Curriculum Vitae of Honorable Dato' Sri Mohd Najib bin Tun Abdul Razak, Prime Minister of Malaysia

The Honorable Dato' Sri Mohd Najib bin Tun Abdul Razak is the eldest son of Malaysia's second Prime Minister Tun Abdul Razak Hussein. He was born in the district of Kuala Lipis in the state of Pahang. Dato' Sri Najib received a degree in Industrial Economics from the University of Nottingham in 1974.

On his return to Malaysia in the same year, Dato' Sri Najib joined Petronas, the national oil company, as an executive. He became a politician following the sudden

demise of his father in 1976 and he was the choice for the ruling National Front coalition to contest the Pekan parliamentary seat vacated by his late father. Thus, he became a Member of Parliament at the age of twenty three.

After becoming Member of Parliament, he was appointed as the Deputy Minister of Energy, Telecommunications and Posts. Following the general elections in 1986 and winning the parliamentary (See page 2)

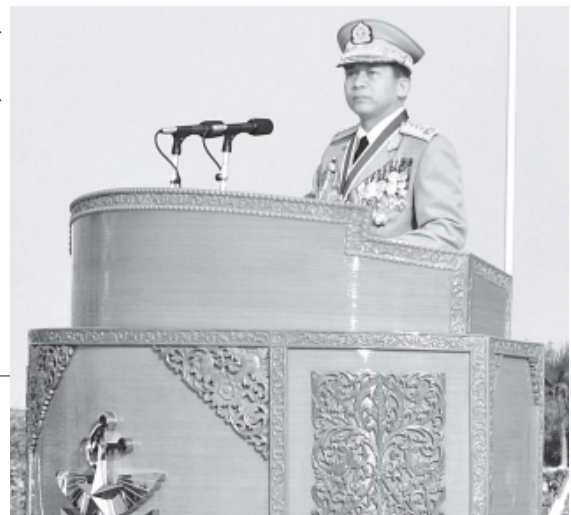

Iraq tests regional muscle with Arab summit

BAGHDAD, 27 March—Iraq's Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki will seek to showcase his country's diplomatic return to the region this week when leaders gather for the first Arab League summit in Baghdad in two decades, and the only one hosted by a Shi'ite Arab ruler.

With violence from its waning and the last US troops gone, Iraq is keen to present itself as more stable and reassert its clout in an often hostile Arab region, where the Iraqi Shi'ite-led government's rise riled Sunni Arab Gulf neighbours. Neighbouring Syria's upheaval will dominate the three-day summit among the Arab League leaders, who have been split over how to react to the violence between

government troops and rebels trying to oust President Bashar al-Assad.

Wary of the region's

delicate sectarian makeup, Baghdad must balance a fledgling detente with Sunni Arabs deeply suspicious of

Iraq's ties to Shi'ite power Iran against calls for it to take a stronger stance against Teheran's main ally Syria. The summit also comes at a sensitive time for Maliki, who is emerging from a crisis that threatened to scuttle Iraq's power-sharing deal among Sunni, Shi'ite and Kurds and renewed regional fears Iraq might slide once again into sectarian violence. Visiting dignitaries will get a glimpse of an Iraq whose long conflict has ebbed, but also see an OPEC member whose population still struggles with the daily threat of bombings, power shortages and a crumbling infrastructure nine years after the US invasion that ousted Saddam Hussein, a Sunni.—Reuters

Three foreign soldiers killed by Afghan forces

KABUL, 27 March—Three foreign soldiers, including two Britons, were shot dead by Afghan security forces personnel on Monday in the latest round of so-called insider killings which have raised deep concerns about the reliability of NATO's local allies and their ability to keep the peace.

Insider attacks have mounted as tension between Afghanistan and its foreign backers rises over a series of incidents, including a massacre of 17 villagers for which a US soldier has been charged. US Defence Secretary Leon Panetta said despite a recent spate of killings of NATO troops by Afghan soldiers, such violence was sporadic and did not "reflect any kind of broad pattern." "We have to keep our eye on the fundamental mission here, which is to accomplish our main strategy of being able to make the transition to Afghan control and security," he told reporters en route to a defence ministers meeting in Canada.

In Monday's attacks, an Afghan army soldier killed two British soldiers at their headquarters in southern Afghanistan, Britain and NATO officials said, while a local policeman shot dead another foreign soldier in the east.—Reuters

India 'Maoist' bomb blast kills 15 police

MUMBAI, 27 March—A landmine explosion in the western Indian state of Maharashtra has killed at least 15 policemen, officials say.

The attack has been blamed on Maoist rebels, who operate in the area as well as several other Indian states.

It is one of the worst attacks on Indian police in

two years. Maoist rebels in the eastern state of Orissa kidnapped two Italians about two weeks ago, but released one and have been in talks with the state government over the other man's release.

