When I got to Pyinsa Village at mile post No. 27/2 after passing through snaked Mandalay-Lashio Road, the clock struck eight. Patches of mist was still overhanging the village. In order to observe road construction between Pyinsa Village and Kabyu Village, I continued my trip.

The road construction is under way by the misty Shan mountain range. Along the road I saw completion of laying gravel in some parts and earthen state in other parts, with the use of machinery and manpower. Pyinsa-Kabyu Road is 17 miles and one furlong long and 12 feet wide, in some parts it is wide up to 18 feet.

The road was earthen type at first and had 19 curves from mile post No 0/0 until 14/0.

Grow tea to increase income

Blessed with favourable conditions, the whole nation is benefiting from growing various crops. The delta region and plains are cultivating monsoon and summer paddy as a major crop as well as beans and pulses, edible oil crops and raw industrial crops. Likewise, cultivation of perennial crops such as tea, coffee, avocado and mango is being extended on highland regions.

Usually, tea can grow well in highland regions, more than 3000 feet above sea. Chin State, Shan State and Sagaing Region are growing tea suitable to their regions. Namhsan Township in Shan State (North) grows tea on a commercial scale, accounting for 80 percent of tea cultivation acreage of the whole nation.

Chin State has grown about 10,000 acres of tea and is trying to extend its cultivation acreage. A special tea zone has been established in Homalin Township, Sagaing Region, and the village-tracts along the Chindwin River are growing extensively.

Putao District in Kachin State is growing tea, trying to become a district of tea. Departments concerned are cultivating tea in cooperation with local farmers by conducting research. So, establishment of commercial-scale tea plantations in combination with technology and capital can contribute to regional economic development.

Not only can tea be used as green tea but also it can be used in cosmetics and personal goods as a raw material. Efforts will have to be made to produce marketable tea that is good in quality and quantity.

By establishing commercial-scale tea plantations in highland regions, local nationals can grow quality tea, thereby increasing their income and contributing to regional development.

Brief but strong storm barrels through NYC; one dead

NEW YORK, 17 Sept—A fast-moving storm packing winds of up to 100 mph ripped through the city Thursday, knocking down trees and power lines, snarling traffic, tearing off roofs and leaving one person dead.

A woman was killed when a tree fell on her car as it was parked on a road in Queens. Iline Levakis, 30, of Mechanicsburg, Pa., who was sitting in the driver's seat, was pronounced dead at the scene, while a 60-year-old passenger suffered minor injuries, police said.

Numerous minor injuries were reported elsewhere. The storm created havoc with the evening commute. Amtrak trains were running with

delays. The Long Island Rail Road said service was temporarily suspended between Penn Station in Manhattan and Jamaica, Queens, because of fallen trees. However, limited service was restored with residual delays. Service east of Jamaica was running on a normal schedule. *New Jersey Transit* reported delays of 20 to 30 minutes during rush hour, but normal service was restored around 7:45 pm.

At least 30,000 customers were without power Thursday night, according to Alfonso Quiroz, a spokesman for Consolidated Edison. He said Queens was the hardest hit borough, with 27,000 outages.

US pilot killed in Iraq explosion

BAGHDAD, 17 Sept—An US pilot was killed while an US soldier was wounded in an explosion at a military base in Iraq, the US military said on Thursday.

The incident took place on Wednesday morning at Joint Base Balad, some 80 km north of Baghdad, a military statement said.

The pilot was killed at the scene of the explosion and the wounded soldier was evacuated to the Air Force hospital in the base, the statement said, adding an investigation into the incident has been launched.

The name of the killed was being withheld pending notification of next of kin, added the statement.

The latest death brings the number of US soldiers killed in Iraq to about 4,419, since the breakout of the US-led war in Iraq in 2003, according to media account based on Pentagon figures.—*Internet*

Five killed in violence in eastern, northern Iraq

BAGHDAD, 17 Sept—Five people were killed and five others were wounded in gunfire and bomb attacks on Thursday in eastern and northern Iraq, while the Iraqi security forces captured 15 suspects across the country during the day, the police said.

In Diyala Province, a member of government-backed Awakening Council group and his wife were shot dead when gunmen

stormed their house at a rural area near the town of Abu Sayda, northeast of the provincial capital city of Baquba, some 65 km northeast of Baghdad, a provincial police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

The Awakening Council group, or Sahwa in Arabic, are mostly anti-US Sunni insurgent groups, who fought the al-Qaida network after the latter exercised indiscriminate killings against both Shiite and Sunni Muslim

communities.

Also in Diyala Province, a civilian was killed and three others wounded in a roadside bomb explosion near their car while travelling near a village in north of Baquba, the source said.

Separately, the Iraqi security forces conducted search operations across the Province during the past 24 hours and apprehended five suspects and wanted individuals, the source added.

