## Functions of Thaphanseik Dam inspected

NAY PYI TAW, 11 April— Union Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation U Myint Hlaing yesterday inspected CCTV-installed computerized control rooms at main spillway of Thaphanseik Dam in Kyunhla Township.

Director-General U Kyaw Myint Hlaing of Irrigation Department reported on inflow of 7.5 million acre-feet of water to Thaphanseik Dam and storage of 2.2 million acre-feet of water at the dam, supply of water to summer paddy farms and generating electricity and control of sluice gate applying computerization process.

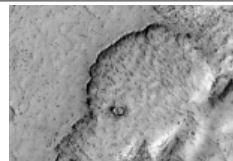

### Plants mimic scent of pollinating beetles

ZURICH, 11 April—The color and scent of flowers and their perception by pollinator insects are believed to have evolved in the course of mutual adaptation. However, an evolutionary biologist from the University of Zurich has now proved that this is not the case with the arum family at least, which evolved its scent analogously to the pre-existing scents of scarab beetles and thus adapted to the beetles unilaterally. The mutual adaptation between plants and pollinators therefore does not always take place.

Soon, the gardens and fields will be blooming, fragrant and buzzing again. Bees, flies and beetles fly, as they have done for millions of years, from flower to flower in search of food or mates, drawn by flower shapes, colors and the scents of the individual plants. Often, pollinating insects favor certain scents and preferentially visit the flowers in question. Previously, researchers always assumed that floral scents and the fondness of pollinating insects for a specific scent evolved mutually via coevolution of plants and insects. However, the evolutionary biologist Florian Schiestl from the University of Zurich now proves that this was not the case with the arum family and their pollinators.

Bayreuth studied the arum family and one of its pollinators, the scarab beetles. In the beetles, they discovered many scent molecules used for chemical communication that were also found in the plants. Based on a phylogenetic reconstruction, they realized that these scents were already present in the ancestors of today's scarab beetles. Evidently, these prehistoric scarab beetles already used the same or similar scents back in the Jurassic period to find food or mates. Unlike today's scarab beetles, these ancestors did not pollinate plants, the first members of the arum family to be pollinated by beetles not appearing until around 40 million years later.—Internet

## Yemen air force, troops kill 62 militants

ADEN, 11 April— Yemen's air force and ground troops killed at least 62 suspected al-Qaeda-linked fighters on Wednesday, officials and tribal sources said, in the government's latest drive to contain an increasingly fierce Islamist insurgency.

Militant group Ansar al-Sharia said however only two of its fighters had been killed in Wednesday's clashes.

Still reeling from a year of political upheaval that eventually unseated former president Ali Abdullah Saleh, Yemen is grappling with militants who have been exploiting weakened central government control to spread their influence, particularly in the country's south.

Local officials and residents said the army killed 30 militants in fighting on Jebel Yasuf, a mountain around 10 km (6 miles) from the southern town of Lawdar.

Dozens of people have been killed in the Lawdar area since Monday, according to officials, after Ansar al-Sharia fighters attacked an army camp there.

Tribal sources later said a further 27 militants, including a local commander called Ahmed Dararish, had been killed by tribal fighters near the southern entrance to Lawdar. Three tribesmen also died in the clashes.

An air strike on the town

of Umm Ayn, around 10 km from Lawdar, killed another 5 militants, a local official said.

Ansar al-Sharia denied that. In an emailed statement whose authenticity could not immediately be verified, it said the air raid, which it blamed on a Saudi war plane, had struck a warehouse belonging to a civilian.

A senior government official said the fighting around Lawdar marked a

turning point in its fight against Ansar al-Sharia (Partisans of Islamic Law) following a series of defeats.

"The battle of Lawdar is considered a decisive one for the army against the terrorist groups and a prelude to the cleansing of all towns seized by militants in the province of Abyan," said the official. He said 10 militants had also been captured. Ansar al-Sharia said none of its fighters had been taken prisoner.

The Defence Ministry said in a text message it had destroyed a number of checkpoints set up by militants on a main road linking Lawdar to the neighboring province of al-Bayda, re-opening the route.

It also cited unnamed military sources as saying that Saudi Arabian, Pakistani and Somali nationals were among the militants killed in the Lawdar area.—Reuters

## China urges 'flexibility' in Iran nuclear talks

TEHERAN, 11 April — Iran's economic ally China urged all sides on Tuesday in upcoming nuclear talks to show "flexibility and sincerity" even as Teheran sent mixed messages with hints of compromise and blasts of defiance. The appeals by China — among the world powers taking part in the negotiations later this week — carry significant weight in Teheran and the West, and appeared aimed at nurturing the cautious hope that this dialogue won't quickly collapse like the last attempt more than a year ago.

Senior envoys from Iran and six world powers — the five permanent UN Security Council members plus Germany — are expected to hold preliminary strategy sessions Friday in Istanbul and move into direct talks the next day. The timetables appear open, but there is speculation that the sessions will not stretch beyond Saturday in a bid for a slower,

step-by-step approach that will involve scheduling future rounds of talks. "We hope all parties will cherish and seize this opportunity, show flexibility and sincerity in the dialogue, to open a constructive and sustained dialogue process," said a statement from China's Foreign Ministry.

China provides an economic lifeline to Iran as one of its major oil customers and investors in Iranian projects. China and Russia, also part of the nuclear talks, have opposed the tough sanctions implemented by the US and Europe. Some potential cards have been revealed in advance of the talks. The US and allies are rallying around efforts to quickly curb Iran's uranium enrichment, a process which produces reactor fuel but can also make weapons-grade material at higher levels. Iran strongly denies that it seeks nuclear arms.

## Putin speech may offer clues on next Russian government

Moscow, 11 April — Russian President-elect Vladimir Putin will play up his economic achievements on Wednesday in his last annual address to parliament as Prime Minister, a speech that will be scoured for clues on the makeup of his next administration. The set-piece speech, which comes less than a month before Putin is sworn in on 7 May, will offer the once and future Kremlin chief - a master of policy detail - a platform to set out a growth agenda for his six-year term.

But Putin, 59, will face tough questions from opposition lawmakers emboldened by the largest protests of his 12-year-old rule over alleged ballot fraud in December's parliamentary election and last month's presidential vote.

Police guarding the State Duma (lower house of parliament) detained one of the protest organizers, leftist opposition leader Sergei Udaltsov, as he tried to join some 30 anti-Putin demonstrators hours before the 12 pm (0800 GMT) address.

