Let's bring down poverty rate!

According to the statistics of UNDP and UNICEF, Myanmar's poverty rate was 32 percent in 2005 and 26 percent, in 2010. In developed countries, agriculture sector accounts for 15 percent of GDP while the services sector and manufacturing sector are making up 85 percent of GDP. So, it is impossible to be a developed country by relying only on agricultural sector. About 70 percent

of the country's population resides in rural areas. Majority of people living below the poverty line are in rural areas. So, improving livelihood for rural populace is the first priority.

With a view to bringing down the poverty rate in the country, the government has laid down eight rural development and poverty reduction tasks—development of agricultural productivity, development of livestock breeding and fisheries, development of rural small-scale productivity, development of micro saving and credit associations, development of cooperative tasks, development of rural socio-economy, development of rural energy and environmental conservation.

The central committee and subcommittees

on eight rural development and poverty reduction tasks are set up and eight major tasks are being implemented in all states/regions, targeting to reduce the poverty rate from 26 percent at present to 16 percent by 2015. Myanmar's Human Development Index (HDI) is low compared to other ASEAN countries. The country needs high individual incomes to achieve higher HDI.

As part of its programme, loans are being disbursed to vendors and needy people. Cooperation of local people is of great importance for development of micro saving and credit associations. It will be necessary to double the living status if the country is to achieve the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by 2015.

Union Minister U Kyaw Hsan attends 7th ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Council Meeting

NAY PYI TAW, 5 April—The seventh ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Council Meeting took place at Phnom Penh in Cambodia on 2 April during which Union Minister for Information and for Culture U Kyaw Hsan explained Myanmar's participation in ASEAN socio-cultural works, future plans and requirements.

In his discussion, he said Republic of the Union of Myanmar, since 1997 when it became full-fledged member of the ASEAN, has tried to promote common social and cultural values in coordination with the ASEAN fellows under the objective of the ASEAN—"Unity in Diversity". It has planned to host a workshop on "initiative for the establishment of Ancient Cities Network in ASEAN towards the promotion of ASEAN Identity" in June, 2012. The workshop is intended to promote the cultural characteristics of the ASEAN, during which experts from ASEAN member states would discuss cultural heritages and arts from various aspects. Myanmar believes the workshop would contribute to the success of ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community in 2015.

Myanmar attaches great importance to environmental conservation works for enhancement of quality of living standard of ASEAN nations which is one of the programmes of the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Blueprint. For this, it has reconstituted the Forestry Ministry as the Environmental Conservation and Forestry Ministry which is focusing its efforts on ecological Conservation. Taunggyi and Pyin Oo Lwin of Myanmar have won environmentally sustainable cities (ESC) award.

As to education, the government has conducted national plan to ensure every school-age children go to school. In addition, it has introduced special education programme which encourages overage students go to school, resulting in an increase in school-going rate at basic education level. University of Foreign Languages has opened diploma course on Myanmar Language and advanced Myanmar Language course since 1989-90 academic year and students from ASEAN countries are learning Myanmar Language there. Besides, it has sent Myanmar students to ASEAN countries

and Japan for studies under the ASEAN University Network/AUN.

With regard to disaster, there has been National Advisory Committee of Disaster Prevention and Preparation in Myanmar which educates the risks of disasters, informs in advance, prevention and security programmes, builds easy communication links and prepares drinking water, foods and first-aid programmes. Apart from this, it holds National Monsoon Forum twice a year in cooperation with regional organizations.

For social security and development of women and children, there has opened 68 kindergartens plus residential nurseries providing care to abandoned and helpless children under five.

Concerning disability, the government has pledged for development and rehabilitation of the handicapped as national duty. It has recorded the number of the handicapped in 120 townships in coordination with non-governmental organizations and drawn up National Plan of Action (2010-2012). The plan includes working plans concerned which will be implemented in coordination

with NGOs. The Social Welfare Department has opened two schools for the deaf, eight schools for the blind, two vocational training schools, and four special schools for Mentally Retarded Children with a view to development of the handicapped and protection of their rights.

In response to discussions of the reps of the ASEAN Secretariat and ASEAN nations, the Union Minister said Myanmar welcomes the measures to extend sports sector to human resources development under education sector.

He said in implementation of score card which would be a yardstick for the progress in implementation of the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Blueprint, Myanmar would like to learn more about evaluating the quantity and quality by organizing workshops with the help of the ASEAN Secretariat as socio-cultural community works are done through coordination of 17 ministries in Myanmar.

Financial, investment restrictions to be eased on Myanmar

WASHINGTON, 5 April—US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton said on Wednesday that the United States will ease its financial and investment restrictions on

Myanmar, following the landmark parliamentary by-election in the country.

The United States is “beginning the processes of a targeted easing of our ban on the export of US financial services and investment as part of a broader effort to help accelerate economic modernization and political reform” Clinton said at a joint Press conference with Kosovo Prime Minister Hashim Thaci.

Terming the by-election as an important step in Myanmar’s transformation, Clinton said that the United States is committed to

“taking steps alongside the Myanmar government and people as they move down the road of reform and development.” She said that Washington is easing visa ban on Myanmar, allowing select of officials and parliamentarians to visit the United States. Clinton also said that the United States is expected to nominate an ambassador to Myanmar very soon, to establish an in-country USAID mission and to support a normal country programme for the UN Development Programme.

Four detained over deadly Thai blasts

BANGKOK, 5 April—Thai police have arrested four suspects in connection with a series of devastating bomb blasts in the insurgency-

plagued deep south, an official said on Thursday. The car bombings in two southern cities on Saturday killed 15 people and wounded

hundreds more in the deadliest attacks in the region in recent years.

