**Display anger in an appropriate way**

Anger is the strong feeling that you have when something has happened that you think is bad or unfair. Anger is important for survival.

It isn't surprising that anger, given its primal origins, often results in action. When we feel angry, there is a strong impulse to get angry.

Bottling up anger is a real problem and it can lead to a heart attack, meaning that stifling anger is dangerous and expressing anger is good.

A recent study suggested that heart-disease symptoms may be severe in hostile individuals who try to suppress their negative feelings and behave in a socially acceptable way. And it has concluded that suppressing anger after receiving an insult or unjustified verbal attack is unhealthy.

The most unhealthy approach is to focus on solving the problem that has promoted the anger, for those with impatient and aggressive behaviour are more likely to develop heart disease. And those who had high scores on the hostility scale have developed heart disease four to five times more often.

Expressing anger in the workplace usually brings negative reactions. Whether at work or at home, chronic anger like chronic anxiety or chronic despair is unhealthy.

Although there are risky to venting anger at work, displaying anger at home can be safe and therapeutic if it's done in an appropriate way. The challenge is thus not to get rid of anger but to use it as vehicle for productive change.

## Deadly attacks hit six Iraqi provinces, 43 killed

BAGHDAD, 20 April— Deadly attacks struck six Iraqi Provinces on Thursday, killing at least 43 people and wounding some 155, in what appeared to be an attempt by militant groups to destabilize the country and undermine confidence in the Iraqi government.

In the Capital Baghdad, one of the deadliest attacks occurred in the morning in the northern neighbourhood of Kadhmiah, when a car bomb parked near a hotel went off and killed up to three people and wounded 20 others.

In central Baghdad, another car bomb detonated near the convoy of the Iraqi Health Minister Majid Hamad Amin Jamil, a Kurd, in al-Talaie Square, killing two of the minister's bodyguards and wounding four people.

A third car and three more roadside bombs ripped through the capital and killed a total of six people and wounded some 28 others.

Near Baghdad, a suicide bomber blew up his car bomb near a military checkpoint in the town of Tarmiyah, some 30 km north of Baghdad, killing a soldier and wounding six

others.

In a separate incident, a suicide bomber blew up his explosive vest in the industrial district in Taji area, some 20 km north of Baghdad, killing five people and wounding nine others. Also in Taji area, two roadside bombs detonated in the area, killing a civilian and wounding five others.

In Iraq's northern-central

government-backed Awakening Council group members, killing a total of eight people and wounding five others.

In Iraq's northern city of Kirkuk, some 250 km north of Baghdad, two car bombs and a roadside bomb struck the Iraqi police in the morning, killing a total of four policemen and wounding 23 people, including seven policemen.

rounds landed on a village in the city of Dibis, some 45 km northwest of Kirkuk, killing four people and wounding six others. The ethnically-mixed province of Kirkuk and its capital Kirkuk City are part of disputed areas between the Kurds and both Arabs and Turkomans.

The area has long been the hotbed of insurgency since the US-led invasion in 2003. In Iraq's eastern Province of Diyala, a suicide bomber blew up his explosive vest at the entrance of the house of a police officer in al-Amin district in northern the provincial capital city of Baquba, some 65 km northeast of Baghdad, killing a passer-by and wounding 11 people. The officer survived the attack unharmed as he was not at home, but five of his family members were among the wounded, the police said.

In a separate incident, gunmen attacked a police checkpoint in al-Hadeed area, just west of Baquba and killed a policeman and wounded three others.

In Iraq's western province of Anbar, a booby-trapped car detonated near a

Near Kirkuk, six mortar

police vehicle in central the provincial capital city of Ramadi, some 110 km west of Baghdad, killing two policemen and wounding four others aboard along with a passer-by. In a separate incident, a policeman was killed and three other wounded when a car bomb struck their patrol in central Ramadi.

In addition, a sticky bomb attached to the car of a policeman went off in southern the city of Fallujah, some 50 km west of Baghdad, killing the policeman and wounding two people accompanying him in

his car.

Also in Fallujah, gunmen planted bombs in the house of a police officer in southern the city and blew them up, wounding two family members, but the officer himself escaped unhurt as he was not at home.

In Iraq's northern province of Nineveh, four civilians were injured when a roadside bomb exploded near a popular restaurant in central the city of Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad, a provincial police source anonymously told Xinhua.—Xinhua

## Turkey intercepts ship with suspected arms headed for Syria

ISTANBUL, 20 April — Turkey has intercepted a vessel in the Mediterranean suspected of carrying weapons and ammunition to Syria, a diplomatic source told AFP on Wednesday. "We

received information that the vessel has a cargo of arms and ammunition headed for Syria," the source said on condition of anonymity, adding that Turkish authorities would search the vessel.

The Antigua and Barbuda flagged Atlantic Cruiser which anchored off

the coast of Iskenderun port Wednesday morning belongs to a German company.

The search of its cargo was delayed until Thursday morning due to stormy weather, the Anatolia news agency reported. The German shipping firm denied allegations Monday that its vessel was carrying Iranian arms to Syria, violating EU sanctions against the Damascus regime.

German news weekly Der Spiegel reported at the weekend that the Atlantic Cruiser, owned by German company Bockstiegel but chartered by a Ukrainian firm, had been stopped on the high seas with Iranian weapons on board. Bockstiegel said they had no indication that the cargo included arms or

ammunition as stated in the Press, and the Ukrainian company that chartered the ship also said that the cargo contained no weapons, but legal goods for civilian use.

Bockstiegel acknowledged that the ship's crew had only been able to check "the container stacked at the top", and the ship would continue its journey only after it passes the inspection.

Late Wednesday Bockstiegel said in a statement that the Atlantic Cruiser entered the port of Iskenderun "unsolicited and as agreed" with German and Turkish authorities. The ship was "never stopped or intercepted by Turkish authorities", the company said, adding that a stop in Iskenderun had been planned from the start.

Iran is under a UN arms embargo imposed in 2007 due to its alleged nuclear activities while Western countries have declared a similar embargo against Iranian ally Syria since a bloody crackdown on dissent began over a year ago. Amid Damascus' violent crackdown, Turkey imposed gradual sanctions against its neighbour — including interception of arms shipments there by air, land and sea.

Throughout last year, Turkey intercepted several ships and trucks suspected of carrying weapons into Syria through Turkish territory.

## US helicopter crashes in Afghanistan, four feared dead

WASHINGTON, 20 April— A US military helicopter went down in poor weather in Afghanistan on Thursday, the military said, in a crash that officials believed may have killed all four people onboard.

