NAY PYI TAW, 19 Oct — Accompanied by Maj-Gen Aung Than Htut of the Ministry of Defence, the ministers, the deputy ministers and departmental heads, Prime Minister U Thein Sein left PyinOoLwin of Mandalay Region on 17 October afternoon and arrived in Hsipaw of Shan State (North) at 2.50 p.m the same day.

The Prime Minister and party together with Chairman of Shan State (North) Peace and Development Council Commander of North-East Command Brig-Gen Aung Kyaw Zaw arrived at the project engineers' office of Hsipaw-Laikha-Namhsan railroad construction project (Hsipaw-Laikha railroad section) of Myanma Railways of the Ministry of Rail Transportation.

Minister for Rail Transportation U Aung Min reported to the Prime Minister on already-built railroads and ongoing railroad construction project, railroad networks from east to west and from south to north, construction of concrete sleeper factories and factories to be built, bridges to be built on No (3) national railroad network construction project and condition of towns the railroad will pass and construction of railroad sections on Myitkyina-Bhamo-Momeik-Kyaukme-Hsipaw-Laikha-Namhsan railroad project.

In his response to reports, the Prime Minister stressed the need to take into consideration the use of administrative roads of railroad construction sites with no motor roads as motor roads in the future, and called for timely completion of construction works.

Electric power: driving force behind industrialization

Myanmar is an agrarian country, so annual increase in agricultural production is on target. Its rice output has reached around 20 million tons a year; well exceeding local demand.

Only with industrialization, can the nation be transformed into a developed one. In order to achieve the ambitious goal, it is efficiently harnessing its rich natural resources, bringing about human resources, establishing more and more industrial regions and zones, boosting heavy machinery industry, and producing import-substitute products.

Electric power is, in fact, a driving force behind national industrialization. So, the nation is building as many hydropower plants as possible according to water and natural sources.

No. 3 generator of Yeywa Hydropower Plant in PyinOoLwin Township, Mandalay Region, for instance, was put into service on 16 October. It has four generators, each of which can generate 197.5 megawatts a year. No. 1 generator was launched on 24 February, and No. 2 generator, on 16 July 2010. No. 4 generator is due to operate soon.

In Myanmar, annual electric power consumption is on the increase owing to the people's living conditions getting high and growing industries. So far, the nation produces over 2800 megawatts yearly. Sustained efforts are therefore to be made to complete ongoing hydropower projects on schedule and distribute hydroelectric power through national grids for better socio-economic status of the people and national industrialization.

NATO aircraft breach Pakistani airspace once again

ISLAMABAD, 19 Oct— NATO's aircraft breached Pakistani airspace once again Tuesday morning at Pakistan-Afghanistan border town Torkham in the northwest of Pakistan, local media reported.

NATO warplanes and gunship helicopters entered up to 15 kilometers inside Pakistani airspace, local television DAWN News reported citing paramilitary sources at certain checkpoints in the border area. However, official sources did not

confirm the incident so far.

The aircraft flew up to Wali Khel, Sultan Khel and Ayub Kala areas and took an aerial view of NATO supply trucks, eyewitnesses said. Hundreds of NATO oil tankers and container trucks are clogged in the border area as the supply is moving at a snail's pace. NATO supply is very much vulnerable to terrorist attacks in Pakistan as almost 150 trucks in different areas in various incidents of

subversion were destroyed during the past few weeks.

Pakistan closed gates at the Torkham border blocking NATO supply after NATO's two helicopters aggressed upon a paramilitary checkpoint inside Pakistan at the Pakistan-Afghan border in Kurram tribal area on 30 Sept. Three paramilitary troops were killed and another three injured in a NATO gunship rocket attack at the checkpoint.

NATO air strike kills, injures 18 Taliban in Afghanistan

PUL-E-KHUMRI, 19 Oct— At least 18 Taliban militants have been killed or injured as NATO's aircraft pounded their hideouts in Baghlan province, Provincial Governor Munshi Abdul Majid said Tuesday.

"The NATO-led forces conducted precision air strikes in Dand-e- Ghor District in the wee hours of Monday. As a result over 18 militants were killed or injured," Majid told Xinhua.

He said initial report indicates that two militants' sub- commanders namely Badir Khan and Mullah Dost Mohammad were among those killed in the raid. The restive Dand-e-Ghor District is located 25 km northwest of the provincial capital Pul-e-Khumri where Taliban militants often organize subversive activities against government interests throughout the Province.

According to locals, hundreds of families have fled the district and surrounding areas over the past months in fear of clashes between Taliban and security forces.

In the meantime, Mahbub Alahi who introduced himself as a Taliban spokesman in Baghlan in talks with media from an undisclosed location confirmed that three militants were killed and four others injured in the air attack, stressing 12 other victims were civilians who lost their lives in the raids.

