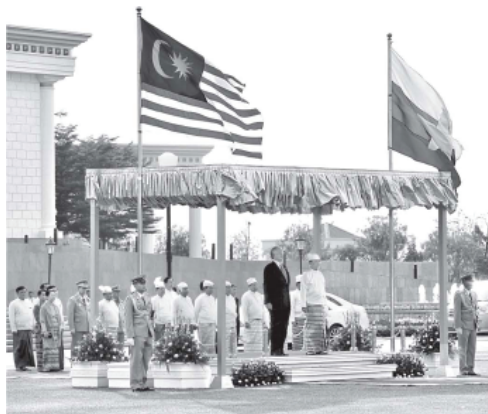

Exchange of fire along Israel-Egypt border

TEL AVIV, 28 March—Israeli troops opened fire at a group of suspects along the Egyptian border on Tuesday, two of whom had crossed from Egypt, a military spokesman

said, indicating that several of them were wounded. The incident took place 2:00 pm (1200 GMT), the army said.

Also during the afternoon, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu paid a visit to another area of the Sinai border to examine the ongoing construction of a vast barrier along the frontier to halt the influx of smugglers and immigrants, his office said, without specifying at what time he was there.

“During a routine patrol along the Israel-Egypt border, the force identified two suspects driving ATVs (all-terrain vehicles) from Israeli territory towards Egypt,” the spokesman said. “At the same time, two infiltrators crossed from Egypt into Israel.” The soldiers fired warning shots, then fired towards the legs of the four suspects, hitting two of them, he said. “The infiltrators then crossed back into Egypt along with one of the two from the Israeli side,” he told AFP, saying one had driven over the border on his quad bike.

Once they crossed the border, there was “an exchange of fire with Egyptian security forces,” he said.—INTERNET

Spain arrests Qaeda suspect for inciting attacks

MADRID, 28 March—Spanish police have arrested a suspected al-Qaeda member on charges of broadcasting videos on the Internet to incite militant attacks, the Interior Ministry said on Tuesday.

A ministry statement said police arrested the man, identified as “MHA”, in the eastern city of Valencia after an investigation launched in February 2011. Interior Minister Jorge Fernandez said the man was suspected of working with al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) as well as al-Qaeda North African branch al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb (AQIM).

“He was known in the heart of the terrorist organization as ‘al-Qaeda’s librarian,’” Fernandez told a news conference. Fernandez

said the suspect worked full-time from home to recruit potential extremists and arrange for them to travel to Afghanistan, as did an al-Qaeda-inspired gunman who went on a killing spree in France last week. “The training of people like Mohamed Merah, the Jihadist killer in Toulouse, arose through acts with such characteristics,” Fernandez said.

French President Nicolas Sarkozy said last week France would make it a crime to consult websites that advocate terrorism or hate crimes and would toughen a crackdown on people who went abroad for ideological indoctrination. Militants killed 191 people in co-ordinated bombings on commuter trains in Madrid in 2004.

US could fly spy drones from Australian territory

CANBERRA, 28 March—Australia on Wednesday said it may allow Washington to use its territory to operate long-range spy drones, as part of an increased US presence in the Asia-Pacific that has rankled China.

The United States and Canberra are planning a major expansion of military ties, with the first of a 2,500-strong

Marine deployment to northern Australia unveiled last November by President Barack Obama due to arrive next month.

The plan has irked China and worried some Asian countries who see it as a statement by Washington that it intends to stand up for its interests in the region amid concerns of increasing

assertiveness by Beijing.

Australian media carried reports Wednesday citing a *Washington Post* story that the United States was considering using the Cocos Islands, an atoll in the Indian Ocean off northwest Australia, to launch unmanned surveillance aircraft. They said the Cocos would replace the present US Indian Ocean base of Diego Garcia, which America leases from Britain and is due to be mothballed in 2016.

Aircraft carriers and nuclear-powered attack submarines could also be based in Perth as part of efforts to refocus American defence resources in the region, the

reports added. Australian Defence Minister Stephen Smith said the use of the Cocos Islands was a longer-term option for closer Australia-US engagement and its airstrip would need to be upgraded before it could be used. “Cocos is a possibility... it’s a long-term prospect and should be treated as such,” Smith told ABC radio.—INTERNET

Zambia-DR Congo river accident kills 20

LUAPALA, 28 March—Twenty people from DR Congo drowned when their boats capsized while crossing the river border with Zambia, where they had gone for a football match, local media reported on Tuesday.

The Democratic Republic of Congo nationals were crossing the Luapula, the longest tributary to the Congo river, when their boats were capsized by a passing speed boat late Sunday, the official *Zanis* news agency reported.

“Their boats were capsized after being hit by waves from a speedboat,” Luapula Province deputy commissioner Aaron Mushanga told *Zanis*.

The victims included members of Congolese football team Virgin KA and their supporters who were returning from a game against a Zambian side known as Senegal that

took place on the Senga islands. The boats were carrying more than 100 people but 80 are reported to have been rescued by the owner of the speedboat.

Drought spreads east and north-environment agency

LONDON, 28 March—A drought affecting southeast England has spread further north to parts of Yorkshire, as another dry month depleted river levels and underground water supplies, the UK’s Environment Agency said on Wednesday.

Areas from Chesterfield to Scarborough have fallen into the drought zone, as well as areas around Sheffield, Doncaster, Hull and Driffield.

The rivers Don, Rother, Hull and Derwent are low or very low for the time of year but public water supplies are unlikely to be affected, the agency said in a statement.

The agency appealed to farmers and businesses to use water wisely and share

available resources.

“Today south and east Yorkshire have moved into official drought status, reflecting the impact that this extremely dry period is having on the environment in the area,” Trevor Bishop, the agency’s head of water resources, said. A large part of England is already in drought after extremely low rainfall for two winters, which has affected much of the southeast, including London, and East Anglia.

