Indonesia warns of 'mistrust' over US Marine deployment plan

SYDNEY, 16 March—Indonesian Foreign Minister Marty Natalegawa on Friday said the stationing of US Marines in Australia needed to be better explained to all countries in Asia to avoid "mistrust".

In an interview with the Sydney Morning Herald, Natalegawa also called on Australia to "wage aggressive peace" in the region and accept that the rise of China was natural and not threatening.

The United States announced in November a plan to station some 2,500 Marines in remote Darwin by 2017, which was seen by

some as an acknowledgement of Washington's concern about China's growing assertiveness.

Natalegawa said he understood the deployment of Marines was not directed at Indonesia "but unless (understanding) is properly disseminated, it could create mistrust among others".

"There are so many potential triggers" for conflict, he added, after talks with his Australian counterpart Bob Carr.

"If we make the anarchical assumption, everyone will behave according to the worst-case scenario."

Natalegawa argued for policies to accommodate a rising China, saying a consequence of the rising prosperity of Asia was military modernisation.

"That's fine and normal as long as we do not attach unnecessary aggressive intent to it," he said.

"Countries rising and falling is natural. Once you accept that, it will not be seen as threatening."

The US currently has only a limited deployment in longstanding ally Australia, including the Pine Gap Joint Defence Facility spy station near Alice Springs.—*Internet*

Afghanistan seeks early security handover

KABUL, 16 March—The US and the Afghan governments should work together for an early handover of security responsibility, Afghanistan President Hamid Karzai has said.

According to a Karzai office statement, the Afghan president told visiting US Defence Secretary Leon Panetta Thursday that "both sides should work together for a security handover from international forces to Afghan troops to take place by 2013 instead of 2014".

"The Afghan government is ready to take overall security responsibility,"

reports of insurgent action in the area. Turkey's foreign minister also said the cause was apparently a technical fault. "Both the location and the way the crash happened makes the impression that it's due to technical failure," Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu told reporters in Istanbul. "It's a cause of great pain, I am sending my condolences once again to the families and the general staff."—*MNA/Reuters*

Xinhua quoted Karzai as saying in the statement. On Wednesday, US President Barack Obama said that the NATO forces in Afghanistan will shift to a support role in 2013, a year ahead of the scheduled date to complete troop withdrawal from the war-torn country.

According to the statement, Karzai also told Panetta that the US should pull out its troops from Afghan villages, where they have military camps and outposts, and relocate them in their bases across the country. The

Afghan president made the comments in the wake of a shooting spree by a US soldier that left 16 Afghan civilians dead in Kandahar Province, the Taliban group's birthplace and stronghold.

Panetta during the meet told Karzai that the US has vowed to hold fully accountable anyone found responsible for the killing of civilians in Afghanistan.

On Thursday, the Taliban outfit announced that it has suspend preliminary peace talks with the US.

16 injured as passenger van hit by bomb in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 16 March—At least 16 people were injured when a passenger van was hit by a remote-controlled bomb in Pakistan's northwest tribal area of Kurram Agency on Friday morning, reported local Urdu TV channel Samaa.

According to the report, the incident took place at about 10:40 am local time when a passenger van was hit by a roadside-planted remote control bomb while on its way from Parachinar, capital City of Kurram Agency, to Peshawar, the largest city in northwest Pakistan.

It is not known how many people were on the van when it was hit by the blast, nor is it clear at this point about the conditions of the injured people.

NATO helicopter crash kills 16 people in Afghanistan

KABUL, 17 March—A NATO helicopter crashed into a house on the outskirts of the Afghan capital, Kabul, on Friday, killing 12 Turkish soldiers on board and four Afghan civilians on the ground, Turkey's military and a senior Afghan police official said. The crash came amid growing unease among NATO partner countries about the increasingly unpopular and costly war nearly 11 years into the conflict as most foreign combat troops set to leave Afghanistan by the end of 2014. "Twelve of our military personnel on board the helicopter have been martyred," the Turkish general staff said in a statement in Ankara.

