NAY PYI TAW, 25 April—President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein attended fourth Mekong-Japan Summit at Hagoromo-No-Ma Hall of State Guest House in Tokyo at 9 am on 21 April.

The summit was also attended by Japanese Prime Minister Mr Yoshihiko Noda, and leaders of Mekong region countries Cambodian Prime Minister Samdech Hun Sen, Laotian Prime Minister Mr Thongsing Thammavong, Thai Prime Minister Ms Yingluck Shinawatra and Vietnamese Prime Minister Mr Nguyen Tang Dung,

ministers, deputy ministers and high-ranking officials of Japan and countries in Mekong region.

On arrival at the State Guest House, President U Thein Sein and leaders of Mekong region countries received cordial welcome by Japanese Prime Minister Mr Yoshihiko Noda.

The leaders then posed for documentary photo.

The Japanese PM and leaders of Mekong region countries addressed the summit.

The President underscored the need to continue exerting efforts for sustainable and equitable comprehensive

economic development in Mekong region while peace prevails in the countries of the region witnessing progress. He tipped rich natural resources and industrious workforce in the region as the sound foundation for future development in Mekong region. East-West Economic Corridor and Southern Economic Corridor, being implemented with the assistance of Japan, could contribute much to both the region and tasks for ASEAN integration by 2015. He said that he is confident that swift commodity flow in the region could boost the role of Mekong region in the international community outside the region.

Japan to cancel 60% of Myanmar's debt to assist the country's moves toward democracy

NAY PYI TAW, 25 April—The following is a joint statement issued by President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein and Japanese Prime Minister Mr Yoshihiko Noda at news press conference held at Hagoromo-No-Ma Hall of the State Guest House in Japan on 21-4-2012.

1. Japan will resume yen loans to Myanmar and cancel about 60 per cent of the debt and overdue charges it is owed to assist the country's recent moves toward democracy.
2. At the Saturday's conference and sideline meetings of leaders from the Mekong region countries—Myanmar, Cambodia, Laos, Thailand and Vietnam,

Japanese Prime Minister Yoshihiko Noda agreed to implement a two step process to reduce Myanmar's financial burden 1—1 a ¥ 127.4 billion debt writeoff and the cancellation of ¥ 176.1 billion in overdue charges from the past two decades. The cancellation is contingent on a year of joint monitoring of the country's democratic reforms. For its part, Myanmar will return ¥ 198.9 billion in previous borrowing from Japan by taking out a new long-term concessionary loan.

3. During the news conference, President U Thein Sein thanked Japanese Prime Minister Noda for cancelling around 60 per cent of Myanmar's debt to Japan, and

stressed the importance of Tokyo's financial support, saying that Japan's cooperation and support will be extremely beneficial in Myanmar's development and reform efforts.

4. Japan will officially resume the low-interest yen loans once the two governments determine the best way to use the funds to improve Myanmar's infrastructure.
5. Japan will also provide ¥ 5 billion in aid to assist ethnic minorities and improve medical care, as well as to support disaster prevention, agriculture and rural development programmes.

We are able

As Myanmar is chasing her dream of democracy, human capital is of crucial importance in her stride towards her destination. Knowledge is power, so goes the saying and human resources are much needed for all these hard work. Here, the participation of all is fundamental to human resources development.

The work force of the disabled should never be neglected in our efforts for better future. The disabled should have access to education, earn a livelihood for survival and have chance to join nation-building endeavours. In fact, the elderly are the source of wisdom who can share their experiences and knowledge to the young. In Myanmar, those aged above 60 was 8.7 per cent of the population in 2007 and increased to 9.1 in 2010. The unprecedented global increase in the number of the aged has posed threat to social security, public health care and even to economic growth. However, the aged who are still fit with full of beans, if allowed to work on, can be main contributors to their families and the society.

It is learnt that home care services projects for the aged have been initiated, but more work is to be done to cover the most. In addition, formation of Older People Self Help Groups (OPSHG) would also contribute to fitness and longevity of the elderly, possibly curbing swelling health care costs.

Weak and withered as they are, the disabled and the aged, under the warm and caring hands of us, still can demonstrate power of willing mind. Every chance should be provided to them to do so. They are the part of the society. They should never be left out nor should they feel they are left out.

ASEAN welcomes EU suspension of sanctions on Myanmar

JAKARTA, 25 April—ASEAN on Wednesday welcomed the European Union's announcement of its suspension of sanctions on Myanmar, a Press statement from the ASEAN Secretariat said.

"All ASEAN member states welcome the suspension of sanctions on Myanmar. We have called for this soon after the country's general elections in 2012, and we reiterated our call immediately after the by-elections in early April," ASEAN Chief Dr Surin Pitsuwan said. The 27 foreign ministers of the EU made the announcement in

Luxembourg on 23 April, suspending restrictive measures imposed on the government, with the exception of the arms embargo which it will retain. "It is the right thing to do at the right time," said ASEAN Secretary General Dr Surin.

He added he was hoping that a long period of strained relations between ASEAN and the EU would be put behind both sides. "The ASEAN-EU Foreign Ministers Meeting in Brunei at the end of April will see a new productive relationship being put on a higher plane for cooperation," Dr Surin said.—MNA/Xinhua

Canada drops non-military sanctions on Myanmar

OTTAWA, 25 April — Canada has suspended its non-military sanctions against Myanmar in recognition of the latter's moves towards democracy, Foreign Affairs Minister John Baird announced here on Tuesday. Baird said he made the decision to drop sanctions after political activist Daw Aung Sang Suu Kyi, who had spent years under house arrest, won a seat in parliament in this month's elections. In March, Baird visited Daw Suu Kyi and conferred honorary Canadian citizenship on her. Baird said he made his decision at Daw Suu Kyi's advice.

During his visit to Myanmar, Baird also met with the country's new civilian leaders and said he was impressed by the country's reforms. The sanctions on imports, exports and financial transactions have been lifted, but Canada will still maintain an embargo on arms and military technology. Baird said he wants more time to monitor the situation before deciding whether to lift the embargo. He said the sanctions

may be re-imposed if Myanmar reverses its policies of freeing political prisoners and relaxing its control of the media.