Earlier this month, the agency warned drought could spread to more regions of Britain if dry weather continued this spring, which prompted seven water companies to impose water restrictions on their customers.

JetBlue flight diverted, passengers say captain restrained

AMARILLO, 28 March—A JetBlue flight bound for Las Vegas was diverted to Texas on Tuesday following what federal authorities described as erratic behavior by the captain, who passengers said had to be restrained after he pounded on the locked cockpit door.

The FBI is investigating the incident on Flight 191 from New York, which had 135 passengers on board

when the pilot-in-command decided to redirect the plane to Amarillo, Texas. JetBlue said in a statement the flight was diverted due to a “medical situation” involving the captain but made no mention of any commotion on board.

Passengers who were on the plane described a chaotic mid-flight scene in which a man in a JetBlue uniform, apparently locked out of the cockpit, began banging on

the door and demanding to be let inside. Passengers subdued him.

“People behind me, a bunch of big guys, started going up there and trying to help, and we found out that the guy banging was actually the pilot, and he was trying to get into the cockpit because the other co-pilot had locked him out,” passenger Grant Heppes told *Reuters*.

4,000-year-old stone monolith likely an astronomical marker

LONDON, 28 March—An ancient stone monolith in England was likely an astronomical marker, according to new archaeological evidence. The 4,000-year-old stone is triangular in shape and angles up toward geographic south. Its orientation and slant angle are aligned with the altitude of the sun at midsummer, researchers said. And new evidence shows that there are packing stones around the base of the 7.2-foot tall (2.2-meter) monolith, indicating that it was placed carefully in its location and position, they added.

“Given the sensitivity of the site, we can’t probe under the surface of the soil,” astronomer Daniel Brown of Nottingham Trent University in England said in a statement. “However, through our survey, we have found a higher density of packing stones on one side, supporting the case that the stone has been orientated intentionally.” The monolith is located at a ridge called

Gardom’s Edge in the Peak District National Park near Manchester, an area that shows evidence of human occupation extending far back through its history.

NZ dolphin survival boosted by Marine Protected Area

WELLINGTON, 28 March—Researchers studied the animals, one of the world’s most endangered species of dolphin, for 21 years. Their results show that the survival rate of the dolphins has increased by 5.4% since the Marine Protection Area (MPA) was declared. The findings are published in the *Journal of Applied Ecology*. “This is the first evidence that Marine Protected Areas can be effective for marine mammals. We found a significant improvement in the survival rate,” said Dr Liz Slooten from the University of Otago who undertook the research. In 1988 the Banks Peninsula Marine Mammal Sanctuary was established in the hope that resident dolphins would be protected from fatalities associated with the gillnet and trawling activities of the fishing industry. A team of ecologists conducted regular photo identification of the dolphins for 21 years, starting two years before the area was officially protected.

“We can identify individual dolphins from their battle

scars—which range from small nicks out of the dorsal fin to major scarring following shark attacks,” explained Dr Slooten. The researchers used the photographs to create a population model; with this they were able to analyse how the animals had fared over two decades. “Estimating population changes in marine mammals is challenging, often requiring many years of research to produce data accurate enough to detect these kinds of biological changes,” said Dr Slooten.

The best way to solve a problem at work

NEW YORK, 28 March—New research may just change what you think about what you know. That’s because when individual employees bring their knowledge and skills to organizational problems, even the most challenging problems can be solved, according to new research. This occurs because, according to study co-author Bryan Bonner, “for groups to be successful, they must

exploit the knowledge of their (individual) members effectively.”

Questions included: what is the minimum driving distance between Salt Lake City and New York City and what is the weight of the world’s heaviest man? “It doesn’t take much. All you have to do is have people sit there for a while and think, ‘What is it I already know about this, and how can that help find the solution?’”

Bonner, an associate professor at the University of Utah’s David Eccles School of Business, said. “People find they often know more than they think they do. They realize that they might not know the whole answer to the problem, but there are a couple things they do know that might help the group come to a solution.”

Therefore, leveraging what individuals already

know is the key to solving a range of problems, according to the research. “We solve problems by using the many examples, good and bad, we’ve gathered through hard-won experience throughout our lives. The problem is that we’re not nearly as good at applying old knowledge to new problems as you’d think,” Bonner said. “Research over more than a century has tried, without much success, to figure out how we can do a better job.”

Apple offers refunds for new iPad in Australia over 4G

NEW YORK, 28 March—US technology firm Apple has offered to refund Australian customers who felt misled about the 4G capabilities of the new iPad. The country’s consumer watchdog has taken Apple to court for false advertising because the tablet computer does not work on Australia’s 4G network. Apple’s lawyers said they were willing to publish a clarification. However the company does not accept that it misled customers.

Australia’s Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) said on Tuesday “that Apple’s recent promotion of the new ‘iPad with WiFi + 4G’ is misleading because it represents to Australian consumers that the product can, with a SIM card, connect to a 4G mobile data network in Australia, when this is not the case”.

The watchdog then lodged a complaint at the Federal Court in Melbourne. At a preliminary hearing, Apple lawyer Paul Anastassiou said Apple had never claimed the device would work fully on the current 4G network operated by Telstra. Apple says the new iPad works on what is globally accepted to be a 4G network. The matter could go to full trial after the Easter break.

The Apple iPad’s third version went on sale earlier this month, with Australia the first country where it was available. Shoppers lined up by the hundreds at Apple stores on opening day and the company said it had been its strongest iPad launch to date. The ACCC said it was seeking an injunction on sales as well as a financial penalty against Apple, corrective advertising and refunds to consumers. On its website, Apple does state that 4G LTE is only supported on selected networks in the US and Canada.