Iraq bomb kills policeman's baby nephew, three others

BAGHDAD, 19 Oct—Iraqi officials say a bomb has detonated near the house of a police officer in Saddam Hussein's hometown of Tikrit, killing his 6-month-old nephew and three other family members.

Police and hospital officials say the officer, Lt Col Qais Rashid, was unharmed in Tuesday's blast. His brother, sister and sister-in-law were killed along with his baby nephew, Col Khalid Jassim of Tikrit police said. Saad Hassan, an official in the city's main hospital, confirmed the death toll.

In Baghdad, two bombs attached to buses carrying Iranian pilgrims detonated while they drove through downtown, wounding 15 Iranians, police officials in the capital said.—Internet

60 Taliban militants lay down arms in N Afghan Province

KUNDUZ, 19 Oct—Sixty Taliban militants have given up militancy and handed over their arms to authorities in northern Kunduz province, provincial police chief Abdul Rahman Syedkhili said Tuesday.

"These people handed over their weapons to authorities in Chardara and Ali Abad districts Monday evening and vowed to help strengthen peace process," Syedkhili told newsmen at a Press conference.

Among those joined the peace process is a Taliban key commander Qari Zia and switching side by them has enabled government to strengthen its control over 20 villages, the official said.

However, he emphasized that three militants who had opposed the process were killed and three others injured.

Taliban militants have yet to make comment.

Chardara and Ali Abad districts have been regarded as the hotbed of Taliban militants in Kunduz Province from where the militants have expanded their activities to the neighboring Baghlan, Takhar and the northeast Badakhshan Provinces.—Xinhua

Six killed in US drone attack in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 19 Oct— At least six people were killed in a US drone attack launched late Monday night in northwest Pakistan's tribal area of North Waziristan, local media reported.

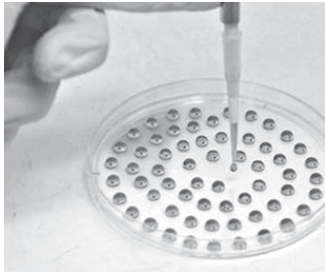
According to the report, the US drones fired six missiles, two of which were targeting at a house and the remaining four at a vehicle, at Sandali village of Datta Khel area in North Waziristan, which borders Afghanistan.

Monday's strike is the 11th of its kind since the beginning of October. At least 80 people, most of whom are believed to be militants, have been reportedly killed in these strikes.

S'pore scientists make stem cell research breakthrough

SINGAPORE, 19 Oct—A team of scientists in Singapore has discovered the most important genes in human embryonic stem cells (hESCs), a crucial breakthrough in discovering how human stem cells work. The team's research offers crucial understanding on how stem cells may one day be used to treat debilitating conditions such as Parkinson's disease and traumatic spinal injury. The team comprises scientists from the Genome Institute of Singapore (GIS) and the Institute of Molecular and Cell Biology (IMCB), which are two

biomedical research institutes of Singapore's Agency of Science, Technology and Research (A*STAR).

The scientists investigated the 21,000 genes in the entire human genome to find those which regulate the two characteristic properties human embryonic stem cells: The capacity to turn into any type of cell in the human body or what's known as pluripotency, and the ability to retain that capacity indefinitely.

Out of the several key genes they identified, a particular gene known as PRDM14 was discovered to make it easier to turn a type of human cell into pluripotent stem cells.

Their research, published in top scientific journal *Nature*, is the first genome-wide study of human stem cells on such a massive scale.

The discoveries contribute to a fundamental understanding of the nature of stem cells and help efforts to improve techniques to turn mature adult cells into hESCs.

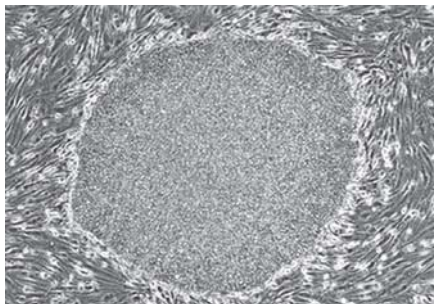
In addition, the scientists found PRDM14 played a key role in hESCs, but not in mouse ESCs.—*Internet*

Japanese, French firms ink stem-cell accord

TOKYO, 19 Oct—A Japanese firm has agreed to give Collectis SA of France access to its patents on how to create stem cells for medical treatment, news reports said Monday.

iPS Academia Japan, which manages patents about use of so-called induced pluripotent stem cells, or iPS cells, signed the accord with the French biotechnology firm, Kyodo News reported without revealing the patent fee. Under the accord Collectis will test its drugs' performance and develop new therapeutic drugs using the iPS cells, which have the potential to grow into any type of body tissue, Kyodo said.

Scientists lower Gulf health grade

ST. PETE BEACH, 19 Oct—Six months after the rig explosion that led to the largest offshore oil spill in US history, damage to the Gulf of Mexico can be measured more in increments than extinctions, say scientists polled by The Associated Press.