"This is progress, but much more remains to be done," Baird told reporters during a news conference in the Canadian parliament. "We put in sanctions to try to encourage and force change," he said. "This is probably one of the best examples in the modern era where sanctions have proven very effective. Given the government has taken such significant reforms, we're prepared to give them a shot."

Canada's decision follows a similar move earlier this week by the European Union which suspended most of its sanctions but maintained its arms embargo. The United States has not yet dropped sanctions, but Secretary of State Hillary Clinton recently visited the country. Baird said he hoped the thawing of relations between the two countries could result in the establishment of trade links. Myanmar is a resource-rich country with 60 million people. —MNA/Xinhua

China to promote cooperation with Sweden in sustainable development: Chinese premier

STOCKHOLM, 25 April — Visiting Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao told his Swedish counterpart Fredrik Reinfeldt here Tuesday that China would like to promote cooperation with Sweden in environmental protection and sustainable development. Sweden has been a global leader in environmental protection and sustainable development, while China takes sustainable development as a national strategy, said Wen, adding that China is ready to carry out long-term and all-around cooperation with Sweden in policy dialogue and mechanism construction.

During his meeting with Reinfeldt, Wen said China will take concrete steps to back its enterprises and research institutions to cement innovation cooperation with Sweden, which is the most innovative country within the European Union (EU). Treating Sweden as an important cooperative partner, China highly values its influence in Europe and international affairs, and is willing to strengthen coordination and collaboration with Sweden to push forward bilateral ties. Wen also welcomed the Swedish side to enlarge its investment in areas such as modern manufacturing, high-tech, service industry and agriculture in China, especially in its central and western regions.

While encouraging Chinese companies to do business in Sweden, China hopes that Sweden could push the EU to launch negotiations with China on an investment deal as soon as possible, he said. Moreover,

Wen also called for closer exchanges in such areas as education, culture and tourism between the two countries. Reinfeldt said Sweden is the first Western nation to set up diplomatic relationship with the People's Republic of China, which is now Sweden's largest trading partner in Asia. He urged the two countries to step up their cooperation in areas such as environmental protection, sustainable development and innovation.

The Swedish prime minister also welcomed China to expand its investment in his country, and hoped more Chinese citizens would come to study, travel and work in Sweden. He promised that Sweden would like to play an active role in promoting EU-China relationship. After the meeting, Wen and Reinfeldt attended a signing ceremony of cooperation agreements between the two countries and met the press. The two sides also issued a framework document on strengthening strategic cooperation in sustainable development. Before meeting Reinfeldt, Wen also held talks with the King of Sweden Carl XVI Gustaf in Stockholm.—Xinhua

Pakistan tests nuclear-capable ballistic missile

ISLAMABAD, 25 April—Pakistan successfully test-fired a nuclear-capable ballistic missile on Wednesday, the military said, less than a week after rival India tested a missile capable of delivering nuclear warheads as far as Beijing and Eastern Europe. Pakistan's *Shaheen-1A* is an intermediate range ballistic missile, capable of reaching targets in India. Military officials declined to specify the range of the missile.

The missile's impact point was in the Indian Ocean. India and Pakistan have fought three full-scale wars since they were carved out of British India in 1947. They conduct missile tests regularly and inform each other in advance.

Pakistan conducted nuclear tests in May 1998, shortly after India conducted similar tests. US intelligence estimates last year put the number of nuclear weapons deployed by Pakistan at 90 to 110. Analysts say the strategic US ally's nuclear arsenal is the fastest growing in the world. Pakistan, like neighbouring India, is not a signatory to the nuclear non-proliferation treaty (NPT).—Reuters

Three Bahraini policemen injured in blast

MANAMA, 25 April — Three Bahraini policemen were injured Tuesday night by a bomb explosion in a riot-hit village, the interior ministry said.

A home-made explosive device detonated when the police were patrolling in the Duraz Village. The ministry describe the blast as a "terrorist bombing" targeting the security forces, and said two of the three injured policemen were in critical conditions.

The police secured the area after the incident, and blocked all roads leading to the village as a precautionary measure. Earlier this month, seven policemen were injured, three seriously, after a home-made explosive made with petrol exploded in East Ekar Village.

Soldier killed by armed groups near Damascus

DAMASCUS, 25 April — Armed groups launched an assault on Tuesday at the Syrian government suburb of Douma, killing one army personnel and leaving three others injured, state-run SANA news agency reported. The armed men fired RPG shells at civilians and law-enforcement forces in Douma, leaving many injured, said SANA.

Douma, some 10 km northwest of the centre of

Damascus, has emerged as a hotspot of armed insurgency against the government troops. Earlier in the day, UN observers who arrived in Syria 10 days ago to oversee a cease-fire toured Douma and met with people there. The 11-member UN observer team continued their tours in different hotspots in Syria and the deployment of 300 observers would be completed over the next few weeks.

Syria has repeatedly declared its commitment to the peace plan brokered by international envoy Kofi Annan, but also accused "armed groups" of escalating their violent acts to stymie Annan's efforts. Syria reported a surge in murders and kidnappings by armed groups in the country since the UN observers' arrival.

Mini helicopters fly autonomously

ZURICH, 25 April—Swiss researchers say they've helped develop a type of flying robot that can be navigated using only on-board cameras and a miniature computer.

Researchers at ETH Zurich say the micro helicopters, developed as part of a European project called sFly, require neither GPS nor remote control, but can operate autonomously.

Current flying robots are large and heavy and when used in open fields they often require GPS or a trained pilot,

they said. Compared with GPS-based flying robots, the new micro helicopters can work both in the open air and in enclosed spaces, and can be navigated deep inside buildings where GPS often fails, an ETH Zurich release said on Monday.

With a diameter of 20 inches, they are designed to maneuver in tight or even enclosed spaces, and to detect and fly around any obstacle.

Possible uses could include protection or rescue missions, or flying over

disaster areas and giving a picture of the situation from the air or locating victims.

"This is a research project that above all aims to explore the technical possibilities.

