Now we all are in festive mood again, as we are celebrating Myanmar New Year festival for six days this year. In the wards, little boys and little girls are splashing water over the people while adults are filling their tubs and giving protection to these kids. Revelers mostly teens go around town in search of water-throwing pavilions that are also entertaining the public with dances and songs.

Decorated floats roam cities and towns presenting dance and songs the whole day till night during the festival. There are also decorated float competitions and decorated water-throwing pavilion contests in big cities like Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon and Mandalay and in many major towns. Film stars and pop idols also join in the festival entertaining the general public with songs and dances from the stages of water-throwing pavilions or on the decorated floats. On the final day or the New Year Day of the festival people focus only one doing meritorious deeds. They release fish, birds and other animals, help senior citizens at their homes or at the homes for the aged, provide sanitation services at pagodas, visit monasteries or seek Dhamma from monks.

So every year we Buddhists celebrate Thingyan with more pious deeds than fun.

### Three killed in train accident in Germany

BERLIN, 13 April—Three people were killed and 13 others were injured when a regional train collided with a works engine near the German town of Offenbach on Friday, the BBC reported.

A total of 35 passengers were onboard the train travelling from Frankfurt to Hanau when the train ran into a maintenance crane on the track.

The train driver and two members of a construction crew were killed, German media reported. Seven people were taken to hospital with severe injuries.

### Chinese state councilor meets N Ireland leaders to boost cultural, educational cooperation

BELFAST, 13 April—Chinese State Councilor Liu Yandong met Northern Ireland's First Minister Peter Robinson and Deputy First Minister Martin McGuinness here Thursday to discuss cultural and educational cooperation.

Liu said Sino-British relations have maintained a sound development momentum over recent years with frequent high-level visits between the two countries, which helped to strengthen mutual political trust.

Trade and investment between the two countries have also increased against the backdrop of the financial crisis, while cooperation has been increasingly diversified, Liu said.

As China is undergoing the largest scale of industrialization and urbanization in history and adjusting its structure and methods to meet the goal of development in a scientific way, its market is maturing and expanding with more and more enterprises looking for overseas investment, the Chinese state councilor said. At the same time, she said the number of Chinese tourists and students to Britain has also increased.

Northern Ireland has a convenient geographic location, a strong industrial base and rich cultural heritage, she said, adding that relations between China and Northern Ireland are getting closer, and that there have been more grounds for common interests and more opportunities for cooperation.

Liu also said she would like to see Northern Ireland further promote itself in China and help more Chinese to learn more about the British region. She believed that deepening cultural and educational exchanges between China and Britain will promote the understanding and mutual trust between the two governments and peoples.

Upon welcoming Liu, Robinson said, "Our relationship with China has steadily enhanced over recent years, and this is bringing benefit for all our communities."

He said Liu was the highest-ranking Chinese official to visit Northern Ireland since the establishment of Sino-British diplomatic ties, adding that he believed "this will be the start of many visits between our governments, institutions and citizens," Robinson said.

"We are keen to develop our cultural, business and academic links with China, and we look forward to welcoming the Chinese Artistic Gymnastics Team for pre-Olympic training in Lisburn later this summer," McGuinness said.

### Japan reactor restart debate swells beyond nuclear frontline

OTSU, 13 April—Japan's nuclear power industry had never spent much time or money winning over the hearts and minds of people like Susumu Takahashi, a fisherman angling for small sweetfish from the serene shores of Lake Biwa, a world away from any nuclear reactor.

But with the industry paralyzed after last year's Fukushima nuclear disaster, and badly in need of public trust to get moving again, it

may wish it had gone to the trouble.

"If Lake Biwa gets contaminated, then that would be irreversible," said Takahashi, a doctor who regularly casts his line into the mountain-ringed lake in western Shiga prefecture, which contains none of Japan's 54 nuclear reactors but sits next to Fukui prefecture which hosts 13 of them.

"The lake is in our hands now but it is also for future

generations, and contamination would be passed down for generations.—Reuters

### Two coast guard members shot dead at Alaska base

ANCHORAGE, 13 April—Two members of the Coast Guard were shot dead at a communications station on Alaska's Kodiak Island, prompting an investigation by the FBI and a lockdown of the base, officials said on Thursday. The Federal Bureau of Investigation said there was no immediate evidence of terrorism or sabotage, but a security alert was in force at the installation because the circumstances surrounding the deaths were unclear.

FBI and Coast Guard officials declined to say whether investigators believed they were dealing with a double homicide or a murder-suicide. The deaths marked the first fatal shootings at a Coast Guard facility in Alaska in over a decade. "Since we don't have all the details, we strongly advise that all Kodiak residents remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity to local law enforcement officials," Captain Jesse Moore, base commanding officer, said in a statement soon after the slayings were first reported.

"We are deeply saddened that we lost two shipmates.—Reuters

### Shell says Gulf of Mexico sheen dissipating

HOUSTON, 13 April—Royal Dutch Shell said an oil sheen near two of its offshore Gulf of Mexico oil and natural gas platforms was dissipating Thursday, and it was "very confident" its installations were not to blame. The Hague-based company said the "orphan spill," estimated to be about six barrels of oil, was breaking up. Shell said it would continue

to monitor the sea floor with a pair of underwater robots.

"Shell's subsea surveillance today and tomorrow will continue to determine if there is a connection between natural seeps and this orphan sheen," the company said. News of the sheen, first reported to US regulators on Wednesday, came nearly two years after BP Plc's deep sea Macondo well blew out on 20 April, 2010, killing 11 workers and spewing more than 4 million barrels of oil into the Gulf of Mexico. The earlier drop in the company's London-listed share price showed that investors remain anxious over potential oil accidents two years after the BP offshore spill, the worst ever in the United States.

Shares of Shell traded on the New York Stock Exchange closed up 11 cents on Thursday at \$67.86. The stock closed down less than 1 percent in London after falling as much as 5 percent earlier in the day, temporarily erasing roughly \$12 billion in value from Europe's largest oil company by market capitalization.—Reuters

### Indonesia quake a record, risks for Aceh grow

SINGAPORE, 13 April — The powerful undersea earthquake off the Indonesian island of Sumatra this week was a once-in-2,000-year event, and although it resulted in only a few deaths, it increases the risks of a killer quake in the region, a leading seismologist said. Wednesday's 8.6 magnitude quake and a powerful aftershock were "strike-slip" quakes and the largest of that type recorded, Kerry Sieh, director of the Earth Observatory of Singapore, told Reuters. "It's a really an exceptionally large and rare event," he said.