Kidnappers seize five French nationals and two Africans in Niger

NIAMEY, 17 Sept—Five French nationals, one Togolese, and one Madagascan national had been abducted in the western African county of Niger, media reports said on Thursday.

The hostages were reported to be working for French companies in the African nation. It remained unclear who carried out the kidnappings, while groups linked to Al-Qaeda were being suspected for the terrorist deeds.—*Xinhua*

100 people evacuated after Sydney gas leak

SYDNEY, 17 Sept—About 100 people have been evacuated and two streets closed after a gas leak in inner Sydney on Friday morning.

The rupture occurred at the corner of Abercrombie and Raglan streets in inner-city suburb of Darlington.

Both streets have been closed to traffic.

The gas leak has caused road closures and the evacuation of parts of Darlington.

A Fire Brigades spokesman said emergency services were at the site.

About 100 people have been evacuated from a church, a TAFE and houses nearby, the fire brigade said.

Gas companies and fire crews are working to disperse the vapour cloud.

It is not yet known what caused the rupture.—*Xinhua*



New insights into the moon's rich geologic complexity

NEW YORK, 17 Sept—The moon is more geologically complex than previously thought, scientists report 17 Sept in two papers published in the journal *Science*.

Their conclusion is based on data from the Diviner Lunar Radiometer Experiment aboard NASA's Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter (LRO), an unmanned mission to comprehensively map the entire moon. The spacecraft orbits some 31 miles above the moon's surface.

The new data reveal previously


unseen compositional differences in the moon's crustal highlands and have confirmed the presence of material surprisingly abundant in silica — a compound containing the chemical elements silicon and oxygen — in five distinct lunar regions. Every mineral, and therefore every rock, absorbs and emits energy with a unique spectral signature that can be measured to reveal its identity. For the first time ever, Diviner is providing scientists with global, high-resolution infrared maps of the moon, which are enabling them to make a definitive identification of silicates commonly found within its crust.

Researchers identify genetic marker of aggressive Alzheimer's Disease

WASHINGTON, 17 Sept—An international team of Alzheimer's disease experts, led by Washington University School of Medicine in St Louis, has uncovered a gene variation that appears to predict the rate at which Alzheimer's disease will progress. The investigators report their findings online in the journal *Public Library of Science (PLoS) Genetics*.

Whereas previous studies have focused

on factors that influence the risk for Alzheimer's, the new research points to a way to determine how rapidly Alzheimer's patients may develop full-blown dementia after their diagnosis.

The investigators studied 846 patients with elevated levels

of a protein called tau in their cerebrospinal fluid (CSF). Recent studies have found that the presence of a particular form of the tau protein in the CSF is an indicator of Alzheimer's disease.

The researchers also looked at single DNA variations in the patients and identified a genetic marker linked to elevated tau levels. That marker turned out to be associated with rapid progression of Alzheimer's disease.

New biology research to run on Space Station

HOUSTON, 17 Sept—The *International Space Station* is about to take one giant leap for biological science in orbit.

Three new biomedical experiments funded by the US National Institutes of Health will take advantage of the space station's unique orbital facilities and weightless environment, NASA officials said. The experiments will use the station as a lab to study how bones and the immune system weaken in space. The NIH grants set aside about \$1.3 million for the experiments as part of the agency's Biomedical Research on the International Space Station (BioMed-ISS) programme.—Internet

Microsoft wraps up tools for mobile app developers

WASHINGTON, 17 Sept—Microsoft has taken another step toward a holiday release for its next generation of smart phones.

The software maker isn't giving an exact launch date for Windows Phone 7. But the company says the tools programmers will use to build Windows Phone 7 applications are complete.

It says developers can start submitting apps to Microsoft for approval in October.

Microsoft Corp is an underdog in the modern smart phone market, given Apple Inc and Google Inc's head start.

Developers may not rush to build apps for a phone that has not captured significant market share.—Internet

Yahoo takes on Apple, fring with Messenger Mobile Video

NEW YORK, 17 Sept—Yahoo is working to bring videoconferencing to Android and Apple iPhones, much like Fring or Apple's FaceTime.

Yahoo showed off the capability as part of a product demonstration of Yahoo Messenger 11 at the company's Product Runway at its Sunnyvale, Calif headquarters.

John Dunning, a product manager for Yahoo, said that the new Yahoo Messenger for Mobile service will run over either 3G or Wi-Fi. For now, Yahoo demonstrated the technology running from the Android phone (an EVO 3G, in this case) to a Webcam-equipped laptop, although users will be able to place mobile-to-mobile voice calls.

Yahoo doesn't have a timeframe that the company is willing to commit to, beyond saying that the technology will be rolled out in the next couple of months, Dunning said. That's roughly the same timeframe as Messenger 11.



