Three policemen killed, one injured in suicide bomb in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 15 March—Three policemen were killed and another was injured in a suicide blast that took place on Thursday morning in Pakistan's northwest city of Peshawar, said local police. Shafqat Malik, Assistant Inspector General of police in Peshawar, said that the attack took place at about 9:30 am local time when a suicide bomber blew himself up near a police vehicle in Pishatkhura area of the city. Superintendent Police Kalam Khan who was on an inspection tour of check posts at the outskirts of Peshawar was killed right on the spot

while his three colleagues in the vehicle were wounded in the blast. Two of the injured police later died in hospital. Police quickly cordoned off the area after the attack was reported and six suspects have been arrested from the nearby area in the search operation. Bomb disposal squad believed that an estimated six kilograms of explosives were used in the suicide vest worn by the bomber. Ball bearings were used in the bomb to enhance the intensity of the blast, they said. Identity of the suicide bomber is yet to be determined, said local police, adding that no group has

claimed responsibility for the attack yet. Over the last couple of days, a series of attacks on police were reported in the country. On Tuesday night, unknown gunmen killed four policemen in Pakistan's eastern district of Gujrat, a place lying some 120 kilometres north of Lahore in Punjab Province. On the same night, three cops were killed in Pakistan's southern port city of Karachi.—Xinhua

Afghan who crashed truck where Panetta landed dies

KABUL, 15 March—An Afghan man who crashed a stolen truck at an airfield as US Secretary of Defence Leon Panetta's plane was landing there died Thursday of extensive burns, a top US general in Afghanistan said. US Lt Gen Curtis Scaparotti, the deputy commander of American forces in Afghanistan, told reporters traveling with Panetta in Kabul that the driver was an interpreter working for the foreign forces. The man apparently had a container of fuel in the car, which ignited during the crash Wednesday at the British airfield in Helmand Province in southern Afghanistan. "There was a puff of smoke and he came out engulfed in flames," Scaparotti said. He said the truck was headed toward a group of US Marines assembled at the ramp. "My personal opinion, yes, he had an intent to do harm," Scaparotti said. But he said he did not think the incident was related to Panetta's arrival because it would have been difficult to know which plane the defence secretary was aboard.

No one in Panetta's party was hurt. The defence secretary was told about the incident after he got off the aircraft. Authorities were not able to talk to or get any information from the driver before he died. A US military official said a British soldier was injured when he tried to stop the driver from stealing the truck on the base. The Afghan man hit the British soldier with the truck as he was driving away. The official spoke on condition of anonymity because the incident is still being investigated.—Internet

Afghans protest US soldier's deadly rampage

KABUL, 15 March—About 1,000 Afghans took to the streets in a southern town on Thursday to protest the killing of 16 civilians in a murderous rampage by a US soldier, police said. Shouting anti-American slogans the demonstrators poured into the main town of Qalat in Zabol Province neighbouring Kandahar, where the shooting spree took place on Sunday, regional police spokesman Hekmatullah Kochai told AFP. The protest came with US Defence Secretary Leon

Lee, Obama welcome implementation of S Korea-US FTA

SEOUL, 15 March—South Korean President Lee Myung-bak held telephone talks with his US counterpart Barack Obama to celebrate the beginning of a long-delayed free trade agreement (FTA) between the two countries, South Korea's presidential office Cheong Wa Dae said Thursday. Lee said he expects that the implementation of the (South) Korea-US FTA will contribute to enhancing the two countries' economic development and bilateral relations, according to Cheong Wa Dae.

