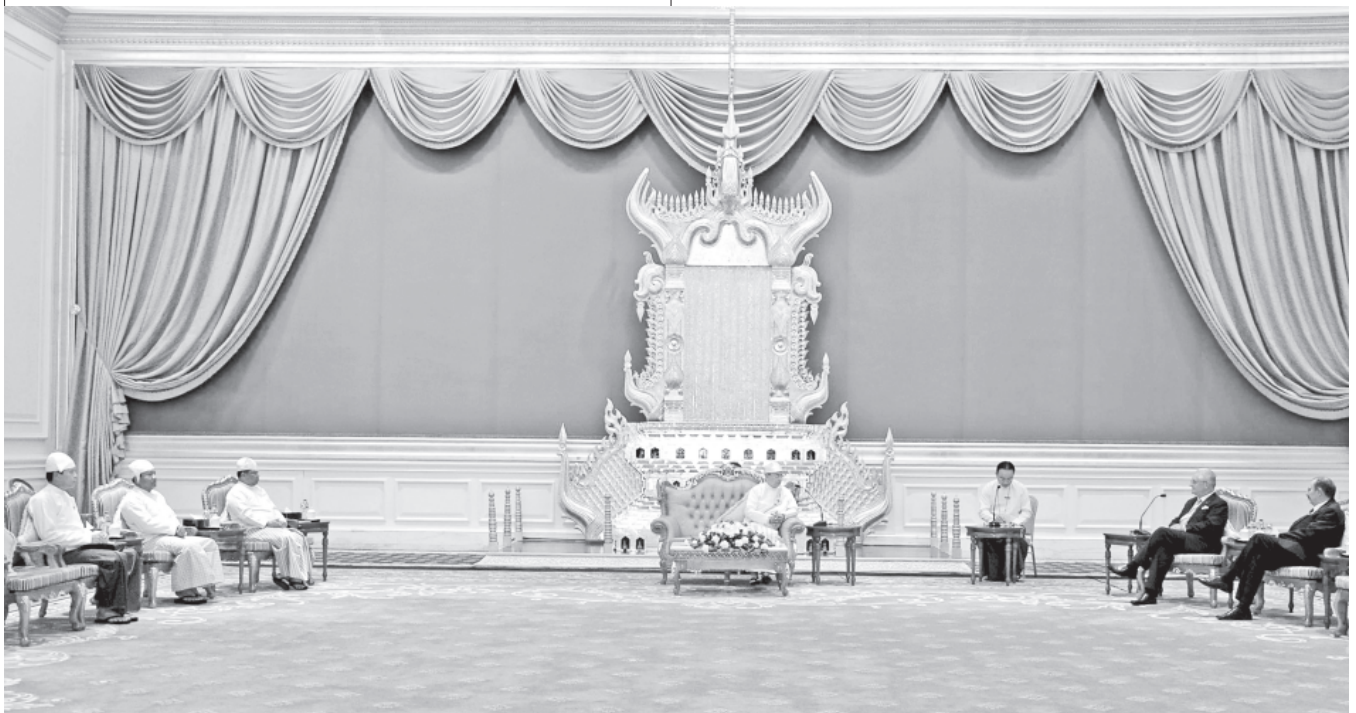

### Amnesty granted

As a gesture of hailing the 64<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Independence Day and for the sake of State peace and stability, the rule of law, national consolidation

and on grounds of humanitarian, the President has granted an amnesty for the prisoners who have served their prison terms for the crimes they committed before 9<sup>th</sup> Waxing of Pyatho 1373 ME (2<sup>nd</sup> January, 2012) in accord with Section 204(b) of the Constitution as follows:-

- Death sentences shall be commuted to life imprisonment (Unlimited jail terms).
- Those sentenced to over 30 years (Those sentenced to unlimited prison terms and life imprisonment excluded) shall get reduction to 30 years in prison.
- Those serving prison terms between 20 and 30 years shall get reduction to 20 years in prison.
- Those sentenced to less than 20 years shall get reduction by a quarter of their prison terms.

## ASEAN welcomes US re-engagement in the region

BEIJING, 2 Jan—After years of neglect, the United States has again made its presence felt in the region, even reaching out to and building bridges with Myanmar. And ASEAN has welcomed this re-engagement and renewed interest.

Dr Surin Pitsuwan, ASEAN Secretary-General, said: "The re-engagement of the US in the region through ASEAN on many issues will be helpful to the region."

"I think the US has also seen that that is beneficial to them because this is the market, this is the where the consumers are, (and) if they want to export, if they want to sell, this is where they have to focus on So I think the

absence of the US in the past has been an anomaly."

Dr Surin noted that despite differences and disagreements, both China and ASEAN are identifying strengths that can be complementary to co-operation. "We have to develop a better integrated market... The more the West is going down in their economic difficulties, the more important it becomes for us to create our own regional market," said Dr Surin. On the South China Sea issue, Dr Surin said both China and ASEAN are working on a more legally binding code of conduct.

It will serve as a framework to prevent accidental flare ups and

incidents. However, there are concerns that America's deepening military presence in the region might antagonise China.

The US had recently reached an agreement with Australia to deploy forces in the country.

But Chinese analysts have openly said that there's no need for China to worry about the re-engagement of the US in the region.

They've said that even though the US has the will to contain China, it does not have the economic means, given the sluggish American economy. They've also argued that perceptions of US strategic influence are greatly exaggerated.

## Former Colombian guerrilla member takes office as Bogota mayor

BOGOTA, 2 Jan—Former Colombian guerrilla member Gustavo Petro took office on Sunday as Bogota mayor to replace Clara Lopez, local Press reported.

Petro, 51, took office at a ceremony in Bolivar Square in Bogota, which was attended by about 5,000 people, including former officials, new cabinet members, federal government representatives and citizens.

In his inauguration speech, Petro, economist and former member of the demobilized 19th of April Movement (M-19) guerrilla group, said he would not follow "a security policy based on killing" and promised to "guarantee the lives" of the citizens of the Colombian capital, where 1,500 homicides were reported during 2011.

He said he would emphasize issues like education, health and access to public services and would lower clean water fees.

Petro, whose term will last until 2015, has been a representative in the congress, senator and presidential candidate in 2010 elections.

## Iran hails US withdrawal from Iraq

TEHERAN, 2 Jan—Iran has welcomed withdrawal of the US forces' from Iraq, describing it a "great success and political and security achievement" of Iraqis.

The exit of US forces from Iraq was a "great success and political and security achievement" for the Iraqi people, government, religious scholars, the lawmakers and political groups, Xinhua quoted the Iranian Foreign Ministry as saying in a statement. Iran also said that it would continue its "constructive role" in Iraq by offering its support to the country's development. Nearly nine years after the US-led invasion, the US troops withdrew from Iraq in December 2011 as per schedule agreed upon in a security pact between the two countries.—Internet

## Iran tests first sample of nuclear fuel bar "successfully"

TEHERAN, 2 Jan—The scientists and researchers of Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) succeeded in producing and testing the first sample of nuclear fuel bar "successfully," the state IRIB TV website reported on Sunday.

The nuclear fuel bar is made of natural uranium, the report said.