AT&T, Sprint, Verizon to carry Samsung tablet

NEW YORK, 17 Sept—All four major US wireless carriers will sell an iPad-like tablet computer from Samsung Electronics Co, the companies said Thursday. Samsung and the service providers — AT&T Inc, Sprint Nextel Corp, T-Mobile USA Inc and Verizon Wireless Inc — didn't say how much the Galaxy Tab will cost, or exactly when it will be on sale. Verizon Wireless said in a statement that it will start selling it "in the coming weeks," and Sprint said it will do so "this fall." T-Mobile and AT&T said they plan to sell it this holiday season.

The Galaxy Tab has a 7-inch screen, half the size of the iPad. It runs Google Inc's Android smart phone software and can play Flash video from the Web, which the iPad can't. It also has two cameras for videoconferencing, which the iPad lacks. The iPad starts at \$499. The Tab will probably cost less, both because it's smaller and because carriers will probably subsidize it when buyers sign up for two-year data service contracts.—Internet

Health tip: Prevent passing germs

Viruses that cause the common cold or flu are spread in droplets produced when a person coughs or sneezes, a process the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention calls "droplet spread."

Virus- or bacteria-laden droplets also can spread disease when a person touches a contaminated surface, then touches their own eyes, nose or mouth, the agency says.

The CDC offers these suggestions to help prevent the spread of germs:

- * Always cover your nose and mouth when you sneeze or cough. Try to sneeze or cough into a tissue instead of your hands.
- * Wash your hands often, and make sure you spend about 20 seconds washing them. That's about the time it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice, the agency notes.
- * Carry a bottle of hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes to wash your hands when you're not near a sink.
- * Teach children to follow these same practices.—*Internet*

Breakthrough for cancer-hit Tasmanian devils

SYDNEY, 17 Sept— Australian scientists said on Thursday they had made a breakthrough in the fight to save the cancer-hit Tasmanian devil by mapping the species' genome for the first time.


The dark, furry marsupials were declared endangered in 2009 after a contagious cancer began sweeping through the population, disfiguring their faces so badly they are unable to eat and starve to death.

Some 70 percent of devils have already been lost to the infectious disease, which is spread by biting as the feisty

creatures mate and fight over animal carcasses.

But researchers working to save the dwindling species said the genome sequence opened a new path to understanding where the cancer attacked and how it could potentially be treated. "This sequence is invaluable and comes at a crucial time," lead researcher Elizabeth Murchison said.

An HIV-like virus that infects monkeys is thousands of years older than previously thought and its slow evolution could have disturbing implications for humans, according to a new study. Scientists said the simian immunodeficiency virus (SIV) is probably between 32,000 and 75,000 years old and may even date back a million years.—INTERNET

Diet to prevent hypertension also helps prevent kidney stones

NEW YORK, 17 Sept— Eating a diet designed to combat high blood pressure may also help prevent kidney stones, researchers report.

They examined the effects of the Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension (DASH) diet, which is high in fruits, vegetables, nuts and legumes, dairy products, and whole grains, and low in sweetened beverages and red and processed

meats. For the study, the researchers analyzed urine samples over a 24-hour period of 3,426 people with and without a history of kidney stones. Despite similar fluid intake, people who followed a DASH-style diet excreted more urine than those who didn't follow the diet. The higher urinary output may be partly due to the higher food water content in a DASH-style diet.—*Internet*

China's investment can help boost Russia's modernization

MOSCOW, 17 Sept— Investment from China can play a significant role in promoting Russia's modernization, especially in the Far East Region, a senior Russian expert on China told *Xinhua* in a recent interview. Russia's modernization process is mainly boosted by major projects that Chinese investors can get involved in, according to Alexander Lukin, director of the Centre for East Asia and Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Studies at the Moscow State Institute of International Relations.

Many projects would need the participation of Chinese investors, including the massive reconstruction in the far eastern city of Vladivostok and the Black Sea resort of Sochi, as well as the host venues of the 2012 summit

of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation and the 2014 Winter Olympic Games, Lukin said.

Noting Russian President Dmitry Medvedev's upcoming visit to China, Lukin said the relationship between the two countries is better than ever before.

President Medvedev is scheduled to talk with Chinese leaders about bilateral ties, economic cooperation and global and regional issues, Lukin said.—*Internet*

Philippine budget carrier Cebu Pacific is aiming to raise up to 725 million dollars to buy new aircraft when it lists almost a third of its shares next month, according to the country's stock exchange.

Philippine budget airline Cebu Pacific to go public

MANILA, 17 Sept— Philippine budget carrier Cebu Pacific is aiming to raise up to 725 million dollars to buy new aircraft when it lists almost a third of its shares next month, the country's stock exchange said on Friday.

