Water is essential not only for living things but also for agriculture. There are a lot of rivers, creeks and lakes in Myanmar. For irrigation purpose, water is being supplied to farmlands by means of dams, river water pumping projects and underground water tapping projects. Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation is taking responsibility for retaining water in order to supply water to farmlands and to use

surplus water in other places.

Kayah State is in pursuit of the target of 260987 acres of monsoon crops for 2010-2011. State Irrigation Department is constantly making endeavors for supply of irrigation water to these farmlands.

The farmlands get irrigation water from 32 dams, Moby, Ngwetaung, Dawtacha and Hotar dams, Loinanpha and Ngwetaung regulating dams, nine diversion dams and 17 lakes. All

other dams, regulating dams, diversion dams and water tanks have been under regular maintenance except upper and lower Tanilale lakes in Dimawhso Township of Loikaw District which were built in 1980.

"Irrigation Department and Care Myanmar Co., Ltd in collaboration with local people have carried out raising level of lower Tanilale lake's bund measuring 1600x14x3 feet from 10 June through 5 July.

Our department

has to build new lakes and dams and to carry out maintenance of these lakes and dams," said U Tin Wan, Deputy Director of State Irrigation Department. Thanks to the said lakes, they contribute much not only to local people but also to the region. The construction of 7000 feet long intake channel from No.2 Phaelyar dam to lower Tanilale lakes has been carried out by Irrigation Department and Care Myanmar company in collaboration with local

Plane carrying 51 crashes in Venezuela; 36 survive

CARACAS, 14 Sept—A plane carrying 51 people crashed Monday in a steel mill yard in eastern Venezuela, killing 15 people on board, officials said.

Workers at the state-run Sidor steel foundry pulled people from the smoking wreckage of the plane owned by Venezuelan state airline Conviasa,

and officials said 36 passengers and crew survived.

Foundry worker Frank Oliveros, 44, said he saw a huge billow of smoke after the crash, then saw the wreckage and joined dozens of fellow employees and firefighters who rushed to the scene.

"I don't remember names ... faces," Oliveros told *The Associated Press* by telephone. "Our only interest was getting all the people out of there alive." The partially scorched fuselage of French-built ATR 42 rested among barrels and shipping containers.

Fifteen people were killed after the crash about six miles (10 kilometres) from the eastern city of Puerto Ordaz, Bolivar state Gov. Francisco Rangel Gomez told reporters. Forensic experts have yet to identify six of the bodies, he said.

"A miracle occurred today," said Rangel Gomez, referring to the number of survivors. The bodies of all the victims have been located, but authorities have not yet identified them all, Rangel Gomez said. It was unclear what caused the crash.

The plane, a twin-engine turboprop, was carrying 47 passengers and four crew members, Rangel Gomez said. Only one of the crew members survived, he said.—*Internet*

Two police officers killed in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 14 Sept—Two police officers were killed in two attacks by silenced weapons in Baghdad on Monday, an Interior Ministry source said.

A police Colonel was shot dead in the morning when unidentified gunmen opened fire from their weapons fitted with silencers on his car while he was driving in the al-Hurriyah neighbourhood in northwest of Baghdad, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident, gunmen with their weapons equipped with silencers shot dead another police officer near his house in the al-Jamia neighbourhood in western Baghdad, the source said.

Violence is still common in Iraqi cities as security deteriorated, causing a setback to the efforts of the Iraqi government to restore normalcy in the country about two weeks after the US military announced withdrawal of its combat troops from the war-torn country.—*Xinhua*

Russia's drug watchdog seizes 10 tons of drugs in 2010

MOSCOW, 14 Sept—The Russian Federal Drug Control Service has seized about 10 tons of narcotic drugs in 2010, reported Russian media on Monday.

"More than eight tons of hemp, over 900 kg of heroin and more than 900 kg of hashish have been seized," the service was quoted by *Interfax* news agency as saying. The service reported the number of drug traffickers has grown lately. "There have been about 80 armed attacks on drug control officers in the past two years.

Many officers sustained serious injuries, and two died," the service said. The traffickers were also reported to put up more aggressive resistance as they use both fire and cold weapon. Recently, Russian President Dmitry Medvedev stressed the problem at the international political forum in the city of Yaroslavl on 9 to 10 Sept. He outlined the "possibility of a democratic state to protect citizens from criminal communities," such as terrorism, drug trafficking and illegal migration. "The elimination of these threats is the first task of a democratic society," Medvedev said.