Three men were detained on Wednesday evening at a house in Rueso District of Narathiwat Province in an operation involving 50 police and paramilitaries, authorities said. A stolen pickup truck which was used in the attack in the city of Yala was earlier seen in front of the house of one of the suspects, said Colonel Satarnfa Wamasing of Rueso district police. He said the licence plate of the truck was also put on a stolen car used in an attack on a hotel in the city of Hat Yai on Saturday. “They still deny it but we have evidence that they met to plot the attacks,” Satarnfa told AFP on telephone, adding that police were investigating records of their phone calls. “There are more people involved but I can’t say how many,” he added. One of the suspects is a cleric with nine outstanding arrest warrants, Satarnfa said.—Internet

Eight Afghan local police killed in outpost attack

KABUL, 5 April — Gunmen attacked an outpost of a government-sponsored militia force in western Afghanistan, killing eight people, officials said on Thursday. Taliban spokesman Qari Yousef Ahmadi claimed responsibility for the attack. Men armed with assault rifles stormed the outpost late Wednesday in Farah Province’s Khaki Safed district, said provincial police chief Shamsul Rahman Zahid. He says eight members of the Afghan Local Police were killed and two captured. The attacks first shot a guard who was posted outside then pushed into the compound and opened fire on those inside, said Abdul Khaliq Noorzai, the district

administrator. The attackers then made off with their weapons. The assault happened on the same day that a Taliban suicide bomber on a motorcycle killed at least 10 people, including three American soldiers, at a park in northern Afghanistan.

The attacks appear to be part of an increase in violence at the start of the spring fighting season. During the harsh Afghan winter, snow often blocks roads and fighting dies down. The Taliban are targeting Afghan and NATO security forces as they fight to assert their power and undermine US efforts to try to build up the Afghan military, which will take the lead in combat responsibility over the next couple of years.

Chavez back in Venezuela after more cancer treatment

CARACAS, 5 April — President Hugo Chavez returned home to Venezuela on Wednesday after his latest session of cancer treatment in Cuba, as he aims to fight off the illness and win a new six-year term in an October election.

The 57-year-old socialist leader walking unaided from his plane after it landed in his home state of Barinas and he was greeted on the runway by relatives, the vice president and several government ministers. “The socialist revolution is irreversible ... I continue recuperating,” he said in a brief speech on state TV, wishing Venezuelans a happy Easter weekend and saying he was “now more Christian than ever.” His second session of radiation treatment had gone well, he said, and the results of all his medical tests were positive. He is expected to return to

Cuba for a third session soon.

Flying back and forth to Havana for the radiation therapy, Chavez has been running a kind of “virtual” election campaign via Twitter and appearances on state television, while his opposition rival tours the South American country.

Somalia theatre bombing kills top sports officials

MOGADISHU, 5 April — The head of Somalia’s Olympic committee and its football chief are among eight people killed in a bomb attack on a high-profile event in Mogadishu. Prime Minister Abdiweli Mohamed Ali survived the blast unhurt after it struck the newly re-

Somalia. The President of the Somali Olympic Committee, Aden Yabarow Wiish, and the Somali Football Federation chief, Said Mohamed Nur, were both killed. They were among a group of dignitaries who had gathered to mark the first anniversary of the launch of

endless efforts to promote sport and football in their country,” he said in a statement. “They will be sorely missed.” Three Somali television journalists were also wounded in the blast, sources told the BBC Somali Service. The theatre had closed in the early 1990s as

opened national theatre in the capital, Mogadishu. Militants from the al-Shabab group say they carried out the bombing.

African Union peacekeepers said the “despicable” attack would not deter peace efforts in

Somalia’s national television station.

Sepp Blatter, president of football’s governing body Fifa, said he was shocked at the deaths of the sport officials. “I knew both men personally and can only say good things about their

Somalia descended into civil war and was only reopened last month, amid a new period of relative optimism. Police and hospital sources told BBC News in Mogadishu that eight people had been killed.

Rocket hits Israeli town of Eilat

JERUSALEM, 5 April—A Grad rocket has landed in the southern Israeli City of Eilat, but has caused no damage or injuries, Israeli security officials said.

District police chief Ron Gertner told Israeli radio the rocket had been fired from Egypt’s Sinai peninsula.

He said it struck a construction site close to a residential area shortly after midnight (21:00 GMT).

The blast took place as thousands congregated in the resort town for the Jewish holiday of Passover.

Rocket attacks from

Egyptian soil are uncommon.

Attacks on Eilat and the nearby Jordanian town of Aqaba in 2010 killed one person and injured another four.

Eilat Mayor Meir Yitzhak-Halevy told the *Jerusalem Post* that the city would function as normal despite the attack.

A wave of unrest has hit the restive Sinai peninsula recently.

Israel says militants have become active in the region since former Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak was overthrown in February

2011. In August 2011, an armed group crossed the border into Israel from the Sinai peninsula and killed eight Israelis.

Israel blamed Palestinian militants but five



Egyptian policemen were killed as Israeli forces pursued the gunmen, sparking a diplomatic row between the two countries.

LONDON, 5 April — A newly described relative of Tyrannosaurus rex is the largest known feathered animal - living or extinct. The feathered meat-eating dinosaur lived about 125 million years ago and is estimated to have weighed a

Yutyranus, has been identified from three fossils found in north-eastern China.

The finds, detailed in *Nature* journal, challenge current theories about the evolution of T rex and its relations.

This group of dinosaurs

is known as the Tyrannosauroids. Tyrannosaurus rex and its gigantic cousins lived until around 65 million years ago - when a huge asteroid wiped out the dinosaurs - but most of their earlier relatives are thought to have been much smaller.

However, Xing Xu and colleagues from the Chinese Academy of Sciences in Beijing have now described three specimens of Yutyranus, which represents an early example of the Tyrannosauroid form.