The airline's holding company, conglomerate JG Summit Holdings, has applied to sell about 32.19 billion pesos (725 million dollars), or 31 percent, worth of its shares from 8 October.

It added that 70 percent of those shares have been put aside for sale in the United States as it prepares for a roadshow at the end of this month, while the rest is to be offered to local investors.

Cebu Pacific, a no-frills carrier that began flying in 1996, is aiming to raise funds for new aircraft over the next two years.

The airline planned to publicly list in 2008, but the global financial crisis forced it to temporarily shelve the idea.—*Internet*



Boeing again lifts 737 production rate

ATLANTA, 17 Sept—Boeing Co (BAN) said on Thursday it will boost production of its best-selling 737 aircraft to 38 a month in the second quarter of 2013, the third rate increase for the popular airliner announced this year.

Boeing said in June that production of its next-generation narrow-body 737 would rise to 35 a month in early 2012. In May, the aircraft maker said it would raise output to 34 a month from 31.5. "Increasing production is in response to customer demand for this airplane," Boeing Commercial Airplanes President and CEO Jim Albaugh said in a statement. The second-largest commercial airplane maker behind EADS (EADPA) unit Airbus said the latest boost was not expected to have a material impact on 2010 financial results. The company also said that improvements to the 737, a model that was introduced in 1997, would result in a 2 percent reduction in the plane's fuel consumption by early 2012.

Low-dose aspirin wards off bowel cancer

EDINBURGH, 17 Sept—Researchers in Scotland say very low-dose aspirin, taken regularly, may ward off bowel cancer. The researchers at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland say the crucial finding is that high doses of aspirin, taken for a long time, are not needed to help ward off bowel cancer. This finding held true irrespective of lifestyle choices, age, diet, weight and poverty. "This is the first study to demonstrate a protective effect against colorectal cancer associated with the lowest dose of aspirin—75 mg per day—after only 5 years use in the general population," corresponding author Malcolm G Dunlop and colleagues say in a statement. The study, published in Gut

online, finds after a year, taking low-dose aspirin regularly was associated with a 22 percent reduced risk of developing bowel cancer and the magnitude of the reduction was cumulative, rising to 30 percent after five years. The researchers looked at 2,279 cases of people diagnosed with colon cancer and 2,907 healthy controls matched on age, sex and locality. All were asked to complete food-frequency and lifestyle questionnaires. The subjects were categorized by their use of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs — taking more than four tablets a month of 75 mg aspirin, taking other anti-inflammatory drugs or taking a mix.

Mother, son dead at Johns Hopkins, doctor shot

BALTIMORE, 17 Sept—Paul Warren Pardus listened as a Johns Hopkins Hospital surgeon updated him on the condition of his elderly mother who likely would never walk again. Overwhelmed, he pulled a gun from his waistband, wounded the doctor, then barricaded himself in his 84-year-old mother's hospital

room before killing her and himself, authorities said.

"I guess he just couldn't bear to see her the way she was," said Pardus' brother 59-year-old Alvin Gibson.

The doctor, identified by colleagues as orthopedic surgeon David B Cohen, was shot in the abdomen and collapsed Thursday

afternoon outside the eighth-floor room where Pardus' mother was being treated. He was expected to survive.

Jean Davis was being crippled by arthritis and rheumatism and had surgery last week at the world-renowned cancer hospital, but it didn't go well, said Gibson of Remington, Va. It was

unclear what sort of operation was performed.

"I guess because he thought my mom was suffering because the surgery wasn't successful and she probably wouldn't be able to walk again," Gibson said about a possible reason for his 50-year-old brother's actions. "She was a dear, sweet lady. She just wanted to walk around like she did when she was younger."

Pardus holed up in the room in a more than two-hour standoff that led authorities to lock down a small section of the Nelson Building while allowing the rest of the sprawling red-brick medical complex — a cluster of hospital, research and education buildings — to remain open.

When officers made their way into the room, they found Pardus and his mother shot to death, he on the floor, she in her bed.—Internet

News photographer killed in Mexican border city

CIUDAD JUAREZ, 17 Sept—Gunmen attacked two newspaper photographers on Thursday in the drug war-torn border city of Ciudad Juarez, killing one and seriously wounding the other.

Luis Carlos Santiago and Carlos Sanchez, of the Diario de Juarez, were driving to lunch when gunmen in two cars intercepted them and opened fire, newspaper director Pedro Torres said.

Santiago, 21, was killed and Sanchez was in serious condition, Torres said. Torres said he did not know why the photographers were targeted.

He said Santiago had just started working for the newspaper two weeks ago, and Sanchez was an intern.