Some five million drug addicts live in Russia with majority addicted to the heroin illegally delivered from Afghanistan. Tens of thousands residents die from it every year.—*Xinhua*

Aging gas pipe at risk of explosion nationwide

SAN BRUNO, 14 Sept—An ominous theme has emerged from the wreckage of a deadly pipeline explosion in California: There are thousands of pipes just like it nationwide.

Utilities have been under pressure for years to better inspect and replace aging gas pipes — many of them laid years before the suburbs expanded over them and now at risk of leaking or erupting.

But the effort has fallen short. Critics say the regulatory system is ripe for problems because the government largely leaves it up to the companies to do inspections, and utilities are reluctant to spend the money necessary to properly fix and replace decrepit pipelines.

"If this was the FAA and air travel we were talking about, I wouldn't get on a plane," said Rick Kessler, a former congressional staffer specializing in pipeline safety issues who now works for the Pipeline Safety Trust, an advocacy group based in Bellingham, Wash.

Investigators are still trying to figure out how the pipeline in San Bruno ruptured and ignited a gigantic fireball that torched one home after another in the neighbourhood, killing at least four people. Pacific Gas & Electric Co, the pipeline's owner, said Monday it has set aside up to \$100 million to help residents recover.—*Internet*

Gun battle leaves two militants dead in N Afghanistan

PUL-E-KHUMRI, 14 Sept—Two Taliban militants were killed and four others sustained injuries as they came in contact with police in northern Baghlan Province on Monday, deputy provincial police chief Syed Zamanudin Hussaini said.

"The convoy of new police chief of Kunduz Province Abdul Rahman Syedkhili was heading towards Kunduz City, the capital of Kunduz Province this morning when Taliban militants attacked and police returned fire, killing two rebels on the spot," Hussaini told *Xinhua*.

Four more Taliban fighters sustained injuries in the gun battle lasted for some three hours, he further said. The incident happened in Jar-e-Khush village of Baghlan-e-Jadid district where Taliban militants are active. Syedkhili formally assumed office as police chief of Kunduz Province on Monday and vowed to improve security situation there in Kunduz Province. Both Baghlan and the neighbouring Kunduz Province are regarded as Taliban hotbed in north Afghanistan since early this year as Taliban militants have expanded their activities in both the provinces.—*Xinhua*

Melting sea ice forces walrus ashore in Alaska

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept—Tens of thousands of walrus have come ashore in northwest Alaska because the sea ice they normally rest on has melted.

Federal scientists say this massive move to shore by walrus is unusual in the United States. But it has happened at least twice

before, in 2007 and 2009. In those years Arctic sea ice also was at or near record low levels.

The population of walrus stretches “for one mile or more. This is just packed shoulder-to-shoulder,” US Geological Survey biologist Anthony Fischbach said in a telephone interview from Alaska. He

estimated their number at tens of thousands.

Scientists with two federal agencies are most concerned about the one-ton female walrus stampeding and crushing each other and their smaller calves near Point Lay, Alaska, on the Chukchi Sea. The US Fish and Wildlife Service is trying to change airplane flight patterns to avoid spooking the animals. Officials have also asked locals to be judicious about hunting, said agency spokesman Bruce Woods.

The federal government is in a year-long process to determine if walrus should be put on the endangered species list.

US senator seeks to safeguard stem cell funding

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept—A US senator unveiled a bill Monday to safeguard government funding for human embryonic stem cell research amid a court battle that saw a judge order a halt to federal money for such work.

Democratic Senator Arlen Specter said his

proposal would codify in law President Barack Obama's March 2009 executive order lifting restrictions predecessor George W Bush had imposed on such research.

Specter pointed to a federal judge's temporary injunction in August freezing federal funds for human embryonic stem cell research, later lifted by a US appeals court in a victory for backers of that pioneering scientific work.

“Even a temporary suspension of funding will disrupt the work on these important research projects in the areas of heart disease, sickle cell anemia, liver failure, muscular dystrophy and other maladies,” said the senator, himself a cancer

survivor. In his August ruling, US District court judge Royce Lamberth found that the research violated a 1996 law — the Dickey-Wicker amendment — that forbids using government money to produce stem cells from human embryos.

