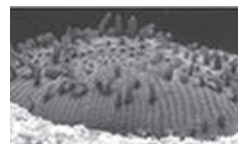

Clinton, Israeli FM discuss Iran, peace talks

WASHINGTON, 8 Feb—US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton on Tuesday discussed with her Israeli counterpart Avigdor Lieberman a wide range of issues, including Iran, bilateral ties and the peace talks with the Palestinians.

In their meeting that lasted about 40 minutes, the pair discussed some seven topics, “just a little bit on each,” State Department spokeswoman Victoria Nuland said.

“With regard to Iran, they talked extensively about the impact that the new sanctions are having in our efforts to work with countries around the world to wean them from Iranian oil and, obviously, our mutual commitment to prevent Iran from getting a nuclear weapon and to increase the pressure through these sanctions,” Nuland told reporters at a regular news briefing.

Following the European Union’s decision last month to target Iran’s oil exports for sanctions, US President Barack Obama ordered on Sunday to freeze all property of the Iranian government and the financial institutions under US jurisdiction, including that of the Central Bank of Iran, in an effort to tighten the pressure on the Islamic republic over its controversial nuclear programme.

The Obama administration prefers a diplomatic approach to Iran’s alleged attempt to acquire nuclear weapons, while rumours are growing about an imminent strike by

Israel on the Islamic republic’s nuclear facilities.

Nuland noted that in her meeting with Lieberman, Clinton reaffirmed “our unshakable commitment” to the relationship with Israel, not only to Israel’s security, but to its democracy.

She said on the peace talks with the Palestinians, Lieberman reaffirmed Israel’s commitment to the two-state solution and its interest in continuing the process of “trying to get to direct talks.”

US to send second ship to bolster Philippines

WASHINGTON, 8 Feb—The United States will soon give a second Coast Guard cutter to the Philippines as part of efforts to boost the ally’s military amid tensions at sea with China, officials said on Tuesday. The United States last year transferred its Hamilton cutter to the Philippines, which made it the flagship of its notoriously dilapidated navy and recently sent it on a mission to the disputed Spratly islands.

Lawmakers will this week conclude formalities to send to the former US colony another cutter, the Dallas, Representative Ed Royce and senior Pentagon official Peter Lavoy told a congressional hearing. “It should soon be on its way to Manila,” said Royce, a Republican from southern California whose district has a significant Filipino American community.

“The US and the Philippines want peace and stability in this region, which is key to the global economy,” Royce said as he chaired the

hearing of a House Foreign Affairs subcommittee.

The Philippines and other Southeast Asian countries have accused China of bellicose behaviour over disputes in the South China Sea. Despite historical sensitivities about US troops, the Philippines has said it would welcome further rotations by US forces on its soil and more joint exercises.

Lavoy, the top civilian at the Pentagon handling East Asia, said that the United States was “considering a range of military capabilities” as it helps the Philippines move from “an inward focus on domestic threats to an

outwardly focused military that needs to be reorganised to address external concerns.”

But Lavoy was non-committal when asked whether the United States would be willing to provide F-16 fighter jets to the Philippines, saying it was critical to look at affordability and other factors.

Kurt Campbell, the assistant secretary of state for East Asia, said that cooperation also depended on human rights. Congress has blocked \$3 million due to concerns over extrajudicial killings by the Philippine military.

Russian Navy to update nuclear fleet

MOSCOW, 8 Feb—The Russian Navy will receive at least 10 new Borey class strategic nuclear submarines by 2020, *Kommersant Daily* said Tuesday.

According to the report, the new submarine fleet is expected to become the core of Russia’s naval force in the future, in line with a revised state armament procurement

programme until 2020.

The programme also envisions the procurement of 10 Graney class nuclear attack submarines and 20 diesel-electric subs, including six Varshavyanka class vessels, said the report.

In addition to submarines, the Navy will receive 14 frigates, 35 corvettes, six Buyan class small artillery

ships and six Ivan Gren Class large landing ships.

Russian Prime Minister Vladimir Putin said last year that the updating of warships and submarines for the Navy would be a priority over the next decade.

The Russian government has allocated five trillion rubles (about \$166 billion) for this purpose.—Xinhua

10 killed in US drone strike in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 8 Feb—At least 10 people were killed and two others injured when a US drone launched two missile strikes in North Waziristan Region of Pakistan’s northwest tribal belt on Wednesday morning, local media reported.

According to the report by local TV channel ARY, the attack was launched early in the morning when a US drone fired two missiles at militants’ hideout in Spalga Village of North Waziristan, a militancy-hit tribal area at Pak-Afghan borderlands. The report said that the death toll may further

rise as the injured are in critical condition. On Wednesday morning’s drone strike came just one day after Defence Minister of Pakistan Chaudhry Ahmed Mukhtar said that the issue of US drone attacks is unresolved and Pakistan would continue raising the issue to the United States. Washington believes that the Northwestern tribal belt of Pakistan is a militant-militant area and these militants are a continuous source of headache to NATO forces operating in Afghanistan.

Wiping out suspected militants from Northwestern

Pakistan is also vital to win the long war against terrorism carried out by both Washington and Islamabad.

Anger against the US drone strikes in the Waziristan tribal areas runs high in Pakistan because the attacks have killed hundreds of innocent people including women and kids since 2004.

This is the fifth strike of its kind in northwestern tribal area of Pakistan since the beginning of 2012. To date, 36 people have been killed and several others injured in 13 missile strikes launched by US drones.—Xinhua

Two die in hand grenade attack in Pakistan’s Karachi

ISLAMABAD, 8 Feb—A hand grenade attack killed two persons in the Pakistani port City of Karachi on Tuesday night, police said.

