### Leinli Bridge to link hilly and plain regions

Leinli Bridge spanning Paunglaung Creek on Nay Pyi Taw-Pinlaung Road was opened on 5 November. It has been built in place of the old bailey bridge that could withstand 13 tons only. The new bridge with 1760 feet in length can bear 75 tons of loads.

In the past, one had to use 200-mile Pynmana-Meiktila-Aungban-Pinlaung Road to travel from Nay Pyi Taw to Pinlaung. Now, the trip is just over 70 miles.

With the advent of Leinli Bridge, there can be links between Shan State (South), Kayah State and Nay Pyi Taw. And commodities can quickly be transported to Yangon and Mandalay Regions, Mon and Kayin States and border areas.

It is the 6<sup>th</sup> 180-foot-and-above bridge in Shan State (South) and the 249<sup>th</sup> in the whole country.

## Afghan Taliban threaten death to all talking peace

KABUL, 7 Nov—Scribbled notes from Taliban leader Mullah Mohammad Omar have surfaced in mosques all over Afghanistan's ethnic Pashtun heartland, threatening death to anyone who takes up a government offer to negotiate for peace, according to a longtime Taliban member.

Trying to quash rumors of a break in their ranks, the Taliban

also have vehemently denied reports—including one by *The Associated Press*—that representatives of the militant group were involved in negotiations with the Afghan government. The leadership could be worried that commanders might strike separate deals that would threaten to undermine the militancy and cripple the morale

of their rank-and-file fighters.

President Hamid Karzai has made reconciliation a top priority and recently formed a 70-member High Peace Council to find a political solution to the militancy. At the same time, the US-led coalition has ramped up its military campaign in an effort to pound Taliban commanders to the negotiating table. There are no signs that either strategy is having much effect on the senior Taliban leadership.

A veteran Taliban member who recently visited the powerful shura—or council—in the Pakistani city of Quetta and controlled by Mullah Omar said there was no talk of negotiation among those who control the militancy.

## Al-Qaeda group takes responsibility for mail bombs

DUBAI, 7 Nov—A Yemen-based al-Qaeda group on Friday claimed responsibility for the international mail bomb plot uncovered late last week as well as the crash of a United Parcel Service cargo plane in September.

A week after authorities intercepted packages in Dubai and Britain that were bound for the US, al-

Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula issued a statement taking credit for the plot and saying it would continue to strike American and Western interests. The group specifically said it would target civilian and cargo aircraft.

"We have struck three blows at your airplanes in a single year. And God willing, we will continue to strike our blows

against American interests and the interests of America's allies," the group said in a message posted on a militant website.

The authenticity of

Friday's claim could not be immediately verified. A US intelligence official said authorities are not surprised to see this claim now.—Internet

## Situation in Afghanistan

KABUL, 7 Nov—Following are security developments in Afghanistan at 0630 GMT on Sunday.

HELMAND—A roadside bomb killed five Afghan civilians travelling in a vehicle in southern Helmand Province on Sunday, a spokesman for the provincial governor said. Six more civilians were wounded in the blast, spokesman Dawud Ahmadi said.

GHAZNI—A security force comprising Afghan and NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) troops shot dead a man when he charged them during an overnight operation, ISAF said in a statement. The force was targeting a Taliban senior leader heading about 20 fighters in Ghazni and Andar Districts, ISAF said.

## Haiti dodges storm disaster, cholera toll rises

PORT-AU-PRINCE, 7 Nov—Earthquake-hit Haiti escaped a fresh disaster threatened by Hurricane Tomas, but the storm caused flooding that killed eight people and increased the contagion threat from a deadly cholera epidemic, the government and aid workers said on Saturday.

Amid widespread relief that the hurricane largely spared crowded camps in the Haitian capital housing 1.3 million quake survivors, the international humanitarian operation was turning its attention back to the two-week-old epidemic, which has killed just over 500 people and sickened more than 7,000.

"We do expect the infection rate to jump up due to the flooding and to the bad sanitation conditions in many areas," Christian Lindmeier, spokesman in Haiti for the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization, told *Reuters*.

