UN uses HDI which is a composite statistic used to rank countries by level of human development. UNDP has been publishing Human Development Report (HDR) for the world countries annually since 1990.

The HDR includes the Human Development Index (HDI) which is a comparative measure of life expectancy, literacy, education, and standards of living for countries worldwide. According to the UNDP's report, it is observed that HDI of Myanmar is low compared to other ASEAN countries. So, Myanmar still is below the chart. We must accept actual condition. Only when departments concerned publish actual figures, will the government know which sectors of the country are weak and develop. Then, the government could put more emphasis on much weaker sectors in its attempt to develop country.

Suicide attacks kill 19 in Afghanistan

HERAT, 10 April—Suicide bombers killed at least nineteen people in attacks across Afghanistan on Tuesday, including 11 Afghan police, as insurgents ramped up violence ahead of the traditional summer fighting months.

Two bombers, including one wearing a head-to-toe covering burqa, blew up a car laden with explosives on the airport road outside the western city of Herat, killing eight civilians and three police, provincial governor spokesman Mohiddin Noori said.

Twenty-three people were wounded in the attack, which took place in a usually

peaceful part of the country near the border with Iran.

In volatile southern Helmand province, three suicide attackers targeted the district governor's office in Musa Qala district, killing eight police. Two of the bombers were shot dead, but one managed to detonate explosives.

"The first one opened fire on Afghan police. In response he was killed by our forces, while the second one detonated himself and police killed the third," said Dawood Ahmadi, spokesman for the Helmand provincial governor.

A NATO spokesman on Monday said insurgents had

so far shown no sign of planning a repeat of last year's unified spring offensive against foreign and Afghan forces, preferring isolated attacks on small units and bases.

US should lead to end World Bank tradition: Nigerian finance minister

WASHINGTON, 10 April—The United States should take the lead and break the long tradition of an American always heading the World Bank, Nigerian finance minister and a nominee for the top post Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala said on Monday. Speaking after a "marathon" three-and-a-half-hour interview by the World Bank board, Okonjo-Iweala said the decision on who leads the global development institution should go to the candidate with the best skills for the job.

During her interview with the board, Okonjo-Iweala said she did not ask for the support of countries but pressed them to ensure that the selection process was open and merit based. Under an informal agreement between the United States and Europe, an American has always headed the World Bank and a European has led the International Monetary Fund since their founding after World War Two. Rising economic powers such as China, India and Brazil have

called for an end to the long-standing tradition and are demanding more influence in global finance institutions.

Okonjo-Iweala, who left a top post at the World Bank last year for a second stint as Nigeria's finance minister, is up against former Colombian finance minister Jose Antonio Ocampo and US nominee Korean-American health expert Jim Yong Kim. Ocampo and Kim are set to be interviewed by the 25-member World Bank board on Tuesday and Wednesday respectively.

It is the first time that candidates from developing countries have challenged Washington for the top post.

"Somebody has to break this" agreement, Okonjo-Iweala told an event hosted by the Centre for Global Development and *Washington Post*. "Therefore, who is the leader in this world? The US is looked on for that leadership," she added. The board is set to decide through consensus on a new president of the World Bank on 16 April. Kim is likely to succeed Robert Zoellick as World Bank president given the US's large voting bloc and support by European allies.—Reuters

US Navy deploys 2nd aircraft carrier to Gulf

DUBAI, 10 April—The US Navy said on Monday it has deployed a second aircraft carrier to the Persian Gulf Region amid rising tensions with Iran over its disputed nuclear programme. The deployment of the nuclear-powered *USS Enterprise* along with the Abraham Lincoln carrier strike group marks one of the few times the Navy has had two aircraft carriers operating in waters near the Persian Gulf, said Cmdr Amy Derrick-Frost of the Bahrain-based 5th Fleet.

The two carriers will support the American military operations in Afghanistan and anti-piracy efforts off Somalia's coast and in the Gulf of Aden, she said. The warships also patrol the Gulf's strategic oil routes that Iran has threatened to shut down

in retaliation for economic sanctions slapped on the Islamic Republic because of its nuclear programme, which the West suspects aims to develop nuclear weapons. Iran denies the allegations, and says its programme is solely for peaceful purposes.

The deployment of a second aircraft carrier is "routine and not specific to any threat," Derrick-Frost said. She did not say how long the Navy will keep the increased military presence in region. The US had two carriers operating in the region in June 2010. Two carriers were also deployed in March 2003 during the US led invasion of Iraq and in February 2007 in support of wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. The *Enterprise* is based in Norfolk, Va. It was the Navy's first nuclear-

powered aircraft carrier and is now on its last mission. The *Enterprise* was commissioned in November 1961. The carrier is scheduled to be deactivated this fall.—Internet

March's heat melts records

WASHINGTON, 10 April—You likely felt it, but now it's official that March 2012 was the warmest March on record for the lower 48 states, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The average temperature of 51.1 degrees Fahrenheit broke the previous record set in 1910 by 0.5 degrees and was 8.6 degrees above average. According to NOAA's preliminary data, more than 15,200 record high temperatures were set for March and all 50 states broke at least one record.

March wasn't the only month that brought the heat. The average temperature of the contiguous United States for the first three months of 2012 was six degrees above normal, NOAA announced. The period from January through March for 2012 broke the previous first quarter record by 1.4 degrees. Weather records are normally beaten by tenths of a degree. While the warm temperatures made winter more tolerable, it worried scientists.

"Everybody has this uneasy feeling. This is weird. This is not good," said Jerry Meehl, a climate scientist at the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, Colo. "It's a guilty pleasure. You're out enjoying this nice March weather, but you know it's not a good thing." The warm weather created favorable conditions for tornadoes and according to NOAA there were 223 preliminary tornado reports this March compared to an annual average of 80. While individual events cannot be cited as examples of climate change, climate scientists said extreme temperatures and weather events will become more frequent as a result of man-made climate change.

Chile navy rescues four from Antarctic ship

SANTIAGO, 10 April—Four Brazilians filming a documentary off the Antarctic coast were rescued by the Chilean navy after their ship became stuck in the ice, Chilean media said on Monday. Officials told the daily *El Mercurio* that the four Brazilians were safe and sound after their vessel *Mar Sem Fim* (*Endless Sea*) was trapped in icy, windy conditions near the Chilean Antarctic naval base.

The boat capsized in 100-kilometre (60 mile) per hour winds on Saturday near the Chilean base, about 1,200 kilometres (750 miles) south

of tip of South America, said the head of Chilean base in Antarctica, Eduardo Rubilar. The ship was carrying four Brazilians filming on a documentary about navigation and the landscape of Antarctica.