Removing Fallopian tubes cuts ovarian cancer risk



MONTREAL, 14 Sept—Removing a woman's Fallopian tubes could cut the number of deaths from ovarian cancer by 30 percent as that is where the illness develops first, Canadian researchers said on Friday. "Instead of clipping the tubes or burning it, it should be removed. We are warning: stop leaving the tubes in, it is where ovarian cancer begins," said gynaecologic oncologist Sarah Finlayson from Vancouver General Hospital. She said the discovery that ovarian cancer actually begins in the Fallopian tubes was "one of these moments of luck" during research into women who carry the BRCA gene that can trigger breast cancer. "We simply hadn't looked there before. Once we looked carefully, we found that ovarian cancer does not begin in the ovaries but in the Fallopian tubes." Ovarian cancer affects one in 70 women in Canada and

the chances of surviving longer than five years after diagnosis are only about 37 percent.

Women with the BRCA mutation have a high risk of developing cancer of the uterus or ovaries and often have them removed as a precaution.

"A woman may have no prior history of ovarian cancer in her family, but we now know that her children and their children could be at risk, and we have the ability to screen them genetically and act proactively," added pathologist Blake Gilks.—*Internet*

Disinfecting hand gels don't affect H1N1 flu infection rate

BOSTON, 14 Sept—The regular use of alcohol-based disinfecting hand gels authorities recommended during the A(H1N1) pandemic has little effect on the disease's infection rate, according to a study published Sunday.

The findings suggest that the pandemic virus

and similar strains may be most effectively transmitted in the air, rather than by contact with infected surfaces, the authors of the study said.

"An alcohol hand disinfectant with enhanced antiviral activity failed to significantly reduce the frequency of infection with either rhinovirus or influenza," wrote the authors of the study presented Sunday at the Interscience Conference on Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy (ICAAC) here.

Participants in the study disinfected their hands roughly every three hours over ten weeks between 25 August and 9 November, 2009. Of that group, 42 out of 100 contracted rhinovirus infections, compared to 51 out of

100 in the control group.

Similarly, 12 of those regularly disinfecting their hands contracted the H1N1 flu, compared to 15 in the control group.

"The hand treatment also did not significantly reduce the frequency of illnesses caused by the viruses," said the authors of the study led by Ronald Turner of the University of Virginia.

The study was financed by the Dial Corporation, which makes various care and cleaning products, including alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

"The results of this study suggest that hand transmission maybe less important for the spread of rhinovirus than previously believed," the authors said.—*Internet*

Google buys second Israeli start-up

JERUSALEM, 14 Sept—Search giant Google said that it is buying its second Israeli start-up, Quiksee, in a deal estimated at 10 million US dollars, local daily *Haaretz* reported on Monday.

Quiksee (Mentor-Wave Technologies) is a location-based service that provides "customized immersive visual experiences," according to their LinkedIn page. The firm allows web surfers to create "virtual tours that include rich-media, multimedia, annotations, links and video," said the company's website.

Quiksee's application appears to be a close-up refinement of Google's existing "Street View" service, which lets viewers view street level images of cities and sites worldwide.—*Xinhua*

AIG formulating plan to exit government ownership

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 Sept—American International Group Inc (AIG.N) is in talks with US officials to formulate a plan that would speed up the insurer's exit from government ownership, the *Wall Street Journal* said, citing people familiar with the matter.

The exit plan could be rolled out as early as the first half of 2011 and is designed to repay the US taxpayers in full, the *Journal* said.

As per the plan, the Treasury

department may convert \$49 billion in AIG preferred shares it owns into common shares. This move would increase the government's ownership stake in the insurance company to above 90 percent, from 79.8 percent currently, the *Journal* said, citing people familiar with the matter. However, after the conversion, the common shares would be sold off to private investors in a phased manner, a move that would reduce US ownership and potentially earn the government a profit if the shares rise in value, the newspaper said.

"Our objectives remain the same: to repay taxpayers and position AIG over time as a strong, independent company worthy of investor confidence," an AIG spokeswoman told the *Journal*. She declined to provide details of the exit plan, the *Journal* said. AIG could not immediately be reached for comment by *Reuters* outside of regular US business hours. AIG was bailed out by the US government two years ago from near-collapse with a \$182.3 billion taxpayer-funded rescue package.

Apple's iPad to hit Chinese market on Friday

BEIJING, 14 Sept—Apple Inc. plans to begin official sales of its iPad tablet computer this Friday in China, the company announced on Monday.

According to a *Wall Street Journal* report, the Wi-Fi models of the iPad will be available to customers through two Apple stores in China and through authorized resellers.

The beginning of the sales will start on Friday at 10 am, according to the newspaper. The iPad's price will be higher in China than in the United States.

It will charge from 3,988 yuan (about 590 US dollars), for the 16-gigabyte iPad, to 5,588 yuan (about 827 US dollars), for the 64-gigabyte model, the newspaper said.