After all the preliminary tests including the physical and dimensional tests were conducted successfully, the nuclear fuel bar was fed into the core of Teheran Research Reactor to further study the performance of the produced sample.

The performability of the sample in the long run will be tested in the core of the research reactor by exposing it to radiations, according to IRIB.

Iran said Teheran Research Reactor uses the nuclear fuel bar to produce medicines for cancer treatments.—Xinhua

## 380 militants lay down arms in Afghan's Badghis province in 2011

KABUL, 2 Jan—About 380 anti-government militants have laid down arms and joined the government-backed peace process in Afghanistan's Badghis Province, 555 km northwest of Capital Kabul, last year, local media reported Sunday. "Twenty anti-government armed opposition groups composed of 380 people have given up fighting and laid down their arms in Badghis Province over the past year," Tolo television quoted spy agency spokesman Lutfullah Mashal as saying.

Several commanders were among those who handed over their weapons to the authorities in Badghis Province, Mashal added. According to Afghan and NATO-led forces, more than 3,000 anti-government militants have given up fighting and joined the government-initiated national reconciliation and peace process over the past year in the war-torn country. However, the Taliban outfit fighting Afghan and NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) has rejected the claim as baseless.—Xinhua

## Gaza militants fire two rockets into Israel

JERUSALEM, 2 Jan—Palestinian militants in the Gaza Strip fired two mortar rockets into the Israeli territory from the enclave early Sunday, according to the army.

The bombs fell in an open area and there were no reports of damage or injury to residents in the area, the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) Spokesman's Office said in a statement.

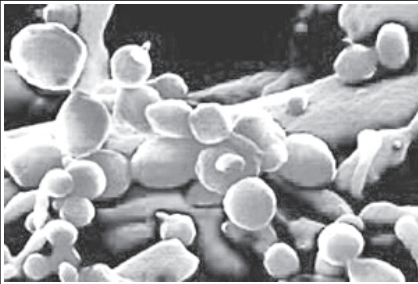
The Israeli Air Force had quickly responded to several such attacks in recent weeks, hitting what the army said launching crews and related targets in the coastal enclave.

The IDF Home Front Command (HFC) plans to test out a new cellphone text message system meant to warn individuals in a specific area of an incoming missile attack.

The army said that the system will send short messages alerts in Arabic, English, Hebrew, and Russian to people in the centre of the country.

When the GPS-linked "Deer Horn" system was first unveiled in early 2011, an IDF operations officer told Xinhua that it was capable of accurately figuring out where a rocket fired at Israel would land, alert the population in the specific area via map-referenced mobile phone numbers, send them an alert via SMS (short message service), and override television and radio broadcasts to warn the public at large before the rocket hit targets.

### Health authorities identify virus leading to Guangdong bird flu death

SHENZHEN, 2 Jan—Health authorities in south Guangdong Province have identified the type of the virus that led to the death of a bus driver, but the cause of the bird flu remains unclear, a local disease control center confirmed Monday.

The receptor of the virus, a highly pathogenic H5N1, is poultry, according to a statement released by the Shenzhen Disease Control Centre.

Though it is highly pathogenic to human beings, the virus can not spread among people, the center said in the statement, adding that there is no need for Shenzhen citizens to panic.

Genetic analysis also indicated that the virus was spread directly from poultry to human, according to the statement.

A 39-year-old man surnamed Chen in Bao'an district of Shenzhen was hospitalized for fever on 21 Dec and tested positive for the H5N1 avian influenza virus. Chen died of multiple organ failure Saturday afternoon.

Health authorities are trying to figure out where Chen acquired the virus.

The Guangdong Department of Agriculture announced Saturday that no epidemic of bird flu among poultry had been reported in the province.—Xinhua

### Sunbed ban 'could prevent 1 in 4 cases of skin cancer in under-40s'

LONDON, 2 Jan—Banning sunbed use could prevent a quarter of cases of the most common form of skin cancer in the under-40s, a new research suggests. The study from doctors at Yale University in the US revealed that indoor tanning significantly increases the risk of basal cell carcinoma. It found that sunbed users are 69 per cent more likely to develop BCC before the age of 40 than people who never use the tanning method.

The link was strongest among women, and the risk increased with years of sunbed use. And that study concluded that avoiding sunbeds can prevent a quarter of all cases of 'early onset' BCC – when the disease occurs before the age of 40. Among women, who are greater users of sunbeds, 43 per cent of cases could be avoided if sunbeds were banned.

Unlike other forms of skin cancer, such as malignant melanoma, BCC can be easily treated and survival rates stand at 98 per cent. But since the 1970s cases have increased by 17

per cent, which is likely to be partly fuelled by sunbed use and holidays abroad. And British doctors say they are seeing increasing numbers of youngsters with this type of cancer. In April, under-18s were banned from using sunbeds although they still remain popular and three million adults use them every year. This Yale University study is the latest to show the damaging effects of sunbeds on the skin.

"We routinely see young women with skin cancer in our practice," the *Daily Mail* quoted Dr David J Leffell, professor of dermatology and surgery at Yale School of Medicine and author of the study as saying.

"In the past, this was extremely rare. But now in many cases the patients acknowledge their use of tanning parlours, and I think this study confirms the harmful nature of this activity," he noted. The study has been published in the *Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology*.

### Aspirin-exacerbated disease tied to smoke

NEW YORK, 2 Jan—Adults with aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease are more than three times as likely to have been exposed to secondhand smoke as kids, US researchers say. Dr Jinny Chang of The Methodist Hospital said about 10 percent of people with asthma and one-third of asthmatics with chronic sinus inflammation have aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease. Although they might have been able to take aspirin previously, most are now unable to take it without suffering an asthma attack or other respiratory symptoms, Chang said. "More than half of US children are exposed to secondhand smoke, and this study adds to the evidence that it is a health threat," Chang said in a statement. "This study shows it also is associated with aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease."

The study included a total of 520 people: 260 patients who had asthma and aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease and their spouses, who did not have asthma or aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease. In the study, compared with those without aspirin-exacerbated respiratory disease, those with the condition were more than three times as likely to have been exposed to secondhand tobacco smoke as children and were five times as likely to have been exposed during childhood and adulthood.—Internet

### Hyundai, Kia see slower sales growth in 2012

SEOUL, 2 Jan—Hyundai Motor <005380.KS> and affiliate Kia Motors <000270.KS> aim to boost global vehicle sales by 6 percent this year to a combined 7 million vehicles, which would mark a slowdown for a duo that has enjoyed double-digit sales rises in recent years.

The South Korean automakers, which together rank fifth in global car sales, are unable to keep up with demand because of stretched production capacity. But they have refrained from boosting capacity sharply, instead

focusing on improving product quality and profits.

Bigger rival Toyota Motor <7203.T> last month forecast a 20 percent jump in 2012 sales to a record 8.48 million vehicles, as it is recovering from output losses caused by natural disasters in Japan and Thailand last year.

"We will strengthen quality management we have continuously pursued," Chung Mong-koo, chairman of Hyundai and Kia's parent group, said on Monday in his annual speech to employees.

