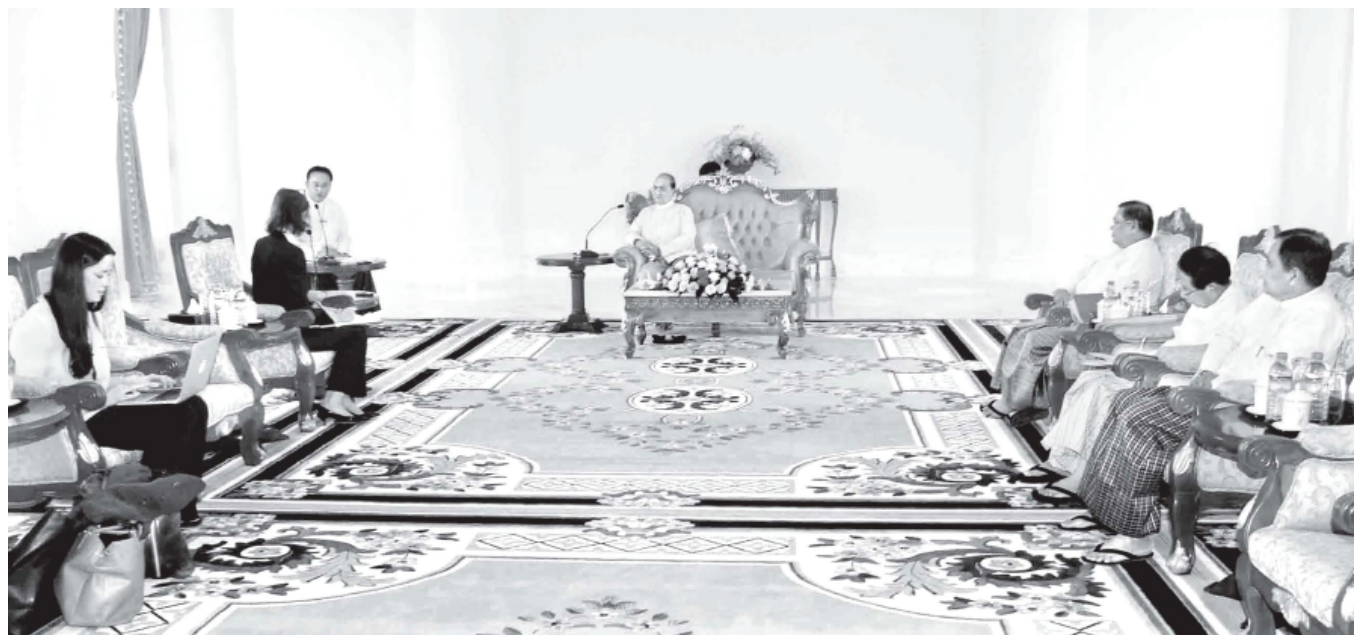
At the meeting, they had a frank and cordial discussion on political developments of Myanmar and promotion of mutually beneficial cooperation.

There are a lot of competitions on earth. But some are necessary while some are unnecessary. Necessary contests can serve the interests of both the mundane and supra-mundane worlds. Unnecessary contests, however, can cause bad effects with sheer waste of time.

Human beings, by nature, are unnecessarily competing with each other. These days, new cars are flooding into Yangon. One who owns a 30 million kyats' worth of car competes with another who possesses a car valued at K 20 million or 10. Moreover, there are those who show off their cars to others who have not. Experts meet to prepare key biodiversity areas conservation

YANGON, 17 Jan—As part of commitments towards conserving wildlife and endangered species in Myanmar, Wildlife Conservation Society has organized the workshop on "Building a Shared Vision for conservation Investment in Myanmar" here today.

The two-day workshop was opened with remarks by U Tin Tun, Director General of the Planning and Statistic Department of the Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry, and Mr Colin Poole, Director of WCS Asia Program.

In his key note address, U Tin Tun called on the participants for updating business opportunities in biodiversity conservation and for finding better solution and synergy to move on current biodiversity conservation activities.

Over 50 experts from the government sector and

stake holders have participated in the two day workshop focusing on wildlife conservation in key biodiversity areas (KBA) in Myanmar.

The number of KBAs in Myanmar has increased from 26 areas in 2005 to 150 areas in 2011, said U Saw Htun, Deputy Country Director of the WCS.

During the first day session, experts discussed in three groups to categorize the KBAs : 43 in upper Myanmar, 59 in lower Myanmar and 48 aquatic ecosystems.

Experts are from Forest Department of MOECAF, Department of Fishery, WCS, Biodiversity and Nature Conservation Association (BANCA) and other related societies, donors and international invitees.

The first workshop of its kind was held in Myanmar 2005.

Mastermind of armed robbers gang caught

BEIJING, 17 Jan—A man suspected in a series of robberies was captured with a loaded AK-47 assault rifle in his possession in a southern border city on Sunday, police say. The man - identified by police only by his surname, Huang - is suspected of masterminding two robberies during last year's Spring Festival holiday in

Pingxiang, the Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region. He is being held by authorities.

According to police, Huang, 33, would cross the border into Vietnam after robberies. But with Spring Festival drawing near, he returned this month to commit new robberies. On 3 Feb, Chinese New Year,

Huang and another man surnamed Liu, are suspected of breaking into a house in Youai village of Pingxiang and getting away with 20,000 yuan (\$3,166).

On 26 February, Liu and another man surnamed Lu, both armed, robbed villagers in Zhushan, Pingxiang, Liu Wenjie, a publicity official with the Chongzuo public security bureau, told *China Daily*. The Chongzuo public security bureau overseas Pingxiang police forces.

According to police, Huang has many relatives in Vietnam and speaks fluent Vietnamese. During robberies, he would threaten people in Vietnamese, so they would believe he was a foreigner. When he was captured at 2 am on Sunday, he had an AK-47 and a Type-54 pistol along with 77 bullets in his possession, police said.—Xinhua

92 militants surrender to Afghan gov't in month

KABUL, 17 Jan—At least 92 armed militants have surrendered to the government last month, a spokesman for Afghan National Directorate of Security (NDS) said here on Monday. "A total of 92 anti-government armed militants have renounced violence and joined the government in Kandahar, Herat, Badghis, Farah, Ghor and Baghlan Provinces last month", spokesman Lutfullah Mashal told reporters at a Press briefing.

He said the former militants were operating in eight groups in the above provinces and a number of local militant leaders were also among those who surrendered to the government. According to Afghan officials, more than 3,000 anti-government militants have laid down arms and joined the government-initiated peace process and

national reconciliation process last year, a claim rejected by Taleban outfit as groundless.