"Besides it being the biggest strike-slip earthquake

ever recorded, the aftershock is the second biggest as far as we can tell," said Sieh, who has studied the seismically active, and deadly, fault zones around Sumatra for years. Strike-slip quakes involve the horizontal movement of colliding earth plates, and are typically less powerful than those where there is vertical movement. They are also less likely to trigger big tsunamis, or tidal waves. A magnitude 9.1 quake in roughly the same region on Boxing Day in 2004 decimated Aceh province on Sumatra and killed over 230,000 people in 13 countries around the Indian Ocean.

Sumatra, the western-

most island in the sprawling Indonesian archipelago, has a history of powerful quakes and tsunamis, most triggered by an offshore zone along its entire length, where the Indian-Australian tectonic plate is forced under the Eurasian plate. This creates a deep ocean trench as one plate slides under the other at a rate of several centimeters a year. In this zone, called the Sunda megathrust, stress builds up when the subducting Indian-Australian plate bends the Eurasian plate like a spring board as it moves down into the Earth's crust.

Eventually enough stress builds up that the edge of

Eurasian plate suddenly jolts upward, triggering an earthquake.

## Contact lost with flagship Envisat spacecraft

PARIS, 13 April—Contact has been lost with the European Space Agency's (ESA) flagship Earth observation mission — Envisat. Controllers stopped receiving data from the eight-tonne spacecraft on Sunday, and have not as yet been able to re-establish communications. Envisat was launched in 2002 and is already operating five years beyond its planned

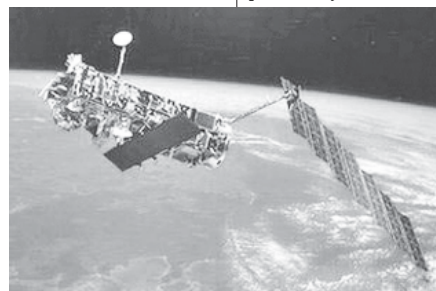
mission lifetime. ESA was expecting to turn off the spacecraft in 2014, once the first in a series of follow-ons had been launched.

A recovery team, which includes experts from industry, is now working to try to re-establish contact with the platform. It is not uncommon for communications with a satellite to be lost from time to time, and controllers will be encouraged that the spacecraft appears to be in a stable condition as it moves around the globe from pole to pole. Envisat has been at the forefront of European Earth observation endeavours for a decade.

It carries 10 sophisticated instruments to monitor the

land, the oceans, Earth's ice cover and its atmosphere.

The mission is due to be



replaced by the Sentinel series of satellites.

The first of these — Sentinel 1 — is supposed to take over the radar duties of Envisat when it is launched

## Satellite mapping pinpoints penguin population

SYDNEY, 13 April— Counting emperor penguins in their icy Antarctic habitat was not easy until researchers used new technology to map the birds from space, and they received a pleasant penguin surprise for their efforts. Using satellite mapping with resolution high enough to distinguish ice shadows from penguin poo, an international team has carried out what they say is an unprecedented penguin census from the heavens over the past three years. The good news was that the team found the Antarctic emperor penguin population numbered about 595,000, nearly double previous estimates.

But the bad news was that some colonies have disappeared altogether due to changing weather patterns and the long-term future of the birds is far from assured. "Yes, this is the first comprehensive census of a species taken from space, absolutely," said Barbara Wienecke, a sea bird ecologist with the Australian Antarctic Division (AAD) who spoke with Reuters by phone from the Aurora Australis research vessel. Previous counts have been inaccurate due to rough terrain that made some colonies inaccessible and frigid temperatures that can plummet to -50 degrees Celsius (-58 Fahrenheit).

## Bird-like dinosaur found with eggs in Patagonia

said they expected the eggs, which were fertilised and well-developed, to help explain how birds evolved from dinosaurs. Some of the eggs were probably still inside the mother dinosaur when she died — other eggs were nearby.

The new species, Bonapartenykus ultimus, is a member of the small, long-legged, fast-moving Alvarezsaurid dinosaur family, they report in Cretaceous Research. Although the link to modern-day birds has been disputed in the past, palaeontologist Fernando Novas said the current batch of bones resembled the skeleton of the Nandu, a modern flightless bird of the Rhea genus, native to Patagonia.—Internet

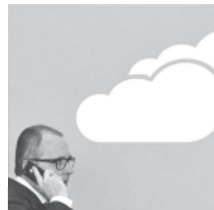
## Microsoft wins its biggest cloud computing client

LONDON, 13 April — Microsoft announced its biggest-ever customer for cloud computing—software that it hosts on behalf of clients and delivers over the Internet — after winning a contract to provide free services to a major Indian education body.

Microsoft, which was built on the sale of expensive software that is installed on individual computers, has been forced by competition from Google and others to branch out into the fast-growing world of cloud computing. The US software giant said on Thursday it would provide its Live@edu

and collaboration software to more than 7 million students and half a million teachers through a deal with the All India Council for Technical Education.

The service, which Microsoft is providing for free as part of its education initiative, includes email, Office Web applications, instant messaging and storage. For users, cloud computing is inexpensive and simple, because it removes the need to spend time and money on installing software and managing servers. Large government departments are prime targets for vendors such

as Microsoft and Google. Last June, Microsoft unveiled a revamped online version of its hugely profitable Office software suite.—Reuters

## Google stock split helps Page, Brin maintain grip

SAN FRANCISCO, 13 April— Google Inc announced a stock split designed to preserve the control of co-founders Larry Page and Sergey Brin over the world's No 1 Web search engine, asking investors to trust their long-term vision. The surprise decision, which its board unanimously approved, came as the company exceeded Wall Street's profit expectations but revealed a worrying 12 percent drop in search advertising rates — the second consecutive quarterly decline. Shares of Google, which finished Thursday's regular session at \$651.01, rose to \$653 in after-hours trading.

