Maj.

Barigye Bahoku said it wasn't immediately known how many members of parliament were killed in the attack on the Muna hotel, located a half-mile (1 kilometre) from Somalia's presidential palace. An 11-year-old shoe shine boy and a woman selling tea in front of the hotel were among the dead, Bahoku said.

Al-Shabab has increased the use of suicide attacks in recent years, though they are still somewhat rare in Somalia. Veterans of the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts are believed to be helping train al-Shabab fighters.—*Internet*

US Drone strike kills 20 in Pakistan

MIRANSHAH, 24 Aug—Missiles fired from a US pilotless drone aircraft killed 13 militants and 7 civilians in Pakistan's North Waziristan on Monday, Pakistani intelligence officials said.

They said the missiles were fired at a militant hideout. Most of the militants killed were members of the Afghan Taliban. Four women and three children were among the dead, said the officials.

"The missiles hit a militant compound and a house adjacent to it. We have confirmed reports of 20 dead," said one of the intelligence officials.

Two French soldiers killed in Afghanistan

PARIS, 24 Aug—Two French soldiers were killed and three others wounded in a military operation in Afghanistan, said French President Nicolas Sarkozy's office on Monday, raising the country's total fatalities in Afghanistan to 47.

The two dead were a soldier and an officer from the 21st Marine Infantry Regiment. They were fatally wounded by gun fire during an overnight operation in Tagab, north of Kabul, while three others were injured at the start of the operation.

"These soldiers gave their lives in the service of France's commitment to the peace and security of the Afghan people," Sarkozy said in a statement.

The French president condemned "insurgents' murderous attacks" on NATO military forces in Afghanistan, stressing France would continue to be a part of the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF).

About 3,500 French troops are deployed in Afghanistan.

Gunmen kill five Iraqi oil workers, steal payroll

BAGHDAD, 24 Aug—Gunmen in Iraq ambushed a car carrying five oil refinery employees transporting the company payroll on Monday, killing them and fleeing with \$300,000 in cash, officials said.

The attack just outside Saddam Hussein's hometown of Tikrit hit the employees after they had picked up the payroll for the Haditha refinery in western Iraq from the main refining headquarters in Beiji, 155 miles (250 kilometres) north of Baghdad, police said.

Three accountants, an engineer and a driver were killed, said an official with the main refinery in Beiji. Hospital officials in Tikrit confirmed the death toll.

The incident was the latest in a growing number of criminal attacks many believe are part of insurgent efforts to raise funds.—*Internet*

One soldier killed in western Iraq bombings

BAGHDAD, 24 Aug—An Iraqi soldier was killed and six people injured in two bomb explosions in Iraq's western province of Anbar on Monday, a provincial police source said.

A soldier was killed and two others wounded when a roadside bomb went off near their patrol in the town of Khaldiya, some 80 km west of Baghdad, a

source from the provincial operations command told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident, a bomb explosion hit a police patrol near a parking lot in central the provincial capital city of Ramadi, some 110 km west of Baghdad, damaging a police vehicle and wounding a policeman aboard. Three civilians at the

outside the parking lot were also wounded by the blast, the source said. Insurgent attacks continue in the once volatile Province of Anbar, which has been relatively calm for nearly three years after Sunni tribes and anti-US militants groups turned to cooperate with the US troops and Iraqi security forces against al-Qaeda network in Iraq.

Afghan villagers protest night raid

KABUL, 24 Aug—Hundreds of villagers have blocked a highway in eastern Afghanistan to protest a night raid by NATO and Afghan soldiers that left two people dead.

A statement from the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) said two "Taliban militants" were killed in the raid in a district near Jalalabad.

But villagers said the men were civilians; their protest temporarily closed the highway connecting Jalalabad to Pakistan on Wednesday.

"The Americans who killed these people should come and see whether it is civilians or insurgents they killed," Mohammad Gul, one of the protesters, said. "We need an explanation from them."

32 killed, 18 injured in western Sudan floods, heavy rains

KHARTOUM, 24 Aug—A total of 32 people in western Sudan's North Kordofan State were killed and 18 others injured in the floods and heavy rains, the official *SUNA* news agency said.