While the focus of the annual report is on the economy, Putin — accused by the opposition of stifling political dissent — may also offer glimpses of his foreign policy priorities after a campaign colored by his harsh criticism of the West. Opponents and foreign governments are watching for signs Putin could expand the limited political reforms the Kremlin offered during a winter of protests or go the other way and crack down on perceived challenges to his grip on power. Putin's spokesman, Dmitry Peskov, told reporters on the eve of the address that Putin would outline "priority steps" and give "a detailed review of the state of the Russian economy and the social sphere." — Reuters

## Iraq parliament approves rights commission

BAGHDAD, 11 April — Iraqi MPs have approved the first independent human rights commission in the country's history, with a remit to track rights violations, lawmaker Ashwaq al-Jaff said on Tuesday. "The main role of this commission is to monitor all violations of human rights in all fields and in all governmental and non-governmental institutions,"

Jaff said of the High Commission for Human Rights, which was approved by parliament on Monday.

"Any citizen will have the right to file a complaint directly to the commission," said Jaff, a member of parliament's human rights committee. Jaff said the commission will take "independent decisions" and "will issue annual reports to

the parliament and to the international organizations."

"We are a country that lived for 35 years in which human rights were violated, and even after 2003 there were some violations of human rights. The role of this commission is to show the citizens what human rights are," she said.

All of its members signed a commitment not to belong to political parties while serving on the commission, Jaff said. The commission will replace the Human Rights Ministry after 2014 elections at the latest, she said.

A parliamentary source said that MPs on Monday approved the commission, which will be made up of 11 members, among them two women, and three substitutes, who will serve four-year terms. Salama al-Khafaji, a 53-year-old Shiite dentist who was a member of the US-backed interim governing council, will head the commission, the source said.— Internet

## East Coast wildfires whipped up by winds

NEW YORK, 11 April — Raging wildfires fueled by strong winds scorched thousands of acres (hundreds of hectares) in New Jersey and on New York's Long Island on Tuesday as firefighters scrambled aircraft to contain the blazes. A snowless winter and dry spring have transformed the New York City metropolitan area into a tinderbox, with recent strong winds fanning the flames, authorities said.

Wildfires were also reported in several states along the eastern seaboard. On eastern Long Island, where New York Governor Andrew Cuomo declared a state of emergency, three sections within a 2,000-acre (809 hectare) area were burning. But a fire was extinguished on the grounds of the Brookhaven National Laboratory, a nuclear physics facility about 70 miles of New York City, Suffolk County

Executive Steve Bellone told a news conference.

In southern New Jersey, a blaze persisted in a 1,000-acre area of the picturesque Pine Barrens but was contained on the firing range at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, where it scorched 300 acres. Military firefighters succeeded in containing the fire on the base and were concentrating on putting out hot spots, said Staff Sergeant David Carbajal.— Reuters

## Endangered blue butterfly receives Federal protection

MIAMI, 11 April—Small blue butterfly that lives along the Florida coast is the latest addition to the Endangered Species List, federal officials announced this week. Effective on 6 April, the Miami blue butterfly is protected by law. Unlike monarch butterflies, known for their harrowing migrations, Miami blues spend their lives in just one area.

The Miami blue's range once extended from the Dry Tortugas, at the tip of the Florida Keys, as far north as St Petersburg on the state's western coast, and Daytona Beach on the eastern coast.

Now the butterflies are found on only a handful of remote islands within the Florida Keys. Only a few, small

populations are known to remain, according to a statement from the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). Coastal development and spraying for mosquitoes caused a big drop in the Miami blue butterfly population in the 1970s. In the early 1990s, after Hurricane Andrew swept across the state, some researchers thought the butterfly had gone extinct.

In 1999, a photographer discovered a small colony of the butterflies living in Bahia Honda State Park in the Florida Keys, but by 2003, only 50 individual butterflies remained, according to a 2004 news release from the University of Florida.

Since then, a smattering

of small populations has survived. In August 2011, the butterflies were given an emergency listing under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), but the protections lasted for only 240 days.

## Disaster zone robot competition announced by Pentagon

WASHINGTON, 11 April—A competition to develop next-generation robots capable of saving lives in disaster zones has been unveiled by the Pentagon's advanced research laboratory. Darpa says it wants "adaptable robots with the ability to use human tools—from hand tools to vehicles". It plans to hold a series of emergency response physical challenges. A \$2m (£1.3m) prize is being offered to the team with the best technology. The competition begins in October. The agency says it hopes software engineers, video game developers and other experts from fields outside robotics will take part "to increase the diversity of innovative solutions".

Robots have already been deployed into danger zones. After the Fukushima nuclear plant meltdown in 2011, Japanese authorities used unmanned vehicles and "first responder" robots developed by the British firm Quintiq to move heavy debris and measure radiation levels. The US Army has also used robots in Iraq and Afghanistan to clear buildings and check for explosive devices.

However, Darpa says more work needs to be done to make the machines interact with humans more naturally. "This challenge is going to test supervised autonomy in perception and decision-making, mounted and dismounted mobility, dexterity, strength and endurance in an environment designed for human use but degraded due to disaster," said Gill Pratt, Darpa's programme manager. "Adaptability is also essential because we don't know where the next disaster will strike."

## UFO video over South Korea: Fact or faked?

SEOUL, 11 April—An airplane passenger videoed a mysterious oval white object flying over Seoul, South Korea, on 7 April. The video has been lighting up the Internet since, and of course many people are offering extraterrestrial explanations.

As is de rigueur these days, the UFO clip was uploaded to YouTube, where it has been viewed millions of times. Some comments say it's clearly an extraterrestrial spacecraft; others insist it's a fake.

Still others say it's neither but instead is a real object—such as a plastic bag in the wind, a parachute seen from above, or a drop of water on the window—that simply

looks strange from that angle.

Aside from the anonymity of the cameraman, the video raises some red flags about its authenticity.

For one thing, the video is not complete; it has been purposely edited to leave some information out. We know this because it begins in progress, with the UFO already well in frame, in the lower right-hand corner.

The video camera didn't suddenly turn on to capture that scene; there must be at least some video that was recorded the first few seconds of the camera being turned on or the cameraman pointing the camera out the window.

This type of selective editing is common among UFO hoax videos. There's also the fact that the cameraman waits almost seven seconds before he mentions the UFO to his companion.

It's clearly present, and it would be hard to keep your reaction to yourself if you were watching while you were videotaping. Perhaps most strange, even though he clearly spots the UFO, the cameraman makes no effort to follow the object after it zooms up and out of frame; instead he videotapes more or less the same area of sky for the remaining 10 seconds of the clip.—Internet



## Supply craft docks with International Space Station

HOUSTON, 11 April—NASA has released this beautiful picture of the moment a supply spacecraft arrived at the International Space Station. The unmanned spaceship was bringing up oxygen, food, fuel and other supplies for the six astronauts on board.