Tuesday's attack happened in Maharashtra's Gadchiroli District, a remote and relatively undeveloped

part of the country. The district is on Maharashtra's border with the central state of Chhattisgarh and is a stronghold of the rebels. The police vehicle was travelling through a forested region when the landmine was triggered, reports said. The policemen, members of India's national paramilitary force,

were travelling on a bus, the Press Trust of India news agency quoted officials as saying. The explosion was so powerful that it could be heard several kilometres away and the bus was turned into a mangled heap of twisted metal, a police officer in the district told the BBC. "Fifteen CRPF [Central Reserve Police Force] are dead," a spokesman for the force told AFP news agency. INTERNET

Ecuador floods kill 30, displace thousands

QUITO, 27 March—Torrential rains in Ecuador have claimed the lives of 30, affected as many as 84,000 people and caused the evacuation of 4,700 others so far this year, according to official figures released on Monday.

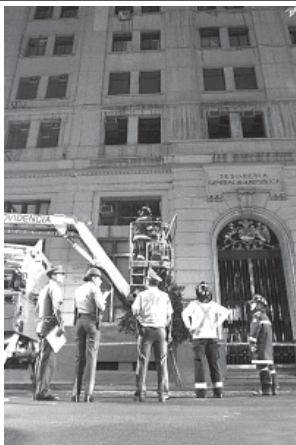
According to a report by Ecuador's National Secretary for Risk Management, the downpours have additionally lead to the loss of 34,000 hectares of crops.

The biggest losses to agriculture have been sustained by six coastal provinces, including Guayas and Los Rios, where officials have declared a state of emergency due to the floods caused by seasonal rains, said Minister for Coordination of Production Santiago Leon.

Officials have been taking a regional census every 15 days to assess the damage in the six most heavily hit provinces, including El Oro, Manabi, Esmeraldas and Loja, Leon said.

Once the rains abate, the government will begin distributing aid to farmers that have lost crops, he added.

Colorado wildfire forces evacuation of 900 homes

DENVER, 27 March—A wind-driven wildfire destroyed an unknown number of homes and forced the mandatory evacuation of 900 dwellings in the foothills and canyons west of Denver on Monday, authorities said.

The blaze, which also forced the closure of some roads in the area, was believed to have been ignited by embers left over from a controlled-burning operation conducted last week to clear parched vegetation that

authorities wanted to remove as potential wildfire fuel.

As of nightfall, the blaze had scorched some 3,000 acres of grasslands and trees as it burned out of control roughly 20 miles from the western edge of Denver, the state's largest and most populous city, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office spokesman Mark Techmeyer said.

"Tonight firefighters are in a defensive posture, trying to protect structures," he told Reuters.

He said an undetermined number of houses had been lost to the fire, but the precise damage toll was not expected to become clear until after sunrise.

No injuries have been reported.

Fire personnel from 30 engine companies and 15 different agencies were assembled to battle the blaze, Jefferson County authorities said.

Rolling plumes of thick smoke from the fire drifted over Denver's southern suburbs and were visible throughout the metropolitan area during the day.

Single-digit humidity values, winds blowing at 40 to 50 miles per hour and a lack of snowfall during the past month put most of eastern Colorado under a red-flag warning for high fire danger on Monday, the National Weather Service said.

The high winds also had prompted flight delays at Denver International Airport. Reuters

Americans' support for Afghan war drops sharply

WASHINGTON, 27 March—Support for the war in Afghanistan has dropped sharply among Americans in recent months as they grow increasingly disillusioned with the conflict that began more than a decade ago, according to a New York Times/CBS News public opinion poll released on Monday.

Two-thirds of those polled - 69 percent - said the United States should no longer be fighting in Afghanistan, up from 53 percent in November and the highest percentage since the New York Times/CBS News poll started asking that question in 2009, CBS reported.

Sixty-eight percent said the fighting was going "somewhat badly" or "very badly," compared with 42 percent who voiced those views in November 2011, the New York Times reported. The Times/CBS News survey results are in line with other recent polls that show a drop in support for the war. The survey comes after the massacre of 17 Afghan civilians in which a US soldier has been charged, violence

set off by the burning of Korans by American troops last month and a number of killings of US troops by Afghan security forces.

According to the poll, negative impressions of the war have increased among both Democrats and Republicans.

Sixty percent of Republicans said the war was going somewhat or very badly, compared with 40 percent in November. Among Democrats, 68 percent said the war was going somewhat or very badly, compared with 38 percent in November.

NATO plans to hand over security responsibilities to Afghan forces by the end of 2014. Forty-four percent of respondents said the United States should withdraw sooner than the planned transition; 33 percent said the Obama administration should stick to the current timetable; and 3 percent said it should withdraw now. Seventeen percent said the United States should stay as long as it would take to stabilize the situation.—Reuters

Earth's deepest spot desolate, foreboding

WASHINGTON, 27 March—In James Cameron's fantasy films, like "Avatar" and "The Abyss," the unexplored is splashed in color and fraught with alien danger. But on his dive to the deepest place on Earth, reality proved far different: white, barren and bland. Yet otherworldly—and amazing. "I felt like I literally, in the space of one day, had gone to another planet and come back," Cameron said Monday after returning from the cold, dark place in the western Pacific Ocean, seven miles below the surface. "It was a very surreal day."

Cameron is the first person to explore the deepest valley in the ocean since two men made a 20-minute foray there more than half a century ago. He spent about three hours gliding through the icy darkness, illuminated only by special lights

on the one-man sub he helped design. That was only about half as long as planned because his battery ran low.