The prices of the two models in the US are 499 and 699 US dollars respectively. On 21 June, Apple announced it had sold three million iPads worldwide.—*Xinhua*

Floods, landslides kill five in S Philippines

COTABATO, 14 Sept—Flood-triggered landslides in a southern Philippine City have already killed five people, local disaster authorities said on Tuesday.

Hundreds of families were affected by flood and a tornado triggered by heavy downpour on Monday night in the city of Koronadal in southern Philippines, said

department of social welfare and development director Zorahayda Taha.

At least 500 people were forced to abandon their homes as flood waters engulfed low lying villages in the southern city of Koronadal.

Local officials declared state of calamity within the city.

"Last night, some roads were flooded and

impassable," Koronadal City Mayor Peter Miguel told reporters.

The Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Service Administration (Pagasa) has warned the prevailing Intertropical Convergence Zone over the western and southern Philippines would bring heavy rains and frequent thunderstorms in the near future.—Xinhua

Drone attack kills 10 people in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 14 Sept—At least 10 people were killed on Tuesday morning in a suspected United States drone attack in North Waziristan tribal area, northwest Pakistan, local TV channels reported citing official sources.

The spy plane fired three missiles at a house allegedly used by militants in Shawal tehsil, 50 kilometre from Miranshah, the centre of North Waziristan, the private TV Express reported.

However, the identity of perished people could not be known as yet as

usually drone strikes focus on targeting prominent militants.

Shawal is reportedly the base of Haqqani Taleban group.

Some 30 people have been killed in five most recent previous drone strikes in North Waziristan.

More than 1,000 people have so far been killed in over 100 drone strikes in troubled Pakistani tribal areas since Aug 2008, raising serious concerns over destruction of civilian properties and an alarming civilian death ratio.

Rains kill 43 in Nicaragua

MANAGUA, 14 Sept—The Nicaraguan Army's Civil Defence said on Monday that 43 people have died in the rain season which began in May as more rain was forecast for the coming hours.

The latest victim was a 29-year-old man, who was dragged by the rain flood in Palos Quemados.

His body was found some 7 km from Pochotillo town in Granada department, some 45 km southeast to the capital of Managua.

The Civil Defence also said that due to rains on Sunday, 151 people from Bajos de Acahualinca in the riverside of Xolotlan Lake were evacuated and taken to shelters.

According to the Civil Defence, nearly 2,000 people are now staying in 26 shelters across the country.

China to cut fossil fuel in total energy mix to 85 pct by 2020

TIANJIN, 14 Sept—Cheng Siwei, a renowned Chinese economist and a former senior legislator, said China is estimated to reduce the proportion of fossil fuel in total energy mix from the current 91 percent to 85 percent in 2020.

Cheng, chairman of the International Finance Forum and former vice chairman of the Standing Committee of China's National People's Congress, made the remarks at the ongoing World Economic Forum's annual Summer Davos meeting in the northern Chinese City of Tianjin.

China needs to improve fossil energy efficiency and also develop new energy, Cheng said.

He cited his research results as saying that pollution cost 34.5 percent of the gross domestic product in 2005.

China is also committed to promoting carbon trade, he said.

"The critical problem now is to find the most suitable carbon trading market."

The economist also proposed carbon tax to promote sustainable growth.

"We are suggesting imposing carbon tax on thermal power plants and using the revenue to subsidize solar and wind energy development," Cheng said.—Xinhua

PARIS, 14 Sept — Europe's top tourist attraction Euro Disney is on Tuesday to extend its partnership deal with the French state to 2030, enlarging the theme park and eyeing eight billion euros in extra investment.

The amended deal gives Euro Disney the right to build a third theme park "in the long term," the company said in a statement, and extends the size of the current site from 1,943 hectares to 2,230 hectares. Euro Disney,

which says it contributes over six percent of foreign tourist revenue in France, will also develop a project with the Pierre & Vacances group based on sustainable development for an investment of 1.8 billion euros. "Les Village Nature de Val d'Europe," to the east of Paris, will include a lake and forest as well as 7,000 hotel beds, the financial daily *Les Echos* reported. The company said its new projects would create around 70,000 direct and indirect jobs at its sites, which have been visited by 215 million people since 1992.

Emerging-market cities to bring biggest commercial growth opportunity

TIANJIN, 14 Sept— Emerging-market cities with a population of more than 500,000 will constitute the biggest commercial opportunity for companies in the coming decades, said a report issued Tuesday by the Boston Consulting Group (BCG). One third of the world's population, or 2.6 billion people, live in the 717 emerging-market cities currently. The number is expected

to increase by an additional 1.3 billion by 2030, according to the report issued during the three-day Annual Meeting of New Champions 2010 in Tianjin. Alongside the burgeoning middle-class households within these cities, new opportunities will continue to emerge, it said.