In an informal survey, 35 researchers who study the Gulf lowered their rating of its ecological health by several points, compared to their assessment before the BP well gushed millions of gallons of oil. But the drop in grade wasn't dramatic. On a scale of 0 to 100, the overall average grade for the oiled Gulf was 65 down from 71 before the spill.—*Internet*

Space shuttle leaking, NASA working up repair plan

CAPE CANAVERAL, 19 Oct—Space shuttle Discovery is leaking on the launch pad.

If it isn't fixed soon, the small fuel leak could delay Discovery's planned launch on Nov. 1. The flight to the International Space Station will be Discovery's last.

Shuttle engineers met Monday afternoon to put together a repair plan. Later this week, technicians will tighten the bolts on the leaking fuel line. If that doesn't help, they may have to replace four seals or even part of the line.

Last week, NASA replaced a cap in the system, but it did not stop the leak.

The rocket fuel is used to maneuver the shuttle while it's in orbit.—*Internet*

Spanish agency sues Google over Street View

MADRID, 19 Oct—Spain's data protection authority said Monday it has filed a suit against Google for allegedly capturing data from Internet users when it collected photos for its Street View service.

"The Spanish Agency for Data Protection (AEPD) has opened disciplinary proceedings against Google" for alleged violation of the country's data protection laws,

following an investigation launched in May, it said in a statement posted on its website.

It said it had evidence of five offences committed by Google involving the capturing and storing of data from users connected to Wi-Fi networks while collection photographs for Street View, and the transfer of such data to the United States.

The agency has

forwarded its findings to a Madrid court.

AEPD said that if the allegations are proven in court, Google could face fines of between 60,000 and 600,000 euros (84,000 and 840,000 dollars) for each offence.

Google's Street View provides pictures of real-world moments at spots around the world. But it has sparked concerns over the possible of erosion of privacy.—*Internet*

Vitamin B12 can prevent people from Alzheimer disease

STOCKHOLM, 19 Oct— Researchers from Sweden and Finland found that Vitamin B12 can become a protection from Alzheimer disease, according to a report from the Swedish Daily Svd on Tuesday.

“A little bit better situation of B12

vitamin can give substantial decrease of risk, our research found,” said Dr. Miia Kivipelto from Karolinska Institutet.

“It was the first time that people look at the direct relations between B12 and Alzheimer in a large scale study with long time following up,”

Kivipelto said.

The researchers have studied 271 older people who lived in eastern Finland. They began the research in 1998 on the group of people who are 65-79 years old and followed them until 2006.

The result has been published in the latest journal *Neurology*.

Kivipelto said that people should research further on how the microwave oven can affect the vitamin B12 in food. There has been report that microwave oven can damage various vitamins including B12 and vitamin C in food. As early as 1998, a Japanese research group showed that over one third of the vitamin B12 could be damaged in a microwave oven, the report said.

Gene found to play key role in depression

PARIS, 19 Oct—Scientists in the United States said they had found a gene that appears to play a key role in the onset of depression, a finding that could unlock new avenues for drug engineers.

A gene called MKP-1 was identified by Yale University investigators after comparing the genetic codes of 21 deceased people who had been diagnosed with depression with those of 18 otherwise healthy individuals.

MKP-1 plays the role of an off switch over a cascade of brain chemicals called MAPK that are crucial to the survival and function of neurons, according to the paper, which appears in the journal *Nature Medicine*.

“This could be a primary cause [of], or at least a major contributing factor to, the signalling abnormalities that lead to depression,” said the study’s lead author, Ronald Duman, a professor of psychiatry and pharmacology.

The scientists created “knockout” mice whose MKP-1 had been deactivated to explore the hunch that altering MAPK levels played a role in

depression. Mice without MKP-1 were happily resilient to stress. But stressed mice with the gene developed depression-like symptoms which were then eased by using anti-depression drugs, they found.

Depression, like many other mood disorders, is believed to have multiple causes, including genetic, for its symptoms vary widely among individuals.

As many as 40 percent of depressed patients do not respond to drugs, which are mainly based on boosting uptake of a brain chemical called serotonin.

Dollar briefly rises to mid-81 yen range

TOKYO, 19 Oct—The US dollar briefly rose to the mid-81 yen zone in Tokyo on Tuesday.

At 5 p.m., the dollar fetched 81.38-40 yen, versus Monday’s 5 pm quotes of 81.21-31 yen in New York and 81.24-26 yen in Tokyo. It moved between 81.14 yen and 81.56 yen during the day, trading most frequently at 81.30 yen.

The euro traded at 1.3917-3919 dollars and 113.26-30 yen against 1.3929-3939 dollars and 113.21-31 yen in New York and 1.3862-3864 dollars and 112.62-66 yen in Tokyo late Monday.