Temperatures could rise by 3C by 2050, models suggest

LONDON, 27 March—Global temperatures could rise by 1.4-3.0C (2.5-5.4F) above levels for late last century by 2050, a computer simulation has suggested. Almost 10,000 climate simulations were run on volunteers' home computers. The projections, published in *Nature Geoscience*, are somewhat higher than those from other models. The researchers aimed to explore a wider range of possible futures, which they say helps "get a handle" on the uncertainties of the climate system.

People planning for the impacts of climate change need to consider the possibility of warming of up to 3C by 2050, even on a mid-range emission scenario, the researchers say. The study—run through climateprediction.net with the BBC Climate Change Experiment—ran simulations using a complex atmosphere-ocean climate model. The representations of physical parameters were varied between runs of the model, reflecting uncertainties about precisely how the climate system works.—Internet

The way ice cream is stored can change the way it tastes. INTERNET

Avalanche research aids search for tastier ice cream



DAVOS, 27 March—Avalanche experts are helping to study how ice cream's structure changes when it is stored in a household freezer. Samples of ice cream have been scanned with an X-ray machine more typically used to study the ice crystals which are key to avalanche formation. Nestle is

hoping to reveal the exact conditions under which ice crystals merge and grow. When the crystals get big enough they change the texture of ice cream and alter how it feels when it is eaten.

The study of ice crystal formation has been carried out with the help of scientists at the Institute for Snow and Avalanche Research in Davos, Switzerland. The X-ray tomography machine at the institute is one of the few that can take images of tiny structures at sub-zero temperatures. "Previously, we could not look inside ice cream without destroying the sample in the process," said Nestle food scientist Dr Cedric Dubois. Via the research, summarised in a paper published in the journal *Soft Matter*, Nestle hopes to find a way to combat the gradual degradation of taste ice cream often suffers. As with many foods, the structure of ice cream is the key to the way it tastes.—Internet



Study: US will watch more movies online in 2012 over DVDs, VHS and Blu-ray

NEW YORK, 27 March—Years from now, DVD and Blu-ray will occupy the near-forgotten nostalgia realms that formats like laserdisk occupy now. The only question is when? According to new research by IHS Screen Digest, 2012 could mark the beginning of streaming movie consumption overtaking their physical counterparts.

The US' consumption of legal, paid movies is predicted to reach 3.4 billion views/transactions this year, which would be 1 billion units more than what is expected of physical video.

The physical video formats include DVD, Blu-ray as well as VHS. Compared to 2011, online video consumption's annual growth is 135 percent from 1.4 billion, and is expected to similar growth in the near future.

Though the online trend will finally dominate, senior IHS analyst Dan Cryan points out that, this is only a sign that the age of the physical format is at an end, "the transition is likely to take time: almost nine years after the launch of the iTunes Store, CDs are still a vital part of the music business."

Amazon Prime, Hulu and of course Netflix have been integral to the online consuming shift. 2011 subscriptions for these types of services accounted for 94 percent of US paid movie consumption.

Dan goes on to say that 2012 is the nail in the, "the growth in online consumption is part of a broader trend has seen the total number of movies consumed from services that are traditionally considered 'home entertainment' grow by 40 percent between 2007 and 2011."

Still, in 2012 there's far more money to be made from the physical sales of movies, and Cryan predicts that won't change until 2016.

This year, online viewing will capture \$1.7 billion of this year's movie revenue, compared to \$1.1 billion that will be made through the physical format.

By 2016, physical video will still have 75 percent of revenue, and online will have 17 percent—pay-TV will make up the remaining portion.

Microsoft's Digital Crimes Unit is a worldwide team of investigators, lawyers, analysts and other specialists who fight cybercrime. A year ago they helped US authorities take down a botnet known as Rustock that had been one of the biggest producers of spam e-mail. Some security experts estimated that in its heyday Rustock was responsible for half the spam in junk email bins.

The company said the moves announced Monday had not dealt a fatal blow to Zeus, which is available for download on websites frequented by criminal hackers. It is used to manage many botnets, including ones that were not impacted by Microsoft's actions.

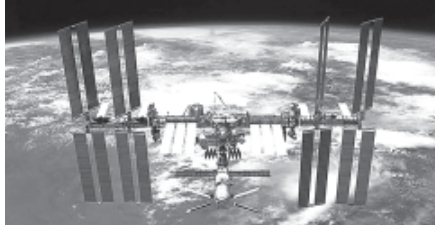

Astronauts evacuate the International Space Station during space debris close-call

WASHINGTON, 27 March—Astronauts aboard the *International Space Station (ISS)* had to evacuate its premises over the weekend to escape what could've been a fatal disaster—a piece of space debris passed too close to the satellite for comfort. NASA usually maneuvers the *ISS* out of the way whenever there's passing debris, but this time, the orbiting rubble was spotted too late.