Accidental blast kills more than 20 in Sri Lanka

COLOMBO, 17 Sept—An accidental blast of explosives intended for road construction by a Chinese firm in eastern Sri Lanka has killed at least 20 people, including two Chinese nationals, the Sri Lankan government said on Friday.

A container carrying the materials exploded near a police station in the small town of Karadiyanaru in the eastern Batticaloa District, government security spokesman Lakshman Hulugalla said. He ruled out the possibility of sabotage. "It is an accidental explosion," Hulugalla said.

Sudan bus crash kills 37

KHARTOUM, 17 Sept—Thirty-seven people were killed and 26 injured on Thursday when two buses collided in the northern Sudanese state of White Nile, the director of Sudan's traffic police said.

"A bus tried to overtake a truck, but it failed and it collided into a minibus coming the other way, setting the minibus on fire," said Mohammed Tahier Fadl.

"Thirty-seven people were killed and 26 others were injured in the crash," with four children among the dead.

The accident happened near the settlement of Alrader, some 60 kilometres (37 miles) south of the capital Khartoum.

I am worried

A Law Analyst

The State Peace and Development Council devotes itself to the State's seven-step Road Map it has adopted for democratization as aspired by the people. Now, the Road Map is in its fifth step: holding election for the formation of hluttaws (parliaments) in accordance with the State Constitution (2008). As groundwork, the government has promulgated Union Election Commission Law, Political Parties Registration Law, and Election Law and Rules.

Political parties that have been formed, following the adoption of Political Parties Registration Law have to apply to the Union Election Commission before the date prescribed in the law to register for political parties, and old political parties for continued existence. Political parties will play a major role in shaping the nation into a democratic one. It is, therefore, obligatory for political parties to put in the fore "Non-disintegration of the Union, Non-disintegration of national solidarity, and Perpetuation of sovereignty", to remain loyal to the nation, and to exercise the multiparty democracy system.

The Union Election Commission issued Notification No. 1/2010 dated 18 March 2010, announcing that political parties that wish to stand for election may apply in line with the law for registration. Notification No. 18/2010 dated 9 April 2010 says that if political parties that came into existence under Article 25 of Political Parties Registration Law wish to continue to exist may apply to the commission within the designated period of 60 days.

Article 25 of Political Parties Registration Law says that if a political party that exists according to Political Parties Registration Law (Ordinance No. 4/88 of the State Law and Order Restoration Council) wishes to continue as a political party, it shall apply to the Union Election Commission within the period of 60 days after the date this law comes into force. After being granted permission by the commission, it may go on in accordance with the provisions of this law. It shall be deemed to have been dissolved automatically as a political party if it does not apply.

Article 27 of the law says that Political Parties Registration Law (Law No. 4/88 of the

State Law and Order Restoration Council) is repealed with this law.

As to repeal of a provision with another law, Article 14 of 1973 Interpretation Law says that provided that a statement is in some way prescribed in the repealed law, it shall be as stated.

Article 25 and Article 27 of 2010 Political Parties Registration Law are consistent with the provisions in the exception of Article 14 of 1973 Interpretation Law. So, it is required to abide by the provisions in Article 25. As prescribed in Article 25, old political parties have to apply to the Union Election Commission before the deadline to continue to exist. However, Notification No. 97/2010 dated 14 September 2010 of the Union Election Commission says of the 10 parties stated in Paragraph-1, the following five parties have become null and void according to the laws as they did not apply to continue to exist.

Article 12 of the Union Election Commission Law says that the commission and relevant sub-commissions formed under this law shall take over existing proceedings of the Multiparty Democracy General Election Commission and sub-commissions at all levels.

So, Notification No. 1/2010 was issued for old political parties to apply in accordance with Article 25 of Political Parties Registration Law (2/2010) to continue to exist. Regarding political parties that failed to apply to survive within the due period, Article 25 says the Union Election Commission shall announce the list of the political parties that have been granted permission to register as political parties, and the list of the political parties that have been revoked from the list of electoral registration and that have been revoked as political parties. **On the ground of that fact the Union Election Commission issued Notification No. 97/2010 dated 14 September 2010, announcing, "Of the 10 parties stated in Paragraph-1, the following five parties have become null and void according to the law as they did not apply for continued existence as political parties within the prescribed days. As those parties no longer have the right to continued existence as political parties, their registrations have been revoked and they have been dissolved."**

Nonetheless, a party that did not apply within the prescribed period to continue to exist is claiming that it has not been null and void; and that the Union Election Commission does not have any authority to announce the dissolution of an old political party. Indeed, the party is turning a blind eye to the provisions of the law and is just attempting to mislead the people into misunderstanding the law.