The announcement came just as Page completed a year in the chief executive's seat for the second time, during which he spearheaded the \$12.5 billion acquisition of Motorola Mobility and launched a social network to take on Facebook. "This stock split dividend, a dividend of a non-voting

shares, is really just so the company can maintain control," BGC analyst Colin Gillis said. "Plus, you have another quarter with a disturbing drop in click prices. OK, paid clicks are up but people are paying less for them. We had smartphones before the December quarter. If we want to blame it all on smartphones, that's a little disconcerting."

Google said its board of directors has approved a 2-for-1 stock split. Investors will get a dividend of one share of the new, non-voting "Class C" stock for each existing Google share. The new shares, to be listed on Nasdaq under a separate ticker, will be available for corporate uses such as equity-based compensation for employees, in which case they would not dilute the share base. "When we went public, we created a dual-class voting structure," Page said in a letter explaining the moves. "Our goal was to maintain the freedom to focus on the long term by ensuring that the management team, in particular Eric, Sergey and I, retained control over Google's destiny," the letter said.

## EU investigates Internet's spread to more devices

BRUSSELS, 13 April — The European Commission is extending a probe into the spread of the Internet. The regulator says it expects an explosion in the number of household appliances and other devices connected to the net before 2020. It is launching a consultation over controls of the way information is gathered, stored and processed, saying it wants to "ensure the rights of individuals are respected".

The public is being invited to send in its views before a 12 July deadline. The commission says that the average person living within the 27-nation bloc has at least two devices connected to the net at present — typically a computer and smartphone. It expects the figure to rise to seven by 2015, with a total of 25 billion wirelessly connected to the net worldwide. By the end of the decade it says that could climb to 50 billion.

"If a university teacher cancels a morning lecture because they are sick, students' alarm clocks and coffee machines could automatically be reset," it gives as an example. "If an elderly person forgets to take an essential pill, a warning message could be sent to a close family member." "People need to know and trust that this sort of change is one they are comfortable with, and it's important to have that conversation now," a spokesman told the BBC.—Internet

## More unmarried couples having babies

WASHINGTON, 13 April— More unmarried women who live with their partners are having babies than ever before, a new government report shows. Twenty-seven percent of births between 2003 and 2010 were to such couples — a threefold increase from 1985, researchers from the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention found. “It’s thought that in births outside of marriage, one parent isn’t present. But our data is showing that a large proportion do have two parents, even though [they’re] not formally married,” said report author Gladys Martinez, a demographer in the CDC’s Division of Vital Statistics.

In addition, not only are many older women giving birth, but many also are having more than one child, she said. “We know that women have been delaying childbirth,” Martinez said.

“But there is also an increase in the number of older women who have more than one kid, and we would expect that to be even higher if we interviewed even older women,” Martinez noted that women who delay having children tend to be better educated. Nearly 60 percent of

women who did not complete high school had their first child as a teenager, compared with only 4 percent of women with a college degree. The data in the report was gathered from more than 22,000 interviews done between 2006 and 2010 with men and women aged 15 to 44. The data was compared with similar data from 2002, according to the CDC. “It’s surprising that so many unmarried couples are having children,” said Dr Christine Mullin, a reproductive endocrinologist and infertility specialist at the Centre for Human Re-production at North Shore-LIJ Health System in Manhasset, NY.

Mullin also noted that, for older women, having one child

is hard enough. Women who delay giving birth usually do so for education and career reasons, she added.

Other highlights of the report include:

\*Forty-three percent of women aged 15 to 44 had never had a baby.

\*Among men aged 15 to 44, 45 percent had fathered a child.

\*The average age at which women had their first child was 23; for men it was 25.

\*Almost 40 percent of women whose first birth occurred between the ages of 35 and 44 had at least two children; it was 26 percent in 1995.

\*Women between the ages of 40 and 44 had an average of 2.1 children.— *Internet*

## China economic growth dips to 8.1% in the first quarter

LONDON, 13 April — China’s economy, the world’s second-largest, has expanded at its slowest pace in almost three years. Gross domestic product increased by an annual rate of 8.1% in the first quarter, down from 8.9% in the previous three months.

That is less than many analysts had forecast with most of them expecting a figure closer to 8.3%. China has been hit by a drop in demand in key markets including the US and Europe. At the same time domestic demand has proved tough to stimulate. “We are slightly disappointed.

The main downside was with exports and some in terms of consumption,” said Kevin Lai of Daiwa Capital Markets.

On Thursday, the World Bank warned that China’s

economy may slow further in the coming months. “China’s gradual slowdown is expected to continue into 2012, as consumption growth slows somewhat, investment growth decelerates more pronouncedly and external demand remains weak,” said Ardo Hansson, the World Bank’s lead economist for China.

The bank cut its growth outlook for the Chinese economy for 2012 to 8.2% from its earlier projection of 8.4%. It cautioned that a slowdown in Beijing’s key export markets and “the ongoing correction in China’s property markets” were key risks to growth in the future.

The rise in property and consumer prices in the country has been the focus of China’s policymakers over

the past few months. The central bank has taken various measures to curb lending in an attempt to control consumer price growth and keep property prices in check. The measures appear to be having the desired effect.

The rate of inflation, which hit a three-year high of 6.5% in July last year, has since slowed down. Consumer prices in March rose by 3.6% from a year earlier, lower than the government’s target of 4% for the year.

At the same time, property prices have fallen for a five consecutive months, easing concerns about the formation of asset bubbles. However, analysts said that while the government’s policies had yielded positive results, authorities needed to ensure that they maintained a

## German MPs call for under-18 ban on cosmetic surgery

BERLIN, 13 April— Plastic surgery could be outlawed for under 18-year-olds unless medically necessary under a proposal by lawmakers from Germany’s ruling party, according to a document seen by AFP on Thursday. The politicians argue that going under the knife for breast enlargement or nose operations should be off the cards for minors, a draft position paper states.

“Even with a proper explanation, it is not guaranteed that the young person is aware of the full implication of the decision” to undergo plastic surgery, the lawmakers argue in their paper.