The six astronauts took shelter inside Russian *Soyuz* capsules because the *ISS* was in danger of getting struck by the rubble and losing pressure and oxygen. Thankfully, nobody was hurt, and the \$100 billion space station wasn't damaged. NASA identified the passing debris as a fragment from the Russian satellite *Cosmos 2251* that smashed into another spacecraft in 2009.

The fragment's size and exact distance from the space

station when it passed remain unknown. But NASA scientists estimate that it was around 6.8 to 8.7 miles away from the *ISS* during the time of its closest approach at 2:38 am Eastern on 24 March.

Approximately 20,000 pieces of smashed satellites and spacecraft orbit the Earth at great speeds. These softball-sized fragments can cause serious damage, which is why NASA and the US military have been looking for ways to track them better and to eliminate them altogether.—Internet

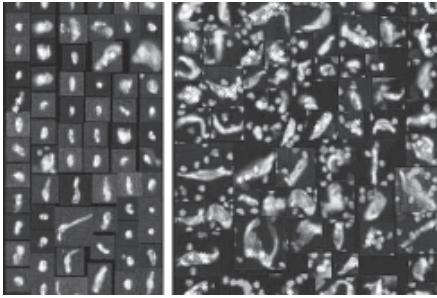

Cigarette packs to bear more explicit labels

OTTAWA, 27 March—New graphic labels for cigarette and little cigar packages will start making their way onto store shelves.

Wednesday marked the first day that tobacco manufacturers and importers have to start labelling packages with the explicit warnings unveiled by the

government last fall.

The new Health Canada rules require larger and more noticeable messages that cover 75 percent of the front and back of packages.

The photos include one of anti-smoking activist Barb Tarbox dying of lung cancer.

The rules also require packages to contain information on how to quit smoking and more details on the chemicals contained in tobacco smoke.

Retailers have until 18 June to unload their old inventory before they must start selling the cigarette and little cigar packages with the new graphics.

Weird cells may lead to heart attack prediction test

WASHINGTON, 27 March—Too often, people pass a cardiac checkup only to collapse with a heart attack days later. Now scientists have found a clue that one day may help doctors determine if a heart attack is imminent, in hopes of preventing it.

Most heart attacks happen when fatty deposits in an artery burst open, and a blood clot then forms to seal the break. If the clot is too big, it blocks off blood flow.

The problem: Today's best tests can't predict when that's about to happen.

"We don't have a way to get at whether an artery's going to crack, the precursor to a heart attack," said Dr Eric Topol, director of California's Scripps Translational Science Institute.

Wednesday, Scripps researchers reported a new lead—by searching people's blood for cells that appear to flake off the

lining of a severely diseased artery.

Topol's team measured high levels of those cells, deformed ones, floating in the blood of 50 people who'd just had a heart attack. The research is reported in the journal *Science Translational Medicine*.

Next, Topol said his team soon will begin needed studies to learn how early those cells might appear before a heart attack, and if spotting them could allow use of clot-preventing drugs to ward off damage. Some San Diego emergency rooms will study an experimental blood test with chest-pain sufferers whose standard exams found no evidence of a heart attack, he said.

Don't expect a test to predict heart attacks any time soon—a lot more research is needed, caution heart specialists not involved with the study. But they're intrigued.

Honda's automobile unit resumes operations in Thailand

BANGKOK, 27 March — Honda Automobile Thailand (HATC) has resumed production at its plant in Ayutthaya after severe floods halted operations in early October. HATC, a subsidiary of Honda Motor, is the last of the Japanese automobile companies to resume production in Thailand after the floods. Toyota Motor and Nissan Motor resumed production at the end of 2011.

The floods forced hundreds of Japanese companies to shut operations, adversely affecting their earnings expectations. Earlier this year, Honda revised down its operating income forecast for the year ending on 31 March to 200b yen (\$2.4b, £1.5b) from a previous forecast of 270b yen. The Honda factory in Ayutthaya has the capacity to produce 240,000 units annually.

A Honda Motor spokeswoman said full production would resume at the HATC unit by the second week of April. Currently production is at about 12% of capacity. HATC was the only car maker whose factory was completely flooded.

Honda and other Japanese carmakers were forced to shut down production.—INTERNET



Honda Motor said HATC is one of its most important production centres in the Asia and Oceania regions. "Honda was totally committed to realising the earliest possible recovery. Honda will maintain the same positioning of HATC in the future and further promote business operations in Thailand," the company said.— Internet

China's Huawei barred from Australia broadband deal

SYDNEY, 27 March—China's biggest maker of equipment for the phone industry, Huawei, has been barred from bidding for a huge project in Australia. It was told late last year that it should not try to bid for work on Australia's National Broadband Network. The \$37.5bn (£24bn) project aims to connect almost every Australian home to a very high speed Internet connection. An Australian Financial Review (AFR) report says that Huawei has been barred over security concerns.

Without making direct reference to the Chinese firm, Australian Prime Minister Julia Gillard said: "The National Broadband Network is a huge infrastructure project and you would expect that as a government we would make all of the prudent decisions to make sure that that infrastructure project does what we want it to do and we've taken one of those decisions." Jeremy Mitchell, director of corporate affairs at Huawei Australia said: "While we're obviously disappointed by the decision, Huawei will continue to be open and transparent and work to find ways of providing assurance around the security of our technology."