A team had been sent to the scene to investigate, it said. Wreckage as well as corpses and body parts

littered the site. Relief workers and Turkish soldiers covered bodies with red and purple blankets on a ground in front of a smoking hole in a two-storey house. Two women and two children were among those killed when the helicopter crashed into the

house, an Afghan police officer said. The officer said the cause of the crash appeared to be a technical fault. NATO's International Security Assistance Force said earlier that the cause of the crash was still unknown but that there had been no

Three Indonesians wounded in Java bomb

SEMARANG, 16 March—Three construction workers were wounded on Thursday after a small bomb exploded on Indonesia's Java island, police said.

A garbage collector found the homemade bomb, made up of a plastic pipe filled with cable wires and explosive materials, in a drain in a residential complex in Semarang City in Central Java Province around midday.

"He then gave the bomb to the three men but it exploded as they were examining it. It was a low-explosive bomb," local police chief Elan Subilan told *AFP*.

One man had a finger blown off in the explosion and two others sustained light injuries, Subilan said, without confirming if a terror group was behind the incident.

"We are investigating who were behind the explosion and their motive. In the meantime, we have increased security in the city," he said. Indonesia has arrested and jailed dozens of members of a new militant cell behind a series of attacks, including parcel bombs sent to liberal Muslim leaders and a counter-terrorism official.

Nobody was killed in those incidents.

The cell was believed to be responsible for suicide bomb attacks at a police mosque last April in West Java and in a church five months later in Central Java.

People discovery app connects us as never before

TORONTO, 16 March—Looking to find new friends or business partners among the hundreds of people you encounter each week? A new app may help.

The iPhone app called Highlight aims to transform how people meet by alerting users when they are physically near people with whom they share a connection such as mutual friends, similar interests or the same hometown. "Nothing affects our happiness or influences our lives more than the people around us. But the way we find or learn about them, is — and always has been — completely random and inefficient," said Paul Davison, the founder of Highlight.

"Take San Francisco as an example. It's a city of 800,000 strangers. We sit on the bus and stand in line next to each other. But you don't know anything about anyone that you pass by. That doesn't seem weird, because it's always been that way. But if you think about it, it's kind of ridiculous," he said. The Highlight app runs in the background on users' devices. When it makes a connection it sends each user the other's profile, including information such as names, photos, mutual connections and interests.—Reuters

Beijing takes a brand-new approach to "Made in China"

BEIJING, 16 March—Two new Chinese LCD screens in Beijing's imposing Great Hall of the People will replace screens made by a Japanese competitor, in a sign of resolve to supply the world with Chinese brands and not just Made in China products.

The screens are made by Chinese electronics giant TCL. At 110 inches, they are the world's largest high-definition 3-D LCD screens, just a touch wider than the 108-inch Panasonic <6752.T> models they will replace.

"We have broken through the Japanese and South Korean monopoly of big flat-screen TVs!" TCL <000100.SZ> chairman Li Dongsheng boasted at a launch ceremony on Friday. Officials from the Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Science and Technology, Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT), and the government of Shenzhen, TCL's hometown, clapped and nodded. The government is encouraging its companies to move up the value chain and develop margin-producing brands, partly as a matter of national pride but also to shift the world's second-biggest economy away from gritty, low-profit manufacturing.—Reuters

Eye problems common in astronauts, study says

WASHINGTON, 16 March—Brain and eye problems have surfaced in astronauts who spent more than a month in space, marking a potential setback to plans for longer deep space missions, according to a US study.

The research in the journal *Radiology* analyzed magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scans of 27 astronauts with an average of 108 days in space, either on space shuttle missions or aboard the International Space Station.

Shuttle missions typically lasted a couple of weeks, while ISS stints can last more than six months. A Mars mission to bring astronauts to the red planet in the coming decades could last a year and a half.

Among the astronauts who spent more than a month in space over their lifetimes, researchers found

a variety of complications that appear similar to a syndrome caused by unexplained pressure on the brain.

These symptoms included excess cerebrospinal fluid around the optic nerve in 33 percent of the astronauts studied and flattening of the back of the eyeball in 22 percent of them.