Motorola to leave Russian market in 2011

MOSCOW, 19 Oct— Motorola will close its Russian office on 1 January, 2011, thus abandoning the Russian market, *RBC* news agency reported on Monday.

The US company has been operating in Russia since 2003, employing about 1,000 workers.

Motorola, once a leader in the Russian gadgets market, has been steadily losing its market share since 2005 which lately dropped to one percent, the report said.

Beside Russia, Motorola has been axing its business in Czech Republic, Hungary, Ukraine and Scandinavia.

China begins research on even faster high-speed trains: Ministry of Railways official

WUHAN, 19 Oct— China has begun research and development on a new “super-speed” railway technology, an official with China’s Ministry of Railways (MOR) said Tuesday.

The new technology will increase the average speed of trains to over 500 kilometers per hour, said MOR Chief Engineer He Huawu at conference held in central China’s Wuhan City.

Meanwhile, the 400-500 km/h high-speed railway technology is in its final phase of development and the 380-km/h trains are already coming off production lines, He added.

As of September, China had put into service 7,055 kilometers of high-speed railway tracks — the longest in the world and that is expected to reach hit 13,000 kilometers by 2012.

“We aim to lead the world in high-speed railway construction,” said He. In September, the China-made *CRH380A* train hit a speed of 416.6 kilometers per hour on a test run to set a new world train speed record. High-speed train run at a speeds in excess of 200 kilometers per hour. Their use is rapidly expanding in China as the country strives to relieve pressures on its transportation systems.

Senior Chinese official highlights cultural exchanges with Cuba

BEIJING, 19 Oct—A senior Chinese official on Tuesday called for closer cultural exchanges with Cuba, saying culture could be seen as bridge for communications between the two peoples. Liu Yunshan, head of the Publicity Department of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee, made the remarks while meeting with Cuban Culture Minister Abel Prieto in Beijing.

Prieto, as guest of Chinese culture ministry, attended the closing ceremony of the eighth China International Folk Art Festival. The two culture ministries also signed an agreement on cultural exchanges between 2011 and 2013. "China attaches great importance to cultural relations with Cuba and will strive to

lift bilateral cultural exchanges to a new height," said Liu, who is also a member of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee. Liu spoke highly of China-Cuba relations, saying the two countries should work for the deep development of friendly and reciprocal cooperation on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of China-Cuba diplomatic ties this year.

Prieto expressed his hope that the two countries could expand cultural exchanges in a bid to facilitate traditional friendship.

China and Cuba have hosted a series of cultural activities marking the 50th anniversary of bilateral ties, which include ballet performances, martial arts exhibitions and traditional art expositions.—Xinhua

More children die in LA due to abuse or neglect

LOS ANGELES, 19 Oct—More children have died in the last two years from abuse or neglect in Los Angeles despite assurances by officials that the problem was getting better, confidential documents released on Monday showed.

The number of child deaths rose despite the watchful eyes of the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), said the Los Angeles Times, which released the documents on its website.

The trend contradicts previous accounts the department had provided

to other county officials, the report said.

According to the documents, the number of deaths from abuse or neglect rose from 18 in 2008 to 26 in 2009, and 2010 so far is on track to be even worse, with 21 maltreatment fatalities in the first eight months of the year.

The department publicly released some of the case files of child deaths Monday morning after repeated inquiries from The Times but has not yet released the overall statistics, which have been circulating among senior county officials, the report said.

The majority of the

maltreatment fatalities occurred while county social workers were actively overseeing the child's welfare or just days or months after they had closed the case for the child, the records show.

The data represent the first time the public has gained access to the department's accounting of how many children in its care have died of maltreatment, the report noted.—Xinhua

UNSG's Message on World Statistics Day

20 October 2010

Today marks the first observance of World Statistics Day, proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly to recognize the importance of statistics in shaping our societies.

Statistics permeate modern life. They are the basis for many governmental, business and community decisions. They provide information and insight about the trends and forces that affect our lives. Collected in surveys and censuses – three billion people will participate in population and housing censuses this year alone – statistics affect the planning of schools, hospitals, roads and much else.

Statistics are a vital tool for economic and social development, including our efforts to achieve the Millennium Development Goals. For development to succeed, we need data collection and statistical analysis of poverty levels, access to education and the incidence of disease. Statistics are a central consideration in justifying almost every aspect of budgets and programmes that enable hungry children to be fed or that provide shelter and emergency health care for victims of natural disasters.

The United Nations Statistical Commission, established in 1947, has created international methodological standards and guidelines in virtually every area of statistics. It has played a key role in helping governments strengthen their statistical reporting, making data more available and comparable across countries and regions than ever before.

I commend the dedication that many statistical experts bring to their reports and publications. They carry out an essential public service — one that promotes peace and democracy by giving citizens reliable and impartial public information about their communities. Their core values — service, integrity and professionalism — deserve full support in all nations.