Huawei hopes to become the world's biggest seller of equipment to the telecoms industry by the end of the year and has already broken into markets in Asia, Africa and Europe. But last year a US Congressional Committee said the firm could pose a security risk. One of the reasons cited was that the company's founder Ren Zhengfei was in the Chinese Army until 1984.— Internet

BMW recalls 1.3 million cars worldwide

FRANKFURT, 27 March—BMW AG, the world's largest premium carmaker, is recalling about 1.3 million cars for repair worldwide due to a possible problem with a battery

cable cover in the trunk, the carmaker said on Monday. The recall affects 5- and 6-Series BMWs built between 2003 and 2010, BMW said in a statement. "In some remote cases, the battery cable cover inside the boot of these vehicles may be incorrectly mounted," it said.

"This can result in the electrical system malfunctioning, the vehicle failing to start and, in some cases, to charring or fire," the company said, adding it was not aware of any accidents or injuries to people due to the problem. Fewer than 1 percent of the cars BMW has so far inspected for the issue have exhibited the problem, a BMW spokesman said. So far, the spokesman said, there have been no reports of fires.

BMW said it was writing to car owners. The repair procedure in a BMW partner workshop would take about 30 minutes to an hour and would be free of charge to customers, it added. The recall affects about 368,000 cars in the United States and about 293,000 cars in Germany, BMW said. Another 109,000 cars are subject to the recall in Britain and about 102,000 in China, BMW said. In some European countries, the trunk is called the car's boot.

Dy F&R Minister clarifies taxation matters

YANGON, 27 March—A seminar on taxation matters was held at UMFCFI Building on Minye

Kyawswa Road, here, yesterday afternoon, with an address by President of UMFCFI U Win Aung.

In his clarification, Deputy Minister for Finance and Revenue U Win Than said that the Ministry of Finance and Revenue coordinated economists and experts including officials of the government departments for several times to issue the notifications on tax relaxation, amend revenue laws, revoke the inappropriate revenue law and amend rules of income tax, commercial tax and revenue stamp law and issued notifications with the agreement of the Union government.

The deputy minister

continued that tax will be levied from the salaries of gazetted officers that had been exempted in the past to be able to gain the full amount of tax.

Director-General U Myat Maw of Internal Revenue Department explained revenue law, rules, regulations and notifications, and Director U Aung Moe Kyi, the notifications related to the IRD.

About 700 participants from departments, enterprises, businessmen, representatives of companies and officials took part in the seminar, and IRD personnel replied to queries raised by those present.

Changes to Myanmar's Exchange Arrangements

The Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) will implement a managed floating exchange rate regime in Myanmar with effect from 1st April 2012. The external value of the national currency, the Myanmar kyat, will from now on be determined by supply and demand conditions in the exchange market.

In line with the new exchange rate regime, Reference Foreign Exchange Rate will be publicized daily by CBM.

This arrangement is part of the reform program of the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar for modernizing the economy. A key part of this program is to unify the various exchange rates and gradually eliminate restrictions on current international payments and transfers abroad. Replacing the official exchange rate,

which has been pegged since 1977 at the level of 8.50847 kyats to SDR with a market-determined exchange rate, is the first step toward unifying the various exchange rates and also allow room for the CBM to influence the market exchange rate.

In all these areas, the CBM, domestic and international concerned agencies are working together to ensure that the changes are smooth. For FY 2012/13 Union Budget, provisions of Foreign Exchange Budget for Ministries and State Economic Enterprises have already been incorporated a budgetary exchange rate assumption in line with market exchange rate.

The CBM will provide further detailed information to the public on changes to Myanmar's exchange arrangements.—Central Bank of Myanmar

Popcorn healthier than fruit, vegetables

BEIJING, 27 March—A new study finds out that popcorn contains more highly healthy antioxidant substances than fruits and vegetables, if it isn't covered with butter, salt, or sugar.

Popcorn in its pure form, as an unprocessed grain, can be one of the healthiest snacks one can have, according to the research presented at the American Chemical Society's scientific society on Sunday.

One of the scientists behind the study, Dr Joe Vinson of the University of Scranton in Pennsylvania, explained that there are more of the antioxidant substances called polyphenols concentrated in popcorn than most fruits and vegetables. One reason is that popcorn only contains about 4 percent water while fruits and vegetables contain up to 90 percent water.

The researchers also find that the hulls of popcorn - the

part that everyone hates for its tendency to get caught in the teeth - has been found to have the highest concentration of polyphenols and fibre. They are actually "nutritional gold nuggets," according to Vinson.

"Popcorn may be the perfect snack food," said Dr Vinson. One serving of popcorn will provide more than 70 percent of the daily intake of whole grain needed by an adult.

Vinson warned, however, that how the popcorn is prepared is the key to its healthiness. Air popped popcorn is the best, while microwave popcorn is much worse, as is popcorn made in pot full of oil, butter, and covered with sugar or salt.