Fifteen percent had a bulging optic nerve and 11 percent showed changes to the pituitary gland — which is located between the optic nerves, secreting sex hormones and regulating the thyroid — and its connection to the brain.

Similar effects, which can lead to problems with vision, have been observed in non-space travelers who suffer from unexplained pressure buildup in the brain, a condition known as intracranial hypertension.

"Microgravity-induced intracranial hypertension


represents a hypothetical risk factor and a potential limitation to long-duration space travel," said lead author Larry Kramer, professor of diagnostic and interventional imaging at The University of Texas Medical School at Houston. "The MRI findings revealed various combinations of abnormalities following both short- and long-term cumulative exposure to microgravity also seen with idiopathic intracranial hypertension."

While bone loss and temporary muscular aches and nerve abnormalities

have been known to afflict astronauts in the past, the new data on eye problems has many at NASA concerned about the health of its spaceflight corps.

"NASA has placed this problem high on its list of human risks, has initiated a comprehensive programme to study its mechanisms and implications, and will continue to closely monitor the situation," said William Tarver, chief of the flight medicine clinic at NASA's Johnson Space Centre.

New map of Titanic wreck site created

FALLMOUTH, (Mass), 16 March—A map of the Titanic wreck site has been made using thousands of photos taken by underwater robots in the depths of the North Atlantic Ocean, researchers say. The map, created with 130,000 photos pieced together, shows debris and ship parts scattered across a 15 square-mile patch of ocean floor and might provide new clues about what happened after the "unsinkable" British luxury liner hit an iceberg and sank in April 1912 with the loss of more than 1,500 of the 2,200 passengers and crew on board, they said.

"If we are going to do our best to manage the Titanic wreck site as a testament to those that sailed on her, we need to understand the disposition and physical state of what's there," Titanic expedition co-leader David Gallo, director of special projects at Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution in Falmouth, Mass, told *Discovery News*.

The expedition to the wreck to take photos using an ROV — remote operated vehicle — fitted with cameras was led by RMS Titanic Inc, the legal custodian of the wreck, the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution and the Waitt Institute of La Jolla, Calif.

The thousands high-resolution photos were stitched together by computer to create a detailed photomosaic map of sunken liner and the surrounding ocean bottom.

"The images are staggering. There you are on the bottom of the ocean, transported to the sea floor," Gallo said. "It's mind boggling; even veterans who have been to Titanic numerous times are slack-jawed."—Internet



New age is confirmed for Spanish dinosaur

ZARAGOZA, (Spain), 16 March—The first dinosaur found in Spain is a younger species than first thought and the ancestor of Titanosauriforms, the Earth's biggest dinosaurs, scientists say.

Twenty-five years ago when the *Aragosaurus* sauropod dinosaur fossil was first described in Spain its age was never clear, but new research has discovered it is 15 million years younger than previously estimated, a release from the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology reported on Monday.

This would make it the only dinosaur of the Hauterivian age — from 136 million to 130 million years ago — to be found in Spain, researchers said, and *Aragosaurus* fills in the transitional period between the Jurassic and Cretaceous

periods, of which little is known.

"This is the only dinosaur of this period found in Spain and is also the most intact in Europe," Jose Ignacio Canudo, a researcher at the University of Zaragoza, said.

"It can be categorized amongst the well-known sauropods of the Jurassic-Cretaceous transition [135 million years ago], the most abundant species during the Barremian age [116 million years ago]. As this group has been studied the least, the *Aragosaurus* fills the gap."

"*Aragosaurus* would have therefore been a primitive ancestor of the titanosaurs sauropods that would later dominate Europe and Asia during the Late Cretaceous Period."