Mashal added that the NDS had detained 18 terrorists loyal to Taleban outfit during manhunt operations in the country's

Kunduz, Logar, Paktika and Nangarhar Provinces last month. The Taleban stepped up their attacks on Afghan and NATO-led troops since a rebel offensive was launched in May 2011 in the war-ravaged country.

Police kill seven gunmen in central Mexico shootout

MEXICO CITY, 17 Jan - Seven gunmen are dead following a pre-dawn shootout with police on a highway in the city of Cuernavaca, south of Mexico City. A federal police officer is recovering from a gunshot wound to the foot following the confrontation.

The prosecutors office in the central Mexican State of Morelos says the gunmen belonged to an organized crime gang, but did not say which gang. "Organized crime" in Mexico generally refers to drug cartels, and remnants of the Beltran Leyva cartel have been fighting for control of Cuernavaca. Prosecutors said the gunmen were traveling in three stolen vehicles when police confronted them early Monday.—Internet

Canadian man shot to death in Mexican state of Sinaloa

MEXICO CITY, 17 Jan—Police in Mexico say the body of a Canadian man has been found on a street in the City of Culiacan in Sinaloa State. Sinaloa state police say Salid Abdulacis Sabas had been shot to death. He was carrying a Canadian identification card. His age is not known.

Sinaloa is home to the cartel led by Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzman, considered the most powerful drug trafficker in the world. State police said Monday in an emailed statement that the Canadian man was shot with a high-powered weapon close to midnight on Sunday.

Stricken Italian liner shifts, 29 people missing

GIGLIO, 17 Jan - A stricken Italian cruise liner shifted on its rocky resting place as worsening weather disrupted an increasingly despairing hunt for survivors and authorities almost doubled their estimate of the number missing to 29 people. As the Costa Concordia's owners accused their captain of veering too close to shore in a bravura "salute" to residents of a Tuscan island, the giant ship slid a little on Monday, threatening to plunge 2,300 tonnes of fuel below the Mediterranean waters of the surrounding

nature reserve.

The slippage forced rescuers to suspend efforts to find anyone still alive after three days in the capsized hull, resting on a jagged slope outside the picturesque harbor on the island of Giglio. Six bodies have been found. Most of the 4,200 passengers and crew survived, despite hours of chaos. Captain Francesco Schettino was arrested a day after the disaster accused of manslaughter and abandoning the ship before all of the people were evacuated.

Prosecutors say he also

refused to go back on board when requested by the coastguard. Schettino was due to appear before magistrates for questioning on Tuesday morning. An Italian coastguard official told *Reuters* late on Monday that the number of people missing had been revised up to 29-25 passengers and four members of staff - from 16, showing how much uncertainty still surrounded the disaster.—Reuters

Explosions damage Italy tax agency - Naples police

NAPLES, 17 Jan—Three explosive devices blew up outside the Naples offices of Equitalia, a state agency that collects overdue taxes and fines, breaking windows but injuring no one on Monday night, a police official told *Reuters*. Police said no group had claimed responsibility for the attack on the building on Corso Meridionale near Naples central rail station.

Equitalia, whose offices have been attacked before, is

deeply unpopular among many Italians who accuse it of using strongarm tactics to collect taxes. Italy's technocrat government says it wants to increase Equitalia's powers as part of a war on tax evasion that robs the exchequer of an estimated 120 billion euros (99.12 billion pounds) a year.

Separately, members of right wing association Roma Nord said they hung dummies outside Equitalia offices in

Rome overnight to protest against the agency's methods, Italian news agency ANSA reported. Equitalia's Naples offices were hit by a similar explosion in December. Two letter bombs were also sent to Equitalia's offices in Rome in December. One was intercepted but the other blew off part of a finger of the agency's director general. An anarchist group said it carried out those attacks.—Reuters

BAGHDAD, 17 Jan—A total of 12 people were killed and some 35 others wounded in two car bomb attacks in northern and central Iraq on Monday, the police said. The deadliest attack occurred at about 8:00 am local time (0500 GMT) when a car bomb went off at al-Ghadiyer compound, some 20 km east of Iraq's northern City of Mosul, which houses residents from the Iraqi Shabak minority, a local police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

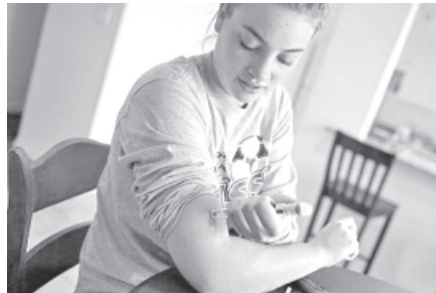
Women and children were among the victims, the source said, adding that the powerful blast damaged several nearby houses, 12 shops and several civilian cars. The Iraqi Shabak people are an ethnic and Shi'ite minority group living in villages in Iraq's northern Province of Nineveh, particularly, around the provincial capital City of Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad. Iraqi security forces cordoned off the scene, while police experts defused another car bomb found in the same area, the source added. Around noon, another car bomb detonated in Nadir District in the center of Hilla City, some 100 km south of Baghdad, killing up to three people and wounding some 15 others, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity. Earlier the source put the toll at a civilian killed and ten wounded by the blast in Hilla, the capital city of Babil Province. Iraqi cities have been plagued by several attacks, including suicide bombings, since the US troops pulled out of the country earlier last month.—Xinhua

Health Tip: What affects blood glucose?

People with diabetes should monitor the amount of glucose (sugar) in their blood. Insulin and certain drugs often are key, but so is understanding what causes blood sugar levels to fluctuate.

The American Diabetes Association mentions these factors:

- * The foods you eat.
- * How much you exercise, and when.
- * Where in the body you inject insulin.
- * The time of day that you inject yourself.
- * Being sick.
- * Being under stress.—Internet

Now, once-a-week jab can end misery of diabetics

LONDON, 17 Jan—A simple weekly jab can now end the torment of millions of diabetics, who at present take injections two times a day, researchers say.

The landmark 18 pounds-a-week treatment is now available on the NHS. The drug, called exenatide, can be given to people with Type 2 diabetes who cannot get their condition under control with currently available pills, the *Daily Express* reported.

It is a slow-release version of the earlier available version of exenatide, called Byetta, and mimics a hormone found in a lizard from Mexico.

At present, people whose blood glucose levels are not brought under control with tablets face having 14 injections a week – two a day – to regulate it. But exenatide, which can be given just once a week, has been found to be just as effective. Exenatide is the first in a new class of medicines known as incretin mimetics, which trigger the pancreas to produce more insulin in response to raised blood sugar and also influence digestion and appetite.—Internet

Adult-infant bed sharing increases risk of infant suffocation

SYDNEY, 17 Jan—Parents should be aware that sharing a bed with their baby increases the risk of infant suffocation, an Australian expert warned on Monday.