Popcorn, in its air-popped form is healthy, but could never fully replace fruits and vegetables due to the other vitamins and nutrients found in them.—*Xinhua*

10 killed in clashes between rival gangs in northern Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 27 March — At least 10 people were killed in a clash between rival groups in the municipality of Temosachi, in the northern Mexican State of Chihuahua, local authorities announced Monday.

State police spokeswoman Alexa Estrada said the investigation established that the confrontation between armed groups in the mountainous area of Chihuahua have occurred between Sunday and the early hours of Monday.

Once arriving at the scene, staffs of the state police and forensic services were attacked from a hill with gun shots, but no officer was injured, she said. After the police personnel repelled the attack, the assailants fled the area, and then the bodies of victims and other evidence have been transferred to the nearby Cuauhtemoc municipality for further investigation.—*Xinhua*

Japan Airlines takes delivery of two Boeing 787s

SEATTLE, 27 March—Japan Airlines took delivery of its first two Boeing Co 787 Dreamliners on Monday, after a delay of about three

years while the plane-maker wrestled with development and production problems. The delivery to JAL brings the total number of Dreamliners delivered to seven. The airplanes also are the first 787s to be powered by General Electric engines rather than Rolls Royce.

The airline, which has 45 Dreamliners on order, postponed Dreamliner service on several routes while it waited out another delay this year resulting from a manufacturing glitch. "We were sorry there was a slight delay, but relieved the aircraft is finally ready," said JAL President Yoshiharu Ueki at a ceremony marking the occasion. "And the delay's

BEIJING, 27 March—Aviation companies are targeting the Chinese market in the expectation that

Chinese businesses will show a greater demand for their services and as authorities relax airspace restrictions.

Christophe Degoumois, vice-president of business aircraft sales from Canada's Bombardier Inc, said on Monday that 2,360 business jets will be delivered to China by 2030.

"The company is expanding the team for sales and marketing in China," he said. He said China is an important market, one that is home to increasingly wealthy individuals, a growing gross domestic product and a government intent on boosting domestic demand, especially consumer demand.

Degoumois made the remarks on the eve of the Asian Business Aviation Conference & Exhibition, which is to be held in Shanghai from Tuesday to Thursday. The exhibition is one of the largest such events held in the world.

China does not play a large role now in the business-jet industry. But that situation is changing fast.

Jing Yiming, vice-president of Shanghai Airport (Group) Co Ltd, said there were 132 business jets registered in the Chinese mainland in 2011, up from 32 in 2008.

"About 3,500 flights were taken by business jets in 2011 in Shanghai, making up a third of the total for the country," he said. "And we expect this year will see a 10 to 15 percent increase in traffic." Jet-charter companies in China have also expanded considerably as the country relaxes its restrictions on the use of airspace. "In the past, you had to apply for a route one week ahead of making a flight, while nowadays it takes only one day to apply," Jing said.

Kong Linshan, president of Minsheng Financial Leasing Co Ltd, said China's business jet market took off after the 2008 Beijing Olympics, seeing an annual growth rate of more than 150 percent. China is now one of the chief growth markets for business jets.

And China has worked increasingly harder to tap that market since 2009. Makers of business jets are expected to pay even more attention to the country during the next decade.

"China's business-jet market has become one of the markets with the most potential and is drawing more and more attention from around the world," he said.

Over the next three years, the Minsheng Financial Leasing's fleet will contain more than 100 jets. Those will be worth more than \$4 billion and make up more than 90 percent of the Chinese market for those aircraft, he said.

In China's 12th Five-Year Plan (2011-15), the country's central government said general aviation will be one of the pillars of the country's economic development. The plan calls for developing the industry, building a large number of airplanes and relaxing airspace restrictions.

Vietnam to lure 2.63 b USD of FDI in first quarter

HANOI, 27 March—Vietnam forecast to attract 2.63 billion US dollars in foreign direct investment (FDI) in the first three months, a decrease of 36.4 percent against the same period last year, reported the Ministry of Planning and Investment (MPI) on Tuesday.

Of the total amount, 2.26 billion US dollars were newly registered by 120 newly-licensed projects, a 22.8 percent decrease from 2011, and the rest of nearly 368 million US dollars came from 29 expanded projects.

Real estate came out top among investment sectors in luring FDI capital, with more than 1.2 billion US dollars (accounting for 45.5 percent of the country's total FDI), followed by the processing and manufacturing industry with 1.17 billion US dollars (44.6 percent), and transport and storage sectors with 180 million US dollars (6.8 percent).

Japan remained the largest investor among 26 countries and territories investing in Vietnam in the first quarter with newly-registered and expanded capital of 2.3 billion US dollars

(accounting for 88.8 percent), followed by Netherlands with 46.1 million US dollars (1.7 percent), and China's Taiwan with 42.9 million US dollars (1.6 percent).

Southern Binh Duong Province took the lead nationwide in attracting FDI with 1.36 billion US dollars (51.7 percent), followed by Hai Phong port city with 605 million US dollars (23 percent), and central Khanh Hoa Province with 180 million US dollars.

During the 3-month period, exports (including oil and gas) by the FDI sector were forecast to earn 15.5 billion US dollars, up 43.1 percent year-on-year and accounting for 63.4 percent of the country's total export value, while it spent 13.03 billion US dollars for the imports, up 30.3 percent and 52.6 percent, respectively. Overall, the FDI sector would post a trade surplus of 1.38 billion US dollars.

