An old grandma was found on a bench by Yangon-Insein Road, with some small notes clenched in her hands and tears welling up in her eyes. When I inquired about her believing she is no beggar, I began to learn that she is an old woman taking care of a paralyzed vagabond. For the sake of two empty bellies, she is finding generous donors for food on roads in her ripe age. How many similar stories are there?

The same day I was taken aback by the news that "Singapore will need almost four times the number of people to work in elder care sector". A ministerial committee was formed in Singapore for elder care and homes for the aged were established. The article says the country is planning to increase the number of workers in this sector from 4000 to 10000. Being a developed country, Singapore could make the move. Myanmar should try to provide more care to such homeless older persons as well.

NGOs alone are taking care of the aged in Myanmar with strict rules and there may be many old tramps beyond the rules. Social organizations should throw themselves into the elder care sector.

The later life is the most important of all three phases of life. However much struggles they have come across in the younger life, it is important to own a life of ease in the advanced age. The grassroots have to struggle only to fill bellies while young and end up being destitute in the great age.

Caring the elderly facing difficulties is a meritorious deed by any religion. The Lord Buddha taught His disciples to nurse the sick rather than Himself. Care of old and sick persons is a noble social service.

The new administration takes care of the old retirees by doubling pension rates. Wellwishers and social organizations are helping the elderly who remain in deep trouble in their own ways.

We should make a vow to help the destitute elderly spend the remainder of their lives comfortably.

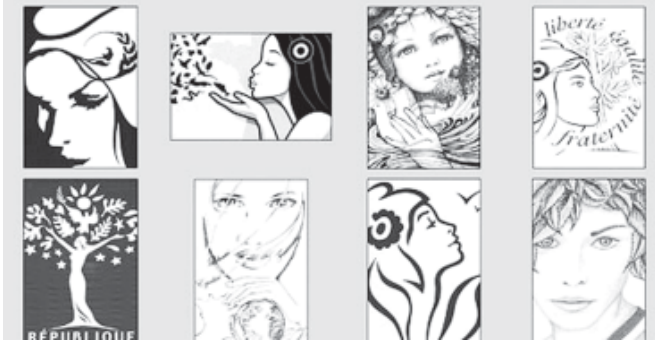

## The beginning of the end for the mademoiselle?

PARIS, 12 Jan — A town in Western France has banned the word “mademoiselle” — the French equivalent of “miss”. The move comes as feminist groups campaign for the word to be consigned to the dustbin of history everywhere.

Could its days be numbered? There are no longer any “mademoiselles” in the town of Cesson-Sevigne. The small Brittany community has banned the use of the term in all its official documents, arguing that women, like men, should not be defined by their marital status. From now on, teenagers, greying grandmothers and 30-something career girls there will all be known as “madame”, just as men of all ages become “monsieur” as soon as they grow out of shorts. The Germans waved goodbye to their “fraulein” in 1972. In

the English-speaking world the use of “Miss” is in decline — and on occasions when an honorific is required, “Ms” provides a convenient way of avoiding being pigeonholed as either “Miss” or “Mrs”.

But in France— just as in Spain with their “senorita” and Italy with their “signorina” — things are a bit different. “Madame” or

“mademoiselle” can even be used to address someone in the absence of a name — “Would Madame care to be shown round the church?” a verger asks. *Flaubert’s Madame Bovary.*

These forms of address are not just about formality and respect, but also about flirtation and familiarity. *Doyennes of the stage and screen* retain their

“mademoiselle” status, regardless of how long in the tooth they are. Waiters can gently flatter a lady of a certain age by calling her “mademoiselle”, and officials can patronise by refusing to call a woman “madame”. But for the mayor of Cesson-Sevigne, Michel Bihan, the key thing is eliminating “discrimination”.—*Internet*

## US condemns bomb attack on Iran nuclear scientist

WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — The US has condemned the killing of an Iranian nuclear scientist in a car bomb attack in north Teheran. National Security Council spokesman Tommy Vietor said the US “had absolutely nothing to do” with the attack. Mostafa Ahmadi-Roshan, who worked at the Natanz uranium enrichment facility, died along with the driver of the car. years, with Iran blaming Israel and the US. Both deny any involvement.

Washington and its allies suspect Teheran of secretly trying to develop a nuclear weapons capacity but Iran insists its nuclear programme is peaceful. “The United States had absolutely nothing to do with this. We strongly condemn all acts of violence, including acts of violence like this,” said Mr Vietor. Iran’s Atomic Energy Organization described the killings as “a heinous act”.

Iranian Vice-President Mohammad Reza Rahimi said on state TV that the bomb attack would not stop “progress” in the country’s nuclear programme. Mr Ahmadi-Roshan, 32,

was a university lecturer who supervised a department at the Natanz plant, the semi-official news agency *Fars* reported. Iranian officials said two men on a motorcycle attached a magnetic bomb to his car during the morning rush hour and detonated it outside a university campus. Mr Ahmadi-Roshan died immediately while his driver died later of his wounds, *Fars* reported. A third occupant of the Peugeot 405 was injured and taken to hospital. The blast left debris hanging in nearby trees. Iran says the attack was similar to the killings of three other scientists over the past two years.—*Internet*

## US military moves carriers, denies Iran link

WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — The US military said on Wednesday that a new aircraft carrier strike group had arrived in the Arabian Sea and that another was on its way to the region, but denied any link to recent tensions with Iran and portrayed the movements as routine. The shift in the powerful US naval assets comes at a moment of heightened tensions with Iran, which has threatened to close the Strait of Hormuz — the world’s most important oil shipping lane — if US and EU sanctions over its nuclear programme cut off its oil exports.

The US military has said it will halt any blockade of the strategic strait and the top US naval officer acknowledged on Tuesday that preparing for a potential conflict there was something that “keeps me awake at night.” Still, the Pentagon denied any direct link between recent tensions and the movement of aircraft carriers. “I don’t want to leave anybody with the impression that we’re somehow (speeding) two carriers over there because we’re concerned about what happened, you know, today in Iran. It’s just not the case,” said Captain John Kirby, a

Pentagon spokesman. Military officials said the *USS Carl Vinson* arrived in the Arabian Sea on Monday to replace the outgoing *USS John C. Stennis* carrier strike group, which Iran last week warned not to return to the Gulf after departing in late December. The *Stennis* was due to return to its home port in San Diego but the Pentagon did not say when that would happen. Another carrier strike group, led by the aircraft carrier *USS Abraham Lincoln*, concluded a port visit to Thailand on Tuesday and was now in the Indian Ocean.—*MNA/Reuters*

## Kim Jong Il’s body to be permanently displayed

SEOUL, 12 Jan — North Korea says late leader Kim Jong Il’s body will be permanently laid in state in a memorial palace in the capital.

Kim’s body will be displayed at Pyongyang’s Kumsusan Memorial Palace, where the embalmed body of his father — North Korea founder Kim Il Sung — has been lying since 1995. He died in 1994.

North Korea has sought to show Kim Jong Il’s son and successor, Kim Jong Un, as firmly in control since his father died of a heart attack on 17 December.