However, as in so many other areas, developing countries often find themselves at a disadvantage, lacking funds to pay salaries, train staff and collect data. On this first World Statistics Day I encourage the international community to work with the United Nations to enable all countries to meet their statistical needs. Let us all acknowledge the crucial role of statistics in fulfilling our global mission of development and peace.

Snowstorm paralyses transportation systems in north China city

HOHHOT, 19 Oct—An overnight snowstorm has paralysed transportation systems in Chifeng City, Inner Mongolia, forcing highways and an airport to close, local authorities said Tuesday. The snowstorm started at 6:00 pm Monday, with snow piling as high as 15 cm in some areas, the municipal weather department said. Over 400 long-distance bus trips were canceled.

The city's Ningcheng County was among the worst hit areas. Kang Ling, deputy director of

the Inner Mongolia Meteorological Bureau, said the snowstorm was the second snowfall in the region this autumn.

The season's first snowfall came on 11 Oct, 10 days earlier than average. "The snow may harm the autumn harvests of corn and potatoes," she said. Because of the snow, temperatures in the region plunged by about 10 degrees.

Chifeng is 485 km north of Beijing, the Chinese capital.

HARRISBURG, 19 Oct— Fire ripped through a row house in central Pennsylvania on Monday night, killing five people, including four young children, and spreading to other homes, authorities said. Flames already had engulfed two white brick houses in uptown Harrisburg by the time fire crews arrived minutes after the alarm, which sounded between 7 pm and 7:30 pm, Fire Chief Robert Talloni said. "There was a plume you could see for miles," he said.

Railway tunnel collapse leaves seven dead, three injured in north China

HONHOT, 19 Oct — A railway tunnel under construction in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region collapsed Monday, killing seven workers and injuring three others, the local work safety bureau said Tuesday.

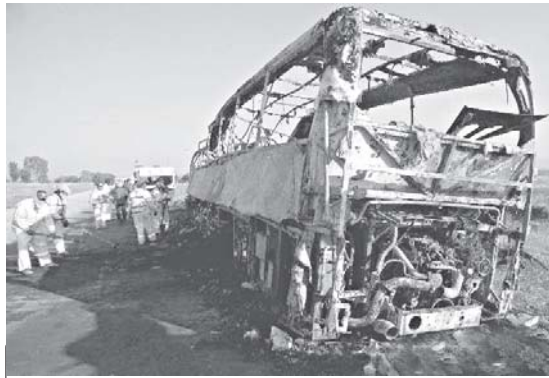
Four died instantly when the tunnel in Aohan Banner collapsed at about 3 pm Monday while three died later in hospital, a spokesman with the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Regional Administration of Work Safety said.

The three injured workers are being treated in hospital and are in stable conditions.

Local authorities are investigating the cause of the accident.

The 282 km-long railway line will link Chifeng in Inner Mongolia and Jinzhou in neighbouring Liaoning Province. Construction on it began in January 2009.

Mexico seizes 105 tons of marijuana

MEXICO CITY, 19 Oct—Mexican security troops seized more than 105 tons of marijuana in over 10,000 packs on Monday during a special operation in Tijuana, south of the Mexico-US border. The seizure, reportedly the largest in years in Mexico, was made as soldiers and policemen raided several houses in suburban Tijuana in the early hours of Monday.

A total of 11 suspected drug traffickers were detained after a brief exchange of fire.

The drugs, estimated to worth at least 4.2 billion pesos (340 million US dollars) in street value, were headed for the US after being brought together in Mexico for several months, officials said. Mexico is a major transit point for drug trafficking to the United States. Since 2006, the Mexican government has been taking tough measures against the country's notorious drug cartels.—Xinhua

Four found guilty in New York bomb plot

NEW YORK, 19 Oct — Four New York men were convicted on Monday of plotting to blow up synagogues in the Bronx and shoot down military planes.

James Cromitie and three others had been accused of wanting to destroy the Jewish house of worship and a Jewish community centre in the Bronx,

as well as to fire Stinger missiles at planes at a nearby Air National Guard base.

They were charged with conspiracy and attempting to use weapons of mass destruction. They face sentences of up to life in prison.

"Homegrown terrorism is a serious threat," Manhattan US Attorney Preet Bharara said in a statement. "The defendants in this case agreed to plant bombs and use missiles they thought were very real weapons of terrorism. We are safer today as a result of these convictions."

The jury in Manhattan federal court took a week to reach the verdict following a trial in which the court heard how an FBI informant lured the four men deeper and deeper into an extended sting operation.—Xinhua

At 13 dead, many missing in Malaysia boat-barge collision

KUALA LUMPUR, 19 Oct— An express boat collided with a timber-barge in the Ulu Tatau River in Sarawak, a state in East Malaysia, on Monday, killing at least thirteen persons, while at least 20 others are missing.

Confirming the incident, a police officer from the state security unit told Xinhua that the tragedy happened Monday afternoon.