The fossils include the one-and-a-half-tonne adult and also two juvenile specimens that would have tipped the scales at about half a tonne.

The dinosaur, whose name translates as "beautiful feathered tyrant", shares some features with later tyrannosaurs like T rex, but has three functional fingers (where T rex had two) and a foot typical of other early tyrannosaur relatives.

CO2 'drove end to last ice age'

LONDON, 5 April — A new, detailed record of past climate change provides compelling evidence that the last ice age was ended by a rise in temperature driven by an increase in atmospheric carbon dioxide. The finding is based on a very broad range of data, including even the shells of ancient tiny ocean animals. A paper describing the research appears in this week's edition of *Nature*. The team behind the study says its work further strengthens ideas about global warming.

"At the end of the last ice age, CO2 rose from about 180 parts per million (ppm) in the atmosphere to about 260; and today we're at 392," explained lead author Dr Jeremy Shakun. "So, in the last 100 years we've gone up about 100 ppm - about the same as at the end of the last ice age, which I think puts it into perspective because it's not a small amount."

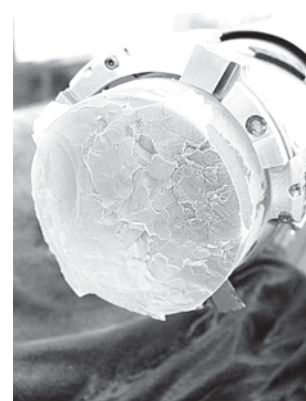
Rising CO2 at the end of the ice age had a huge effect on global climate." The study covers the period in Earth history from roughly 20,000 to 10,000 years ago.

This was the time when the planet was emerging from its last deep chill, when the

great ice sheets known to cover parts of the Northern Hemisphere were in retreat.

The key result from the new study is that it shows the carbon dioxide rise during this major transition ran slightly ahead of increases in global temperature.

This runs contrary to the record obtained solely from the analysis of Antarctic ice cores which had indicated the opposite - that temperature elevation in the southern polar region actually preceded (or at least ran concurrent to) the climb in CO2.—INTERNET

Memory decline speeds up in years before death

WASHINGTON, 5 April — Memory declines faster than any other time in the two-and-a-half years before death of old age, a new study finds. In the years before death, the rate of memory decline speeds up eight to 17 times, according to the research. The study examined the brains of 174 Catholic priests, nuns and monks who had undergone memory testing for six to 15 years before their deaths. After death, researchers led by Rush University Medical Centre scientist Robert Wilson investigated the participants' brains.

They found that the characteristic plaques and tangles of Alzheimer's disease (which occur before the disease is diagnosable) are not to blame for the fast rate of the decline. Alzheimer's tangles and plaques were associated with the decline starting earlier, but not with it going faster. That points to another culprit for the memory problems.

"The findings suggest that the changes in mental abilities

during the two to three years before death are not driven directly by processes related to Alzheimer's disease, but instead that the memory and other cognitive decline may involve some biological changes in the brain specific to the end of life." Oregon Health and Science University professor Hiroko Dodge, who was not involved in the study, wrote in an editorial accompanying the new paper.

"The study by Wilson and his co-authors deepens our understanding of terminal cognitive decline." With further study, Dodge wrote, researchers could develop algorithms to detect and analyze memory changes to identify people in this terminal phase of life.

The study and editorial appeared online on 4 April in the journal *Neurology*. A second study, also led by Wilson, finds that mental activity can boost brainpower in old age.

Palm-sized Star Trek tech may be closer than you think

NEW YORK, 5 April — In the Star Trek universe, the tricorder is a handheld device used by Kirk, Spock, and various red-shirted crew members to make detailed scans of unfamiliar planets and even less familiar life-forms. It can be used in sick bay to diagnose intergalactic patients, and in engineering to find which part of the warp core is missing. One small device that can do all that must be total science-fiction, right? Well thanks to recent advances in X-ray technology, the tricorder might be much closer than you think.

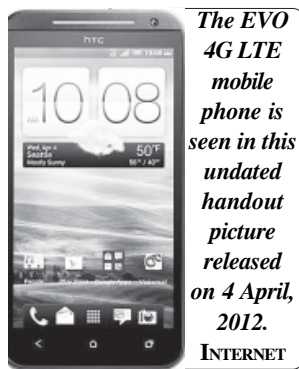
When many of us hear of X-rays, the first thing we

think of is a visit to the doctor's office. We're led into a big room, covered with a lead apron while the intended area is shot with those powerful, yet invisible rays. Or perhaps we think of a trip to the airport, where X-rays are used to check baggage and passengers before boarding a plane. But aside from that, X-rays tend to be — literally — out of sight, out of mind. But that may be changing. The scientists at Tribogenics have found some creative ways to advance a technology that doesn't seem to have evolved much in the past 130 years.

CEO Dale Fox and Chief

Scientist Dr Carlos Camara are taking advantage of an amazing scientific phenomenon similar to what occurs when light energy is created as an adhesive is peeled (try it yourself with some Scotch tape in a dark closet). They are harnessing that energy to create usable and portable X-rays. For us non-scientists out there the technology is quite complicated, but the implications are not. Since the X-ray source is small, that means devices can be made smaller as well. Contrast this with the big and bulky machines we're used to seeing.

NEW YORK, 5 April — Sprint Nextel, the No 3 US mobile service, is hoping to turn heads next month with the EVO 4G LTE, an HTC Corp phone with an advanced camera, a big screen, a high-speed wireless connection and crisper voice call quality. However the device may not immediately support fast data services and the new sound

technology as it is expected to hit store shelves before Sprint launches services based on a multi-billion-dollar network upgrade it plans to kick off around mid-year.