He also said he believes the agreement will serve as a "good model" for global free trade and that he hopes it will achieve successful results. Obama responded

that he is pleased with the implementation of the deal, and stressed that it is a strong example of the two country's partnership, Cheong Wa Dae said. The deal, which went into effect at midnight Wednesday, was ratified by the South Korean parliament in November last year despite

vehement protests from opposition lawmakers. It was initially signed in 2007 and was renegotiated in 2010. The two leaders also agreed to work closely for the upcoming Nuclear Security Summit in Seoul on 26 to 27 March. Xinhua

India police name Iranian suspects in Delhi attack

NEW DELHI, 15 March—Three Iranians have been named by Indian police as suspects in an attack on an Israeli diplomat in New Delhi, the first time Iran has been firmly linked to the bombing, reports said on Thursday. The men entered the country on tourist visas and left after the assassination attempt in the centre of the Indian capital on 13 February that badly wounded a female embassy worker, The Times of India and The Indian Express reported. "They had entered the country during different times and did not leave together," an unnamed security source told The Indian Express. "We have their travel details." The reports, based on anonymous police and intelligence agency sources, said police had asked a local court for warrants for the men and their names would be given to the Iranian government. Last week, a veteran Indian freelance journalist called Syed Mohammed Kazmi who worked part-time for Iran's news agency IRNA became the first person arrested in connection with the attack. He is accused of providing logistical support for the plotters and a bike used for reconnaissance of the embassy was allegedly found at his house in an upmarket area of the Indian Capital. In the attack, a hitman on a rented motorbike attached a magnetic bomb to the back of an Israeli embassy car carrying the 42-year-old diplomat as she went to pick up her children from school. The woman, also the wife of the defence attache at the embassy, was left in a critical condition with spinal injuries and has since been flown to Israel for further treatment. Internet

Venus and Jupiter cuddling up in night sky

CAPE CANAVERAL, 15 March—It's not too late to catch the spectacular Venus and Jupiter show. On Monday and Tuesday evenings, the planets will appear just 3

degrees apart in the western sky. The gap has been narrowing since last month.

The two planets are visible every night at twilight. Venus is brighter because of its relative closeness, compared with super-far-away Jupiter.

Even though the gap will widen, the planets will appear remarkably close all week and be easily visible the rest of this month. So says astronomer Tony Phillips, author of the spaceweather.com website. Grab a small telescope, and you can also catch Jupiter's four largest moons.

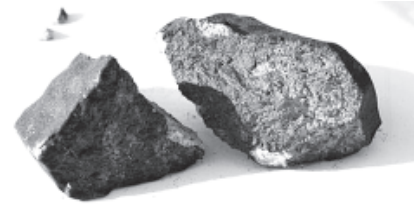
Astronomers consider it the best evening tag-up of Venus and Jupiter in years. In July, early-risers will be treated to a similar spectacle, in the eastern sky at daybreak. Phillips says throw in the crescent moon, and it "will be worth waking up for."

Encounters of another kind: meteorite chunk falls on Oslo

OSLO, 15 March—A Norwegian family was flabbergasted to find that what appeared to be a piece of a meteorite had crashed through the roof of their allotment garden hut in the middle of Oslo, media reported on Monday.

The rock weighing 585 grammes (one pound, four ounces), which split in two, probably detached from a meteorite observed over Norway on 1 March, experts said, and had landed on the empty hut in the Thomassen family's allotment in a

working-class neighbourhood of the Norwegian Capital. Astrophysicist Knut Joergen Roed Oedegaard and his wife Anne Mette Sannes, a meteorite enthusiast, identified the object as a breccia, or a rock composed of broken fragments of minerals or rock.

"It is a sensation in more than one way. On one hand because it is rare that a piece of meteorite goes through a roof and on the other hand because it is a breccia, which is even harder to find," Sannes told AFP.

She said the owners of the meteorite pieces wanted

to keep them in Norway, maybe in a museum.

Meteorites speed through space and generally break up as they enter our atmosphere, but it is extremely rare for the debris to fall on inhabited areas, according to Serge Kouchmy, a researcher at the Paris Astrophysical Institute. "This family is very lucky," Kouchmy told AFP.

"First off because the piece of meteorite did not cause much damage, but also because it is worth a small fortune," he said.