Six more people were injured in the attack at Liyari area of the city, police officer Nasir Aftab said.

He said that four people riding two motorcycles threw a hand grenade at women and children who were taking drinking water from a plant.

The motorcyclists fled after the attack.

Local residents said the grenade was thrown at people outside the office of People’s Aman Committee. The committee is considered pro the ruling Pakistan Peoples Party but was banned last year after the powerful group Mutahida Qaumi Movement blamed it for violence.

The police officer said a search was launched for the attackers. No group claimed responsibility for the attack as of now. Local residents staged a demonstration against the attack and demanded the government to apprehend the culprits.

The injured, including women and children, were taken to a local hospital.

Commons Health Select Committee hears evidence on PIP implants

LONDON, 8 Feb — About 1,000 private patients with PIP breast implants have contacted the NHS in England. The figure was given by Professor Sir Bruce Keogh, NHS Medical Director, in evidence to the Commons Health Select Committee. Last month the NHS in England said it would remove PIP implants from private patients but would not replace them. It is thought around 40,000 women in Britain have PIP implants, the vast majority of surgery being for breast augmentation performed in the private sector. Professor Keogh said 745 NHS patients with PIP implants had so far been identified but this figure may

rise. Most of this surgery was reconstructive following breast cancer.

In December the French government recommended the removal of all PIP implants because of concerns about high rupture rates and doubts about their long-term safety. In January an expert committee led by Professor Keogh said there was no need for routine removal but recognised the anxiety the issue was causing women. He said there was a "significant uncertainty" about the safety of PIP implants and his committee was doing all it could to collate hard evidence; countries which had recommended the implants be removed were acting on the same information available in the UK.—Internet

Transplant jaw made by 3D printer claimed as first

LONDON, 8 Feb — A 3D printer-created lower jaw has been fitted to an 83-year-old woman's face in what doctors say is the first operation of its kind. The transplant was carried out in

June in the Netherlands, but is only now being publicised. The implant was made out of titanium powder — heated and fused together by a laser, one layer at a time. Technicians say the operation's success paves the way for the use of more 3D-printed patient-specific parts. The surgery follows research carried out at the Biomedical Research Institute at Hasselt University in Belgium, and the implant was built by LayerWise — a specialised metal-parts manufacturer based in the same country.

The patient involved had developed a chronic bone infection. Doctors believed reconstructive

surgery would have been risky because of her age and so opted for the new technology. The implant is a complex part—involving articulated joints, cavities to promote muscle attachment and grooves to direct the regrowth of nerves and veins. However, once designed, it only took a few hours to print."

Once we received the 3D digital design, the part was split up automatically into 2D layers and then we sent those cross sections to the printing machine," Ruben Wauthle, LayerWise's medical applications engineer, told the BBC.

Researchers say diabetes quadruples birth defects risk

LONDON, 8 Feb — The risk of birth defects increases four-fold if the pregnant mother has diabetes, researchers say. The Newcastle University study, published in the journal *Diabetologia*, analysed data from more than 400,000 pregnancies in North East England. The risk of defects such as congenital heart disease and spina bifida were increased. National guidelines already recommend having good control over blood sugar

levels before trying to conceive.

Both Type 1 diabetes, which tends to appear in childhood, and Type 2 diabetes, often linked to diet, lead to problems controlling the amount of sugar in the blood. This is known to cause problems in pregnancy, such as birth defects, miscarriage and the baby being overweight due to too much sugar. There is concern that rising levels of diabetes, particularly Type



Insulin can be used to control sugar levels during pregnancy.

2, could make the issue worse. Researchers analysed data from 401,149 pregnancies between 1996 and 2008—1,677 women had diabetes. The risk of birth defects went

from 19 in every 1,000 births for women without pre-existing diabetes to 72 in every 1,000 births for women with diabetes. Their report said that sugar levels in the run-up to conception were the "most important" risk factor which could be controlled. The lead researcher, Dr Ruth Bell from Newcastle University, told the BBC: "Many of these anomalies happen in the first four to six weeks."—Internet

India aviation sector rescue plans unveiled

NEW DELHI, 8 Feb — India has set out plans to allow aviation firms to import jet fuel directly, as part of a package aimed at bolstering the ailing air industry. A ministerial panel also recommended debt restructuring for Air India and that foreign firms could take a stake of up to 49% in Indian carriers. The measures will now go to the cabinet for final approval. Five of India's six main airlines are loss-making. They have been particularly badly hit on fuel price. Analysts say

the import proposal could save them up to 20% on fuel costs. Share prices in airlines soared on the news, with Kingfisher up 20%, SpiceJet 19% and Jet Airways 16.8%.

The Group of Ministers meeting, held in Delhi, was headed by Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee. Aviation Minister Ajit Singh said that "companies will be allowed to import fuel directly for their use. This has to go to the cabinet. The Group of Ministers has approved this. We will try to see whether some kind of credit arrangement can be made."

The fuel move will cut the tax burden for the airlines. The carriers at present must buy from oil marketing companies and are subject to a number of levies. Mr Singh also said that Air India would be allowed to issue 74bn rupees (\$1.5bn) through bonds and other means as part of a restructuring package. The cabinet must also decide on whether to allow foreign airlines to buy stakes of up to 49% in India's airlines.

