Seventh day session of Pyithu Hluttaw continues Seven questions asked, replied, one bill approved

NAY PYI TAW, 21 Feb—The seventh day session of the Pyithu Hluttaw, attended by Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw Thura U Shwe Mann and 353 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives, continued at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Building, here,

at 10.20 am today.

Seven questions were replied and one bill approved.

The Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw submitted his message to be sent to the Speaker of the Pyidaungsu

Hluttaw.

U Kyaw Naing Htay of Indaw Constituency asked whether there is a plan to solve the problem that local people use muddy water in creeks nearby villages all the year round due to gold mining works. Union Minister for Mines U Thein Htaik replied that Myanma Gems Enterprise of the Ministry of Mines permitted five companies to carry out jade mining along Laytan Creek in Mohnyin Gems Land and supervise their works.

In jade mining works, 1500 feet in the blocks from the confluence, the companies excavate the stone layers with the use of backhoes and screen the stony soils with water. They store muddy water from the production again and use it once more.

The muddy water in the creek may be flowed from spilling the embankment. However, the water may not be muddy due to the fact that the muddy water has been settled in the sediment ponds. As both the mining blocks and farmlands are 15 miles from Laytan Creek, the mining works cannot damage the farmlands according to the survey.

The companies have been explained not to harm the natural environment and to emphasize flow of clean water to the creek by constructing the sediment lakes systematically.

The Ministry of Mines has issued directives to five gems mining companies for their works to cause muddy creek water, for abiding by the prescribed rules and (See page 8)

The deputy minister replied that the earthen road linking Nyaungwaigyi Village and Tagundaing Village in Einme Township and Kangyi Village in Myaungmya Township is five miles and seven furlongs long. It was estimated that it

Rehabilitation of displaced families in Kachin State discussed

Deputy Minister for Border Affairs Maj-Gen Zaw Win addresses work coord meeting on rehabilitation of displaced families in Kachin State.

NAY PYI TAW, 21 Feb—A coordination meeting on rehabilitation of displaced persons, who moved in Kachin State due to regional security, was held at the hall of Kachin State Government Office on 18 February afternoon.

Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Minister for Border Affairs Maj-Gen Zaw Win said that he and his team met some families wishing to resettle in their region and some wishing to establish new villages in better transport areas. Thanks to food, clothing and accommodation assistance of the State and the respective organizations, the displaced families are now comfortable, and communication difficulties were found at only a few relief camps. At a time when the conflicts were over, it needs to systematically keep necessary accounts for rehabilitations. In undertaking rehabilitation works, it is necessary to consider fulfillment for not only basic requirements but also reserved rights of the families, he said.

Deputy Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement U Phone Swe stressed the need to carry out regional development tasks inclusive of rehabilitation tasks. All are to work in concert for improvement of health and education sectors as necessary infrastructures are built for regional development. The local authorities are to place emphasis on taking out the tasks in conformity with the aspirations of all national races of the region with Union

Spirit.

The participants of the meeting submitted on arrangements for rehabilitations and difficulties of the national race families. The deputy ministers attended to the needs. Deputy Minister Maj-Gen Zaw Win said that the Union government will provide more necessary assistance for the requirements. The respective organizations are accelerating the peace-making process for enabling the displaced families to safely do agricultural tasks in their respective regions, he said.

The plan with 11 sectors is being implemented to be able to resettle the displaced families at their native regions of their own accord, to effectively provide assistance for regional development and rehabilitation tasks, improve their livelihoods and take care of the aged, children and women when the conflicts were over in Kachin State.

Malaysian, Thai leaders discuss border unrest

KUALA LUMPUR, 21 Feb—Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak on Monday pledged full assistance to visiting Thai Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra to help resolve the insurgency raging in southern Thailand.

Najib urged armed groups to renounce violence, as he offered to work with Thailand in seeking ways to defuse the simmering rebellion along their common border as Yingluck arrived for a one-day trip.

“We both agree (the unrest) is a domestic matter for Thailand and people in the south must not seek a separate state. They must reject violence and extremism,” Najib said at a joint Press appearance after their talks.

Yingluck, who took office in August, is finishing up a round of visits aimed at introducing herself to her neighbours. Najib said the pair “discussed the need to find a long-term and durable peaceful solution in the south” of Thailand, where a seven-year insurgency has left thousands dead.

“Prime Minister Yingluck has requested Malaysia to provide whatever assistance and cooperation we can to help Thailand in the process towards a long-term solution in the south,” Najib said at a joint Press appearance.

Yingluck, the younger sister of ex-premier Thaksin

Shinawatra, had originally been scheduled to visit Malaysia in October but postponed the trip as she grappled with Thailand’s worst floods in half a century.

Her visit came as Thai authorities are investigating last week’s failed bomb plot in Bangkok, which involves Iranian suspects and allegedly targeted Israeli diplomats.

UK warns Israeli military action against Iran would be ‘unwise’

LONDON, 21 Feb—British Foreign Secretary William Hague has warned Israel that military action against Iran would not be a ‘wise thing’ to do, and insisted that economic sanctions and negotiations must be given ‘a real chance’ to convince Teheran to abandon its nuclear ambitions.

During an interview with The BBC, Hague repeated his warning that a nuclear-armed Iran would result in another cold war in the Middle East.

“They would either be attacked and there would be a war, or there would be a cold war in which Iran for the long term would be subject to these very intense economic sanctions and they would find that other nations in their region developed nuclear weapons,” he said.

Hague urged against military action, although he said it was not ruled out as an option. *The Telegraph* reports.

“I don’t think a wise thing at this moment is for Israel to launch a military attack on Iran,” the paper quoted him, as saying. “I think Israel like everyone else in the world should be giving a real chance to the approach we have adopted on very serious economic sanctions and economic pressure and the readiness to negotiate with Iran. That’s what we need to make a success of,” he added.—Internet

Militants kill four civilians on spying charges in S Afghanistan

LASHKAR GAH, 21 Feb—Taleban militants killed four civilians for allegedly spying for the government in southern Afghan Province of Helmand, a spokesman for provincial government said on Tuesday.

“Four innocent civilians were beheaded by militants in Washer District on Sunday night,” Daud Ahmadi told *Xinhua*.

He said the victims had no connection with the government or foreign forces in Helmand.—*Xinhua*

Four killed, two injured in Iraq’s Anbar Province

RAMADI, 21 Feb—Four people were killed and two others wounded in separate gunfire and bomb attack in Iraq’s western province of Anbar, a provincial police source said on Monday.

Gunmen using assault rifles stormed the house of Sheikh Kitab al-Issawi, chieftain of a local tribe in southern city of Fallujah, some 50 km west of Baghdad, and dragged him out of his house before they shot him dead, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

The attackers also wounded Issawi’s son during their breaking into the house, the source said.

In a separate incident, a sticky bomb attached to a car carrying three police officers detonated late on Sunday night in central of the provincial capital city of Ramadi, some 110 km west of Baghdad, killing two officers and wounding the third, the source said.

Also in the province, the body of Osama Abdul-Razzaq al-Kubaisi, a judge of the local criminal court in the city of al-Qaim, was found inside his house in the western outskirts of the city, some 230 km west of Ramadi, the source added.

Kubaisi’s body was badly charred after being repeatedly stabbed with sharp object, he said, adding that the victim’s family was not at the house when the attack occurred late on Sunday. Armed group attacks continue in the once volatile Sunni Arab area west of Baghdad that stretches through the province to Iraq’s western borders with Syria, Jordan and Saudi Arabia.—*Xinhua*

Thai police charge bomb suspect involved in Bangkok blasts

BANGKOK, 21 Feb—Thai police on Monday took the second bomb suspect, Mohammad Hazaei, to the Metropolitan Police Bureau for the first-time questioning and formally charged him of involvement in the Bangkok blasts on 14 Feb.

Hazaei, 42 year old, was detained at the country’s main international airport last Tuesday while attempting to board a plane bound for neighbouring Malaysia.

Deputy Metropolitan Police Chief Pol Gen Pansiri Prapawat, head of the investigation team, formally charged Hazaei together with

other suspects three offences — illegally assembling bombs, illegally having explosives in possession, and causing explosions that hurt other people.