Cassini spacecraft glimpses new views of moon Rhea

PASADENA, 15 March—The pockmarked surface of Saturn's second-largest moon has come into sharper focus in new images released by NASA.

The space agency on Monday released the new views of the moon Rhea, which were captured by the international Cassini spacecraft during a recent flyby. One of its cameras spied two huge impact basins and other geologic features on Rhea's icy surface from 26,000 miles away last week.

Cassini, funded by NASA and the European and Italian space agencies, was launched in 1997. It reached Saturn in 2004 and has been studying the ringed planet and its numerous moons.

Twitter buys mobile blogging startup Posterous

SAN FRANCISCO, 15 March—Twitter on Monday announced that it has bought mobile blogging startup Posterous and will put engineers behind the popular "lifestreaming" service to work on special projects.

"This team has built an innovative product that makes sharing across the Web and mobile devices simple—a goal we share," San Francisco-based Twitter said in a blog post.

"Posterous engineers, product managers and others will join our teams

working on several key initiatives that will make Twitter even better."

Posterous launched in 2008 as a platform for blogging with an emphasis on letting people use smartphones to post pictures, videos, audio or other digital snippets and share them with groups in virtual "Spaces."

The legions of Posterous fans have grown along with a "lifestreaming" trend in which moments are captured throughout the day and shared in online journals.

"The opportunities in front of Twitter are exciting," Posterous founder and chief executive Sachin Agarwal said in a message at the freshly-acquired San Francisco startup's website.

"We couldn't be happier about bringing our team's expertise to a product that reaches hundreds of millions of users around the globe." Posterous Spaces will continue to operate with users of the firm's free application promised they would get plenty of notice of any changes to the service, according to Twitter.—Internet

Yahoo sues Facebook for infringing 10 patents

SAN FRANCISCO, 15 March—Yahoo Inc sued Facebook Inc over 10 patents that include methods and systems for advertising on the Web, opening the first major legal battle among big technology companies in social media.

The lawsuit, filed in a San Jose, California federal court on Monday, marks a major escalation of patent litigation that has already swept up the smartphone and tablet sectors and high-tech stalwarts such as Apple Inc, Microsoft Corp and Motorola Mobility Holdings Inc.

Yahoo's patent lawsuit follows Facebook's annou-

ncement of plans for an initial public offering that could value the company at about \$100 billion. Facebook spokesman Jonathan Thaw said Facebook learned of the lawsuit through the media.

"We're disappointed that Yahoo, a longtime business partner of Facebook and a company that has substantially benefited from its association with Facebook, has decided to resort to litigation," he said.

In an emailed statement, Yahoo said it is confident it will prevail. "Unfortunately, the matter with Facebook remains unresolved and we are compelled to seek redress

in federal court," the company said in a statement.

Yahoo, one of the Web's pioneering companies, has seen its revenues decline in recent years at a time when rivals such as Facebook and

Google have thrived. In January, Yahoo appointed former PayPal President Scott Thompson as its new chief executive, replacing Carol Bartz, who was fired in September.—Reuters

Intel eyes Internet-based TV service: WSJ

SAN FRANCISCO, 15 March—Chipmaker Intel Corp is developing an Internet-based TV service for consumers and has been promoting it with media companies, the Wall Street Journal said, citing people familiar with the effort.

The world's top chipmaker plans to create a "virtual cable operator" that would offer media companies' TV channels in a bundle over the Internet, the WSJ said. An Intel spokeswoman declined to comment on the story.

The product could use an Intel set-top box and Intel's name, and the chipmaker has told its potential partners it wants to start the service before the end of the year, the WSJ said. In October, Intel wound down its efforts to make chips for digital "smart" TVs, although it continues to make chips for set-top boxes. At the same time, it formed the Intel Media business group, headed by former BBC executive Erik Huggers, aimed at promoting digital content on Intel-based platforms.—Reuters



Health Tip: Calm a canker sore

Canker sores are ulcers that form inside the mouth that can make eating and drinking painful.