It's called Automated Transfer Vehicle-3 (ATV-3 for short), and took five days to reach the space station from Earth, docking on 28 March. The crew had to change their sleeping patterns so they could monitor the arrival to ensure nothing went wrong. ATV-3 is expected to stay at the space station until early September, when it will be released and will burn up in the Earth's atmosphere.—Internet

## 'Tough' rules govern smart meter data sharing

LONDON, 11 April—Consumers should be able to decide how much data smart meters surrender about their energy use, says the government. The plan to give consumers control is part of official guidelines for the mass rollout of smart meters—devices that show exactly how much electricity and gas is being used—to UK homes. The meters should be fitted in 30m UK homes by 2019, at a cost of £11.7b. The guidelines come as FBI warnings emerge about attacks on smart meters that make them report low energy use.

The government proposals lay out technical specifications for the 53 million smart meters it wants installed in UK homes by the end of 2019. The move to bring in the gadgets aims to reduce power use, cutting bills and helping

the government meet energy efficiency targets. Mass roll-out of smart meters is due to start in 2014 and energy firms are expected to shoulder most of this cost. But the government believes the high cost of the mass rollout will be offset by the £7bn or so of savings it will bring about for both consumers and power suppliers.

Audrey Gallacher, director of energy at Consumer Focus, said the watchdog group broadly welcomed the proposals. She added: "We continue to have concerns that the costs of the scheme may be underestimated and that costs for consumers could rise." The guidelines cover what energy firms can do when installing metres. Energy minister Charles Hendry said the installation rules were "tough" because fitters would not be allowed to try to sell consumers more services during installation.

In addition, all households fitted with the gadgets must get an in-home display that logs how much power is being consumed. Alongside the guidelines goes a consultation exercise to find out what should happen to detailed energy use data. The government proposes that consumers choose who can access this information. Basic data used for billing will be available to suppliers without asking.—Internet

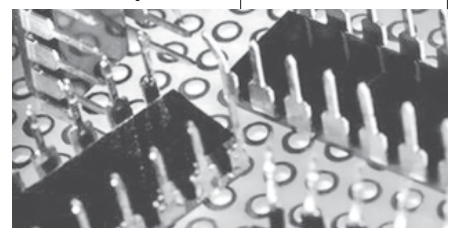
## Fake semiconductors 'could cause tragedy'

LONDON, 11 April—The number of fake memory chips and processors in use has tripled since 2009, suggests a report. The report, compiled by semiconductor analyst IHS iSuppli, said fakes were found in phones, computers, military hardware, cars and hospital equipment. The analyst said the fakes were turning up in so many places that they might soon put lives at risk. The military and aerospace firms were the most likely to be using fakes, it said.

More than 1,363 fakes

were reported in 2011, said the report, and threatened to dent a market worth more than \$169b (£109b) a year. The five most widely counterfeited chips included memory chips, microprocessors and analogue integrated circuits (IC). Analogue ICs are widely used in domestic gadgets such as wireless routers, TVs and computers. Typically, said iSuppli, the fake parts were low cost copies of widely used semiconductors or components discarded by chip firms during fabrication. Manufacturing wastage for

semi-conductors is high because the components are



stringently tested to ensure they will perform reliably throughout their life.

## Artificial heart keeps boy alive for record 251 days

LONDON, 11 April — A three-year-old boy has been kept alive with an artificial heart for more than eight months, which doctors say is a record for a child in the UK. Joe Skerratt from Gillingham, Kent, was diagnosed with dilated cardiomyopathy, which meant his heart struggled to pump blood around his body. He was temporarily fitted with a "Berlin heart", to give his own a helping hand. After 251 days, he finally had a heart transplant last year. Joe's mother, Rachel, said "we started to see his character coming back" after he was fitted with the Berlin heart. But this was the start of a long wait for a heart donor. "When Joe passed the

200-day mark on the Berlin heart we started to really question what else could be done if a heart wasn't found, but we knew deep down there wouldn't be much," she said. "On day 251 the call we had been waiting for came. We were offered a heart for Joe. The call came early in the morning and time seemed to stand still before he was taken down to theatre." After the operation, Joe's chest would not be closed for four days. Rachel said: "Seeing his new heart — a normal size and thumping away in his chest — was incredible." Their first night back home was celebrated with Joe's favourite meal — pizza.

Joe was first diagnosed with dilated cardiomyopathy

when he was taken to hospital looking grey at just three weeks old. An X-ray showed his heart was severely enlarged. He was later diagnosed with a genetic disorder—Barth syndrome, which leads to muscle weakness, short stature and feeding problems. In December 2010, Joe's heart was failing and doctors found his valves were leaking. His heart had now become even more enlarged and was taking up too much space in his chest.

A few days later his heart stopped twice while he was in hospital. He was then transferred to Great Ormond Street Hospital in London, where his heart stopped for a third time. Doctors stabilised

Joe and he was fitted to a Berlin heart. The Berlin heart is about the size of a small fridge. Some children need to be on the device for only a couple of weeks, while for others, the wait for a new heart can take many months. Dr Alessandro Giardini, consultant paediatric cardiologist at Great Ormond Street, said: "We are really delighted to see Joe doing so well and thriving at home. He spent a long time with us in hospital.

"Joe was very lucky to be able to have a heart transplant. There is a chronic shortage of donor organs for children in the UK and at any one time we have several children in the hospital awaiting a transplant. Lots of

children wait years for an organ to become available and can very sadly die while they are doing so." Joe's parents have both called for people to join the NHS organ donor register. Rachel said: "We are eternally grateful to the donor family.— Internet or every year when the American Dental Association is saying once every two to three years." ### Dental X-rays may be linked to benign brain tumours

NEW YORK, 11 April — People who underwent frequent dental X-rays in the past, before radiation doses were lowered, may be at greater risk of a usually benign form of tumour in the lining of the brain, a new study suggests. The research doesn't definitely link dental X-rays to the tumours, which affect about 1 percent of people. It's also possible that

dental X-rays, which are now given at a lower radiation dose, have nothing to do with the tumours. Still, the study suggests that dental X-rays could be a risk factor for the tumours, called meningiomas, said study author Dr Elizabeth Claus, a neurosurgeon at Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston and a professor of epidemiology at Yale University School of

Medicine.

The findings suggest that patients should talk to their dentists about the possible dangers of X-rays and be aware of national recommendations regarding their use, she said. "I do not get the feeling that people are aware of those guidelines," she said.