According to the report, more than 37 percent of the world's cars are purchased in emerging-market cities, and sales of luxury autos already rival sales in Germany, Japan and the United States.

Emerging-market cities will account for 30 percent of global private consumption by 2015, the report said.

The rise of the emerging-market cities will also greatly boost demand for infrastructure. About 60 percent to 70 percent of the total global investment in infrastructure will go to these cities by 2030, the report said.

The report warned that despite the new opportunity created by the emerging markets, challenges also remain for companies.—Internet

Cambodia intends to host the 36th World Heritage Committee meeting in 2012

PHNOM PENH, 14 Sept— Cambodia intends to host the 36th World Heritage Committee (WHC) 2012 meeting in the country's northern province of Siem Reap, a government official said Tuesday. Phay Siphan, spokesman for the Office of the Council of Ministers, said Cambodia has already expressed its readiness and intention to UNESCO to host the 36th WHC meeting.

He said, Cambodia is now vice chairman of the WHC and this country's richness in cultural sites along with

nearly 1,000 temples and preservation experiences is fit to the event. For the purpose itself, Phay Siphan said Cambodia wants to share its experiences in the conservation and preservation works that have been worked with many development partners for many ruin temples across the country.

He said, if approved as planned, the meeting will be held in Siem Reap, the country's tourism hub where is rich of cultural sites along with world famous temple of Angkor Wat.—Xinhua

Two Barbados men charged in fire that killed six

BRIDGETOWN, 14 Sept—Police said Monday they have arrested two robbers who set a clothing store ablaze, killing six young women in the normally tranquil capital of the Caribbean Island.

Commissioner Darwin Dottin said 21-year-old Renaldo Anderson Alleyne and 19-year-old Jamar Bynoe have been charged with

six counts of murder, aggravated burglary, and arson in the 3 Sept attack.

"Evidence suggests the two are friends and planned and carried out the burglary," Dottin said Monday. He said investigators had "massive help from the public," even though it took more than a week to make arrests. The suspects had not yet entered pleas on Monday and it was not

immediately clear if they had attorneys.

Investigators allege the suspects burst into a Bridgetown clothing shop and demanded money before setting the place on fire.

The blaze killed six women aged 18 to 24, shocking people across the island where crime is rare and usually involves petty theft.

2. Of the 10 parties stated in the Paragraph-1 and which are encompassed by the Article 25 of Political Parties Registration Law, the following five parties applied to the UEC for registration within 60 days.

- (a) Mro or Khami National Solidarity Organization (MKNSO)
- (b) National Unity Party
- (c) Lahu National Development Party
- (d) Kokang Democracy and Unity Party
- (e) Union Kayin League

3. Of the 10 parties stated in Paragraph-1, the following five parties have become null and void according to the law as they did not apply for continued existence as political parties within the prescribed days. As those parties no longer have the right to continued existence as political parties, their registrations have been revoked and they have been dissolved.

(a) issue or refuse to issue a permit.

(b) If it issues a permit, the Union Election Commission shall mention the duration and the person granted permission to canvass in the permit in line with the designated date and timetable.

(c) If it refuses to issue a permit, the Union Election Commission shall inform the applicant, giving the reason of why it has to refuse.

5. To canvass on radio and TV, a political party is permitted:—

(a) to take 15 minutes if it wishes to canvass on radio,

(b) to take 15 minutes if it wishes to canvass on TV.

(c) to air its song during the designated period of 15 minutes.

6. In canvassing on radio and TV, political parties shall not breach any of the following restrictions.

(a) not to give any talks that can harm 'non-disintegration of the Union', 'non-disintegration of national solidarity', and 'perpetuation of sovereignty'.

(b) not to give any talks that can harm security, the rule of law, and community peace,

(c) not to disobey the State Constitution of the Union of Myanmar and existing laws,

(d) not to stimulate sedition or give any talks that can tarnish the image of the State,

(e) not to give any talks that can lead to the collapse of the Tatmadaw or tarnish the image of the Tatmadaw,

(f) not to give any talks or take organizing measures that can lead to conflicts or harm the dignity or moral conduct in connection with racism, or religion or the affairs of an individual or community,

(g) not to abuse religion for political ends,

(h) not to give any talks that can harm peaceful pursuit of school education,

(i) not to give any talks that can discourage service personnel from performing their duties or to abet them to stage protests against the government.