The American Dental Association suggests how to help heal a canker sore:

- * Apply an over-the-counter topical anesthetic to numb the sore.
- * Use an antimicrobial mouth rinse.
- * Avoid foods that may irritate the sore, especially anything spicy, hot or acidic.
- * See your dentist if the sore doesn't heal without treatment after two weeks.
- * Use an antibiotic and/or bandage as recommended by your dentist, to help reduce the risk of infection.

Anti-smoking efforts save 800,000 US lives

WASHINGTON, 15 March—Higher taxes on cigarettes, limits on selling to kids and campaigns to educate people on the dangers of smoking have saved nearly 800,000 lives, according to a US study released on Wednesday.

The research is based on scientific models that counted how many people smoked up until 1970 and projected how many would have died of lung cancer between 1975 and 2000 if not for a concerted US effort to cut back. "This is the first attempt to quantify the impact of changes in smoking behaviors on lung cancer mortality based on detailed reconstruction of cigarette smoking histories," said lead author Suresh Moolgavkar of the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Centre in Seattle.

"The methods that were developed as a part of this research should prove to be invaluable to other researchers investigating the adverse health impacts of cigarette smoking." If everyone had quit smoking after the Surgeon General's 1964 report that first warned

of the hazards of cigarettes, 2.5 million lung cancer deaths could have been avoided, said the study in the Journal of the National Cancer Institute.

But since that did not happen, of course, there were more than two million deaths among men from lung cancer and more than a million among women from 1975 to 2000. Tobacco control efforts averted 550,000 lung cancer deaths among men and 240,000 among women during that span, said the study, funded by the National Cancer Institute. The study only extended to 2000 because the researchers lacked detailed data for subsequent years at the time when the study first began, the study authors said.—Internet



Drug may reduce subconscious racism

OXFORD, (England), 15 March—A beta-blocker, a medication used to treat heart disease, may reduce a person's subconscious racial bias, researchers in Britain suggest. Lead author Sylvia Terbeck, an experimental psychologist at Oxford University in England, and colleagues gave 18 people the drug propranolol and 18 people a placebo.

The study published in Psychopharmacology found the propranolol group scored significantly lower on the Implicit Attitude Test into subconscious racial bias—a standard test for testing subconscious racial attitudes.

Propranolol blocks activation in the peripheral "autonomic" nervous system and in the area of the brain implicated in fear or emotional responses, Terbeck said.

The researchers said they think propranolol reduced implicit racial bias because such bias is based on automatic, non-conscious fear responses, which propranolol blocks, Terbeck explained. Study co-author Julian Savulescu said this research raises the tantalizing possibility that unconscious racial attitudes could be modulated using drugs, a possibility that requires careful ethical analysis. "Biological research aiming to make people morally better has a dark history," Savulescu said in a statement.

"And propranolol is not a pill to cure racism. But given that many people are already using drugs like propranolol which have 'moral' side effects, we at least need to better understand what these effects are.—Internet

China Mobile Q4 growth mild; hopes pinned on iPhone tie-up

HONG KONG, 15 March—China Mobile <0941.HK>, the world's biggest wireless carrier by number of subscribers, met expectations by posting a 4.6 percent rise in fourth-quarter net profit on Thursday as higher mobile data usage offset some of the impact of hefty handset subsidies.

The carrier, which has a market value of about \$218 billion and competes with smaller rivals China Unicom <0762.HK> and China Telecom Corp <0728.HK>, could see growth accelerate later this year if it succeeds in sealing a deal with Apple Inc to offer the iPhone. China Mobile has been trying to boost the average rates users pay in the world's largest mobile phone market, where barely 15 percent of the 988 million subscribers - and soon to hit 1 billion - are 3G users.