"Cholera is a water-borne disease and so additional water means additional risk," said Lindmeier. Tomas skirted Haiti on Friday, flooding some coastal towns, forcing thousands from their homes and soaking camps for displaced people in the capital Port-au-Prince with rain. Eight people died as a result of the hurricane, the government said on Saturday, and about 10,000 people left their homes voluntarily to escape floodwaters.—MNA/Reuters

## Abducted ex-prosecutor's brother found dead in Mexico

CIUDAD JUAREZ, 7 Nov—The brother of an ex-attorney general was found dead after being abducted and forced to confess to links to a drug gang in a video released on YouTube, and eight suspects were detained, Mexican police said Friday.

The suspects worked for the powerful Sinaloa drug gang and were allegedly linked to the disappearance and killing of Mario Gonzalez Rodriguez, federal police commissioner Facundo Rosas told a news conference.

Police found the body Thursday, half-buried and bearing signs of torture in an abandoned house on a road between the cities of

Chihuahua and Ciudad Juarez, he said.

Gonzalez Rodriguez, a lawyer, last week appeared handcuffed and surrounded by five men aiming weapons at him in the video released on YouTube.

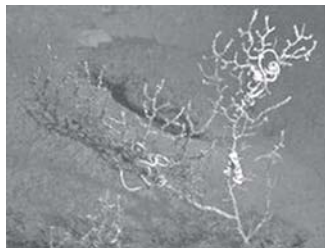


*A person watches a video which shows the interrogation of an allegedly kidnapped person in Mexico City.*

He said at gunpoint that he and his sister were linked to the Juarez drug gang, which is fighting fierce turf battles with the Sinaloa gang around Mexico's most violent city of Ciudad Juarez.

The abduction, two weeks ago, occurred shortly after his sister, Patricia Gonzalez, stepped down as attorney general of northern Chihuahua state.—Internet

## Scientists find damage to coral near BP well

NEW ORLEANS, 7 Nov—For the first time, federal scientists have found damage to deep sea coral and other marine life on the ocean floor several miles from the blown-out BP well — a strong indication that damage from the spill could be significantly greater than officials had previously acknowledged.

Tests are needed to verify that the

coral died from oil that spewed into the Gulf of Mexico after the Deepwater Horizon rig explosion, but the chief scientist who led the government-funded expedition said Friday he was convinced it was related.

“What we have at this point is the smoking gun,” said Charles Fisher, a biologist with Penn State University who led the expedition aboard the Ronald Brown, a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration research vessel.

“There is an abundance of circumstantial data that suggests that what happened is related to the recent oil spill,” Fisher said.

For the government, the findings were a departure from earlier statements. Until now, federal teams have painted relatively rosy pictures about the spill’s effect on the sea and its ecosystem, saying they had not found any damage on the ocean floor.—*Internet*

## World’s oldest axe found in Australia

SYDNEY, 7 Nov—Archaeologists revealed they have found a piece of a stone axe dated as 35,500 years old on sacred Aboriginal land in Australia, the oldest object of its type ever found.

The shard of stone,

found in Australia’s lush and remote far northern reaches in May, has marks that prove it comes from a ground-edge stone axe, Monash University’s Bruno David said on Friday.

“We could see with

the angled light that the rock itself has all these marks on it from people having rubbed it in order to create the ground-edge axe,” he said.

“The person who was using the axe was grinding it against a sandstone surface in order to make it a smoother surface.”

David said the previous oldest ground-edge axes were 20,000 to 30,000 years old, and the conventional belief was that the tool first emerged in Europe when populations grew and forests flourished at the end of the last Ice Age.

## Recession hitting pets along with people

WASHINGTON, 7 Nov—Stray animals are becoming victims of the economy as shelters have to cut back, animal welfare advocates say. More private shelters are forced to reject strays since they are filled with pets abandoned by owners who cannot afford to keep them, Pam Burney, vice president for community initiatives at the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, told *USA Today*.

“Non-profit shelters are looking at the resources they have available,” she said. The shelters are reaching capacity as people who have lost their jobs or homes give up their cats and dogs, Burney said. Inga Fricke, director of sheltering initiatives at the Humane Society of the United States, said some shelters have stopped accepting strays to avoid euthanizing more animals.

Shelters also are canceling contracts with municipalities to take strays off the streets. Cities, also under budget stress, must find other places for them, said Debbie Dawson, senior animal control officer in Edmonds, Washington, who is president of the National Animal Control Association.—*Internet*

## Cancun talks cannot afford to fail: EU climate chief

MEXICO CITY, 7 Nov—The European Union’s top climate official warned Friday that international climate talks in Cancun this month were likely to be tough, but that failure could threaten the whole UN process.