Correspondents say that allowing foreign investment will bring much-needed cash for the ailing carriers. Mr Singh has admitted the aviation sector is in a "rough patch". Last week oil firms halted supplies to Air India for four hours, saying they had not been paid. Air India has been making heavy losses and its debt burden has been raising increasing concerns about its long-term viability. Kingfisher Airlines recently announced significant losses and shut its budget carrier, Kingfisher Red, last year. A recent internal report also raised finance-related safety concerns over Kingfisher Airlines and Air India Express.—Internet

Citigroup wins approval to launch credit cards in China

HONG KONG, 8 Feb — The Chinese unit of Citigroup will be the first non-Asian bank to launch credit cards in China. The US-based bank announced on Monday that the move had been approved by China's banking regulator. Citibank (China) will offer credit cards to Chinese customers later this year. Citi is looking to cash in on China's increasing consumption, and had already established consumer and corporate banking businesses in the country.

"This approval represents a significant milestone in the continued expansion of Citi's business in China, a priority market for Citi," said Stephen Bird, chief executive officer for Citi Asia Pacific. Until now, Hong Kong's Bank of East Asia was the only 'foreign' bank to offer credit cards in China. Citi has offered 'co-branded' credit cards with Shanghai Pudong Development Bank (SPDB) since 2003. Citibank has branches in 13 Chinese cities.—Internet

Theme parks and TV channels drive Disney profits

NEW YORK, 8 Feb — Profits at Walt Disney have risen thanks to the rising popularity of its theme parks and earnings from its television channels. Disney reported profits between October and December last year of \$1.46bn (£0.92bn), a rise of 12%. However revenue in its film business fell, despite the successful release of the *Muppets* movie in the United States. Disney's shares fell by 1.3% in after-hours trading in New York.

Revenue overall for the quarter rose by 1% to \$10.8bn, slightly short of analysts' expectations. It was helped by higher ticket prices and attendance levels at Disney's theme parks. The company said those revenues were boosted by the opening of Toy Story Land at Hong Kong Disneyland in November. Disney's television businesses performed solidly, the company said, with cable and satellite distributors paying more to carry ESPN sports programming.

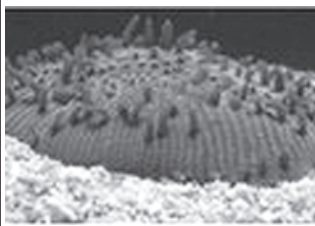

Corals inflate to escape being buried alive in sand



CANBERRA, 8 Feb—Coral might appear solid and inanimate, but surprising new footage of a mushroom coral inflating itself to escape a sandy burial has brought the organism to life. A scientist from the University of Queensland used timelapse photography to capture the footage. It was already known that the species could release itself from the sandy seabed, but it was not clear how. Since corals move so slowly, time-lapse imagery was used to find out.

Dr Pim Bongaerts captured the footage and published his findings in the journal *Coral Reef*. As sandy sediments shift on the seabed, corals need to breathe and prevent themselves from being smothered. “Sedimentation presents a major threat for corals, as they can become covered in a layer of sand from which they are unable to escape,” explained Dr Bongaerts. To find out how mushroom corals — a particularly mobile family of corals — did this, the researcher brought specimens into the lab and put them in aquaria in order to film the process.

“I covered the corals in sediment and, from that moment on, started photographing them every 10 seconds for 20 hours,” Dr Bongaerts said. Unlike many of the more familiar branching and “staghorn-type” corals, mushroom corals have a relatively thick layer of fleshy tissue on top of their tough calcium carbonate skeleton.

NASA should participate in dark matter-mapping mission

WASHINGTON, 8 Feb—NASA should contribute \$20 million worth of hardware to Europe’s planned Euclid dark-matter observatory, but only “in the context of a strong US commitment” to the proposed Wide-field Infrared Survey Telescope (WFIRST), a panel of astrophysicists said. The National Research Council’s Committee on the Assessment of a Plan for US

Participation in Euclid was asked by NASA in November to determine whether that mission would help fulfill any of WFIRST’s science objectives. The European Space Agency (ESA) wants NASA to provide near-infrared detectors for Euclid in exchange for a spot on the 12-member Euclid science team and early access to the mission’s science data. ESA

Fatal shark attacks see spike in 2011

NEW YORK, 8 Feb—The numbers are in, and 2011 continued the downward trend in shark attacks in the United States. That’s the good news. The bad news: Worldwide shark-related deaths were higher than they’ve been in nearly two decades, according to the report released today (7 Feb). The 2011 spike in shark-attack fatalities — all of which occurred outside of the United States — suggests tourists are venturing to more remote places, said ichthyologist George Burgess, director of the University of Florida’s International Shark Attack File, which released the shark-

attack numbers.

“We had a number of fatalities in essentially out-of-the-way places, where there’s not the same quantity and quality of medical attention readily available,” Burgess, of the Florida Museum of Natural History, said in a statement. “They also don’t have histories of shark attacks in these regions, so there are not contingency plans in effect like there are in places such as Florida.”

The report tallied 75 global shark attacks, a number closely matching the decade average. Twenty-nine attacks occurred in the United States, with 11 of those

from Florida. Other countries with multiple shark attacks included: 11 in Australia; five in South Africa; four in Reunion; three each in Mexico and Russia; and two each in the Seychelles and Brazil. As expected, surfers and others involved in board sports took the brunt of the attacks, accounting for 60 percent of unprovoked shark attacks, swimmers 35 percent and divers about 5 percent.

“It’s more than coincidence that we’ve had this drop over this last decade,” Burgess said.

Trendnet security cam flaw exposes video feeds on net

NEW YORK, 8 Feb — Feeds from thousands of Trendnet home security cameras have been breached, allowing any web user to access live footage without needing a password.