Joao Lara, journalist and leader of the Brazilian expedition, praised the navy for the "risky maneuver" and

said "they handled the situation in a controlled manner when the wind was very strong." The Brazilians were taken to the southern Chilean port of Punta Arenas. Chilean officials said it will monitor the area for a possible oil leak and will attempt to refloat the vessel in the summer season.

Japan sees nuclear contingency plans soon, before restarts

TOKYO, 10 April—Japan's government will announce soon its contingency plans for dealing with nuclear accidents to ease public concerns about restarting reactors closed since the Fukushima radiation crisis last year, Trade Minister Yukio Edano said on Monday. Contingency plans for Kansai Electric Power Co's two reactors, which are at the most advanced stage in the government's safety checks before restarting, would be announced in a few days, said Edano, who also has the energy portfolio.

The government, which has demanded a series of safety measures on all nuclear generators since the disaster last March, is also keen to see the public accept the idea of restarting the first two reactors. But it also wants to avoid power shortages this summer, when demand peaks. Osaka-based Kansai is the country's most nuclear-reliant regional power utility.

"I understand this is now a major concern of people and the most important point in case there were a severe accident," said Edano, referring to the government's improved contingency plans. "There is a possibility for any idled reactors, whether they are running or offline, to suffer from a severe accident as long as active nuclear fuels are located," he told reporters.

Fungus behind bat die-off came from Europe

LOS ANGELES, 10 April — The mysterious deaths of millions of bats in the United States and Canada over the past several years were caused by a fungus that hitchhiked from Europe, scientists reported on Monday. Experts had suspected that an invasive species was to blame for the die-off from “white nose syndrome.” Now there’s direct evidence the culprit was not native to North America. The fungal illness has not caused widespread

deaths among European bats unlike in the US and Canada. In North America more than 5.7 million bats have died since 2006 when white nose syndrome was first detected in a cave in upstate New York. The disease does not pose a threat to humans, but people can carry fungal spores. It’s unclear exactly how the fungus crossed the Atlantic, but one possibility is that it was accidentally introduced by tourists. Spores are known to stick to people’s clothes, boots and caving gear. White

nose syndrome has killed bats in four Canadian provinces and 19 US states, mostly in the Northeast and South. Last week, the illness marched west of the Mississippi River, infecting bats in Missouri. Now that scientists have pinpointed the apparent origin of the epidemic, what can be done to protect bats? They play a crucial role in the ecological food chain by devouring insects. “There is still not much we can do beyond making absolutely sure we don’t make things

were by accidentally spreading the fungus,” said biologist Craig Willis of the University of Winnipeg in Canada. Willis and a team of

US-Canadian scientists set out to determine whether the fungus behind white nose syndrome was native to this continent or invaded from

abroad. To do this, they collected 54 little brown bats from an uninfected cave in Manitoba.

Deadly March tornadoes are first billion-dollar disaster of 2012

WASHINGTON, 10 April — A swarm of tornadoes that tore through the Midwest and Southeast in early March has earned the grim title of the nation’s first billion-dollar weather disaster of 2012. From 2 March through the early hours of 3 March, 132 tornadoes were reported across nine states. Although those numbers are preliminary, and will undoubtedly decrease once overlapping reports are eliminated, their aftermath was devastating, causing more than \$1.5 billion in damage and killing 40 people. The storms killed four

people in Ohio, but they took the greatest toll in Indiana, killing 13, and Kentucky, where 23 people died. The costly disaster follows on the heels of a record-breaking year for devastation wrought by the vagaries of the weather and longer-term climate conditions. Last year, the United States experienced 14 separate events that caused \$1 billion or more in damage. Five of those events were tornado outbreaks. Last year’s costliest weather disaster was the late April 2011 tornado outbreak, which produced an estimated

343 tornadoes across Midwestern and southern states, killing 321 people and causing some \$10.2 billion in damage. [The Top 5 Deadliest Tornado Years in US History] This year’s early March tornado outbreak was significant for a number of reasons, according to Jake Crouch, a climatologist with the National Climatic Data Centre (NCDC), and co-author of a new State of the Climate report from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration released on 9 April.

Niceness is in your DNA, scientists find

WASHINGTON, 10 April — Many times, two siblings raised by the same parents, and subject to similar environmental influences, can turn out to be polar opposites: one kind and generous, the other mean-spirited. A new study reveals that the latter might simply have been dealt the wrong hormone receptor genes.

Oxytocin and vasopressin, two hormones that inspire feelings of love and generosity when they flood our brains, bind to neurons by attaching to molecules called receptors, which can come in different forms. The new research, led

by psychologist Michel Poulin of the University of Buffalo, suggests that if you have the genes that give you certain versions of those hormone receptors, you’re more likely to be a nice person than if you have the genes for one of the other versions. However, the researchers found that the genes work in concert with a person’s upbringing and life experiences to determine how sociable — or anti-social — he or she becomes.

As detailed in a new article in the journal

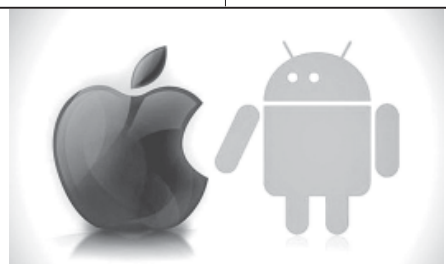
Psychological Science, hundreds of people were surveyed about their attitudes toward civic duty, their charitable activities and their worldview. They were asked, for example, whether people have an obligation to report crimes, sit on juries or pay taxes, whether they themselves engage in charitable activities such as giving blood or volunteering, and whether people — and the world as a whole — are basically good, or are threatening and dangerous.

Google makes more money from iOS than Android

WASHINGTON, 10 April — It seems Google makes more money from Apple’s mobile devices than its own Android smartphones and tablets, thanks to the use of Google’s search products by those devices. The story comes by way of PC World, which cites a story from *The Guardian* looking at documents filed in Google’s court case with Oracle. In that case, Google revealed that it has made less than \$543 million from Android devices between 2008 and December 2011, and that’s almost four times as much revenue has come from iOS devices.

The reason for that discrepancy is that Google doesn’t make its money off Android, per se, but off the products it provides that mobile device owners use. Android gets licensed out to smartphone makers for free — that’s part of what makes it so appealing and its use so widespread — and Google collects 30 percent of app sales and advertising on those



devices. Meanwhile, on iOS, Google makes money through advertising on the use of search in Mobile Safari or ads used on Google Maps, for example, and it doesn’t have to split that money with anyone.