The 73-year-old Chung has headed Hyundai Motor

Group since 2000 when he led auto-related firms out of the parent Hyundai Group, then South Korea's biggest conglomerate marred by financial troubles and a bitter family feud. The son of Hyundai's founder is credited with transforming the once maker of cheap, poor-quality vehicles into a stellar performer, especially during the global economic downturn.

Hyundai Motor Group, South Korea's No 2 conglomerate, is expected to top Samsung Group, which also includes Samsung Electronics <005930.KS>, in terms of net profit in 2011, media reports said, showing how fast the motor group has grown in the past decade.

Shares of Hyundai Motor dropped 0.9 percent and Kia shares fell 0.3 percent in the wider market <KSI1> that was down 0.2 percent as of 0534 GMT on Monday.

Shares in Hyundai Motor rose 23 percent and Kia shares rose 32 percent last year, far outperforming the wider market's 11 percent fall.—Reuters

### Indian gov't allows foreigners to directly invest in stocks

NEW DELHI, 2 Jan—Indian government has allowed foreign nationals, including overseas individuals, to invest directly in Indian stock markets, local media reported Monday. "As a next logical step, it has now been decided to allow qualified foreign investors (QFIs) to directly invest in the Indian equity market in order to widen the class of investors, attract more foreign funds and reduce market volatility and to deepen the Indian Capital market," the Finance Ministry said in a

statement on Sunday. Earlier, foreigners were allowed to invest only in mutual fund schemes.

By allowing QFIs, the government is opening a new avenue for investment, earlier controlled by foreign institutional investors. Foreign nationals, who wanted to invest in Indian stock markets, earlier came through the sub-account route, local daily *The Times of India* reported. "In this arrangement, a large number of Qualified Foreign Investors, in particular, a large set of diversified individual foreign

nationals who are desirous of investing in Indian equity market do not have direct access to Indian equity market. In the absence of availability of direct route, many QFIs find difficulties in investing in the Indian equity market," the Finance Ministry was quoted as saying.

The move came at a time when foreign institutional investors are withdrawing from Indian equity markets due to problems in their domestic markets, the report said.

## DPRK's top papers glorify 2012 with leadership of Kim Jong Un

PYONGYANG, 2 Jan—The Democratic People's Republic of Korea's "Rodongsinmun", "Josoninmingun", "Chongnyonjonwi" top newspapers, published a New Year Joint Editorial titled "Glorify This Year 2012 as a Year of Proud Victory, a Year When an Era of Prosperity Is Unfolding, True to the Instructions of the Great General Kim Jong Il".

Summary of the joint editorial is as follows:

## Stephen Hawking seeks help to make voice heard

LONDON, 2 Jan—Can you help make Stephen Hawking's voice heard?

The famed British physicist is seeking an assistant to help develop and maintain the electronic speech system that allows him to communicate his vision of the universe. An informal job ad posted to the famed physicist's website said the assistant should be computer literate, ready to travel, and able to repair electronic devices "with no instruction manual or technical support."

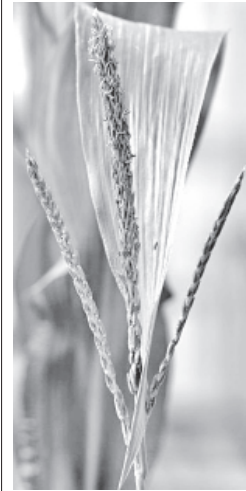
Hawking has long struggled against amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, a disease which left him almost completely paralyzed. He lost his real voice in a tracheotomy in 1985, but a wheelchair-mounted computer helps synthesize speech by interpreting the twitches of his face. The synthesizer's robotic

monotone has become nearly as famous as Hawking himself, but the computer — powered by batteries fastened to the back of Hawking's wheelchair — isn't just for speaking.

It can connect to the Internet over cell phone networks and a universal infrared remote enables the physicist to switch on the lights, watch television, or open doors either at home or at the office. It's a complicated, tailor-made system, as the ad makes clear. A photograph of the back of Hawking's wheelchair, loaded with coiled wires and electronic equipment, is pictured under the words: "Could you maintain this?"

"If your answer is 'yes,' we'd like to hear from you!" the website says. Hawking's website says that the job's salary is expected to be about 25,000 pounds (\$38,500) a year.—Xinhua

## Greying Singapore taps robots, games in rehab

SINGAPORE, 2 Jan—Six months ago, Singaporean retiree Soon Eng Sam, 70, suffered a stroke that paralysed the left side of his body. Bedridden for three months, he has regained some limb functions on the affected side through conventional physical therapy but now hopes to hasten his recovery with the help of new gadgets designed to make rehabilitation fun. "This therapy is not so boring, not so painful as physical therapy, because the machine is assisting me to move my arm up and down and laterally," he said after a recent hour-long session with the "Armeo" robotic arm.

A therapist had to tell Soon to slow down as the former civil servant enthusiastically used his left hand, partly supported by the robotic arm, to catch virtual water droplets with a teacup on a colour monitor. The machine is among the high-tech exercise stations now being used at the Centre for Advanced Rehabilitation Therapeutics (CART), described by its administrators as the most advanced facility of its kind in Asia.

Medical authorities are deploying the latest technology as fast-greying Singapore prepares for a "silver tsunami" of elderly people as a result of longer life spans and low birth rates. In two decades, an estimated 20 percent of the population will be 65 years or older, compared to 9.3 percent at present.

## Sony Tablet S prices slashed by \$100 to kick off the new

TOKYO, 2 Jan—Sony is knocking \$100 off the price of its Tablet S, as you can see in the company's online store, with prices now falling at \$399 for the 16 GB model and \$499 for the 32 GB. The Android-powered tablets launched in September, but the holidays are now behind us and Sony is probably looking to make its new tech a little more attractive to shoppers in the new year.

Note that the price drop is also in effect at Newegg.com. The online electronics retailer was originally running a New Year's Day promotion that bundled a 16 GB Tablet S with 1TB GoFlex hard drive for \$449.99. The price for that same bundle now sits at \$399.99.

The Tablet S sports a 9.4-inch screen and runs on Honeycomb. It's packing a Tegra 2 CPU and 1GB of memory, plus a 5.0 MP rear camera and a 0.3 MP in the front. Not a bad tablet to have according to reviews so far, but early adopters have got to be a little rankled over such a quick turnaround on the price. Then again, Sony dropped the price "temporarily" by \$50 in mid-December. Maybe there aren't enough early adopters out there to begin with.

## Indian PM promises to continue act against corruption in coming year

NEW DELHI, 2 Jan—Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh Saturday called on the Indians to be patient for the results of his efforts to fight corruption, and promised to work for the livelihood of ordinary people as his priority in the coming year.

“These initiatives (to fight corruption) will take time to have their full effect and we must therefore be patient,” the prime minister, who is 79-year-old, said in his New Year’s address to the nation.

“But I do believe they are transformational initiatives, which will be recognized as such a few years down the line,” he added.

He said he personally will work to “provide an honest and more efficient government, a more productive, competitive and robust economy and a more equitable and just social and political order.”

The government has introduced the anti-graft Lokpal (Ombudsman) bill to the Parliament this week. While the Lower House of the Parliament has endorsed it, the Upper House has yet to give its approval due to differences with the opposition over the bill.