7. If a political party breaches any of the prohibitions in this notification, or any of the principles or provisions enumerated in the permit, action will be taken against the party in accordance with the existing laws as well as the Political Parties Registration Law.

8. It is hereby announced that in presenting their policies, stances and work programmes on radio and TV to canvass for votes, political parties shall abide by this notification to ensure that the multiparty democracy general elections due to be held on 7 November 2010 are free and fair ones.

people from 5 to 30 July this year. Irrigation Department carried out the remaining 3000 feet. After the level of lake's bund has been raised, much water can be retained and stored. With respect to supply of irrigation water to farmlands, head U Maung Maung Win said, "Thanks to the canal and maintenance of these lakes, irrigation water can be adequately supplied to 1832 acres of farmlands in Phelya, Htethekaloe, Dawlyakhu and Tanilale villages."

Due to the two lakes, nearby villages will not face shortage of irrigation water and surplus water flows through Dawpawkaile and Pakhawdu lakes. Ngwetaung Dam can store much more water than before.

In addition, in order to store much water in wetland of the dam, plans are under way to dig sand and silt along the canal as soon as possible. Soon, green farmlands can be seen in the region.

Philippine travel sector to grow despite fallout from hostage crisis

MANILA, 14 Sept—Philippine tour operators are confident that the country's travel industry will continue to grow despite the negative publicity generated by the 23 Aug hostage crisis, Tourism Congress President Alma Jimenez said in a statement Monday.

"No doubt the setbacks are serious and costly for the country and the industry but we remain undaunted that the overall goals that both government and the private sector have set are still achievable," said Alma Jimenez.

On 23 Aug, a disgruntled former Police Senior Inspector hijacked a tour bus carrying 21 Hong Kong tourists, which led to the death of eight tourists in shooting.

The tourism department is

planning to bring in 3.3 million foreign tourists this year. There are concerns that the number of tourists may decline following the bungled hostage rescue attempt.

But the private sector-led Tourism Congress said it will help the government to achieve this goal.

Jimenez said member-organizations of the Tourism Congress are launching marketing campaigns to counter the negative publicity. Aside from spearheading the Philippine Travel Exchange and the Philippine Travel Mart (PTM), private tour operators also held one-on-one business meetings with other travel wholesalers from Europe, North America, South Korea and Southeast Asian countries.

New Zealand Earthquake Commission receives 44,000 claims

WELLINGTON, 14 Sept—In the week following the 7.1 magnitude earthquake in South Island's Canterbury Region, more than 44,000 claims for residential property damage have been lodged with the Earthquake Commission. The commission said this number of claims is unprecedented in the state agency's history. Its insurance manager, Lance Dixon, said staff

are first trying to get to the more than 5000 people who have said their houses are uninhabitable or not weatherproof. Dixon said 60 staff are inspecting damaged properties and reinforcements are being brought in from around the country and from overseas to boost the team to more than 400 in coming weeks.

The commission said Canterbury residents who need to make emergency

repairs to their quake-damaged homes don't have to wait for an assessor to inspect the property, *Radio New Zealand* reported on Sunday. Inspections of buildings in the suburbs of New Brighton are the priority on Sunday as Christchurch civil defence staff continue their door-to-door work to establish how many homes are damaged following last weekend's earthquake.

S Korea's Asiana Airlines to offer flight service solely for Chinese tourists

Cuba to cut one million public sector jobs

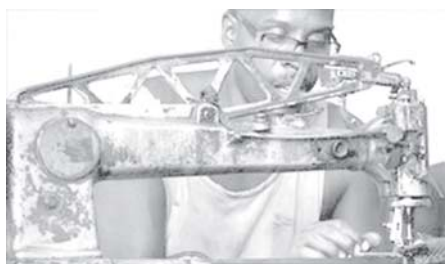
LONDON, 14 Sept—Cuba has announced radical plans to lay off huge numbers of state employees, to help revive the communist country's struggling economy.

Merged United Air to keep Ohio jobs for 5 years

NEW YORK, 14 Sept—Merger partners United Airlines and Continental Airlines must maintain jobs at Ohio's Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (CLE) for at least five more years as part of an agreement with Ohio officials. The merged airline will have to pay damages of up to \$20 million should it fall short of its commitments, Ohio Attorney General Richard Cordray said in a statement on Monday.

"Through this contractual agreement, the airlines have committed to working with my office and the city of Cleveland to ensure that CLE remains a viable hub for the foreseeable future," Cordray said in a statement. United parent UAL Corp said in May that it would buy Continental in an all-stock deal worth \$3.2 billion.