### Alcoa surprises Wall Street with first-quarter profit

NEW YORK, 11 April — Aluminum producer Alcoa Inc surprised Wall Street with a first-quarter profit after a loss in the fourth quarter of 2011 as global markets improved, especially in the aerospace and automobile sectors. The results, which beat analysts' forecast for a loss, sent the company's stock up 6 percent to \$9.80 in after-hours trading on the New York Stock Exchange.

"We pretty much see growth in all global end

markets," Chief Executive Officer Klaus Kleinfeld told analysts on a conference call. "On aerospace, the market goes from strength to strength." He said demand for aluminum in North America was strong in most industrial sectors except for building and construction. "China, (there is) growth across all segments. A little softer but still good, good growth. The markets in Europe are hovering along," he said.

Alcoa, which makes

aluminum for aircraft, cars and beverage cans, raised its 2012 global growth forecast for the aerospace market by 3 percentage points to 13-14 percent and said it expects global growth in the auto industry of 3-7 percent. The company also projects a global aluminum supply deficit in 2012 and reaffirmed its forecast that global aluminum demand would grow 7 percent in 2012, on top of the 10 percent growth seen in 2011.— Reuters

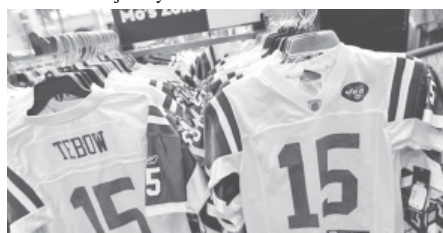
### Nike and Reebok settle NY fight over Tebow apparel

NEW YORK, 11 April — Running for a loss, Reebok has scrapped its effort to sell New York Jets Tim Tebow apparel, agreeing to rid stores of thousands of jerseys and T-shirts it stamped with the quarterback's name after he was traded from the Denver Broncos to the Jets last month. The terms of a settlement with Nike were disclosed Tuesday in papers filed in US District Court in Manhattan that had been signed a day earlier. It was not clear if any money changed hands.

Beaverton, Ore.-based Nike Inc sued Reebok International Ltd two weeks ago, saying the rival apparel maker was trying to squeeze the most out of the end of its 10-year NFL apparel

licensing deal by stamping Tebow's name on jerseys and T-shirts even though Nike was about to begin a five-year NFL contract of its own. Judge Kevin Castel immediately blocked Reebok from selling 6,000 Tebow-Jets jerseys and

25,000 T-shirts it was distributing to stores while he heard evidence in the case. After a daylong hearing last week, he left his restraining order in place and announced that he believed Nike would ultimately prevail in its claims.—Internet

### Coal exports surge to highest level since 1991

BILLINGS, 11 April — US coal exports reached their highest level in two decades last year as strong demand from Asia and Europe offered an outlet for a fuel that is falling from favour at home.

US Department of Energy data analyzed by The Associated Press reveal that coal exports topped 107 million tons of fuel worth almost \$16 billion in 2011.

That's the highest level since 1991, and more than double the export volume from 2006.

Much of the increase went to slake the thirst of power-hungry markets in Asia, where rapid development has sparked what mining company Peabody Energy calls a "global coal

super cycle" that heralds renewed interest in the fuel. The AP's analysis showed coal exports to South Korea leapt 81 percent last year to more than 10 million tons. India saw a 65 percent jump, to 4.5 million tons. And Japan bought almost 7 million tons of US coal last year — a 119 percent increase — as the nation sought alternatives to nuclear power after an earthquake and tsunami prompted the Fukushima nuclear complex meltdown.

King Coal faces a tougher outlook in the US, where competition from cheap natural gas and costly



## DOJ may sue Apple over ebooks as early as Wednesday

WASHINGTON, 11 April—The Justice Department could sue Apple Inc as early as Wednesday over alleged electronic book price-fixing, while settling with several publishers as early as this week, two people familiar with the matter said. The Justice Department is investigating alleged price-fixing by Apple and five major publishers: CBS Corp's Simon & Schuster Inc; HarperCollins Publishers Inc; Lagardere SCA's Hachette Book Group;

Pearson and Macmillan, a unit of Verlagsgruppe Georg von Holtzbrinck GmbH.

A lawsuit against Apple, one of the parties not in negotiations over a potential settlement, could come as early as Wednesday but no final decision had been made, the people said.

Apple declined to comment. The Justice Department and the five publishers could not be reached for comment.

The Justice Department is investigating whether deals Apple cut two years ago with the quintet of major publishers—when the consumer electronics maker launched its iPad tablet computer - were done with the intent of propping up prices for digital books, sources have said.

## Elephant on Mars sculpted by lava flow

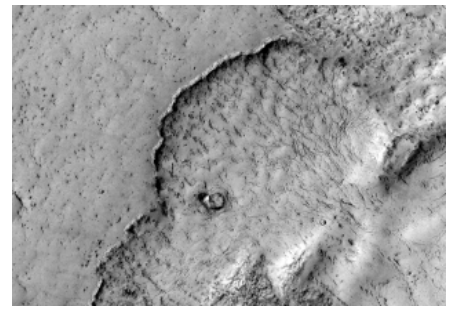
WASHINGTON, 11 April—The dried flood of lava over the surface of Mars has created the spitting image of the eye and trunk of an elephant. The curve of the animal's forehead and the dent of an ear also appear in a new photo taken by the High Resolution Imaging Science Experiment (HiRISE) on NASA's Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter.

"This is a good example of the phenomena 'pareidolia,' where we see things (such as animals) that aren't really there," University of Arizona planetary geologist Alfred McEwen wrote in an update posted on the university's HiRISE website. The Mars elephant illusion photo shows a region of the Red Planet called the Elysium Planitia, which is the youngest flood-lava province on Mars. Scientists aren't sure if the lava flows on Mars were

deposited quickly, or over a longer time period, as is the case on Earth, where most lava floods were put in place over years to decades.

"This is probably true for much of the lava on Mars as well," McEwen wrote. "An elephant can walk away from the slowly advancing flow front. However, there is also evidence for much more rapidly flowing lava on Mars, a true

flood of lava. In this instance, maybe this elephant couldn't run away fast enough." The Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter, which has been circling the Red Planet since 2006, was launched in 2005. The orbiter, currently in an extended phase of its mission, has transmitted more data to Earth than all other interplanetary missions combined, NASA officials have said. — INTERNET

## 'Urban explorers' scale unfinished Shard

LONDON, 11 April—The developers building the Shard defended their security measures on Monday after it emerged that a group of "urban explorers" had broken into the skyscraper. Spectacular photographs apparently showing trespassers leaning over scaffolding at the top of London's 310-metre Shard tower as the city lights twinkled below appeared online over the weekend.

Sellar Property Group, the developer scheduled to finish work on the European Union's tallest building next month, admitted there had been a break-in but said it had stepped up security in response.