In an editorial published in the *Medical Journal of Australia (MJA)*, Australian forensic pathologist Roger Byard at the University of Adelaide said research has confirmed infants sleeping in the same bed as their parents face an increased risk of accidental suffocation.

It has been reported that 50 percent or more of all infants found unexpectedly dead are sleeping beside an adult at the time, he said, indicating they may have died from suffocation and not sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS). “Accidental suffocation appears to be a more likely mechanism of death than subtle processes leading to SIDS,” Byard said.—Xinhua

Cholesterol meds raise diabetes risk in women

WASHINGTON, 17 Jan—Post-menopausal women who take medication to lower their cholesterol face a higher risk of getting diabetes than women who do not take the popular drugs, known as statins, said a US study on Monday.

The risk was apparent even after researchers adjusted for variables such as age, race/ethnicity and body mass index, said the study in the

Archives of Internal Medicine, a publication of the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA).

The link appeared regardless of what type of statin, or what dosage, the women were taking, said the study which included 153,000 women with an average age of 63. The researchers from the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota called for more study on the matter but said in the meantime there was no need to revise the guidelines for statin use in non-diabetic people, pointing out that statins aim to fix the negative heart consequences of diabetes. “Women who are taking statins should be aware of the need to check their blood sugars, along with

China GDP growth at 2-1/2 year low but tops forecast

BEIJING, 17 Jan—China’s economy grew at its weakest pace in 2-1/2 years in the latest quarter and it appeared headed for an even sharper slowdown in the coming months as export demand fades and the housing market falters.

The fourth-quarter year-on-year growth of 8.9 percent, although slightly stronger

than the 8.7 percent that economists polled by Reuters had predicted, may give Beijing yet another reason to gently ease monetary policy, most likely by reducing the amount of reserves that large banks must hold.

The data released on Tuesday may not satisfy investors, who were looking for figures that were either

weak enough to provide a clear-cut case for policy easing or strong enough to allay fears that the world’s second-biggest economy might unravel.

“The slowdown is not scary, so we are not going to get massive policy easing,” said Kevin Lai, an economist with Daiwa in Hong Kong.—Reuters

Samsung Group plans record \$41 billion investment in 2012

SEOUL, 17 Jan—Samsung Group, which includes Samsung Electronics Co, said on Tuesday it is raising its 2012 investment to a record \$41.4 billion, as the South Korean conglomerate seeks to consolidate its leading position in mobile chips and flat screens.

Best known for making massive investments in new technologies ahead of rivals, Samsung is now banking on logic chips and OLED displays to repeat its roaring success in flash chips, computer memory chips and LCD flat-screens, even as a gloomy global economic and IT spending outlook make its peers stick to conservative plans.

Samsung Group, South Korea’s biggest business group, did not provide a breakdown of the 47.8 trillion won investment. But analysts have widely

expected it to raise investment in mobile chips and next-generation OLED (organic light emitting diode) flat-screen displays. Reuters

China’s growth ebbs in final quarter of 2011

BEIJING, 17 Jan—China appears on track to avoid an abrupt economic slowdown with possible global repercussions after growth eased to a still robust 8.9 percent in the last quarter of 2011.

The expansion in the world’s second-largest economy was the slowest in 2 1/2 years but December retail sales and factory output accelerated, data showed Tuesday. Growth in the previous quarter was 9.1 percent.

“Today’s outcome seems to confirm a ‘soft landing’ scenario,” said Frances Cheung of Credit Agricole CIB in Hong Kong.

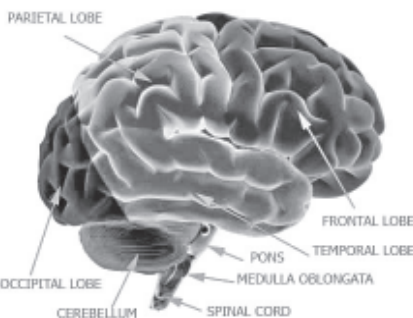

Beyonce gets fly with golden booty named after her

CANBERRA, (Australia), 17 Jan—A newly discovered horse fly in Australia was so "bootylicious" with its golden-haired bum, there was only one name worthy of its beauty: Beyonce.

Previously published results from Bryan Lessard, a 24-year-old researcher at Australia's Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organization, were

recently announced on the species that had been sitting in a fly collection since it was captured in 1981—the same year popdiva Beyonce was born.

He says he wanted to pay respect to the insect's beauty by naming it *Scaptia (Plinthina) beyonceae*.

Lessard said Beyonce would be "in the nature history books forever" and that the fly now bearing her name is "pretty bootylicious" with its golden backside.

"Bootylicious" was the title of a song by Beyonce's previous group, Destiny's Child.

It's unknown if the rare species is a bloodsucker like many female horse flies. Lessard says he was unable to find any live specimens when he went looking in 2010 in northeast Queensland's Atherton Tablelands, where it was captured three decades ago. However, at least one member of the public has alerted him that he was recently bitten by what's locally called the "gold bum fly."—INTERNET

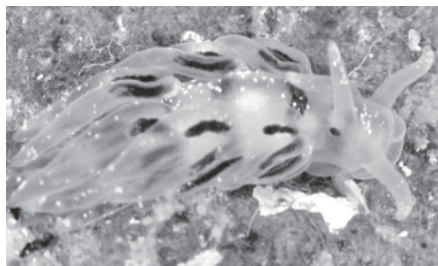
Soil bugs quit sea for land later than speculated

WASHINGTON, 17 Jan—Soil bacteria *azospirillum* quit the sea for land much later than speculated by scientists.

Igor Jouline, joint faculty professor of microbiology at Oak Ridge National Lab's (ORNL) Institute for Computational Sciences, performed a genome sequence analysis of *azospirillum*. The analysis indicates the shift may have occurred only 400 million years ago, rather than approximately two billion years earlier, as originally thought.

"Because these bacteria colonize roots of grasses and improve their growth and development, they might be important for bioenergy research," Jouline said.

Jouline conducted the research with microbiologists Kristin Wuichet and Leonid Sukharnikov, molecular biologist Gladys Alexandre and Kirill Borziak, graduate student of genome science at the the ORNL.—INTERNET

Samsung's Bada goes boom, gets integrated into Tizen



Samsung hope to have "at least one or two" Tizen phones out this year, but have no plans to make it their main mobile operating system.—INTERNET

SAN FRANCISCO, 17 Jan—Samsung made a big deal of its Bada mobile operating system when it was launched back in 2009, using words such as "ground-breaking" and "iconic" when describing it. Since then it has achieved around 2% market share and several phones using it have been released, including the Wave 3, which also introduced the second version of Bada.