Hazaei, however, denied all the charges against him.

According to Deputy National Police Chief Pol Lt Gen Jarumporn Suramancee, the DNA test matched Hazaei with bloods found in the rented house where the first bomb went off. However, the DNA test to find connection with another suspect 28-year-old Saeid Moradi, who lost both legs by accident from his own explosive device and is still

hospitalized, has not yet been conducted, he added.

Darfur rebels claim holding 52 peacekeepers

KHARTOUM, 21 Feb—A major armed rebel group in Sudan’s Darfur region claimed on Monday that it was holding 52 international peacekeepers of the United Nations-African Union peacekeeping mission UNAMID.

Gibril Ibrahim, spokesman of the Justice and Equality Movement (JEM), said that “The held members of UNAMID include 46 Senegalese, one Yemeni officer, one from Rwanda, and one from Ghana, besides three Sudanese. We believe they work for the Sudanese intelligence and security service.”

Ibrahim told *Xinhua* on phone that the peacekeepers were not abducted, but “only being held” by the group.

“We are holding the UNAMID soldiers because they entered our territory without our permission,” the spokesman said.

The rebel spokesman said all the held peacekeepers were fine and at a safe place. “They have been held at a safe place and they are fine. We are waiting for a justification from the mission on why this force moved into the movement’s areas,” he said.

He added that the group also suspected the Sudanese soldiers accompanying the peacekeepers were working for the Sudanese security services.

The UNAMID could not be reached for a comment on the event at the moment.

“This event came only few days after the movement asked for signing an agreement between it and the UNAMID to facilitate the work of the mission in Darfur, but Ibrahim Gambari, the chief of UNAMID, refused the signing of this agreement,” he noted.

He further criticized the UNAMID chief for not being “neutral” in the mission, saying that “yes, we have a big difference with Gambari. He has become a persona non grata in Darfur. We demand him to resign.”

“We believe that the force we are holding was on a mission to bring information for the interest of Khartoum. This is a clear violation for the UNAMID task in Darfur,” the spokesman said. UNAMID, which was deployed 2008 in Darfur as a peacekeeping mission, has encountered repeated attacks by unidentified gunmen in the region, which led to the death of more than 34 peacekeepers.

Cold baths 'ease aching muscles, but may be risky'

LONDON, 21 Feb — After exercise can soothe sore muscles but it is unclear whether this is safe, say experts. Plunging into chilly water can provide a shock to the system and may even be harmful, researchers at the UK Cochrane Centre warn.

After looking at available trial evidence—17 small studies involving 366 people—they say there is not enough evidence to back the technique. There may well be other better ways to ease muscular aches, they

say. This might include a spot of light jogging or a dip in a warm bath, they say. The idea behind submerging the muscles in icy water, sometimes referred to as cryotherapy, is to reduce swelling and the associated stiffness and soreness that comes with working the muscles hard.

The trend started in elite level sport, but it is becoming increasingly popular amongst amateur athletes too. Comedian Eddie Izzard, who last year ran 43 marathons in 51 days to raise money for charity, said his daily ice baths were a necessary evil to stop his "legs inflating to twice the size of an elephant".

In the studies that the Cochrane team looked at, participants were asked to get into a bath or container of cold water after running,

cycling or resistance training. In most trials, participants spent between five and 24 minutes in water that was 10-15C, although in some cases much lower temperatures were used or participants were asked to get in and out of the water a number of times.

New approach urged for late-talking bilingual babies

WASHINGTON, 21 Feb—Babies who are raised in homes where two or more languages are spoken may appear to talk later than those learning just one language, leaving parents puzzled and concerned as to the reasons why. Conventional wisdom often suggests that such children are confused and so they take longer to talk. Or, parents may hear that any apparent delay is just an illusion because kids are little geniuses who can learn many languages quickly and easily.

"Both of these views are wrong," US psychologist Erika Hoff told the American Association for the Advancement of Science meeting in Vancouver this weekend. "It is not the case that hearing two languages confuses the child and impairs their ability to acquire anything. But it is also not the case that children can magically acquire two languages as quickly as one." Instead, psychologists should take a different

approach to testing young children, one that measures their proficiency in both languages instead of just one.

When that is done, researchers typically find that the two tests add up to about the same level of proficiency as would be seen in a baby who is learning a single language. "Children who are exposed to two languages... must hear less of each language than a child who hears only one and so it takes them longer to get the same amount of experience with each language," added Hoff, whose research has focused on highly educated bilingual Spanish-English families in south Florida.

Two kinds of tests have existed for decades — the Language Development Survey and the MacArthur Bates Communicative Development Inventory — in which parents answer questions about which words their child knows and how many word combinations the child has at around age two.—Internet



Japan trade deficit balloons as fuel imports surge

TOKYO, 21 Feb—Japan posted a record high trade deficit in January after its nuclear crisis shut down nearly all the nation's reactors for tougher checks, sending fuel

imports surging. Exports were hurt by a strong yen and weak demand. The 1.48 trillion yen (\$18.7 billion) deficit reported on Monday highlights Japan's increased dependence on imported fuel after the 11 March earthquake and tsunami sent the Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear plant into multiple meltdowns.

As public worries grew, nearly all the 54 nuclear reactors in Japan were stopped for inspections. The government wants to restart at least some of the reactors, after checking for better tsunami and quake protection. Resource-poor Japan imports almost all its oil. Until the Fukushima disaster, the country had trumpeted nuclear technology as a safe and cheap answer to its energy needs. Now, Japan is importing more natural gas and oil as utilities boost non-nuclear power generation. Imports of natural gas in January vaulted 74 percent from a year earlier and imports of petroleum jumped nearly 13 percent.

Asia stocks rise as China moves to boost economy

BANGKOK, 21 Feb—Asian stock markets climbed Monday after China moved to boost its economy by freeing up bank lending and hopes grew that Greece will clinch the aid it needs to avoid bankruptcy. Oil prices jumped to an nine-month high near \$105 a barrel after Iran said it halted crude exports to Britain and France in an escalation of a dispute over the Middle Eastern country's nuclear programme. The dollar weakened against the euro but gained against the yen.

Japan's Nikkei 225 index added 1 percent to 9,480.55. Hong Kong's Hang Seng rose 0.7 percent to 21,683.05 and China's

Shanghai Composite Index was up 0.9 percent at 2,377.96. South Korea's Kospi added 0.2 percent to 2,027.63. Australia's S&P/ASX 200 gained 1.3 percent to 4,249.40. Benchmarks in Singapore, Taipei and the Philippines also rose. Indonesia fell.

China's central bank said over the weekend it will lower the ratio of funds that banks must hold as reserves to 20.5 percent from 21 percent, effective Friday. That will free up tens of

billions of dollars for loans at a time when the growth rate is expected to drop from last quarter's 8.9 percent to closer to 8 percent. The cut is the second in two months. Investors hoping for more lending in the real estate sector pushed up Chinese property shares. Hong Kong-listed China Resources Land Ltd surged 3.8 percent and China Overseas Land & Investment Ltd. added 3.4 percent.

Wal-Mart increases stake in Chinese e-commerce firm

SHANGHAI, 21 Feb—Wal-Mart Stores Inc said on Monday it has reached an agreement to raise its stake in a Chinese e-commerce firm, Yihaodian, to around 51 percent as the world's largest retailer aims to boost its presence in China's fast growing consumer market. Walmart announced in May last year it planned to buy a minority stake in Yihaodian, a Chinese website selling consumer items and groceries.

Walmart said in a news release that the fresh investment into Yihaodian will take its stake to around 51 percent and will be subject to government regulatory approval. Walmart did not provide any financial details to the deal.

"Our further investment in Yihaodian demonstrates that we are committed to investing in China in a key growth industry and developing all that goes with it: logistics, infrastructure, innovative talent and new technologies..." Neil Ashe, President and CEO of Walmart Global eCommerce, said in the statement.