The official *Korean Central News Agency* said Thursday that North Korea will also erect a Kim Jong Il statue, set up portraits of Kim and build “towers to his immortality” across the country.

## 47,515 Killed in drug violence in Mexico from 2006 to 2011

MEXICO CITY, 12 Jan — A total of 47,515 people were killed in drug related crimes from December 2006 to September 2011 in Mexico, the Attorney General’s Office announced on Wednesday.

The office said the death toll in the first nine months of 2011 was 12,903, an increase of 11 percent compared with the same period in 2010, which registered 11,583 deaths in drug violence.

The most violent month in 2011 was April when 1,630 people were killed. The most violent Mexican city last year was

again Ciudad Juarez, which borders the United States.

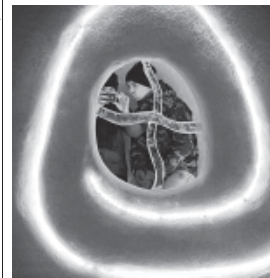
Due to the dispute between the drug cartels of Sinaloa and Juarez, the city witnessed 1,206 killings in the first nine months of last year.

The resort city of Acapulco ranked second with 795 deaths linked to organized drug crimes, which was followed by the northern cities of Toluca (476), Monterrey (399), Durango (390), Culiacan (365) and San Fernando (292).

## New cream could treat cancer without surgery

ROME, 12 Jan—Italian scientists have discovered a painless, non-surgical skin cancer treatment using radioactive cream that could treat cancer in as little as two hours. According to media reports in recent days, the breakthrough treatment was tested on 700 patients with basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma, less aggressive forms of skin cancer, with a success rate of 95 percent after one to three treatments.

While basal cell carcinoma — caused by exposure to harmful UV rays — accounts for about 80 percent of skin cancer cases, it isn't metastatic, meaning it doesn't spread to other

organs in the body.

But treatment usually requires surgery that can leave scars, particularly problematic on the face.

While trials are currently being held in Germany and Australia, researchers believe that the cream could be available for market within two years. Other nonsurgical treatments already used to treat skin cancer is a light-induced technique called photodynamic therapy (PDT), in which chemical cream is applied to the skin cancer tumor. The *Guardian* in the UK reports that it is usually spread for lumps that do not penetrate too deeply into the skin.—*Internet*

## Fake data behind red wine benefit claims, experts allege

HARTFORD, 12 Jan—A US university says a researcher known for his work on red wine's benefits to cardiovascular health falsified his data in more than 100 instances.

Nearly a dozen scientific journals are being warned of the potential problems after publishing the University of Connecticut professor's studies. University officials say dismissal proceedings have started against Dipak Das, director of the UConn Health Centre's Cardiovascular Research Centre.

UConn says it started investigating Das' work after receiving an anonymous complaint of potential irregularities in his research, and that it found 145 instances of fabricated, falsified and manipulated data. Das has gained attention for research into an ingredient in red wine that's shown potential for promoting health, though the university did not say whether the falsifications occurred in research on that topic. Das could not immediately be reached for comment.—*Internet*

## Health Tip: When your child cries at night

Though it's tempting for parents to run to their child at the slightest cry during the night, experts say that's not always the best reaction. The American Academy of Pediatrics offers these suggestions for when your child cries at bedtime:

- \* Wait a few minutes before responding; if the crying continues, wait longer each time before you respond to the cries.

- \* Offer reassurance that you're there, but don't play, linger or turn on a light if you do enter the room.

- \* Each time you enter the room, stay a little farther from the bed; eventually, reassure your child without entering the room.

- \* When your child calls for you, offer a gentle reminder that it's time to go to sleep.—*Internet*

## Nicotine patches may not help smokers quit

BOSTON, 12 Jan—Nicotine patches and nicotine gum do not appear to be effective in helping smokers quit long-term, US researchers say. Lead author Hillel Alpert, research scientist at Harvard School of Public Health, and co-author Lois Biener of the University of Massachusetts Boston's Centre for Survey Research, tracked 787 adults in Massachusetts who had recently quit smoking.

The participants were surveyed during three time periods — 2001-2002, 2003-2004 and 2005-2006 — and asked whether they used a nicotine replacement therapy in the form of the nicotine patch, nicotine gum, nicotine inhaler or nasal spray.

The results, published in *Tobacco Control*, showed almost one-third of recent quitters reported to have relapsed during each time period — and there was no difference in the relapse

rate among those who used nicotine replacement therapy for more than six weeks, with or without professional counseling, and that of smokers who did not use nicotine replacement therapy. In addition, no difference in quitting success with use of nicotine replacement therapy was found for either heavy or light smokers.

"This study shows that using nicotine replacement therapy is no more effective in helping people stop smoking cigarettes in the long-term than trying to quit on one's own," Alpert said in a statement.

Even though clinical trials found nicotine replacement therapy to be effective, the new findings demonstrate the importance of empirical studies regarding effectiveness when used in the general population, Alpert said.—*Internet*

## Infosys net up 33 percent in third quarter

BANGALORE, 12 Jan—Infosys Ltd posted net profit of Rs.2,372 crore (Rs.23.7 billion) for the third quarter (October-December) of this fiscal (2011-12), registering a record 33 percent year-on-year (YoY) growth as per the Indian accounting standard.

In a regulatory filing Thursday, the IT bellwether said its consolidated revenues for the quarter (Q3) under review increased to Rs.9,298 crore (Rs.92.98 billion), posting 31 percent YoY.

Under the International Financial Regulatory System (IFRS), net income grew 15 percent YoY to USD 458 million and gross income to USD 1.81 billion, up 14 percent YoY for the third quarter.—*Internet*

## Samsung launches new tablet in Indian market

BANGALORE, 12 Jan—Global consumer electronics major Samsung Wednesday launched in the Indian market its next-generation tablet Galaxy Tab 620, with a 1.2GHz dual core processor and Android Honeycomb 3.2 operating system.

"Our latest tablet will enable customers to manage their work and life while on the move. Value added features of Galaxy Tab will offer faster browsing, downloading and transmission," Samsung Electronics Ltd head Ranjit Yadav said in a statement here.

Besides content viewing and gaming, users can download movies and songs and surf the web with high data speeds of 21Mbps (megabits per second) "The new tablet can download a 1GB (gigabit) movie in 6.5 minutes and a 1.5MB (megabit) photo in one minute. Similarly, a 10MB music file can be transmitted in one second through a 40MHz channel," Yadav asserted.

Priced at Rs.30,250 and weighing 345 gm, the tablet is one of the lightest in its

category. At 9.96mm, its sleek design makes it convenient to carry.

With integrated communication service, users can aggregate contacts, calendar and email with instant messaging and social networking service (SNS). Contacts can be synched with online portals and social networks and manage schedules and events from multiple accounts.

"The tablet's Android operating system (OS) provides a greater user experience with a compatibility zoom for non-tablet sized applications," Yadav added.

The USD 136-billion Korean multinational is a global leader in semiconductors (chips), telecom, digital media and digital convergence technologies. It employs about 190,000 people in 206 offices across 68 countries, including India.