The EVO 4G LTE will have much of the same technology HTC is putting into phones that rivals AT&T Inc and T-Mobile USA plan to sell, but Sprint is hoping that its popular EVO brand and some design changes will help make the device a hit. Fared Adib, Sprint's vice president for product development told Reuters that it made sense for Sprint to stick with the EVO brand as

the company has sold 7 million EVO devices in the roughly two years since its first launch.

The latest device, which customers will be able to pre-order for \$199.99 starting on 7 May, comes with a 4.7 inch display. It also comes with an 8 megapixel camera with features that are more often found in high-end cameras than smartphones. For example, the phone's camera can take multiple shots when the user presses a button once, a feature known as continuous shooting. It can also capture still photographs even when the camera is in video mode.—INTERNET

Print-your-own-robots developed in US

NEW YORK, 5 April — Printed-on-demand robots might be a reality before the end of the decade if a US-based project achieves its goals.

Researchers aim to build a desktop technology that would allow an average person to design and print a machine within 24 hours.

The team says that making it easier to create specialised robots could have a "profound impact on

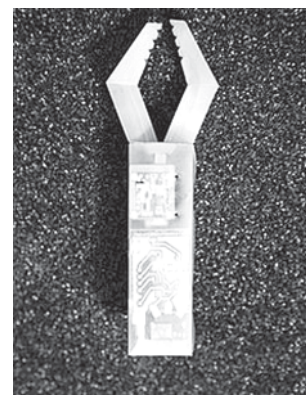
society". The effort is being funded by a \$10m (£6.3m) grant from the National Science Foundation.

The Virginia-based organization described the move as a "game changing investment". "It has the potential to democratise and personalise automation to meet the needs of individual users — whether for search and rescue workers in remote areas of the world or educators in classrooms around the US

— possibilities for social impact abound," said spokeswoman Lisa-Joy Zgorski. The five-year project involves robotics experts at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Harvard University and the University of Pennsylvania.

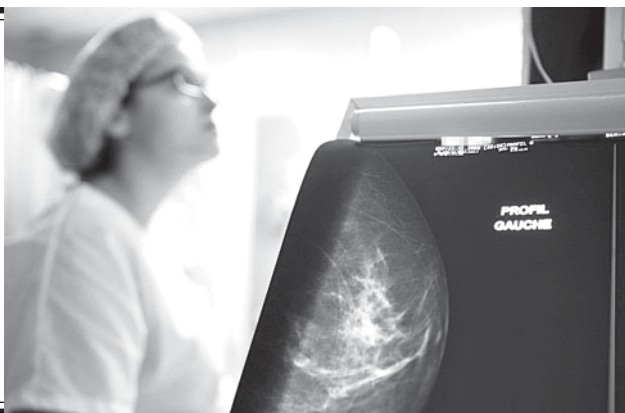
The team members admit it would be unrealistic to hope to have created a "universal robot-making machine" within that time limit.

Cancer diagnosis may raise odds for suicide, heart attack death

STOCKHOLMS, 5 April — When people learn they have cancer, they might face a heightened risk of suicide or a fatal heart attack in the days and weeks that follow, according to a large new study. Using nationwide census and death registry data that covered more than 6 million people over a 15-year period ending in 2006, Swedish researchers tabulated the suicides and cardiovascular fatalities among people with new cancer diagnoses and compared them to similar deaths in those without cancer. Suicide risk was more

than 12 times higher for people with cancer during the first week after diagnosis and nearly five times higher during the first three months, they found. Death from cardiovascular causes — particularly heart attack — was 5.6 times higher in the week after a cancer diagnosis and 3.3 times higher in the first month. Hard-to-treat cancers with poor odds for survival, including cancers of the esophagus, pancreas, liver, lung and central nervous system, were most common in these types of deaths, the researchers said.

“That the risk increase appeared so quickly after cancer diagnosis and then decreased in magnitude during the first year after diagnosis really illustrated the role of the diagnosis itself on these adverse outcomes,” said

study co-author Dr Katja Fall, a senior lecturer in epidemiology at the University of Orebro. “It largely argues against [death] from cancer treatment and progression that presumably take time to accumulate.” —INTERNET

LONDON, 5 April — There is no evidence that metal-on-metal hip replacements increase the risk of cancer, a study suggests. The new analysis of nearly 41,000 patients found no link in the

seven years following surgery, the *British Medical Journal* website reported. But the researchers — from the universities of Bristol and Exeter — said longer-term follow-up was needed.

Cancer risk was just one of the fears linked to the implants. Regulators have already called for them to be monitored closely following reports of high failure rates. Tiny metal ions made up of cobalt and chromium are thought to break off from the implants and leak into the blood, with fears that this leads to muscle and bone damage,

and neurological issues.

The data for this study, based on the National Joint Registry of England and Wales, covered 40,576 patients with metal-on-metal hip implants and 248,995 who had other types. The study found no evidence of an increased risk of any type of cancer in the patients. However, researchers said “as some cancers have a long latency period it is important that we study the longer-term outcomes and continue to investigate the effects of exposure to orthopaedic metals”.

Asia stocks fall as Europe debt woes flare anew

BANGKOK, 5 April — Asian stock markets fell Thursday after a weak Spanish bond auction inflamed concerns about the European debt crisis and hopes faded for more help for the US economy from the Federal Reserve. Japan's Nikkei 225 index fell 1 percent to 9,717.93, after hitting its lowest intraday point since 8 at 9 March, 692.70. Hong

Kong's Hang Seng tumbled 1.5 percent to 20,489.01 and South Korea's Kospi fell 0.8 percent to 2,002.69. Falling commodity prices dragged Australia's S&P/ASX 200 down 0.9 percent to 4,296.80.