Yihaodian, with 5,400 staff, operates a logistics network based in Shanghai, Beijing, Guangzhou, Wuhan and Chengdu. It serves a growing customer base with same-day and next-day delivery of essential daily items at competitive prices.—Internet

'Jacuzzi vents' model CO2 future

LONDON, 21 Feb — A UK scientist studying volcanic vents in the ocean says they hold a grave warning for future marine ecosystems. These vents have naturally acidified waters that hint at how our seas might change if atmospheric carbon dioxide levels continue to rise. They are conditions that would make it harder for corals and similar organisms to make the hard parts in their bodies. Dr Jason Hall-Spencer's work suggests our oceans could lose perhaps 30% of their biodiversity this century.

The Plymouth University researcher has been presenting his latest findings to a major conference in Vancouver, Canada. "I am investigating underwater volcanoes where carbon dioxide bubbles up like a Jacuzzi, acidifying large areas of the seabed, and we can see at these vents which types of organisms are able to thrive and which ones are most vulnerable," he told the annual meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS).

Dr Hall-Spencer treats the vents like a time machine. As he swims towards them, the pH level of the water falls and he can use particular locations to simulate what the open ocean will be like in the decades ahead if emissions of atmospheric CO2 go unchecked and much of the that gas is absorbed into sea. "What we see as you swim along a gradient of carbon dioxide, up to levels we expect for the end of this century, is diversity loss.

"As you go along that gradient, species drop out of the system," he told BBC News. "It's not all calcified species - ones with hard shells or skeletons - which drop out; there are other organisms with soft bodies which drop out as well. "This CO2 is a stressor. Some organisms can adapt but there're only a few species that can handle it. If I extend the gradient up to the year 2100 — that represents a 30% loss in biodiversity." — *Internet*

Japanese scientists confirm fat-burning protein

OSAKA, 21 Feb — A team of researchers of Japan's Kyoto University has found a protein that helps the body burn fat following an intake of fatty meals, Japanese public broadcaster NHK reported on Monday. The researchers at the Kyoto University's Institute of Chemical Research compared mice with protein called GPR120 with those that do not have the protein, and provided them with high-fat feeds, the report said.

They confirmed that the mice without the protein were heavier than those who had it by an average of 15 percent, and accumulated twice as much fat in their bodies, it

said. The Japanese scientists also analyzed the genetic sequence of about 20,000 people in Europe, including the French and the British, and found that people with mutant GPR120 genes were 1.6 times more likely to be obese.

Based on the result of the research, the Japanese scientists concluded the protein is capable of detecting fat, and also plays a role in prompting the body to burn the fat. Professor Gozo Tsumimoto, head of the researcher team, was quoted by NHK as saying that the development of drugs that activate the protein will help prevent obesity.— *Xinhua*

'Abyss Box' to keep deep animals

PARIS, 21 Feb — The public are going to get the chance to see live creatures pulled up from the deep ocean in a permanent display. Normally when organisms are raised from kilometres below the sea surface, they quickly die because of the huge change in pressure. But scientists have now developed the Abyss Box, which can maintain animals in the extreme environment they need. The vessel, containing deep-sea crab and shrimp, will go on show at the Oceanopolis aquarium in Brest, France.

The volume of the box is quite small (16 litres) but researchers believe the technology could eventually be scaled up to house larger animals, such as fish. It is hoped such vessels will enable scientists to study bottom-dwelling creatures over long periods of time — something that is just not possible at the moment."

We want such basic information as the length of life of a deep-sea animal," explained Dr Bruce Shillito, a marine biologist at the Universite Pierre et Marie Curie, Paris.— *Internet*

Samsung shifts to new TV technology with LCD spin off

SEOUL, 21 Feb — South Korea's Samsung Electronics Co, the world's biggest maker of televisions, is shifting its focus towards new generation OLED display technology, and said it will spin off its loss-making LCD flat-screen business into an affiliate.

The outlook for liquid crystal display TVs has dimmed as shoppers in developed markets have traded in their bulky cathode-ray tube TVs for flatscreens, and competition has intensified from low-cost Chinese manufacturers.

Annual global sales of LCD TVs will contract by 8 percent to \$92 billion by 2015, flat panel industry

research company Display Search has forecast, while the OLED display market could top \$20 billion by 2018, accounting for 16 percent of the total display industry, up from a current 4 percent. Japans' Sony Corp agreed to exit its LCD joint venture with Samsung in December, while Sharp Corp said it would halve LCD output for January-March at a plant in western Japan.

Together, Panasonic, Sony and Sharp expect to lose \$17 billion this year, highlighting the savaging of Japan's electronics industry, and TV makers in particular, by foreign rivals such as Samsung, weak demand and a strong yen. Samsung's LCD division made an operating

loss of 750 billion won (\$666 million) last year. With TVs becoming smart—linked to other devices like tablets and smartphones—an inability to win in the TV market risks hobbling sales across the Japanese groups' wider consumer electronics line-ups.— *Internet*

Single-atom transistor busts the records

CANBERRA, 21 Feb — Researchers in Australia said on Sunday they had made with pinpoint accuracy a working transistor consisting of a single atom, marking a major stride towards next-generation computing. The device comprises a single phosphorus atom, etched into a silicon bed, with "gates" to control electrical flow and metallic contacts that are also on the atomic scale. "Our group has proved that it is really possible to position one phosphorus atom in a silicon environment, exactly as we need it, with near-atomic precision, and at the same time (incorporate) gates," said lead scientist Martin Fuechsle.

Transistors, which switch or amplify electrical flow, are the building blocks of computer chips. For more than 50 years, the semi-conductor industry has been upholding Moore's Law, the celebrated prediction by Intel Corp pioneer Gordon Moore that the number of transistors on a chip would double every 18 months or so. But the astonishing run of success could hit a wall by the end of this decade without a breakthrough in miniaturising transistors.— *Internet*

Obama to meet Netanyahu at White House on 5 March

WASHINGTON, 21 Feb—US President Barack Obama will meet Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at the White House on 5 March, as a potential Israeli strike on Iranian nuclear sites has become a hot topic in Washington, the White House said on Monday.

Tom Donilon, the president's national security advisor who just concluded a three-day visit to Israel, relayed to Netanyahu that Obama "looks forward to meeting with him," the White House said.

In his consultations with senior Israeli officials including Netanyahu, Defence Minister Ehud Barak, Chief of the General Staff Benny Gantz and National Security Advisor Yaakov Amidror, Donilon addressed the "full range of security issues of mutual concern," the White House said in a statement. Donilon's visit is referred as part of the "continuous and intensive dialogue" between the two countries which reflects unshakable US commitment to Israel's security. Late last month, Martin Dempsey, chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff, travelled to Israel.

Last Thursday, Netanyahu called Iran "the most irresponsible" country in the world, saying sanctions against

Teheran over its controversial nuclear programme "haven't worked". Israel also accused Iran of being behind the recent bomb attacks on its embassy personnel in India, Georgia and Thailand. US Defence Secretary Leon Panetta was quoted as saying early this month that Israel could attack Iran as soon as this spring.—Xinhua

Chinese vice president arrives in Turkish capital for official visit

ANKARA, 21 Feb—Chinese Vice President Xi Jinping arrived here on Monday evening for an official visit to Turkey at the invitation of Turkish President Abdullah Gul.

"The main purpose of my visit is to deepen mutual understanding and the traditional friendship between our two peoples, and boost the friendly and mutually beneficial cooperation between China and Turkey in a variety of fields so as to better benefit the two countries and the two peoples," Xi said in a written speech upon his arrival at the Esenboga Airport in Ankara.

"Turkey, like China, has a long history and colourful cultures. Friendly exchanges between China and Turkey date back to ancient times," Xi said.

"We are pleased to see the continuous development in bilateral cooperation in

the political, economic, cultural and other fields since China and Turkey established diplomatic relations in 1971," the Chinese leader noted.

"As two important developing nations, China and Turkey share extensive common interests in safeguarding world peace, promoting common development and meeting global challenges," Xi said, adding that China is willing to strengthen its ties with Turkey in a bid to further push forward their strategic partnership.

During his stay, Xi will meet separately with Turkish President Abdullah Gul, Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan and Parliament Speaker Cemil Cicek.

Turkey is the last leg of Xi's three-nation tour, which has already taken him to the United States and Ireland.