However, we can well imagine that the flying robots developed in the sFly project could be an important aid for rescue teams in disaster relief missions in the not too distant future," Roland Siegwart, head of the Laboratory for Autonomous Systems at ETH Zurich.

Long-lost scroll fragment found in museum

BRISBANE, 25 April—Egyptian artifacts in an Australian museum include a long-lost section of the burial scroll of one of the civilization's greatest builders, a researcher says.

British Museum curator John Taylor — in Brisbane for the opening of a touring exhibition of mummies from his museum — spotted a shred of papyrus on display in the Queensland Museum bearing the distinctive hieroglyphs of Amenhotep, a chief builder in the 15th century BC, whose burial scroll, known as a "Book of the Dead," was scattered across the globe in the 1890s.

The fragment was given to the museum in 1913 as an anonymous gift, and Taylor asked if there were any more such fragments in the museum's storage areas.

"When I was brought into the conservation lab to see them, after a very short period of time it became apparent that we did indeed have many fragments of the Book of the Dead of this extremely important man," Taylor told The Australian. "This is not the papyrus of just anybody — this is one of the top officials in Egypt at the peak of Egyptian prosperity."

Books of the Dead

contained magical spells and were entombed with mummified Egyptians to ensure safe passage from this world to the next life, he said.

Other fragments of Amenhotep's Book of the Dead are in collections at the British Museum, the Boston Museum of Fine Arts and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.

"If we can reconstruct the whole document, then that's going to tell us a whole lot about how these religious texts were put together in ancient Egypt (and) how they selected different component spells," Taylor said.

Rare crested ibis hatches in Japan

TOKYO, 25 April—Japanese wildlife researchers say a crested ibis chick hatched in the wild is the first of the endangered birds born outside captivity in 36 years.

The nestling hatched from an egg produced by a pair of the endangered birds on Sado Island in Niigata prefecture, the Environment Ministry said on Sunday.

Its parents, a 3-year-old male and 2-year-old female, were raised at an ibis conservation centre on the island and released into the wild in March 2011.

They were found to have built a nest on 16 March of this year, *Jiji Press* reported, and the chick's birth was recorded by a remote camera placed near the nest.



The crested ibis, *Nipponia nippon*, is registered as a special Japanese natural treasure, but their population plummeted in the late 19th and early 20th centuries when they were overhunted for their beautiful feathers and when agricultural chemicals degraded their habitats.

The last true Japanese crested ibis died in October 2003, and Japan has been trying to reintroduce the species into the wild since 2008, after receiving a pair from China in 1999 to breed in captivity.

All crested ibises in Japan now are Chinese birds or their offspring, and a total of 76 have been released since September 2008.

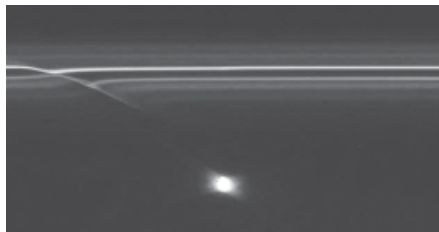
Private company delays 1st space station visit

CAPE CANAVERAL, 25 April—A private US company has delayed launching a cargo ship to the International Space Station.

Space Exploration Technologies Corp, or SpaceX, was scheduled to launch the supply ship next Monday. But company officials said that the spaceship needs more testing. The delay will probably be about one week.

The Dragon spacecraft will be first private ship to go to the station. It will be hoisted aboard the company's Falcon rocket from Cape Canaveral. NASA loaded the test flight with non-essential cargo of clothing, food, computers and science equipment.

SpaceX has successfully launched the Falcon and Dragon before, but going to the space station requires more proven precision. NASA is turning to private companies to carry cargo and eventually astronauts to the space station.—Internet

PASADENA, 25 April—Scientists say strange half-mile-sized objects punching through parts of one of Saturn's rings leave glittering trails behind them they've dubbed "mini-jets."

The findings, seen in images from NASA's orbiting Cassini spacecraft, fill in a missing link in the understanding of the curious behavior of Saturn's outermost ring, known as the F Ring, a release from NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif, said on Monday.

The F ring, perhaps the most active ring in the solar system, has features that can change on a timescale of hours, astronomers say.

"I think the F ring is Saturn's weirdest ring, and these

US offers more aid to drought-hit Horn of Africa

WASHINGTON, 25 April—The United States is offering an additional 120 million dollars in aid to help the drought-hit Horn of Africa countries to cope with the crisis, the White House said on Tuesday.

The aid aims to prevent

a worsening of the situation on the ground in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia as the lateness and insufficiency of rains are expected to have a "significant" negative impact on crop production there, White House spokesman Jay Carney said

Saturn's outer ring in cosmic light show

latest Cassini results go to show how the F ring is even more dynamic than we ever thought," said Carl Murray, a Cassini imaging team member based at Queen Mary University of London, England. "These findings show us that the F ring region is like a bustling zoo of objects from a half mile to moons like Prometheus a hundred miles in size, creating a spectacular show." Scientists have known large objects like Prometheus can create channels, ripples and snowballs in the F ring, and now believe smaller objects, perhaps created when larger objects break up after passing through the ring, go off in new orbits that mean they can pass through the F ring on their own, creating the visual "mini-jets."

These small objects appear to collide with the F ring at low speeds, about 4 mph, and then drag glittering ice particles out of the F ring with them, leaving a trail typically 20 to 110 miles long, such as the ones seen in the Cassini images.

"Beyond just showing us the strange beauty of the F ring, Cassini's studies of this ring help us understand the activity that occurs when solar systems evolve out of dusty disks that are similar to, but obviously much grander than, the disk we see around Saturn," Linda Spilker, Cassini project scientist at JPL, said.—Internet

With respect to the question of U Aung Kyaing of NyaungU Constituency whether **“there is any plan to move Phawtaw gate in Thabeikkyin Township to the entrance way to Mogok about 100 feet away from current location”**, Deputy Minister for Immigration and Population U Kyaw Kyaw Win replied: systematic inspection was carried to prevent foreigners from entering the restricted areas. With the permission of respective departments and organizations, a total of 1050 foreigners were allowed from Mandalay to Mogok and 2164 from Mogok to Mandalay during the period from 1-1-2011 to 29-2-2012. So, that gate does not restrict the people who go through and allow the people to pass it only after staff of departments concerned inspected whether they have the permission to enter restricted areas in

accord with the existing order of the Ministry of Home Affairs .