But Bada's days as a standalone mobile OS are numbered, as Samsung has decided it'll be merged with Intel's Tizen, the phoenix that rose from the ashes of MeeGo following Nokia's departure from the project. Samsung and Intel

got together to announce Tizen in September last year.

The Tizen/bada mash-up joins Windows Phone, Android and several other mobile platforms supported by Samsung, although like MeeGo, Tizen can be used in other devices too.

According to a Samsung senior vice-president work has already started on the project, but they currently do not have a completion date.

Thanks to both platforms being based on Linux, Tizen will be backwards compatible with Bada and the SDK will be almost identical, allowing existing developers to start working on Tizen apps straight away.

Hackers disrupt Tel Aviv exchange, El Al websites

JERUSALEM, 17 Jan—Computer hackers disrupted access to the websites of the Tel Aviv Stock Exchange (TASE) and Israel's flag carrier El Al Airlines on Monday, officials at both companies said.

Stock trading and flights operated normally despite the cyber assaults, which occurred as Israeli media reported that pro-Palestinian

hackers had threatened at the weekend to shut down both these websites.

The site of El Al Israel Airlines website also crashed, and the company said it was busy trying to overcome the problem. "El Al is aware that for the past two weeks cyber war has raged against Israel," El Al said in a statement. "The company is closely monitoring the Saudi hacker's activity."

A hacker who identified himself as coming from Saudi Arabia had earlier this month published thousands of personal and credit card details of Israelis apparently gleaned from commercial websites in one of the worst cases of mass cyber identity theft experienced by Israel.

There was no claim of responsibility for Monday's cyber incidents. El Al said it had taken "precautions in

operating the company's site. As a result there may be disruptions in the site's activity." Israel opened an agency to tackle cyber attacks earlier this month. A founding member of the unit, Isaac Ben-Israel, said the country's most vital systems were already protected, but that incidents like the ones seen recently would only increase.

"As long as the systems are not guarded, any hacker anywhere in the world can break into them and do damage," Ben-Israel said on Israel Radio. "I believe that, done right, in a year or two, we will be able to wipe out all these hackers' threats."—Reuters



China's Xi says to push forward Sino-US cooperation

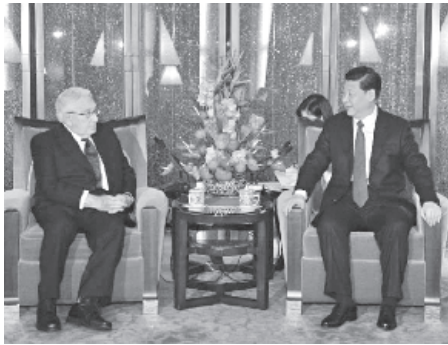
BEIJING, 17 Jan—China's Vice President Xi Jinping on Monday said that China is willing to work with the United States to push forward their cooperative partnership under the new situation, so as to benefit the two peoples and world peace.

Xi and former US Secretary of State Henry Kissinger attended a ceremony marking the 40th anniversary of former US President Richard Nixon's visit to China and the release of the Shanghai Communiqué.

In his speech, Xi reviewed the course of Sino-US relations and expressed his wish for the continuation of bilateral cooperation. The vice president said that China and the United States have gained a lot of experiences from the 40-year history of bilateral ties, one of which is that both sides should always adhere to the three Sino-US joint communiques. The two countries should constantly enhance mutual

understanding and cultivate and deepen strategic trust, Xi said. "Under the new situation, we should unswervingly develop the Sino-US cooperative partnership based on mutual respect and mutual benefit, in accordance with the important consensus reached by President Hu Jintao and President Obama," he said. The vice president urged the two sides to

respect each other's core and major interests, as well as properly handle their differences, in order to keep the proper direction of bilateral ties. He also urged the two sides to strengthen contact at all levels, promote cooperation in the economic and trade fields, and enhance coordination on inter-national and regional issues.—Xinhua

China seeks Gulf partnership to push renewable energy

ABU DHABI, 17 Jan—At the 5th World Future Energy Summit (WFES) which opened in Abu Dhabi on Monday, Chinese firms are looting to sell their innovative products to the sun-rich, but dry and hot Gulf Arab region. For the first time China has a national pavilion at the leading energy convent and exhibition in the Middle East to seek cooperation in the rapidly growing market in the region. Senior managers from China's major solar companies also attend the conference. Five Star Solar Energy Company from Dongguan City in south China's Guangdong Province produces water heater systems powered by solar panels for private

homes. The 1990-founded company landed a major success when they installed solar panel park of 1,200 square metered for the 2010 Asian Games in Guangdong.

According to the company's exclusive sales agent Solitaire Solar in the sheikhdom of Dubai, some 100 unites of solar water heaters from the FS-NPTS Series were sold to private homes so far. "One unit costs 6,800 Dirham (1,854 US dollars), and

its installation pays off after five years," Murad Fahmy, Business Development Manager at Solitaire Solar said, adding that prices in the solar industry came down by 60 percent since 2008.

Amazon-owned Zappos warns users after cyber-attack

New York, 17 Jan—Cyber-attackers have struck Zappos, the Amazon-owned fashion e-retailer. The company has reset the passwords of 24 million customers and asked them to choose new ones. It said names, email addresses and other personal information may

have been exposed, but not full credit card numbers. Though significant, other attacks have been larger. In 2010 a US court convicted a hacker of stealing details from more than 130 million cards. Zappos, which was founded in 1999 by Nick Swinburn, started out as an online shoe retailer but now sells clothing and accessories.

It was sold to Amazon for more than \$1bn (£650m) in 2009. In an email to staff sent on Sunday and posted on the company website, Zappos chief executive Tony Hsieh said: "We were recently the victim of a cyber-attack by a criminal who gained access to parts of

our internal network and systems through one of our servers in Kentucky.

"We are co-operating with law enforcement to undergo an exhaustive investigation." Mr Hsieh added: "We've spent over 12 years building our reputation, brand, and trust with our customers. It's painful to see us take so many steps back due to a single incident." Following the attack the company wrote to its 24 million customers asking them to choose new passwords for zappos.com and any other site where they may have used the same or similar password.