But its adoption of a homegrown mobile phone technology, the TD-SCDMA standard, viewed by analysts as inferior to the internationally accepted technologies used by its main competitors, is a stumbling block in its efforts to secure the Apple tie-up and attract higher-end phone users. China Mobile, which was born out of several rounds of government restructuring of the domestic telecoms industry, is now running trials on a superior 4G technology - TD-LTE - which it expects to use on a wider scale next year.—Reuters

Asia stocks mixed amid doubts about China growth

BANGKOK, 15 March—Asian stock markets were mixed Thursday, hindered by falling commodity prices and worries about the extent of China's economic slowdown.

Benchmark oil remained below \$106 per barrel while the dollar rose against the yen but slipped against the euro. Japan's Nikkei 225 index rose for a third straight day, basking in the ongoing retreat of the yen from record highs against the US dollar. The Nikkei was 0.9 percent higher to 10,144.48.

But Hong Kong and mainland Chinese shares fell, a day after Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao said curbs that have started to cool surging

housing prices will remain in place despite complaints they might worsen an economic slowdown. Construction and real estate sales are key drivers of China's growth.

South Korea's Kospi rose less than 0.1 percent to 2,046.28, while Australia's S&P/ASX 200 was down 0.3 percent at 4,276.30.

In currencies, the euro rose to \$1.3028 from \$1.3024 late Wednesday in New York. The dollar rose to 84.05 from 83.72 yen. The Japanese currency has been weakening against the dollar ever since the Bank of Japan increased its economic stimulus programme in February.

Treasury to sell stock in six bailed-out banks

WASHINGTON, 15 March—The US Treasury said on Wednesday that it plans to sell its preferred stock position in six community banks as part of the Obama administration's effort to unwind bailout programmes from the financial crisis. Treasury said it plans to conduct public auctions to sell its stock in Banner Corp, First Financial Holdings Inc, MainSource Financial Group, Seacoast Banking Corp, Wilshire Bancorp and WSFS Financial Corp.

It has so far recovered \$259 billion from the Troubled Asset Relief Programme bank programmes, which were set up to help stabilize the financial system during the 2007-09 crisis. The Treasury said it expects to start unwinding its positions in the six small banks around 26 March using a modified Dutch auction that establishes a market price by allowing investors to submit bids at specified increments.

Treasury still has stakes in 361 banks. Last week the administration announced plans to cut its position in insurer American International Group to 70 percent from 77 percent.—Reuters

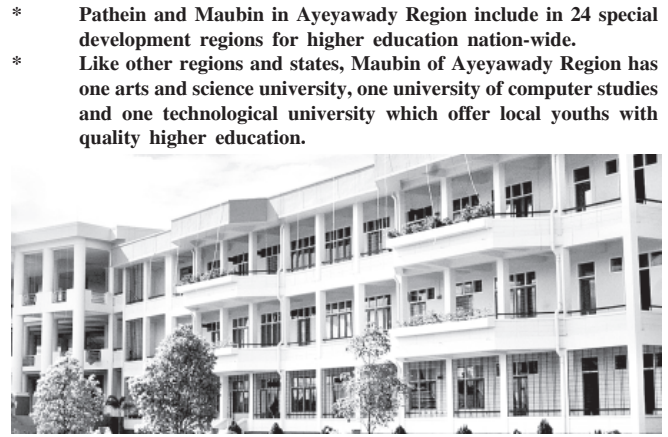

One killed, three injured in BC avalanche

SPARWOOD, 15 March — An avalanche in southeastern British Columbia killed one person and injured three others, Canadian authorities said. The three survivors of the Friday afternoon avalanche in Elk Valley near Sparwood were taken to Sparwood Hospital in stable condition, *Postmedia News* reported. It was unknown if there are any other survivors or

what the victims had been doing when the avalanche struck. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police have taken over the investigation. A "special public avalanche warning" was issued Friday for recreational back-country users by the Canadian Avalanche Centre and is in effect during the weekend. The warning includes the mountains of the South Coast Inland, the Columbia Mountains from

near Prince George in the north to the US border in the south and British Columbia's South Rockies, the Avalanche Centre said. Ilya Storm, the centre's avalanche warning services coordinator, said in a news release avalanches were likely to be much bigger than expected and could be triggered from a distance or at the bottom of a slope. Storm also said slopes typically considered safer — those with

lower angles and below treeline — were "primed" for being triggered by humans. Storm said local knowledge and extensive training and experience are needed to travel safely in avalanche terrain. The centre urges all recreational back-country users to monitor bulletins and be equipped with a shovel, probe and transceiver. The centre also advises back-country users to take an avalanche awareness course.