“If we do not keep momentum in Cancun and build on what was achieved in Copenhagen, then there is a risk

that some key parties will start to simply lose interest in the international UN process,” said European Commissioner for Climate Action Connie Hedegaard at a pre-summit meeting in Mexico City.

The UN-backed 29 November -10 December talks in Cancun follow an acrimonious summit in the Danish capital one year ago on pushing back the threat of climate change after 2012.

“It’s probably going to be tough” in Cancun, Hedegaard said, acknowledging that the goal of an internationally binding deal had slipped given the unchanging positions of China and the United States.

The two giants clashed at a UN climate meeting in China in October, accusing each other of blocking progress ahead of Cancun.—*Internet*

## Climate change hurting China’s grain crop

BEIJING, 7 Nov—Climate change could trigger a 10 percent drop in China’s grain harvest over the next 20 years, threatening the country’s food security, a leading agriculture expert warned in comments published Friday.

Tang Huajun, deputy dean of the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences, warned crop production could fall by five to 10 percent by 2030 if climate change continues unchecked, in an interview with the official *China Daily*.

“The output of the country’s three main foods — rice, wheat and corn — may suffer a 37 percent decline in the latter part of this century if the government fails to take effective measures to address the impact of climate change,” Tang was quoted as saying.

China, which produced 530.8 million tonnes of grain in 2009, plans to increase output to 550 million tons by 2020 to ensure food security for the world’s most populous country of more than 1.3 billion, the paper said.

The environmental watchdog Greenpeace said in a recent report that China’s food supply would be insufficient by 2030 and its overall food production could fall by 23 percent by 2050.

## Bing Bang launches Poland’s first science centre

WARSAW, 7 Nov—A state-of-the-art science centre co-financed by the European Union opened its doors in Warsaw Friday with a spectacular multi-media “Big Bang” extravaganza by British film director Peter Greenaway.

“It’s a great day for Polish science and may this Big Bang be the only kind of explosion we have on Earth, in Poland and Warsaw,” Poland’s Prime Minister Donald Tusk

said at the start of the hour-long event detailing the origins of the universe and the great minds of science that inaugurated the Copernicus Science

Centre. “I’m moved because like all big kids, and we’re all big kids, we’ve all dreamt about a place like this where science becomes fun and dreams turn into science,” he added.

With a total 454 expositions, the centre’s facilities include hands-on chemistry, physics and biology laboratories and a state-of-the-art robotics lab boasting a robot able to compose poetry.

## Study says electric brain stimulation can improve maths

LONDON, 7 Nov—Stimulating the brain with a very low electric current can enhance a person's maths ability for up to six months, British neuroscientists said here.

Researchers at Britain's Oxford University studied 15 volunteers and demonstrated for the first time that electrical stimulation of the brain improved their performance in a series of maths assessments, and continued to do so half a year later. "We're not advising people to go around giving themselves electric shocks, but we are extremely excited by the potential of our findings and are now looking into the underlying brain changes," said Oxford's Cohen Kadosh, who led the study.

"Electrical stimulation is unlikely to turn you into the next Einstein, but if we're lucky it might... help some people to cope better with maths." Scientists said last month they found that using electrodes to stimulate areas deep within

the brain might be able to help patients with severe obsessive compulsive disorder who do not respond to other treatment.

For this study, 15 student volunteers aged 20 and 21 were taught symbols that represented different numerical values, and then timed to see how quickly and accurately they could complete a series of maths puzzles based on those symbols.

## New Kan gov eyes income tax cuts

TOPEKA, 7 Nov—Kansas Gov-elect Sam Brownback said Friday he's looking for bold action on taxes next year and sees lowering the state's individual income taxes as crucial for economic growth.

In an interview with *The Associated Press*, the incoming governor said he's convinced the state's income tax rates impede job creation and discourage people from moving to Kansas.

"The individual income tax is, probably of any thing, the most

sensitive area to growth," Brownback said. "What I'm interested in is reducing those taxes that hinder growth in Kansas, and not all tax cuts are created equal when it comes to growth policies."