However, detailed report had yet to be received as the rescue team was still searching for survivors, said the officer. Local people described the incident as the worst river tragedy in the largest state of Malaysia. Several parties, including the police, the fire and rescue department, the fisheries department and the marine department, as well as local residents and civil organizations are involved in the rescue and search operation.

F16A jet of Thai Air Force found crashed

BANGKOK, 19 Oct— An F16 jet fighter of Thai Air Force crashed in northern Tak Province, killing the pilot, Tak governor Samart Loyfa said.

The jet fighter disappeared from the radar at 10 am while it was flying to Wing 41 in northern Chiang Mai Province from Wing 4 in central Nakhon Sawan province along with other three jet fighters. However, the other three reportedly arrived at Chiang Mai safely.

The investigation team went to inspect the area after the local villagers said they heard crashing sound and urged the authorities to go there.

The jet fighter was found crashed in a mountainous area in Ban Tak district, Tak province. Body of the pilot was mutilated but his name tag identified him as Flight Lieutenant Ekthakorn Luangrunwaree, 31 year-old. According to Air Force spokesman Gp Capt Monton Satchukorn, Aircraft Accident Investigation Committee has already been ordered to examine the area where the accident took place to clarify whether poor weather caused the tragedy.

This single-seat F16A jet has been in use in the Royal Thai Air Force since 1997.

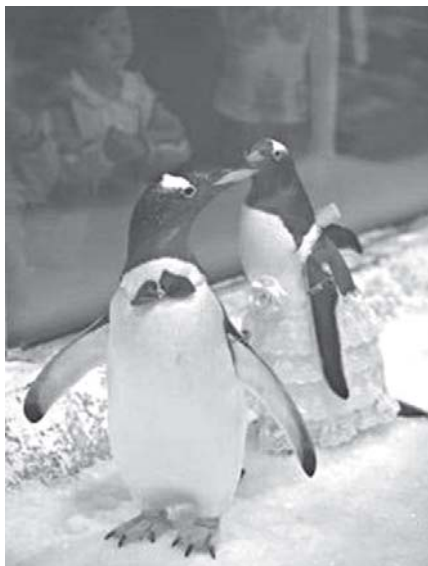

Cambodians died of wine poisoning

PHNOM PENH, 19 Oct — At least 12 Cambodians have died of wine poisoning and 20 others fall ill after drinking local-made wine, DAP News reported on its website on Monday, citing a senior police official.

Non Samen, Police chief of Kompong Cham province was quoted as saying that 12 local residents in Prothet commune, Oreang Ov district of Kompong Cham province, about 125 km east of capital Phnom Penh, had died after drinking local wines poisoning since 16 Oct in religion ceremony of ancestors. They first feel foot and hand coldness, then began dizzy and vomit, and finally death by suffocation, according to victims family members.

Samen added that the local people used the bottles which used to contain grass poisoning to buy local wine and to drink when they gathered in religious ceremony. Nine Cambodians died in first day, and up to now, there were 12 people died and other 20 were falling ill, but now they were getting better after treatment in the hospital, he added.—Xinhua

Philippine death toll from Typhoon Megi rises to 10

BAGUIO CITY, 19 Oct— The death toll from supertyphoon Megi, the strongest typhoon to hit the Philippines in the last four years, continues to rise with ten people now dead, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

(NDRRMC) said Tuesday.

NDRRMC Executive Officer Benito Ramos said three were killed in the province of Isabela; four in Pangasinan; one in Baguio, one in Kalinga and one in Cagayan. Seven were injured. Ramos said 90 percent of houses in Palanan, Isabela were wiped out.

The heavy rains and strong winds uprooted trees, toppled power lines that caused widespread blackouts in northern Philippines, and overflowed rivers in northern Philippines. Most of the casualties were killed by falling trees that flattened houses.

In the Cordillera region, Megi caused landslides, forcing hundreds of residents to flee the mountainous areas. Some vegetable farming communities were isolated while main roads in Benguet and Kalinga provinces remain impassable.

Packing sustained winds of 175 kilometers per hour and gusts of up to 175 kph, Megi is located 180 km west northwest of Dagupan City in Pangasinan province, according to the latest bulletin issued 11 am local time by the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (Pagasa).

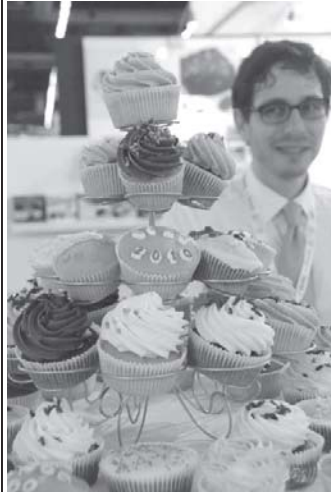
14 dead, Nine missing in S Russia floods

MOSCOW, 19 Oct— The death toll has risen to 14 with nine more missing in the wake of the flooding that hit Russia's southern Krasnodar region over the weekend, Russian media reported on Monday.