It has come to the knowledge of the people that the party is abetting the people to protest against the elections by boycotting the elections. The right to vote and the right not to cast votes in elections if a citizen does not want to are prescribed in Article (b) of Criminal Law 171-A, and in Hluttaws Election Law say that electoral right means the right of a person to stand, or not to stand as, or to withdraw from being as a candidate or to vote or refrain from voting at an election. If a person cheats people to protest against elections, he uses undue influence to prevent a person exercising the voting right and the right to stand for election. So, such a person violates Article 57 of Hluttaw Election Law. Article 57 of Hluttaw Election Law says, "Whoever is found guilty of violence, threat, undue influence, cheating, taking or giving of bribes to prevent a person from exercising the right of voting and the right to stand for election, shall, on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or with fine not exceeding one hundred thousand kyats or with both." Article 58 (d) of Hluttaw Election Law says that whoever is found guilty of giving speeches at meetings, instigation, writing, distributing or using posters or attempting by other means to disturb the voting or such acts shall, on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or with fine not exceeding one hundred thousand kyats or with both.

In reality, attempting to disrupt elections designed to introduce multiparty democracy system to satisfy the aspiration of the people means showing disregard for the people's desire. Doing such acts without or with knowledge is associated with breach of the provisions of the law. So, the people are urged to abide by the law.



Part of the road between mile post Nos. 16/1 and 16-0/16 was all uphill and downhill and had three dangerous curves. It was making the road dangerous. Besides, in rainy season, the road between mile post Nos. 17/0 and 17/6 was left in ruins due to mountain torrent.

District Senior

Engineer Daw Aye Aye Maw of PyinOoLwin District Construction Works explained that with the use of survey conducted by Public Works (Head Office), PyinOoLwin District Construction Works constructed a new detour between mile post Nos. 9/6 and 17/6 to overcome those difficulties. The detour keeping away from

dangerous curves is seven miles and three furlongs long.

Myaybon, Shwechaung, Latekyia and Thandaung villages are lying along the Pyinsa-Kabyu Road. Together with Assistant Engineer U Zayar Soe Tint, I studied construction of detour, extension of road to 40 feet in plain and to 30 feet in uphill areas, construction of RC bridges, and construction of 14-foot-wide road.

Moreover, traveling distance between Yeywa Hydropower and PyinOoLwin by way of Yeywa-Kabyu-Pyinsa Road will be cut by 13 miles compared with the old road. When PyinOoLwin-Mogok Road is completed, people from Kyaukse will be able to travel to Mogok safe and sound.

Upon completion of Pyinsa-Kabyu Road, development of all the villages along the road will

Airlines in need of pilots and crew

SINGAPORE, 17 Sept—The commercial aviation industry will need more than a million pilots and maintenance personnel in the next 20 years, with Asia accounting for almost 40 percent of demand, Boeing said Thursday.

The US plane maker estimated world demand at 466,650 pilots and 596,500 maintenance personnel from 2010 to 2029, of whom 180,600 pilots and

220,000 maintenance personnel would be needed in Asia, particularly in China. "When you add up all the numbers you quickly understand the issues facing this industry," Roei Ganzarski, chief customer officer for Boeing Training and Flight Services, told a news conference in Singapore.

Maintenance personnel include engineers and mechanics.

"Our challenge is adapting our training to engage the future generation of people who will fly and maintain the more than 30,000 airplanes that will be delivered by 2029," he added.

The world commercial aviation fleet is forecast to grow from 18,890 planes in 2009 to 36,300 in 2029, Boeing said.

Airline association IATA said in July that global air travel grew faster than expected in June led by a sharp improvement in Asia, particularly in China, following a severe slowdown during the global recession.—*Internet*

Pilot error, faulty maintenance cause 2008 Air NZ crash

PARIS, 17 Sept—French civil aviation investigation agency BEA announced Thursday the 2008 crash of an Air New Zealand Airbus 320 was caused by pilot errors and faulty maintenance.

The France-based Bureau of Enquiry and Analysis for Civil Aviation Safety (BEA) published its final report on the crash, which occurred during a test flight in France, killing all seven people on board.

According to the final report, five New Zealanders and two Germans, all profes-

sionals, made more than one error in maneuvering at low speed and low altitude before they finally lost control of the plane.

The report also linked the crash to cleaning done by Perpignan's Europe Aero Services Industries (EAS) the night before the fatal flight, saying incorrect wash of the plane caused a block to an important instrument.

An interim report issued last year by BEA said a combination of pilot error and faulty sensors may have caused the crash.

Earlier this year,

French prosecutors conducting a separate criminal investigation into the accident estimated that "an inappropriate test, in unsuitable conditions, with a manoeuvre carried out in an unprepared manner" jointly doomed the crew.

The Airbus 320 crashed into the Mediterranean off Canet-en-Roussillon on 27 November, 2008, as it was coming in to land at Perpignan Airport, in southern France.