The agency quoted a report by Sudan's operations room of rainy season as saying that the casualties were caused by "drowning, thunder-bolts and collapse of houses." The report said 886 houses completely collapsed, while around 11,000 houses partially collapsed. About 159 government utilities have been affected by the heavy rains and some 4,950 head of cattle died.

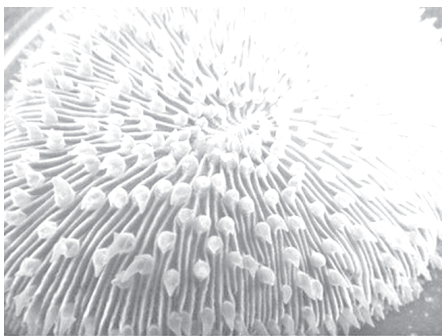

Researchers monitoring Hawaii coral for bleaching

PEARL HARBOR, 24 Aug—Scientists plan to monitor corals in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands next month for signs of bleaching that could harm the reefs.

Corals become stressed and expel the algae that live inside them when temperatures are warmer than normal. This causes corals to lose their colour and appear white.

Corals may die if this continues for extended periods, depriving fish of vital food and habitat.

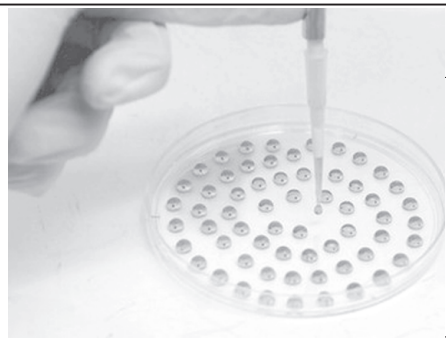
Researchers will be observing coral in the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument during September—the hottest month of the year in Hawaii, monument deputy superintendent Randall Kosaki said on Friday. They're due to leave for the remote atolls aboard the research ship Hiialakai in a week, he said. Kosaki measured

surface temperatures of 82 to 84 degrees during another research trip to the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands earlier this month.

Kosaki also noted there's currently a mass of warm water from Southeast Asia that's pushing into the North Pacific. "It's warm now. If it cools off we might not have a bleaching event. If it stays warm for an extended period we might have a bleaching event," he said. Bleaching would be likely if temperatures stay higher than normal for more than two to four weeks, Kosaki said.

The Northwestern Hawaiian Islands, which are home to 69 percent of the coral under US jurisdiction, had bleaching events in 2002 and 2004. In May, marine biologists working for the Wildlife Conservation Society observed coral bleaching off Indonesia's Aceh Province as surface waters in the Andaman Sea peaked at 93 degrees—7 degrees higher than long-term averages.

Subsequent surveys found 80 percent of the bleached corals had died.—*Internet*



Chronic pain may be genetic, and controllable

JERUSALEM, 24 Aug—A group of Israeli and international researchers say they may have found a gene responsible for controlling chronic pain from nerve injury.

"Our discovery may provide insights for treating chronic pain through previously unthought-of mechanisms," said Prof Ariel Darvasi of the Alexander Silberman Institute of Life Sciences at the Hebrew University, according to a report appearing in the peer-reviewed journal, *Genome Research*. Darvasi and his team used the tests to narrow

down the possibilities to what they believe may be the genetic culprit, *Cacgn2*.

"The immediate significance is the mere awareness that differences in pain perception may have a genetic predisposition," Darvasi said of the discovery. Going up the evolutionary scale, the scientists then analyzed a group of breast cancer patients who experienced chronic pain more than six months after undergoing a full or partial mastectomy. The researchers again found that genetic variants of *Cacgn2* were significantly associated with this chronic pain. Some 20 percent of adults worldwide suffer from some degree of chronic pain, according to the report, whether from recognized sources such as headaches, back pain and arthritis, or psychosomatic reasons with no clear cause.—*Internet*

Google acquires visual shopping search engine "Like.com"

BEIJING, 24 Aug—Google has acquired Like.com, whose visual search engine helps people match clothes and other apparel online and purchase them from retailers, according to media reports on Monday.