India has seen an unprecedented movement of protests against corruption in the passing year.

Singh also said there were five challenges he would like to address in 2012—livelihood security, (covering education, food, health and employment), economic security, energy security, ecological security and national security.

“In addressing each of these five challenges we must work together as a nation, while working with like-minded nations around the world. I assure you that I will work with all the energy at my command to ensure that we meet each of these challenges and overcome them,” he said.—Xinhua

## Chinese President delivers New Year address, stresses world peace, development

BEIJING, 2 Jan—In a New Year’s address broadcast on Saturday, Chinese President Hu Jintao vowed that China will continue to develop friendly exchanges with other countries and positively participate in international cooperation on global issues. While addressing domestic and overseas audiences via state TV and radio broadcasters, Hu urged the acceleration of the transformation of the country’s economic development pattern and structural adjustments while making more efforts in ensuring people’s livelihood.

The country will continue to balance maintaining steady and relatively fast economic growth with adjusting its economic structures and managing inflation expectations, he said in the speech titled “Jointly Improve World Peace and Development,” which was

The year of the dragon has meant good luck for Russia in the past, Putin said. “(I) Hope this time that Dragon will bring luck, well-being and prosperity to each Russian family and to all our citizens,” Putin said.

Addressing the recent parliamentary elections held on 4 Dec and the upcoming presidential election on 4 March, Putin said that in such times everything is somewhat unsteady and turbulent. “But this is the inevitable cost of democracy. There is nothing unusual here,” Putin stressed.

Following the 4 Dec election, Russia has been marred by mass protests against alleged vote frauds, in which the ruling United Russia party, led by Putin, gained 238 out of 450 seats and kept an absolute majority in the new State Duma, or the lower house of parliament.—Xinhua

BEIJING, 2 Jan—China has marked the New Year with the start of 3D TV service. After a trial run, the 3D TV will be officially put into operation during Spring Festival later in January.

The first stations for the 3D trial are China Central Television, Beijing Television, Tianjing Broadcasting TV, Jiangsu TV and Shenzhen TV. 3D programmes will be offered daily from 10:30am to midnight. The programmes include animation, sports, documentaries, TV dramas, entertainment and live broadcasting of big events, such as CCTV New Year’s Gala and the London 2012 Olympic Games.—Xinhua

Kim, supreme commander of the KPA and supreme leader of the Workers’ Party of Korea (WPK), state and Army, said the Seoul Ryu Kyong Su 105 Guards Tank Division was the unit that late DPRK leaders Kim Il Sung and Kim Jong Il had inspected the most, according to the report. He expected the division would become the Army’s most powerful unit, expressing his hope that it would strengthen training and be ready to fight any time. This was Kim’s first KPA inspection since he assumed its top role.

The Political Bureau of the Central Committee of the WPK proclaimed on December 30 that Kim had assumed the supreme KPA commandership “at the behest” of late leader Kim Jong Il on 8 October, 2011.—MNA/Xinhua

## Sarkozy says debt crisis not over

PARIS, 2 Jan—French President Nicolas Sarkozy said Saturday in his New Year greetings that the spiralling debt crisis is not finished, urging more work to boost growth and competitiveness.

“This unprecedented crisis, probably the worst since the Second World War is not over yet but there are reasons for hope and we must, we can keep confidence in the future. 2012 will be the year of all the

risks but also of hopes,” the French president said.

“The problem is not that of a new package of spending cuts for the coming year. What should be done has been done by the government. Now we need to work primarily for growth, for competitiveness, for the re-industrialization which will enable us to create jobs and purchasing power,” he added.—Xinhua

## Militants demand ransom for Australian hostage in S Philippines

COTABATO, 2 Jan—Militants demanded ransom in exchange for the freedom of their Australian hostage in the restive southern Philippines, police said on Monday.

Felicisimo Khu, chief Director for Integrated Police Operations, said gunmen holding Warren Richard Rodwell demanded at least 1 million pesos (22,831 US dollars) ransom money. Khu said the demand was relayed to the victim’s Filipina wife. Roduel was seized on 5 Dec from his house in Green Meadows Subdivision, Upper Pangil Village in Ipil Town. He was last seen along with his captors in the province of Basilan. The Philippine government has since warned their citizens from travelling to southern Philippines due to the abduction.

Basilan is a known bailiwick of the Abu Sayyaf, a militant group founded in the 1990s and has perpetrated a number of high-profile attacks, including kidnapping, bombing and beheading. The Philippine military estimates the group, which has links with external terrorist organizations such as al-Qaeda, at less than 400 members.—Xinhua

## Fukushima hospitals face financial crisis

FUKUSHIMA, (Japan), 2 Jan—Hospitals in Japan's Fukushima prefecture have reported financial strain in the wake of Tokyo Electric Power Co's Fukushima No 1 nuclear power plant disaster. The prefecture's hospital association, to which 90 percent of its hospitals belong, estimated the medical facilities' combined losses would reach at least \$164 million for the first year after the March nuclear crisis, *The Yomiuri Shimbun* reported Thursday. The hospitals demanded Tepco pay compensation for the first six months following the disaster. They received about 70 percent of their request, though retirement bonuses for doctors and other expenses, such as the cost of medicine, were not covered.

Due to financial shortfalls, hospitals have been forced to reduce staff and cut services.

"Many of the hospitals had to limit the number of inpatients they accept due to the declining number of medical staff," said Kazuhira Maehara, head of the prefecture's hospital association. "Compensation payments didn't start until nine months after the accident. Unless something is done, it will be a long time before hospitals [in the prefecture] can resume

The year 2011 has come to an end with changes and developments plus pleasure and refreshment. The auspicious occasion of the 64<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Independence Day, which falls on 4 January, 2012, is the newest archway of an era in history.

Over the past 60 years after Myanmar regained her independence, there has been no other year as significant as 2011 that was filled with remarkable changes and political developments. ### The drive for turning point

Most of international observers were taken aback by the fact that Myanmar, which had been ruled by an authoritarian Tatmadaw government in its political sector, has started practising democracy after holding elections and electing a new government within years or months.

The then government built not only political but also economic and social foundations for the emergence of a new democratic nation.

In accord with the instructions included in the speech made by the President at the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw on 30-3-2011, peace talks and negotiations were held with aboveground and underground armed groups that had not been accepted the constitution so as to make eternal peace. The peace talks were held after a peace-making group had been formed with Hluttaw representatives who are familiar with the areas and masses of respective national races and ministers at state and union levels.

Plans have been made to hold peace talks and negotiations at three levels – state, Union and Hluttaw. At state level, initial agreement is to be reached for ceasefire agreement and future

programmes of peace talks and at Union level, coordination, negotiations and solutions are to be sought politically.

After seeking approval from individual groups at Union level, discussions will be held at the Hluttaw to seek common ground by inviting various national race armed groups. The constitution will be amended if required. Finally, a complete agreement will be officially signed in the Hluttaw for eternal peace. National race organizations will have the chance to transform themselves into political parties as they wish.