Otters in Calif falling prey to sharks

SACRAMENTO, 17 Sept—California wildlife officials say they collected a record number of sea otters killed or injured by shark bites off the state's coast in August.

Seven more in September have been added to the total of 19 for last month, a Department of Fish and Game release said. The 10-year average for August is seven, officials said.

Scientists say they believe cooler-than-average ocean temperatures from an unusually mild summer are creating an ideal condition for white sharks.

"White sharks do not typically feed on sea otters," Michael Harris, a DFG environmental scientist, said.

"Their preferred prey is seals and sea lions. This would explain why the majority of the otters collected have a single bite mark. These bites are more investigative like a taste test." White sharks inhabit mostly cold, temperate seas with a surface temperature of 50 to 72 degrees Fahrenheit. As they grow, they transition from feeding on fish as juveniles to feeding on marine mammals like seals and sea lions.

Death toll from Mexico's army-gunmen clash rises to 19

MEXICO CITY, 17 Sept—Mexican authorities on Thursday raised the death toll from Wednesday's gunfight between the nation's military and unnamed gunmen to 19. On Wednesday, authorities in the state of Nuevo Leon, north of the country, reported eight deaths that had found in their territory.

The Wednesday clash occurred on the road linking the small town of Miguel Aleman, which is located in Tamaulipas state, to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon's state capital.

The violence occurred close to Cerralvo, a small

town close to the Monterrey-Nuevo Leon border, which saw a shootout between gangsters and army officers in March that killed six people. Army and gangsters have been fighting in several municipalities in the region during the last few weeks.



SEOUL, 17 Sept—A consortium of South Korea's GS Engineering and Construction and Germany's Siemens has won a 1.3 billion dollar deal to build power plants in Oman, GS Engineering said Thursday.

It said in a statement the consortium would build two thermal power plants northwest of the capital Muscat by April 2013. Each plant will produce up to 750 megawatts of electricity.

The company said its previous projects to build power plants in Oman and Armenia helped it garner the deal.

GS Engineering in April completed a 218 million dollar project to build a thermal power plant in Yerevan, Armenia.—*Internet*

Suspected Filipino mom of mystery plane baby found

MANILA, 17 Sept—Investigators Thursday questioned the suspected Philippine mother of a baby found alive in the trash of a Bahrain-to-Manila flight, after tracing the passenger assigned to a bloodstained seat on the plane.

Social Welfare Secretary Dinky Soliman said authorities planned DNA tests on the baby, who apparently was born during the weekend flight,

and the 30-year-old woman, who was tracked down Wednesday in a remote northern province.

Authorities brought her to Manila for questioning and testing, which may not yield results until next week. They did not release her name.

"We want to be very sure that we won't ascribe this act to the wrong person," Soliman said.

Hurricane Karl takes aim at Mexican Gulf coast

VERACRUZ, 17 Sept—Karl strengthened into a Category 2 hurricane in the Gulf of Mexico on Thursday and was expected to gain more power before hitting Mexico's coast near a port and an oil hub Friday.

Karl's maximum sustained winds reached 100 mph (160 kph), making it a Category 2 storm, according to the US National Hurricane Centre in Miami. There was a possibility it could become a major hurricane with winds of 110 mph (175 kph) or higher before making landfall, the centre said.

The Mexican government issued a hurricane warning for a 186-mile (300-kilometre) stretch of coast in Veracruz state, stretching northward from the city of the same name. On its predicted path, Karl could make landfall between the port of Veracruz and the oil hub of Poza Rica.

Brazil unveils \$200M plan to save savanna

BRAZILIA, 17 Sept—Brazil's government has unveiled plans to slow the deforestation and help halt the wildfires that destroy its tropical savanna.

The government plans to spend \$200 million in the next two years to combat illegal deforestation and prevent fires.

The destruction is due to expanding cattle ranches, the clearing of land for massive farms and the felling of trees

to produce charcoal used by steel industries.

The government says Wednesday it will step up patrols to combat these activities.

Also, an additional 4,500 firefighters will be hired to focus on the area, which is hit hard annually by devastating wildfires.

Brazil's savanna covers nearly 25 percent of its territory, stretching from its midwest to the northeast.

HONG KONG, 17 Sept—Hong Kong Census and Statistics Department announced Thursday the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped from 4.3 percent in May-July to 4.2 percent in June-August.

The underemployment rate also declined from 2 percent to 1.9 percent.

The number of unemployed persons was 167,500 from June to August, about the same as 167,400 in May to July. The number of underemployed persons fell

by around 2,400 from 72,900 to 70,500.