Amazon’s Kindle Touch comes to Europe, but no Fire news

NEW YORK, 28 March—Amazon is launching a touchscreen version of its Kindle e-reader in the UK, Germany, France, Spain and Italy. The Kindle Touch will be available for delivery from 27 April, five months after it went on sale in the US. Unlike in America, there will not be a discounted version with adverts. The device aims to challenge touch-based e-readers from Kobo and Sony. Amazon had no update on a European release date for its bestselling Kindle Fire Android-based tablet.

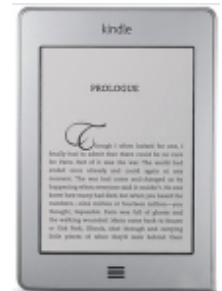
The Touch is being sold for £109 with wi-fi, and £169 with both wi-fi and 3G

connectivity, with no monthly fee. Both options allow books to be bought “on the go” from Amazon. The device also contains an “experimental” web browser, but it only works with wi-fi signal. The e-reader is 70 grams (2.5 ounces) heavier and slightly larger than the basic Kindle model, which is sold for £89.

However, it also offers an “x-ray” feature—exclusive to the device—which lets users to find related passages in a book as well as more detailed information from Wikipedia and Amazon’s community-written book encyclopaedia “Shelfari”. The latest version of its operating system will

allow books to be read in both portrait and landscape mode. US-owners had previously been restricted to holding the device vertically and had pressed Amazon to make both options available.

Amazon said UK readers will have access to more than one million books including the Harry Potter series, which has just become available to the firm and its rivals. “We launched our first Kindle here 18 months ago and it very quickly became successful with 500,000 titles,” Amazon’s European vice president of Kindle, Jorrit Van der Meulen, told the BBC. “It is the bestselling e-reader in the world,

Woman kills self while on Facebook

TAIPEI, 28 March — A woman in Taipei killed herself by inhaling poisonous fumes while chatting with friends on Facebook and none of them alerted authorities, police said on Tuesday. Claire Lin killed herself on her 31st birthday, 18 March, and family members who reported her suicide were unaware of the Facebook conversations that accompanied it, Taipei police officer Hsieh Ku-ming said. Lin’s last Facebook entries show her chatting with nine friends, alerting them to her gradual asphyxiation. One picture uploaded from her mobile phone depicts a charcoal barbecue burning next to two stuffed animals. Another

shows the room filled with fumes.

One friend identified as Chung Hsin, told Lin, “Be calm, open the window, put out the charcoal fire, please, I beg you.” Lin replied: “The fumes are suffocating. They fill my eyes with tears. Don’t write me anymore.” A few of the Facebook friends chatting with her tried to stop her and track her down on their own, but none called police. Chung did not respond to attempts to reach him for comment. Lin’s last words, in Chinese, were: “Too late. My room is filled with fumes. I just posted another picture. Even while I’m dying, I still want FB (Facebook). Must be FB

poison. Haha.”

Lin’s Facebook postings indicated she was unhappy because her boyfriend was ignoring her, and had failed to return home to be with her on her birthday. Her boyfriend found her body the next morning and alerted her family, Hsieh said. Hsieh said he regretted that none of her friends called police to help her during the 67-minute episode, but he added it may have been difficult for them to know her whereabouts because of the nature of social media. “It could be true that it would be

hard to track down a Facebook friend without her address or phone contact,” Hsieh said.

Chai Ben-wei, a sociologist at Taipei’s Feng Chia University, said the incident reflected social isolation in the Internet age. “People may have doubts about what they see on the Internet because of its virtual nature, and fail to take action on it,” he said. In a statement, Facebook said the company is deeply saddened by Lin’s death and that the case serves as a “painful reminder of how people can help others who are in distress or need assistance.” —INTERNET



Survival odds better with bypass than angioplasty

NEW YORK, 28 March — Patients who undergo bypass surgery for heart disease have better long-term survival rates than those who opt for less invasive procedures like angioplasty, a major US study showed on Tuesday. The study looked at data from 190,000 US patients and found that those who had bypass surgery had a lower death rate in the first four years (16.4 percent) compared to those who had angioplasty (20.8 percent).

Bypass operations involve open heart surgery to create a detour around a blocked artery using a vein taken from somewhere else in the patient's body. The type of angioplasty examined in the study, known as percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI), involves a small incision to thread a balloon, a wire stent or a tube through the blocked artery to keep it open. "Our study is the most general one ever done because it uses data from across the whole country. It is also much larger than any other study", said William Weintraub, chair of cardiology at Christiana Care Health System and the study's lead investigator. "Combining data from several large databases, we found that survival was better with coronary surgery than percutaneous coronary intervention." —Internet

Man hugs doctors after seeing face transplant in mirror

BALTIMORE, 28 March — Surgeons from the University of Maryland Medical Centre on Tuesday detailed what they said was the world's most comprehensive face transplant - allowing a 37-year-old man to emerge from behind a mask 15 years after a gun accident almost killed him.

Richard Norris of Hillsville, Virginia, was shot in the face in 1997 and lost his nose, lips and most movement in his mouth. Since then, he has had multiple life-saving and

reconstructive surgeries but none could repair him to the extent where he felt he could return to society. He wore a prosthetic nose and a mask even when entering hospital for the transplant.

But last week, during a 36-hour operation, University of Maryland doctors gave him a new face from an anonymous donor whose organs saved five other patients' lives on the same day. Six days after the surgery, he could already move his tongue and open and close his eyes and was recovering much faster than doctors expected.

"He's actually looking in the mirror shaving and brushing his teeth, which we never even expected," said Dr Eduardo Rodriguez, associate professor of surgery at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and head of the transplant team, who spoke at a Press conference.

Study suggests too much sitting can kill you

NEW YORK, 28 March — For better health, try standing up more, a new study suggests. Those who spend 11 or more hours a day sitting are 40 percent more likely to die over the next three years regardless of how physically active they are otherwise, researchers say. Analyzing self-reported data from more than 222,000 people aged 45 and older, Australian researchers found that mortality risks spike after 11 hours of total daily sitting but are still 15 percent higher for those sitting between 8 and 11 hours compared to those sitting fewer than 4 hours per day.