The debt crisis in Europe flared anew Wednesday after a disappointing auction of government debt in Spain signaled investor confidence in the country's finances is weakening. The Dow Jones industrial average lost 125 points, and the price of gold plunged to its lowest level since January. That compounded worries that arose Tuesday, when minutes released from the March meeting of the US Federal Reserve's Open Market Committee gave no hint of a third round of bond purchases, dubbed quantitative easing III or QE3, to support the US economy. —INTERNET

LONDON, 5 April — Jaguar Land Rover is to build a successor to its previous sports cars called the F-type at its factory in Birmingham. It will launch as a two-seater convertible with petrol engines made at Jaguar's Castle Bromwich plant with the design to be unveiled this year, the carmaker said. As the iconic E-type was last made in 1975, Jaguar said it had been “absent for too long” from making sports cars.

The car will go on sale in mid-2013. Jaguar has previously described it as “the spiritual successor to the E-type”, which had its debut more than 50 years ago.

“The C-type, D-type and E-type Jaguars were all sports cars that held true to this principle in their era, and the F-type will hold true to that same principle in its time, a time that is soon to arrive,” said Ian Callum, Jaguar's director of design. The design

Yahoo to cut 2,000 more jobs in new redundancy round

LONDON, 5 April — Yahoo is to cut 2,000 staff, 14% of the workforce, the company has confirmed. The California-based company said the cuts were part of efforts to make it “smaller, nimbler, more profitable”. The web portal has 700 million users, but has failed to keep up with rival Google in the search engine business, while its popular webmail service has been overtaken by social media such as Facebook and Twitter.

Yahoo expects its cost-cutting programme to save \$375m (£236m) a year.

However, severance pay is expected to cost the company a one-off \$125m-145m. The affected employees will be notified later on Wednesday.

It is the struggling company's sixth round of redundancies in the last four years, with the latest announcement bringing the total to almost 6,000 jobs losses.

This is the biggest round yet - beating the 1,500 laid off in late 2008 in response to the recession. Yahoo has also changed its chief executive twice over in the same period, but has

as yet failed to turn around its fortunes. The company made a profit of \$1bn last year, down from \$1.2bn in 2010. More worryingly, revenues fell to \$5bn from \$6.3bn, at a time when rivals have seen rapid growth.

“You can't cut your way to revenue growth,” said analyst Colin Gillis of brokerage BGC Partners. “What people want to see out of Yahoo is they want to see a plan and provision for revenue growth.”

The firm said it would reveal more details of its new strategy when it releases its next set of results on 17 April.

“We are intensifying our efforts on our core businesses and redeploying resources to our most urgent priorities,” said Yahoo's current chief executive, Scott Thompson, who joined from PayPal three months ago.

He said it would move “aggressively” towards its goal of putting users and advertisers first.

“Today's actions are an important next step toward a bold, new Yahoo,” he added.

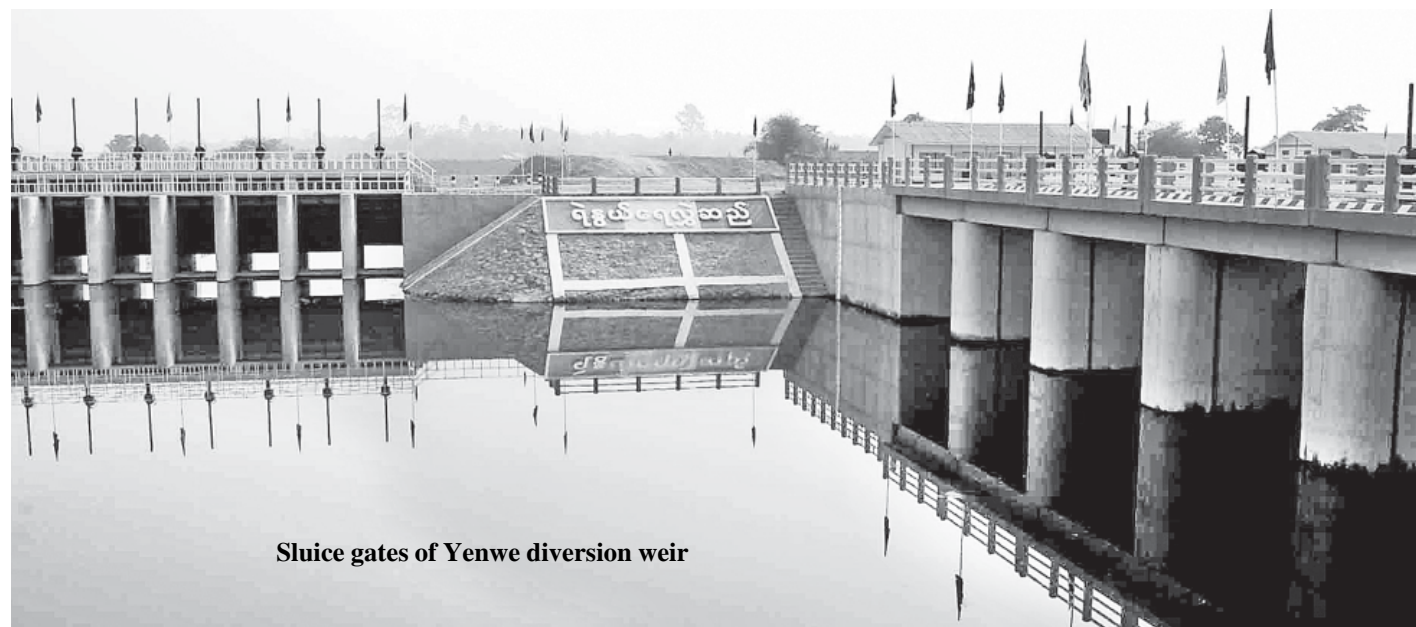

Police nab suspected top Guatemala drug trafficker

GUATEMALA CITY, 5 April — A leading drug trafficker who helped Mexico’s brutal Zetas drug cartel expand into Guatemala was arrested Tuesday and is facing extradition to the United States, authorities said. Horst Walther Overdick, 44, was captured during an operation to arrest Zetas operatives east of Guatemala’s capital, Interior Secretary Mauricio Lopez Bonilla told reporters.