In this regard, contacts were made with 10 national race armed groups which had yet to make peace with the government and peace talks have been held with all the armed groups, except the Kachin group. And success has been achieved to a certain extent and initial peace agreement has been reached at state level with about four groups. Peace talks with Kalohtobaw Group (Former DKBA) and Special Region (4) Group have reached Union level. As the peace talks with the remaining groups are gaining momentum, the hilly regions to the east of Myanmar are beginning to hear pleasant voices of peace doves in place of sounds of gunfire.

With the prevalence of regional peace and stability, steps are being taken in accord with the instructions included in the President's speech to establish industrial zones and special (see page 9)

But it is natural that everything cannot be perfect. Parts of Kachin State are still noisy with sounds of gunfire. The government on its part is offering peace talks with kind patience and Union Spirit. The President halted the Myitsone hydropower project on 30-9-2011 in accordance with the desire of the Myanmar people, including the mass of Kachin. On 10-12-2011, he directed the units and regiments of the Myanmar Tatmadaw not to launch offensive except for self-defence. Besides, the government, international organizations and social organizations provided food, medicine and other humanitarian aids for refugees who evacuated to the government-controlled areas as well as for local refugees who were in the other armed group-operated area. It is therefore hoped that sooner or later, the other side will understand and response to the peace offerings being made with goodwill and kind patience based on Union Spirit.

### Towards clean government and good governance

"The important duty of the new government is to

strive for emergence of clean government and good governance," said the President to the members of the Union Government on 30-3-2011. In this context, the tasks must have transparency and accountability and be in conformity with the constitution and existing laws. In addition, they must be effective and efficient paying respect for public desires and ensuring all-inclusiveness, the President also noted.

The government's second work programme is the flourishing of democracy. Now, Myanmar has had a constitution fundamental to building a democratic nation. The three legislative, executive and judicial pillars emerging from

which have human rights watch groups. Among them, National Human Rights Commission of Myanmar is an organization of international standard formed with the Paris fundamental principles.

As the three powers of the constitution are in force, legislative Hluttaws have been able to widen the scope of their knowledge and experience and work more actively in the Hluttaw sessions. In changing a new system and new era, a primary work plan is to make reforms in laws and procedures in parallel with the present time. Out of over 800 laws in Myanmar, about half was inherited from the colonial era and some were prescribed in the British-India colonial era before the entire country had been forced into enslavement. So, it is the tremendous duty of the legislative body to abolish or amend the old laws and to pass necessary new ones. It is difficult for a law to be amended after being promulgated. Amending of laws needs thorough decision and is time-consuming. Hence, 15 cases for abolishing, amending and passing laws could only be carried out at the two previous Hluttaw sessions.

Nonetheless, new laws such as freedom of peaceful expression law and labour union law could have been successfully passed in a short time and we must recognize that these are the significant legislative tasks.

**Four killed, dozens injured as blast hits NE Kenya**

GARISSA, 2 Jan—At least four people were killed and dozens of others seriously injured when a nightclub came under a hand grenade attack here in northeastern Kenya early Sunday.

Leo Nyongesa, northeastern provincial police officer, confirmed the incident in Garissa, a town near the Kenya-Somalia border, saying that "the police have launched investigations to establish the motive behind the attack, but so far no arrests have been made."

He said that the deceased

included a military officer, a policeman and two civilians, adding that the injured have been sent to a local hospital and the number of casualties may rise.

Eyewitnesses said unknown attackers drove to the nightclub in a taxi and hurled the hand grenade in the pub where people were having New Year celebrations.

The country's security agencies are on an unprecedented alert amid latest reports that Islamist Al-Shabaab militia have

planned attacks against Kenya and US interests in the country.

Kenyan forces are hunting down the Al-Shabaab militants inside Somalia to stop further incursions into Kenya.

In the last few weeks, Kenya suffered incursions by the Al-Shabaab militia from neighbouring Somalia, with heavy fighting reported near the border Town of Mandera, as well as in the northern Districts of Wajir, Garissa and Dadaab.

**Overdue library book with 4,500 pounds fine uncovered 123 years late**

LONDON, 2 Jan—A library book that has been overdue for 123 years has been unearthed at a historic Lake District home.

The Victorian miscellany 'Good Words for 1888' was borrowed from the Troutbeck Institute library in North West England shortly after it was first published, but was never returned.

It sat on the fireside shelf at Townend House in

Troubeck, home to the wealthy Browne family ever since. It was discovered by chance by staff at the National Trust, which now owns the building.

The library from which it was borrowed no longer exists, and the book could be the longest-ever library loan in Britain. Cumbria libraries now cap their book fines at 6 pounds. Otherwise the total payable, at 10p a day, would

be a hefty 4,489.50 pounds.

"It would have quite a fine on it by now. I think it's a huge amount of time for a library book to be overdue. The Institute still has a collection of books, I wonder if they know it is missing?" the *Daily Mail* quoted Katrina Zanhak, custodian of Townend House, which has been a National Trust property since 1948 as saying.—Internet

**Argentine governor 'accidentally' killed by gunshot**

LONDON, 2 Jan—A provincial governor in Argentina has died of a gunshot at home while celebrating the new year with family.

According to the police, Carlos Soria, the Rio Negro governor, was with his wife when he got killed around 08.00 GMT, the *BBC* reported. He had sworn in as a governor just a few weeks ago and had been elected in Rio Negro by a wide margin.

Vice-governor Alberto Weretilneck termed it a "domestic accident".

As per local media reports, Soria's wife Susana Freidos is being questioned by police.

**China, Afghanistan sign agreement on bilateral cooperation**

KABUL, 2 Jan—Chinese Ambassador to Afghanistan Xu Feihong and Afghan Foreign Minister Zalmi Rassoul signed an agreement on bilateral economic and technical cooperation on Saturday.

The deal is a part of the grant assistance of China to the people of Afghanistan, said a Press release by the Afghan Foreign Ministry.

The latest grant will be spent on the implementation of projects based on consultations between the two countries, it said.

The main projects include the reconstruction and equipping of the

Jamhooryat Hospital in Kabul, the reconstruction of the Parwan Irrigation Canal, construction of the Conference Hall within the Arg premises (Afghan Presidential Palace), the reconstruction of the Ministry of Education's Centre for National Science and Technology, the reconstruction of the Ministry of Higher Education's guest house, the construction of the department of the Chinese Language in Kabul University and the provision of 100 ambulances to the Ministry of Public Health.

Since 2001, the People's Republic of China has

provided a total amount of 200 million US dollars to the reconstruction projects in Afghanistan, the foreign ministry said.

**13 die after drinking illicit liquor in India**

NEW DELHI, 2 Jan—At least 13 people died after drinking illicit liquor to celebrate New Year Saturday night in India's southern state of Andhra Pradesh, local media reported on Sunday.

The incident took place after over 170 died of drinking the illicit liquor, also known as hooch, in the eastern state of West Bengal two weeks ago.

Hours before the dawn of New Year, the tragedy struck Poratanagar in Krishna district of coastal Andhra, said *Indo-Asian News Service*.

At least 10 others are still battling for life in hospitals where they are being treated for poisoning.

The victims belonged to three tribal hamlets. After consuming the country-made liquor, they suffered giddiness.

Local authorities ordered judicial investigation into the incident and suspension of two tax officers for negligence.