He said while Kansas draws people from states with higher income rates, it loses far more and he wants to reverse the trend, "to attract people and their capital and the chance at creating jobs."

## Jobs crisis eases, but economy has long way to go

WASHINGTON, 7 Nov—The jobs crisis eased just a bit last month as the American economy added 151,000 jobs, its best showing since April—yet still not enough to make a significant dent in unemployment.

In fact, the pace of job creation is still only about half of what it would take to have a noticeable effect on the jobless rate. So the big question remains: What will it take for businesses to hire that vigorously again, and when will that be? The unemployment rate held steady for the third straight month at 9.6 percent in October, the government said Friday. With Congress facing gridlock, some economists say it will be at least a year before companies gain enough

confidence to start adding 300,000 new jobs a month, a sort of economic sweet spot. That's what it would take to reduce the unemployment rate by a full percentage point over a year.—Internet

## Stocks post meager gains despite strong jobs news

NEW YORK, 7 Nov—Stocks struggled to end barely higher Friday after a blowout report on job creation failed to extend a powerful rally this week driven by the Federal Reserve's latest plan to pump up the economy.

The Dow Jones industrial average waffled between gains and losses for much of the day before ending with a gain of just 9 points. Earlier in the week the Dow reached its highest level since September 2008, just before the peak of the financial crisis, over enthusiasm about the Fed's \$600 billion bond-buying programme announced Wednesday. Stocks rapidly lost momentum Friday, despite a report from the Labour Department showing that employers added 151,000 jobs last month, the first gain since May and far more than analysts had anticipated.

## Bernanke defends Fed from global critics

JACKSONVILLE, 7 Nov—Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke on Friday defended the US central bank's bond-buying against beggar-thy-neighbour criticism, saying it was "critical" for global stability that the US economy regain its strength.

Doing so, he suggested, would bolster a dollar whose weakness has sparked cries of foul from Bogota to Beijing.

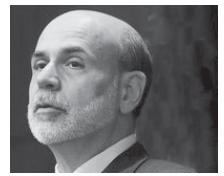
The US central bank's decision to buy \$600 billion of government debt has drawn scathing comments from a host of nations who contend it is generating global instability by ramping up their currencies against the dollar, inflating asset bubbles and stoking inflation in their economies.

"With all due respect, US policy is clueless," German Finance Minister Wolfgang Schäuble said in Berlin.

Bernanke, answering questions from college students, stressed that Fed policies aimed at giving a boost to the weak US recovery would pay dividends around the world.

"I think it's important to emphasize ... that a strong US economy, a recovering economy, is critical, not just for Americans but it's also critical for the global recovery," Bernanke said.

## Boeing signals 787 delays up to 10 months

WASHINGTON, 7 Nov—US aerospace giant Boeing has warned some customers its new 787 Dreamliner will face delays of up to 10 months, *Aviation Week* reported Friday, citing industry sources.

According to people familiar with the situation, Korean Air is the airline hardest hit so far, the industry magazine said on its website.

Korean will get its first 787 in August 2012, 10 months later than previously planned.

Air India now is believed to be scheduled to receive its first 787 in September or October 2011 instead of April, a delay of around five months.

And Japan Airlines will take delivery of its first 787 in June 2011 at the earliest, *Aviation Week* said. That compares to a previous March delivery date.

None of the airlines was available for comment, it said.

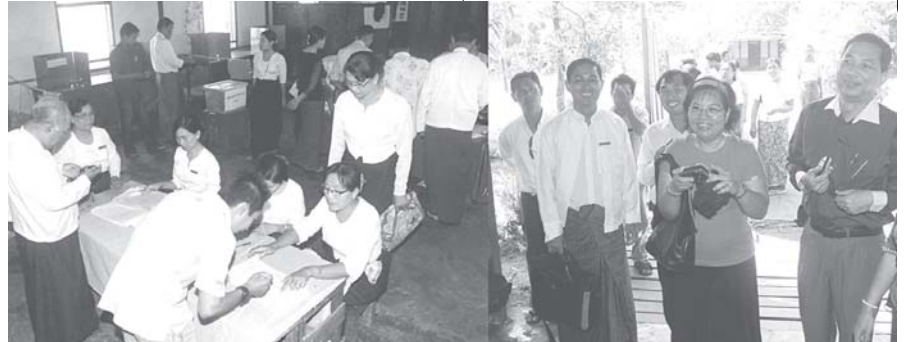

## Italy to liberalise wifi access from 2011

ROME, 7 Nov — Italy will liberalise public wifi access to the Internet from next year, Interior Minister Roberto Maroni said Friday, referring to a much-criticised law restricting wifi connections for security reasons.