Uncertainties cloud China's economy in 2012

BEIJING, 17 Jan—A slowdown is expected for China's growth engine in 2012 as uncertainties continue to cast clouds over the world's second largest economy amid festering European debt woes and painstaking macro-control policies. The country's release of economic data for the fourth quarter of 2011 will take the spotlight on Tuesday, with many analysts expecting economic growth below 9 percent, the slowest in 10 quarters.

A slowing Chinese economy is inevitable due to weaker exports and fixed-asset investment, said Lu Zhongyuan, Deputy Director of the Development Research Center (DRC) of the State Council, or China's Cabinet. "We should no longer be obsessed with the speed of growth," said Lu, who predicted the expansion of China's gross domestic product (GDP) would decelerate to around 8.5

percent in 2012. While short-term demands shrink, China's mid- and long-term growth potential will decrease because of factors such as an aging population, rising labor costs and less room for infrastructure improvement, said Yu Bin, director of the

DRC's Macroeconomic Research Department. Yu also estimated the 2012 GDP growth will slow to around 8.5 percent, based on an overall stable domestic property market and barring another global financial crisis.—Xinhua

"Merry-go-rounds" become powerful investment tools in Kenya

NAIROBI, 17 Jan—They were once dismissed as "dens of gossips", but "merry-go-rounds", as they are popularly known in Kenya, are turning out to be powerful investment tools. The groups are economically empowering Kenyans as many turn to them to pool resources together and invest in various sectors.

Merry-go-rounds, which are micro-finance schemes, work as the name suggests.

Members contribute money weekly, fortnightly or every month. The collection is then passed to one person in a continuous cycle, until the last person is served. Initially, the groups also known as chamas were mainly associated with women, making them appear like "dens of gossip".

However, over the years, they have evolved into investment groups and clubs, attracting all members of the

Kenyan society, including children, men, the youth and rich and poor. Kenyans are now using them to invest in the public service transport sector, real estate, stock market, among others. Contributions, depending on the group, range from as low as 0.6 US dollars to 2,352 dollars, which is pooled together and given to one member, thus the term "merry-go-round".

Outpatient shocked by \$45m bill error from New York hospital

NEW YORK, 17 Jan—An outpatient is recovering from shock after being billed \$44.8m (£29.2m) in error by a New York hospital. Alexis Rodriguez, 28, was one of a number of patients charged astronomical amounts because of a computer glitch, the *New York Daily News* reports. The Bronx-Lebanon Hospital treated him for pneumonia, but the actual cost was no more than \$300. Billing firm PHY Services said it had mistakenly printed the patient invoice number where the amount should go.

Mr Rodriguez told the *New York Daily News* he could not believe his eyes when he opened the envelope last week. "I think they should have somebody look over the bills before they send them out," said the unemployed doorman. "To send out a lot of bills with numbers that big - someone could have had a heart attack." PHY Services requested that patients ignore the bills, adding that new ones would be sent out.—Internet

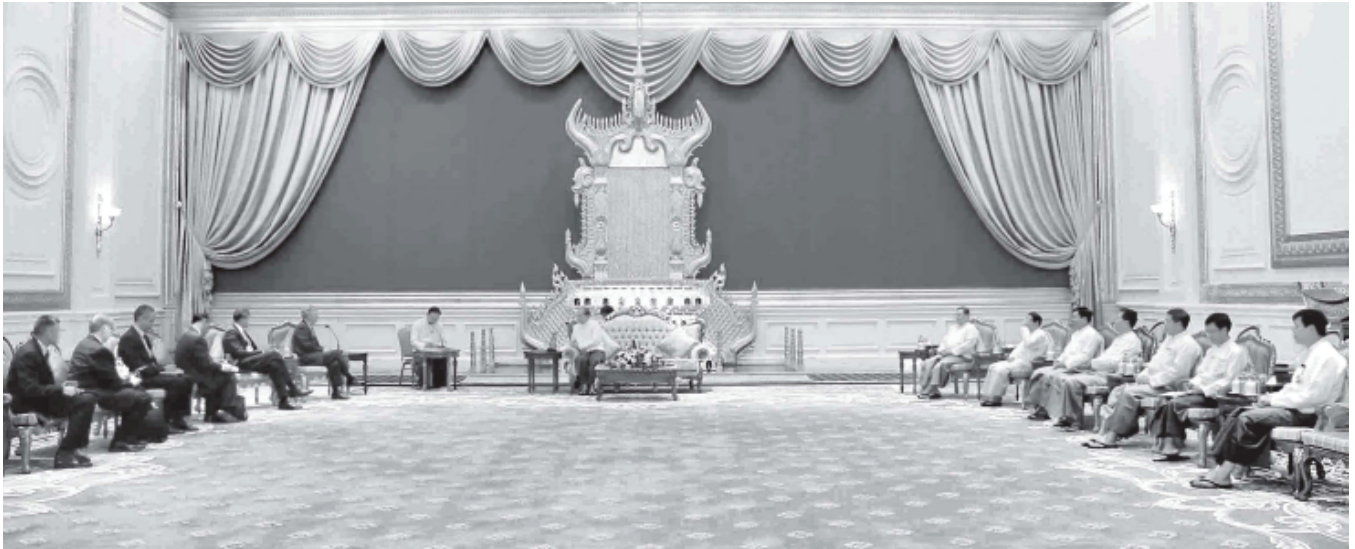

Than on thriving of crop plantations due to temperate climate and favourable soil condition, supply of quality strains and extended reclamation of vacant land and regional economy; and Deputy Minister for Health Dr Win Myint on necessary measures for cooperation between health staff and the public in disseminating health knowledge to the people. London seeks major slice of offshore yuan market

LONDON, 17 Jan—The government said Monday it will partner with Hong Kong to develop the City of London as a major offshore centre of trade in China's yuan currency.

Chancellor of the Exchequer George Osborne said Britain and Hong Kong had agreed to launch a joint private-sector forum to enhance cooperation and

support China's efforts to develop the offshore market for the yuan (renminbi).

Osborne told a meeting of Asian finance officials and executives in Hong Kong the intention was to "establish London as a new hub" for the yuan (RMB).

"It's clear that there is scope for the substantial expansion of the RMB market in the coming years,"

he told the Asian Financial Forum in the southern Chinese banking centre.

"I think London is perfectly placed to act as a gateway for Asian investment and banking to Europe and as a bridge to the United States."

Hong Kong is currently the only officially designated offshore yuan trading centre, and is keen to expand the currency's use in international transactions as an alternative to the greenback and the euro.

China and Britain agreed in September to work towards the development of an offshore yuan market in London, the heart of European banking.