## 2012 oil price to be about 100 USD per barrel

HOUSTON, 12 Jan—The price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil is expected to be about 100 US dollars per barrel in 2012, five dollars per barrel higher than the average price in 2011, the US Energy Information Administration (EIA) said Tuesday.

The EIA, a unit of the US Department of Energy, said in its monthly report that it also expects WTI to continue rising, reaching 106 per barrel in the fourth quarter of 2013.

The forecasts represent an increase of oil price prices from last year, when WTI averaged 94.86 dollars a barrel, according to the EIA. WTI, also known as Texas light sweet, is a grade of crude oil used as a benchmark in oil pricing, alongside the price of Brent crude from the North Sea.

The forecast said that US real gross domestic product grows by 1.8 percent in 2012 and 2.5 percent in 2013, while world real GDP (weighted by oil consumption) grows by 2.9 percent and 3.8 percent in 2012 and 2013 respectively, the EIA said.—*Xinhua*

## Canaveral has busy 2012 launch schedule

CAPE CANAVERAL, (Fla), 12 Jan—The director of Florida's Cape Canaveral rocket range says a busy 2012 launch schedule is proof there's life after the end of NASA's shuttle programme.

A dozen launches from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station are set for the coming months, including missions critical to the International Space Station, *Florida Today* reported Wednesday.

"We are alive and well, and we are in business here in Central Florida," said Brig. Gen. Anthony Cotton, commander of the Air Force

45th Space Wing.

Cotton is director Cape Canaveral's Eastern Range, the nation's main rocket-launching region.

"With the exception of the month of March, there is something going on at the cape throughout the year," he said.

## Astronomers find smallest planets yet

PASADENA, (Calif), 12 Jan—US astronomers say three of the smallest planets ever detected outside the solar system have been discovered orbiting around a single star.

The three planets are smaller than Earth and appear to be rocky with a solid surface, the team of astronomers, led by scientists at the California Institute of Technology, says.

Until now, astronomers have found at most only four other rocky planets, also called terrestrial planets, around other stars, a Caltech release said Wednesday.

While the new planets are too close to the star to be in its habitable zone — the narrow region around a star

where the temperature is mild enough for liquid water, and possibly life, to exist — the planets are the first rocky ones to be found orbiting a type of dim, small star called a red dwarf, the most common type of star in the Milky Way.

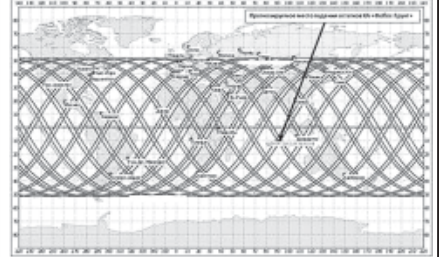
That suggests our galaxy could be teeming with similarly rocky planets, with the possibility that many are in the habitable zone, astronomers said.

"Red dwarfs make up eight out of every ten stars in the galaxy," Caltech astronomy Professor John Johnson said. "That boosts the chances of other life being in the universe — that's the ultimate result here."—*Internet*

## Russia's Mars probe may fall into Indian Ocean on Sunday

Moscow, 12 Jan—Russia's failed Mars probe Phobos-Grunt may fall into the Indian Ocean during daytime on Sunday, Russia's Federal Space Agency Roscosmos said Wednesday. According to a statement posted on its website, Roscosmos said the debris of the interplanetary spacecraft may hit the Earth during 14-16 Jan, most probably at 13:18 Moscow time (0918 GMT) on 15 Jan. "The approximate location where the debris will fall is between latitude 10 degrees South and longitude 90 degrees East," Roscosmos said. As of Wednesday, the Phobos-Grunt's maximum distance to the Earth was about 204 km. "The location and time (of the probe's falling) are to be adjusted during its descent," Roscosmos said.

The space agency added that some 200 kilograms of the Phobos-Grunt's fragments may fall onto the Earth, while other fragments of the probe would burn down in the dense layer of the atmosphere at an altitude of approximately 100 km. Roscosmos confirmed in November that the Phobos-Grunt probe carrying China's *Yinghuo-1* satellite, which was launched on 9 Nov, failed to reach the intended orbit, as the vehicle has not used its own booster to reach the designated flying orbit as scheduled.—*MNA/Xinhua*

## Gadget Watch: HP Envy 14 PC has smart-tag sensor

LAS VEGAS, 12 Jan—Thin, light laptops — known as "ultrabooks" — are a much-hyped category at this year's International Consumer Electronics Show, an annual showcase for the latest smartphones, tablet computers and other consumer-electronic devices.

Deep-pocketed chipmaker Intel Corp created the term to push PC makers to make laptops that are more like Apple's MacBook Air, and help them market them. Practically every PC maker is showing off at least one ultrabook at the show. Hewlett-Packard Co is talking up its own ultrabook, dubbed the HP Envy 14 Spectre, this week. The HP model has a few features that set it apart.

**WHY IT'S HOT:** HP's Envy includes a sensor for Near-Field Communications, the radio standard used by security cards and so-called "smart tags," which are small chips with flat, stamp-sized radio antennas. That means that it can read information from NFC tags and upcoming smartphone models when they're bumped against the laptop. For instance, a promotional flyer might include a tag with a special Web address that appears on-screen when touched to the laptop.

**THE UPSIDE:** There's a movement to make NFC the basis for tomorrow's payment cards, and to build NFC into smartphones. That means someone with an NFC-enabled laptop could, in the future, pay securely for an online purchase by tapping a payment card to the computer. Intel Corp demonstrated this procedure at a Press conference at the show, with a prototype laptop.

**THE DOWNSIDE:** The Envy's NFC capability may never progress beyond the ability to grab Web addresses from phones and promotional materials. The business relationships and networks needed to make NFC-enabled payments ubiquitous have been slow to emerge, as many different players are jockeying for position.

IDC analyst Williams Stofega said NFC has a lot of potential as part of the trend of "tangible computing" — getting the things around us to talk to each other intelligently, to make our lives easier. But the lack of standards is a big obstacle. "If NFC is not integrated with everything else, it's going to die," Stofega said.

with super-fast "solid state" hard drives. It includes a chip that can communicate wirelessly with some stereo headphones, with an audio quality that's much better than Bluetooth. The Envy is also covered in scratch-resistant glass.

## World's first wind-up tablet introduced

LAS VEGAS, 12 Jan—A US group aiming to bring low-cost computing to the developing world says it wants to put a tablet computer into the hands of the world's poorest children.

One Laptop Per Child introduced what it says is the world's first wind-up tablet computer at the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas, *NewScientist.com* reported on Wednesday.

The organization's XO 3.0 laptop has an 8-inch

touchscreen and is designed for outdoor use, sporting a rugged green rubber case.

Running either Android or Linux software, the XO 3.0 can be powered by a hand crank, a built-in solar panel or a regular power adaptor. Spinning the crank for 6 minutes creates 2 watts of power, sufficient to run the low-energy tablet for about an hour, OLPC said.

While OLPC's long-standing aim is to produce a computer for \$100 it has yet

## Apple to hold event in New York on 19 Jan, hardware launch not expected

NEW YORK, 12 Jan—Apple has sent out invitations for a media event to be held in New York City on 19 January. But banish from your mind images of CEO Tim Cook strutting around a stage holding aloft the iPad 2 successor or iPhone 5—the tagline on the invitation reads, "Join us for an education announcement in the Big Apple."