White rice increases risk of type 2 diabetes. INTERNET

White rice link seen with Type 2 diabetes, says study

WASHINGTON, 16 March—Health researchers said on Thursday they had found a troubling link between higher consumption of rice and Type 2 diabetes, a disease that in some countries is becoming an epidemic. Further work is needed to probe the apparent association and diets that are notoriously high in sugar and fats should remain on the no-go list, they cautioned. “What we’ve found is white rice is likely to increase the risk of Type 2 diabetes, especially at high consumption levels such as in Asian populations,” Qi Sun of the Harvard School of Public Health told AFP. “But at the same time

people should pay close attention to the other things they eat. “It’s very important to address not just a single food but the whole pattern of consumption.” In the *British Medical Journal (BMJ)*, Sun’s team said the link emerged from an analysis of four previously published studies, carried out in China, Japan, Australia and the United States. These studies followed 350,000 people over a timescale from four to 22 years. More than 13,000 people developed Type 2 diabetes. In the studies carried out in China and Japan, those who ate most rice were 55 percent likelier to develop the disease than those who ate least.—*Internet*

Dutch recommend removal of PIP implants done before 2001

AMSTERDAM, 16 March—Dutch health authorities on Thursday recommended the removal of breast implants manufactured by French company Poly Implant Prothese that were done before 2001. “Women who had a PIP breast implant before 2001 should have themselves examined by a doctor and, in consultation, eventually have the implants removed,” the Dutch government’s health watchdog said in a statement. The Dutch Health Inspectorate (IGZ) call followed a probe by Dutch investigative TV programme Zembla, which discovered that “several hundred” women received PIP implants since 1997, public broadcaster NOS reported. “Until now, the IGZ believed that only Dutch women who received the implants from 2001 onwards were at risk,” the IGZ added. The company, which shut in 2010, also said previously that only PIP implants used after 2001 had been made with a substandard, industrial-grade silicone gel that had caused an increased risk of rupture. Dutch health authorities on 11 January recommended the removal of PIP implants done after 2001, which affects around 1,000 women in the Netherlands. The country’s health insurance federation said the same month that women wanting to replace the potentially defective

implants would be paid back in full. Initially, the Dutch health authority recommended only that women with PIP implants — sold in the Netherlands under the name “M-Implants” — should see their doctors, but changed its stance after confusion over the issue. PIP implants have been banned in the Netherlands since early 2010. More than 400,000 women around the world are thought to have received PIP implants which has sparked a global health scare. *Internet*

Health Tip: Bringing home a premature baby

Caring for a premature baby, born before 37 weeks’ gestation, requires extra care and attention. The American Academy of Pediatrics says new parents of preemies should ask these questions before leaving the hospital:

- What special care will I need to give baby at home?
- What should trigger a call to the doctor’s office, or a trip to the hospital?
- How will I know if baby is eating and sleeping enough, and gaining enough weight?
- Do I need to give baby any medication?
- How frequently will I need to bring baby in for a checkup?

S&P ends over 1,400 for first time since 2008 credit crisis

NEW YORK, 16 March—The S&P 500 closed above 1,400 for the first time since the 2008 financial crisis on Thursday as stocks resumed the upward climb that has produced a steady stream of gains this year. The benchmark index is up for six of the past seven

days, but so is the momentum of the market,” said Rex Macey, chief investment officer at Wilmington Trust in Atlanta, Georgia, which manages about \$60 billion. “People are getting more comfortable with the S&P above 1,400 and financials leading, which by itself is indicative of a sigh of relief. The trend is your friend, and lately the trend has been higher.” Though 1,400, which marks the highest level for the index since June 2008, does not have much technical importance, it is viewed as a bullish psychological marker. Some investors have called for a pullback, given the 11 percent rise in the S&P 500 since the start of the year. However, interruptions in the rally have been brief, lasting only a couple of days at the most.—*Internet*

WASHINGTON, 16 March—Economic growth showed signs of becoming more self-sustaining as the number of Americans claiming new jobless benefits fell back to a four-year low last week and manufacturing activity in the Northeast picked up this month. But the impact of higher oil prices also was starting to be seen in data on Thursday. Producer prices racked up their biggest increase in five months in February, while manufacturers in New York State reported a surge in input costs in March. The recent gains in oil and gasoline prices have raised concerns the higher costs could start to squeeze businesses and consumers and put a dent in the recovery. Still, producer prices last month did not rise as much as economists had expected, and underlying inflation pressures were contained. The Federal Reserve