Osborne said establishing London as an offshore centre for yuan denominated settlements, in partnership with Hong Kong, would benefit China's economic development as well as Britain's.—Internet

China, India face golden period to grow bilateral ties

BEIJING, 17 Jan—Chinese State Councilor Dai Bingguo said China and India face a golden period to grow bilateral relations, in a bylined article published on the Indian mainstream daily *The Hindu* on Monday.

Dai, who is visiting India to attend the 15th meeting between special representatives on China-India border issues, said China-India relations have huge potential and broad space for

cooperation. In the mid 1950s, China and India, in response to the call of the time, jointly initiated the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence. Today, these five principles are still shining with strong vitality, Dai said in his article.

Noting the world is undergoing drastic and profound changes, he said China and India, both ancient civilizations and major developing countries

whose combined population accounts for nearly two-fifths of the world's total, once again respond to the call of our time. The two countries have seized the historic opportunity of economic globalization and achieved fast development, he said, noting that they are now the two largest emerging countries in the world and play increasingly important roles in regional and international affairs.

Egypt tourism earnings fall 30% in 2011

CAIRO, 17 Jan—Revenues from Egypt's lucrative tourist industry dropped by 30 percent in 2011.

Munir Fakhri Abdel Nur told reporters that tourism revenues in 2011 dropped to \$8.8 billion compared to \$12.5 billion in 2010, with tourist arrivals falling and their daily expenditures also dropping.

"The significant drop in revenues last year was expected in a country where millions revolted in all main cities and where the political situation has been developing for the past 12 months," Abdel Nur said.

"The security circumstances in the country have affected tourism," he added, stressing however that he was confident that the situation would improve in the coming year to make up for the losses of 2011.

Abdel Nur said the number of tourist arrivals fell by 33 percent in 2011 with tourists spending fewer



nights in Egypt than in the previous year and spending on average about \$13 each less per day.

Tourists spent 114 million nights in Egypt in 2011 compared to 141 million nights in 2010, he said, each spending about \$72 per day instead of \$85 the previous year.

Thai police raid warehouse in terror probe

BANGKOK, 17 Jan—A Thai television station is reporting that a Lebanese suspect with alleged links to Hezbollah militants has led police to a warehouse housing materials that could be used to make explosives. Thai PBS television showed police confiscating boxes of urea fertilizer and liquid ammonium nitrate in Monday's raid.

The raid comes after the

US and Israel warned Friday of a terror threat targeting their citizens in Bangkok. Officials say that threat has now been thwarted.

The Lebanese suspect was detained Thursday. He led police to the warehouse, where police also found three beds, matching accounts that the man was travelling with two companions.

S Korea couple tell of 30-hour nightmare in sinking ship

SEOUL, 17 Jan—A South Korean honeymoon couple have described their 30-hour nightmare trapped in a wrecked Italian cruise ship, saying they screamed for help for hours after waking up too late to evacuate the vessel.

The couple were rescued Sunday morning after being stranded in the half-submerged ship, where a search for people still missing out of more than 4,200 originally on board was underway.

Five people have been confirmed dead and more than a dozen are still missing after the Costa Concordia hit rocks off Italy's west coast on the evening of Friday the 13th.

Prosecutors have arrested the captain and

officer for alleged mishandling of the incident and neglect of duty.

Han Ki-Deok and his wife Jeong Hye-Jin, both 29-year-old schoolteachers, said in an interview with South Korea's *Yonhap* news agency published Monday that they had been sleeping after dinner, oblivious to the disaster outside.

"By the time we woke up, the ship was tilting," *Yonhap* quoted Han as saying in a hotel in Rome.

The couple ventured out to the corridor, which was already inclined so steeply that they couldn't walk on it, he added.

"We ended up slipping towards the end of the corridor and even got ourselves injured," said Han.

Mount Rainier rangers search for missing snowshoer

SEATTLE, 17 Jan—Park rangers and volunteer mountaineers searched Mount Rainier National Park with snowshoes, skis and dogs for a second day on Sunday looking for a missing 66-year-old snowshoer hike leader.

Yong Chun Kim was leading a Tacoma hiking club on a snowshoer walk near the park's 5,400-foot-high Paradise region on Saturday afternoon when he slipped and fell down a steep incline, park spokesman Lee Taylor said.

Kim was well-equipped for a day hike, but not for overnight blizzard conditions, with icy winds whipping up to 50 mph, temperatures at 10 degrees Fahrenheit and up to 30 inches of fresh snow falling in parts of the park on Saturday night.

"We're still hopeful but as the more time goes by, it's less likely he's alive and well," Taylor said.

Kim radioed his group to continue the hike, telling them he would traverse the area where he fell, but rangers began the search about 30 minutes after he failed to show up, Taylor said. Back-country campers had spotted fresh tracks believed to be those of Kim, who is an experienced 10-year snowshoer hiker.—Reuters

Drink makers look to cut waste, emissions

BEIJING, 17 Jan—Drink makers are investing heavily to make better use of resources and lower carbon emissions in China to achieve sustainable development.

There should be a systematic government plan to support the companies executing environmental protection plans, experts said.

The Belgian-based international beverage manufacturing giant Anheuser-Busch InBev (AB InBev) has signed a strategic partnership agreement with United States-based General Electronic Co (GE) to undertake a series of activities to improve the

efficiency of energy usage and reduce carbon emissions from its Chinese factories.

The company said the first phase of the plan will be complete in 2013. It will help to reduce emissions of carbon dioxide by about 100,000 tons a year. Water consumption will also be reduced significantly for every unit of beer produced in China.

"If this project succeeds and is promoted throughout the entire drinks industry, it will greatly help businesses lower energy consumption and can help the country to develop into a low carbon economy," said Wang Yancai, director of the China

Alcoholic Drinks Industry Association.

ABInBev said it has done everything possible to reduce the production of waste and improve the efficient use of resources over past years in China. The company said it needs to strengthen cooperation with technology service companies to make better use of resources. "We did everything we could. Now we have reached a point at which if we want to achieve our dream to live in a better world, we need GE to help us," said Ricardo Dias, vice-president of procurement for ABInBev.—Xinhua

6.0-magnitude quake hits South Shetland Islands

BEIJING, 17 Jan—A 6.0 magnitude earthquake hit South Shetland Islands around 22:21 Beijing Time (14:21 GMT) on Sunday night, said the China Earthquake Networks Centre (CENC) on Monday morning.

The epicentre was monitored at 60.7 degrees south latitude and 55.9 degrees west longitude with a depth of 10 kilometres, according to the CENC.

China's Internet population hits 513 million

BEIJING, 17 Jan—The number of Internet users in China rose last year by nearly 56 million to more than half a billion, nearly half of whom used weibos, or microblogs, according to latest official figures. China's online population — the world's largest — hit 513 million in 2011, a 12.2 percent increase over the previous year, the China Internet Network Information Centre (CNNIC) said in a statement on Monday.