Horace Dediu of Asymco reckons Google’s take from iOS devices might be even higher than what *The Guardian* guesses at, figuring that Google could be making five times as much per iOS device as compared to Android. — Internet

Warning over medical implant attacks

LONDON, 10 April — Many medical implants are vulnerable to attacks that could threaten their users’ lives, according to studies. Security researchers have developed attacks that locate and compromise implants used to manage conditions such as diabetes and heart disease. One attack caught a radio signal that, if re-broadcast, would have switched off a heart defibrillator. Researchers say more work needs to be done to secure implants and protect against malicious actions.

For increasing numbers of people an active life is only possible thanks to a medical implant that monitors their vital signs and which intervenes when needed. Pacemakers that regulate heart beats, pumps that deliver insulin and defibrillators that watch for abnormal cardiac rhythms are being fitted to many more people to help them manage these chronic conditions. Barnaby Jack, a researcher at security firm McAfee, has discovered that the wireless links used to interrogate and update these devices left them open to attack. In two weeks of work he found a way to scan for and compromise insulin pumps that communicate wirelessly. “We can influence any pump within a 300ft [91m] range,” Mr Jack told the BBC. “We can make that pump dispense its entire 300 unit reservoir of insulin and we can do that without requiring its ID number.” Mr Jack said diabetics typically needed a dose of 5-10 units of insulin after a heavy meal to help regulate blood sugar. Making the device empty its cartridge into a host’s bloodstream would cause “deep trouble”.

Microsoft deal with AOL part of patent scramble

NEW YORK, 10 April — AOL’s \$1 billion deal to sell and license patents to Microsoft is another in a series of “Antiques

Roadshow” moments in the technology world. Faded companies have been rummaging through their assets recently, and some of them have found musty old patents that turn out to be worth a great deal.

Patents have become a hot commodity in recent years. They give the holder the exclusive right to use certain technologies or business processes in the US. Companies such as Microsoft, Apple, Facebook, Google and others are collecting large patent libraries and increasingly using them in lawsuits — to defend their businesses or to attack rivals.

A valuable patent is less like a forgotten Rembrandt and more like a rusty-but-serviceable gun. “Patents have become legal weapons. They’re not representing ideas anymore,” says James Bessen, a lecturer at Boston University and the director of a nonprofit that studies patent issues.

Two big deals in the past year have pushed patents into the spotlight. In July, a consortium that included Apple Inc and Microsoft Corp pledged to pay \$4.5 billion for a collection of patents from Nortel Networks, a bankrupt Canadian maker of telecommunications equipment. — Internet

Obesity in pregnancy linked to autism

WASHINGTON, 10 April — Mothers who are obese or have diabetes during pregnancy may be more likely to have babies with autism or other developmental delays, said a US study published on Monday. The findings “appear to raise serious public health concerns,” said the study in the journal *Pediatrics*, which comes amid an obesity epidemic in the United States with recent research showing autism strikes up to one in 88 children. Researchers examined 1,004 mother-child pairs from diverse backgrounds in California — about half of the children had autism, while 172 had other developmental problems and 315 were considered normal.

While the study did not say whether the mother’s weight or diabetic status caused the children’s developmental problems, it did find strong associations between the likelihood of such ailments and the mother’s health in pregnancy. For instance, mothers who were obese were about 67 percent more likely to have a child with autism and more than twice as likely to have a child with some kind of disorder than normal-weight moms without diabetes.

More than 20 percent of the mothers of children with autism or other developmental disability were obese. Just 14

percent of the mothers of normally developing children were obese at the time of pregnancy, it said. Also, the autistic children of diabetic moms appeared to have more severe disabilities — with greater deficits in language and communication skills — than the autistic children of normal-weight moms.

Climate change could be tough on seniors’ health

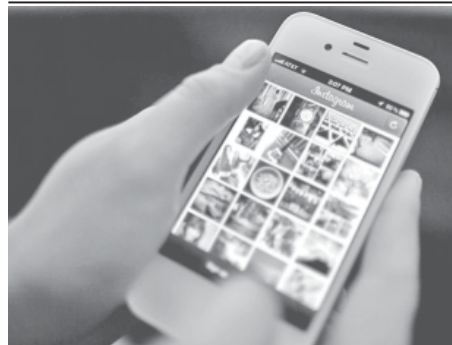
WASHINGTON, 10 April — Even small swings in temperatures could put elderly people with chronic illnesses such as diabetes, heart failure and lung disease at greater risk of death throughout the coming summer, a new study indicates. Researchers from the Harvard School of Public Health in Boston found temperature fluctuations related to climate change could claim thousands of lives every year.

Experts predict climate change could increase variations in summer temperatures, particularly in the mid-Atlantic states and in parts of France, Spain and Italy. In these more volatile regions, this could pose a serious public health risk, the study authors claimed. “The effect of temperature patterns on long-term mortality has not been clear to this point. We found that, independent of heat waves, high day-to-day

variability in summer temperatures shortens life expectancy,” study author Antonella Zanobetti, a senior research scientist in the department of environmental health at Harvard, said in a news release from the university. “This variability can be harmful for susceptible people.” Using Medicare data from 1985 to 2006, the researchers tracked the long-term health of 3.7 million chronically ill people older

than 65 living in 135 American cities. After considering each person’s individual risk factors, they determined if any of these people died due to variability in summer temperature. The study, published in the 9 April online edition of the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, revealed that years with larger summer temperature swings had higher death rates than those with smaller swings. This was true for each city examined. — Internet

Facebook buying photo-share app Instagram for \$1b

NEW YORK, 10 April — Facebook is spending \$1 billion to buy the photo-sharing company Instagram in the social network’s largest acquisition ever. On the surface, that’s a huge sum for a tiny startup that has a handful of employees and no way to make money. But the lack of a business model rarely dampens excitement about hot tech upshots these days. As Facebook has shown, itself without ads or revenue in its early days, money goes where the users are.

Instagram lets people share photos they snap with their mobile devices. The app has filters that can make photos look as if they’ve been taken in the 1970s or on Polaroid cameras. Its users

take photos of everything from their breakfast egg sandwiches to sunsets to the smiling faces of their girlfriends. In a little more than a year, Instagram attracted a loyal and loving user base of more than 30 million people. Apple picked it as the iPhone App of the Year in 2011.