The measure "allows us to lift restrictions... that

have now been superseded by technological evolution," Maroni said at a press conference, following a government meeting that approved a package of security-related measures.

Italy in 2005 imposed serious restrictions on wifi access in public places

after a series of bomb attacks in London, forcing wifi providers to require documents proving the identity of users and to track their Internet activity.

Antonio Palmieri, a lawmaker from the ruling People of Freedom party, said the removal of the restrictions was "a balanced position that combines requirements for security and for the modernisation of Italy."

## Dell switching off BlackBerry, onto own smartphone

SAN FRANCISCO, 7 Nov — Dell Inc will shift thousands of its employees off Research in Motion Ltd's BlackBerry and over to Dell's smartphones, the company said on Thursday.

The money-saving switch affects the roughly 25,000 Dell employees who carry a company-issued BlackBerry. Dell employs around 100,000 people worldwide.

Dell is also launching an effort to convince its business customers to switch to the company's smartphone.

News of the company's plans was first reported by the Wall Street Journal, and confirmed by Dell spokesman David Frink.

Frink said the switch will begin soon, but said it will take some time to complete.

RIM did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

OROTO, 7 NOV — Shares in Research In Motion slipped more than 3 percent on Friday morning as investors fretted the BlackBerry smartphone's staranglehold on corporate communications was being eroded by rival devices.

Bank of America and Citigroup have joined a growing throng of financial institutions eyeing alternatives to the BlackBerry for corporate email. The banks are testing software designed to

## China says its car boom is ruining air quality

SHANGHAI, 7 Nov—China's booming car sales have had a devastating effect on the environment, the national environmental watchdog has warned in its first-ever report on pollution caused by vehicle emissions.

About a third of 113 cities surveyed failed national air standards last year as the number of vehicles swelled to 170 million, up 9.3 percent on year and 25 times the number on the roads in 1980, the ministry of environmental protection said.

"All the problems are closely related to vehicle exhaust emissions," said the government report, which was published on Thursday.

Vehicle exhaust emissions exceeded 51 million tonnes in 2009, including more than 40 million tonnes of carbon monoxide, nearly five million tonnes of hydrocarbons

and about six million tonnes of nitrogen oxide, the report said.

China's auto sales hit 13.64 million units in 2009, up 46 percent on-year, and are expected to rise by a further 25 percent this year to 17 million.—Internet

## EU wants tighter online privacy

BRUSSELS, 7 Nov — The European Union wants companies such as Google Inc. or Facebook Inc. to give people more control over how their online habits are tracked, requirements that could crimp Internet firms' ability to target advertising.

Internet companies, privacy activists

and the EU's executive commission are likely to wrestle over the specifics of the rules, which cut to the heart of funding models not only for technology firms but also for many online news sites and blogs.

"People should be able to give their informed consent to the processing of their personal data," the European Commission said Thursday in a new strategy paper.

It also wants users to be able to modify and delete any information that has been collected, giving them "a right to be forgotten."

Thursday's strategy paper will form the basis for an overhaul of the EU's 15-year-old laws on data protection scheduled for next year. It is open for public consultation until January, and the commission aims to propose legislation by mid-2011. Any new laws would have to be approved by the European Parliament and national governments.—Internet

## Russian Facebook investor soars on London stock debut

LONDON, 7 Nov — Shares in Russian Internet company Mail.ru, an investor in social networking site Facebook, surged on their London debut on Friday.

Shares in the largest Internet company in the Russian-speaking world were offered at 27.7 dollars each (19.6 euros) but leapt up over 30 percent to 37 dollars shortly after the market opened.

The shares are only being conditionally traded at the moment and will be officially available for open trading on 11 November.

The company, which was 34-percent owned by Arsenal Football Club major shareholder Alisher Usmanov prior to the Ini-

tial Public Offering (IPO), raised 912 million dollars after selling all 32.9 million shares.