Internet addresses which link to the video streams have been posted to a variety of popular messageboard sites. Users have expressed concern after finding they could

view children’s bedrooms, among other locations.

US-based Trendnet says it is in the process of releasing updates to correct a coding error introduced in 2010. It said it had emailed customers who had registered affected devices to alert them to the problem. However, a spokesman told the *BBC* that “roughly 5%” of purchasers had registered their cameras and it had not yet issued a formal media release — despite

being aware of the problem for more than three weeks.

“We first became aware of this on 12 January,” said Zak Wood, Trendnet’s director of global marketing. “As of this week we have identified 26 [vulnerable] models. (In) seven of the models, the firmware has been tested and released. “We anticipate to have all of the revised firmware available this week. We are scrambling to discover how the code was

introduced and at this point it seems like a coding oversight.” Mr Wood added that the California-based firm estimated that “fewer than 1,000 units” might be open

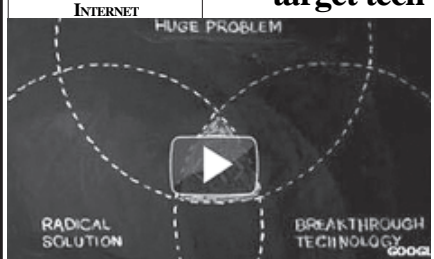
to this threat in the UK, but could not immediately provide an exact global tally beyond saying that it was “most likely less than 50,000.” — Internet

Renesas, Fujitsu, Panasonic in talks to merge system chip ops

TOKYO, 8 Feb—Renesas Electronics Corp, Fujitsu Ltd and Panasonic Corp are in talks to merge their chip operations, four sources familiar with the matter told *Reuters* on Wednesday. The three firms are considering spinning off their system chip design and development divisions, with production to be transferred to California-based Globalfoundries Inc, which is planning to set up a company in Japan, the sources said.

The government-backed investment fund Innovation Network Corp is likely to be involved in the project, according to the sources. *The Nikkei* newspaper has also reported that Elpida Memory Inc officials and Globalfoundries would meet this week to discuss a possible sale of Elpida’s Hiroshima factory. Elpida said in a statement that the report on the sale of the Hiroshima plant was incorrect, but did not specify what element of the report was wrong. — Reuters

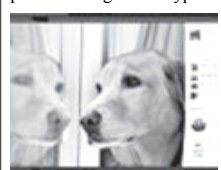
Facebook launches widescreen photo viewer similar to Google

Obama touts plan for better math and science instruction

WASHINGTON, 8 Feb— President Barack Obama announced on Tuesday an \$80 million plan to improve mathematics and science instruction in US public schools as one of his initiatives to revive the economy.

“(W)e’re a nation of tinkers and dreamers and believers in a better tomorrow,” Obama said at the White House Science Fair attended by more than 100 students from all over the country. “We know that

innovation has helped each generation pass down that basic American promise, which is no matter who you are, no matter where you come from, you can make it if you try,” he told the students, praising them for “making sure America will win the race to the future”.

Obama said he will request Congress for the \$80 million when he submits his 2013 budget next week.

The plan, to be administered by the Department of Education,

would provide training for 10,000 science and math teachers while boosting to 1 million the number of students graduating in the sciences, technology, mathematics and engineering in the next decade.

Praising support from the private sector, the president said the Carnegie Corporation is leading a group of businesses and foundations that has created a \$22-million fund to provide added support for this teacher-training

programme.

The White House organized the science fair, which included innovative projects by more than 100 public-school students to highlight the benefits won by improving the teaching of science and math.

Since he came to power in 2009, Obama has emphasized the urgency of improving mathematics and science teaching in public schools as part of his plan to springboard economic recovery.—*Internet*

Florence Green, last WW1 veteran, dies

KINGS LYNN, 8 Feb— Florence Green, a veteran of the Women's Royal Air Force and the last living veteran of World War I, died at the age of 110 in an English nursing home. Green died in her sleep during the weekend, the *Norfolk Eastern Daily Press* reported.

While she became the last survivor of the millions who served in the war, Green was only identified as a veteran in 2008, the newspaper said. A gerontology researcher discovered her service records, which were under her maiden name, Patterson.

“She would never blow her own trumpet and certainly wouldn't shout about the fact she was the last veteran,” June

Evetts, at 76 the youngest of her three children, said. Green enlisted at the age of 17 in 1918 and worked as a waitress in the officer's mess at RAF Marham. The base, home to wooden biplanes during World War I, now houses supersonic Tornados, which have seen service in Afghanistan. Green said she enjoyed her work but discovered when a pilot took her up for a spin that she was afraid of flying.

In her last years, Green lived with her older daughter in Kings Lynn until moving to the nursing home just before Christmas. RAF Squadron Leader Paula Wilmott said a delegation from Marham had been

planning to visit Green this Friday with a cake for her upcoming 111th birthday.

Brazil files suits against Twitter on police traps

BRASILIA, 8 Feb—The Brazilian government has filed a lawsuit against Twitter and its users in a bid to stop publication of messages alerting drivers to police speed traps and drunk-driving checkpoints. The suit was filed in a federal court in the central-west state of Goias.

Brazil has asked for the “immediate suspension of all accounts that give information about the location of police radar,” the office of the Attorney General of the Union, who defence the state's interest, said in a statement. The government also wants “the definitive closure of accounts revealing

the date, time and place of police checkpoints,” the statement said.