The process of extraditing Overdick will

begin after he enters a plea to the trafficking charges against him in the US and Guatemala, attorney-general Claudia Paz y Paz said. Lopez Bonilla said Overdick, known as “The Tiger,” had worked for years to establish a cocaine-trafficking link between South America and Mexico, and was the primary ally of the Zetas in Peten, Izabal and Verapaces Provinces.

Overdick began as a trader in cardomom, a spice used in cooking, then used is knowledge of import and export routes to help the Zetas move cocaine to the United States.

Rescue in Llanddulas as cargo ship hits rocks

LONDON, 5 April — Seven crew members have been rescued from a stricken cargo ship that ran aground off the Conwy coast in rough seas. Two lifeboats and a helicopter were called at 20:30 BST on Tuesday after the ship hit a rock near a quarry jetty at Llanddulas, near Colwyn Bay. An operation to refloat the stricken vessel is expected to begin later. Concerns now are that the ship's fuel tanks may have been ruptured and pollution crews are on alert.

The Marine and Coastguard Agency (MCA) said the cargo ship was in one piece following the incident, but the fear was that it could begin to leak some of the 40,000 litres of fuel it is carrying. A Welsh Government spokesman said: "The Welsh Government is closely monitoring the emerging situation at Llanddulas. "We are being kept fully informed of developments." The RNLi said the vessel—thought to be a coaster, which used the jetty to load limestone — hit a rock on the breakwater at Llanddulas and ended up broadside on the shore.

It added that the Llandudno and Rhyl all-weather lifeboats

launched into a "full gale and rough seas" at 20:30 BST and arrived on scene by 21:00 BST. Five of the Polish crew were successfully rescued by midnight but two remained on board with a helicopter winchman after the rescue helicopter's winch broke. The A55 eastbound between junction 22 and junction 23 was closed from 22:00 BST to allow the helicopter to land and take-off. The 82m-long (269ft) ship was registered in Antigua and Barbuda.—Internet

Russian plane 'may have iced over before crashing'

Moscow, 5 April — Russian investigators have ruled out engine failure as the cause of an air crash which killed 31 people, amid reports the plane may have iced over. Twelve survivors are being treated in hospital after the disaster in Tyumen, western Siberia, when the plane crashed 40 seconds after take-off. The engines on the turboprop plane continued working right up until the moment of impact, investigators said.

The operator, UTair, has grounded its ATR 72-200 fleet

as a precaution. Company head Andrei Martirosov said the planes would not be used again until the investigation was completed, and cited "psychological" reasons for taking the decision. Built by a

French-Italian company, the ATR 72-200 which crashed had been in service 21 years.

Having made a preliminary analysis of the plane's flight recorders, the Moscow-based Interstate Aviation Committee (Mak) said on its website that the engines had been working "right up to the moment of ground impact". Following take-off, the plane climbed to roughly 210m (689ft) after which it listed first by 35 degrees to the right, then by more than 50 degrees to the left, at which point it crashed. There was no official comment on Press reports of the ice factor.—Internet

Indian Navy to deploy Russian nuclear submarine

NEW DELHI, 5 April — India is to formally commission a nuclear submarine into its navy, joining an elite group of nations with similar capabilities. The \$1bn (£630m) Russian-built *Nerpa* has been leased by the Indian navy for the next 10 years. It was handed over to India in

eastern Russia in January. India previously had a Soviet submarine but decommissioned it in 1991. It now rejoins China, Russia, the US, the UK and France as an operator of underwater nuclear vessels. India is also developing its own nuclear-powered submarine which is expected to be ready by the

end of this year. The 8,140-tonne *Akula II* submarine, the *K-152 Nerpa*, has been renamed by India as the *INS Chakra II*. The submarine will be formally commissioned into the navy by the country's Defence Minister, AK Antony, at a ceremony in Vishakhapatnam, on India's east coast off the Bay of Bengal on Wednesday morning.

The submarine set sail from the Russian port of Vladivostok 40 days ago and is now set to become the pride of the Indian navy, the BBC's Sanjoy Majumder reports from Vishakhapatnam. In keeping with international non-proliferation treaties, the submarine will not be equipped with nuclear weapons.—Internet

Dutch boy comes up with pizza-based euro solution

LONDON, 5 April — An 11-year-old Dutch boy has gone where many of the best economic minds in Europe have feared to tread and proposed a radical solution to the European single currency's problems—using a pizza as his inspiration. Jurje Hermans' entry in the 250,000 pounds (\$401,000) Wolfson Economics Prize, an international economics competition to find the "best contingency plan for a break-up of the euro" won special mention Tuesday from the judging panel.

Hermans, of Breedenbroek in the Netherlands, was 10 at the time he entered. He has been given a €100 (\$133) gift voucher for his efforts but failed to make the final short list of five proposals — which included reversing the process in which the euro was created and exiting the system over a weekend.

The 17-country single currency union has been placed under considerable strain by the crippling debt problems of some of its members. Greece recently managed to avoid a chaotic default on its debt — an event that could have destabilized the 17-country eurozone and the global economy — by negotiating a €170 billion (\$226 billion) bailout. If Greece had been forced into a disorderly default, one course of action would have been for it leave the euro and go back to its old currency, the drachma.

al-Qaeda 'could target UK youths'

LONDON, 5 April — British youths from African communities could become radicalised as al-Qaeda looks to Africa to build its strength, the Rusi think tank has suggested. It says such a development would pose new challenges for UK and other Western intelligence services. It warns of potential for new or greater radicalisation among British youths from the Somali and other east and west African communities. The government said it was tackling home-grown terrorist threats.