"We believe this is an incident which took place around December 2010," said a Sellar spokesman. "The breach was discovered very soon afterwards and security immediately tightened." "Today security on the site is tight with 14 night-time

security guards on duty continuously who cover all areas, as well as 25 CCTV cameras in operation together with a ground floor level laser alarm system," he added.

But Bradley L Garrett, an American graduate who posted some of the photographs on his blog Place Hacking, said he and a group of fellow "urban explorers" had climbed the Shard's stairs "half a dozen" times.

"It is impossible to secure a site that big," said the 31-year-old. "The security guards that work on the site are only human. No one wants to sit there watching cameras 12 hours a day," added the Californian, who completed a PhD on urban exploration at the University of London in February.

The group first climbed the Shard to watch the New Year's Eve fireworks over London in December 2010, Garrett added.

## London welcomes Chinese probe over Briton's death

LONDON, 11 April — Foreign Secretary William Hague welcomed an investigation into the death of a British man in China, after Chinese authorities reopened their probe on Tuesday.

Chinese police have found evidence that the wife of Bo Xilai, the disgraced former senior Chinese politician, may have been involved in the murder of businessman Nigel Heywood, state media said.

Hague told Sky News television he had taken a "personal interest" in the case. "I decided a few weeks ago that we should ask the Chinese authorities to investigate the death of Mr Heywood, so of course I welcome the announcement," he said. "The Chinese

are doing as we asked them to do and we now look forward to seeing those investigations take place, and in due course hearing the outcome of those investigations."

Heywood died in the southwestern city of Chongqing, a sprawling metropolis which is at the heart of China's biggest political drama in years after its leader Bo was removed last month.

The Briton is believed to have been a close business associate of Bo. A Foreign Office spokesman said: "We welcome the fact that the Chinese are investigating this case; indeed we had called for this to happen. We will await the conclusion of their investigations."

## Woman charged with faking cancer for NY wedding

WHITE PLAINS, 11 April—Strangers donated the beautifully embroidered wedding dress, the two rings, the honeymoon time-share in Aruba. They acted quickly, too, because the bride was dying of cancer. Or so she said. The state attorney general's office announced Tuesday that Jessica Vega, 25, has been indicted on charges of fraud and grand larceny for getting her "dream wedding" by falsely claiming she was dying of leukemia.

"By pretending to have a terminal illness, Vega inexcusably took advantage of the community's hearts and minds, and profited off of their generosity," said Attorney General Eric Schneiderman. "Our office will hold this individual accountable for fleecing the public through lies and deception." Vega, formerly of Montgomery, NY, was arrested in Virginia on 3 April, extradited to New York and arraigned Friday in Orange County Court in Goshen. She pleaded not guilty. A call to the Legal Aid firm that represented her was not immediately returned. Among the alleged victims listed in the indictment is the Nu-Cavu restaurant in Wallkill, where the bridal reception was held and wine and appetizers worth more than \$1,000 were donated. Part-owner Carmela Vitolo-Gelsomine said, "We tried to do the best we could for her. We thought she was in a situation where she needed help." Others listed as victims are the boutique that donated the wedding dress, and a woman who volunteered to do hair and makeup for the bride and seven bridesmaids. — INTERNET

## NASA scientist says mystery fireball in Texas actually a jet contrail

WASHINGTON, 11 April — A bright object that streaked across the Texas sky during the day 4 April, originally believed to be a meteor burning up as it entered Earth's atmosphere, was actually a flying jet and its contrail, a NASA scientist has confirmed. Local news stations reported that the bright object was a fireball (an especially bright meteor) and Bill Cooke, head of NASA's Meteoroid Environment Office, initially said it was indeed a fireball, and more evidence of the mysterious and unexplained observation that there are more fireballs in the spring than other times of

the year. However, other experts argued that the Texas fireball was actually a jet contrail reflecting the glow of the setting sun, making it appear fiery. Cooke has agreed. "Reviewing the video, it does appear to be a contrail," he told Life's Little Mysteries. "There were sightings of a daytime meteor 2 April but this video is not of a meteor/fireball. Different event." The 2 April daytime fireball — a rare event, as a meteor must be at least one yard across for its atmospheric entry to be visible during the day — was seen by thousands of people in New Zealand. — *Internet*

## Korean Air says jet diverted in Canada after threat

SEOUL, 11 April — A Korean Air passenger jet made an emergency landing at a Canadian military airbase after a call centre in the United States received a threat by telephone late on Tuesday, the airline said.

Korean Air flight 72, which was en route to South Korean Capital Seoul, diverted to the Comox base on Vancouver Island in Canada's Pacific Province British Columbia, soon after takeoff from Vancouver, the airline said in a statement released on Wednesday in Seoul.

"The (Korean Air) US call centre received a call that there was a threat on board the aircraft," Korean Air said in a statement. A

Korean Air spokeswoman could not confirm whether it was a bomb threat, as earlier reported by Canadian media. The plane, a Boeing 777, had 147 people including 134 passengers on board, the airline said.

Two US fighter jets, which took off from Portland, Oregon, intercepted it and shadowed it until it landed at the Canadian base, the Pentagon said in a statement.

"The airline will decide about the continuation of the flight after discussion with the airport and related authorities," Korean Air said.

But we must understand their politeness does not mean that we have become trustworthy and reliable people, or that we are a particularly important person. It only means that we also must show our politeness to the same degree.

These are some of the tips to deal with our Northeastern Asian friends, and we are sure that our entrepreneurs and their representatives have more information and knowledge on this field.

Our country, Myanmar on her part is in transition to democracy seeking greater international cooperation that will bring progress in the sectors from capacity building to infrastructural development the foundations for our sustainable economic growth.

So we will keep on finding common ground with global partners including the people from northeast Asia in our own interest.

We need to learn their ways of doing business and emulate their working spirit, discipline, patriotism, zeal and intelligence. Some even say that *Koreans* are the only people in the world who can make the Japanese look lazy. So we can imagine how hardworking they are and their fast growing economy bears witness to this fact.

## China returns to trade surplus in March

BEIJING, 11 April — China said on Tuesday it recorded a trade surplus last month, reversing a massive deficit in February, but exports were still weak owing to economic woes in major overseas markets.

The country recorded a trade surplus of \$5.35 billion in March, as exports rose 8.9 percent to \$165.66 billion for the month, Chinese customs said in a statement on its website. Imports rose just 5.3 percent to \$160.31 billion in March, it said.

The Asian giant's trade figures are politically sensitive, with Beijing and Washington embroiled in a long-running dispute over the value of the yuan, which US politicians say is kept artificially low to help Chinese exporters.