Like.com CEO and co-founder Munjal Shah announced the deal on his company's home page this weekend. Financial details were not disclosed, but a *Wall Street Journal* report said the startup could be worth as much as 100 million US dollars.

Founded in 2004, Like.com uses computer vision and machine learning technology to provide a visual search engine focused on shoes, clothes, jewelry and decor, according to the company. The deal is Google's latest acquisition. Analysts say Like.com's technology could be applied to the Internet giant's Product Search or Commerce Search engine.

BlackBerry releases paid apps in Aus

NEW DELHI, 24 Aug—After months of waiting, Research in Motion (RIM) has confirmed that Australian BlackBerry users would be able to purchase apps from the BlackBerry App World store.

RIM said today that users would be able to make purchases starting at US\$0.99 using various payment options.

"Customers will be able to purchase applications using PayPal and major credit cards, including Visa and MasterCard," RIM said in a statement.

The smartphone maker also announced new security features in the latest version of software that gives users a BlackBerry secure identification marker. The marker will allow users to carry purchases over when switching to a new device.

The company had previously launched a free version of App World in December last year and couldn't confirm when paid applications would become available. RIM has had its fair share of headlines over the past few weeks, with countries including India and Saudi Arabia raising concerns over the security of messaging data that was preventing government agencies from monitoring user communications.—*Internet*

Bloggers crying foul over Philly business tax

PHILADELPHIA, 24 Aug—Bloggers in Philadelphia are up in arms about what they're calling an unfair tax. The city's so-called business privilege license costs \$50 a year or \$300 for a lifetime.

If a blog takes money for advertising, or sells photographs or other goods, it's a business and must pay for a license—no matter how little it makes—plus taxes on profits. A spokesman for Mayor Michael Nutter says it's nothing new and it applies to any revenue-making enterprise, from large corporations to neighbourhood pizza joints and mom-and-pop businesses.

Some bloggers are complaining that the fee would impinge on their free speech and would discourage dissent. They also say it's unfair to require business to pay taxes if they're making only \$25 or \$50 a year.

Chinese vaccine shields against hepatitis E

PARIS, 24 Aug—A prototype vaccine devised and tested in China has proven 100-percent effective in preventing hepatitis E, a disease that is widespread in the developing world and can be fatal, investigators reported in *The Lancet* on Monday. The hepatitis E virus, often transmitted by faecal contamination of water supplies, causes liver inflammation, whose symptoms are jaundice, fever and vomiting. It was only recognised as a distinct disease 30 years ago.

Mortality from the



disease is low, but people with chronic liver disease and pregnant mothers and their foetuses are badly at

risk. The trialled formula, codenamed HEV 239, is a recombinant vaccine, meaning that it includes a protein from the virus designed to stimulate the body's immune defences.

It was administered to 48,000 healthy adults aged 16-65, while an identical group of counterparts received a placebo. Three doses were issued over six months, and the volunteers were then monitored for a year. Fifteen fell ill with hepatitis E in the placebo group, but there were no cases in the vaccine group.

"During a hepatitis E outbreak, or for travellers to an endemic area, protection can be quickly obtained by two vaccine doses given within one month," said the study, headed by Nin-Shao Xia, of the Institute of Diagnostic and Vaccine Development in Infectious Diseases in Xiamen.

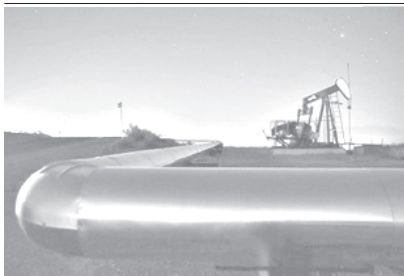
69 new dengue cases reported in Indian capital within one day

NEW DELHI, 24 Aug—At least 69 new cases of dengue were reported in Delhi since Sunday, taking the number of those infected to 434 this year. The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) on Monday said that the body has issued 45,532 legal notices against owners of property where water stagnation was found. These conditions lead to breeding of mosquitoes.