"The evidence on the detrimental health effects of prolonged sitting has been building over the last few years," said study author Hidde van der Ploeg, a senior research fellow at the University of Sydney. "The study stands out because of its large number of participants and the fact that it was one of the first that was able to look at total sitting time. Most of the evidence to date had been on the health risks of prolonged television viewing." The study is published in the 26 March issue of the *Archives of Internal Medicine*.

Average adults spend 90 percent of their leisure time sitting down, van der Ploeg said, and fewer than half meet World Health Organization recommendations for 150 minutes of at least moderate-intensity physical activity each week. The data was collected as part of Australia's 45 and Up Study, a large, ongoing study of healthy aging. Strikingly, the elevated risks for dying from all causes remained even after taking into account participants' physical activity, weight and health status. Sixty-two percent of participants said they were overweight or obese (a similar proportion to Americans), while nearly 87 percent said they were in good to excellent health, and one-quarter said they spent at least 8 hours each day sitting. —Internet



Fiji takes control of national airline from Qantas

WELLINGTON, 28 March — Fiji's military government says it is taking control of the country's national carrier Air Pacific from Australian company Qantas. The government of Commodore Frank Bainimarama has issued a decree saying that all Fijian-registered carriers must now be owned and controlled by Fijian nationals. Fiji already owns a majority stake in the airline, holding 51 percent of it while Qantas owns 46.3 percent. But Fijian Attorney General Aiyaz Sayed-Khaiyum said Qantas since 1998 has exercised effective control over the carrier because Qantas-appointed board members enjoy supermajority and veto rights.

Qantas said it would issue a statement later Wednesday. "It's an open secret that Qantas has proposed to sell their stake to the Fijian government," said Sayed-Khaiyum. He said the two groups haven't been able to agree on a price and that Fiji is hoping

Qantas will agree to a binding independent valuation of its stake. He added the decree has nothing to do with the potential sale. However, the Fijian government's latest move could negatively impact the value of the stake to Qantas and to any interested third parties.

In a question-and-answer statement on the change, the Fijian government said it is "false and misleading" to think Fiji is nationalizing the airline and depriving Qantas of its shareholder rights. Qantas will retain its ownership stake and its right to dividends, according to the Fijian government, but will no longer be able to exercise control over the annual operating budget, the appointment of the airline's chairman, the addition of new routes or a host of other management decisions. Fiji claims Qantas has been directly competing with Air Pacific through Qantas's wholly owned subsidiary, Jetstar.

read only on the company's Kindle e-readers and on its Kindle applications for smartphones, tablets and PCs. It can't be read on Barnes & Noble's Nook e-readers.

Conversely, a book for the Nook can't be read on a Kindle. A book purchased from Apple Inc. can only be read on iPhones, iPod touches and iPads. Publishers insist on encryption in the form of "Digital Rights Management," or DRM because they believe it stops piracy. It also helps e-book retailers like Amazon defend their business models, keeping non-Amazon books off Kindle e-readers. —Internet

Motion Torch, Samsung Galaxy S and Galaxy SII, and Sony Xperia Play smartphones. Graphics Properties said that unless the alleged infringements are halted, it will suffer irreparable harm. The lawsuits seek to stop the sale of infringing products and also seek reasonable royalties and other damages.

HTC spokeswoman Lori Rodney, LG spokesman John Taylor, Research In Motion spokeswoman Tenille Kennedy and Sony spokeswoman Sandra Genelius declined to comment on the substance of their companies' respective lawsuits. Apple and Samsung did not immediately respond to requests for comment. Silicon Graphics filed for bankruptcy in 2009 and sold much of its operations to Rackable Systems Inc. The remaining operations are based in New Rochelle, New York, and are owned by private investment firms and other investors, according to the complaints.

Harry Potter breaks e-book lockdown

NEW YORK, 28 March — When the Harry Potter books finally went on sale in electronic form on Tuesday, it was as if Harry himself had cast the "Alohomora" spell on them — the one that unlocks doors. In a break with industry practices, the books aren't locked down by encryption, which means consumers can move them between devices and read them anywhere they like.

If "Pottermore," JK Rowling's new Web store, proves a success, it could provide a model for other

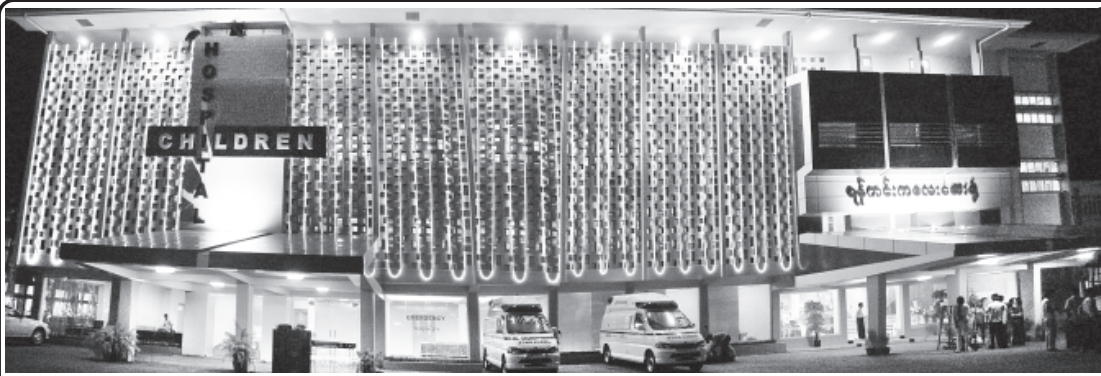

E-books from major publishers are sold in encrypted form today. The text of a book is scrambled so that only authorized devices and software can read it. For instance, a book bought from Amazon can be

Snakes, spiders, scorpions taken from New Mexico home

SANTA FE, 28 March—Animal control officials confiscated 31 venomous snakes, two tarantulas, two black widow spiders and about 10 scorpions from an Albuquerque apartment, an official involved with the collection said on Friday.