In February, China posted a huge deficit of \$31.48 billion — the largest in more than a decade — as it felt the ripples from the debt crisis in Europe and the stuttering recovery in the United States. Analysts had predicted a deficit of \$3.2 billion for March, according to Dow Jones Newswires. "The March surplus figure is relatively small as the deterioration in overseas markets since last year has continued to affect China's exports," Liao Qun, China economist for Citic Bank International, told AFP.

## Peru says rescue of nine trapped miners imminent

Ica, 11 April — Rescuers were closing in on nine workers trapped inside a wildcat mine in southern Peru on Tuesday and officials said they could be pulled to the surface within hours after spending five days underground. The men have been stuck about 656 feet below ground since the

Cabeza de Negro gold-and-copper mine partially collapsed on Thursday. They have been receiving oxygen and liquids through a giant hose in place since before the accident.

"We have a couple of meters (feet) left to go," Mines and Energy Minister Jorge Merino told reporters at the

site monitoring the digging operation. "We've advanced six meters (19.5 feet) in a tunnel that's eight meters (26 feet) long." The cave-in spurred calls to formalize Peru's vast informal mining sector, which generates as much as \$2 billion a year in income, according to private estimates.

## Gas production in Azerbaijan to reach 50 bln cubic meters by 2025

BAKU, 11 April — The volume of gas production in Azerbaijan will reach 50 billion cubic meters per year by the end of 2025, President of the State Oil Company of Azerbaijan (Socar) Rovnag Abdullaev said here Tuesday at the opening of a business forum on Oil Gas Processing.

According to Socar president, total gas production in Azerbaijan is projected to grow to 30 billion cubic meters per year by 2015 and reach 50 billion cubic meters per year by the end of 2025.

Growth in domestic natural gas production will increase the importance of Azerbaijan in ensuring regional and European energy security. With natural gas imports in Europe projected to be 70 percent by 2020, the role of Azerbaijan in ensuring Europe's energy security will increase even more, he said.

Abdullaev also said that Azerbaijan plans to start construction works on a new oil gas processing and petrochemical complex in the first quarter of 2013.

## Wash man on the run finds time to update Facebook

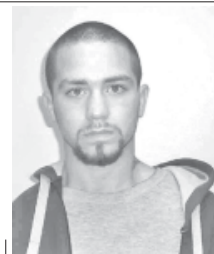

## Titanic's first-class menu recreated in Hong Kong

HONG KONG, 11 April — The Titanic was more than just the most advanced ship of its time. It was the paragon of turn-of-the-century style and luxury, when languid meals, dinner suits and fine china were de rigueur. Like the steel and steam engines that made the liner an engineering wonder, the Titanic's more perishable finery now lies 12,400 feet

(3,780 metres) down in the darkness of the North Atlantic.

But some of it will be brought back to life, including a bottle of champagne salvaged from the wreck, when the Hullett House hotel in Hong Kong recreates the Titanic's last meal to mark the disaster's 100th anniversary on Saturday. Eight diners will pay HK\$15,000 (\$1,930) each

for the 10-course banquet based on the original menu, executive chef Philippe Orrico told AFP. The highlight will be a bottle of Heidsieck & Co Monopole Gout American vintage 1907, brought up from the frigid depths in pristine condition in 1998 and purchased by the hotel for more than \$11,000.

"One day, I was researching different kinds of (historical) menus we could use, and I found the menu of the Titanic," Orrico said. "The menu was saved by someone in first class. This year, we thought it would be interesting and funny to recreate the menu because it's 100 years since the sinking of the boat." The meal begins with oysters in vodka sauce, followed by a consommé Olga made with scallops, slow-cooked poached salmon, sautéed chicken and lamb with mint sauce, punch romaine — served as a palette cleanser — then finishing with a Waldorf pudding with ice cream.— Internet

## BAA March traffic boosted by emerging market growth

LONDON, 11 April — Traffic at airports operated by BAA rose by 4 percent in March, compared with the same month in 2011, helped by Easter being earlier this year and strong growth on routes to emerging markets. BAA, which is Britain's main airport operator and majority owned by Spanish infrastructure group Ferrovial, on Wednesday said 8.6 million passengers travelled through its airports last month.

The company said 5.7 million passengers passed through London Heathrow — Europe's busiest airport — last month, 6.9 percent up on last March. "That increase means Heathrow saw more than 70 million passengers over a twelve month period for the first time," BAA Chief Executive Colin Matthews said in a statement. "Traffic from Heathrow to the BRIC (Brazil, Russia, India and China) countries saw growth compared with March last year, with an increase of 62.3

percent in traffic to and from Brazil." BAA said Heathrow's performance was particularly notable for the 4.2 percentage point increase in load factor — how full planes leaving the airport are — to 73.4 percent compared

to March last year. The increase was also helped by Easter being earlier this year, with a substantial proportion of pre-Easter traffic falling in March rather than in April last year.

## Cameron in Indonesia to finalise Airbus deal



Prime Minister David Cameron arrived Wednesday in Indonesia, where he will finalise a \$2.5 billion deal between Garuda and Airbus as the European plane maker looks to tap the growing economy.— INTERNET

JAKARTA, 11 April — David Cameron arrived on Wednesday in Indonesia, where he will finalise a \$2.5 billion deal between Garuda and Airbus as the European plane maker looks to tap the growing economy. The trip is the latest leg of Cameron's trade mission around Asia, along with a posse of businessmen, as he looks to offset sluggish growth at home and in the troubled European economy.

"The \$2.5 billion deal for 11 A330-300 planes will be signed later today at the presidential palace," Garuda President Emir Syah Sar

told AFP. Indonesia's presidential spokesman Teuku Faizasyah told AFP the deal with the airline, which is majority owned by the state, would be the "highlight" of Cameron's visit. The agreement is the second in a year between the two after Garuda ordered 25 medium-range A320 Airbus planes for a catalogue price of \$2.18 billion.

The latest deal will be a boost to Garuda as it embarks on an expansion drive less than two years after the EU lifted a ban on the airline operating in European airspace over safety fears. It will also be more than welcome for Airbus, which has only secured firm orders for 90 planes in the first quarter of 2012, compared with more than 400 for US rival Boeing.

Cameron will also likely push military sales, after Britain banned defence exports to Indonesia in 1999 following accusations that British-made Hawk fighters were used in counter-insurgency attacks in East Timor, then an Indonesian Province.— Internet

## Delhi helmet law takes deadly toll on women

NEW DELHI, 11 April — Priya Mahindroo, 25, zips through New Delhi traffic on the back of a motorbike every day to get to work. While the law mandates a helmet for her male driver, as a woman she can legally go without.