According to *AppleInsider*, the event is rumored to involve the announcement of improvements to the iBooks platform, possibly connected to education and digital book publishing. The launch of some piece of new hardware is not expected.

Unnamed sources have told All Things Digital's John Paczkowski that the Cupertino company will be using the event "to talk about a textbook initiative" that could be "related to iBooks in education, presumably with some sort of tie-in to iTunes U." iTunes U is part of Apple's iTunes store and features more than 150,000 free educational media files from universities and cultural institutions around the world. However, All Things Digital also reports that none of the major textbook publishers are known to be working with Apple's iBooks platform or iOS at this time.—*Internet*

## South Africa loses eight rhinos in one day

JOHANNESBURG, 12 Jan— South African rangers say they have found eight dead rhinos that had been stripped of their horns, an unprecedented one-day toll. Reynold Thakhuli, South African National Parks spokesman, said rangers found the rhinoceros carcasses Tuesday at two sites in Kruger, the country's flagship national park. Thakhuli said Wednesday, "This is the first time that we've had so many in one day, and it's really a concern

for us." Thakhuli says 448 rhinos were poached across South Africa in 2011, a record loss. The eight found Tuesday were the first recorded deaths for 2012. An Asian economic boom in recent years is believed to be behind the spike in poaching, with a growing middle class in countries like China and Vietnam able to afford exotic purported remedies like powdered rhino horn. *Internet*

## World's smallest vertebrate creature named

NEW YORK, 12 Jan— An article on Wednesday in the journal *PLoS One* named *Paedophryne amanuensis* as the world's smallest animal with a spine. The adult frogs are about three-tenths of an inch long, and a millimetre or so smaller than a carp found on the Indonesian island of Sumatra.

The frogs are so small that Louisiana State University herpetologist and environmental biologist Christopher Austin had to enlarge close-up photos to describe them.

But the males of a species of deep-sea anglerfish are about 2mm smaller, said

University of Washington ichthyologist Theodore Pietsch, who described them in 2006. The males don't have stomachs and live as parasites on 1.8-inch (4.57-centimetre)-long females. Mr Austin discovered the tiny frogs — along with another small frog species — in August 2009 while on a trip to Papua New Guinea to study the

extreme diversity of the island's wildlife. He said he knew about the anglerfish but felt that average species size made more sense for comparison.

Steven J Beaupre, a University of Arkansas scientist and president-elect of the American Society of Ichthyologists and Herpetologists, said many vertebrates have males and females of very different sizes, "so it is reasonable that the world's smallest vertebrate may end up being either the males or the females of some specific fish or amphibian species." *Internet*

## Vietnamese crewmen killed in Antarctic ship fire

WELLINGTON, 12 Jan — Three Vietnamese crewmen died when a South Korean fishing boat caught fire in Antarctica, New Zealand officials confirmed, as a US vessel treated seven injured sailors. Maritime New Zealand (MNZ) said the men did not make it out of the Jeong Woo 2's accommodation area when

the fire started. The incident happened 3,700km (2,000 miles) from New Zealand on Wednesday. Seven injured men are being taken to an Antarctic base.

MNZ said of the seven — who are all Vietnamese and Indonesian — three men had serious injuries. They are on board the American research vessel Nathaniel B Palmer,

which reached the burning boat on Wednesday. The US vessel is now making its way to the US McMurdo Antarctic base, located about 600km (375 miles) away. The injured men are scheduled to be evacuated to a hospital in Christchurch, New Zealand once they reach the base.

New Zealand officials report that the Jeong Woo 2 is still ablaze and there are plans for her sister ship Jeong Woo 3 to tow the boat out of Antarctic waters to minimise the impact on the environment.

The cause of the fire will be determined by Korean maritime authorities. The Jeong Woo 2 was built in Japan and is registered in Busan, South Korea, according to the *Associated Press* news agency. *Internet*

## Cheetah seized at Heathrow Airport by UK Border Agency

LONDON, 12 Jan — A cheetah has been stopped at London's Heathrow Airport by border officials who were suspicious about the animal's missing identity microchip. The African cheetah, called Isaac, was on his way from a South African safari park to Russia when he was seized. He is being kept in the UK until it is known why his microchip was missing, the UK Border Agency said. The agency said all endangered animals had to be clearly identifiable by a unique marking to be allowed to travel.

The markings are used to tackle the trade in illegal animals and stop smugglers cheating the system. Transporting endangered animals without microchips is a breach of the Convention in International Trade in Endangered Species. Marc Owen, head of UK Border Agency operations at Heathrow, said: "The illicit trade in animals is a serious contributory factor in the threat of extinction faced by many endangered species, and that is why the rules around moving them are so strict."

"Each animal has to be clearly identifiable by a unique marking, for instance a microchip, to ensure they can be tracked and traced, and

to prevent them being sold illegally. "At this stage we do not know whether this was simply an error or whether there were other reasons for it." He said that Isaac was in good health and would be kept at a UK wildlife park while investigations continued. ## Apple's Steve Jobs immortalized in comic

NEW YORK, 12 Jan — A comic book documenting the life of Apple co-founder Steve Jobs has gone on sale in the US. It depicts the life of the technology mogul from his adoption as a baby to his unveiling of products such as the iPhone and iPad. The Silicon Valley icon, who has been described as the Michelangelo of the digital age, died in October at the age of 56 following a battle with pancreatic cancer.

Thor Parker, of Midtown Comics in New York, said: "The Steve Jobs comic is basically an overview of his whole life, kind of a short biography for someone that knows of him but doesn't know all the details. It really briefly hits on all the bigger points in his life." He added: "The artwork is pretty basic for a comic. You see a lot of

iconic images that are related to Steve Jobs. You see comic renditions of his *Forbes* magazine cover, a lot of his keynote addresses."

Comic book fans have given mixed reviews. One, Zane, told *Reuters*: "I think it's great. I think he's a interesting guy, interesting point of view in his life and in my opinion everything translates well into comics." But Michael said: "I think I

would rather read an autobiography about him than a comic book." The comic was produced by Bluewater Productions, which has previously given the same treatment to Facebook boss Mark Zuckerberg and celebrities such as Lady Gaga. Mr Jobs founded Apple in 1976 with Steve Wozniak and Ronald Wayne. *Internet*



## World heritage Mogao Grottoes receives record visitors in 2011

LANZHOU, 12 Jan — The renowned world heritage site Mogao Grottoes in northwest China's Gansu Province has reported record high visitor numbers for 2011.

One of the country's three major Buddhist art treasures, the Mogao Grottoes in Dunhuang received 680,000 tourists in 2011, up 23.6 percent from 550,000 in 2010, according to the Dunhuang Academy, which is in charge of the research, protection and management of the heritage site, in a statement on Wednesday. Tourist numbers fell in 2008 and 2009 due to the global financial crisis, but started to recover in 2010, according to the statement.— *Xinhua*

## Micro blogs keep travelers informed

BEIJING, 12 Jan — Railway agencies across the country are posting up-to-date information on their micro blogs to provide better service to passengers going home in the Spring Festival peak travel season. To date, 19 railway bureaus and 35 train stations have opened official micro blog accounts on Sina weibo, China's most popular micro-blogging website, to publish information on the Spring Festival travel rush.