A US defence official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the Black Hawk helicopter crashed in the Regional Command-Southwest area, which includes the traditional Taliban stronghold of Helmand province. Poor weather appeared to have been the cause of the crash.

Another official said all four people aboard the helicopter were feared dead.

Almost 3,000 foreign soldiers have died in

Afghanistan since the West's war against the Taliban and other militants began in 2001. Despite a resilient insurgency, the United States, like its NATO allies, plans to withdraw most of its combat troops from the country by the end of 2014.—Reuters



## Russia, China seek info on US drone held by Iran

TEHERAN, 20 April— Iran's semi-official Fars news agency says Russia and China have asked Teheran to provide them with information on a US drone captured by the Islamic Republic in December.

The Thursday report quotes Ahmad Karimpour, an adviser to Iran's defence minister, as saying Teheran has received requests for information on the RQ-170 Sentinel, but Moscow and

Beijing have been most aggressive in their pursuit of details on the drone. He did not elaborate.

Iran said in December that it had downed the unmanned stealth aircraft in eastern Iran. US officials have acknowledged losing the drone. They have said Iran will find it hard to exploit any data and technology aboard it because of measures taken to limit the intelligence value of drones operating over hostile territory.—Internet

**India testfires intercontinental Agni-V ballistic missile off eastern coast**

NEW DELHI, 20 April— India Thursday successfully testfired its homemade nuclear-capable Agni-V intercontinental ballistic missile, with a range of 5,000 kms, off the coast of the eastern state of Odisha, sources said.

“The missile, with a strike range of over 5,000 kms, was testfired at 08:07 am local time from Wheeler Island off Odisha coast, hitting the

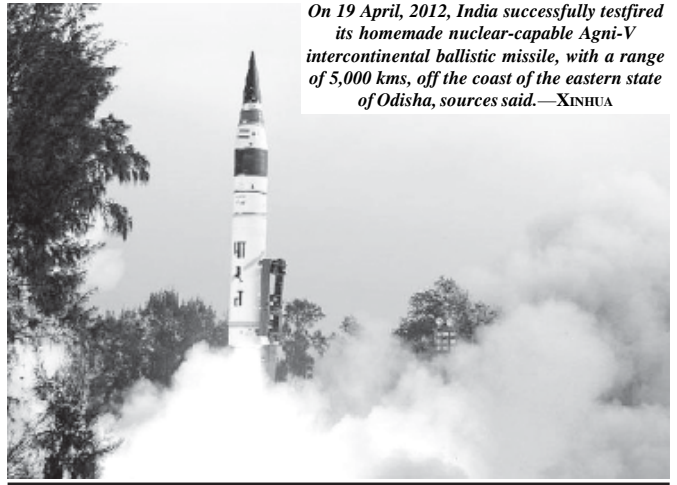
target 5,000 km away.

“We have done it. Superhit,” said VL Saraswat, chief of the India’s Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO).

The missile’s 17.5 metre tall, solid-fueled, has three stages and a launch weight of 50 tonnes. It has cost more than 2.5 billion rupees (480 million US dollars) to develop,” the sources said.

Agni-V incorporates

advanced technologies involving ring laser gyroscope and accelerometer for navigation and guidance, they said, adding the solid-fuelled intercontinental ballistic missile has been developed by the Defense Research and Development Organization. The missile brings the whole of Asia, 70 percent of Europe and other regions under its strike range and puts India among a select band of countries in the world to possess the technology of Inter-Continental Ballistic Missiles.—Xinhua

**Dinosaur eggs found in Russia’s Chechnya**

MOSCOW, 20 April— Geologists in Russia’s volatile Chechnya Region have discovered what they believe to be fossilised dinosaur eggs laid by one of the huge extinct reptiles that roamed the Earth more than 60 million years ago. “We’ve found about 40 eggs so far, the exact number has not been established,” said Said-Emin Dzhabrailov, a geologist at the Chechen State University.

“There could be many more laying under the ground.”

The find was uncovered when a construction crew was blasting through a hillside to build a road near the region’s border with former Soviet Georgia in the Caucasus Mountains.

A team of geologists stumbled across the smooth, oval rock-like forms, which range from 25 cm to one metre coincidentally on a recent trip to the area, said Dzhabrailov.

He said paleontologists were needed to determine which species of dinosaur had laid them. Dzhabrailov said that the regional Chechen government, which is eager to shed the region’s reputation for violence, is considering turning the area into a nature

preserve and seeking to attract tourists.

Federal forces fought two separatist wars between 1994-2001 in Chechnya, and an Islamist insurgency persists in the mostly Muslim Region and surrounding provinces of Russia’s North Caucasus.

However, violence has declined under the strong-arm rule of Ramzan Kadyrov, whose multi-million dollar construction projects are aimed at raising the region’s profile and boosting the tourism potential of the troubled area.—Reuters

**China ‘river pig’ deaths raise extinction fears**

SHANGHAI, 20 April— China says 16 endangered finless porpoises have been found dead since the beginning of the year and experts blame water pollution and climate change for pushing the species toward extinction.

The freshwater porpoise—popularly known in Chinese as the “river pig”—mainly lives in China’s Yangtze River and two lakes linked to the waterway.

Authorities have discovered 10 dead porpoises in Dongting Lake in the central Province of Hunan since March, said a statement Thursday by the government of Yueyang City, which is located on the lake’s shore.

Another six dead porpoises have been found in Poyang Lake in the eastern province of Jiangxi since the beginning of the year, the

official Xinhua news agency said late Wednesday.

It quoted experts as warning the species will be extinct within a matter of years.

Wang Kexiong, a researcher at China’s Institute of Hydrobiology, said water pollution, shipping, sand dredging and illegal fishing were all possible contributing factors to the recent deaths.

Many waterways in China have become heavily contaminated with toxic waste from factories and farms—pollution blamed on more

than three decades of rapid economic growth and lax enforcement of environmental protection laws. Tests have shown that some of the porpoises are believed to have died of starvation, it said.

In 2006, China was estimated to have only 1,200 finless porpoises left. That same year, the Baiji—a freshwater dolphin also native to the Yangtze River—was declared extinct. Earlier this year, a survey found just 65 “river pigs” in Dongting Lake and 300-400 in Poyang Lake, the report said.—Internet

**Twitter to limit use of patents in lawsuits**

SAN FRANCISCO, 20 April— Twitter said on Tuesday that it would structure its patents so they could not be used for offensive litigation purposes without permission from the people who developed them.