Following an anonymous tip, animal welfare officials were called to the apartment on Thursday. The reptiles they found were primarily rattlesnakes, which are commonly found in New Mexico, but also included several

cobras, including the cape cobra, "which is probably the most venomous of all the cobras," said Doug Hotle, curator of herpetology at the Albuquerque BioPark. Hotle, who was called in to help collect the snakes, said the owner did not have the proper permits required to keep such a large number of snakes nor to keep animals such as the cobra that are not native to New Mexico. The city of Albuquerque allows residents to keep up to 14 exotic or wild animals without a permit.—Reuters

Colo wildfire could be linked to controlled burn

CONIFER, 28 March—Investigators on Tuesday were trying to determine whether a controlled burn designed to minimize wildfire risk reignited and became a stubborn mountain wildfire that forced hundreds of residents to flee their homes and may have caused the deaths of two people.

Federal agencies dispatched two large air tankers to tackle the 7-square-mile blaze that damaged or destroyed 28 structures and resulted in mandatory evacuations of 900

homes south of the commuter town of Conifer, about 8,200 feet up in the Rockies foothills and 25 miles southwest of downtown Denver.

Some 450 firefighters from Colorado, Idaho, Nevada and Utah were sent to assist 250 firefighters on the ground. The fire consumed grass, brush and some Ponderosa Pine tree canopies. Winds were 20 mph to 30 mph before calming late Tuesday. Denver's tightly populated southwestern suburbs were not threatened.—Internet

The full text of the Joint Statement is as follows:-

Joint Statement Between The Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar And The Government of Malaysia

1. The President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, His Excellency U Thein Sein and the Prime Minister of Malaysia, the Honourable Dato' Sri Najib Tun Razak met in Nay Pyi Taw on 28 March 2012 during the first Official Visit of the Prime Minister of Malaysia to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. The visit had strengthened the friendly relations and promoted greater cooperation for the mutual benefit of the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and the Government of Malaysia.
 2. Both leaders recognized the network of interdependence between neighbouring countries including Myanmar and Malaysia. With both countries being part of the ASEAN family, supporting and complementing the economic and social developments of each other remain paramount in this relationship. The Prime Minister of Malaysia was pleased to note of the significant progress in Myanmar with regard to its national reconciliation process and the aim to transform the country into a modern and democratic state.
 3. The two leaders expressed satisfaction at the excellent state of bilateral relations at all levels, including the positive growth in trade and investment between both countries. They reaffirmed the commitment to consolidate the existing bilateral relations and strive for greater cooperation between Myanmar and Malaysia in strategic areas of mutual interest. Both leaders agreed that mutual trust and understanding, including constant engagement in dialogues are the ingredients for elevating the friendly and constructive relations between the two countries.
 4. In order to further expand and deepen the bilateral relations as well as the mutually beneficial partnership and cooperation between Myanmar and Malaysia, both leaders have agreed in the spirit of goodwill on the following:-
 - (i) The two leaders agreed to foster greater political linkage through exchanges of visits at all levels in order to further enhance government-to-government cooperation as well as people-to-people contacts;
 - (ii) Both sides agreed to convene the first Joint Commission Meeting headed by
- (iii) The two sides, realizing the tremendous potential that exists due to complementary nature of both economies, affirmed their commitment to elevate the level of bilateral trade and investment. To this end, both leaders are pleased to note the significant impact of the Malaysian Trade and Investment Mission led by the Minister of International Trade and Industry to Myanmar on 23 February 2012;
 - (iv) Both leaders agreed to explore the possibilities of expanding cooperation in potential sectors in the Myanmar economy particularly in the fields of plantation, agriculture, energy, construction, manufacturing, telecommunications, tourism and hospitality where Malaysia has the expertise and experience;
 - (v) The two leaders expressed satisfaction with the close cooperation between the two countries in the areas of labour and human resources. Both countries acknowledged the important contribution of Myanmar's labour force to Malaysia's economic development progress;
 - (vi) Both sides recognized the significance of tourism in fostering greater understanding and friendship between the people of the two countries, and as such are prepared to renew their cooperation in tourism with the aim to further enhance people-to-people interaction as well as to the economic development of both countries;
 - (vii) The two sides agreed to continue working together in the field of capacity building through identified training courses under the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) in the specific areas according to Myanmar's immediate need;
 - (viii) Both leaders look forward to continue collaborating closely to ensure the success of Myanmar's chairmanship of ASEAN in 2014 before the eventual succession of Malaysia as the next chair of ASEAN in 2015;
 - (ix) The two leaders welcomed the cooperation in the field of training for young and mid-level diplomatic officers to enhance the skills of officers in light of the Myanmar's Chairmanship of ASEAN in 2014;
 - (x) Both sides agreed to enhance collaboration in the field of Sports through assistance and sharing of experience vis-à-vis Myanmar's preparation in hosting the 27th SEA Games in 2013;
5. The leaders of both countries reaffirmed that with the Official Visit of the Honourable Prime Minister of Malaysia to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar have further strengthened the bilateral ties between the two countries. The Prime Minister of Malaysia has also extended an invitation to the President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, His Excellency U Thein Sein to undertake an official visit to Malaysia, and President U Thein Sein has accepted the invitation with pleasure.