Behind the bid are officials dealing with health matters from Chancellor Angela Merkel’s Christian Democratic Union and its Bavarian sister party, the Christian Social Union. They want the proposed ban, revealed earlier by the Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung, to be wrapped into new patient-protection legislation.

It is due for discussion at a Friday gathering of party leaders.

The move was generally welcomed by medical associations.

“We support a ban on cosmetic surgery on children and young people,” vice president of the German Medical Association, Martina Wenker, told AFP. The German Society of Plastic, Re-constructive and Aesthetic Surgery (DGP-RAC) also basically gave the thumbs up but warned of the need for certain caveats.

“With a sweeping ban there’s the danger that patients for whom interventions are necessary for psychological reasons slip through the net,” a spokeswoman said.

## Mortgage rates hit new record lows

WASHINGTON, 13 April— The average rate for a 15-year fixed-rate mortgage hit a record low of 3.88 percent for the week ending on 12 April, according to Freddie Mac. The rate fell .10 percent from the previous week and is .01 percent below the previous 30-year mortgage rate of 3.87 record set in February. The average rate for 15-year mortgages fell to a record low 3.11 percent.

“Fixed mortgage rates eased for the third consecutive

week following long-term Treasury bond yields lower after a weaker than expected employment report for March,” Frank Nothaft, vice president and chief economist at Freddie Mac, said in a statement.

“Although the unemployment rate fell to the lowest reading since January 2009, the overall economy added just 120,000 new jobs in March, nearly half that of the market consensus forecast,” said Nothaft. “On a more positive note, the Federal Reserve reported hiring was steady, or showed a modest increase, across many of its Districts in its 11th April Beige Book of regional economic conditions.”

For the week ending 6 April, the Mortgage Bankers Association saw a 2.4 percent drop in mortgage applications from the previous week. But, there has been some bright spots in the real estate market. “The mild winter has helped lift expectations for the housing market after four years of sluggish sales,” according to the *Associated Press*. “January and February made up the best winter for re-sales in five years, when the housing crisis began. And builders in February requested the most permits to construct homes in more than three years,” according to the AP.

## Kraft discontinues Athenos Greek yogurt

NEW YORK, 13 April — Kraft Foods Inc is discontinuing its Athenos line of Greek yogurt, the company said on Thursday, exiting the fast-growing US Greek yogurt market. Athenos, which also makes feta cheese, hummus and pita chips, discontinued the yogurt in March. “Although we had a loyal following of Athenos Greek yogurt fans, we have decided to refocus our efforts on innovating new products for the Athenos brand,” a Kraft spokesman said in a statement. “We know that this is very disappointing to consumers, and it was an extremely difficult

decision for us to make.”

Sales of Greek yogurt, which is thicker and has more protein than other yogurt, have soared in the United States in the last few years. The market is dominated by privately held Agro Farna, whose Chobani brand has about a 60 percent share. Danone is second with 17 percent, followed by Greece-based Fage, and Yoplait owner General Mills. Kraft Foods is preparing to split into two companies — one focused on snack brands like Cadbury, Oreo and Ritz and one focused on grocery brands like Oscar Mayer, Maxwell House and Planters.— *Reuters*

# The Thingyan Days I Would Always Remember

My most memorable Thingyan days were when our family was still young. We had only two children then, a boy and a girl. The 3<sup>rd</sup> son was not yet born. Inside our compound in Yangon there is a well and when Thingyan comes around it became the rendezvous for both my 2 children and their friends (two girls) who lived opposite our house.



Every morning during Thingyan the children troops out with buckets and water guns ready to splash everyone passing by with Thingyan water. Our duty was to regularly refill the huge tub with water drawn from the well and keep an eye on them too. We had no electric motor to pump up the water from the well, just the old fashioned pulley system hanging on the crossbar above the well. My son would be armed with a water gun but the three girls would have small buckets in their hands. The children were so happy, splashing everyone in sight with Thingyan water.

Sometimes an overloaded Jeep or a small utility truck with revellers would detour into our small street to pick up someone. It was a great opportunity for the children to really engage in water fights: the revellers on the Jeep would taunt them or shout encouragement as they drive past. They might even throw back water from the huge drum they carried on their

vehicle. Then the children would be extra happy to get back the response.

But this happens occasionally only. Most of the time the children wait for someone coming back from the bazaar, or someone they knew from the street to venture out or the milkman on his daily rounds. But if they see a gang of more aggressive children, armed with more water

guns and assortment of armaments, advancing in the distance they would quickly steal inside the gates and hide behind the parents to emerge later after this gang had passed.

But one permanent victim of their assault was a young teenage boy, a little bit eccentric, who lived at the top of our street. He loves the children very much and the children are also not afraid of him, treating him as their very good friend. If there is nobody coming for the children to douse with water, he would volunteer. He would take off his shirt and parade up and down in front of the children and give them a chance to splash water on him. He would also make fun by sometimes soaping himself and letting the children pour water onto his head.

In the evening time there would be entertainment too. A visit to the prize awarding pandal situated near our house by the Kandawgyi Lake in the evening would also make the children happy. At



the pandal there would be dancing and singing. Sometimes a competing troupe on a gaily decorated float will be there. They would stage dancing and singing and thangyat (a form of satirical verses) and short plays. Heaving the children onto our shoulders so that they can see too we enjoyed these entertainments.

But the children are so tired by that time. And as we walked back home they

would become grouchy, grumpy and sleepy and we had to carry them home in our arms the whole way back.

And those were the Thingyan Days I always remember. Now the children are all grown-ups and we have become grandparents ourselves. But in our eyes they are still small children and tears well up in my eyes whenever I remember the Thingyan that was nearly 30 years ago.

## Police probe hacking of anti-terror hotline

LONDON, 13 April — British police said their communications remained secure on Thursday after hackers linked to the anti-establishment group Anonymous blocked an anti-terrorism hotline and illegally recorded a security unit's officers discussing their actions. An activist group called Team Poison jammed the hotline with repeated calls - so-called "phone bombing" - preventing those with genuine concerns from getting through in the latest

attack on a high-profile institution.