Last nuclear reactor in western Japan shuts down for checkup

OSAKA, 21 Feb—The last nuclear reactor in western Japan operated by Kansai Electric Power Company has shut down for a regular checkup, leaving only two out of Japan's total 54 commercial reactors operating, local Press reported. Kansai Electric Power Company said it completed the shut down procedures for the No 3 reactor at the Takahama nuclear power plant in Fukui Prefecture early on Tuesday.

Kansai Electric has 11 reactors and had produced half of its electricity by nuclear power before the quake-triggered disaster in northeastern Japan. With the shutdown of the last reactor, the company forecasts its supply capacity could fall short of peak demand by 8.8 percent by mid-March under

one scenario.

Makoto Yagi, president of Kansai Electric, expressed at a press conference in Osaka on Monday his regret over

the current severe situation and said his company would make efforts to resume nuclear power generation.

"We will strive to restore

trust by taking all possible measures to ensure the safety of nuclear power generation," he said. Now, only two of Japan's 54 nuclear reactors are running. But those two in the central prefecture of Niigata and in the northern prefecture of Hokkaido will also be shut down by late April for checkups. As no reactors have resumed operation after going through regular checkups since the Fukushima complex disaster last March, it is highly likely that Japan will have no operating nuclear reactors this spring. The Japanese government will ultimately decide on whether to resume the reactors which are being checked, but it also needs the approval of the local governments where the reactors are located. The local governments are urging the central government to set new safety standards based on lessons learned from the Fukushima disaster.—Xinhua

Cuba condemns Spanish "interference" in domestic affairs

HAVANA, 21 Feb—Cuba on Monday condemned Spanish foreign minister Jose Manuel Garcia-Margallo's criticism on its human rights situation, calling it "disrespectful interference in Cuban internal affairs."

"We express our strong opposition to these statements constituting a new interference in Cuban internal affairs," Cuban Deputy Foreign Minister Dagoberto Rodriguez Barrera said in an official release Monday afternoon.

In an interview with Spanish daily *El Mundo* published on Sunday, Garcia-Margallo said that "as long as Cuba does not take steps toward democracy ... and full recognition of rights and freedoms, his country would not support any change of the so-called 'Common Position' of the European Union (EU) toward Havana."

The "Common Position," adopted in 1996, conditions the EU relations with Cuba to the "improvement of the respect to human rights and freedom on the island." Havana rejects the EU measure and considers it as a "violation to its sovereignty and interference in its domestic affairs."

"The Spanish foreign minister should remember that Cuba is no longer a Spanish colony" and "does not accept questions from anyone, especially those trying to give lessons, when they actually have a roof of glass," Rodriguez stressed. Rodriguez stated that instead of interfering in Cuban internal affairs, the Spanish government should try to solve its own economic and human rights problem.—Xinhua

Soon, driverless cars will zoom in streets with no stoplights

WASHINGTON, 21 Feb—Traffic red lights will soon be a history, says a computer scientist who is developing virtual intersection systems for fully autonomous vehicles.

According to Peter Stone, a professor of computer science at The University of Texas at Austin, intersections of the future will not need stop lights or stop signs, but will look like a somewhat chaotic flow of driverless, autonomous cars slipping past one another as they are managed by a virtual traffic controller.

“A future where sitting in the backseat of the car reading our newspaper while it drives us effortlessly through city streets and intersections is not that far away,” said Stone.

Stone's research focuses on creating artificially intelligent (AI) computing systems, and he is developing some of the systems that are needed to make autonomous driving a reality. For example, Stone and his students created an autonomous car, named Marvin, in cooperation with Austin Robot Technology that competed in the 2007 DARPA Urban Challenge competition.—*Internet*

Open windows could help prevent infections

LONDON, 21 Feb—Air conditioning and the ultra-sterile environment in places like hospitals may actually contribute to infections, say experts.

Friendly bacteria found outdoors could be recruited to fend off the potentially deadly microbes that cause hospital-acquired infections, according to Jack Gilbert of Argonne National Laboratory in Chicago and head of the Earth Microbiome Project, a global database of microbial species, *The Independent* reported on Monday.

He said the idea is supported by a study

showing that open windows influence the composition of microbial communities found on handles and surfaces, but did not increase the numbers of dangerous pathogens—the sort of antibiotic-resistant superbugs which infect patients. “Open windows let bacteria in from outside and you will either dilute out the pathogens, or you are not allowing the pathogens to establish themselves because there is too much competition for the nutrients and energy that the bacteria need to survive,” Gilbert told the American Association for the Advancement of Science.—*Internet*

regulations and withdraw the permits if they do not follow the rules and regulations. However, the inspection team cannot check their tasks due to regional situation. If the local situations are in good condition, supervision tasks will be undertaken.

Among four mining blocks, the nearest distance between the block and Laytan Creek is 20 miles and the farthest distance, 50 miles. With regard to flow of muddy water and bad quality of water in the creek, the inspection team will be sent to the region for making necessary supervision and some arrangements when the region is in good situation.

Deputy Minister for Construction U Soe Tint replied to two questions on construction sector by two Hluttaw representatives.

U Hla Tun of Hkamti Constituency said that as **Koetan Creek Bridge linking Thetkelkyin and Khatun villages on Monywa-Hkamti strategic road between is damaged due to erosion, the new bridge is under construction spending a large sum of money. Whether there is a plan to rebuild the bridge as a suspension bridge by the State.** The deputy minister replied that 290-foot Koetan Creek Bridge was built temporarily in 2011-2012 fiscal year. Due to heavy rains and 13 feet high torrent water on 12-9-2006, the bridge was damaged. Then, the bridge could not be rebuilt depending on the fund and the temporary bridge was built there in open season annually.

Koetan Creek Bridge on Thetkelkyin-Phaungpyin-Homalin-Hkamti Road was included in the fifth five-year plan and it will commence in 2013-2014 fiscal year.

U Soe Soe of Htiyaing Constituency asked **whether there is a plan to build a culvert on Kwanbaung Creek on Htiyaing-Kyaunggon Road near Kwanton-Kyaukaik Village.** The deputy minister replied that Sagaing Region spends its fund on maintenance and upgrading of the road, construction of retaining wall and conduits.

Htiyaing-Kyaunggon Road is under management of the Region Government. Due to strong current of the creek, it should build a bridge than the culvert. Thus, the fund is being sought from the region government to build 250-foot Kwanbaung Bridge in 2012-2013.

Union Minister for Transport U Nyan Tun Aung replied to four questions raised by three Hluttaw representatives.

U Win Myint of Pyay Constituency asked **whether Marine Administration Department will have a plan to manage landslides in Pyay Township due to bank erosion that local people lose housings and plantations** and he asked **whether there**

is a plan to make arrangements for small passenger aircrafts to land at Pyay Airport of Bago Region. The Union Minister replied that the Ministry of Transport is taking responsibility for waterway and aviation sectors. Its aim depends on raising the funds of the ministry. Thus, the ministry is difficult to take responsibilities for maintenance of bank erosion and landslides along all rivers and the delta region. In conducting survey of buildings and necessary measurements for Myaywa River Water Pumping Project, the area was eroded due to over volume of water. In this regard, the project is being implemented to store necessary volume of water by applying technology. However, the ministry does not have the funds not only for the bank erosion in Pyay but also in all landslides along all rivers of the nation including that of the delta region. Township authorities are to submit matters related to bank erosions to the President Office through respective region/state governments. The President Office will allot the separate budget for the tasks. The ministry will not allot its fund for the bank erosion.

Regarding the second question, Myanmar is practicing market economy, the minister said. Aircrafts once landed Pyay Airport which is under maintenance of Civil Aviation Department now, he said. As there is no passenger, there is no flight grounding Pyay Airport, the minister pointed out. If the representatives wish the airport to operate flights and they can assign an agent there and book passengers for half of the flight, the aircrafts are ready to board them, the Union minister answered.

U Tin Maung of Chanmyathazi Constituency asked **whether there is a plan to upgrade Chanmyathazi Airport in Mandalay Region by the Union government to give a facelift to the city.** The Union minister answered: the airport emerged in parallel with the Independence. Its original length is 4000 ft and width, 75 ft. Its current length is 6500 ft and width, 100 ft. F-28 aircrafts weighing 75 tons and above can land the airport. It is a global fashion constructing new airports in cities if they come to development. TadaU Airport was built to handle international flights Mandalay.