Cleveland officials had been openly uncertain of what the merger could mean for their area. Airline watchers had said that the Cleveland airport hub could be downsized or lost. Cordray's office may audit the books and records of the airline, at the company's expense. Any violations of the agreement are enforceable in federal court in Ohio, the attorney general said.

The Cleveland airport is one of Continental's major hubs. According to the statement, Continental employs more than 2,000 workers at the airport and 1,000 others are employed by the airline's regional affiliates. In 2009, Continental fliers made up 65.2 percent of the passenger traffic to the airport, while United accounted for 5.4 percent. Last year, the airport was the No 35 busiest airport in the country, according to the release.

KENTUCKY, 14 Sept — A Kentucky man who was facing eviction over his anti-social behaviour became enraged by how his wife cooked his eggs and killed her, his step-daughter and three neighbours with a shotgun before shooting himself this weekend.

Trooper Jody Sims, of the Kentucky State Police, said 47-year-old Stanley Neace killed the five people in two mobile homes in rural eastern Kentucky around 11:30am local time on Saturday, then went to his home and turned the gun on himself.—Internet

Meningitis test drug could save thousands of children

LONDON, 14 Sept — Child health experts yesterday hailed the success of a medical trial that could lead to the widespread vaccination of children against deadly meningitis B. Data presented by pharmaceutical giant Novartis revealed that a large majority of infants given a new test drug achieved a robust immune response against strains of the disease.

Charity Meningitis

UK said that the results could eventually lead to a vaccine that would save the lives of thousands of children. Meningitis B is the most common form of the disease, causing up to 80pc of cases in the UK. It is also one of the most deadly, with symptoms that can kill within 24 to 48 hours of onset. But due to its complex nature, it has been the hardest to immunise against.

Mark McCullough, 32, of Glenthams, England, said he received a letter Friday from Lincolnshire County Council informing him that he must accompany his daughter, Isabelle, to her Normanby-by-Spital Primary School bus stop every day or it will be reported as a "child protection issue," the Lincolnshire Echo reported Monday.

The letter said the driver of the bus has been helping Isabelle cross Caenby Road when she is dropped off at the end of the day. "It's more than upsetting, it has made me angry. I am happy for Isabelle to walk from home to the end of the road and, if necessary, cross a country lane and walk home," McCullough said. "I'm not going to wrap them up in cotton wool," he said of his children.

Car thief foiled by wrong gas

A British court heard an automobile thief was arrested after he put gasoline into a stolen diesel-powered car. Police said Daniel Boxall, 27, of Ramsgate, England, was arrested 12 June along with passenger Richard Lloyd after the \$20,000 Audi A4 broke down at the side of a road. This is Kent reported on Monday. Prosecutors said Boxall, who spent three months in jail awaiting trial, stole the keys to the car from a woman's jacket at a children's party. Boxall pleaded guilty to aggravated vehicle taking and driving with no insurance. 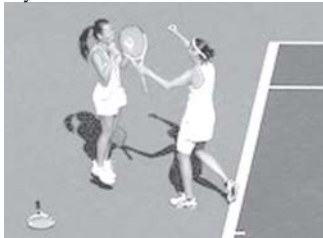

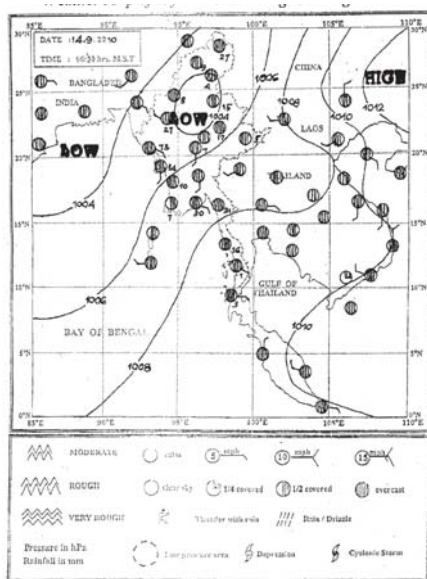

Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr. M.S.T. During the past 24 hours, Southwest monsoon has withdrawn from the Northern Myanmar areas. Rain or thundershowers have been scattered in lower Sagaing and Mandalay Regions, fairly widespread in Shan State, Yangon Region and widespread in the remaining States and Regions with locally heavy falls in Magway Region and isolated heavy falls in Rakhine State. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Sittway (3.26) inches, Kalewa (2.04) inches, Manaung (2.01) inches, Mindat (1.93) inches, Minbu (1.85) inches, Mawlaik (1.69) inches, Kyaukpyu (1.61) inches and Taungdwingyi (1.57) inches.