Recordings of the hoax calls to the hotline, which is manned by specially trained police, and of other officers apparently from London police's Counter Terrorism Command (CTC) discussing the attack have been put on the YouTube website. London's Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) said it had conducted an investigation and was confident its internal communication system had

not been penetrated. "We have throughout the day researched the allegation that the Anti-Terrorist Hotline had been 'hacked' and activists' claims that they were able to listen unrestricted to confidential communications," said Ailsa Beaton, director of information for the London police force.

"We are confident the MPS communications systems have not been breached and remain, as they always have been, secure.

## Iran offers Asia oil buyers easier credit terms

SINGAPORE, 13 April — Iran is offering Asian oil buyers, including India, easier credit terms to lure more business and counteract tough Western sanctions aimed at restricting the OPEC member's principal export, the *Financial Times* reported on Thursday.

Teheran has been offering a handful of potential customers in Asia 180 days of free credit, the newspaper said

quoting unnamed industry officials. Each month of credit amounted to a discount of roughly \$1.2 to \$1.5 a barrel. Despite its generous terms, Iran was struggling to find new customers, the FT said.

The United States and European Union have tightened sanctions on Iran's oil trade as they seek to reduce the flow of petrodollars and to force Teheran to halt a nuclear programme the West

suspects is intended to produce weapons.

Saudi Arabia and other leading Middle East oil producers extend 30 days of credit, and Teheran in the past has allowed importers such as China to pay in 60 to 90 days. Iran's offer of longer payment periods amounts to a discount of about 7.5 percent per \$118 barrel, the newspaper said.

## China, Fiji sign economic, technical cooperation deal

SUVA, 13 April — China and Fiji signed three documents here Friday, agreeing on further strengthening economic and technical cooperation.

The documents, which include an economic and technical cooperation agreement and two letters of exchange, were signed between Fiji's Prime Minister Voreqe Bainimarama and visiting Chinese Commerce Minister Chen Deming who is leading a

delegation on a 4-day visit to Fiji. Under one letter of exchange, China will help Fiji in its development of the Rice Industry Project in Vanua Levu, one of the Fijian Government's initiatives for the revival of the northern division's economy. This will result in the visit of a technical team comprising of eight experts from China that will conduct a feasibility study of what is required to keep the industry sustainable.—Xinhua

## Serbia finds stolen Cezanne worth \$100 million

BELGRADE/ZURICH, 13 April — Police in Serbia have recovered a painting by the French artist Paul Cezanne that was stolen at gunpoint from a Swiss museum four years ago, officials said on Thursday. Cezanne's *Boy in a Red Waistcoat*, which media said was worth more than \$100 million, was one of four paintings stolen from the E G Buehrle Collection in Zurich in 2008 by a trio of masked robbers who burst in just before closing time and told staff to lie on the floor while they took what they wanted.

The heist was one of the largest in the world at the time. Four men were arrested in the capital Belgrade and the southwestern town of Cacak on Wednesday in connection with the theft and

the director of the Buehrle collection confirmed the authenticity of the painting, the Zurich state prosecutor's

office said. At a Press conference in Belgrade, Miljko Radisavljevic, the special prosecutor for organized crime, said the suspects wanted to sell the painting, found in the door panel of a car, for as little as 3.5 million euros. "They received 2.8 million euros before the arrest," he said.

Boy in a Red Waistcoat, thought to have been painted in 1888, depicts a boy in traditional Italian dress wearing a red waistcoat, a blue handkerchief and a blue belt. Three other versions of the painting are in museums in the United States. Two of the stolen canvasses, one by Claude Monet and the other by Vincent Van Gogh, were recovered not long after the robbery, abandoned in a car.

## India to allow investment from Pakistan, open border post

NEW DELHI, 13 April — India has decided to allow foreign direct investment from Pakistan, India's trade minister said on Friday, hours before the two countries were due to open a trading post on the border in the latest sign of thawing economic ties.

Liberalizing heavily restricted trade and investment flows is now the driver of peace efforts between the neighbours, whose fragile ties were shattered in 2008.

"India has taken an in-principle decision, as a part of the process to deepen our economic engagement, to allow foreign direct investments from Pakistan in India," said Trade Minister Anand Sharma at a news conference with his Pakistani counterpart.

Despite thousands of years of shared history and culture and a combined population of 1.4 billion people, cross-border trade remains paltry - a legacy of three wars since their independence from Britain in 1947.

Under current rules, Pakistani citizens cannot directly invest in India. Investment flows are unlikely to surge, but the move will go some way to addressing concerns by Pakistani businessmen that India places too many restrictions on them.

More than 600 Pakistani businesses are in New Delhi this week at a trade fair to promote their products to the Indian market.

In the face of some domestic opposition, the government of Pakistan President Asif Ali Zardari last November vowed to grant India most favoured nation status, which ends restrictions that require most products to move via a third country.

The move was hailed by India and the two countries are now focused on resolving economic issues before moving on to more intractable problems such as the disputed region of Kashmir.

## UN asks Indonesia to step up fighting against malaria

JAKARTA, 13 April — The United Nations asked Indonesia to step up effort in fighting against malaria as part of the Millennium Development Goals, Indonesian deputy minister said here on Friday.

The request was delivered by the UN special envoy for fighting malaria Princess Astrid during meeting with Indonesian first lady Ani Bambang Yudhoyono at the State Palace here.

The UN expected Indonesia to raise the issue of malaria at the international forum such as ASEAN and G-20, Deputy Health Minister Ali Gufron said.

"Princess Astrid wants Indonesia to bring the issue of malaria at the international forum and make it one of the main agenda," he told a Press conference after the meeting.

Indonesia has taken part in the Roll Back Malaria Partnership, as the country applied several programme on fighting malaria.—Xinhua

**Chavez says he's 'doing very well' after treatment**

CARACAS, 13 April—Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez returned to Venezuela on Wednesday, saying he's "doing very well" following cancer treatment in Cuba. After flying in to Simon Bolivar International Airport, Chavez met with several. The president says he's been recovering well since surgery in February that removed a second tumor from his pelvic region.

He has regularly traveled to and from Cuba for cancer treatment since last June, when he says an initial surgery removed his first tumor, which was the size of a baseball. Chavez has not identified the type of cancer or the precise location where the two tumors were.