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare Matthew Cheung Kin-chung indicated that the labour supply was expected to drop as some of the youngsters, who had joined the workforce during the summer months, went back to school for further study upon commencement of the new academic year in September, thus easing the pressure on unemployment in the near term.—Xinhua

Tropical storm Fanapi heading for southeast China

HANGZHOU, 17 Sept—Southeast China is on flood alert and emergency services are preparing for the onslaught of tropical storm Fanapi, which is expected to hit early next week.

An official with the flood control and drought relief headquarters in east China's Zhejiang Province said Fanapi, expected to be the 11th tropical storm to hit China this year, formed in the western Pacific late Wednesday.

At 11 am Thursday, the storm was 1,000 km southeast of Wenzhou city, Zhejiang, and it was forecast to land around 20 Sept, according to the local meteorological administration.

The storm was bringing winds of 5 to 10 km an hour with 9 km an hour at its eye.—Xinhua

Louisiana sues drilling companies over Gulf spill

ATLANTA, 17 Sept—The state of Louisiana sued Transocean and Triton Asset Leasing in federal court for discharging oil into the Gulf of Mexico during the BP oil spill, according to court documents.

"The State seeks declaratory relief as to Transocean's designation as a responsible party for the discharges emanating from the Macondo Prospect and the Deepwater Horizon and the State's right to seek removal costs and damages from Transocean as a result of the spill," the suit said.

S Korea to host 30th FAO regional conference for Asia and the Pacific

The Gyeongju meeting will aim to discuss a range of issues central to food

security and rural poverty alleviation in Asia-Pacific countries such as climate change and food security, the ministry said. "The participating nations will share their experiences with the recent global financial and food crises and discuss key global agendas such as the climate change and food security," the ministry said in a press release.

"In addition, unlike previous regional conferences, the upcoming conference will focus more on regional issues to bring out more serious discussions and outcomes," the ministry said.—Xinhua

171 animals seized from Arizona family's home

Authorities say 171 animals were seized from an Arizona trailer home that had no running water or litter boxes. Authorities say a couple and their two teenage children were living in the home with the 152 cats and 19 dogs. The Pinal County Animal Care and Control director says there were layers of feces on the floor throughout the trailer in the Hidden Valley community just south of Maricopa.

With help from the sheriff's department, the animals were taken in a horse trailer to an Animal Care and Control facility.

The owners on Tuesday signed all of the animals over to the agency.

Authorities say the healthy animals will be put up for adoption.

It's not immediately clear whether the owners will be charged with animal cruelty.

Burglars had toddler in car

Police in Washington state said they discovered a 3-year-old child in a car being used by two men accused of attempted burglary.

Investigators said a neighbour of the Redmond home called 911 about 11 am Tuesday and reported a man was trying to break into the house, *The Seattle Times* reported.

Officers said they arrived to see a man jump into the passenger seat of a vehicle being driven by another man. Police pursued the car, and the passenger eventually jumped out and fled on foot.

The driver was arrested and police discovered the toddler in the car. The passenger was arrested after officers tracked him for more than an hour.

Investigators said the 3-year-old was the child of one of the suspects. The toddler was turned over to Child Protective Services.

World's largest, smallest dogs meet

The Guinness World Record holders for the largest and smallest dogs in the world met for the first time in New York's Central Park.

The dogs, a 3-inch-tall, 2-pound Chihuahua named Boo Boo and a 43-inch-tall, 245-pound Great Dane named Giant George, had a cordial first meeting Wednesday in the park, their owners told *the New York Daily News*.

"I thought he might

want a snack or something, but he was very gentle," Lana Elswick, Boo Boo's owner, said of Giant George. "Boo Boo was fascinated. She waited a few minutes and then she went over."

Elswick, of Kentucky, said Boo Boo weighed only 1 ounce when she was born and eats only one tablespoon of dog food per day.

Giant George, meanwhile, goes through 110 pounds of dog food each

month, said owner David Nasser of Tucson.

"He would eat twice that if we let him," Nasser said. "He's great, very playful with tons of energy."



Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring area for 18-9-2010: Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Weather outlook for Third weekend of September 2010: During the coming weekend, one or two rain or thundershowers in Nay Pyi Taw and Yangon Regions, rain or thundershowers will be isolated in Mandalay.

Rehabilitation therapy included in China's medical insurance programmes

BEIJING, 17 Sept—Nine forms of therapy to help disabled people will be included in China's medical insurance programs from 1 Jan, 2011, the government announced Friday.

The move is expected to reduce the financial burden on disabled people requiring rehabilitation therapy, said a statement from the China Disabled Persons' Federation (CDPF).

According to a circular issued by the ministries of health, human resources and social security, civil affairs and finance as well as the CDPF, the therapies will include rehabilitation treatments for paralysed limbs and body, cognitive disability, acute stroke impairments as well as language and sport training.