Torrential rains fell in mountainous areas of the region on Saturday, causing rivers to overflow and flooding more than 20 villages. About 300 people were evacuated and a state of emergency was imposed.

Aleksandr Gulobev, an official from the Meteorological Monitoring agency said the water level there is expected to reach the alarming lines and even higher in future. "The same events are not excluded; they may develop not at that tragic scale, so far the situation there is rather volatile," he was quoted by the RIA Novosti news agency as saying.

He also explained that the anticyclone moving from the South of Russia to the North-East would cause an intense atmospheric front in the south of the country, warning that authorities should be ready for more rains.—Xinhua

Landslide hampers rescue efforts for trapped miners in Ecuador

QUITO, 19 Oct—The rescue of two miners trapped in a collapsed gold mine in Ecuador has met with difficulties due to a landslide, a minister said Monday.

According to Non-Renewable Resources Minister Carlos Pareja, the rescue operation, now in its fourth day, was not easy due to a landslide.

"The landslide is making the rescue more difficult," he said.

Some 100 rescuers were searching for the trapped miners at the "Esperanza (Hope)" mine, trying to reach them via two entrances.

According to the authorities, both

miners, one of them Peruvian, could be alive. "There is not a bad odor in the mine, which shows us the probability that they could be alive," National Secretary of Risk Management Maria del Pilar Cornejo said. She said the rescuers are close to the place where the miners could be trapped, but they have not made contact with them yet.

Four miners were trapped on Friday some 150 meters underground in El Oro Province, about 400 km southwest of the capital. Two of them were found dead by the rescuers on Saturday.—Xinhua

Death toll rises to 31 in Vietnam flood

HANOI, 19 Oct—The death toll caused by continuous heavy rain and massive flood in central Vietnam has risen to 31, the Vietnam News reported Tuesday.

According to the Central Steering Committee for Flood and Storm Prevention and

Control, 13 victims are in Ha Tinh Province, 12 in Nghe An, five in Quang Binh and one in Thua Thien-Hue province. A bus carrying 37 passengers was washed away in heavy flood waters on Monday. While 17 have been rescued, the other 20 are

still missing. Floods have submerged more than 152,000 houses in central Vietnam.

The National Hydro meteorological Forecast Centre has issued a flood and landslide warning to residents in the central provinces.

South China on alert as typhoon Megi approaches

GUANGZHOU, 19 Oct—Southern China is bracing itself for typhoon Megi, as possibly the strongest typhoon to hit China this year inches toward south China's Guangdong Province. Megi, meaning "catfish" in Korean, reintensified into a super typhoon at 8 am Tuesday after entering the South China Sea late last night.

It is located 850 kilometers east of Zhuhai City, Guangdong Province, according to the latest report from the Guangdong Provincial Meteorological Administration.

Packing winds of 52 meters per second near its centre, the typhoon is heading west northwest at a speed of 15 kilometers per hour. Although it is too early to accurately tell where and when Megi will make landfall, authorities warned that central and western parts of Guangdong Province are most vulnerable. The State

Oceanic Administration estimates 5-to-7-meter-high waves near Guangdong Province over the next 48 to 72 hours. Authorities have ordered all fishing boats to return to harbor before midnight Tuesday and reservoirs and hydro-stations to be on alert. Megi dumped heavy rains on Taipei's Ilan and Hualien Monday, with rainfall expected to reach 1,000 millimeters. Total losses are not yet known. The

typhoon left four dead and six injured in the Philippines while also destroying tons of crops. The Ministry of Civil Affairs and the State Disaster Relief Commission issued urgent notices Monday to civil affairs departments in regions along China's southern coast Hainan, Guangdong, Guangxi and Fujian ordering them to prepare for rescue and relief operations.—Xinhua

TRENTON, 19 Oct—A Michigan woman who harassed a sick 7-year-old girl on Facebook in a feud with the girl's grandmother faces charges of running down a neighbour, police say. Jennifer Petkov, 33, of Trenton appeared in court on Friday, the *Detroit Free Press* reported.

Mexico 'Pirate Attack' wife gives new details

MEXICO CITY, 19 Oct —The wife of an American tourist reported shot to death by pirates on a border lake has given helpful new details about the incident to Mexican authorities, the federal government said on Saturday.

The Attorney Gener-

al's Office said Tiffany Hartley gave a second statement on Friday at the Mexican consul in McAllen, Texas, on what happened to her husband on 30 Sept on the Mexican side of Falcon Lake. "Mrs Hartley provided valuable information that will allow federal investigations to continue," the statement said.

The agency did not give any specifics on her statement. She has said that she and her husband, David Hartley, rode Jet Skis into Mexico's portion of the lake to take pictures of a historic church that was half submerged when the Rio Grande was dammed in 1946 to create Falcon Lake.