The 57-year-old leader has vowed to overcome cancer and win re-election on 7 Oct. His political foes argue Chavez is not fit to continue governing the country because his health is failing — an allegation the president vehemently denies. "We have less than six months before 7 Oct, let's get ready," said Chavez, urging government supporters to gear off for the crucial vote.— *Internet*

LONDON, 13 April — A third of parents spend between 10 and 49 hours a month per child ferrying their children about by car, a survey suggests. The AA Driving School poll of more than 6,000 parents found a minority (2%) spend at least 50 hours a month. The motoring organization said this was equivalent to many people's annual leave of 25 days a year. Mark Peacock, head of AA Driving School, said: "Mum and

dads' taxi is still very much in operation." He added: "Besides taking up a lot of time, parents driving habits can influence the drivers their children will become later in life so it's important they set a good example on these journeys. "Hopefully many of those hours spent driving the children to their activities will be re-paid when they are old enough to drive themselves and keen to get behind the wheel - even if it's just popping to the supermarket to help their mum out."

AA Driving School said that with the average number of children per family at 1.9 it meant many parents were spending nearly double the times given in the survey driving their children.

The AA/Populus research also found that just under a fifth (19%) of parents said they spend at least £1,200 a year per child on hobbies and activities, including the transport costs of getting them there.

Parents in London appeared to fork out the most, with one in 20 spending more than £200 per child every month on such activities. AA Driving School said that was equal to parents spending £43,200 for each offspring through their childhood up to the age of 18.

**Icann's internet suffix application deadline looms**

WASHINGTON, 13 April— Organizations wishing to buy web addresses ending in their brand names have until the end of Thursday to submit applications. For example, drinks giant Pepsi can apply for .pepsi, .gatorade or .tropicana as an alternative to existing suffixes such as .org or .com. Parties are able to request up to 50 web address endings. The Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers plans to publish application details on 30 April.

Companies had to sign up to its process by March to qualify for the upcoming deadline. It says 839 users are taking part. Canon and Google are among the companies to have said that they paid the

\$185,000 (£116,355) fees required to take part in the process. Nominet, the organization which manages .uk domains, confirmed it was also applying for .wales and .cymru. Successful applicants also face \$25,000 in costs per year to maintain the addresses.

"We plan to apply for Google's trademarked gTLDs, and we're currently exploring opportunities to apply for new ones as well," the search giant told the BBC. "We want to help make this a smooth experience for web users - one that promotes innovation and competition on the internet." Other organizations were less forthcoming - Facebook, the BBC and Coca-Cola would

not comment on their plans. "We do not disclose details of any proprietary marketing plans until they are public facing," the drinks maker said.

The process has the potential to cause problems among firms that share brand names. The US and German firms that both operate under the name Merck have already clashed over ownership of a Facebook page. "We're monitoring the Icann gTLD application process with interest," Ron Rogers, a spokesman for the New Jersey-based company, told the BBC. Anheuser-Busch InBev and Budejovicky Budvar may face similar conflict over their claims to own the Budweiser brand.— *Internet*

**Collapse of Antarctic ice sheet linked to ancient 'mega flood'**

CANBERRA, 13 April — Dramatic warming at the end of the last ice age produced an intense rise in sea level and a massive ice sheet collapse in the Antarctic. The sea level rise is known as Melt-Water Pulse 1A, and new research indicates it increased sea level by about 45 feet (14 metres) sometime between 14,650 and 14,310 years ago, during the same time as a period of rapid climate change known as the Bølling warming. Understanding the impacts of

earlier warming and sea level rise is important for predicting the effects of future warming.

"It is vital that we look into Earth's geological past to understand rare but high-impact events, such as the collapse of giant ice sheets that occurred 14,600 years ago," study researcher Alex Thomas of Oxford University said in a statement. "Our work gives a window onto an extreme event in which deglaciation coincided with a dramatic and rapid rise in

global sea levels—an ancient 'mega flood.'"

During this period, "sea level rose more than ten times more quickly than it is rising now," Thomas said, with the rising seas resulting from melting ice sheets that had formed during the ice age. "This is an excellent test bed for climate models: If they can reproduce this extraordinary event, it will improve confidence that they can also predict future change accurately."— *Internet*

**Shaken by shooting, Chinese still seek US colleges**

BEIJING, 13 April — Chinese parents say the shooting deaths of two Chinese students near the University of Southern California is a concern but will not deter them from seeking an American education for their children.

Chinese students and

education consultants say the shootings in Los Angeles are isolated. One parent, Wu Qing, said Thursday that although she is worried her 18-year-old son will continue his studies at the California Institute of Technology in nearby Pasadena.

According to US-based

Institute of International Education, China sent nearly 160,000 students to US colleges last year, more than any other country. USC has about 2,500 Chinese students. It's within a mile of neighbourhoods that have been plagued with crime.

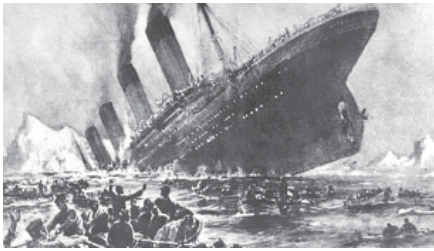

## Women first rule 'ignored in ship disasters'



Research suggests that in a crisis women are only first into lifeboats when the rule is backed up with force.

The belief that women and children are first to be saved when ships sink is largely a myth, a new study suggests. Analysis of survivors from 18 maritime disasters shows women "have a distinct survival disadvantage", say researchers at Uppsala University in Sweden. The report says captains and crew have a significantly higher survival

rate. The Titanic disaster 100 years ago this week was an exception because the captain threatened to shoot those who disobeyed, they conclude.

But the "women and children first" rule is now seen as the normal way to behave in emergencies. The authors of the report, economists Mikael Elinder and Oscar Erixson, say the captain has

the power to enforce the rule. But they say their findings show that behaviour in real life-or-death situations is best captured by the expression "every man for himself".

The study covered sea disasters spanning three centuries, involving more than 15,000 people. The authors say data from 16 of the ships had never been analysed in this way before.