Thursday’s initial claims data for state unemployment benefits was further evidence of an improving labor market after the jobless rate held at a three-year low of 8.3 percent in February. “This suggests that the recovery is firmly on track,” said Scott Brown, chief economist at Raymond James in St Petersburg, Florida. The Federal Reserve earlier this week acknowledged the recent improvement in the labor market, but remained concerned with the still-high unemployment rate. The central bank also reiterated its expectation it will keep interest rates at ultra-low levels through late-2014 as part of its efforts to support the economy. *Reuters*

Iran cut off from global financial system

BRUSSELS, 16 March—Dozens of Iranian banks were blocked from doing business with much of the world as the West tightens the financial screws on a country it wants to prevent from developing nuclear weapons. The Belgium-based company that facilitates most international bank transfers on Thursday took the unprecedented step of blocking 30 Iranian banks from using its service. The move is likely to hurt Iran’s all-important oil industry and make it difficult for citizens to receive money from relatives living abroad.



Suicides up last year among Japan students

TOKYO, 16 March—The number of students who took their own lives in Japan in 2011 was up almost 11 percent from the previous year, the National Police Agency reports. The total number of suicides fell by more than 3 percent to 30,651, The Yomiuri Shimbun reported. The year was the 14th straight when more than 30,000 people committed suicide in the country. There were 1,029 student suicides, up by 101 from 2010. Where a reason for the suicide could be determined, 140 were motivated by academic problems and 136 by worries over

what they would do after they left university, the NPA report said. There were 5,547 suicides among people in their 60s, the largest number for any age bracket. Overall, health problems were the biggest reason for suicide, with 65 percent of those who left notes or other evidence citing poor health. The Cabinet Office reported that 56 people took their own lives in the second half of the year for reasons related to the devastating 11 March earthquake and tsunami.

Iran plans to sell more arms to "friendly" states: military official

TEHERAN, 16 March—Iran's Deputy Defence Minister Majid Bokaei said Saturday that Iran plans to sell more arms to "friendly" and neighbouring countries in the new Iranian calendar year starting on 20 March, the local Mehr news agency reported. Bokaei did not mention the name of the friendly states that Iran plans to sell arms to, but in February, he said to Lebanese Defence Minister Fayez Ghun that Iran is seeking to strengthen defence ties with friendly countries. On 26 Feb, Iran's Defence Minister

Brigadier General Ahmad Vahidi and his Lebanese counterpart held talks on defence cooperation in Teheran. During the meeting, Vahidi said that one of Iran's strategic policies was to strengthen the Lebanese army. Lebanon should have a strong army to defend its interests in the region and Lebanon should be protected against the threats, Vahidi said. Ghun's visit to Iran provided a good opportunity for the expansion of cooperation between the two countries in the area of defence, Vahidi said.—Xinhua

49th Myanmar Gems Emporium packed with local and foreign gem merchants

The 49th Myanmar Gems Emporium is in progress at Mani Yadana Jade Hall. We saw bustling of local and foreign gem merchants among jade lots displayed in a row. We witnessed that a total of 1951 gem merchants form 432 gem companies from eight countries and over 3000 gem merchants from 694 local gem companies were buying many lots of jade, gems and pearl through competitive bidding system.

totalling 16452 through open tender and 245 lots of uncut jade through competitive bidding system. A total of 16697 lots of jade were put on sales through tender and competitive bidding system. Many jade lots were sold through competitive bidding system including 41 lots of jade worth above one million Euro each at reserve price. The jade lot at 5 million Euro of highest reserve price was excavated from Mamon Mine of

Various items of jewellery such as uncut jade stone, polished jade, uncut gem stones and finished jewellery, pieces of pearl, ornaments made of jade, gems and pearl, jade like stones, uncut petrified wood and finished products, figurines, crystals, mosaic paintings and silver wares are put on sales. In enquiries, I have learnt that there were 16697 lots of jade, 227 lots of gems and 367 lots of pearl.