Mandalay Chanmyathazi Airport was extended to 6500 ft in 1996. Since opening of TadaU Airport in September, 2000, it was suspended. 450 aircrafts are crossing Myanmar's aviation territory. Of them, 200 have to report to the airport which plays a significant role in global aviation route. Every computer has the distance of the airport. It is planned to swing the airport into action.

It is planned to open civil aviation training school to nurture qualified pilots for local and international airliners and to open flying club for aviation enthusiasts and amateur pilots. The principal and trainers of Defence Services (Air) Aviation Training School are being recruited for opening the civil aviation training school.

After the flying club is opened, it will be

packed with training aircrafts, amateur aircrafts and buildings of the club and will become a glory of Mandalay where aviation education is provided. The airport could also be used as a reserve airport of TadaU Airport.

It is planned to keep the airport as compulsory report point on international aviation route, civil aviation training school and flying club.

U Win Myint of Myingyan Constituency asked **whether there is a plan**

upgrading the 3.5-furlong road section of the road in Einme Township in the 2012-2013 fiscal year.

The earthen road linking Mezali Sarphyusu and Kangyi and Kyonton in Einme Township is 23 miles and six furlongs long. The 4-furlong distance of the 19-mile road section of the road in Einme Township was upgraded to gravel one in the 2008-2009 fiscal year and two-furlong distance was upgraded in the 2009-2010 fiscal year by Einme Township Development Affairs Department, he added.

Einme Township Development Affairs Committee would spend 80 million kyats on upgrading the two-mile-long section of the road in Myaungmya Township and K 40 million on upgrading the one-mile long section of the road in Einme Township in the 2012-2013 fiscal year, he said.

Afterwards, U Aung Nyein of Magway Region constituency No. 2 asked to help the shortage of drinking water in Gwaybin Model Village in Gwaybin Village-train in Chauk Township.

Deputy Minister for Border Affairs Maj-Gen Zaw Win replied that the ten-year project on drinking water supply in rural areas was implemented from the 2000-2001 fiscal year to the 2009-2010 fiscal year, benefiting 23225 villages out of 64349 villages in the country and a total of 34858 water supply facilities were built during the ten-year project, he said.

Thirty-six tube wells were drilled and 36 lakes to storage rain water were constructed in Chauk township at the cost of K 257.96 million funded by Chauk Township DAC, donors and the State, benefiting 45 villages.

Gwaybin Model Village has over 260 households and has a population of 1555. There is a tube-well and three lakes built in 1979. Though the township DAC repaired the tube well in the 2008-2009 fiscal year as the water supply from the tube-well had decreased, it did not work again, he added. The deputy minister gave a green light to the township DAC to repair the tube well at the cost of K 36.47 million.

U Kyaw Kyaw of Rakhine State constituency No. 2 asked whether the ministry had a plan to upgrade Konthedan wooden bridge in MraukU to the bridge with reinforced concrete pillars and wooden floor and to upgrade Bandoola Bridge in MraukU to the iron reinforced one.

The deputy minister replied that Konthedan Bridge is 120 ft long, 6 ft wide and 18 ft high. The wooden bridge was repaired by MraukU Township DAC in the 2006-2007 fiscal year and in the 2008-2009 fiscal year spending the funds of the township DAC. The local people and MraukU Township DAC also repaired the bridge again as it was damaged by the natural disaster in 21 July, 2011.

Myaoku Township DAC would spend K20 million on the first phase of upgrading the bridge in the 2012-2013 fiscal year and the remaining works would be carried out according to yearly plan, he said.

Funded by the State, Bandoola Bridge was upgraded to the wooden bridge with concrete bases and it was 145 ft long, 14 ft

wide and 24 ft high in the 2001-2002 fiscal year at the cost of K23.197 million. The bridge was repaired in the 2008-2009 and in the 2011-2012 fiscal years funded by the township DAC, he added. The bridge would be upgraded to the iron reinforced concrete bridge at the cost of K250 million according to the yearly plans of MraukU township DAC.

U Nyan Lin of Ayeyawady Region constituency No. 3 asked whether the ministry had a plan to construct Natsinggu-Yenatchaung Bridge for the development of Kyonpyaw, Yekyi and Laymyathnar townships and to complete the gravel road linking Chingon and Ngapiseik in Yekyi Township.

The deputy minister replied that it was estimate that it would cost around K100 million to construct the 200-foot-in-length Natsinggu-Yenatchaung Bridge and Kyonpyaw Township DAC would spend K30 million to start the work in the 2012-2013 fiscal year and the remaining works would be carried out according to yearly plans.

Chingon-Chaunghpya-Ngapiseik Road is five miles long and one mile and four furlongs road section of the road was paved gravel in the 2006-2007 fiscal year and four furlong was paved with grave in the 2010-2011 fiscal year, he said.

The remaining earthen section of the road would be upgraded in the 2012-2013 fiscal year and one mile distance of the remaining three miles would be upgraded at the cost of K 40 million : K20 million funded by Yekyi Township DAC and K 20 funded by the State, he added.

U Aung Cho Oo of Bago Region constituency No 11 asked the ministry whether it had a plan to upgrade the road linking Chauktinkwin, Kywephyuma, Ywashaung and Wai villages in Okpo Township, the road linking Gonyindan, Boketho, Didubin and Kanthaya villages and the road linking Kyatsudaw, Htoo Chaung, Kinponchon, Othegon villages to an all-weather road.

The road linking Chauktinkwin, Kywephyuma, Ywashaung and Wai villages in Okpo Township was constructed by the local people in the 1990-1991 fiscal year and the earthen road was 13 miles long and 10 ft wide. The 5-furlong distance of the road was upgraded to the laterite road at the cost of k 1.2 million in the 2004-2005 fiscal year by the township DAC.

The township DAC spent K11.435 million on upgrading the one mile and 2.6 furlong distance of the road to the laterite road in the 2011-2012 fiscal year and it was estimated that it would cost k130.3 million to upgrade the remaining road section which was 12 miles and three furlongs long. In the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the township DAC would spend K4.4 million on upgrading the three furlong distance of the road section.

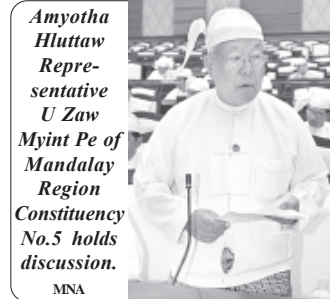
Gonyindan-Kanthaya Road is 5 miles long and 10 ft wide. Though two miles and six furlong distance of the road had been paved with laterite, the road was the earthen road today. The 0.83 furlong distance of the road was paved with laterite in the 1998-1999 fiscal year funded by the township DAC, 1.15 furlong in the 1999-2000 fiscal year and road works was carried out on the 6000 sq ft on the road in the 2011-2012 fiscal year.

The road was being upgraded in the 2011-2012 fiscal year funded by Okpo Township DAC and one mile and 2.6 furlong

road section had been paved with laterite. It was estimated that it would cost K 51 million to pave the five-mile distance of the road in an attempt to upgrade the road to an all-weather road and the four-furlong distance would be upgraded at the cost of K 5 million in the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The upgrading of the road would be carried out according to the yearly budget of the township

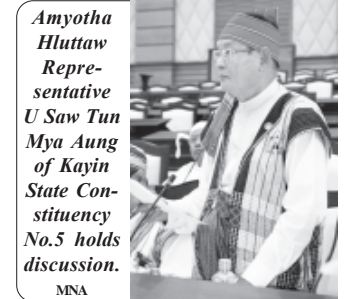

DAC. Kyatsudaw-Htoochaung-Kinponchon-Othegon village-to-village linking road was seven miles long and 10 ft wide and was constructed by the local people in the 1990-1991 fiscal year. The one-mile section of the road was upgraded to the laterite one at the cost of K12.9 million funded by the township DAC.