## Performers dance to a different tune

When Alison Friedman first came to China in 2002 on a Fulbright fellowship to research modern dance, local residents had little idea what it was. "Most people would say, 'Oh, you mean hip-hop?' or 'You mean disco in a bar?'" recalled Friedman, who later founded Ping Pong Productions to develop cultural exchange projects between Chinese and international performers.

"Now when I say I research modern dance, they'll say, 'Oh, like Pina Bausch?'" (the late German dancer, choreographer and director) or 'Oh, like the Beijing Modern Dance

Company?' The difference is amazing. People are more aware of what it is, and there are definitely bigger and bigger audiences." The birth of modern dance in China can be traced back to the latter stages of the Qing Dynasty (1644-1911) when Yu Rongling, the daughter of the then ambassador to France, studied with Isadora Duncan in Paris. Yu later returned to China and performed this type of new dance for Empress Dowager Cixi.

## Measurements in bakeries 'take the cake'

When it comes to pricing their delicacies by size, Chinese bakeries could be said by customers "to be taking the cake". In most bakeries, cakes are only labeled with their diameter measured in cun, which most people think is a Chinese unit of 3.33 centimetres. However, to bakeries it stands for the much shorter "inch" (2.54 cm), or ying cun. And it makes a big difference when buying cakes. If the cun means inch, a 10-cun cake is 506 square centimeters. If it's the Chinese measure, the cake is a tasty 870 sq cm.

"It's confusing. Why can't they write down the exact size, rather than simply put an abbreviation there?" said Zhang Huijie, a white-collar worker in Shanghai, with a sweet tooth. "In fact, it's difficult for ordinary people to calculate the size of the cake using either of the measurement units.

## Bollywood star Shah Rukh Khan 'detained' in US

NEW YORK, 13 April — Bollywood star Shah Rukh Khan says he was detained by US authorities for 90 minutes at White Plains airport, which serves New York. The actor, who arrived on a private plane, was on the way to Yale University for a function. It is not clear why Khan was detained at the airport. Khan was earlier detained for two hours in 2009 at Newark airport and was released after India's embassy in the US intervened.

The actor had then said he was stopped because he had a Muslim name. US Customs officials had denied that Khan had been detained, saying he was questioned. *The Press Trust of India news*

agency quoted sources as saying that Khan was stopped and questioned for over two hours before being cleared by immigration officials on Thursday. He was freed after Yale University officials contacted homeland security and customs officials, the BBC's Salim Rizvi in New York said.

"Khan was very very upset over the episode," the CNN-IBN channel said, quoting unnamed sources. Later, he told the students of Yale University that he had been stopped and questioned at the airport. But, he made light of the incident and joked about it. "Whenever I want to stay at the airport, I should

come to the US. "They [officials] asked me what my height was, and I lied. Then they asked me what was my colour. I lied and said I was white," he said. Khan has appeared in more than 70 films and is considered one of India's most recognisable and popular celebrities.—Internet

## JK Rowling announces title of first adult novel

LONDON, 13 April — Author JK Rowling has announced her first adult novel will be called *The Casual Vacancy*. The Harry Potter writer revealed in February that she was working on the book, and said it would be "very different" from her previous material. The book will be published worldwide in hardback, e-book and as an audio download and CD on 27 September. "The freedom to explore new territory is a gift that Harry's success has brought me," Rowling said.

The story is centred on the death of Barry Fairweather, whose unexpected passing shocks the local villagers of Pagford. Publishers Little, Brown & Co said: "Pagford is, seemingly, an English idyll,

with a cobbled market square and an ancient abbey, but what lies behind the pretty facade is a town at war." The company describes the tale as being "blackly comic, thought-provoking and constantly surprising". Speaking at the premiere of the final Potter movie last year, Rowling told BBC News that the movie marked the start of a new writing direction. "I think I always felt that I didn't want to

publish again until the last film was out, because Potter has been such a huge thing of my life." "I've been writing hard ever since I finished writing [Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, so I've got a lot of stuff. And I suppose it's a question of deciding which one comes out first."

More than 450 million copies of Rowling's seven Potter books have been sold worldwide. The novels, about a boy wizard who survives the attack that kills his parents, became a worldwide phenomenon and were turned into eight blockbuster films starring Daniel Radcliffe. When the final instalment of the book series went on sale in 2007, thousands of copies sold in minutes.—Internet

## Madonna album suffers record sales slump in US

LONDON, 13 April — Madonna's MDNA has suffered the biggest second-week drop in sales for a number one album in US chart history. The record debuted at the top of the Billboard chart last week, but has now fallen to number eight. That reflects a drop in sales from 359,000 in week one to 48,000 copies in week two - a decline of 86.7%.

Lady Gaga previously held the title. Her 2011 album *Born This Way* fell from 1.1 million copies in its first week to 174,000 in week two, an 84% decline. MDNA was knocked off the top spot this week in the US and in the UK by Nicki Minaj's album *Pink Friday*—Roman

Reloaded, which went straight in at number one in both countries. The rapper features twice on Madonna's album, along with the singer's 15-year-old daughter, Lourdes, who sings on track *Superstar*.

Neilsen Soundscan, which compiles the chart, predicted MDNA's large fall, as its first-week sales included albums given away with concert tickets, as well as pre-orders from iTunes. Also, without a current hit single or any recent promotion on Madonna's part, the drop was bound to be significant. In the UK, MDNA fell from number one to number seven this week in *The Official Album Chart*.—Internet

## Adele tops young musicians rich list with £20 million

LONDON, 13 April — Adele has become the richest young musician in the UK, with an estimated fortune of £20m. Last year's *Sunday Times* Rich List estimated her to be worth £6m but massive sales of her album *21* have helped her gain another £14m in the past 12 months. Adele has beaten other young stars such as JLS and Jessie J to the top spot. Cheryl Cole is second equal on the list with

Leona Lewis, with each having fortunes valued at £12m. Only two of the top 10 richest young musicians are men. Both Craig David and Paolo Nutini are joint sixth, with £8m apiece.