Instagram’s fans, brand recognition and its potential are difficult to put a price tag on. Yet Facebook has — and can afford it. The company is preparing for an initial public offering of stock that could value it at as much as \$100 billion in a few weeks. What’s \$1 billion? A drop in the bucket, really. “Facebook

after this IPO is going to be in a position to be predatory. They can make sure no one steps in their way and buy anyone who gets in their way,” said Wedbush analyst Michael Pachter, who follows social media.

Buying Instagram, he added, not only eliminates a rival but gives Facebook the technology “that is gaining crazy traction.”

Facebook is paying cash and stock for San Francisco-based Instagram and hiring its dozen or so employees. The deal is expected to close by the end of June.

Omega-3 supplements no help against repeat heart trouble

WASHINGTON, 10 April — Taking omega-3 fatty acid supplements won’t protect against repeat heart attacks, strokes or other cardiovascular problems, a new analysis indicates. “I was not surprised at these findings because I assumed that there was no benefit of omega-3 supplements,” said lead researcher Dr Seung-Kwon Myung, chief of the carcinogenesis branch of the National Cancer Centre, Republic of Korea. The study is published online 9 April in the *Archives of Internal Medicine*. Instead of taking supplements, people trying to prevent heart disease or repeat problems should eat oily fish such as salmon, tuna and mackerel, which are all rich in omega-3 fatty acids, Myung said.

“It is effective against cardiovascular disease to eat fish rich in omega-3 fatty acids, not supplements,” he said. Many studies have demonstrated that eating fatty fish two or more times a week is linked with a lower risk of death from cardiovascular disease. However, studies that looked at the potential cardiovascular benefits of fish oil supplements have

produced mixed results. Myung and his colleagues selected 14 studies that had been published in the medical literature. In all, the studies looked at more than 20,000 patients who had a history of cardiovascular disease.

The patients’ average age was 63. Nearly 80 percent were men. The studies were published between 1995 and 2010. The daily dose of omega-3 fatty acid supplement ranged from about half a gram to nearly 5 grams a day. The follow-up period ranged from one year to nearly five years.

Myung’s team looked to see if the supplements made a difference in sudden cardiac death, heart attack, congestive heart failure, death from any cause, stroke or transient ischemic attacks (often called TIAs or mini-strokes). The supplements did not reduce the risk of any of those problems. The researchers did find a small reduction in cardiovascular death risk.

AT&T sells Yellow Pages for close to \$1b

WASHINGTON, 10 April — US telecom giant AT&T has sold the Yellow Pages to a private equity firm for \$950m (£600m). AT&T shares fell 0.7% after it sold the local listings business to Cerberus Capital Management, which once owned US carmaker Chrysler. The sale includes 1,200 Real Yellow Pages print titles — which reach 150 million US homes — as well as YP.com.

The Yellow Pages business units generated about \$3.3b in revenues in 2011. As part of the deal, AT&T will get a 47% stake in the new entity, YP Holdings. “It enables AT&T to focus on its core strategy of leadership in wireless, IP,

cloud- and application-based services,” said Jose Gutierrez, president of AT&T Advertising Solutions.

“At the same time, it gives our advertising customers, partners and developers continued access to strong advertising and

search innovation and performance.” The deal includes assets of AT&T Advertising Solutions, which delivers sales and customer support, and AT&T Interactive, and is expected to be closed by the middle of the year. — Internet

Carriers agree to disable stolen phones for good

WASHINGTON, 10 April — Cellphone companies and the government are trying to make it as difficult to use a stolen cellphone as it is to sell a stolen car. US Sen Charles Schumer said in a statement late Monday that major cellphone carriers and the Federal Communications Commission have agreed to set up a database of identification numbers that are unique to each phone.

Using the list, cellular carriers will be able to permanently disable a phone

once it’s been reported stolen. Until now, US carriers have only been disabling so-called “SIM” cards, which can be swapped in and out. That’s enabled a black market to exist for stolen phones. Schumer said that the goal of the agreement is to make a stolen cellphone “as worthless as an empty wallet.”

He has said that unique ID numbers known as International Mobile Equipment Identity numbers are already effectively used in Europe to deter stealing.

Schumer also said he will introduce legislation to make it a federal crime to alter or tamper with a phone’s IMEI number. According to New York police, 42 percent of all property crimes of individuals in New York City in 2011 involved a cell phone, and some crimes have been accompanied by violence. Both iPhones and Android phones use SIM card technology that makes them susceptible to being resold after thefts.

Thai king leaves hospital for cousin's funeral

BANGKOK, 10 April — Thailand's frail king left the hospital where he has been staying for more than two years on Monday for a rare public appearance at the funeral of his cousin, King Bhumibol Adulyadej, the world's longest reigning monarch, left Siriraj hospital in a wheelchair, wearing the customary white royal uniform and a black armband for the memorial rites of Princess Bejaratana Rajasuda.

Together with his wife Queen Sirikit, he lit candles and incense at a specially constructed royal crematorium at the Sanam Luang ceremonial ground in

Bangkok's historic district attended by saffron-robed monks and top officials including Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra. The monarch, now 84, was admitted to hospital in September 2009 to be treated for a respiratory condition and has rarely left, aside from a few public appearances. He was due to return to hospital after the funeral.

Princess Bejaratana, the only child of late King Vajiravudh, died in July 2011 from a blood infection at the age of 85 and had lain in state since then at the Dusit Maha Prasat Throne Hall in the Grand Palace. Her remains were transported in a large

golden urn atop a gilded teak chariot pulled by more than 200 men in one of three processions ahead of her cremation due to be held later Monday, which was declared a special holiday.

Yemen: 64 killed in clashes with al-Qaeda fighters

SANAA, 10 April — An al-Qaeda attack on a Yemeni army post in the south set off clashes that left 64 people dead on Monday and prompted local civilians to take up arms alongside the military to beat back the militants, said army officials and residents. The dawn attack is the latest in a series of bloody battles in recent months that mark an escalation in al-Qaeda's efforts to expand its control around a swath of land it seized last year. The group took advantage of the country's political turmoil to overrun cities and towns in southern Yemen.

The militant movement appears to be on the offensive, assaulting and sometimes overrunning army positions, although it also suffers reverses. The officials said this latest assault fell on an outpost in the town of Lawder in Abyan Province, some 155 miles (250 kilometres) southeast of the capital of Sanaa. Residents and military officials said 40 militants were killed in the clashes. Additionally, 18 soldiers, including a colonel, were killed battling the militants, officials said. Six civilians allied with the army were also reported killed.