Campaigners are becoming increasingly vocal about the consequences of this anomaly which results in dozens of lives needlessly lost each year as well as thousands of serious injuries that wreck families and burden hospitals.

Others see it as a sad reflection on patriarchal Indian values: that women are men's inferiors, their lives simply worth less in a country with a culture of celebrating sons over daughters. For women such as Mahindroo, however, the considerations are mostly aesthetic and unless she is forced to wear a helmet by law, she'll continue to ride some of the world's most dangerous streets with her head unprotected. "It ruins my hair," she told AFP in New Delhi as she arrived for work at her newspaper's office in the busy central area of the

city. "I don't wear a helmet because I feel really hot and suffocated inside so I don't really think about the safety."

India's federal Motor Vehicles Act of 1988 stated that every person driving or riding a two-wheeler had to wear a helmet, but this sparked an uproar from the Sikh community which raised religious objections. Sikh men were later exempted, largely because of the religious demand for them to wear turbans.

The local New Delhi government decided it was impossible to tell a Sikh woman from a non-Sikh and so made helmets optional for all female motorcycle riders. About 133,938 people or 366 a day died on India's roads in 2010, according to the National Crime Records Bureau, more than any other country.

## Power firms to inform clients of best tariffs

LONDON, 11 April — Britain's main energy suppliers from autumn will regularly inform customers about the best available tariffs to enable households to better meet their specific needs, the government said on Wednesday. The commitments secured by the government will mean that the big six energy companies — EDF, E.ON, British Gas, Scottish and Southern Energy, Scottish Power and RWE nPower — will write to customers every year to specifically tell them what the best tariff is for them and how to get it, Deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg said on Wednesday in London.

"As of this autumn, your supplier will have to contact you with the best tariff for

your needs. And if you call them, they'll have to offer you the best deal too," Clegg said, adding that energy companies had also confirmed a commitment to simplify tariffs. The government said that vulnerable customers who are assisted by the Warm Home Discount scheme would be contacted twice a year.

Clegg also said the government was working with consumer groups to make it easier for people to club together and switch suppliers. "Consumers will be able to use their collective purchasing power to bring down bills," he said. With over 120 different energy tariffs on offer, seven out of 10 customers are currently not on the best tariff for them, according to the government.— Reuters

## Australian mum completes in 660km outback run

SYDNEY, 11 April — A 51-year-old mother said Wednesday she felt "fantastic" but tired after becoming the first woman to run across Australia's Simpson Desert, enduring searing temperatures on the 660 kilometre journey. Intensive care nurse Jane Trumper had attempted the 410-mile run last year, only to be stopped at 352 kilometres (220 miles) by bushfires. Trumper said the relentless desert heat had been difficult on the run which began at the geographical centre of Australia in the Northern Territory, detoured through South Australia and ended in Birdsville, southwest Queensland.

"It was 45 degrees (Celsius, 113 degrees Fahrenheit) on the first day and I really had doubts about whether I would absolutely get this thing done," she told the Australian Broadcasting Corporation. "No female has ever done it, so I think that was in the back of my mind that it would be good to do something that no one has ever done." Sydney-based Trumper had to run 750 kilometres in total because of a detour caused by recent heavy rains. According to her blog, she completed the run on Tuesday after 10 days. The ultramarathon runner, who was raising money for a Sydney children's hospital charity, said she was happy with how she felt after the run.

"It was the heat, the flies and the last couple of days I had a headwind, so the running was very, very slow," Trumper told the ABC. "I actually feel fantastic. I am a bit croaky, with all the dust from the last couple of days, with the wind. "My calves are tight, there's a couple of blisters on my feet — but pretty good really." Trumper was accompanied by two vehicles, with two supporters in each, on the journey during which she knew she would be facing snakes and extreme heat.

## British man allegedly fathered up to 600 children through sperm bank donations

New DNA tests suggest the owner of a British fertility clinic may have fathered as many as 600 children, while keeping his donations a secret. And in an even stranger twist, one of his newly discovered offspring says the man's belief in eugenics may have been behind the decision.

The Telegraph reports that Bertold Wiesner and his wife operated a fertility clinic in the 1940s and were responsible for helping more

than 1,500 families conceive. Two of the children conceived through clinic donations, Barry Stevens and David Gollancz, took part in DNA testing that revealed both were conceived using Wiesner's sperm. "Using standard figures for the number of live births which result, including allowances for twins and miscarriages, I estimate that he is responsible for between 300 and 600

children," Gollancz told the paper.

Eighteen people conceived through the clinic between 1943 and 1962 were tested, with about two-thirds of them matching Wiesner's DNA. However, it's nearly impossible to determine exactly how many of the 1,500 children came directly from Wiesner, since his wife Mary Barton reportedly destroyed the records from the clinic.



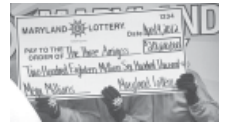

## Three Baltimore school employees split Mega Millions jackpot

Two Maryland public school teachers and a school administrator have claimed the second of three Mega Millions jackpot tickets, according to officials. The self-described "Three Amigos" say they plan to purchase new homes, start children's college funds and organize trips to Europe. Their winning was one of three jackpot tickets sold for the record-breaking \$656 million jackpot awarded on 30 March.

"If it can't be you, these people are precisely the people you would want to see win," said Maryland Lottery director Stephen Martino. The three winners have chosen to remain anonymous but did allow the lottery officials to reveal some details about them. All three reportedly currently work multiple jobs just to pay their

monthly bills. Even with their newfound fortunes, all three told Martino that they would keep their jobs at the school. "One said 'I can't give up on my kids,'" he said.



Martino said the three winners did indulge in a laugh over Marlinde Wilson, who has infamously claimed to have purchased the winning ticket and stashed it inside a Baltimore-area McDonald's. Wilson has reportedly retracted her story. The three actual winners purchased 60 tickets at the 7-Eleven store where Mega Millions officials say the winner was purchased. Each of the three winners will receive a lump sum of \$35 million after taxes.

## Simpsons creator Matt Groening spills Springfield secret

The creator of the iconic cartoon sitcom The Simpsons has finally revealed the inspiration behind the show's fictional town of Springfield. Matt Groening told Smithsonian magazine he based the town on Springfield, Oregon, but since it is such a common US place name he knew many would think it was their own Springfield. The Springfield question is one of the best-kept secrets in TV history.

The Simpsons is the longest-running show in the US, on air for since 1989. Characters in the show have often joked about hiding

Springfield's real location. "In anticipation of the success of the show, I thought: 'This will be cool, everyone will think it's their Springfield.' And they do," Mr Groening said. There are thought to be at least 34 towns or cities called Springfield in the US.