Twitter said the move would give inventors more control over their creations and ensure its patents are not used to “impede the innovation of others,” the company said in a post on its official blog.

“It is a commitment from Twitter to our employees that patents can only be used for defensive purposes.

We will not use the patents from employees’ inventions in offensive litigation without their permission,” Twitter said on the blog.

Twitter, which launched its microblogging service in 2006, does not currently have any patents, but sources said the company has applied for many.

Patent litigation involving tech companies has exploded during the past two years.

Yahoo Inc sued Facebook in March for infringing ten of

its patents, and smartphone manufacturers such as Apple Inc and Microsoft Corp are engaged in a fierce legal war against rivals such as Motorola Mobility.

Some patent holders are derided as “patent trolls” by critics, a term the holders say unfairly paints them as villains for helping inventors make money.

Twitter said that the limits on the use of its patents, which it dubbed the Innovator’s Patent Agreement, will apply to patents even after they are sold.

Eric Goldman, an associate professor at Santa Clara University School of Law, said Twitter’s announcement will burnish the company’s standing among software engineers, some of whom have grumbled at seeing their patents used to sue other companies.

“Unquestionably, it’s an effort to define Twitter’s brand in the marketplace and to signal that its perhaps more engineering-friendly than companies that wouldn’t make such a promise,” said Goldman.

**Researchers create hair follicles from stem cells**

TOKYO, 20 April—A group of researchers have successfully created an organ that creates hair using two different types of stem cells. Stem cells have the potential to evolve into any tissue or organ. The research group from the Tokyo University of Science focused on the epithelial stem cells and hair papilla cells found around each individual hair.

The researchers removed these stem cells from the area around the whiskers of a mouse and transplanted them onto the animal’s back. The cells later developed into organs that create hair called follicles.

The researchers say that the follicles were able to generate whisker-like hairs. When cells that create melamine were transplanted together, the whiskers turned dark.

The number of hair follicles grew in proportion to the number of transplanted stem cells. The group says the discovery could be used to reverse hair loss.—NHK

### US factory decline suggests economy losing steam

WASHINGTON, 20 April—Output at US factories slipped in March and builders started construction on fewer homes, offering cautionary signals for an economy that appeared to be gaining traction.

Manufacturing output slipped for the first time in four months, dropping 0.2 percent, the US Federal Reserve said on Tuesday.

The decline dragged on overall industrial production which was unchanged and fell short of analysts' expectations.

"It looks pretty bad on the face of it," said Tom Porcelli, an economist at RBC Capital Markets in New York.

Surging exports and efforts by companies to restock their shelves have made economic growth look more solid in recent weeks.

The factory data did little to change that view, but economists said it suggested the recovery lost a little steam at the close of the first quarter, in part due to headwinds from Europe's debt crisis, which is weighing on global growth.

"(It) raises the possibility that the recent easing in global demand is starting to take a

toll on US manufacturers," said Paul Dales, an economist at Capital Economics in London.

Signs of a cooldown in growth became apparent earlier this month when a report showed hiring slowed sharply in March.

Still, Porcelli and others said the factory sector, which has been a key driver of America's recovery from the 2007-2009 recession, appeared to have enough momentum to continue growing.

Auto production, for example, increased 0.6 percent after rising 0.8 percent in February. Also, initial estimates for manufacturing output in February were revised higher.

Citing these factors, Goldman Sachs on Tuesday raised its forecast for first-quarter growth in gross domestic product to a 2.6 percent annual rate from 2.5 percent.

That would be a slowdown from the 3 percent rate clocked in the fourth quarter, but still faster than many analysts expected a few weeks ago.—Reuters

### Euro zone debt fears ease, German bond sale eyed

LONDON, 20 April—European shares and the single currency held within narrow ranges on Wednesday as investors' fears over Spain eased and growth hopes rose, with the focus on a two-year German bond sale, which some fear could struggle, given ultra-low yields.

Strong demand at a

Spanish bill auction on Tuesday soothed fears of a flare up in the euro zone crisis, but the rise in short-term borrowing costs underscored the challenges still facing the highly indebted country.

Spain will also auction two- and 10-year bonds on Thursday, while France, where uncertainty over the outcome of a presidential election is rising, is also due to sell debt.

"Markets are undergoing a consolidation phase after a strong rally earlier in the year, and if Spain's bond auctions on Thursday pass without a problem, investors will likely become more committed to risk-taking," said Hirokazu Yuihama, a senior strategist at Daiwa Securities in Tokyo.

German Bund futures were 12 ticks higher at 140.08, while the existing March 2014 bond was yielding only 0.16 percent in the secondary market.

In equity markets the

well-supported Spanish debt sale, signs of strong growth in Germany and positive US corporate earnings releases were supporting prices, but the major share indexes



ceased slightly after the previous day's strong gains. The euro zone blue-chip Euro STOXX 50 index, which saw its biggest daily gain of the year on Tuesday, retreated slightly to be down 0.4 percent at 2,357.93.

### Scientists find neural stem cell regulator

WASHINGTON, 20 April—Researchers at the University of Colorado (CU) have found that lack of a specific gene interrupts neural tube closure, a condition that can cause death or paralysis. The study was the cover story this week in the journal *Genes & Development*.

"The neural tube is the beginning of the brain and spinal cord," said the study's lead investigator Lee Niswander, professor of pediatrics at the CU School of Medicine. "A defect in the mLin41 gene doesn't allow the tube to close because not

enough neural progenitor cells are being made."

Niswander and the paper's first author, Jianfu Chen, made their findings while studying neural stem cells in mice. They said the cells use distinct self-renewal programmes to meet the demand of tissue growth and repair during different stages of embryonic development. The molecular mechanisms that control these programmes remain largely unknown.

The researchers discovered that the gene mLin41 in mice controls the extent of

### Using AIDS drugs to prevent infection: a bargain?

CHICAGO, 20 April—Giving an AIDS-fighting drug to men who are at high risk of HIV infection would cost billions, but it might be worth it in terms of reducing infection rates, US researchers said on 16 April.

Since 2010, when a landmark study in the *New England Journal of Medicine* found that giving a daily dose of Gilead Sciences' Truvada to men who have sex

prophylaxis," often shortened to PrEP. The drug is already approved to treat people infected with the human immunodeficiency virus that causes AIDS.

A prior study found that giving Truvada to all men who have sex with men — who account for more than half of the estimated 56,000 new infections annually in the United States — was too costly.

high-risk individuals took the drug it could prevent 41,000 new infections over a period of 20 years, at a cost of about \$16.6 billion during that period, the team found.