"A total of 6,125 persons have been prosecuted. The civic body has also released advisory in newspapers, stating the symptoms of and preventive measures for the vector-borne disease and urging the people not to panic," the advertisement of the MCD said.

Dengue is transmitted to humans by the aedes aegypti mosquito and its symptoms include fever, joint and bone pain, nausea, headache and fatigue. Mosquito breeding has been detected in 44,743 houses in various parts of the city, officials of the MCD said, adding that the south zone of the civic agency has been the worst affected.—*Xinhua*

Sinopec says H1 profit rises 6.7% to \$5.2 bln

HONG KONG, 24 Aug—Sinopec, China's top refiner, said on Sunday its net profit in the first half of this year edged up 6.7 percent to reach 35.46 billion yuan (5.2 billion US dollars) from a year earlier.

In a filing to the Hong Kong stock exchange, Chairman Su Sulin said Sinopec's turnover and other operating revenues amounted to 936.5 billion yuan, and the operating profit was 49.8 billion yuan, representing an increase of 75.4 percent and 7.8 percent respectively, over the same period of 2009.

The Beijing-based company attributed "encouraging operational results" in the first half to steady progress of China's economic recovery, growing demand for petroleum and petrochemical products, continued

expansion of Sinopec's operational scale and rising prices of crude oil, refined oil products and chemical products. According to the statement, Sinopec's refinery throughput reached 101 million tonnes in the first half, representing an increase of 16.7 percent year on year. The refining segment and marketing and distribution segment achieved external sales revenue of 567 billion yuan, an increase of 59.7 percent year on year. The two segments accounted for 60.5 percent of Sinopec's turnover and other operating revenues, it said. In the exploration and production (E&P) segment, Sinopec produced 149 million barrels of crude oil, flat from a year earlier, and produced 200.6 billion cubic feet of natural gas, an increase of 40.7 percent year on year, it said.

Vietnam sends 37,068 laboures to work abroad in first half

HANOI, 24 Aug—Vietnam sent 37,068 laboures to work abroad in the first half of this year, up 12.32 percent year-on-year, said a report of the Department of Overseas Laboures Management on Monday. The country sent 7,493 workers to foreign markets in June alone, an increase of 15.65 percent from a month earlier, said the department.

The department said Chinese Taipei was the largest export market for Vietnamese laborers in the first six months this year with 12,939 people. The United Arab Emirates came second for receiving 4,416 Vietnamese laborers to work in the country. Vietnam also sent 3,032 workers to work in Libya and another 2,840 to Laos, according to the department. The rest of Vietnamese laborers were sent to Japan, Malaysia, the Republic of Korea, Saudi Arabia and other markets, according to the department.—*Internet*

AIG pays back \$4 billion of US loan

NEW YORK, 24 Aug—Bailed-out insurer American International Group Inc said on Monday it paid back nearly \$4 billion in US loans in its single largest cash payment so far to reduce its debt to taxpayers.

The partial repayment of a Federal Reserve Bank of New York credit facility came after International Lease Finance Corp, AIG's aircraft leasing unit, sold \$4.4 billion in debt to investors and used the bulk of the proceeds to repay \$3.9 billion in government loans three years early.

AIG said the repayment will trigger an accelerated amortization of a prepaid commitment fee asset, resulting in a roughly \$650 million pre-tax charge.

The latest payment reduces the size of the Fed credit facility to about \$30 billion from \$34 billion.

Buckwheat shortage detected in Moscow

Moscow, 24 Aug— Buckwheat disappeared from all food stores across Moscow city, the *Interfax* news agency reported on Monday.

As one of the basic staples for Russians, Buckwheat has been absent from the shop shelves in all the capital's major supermarkets, said the report. Shop managers have been uncertain when the supplies could be restored.