The one miles and 2.6 furlongs section of the road was being upgraded at the cost of K11.435 million funded by Okpo Township DAC in the 2011-2012 fiscal year. It was estimated that it would cost K87.2 million to upgrade the remaining 6-mile long earthen section and to construct a wooden bridge across the Gamone Creek. Therefore, the township DAC would spend K5 million on paving the four furlong distance of the road in the 2012-2013 fiscal year as a first phase.

Regarding the question of U Nain Khin Paung of Chin State Constituency No.7 on "Plan to continue the construction of road that links Khampat Sub-Township and Keekha Sub-township and Manipura river-crossing bridge," the deputy minister said: The road that links Keekha Sub-township of Chin State and Khampat Sub-township of Sagaing Region, is 65 miles long.

Under border area development programme, Field Engineering Battalion has constructed earthen road. The site for construction of Manipura river-crossing bridge is far about 20 miles of Keekha Township. So, it needs to construct about 300-ft-long suspension bridge on the 250-ft-wide river. Construction of road will go on and matter on construction of Manipura river-crossing bridge would be submitted to the Central Committee for implementation of border areas and national races development, based on Chin State Government's findings and feasibility in order to get assistances from the government.

Regarding the amended Vacant Land, Fallow Land and Virgin Land Management Bill of Pyithu Hluttaw which has approved by Amyotha Hluttaw, U Saw Aung Kyaw Naing (a) Sharbuphaw of Kayin State Constituency No.1 discussed Chapter (4), Section 10 (a), Sub-section 4, Chapter (6), Section 16 (b) and (c), Chapter (7), Section 21 and Section (10) Sub-section 33.

The Hluttaw decided to make discussions by Amyotha Hluttaw Bill Committee. Regarding the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Foreign Investment Bill, member of Amyotha Hluttaw Bill Committee U Myint Tun read out the Bill Committee's report.

needs to have not only proper Investment Law but also good legal system. Myanmar Foreign Investment Laws do not conform with the current conditions, which have existed since many years ago. Foreign Investment Law (bill) with 19 chapters and 47 sections has been complied with a view to ensuring the development of foreign investment. Dr Khin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency No.9, U Saw Tun Mya Aung of Kayin State Constituency No.5, Dr Banyan Aung Moe of Mon State Constituency No.7 and U Nu of Yangon Region Constituency No.10 discussed the proposal on U Hla Swe of Magway Region Constituency No.12 on "Urging the Union Government to camp and turn out youth athletes for the 2013 SEA Games to be held as a host country after holding Inter-Basic and Higher Education Schools sport competitions, Inter-region/states sport competitions, inter-ministry sport competitions including Ministry of Defence across the country".

Their discussion is that holding of inter-basic education, higher education schools sport competitions across the country for the 2013 SEA Games. Inter-ministry sport competitions including Ministry of Defence needs to be held for selection of athletes; selections are to be carried out without giving favors; Encourages are to be given to school-aged children so as to do sport according to their hobbies; and measures to turn out outstanding athletes in all kinds of sports and camp them as a national duty.

Deputy Minister for Sports U Aye Myint Kyu said that, in his response to the query, the ministry is making efforts to achieve success in the XXVII SEA Games to be held as a host country in 2013, in line with the five pillars laid down by the ministry; the first is to train nominated athletes who are selected from the respective sports federation in the country in a training camp; the second is to give a camp training to the athletes selected from the first Champion Challenge Cup and State/Region Sports competitions, the third is to teach the selected athletes basic and modernized sports techniques, lessons, computer, language lab and ethics lessons; the fourth is to select young athletes from

Italy to try accused Somali pirates

ROME, 21 Feb—Nine Somalis will be tried in Italy's first international piracy trial on charges they attacked an Italian cargo vessel off Somalia, a court ordered on Monday.

Four minors and five adults will stand trial March 23 on charges of piracy, weapons possession and damages incurred when they allegedly laid siege to the Italian cargo vessel, *Montecristo* off Somalia in

October, the Italian news agency ANSA reported.

The accused surrendered to US and British troops working under NATO's Ocean Shield, CNN reported.

The multinational crew had thrown overboard a message in a bottle and put up a cardboard sign letting potential rescuers know they were hiding in the engine room awaiting help.

Lt Gwenn Laine of NATO said the *USS DeWert*

kept an eye on the hijacked vessel until the British ship *HMS Fort Victoria* arrived with a boarding team, CNN said at the time of the October incident.

The minors are being detained in a juvenile facility while the adults are being held in Rome's Rebibbia and Regina Coeli prisons, ANSA said. If convicted, the accused face 20 years in prison.

Hitler had eye on UK mansion for headquarters

LONDON, 21 Feb—Hitler would have set up his headquarters in a sleepy Midlands market town in Britain if he had succeeded in invading the country.

Historians believe the dictator had selected Apley Hall, near Norton, in the heart of the Shropshire countryside, and it would have been the nerve-centre of his operations.

A bundle of 1940s papers recovered in a bunker in Belgium at the end of the war contained maps highlighting strategic sites for attack by the Germans, including railway stations, power plants and bridges. An enormous amount of attention was focused on Bridgnorth.

The stately, Grade II listed Apley Hall, just seven miles from the tourist town of Bridgnorth, was once a retreat

for rich guests wanting to escape the city.

But, historians believe Hitler's interest in the area was due to it being geographically in the middle of England.

It was also away from the urbanised West Midlands and had a handy airbase nearby. "As far-fetched as it

may sound, the papers, which were marked 'top secret', earmarked a place in the middle of nowhere where Hitler hoped to set up camp during his planned invasion," the *Daily Mail* quoted Richard Westwood-Brookes, who studies historical documents, as saying. —Internet



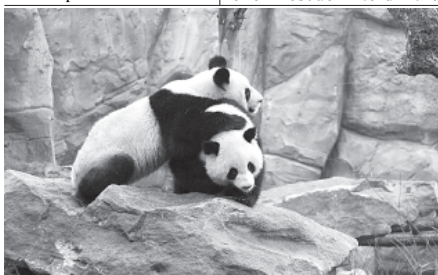

Swedish man stranded in car for 2 months

UMEÅ, (Sweden), 21 Feb—A Swedish man survived being buried in snow in his car for two months, with only snow and ice to keep him alive, authorities said. They believed his car, which was parked at the end of a forest track, to be abandoned. Sharks target sea otters more than ever

MONTEREY, 21 Feb—Scientists say the number of sea otters found dead along the California coast due to shark bites has risen sharply in recent years. Last year, 70 sea otters washed ashore between San Mateo County and Santa Barbara showing signs of shark attacks. Today, 30 percent of sea otters found dead along the California coast have been killed by sharks. In the mid-1990s, it was only 10 percent.

Scientists are at a loss to explain what is causing the sudden increase in shark attacks. Mike Murray, staff veterinarian at the Monterey Bay Aquarium told *Mercury News*: "Is it because the sharks are changing their behaviour, or is there a change in the number of sharks? Or is there something wrong with the otters?" he said. "Are these otters sick and maybe doing something at the surface of the water that attracts a predator? Or are they unable to avoid predators?" The federally designated threatened animal still struggles to recover its numbers, and the recent spike in shark attacks is now one of the most significant hurdles.

Activists also decry a new piece of legislation introduced into congress this week would allow the Navy to continue testing weaponry on remote Channel Island. Many say this would endanger the area's otter population by exempting the Navy from provisions of the Endangered Species Act and Marine Animal Protection Act. The bill also includes requirements to ensure the populations of commercially harvested shellfish and endangered abalone. Steve Shimek, executive director of The Otter Project, told the Santa Cruz Sentinel he thinks the bill should be called "SOS, Sacrifice Otters for Shellfish."—*Internet*

Campaign reports show contribution prowess

WASHINGTON, 21 Feb—A third-party committee supporting Mitt Romney spent \$14 million on advertising against his Republican US presidential rivals last month, reports indicate. Documents filed with the Federal Election Commission indicated

Restore Our Future, a super political action committee, also raised nearly \$7 million during January and began February with more than \$16 million in the bank. *The New York Times* reported on Monday. Although Restore Our Future received donations in amounts as small as \$5, nearly \$5 million raised by the super-PAC came from 25 individuals and corporations that donated \$100,000 to \$500,000 each, documents indicated. Rep Ron Paul of Texas pulled in \$4.5 million in January, a person close to Paul's campaign told *The Washington Post*. President Obama's campaign last week said it raised \$11.9 million for its campaign and \$17.3 million more for the Democratic National Committee in January, the *Post* said. Obama's campaign committee had \$75.9 million in cash on hand. Campaigns had until midnight Monday to file their January fundraising reports with the FEC. *Internet*

A seven kg baby is born in China!