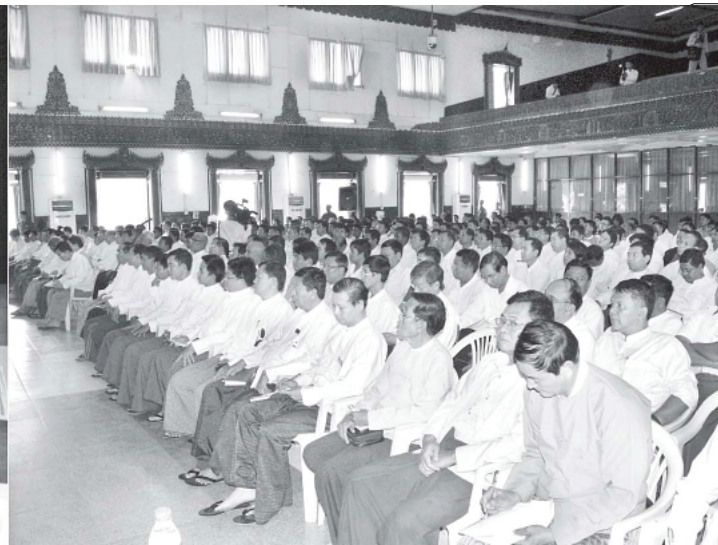

NAY PYI TAW, 28 March—Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann met with members of Pyithu Hluttaw committees and commission, and townsenders, merchants, entrepreneurs and members of social organizations of Mandalay and Sagaing Regions at City Hall of Mandalay City Development Committee in Mandalay Region on 26 March.

The meeting was attended by Mandalay Region Chief Minister U Ye Myint, Chairman of Pyithu Hluttaw Banks and Monetary Development Committee U Aung Thuang, Chairman of Pyithu Hluttaw National Races Affairs and Internal Peace Making Committee U Thein Zaw, Chairman of Pyithu Hluttaw Economic and Trade Development Committee U Maung Maung Thein, Region Hluttaw Speaker U Win Maung, Region ministers, secretaries and members of Pyithu Hluttaw committees, chairpersons, secretaries, CEC members, members and officials of business organizations in Mandalay and Sagaing Regions, members of social organizations, townsenders, intellectuals and intelligentsia and guests.

Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann said that he would like to extend his greetings to all those present at the meeting. He was happy to meet with townsenders, merchants, officials of industrial federation, chairpersons of local NGOs, CEC members, and business and social entrepreneurs in Mandalay, Sagaing and Monywa regions. He had attended two similar meetings in Yangon Region, a political, commercial and social hub, since his assumption of duty as Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker. Those two meetings were arranged when he was in Yangon for foreign trip. But, the meeting for this time was on purpose. The Pyithu Hluttaw committees and commission are formed in the Pyithu Hluttaw. Those Hluttaw committees formed to perform Hluttaw's duties are small Hluttaws which report to the Hluttaw on their undertakings and carried out legislation tasks as the main duty and the check and balance among executive, judicial and legislation institutions as the second duty.

To go into detail, the accomplishment of these duties depends on performance of the Hluttaw committees. Originally, there are four committees in the Pyithu Hluttaw. It formed 19 new committees out of necessity. Another commission was necessarily established to

report to the Hluttaw and the Speaker in performing Hluttaw duties. That is Legal Affairs and Special Cases Assessment Commission which is tasked to suggest the Hluttaw through the Speaker to abolish laws after studying existing laws and to prescribe new laws and to provide the respective committees with suggestions through the Speaker regarding political, economic, social and technological cases arose by any factor. It is believed that the commission comprised of legal specialists, experienced persons of international affairs and specialists from revenue, education, health, social and science and technology fields may contribute to the Pyithu Hluttaw and the Pyithu Hluttaw committees.

The Pyithu Hluttaw could somewhat take on the duty of legislation and check and balance. As per the motto of the Hluttaw, it needs to know actual desires of the people. It is vital important for the country that the representatives put forward these desires to the Hluttaw as questions, proposals, bills and laws. The Hluttaws play a key role in Myanmar's political transition which could be completed only through legislation not by orders. The bills which need be drafted and submitted to the Hluttaw hastily are as important as questions and proposals. To enable the representatives perform the duties successfully, suggestions of townsenders, businessmen, merchants and intellectuals and intelligentsia are very important. Questions and discussions which would serve the interests of the region and the State would be acquired at the meeting. It is believed that the Hluttaw could produce the pragmatic solutions for the State.

He said that he has wanted much to go there and make coordination because Mandalay and Sagaing regions especially can play a leading role both in political and social affairs. Now, his wishes have been fulfilled. Economic and Trade Development Committee, one of the parliamentary committees, came to Mandalay Region to hold discussions and seek suggestions and submitted the results to the Hluttaw, which were found to be highly effective. So, he said that he came there to Mandalay Region to have discussion with businessmen, traders and Chambers of Commerce and Industry. He said that he believes the discussions would bear fruitful results. Therefore, he would like

to ask them to discuss frankly everything beneficial to the nation and the people. Personnel concerned would give an answer whether possible and not, take the requirements to the Hluttaw to write a related law or introduce a related process.

After that, Committee Chairmen U Maung Maung Thein, U Thein Zaw and U Aung Thuang elaborated on the ongoing works of their respective committee and future works.

Those present cordially discussed difficulties and advantages and disadvantages they are now facing in actual practice and matters that could be done by the government.

In his concluding remark, the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker said: the reports are very interesting and can be said profitable ones for the State and its people. He would carefully memorize the reports and coordinate with committees and ministries concerned. There must still be inconveniences during transition period while transforming from one era to another and one system to another. However, they need to change the law in finding the solutions for hindrances. To change the law, they must change our mindset first. It is necessary to change their basic thoughts and actions in efforts for positive change.

To finalize the reports, it can be seen that they need urgent measures to compete AFTA in 2015. Our parliament desperately needs to

take actions to face any global challenge apart from AFTA. To face those challenges, they need to assign clear duties, choosing who for what. People's representatives are to fulfill the needs of the people through parliament and the parliament in turn needs to draw up legislation effectively and speedily. In so doing, it needs to check whether laws and by-laws enacted are actually beneficial to the State and its people and to revoke them if they fail to meet the expectation.