At present, foreigners are allowed to go to Thabeikkyin and Mogok Townships through the gate with prior permission. And there is no difficulty. The Region also gave comment that the gate is running smoothly. So, at present, there is no plan to move it to the entrance way to Mogok. But, with respect to the proposal, the move will be reconsidered at an appropriate time, based on the factors including increased interest in Tagaung ancient city and the completion of Tagaung road.

With regard to the question of U Soe Win of Sangyoung Constituency on **“Section 359 of the Constitution prescribes that the Union prohibits forced labour except duties assigned by the Union in accord with the law in the interest of the public. He would like to know how the ministries would follow this provision, how the people would complain about forced labour and why farmers are not allowed to grow crops they want to.”**

Deputy Minister for Labour U Myint Thein said: Para 2, subpara 1 of ILO Convention No. 29 states that the term forced or compulsory labour shall mean all work or service which is exacted from any

person under the menace of any penalty and for which the said person has not offered himself voluntarily.

In addition, Para 2, Subpara 2 also says that the term forced or compulsory labour shall not include any work or service exacted in virtue of compulsory military service laws for work of a purely military character; any work or service exacted from any person as a consequence of a conviction in a court of law, provided that the said work or service is carried out under the supervision and control of a public authority and that the said person is not hired to or placed at the disposal of private individuals, companies or associations; any work or service exacted in cases of emergency, that is to say, in the event of war or of a calamity or threatened calamity, such as fire, flood, famine, earthquake, violent epidemic or epizootic diseases, invasion by animal, insect or vegetable pests, and in general any circumstance that would endanger the existence or the well-being of the whole or part of the population; minor communal services of a kind which, being performed by the members of the community in the direct interest of the said community, can therefore be

considered as normal civic obligations incumbent upon the members of the community, provided that the members of the community or their direct representatives shall have the right to be consulted in regard to the need for such services.

Amyotha Hluttaw session continues for 20th day

NAY PYI TAW, 25 April—The third regular session of the First Amyotha Hluttaw continued for 20th day at Amyotha Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here today, attended by Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Aung Myint and 216 MPs.

First, Bill Committee Member U Myint Tun read the report of the committee on Foreign Currency Expenditure Bill which was sent back to the Amyotha Hluttaw by the Pyithu Hluttaw with amendments.

The Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker sought approval from the Hluttaw about the amendments and supplements of the Bill Committee made to the bill.

Next, U Zaw Myint Pe of Mandalay Region Constituency (5), U Steven Thabeik of Chin State Constituency (4), Dr Myint Kyi of Yangon Region Constituency (8) and U Nyan Lin of Ayeyawady Region Constituency (3), in their affirmative discussion about the proposal of U Myo Myint from Mandalay Region Constituency (6) who **urged the Union government to hire local and foreign experts to compile reports on economic and engineering development of Myanmar and to form high-level work supervision coordination committee**, said it needed to draw national development for both short term and long term. It was disappointing that KTL Plan was still the blueprint of the national development plans of the present time. It was required to adopt Myanmar Investment Plan with the assistance of local and foreign experts. As there was a great potential of investment from foreign countries flooding into the

country following the reforms of the nation, it was advisable to have a master plan to get ready. It needed to compile comprehensive reports on economic and engineering development for such reports were pivotal for national development.

Regarding the proposal, Deputy Minister for Industry U Myo Aung said the 30-year grand plan was initially drawn by experts from ministries of the nation without the ideas foreign experts. The plan was found to be incomprehensive despite the utmost efforts of the ministries due to time and financial constraint for detailed surveys on the ground. Policies and fields of some ministries had changed much during ten-year period from 2001 to 2010.

The new government was re-drawing 30-year grand plans of the respective ministries in line with national project policies of the modern time. In addition, it was also planning rural development project, township development project, urban development project, regional projects for regions and states, calling for sheer quantity of local and foreign competence assistance. Likewise, previously it was focused on net production and GDP in agriculture, meat and fish, forestry, industry, mines and minerals, energy, electric power, construction, transportation, communication, finance, social and management, service, trade and other sectors. Now, it had been instructed to launch projects in national interests, which means to only essential projects for the nation, region and the people will be implemented under consideration of

economic viability and socio-economic needs. In so doing, it needed to invite the assistance of experts at home and abroad.

Now, as there were offers from international organizations for assistance and economic cooperation, some ministries had started seeking international competency assistance. Under the assistance of UNDP, foreign experts were conducting trainings to local experts in shifting over to 1993, 2008 System of National Account from 1986 System of National Account in national planning. Investment feasibility surveys were being carried out by hiring foreign consultant groups in addition to local experts, and seeking assistance from UNCTAD. It was also preparing to draw industrial development plan with foreign assistance. The national plan covered sector-wise projects and regional projects. Coordination for adopting of comprehensive plan was under way and discussions would be held in near future.

Regarding formation of a high-level project coordination committee, “National Plan Commission” led by the Prime Minister was formed in parliamentary democracy era. “Special Projects Implementation Committee” chaired by the Chairman of State Peace and Development Council was established in time of SPDC. In time of the new government, the President chairs “Special Projects Implementation Committee”.

Financial Commission was formed in line with Section 229 of 2008 Constitution which does not require the formation of

Planning Commission. Formation of the National Planning Commission would focus more on sector-wise projects and regional projects.

As the Hluttaw was agreed on the proposal, it was approved.

Daw Khin Waing Kyi of Yangon Region Constituency-1 seconded the proposal submitted by U Maung Aye Tun of Rakhine State Constituency-9 **“urging the Union government to amend penalties in Sections 417, 426 and 427 of Penal Code”**.

Assignment of duties by the State in accord with the law for the interest of the general public means that every works making cooperation with the local people must benefit them directly and special emphasis are to be placed not to be a massive burden to them when there occurs emergency that causes damage to the interest of people and the local people.