Several Brazilian states have adopted strict zero-tolerance laws to tackle drunk-driving. Drivers are increasingly using social media sites such as Twitter to alert others to the location of police checkpoints. The attorney general's office said such a move constituted “a direct blow to human life and security” of Brazil's citizens. About 55,000 people die in the country each year in road accidents.

News of the lawsuit raged on Twitter, with some applauding the government's



move and others criticizing it, noting that driver tweets also helped others avoid accidents and traffic bottlenecks, CBN radio reported. San Francisco-based Twitter announced last month that it could block tweets on a country-by-country basis if legally

required to do so.

Twitter pledged to be transparent and said it would post details of any removal of content to Chilling-Effects.org, a public database of takedown requests. No posts relating to the Brazil case were found on Tuesday.

Italian cruise ship captain must remain under house arrest, judge rules

ROME, 8 Feb—The Italian captain of the shipwrecked cruise liner *Costa Concordia* must remain under house arrest while investigators look into possible charges against him, a court in Florence, Italy, ruled Tuesday, a defence lawyer said.

The court rejected a prosecution motion that Francesco Schettino be sent back to jail as well as a defence motion that he be set free, according to lawyer Alessandro Antichi. Schettino's other attorney, Salvatore Parascandola, called the ruling “quite positive” as it rejected the prosecution's request to send the captain back to jail.

When informed of the ruling, Schettino “maintained his serenity,” Parascandola said. Attorneys will likely wait until 9 February, when the full text of the court's decision is published, to decide whether to appeal, Antichi said.

The captain faces possible charges of manslaughter, shipwreck and abandoning ship in connection with the 13 January incident. The vessel struck rocks and rolled onto its side in the waters off the Italian island of Giglio. At least 16 people died. Authorities say 16 people remain missing from the roughly 4,200 people who were aboard the ship.

Schettino has said managers of the cruise line instructed him to sail close to the island and has denied allegations that he was sailing too fast. He has said the rock the ship struck was not indicated on his charts of the area.—*Internet*

Five missing after Japan refinery tunnel collapse

TOKYO, 8 Feb—Five workers were missing Tuesday after an undersea tunnel collapsed as it was being constructed at one of Japan's largest oil refineries, emergency services and reports said. Local media said divers were being sent to the site in Kurashiki, where firefighters confirmed to *AFP* they were dealing with an incident at the site, which lies around 550 kilometres (350 miles) west of Tokyo.

“We received a report that an accident occurred at the No 2 undersea tunnel in the port of Mizushima, involving six workers,” said a spokesman for the Kurashiki City fire department. “One of the six got out but the five others are missing,” he said without disclosing further details.

Jiji Press said the accident happened at an oil refinery operated by JX Nippon Oil and Energy Corp. *NHK* said seawater may have poured into the tunnel and police are sending divers to the accident site.—*Internet*

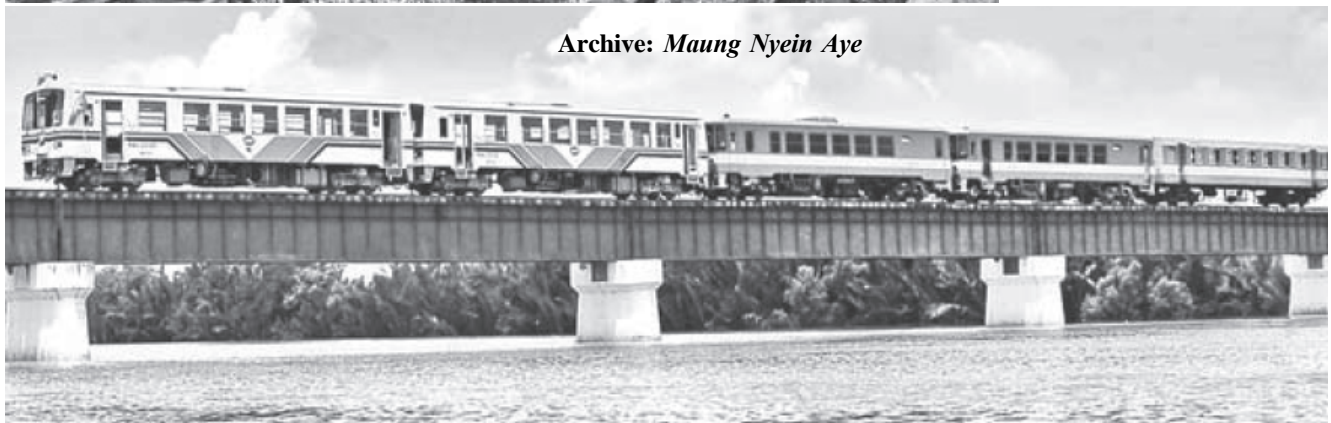

that their own possessions are lost and the environment is thrown into disarray. Sinking in thoughts of society, I realized that breakdowns of grouping or unity are often found in our society, as of rafts, damaging one's own interests and colouring the society. Men of intelligence are cause of most damages. Also, human beings are responsible to attempt to avoid these consequences.

Iraq and Afghanistan are good examples. Debris piling around the whole country, trembling neighbourhoods and horrible casualties shown even by incomplete figures throw a light on errors of strategy. While those who introduce the strategy prepare their backpacks and wave goodbye to the countries in ashes and burnt rubbles, disintegrated peoples of the hardly recognized democracies are left in cycle of tears and grieves. It will take years to remedy the situations. The proverb, "It is never too late to mend", is not for them. It takes them forever to mend.