Mrs Hartley said that pirates shot her husband in the neck and that she barely escaped when they shot at her when she tried to retrieve him.— *Internet*

One dead, 39 hurt in Jamaica bus crash; driver flees

KINGSTON, 19 Oct—Police in Jamaica say a bus has plunged over a cliff on the Caribbean island's north coast, killing a teenage girl and injuring 39 people. Police Constable Yanique Matthews says the bus driver fled after the accident late Friday and has not been found.

Matthews said on Saturday that the bus was carrying church members to a weekend retreat when it went off the road in St Ann, Jamaica's largest parish. She says a 16-year-old girl died and several of the 39 injured people are in critical condition.

"It was a great success with a new world record of 1,697 coins being tossed simultaneously," said a Royal Mint spokeswoman. "After a final, nail-biting count to verify the number of coins officially flipped, the Royal Mint team were confirmed as the new world record holders."

"The title was snatched from previous holders, the Acharya World Class

One punter had scooped 77,000 dollars after betting 7,000 dollars at odds of 10 to one, sportsbet.com.au said. So you think is unbeaten in his past three races, with his odds now shortened to one to two.

Tooth in man's ear for 30 years

A British man who suffered headaches and partial deafness for 30 years said doctors eventually found a tooth lodged in his ear canal.

Stephen Hirst, 47, of Sheffield, England, said he began suffering frequent earaches and infections when he was 14 and doctors were baffled as to the cause of the discomfort for 30 years, *The Mirror* reported Monday.

"I decided to have one last try to sort it out. The nurse used a microscope then tweezers and pulled out the tooth. She stood there stunned. I don't know why they didn't find it before," Hirst said.

He said full hearing has not returned to his right ear, but the headaches have disappeared and he now sleeps with greater ease.

Indian centenarian goes back to school

An Indian man who just entered his 100th year and retired as a court judge 39 years ago has enrolled at university, insisting it is never too late to learn.

"There is no age limit for acquiring knowledge," Bholaram Das told *AFP* in the northeastern city of Guwahati, where he will pursue a doctorate on the role his native village played in the spread of a particular stream of Hinduism.

Das, who has five sons, one daughter, 10 grandchildren, and a great-grandchild, was born on 16 October, 1911, when India was a British colony, and turned 99 this weekend. "I had a very fulfilling 100 years, having been a teacher, dabbled with politics by joining the Congress party in 1945, became a lawyer, then a magistrate, and retired as a judge in 1971," Das said.

Israeli lottery repeats number set

Israeli statisticians said a lottery draw with the same numbers as a recent draw, only reversed, was a one in 4 trillion occurrence.

The numbers from Saturday's lottery draw — 36, 33, 32, 26, 14, 13 — matched the numbers from a 21 Sept lottery pull with the numbers reversed, Ynetnews.com reported Monday.

"We are in the business of luck, and when it comes to chances and probabilities anything is possible, even the rare and infrequent, like in this case," said Dr Chaim Melamed, the statistics expert for Miphal HaPais, Israel's gambling organization. The lottery organization said 3 people picked all seven winning numbers plus the "string number" of 2 Saturday, earning \$1,116,694 each. Miphal HaPais said 92 others got six of the numbers correct, earning \$1,116 to \$1,831 each.

Madrid's Prado to stage Renoir exhibit

MADRID, 19 Oct— Madrid's Prado Museum opens Tuesday an exhibition of 31 oil canvases by French painter Pierre-Auguste Renoir, the first major retrospective of the artist in Spain. The "Passion for Renoir" show, which runs until 6 February, will feature the Clark Art Institute's complete collection of 31 works by the Impressionist master. It is the first time the US museum has loaned all its Renoirs at once.

The paintings are mostly from Renoir's earlier years but the exhibit also includes a handful of works from when his art evolved from light-dappled Impressionism to a more tight, classical manner inspired by old-school masters such as Titian and Rubens.—*Internet*

Woods getting used to a new life

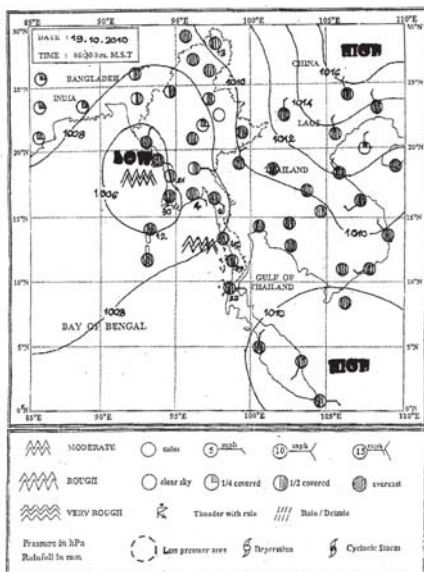