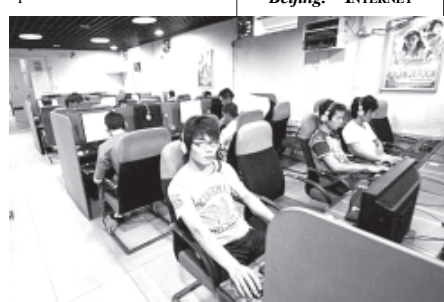
Of these, 48.7 percent — or nearly 250 million people — now used weibos, compared to just 63.1 million at the end of 2010, posing a huge challenge to government attempts to

control information in the country of 1.3 billion.

The weibos — hugely popular microblogging services similar to Twitter, which China bans — have become the most popular medium for web users to vent their anger over corruption, scandals and disasters, or alert others about protests or riots. The number of people using more traditional communication tools such as emails, web forums or blogs was falling, the CNNIC said.

The government blocks web content it deems politically sensitive in a vast censorship system dubbed the "Great Firewall of China", and is hugely concerned about the power of the

Internet to influence public opinion. In a bid to exert more

control over weibos, some cities such as Shanghai and Beijing now require users to register under their real names, making it easier for authorities to track them.

CNNIC said the number

of people in rural areas using the Internet also rose last year — up 8.9 percent to 136 million in 2011 — but huge disparities still exist between rich and poor regions.

Australia's unemployment rate forecast to rise in 2012

SYDNEY, 17 Jan—Australia is expected to have a higher jobless rate in 2012, the nation's major bank ANZ Bank said on Monday. The total number of job advertisements in Australia on the Internet and in newspapers dropped 0.9 percent in December compared with the previous month, contributing to a 2.6 percent annual fall, ANZ said.

ANZ head of Australian economics Katie Dean said the figures point to modest employment gains for the Australian economy over the coming months.

"Indeed, the current trend rate of employment growth is unlikely to be fast enough to absorb the forecast growth in the labor force in the short term," Dean said.

"As a result, ANZ forecasts the unemployment rate to rise to 5.5 percent by mid-2012." Dean predicted that the unemployment rate would remain at this elevated level in 2012, before declining modestly in 2013 as economic activity started to rise, in response to strong mining and infrastructure investment and a possible prolonged period of low interest rates. The Australian Bureau of Statistics is due to release official employment figures for the month of December on Thursday.—Xinhua

Two giant pandas from China find new home in France

PARIS, 17 Jan—Two giant pandas from China's southwest Sichuan Province arrived Sunday at Paris' Charles de Gaulle airport to start their new life in France.

The two giant pandas, Huan Huan and Yuan Zi, both 3 years old, will be directly delivered to the Beauval Zoo near the city of Tours in central France, where they will settled down in an living area of 2.5 hectares as their new home in France. "The arrival of Huan Huan and Yuan Zi is a historic event for the Beauval Zoo. It reflects our excellent cooperation with China and our long-standing involvement in the protection of endangered species," said Frances Delord, Founder and President of the Beauval Zoo.

The two pandas' arrival marks the return of the Chinese

endangered species to France. Since 1973, two pandas had been sent to France, one died shortly after arriving, another one named Yen Yen died in 2000 of old age.

"We've been waiting for this moment for five years," the zoo president said, "since the day the zoo decided to embark on this epic to bring giant pandas in France."

Rodolphe Delord, Director of the Beauval Zoo, said the arrival of the two giant pandas has allowed the zoo to strengthen its role in protecting one of the most endangered species in the world. "This marks the beginning of a long-term partnership in support of research programmes and conservation between Beauval and (China's) Chengdu panda base."—Xinhua

Message falsely claimed plane going down

Passengers on a British Airways flight said they received only a "blase" apology when a recorded message mistakenly warned their plane was going down. Duncan and Tracey Farquharson of London said they were on a Miami to London flight on 14 Jan when the recorded message informed passengers of an "emergency" and said the plane would "shortly be making an emergency landing on water," *The Daily Telegraph* reported Monday.

"We looked at each other and figured we were both about to die. Families with children were distraught and people were in tears. It was very distressing," Duncan Farquharson said. "About 30 seconds later one of the cabin crew told us to

ignore the announcement and accept their apologies but the tone of suggested they had not grasped how seriously we had taken it.

"Imagining yourself plunging towards a cold, watery grave in the middle of the Atlantic is a pretty horrific thought but they seemed very blase about it."

A British Airways spokesman said the cabin crew spoke to passengers individually to reassure them after the incident.

"A pre-recorded emergency announcement was activated in error on our flight from Miami to Heathrow on Saturday ...," the spokesman said. "The cabin crew canceled the announcement immediately and sought to reassure customers that the flight was operating normally."

Woman with two husbands not a bigamist

A New York woman who wound up with two husbands at the same time can keep the support payments from her first husband, court records show.

A recent court decision said husband No 1, Daniel Silber, can stop paying \$60,000 in annual support, but Eda Silber, 37, of Long Island can keep the \$300,000 she's already been paid, the *New York Post* reported Monday.

And even though Eda Silber married husband No 2, George Frenkel, before her divorce from Daniel Silber became final, she's not a bigamist under law because there was no state marriage license involved in her second

wedding, the court said.

Eda and Daniel Silber married in 1995 and had four children. In 2006, she left the family to move in with Frenkel, a wealthy 51-year-old pillow manufacturer who showered her with expensive gifts and vacations, court papers say.

Silber sued for divorce but Eda kept stalling all the while "she was being plied with lavish gifts by her male companion," hearing officer Stanley Gartenstein said.

Eda Silber, claiming to be an Orthodox Jew, allegedly married Frenkel last April in a religious service but without benefit of a state marriage, *the Post* reported.

German group upset by dictionary's word

A German dictionary maker drew heat from a group dedicated to preserving the language by picking an English-derived word as the "Youth Word of the Year."

The Verein Deutsche Sprache, which is dedicated to preserving the purity of the German language, criticized dictionary-maker Langenscheidt for choosing "swag," an English-derived word meaning an "envious, casual-cool appeal" and a "charismatic positive aura," as its "Youth Word of the Year," *The Local* reported Monday. The group said the dictionary's choice is contributing to the language being diluted by foreign influence.

Christie's to sell Elizabeth Taylor art collection

LONDON, 17 Jan—A Vincent van Gogh landscape and other paintings from the collection of Elizabeth Taylor are up for auction in London next month.