"OK, we have democracy. We can talk freely with no fear. We can demonstrate and vote freely. All these are available, and all were not before 2003. But why don't you ask us about the other side of the story of the U.S. presence in Iraq? Why don't you ask about their crimes, atrocities, the pain and anguish that we suffered because of their military presence here?" Hussain Ali, a student in Baghdad said.

"What democracy are you asking me about, when my basic rights as a human being are stolen?" Wael al-Khafaji, a shopkeeper who has to deal with roadside attacks and bomb blasts daily. First, they had no worry about their future. If they protested, if they attacked or if foreign troops entered, they thought they would eventually establish democracy. These are consequences of democracy which is not fundamental and suited them.

Apart from imported democracies, outcomes of Egypt, Libya, Syria, Yemen and Bahrain which build democracy through violent protests by brute force do not have many differences. Despite poetic title, Arab Spring is the spring painted in blood and is supposed to end with troubles and poverty. What resulted from it are only splits between ethnic groups.

In light of these significant examples, genuine goodwill of the former government, which help the country walk on the road to democracy in stable and peaceful manner, and of the new government, which assume the power of the country well, on the State and people is tangible. The Union is in democracy without suffering grieves as in abovementioned countries thanks to this generosity. It is a practical model of firm Union Spirit.

As our country is now building a new and developed democracy, it is bounden duty for all national races to keep prevailing national unity stronger than ever and help the Union develop. In so doing, the government is bringing about equitable development of the Union and three pillars are picking up strengths. In developing the Union, making peace and democratic processes should be carried out in accordance with national objectives.

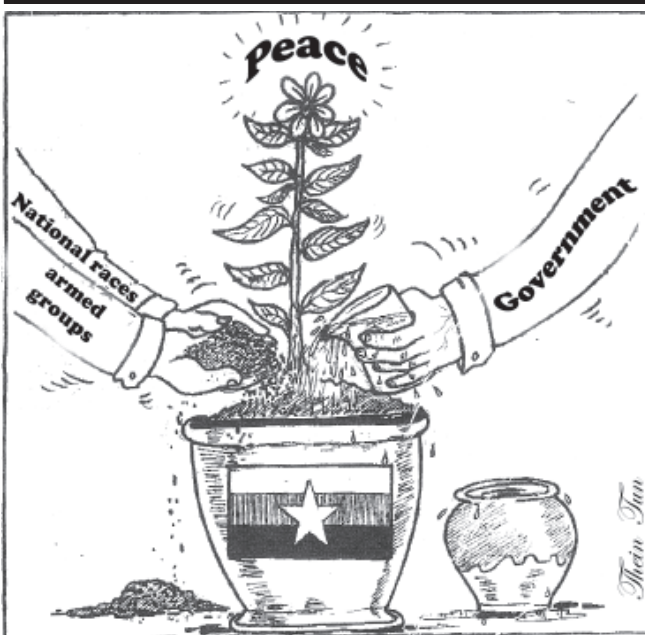

HAVANA, 8 Feb—A Cuban sculptor uses tobacco leaves to create wonderful pieces of art, and has made life-size as well as miniature sculptures of Winston Churchill, Che Guevara, John F Kennedy, Charles Chaplin, Luciano Pavarotti and Arnold Schwarzenegger.

With his unique work, Janio Nunez Leal has pieces in many private collections around the work, the *Prensa Latina* news agency reported. Nunez, who worked as a

"torcedor" or cigar twister in many cigar factories, first took up the idea of becoming a tobacco sculptor in 1994.

His work will be on display at the 14th Habano Cigar Festival to be held 27 Feb-2 March.

Tourists wanting to know more about Cuban culture and tobacco are flocking to his recently opened studio-workshop in Boca Ciega beach in Havana.

In 2000, Nunez met Celia Sandy, granddaughter

He says his sculptures are made only of tobacco leaves, using only an idea without any mold or frame.

His pieces, however, must be well preserved at 18-24 degrees Celsius and a relative humidity of 60-70 percent.

Stun gun used on woman at McDonald's

FAYETTEVILLE, 8 Feb—Sheriff's deputies used a stun gun on a woman who was holding up the drive-through line at a North Carolina McDonald's restaurant, a sheriff's spokeswoman said.

Deputies used what is called a "drive stun," not a full stun-gun hit, on Evangeline Marrero Lucca, 37, said Debbie Tanna of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office.

Lucca cut to the front of the line at the McDonald's in Fayetteville Friday afternoon and sat there for about 20 minutes before deputies arrived, *The Fayetteville Observer* reported.

"She did not want to wait in line," Tanna said. "They

told her she had to go around and wait like everybody else did and place her order that way, that they weren't set up at that window to take her order or take her money. ... She wasn't having any of that." Tanna said Lucca refused to move her vehicle and got confrontational with employees. "When we arrived, she really got mad," Tanna said.

Customer Anthony Rich, who witnessed the incident, said deputies ordered Lucca out of the car but she refused. He said this continued for 20 minutes or so before officers forced Lucca out of her vehicle.

"Two or three officers entered the car with her and started trying to forcibly drag her out of the car and that's

when you could hear the clicking sound of the Taser one time," Rich said. "They pulled on her a couple of times and then they Tased her again and when they Tased her the second time she just flopped out of the car like a fish." Lucca was charged with second-degree trespassing.

Social workers took custody of her 3-year-old child, who was in the car at the time of the incident, Tanna said.

"Our top priority was making sure people weren't hurt because we didn't know if she was going to drive the car off and run over somebody," Tanna said. "Then there was the baby in the car we were concerned about."—Internet

Tigers attack tourist bus in China

BEIJING, 8 Feb—A group of 27 visitors to a Chinese zoo had the shock of their life when their bus was attacked by enraged Bengal tigers. The trauma continued for 20 minutes since the tiger zone's gatekeeper had gone out for lunch.