Nay Pyi Taw Weather

Maximum temperature on 13-9-2010 was 91°F. Minimum temperature on 14-9-2010 was 77°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 14-9-2010 was (84%). Rainfall on 14-9-2010 was (Nil).

Yangon (Kaba-Aye)

Maximum temperature on 13-9-2010 was 88°F. Minimum temperature on 14-9-2010 was 76°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 14-9-2010 was (92%). Total sunshine hours on 13-9-2010 was (1.1) hours.

Rainfall on 14-9-2010 was (0.55) inch at Mingaladon and (1.19) inches at Kaba-Aye and (0.35) inch at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2010 was (66.10) inches at Mingaladon, (76.50) inches at Kaba-Aye and (82.44) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum windspeed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (4) mph from Southeast at (18:30) hours MST on 13-9-2010.

Bay Inference: Monsoon is generally moderate in the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal.

Forecast valid until afternoon of the 15th September 2010: Rain or thundershowers will be scattered in Kayah State and lower Sagaing Region, fairly widespread in Kayin State, Yangon and Ayeyawady Regions and widespread with likelihood of isolated heavy falls in Rakhine and Mon States, Mandalay, Magway, Bago and Taninthayi Regions. Degree of certainty is (80%).

State of the sea: Seas will be moderate in Myanmar waters.

Outlook for subsequent two days: Continuation of thunder conditions in the Central Myanmar areas.

Forecast for Nay Pyi Taw and neighbouring area for 15-9-2010: One or two rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Yangon and neighbouring area for 15-9-2010: One or two rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring area for 15-9-2010: One or two rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Landslide buries car with unknown number of people in east China

HANGZHOU, 14 Sept—Rescuers are digging through debris to reach people believed to be trapped in a car that was buried in a landslide in east China's Lishui City, Zhejiang Province, Tuesday. The number of people in the car was unknown, said a rescue spokesman. Two excavators are also working at the scene.

The landslide hit a sector of the Yinchang road, which links Lishui City and neighboring Jinyun County, at about 2:30 pm the spokesman said. No casualties have yet been reported.

An estimated 2,000 cubic meters of debris covered 80 meters of road below, said the spokesman. The biggest rocks weighed 2 to 3 tonnes and the debris was up to 5 metres deep.—Xinhua

1. The Union Election Commission announced with the Notification No.1/2010 dated 18-3-2010 that political parties wishing to stand for multiparty democracy general elections of respective Hluttaws to be held on 7 November 2010 may apply for registration in accord with the law. It also announced with the Notification No.18/2010 dated 9-4-2010 that the following 10 parties that are encompassed by the Article 25 of Political Parties Registration Law may apply to the UEC for continued existence as political parties within 60 days.

- (a) Kokang Democracy and Unity Party
- (b) National Unity Party
- (c) Union Kayin League
- (d) Union Pa-O National Organization
- (e) Mro or Khami National Solidarity Organization (MKNSO)
- (f) Shan Nationalities League for Democracy
- (g) Shan State Kokang Democratic Party
- (h) Lahu National Development Party
- (i) "Wa" National Development Party
- (j) National League for Democracy

Union Election Commission issues Notification No. 98/2010

NAY PYI TAW, 14 Sept—The Union Election Commission issued Notification No. 98/2010 today.

The following is the translation of the notification.

The right to canvass on radio and TV

1. The Union Election Commission issued Notification No. 89/2010 dated 13 August 2010, announcing that it would hold the multiparty democracy general elections for the respective Hluttaws on 7 November 2010. And it granted permission to form political parties and register as political parties. In addition, it also issued Notification No. 97/2010 dated 14 September 2010 to announce that 37 political parties were granted permission to subsist as political parties.

2. The 37 political parties have yet to be granted permission to present their stances and work programmes on radio and TV till 31 October 2010 to canvass for votes for the multiparty democracy general elections. If a political party wishes to canvass for votes on radio and TV, the chairman or secretary concerned has to apply with the manuscript for permission to the Union Election Commission at least seven days ahead of the date. The application must not exceed seven A4-size pages.

3. The Union Election Commission, in coordination with related departments and organizations, will designate the date and timetable for each political party in order that political parties take turns canvassing for votes on radio and TV.

4. After scrutinizing the manuscripts as necessary, the Union Election Commission, in coordination with the Ministry of Information, has the right to:—