BEIJING, 21 Feb—A baby boy weighing 7.4 kilograms at birth has set a record for China's heaviest newborn. Chunchun was born via caesarean section that lasted about 20 minutes on 4 February. Both mother and the baby are doing fine, according to doctors in Henan province's Xinxiang City, the *Global Times* reported.

His 29-year-old mother Wang Yujuan said Chunchun's elder sister was four kilograms at birth who is now six years old. "I clearly felt that my body was more clumsy than when I had been pregnant with my daughter. My belly was bigger than it was then," Wang said. "I guessed the baby would be four-and-a-half and

five kilos. I never expected to hear that he weighs so much." For the title of China's heaviest newborn, Chunchun edged out three other babies born between 2008 and 2010, all of whom weighed exactly 6.98 kg. In a study researchers have found that the baby's genes, or genes shared between mother and child, certainly contribute to high birth weight. The chance a baby will weigh more at birth is greatly increased if the mother gains excessive weight during pregnancy. The study, published last year in the scientific journal *The Lancet*, defined high birth weight as four kilograms or heavier. The heaviest birth listed by Guinness World Records belongs to a baby boy born in 1879 in Ohio, who weighed 10.77 kg at birth and whose mother was said to be a "giantess". Unfortunately, the baby died 11 hours after birth. *Internet*

Fake lawyer sentenced to two years in prison

Moscow, 21 Feb—A Russian court sentenced a man to two years in prison for practicing law without a diploma for 12 years. Vladimir Oreshniko, a well-known lawyer in Moscow, pleaded guilty to fraud for working as a lawyer without a proper diploma, *RIA Novosti* reported on Monday.

The investigation into Oreshniko found he applied for a license to practice law at the Moscow Regional Bar Association with a fake diploma allegedly issued to him in June 1991 by the Belarusian State University. "The lack of higher education may be grounds to review cases in which he participated, as well as the provision of low-quality legal services, which is a violation of the right for defence," said Vladimir Zherebenkov, the chairman of the Bar Association. Oreshniko was sentenced to two years in prison by the Tver District court.—*Internet*

Israel holds earthquake drill in schools

JERUSALEM, 21 Feb—Israel's Home Front Command conducted a simultaneous earthquake exercise on Monday in schools all over the country. The drill was a joint exercise held by the Home Front Command along with the Ministry of Education, the Israel Police, Magen David Adom, the Fire and Rescue Services, as well as local authorities.

All schools and kindergartens in Israel

participated in the drill, which was intended to raise the alertness of the education system to "an earthquake scenario" and to test the effectiveness of the procedures during and following such an event, according to a statement from the Israel Defence Forces.

The aim of the drill "is to strengthen the cooperation between local authority and the educational establishment along with the Home Front

Command, Emergency Services and volunteers from different organizations," the statement said. Last spring, a similar drill throughout schools in Israel was staged by the Home Front, including a missile strike.

Parts of Israel and the West Bank lay on the Syrian-African fault line. The last earthquake to hit Israel was a magnitude 4.2 one in last August.

Suit says Scouts hide widespread abuse

SANTA BARBARA, 21 Feb—A California lawsuit says the Boy Scouts of America's reluctance to call in police in a troop leader's case shows an effort to conceal widespread sex abuse. The suit also targets the organization's secret files of Scouts leader abuse allegations, and a judge has ordered the Scouts to turn over documents covering 20 years. In addition, the civil suit says the Scouts should have known a troop leader put a boy in jeopardy in the 2007 criminal case, the *Los Angeles Times* reported.

The newspaper is withholding the name of the family to protect the boy's identity. When first told of the allegations, the boy's

mother said, a Scouts executive hesitated to inform law enforcement.

"He said that wasn't necessary, because the Scouts do their own internal investigation," the woman told the *Times*. "I thought that was really weird. ... I thought it was really important to call the sheriff right away."

The mother called in police herself. Scout leader Al Steven Stein, then 29, was charged with abusing her son and two other boys. He pleaded no contest in 2008 to felony child endangerment.

Stein was put on probation, but when officials later found pictures of nude children on his cellphone data card, he was sent to prison.

San Francisco quake survivor, 109, dies

SANTA ROSA, 21 Feb—Rose Cliver, one of the last five known survivors of the 1906 San Francisco earthquake, died during the weekend at a Santa Rosa, Calif, residential care home.

Cliver, 109, died Saturday, her son, Don, told the *San Francisco Chronicle*. Cliver, one of 13 siblings and a mother of two, was 3 when the quake and subsequent fire hit San Francisco, killing 1,000 people and destroying more than 28,000 buildings.

Cliver was honored at noon Monday at John's Grill, said Lee Houskeeper, one of the organizers of San Francisco's annual earthquake commemoration.

Houskeeper said this year's 18 April ceremony will be dedicated to Cliver. Funeral arrangements were pending.—*Internet*

Man arrested for bringing gun to airport

CHICAGO, 21 Feb—A Chicago man was arrested for attempting to bring a loaded gun onto an airplane, prosecutors said.

Willie T Thomas was arrested at the Midway Airport Saturday morning when an X-ray scan of his laptop bag showed he was carrying a loaded handgun, the *Chicago Tribune* reported.

Thomas, who was travelling to Atlanta to visit family, said he forgot the gun was in his bag when he went to the airport, said his attorney, Michael Schmiede.

He was charged with attempting to board a plane with a weapon and held on \$30,000 bond Sunday. Schmiede said Thomas would not have intentionally brought a loaded gun onto an airplane, because that would be "about the stupidest thing anyone could ever do."—*Internet*

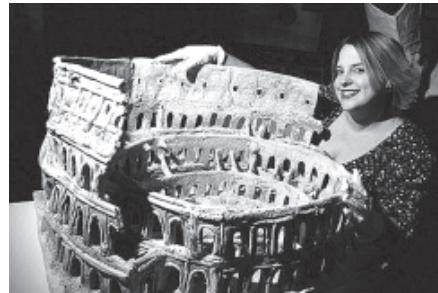


Photo shows an amazing building model made of yummy foods.

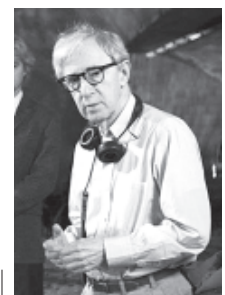

weekend. "I'm fine," he claimed. "I felt good against Valencia and will hopefully be in top [condition] on Sunday [at the Vicente Calderon]." Xavi, a product of the Barcelona youth team, is now approaching 500 La Liga appearances for the club.

LONDON, 21 Feb — Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson has revealed his regret at passing up the chance to sign Joe Hart for £100,000 earlier in his career. Hart, 24, joined Manchester City from Shrewsbury in 2006 and has become England's first-choice goalkeeper. But Ferguson told BBC Radio 5

live: "I could have bought Joe Hart for £100,000 so we all make mistakes." The Scot also said he would like an ambassadorial role at United after another "two or three years" as boss.

In a wide-ranging interview, the United manager claims Hart will be an England regular for at least another decade and is the best goalkeeper the country has produced for the last 20 years. After struggling to replace Peter Schmeichel, who left Old Trafford in 1999, Ferguson eventually signed Edwin van der Sar from Fulham in 2005. Van der Sar retired last summer and although Ferguson has defended the purchase of David de Gea, many United fans will be frustrated to hear that Hart could have been their player.

The United manager claims he could have picked the youngster up from Shrewsbury before he eventually moved to rivals City for an initial fee of £600,000 in 2006. Ferguson said: "I've no doubt [that Hart will be England goalkeeper for the next 10 years]."

The top-ranked Belarusian drew attention during her run to the Australian Open title for the high-pitched sound she makes when she hits the ball, with some fans at Rod

Laver Arena even mimicking the noise that sounds like a hooting owl.