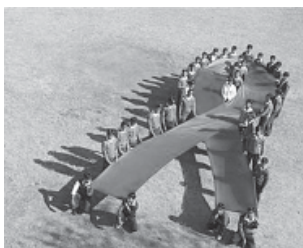
By targeting this high-risk group, the team estimates the treatment could prevent twice as many infections as it could if given to 20 percent of the general population of men who have sex with men, and it would offer a better value.

"Use in high-risk men who have sex with men would provide substantial health benefits at a lower cost, although the budgetary effect would still be sizeable," Jessie Juusola, a PhD candidate at Stanford, and colleagues wrote in the *Annals of Internal Medicine*. An estimated 1.2 million Americans have HIV, according to the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention.

In preliminary guidelines issued last year, the CDC said only high-risk gay and bisexual men should use a daily AIDS pill to protect themselves from the virus.

An FDA advisory panel is expected to consider in mid-May whether to allow use of the drug as a way to prevent HIV infection in healthy people.—Reuters

Instead, the team looked specifically at men who are high risk of developing HIV — those who have five or more sexual partners a year.

## 16 Amish plead not guilty in Ohio hair attacks

CLEVELAND, 20 April—Sixteen men and women pleaded not guilty Thursday in beard- and hair-cutting attacks against fellow Amish in Ohio.

The 10 men and six women and their attorneys overflowed defense tables and the jury box as they entered the pleas before US District Court Judge Dan Polster in response to an updated indictment.

The latest indictment added new allegations that the suspects tried to hide or destroy evidence, including a disposable camera, shears and a bag of hair from the victims.

Members of the Amish community who were in court left through a rear enclosed walkway without speaking.

The judge said he would keep the schedule set after the first indictment — a 30 July deadline for any plea change and 27 Aug trial.

Joseph Dubyak, attorney for Linda Schrock, daughter of alleged ringleader Samuel Mullet Sr., said the related extended families are helping each other during the busy planting season with seven defendants still held on bond.

"I talked to my client and she's got her other members of her family and her children planting the crops in the field," he said outside court.

"They planted the oats and they are getting the corn ready. They are all pitching in, they are all working together. They have somebody conducting their religious services."

A feud over church discipline allegedly led to attacks in which the beards and hair of men and hair of women were cut, an act considered deeply offensive in Amish culture. The Amish believe the Bible instructs women to let their hair grow long and men to grow beards and stop shaving once they marry. Several members of the group living in Bergholz carried out the attacks in September, October and November by forcibly cutting the beards and hair of Amish men and women and then taking photos to shame them, authorities have said.

Ohio has an estimated Amish population of just under 61,000 — second only to Pennsylvania — with most living in rural counties south and east of Cleveland.—Internet

## Man killed by five-metre shark in S Africa

CAPE TOWN, 20 April—A 20-year-old body boarder was killed Thursday when a giant shark estimated at up to five metres (16 feet) long bit off his leg in a Cape Town bay, in South Africa's second deadly mauling this year.

David Lillienfeld's brother Gustav tried to pull him to safety when the shark struck while the siblings were bodyboarding, reported Eyewitness News website.

"The deceased man sustained complete amputation of his right leg, below the hip, while body boarding with his brother and friends," said National Sea Rescue Institute spokesman Craig Lambinon.

"There are no other bite marks or lacerations on the deceased man's body — only the complete amputation of the right leg and the leg has not been recovered."

Witnesses reported a single shark, thought to be a Great White and measuring four to five metres, attacked the man. They said up to six sharks were spotted after the incident at a popular surfing and body boarding site in False Bay. The South African man's body was recovered off rocks on the shore after he was hauled to shore, said Lambinon.

City officials confirmed the fatal attack at Kogel Bay Resort which is near Gordon's

## Trio jailed for Thusha shooting

LONDON, 20 April—Three men were jailed for life Thursday over a south London gangland shooting that left a five-year-old girl paralysed.

Nathaniel Grant, Anthony McCalla and Kazeem Kolawole were trying to kill a member of a rival gang in an off-licence when they accidentally hit Thusha Kamaleswaran, whose aunt owned the store in Stockwell, in the chest. They also seriously wounded another innocent bystander, Roshan Selvakumar, in the March 2011 attack.

The Old Bailey heard the trio, from the Organized Criminals gang, cycled to the shop intending to kill rival gangster Roshan Bryan of rival gang All Bout Money.

The trio were found guilty last month of causing grievous bodily harm with intent to the girl and Selvakumar, plus the attempted murder of Bryan.

Grant, 21, — who fired the gun which wounded the two innocent victims — was told Thursday he will serve a minimum of 17 years, while fellow gang members Kolawole, 19, and McCalla, 20, must serve at least 14 years.—Internet

## First-grader born without hands wins penmanship award

NEW YORK, 20 April—Annie Clark, a 7-year-old born without hands but with a can-do spirit, has won a national award for penmanship.

The first grader at Wilson Christian Academy in the Pittsburgh-area was awarded the Nicholas Maxim Special Award for Excellent Penmanship at a surprise assembly at her school Wednesday, where she was presented with a trophy and \$1,000 prize from Zaner-Bloser, the textbook publishing company that sponsors the contest.

After accepting the award, Annie demonstrated for the audience how she writes, gripping the pencil steadily between her

forearms to perfect the letters and capitalization.

"She is a studious and conscientious student who really strives for perfection," her teacher Laura Erb said. "She is very determined to get it right. When she does any kind of writing, she wants to make sure that it's clear and concise and she really takes pride in her work."

Erb said Annie sometimes has to stand up to give herself leverage over the lined paper, but always keeps up in the classroom with her peers. In fact, she tutors other students.

## Meningitis kills 749 in West, Central Africa

OUAGADOUGOU, 20 April — Meningitis has killed 749 people in West and Central Africa this year, according to the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA).

In a report released here on Friday, OCHA said Burkina Faso and Chad were the most affected countries in West and Central Africa. In Burkina Faso, OCHA recorded 3,630 cases since the beginning of the year, which is 40 percent of all cases reported in the

region and, out of which, 400 people had died by 1 April.

The organization's website, ochaonline, reported that most cases were found in the country's west bordering Mali, Ghana, Togo and Benin.

By 1 April, Burkina Faso had seen eight districts in an epidemic situation and 11 others on alert level. The meningitis disease in Burkina Faso is attributed to NmW135 germ.

Chad had registered 2,136 cases as per 1 April and 102

deaths.