Mr Groening also said he was inspired by the TV show Father Knows Best, which was set in a place called Springfield. But the Springfield in Oregon is just 100 miles (160km) south of Portland, the city where Mr Groening grew up.

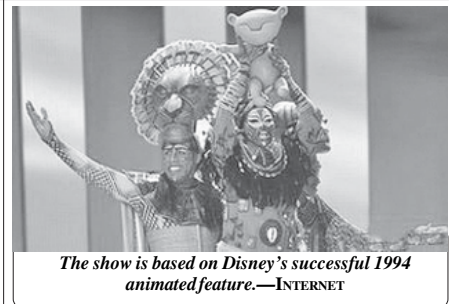

## Barcelona pile pressure on Real with Getafe romp

BARCELONA, 11 April — Defending champions Barcelona upped the pressure on leaders Real Madrid on Tuesday as they moved to within a point of their bitter rivals after a 4-0 thumping of Getafe. "Our work is done here, lets wait and see what Madrid do tomorrow night in their game," he said. However coach Pep Guardiola was cautious about talking about his team's title chances.—Internet

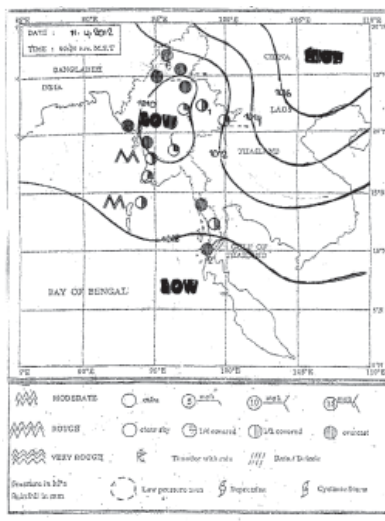

JAKARTA, 11 April— Small tsunami waves of around one meter hit the western coast of Indonesia's Sumatra island on Wednesday after a series of major earthquakes, though the country's disaster agency said it was still assessing whether there were any deaths or damage.

The agency expects the worst impact to have been on Simeulue island off Sumatra and forecasts further small aftershocks in the country's westernmost region, but it has lifted its tsunami alert for an area which was devastated by a tsunami in 2004.

**Liverpool recall keeper, Dalglish dismisses crisis talk**

LONDON, 11 April— Liverpool will recall youngster Peter Gulacsi from a loan spell at Hull City to help them cope with a goalkeeping shortage ahead of Saturday's FA Cup semi-final against Everton.

Liverpool manager Kenny Dalglish will have to field third-choice Brad Jones in the all-Merseyside clash at Wembley Stadium because both of his senior keepers are suspended.

But he dismissed talk of a crisis following the 3-2 win

at Blackburn Rovers on Tuesday. "We don't have a problem going in with any players, no problem whatsoever," he told reporters.

Kulacsi, a 21-year-old Hungarian who joined Liverpool five years ago but has never made a first team appearance, has spent time on loan at Hereford United, Tranmere Rovers and Hull. "Goalkeeper Peter Gulacsi is set to be recalled from his loan spell with the Tigers by parent club

Liverpool," Hull said on their official Twitter feed on Wednesday.

Liverpool's first choice keeper Spaniard Pepe Reina is suspended after being sent off at Newcastle United in a Premier League game on 1 April.

Back-up Alexander Doni, who made his long-awaited debut against Aston Villa on Saturday, is banned after the Brazilian was shown a red card at Blackburn.

**Hailstorms leave three dead, 25 injured in China**

NANCHANG, 11 April— Hailstorms have battered parts of eastern and southwestern China, leaving three people dead and 25 others injured, local authorities said Wednesday.

In East China's Jiangxi province, hailstorms struck some areas from Tuesday morning to Wednesday morning, resulting in the

deaths of three people and affecting the livelihood of 170,000 rural residents, a spokesman with the Jiangxi Provincial Department of Civil Affairs said.

Storms have also forced the evacuation of more than 700 people, destroyed about 2,700 hectares of crops and damaged more than 900 houses, the spokesman

added. In southwestern Guizhou province, hailstorms hit 47 villages in Taijiang county Tuesday night, leaving 25 residents injured, including two severely injured, a county government spokesman said.

The hailstones were as large as 3.5 cm in diameter and weighed 18 grams on average, the spokesman said.

Power supplies and telecommunications networks have also been disrupted, he said.

Local authorities have dispatched teams to oversee relief operations in those areas, according to the spokesman.

NAY PYI TAW, 11 April—At the peace invitation of the government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, armed national races groups have been holding peace talks with the government, at respective regions.

## NASA views our perpetual ocean



SCIENCE DAILY, 11 April—The swirling flows of tens of thousands of ocean currents were captured in this scientific visualization created by NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md.

“There is also a 20-minute long tour, which shows these global surface currents in more detail,” says Horace Mitchell, the lead of the visualization studio. “We also released a three-minute version on our NASA Visualization Explorer iPad app.”

The visualization covers the period June 2005 to

December 2007 and is based on a synthesis of a numerical model with observational data, created by a NASA project called Estimating the Circulation and Climate of the Ocean, or ECCO for short. ECCO is a joint project between the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif. ECCO uses advanced mathematical tools to combine observations with the MIT numerical ocean model to obtain realistic descriptions of how ocean circulation evolves over time.

These model-data syntheses are among the largest computations of their kind ever undertaken. They are made possible by high-end computing resources provided by NASA's Ames Research Center in Moffett Field, Calif.

## Rudisha plans only three races before London Games

LONDON, 11 April—Kenya's 800 metres world record holder David Rudisha plans to run no more than three races before the London Olympics, starting with the opening Diamond League meeting in Doha next month. Rudisha is favourite to add the Olympic title to his world crown won in Daegu last year. However, he told reporters on Wednesday his style of running from the front made it difficult to sustain his form.

“It's hard to maintain and always to win races especially with my way of

running,” the 23-year-old said in a conference call from his training base in Iten, Kenya.

“I know it's going to be tough and that's why I want to race in Doha and see how it goes and from there I can discuss and see if I want to try another one.

“But probably I don't think I can do more than three (races) before the Olympics,” added Rudisha, who started as a 400 metres runner before switching to the two-lap race and has not discounted running the relay in London.

“I think I can do that,” he said when asked about taking part in the 4x400 metres. The London Olympics, which open on July 27, will the first Games for Rudisha after he missed out on Beijing four years ago when he suffered an injury before the Kenyan trials.

His father Daniel won silver at the 1968 Mexico City Games as part of Kenya's 4x400 metres relay team and Rudisha is keen to add to the family's Olympic medal haul.