"On our micro blog, we provide the train schedule,

the number of tickets available and other information that may affect passengers' travels, to give our followers the latest news," Tang Yizhi, an official who is responsible for the micro blog of Nanning Railway Bureau in the Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region, told *China Daily* on Tuesday. She added that if passengers lost their luggage in the railway station, they can also visit the micro blog to see whether there was any information about the luggage.

The bureau opened micro blog accounts on some big Web portals, including Sina and People.com.cn, at the end of 2010, and has attracted more than 700,000 followers.

"Our micro blog mainly targets people departing from or going to Nanning," Tang said, adding that the site got 50,000 additional followers before the Spring Festival rush this year. "We post railway information on times, but also answer our followers' questions," she said. *Xinhua*



## The Greek parents too poor to care for their children

ATHENS, 12 Jan — Greece's financial crisis has made some families so desperate they are giving up the most precious thing of all - their children. One morning a few weeks before Christmas a kindergarten teacher in Athens found a note about one of her four-year-old pupils. "I will not be coming to pick up Anna today because I cannot afford to look after her," it read. "Please take good care of her. Sorry. Her mother." In the last two months Father Antonios, a young Orthodox priest who runs a youth centre for the city's poor, has found four children on his doorstep - including a baby just days old. Another charity was approached by a couple whose twin babies were in hospital being treated for

malnutrition, because the mother herself was malnourished and unable to breastfeed. Cases like this are shocking a country where family ties are strong, and failure to look after children is socially unacceptable - they feel to Greeks like stories from the Third World, rather than their own capital city. One of the children cared for by Father Antonios is Natasha, a bright two-year-old brought to his centre by her mother a few weeks ago.

The woman said she was unemployed and homeless and needed help - but before staff could offer her support she had vanished, leaving her daughter behind. "Over the last year we have hundreds of cases of parents who want to leave their children with us - they know us and trust us,"

Father Antonios says. "They say they do not have any money or shelter or food for their kids, so they hope we might be able to provide them with what they need." Requests of this kind were not unknown before the crisis - but Father Antonios has never until now come across children being simply abandoned. — *Internet*

## Samsung's 'future-proof' voice-controlled television

LAS VEGAS, 12 Jan — A "smart" internet-connected television that has the ability to have its hardware upgraded every year has been unveiled by Samsung. It has an expansion slot allowing new kit to be added to boost processing performance and introduce new features. The innovation may help reassure shoppers concerned about their screen becoming outdated.

The move is aimed at helping the South Korean tech giant retain its lead as the world's best-selling TV maker. Samsung's president of consumer electronics, Boo-keun Yoon, unveiled the firm's flagship LED television at the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas noting that his firm currently sells two televisions every second. In addition to its "smart evolution capability" Samsung has also added gesture, voice and face recognition features to the ES8000 model.

A built-in camera allows users to browse the internet with a wave of their hand and to change channel by speaking in one of the more than 20 languages that the set can "understand". A facial recognition facility also allows the set to recognise users, pulling

up the relevant selection of their favourite apps. The device is the latest in a run of so-called Smart TVs launched by the firm since 2008.

Samsung is on course to hit a milestone of 20 million global TV app downloads before the end of January, said its president of consumer electronics America Tim Baxter. New apps announced at the trade show included Rovio's Angry Birds video game. Samsung also announced its users would be given free access to a new Angry Birds on-demand animated television channel, marking the latest evolution of the hit title. — *Internet*

## Can Hollywood's top dogs really act?

WASHINGTON, 12 Jan — Animals have been stealing scenes since movies began - but can Hollywood's top dogs really act or is it all down to clever training?

The Artist is being tipped to sweep the board at this year's Oscars - but there will be no Academy Award for one of the silent film's biggest stars. In fact, he will be lucky to get a pat on the head and a consoling bone to chew on.

Uggie is a nine-year-old Jack Russell terrier — and the Academy is famously sniffy when it comes to handing out prizes to animals. Lassie, Cheetah and Rin Tin Tin may have been among the biggest stars of their day - but not one of them ever gripped the famous gold statuette in their jaws.

The nearest a "non-human" performer has come to Oscar-night glory was in 1998, when Bart the Bear, a 1,480-pound Kodiak and star of films such as The Edge and Legends of the Fall, presented the Oscar for Best Achievement in Sound Effects Editing.

Fans of Uggie — who has already won the coveted Palm Dog at the Cannes film

festival for his performance as the faithful sidekick of a fading matinee idol — have launched a campaign on Twitter and Facebook for the Academy to recognise his talents. But the chances of this latest Doggie De Niro jumping the celluloid species barrier into the world of human acting honours appear remote.

The Academy appears to have had a downer on dogs since the first Oscar night in 1929 when, legend has it, German Shepherd Rin Tin Tin was voted best actor, only for the statue to be mysteriously handed to a human actor, Emil Jannings, instead.

Some think today's Hollywood establishment are no less wary of sharing the awards night spotlight with a furry rival. "There is a good chance that a certain number of serious thespians would be very offended to be on a stage with, say, a cute golden retriever who happened to make a very popular film," says author Susan Orlean, who is campaigning for Rin Tin Tin to be awarded a posthumous Oscar.

## Cayman vents are world's hottest

LONDON, 12 Jan — The world's deepest known volcanic vents are also the hottest, a UK-led expedition has indicated. The seafloor vents are located 5km below the surface of the Caribbean, in the Cayman Trough.

The researchers say the structures are shooting jets of mineral-rich water more than a kilometre into the ocean above. The vents' features suggest the water is warmer than 450C — hot enough to melt lead. are teeming with new species including a type of pale shrimp with a light sensing organ on its back.

Details of the research have been published in the journal *Nature Communications*. Researchers from the UK's National Oceanography Centre in Southampton first investigated the vents in April 2010.

The vents are known as

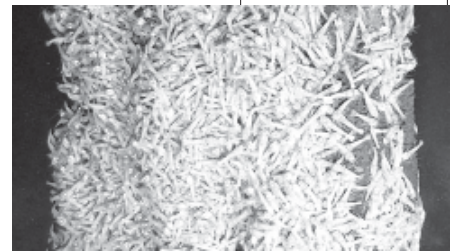
"Black Smokers" on account of the smoky-looking hot liquids that gush out of them. One of the vents, which the team named the Beebe Vent Field, was almost a kilometre deeper than anything previously found.

According to Dr Jon Copley, from the University of Southampton and one of the leaders of the expedition, the discovery was surprisingly moving.

"When we came across the black smokers on the sea floor there were honestly tears among the science party, there was this sort of moment of overwhelming wonder at the marvel of the world," he said.