OCHA said, "In the 11 West and Central African countries which have been affected, the meningitis season had killed a total of 749 people out of the 8,667 cases that had been reported by 1 April." While Burkina Faso, Benin and Chad reported more cases in March, Togo, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali and the Central African Republic saw the incidence decline, OCHA said.

## Three killed, several wounded in Texas cockfight shooting

HOUSTON, 20 April — Three people were killed and eight others injured Thursday morning when several masked gunmen opened fire at an illegal cockfighting match in the US state of Texas. The site of the shooting, a ranch near the city of Elsa, close to the Mexico border, hosted a sophisticated cockfighting operation that included concession stands and bleachers, according to CNN affiliate KRGV.

Several people with weapons of various caliber ambushed spectators and participants at the rooster battle and began "shooting indiscriminately" at the crowd.

Hidalgo County Sheriff Lupe Trevino described the site as "the crime scene from hell."

Some spectators at the scene created more chaos and injured other people in a frantic attempt to get away. "It really has to be a chaotic situation. Because a lot of the spectators trampled all over the casings, spent casings, trampled the victims, and just wanted to get out of there.—Xinhua

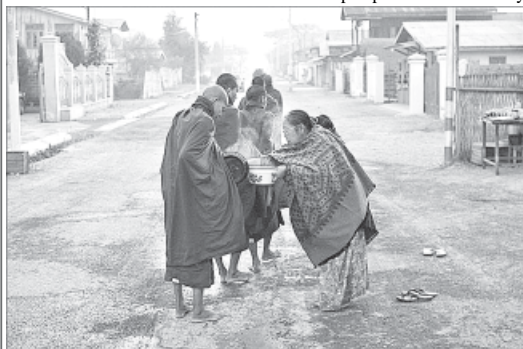


**The Aged, The Sick, The Dead and The Monk.**

Things never stay the same and stable. The world is just too full of dirt and evil. Such were the thoughts overwhelming me since the beginning of this summer. As I saw leaves turning yellow and falling down preparing for revival in monsoon, I became aware of the circle of existences and wanted much to wash off my sins to start a new life. So, I nodded with much enthusiasm when asked whether I would join the Buddha's Order for Thingyan period.

It is traditional belief that Tha-

and pain of life and seek the peace of mind. I have dogged determination to free myself from the world of greed, resentment, and jealousy to find the Path to Liberation or Cessation of Suffering accompanying virtue for the entire lifetime. As soon as I put on yellow robes, the first thought of mine was to meditate to attain insight. I found myself a shady tree and sat down in the embrace of nature. The weather was boiling hot and within a few minutes, the beads of perspiration deterred my

gyar-min, King of the celestials, comes down to us, the abode of humans, in the time of water festival, partly to celebrate it and partly to record the names of evildoers on the parchment of dog-hides which is supposed to be absolute disgrace for us. He also carries another parchment made of gold on which he puts the names of the good. But it seemed that the Indra is too busy to check us in recent years or has run out of dog-hides and thus handed over his responsibility to our Big Brother Ko Gyi Kyaw, who is the well-known boozing spirit. The popularity of Tha-gyar-min is on the wane as youths sing and dance in honour of Ko Gyi Kyaw in whatever religious rituals.

As a senior monk was shaving my head, I was strong-willed to abandon the pleasure

concentration. My strong resolution surrendered the thirst of water and I adjourned to a nearby water pot to refresh myself.

The water was not bottled one but from the artesian wells in the monastery precinct. It was too tasteless to drink for I was used to drinking bottled water. To a man with strong determination and willing mind to make sacrifices for his goal, how can small difficulties like this one hamper his steps forward? So, I took out my mobile, called my roommates and asked them to send me a dozen of bottled water. It was 8 April, three days before the water festival.

As the silvery moon in company with twinkling stars appeared over the dark blue sky, there came the breeze. As it touched my bare head, I feel relaxed from the heat. Tonight, I would be the

new one clear of dirt and dread. I took deep breath putting myself in the middle of nowhere trying to catch the wild rampant mind. As I began to enjoy the bliss of solitude, a loud buzzing noise attacked my ears. They were the uninvited guests, mosquitoes from monastery. But, they did not keep Sabbath and neither spare my blood. I concentrated and concentrated. They bit and bit. My devotion was as firm as rock but their bite was unstoppable and unbearable. I took shelter in *Dhamma* but for the moment it was not as effective as mosquito net in which I took shelter for the night like a log.

April is supposed to be the time of mass novitiation ceremonies which are held especially during the water festival. The life of austerity and virtue in yellow robes with black alms-bowl, however short the period, is a must for a Buddhist man for his life is considered incomplete without novitiation.

The next morning was the formal ordination organized by the News and Periodicals Enterprise, followed by laypersons presenting the monks with offertories which is done as the act of *Dana* or giving to the new monks at the end of ordination. Then, we were offered with meal which was oily pilau and it made me feel dozy. An afternoon nap after the lunch makes one refresh. So goes the saying but when I woke up energetically the sun was setting in the west.

I was not much worried for I believed that I could conquer my mind to discover the Path to Liberation. Again, I sat inside the mosquito net, sheltering from the awful bite of flying blood suckers. As I was realizing the sugar-coated agonies of life, my phone rang, awakening my deep thoughts. It was from one of my female friends who was also my classmate. To be more exact, I have been waiting for her to say I am more than a friend to her. She asked my whereabouts as she did not know I am already the Son of Buddha. I told her that I was wearing yellow robes and she hung up and told me to call her back when I left the Buddha's Order as she had something to tell me.

Then, I got back to meditation. I tried to concentrate, but I could not help thinking of her. No, I cannot lose. I said to myself. She is an enemy who would drag me into the endless suffering. No, she would not for she has always encouraged me and been the guiding star of my life. I tried to drive her out of my mind, but at last I had to admit that she was too powerful to resist. *Dhamma* is sweet, but at the moment not as sweet as her smile. Well, I have so

much time left. As I would think no more of her, tonight I would miss her for the last time.