According to zoo authorities in Shandong province's Capital Jinan, the incident occurred Saturday noon when around five adult tigers bit into the bus' tires and smashed the bus with their paws, breaking its windows, the *Shanghai Daily* reported.

The zoo staff learned about the incident only after they looked at the security cameras and rushed to open the gate for the tigers 20 minutes later, *Jinan Times* reported. No one was hurt in the incident.

Learning many languages 'no problem for infants'

SINGAPORE, 8 Feb—A child's language learning ability is not hindered even if he or she is taught multiple languages, according to a landmark study.

The study of 100 infants, aged between 18 and 30 months, found they could coordinate different sets of rules when learning different languages.

The infants were taught a new word using a video display, and then an element, for example, the tone, would be changed. Researchers would track the children's eye movements to see if they thought the meaning of the word had changed.

Associate Professor Leher Singh from the National University of Singapore's Department of

Psychology found that children aged 18 months could differentiate words using vowels and tones in the languages that they are learning, and it did not matter if they were monolingual English learners or English-Mandarin bilinguals.

When children reached the age of 24 months, English learners were able to identify that a vowel change means a change in meaning for English words.

English-Mandarin learners, meanwhile, were able to consider both vowel and tone changes when identifying that there was a change to the meaning of Mandarin words.

She also found that children aged 30 months were able to translate between

English and Mandarin but could only do so from the language that they were dominant into the non-dominant language.

For example, if an infant learns 60 percent English and 40 percent Mandarin, the child can translate rapidly from English to Mandarin but not vice versa.

The landmark study did not come without its own challenges. "When working with children ... you are not sure if you caught the child in a bad or uncooperative mood," said Assoc Prof Singh.

Her team is looking to study this area further and are recruiting about 200 children between the ages of two to four. Parents can contact Ms Calista Chan at psyjc@nus.edu.sg.—Internet

**Bankruptcies
soar in Spain**

MADRID, 8 Feb —The number of Spanish firms and individuals declaring bankruptcy rose 13.3 percent last year to 6,755, the highest total since the country's bankruptcy law took effect in 2004, officials said Tuesday.

One in every three companies that went bankrupt in 2011 was in the construction or property business, according to a report from the National Statistics Institute.

Bankruptcies in Spain declined by 7.2 percent in 2010 after skyrocketing 80 percent the previous year as the economic crisis deepened.

More than 5,800 firms filed for bankruptcy last year, an increase of 16.7 percent over 2010, while individual bankruptcies dipped 3.9 percent to 934.

The 2008 global financial meltdown came as Spain was struggling to contain the damage from the bursting of a decade-long real estate bubble. The ensuing slump has led to numerous business failures and pushed the country's jobless rate to nearly 23 percent, representing 5.2 million people out of work.

Federer recalls emotional 2001 Davis Cup win vs US

FRIBOURG, 8 Feb — Roger Federer hopes to recapture the emotion of Switzerland's 2001 Davis Cup victory against the United States when they meet again in the first round this weekend. Federer recalled the Swiss win on Tuesday, when as a 19-year-old he won three matches

for a 3-2 victory in his home city of Basel. "I think it was my first emotional outburst on a tennis court because I was so exhausted on Sunday after winning singles, doubles and singles," Federer said.

Federer said that performance, against a US team led by Todd Martin,

"definitely got me in winning ways." Months later at Wimbledon, he beat four-time defending champion Pete Sampras in the fourth round. "It was a start of great things for me and I'm happy playing America again," said the 30-year-old Federer, who will line up in singles on Friday with Stanislas Wawrinka against Mardy Fish and John Isner. Federer owns a record 16 Grand Slam singles titles, but he hasn't won the Davis Cup trophy.

Federer skipped the first round of the Davis Cup since 2004, and changed his preparation to play Davis Cup this year. He hasn't played on clay so early in the season since 2004 in Romania, and it's been seven years since he played in Europe in February.

Dereck Chisora can beat Vitali Klitschko, says Lennox Lewis

LONDON, 8 Feb — Former world heavyweight champion Lennox Lewis thinks unfancied Brit Dereck Chisora has the power to shock Vitali Klitschko later this month. Klitschko chose to meet 28-year-old Chisora, instead of another Londoner David Haye, in the defence of his WBC heavyweight title on 18 February. The 40-year-old Ukrainian was last defeated nine years ago by Lewis. "Vitali is very good but Chisora has a chance. All it takes is one punch on the chin to win," said Lewis.

Chisora has lost his last two title fights after defeat by

Tyson Fury in their battle for the British and Commonwealth belts and a controversial points loss against Robert Helenius in December. But the Zimbabwe-born fighter insists he can

bounce back in style by knocking out Klitschko in Munich. Lewis stopped Klitschko in the sixth round of their 2003 bout in Los Angeles to retain his WBC and IBO crowns before



retiring from the sport. And he believes Chisora has the punching power to cause a big upset.

"I always say if you walk into the ring, you have to get wet," said the 46-year-old. "If he [Klitschko] is in the fight, in the ring, and he gets punched, there is a chance that he might get hurt or knocked out. "It will be an interesting fight." Chisora, whose two scheduled fights against Klitschko's younger brother Wladimir were cancelled, won the race to face Vitali ahead of compatriot Haye.