Therefore, they need to strengthen and consolidate the parliament, the legislative mechanism. He has urged the MPs to devote to the interests of the nation and citizens abandoning party attachment, racism, sectarianism, and dogmatism. He said that the Hluttaw has managed to function well to certain extent. This has enhanced the dignity of the Hluttaw, lending auspiciousness to the government. He said that he has heard very good ideas as people had suggested on behalf of the people. He was grateful to respective organizations for their contribution of ideas for the welfare of the nation and its people. The Hluttaw and committees would always be loyal to the interests of the nation and its people.

After the meeting, Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann cordially greeted the attendees.—MNA

Constitutional Tribunal of the State delivers final verdicts

NAY PYI TAW, 28 March—The Constitutional Tribunal of the State inclusive of the chairman and all the members delivered final verdict on proposal No 1/2012 and proposal No 2/2012 submitted the Attorney-General of the Union on behalf of the President at Room No. 1 today.

According to the verdicts, in the proposal No 1/2012, Union level organizations formed under the constitution and the members or personalities of those organizations are

members and personalities of Union organizations appointed by the President with the approval of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw. Committees, commissions and groups formed by respective Hluttaws are parliamentary organizations. The additional definition of committees, commissions and groups formed by respective Hluttaws as Union level organizations violates the provisions of the constitution.

In the proposal No 2/2012, the Attorney-General of the Union on behalf of the

President asked the tribunal to reconsider its resolution made on 14 December, 2011 which defined that provisions of the Article 5 and Article 17 of the Region or State Personalities' Allowances, Emolument and Insignia Law are not conformity with the constitution because Region or State national races affairs ministers are officially appointed as Region or State ministers of respective Region or States. The tribunal did not accept the proposal as its resolution is final verdict legally.—MNA

LONDON, 28 March—In their scruffy jeans and trainers, Ross Harper and Ed Moyses look just like any other British 22-year-olds — except for the words "Buy My Face" and



German parties reject Merkel timeline on fiscal pact

BERLIN, 28 March—Germany's main opposition parties rejected on Tuesday plans by Chancellor Angela Merkel's government to push a European pact on budget discipline through parliament by June, saying more time was needed to complement it with measures to bolster growth.

The pact, which aims to enshrine German-style fiscal rules across 25 EU countries, requires a two-thirds majority in parliament to pass, meaning Merkel is dependent on the opposition. The chancellor's

original plan was to link the vote on the pact to legislation authorizing Europe's new

bailout facility, the European Stability Mechanism (ESM), with both going to the Bundestag lower house of parliament in May and the Bundesrat upper house in June. But opposition parties argue that Merkel has focused too much on consolidating euro zone finances and not enough on getting struggling countries such as Greece out of deep multi-year recessions. They are pushing for additional growth-friendly policies as a condition for approving the pact.

The Social Democrats (SPD) and Greens reacted angrily to comments by Merkel's finance minister, Wolfgang Schauble, on Monday evening where he effectively ruled out the introduction of a financial transaction tax in the euro zone because of opposition from other member states.

Both parties want such a tax to help finance growth-boosting measures. They made clear on Monday that they did not consider the transaction tax to be dead and saw no reason to approve the fiscal pact according to the government's timeline.

"Sold" emblazoned brightly on their faces.

Standing in the middle of London's shopping mecca Oxford Circus, the two Cambridge University graduates attract more than a few curious glances from the hordes of passers-by. "How much?" a young man calls out from a gaggle of Spanish tourists, to which Harper, a former neuroscience student, replies that it's £100 (\$160, 120 euros) to hire the two faces as advertising space for the day. "A hundred pounds?" The tourists throw up their hands in mock outrage before bursting into laughter.

There may be no customers here, but others are queuing to hire the two human billboards. Harper and Moyses have made over £30,000 since setting up Buy My Face in October in a bid to pay off their student debts. The enterprising duo plan to launch the business, which works by directing online traffic to advertisers' websites through their own entertaining site, on the international market in May.—Internet

Hungarian rows canoe across Atlantic Ocean

After 76 days, Gabor Rakonczay — isolated and incommunicado for nearly 50 of those after his canoe capsized — has become the first person to paddle across the Atlantic Ocean from Europe to the Caribbean.

Rakonczay, who began his adventure in Lagos, Portugal, on 21 Dec, and stopped for several days in the Canary Islands for rest and supplies, reached the island of Antigua on Sunday, he told *The Associated Press*

in a phone interview from the Caribbean nation.

When his 24.61 feet (7.5 metre) canoe capsized at sea, the Hungarian adventurer said he managed to save it but his communications equipment was damaged and he had not been in contact with his family since 6 Feb.

Rakonczay made the journey without a satellite tracking system which would have allowed him to signal that he was all right. So his wife, who stayed behind in

Hungary, could only hope for the best. "The supplier raised the price at the last minute and I decided to leave without one because it was not possible to postpone the trip," the 30-year-old said from Nelson's Dockyard in southern Antigua.

"This trip was the first time I didn't have a tracking system and the first time I really would have needed one." During the nearly seven weeks he was out of reach, Viktoria, his wife, gave no

indications that she was anything but totally sure that her husband was alive and that only equipment failure was to blame for their lack of

communication. She kept posting entries on their web page nearly every day, speculating about Gabor's position and how the

weather conditions were affecting his voyage on the canoe nicknamed "Vitez," which means "valiant" in Hungarian.

Jerry Gamble, 80, of Delray Beach said his wife Jean, who died in February at the age of 78, would rescue

the unwanted bears from garage sales, fix them up and find them new homes, the *South Florida Sun Sentinel* reported on Tuesday.

"She would rescue the bears," Gamble said.