Yemen's military in the south, poorly equipped and low on morale after a series of defeats, has not been able to fight the group and its supporters alone. In cities like Lawder, residents have become fed up with the government's inability to protect them and, in a country where tribes possess weapons, have taken up arms to protect themselves.—Internet

Ex-rebel held in Philippine blasts

MANILA, 10 April — Philippine police have arrested a former Muslim rebel in connection with bomb blasts that wounded three people on the tourist island of Palawan, an official said on Monday. Two devices went off nearly simultaneously outside a hotel in the El Nido beach resort and outside a bus depot in the provincial capital Puerto Princesa on Thursday. Suspect Hiya Hassan was arrested Sunday after allegedly sending a threatening text message to the bus company that was hit, Palawan police chief Abad Osit told reporters.

Hassan's 14-year-old daughter, who owned the mobile phone used, was also initially detained but had since been released without charge, Osit said. "He's a former MILF who later returned to the fold of the law," Osit said of Hassan, referring to the Moro Islamic Liberation Front, the largest Muslim guerrilla group in the southern Philippines. Police would file charges of attempted murder for the bombings, as well as for making grave threats against one of the bombed establishments, Osit said. "He sent a message to the effect that, 'If you persist, there will be more of the same'," Osit said. He did not disclose what Hassan was allegedly demanding.

Police have not found any threats sent to the hotel that was bombed but investigators are treating it as a related case, he added. "The IEDs (improvised explosive devices) that we detected in the debris recovered from the scenes were similar and appear to have come from the same source," Osit said. The blasts wounded a hotel cook in El Nido as well as a rickshaw driver and his female passenger in the provincial capital Puerto Princesa, about 175 kilometres (110 miles) away. Palawan is a major Philippine tourist draw with its beaches and spectacular rock formations.—Internet

Police say Tulsa shooting suspects confessed

OKLAHOMA CITY, 10 April — Two white men accused of shooting five black people in Tulsa, Oklahoma, killing three of them, have confessed to authorities, media reports said on Monday, citing police and court documents. Jake England, 19, has admitted to police that he shot three of the victims and Alvin Watts, 33, has said that he shot two others, a Tulsa police spokesman told the *New York Times*. Three men and a woman were shot within a mile of each other in north Tulsa before dawn on Friday, police said. The body of a fifth victim was discovered outside a nearby funeral

home in the predominantly black part of the city the same morning.

Police have described the shootings during the predawn hours of Friday as random because there is no evidence the suspects knew any of the victims. One witness said the gunman simply pulled his pickup truck to the side of the street and asked for directions before he opened fire. England and Watts were arrested on Sunday in the shooting spree, which left residents on edge and prompted an intensive manhunt across Tulsa and surrounding areas.—Reuters

Titanic memorial cruise delayed by strong winds

LONDON, 10 April — A memorial cruise retracing the route of the Titanic 100 years since it sank has been slightly delayed because of high winds, a spokeswoman for the cruise said on Monday. The Titanic Memorial Cruise arrived at the town of Cobh, on Ireland's southern coast, about two hours later than scheduled due to the bad weather, Rachel O'Reilly said. The vessel, called the MS Balmoral, set sail from Southampton in southern England on Sunday for the 12-night cruise.

Cobh, once known as Queenstown, was the Titanic's last port of call before it set out across the Atlantic in April 1912. As the Balmoral pulled into the town's port Monday, it was welcomed by thousands of cheering well-wishers. The ship, which carries 1,309 passengers — including relatives of some of

the more than 1,500 Titanic passengers who died — will leave Cobh around midnight for the North Atlantic site where the ship hit an iceberg and sank, O'Reilly said.

The cruise seeks to recreate the experience onboard the Titanic — minus the disaster. Many passengers are dressed in period costumes for the journey, as are crew members and stewards. Passengers will also eat meals from the Titanic's menu, while a live band plays music of the era. Two special memorial services will take place over the weekend: The first close to midnight 14 April, when the Titanic hit the iceberg, and the second on early 15 April, when the ship sank.

The Balmoral is operated by Fred. Olsen Cruise Lines, whose parent company, Harland and Wolff, built the Titanic in Belfast.

Militant Irish nationalists renew threats, six arrested

BELFAST, 10 April — Police in Northern Ireland arrested six men in Londonderry on Monday after a group of Irish militant nationalists threatened renewed armed attacks on law enforcement during a ceremony attended by hundreds at a city graveyard.

A man wearing a balaclava said Ogligh na hEireann, also known as the Real IRA, would "continue to attack Crown Force personnel, their installations, as well as British interests and infrastructure," in footage broadcast by television station UTV.

Indonesia rescues 120 Australia-bound Afghan migrants from a leaking wooden ship

JAKARTA, 10 April—Indonesia says it has rescued 120 Afghan migrants from a leaking wooden ship headed to Australia.

An official called Joko from the National Search and Rescue Agency says they received a distress call from the ship's captain on Sunday and went to their aid. The Afghans were taken by tanker to a port on the western side of Indonesia's Java Island.

Witnesses said on Monday that police were still negotiating with the migrants who were refusing to leave the tanker. Joko says they will be handed over to immigration officers. Migrants without legal documents are usually deported home while others may apply for asylum. Migrants from conflict-ridden countries have long used Indonesia's thousands of islands as a transit point for their way to Australia.—*Internet*

Taking fire preventive measures a matter of urgency in dry season

According to its geographical features, the country is prone to multiple hazards. Its coastal regions are exposed to cyclones, storm surges, and tsunamis while major parts of the country are at risk from earthquake and fires.

The country is vulnerable to natural and man-made fires right across the country. Fire is especially likely in the dry zone and densely populated areas. Due to the excessive forest coverage throughout the country, forest fire incidents are found in almost all regions and states. However, they are particularly common in upland areas of regions and states such as Bago, Chin, Kayah, Kachin, Mandalay, Rakhine and Shan.

Fire or combustion is a chemical chain-reaction accompanied by evolution of intense heat and light. Fire or combustion occurs when three elements, namely, fuel, oxygen and heat react. If conditions are right, a fire can start almost anywhere at any time. If all three are not present in sufficient quantities, a fire will not ignite or a fire will not be able to sustain combustion. Combustion will continue as long as these three factors are present. If one of them is removed, the fire will be extinguished.

Fire cases often lead to the loss of human lives and property. The value of property loss depends on the fire intensity, the location and the duration of the blaze. According to the Fire Services Department, fire hazards account for 70 per cent of

disasters in the country and the annual losses are approximately one billion kyats.