JEREZ, 8 Feb — Kimi Raikkonen set the fastest time on the first day of pre-season testing, his first day of running with other drivers since his return to Formula 1. The Finn, who is driving for Lotus this season, headed the new Force India car driven by Paul di Resta as the teams tested their vehicles in Jerez, Spain. All the teams are running 2012 cars apart from Mercedes and HRT. Marussia, formerly Virgin, are not taking part. Red Bull, McLaren and Ferrari

all had low-key first days. "It was a positive day," said Raikkonen. "The lap times don't matter today. I'm happy with the balance of the car, which feels good, and the fact that we didn't have any major issues." "Also, I did more than a race distance today and did not have any physical problems at all, which is good." After a slow start following the late arrival of some parts, Red Bull's Mark Webber began to set ominously quick times. The Australian, whose team have won the drivers' and constructors' titles for the last two years, eventually finished fourth fastest, 0.826secs off Raikkonen's pace.

Webber said: "It's very early days but so far, so good. We had some late parts because of the fog at the airport but we made a reasonable recovery.

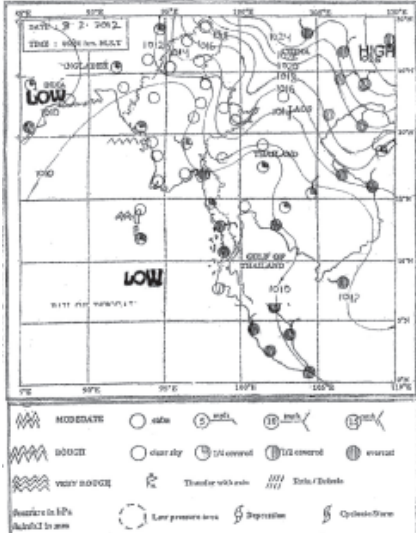

Mitsubishi offers Dutch car plant for one euro

AMSTERDAM, 8 Feb — A Mitsubishi Motors boss has offered to sell its Dutch factory for one euro, a day after the Japanese car-maker said it was halting production there. As 1,000 workers blocked entrances to the plant, unions reportedly called a strike on Friday against the closure. Union leaders say shutting the plant would be a "disaster" for the southern Netherlands.

Mitsubishi has blamed the difficult operating environment in Europe for its decision. The Nedcar plant in the south-eastern province of Limburg currently employs 1,500 workers, producing Colts and Outlanders. Under Tuesday's offer, announced by Mitsubishi Motors President Osamu Masuko according to a spokesman, the plant would be sold for a euro "if the payroll of about 1,500 factory workers can be maintained".

The BBC's Netherlands correspondent Anna Holligan says that as things stand the factory is due to close down at the end of this year. The workers decided to go on strike to show they were not prepared to accept the decision "like lambs to the slaughter", Dutch broadcaster Nos reported. But it added that the unions wanted to find a suitable buyer for the plant.— Internet

The twins, whose maiden name is Rennie, live together in Bonnyton House care home in Ellon.

Neither of them has ever travelled outside of the UK. Although not identical, their mother would dress the girls in the same clothes.

After leaving school the pair worked on farms before starting their own families. Evelyn married William Middleton and had four children, 12 grandchildren, 26 great-grandchildren and three great-great grandchildren.

Edith married Nathaniel Ritchie and had four children, nine grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren and three great-great grandchildren. When asked her secret to a long life, Edith said: "Simple living, hard work and a good husband."

Guinness World Records editor-in-chief Craig Glenday said: "Edith and Evelyn are a remarkable pair."

**PL won't scrap handshakes

LONDON, 8 Feb—The Premier League has no plans to cancel the pre-match handshakes ahead of Manchester United's clash with Liverpool on Saturday, when Patrice Evra and Luis Suarez are likely to come face to face again.

It is understood the handshakes will take place as planned at Old Trafford as the Premier League believes cancelling them would negate the point of having the tradition in the first place.

Saturday's match will be the second encounter between Liverpool and United since Reds forward Suarez was banned for eight matches for racially abusing United's Evra last year.

The Uruguayan was suspended for last month's FA Cup tie between the two sides at Anfield, which Liverpool won 2-1.

Suarez's ban has now expired and he returned to action in Monday's league match against Tottenham.

Last month, the Football Association elected to cancel the handshakes between QPR and Chelsea ahead of their FA Cup clash in an effort to ease tensions due to John Terry's charge of racially abusing Rs defender Anton Ferdinand, an allegation the Chelsea captain denies.

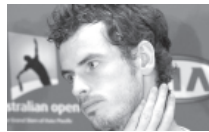
**Murray - I will win a Slam

**Suriname forest reveals
46 new species**

PARAMARIBO, 8 Feb—A "cowboy frog" and a "crayola katydid" are among 46 new species that have been discovered in the dense forests of the tiny South American nation of Suriname, scientists said Wednesday.

The caramel-coloured frog displays white fringes along its back legs and a spur on its heels, while the unusual katydid earned its nickname from the striking hues on its body and wings. Other discoveries included a two-inch (five-centimetre) catfish, and larger catfish covered with a spiny armour to protect it against predators in the piranha-filled river.

The findings were made by an expedition of international scientists, indigenous people and university students as part of a three-week river expedition organized by Conservation International. The journey took them along the Koetari and Sipaliwini rivers, where they also found intriguing new rock carvings, or petroglyphs, along the border with southern neighbour Brazil.

"As a scientist it's exciting to do research in such remote areas where countless new discoveries await you," said Trond Larsen, director of the Rapid Assessment Programme survey for Conservation International. The petroglyphs were found on caves near the Trio village of Kwamalasamutu, a site that Conservation International is helping local communities preserve as an ecotourism destination.