Affected region and time are to be fixed and disclosed in assigning duties for that emergency condition. The period for necessary participation of the people must not exceed the period needed for the emergency. So, the ministries are now following the provision as per the Constitution.

As to the second question, he said stern actions can be taken in accord with the Amended Ward or Village-tract Administration Bill. Decision of court is to be taken after the case is applied to the court directly.

With regard to the last question, he replied, at present, the country has no such cases. Farmers can grow any crops they want to, except permission and restrictions. Those who give order to grow can be complained in case of that case.

Deputy Minister for Education U Aye Kyu replied the two questions. With respect to the question of U Mya Thein of Bogale Constituency whether **"there is any plan to lay down education plan for narrowing education gap between urban and rural areas and to place emphasis on education in rural areas"**, he replied: the number of basic education schools in rural areas has reached 89 percent across the country. And over 67 percent of students are taught by 69 percent of teachers. The average ratios of teacher and student in rural areas are 1:23 at high school level, 1:37 at middle school level and 1:26 at primary school level.

At present, Plans are under way to transfer teachers from the schools having a lot of teachers to the schools with few teachers in order that the students can learn lessons effectively. In addition, arrangements are being made to assign new teachers with the growing number of students. Special emphasis placed on appropriate appointments of teachers according to the ratio of teacher and student and teacher and class room ratio.

Respecting the question of U Khin Maung Myint of Paung Constituency whether **"there is any plan to hold National level Education Conference with the participation of experienced scholars and organizations so as to implement education development programme for the development of the country"**, he said: Ministry of Education has been holding education promotion programme since 1998. National Education Promotion Conference with the participation of officials and scholars is held at the last week of April yearly. Works to be done for coming academic year are discussed and decided at the conference. State-level policy choosing conference on Education and Health Development was held in February, 2012. Integrations programme with International experiences were coordinated at the conference. There is no plan to hold National-level Education Conference as national education promotion conference is held yearly.

At the bill approval session, Hluttaw approved the para 1, para 2 (c), para 3, para 3 heading, Para 4 (a and b), para 5 and para 9 of amended Important Goods and Services Bill by Amyotha Hluttaw.

At the report submitting session, member of Bill Committee U Thein Tun read out the report of Bill Committee on the 2012 Examination Board Bill submitted by Pyithu Hluttaw Education Promotion Committee yesterday. At the bill submitting session, Secretary of Pyithu Hluttaw Education Promotion Committee Dr Mya Oo submitted the 2012 Basic Education Bill. The date will be announced to discuss the bill and those wishing to discuss the bill are to register along with detailed para, subpara and content not later than 4 pm on 29 April. The meeting came to an end at 11:40 am and date will be announced for the 22nd Day meeting.—MNA

Wider transportation routes in the region would establish more mutual understanding and friendship among the peoples and bring about regional stability and development thanks to more frequent contacts among the peoples in the region, he went on. 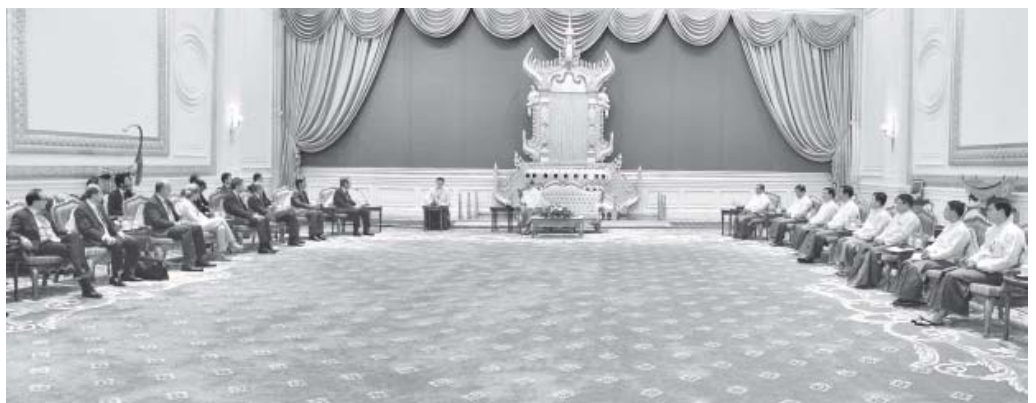

poverty, improvement of displaced people, preventive measures against natural disasters and producing value-added agricultural products and the second pillar was to focus on the human resource development which was vital for the socio-economic development and the third pillar was to assist in construction of basic infrastructures to achieve long-term development, Mr Noda said. Similarly, Japan would help development of agro-based industries in Myanmar. He also expressed Japan's willing to help build necessary infrastructures for the development of Yangon and its environs and drawing the Master Plan for development of the transportation sector. Mr Noda also added that Japan had a plan to send an expert team to renovate the Biluchaung Hydro Power Plant No 2 and was willing to implement the task as soon as possible. He also welcomed the ways for the debt cancelling agreement and pledged that Japan would help to negotiate with international monetary organizations regarding the financial assistance from the organizations. Japan had a plan to review giving loans to Myanmar and welcomed the joint-venture projects of Thilawa Deep Sea Port and special economic zone between Myanmar and Japan. He urged the Myanmar side to encourage the practical cooperation between the government and the private sector in order that the project could be implemented early.

Production, agriculture, mining and energy companies in Japan were willing to invest in Myanmar and Japan was willing to help draft the foreign direct investment law and the special economic zone law and to coordinate for drawing the

stability and prevalence of law and order, national reconciliation, flourishing democratic practices, emergence of the good governance and clean government, enjoying fundamental rights in accordance with the provisions of the constitution, promotion of education and health standard, economic reforms, promotion of the socio-economic life of the people and environmental conservation.