In the emporium being held from 9 to 18 March, the lots of pearl were displayed on 8 March and sold on the floor of Yadana Market of Myanmar Gems Mart on 9 and 10 March through open tender and competitive bidding system. Lots of gems were also put on display from 6 to 9 March and sold at Mani Yadana Jade Hall on 10 March through open tender and competitive bidding

Lonkhin-Phakant gems land by Jade Dragon Jewellery Company which is undertaking joint-venture works with the State. Likewise, Maha Asa Pahtama Jewellery Company displayed to sell a jade lot worth 3.8 million Euro, Sein Treasury Jewellery Company and Aung Shwe Nann Jewellery Company, a jade lot worth 3.66 million Euro and Aung Aung Naing Naing Jewellery Company, a jade lot worth 3.2 million Euro. Some gem merchants estimated that as the gem merchants buy lots of jade in competitiveness at the gem emporiums paying the highest prices many times than the reserve prices, the prices of jade lots may get higher prices than the expected.

A local gem merchant who bought jade lots expressed his opinion that if value-added jade lots with masterpiece works are sold as

finished goods instead of uncut jade stones, the products will get better prices. Local entrepreneurs should strive for taking modern technology for making finished products, he said. With regard to fine arts, culture and religion, he continued that although works on Guanyin statues and dragon statues of Chinese entrepreneurs of finished goods industry are better than us, their works cannot meet standards of Buddha images and Myanmar traditional statues of us. However, he noted that if anyone wishes to get good prices, it should produce advanced products of statues and figurines for foreign countries.

At the emporium, joint venture companies and private companies

participated in displays of jewellery. A total of 277 gems displayed by 35 companies were sold as 49 lots through competitive bidding system and 178 lots through open tender. As the highest reserve prices, Moe Cherry Joint Venture Company sold one piece of pinky sapphire worth 350,000 Euro, Myanmar Lahba Joint Venture Company one piece of uncut sapphire worth 250,000 Euro, Arrow Brothers Company one piece of ruby feather worth 120,000 Euro, Merciful Company one piece of uncut ruby worth 100,000 Euro and Four Star Company, one piece of uncut ruby worth 75,000 Euro. The gem merchants from Thailand purchased the most value of gems at every gems emporium. They focused on pieces of uncut Mongshu ruby to polish them in Thailand so as to fetch many benefits by for exporting the finished works. In fact, ruby and sapphire of Myanmar are rare gems across the world. If the gems market achieves more flourishing in Myanmar, not only the State but also national gems entrepreneurs will enjoy much benefit.

Among 367 lots of pearl displayed by Myanmar Pearl Enterprise and four companies, 36 lots of pearl were sold through competitive bidding system and 331 lots through open tender. Many pieces of Myanmar golden pearl and silver pearl that the merchants across the world prefer were also put on sales. The pearl produced by Myanmar is the type of South Sea Pearl. The Myanmar golden pearl is the best quality among three South Sea Pearl producer countries namely the Philippines, Indonesia and Myanmar and the most favorite type of pearl throughout the world.

Moreover, as Myanmar sells its pearl in natural colour without any makeup decoration like that of pearls from other countries, the pearl of Myanmar is famous in the world pearl market, said Daw Su Su Lwin of Myanmar Oriental Pearl Company. Although the quality-enhanced pearl can lose its colour in the long run, the natural pearl never loses its colour from original style. Regarding the pearl production, natural pearl oysters were searched to culture and produce pearl in the past. At present, pearl production is bigger and bigger as pearl oysters can be bred at home. As a result, production of pearl cannot harm the environment, she explained.

U Myat Soe of Snow Pearl Jewellery Shop at Bogoyoke Aung San Market of Yangon

who purchased pieces of pearl at the emporium said, "I saw larger number of golden pearl at the emporium. The pearl merchants prefer both golden and silver pearls. I think silver pearl should be displayed more than the present number of pieces to fetch greater income."