Radicalisation has already been seen during the past 15 years among some young members of the Pakistani, North African and Indian communities in Britain, the report published by the Royal United Services Institute suggests. Report author Valentina Soria said: "Most significant is the potential for radicalisation and then mobilisation of a new subset of

British youths." "The UK could soon be facing much greater radicalisation among the Somali minority and new radicalisation in some sections of other communities from east and west African countries."

This was because the "jihadist challenge" may be migrating across Saharan and Sub-Saharan Africa as the al-Qaeda leadership - weakened by the death of Osama Bin Laden - looks to partnerships to re-group and re-energise itself, the report says. Western intelligence services have acknowledged that the terror threat has changed and shifted, including into Africa, with Somalia a particular focus of concern.—Internet

Total to send expert team to assess gas leak soon

ABERDEEN, 5 April — France's Total plans to send a team of experts on Wednesday afternoon or Thursday morning to assess the steps needed to stop a large and potentially explosive gas leak at its North Sea Elgin platform, a spokesman said on Tuesday. Helicopter flights resumed carrying crews to North Sea oil and gas rigs on Tuesday afternoon, after adverse weather conditions offshore grounded traffic overnight, preventing the oil company from beginning its relief efforts on the platform.

Strong east to northeast winds are expected in the area on Wednesday evening and early on Thursday with a risk of gales, forecasters from the Met Office said, potentially

hampering relief efforts if conditions deteriorate further. "The team of engineers will be on a mission to assess conditions," Total's UK Public Affairs & Corporate Communications Manager Andrew Hogg said. Hogg said part of the mission would be to find out whether a so-called "well kill" was feasible through pumping mud into the well and whether any other measures would be necessary. Another, much more expensive option being pursued in parallel is to dig two relief wells to the source of the gas at 4,000 metres depth, far below the sea bed. Experts have said that this option could take up to six months to complete and could cost the company billions of dollars.—Reuters



Afghan police kill four Taleban militants, detain 28

KABUL, 5 April—Afghan police have killed four Taleban militants and captured 28 others over the past 24 hours during series of operations across the country, Interior Ministry said in a press release.

“During the operations, conducted in several provinces including the southern Kandahar, Helmand, Zabul and the eastern Nangarhar and

Laghman provinces, four Taleban rebels have been killed, one injured and 28 others made captive,” the press release said.

A number of arms and ammunitions, including 17 pistols and 19 anti-personnel and anti-vehicle mines were also seized, it said. However, it did not say if there were any casualties on the police. Taleban militants have yet to make comment. —Xinhua

Six bodies were retrieved from under the rubble, another died on the way to hospital while the eighth died in hospital,”

“We do not believe that there are any more bodies here,” the head of the Kenyan disaster management service Vincent Anami said.

‘Winning’ ticket in Mega Millions jackpot sparks row

NEW YORK, 5 April — A US woman claims to have one of three winning lottery tickets from a \$640m (£403m) jackpot, but her colleagues say it would be part of their syndicate. A lawyer for Maryland woman Mirlande Wilson said in a news conference he had not seen the ticket, but added he was preparing for any challenges. Ms Wilson told the *New York Post* she hid the winning ticket somewhere at the Baltimore McDonald’s where she works.

Maryland officials say no-one has come forward to claim the prize. Lottery officials have called a press conference on Thursday to discuss the status of the Maryland winning ticket. Ms Wilson spoke little during Wednesday’s Press conference but Edward Smith Jr, her lawyer, asked for reporters staking out her house to leave the 37-year-old woman alone. “Let’s be human about this,” Mr Smith said, adding Ms Wilson’s blood pressure had risen because of the attention.

“It’s just money, people.”

Three tickets - one in Maryland, one in Kansas and one in Illinois - matched the numbers drawn last week in the Mega Millions jackpot, the largest single prize in the world. According to the *Post*, the boss of the McDonald’s outlet gave Ms Wilson money to buy extra tickets for a group pool on Friday. She says she bought those tickets, but also some for herself and that the winning ticket came from the latter set.

“We had a group plan, but I went and played by myself,” she told the *Post*. One of 15 members of the lottery syndicate, Suleiman Osman Husein, says the group does not believe her. “We each paid \$5. She took everybody’s money!” he told the *Post*. Mr Smith said the mother of seven had been thrust into the spotlight by her colleague’s accusations, and that he himself had no idea if the ticket was legitimate.— Internet

Spiced chickpea recipe from Cookbook of the Year ‘Tasting India’

CANBERRA, 5 April—An Aussie chef’s cookbook chronicling her gastronomic journey through India was named the Cookbook of the Year at the International Association of Culinary Professionals Awards in New York this week.

Christine Manfield became the first Aussie chef to take home the coveted title for her book *Tasting India*, which features 250 recipes of authentic recipes from all the

regions of the country. The 26th annual IACP awards recognize the best in English-language cookbooks and food publications. Here’s a sample recipe from the book, courtesy of Manfield.

Punjabi Spiced Chickpeas

SERVES 6

Typical of north-west frontier cuisine, this is a wonderful dish to serve with grilled or barbecued meat. I sometimes serve it with roasted chicken that I have

rubbed with similar spices to complement the chickpeas.

I use dried chickpeas from Indian suppliers; they are smaller and slightly darker than some other varieties.