Especially, the government had steadfastly made endeavours for the stability and development of the country, improvement of the socio-economic status of the people, democratic transition and helping the people to earn their livelihood in accordance with the law, he said.

million USD which accounted for 0.53 per cent of total investment in Myanmar. He thanked the Japanese Prime Minister for his encouragement to Japanese companies to make investments in Myanmar. The Myanmar President said that Myanmar has projects to build Thilawa Special Economic Zone near Yangon and deep sea ports in Dawe, the southern part of Myanmar, inviting Japanese to make investments, pledging to make sure smooth investment procedures.

The Myanmar government was adjusting the investment law, continued the Myanmar President, promising to create investor-friendly business environment. Myanmar was trying to bring down its poverty rate to 16 per cent in 2015 from current rate of 26 per cent to meet the Millennium Development Goals. In so doing, the government's focus was on power supply, jobs creation and increased income in rural regions as 70 per cent of the population are rural people who live in poor condition. The Myanmar President then proposed the Japanese Prime Minister to urge Japanese businessmen to make a lot of investments in production industries that can create a large number of jobs, small and medium enterprises and local product-based industries in Myanmar.

The Myanmar President then expressed his commitment that Myanmar government would like to promote the bilateral trade further. During 2010-2011, the bilateral trade amounted to 493.8 million USD and in 2011-2012 it nearly doubled, reaching 822.5 million USD. And he added that he would like Economics, Trade and Industry Ministry, Chambers of Commerce and Industry and Japanese export, import companies including JETRO to smoothen the way for increased trade activities.

The Myanmar President said that Myanmar, based on agriculture, was working hard for industrialization of the nation. He requested the Japanese Prime Minister to render prioritized help in reclamation of flooded farmland, construction of anti-salt water embankment in farmlands prone to natural disaster-led salt water, production of paddy seeds and modern rice mills. Six Japanese enterprises including the Economy, Trade and Industry Ministry had come to Myanmar to discuss exploration of oil and gas, construction of oil refineries and LPG factories and renovation of factories. 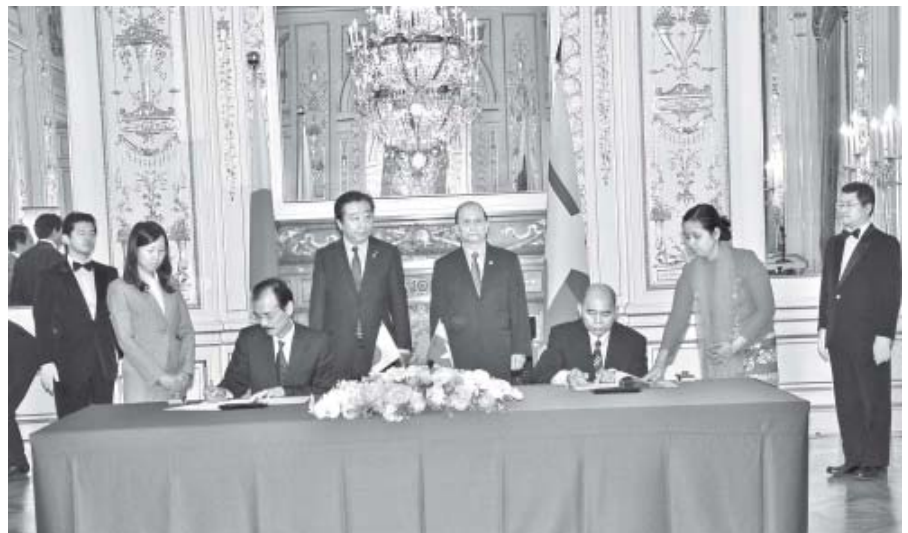

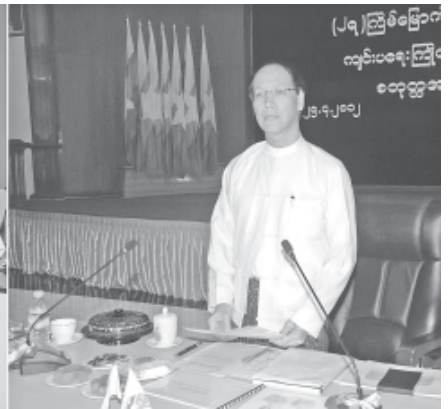

US oil price edges up

NEW YORK, 25 April—The US crude oil price edged up on Tuesday while the Brent crude slipped, and the spread between the two benchmarks narrowed further.

Driven by solid US corporate earnings, the market sentiment rose, which offered support to the US crude price.

And a weakening dollar,

which dipped about 0.2 percent against a basket of currencies, also contributed to the price increase.

But the US economic data offered no support. According to a closely-watched gauge, US home prices in most major cities hit new lows in February, suggesting a struggling situation in the housing

industry. Besides, the Conference Board's consumer confidence index slipped in April in a reflection of the softening general economy.

Investors were waiting for the inventories data due out on Wednesday and the Federal Reserve's updates about the US economy following a two-day policy meeting.—Xinhua

Central China mine flood kills nine

ZHENGZHOU, 25 April — Four miners who went missing following a coal mine flood in central China's Henan Province have been confirmed dead, bringing the death toll for the 14 April flood to nine, rescuers said on Wednesday.

A total of 53 miners were working in the mine in the city of Pingdingshan when it flooded. Forty-two of them managed to escape on their own, while two others were pulled out after rescuers pumped water out of the mine, according to the local rescue headquarters.

The bodies of five miners were found shortly after the flood, leaving four miners unaccounted for. After finding their bodies on Wednesday, rescuers wrapped up their rescue efforts to make way for a subsequent investigation into the accident.

A preliminary investigation showed that the flooding was caused by seepage from a disused mining pit adjacent to the mine. The mine is owned by the Yulongyuantong Coal Mining Co, which was taken over by Henan Coalbed Methane Development Co Ltd, in January this year.— *Xinhua*

Two UN observers station in Syria's Hama on Tuesday

DAMASCUS, 25 April— The spokesman of the advance team of UN observers said that two observers have stationed in Syria's central Hama Province on Tuesday. The team has toured Douma suburb of Damascus, central Hama Province and is currently patrolling the outskirts of central Homs province. Neeraj Singh told *Xinhua* by phone on Tuesday.