**Vietnamese cargo ship sinks; 22 dead**

HANOI, 2 Jan—A Vietnamese cargo ship that vanished near the Philippines on Christmas Day has sunk, killing 22 of its 23 crew members, Vietnam state shipping firm Vinalines said

on Friday.

"According to our initial information, only one sailor has been rescued and the vessel has not been found yet," a Vinalines official based in Hanoi told *AFP*,

asking not to be named.

The Vinalines Queen disappeared after passing Luzon island and apparently did not send out a distress signal.

Late on Friday, online newspaper Dan Tri reported that the surviving sailor, Dau Ngoc Hung, was rescued by a British ship which was heading towards Singapore.

Vinalines said its ship was carrying more than 54,000 tonnes of nickel ore and was travelling from Indonesia to China when it lost contact.

Vietnam appealed to the Philippines, Taipei and Japanese coastguards for help in finding the vessel, but had heard nothing from the ship until now.

"We are now focusing

our efforts on searching for the Vinalines Queen," the company official added.

Rescue experts quoted in the local Press said emergency equipment in the vessel should have automatically sent SOS signals to satellites and coastal rescue stations. It is not yet clear why none was transmitted.

The Japanese-built 190-metre (627-foot) Vinalines Queen was one of the largest and most modern cargo ships in the Vietnamese fleet, with a capacity of more than 56,000 tonnes. It had been in service for Vinalines since 2005.

Vietnam National Shipping Lines, or Vinalines, is one of the communist country's main state-owned enterprises.

## Israel to build wall along Jordanian border

JERUSALEM, 2 Jan—Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Sunday announced that Israel plans to build a wall along its eastern border with Jordan, similar to the one currently under construction along its border with Egypt.

The government invests some 360 million US dollars in a five-metre-high steel fence along its 240-kilometre-long western border, which is scheduled for completion by September.

"When the security barrier along the Egyptian border is finished, one will be built along the border with Jordan," Netanyahu told ministers at the weekly cabinet session, Army radio said.

Both structures are intended to thwart infiltrators, whether refugees, those

seeking work, smugglers, or hostile cross-border attacks.

"Israel's border with Egypt is a border of peace," Netanyahu said during a visit in September.

But, he continued, "To continue the peace, there must be security and to this end a fence is necessary. Its rapid construction is important for both peace and security."

Political and defence echelon officials are deeply concerned by the deteriorating situation along the Egyptian border.

"I'd define the border these days as one of tense peace ... We've always known that radical Islamist elements are infiltrating into Sinai," an Eilat-area counter-terrorism expert told *Xinhua* in December.

In a cross-border attack along a nearby road in

August, militants killed eight Israeli motorists, and wounded some 30 others. The army has since then deployed some of its crack infantry units to patrol the region and upped the number of early-warning installations.

It is also considering calling up reserve units to

beef-up manpower for patrols. "The fence is an important tool that will enable us and other forces to control occurrences on the border with greater effectiveness," the official said, but warned that without boots on the ground, the barrier itself would be "worthless."

## Blackbirds fall to the ground in Beebe

BEEBE, (Ark), 2 Jan—At least 80 dead blackbirds fell from the sky in Beebe, Ark, on New Year's Eve, prompting police to ban fireworks, the suspected cause, for the night.

Beebe animal control officer Horace Taylor said his office picked up about 80 blackbirds on New Year's Eve, KHTV, Little Rock, Ark, reported.

Authorities put an emergency ban on fireworks

for the night after police received the first report of birds falling to the ground at 7:14 pm.

On New Year's Eve 2010, about 4,000 blackbirds fell from the sky in Beebe, KATV, Little Rock, Ark, reported.

Experts said the loud noises from fireworks sent the birds crashing into buildings, cars and each other before the fell to the ground.

## Fireworks smoke cancels Manila flights

MANILA, (Philippines), 2 Jan—New Year's fireworks displays in Manila created so much smoke airlines were forced to cancel flights, Philippine officials said.

*GMA News* reported the air pollution also presented a problem for people with asthma and other respiratory illnesses.

On the plus side, health officials said this year's

celebration produced significantly fewer firecracker-related injuries, the Philippines broadcaster said. Health Secretary Enrique Ona said 476 fireworks-related injuries were recorded by 6 am Sunday. The department had said in a news release in late November that there had been 1,022 injuries during the 2010 New Year's revelry. *GMA News* said visibility

had been reduced to zero in Manila on New Year's Eve, forcing airports to shut down their runways until 9 am Sunday. Some airlines canceled and delayed flights even after the runways reopened.

Officials said while there were fewer fireworks set off this year, the smoke lingered because of dry weather and calm winds.—*Internet*

## Southern Thailand under flood threat

BANGKOK, 2 Jan—The National Disaster Warning Centre of Thailand issued a warning on Sunday for people in eastern provinces of the South to prepare for heavy rain and the danger of floods and mudslides.

Most of the southern provinces were greeted by incessant heavy downpours during the New Year holiday. 12 districts of

Songkla were taken over by floodwaters, with one people reportedly killed by the flood. 8 districts in Narathiwat were declared disaster zones from flooding.

In Yala, heavy rain hit this southernmost province for four straight days inundating areas. Photos on the website of *Thai News Agency* show that the water level in some regions reaches

half-metre high and submerges shops along the roads. Meanwhile, strong winds and high waves in the Gulf of Thailand are expected and people living along the coast are warned of high waves pounding the shoreline.

Fishermen are advised to be cautious and small boats should stay tied ashore.—*Xinhua*

## Five new members join UN Security Council

UNITED NATIONS, 2 Jan—Azerbaijan, Guatemala, Morocco, Pakistan and Togo, the five new non-permanent members of the 15-nation UN Security Council, on Sunday began to serve their two-year terms.

The five new Council members were elected by the UN General Assembly in October 2011.

The five represent different geographical groups — three from Africa and the Asia-Pacific Region, one from Eastern Europe, and one from Latin America and the Caribbean.

Lebanon, Nigeria, Gabon, Bosnia and Brazil are ending their terms on

the Council on Sunday. The five temporary members that will remain through 2012 are Colombia, Germany, India, Portugal and South Africa.

Under the UN Charter, the Security Council, the most powerful UN body, has the primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security.

The Council has 15 members: five permanent — China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom and the United States — and 10 elected by the UN General Assembly for two-year terms.

Each member has one vote. Decisions on

procedural matters are made by an affirmative vote of at least nine of the 15 members. Decisions on substantive matters require nine votes and the absence of a negative vote by any of the five permanent members.

Under Article 25 of the UN Charter, all members of the United Nations agree to accept and carry out the decisions of the Security Council. While other organs of the United Nations make recommendations to member states, the Council alone has the power to take decisions which member states are obliged under the Charter to implement.

## Blues guitarist DeGennaro killed

BRISTOL TOWNSHIP, 2 Jan—Authorities were looking for whoever shot and killed blues guitarist Daniel DeGennaro in suburban Philadelphia. The 56-year-old musician and songwriter was found with a fatal shotgun wound to his chest Wednesday night near the front door of his home, The Philadelphia Inquirer reported. Bucks County authorities ruled the death a homicide Friday, the newspaper said.