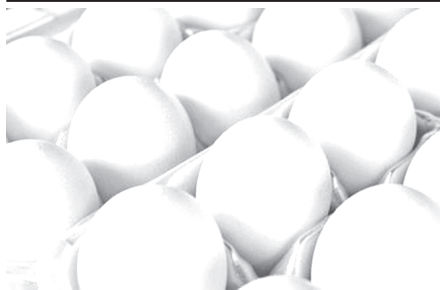
Meanwhile, on the city's free markets, prices for buckwheat jumped from 20 to 76 rubles (from 0.65 to 2.5 US dollars) per kilogram during the last weekend. The report said buckwheat also disappeared from the supermarkets in Ukraine. An official in the Russian Ministry of Economic Development told *Interfax* that he did not see any reasons the government should regulate the prices of buckwheat. Market prices for that grocery rose over 60 percent during the summer.

According to head of Moscow's trade association, Ilya Belonovsky, a hike was expected also in the prices of honey, beer, salt, cheese, sugar and milk. "Salt traders explain they have suffered from the drought — it is ridiculous," he told local media. A buckwheat and milk shortage was expected, the agency reported on Monday citing a head of one of Russia's largest supermarket chains. The source said, the retailers have already been facing 20 to 30 percent supply shortage of their orders for milk. Price hike for buckwheat was expected up to 60 percent, he added.—*Xinhua*

Arthritis protein may reverse Alzheimer's disease

BEIJING, 24 Aug— A protein triggered by rheumatoid arthritis appears to protect against the development of Alzheimer's disease, according to a new study on Monday.

Scientists from the University of South Florida found that memory loss associated with Alzheimer's was partially reversed by the protein GM-CSF, which is an attacking protein produced by the immune system in cases of rheumatoid arthritis.

In some cases the memory impairment was completely reversed after treatment, said the research published online in the *Journal of Alzheimer's Disease*.

As people with rheumatoid arthritis suffer swollen joints, the protein stimulates scavenger cells in the body. In tests on mice, these cells removed deposits left by Alzheimer's in the brain, according to the study.

A synthetic protein of GM-CSF, known as Leukine, is commercially available and is already used in cancer treatment.

"Our findings provide a compelling explanation for why rheumatoid arthritis is a negative risk factor for Alzheimer's disease," said Prof Huntingdon Potter, a molecular medicine expert involved in the study.

Potter hoped the treatment could soon be tested on humans.—*Xinhua*

Macao's visitor arrivals up 23.2% in July

MACAO, 24 Aug — Macao's visitor arrivals in July went up by 23.2 percent over the same period of last year to 2.68 million, according to the figures released on Monday by Macao's Statistics and Census Service (DSEC).

Chinese mainland remained Macao's major source market, accounting for 52.8 percent of the total, standing at 1.14 million, with 477,119 traveling to Macao under the Individual Visit Scheme, up by 40.3 percent from July 2009. Visitors from Hong Kong and Taiwan rose respectively by 15.4 percent and 3.5 percent year-on-year to 670,953 and 121,273, the figures indicated.

As for the seven months of 2010, visitor arrivals reached 14.39 million, rising by 18.7 percent over last year,

with the majority of visitors coming from the Chinese mainland and Hong Kong, according to the DSEC.

Sameday visitors accounted for 51.8 percent of the total visitor arrivals, at 7.45 million in the first seven months of 2010, the DSEC also said.—*Xinhua*

MUMBAI, 24 Aug—Tata Group Chairman Ratan Tata said on Monday he regrets Tata Motors could not do the Nano car project, which it wanted to do in West Bengal, but the state would always be there as a part of the group's corporate identity. "We regret we have not been able to do what we wanted to do over here," he said, without mentioning the Singur project in the annual general meeting of the company.

Tata Motors in October 2008 moved the small car plant to Sanand in Gujarat in the face of continuing agitation by Trinamool Congress demanding return of 400 acres acquired from farmers.

"We are dedicated to the cancer hospital that is coming up. It is hoped that it will start this year. West Bengal is very much a part of our total corporate identity," Tata said.

The company is constructing a cancer hospital in Rajarhat in the northeastern fringes of the city.