The Beebe Field is a mound of mineral rubble on the bottom of the ocean estimated to be about 80m across about 50m high. On top of the mound are naturally formed chimneys, estimated

to be about six metres tall with hot fluid gushing out." The scientists say the fluid is rich



in minerals, particularly copper. "As soon as it hits the cold sea water, it starts to form particles of copper that build up the chimneys we've seen," Dr Copley explained. The researchers weren't able to directly measure the temperature of the water with their equipment. "We analysed the chemistry of what was gushing from the

vents and from that we estimated that these vents could be hotter than 450 degrees Celsius, which means they're not only the deepest known they're also possibly going to be the hottest known."

The height of the plume is also indicative of extremely high temperatures.

## Middle-aged surgeons 'are safest'



**"Trust me - I'm a doctor". But should age come into it?** — *INTERNET*

LONDON, 12 Jan — If you are due to have an operation, it might be worth checking the age of your surgeon beforehand, say researchers who claim age influences acumen.

Although inexperience is an obvious disadvantage, having been in the profession for decades is not desirable either, they say. Middle-aged surgeons in their 40s and late 30s are safest, they suggest. The small study, published at

bmj.com, looked at operative complications across five hospitals in France.

This revealed that patients undergoing one surgical procedure - thyroid gland removal — were more likely to have complications when operated on by inexperienced surgeons and those who had been in the job for more than 20 years. The analysis looked at more than 3,500 of these operations carried out by 28 surgeons.

The researchers chose to look thyroidectomy because the procedure is, generally, carried out in the same way by all surgeons and has not changed substantially over the past few decades.

The link they found between a surgeon's age and

complication rates was irrespective of how complex the surgical case list was, which suggests it wasn't because the older, more experienced surgeons were seeing the "harder-to-treat" patients. But experts stress the studies findings are not conclusive and more investigations are needed to ensure surgeons stay on top form.

The researchers from the University of Lyon said: "Optimum individual performance in thyroid surgery cannot be passively achieved or maintained by accumulating experience. "Factors contributing to poor performance in very experienced surgeons should be explored further." Prof Mike Larvin, of England's

Royal College of Surgeons (RCS), said it was important for surgeons to keep honing their skills.

"Given the pace of change in medical innovation it is certain that a surgeon at the end of his career will be undertaking a nearly completely different range of operations than at the outset.

"This interesting study shows the importance of lifelong learning for surgeons — something the RCS supports by directly running courses for trainees and consultants and quality assuring courses run by others. "We have also set out requirements for continuing professional development for medical revalidation, a system of regular five-year check-ups on doctor competence, which starts at the end of this year."

## James Bond villains blamed for nuclear's bad image

LONDON, 12 Jan — The evil villains in James Bond movies are being blamed for casting a long-lasting shadow over the image of nuclear power, says the president of the Royal Society of Chemistry. Prof David Phillips says that Dr No, with his personal nuclear reactor, helped to create a "remorselessly grim" reputation for atomic energy. Prof Phillips was speaking ahead of the 50th anniversary of the movie. The chemistry organization says it wants a "renaissance" in nuclear power. Prof Phillips says the popularity of the Dr No movie from

1962 created an enduringly negative image of nuclear power — as something dangerous that could be wielded by megalomaniacs with aspirations to world domination.

The villain of the movie, planning mass destruction from his secret Caribbean hideout, eventually dies in the cooling pool of his nuclear reactor, having been foiled by James Bond, played by Sean Connery. Against a background of the cold war and a nuclear arms race, the movie showed a world of intelligence agencies, glamorous spies, secretive assassins and underground laboratories.

But the Royal Society of Chemistry, which promotes the work of chemical sciences, says that it also meant that millions of people who saw the film saw nuclear technology being presented as a "barely-controllable force for evil". Later Bond villains, as part of their catstroking, laser-pointing, world-destroying repertoire, also had nuclear ambitions.

When there are worries about nuclear safety — such as following the tsunami in Japan — the Royal Society of Chemistry fears that the public reaction is still shaped by such emotive, negative associations.

As such, Prof Phillips says that when nuclear power is discussed "it is not at all surprising that the public at home and abroad are sceptical". — *Internet*

## Twitter unhappy about Google's social search changes

LONDON, 12 Jan — Twitter has complained about changes made by Google to integrate its social network Google+ into search results. The new feature, called Search plus Your World, will automatically push results from Google+ up the search rankings. Tweeting on the news, Twitter's lawyer Alex Macgillivray described it as a "bad day for the Internet". Google is determined to push its social network in the face of continued rivalry with Facebook.

The current changes were about even greater personalization, it said. It already includes personal search history in its search algorithms. The three changes are: Personal Results — which enable users to find

information such as Google+ photos and posts, both their own and those shared specifically with them, that only they will be able to see on their results pages

Profiles in Search — both in autocomplete and results, users will be able to find people they are close to or might be interested in

following People and Pages — helps users find people profiles and Google+ pages related to a specific topic or area of interest, and enable people to follow them with just a few clicks.

"Search is pretty amazing at finding that one needle in a haystack of billions of webpages, images, videos,

news and much more," said Amit Singhal in the firm's official blog. "But clearly, that isn't enough. You should also be able to find your own stuff on the web, the people you know and things they've shared with you, as well as the people you don't know but might want to... all from one search box," he added.

Twitter's general counsel Alex Macgillivray tweeted in response to the changes: "Bad day for the internet.

Having been there, I can imagine the dissension @Google to search being warped this way." Mr Macgillivray had previously been employed at Google. Twitter expanded his point in an official statement.

## Google persuades Spanish bank BBVA to use the cloud

LONDON, 12 Jan — Spanish banking giant BBVA is switching its 110,000 staff to use Google's range of enterprise software. The deal is the biggest that the search giant has signed with one company for its cloud-computing services, where software is offered as a service via the Internet.

The bank told the BBC it would use Google's tools only for internal communication. But the deal can be seen as a breakthrough in corporate adoption.

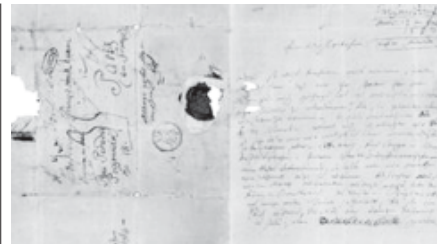

Banking—with its high security needs and strict regulations—was always considered to be one of the last industries to accept cloud-computing. BBVA's director of innovation, Carmen Herranz, stressed that all customer data and other key banking systems would "stay in our own data centres" and be completely separate from the cloud solution.

The bank would use Google applications like email, calendar, docs, chat, video conferencing and other collaboration tools to "achieve a cultural change" and get "the whole company working together" across the 26 countries where BBVA is based.

Ms Herranz said the project — with roll-out across all employees to be complete by the end of the year — was not about saving cost. "The main goal is to promote innovation and making decisions and increase productivity. We are in a challenging market and need to make faster and more accurate decisions... and eliminate duplication," Ms Herranz told the BBC. Also driving the change was the increasing mobility of the bank's workforce. A lot of the bank's computing needs had moved to smartphones, tablets, laptops and computers at home, she said.



## Letter penned by Beethoven uncovered in Germany

BONN, 12 Jan — A letter written by composer Ludwig van Beethoven has emerged in Germany after being left in a will. In the six-page document of Beethoven's scrawled corrections, he complains about his illness and a lack of money. Experts were already aware of the 1823 letter's existence, but say it is of historic value. Broadcaster John Suchet, who has written books on Beethoven, said finding the letter was "hugely significant".