We went on our alms-round the next morning barefooted. Monks live solely on the offerings of the laity. The yellow-robed monks go on their rounds for alms every morning. Monks do this not because they have to depend on the charity of lay people but because of the spirit of humility and

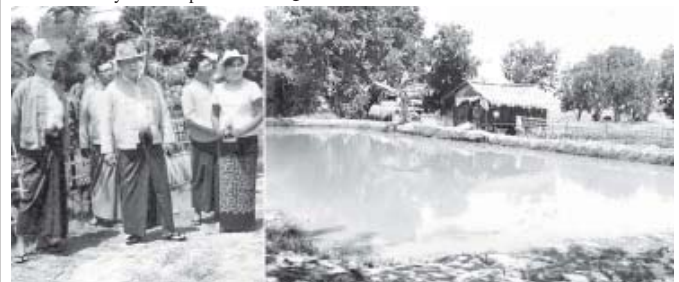

## London enters final straight for 2012 Games

LONDON, 20 April — London entered the final straight in the run-up to the 2012 Olympics during a wet and windy spring day on Wednesday with celebrations across the world to mark the 100 days' countdown to the Games. The day began at Kew Gardens where London organizing committee chairman Sebastian Coe helped plant one of 40 oak trees which will be installed around the country to recognise Britain's role in the birth of the modern Olympic movement.

The trees were grown from acorns taken from an oak planted in 1890 by the founder of the Games, French aristocrat Baron Pierre de Coubertin, at the Much Wenlock Games in the

county of Shropshire. Twenty thousand flowers in the shape and colour of the five Olympic rings were revealed and a giant sandcastle, also featuring the rings, has been built at Weymouth and Portland, venue for the sailing events. More than 250 guardsmen formed the figure 100 at the Horse Guards Parade where the beach volleyball will be staged. "These celebration are actually being marked around the globe today," Coe told a news conference. "From Times Square in New York through to Palestine, New Zealand and Socchi. "If ever I needed reminding that we are delivering a Games for the whole world, it's actually been on my international engagement programme over

the last few months. "It's taken me effectively to five continents. I have rarely witnessed the level of excitement amongst national Olympic committee, amongst the media and certainly amongst the elite level competitors that are going to come and dignify our Games in 100 days' time." Unsurprisingly, the organising committee and government ministers remained resolutely upbeat about the third Games to be hosted by London following the 1908 and 1948 editions. — Reuters

## Volkswagen's Audi to invest 2 bln USD in auto plant in Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 20 April — German automaker Volkswagen announced Wednesday it will invest 2 billion US dollars in a new plant for its Audi premium-car unit in Mexico. The company plans to build sport utility vehicles in the Latin American country from 2016 and will decide later this year where exactly it will build the plant, it said in a statement released on Wednesday on its website. "Good infrastructure, competitive cost structures and existing free trade agreements played a significant role in the choice of Mexico," Audi Chief Executive Rupert Stadler said.

"Mexico is known for making cars and offers excellent economic conditions for a production plant of Audi," he added. Mexico's Economy Minister Bruno Ferrari said the investment would be worth about 2 billion dollars, but added the timeframe for the plan and the number of jobs it would create were unclear. "This reflects the competitiveness of Mexico, they choose places where they know they have a safe environment," Ferrari made the remarks at the World Economic Forum in the Mexican Pacific coastal city of Puerto Vallarta. "I know they have several places which they are considering."

Meanwhile, Frank Dreves, the production manager of Audi said that the factors taken into account for the location of the plant not only included features of the site or context of logistics, but also the availability of qualified personnel. "The main benefits offered by Mexico are the cost of labor, supported by the Volkswagen plant in Puebla and Guanajuato, and the network of free trade," he said.

## Barclaycard unveils mini, stick-on credit card

LONDON, 20 April — The latest salvo in the battle to launch a digital wallet has been unveiled - with a mini, stick-on credit card. Barclaycard is hoping that UK customers attach the extra card to their mobile phones and use them at "contactless"

terminals for everyday purchases. This wave-and-pay technology has been in place for a few years. It allows cardholders to spend up to £15 at certain stores, without entering a Pin. However, the latest product, which will be available to millions of

Barclaycard customers by the end of the year, remains some way short of interactive banking on a mobile phone.

The Barclaycard PayTag is being offered to a group of customers who will receive letters in the coming days. It is one third of the size of a standard credit card, with a sticky reverse side. It will be sent without charge to customers who request it and will come in addition to their regular credit card.

The credit card provider believes that people should stick it to the back of their mobile phone handset because most adults carry their phone with them at all times. Cardholders may choose to attach it to their wallet or a key ring, instead.

Barclaycard's Tom Gregory said that the new product gave anyone the opportunity to use a credit card stuck to their phone, without having to upgrade their mobile. However, the implication is that a big take-up would eventually allow Barclaycard to approach mobile phone manufacturers with evidence that inserting a payment chip in a handset would be popular. So far, this technology is available to some Barclaycard customers with certain Orange phones in the UK, but it has not yet taken off as it has in other countries such as Japan. David Chan, chief executive of Barclaycard Consumer Europe, said he wanted the product to "open people's eyes to mobile payments".

## Suspected food poisoning on China campus

CHENGDU, 20 April — Health authorities in southwest China's Sichuan Province are probing a suspected food poisoning incident that sickened dozens of university students on Wednesday. Nearly 100 students from Sichuan University sought medication for vomiting and diarrhea Wednesday afternoon, the

provincial health department said in a statement Thursday.

It said the incident was reported on the university's Jiang'an campus near the Shuangliu International Airport in the provincial Capital Chengdu, but did not give details. A student who gave only her family name as Xia said she suspected the food served at the school

cafeteria was to blame.

"School authority have cleared all the privately-run restaurants and snack bars on campus and the school cafeteria is the only place where we can eat," she said in her microblog at Sina's weibo.com. The health bureau said it was investigating the incident.

## Singapore urged to invest in New Zealand

SINGAPORE, 20 April — Visiting New Zealand's Prime Minister John Key has said Singapore could invest much more in New Zealand's tourism, services and education sectors, local media reported on Thursday. During his first official visit here on Wednesday, part of a frenetic three-day tour that also included Indonesia, John Key was to drum up new business for New Zealand businessmen, the Straits Times reported. Key was in Singapore at the invitation of Prime Minister Lee Hsien

Loong. He called on President Tony Tan Keng Yam at the Istana and attended an official dinner hosted by Lee.

During an interview with the Straits Times, Key highlighted potential tie-ups, citing the development of drugs and health supplements. He said New Zealand could provide expertise and products for Singapore to sell to the world. One such tie-up was made last month when New Zealand's Douglas Pharmaceuticals had Singapore-based McPherson's

Consumer Products distribute its line of fish oil pills.

New Zealand businessmen told the media that they have come to rely on Singapore, nestled in the region's heart, as their main gateway to Asia.

The prime minister considers Singapore's role in opening doors for New Zealand regionally as 'critically important' because booming Asia is 'absolutely critical and integral' to his country's future growth.