He said that two observers have stationed in Hama to monitor the situation there following reports of continued clashes between

Syrian troops and rebel forces in that area over the past days. On Saturday, two observers also stationed in Homs. Witnesses told *Xinhua* that the situation there got calmer

after the deployment of observers.

On ground, there are 11 unarmed military observers operating and preparing the ground for the larger mission, which the UN Security Council has agreed to expand to around 300 observers. The advance team of international observers arrived last week after Syria accepted the UN-backed truce aiming to solve its crisis politically. Since their arrival, violence has declined to some extent, but attacks and deaths are still reported to take place on daily basis.

Judge killed in ambush in C Philippines

MANILA, 25 April — A trial court judge was killed in an ambush on Tuesday night in central Philippine Province of Negros Occidental, police said on Wednesday.

The victim was identified as Judge Henry Arles of Regional Trial Court in Kabankalan, a city of the

Negros Occidental Province, Philippine National Police spokesman Agrimero Cruz Jr said.

Initial investigation by the police revealed that the victim, while driving his car going to south direction, was shot by a group of unidentified suspects on a tricycle in the vicinity of

Manalad village, Ilog town of the province. Arles was brought to a hospital but was declared dead on arrival by the attending physician.

Cruz said investigation has been ongoing to determine the possible motive of the killing and for the apprehension of the suspects.— *Xinhua*

Explosion rocks soccer viewing centre in Nigeria

Jos, 25 April — An explosion rocked a football viewing centre in Nigeria's central north city of Jos on Tuesday night, the police said. Plateau State commissioner of police Dipo Ayeni confirmed this to *Xinhua*, saying that the number of casualties cannot be confirmed now.

A *Xinhua* reporter in the restive city said three persons were injured in the blast that rocked a football center at Tudun Wada in Jos north area of Plateau. According to him, the affected persons have been rushed to the hospital while the youths in the area are demanding for the immediate withdrawal of security from the area.

He said security personnel have cordoned off the area and dispersed the protesting youths. There is no immediate claim of responsibility from any group. The blast occurred when the European Champions League match between Chelsea football club of England and FC Barcelona of Spain was going on.— *Xinhua*

Beijing roast duck prepared by culinary disciples

BEIJING, 25 April — Wearing white chef uniforms and hats, four top-ranking chefs from the Quanjudu Group, a chain of restaurants renowned for their roast duck, presented a bouquet of flowers and bowed to Gu Jiuru and Zheng Shaowu, two master chefs who represent the highest level of Chinese cooking. The ceremony, referred to as a "discipleship ceremony," is a traditional part of many Chinese workplaces. In these ceremonies, "disciples" (workers who are being trained to improve their abilities) bow and serve tea to their "shifu" ("master"), the person responsible for guiding their training.

Although the more traditional aspects of the ceremony are seldom observed, the respect given to the masters by their disciples has never changed. Of the four top chefs from Quanjudu, 38-year-old Yang Huiyu is the youngest. He is in charge of a team of 43 chefs at a Quanjudu branch in southwest China's Chongqing municipality. After going through a meticulous selection and examination process administered by Quanjudu, Yang finally got the opportunity to acknowledge and pay his respects to Gu at the discipleship ceremony, which was held last Wednesday. "Chinese dining culture is extensive and profound. I hope to learn about and inherit traditional cultural knowledge from my master Gu," Yang said.

China Quanjudu (Group) Co, Ltd has been around for nearly 150 years and is one of China's most well-known restaurant chains. Although perhaps best known for their roast duck, Quanjudu serves a wide variety of Chinese cuisine, all prepared by some of the best chefs in the business. Quanjudu's chefs bear a quote from the late Chairman Mao Zedong in mind while working: "Quanjudu should be forever kept."

South American bird found in Chicago

Chicago bird-watchers say they've found a South American white-crested elaenia 7,000 miles away from home—only the second to be spotted in the United States.

Two Oak Park brothers spied the green and white bird last week during a routine bird-watching trip to

Douglas Park.

The teens posted photographs on Facebook on the Illinois Birders' Forum, *The Chicago Tribune* reported Sunday, and other bird-watchers quickly weighed in to confirm the boys' suspicions.

"You're finding something that shouldn't be

there," said Ethan Gyllenhaal, 16. "It's so weird to think that it flew 7,000 miles away. You just happen to be looking at the right tree and the right time."

"It's kind like being a proud parent," said Aaron Gyllenhaal, 15. The elaenia — about 13.5 to 15 centimeters long and

weighing about half an ounce — is normally found in the forest edges in the Andes Mountains, the Cornell Lab of Ornithology said.

The American Birding Association has not confirmed the bird is, in fact, a white-crested elaenia. No one seems to know how or why the bird traveled 7,000 miles to perch in Douglas Park, the *Tribune* said.

Woman angry at dating spreadsheet leaker

The woman who received the highest ranking on a New York investment banker's dating spreadsheet said she's angry at the woman who leaked the document.

Liliana Beidaut, 26, a makeup artist who received a 9.5 ranking on the infamous Match.com dating scorecard made by David Merkur, 28, said she was upset to find someone had leaked the spreadsheet to the public, the *New York Post* reported on Friday. The spreadsheet, which Merkur used to rank eight female Match.com users on their appearances, became public after the banker sent it

to one of his dates, a woman named Arielle, and she sent it to her friends. "Why would she send it to the whole world?" said Beidaut, whose ranking was the highest on the list. "It was a really stupid move." "My face is plastered everywhere now," she said. "I was just thinking that I was using Match.com."

Beidaut, who theorized Merkur sent the list to Arielle because he "really liked" her and she passed it on because she was "spiteful" about her low ranking, said she is "absolutely" considering legal action against the other woman.

Century-old tortoise dies

A 660-pound Aldabra tortoise more than 100 years old has died at the Silver Springs Nature's Theme Park in Silver Springs, Fla, officials say.

Frank the Tank passed away in his pen Thursday, *The Ocala (Fla) Star-Banner* reported. Considered to be the theme park's oldest animal, the park was Frank's home for more than 40 years. Aldabra tortoises are native to the Aldabra group of islands of Seychelles, a country off the east coast of Africa.