"We don't believe it was a random attack," prosecutor David W. Heckler said. "But there are a number of avenues of investigation to pursue. We have a number of layers of things to look at."

Nick Wilson, who lives near DeGennaro's house in Bristol Township's Levittown community, said he called authorities after a tenant living in DeGennaro's basement showed up at his door in a panic.

"The house looked like

it was robbed, and someone got hurt really bad," Wilson said. Investigators said they questioned the renter and do not consider him a suspect, the Inquirer said. They said none of several guns removed from the residence were believed to have been used to kill DeGennaro.

Bob Settelen, a friend and vice president of the

Bucks County Blues Society, described DeGennaro, who had toured with Kingfish and also was known as Danny Rio, as "an incredible musician."

According to his Web site, DeGennaro had also performed with Bo Diddley and the late E Street Band saxophonist Clarence Clemons.—*Internet*

**Chile detains tourist suspected  
of causing park fire**

SANTIAGO, 2 Jan—Officials in Chile say they have detained an Israeli tourist they suspect of having caused a forest fire in a nature reserve in Patagonia. An expanse of pristine forest 110 sq km (27,000 acres) large has already burned in the Torres del Paine national park. Hundreds of firefighters continue to fight the blaze, which is believed to have been sparked by a camp fire.

Torres del Paine is one of the country's most popular parks, visited by more than 100,000 people a year. Local prosecutor Juan Melendez said that the 23-year-old Israeli had been arrested on suspicion of causing the fire through negligence. Four hundred tourists were evacuated from Torres del Paine on Thursday as fire-

fighters failed to stem the blaze. Chilean President Sebastian Pinera said it could take weeks to bring the fire under control. The head of Chile's national emergency service, Vicente Nunez, called the situation "an extreme scenario, mainly due to topography, strong winds and highly combustible vegetation".

In 2005, a campfire started by a backpacker destroyed 160 sq kms (40,000 acres) of the nature preserve. President Pinera said the ministers of agriculture and the environment would travel to Patagonia to personally oversee the firefighting efforts. The president also said the number of military personnel deployed to fight the blaze would be raised to 450.

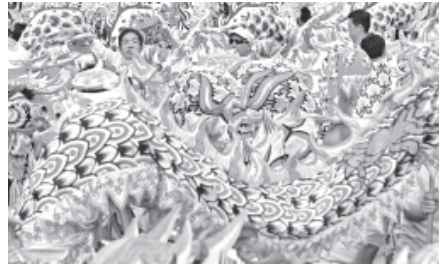

**Mt Rainier ranger slain, suspect  
at large**

SEATTLE, 2 Jan—A manhunt was under way Sunday for a gunman who killed a park ranger in Mount Rainier National Park in Washington state, authorities said. Officials said Park Ranger Margaret Anderson was fatally wounded about a mile south of Paradise about 10:30 am after placing her car as a roadblock to stop a car that fled when other park rangers tried to pull it over for a routine traffic stop on a road near Longmire, *The Seattle Times* reported. "He just jumped out and shot her," park spokeswoman Lee Taylorsaid. The killer, who was armed with a rifle, escaped on foot. The 34-year-old ranger was a mother of two who was married to another park ranger, the newspaper said.

Park officials said about 86 park visitors and about 20 employees were locked down at a visitors center Paradise because of the shooting. "It's really not safe right now," Taylor told the *Times*. "We've got a guy on the loose with a gun and he's obviously willing to use it."—Internet

**Monkey-nappers break into San Francisco  
Zoo and snatch Banana Sam**

SAN FRANCISCO, 2 Jan — Thieves broke into San Francisco Zoo and snatched its beloved squirrel monkey; Banana Sam. The monkey-snatchers cut two holes into the metal mesh of the squirrel monkey enclosure and took the foot tall, two-pound animal on Thursday. The zoo is offering a \$1,000 reward for Banana Sam's safe return. Investigators believe someone stole the animal late on Thursday, San Francisco police Sgt

Michael Andraychak said.

"It was apparent someone broke into the zoo and deliberately took the animal, we believe somebody has him," Andraychak said. Zoo officials discovered Banana Sam was missing when they arrived at work on Friday morning. The zoo said the thieves cut a back perimeter gate and made it to the top of a roof that houses five other primate exhibits. The zoo, which keeps about 20 squirrel monkeys, said it is concerned on many fronts. First, Banana Sam requires a special diet to

survive and is older.

Also, while squirrel monkeys are not large animals, they have sharp teeth and will bite if provoked. "This was a criminal act of vandalism and trespassing and we are working with the police to identify the perpetrators," said Tanya Peterson, president and executive director of the San Francisco Zoological Society. News of the stolen monkey spread quickly on the Internet Friday, and someone set up a fake Twitter account 'tracking' the alleged whereabouts of Banana Sam.—Internet

**Man critical after contracting first case of rabies in  
Massachusetts in 75 years after being 'bitten by infected bat'**

BOSTON, 2 Jan— A Boston man is fighting for his life after contracting human rabies - the first case in Massachusetts in

more than 75 years.

It is believed the victim, who is in his 60s and from Cape Cod, may have been bitten by a rabid bat in his home. The man, who has not been identified, is in a critical condition and state public health officials say the chances of him surviving the

highly deadly disease are poor.

"It is not clear how the man was infected, but there was evidence that he may have been exposed to a rabid bat, said Dr Al DeMaria, medical director of the state's Bureau of Infectious Disease.

**Fracking  
wastewater  
might have  
caused  
Ohio quake**

MCDONALD, 2 Jan—Officials said on Saturday they believe the latest earthquake activity in northeast Ohio is related to the injection of wastewater into the ground near a fault line, creating enough pressure to cause seismic activity.

The brine wastewater comes from drilling operations that use the so-called fracking process to extract gas from underground shale. But Ohio Department of Natural Resources Director Jim Zehringer said during a news teleconference that fracking is not causing the quakes.

"The seismic events are not a direct result of fracking," he said.

Environmentalists and property owners who live near gas drilling wells have questioned the safety of fracking to the environment and public health. Federal regulators have declared the technology safe, however. Mr Zehringer said four injection wells within a five-mile radius of an already shuttered well in Youngstown, Ohio will remain inactive while further scientific research is conducted.

### Lost ring found growing around carrot

A Swedish woman has discovered her wedding ring on a carrot growing in her garden, 16 years after she lost it, says a newspaper. Lena Paahlsson had long ago lost hope of finding the ring, which she designed herself, reports *Dagens Nyheter*. The white-gold band, set with seven small diamonds, went missing in her kitchen in 1995, she told the paper. Although the ring no longer fits, she hopes to have it enlarged so she can wear it again.

Mrs Paahlsson and her family live on a farm near Mora in central Sweden. She took the ring off to do some Christmas baking with her daughters, but it disappeared from the work surface where it had been left, she explained to *Dagens Nyheter*. The family searched everywhere and years later took up the tiling on the floor during renovations, in the hope of finding the ring. It was not until 16 years later when Mrs Paahlsson was pulling up carrots in her garden that she noticed one with the gold band fastened tightly around it.