Govt will do more to continue to invest in parks, says Khaw

SINGAPORE, 15 March—Singapore National Development Minister Khaw Boon Wan has said that his ministry will do more to continue to invest in parks.

In his latest blog post, he wrote that parks add to the

quality of life, promotes healthy living and community bonding.

Mr Khaw pointed to two big projects - the Rail Corridor and the 150 kilometre-long Round Island Route which will link up the country's major natural,

cultural and historical attractions.

But with such investments, Mr Khaw urged the community to play its part in taking ownership of public spaces.

He cited parks in Australia, Japan and Korea, which Mr Khaw described as being "wonderfully clean" and not because they have "foreign cleaners to pick up litter".

"The users do not litter in the first place. Park users take their rubbish with them as they leave. Pets are leashed and the owners (clean up after their pets). Many Singaporeans are picking up such good habits. But I think we are still not yet at the level of the Aussies, Koreans or Japanese," he said.

Australia floods inundate almost 2,000 homes

SYDNEY, 15 March—Australian floods have inundated close to 2,000 homes in New South Wales, an official said Saturday, as the surging waters appeared to claim the life of a man in the state's north.

Eastern Australia has been hit by heavy downpours in recent days, causing swollen river systems to pour through towns and villages in New South Wales, Queensland and

Victoria, damaging crops, roads and bridges.

In badly-hit southern New South Wales, more homes were evacuated Saturday as the State Emergency Service said some 1,963 homes had been inundated, mostly around the major inland town of Wagga Wagga and the surrounding regions.

"There's further assessments being done at

present to see whether they will crack the 2,000 mark which sadly I think it will do," State Emergency Service (SES) spokesman Phil Campbell told AFP.

"This is all over-floorboard flooding. It is the significant stuff that causes so much damage and it does range from water up to the ceiling to down to just creeping into the house."

Two earthquakes rattle Japan

TOKYO, 15 March—A tsunami advisory, warning of a half-metre wave following a 6.8-magnitude earthquake Wednesday off the Japanese coast, has been canceled, officials said.

Two earthquakes with magnitudes greater than 6 struck off the east coast of Honsu, Japan, the US Geological Survey said.

The first quake, at a depth of 16 miles, was a magnitude of 6.8, USGS said. It was about 145 miles south of Kushiro, and 457 miles northeast of Tokyo. The second quake was a 6.1-magnitude event at a depth of about 5 miles, USGS said. Its epicenter was about 151 miles south of Kushiro and 447 miles northeast of Tokyo.

The Japanese Japan Meteorological Agency issued a tsunami warning following the first quake but not the second, *Kyodo News* reported. Reports of damage or injuries for both quakes were not available.—*Internet*

Terror attack foiled in Russia

MOSCOW, 15 March—Russian security forces Wednesday prevented a terror attack by defusing nine bombs at an illegal laboratory in Nalchik City.

According to the National Anti-Terrorism Committee, the laboratory where the bombs were produced was located in a garage in Nalchik, capital of Kabardino-Balkaria republic in the North Caucasus Region.

The total mass of the explosive devices was the equivalent of over 100 kg of TNT. According to bomb experts, an explosion of that magnitude would have destroyed a whole city block, the committee said.

All the bombs were taken to a secure area and destroyed.

Terror attacks are common in the mainly Muslim North Caucasus republics. Nalchik witnessed a clash in 2005 between 150 local militants and police. The attackers killed 35 policemen and 14 civilians but lost 92 of their own men.