Christie's auction house says 38 works belonging to the late actress will be included in Impressionist and modern sales 7 and 8 Feb.

They include van Gogh's autumn landscape "Vue de l'Asile et de la Chapelle de Saint-Remy," estimated at 5 million to 7 million pounds (\$7.6

million) to \$11 million), as well as an Edgar Degas self-portrait and works by Camille Pissarro and Auguste Renoir.

The daughter of a London art dealer, Taylor amassed a significant collection of 19th and 20th century works.

Her father, Francis Taylor, bought the van Gogh painting in 1963 on his daughter's behalf for \$257,600 at a Sotheby's auction in London.

It was later the subject of an ownership battle that ended

in 2007, when the US Supreme Court refused to consider a claim brought by descendants of a former owner, a Jewish woman who had fled Germany in 1939.

"Having grown up surrounded by fine art and surrounded by her own canvasses until the end of her life, this collection of paintings was very important to Miss Taylor," said Christie's Impressionist and Modern specialist Giovanna Bertazzoni.—INTERNET

50 years of James Bond cars on show

LONDON, 17 Jan—The largest collection of James Bond vehicles in the world opens to the public on Tuesday in Britain featuring classics such as the Aston Martin DBS from "Quantum of Solace."

Mickey's next stop is China

NEW YORK, 17 Jan—Mickey Mouse and Winnie the Pooh are setting up shop in China.

Walt Disney Co is on track to open its first store in China in Fall 2012, and is committed to opening 25 to 40 stores in the world's most populous country over the next three years, a top company executive told *Reuters*.

The news comes as the world's largest media conglomerate, home to iconic brands such as Mickey Mouse and Winnie the Pooh, looks beyond mature markets such as the United States and Europe for new sources of revenue.

"China is very important to overall Disney company plans, obviously with the launch of the Shanghai Disneyland Park. So, it is probably the newest country that is getting the most focus," Jim Fielding, president of Disney Stores Worldwide, said in an exclusive interview. Disney broke ground on the Shanghai Disneyland theme park in April 2011.

Also, the Chinese are not new to the Disney brand.

"Because the licensing division has had a presence in China already, there is affinity for the brand and affinity for characters," he said. "The market is ready."

Disney has signed a lease for its first store in Shanghai and is looking at sites in other top tier cities such as Beijing,

Fielding said.

"We are focusing on tier-one cities in very high population and tourist locations, very similar to what we look at around the world," Fielding explained.

The difference will be in Disney's strategy to woo the Chinese.

"The product assortment is definitely localized to Chinese consumers and Chinese knowledge because they don't know all the Disney characters that people know in America and in Europe," he said.

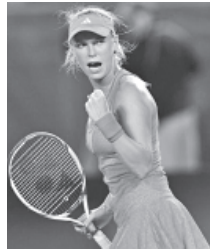
The 21-year-old Czech broke her Russian rival's serve three times in each set and finished off Tuesday's opening match on Rod Laver Arena in an hour. Kvitova reached the quarterfinals here last year at the start of a season in which she surged up the rankings.

Last week, she missed

Dulko's next two service games and while the Argentine had three break points when the fourth seed was serving for the match she was unable to stave off the inevitable.—*Internet*

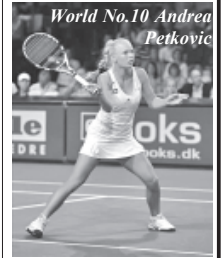

Uncertainty clouds recovery of skier Burke in Utah

SALT LAKE CITY, 17 Jan—Canadian freestyle skier Sarah Burke's agent and her publicist were teary-eyed at a hospital on Monday as they tried to explain the lack of any prognosis report for the Olympic favourite. Burke, 29, was seriously injured on 10 January in a training accident at the superpipe in Park City, Utah, and six days later remained sedated on a breathing tube as doctors tested her brain functions.

Reporters gathered at Salt Lake City hospital on Monday for what was expected to be a discussion by doctors of Burke's most recent neurological tests and assessments. At the last minute, however, Burke's agent, Michael Spencer, and her publicist, Nicole Wool, said there was nothing the family wanted to report as doctors continued working on Burke, so the news conference was canceled. "Obviously, this is a sensitive situation," a somber Wool said at the University of Utah Hospital.—*Internet*

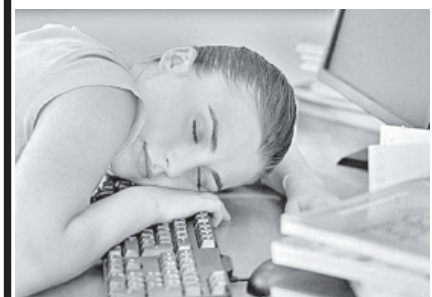

NAPLES, 17 Jan—Napoli's title hopes took another blow as Walter Mazzarri's team were frustrated by lowly Bologna, who held them to a 1-1 draw at the San Paolo Stadium on Monday. Being desk-bound can erode physical, mental health



LONDON, 17 Jan—Being desk-bound for long hours daily is not only bad for your physical health but can affect your mental well-being as well.

The findings by Myanna Duncan, Aadil Kazi and Cheryl Haslam, professor at Work & Health Research Centre, Loughborough University, also showed that more time spent sitting at work was tied with decrease in mental well-being.

Researchers surveyed over 1,000 employees measuring employees' use and experiences of occupational health services and their physical activity levels.

In the UK, as elsewhere in Europe, there are now twice as many workers aged 50 and over as there are aged 25 or younger.

Duncan says: "People don't need a psychologist to tell them to get up and walk around. But if it helps, I'd tell them to put a post-it note on their computer to remind them. Anyway go and talk to your colleagues face to face, it's a lot more sociable and better for you than emailing them."

These findings were presented at the British Psychological Society's Annual Occupational Psychology Conference, in Chester.—*Internet*

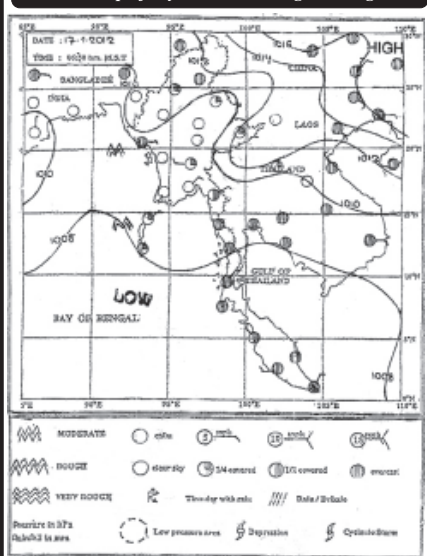