"It will be with me for my entire career. But let me put it this way: do you snore?" Azarenka asked one reporter on Sunday after winning the Qatar Open. "Can you control that? ... There are ways but you still snore. Right? So it's natural to you, right? So that's natural to me, too. The way I play tennis. That's it." The issue has attracted the attention of the WTA. The governing body of women's tennis plans to look at ways of reducing the noise levels made by players, an issue it says has become "bothersome" for supporters.

Currently, the umpire can penalize a player for "a deliberate act" of hindrance, but the rule is rarely enforced for grunting. In the midst of a 17-game winning streak, Azarenka said the noise she makes started as a way to give her extra power. The woman she beat to win the Australian Open, Maria Sharapova, grunts loudly when hitting the ball. — Internet

Gyan says psychologically shattered after penalty misses

CAPE TOWN, 21 Feb—Missing key penalties for Ghana in successive tournaments has left Asamoah Gyan "psychologically down" and wanting a break from the national team, the striker said on Twitter on Monday. Gyan, who missed penalties during the 2010 World Cup quarter-finals and this year's African Nations Cup semi, used the social network to explain his decision to suspend his international career but said he would be keen to play in the future.

"Psychologically I'm

down. As you can imagine it's been very hard for me mentally to miss important successive penalties for my country," the former Sunderland striker said on his account @asamoah_gyan. "And because of this, a break to recoup my thoughts and emotions will aid me to come back bigger and mentally stronger. I have never fully recovered from (the) 2010 World Cup and now 2012 Afcon (Nations Cup).

"I would like to ask for prayers and support from Ghanaians to help me come back with renewed strength to continue serving my country," he Tweeted. Gyan hit the crossbar with a last-minute penalty against Uruguay in the World Cup quarter-final in Johannesburg, that had he converted would have meant Ghana becoming the first African country to reach the last four.—Internet

Learn from United's Basel slip, warns Bayern boss

MUNICH, 21 Feb—Bayern Munich boss Karl-Heinz Rummenigge insists his team must learn from Manchester United's lesson and avoid a slip-up in Basel on Wednesday in the Champions League Round of 16 first-leg tie. Bayern will face FC Basel at their St Jakob Stadium and chief executive officer Rummenigge has said the Bavarians must be on their guard to avoid suffering a similar fate to the English Premier League champions.

Alex Ferguson's United were beaten 2-1 at Basel last December in the group stages, which knocked them out of the Champions League. But Rummenigge says his team must learn from United's mistakes. "If we play like Man United did, we will also have problems," he told German magazine *Kicker*. Bayern produced a below-par performance in Saturday's goalless draw at Freiburg, which left them third in the German league, and Rummenigge says they can ill-afford another poor display.

"It's not permitted (in the Champions League)," he was quoted as saying. "The knock-out system does not forgive performances like that, or you're gone." Rummenigge says Bayern have a "duty" to their fans to reach the Champions League final on 19 May at their own stadium, but it has been 15 years since a team won the title in their own country.

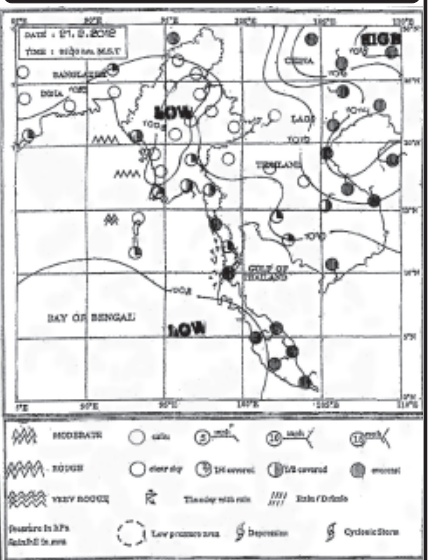

Wozniacki hits out at Navratilova

DOHA, 21 Feb—Former world number one Caroline Wozniacki hit back at Martina Navratilova on Monday for claiming that the Dane had never deserved to be top of the world rankings. Wozniacki also suggested she has lost respect for Navratilova, regarded by many as the greatest woman player ever, implying that her TV commentating sought to stir things up and that it would be better to "think a little bit."

"I would never say Martina was number one when there was no-one

playing," Wozniacki said, "or that she was the best when no-one was playing. That would be disrespectful." Her comment was an echo of Navratilova's remarks at an Australian Open Press conference, in which the 55-year-old legend said: "Clearly nobody feels Wozniacki is a true number one." Navratilova, whose 18 Grand Slam singles titles were achieved when the women's game had less depth, also criticized the modern ranking system which placed Wozniacki at the top for 68 weeks.

Lady luck isn't smiling on Barca, laments Xavi



BARCELONA, 21 Feb—Barcelona midfielder Xavi Hernandez on Tuesday lamented his side's lack of luck at key times this season as the Catalan giants sit ten points adrift of leaders Real Madrid.

"This ten-point difference comes down to details. At key moments when it was double or quits luck wasn't on our side," said the Spanish international.

"But we're going to battle until the end, La Liga is still not lost." The midfielder acknowledged that "unconsciously" Barca had "perhaps taken their foot off the pedal" slightly. "We're always competitive but unconsciously the team may not have realised it and slackened off," he said.

Barca have failed to win seven away fixtures, a weakness not shown in previous seasons. Uncertainty also surrounds the future of coach Pep Guardiola, whose contract expires at the end of the season, with Xavi insisting that he wants him to remain at the Catalan side.

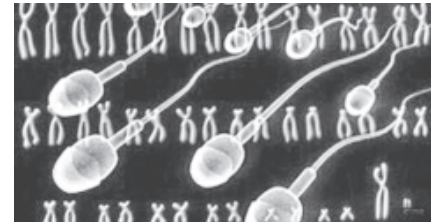
"I'd love Pep to renew his contract, he's the key element to this machine and hopefully he will sign an extension."

Xavi dismissed speculation linking himself to a coaching role with Barca. "Leave me alone, let me play. I'm not thinking about anything else but playing football. And besides, I don't even have a coaching diploma," he added. —Internet

Men can inherit a form of heart disease from father via Y chromosome

LONDON, 21 Feb—Men can inherit heart disease from their father say scientists who have tracked the condition to the Y chromosome that dads pass to sons. By studying the DNA of over 3,000 men they found a particular version of the sex chromosome increases the risk of coronary artery disease by 50%. As many as one in five British men carry this version of Y. And the risk it confers is in addition to other heart risk factors like cholesterol, *The Lancet* reports.

Experts already know that men develop heart disease a decade earlier than women, on average. By the age of 40, the lifetime risk of heart disease is one in two for men and one in three for women. Lifestyle factors like smoking and blood pressure are important contributors. This latest work suggests the male Y chromosome can also play a role in coronary artery disease—a common form of heart disease that kills thousands each year in the UK. Dr Maciej Tomaszewski, from the University of Leicester, and colleagues studied 3,233 biologically unrelated British men who were already enrolled in other

medical studies investigating heart disease risk. When they carried out genetic tests on the men they found that 90% possessed one of two common versions of Y chromosome—named haplogroup I and hap-logroup R1b1b2.

And the risk of coronary artery disease among the men carrying the haplogroup I version was 50% higher than in other men. The scientists say they now need to pinpoint precisely which genes on the Y chromosome are responsible. But they believe they already know how they exert their effect - by upsetting a man's immune system. Internet

Terry out for two months



LONDON, 21 Feb—Chelsea captain John Terry has been ruled out for up to two months after aggravating his knee injury.

Terry is due to undergo what is understood to be a small procedure on the right knee that has been troubling him ever since he collided with a post in last month's FA Cup clash with *Portsmouth*.

Blues boss *Andre Villas-Boas* had been hoping the 31-year-old would recover in time for Tuesday night's Champions League clash at *Napoli*.

But, despite taking part in training on Monday night, the England centre-back woke up in considerable pain at *Chelsea's* team hotel on Tuesday morning and will now miss the game at the *Stadio San Paulo* as well as next week's international friendly against *Holland*.

The news is a major blow for *Chelsea* who have struggled in recent weeks and dropped out of the top four in the Premier League to increase the pressure on *Villas-Boas*. Internet