Speaking to BBC News, he said: "We've always known it existed, therefore the

information in it isn't new, but anything in its original form to do with Beethoven is hugely significant.

"It means we can look at his handwriting, which was

always untidy, because his father took him out of school very early so he could concentrate on music."

## PIP breast implants: Harley medical group will not replace implants

LONDON, 12 Jan — The Harley Medical Group, which fitted more PIP breast implants than any other UK cosmetic surgery firm, says it will not replace them free of charge. It claimed replacing the banned implants would put the company out of business. The government says private clinics who fitted implants have a "moral duty" to remove them. However, the NHS will pay to remove, but not replace, implants if a private clinic refuses or no longer exists.

Around 40,000 women in the UK have been fitted with PIP implants. The Harley Medical Group said it fitted 13,900 women with the implants between September 2001 and March 2010. Its chairman Mel Braham said the company had neither the resources, the surgeons, nor the operating facilities needed to do the surgery. He said the government must accept "moral responsibility" for replacing the PIP implants.

Suchet added: "Beethoven, in my view, is one of the greatest artists who ever lived. His music and legacy will be known to every single generation in the world, until the end of time.

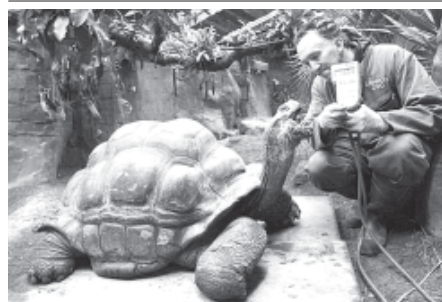
beautiful.

## Singapore youth counselors call for sex education to start earlier

SINGAPORE, 12 Jan — Some youth counselors called for sex education in schools to start earlier and be more specific, following a court case of underage sex.

The 15-year-old girl in the court case said she was told by his boyfriend that his menthol cigarettes would kill his sperm, local daily *Straits Times* reported on Wednesday.

Some counselors said sexuality education should start at the lower-primary level, given that children hit

puberty earlier now.

"When dating couples get more intimate, some guys will come up with all sorts of explanations for not having to worry about pregnancy after sex," said Rachel Lee, head of a family service centre that gives sexuality education courses in several schools.

A senior expert involved in efforts to contain the spread of HIV (human immunodeficiency virus) in Singapore also said recently that sex education should start earlier to prevent unsafe sex.

A call was also made for sexuality education to be less abstract.

"The programmes need to include more real-life scenarios and case studies, so teens can relate to these and apply them to the situations they are in," said psychologist Daniel Koh of Insights Mind Centre.

## Ford Fusion targets midsize market

DETROIT, 12 Jan—US auto giant Ford seems to have pinned its future sales hopes on the debut of its latest Fusion model after winning the North American International Auto Show's EyesOn Design top prize earlier this week. Ford hopes prospective customers will have the same reaction to the vehicle's new look. A panel of judges composed of a variety of auto industry experts voted the 2013 Ford Fusion best designed in production vehicle, beating out fellow finalists the BMW 3 Series and Cadillac ATS models to take the yearly prize.

Unlike the BMW and Cadillac models, the Fusion is not a luxury car. Although the 2013 Fusion pricing has yet to be set, Ford leaders say it will be close to the current model's price tag, which starts around 20,200 US dollars. That the Fusion could target Cadillac and BMW's customers is highly doubtful, as despite its

award-winning design, the Fusion is not of the same high performance caliber as luxury brands. However, Ford executives hope that the Fusion's futuristic design featuring an elegant aerodynamic shape could finally give the brand an advantage over leading competitors Toyota and Honda in the midsize sedan market segment, where Ford has traditionally lagged behind.

"It's a beautiful car — I think that's something that you see right away," Ford Executive Chairman Bill Ford told reporters about the new Fusion's design concept. "It's a very highly-styled car both internally and externally, and that's something that traditionally in the past you wouldn't have expected to see from this segment of the market," Ford continued, revealing how Ford aimed to win an advantage by combining style with pricing.

## UK university to open campus in Thailand

LONDON, 12 Jan—A UK university is to open a campus in Bangkok — in what is claimed as the first such UK branch university to be established in Thailand.

The University of Central Lancashire has signed a deal with a Thai-based entrepreneur to open a university campus in Bangkok in 2014. Degrees will be taught in English and validated by the UK university.

This will be the latest example of universities "globalising" with overseas branches.

It follows a path set by the University of Nottingham which set up a branch university in China.

The greatest concentration of such branch universities, from UK and US universities, has been in Asia and the Gulf states.

Newcastle University is establishing a medical school in Malaysia, where Nottingham also has a campus. University College London has a campus in Qatar.

The announcement of the University of Central Lancashire's plans will give

this "new" university an international identity and an opportunity to expand.

The University of Central Lancashire's vice-chancellor, Malcolm McVicar, said its market research showed "strong demand" for undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Thailand.

Thailand has been identified as a hub for South East Asia, which it expects to be a "key area for future global growth".

The UK university will invest £7.5m and will work alongside the entrepreneur Sitichai Charoenkajonkul.

There are other UK

universities which have partnerships with universities in Thailand, but the University of Central Lancashire is claiming to be the first from the UK to set up a full university there.

It expects to have 5,000 students in 10 years and will offer courses in areas such as business, built and natural environment, engineering, creative and performing arts and languages.

Kevin Van-Cauter, higher education adviser at the British Council, says this is part of an increasing pattern of globalisation in higher education.

## Children's Society finds unhappy childhoods afflict one in 10 youngsters

LONDON, 12 Jan — Almost one in 10 children over the age of eight are unhappy, according to a landmark survey by the Children's Society, which questioned more than 30,000 youngsters aged eight to 16 in the UK. The charity's researchers found that family had the biggest impact on children's happiness. Relationships within a household rather than the family "structure" most affected the emotional wellbeing of young people, they found.

The Children's Society said its evidence showed that "at any one time, one in 11 (9%) eight- to 15-year-olds had low levels of subjective well-being". Across the

population, that equated to just over 500,000 having low levels of subjective well-being on any one day. Almost a quarter of children who had moved home more than once over 12 months had low levels of well-being, compared to the average of

about 10% in the survey. And the study showed that unhappiness increased dramatically with age; the number of those saying they felt "low" doubling from the age of 10 (7%) to the age of 15 (14%).

### Direct flight launched between Chinese mainland's Lanzhou, Taipei

LANZHOU, 12 Jan — A direct flight was launched between the Chinese mainland's far western City of Lanzhou and Taipei Wednesday to meet increasing market demand. The mainland-based Hainan Airlines operates the new direct air route between Taipei and Lanzhou, capital of Gansu Province, with around-trip flight each week, a company spokesman said.

The flights will be offered until 24 March this year, the spokesman said, without specifying the reason for the given date or whether the company would continue providing the service after that point. Far Eastern Air Transport, based in Taipei, plans

to launch two direct flights between Taipei and Lanzhou every week, but the date of the maiden flight is yet to be decided, a spokesman with the Gansu Airport Group said in November last year.