World's tallest man finally stops growing

LONDON, 15 March—Sultan Kosen, the world's tallest man, has finally stopped growing, after he was treated at a US hospital to control the production of growth hormone.

The 29-year-old at 8ft 3inches measures in Guinness World Records as the tallest living man.

Kosen from Turkey received treatment at the University of Virginia Medical Centre in May 2010 for treatment for a disorder called acromegaly, which is usually caused by a tumour in the pituitary gland.

Special equipment was flown in from Sweden to fit Kosen's larger skull, according

to doctors.
According to the Richmond Times-Dispatch, he was placed on a new medication that could potentially help control the production of growth hormone and stop his continued growth.

University officials now claim that Kosen has stopped growing.

The treatment will be noted in Guinness World Records.

"He's done very, very well, fortunately," *the Telegraph* quoted Dr Jason Sheehan, a University of Virginia Brain surgeon, as saying.—*Internet*

117 dead, more missing in Bangladesh ferry sinking

DHAKA, 15 March—Villagers along a Bangladesh river where a packed ferry capsized earlier this week found five more bodies floating in the water Thursday, bringing the death

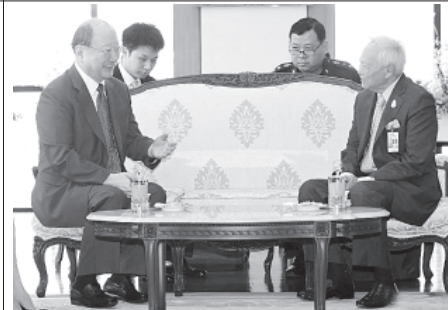
toll from the disaster to 117.

The decomposing bodies surfaced near the scene of the accident hours after the double-deck ferry was salvaged and the rescue operation was called off, local police chief Mohammad Shahabuddin Khan said. Rescuers recovered 112 bodies from inside the sunken boat Tuesday and Wednesday.

At least another 12 people were still listed missing, the area's government administrator Azizul Alam said. Local media, quoting relatives, put the number of missing higher.

The ferry carrying about 200 people collided with a cargo boat and sank early Tuesday, sending scores of people into the Meghna River, just south of Dhaka. Khan said about 35 survivors were plucked from the water, while local media reported that another 40 managed to swim to shore.

Hundreds of anxious people, many of them weeping, gathered near the scene of the accident to look for their loved ones. Some were angry, saying they blamed local authorities for the slow pace of the rescue operation.

Real Madrid book place in last 8 of Champions League

MADRID, 15 March — Real Madrid had few problems in qualifying for the last eight of the Champions League as they defeated CSKA Moscow 4-1 in the Santiago Bernabeu Stadium on Wednesday night. The win, which came thanks to goals from Gonzalo Higuain, Cristiano Ronaldo and Karim Benzema takes Madrid into the quarterfinals of the competition and keeps alive the club's hopes of winning a tenth European Cup.

Mourinho had said in the run up to the game, that he would start with three strikers, but in the end he only started with two as Cristiano Ronaldo partnered Higuain in attack, while fit-again Karim Benzema was kept on the subs' bench.

Madrid did have two attacking midfielders in Kaka and Mesut Ozil on the pitch but it was a more defensive player, Sami Khedira who was to prove vital with a magnificent pass for Higuain to open the score after 25 minutes. Higuain once again

proved that he deserves a place in the Real Madrid starting line up with his fourth goal in three matches. Ahmed Musa came close to levelling the score before the break, but Iker Casillas showed he was alert to the danger with a good save.

Ronaldo doubled Madrid's lead 10 minutes into the second half as he shot from 30 metres and CSKA goalkeeper Sergie Chepchugov made a horrible mess of it, allowing it to bounce into the back of the net when he really should have made a save.