"The carrot was sprouting in the middle of the ring. It is quite incredible," her husband Ola said to the newspaper. The couple believe the ring fell into a sink back in 1995 and was lost in vegetable peelings that were turned into compost or fed to their sheep. "I had given up hope," Mrs Paahlsson told *Dagens Nyheter*, adding that she wanted to have the ring adjusted to fit her. "Now that I have found the ring again I want to be able to use it," she said.

### Woman arrested in pink paint attack on ex

A Florida woman was arrested after allegedly throwing pink paint on her ex-boyfriend and his car at the parking lot where he works, police said.

Hallandale police said Tasha Franklin, 25, of Hollywood, and her ex-boyfriend split up in July, but she showed up at the parking lot where he works a few days before Christmas and threw pink paint on the man and his car before dipping her own hand in paint and leaving an imprint on his front seat, the *South Florida Sun Sentinel* reported Friday. Investigators said Franklin then bit her ex on the arm, leaving an imprint of her teeth. Franklin was charged with dating battery, burglary of the victim's car and criminal mischief.



### Michigan's longest-serving nurse retires

A woman believed to be Michigan's longest-serving nurse has announced her retirement only one month prior to her 90th birthday.

Dorothea Canty, who became a nurse near the start of World War II and was recognized by the state Legislature in 2007 as Michigan's longest-serving nurse, said she completed her final shift Thursday at Dr Alan Bolton's obstetrics/gynecology practice in Berkley, the *Detroit Free Press* reported Friday. "My husband always said, 'Just say the word 'go' to Dorothea, and she's already gone,'" Canty said.

Canty said she retired once before, in 1984, but her retirement quickly ended when Bolton asked her to work for a few days, which turned into years. "Don't tell them," Canty said, "but I'm not giving back the office keys just yet."

### Injured man stole ambulance

Police in Florida said they arrested an injured man accused of stealing an ambulance while it was on a call to drive himself to the hospital.

Tampa police said medical personnel from ambulance #41, which belongs to Transcare Ambulance Co, were in a home on a call shortly before 10:30 pm Thursday when they heard a vehicle's engine start and looked outside to see a man drive away in the ambulance, the *Tampa Bay Tribune* reported Friday.

Police tracked the vehicle via its GPS system and stopped the ambulance at North Tampa Street and East 26th Avenue.

The man, Hubert Lee Credit, 39, was arrested on charges of auto burglary and grand theft auto.

"I got beat up by four guys," a police report quotes Credit as saying. "I saw the ambulance and I was going to drive myself to the hospital."

Credit was treated for a puncture wound to the head at Tampa General Hospital.

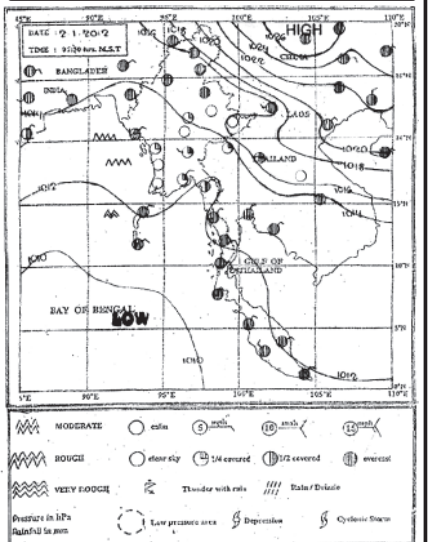

**Wave of pirated eBooks may hit Kindle profits**

LONDON, 2 Jan—Pirated e-books, which can be downloaded for free, have sparked fears of adversely affecting profits of makers like Amazon, which produces Kindle.

Creating pirate copies of published books is simple and can be done using a computer and a scanner in a comparatively short duration of time.

The pirates have developed software, which people can download to their home computers to convert these pages into images that can be read on a Kindle or similar device, the *Daily Mail* reported.

"With a Kindle there is pretty much no protection against pirated books. There are programs which can simply convert any piece of text into the proper format and it will show on your Kindle as if you had bought it!" one of the pirate websites said.

It is estimated that up to 20 per cent of e-book downloads are from pirate sites. Publishers are in talks with the Government and Google to find ways to bring an end to this trade, which breaches their copyright.

They have asked Google to demote pirate websites to make certain they do not appear at the top of web searches for consumers looking to find free e-books.

Even the internet service providers are being pressurized to shut down pirate websites. (ANI)

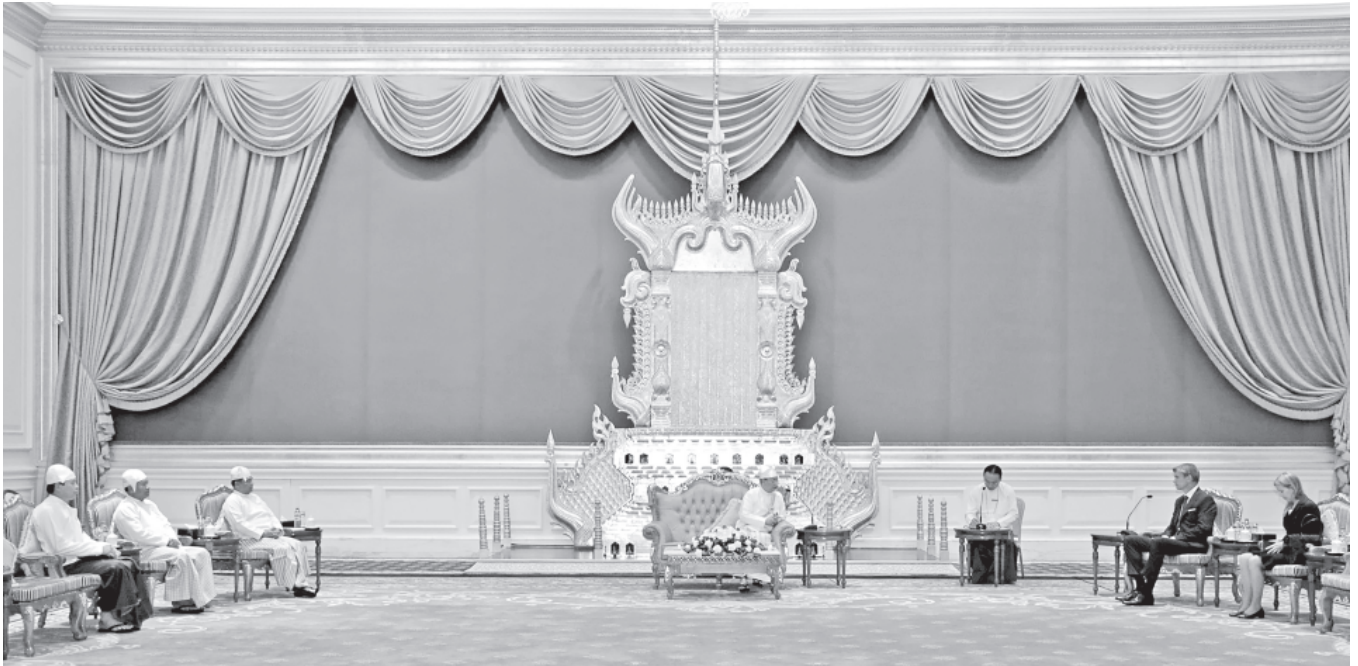