Generally, the high incident of urban fire are due to climatic conditions including temperature, use of flammable construction materials, increasing urban development and people's negligence when using fire. To fulfill the growing urban population's need for housing, construction and extension of buildings, apartments and houses are taking place at a speedy rate with an increase in the number of slums and improper houses. However, the enforcement on land use planning and building design for fire safety is still weak. The crowd population, congested houses and careless handling of electrical appliances and fuels often lead to fire cases.

The country does not receive rainfall all year round. The wet season lasts for about five months and the dry period for the remaining seven months. The maximum temperature reaches up to 40°C in the central dry zone during the peak hot season. The majority of households live in dwellings with thatched roofs, bamboo walls and wood plank floors. Rural people prefer to live in bamboo houses with thatched roofs made of bamboo shaves and Nipa palm leaves as these materials are inexpensive, locally available, do not require sophisticated technology and suit the local weather conditions, but they are flammable.

Regardless of location, urban or rural areas, uncovered cinders left cooking with wood or charcoal, candles left alight after

use, exposure to naked flames, and unattended mosquito coils near diesel, petrol and engine oils may lead to accidental fire.

Disasters cannot be stopped from happening. But their impact can be reduced dramatically if the right disaster risk reducing measures are taken in advance. With climate changes there can be more and more intense natural disasters.

As the major cause of fire cases is people's negligence when using fire, public awareness activities on fire hazard should be carried out intensively and continuously in the dry season. And educational activities through newspapers, journals, magazines, pamphlets and billboards are effective tools for public awareness generation. Meanwhile, the community-based disaster

management organization should frequently remind the people to be alert for fire, to use fire with care, and to keep fire extinguishers and locally available materials for extinguishing fire such as fire-hook, fire flat, sand, water and buckets at home.

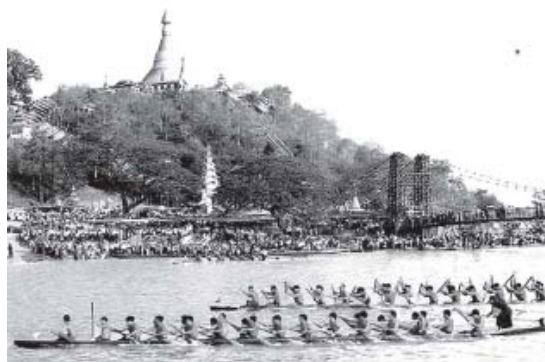
There are a series of measures that can be undertaken to avoid the possibility of a fire occurrence. Every household should take necessary prevention and preparedness actions to prevent fire outbreaks. The community is at the heart of implementing fire preventive measures. However, government intervention in policy, guidelines and enforcement for fire prevention and mitigation of loss and damage are also important.

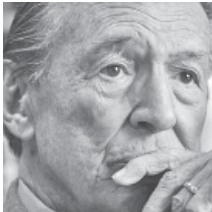

Mike Wallace, '60 Minutes' interrogator, dies

NEW YORK, 10 April — "Mike Wallace is here to see you."

The "60 Minutes" newsmen had such a fearsome reputation that it was often said that those were the most dreaded words in the English language, capable of reducing an interview subject to a shaking, sweating mess.

Wallace, who won his 21st and final Emmy Award at 89, died Saturday in the New Canaan, Conn, care facility where he had lived the last few years of his life. He was 93.

Wallace didn't just interview people. He interrogated them. He cross-examined them. Sometimes he eviscerated them pitilessly. His weapons were many: thorough research, a cocked eyebrow, a skeptical "Come on" and a question so direct it took your breath away.

He was well aware that his reputation arrived at an interview before he did, said Jeff Fager, CBS News chairman and Wallace's long-time producer at "60 Minutes."—*Internet*

Suspect in dismembering says he met woman online

URBANA, 10 April — A man suspected of stabbing, suffocating and dismembering his girlfriend told a newspaper that he met her through Facebook while looking for new friends and that he met two of his alleged accomplices at a library just three days before the killing.

Matthew Puccio, 25, is among five people charged in connection with the death of 21-year-old Jessica Rae Sacco, whose remains were found in the bathtub of their Urbana duplex apartment in late March, about a week after police believe she was killed.

A couple from Fenton, Mich, and two people from Urbana are accused of failing to intervene in the killing and helping Puccio cut off or transport limbs that were

dumped in southern Ohio and Kentucky, about 70 to 85 miles away.

In an interview, Puccio said he met Urbana residents Sharon Cook and Christopher Wright at a local library days before the killing, then contacted them afterward and was stunned that they helped him cover it up instead of calling the police, the *Springfield News-Sun* (<http://bit.ly/HnNkaf>) reported on Sunday. "It shocked the hell out of me," Puccio said. "I figured they'd be the first to call the cops on me."

Puccio said he had met Sacco through Facebook while he was living in Texas.

Puccio said Sacco provided support he needed after his former fiancée left him and took two of his

children.

Puccio said he and Sacco argued often and that their relationship became more stressed because she didn't get along with Andrew Forney and his wife, the Michigan couple who began living at the home shortly after Puccio moved in last fall.

Brazil not planning new incentives for automakers

SAO PAULO, 10 April — Brazil has no plans to offer further incentives for automakers, but the government does not rule out taking steps to boost the competitiveness of other industries, Trade and Industry Minister Fernando Pimentel said in an interview published on Sunday.

Pimentel told *O Estado de Sao Paulo* newspaper that the Brazilian government wants to encourage automakers to invest more heavily in innovation to meet surging

demand in the world's fourth biggest auto market.

"The industry already has many incentives. I don't see the need to touch that," he said. Brazil last week announced a battery of tax breaks and subsidized credit to help struggling manufacturers and speed up the country's fragile economic recovery. Critics say those measures are just short-term solutions and don't address underlying problems such as a heavy tax burden, bureaucracy and lack of investment.

Under recently adopted measures for the auto industry, carmakers will be offered tax cuts in exchange for further investment in research and development. "Bring over here the engineering, production, research and innovation departments. We want products conceived in Brazil. We have the capacity to produce," Pimentel told *Estado*.

He also said Brazil is ready to help other industries regain competitiveness and mentioned pharmaceuticals, chemicals, appliances and fertilizers as sectors that are on the government's radar.

President Dilma Rousseff said domestic demand is key for the BRICS nation to resume vigorous economic growth after a disappointing 2.7 percent expansion in 2011, down sharply from 7.5 percent growth in 2011.—*Reuters*

Suicide rates rising among Canadian girls

MONTREAL, 10 April — Suicide rates for female teens and pre-teens in Canada rose over the past few decades even though the overall number of youths who took their own lives was dropping, according to a Canadian study that covered nearly 30 years. Researchers whose findings were published in the Canadian Medical Association Journal also noted a change in the preferred methods of suicide, from guns or poisons to suffocation by strangulation.