The rest of the top of the chart is dominated by women, including Charlotte Church (£8m), Florence Welch (£7m) and Lily Allen (£6m). Daniel Radcliffe is still the richest actor under 30. His latest film

*The Woman In Black* has helped him to amass a total of £54m, up from £48m last year. His Harry Potter co-stars also feature on the list, with Rupert Grint thought to be worth £24m.

Emma Watson features on both the lists for actors and models and has a fortune of £26m. Robert Pattinson has made the biggest increase in his fortune. His worth has gone from £32m in 2011 to

## Liverpool's third choice keeper Jones set for

LIVERPOOL, 13 April — Liverpool's third-choice goalkeeper Brad Jones looks set to start Saturday's FA Cup semi-final against city rivals Everton after the club's appeal against second choice Doni's suspension was rejected. Jones, whose young son Luca died of leukaemia late last year, was thrust into the spotlight at Blackburn Rovers in midweek when Doni was dismissed for bringing down Junior Hoilett in the penalty area with Liverpool leading the Premier League game 2-0.

The Australia international's first job was to save Yakubu's spotkick, after which he raised a finger to the sky. While he was twice beaten later in the 3-2 victory, once from the spot after he escaped a red card after a fumble, his performance and composure so soon after a personal tragedy impressed manager Kenny Dalglish.

"You can only guess what it must be like to go through what he's been through, but he has done and I'm sure he

enjoyed his first bit of action on Tuesday night, saving a penalty," Dalglish said of Jones, who was signed from Middlesbrough in August 2010 but has rarely featured.

"We know that to do what he's done has shown a great deal of strength of character." Doni's appeal was rejected by the FA, a statement from the English governing body said on Thursday. With regular keeper Pepe Reina also suspended following a recent sending off against Newcastle United, Liverpool have recalled youngster Peter Gulacsi from a loan spell at Hull City as backup for the semi-final at Wembley.

While it will be an emotional day for Perth-born Jones, it will also be a poignant occasion for the club on the weekend of the 23rd anniversary of the Hillsborough tragedy in which 96 Liverpool fans died at an FA Cup semi-final against Nottingham Forest. Dalglish was manager at that occasion in his first stint in charge and

said it was fitting Saturday's semi-final was against Everton, the team Liverpool beat to win the FA Cup final in 1989 just weeks after the shocking events in Sheffield. — Internet

## Three share lead at PGA Harbour Town

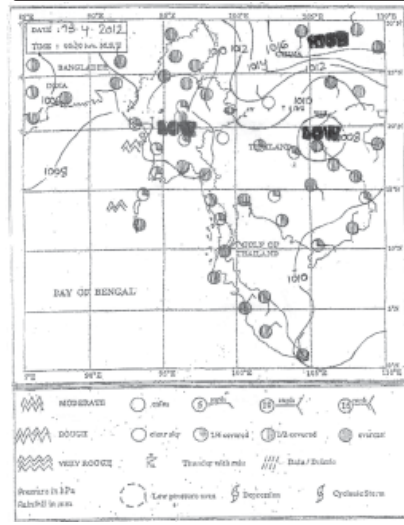

**Shi'ite pilgrims killed in Iraq ambushes**

BAGHDAD, 13 April—Armed men killed seven Shi'ite pilgrims in ambushes on Friday, police and hospital sources said, in the latest attacks to highlight underlying sectarian and ethnic tensions in Iraq.

Political tensions in the country have been high since US troops withdrew in December, when Shi'ite Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki's government moved against two top Sunni officials - seeking the arrest of Vice President Tareq al-Hashemi and the removal of Deputy Prime Minister Saleh al-Mutlaq.

The crisis sparked protests in Sunni strongholds and raised fears of a return to the sectarian slaughter that engulfed Iraq a few years ago.

On Friday, two cars blocked a bus carrying pilgrims from Baghdad to a

key Shi'ite shrine in the northern, mainly Sunni, city of Samarra. Some seven gunmen opened fire, killing five and wounding six of them

in the attack at around 5am (0200 GMT) near Tarmiya, 25 km (15 miles) north of the capital, a local police source said.

The bombing of the golden-domed Askari shrine in Samarra in 2006 was a catalyst in igniting two years of sectarian violence that drove Iraq to the brink of civil war.

A second incident occurred at 7.30am in the southern outskirts of Baghdad when gunmen killed two Shi'ite pilgrims en route to the holy Shi'ite city of Kerbala in Iraq's south. Six others were wounded, police and hospital sources said.

**Klitschko to defend titles against Thompson**

WASHINGTON, 13 April—World heavyweight champion Wladimir Klitschko will face Tony "The Tiger" Thompson of the United States in a mandatory defence of his IBF title in Bern, Switzerland, on 7 July, it was announced on Thursday.

This will be the first time Klitschko has fought in Switzerland and the last time the Ukrainian climbed in the ring was when he enjoyed the 50th KO of his career with a technical knock-out of France's Jean-Marc Mormeck in March.

### Terry and Cole fit for Chelsea against Spurs

LONDON, 13 April—Skipper John Terry and left back Ashley Cole are both available for Chelsea's FA Cup semi-final against Tottenham Hotspur at Wembley this weekend after recovering from injuries, stand-in manager Roberto Di Matteo said on Friday.

Terry has been nursing a rib injury while Cole missed Chelsea's last two games with an ankle problem.

With regular right back Branislav Ivanovic suspended for the clash against Tottenham, the availability of the experienced Terry and Cole is a major boost for the Di Matteo who faces three crucial games in eight days.

"Ashley trained today and is fine, he's available," Di Matteo told reporters at Chelsea's training ground.

"It's a good time to have him back. John Terry came through training fine too."

Midfielder Oriol Romeu is ruled out through illness.

Chelsea face a pivotal period in their season with the Wembley clash against Tottenham on Sunday being followed by the first leg of their Champions League semi-final at home to Barcelona on Wednesday. The Blues then face third-placed Arsenal in the Premier League next Saturday as they try and stay in the hunt for a top-four finish in the league. Despite Barcelona looming on the horizon, Di Matteo's sole focus is on Tottenham as Chelsea try and regain the FA Cup they won for the sixth time in 2009-10 by beating Portsmouth who surprisingly beat Spurs in the semi-final.—Reuters