## Warning benefit changes may see fewer free school meals

LONDON, 20 April — Plans to simplify the welfare system may mean thousands of England's poorest children lose their entitlement to free school meals, a charity has warned. The meals are linked to low-income benefits that are among those merging into a single Universal Credit in 2013. In a report, the Children's Society said ministers were considering an income cap for eligibility

that could leave 120,000 families worse off. The government said it was determined to ensure no needy child misses out. The Children's Society estimated that it would cost £500m to extend free school meals to all families on Universal Credit.

It said ministers were instead considering limiting it to households with earnings below a certain

level, thought to be about £145 a week. The charity said that would create a benefit cliff-edge that could see 120,000 families worse off if they worked longer or earned more. The government has said people should always better off in work than on welfare. The Children's Society's campaign for childhood director, Elaine Hindal, said the introduction of a new system of entitlement was a chance to increase the availability of free school meals.

"The government has an unique opportunity to extend free school meals to all low-income working families, so that no child living in poverty misses out. "This would be in line with the government's aim to make work pay by paving the way for many families to return to employment and help lift them out of poverty."

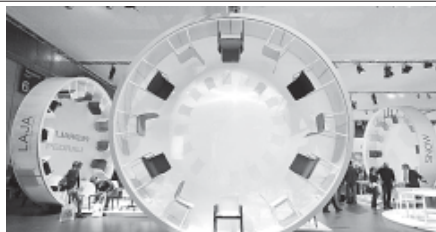
**More exercises reduce Alzheimer's disease risk**

BEIJING, 20 April—More daily exercises, even doing housework, can reduce the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease, according to a new study by the US National Institute on Aging as quoted by media reports on Thursday. The study published in the journal *Neurology* involved 716 subjects without dementia who participated in the Rush Memory and Aging Project, a prospective, observational cohort study.

The subjects were tracked for about four years, during which 71 people developed Alzheimer's

disease, while others were free from the disease. Results showed that the 10 percent of those who got the least exercise were 2.3 times more likely to get the disease compared with the 10 percent of those who got the most exercise. A lot of researches have suggested that people who are not in the habit of doing exercises are more likely to develop Alzheimer's disease.

In a linear mixed-effect model, the level of total daily physical activity was associated with the rate of global cognitive decline, the study showed.—*Xinhua*

**ASML's lumpy chip equipment orders cloud outlook**

AMSTERDAM, 20 April—The world's leading chip equipment maker ASML expects steady sales, driven by demand for hot consumer gadgets such as smartphones and tablets, but said it was hard to predict exactly when orders would arrive. The Dutch company declined to give an orders outlook on Wednesday, disappointing some investors who had recently pushed the stock to a 11.5-year high.

As the world's largest maker of semiconductor lithography machines, ASML is seen as a barometer for the tech sector, and investors had been expecting it to give guidance on orders.

ASML, which competes with Japanese groups Canon and Nikon, said it expects steady sales over the next six to nine months. But a shift to fewer, bigger customers had made it hard to predict exactly when orders would be made.

"The firm reiterated guidance for first-half revenues of 2.4 billion euros and also said that third-quarter sales should be stable at first-half levels – good as bears saw some deceleration in the second half," Jefferies Intl analysts said in a note.

ASML's customers, which include Samsung Electronics, Taipei Semiconductor Manufacturing (TSMC) and Intel Corp, tend to "place big orders of a couple of hundred millions," Peter Wennink, chief financial officer, said in a webcast interview. "We have to deal with fewer but bigger customers over the last couple of years, and those customers place bigger but lumpier orders," Wennink said.

Shares in ASML, whose machines map out electronic circuits on silicon wafers, were down 3.9 percent at 36.425 euros at 1034 GMT, off an 11.5-year high of 38.3 euros hit on 2 April.—*Reuters*

age discrimination on that rule," Milledgeville Chief of Police Dray Swicord, told the station.

Swicord said the officer who handcuffed Johnson is not facing an investigation over his actions.

Swicord added that Johnson was handcuffed for her safety as well as the safety of others. She was taken to the principal's office after pushing two other students, according to a police report.

"The student was never placed in a holding cell or jail cell and the student's safety was of the utmost importance," Swicord said.

## Dutch bug cookbook launched to stir taste for insects

Need more protein in your diet? Try adding worms to your chocolate muffin recipe mix, or spice up a mushroom risotto with a sprinkling of grasshoppers.

"The Insect Cookbook", which comes out on Tuesday and is written in Dutch, contains these and other unusual recipes and is intended to promote insects as a source of protein. "I see this as the next step towards the introduction of insects on restaurant menus in the Netherlands. I also expect people to buy the book and start cooking with insects at home," said Marcel Dicke, a professor at Wageningen University which specializes in food and food production.

To mark the book launch in Wageningen, specialist insect chef Henk van Gorp will try to set a record for cooking the world's biggest grasshopper pie.

Research by scientists at the university showed that insects could provide the best source of protein to meet the needs of a rising population. Currently, 70 percent of agricultural land is used for livestock production.

mountain has a rocky summit with no trail known as the Haystack. The owner called the King County Sheriff's Office late Sunday afternoon to report that her dog, apparently spooked by something, had raced 200 feet up the Haystack and refused to descend, the report said. The Washington State Animal Rescue Team responded but decided it was

too late to bring the dog down safely that night.

In the morning, a Seattle Mountain Rescue team climbed the peak, secured Ana in a harness and lowered her from the mountain. "These rescue teams are amazing," the owner said. "These people drop whatever they are doing to volunteer their time to save humans and animals alike."

## Tom Petty gets guitars back, security guard arrested

LOS ANGELES, 20 April—The waiting might have been the hardest part, but rockers Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers have gotten back the missing guitars they were seeking and police said on Tuesday a security guard has been arrested on suspicion of stealing the instruments.

The five guitars—which included Petty's 1967, 12-string Rickenbacker made of

maple—were reported stolen on Thursday from a sound studio in Culver City, west of Los Angeles, and the band announced it would pay a \$7,500 reward for information leading to their recovery.

Daryl Washington, a 51-year-old security guard at the studio, was arrested on Monday and booked on suspicion of grand theft, police said. Detectives got a tip one of the guitars was sold

to a Hollywood pawn shop, police said. "I am extremely grateful to the Culver City Police Department for a job well done and touched by the outpouring of good wishes and concern from our fans and friends," Petty wrote on his Facebook page.