"Our message is that all suicide is a tragedy and the trend is very disturbing," said lead author Robin Skinner, an epidemiologist with the Public Health Agency of Canada in Ottawa. In 1980, 0.6 per 100,000 girls between the ages of 10 to 14 committed suicide, rising to 0.9 per 100,000 in 2008. But among girls 15 to 19 years old, the rate rose from 3.7 per 100,000 in 1980 to 6.2 per 100,000 in 2008. Overall, suicide is the second leading cause of death for Canadians between 10 and 19 years old, after accidents.

Skinner told *Reuters* Health there was a small improvement in suicide rates for all Canadians in that age group between 1980 and 2008. Whereas 6.2 of every 100,000 young Canadians killed themselves in 1980, the rate fell to 5.2 per 100,000 in 2008 — in general, a 1 percent annual decline over nearly three decades. The group found there was no significant change in the suicide rate for boys 10 to 14 years old. In 2008, 1.6 per 100,000 committed suicide. But the rate for those aged 15 to 19 fell considerably, from 19 per 100,000 in 1980 to 6.2 per 100,000 in 2008.

The study did not examine why the rates for girls increased over the 28-year period, or why that of boys dropped, but they did point out a steady rise among both sexes in deaths by suffocation. Previous research has found that young people perceive hanging to be a "clean, quick and painless method" of suicide, according to the authors.—*Internet*

Russian polar expedition yacht missing in Antarctica

LONDON, 10 April — A Russian Polar expedition yacht with a crew of seven has gone missing in Antarctica, a spokeswoman has told the BBC News website. There has been no contact with the *Scorpius* since Monday night, when the crew said gale-force winds were keeping it at anchor, Anna Subbotina said. It is believed to be stuck in ice between two polar research stations.

The crew—four Russians and three Ukrainians—set out in September to visit the two poles. Ms Subbotina said she had last received an email from the crew at 03:00 Moscow time on Tuesday (23:00 GMT on Monday). They had left Ukraine's Vernadsky polar station in the Argentine Islands and were on their way to Russia's Bellingshausen station in the South Shetland Islands when the storm forced them to drop anchor.

Reporting winds of about 40 knots (74km/h; 46mph), they wrote: "In wind like this, it is very dangerous to enter the strait which is full of underwater stones." Ms Subbotina said she was concerned because she had had an agreement with Captain Sergei Nizovtsev to make contact

every two or three days since the boat set sail on 18 September. "I hope very much that it is just a technical fault with the communications," she added.

In the course of the trip, officially known as the Russian Polar Sailing Expedition, the crew have already produced spectacular photo journals of wildlife and ice formations in Antarctica, displayed on their website. Their mission statement speaks of bringing "glory to Russia" in the course of exploring both the poles. The *Scorpius* is a 29.45-metre (96-ft) sailing yacht with a steel hull, built by the Dutch firm Jongert in 1991.

MIAMI, 10 April—The US Coast Guard said one of its crews and another boat rescued 10 people they found clinging to a small pleasure boat that capsized off the Miami coast.

The incident involved five adults and five children who were aboard the 14-foot boat when it capsized about 8 pm Saturday about 250 yards off Sea Isle Marina.

A Coast Guard crew pulled seven of the boaters to safety and a Tow Boat US crew helped three others. The Coast Guard told the newspaper only minor medical concerns were reported.—*Internet*

Four Chinese oil workers killed in Niger helicopter crash

ABIDJAN, 10 April—The Chinese embassy in Niger confirmed Monday that the wreckage of a missing helicopter was found in the desert in northern Niger, with all six people aboard killed. Four Chinese oil workers and two French crew members

died of the crash, said the embassy.

The Chinese workers, all employees of China's oil giant CNPC, was traveling Friday morning in the chartered helicopter from their base in Agadem to a working site.

At the news of the crash,

the Chinese embassy immediately contacted the Niger government and military for help, Xia Huang, Chinese ambassador to Niger, told *Xinhua* on Monday.

The embassy also informed the French embassy, considering the two crew

members were French nationals.

Although the deep desert where the helicopter went missing made the search very difficult, with concerted efforts the wreckage of the helicopter was finally found, Xia said.—*Xinhua*

Ford recalls more than 140,000 Focus vehicles

CHICAGO, 10 April—Ford Motor Company is recalling 140,312 of its 2012 Ford Focus models in the United States due to a potential issue with the car's windshield wiper, US National Highway Traffic Safety Administration said on Monday.

According to NHTSA filings, some US Ford Focus vehicles may have a missing

component in the windshield wiper motor that would normally keep water out. Without the safeguard, the electric connection could become faulty and cause the passenger-side wiper to fail, which could potentially lead to a crash due to limited visibility. Ford said that there have currently been no reported accidents due to the windshield issue.—*Xinhua*

Mechanic takes motorized couch for a spin

A New Zealand mechanic who designed a motorized couch with a top speed of 37 mph said his creation has been admired by townspeople, even police officers. Josh Steeg of Hastings said he and some friends took the couch for an Easter spin through Napier as part of a scheme to attract business for his mechanical work and perhaps even the couch itself, *Hawkes Bay Today* reported on Monday. "Who knows, someone

might see it as a great opportunity to do some advertising," Steeg said. The couch has a 2008 Yamaha Jog motor, a stereo system and speedometer, and it pulls a refreshment trailer. Steeg said the rig was a hit with people in the community.

"Police had a look at us but it was all good. It's only the second time I've had it out for a run. If I had a dollar for every time someone stopped us to take a photo today, I'd be rich," he said.

Man serves public for 63 years

An 84-year-old Virginia man has been recognized by *Guinness World Records* for having the world's longest career as a civil servant. Sara Wilcox, a *Guinness World Records* spokeswoman, said Hardy Cash began serving the public 1 July, 1947, when he was hired to assist Elizabeth City County Executive WR "Buddy" Freeman with office tasks, and his career ended when he retired as the Hampton city ombudsman on 28 Jan. 2011, the *Newport News Daily Press* reported on Monday.

Wilcox said Cash's public service, which lasted 63 years, 210 days, is now believed to be the world's longest and will appear in the next edition of the *Guinness Book of World Records*. "Hardy Cash is a Hampton icon," Mayor Molly Joseph Ward said.

"To remain in public service to one city for more than 60 years is a feat that won't likely be duplicated any time soon. We are most grateful to him for his commitment to public service."