"She used to buy a hell of a lot of bears. We would

come home sometimes with 50 bears in the car." Gamble said he and his son, Jeffery, are trying to honor her memory by finding new homes for the bears.

"I have given away 500, which is an immense number by itself," Jeffrey Gamble said. "It barely made a dent."

Man ticketed for 100 mph twice in hour

A North Dakota man was ticketed twice within an hour for speeding at least 100 mph in neighbouring Minnesota, police say.

The Minnesota State Patrol said Monday Murat Ayamba Ndikum, 31, of Grand Forks was pulled over the first time shortly after 6 pm 13 March for allegedly doing 100 mph on Interstate 94 near Alexandria, the *Minneapolis Star Tribune* reported. Within the hour, he was stopped a second time on the interstate near Barnesville, this time clocked at 106 mph,

the patrol said. The speed limit on the interstate is 70 mph along those stretches, the newspaper said.

Ndikum allegedly told the second trooper he finds it difficult to keep track of his speed.

The *Star Tribune* said the average cost of a speeding ticket in Minnesota is about \$120 for 10 miles over the limit. Those caught racing 20 mph over face double the fine and hitting 100 mph can cost them their licenses for six months.

Landmark Amsterdam museums get 21st-century facelifts

AMSTERDAM, 28 March—A virtual adventure at sea with storms and battles, a new "jewel box" for Asian art and a high-tech building shaped like a bathtub: Amsterdam's landmark museums are getting facelifts to catapult them from their dusty pasts into the 21st century.

The makeover of three of the capital's most important museums, the Maritime Museum, the Rijksmuseum and the Stedelijk Museum, has been hailed as the dawn of a "new cultural

golden age" to attract the 12.2 million visitors to Amsterdam every year.

At the recently reopened National Maritime Museum in the grand white 17th-century Zeemagazijn (sea storehouse) building, excited children and their parents lined up for an experience spiced with interactive computer games and electronic simulations.

"We have chosen to redefine the museum," said spokeswoman Kerstin Ruter.—*Internet*

Sharapova solves Li to reach semis at Key Biscayne

KEY BISCAYNE, 28 March—Second seed Maria Sharapova stormed into the semi-finals of the Sony Ericsson Open after ending her jinx against China's Li Na with a convincing 6-3, 6-0 win on Tuesday. China's star hurdler Liu still dogged by injury

BEIJING, 28 March—China's star hurdler Liu Xiang is still struggling with an injury that ended his quest to win a gold at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, state media reported Wednesday, quoting his coach.

The 28-year-old Chinese athletics star was a shock Olympic champion in the high hurdles at the 2004

Athens Games and remains history's second fastest man in the event.

"But the whole team has done an excellent job of controlling his old injury and avoiding new wounds," he said.

Sun added Liu was focusing on outdoor training ahead of the Olympics in London, which starts in four months.

During the 2008 Games in Beijing, he pulled up injured in the 110m hurdles in front of an expectant home crowd.—*Internet*

Magic Johnson group to buy Dodgers for record \$2b

NEW YORK, 28 March—A group that includes former Lakers star Magic Johnson and longtime baseball executive Stan Kasten agreed Tuesday night to buy the Los Angeles Dodgers from Frank McCourt for a record \$2 billion. The price would shatter the mark for a North American sports franchise, topping the \$1.1 billion Stephen Ross paid for the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2009.

Mark Walter, chief executive officer of the financial services firm Guggenheim Partners, would become the controlling owner. The deal, revealed about five hours after Major League Baseball owners approved three finalists for an intended auction, is one of several steps

toward a sale of the team by the end of April. It is subject to approval in federal bankruptcy court.

"I am thrilled to be part of the historic Dodger franchise and intend to build on the fantastic foundation laid by Frank McCourt as we drive the Dodgers back to the front page of the sports section in our wonderful community of Los Angeles," Johnson said in a statement.—*Internet*

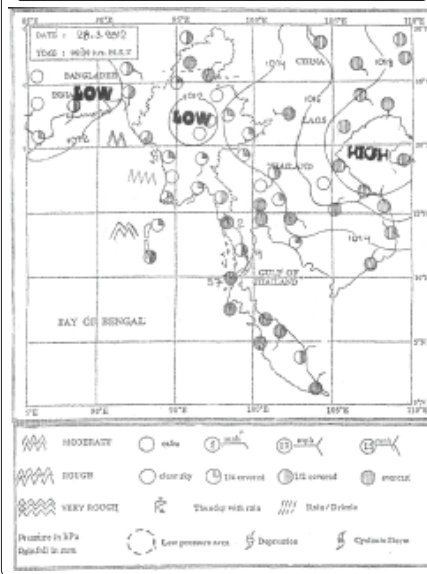

LISBON, 28 March—A second-half goal by Salomon Kalou handed Chelsea a 1-0 win over Benfica in the first leg of their Champions League quarter-final on Tuesday.

The Londoners always appeared in control and Kalou grabbed the only goal in the 75th minute, tapping the ball in from close range after excellent work down the right by Fernando Torres and Ramires.

"This was a very good result. We knew the difficulties we were going to face and now we will take the game back to London where we will have the support of our fans," said Chelsea centre back David Luiz.

"Nothing is won yet but we showed a lot of maturity and experience," added the Brazilian who was signed from Benfica in a big-money transfer 14 months ago.

Kalou's goal vindicated the decision by interim coach Roberto Di Matteo to start the Ivory Coast forward in place of England international Daniel Sturridge who was rested from the

starting lineup along with Didier Drogba, Frank Lampard, Michael Essien and Gary Cahill.

Juan Mata had also gone close for Chelsea on the hour when he rounded keeper Artur Moraes but struck the post from an acute angle. Mata then had a late chance to put the tie beyond Benfica's reach ahead of the second leg at Stamford Bridge on 14 April.

The Spanish playmaker was set free on the left with four minutes to go after