Karim Benzema replaced Higuain with 21 minutes remaining and wasted no time in staking his claim to a first team place by scoring the third goal a minute later. Zoran Tosic gave his side a slim lifeline when he scored for CSKA with a fine individual goal with 13 minutes remaining, but Ronaldo rounded up the scoring in the last minute of injury time as he finished from a Benzema cross. —Xinhua

It was only the fourth time in Champions League history that a club has successfully come back from a two-goal first leg deficit.

three since taking over following the sacking of Andre Villas-Boas — believes Chelsea's win over Napoli can lift his side over the vital final few weeks of the season. "It meant a lot to the club that we're still able to play in the Champions League and also you could see how much it meant to the players tonight," said Di Matteo, who celebrated with the squad at the final whistle.

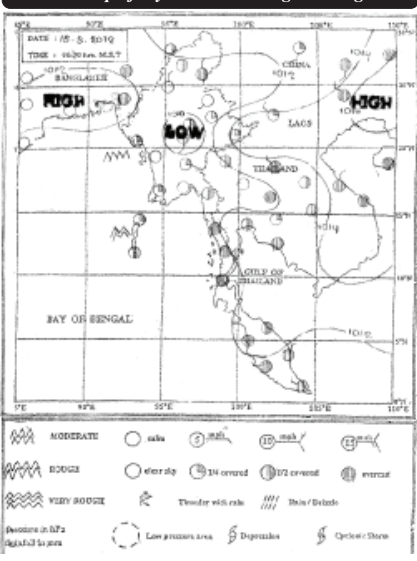

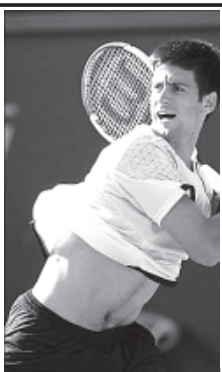

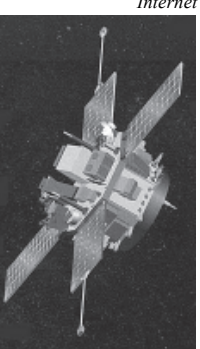


World No 1 Novak Djokovic

Age of warning satellite causes concern

WASHINGTON, 15 March—A US satellite giving the only advance warning of incoming high-energy solar particles is getting old and is possibly on its last legs, researchers say. But a replacement for NASA's Advanced Composition Explorer, or ACE, satellite is at least two years away, they said. ACE provides the only advance notice of incoming high-energy particles from the sun which can wreak havoc on indispensable radio, GPS and satellite communications, researchers said. Launched in 1997, ACE gives the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration's space weather forecasting arm advance notice if a storm is headed toward Earth, as it did with the solar storm that left the sun Tuesday. How much longer the satellite can keep working is a concern, scientists said. "It would be a very bad day for us if that spacecraft was not working," William Murtagh, programme coordinator for NOAA's Space Weather Prediction Center in Boulder, Colo, told Discovery News. "When an eruption occurs on the sun, there are still quite a few question marks as to if it's going to hit the Earth and when it's going to hit the Earth," he said. From about 1 million miles away, ACE provides the only early warning of what's headed toward Earth and utility operators, airlines, satellite owners, GPS users and others depend on space weather alerts from NOAA. "ACE is a single point of failure and it's old," Murtagh said. "Every time I have a space weather storm I cringe a little bit that our very own space weather satellite doesn't succumb to the storms I'm relying on it to help forecast."—Internet

Civil servants working in far-flung areas with difficult access to social affairs granted regional allowances

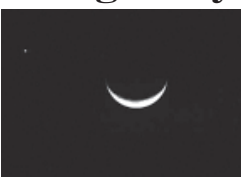

Pre-monsoon rain/squalls warning

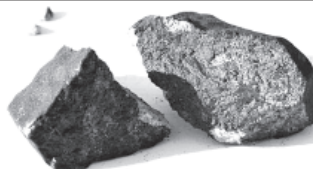