It was not immediately clear if anyone would collect the \$7,500 no-questions asked reward for the return of the guitars.—Reuters

## Author Rowling writing Harry Potter encyclopedia

LONDON, 20 April—Author JK Rowling is working on a Harry Potter encyclopedia, and will donate the royalties to charity, she has said on her website.

Four years ago the British writer took an independent US publisher to court to stop its plans for a reference book on the world of the fictional boy wizard, saying it constituted a "rip off" of her work.

On her re-vamped website, Rowling addressed the question of a Harry Potter encyclopedia in a "frequently asked questions and rumors" link.

"For a long time I have been promising an encyclopedia of Harry's world, and I have started work on this now," said the 46-year-old, whose announcements related to Harry Potter are closely followed by millions of fans.

"Some of it forms the new content in Pottermore."

Pottermore, a free website allowing visitors to navigate the stories and discover new content not in the original books, is one of several Potter spin-offs following the completion of the seven-novel series.

The novels have sold more than 400 million copies worldwide and spawned a hit eight-movie film franchise that have helped turn Rowling into the world's most successful author.

## Iron Man 3 to be co-produced in China

HONG KONG, 20 April—The next "Iron Man" film will be co-produced in China under a joint agreement between Walt Disney Co, Marvel Studios and DMG Entertainment, the latest in a series of tie-ups between Hollywood and China where movie-going is growing fast. DMG—a Chinese entertainment and marketing group—will invest in Iron Man 3, manage the Chinese co-production process and jointly produce the film in China. Along with Disney's China unit, it will also distribute the film in China, the companies said on Monday.

Iron Man 3 will star Robert Downey Jr, Gwyneth Paltrow and Don Cheadle. It will be released in the United States on 3 May, 2013. Monday's announcement comes after China in February agreed to allow in more foreign films and reflects the fast-growing Chinese middle class spending more money in theaters and less on pirated movies. Last week Disney said it would work with China's Ministry of Culture and Tencent Holdings to promote the animation industry in China, while Dreamworks Animation SKG Inc in February said it would build a studio in Shanghai as part of a joint venture with some of China's biggest media companies.—Reuters

## Court upholds convictions in Stamos extortion plot

LOS ANGELES, 20 April—An appeals court on Monday upheld the convictions and sentences of a Michigan couple charged with trying to extort \$680,000 from actor John Stamos.

Allison Coss and Scott Sippola were convicted in 2010 of concocting an elaborate plot to extort money from Stamos by threatening to release pictures of him at a party where there were strippers and cocaine. The defendants were each sentenced to four years in prison.

Coss and Sippola, who were in a relationship at the time, challenged their convictions, claiming the extortion law was vague and therefore unconstitutional. They argued that the statute should only criminalize threats to commit unlawful acts, not just wrongful acts.

## Manchester United top Forbes money list

### Forbes rates six Barclays Premier League sides in the top 20 most valuable clubs

LONDON, 20 April — Manchester United have been rated as the world's most valuable football club as Premier League sides took six of the top 13 places in the new Forbes valuation list. United are valued at £1.4bn by Forbes magazine, which means they retain the number one rating for the eighth year in a row.

The Barclays Premier League has a collective rights selling model and an equitable distribution of broadcast revenues, which perhaps explains why the English clubs have the largest representation in the top-20 with six clubs, followed by Italy (five), Germany (four), Spain (three) and France (two). Forbes says Manchester United, the 12-time Barclays Premier League champions, are worth 20% more than last year and are ranked as the most valuable team in any sport in the world.

They are worth £240m

more than baseball's New York Yankees and the American Football side Dallas Cowboys from the National Football League. Forbes executive editor Mike Ozanian said: "Manchester United's global fan base of some 330 million also helps make it the most valuable team in any sport." The report stated that the five teams that were worth at least £623m (\$1bn), Manchester United, Real Madrid, Barcelona, Arsenal and Bayern Munich, have capitalized on having strong brands.

"Not only do these teams reap direct revenue from finishing near the top of their domestic leagues and tournament competition, but they also generate rich sponsorship and merchandise deals from the powerful brands they have built through success on the pitch over time," added Ozanian. Forbes start to formulate their valuations by using the Deloitte Football Money League report, which ranks clubs by revenue generation, before conducting their own research which includes "reviewing financial documents and speaking to sports bankers, to derive operating income, debt and values for each team."—Internet

## Barcelona confident of Champions League turnaround

MADRID, 20 April — Lady luck was not smiling on profligate Barcelona in Wednesday's 1-0 Champions League defeat at Chelsea but the holders expressed confidence they could turn the semi-final around in the second leg at their daunting Nou Camp arena on Tuesday. The English Premier League side turned in a gritty performance to deny the Spanish champions and managed to keep World Player of the Year and competition top scorer Lionel Messi quiet to boost their chances of making next month's final.

A large slice of good fortune also helped inflict only a third defeat this season on Barca, who dominated possession, hit the bar and the post and had a Cesc Fabregas effort cleared off the line by Ashley Cole. Barca coach Pep Guardiola, whose side host

"And I'm sticking to that. When I get on the course, I'm more interested in playing golf than my golf swing." Every is in the lead for the first time since January, when he shared the lead going into the final round of the Sony Open.

## Serena ends foreign exile for Olympic dream

Third-seeded Andy Murray advanced after Julien Benneteau of France injured his ankle and quit near the end of a tight first set with the score 6-5. He said later he had a fractured right elbow and sprained right ankle. The top-ranked Djokovic seemed preoccupied as he walked onto center court, his head down.

## Libya to play Cameroon World Cup tie at neutral venue

JOHANNESBURG, 20 April—Libya's opening home match in the World Cup qualifiers against Cameroon will be played at a neutral venue and behind closed doors, FIFA said on Friday.

The 10 June game will be hosted in Sfax in neighbouring Tunisia.

Tunisia has not allowed spectators to watch all but a handful of matches since the uprising in the country in January last year,

which heralded the start of the Arab Spring.

Controlled numbers of supporters have been allowed to attend games in African competitions but league matches are all played behind closed doors because officials fear violence in the stands. There has been no organised football in Libya since March 2011, when the uprising against Muammar Gaddafi's regime began.

Libya played two of their 2012 African Nations

Cup qualifiers at neutral venues in Egypt and Mali but despite losing home advantage and having their team ravaged by the strife, they reached the finals, which were held in Equatorial Guinea and Gabon in January. Libya's last home match was in October 2010 when they beat Zambia. They begin their 2014 World Cup qualifying campaign with an away game against Togo on 3 June.