In the world, the great majority of the countries are multicultural ones. In particular, each of Union nations is home to various national races with different religions, cultures and traditions. Bodies hung from bridge in Cuernavaca, Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 24 Aug — Police in Mexico say they have found four bodies hung from a bridge in an affluent town south of Mexico City. The four men had been decapitated and mutilated before being hung by their ankles from the bridge outside Cuernavaca, in the state of Morelos. A message had been left with their heads warning that anyone supporting Edgar Valdez would risk a similar fate.

Edgar Valdez is reportedly fighting Hector Beltran Leyva for control of the influential Beltran Leyva drug cartel. Cuernavaca, a city of 350,000 and a popular

Trapped Chile miners receive food and water

LONDON, 24 Aug— Rescue workers in Chile say they have sent the first supplies of water and food to 33 miners who have been trapped underground for 17 days.

Capsules containing the supplies were sent down a tube, which is the miners' only lifeline.

Rescuers made contact with the miners on Sunday after lowering a probe some 700m (2,300ft) beneath the surface.

The miners have not been told it may take up to four months to get them out, the head of the rescue operation said.

Andres Sougarret said

it could take that long to drill a new shaft wide enough to pull the men to safety.

A specialised drill is on its way to the San Jose copper and gold mine, near the city of Copiapo, for the task.

If more specialised equipment was sent from outside Chile, the operation would still take at least two months, mining minister Laurence Golborne said.—*Internet*

At least 150 women raped in east DRC

UNITED NATIONS, 24 Aug — Militants raped at least 150 women last month during a weekend raid on community villages in eastern part of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), United Nations spokesman Martin Nesirky reported at a press briefing here on Monday.

UN officials accused the Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda (FDLR) for the attack. The FDLR is an ethnic Hutu rebel group that has been terrorizing the hills of eastern DRC for years, preying on villages in a quest for the natural resources beneath them, reports said.

In the eastern DRC province Nord Kivu, a UN joint human rights team verified allegations of at least 154 women, Nesirky said.

"Victims are receiving medical care and have also been provided with psycho sociological care," he added.

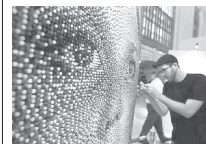
Maine family finds fake bomb in their new home

Peter Chan's new movie starts shooting

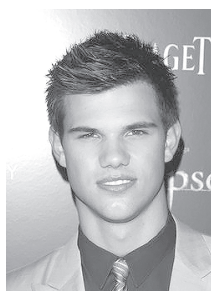

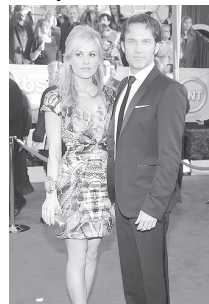

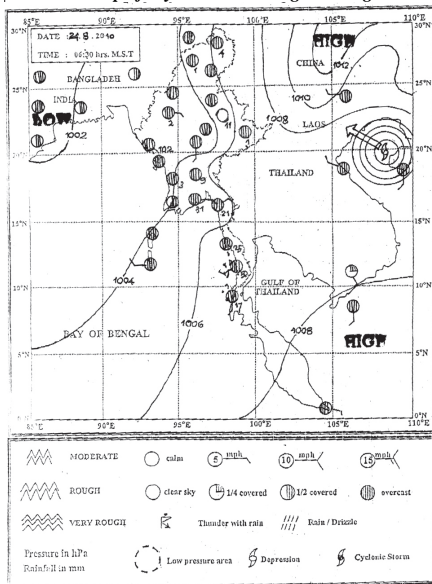

Guatemala warns of high waves, heavy flooding

MEXICO CITY, 23 Aug—Guatemala will be faced with high waves and heavy flooding throughout the week, due to tropical storm Frank, which passed by the nation on Sunday, it is reported.

Guatemala's National Institute of Seismology, Volcanology, Meteorology and Hydrology is predicting sea waves of 3.8 meters high on Monday and Tuesday, which will reduce gradually to 2.7 meters by Sunday. Wind speed is expected to be around 24 km per hour (kph), dropping to about 14 kph by Sunday.

Many Guatemalans experienced heavy rains at the weekend as the storm moved close to the country's Pacific coast, which triggered flooding in some regions around its capital, Guatemala City.