Woman uses telepathy after crash

A California woman who barely survived a car crash said she reached out to her husband for help, telepathically. Tracy Granger, 56, was driving from Pasadena to Juniper Hills in the Palmdale area the evening of 25 March when her pickup truck veered off the road and plunged 350 feet down the side of a mountain, KTLA-TV, Los Angeles, reported on Monday.

Granger said she considered climbing up the mountain side, but knew it would be impossible as she suffered a fractured neck, pelvis and several broken ribs during the crash. So, she reached out to her husband with her mind. "I sat down and I said out loud, 'Lee, I'm overdue,'" Granger said. "Something has happened. Figure it out." Sheriff's deputies spotted Granger's truck the next morning.

"As deputies were walking along the ridge-line here, they actually saw a tool box laying down," said Sgt. Andrew Nagel of the LA County Sheriff's Department. "They got some binoculars, looked and then found her way down at the bottom of the canyon there, up against a tree," he said. Granger was unconscious when first responders reached her, but when she came to she told them she was very grateful. "I'm very grateful for them," Granger said. "The care, the support and the love that I've been shown."

Woman poured bleach on man's lap

Police in Florida said they arrested a woman accused of pouring bleach on her ex-boyfriend's lap while he was driving. Gainesville Police said Shanay Jackson, 19, was arguing with her ex-boyfriend Wednesday night while he was driving and allegedly pushed him in the face and poured bleach on his lap. *The Gainesville Sun* reported on Friday.

Playing with eventual winner Watson in Sunday's final round, Oosthuizen watched as his ball landed on the front of the green in between the two bunkers and bounced along before rolling up the hill. The fans crammed around the green applauded politely but the ball kept on

rolling, tracking sharply from left to right before dropping into the cup with what appeared to be its dying breath. The cheering reached an ear-splitting crescendo and the sound reverberated around the Georgian pines as players on every part of the course were alerted to something very special.

Oosthuizen thrust both arms skywards before high-fiving his caddie. Watson considered joining the celebrations but thought better of it.—*Reuters*



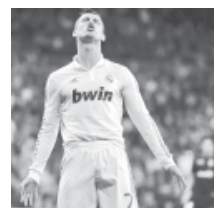

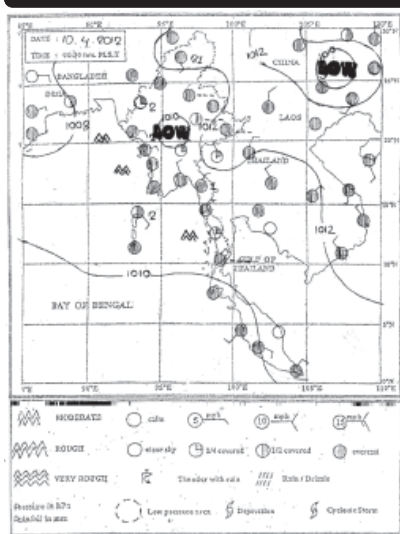

No London 'divorce' for China's Li

LONDON, 10 April—China's top tennis player Li Na has blasted media scrutiny of her Olympic preparations by insisting she will not be giving her hen-pecked husband coach the boot for this year's London Games.

The reigning French Open champion, who has always had an uneasy relationship with the Chinese media, will stick with Jiang Shan and not hire a foreign coach, she told the *China Daily*.

"I don't know why the media are so interested," said the outspoken 30-year-old. "Maybe you are not confident in Jiang and my current team."

"Up to now, I haven't had any intention of recruiting a foreign coach," said Li, who often pokes fun at her husband in interviews. "I hope the media won't ask about it again."

Jiang guided Li to the final of last year's Australian Open, where she lost a tough three-setter to Belgium's Kim Clijsters.

Danish Fed Cup captain Michael Mortensen took over and helped her win the French Open title but Jiang was reinstated after the US Open.

Li's form dipped after becoming Asia's first grand

slam winner in Paris, although the player expressed confidence ahead of the Olympics.

"Compared with reaching the final at the Australian Open last year, people may feel a little bit disappointed about my results this year," said the world number eight.

"But I think my form is okay right now and I have no regrets so far."

Li has planned her year around London.

"After the French Open, I won't play any matches until Wimbledon," she said. "After

Loss of predators in northern hemisphere affecting ecosystem health

SCIENCE DAILY, 10 April—A survey on the loss in the Northern Hemisphere of large predators, particularly wolves, concludes that current populations of moose, deer, and other large herbivores far exceed their historic levels and are contributing to disrupted ecosystems.

The research, published recently by scientists from Oregon State University,

examined 42 studies done over the past 50 years.

It found that the loss of major predators in forest ecosystems has allowed game animal populations to greatly increase, crippling the growth of young trees and reducing biodiversity. This also contributes to deforestation and results in less carbon sequestration, a potential concern with climate change.

"These issues do not just affect the United States and a few national parks," said William Ripple, an OSU professor of forestry and lead author of the study. "The data from Canada, Alaska, the Yukon, Northern Europe and Asia are all showing similar results. There's consistent evidence that large predators help keep populations of large herbivores in check, with positive effects on ecosystem health." Densities of large mammalian herbivores were six times greater in areas without wolves, compared to those in which wolves were present, the researchers concluded.—Internet

Arsenal could have signed Ronaldo

MADRID, 10 April—Cristiano Ronaldo would have signed for Arsenal rather than Manchester United if they former had been more decisive, according to the agent of the Real Madrid star.

The 27-year-old forward moved to Old Trafford from Sporting Lisbon in the summer of 2003, but it was the Gunners who had initially shown the most serious interest in acquiring his signature.

Arsene Wenger had sent scouts to run the rule over the Portuguese youngster on numerous occasions and, it appeared, Ronaldo would be on his way to Arsenal in time for the 2003-04 season.

However, Ronaldo soon made himself known to

Ronaldo starred for Sporting as they defeated United 3-1 and, as Arsenal hesitated, Ferguson made his move for the promising youngster.

"I remember what happened to Ronaldo at Arsenal," Ronaldo's agent Jorge Mendes said, according to skysports.com.

"They watched him nine or ten times, and when everything seemed decided, then Manchester United played at the inauguration of the Alvaladze Stadium (Sporting Lisbon) and the players themselves urged Ferguson to buy him."

Mendes also revealed that Luis Nani moved from Sporting to United in similar circumstances, with Arsenal having tracked him during his days in Lisbon.

Mendes added: "Nani was also followed by Tottenham and Arsenal, but as I say, who sleeps in business loses."