The largest number of merchants from Singapore and Japan arrived at the pearl sale. We have learnt that not only Japanese merchants but also Indians engaging in pearl industry in Japan arrived there to buy pearl.

Sales of Myanmar Gems Emporiums with more and more achievements are earning a greater sum of foreign exchange for the State and citizen gem entrepreneurs. Serving the interests of the State and citizen entrepreneurs, the Central Committee for Organizing the Myanmar Gems Emporium is making arrangements for holding the gems emporiums at least thrice a year.

We saw that cards were made through RFID technology for systematic entrance and exit of local and foreign gem merchants, and they were allowed to pass the RFID shutter gates. The gem merchants applied Emporium Sale Information System KIOSK Module system and machines to quickly know numbers of jade and gem lots they bought at the end of the emporium.

Hong Kong Airlines Limited, C-Z Airlines Limited, Air Macao Company and MAI managed smooth aviation for seven round trips to 1147 foreign merchants from Hong Kong, Shandong, Guangzhou and Macao to Nay Pyi Taw. As a result, the gem merchants arrived at the emporium smoothly. Moreover, Parami Bus Association and Nay Pyi Taw Development Committee provided the gem merchants with taxis for convenient of transport.

Furthermore, various work committees under the Central managed better and smooth facilities on accommodation, transport, food, easy observation to jade and gem lots and communication for local and foreign gem merchants. Therefore, we saw that the gem merchants had the pleasure of viewing and buying jade, gems and pearl at the emporium.

On our visit to the emporium, we witnessed the 49th Myanmar Gems Emporium was held on a grander scale in greater achievement and smoothness.

One killed, five injured in water recycling centre fire in S Korea

SEOUL, 16 March—One worker was killed and five others were injured in a fire at a water recycling centre in Goyang, northwest of Seoul, on Friday, local media reported.

Seven workers were removing an old generator no longer in use when a gas explosion occurred, smashing windows and walls of the building, according to YTN television in Seoul.

Some witnesses reported hearing a loud boom or explosion sound before the fire began at around 11:05 am (local time), it said.

Fire officials suspect that the explosion occurred after a spark came into contact with gas leaking from a valve that was accidentally opened while cutting gas pipes to dismantle the generator.

Police are investigating the exact cause of the accident in cooperation with forensic experts, fire officials and gas experts.

China mine accident kills 13

BEIJING, 16 March—Thirteen people died after a capsule plunged into a pit at an iron ore mine in China's eastern Shandong Province Thursday, official state media reported.

The accident happened at the Shimen mine in the city of Linyi, Xinhua news agency said, quoting local authorities.

A search had been completed and 13 people were confirmed dead, said a provincial government official, according to the report.

Initial investigation suggested the capsule dropped after a steel rope broke, the official said.

The provincial government had set up an investigation team and a further probe was under way. Accidents are common in China's notoriously dangerous mining industry.—Xinhua

11 dead in Vietnam from hand-foot-mouth disease

HANOI, 16 March—At least 11 people have died and more than 12,400 cases of hand-foot-mouth (HFMD) disease have been reported in Vietnam this year, a media report said Thursday. The health ministry's Preventive Medicine Department said the figure was seven times higher than last year's, Xinhua reported citing Voice of Vietnam online. Nearly 400 cases of HFMD disease have been reported in central Binh Dinh Province, with children under five accounting for 80 percent of these patients. There have been over 900 cases in Ho Chi Minh City.

Hand-foot-mouth disease is a common infection viral infection that usually begins in the throat. It is caused by coxsackievirus A16, a member of the enterovirus family. People get the disease after coming into direct contact with nose and throat discharges, saliva, fluid from blisters, or stool of an infected person. The infection occurs most often in children under age 10, but can also be seen in adults. There is no specific treatment.—Internet

6-year-old heads to Scripps spelling bee

A 6-year-old Virginia girl has a chance to be the youngest Scripps National Spelling Bee winner, after beating out 21 other students to represent her county.

Lori Anne Madison, the youngest person in the 34th Prince William County Spelling Bee, told ABC News she was not intimidated by competing with older contestants.