Meanwhile, the country's FDI disbursement in the first three months reached 2.52 billion US dollars, or 99.2 percent of last year's figure, according to the MPI.—Xinhua

UK in talks to sell part of RBS stake to Abu Dhabi

LONDON, 27 March—Britain has held talks to sell part of its stake in Royal Bank of Scotland to Abu Dhabi investors although a multibillion-pound deal is not imminent, people familiar with

the matter said on Monday.

Britain could sell as much as a third of RBS to Abu Dhabi wealth funds in a deal that could lose taxpayers billions of pounds, the BBC said.

Investments, which holds the government's stake, has held regular talks with big investors about their views on the industry and RBS, which has included meetings with sovereign wealth investors, including from Abu Dhabi, sources said.

Two people said a deal was not imminent, however.

Andrew Tyrie, head of Britain's Treasury Select Committee, told the BBC on Monday night that the TSC would look closely at any deal to make sure the taxpayer received value.

"It strikes me as sensible to take an opportunity if it's there," Tyrie said.

Britain pumped 45.5

billion pounds (\$72.5 billion) into RBS, leaving the taxpayer with an 82 percent holding. A deal could see at least 10 percent and up to a third of the government's stake sold, the BBC said. Abu Dhabi, one of the oil-rich states of the United Arab Emirates, could be attracted to a deal after making billions of pounds on a bet on rival British bank Barclays during the financial crisis. The BBC said the government has been negotiating for months with Abu Dhabi sovereign wealth funds and wants a deal to be agreed by the end of the year. An earlier version of the report said the talks were "advanced."—Reuters

250-year-old Japanese paintings to be shown in DC

A 30-scroll set of nature paintings from the 1700s that's owned by Japan's royal family and considered a cultural treasure is being shown in its entirety for the first time outside of the country at an exhibit in Washington.

The "Colourful Realm of Living Beings," created more than 250 years ago by artist Ito Jakuchu, consists of intricate paintings of birds, flowers, insects, fish and other animals on vertical silk scrolls. It opens to the public Friday at the National Gallery of Art and will be on view through 29 April.

For only the second time in 120 years, the nature paintings are paired with Jakuchu's "Sakyamuni Triptych." In this piece, three Buddhist deities overlook the bird-and-flower paintings to serve as the

exhibit's centerpiece. The pairing evokes the original religious context of the nature paintings as objects of worship, curators said.

Since 1889, the fragile silk scroll paintings have been held in separate locations. The nature paintings were donated to Japan's royal family and held ever since by the world's oldest monarchy. The Buddhist triptych is held at the monastery where

Jakuchu originally left his works.

Even though his masterpieces are kept mostly out of view to help preserve them, Jakuchu has become Japan's most famous pre-modern artist, said guest curator Yukio Lippit, a Harvard University professor of Japanese art. While his works were famous around the time they were painted, his achievements were later forgotten to a certain extent.

The record-keeping organization said an adjudicator was on hand to see students from local schools and colleges join the 13 contestants from this season of the show in a dance set to the Bollywood song "Dhinkachika Dhinka-chika."

Company uses Hitler video to sell shampoo

The Anti-Defamation League, based in New York, is criticizing a Turkish company for using video of Adolf Hitler to sell shampoo. The Biomen commercial, which uses real footage of Hitler with fake subtitles, was described as "disgusting" by Abraham Foxman, national director of the Anti-Defamation League, Israeli broadcaster Arutz Sheva reported Monday.

"If you're not wearing

women's clothes, then you also shouldn't be using women's shampoo. Here it is, a real men's shampoo, Biomen," the fake subtitles read. "The use of images of the violently anti-Semitic dictator who was responsible for the mass murder of 6 million Jews and millions of others in the Holocaust to sell shampoo is a disgusting and deplorable marketing ploy," Foxman said.

"It is an insult to the memory of those who perished in the Holocaust, those who survived, and those who fought to defeat the Nazis. This video is just the latest example of the use of Holocaust imagery in some countries to sell commercial products, which has contributed to the trivialization of and desensitization to the unparalleled horrors of the Holocaust.

Bobby Brown arrested for driving under the influence

LOS ANGELES, 27 March—Singer Bobby Brown, the ex-husband of late singer Whitney Houston, was arrested in Los Angeles on Monday on suspicion of driving under the influence, police said. Brown, 43, was pulled over shortly after noon for talking on his cellphone while driving in the suburb of Reseda. Police suspected he had been drinking and he failed a sobriety test, said Los Angeles police Sgt. Mitzi Fierro.

Brown was booked and briefly jailed before being released. The singer will likely face formal charges at a later date. Brown, who was married to Houston from 1992 to 2007, has had numerous run-ins with the law, including arrests for battery, drug possession, drunk driving and parole violations.

Houston, whose marriage and career was marked by drug addiction, died suddenly in February at a Beverly Hills hotel. Authorities said last week that she drowned accidentally in her bathtub and that she had cocaine in her system.—Reuters

'Bully' to be released unrated on 30 March

NEW YORK, 27 March—The controversial documentary "Bully" will be released unrated in the United States this month, The Weinstein Co announced Monday.