This is the first time that flights will be offered between Zhongchuan Airport in Lanzhou and Taipei since the airport was established in 1970. The regular flights are expected to be popular not only with people in Gansu wishing to travel to Taipei, but also with people in the neighbouring provinces. ### UK films urged to be more 'mainstream' in new report

LONDON, 12 Jan — The British film industry should back more mainstream movies, a report is expected to recommend next week. Ahead of a visit to Pinewood Studios on Wednesday, Prime Minister David Cameron said the film industry should support "commercially

successful pictures". His comments come before the publication of Lord Smith's review into the government's film policy on Monday. The review was commissioned to find out how the industry could offer better support to UK film-making.

Mr Cameron praised the UK film industry but said "we should aim even higher, building on the incredible success of recent years". He acknowledged the British film industry had made "a £4bn contribution to the UK economy and an incalculable contribution to our culture". Lord Smith, the former Labour culture secretary, is also expected to recommend

developing an export strategy to increase the profits of British films. Speaking to the BBC, director Ken Loach said it was important to have a diverse film industry with a wide range of films to choose from.

"If everyone knew what would be successful before it was made, there would be no problem," he said. "What you need to do is fund a lot of different, varied projects and then you'll get a really vibrant industry." Loach added he would encourage more independent cinemas, saying: "The market does not provide choice if you don't intervene." Oscar-winning screenwriter Julian Fellowes, who was a member of Lord Smith's panel, said it was necessary to support mainstream films.—Internet

### Exoplanets are around every star, study suggests

LONDON, 12 Jan — Every star twinkling in the night sky plays host to at least one planet, a new study suggests. That implies there are some 10 billion Earth-sized planets in our galaxy. Using a technique called gravitational microlensing, an international team found a handful of exoplanets that imply the existence of billions more. The findings were released at the 219th American Astronomical Society (AAS) meeting,

alongside reports of the smallest "exoplanets" ever discovered.

Gravitational microlensing is a method that uses the gravity of a far-flung star to amplify the light from even more distant stars that have planets. Astronomers used a number of relatively small telescopes that make up the Microlensing Network for the Detection of Small Terrestrial Exoplanets, or Mindstep, to look for the rare event of one star passing directly in front of another as seen from Earth. The team witnessed 40 of



these microlensing events, and in three instances spotted the effects of planets circling the more distant stars.

While the number of actual events and detected

planets was low, the team was able to estimate how many such exoplanets must exist. Most news of exoplanets in recent years has come from the Kepler telescope, which spots planets by looking for the slight dimming of their host stars' light as planets pass in front of them. That method is better at finding large planets close to their host stars. While a more difficult effect to catch, gravitational microlensing is better at finding planets of all sizes and distances.

It can currently spot a planet as small as Mercury, orbiting at a similar distance to its host star, or as far away as Saturn.

## Low risk of heart incidents found for marathoners

NEW YORK, 12 Jan—It's dramatic news when a marathon runner collapses with no pulse. Now a big study finds such calamities are rare and usually due to a pre-existing heart problem. The study also found such incidents are increasing as more runners try to go the distance. “You hear about this more and more,” said Dr Aaron Baggish, senior author of the study Baggish, who runs a programme for athletes with heart issues at Massachusetts General Hospital, and co-authors present their analysis in Thursday's issue of the *New England Journal of Medicine*.

The study covers 10.9 million runners who participated in marathons or half-marathons in the United States from 2000 to 2010. By

scouring media reports and checking with medical staff of races, the researchers identified 59 cases of cardiac arrest, where a runner became unconscious with no pulse during the race or within an hour of finishing. Cardiac arrest is when the heart stops because of a heart attack, a rhythm problem or other disorder.—*Internet*

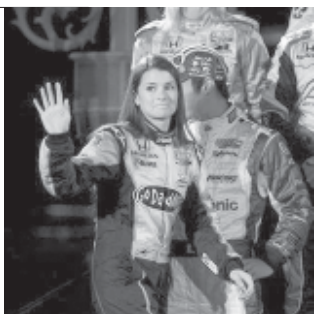

## Stolen meteorite recovered in Mexico

ALBUQUERQUE, (New Mexico) 12 Jan—A meteorite that landed in Russia in the 1940s and was recently stolen from the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque has been located.

After the meteorite went missing, the museum contacted an association of meteorite collectors and a Missouri man responded that he had bought it for \$1,700, KRQE-TV reported. It's worth between \$20,000 and \$40,000.

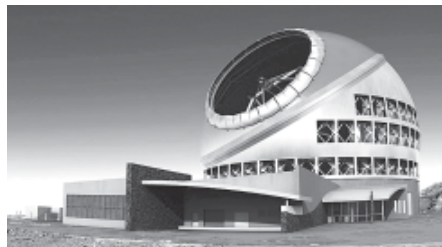

## China, India to help fund world's largest telescope

HONOLULU, 12 Jan—China and India are signing on as partners in a telescope that will be the world's largest when it is built at the summit of Hawaii's Mauna Kea volcano in 2018.

Their participation in the Thirty Metre Telescope will catapult the two nations to the forefront of astronomy research. It's the first time either nation has participated in such an advanced telescope.

As partners, China and India will pay a share of the

construction cost, which is expected to top \$1 billion. They will have a share of the observation time.

Shude Mao, an astrophysics professor at the National Astronomical Observatories of China, says China has lagged behind in observational astronomy, but the country has ambitious science goals and wants to catch up as fast as it can.

A group of California and Canadian universities founded the telescope project.—Internet

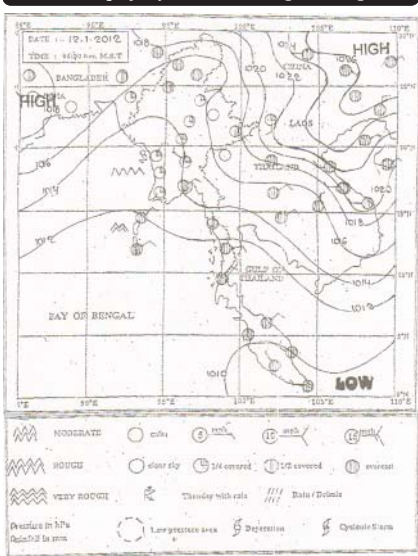

Sky Sports sources on Wednesday revealed new QPR boss Mark Hughes had set his sights on the Brazilian and the Loftus Road side are believed to be the origin of the bid.

Alex wants to leave Chelsea and in December the centre-back had a transfer request accepted at Stamford Bridge.

He does not feature in the plans of Villas-Boas, who

hopes this week to complete the signing of Bolton's Gary Cahill, and Chelsea are now aiming to receive an acceptable offer.

Chelsea's manager said on Thursday afternoon: "From what I know from my chief executive, there has been an approach from a Premier League club.

QPR owner Tony Fernandes on Wednesday revealed he was ready to spend money in the transfer market and hoped to sign somebody before the weekend match against Newcastle.

It seems that new arrival could now be Alex, who has proven his Premier League credentials at Chelsea since a loan spell with PSV Eindhoven came to an end in 2007.