"I have been in competitions with older kids before and I have many friends, some younger and some older, and I feel comfortable in any group," she said.

Madison said she started spelling and reading when she was 3 years old and finds it fun to be on stage.

"I started reading very early and I read a lot, and that helps," she said. "Plus, I work hard and love to find new interesting words in the dictionary."

If Madison wins the Scripps Bee — where she

will compete with spelling champions from across the globe for more than \$40,000 in prizes — she would be the youngest winner in the competition's history.

"I'm very excited," she told ABC News. "I want to have fun with other kids who love spelling and learn new words. And hope to do my best."


Greenberg said he is looking for women over the age of 50 who would be willing to retire with him in San Diego. He said he is looking for chemistry and happiness.

was seen on the set of "Follow The Leader" video in Mexico, alongside her stunt double.


The two struck remarkable similarities with both their physiques clad in tight black leggings and matching black zip tops, the Daily Mail reported.

MANCHESTER, 16 March—Roberto Mancini saw his expensive Manchester City side fail in Europe once more on Thursday, but still insisted they can still win their first ever Premier League title.

Mancini attempted to deflect pressure from his players by blaming himself for the setback, claiming he had failed to prepare his team adequately although he insisted he will not err again, especially with a home game against Chelsea looming on Wednesday.—*Internet*


Tiger vows he will be ready for the Masters


Woods said he is still hopeful of playing in next week's US PGA Tour event, the Arnold Palmer Invitational, his traditional final tuneup for the year's first major championship.

Teen star Manassero equals Andalusia course record

MARBELLA, 16 March—Italian teenager Matteo Manassero carded an eight-under-par 64 to equal the course record and claim a three-shot lead in the opening round of the Andalusia Open on Thursday.

Manassero, who also captured the 2011 European Tour event in Malaysia, played the Masters in 2010 after qualifying as British amateur champion.

"This is a course that suits me and hopefully it will be my week," added the Italian. "It's my first time at Aloha. This course suits my game because it's not long, and I don't need to hit 300 yards to reach the par fives. You need accurate shots and a good strategy, and I enjoy this type of course." *Internet*

Vonn wins World Cup super-G title in Austria

SCHLADMING, 16 March—More accolades for Lindsey Vonn, and perhaps more to come. Vonn won her fourth World Cup super-G title Thursday by finishing sixth in the discipline's final race of the season. It was her 16th career crystal globe.

Viktoria Rebensburg of Germany was the winner, her first super-G victory. Julia Mancuso of the US was

second, followed by Marion Rolland of France. Another American, Leanne Smith, was fifth. Vonn, the overall World Cup champion, narrowly avoided skiing out on a blistering run, taking a 1.22-second advantage over Rebensburg into the final intermediate time check. She went off course and just made the next gate shortly before the finish.

"I had a great run, but was much too straight in that banana turn," Vonn said. "Coaches had told me I could approach that turn straight, but at my speed it was just impossible." Vonn had to slow down to get back on the course and lost almost two seconds to trail Rebensburg by 0.57 at the finish. Vonn has two races left to earn 53 points and overtake Austrian great Hermann Maier's record of 2,000 World Cup points in a single season. She is closing in on the women's mark of 1,980 points held by Janica Kostelic of Croatia.—*Internet*




Head of Township Information and Public Relations Department U Tin Maung Win and village elder U Sein Hla Maung formally opened the library building.

21st day session of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw held

The Speaker said regarding the 2012-2013 national planning bill, Daw Nan Wah Nu of Kunhing Constituency submitted a proposal on Myanmar National Human Rights Commission at the 20th day session on 15-3-2012. In connection with the proposal, the Joint Bill Committee remarked that the formation of MNHRC does not conform to the constitution and existing laws. So, he said, the Speaker decided that the inclusion of the commission in the leading committee and inclusion of the commission's expenses in the budget were cancelled.

Next, U Min Swe of DaikU Constituency submitted the proposal to reduce the work volume of Fines Arts