LOS ANGELES, 25 April— Singer-actress Christina Aguilera loves her cosmetics too much, says make-up artist Scott Barnes, who doubts the former can ever keep her look toned down.

Barnes suggested that

Britain to face Senegal in first game

LONDON, 25 April — Hosts Britain, taking part in their first Olympic soccer finals since 1960, will kick off their bid for gold against Senegal at Old Trafford after being placed in a tough opening round group in the draw at Wembley on Tuesday. Senegal, who play Britain on 26 July, reached their first Olympics after beating Oman 2-0 in a playoff on Monday and the group will be completed by Uruguay and the United Arab Emirates. Like Britain, who won the soccer gold in 1908 and 1912, Uruguay also boast two

We will also field our strongest team and see if our players at Newcastle like Demba Ba and Papiiss Cisse can be involved."

Seeded Brazil, five-times World Cup winners but never Olympic champions, face Egypt, Belarus and New Zealand in Group C and will play their matches in Cardiff, Manchester and Newcastle.

Brazil to invest \$17 billion in mass transit for World Cup

SAO PAULO, 25 April — Brazil will invest \$17 billion on public transport for the 2014 World Cup and the 2016 Summer Olympics. President Dilma Rousseff announced on Tuesday. She said in a speech here that the federal government, states and cities would earmark a total of 32 billion reals (\$17 billion) for streetcars, subways and bus stations but gave no timetable for completion.

The president stressed that the projects would directly benefit 53 million Brazilians in several cities. "Young people, children and adults use these transport systems and mass transit most serves people with the lowest incomes," she stressed.

With a population of more than 191 million, Brazil, Latin America's leading economic power, faces huge transportation problems in big cities such as Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Salvador and Belo Horizonte, its biggest challenge as host of the world's two top sporting events.

No complaints says Terry after red card

BARCELONA, 25 April — Chelsea captain John Terry said he deserved his red card in Tuesday's 2-2 draw at Barcelona which eliminated the holders and booked the Premier League side's place in next month's Champions League final. Defender Terry was shown a straight red card by Turkish referee Cuneyt Cakir in the 37th minute for kneeling Alexis Sanchez in the back and will miss the final on 19 May.

"It does look bad on the replay. I raised my knee which in hindsight I shouldn't have done. No complaints from the replay," the Englishman told Sky Sports after his team went through 3-2 on aggregate. "Sanchez darted in behind me. At the time I was bewildered. I feel like I've let the lads down," added Terry, whose missed penalty cost Chelsea the 2008 title against Manchester United in Moscow.

Chelsea will also be without the suspended Branislav Ivanovic in the Munich final while fellow defender Gary Cahill was injured during Tuesday's match and David Luiz missed the game.

Terry said he was not surprised at Chelsea's stunning upset. "This is what this football club deserves. It's massive." Caretaker coach Roberto Di Matteo said: "He's a fantastic leader of this group. Everybody can make a mistake in life. We're just happy to go through. We're all human beings. They're under huge pressure these players."

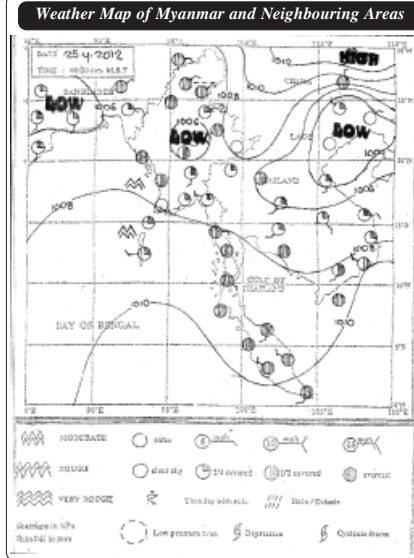

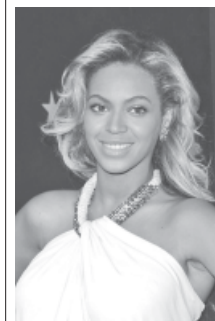

Owen aims for return this season

LONDON, 25 April—Former England striker Michael Owen thinks he could still feature for Premier League title-chasers Manchester United before the end of the season, despite being sidelined by a string of injuries. It could be the last game of the season at Sunderland. "I might have built up enough, whether playing in a reserves game or two, and then that's fine."

Owen's only league appearance this season was in a draw at Stoke in September but he has scored three goals in two League Cup matches.—*Internet*

UK police still hope to find missing Madeleine alive

LONDON, 25 April—British police investigating the disappearance of Madeleine McCann, the three-year-old who went missing in Portugal five years ago sparking a global hunt, still hope to find her alive, the officer leading the inquiry said on Wednesday. Detective Chief Inspector Andy Redwood told reporters police have identified 195 "investigative opportunities" from existing evidence that have been handed to Portuguese police. Some, he said, included new information.

Gerry were dining at a nearby restaurant with seven friends. Despite numerous

reported sightings from Belgium and Spain to Morocco, France and Malta and investigations stretching as far as Australia, her whereabouts remain a mystery. The McCanns were named as official suspects by Portuguese police four months after their daughter's disappearance but in 2008 they were cleared and Portugal's public prosecutor later dropped the case citing a lack of any evidence. The McCanns had won

550,000 pounds (\$888,000) in damages from two British newspapers who suggested they had killed Madeleine, while their friends—known as the "Tapas 7"—also won large payouts over claims they had lied about the abduction. Last year, the McCanns wrote to British Prime Minister David Cameron saying neither the British nor Portuguese officials were doing enough to find their daughter and that only private investigators they had hired were still following their case.

Cameron subsequently ordered a new probe by London police who are working through 40,000 pieces of material and documents, and have issued a computer-generated photograph showing how Madeleine might look now as her ninth birthday approaches.

Redwood, who has been to Portugal seven times on the case, declined to give details about any possible

suspects, or sightings, although he said these form part of the new findings. He said he would not be drawn on any hypothesis of where Madeleine might be if alive and that police were giving equal weight in their review to the notion she was dead. Any formal decision to reopen the case would have to be taken by Portugal.—*Reuters*