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 12 curry leaves
- 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 onion, finely diced
- 6 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 teaspoons minced ginger
- 2 small green chillies, sliced
- 2 ripe tomatoes, peeled and diced
- 100 g thick plain yoghurt
- 300 g cooked chickpeas, drained
- 1 teaspoon Chat Masala, a spice mix that typically consists of amchoor or dried mango powder, cumin, kala namak or black salt, coriander and dried ginger.
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons pomegranate seeds
- 2 tablespoons chopped coriander leaves
- Heat the oil in a heavy-

based frying pan and fry the curry leaves and cumin for 30 seconds over a medium heat until fragrant. Add the onion, garlic, ginger and chili and gently fry until starting to colour. Stir in the tomato and any juice and bring to simmering point. Add the yoghurt and chickpeas and cook for 4-5 minutes until heated through.

• Remove from the heat and stir in the chat masala, salt, lemon juice and pomegranate seeds. Taste and adjust the seasoning if necessary.

Sprinkle with the fresh coriander to serve.

82 snakes released after winter in cooler

Animal rescuers in the Chicago area said dozens of brown and garter snakes have been released after spending the winter in a wine chiller.

Rob Carmichael, director of the Lake Forest Wildlife Discovery Center, said the 82 snakes were found hibernating underneath old tracks near the decommissioned Zion nuclear power plant and were removed before work crews came in to repair the tracks, the *Chicago Tribune* reported Tuesday.

Carmichael said the snakes, which were discovered by a high school teacher in December, would have been exposed to freezing temperatures and possible death if they had not been removed before the scheduled repair work.

The reptiles were kept in a donated wine chiller at the Lake Forest Wildlife Discovery Centre for the duration of the winter and are now being released into a newly created habitat at Illinois Beach State Park.

"We hope these snakes will recognize this as their new home," Carmichael said.

Colo court won't accept coins as payment

A Colorado court has refused to let a college student pay a speeding ticket with coins, even though there is a coin-counting machine on premises. Fort Collins municipal court workers said it would take too much time to count the coins Ted Nischan brought in to pay his \$160 speeding ticket, *The Coloradoan* reported on Wednesday.

"It's not prudent use of taxpayer funds to have one of the clerks sit there counting quarters, nickels and pennies," municipal court supervisor Fran Seaworth said.

Nischan said he didn't understand why the court wouldn't accept legal tender for his ticket, which he said he couldn't afford to pay with funds from his bank account after paying rent. "This is what I've got," Nischan said Tuesday at a court hearing. "Please take it. It's real money."

Cannes festival left fuming by April Fool's line-up

PARIS, 5 April—A French blog has admitted to posting a bogus line-up for next month's Cannes Film Festival, saying it was tricked by an April Fool's prank that left the organisers of the Riviera showcase fuming.

"It was an April Fool's stunt played by a couple of jokers," the festival's general delegate Thierry Fremaux,

who is tasked with choosing films to compete in the 16 to 27 May festival, told *AFP* late Tuesday. "Everything they said is false—simply because the line-up hasn't been decided yet," he said, confirming that the films in the running would be unveiled as planned at an 19 April Press conference.

"I am stunned to see how easily some media let themselves be tricked." The 24 films on the fake list—which was widely picked up on Twitter and movie-watching websites—included Wes Anderson's already announced Cannes opening film "Moonrise Kingdom", David Cronenberg's "Cosmopolis" starring Robert Pattinson, and Jacques Audiard's "Rust and Bone" with Marion Cotillard.

Kagawa planning Premier League switch

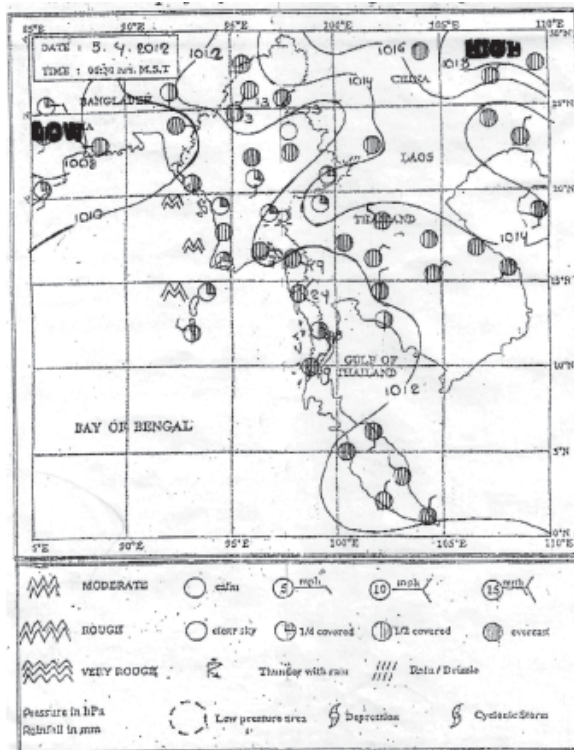

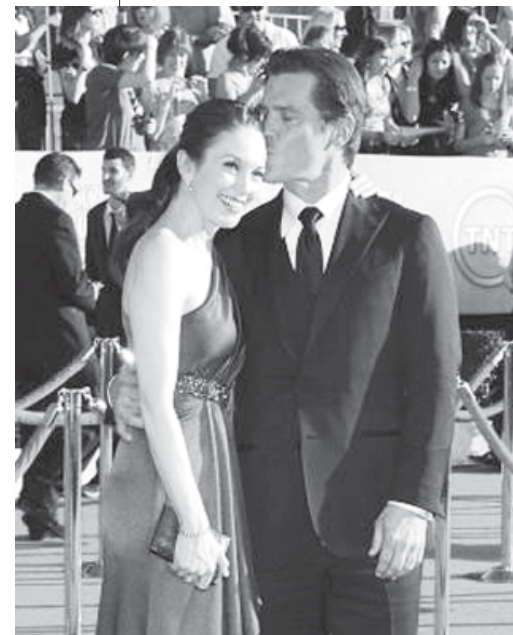