The movie studio lost its appeal to have the Motion Picture Association of America rate the film PG-13 instead of R due to its inclusion of expletives.

The documentary's producers and its growing number of supporters said the language demonstrated the abusive behavior of bullies and argued rating the film R prohibits kids under 17 — who will benefit from the movie the most — from seeing it.

"The kids and families in this film are true heroes, and we believe theater owners everywhere will step up and do what's right for the benefit of all of the children out there

who have been bullied or may have otherwise become bullies themselves. We're working to do everything we can to make this film available to as many parents, teachers and students across the country," TWC Marketing President Stephen Bruno said in a statement.

"The small amount of language in the film that's responsible for the R rating is there because it's real," "Bully" director Lee Hirsch said. "It's what the children who are victims of bullying face on most days. All of our supporters see that, and we're grateful for the support we've received across the board. I know the kids will come, so it's up to the theaters to let them in."

Chocolate 'may help keep people slim'

SAN DIEGO, 27 March—People who eat chocolate regularly tend to be thinner, new research suggests.

The findings come from a study of nearly 1,000 US people that looked at diet, calorie intake and body mass index (BMI) - a measure of obesity.

It found those who ate chocolate a few times a week were, on average, slimmer than those who ate it occasionally.

Even though chocolate is loaded with calories, it contains ingredients that may favour weight loss rather than fat synthesis, scientists believe.

Despite boosting calorie intake, regular chocolate consumption was related to lower BMI in the study, which is published in Archives of Internal Medicine.

The link remained even when other factors, like how much exercise individuals did, were taken into account.

And it appears it is how

often you eat chocolate that is important, rather than how much of it you eat. The study found no link with quantity consumed.

According to the researchers, there is only one chance in a hundred that their findings could be explained by chance alone.

But the findings only suggest a link - not proof that one factor causes the other.

While there's no harm in allowing yourself a treat like chocolate now and again, eating too much might be harmful because it often contains a lot of sugar and fat too.

And if you are looking to change your diet, you are likely to benefit most from eating more fresh fruits and vegetables.

NAY PYI TAW, 27 March—The Myanmar National Human Rights Commission issued its Statement No 2/2012 today. The full text of the Statement is as follows:-

The Statement of the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission on its establishment and its current status of functioning (Statement No 2/2012)

On 16 March 2012, the Speaker of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw, based on the opinion of the Joint Bill Committee that the establishment of the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission (MNHRC) is not consistent with the Constitution and existing laws, decided that the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission is not part of the Leading Bodies of the State and that the request for the budget appropriations for the Commission is revoked.

This items of news was widely reported both inside and outside the country and led to the public assumption that the Commission has become defunct and resulted in various comments and queries. There were also expressions of concern both inside and outside the country.

The Commission was established in order to promote and protect the fundamental rights of the citizens of Myanmar enshrined in the Constitution as well as to interact with the United Nations and other international organizations. This is to enable the enhanced enjoyment of human rights and to contribute to the current democratization process both in form and essence.

Here it is pertinent to examine all the relevant provisions of the Constitution. It is found that under these provisions, every citizen shall enjoy the rights of equality, the right of liberty and the right of justice and necessary laws shall be enacted to make citizens' freedom, rights, benefits, responsibilities and restrictions effective, steadfast and complete.

It is found that, subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the executive power of the Union extends to administrative matters over which the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw has power to make laws. It is also found that, subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the executive power of the Union is vested in the President. The Commission is of the view that it is as part of the exercise of that executive power that the President had established the MNHRC. The establishment of the Commission under the present circumstances is not only appropriate

and timely but also has resulted in positive benefits for the citizens and the State. The Commission is an institution formed by the President under the executive power vested in him. The fact that it is not part of the Leading Bodies of the State and that its budget had been revoked has no effect on the existence and functioning of the Commission.

The MNHRC is an institution founded to promote and protect the human rights of citizens in a sustainable manner. The Commission is of the view that, in order to fully comply with the Paris Principles and act as an independent institution, it needs to become an institution established under an act of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw. Under the Paris Principles, to enable the Commission to function independently, adequate funding should be provided to it. The Commission will systematically utilize the funding provided by the Government as well as other sources.

Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines and Thailand from ASEAN and many countries of the world have established national human rights commissions to promote and protect human rights. In the initial stages of establishing their commissions, many of the countries established them under a Presidential decree or decree by the Prime Minister. Subsequently enabling acts of national human rights commissions were enacted and those commissions functioned in accordance with those acts. According to international reaction, the fact that the MNHRC is the fifth national human rights institution in ASEAN has enhanced the image of the country. For these reasons, to strengthen the MNHRC in the long run, the Commission, pursuant to the guidance of the President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, is already drafting an enabling national human rights commission act. The Commission will submit the draft to the President and, if approved, present to the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw for adoption.

The Myanmar National Human Rights Commission, in accordance with its mandate, will continue to promote and protect the fundamental rights of citizens enshrined in the Constitution with added momentum.