Almost 91 percent of the equity traded were existing shares owned by the company's founders, management and early investors.—Internet

## Spider-Man musical stuck in a web of troubles

NEW YORK, 7 Nov—The bugs apparently still need to be worked out on Broadway's version of Spider-Man.

Producers of "Spider-Man Turn Off the Dark" have been forced to delay by three weeks the official opening of the costly and complicated show, and it will only open its doors for previews after the busy Thanksgiving holiday.

"Shows like ours, that embrace the challenge of opening on Broadway without an out-of-town tryout, often need to adjust their schedules along the way," lead producer Michael Cohl said in a statement released Friday, citing an "unprecedented level of technical artistry."

Originally scheduled to begin previews on 14 Nov with an opening four days before Christmas, the show will now begin previews on 28 Nov and finally open on 11 Jan, a less-than-ideal timetable for luring the crowds that descend on Broadway over the holidays.

"That's usually a sign that there's trouble in River City," says Robert Westenberg, a Tony Award-nominated actor whose Broadway credits include "Les Misérables," "Zorba" and the original 1987 run of "Into the Woods," which he recalls was delayed for several weeks while Stephen Sondheim tinkered with the musical before it finally opened. When it did, it ran for two years.

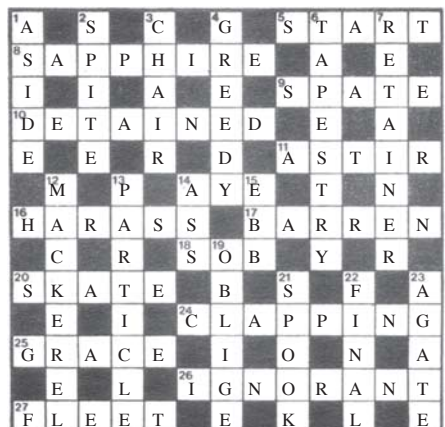

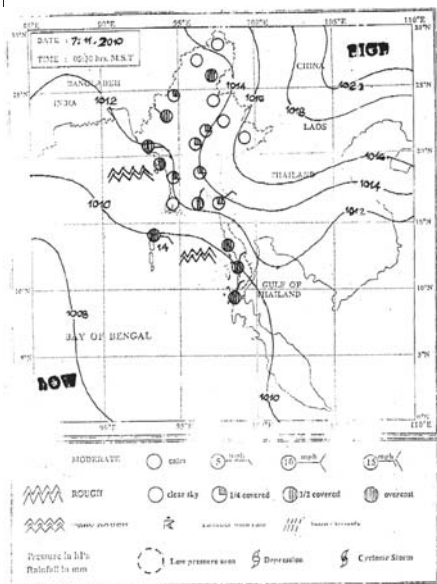

## September pending home sales fall 1.8 percent

WASHINGTON, 7 Nov — Pending sales of previously owned US homes fell unexpectedly in September, a report showed on Friday, and activity may remain volatile for months as troubles with foreclosures disrupt the market. The National Association of Realtors said its Pending Home Sales Index, based on contracts signed in September, fell 1.8 percent to 80.9 from an upwardly revised 82.4 in August. Economists polled by Reuters had expected a 3 percent rise. The data reflects home sales contracts, not closings, and is seen as a leading indicator of housing market trends.

"Existing home sales have shown some improvement but the foreclosure moratorium is likely to cause some disruption and contribute to an uneven sales performance in the months ahead," NAR chief economist Lawrence Yun said in a statement. Several major US mortgage lenders temporarily halted foreclosures in October as attorneys general in all 50 states investigated whether banks had submitted faulty paperwork to back evictions.

### Cyclonic storm “Jal” coded yellow stage not moving towards Myanmar Coasts

NAY PYI TAW, 7 Nov — The Department of Meteorology and Hydrology announced that according to the observations at 5.30 pm today, severe cyclonic storm “Jal” over southwest Bay of Bengal downgraded to cyclonic storm and centered at about 50 miles northeast of Chennai (India). It is likely to move further northwestwards and cross tonight between southern Andhra Pradesh and northern Tamil Nadu Coasts of India.

The present stage of cyclonic storm “Jal” is coded yellow stage and it is not moving towards Myanmar Coasts.

Under the influence of the storm, squalls with moderate to rough seas are likely at times Deltaic, off and along Rakhine Coasts. Surface wind speed in squalls may reach 35 mph.—MNA
