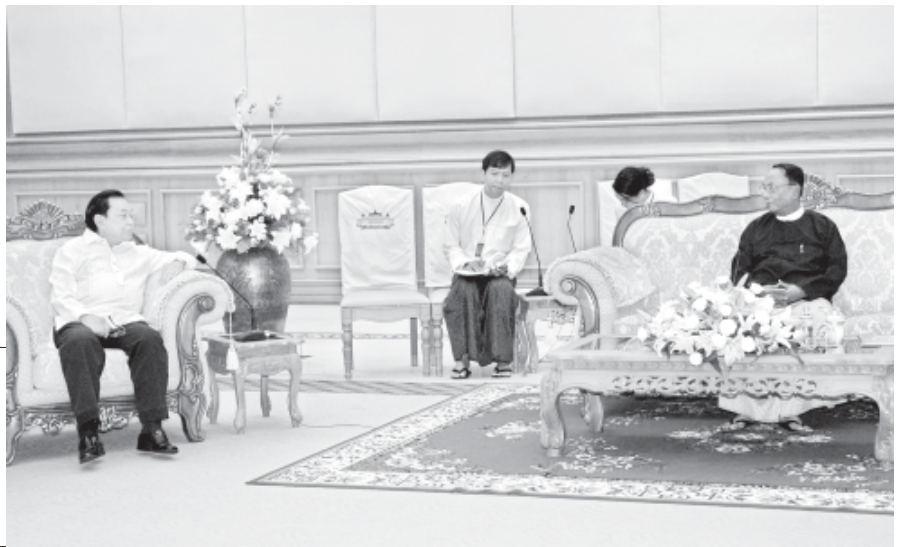

Roberto Mancini says Newcastle game tougher than facing Man Utd

LONDON, 4 May—Manchester City's visit to in-form Newcastle United on Sunday (12:30 GMT) will be more difficult than last Monday's match against title rivals Manchester United, according to manager Roberto Mancini.

The Italian said fifth-placed Newcastle would approach the game against Premier League leaders City in an extremely confident mood after their 2-0 victory at Champions League finalists Chelsea on Wednesday. "Newcastle played a fantastic game at Chelsea and I think this game will be more difficult for us," Mancini told reporters on Friday.

"The Manchester United game was at home and we played very well to win 1-0 but Newcastle is away and I think it will be harder."

The two Manchester clubs are locked together on 83 points with two games left to play

this season, with City top on goal difference.

Mancini said City would keep a particularly close eye on red-hot Senegal striker Papiss Cisse on Sunday. "Cisse is incredible," said the Italian. "He scored two fantastic goals against Chelsea. "He has 13 goals in 12 league games for Newcastle and he's a good player. But not just him, their whole team is playing very well.

"They play to win in every game, they have a good mentality and for this reason I think it will be a good game on Sunday."

Manchester United entertain Swansea City at 15:00 GMT and Mancini dismissed the suggestion that Manchester City would be under more pressure because they play first on Sunday. "Our players know they have everything in their own hands," he said.—Reuters

Great strides towards prosperity

Regarding the second question, the UN chief said, "UN is also going to normalize our operations. First of all we will discuss with the member states and try to normalize our operations as

soon as possible. Right after my visit, we will discuss this matter with the governing body of UNDP. We will try to provide full economic assistance."

"As you may know, I am going to launch Global Compact of the United Nations. This will be very fortunate occasion for local entrepreneurs to engage with the international business counterpart."

"We will also try to discuss with the donors how to increase the Official Development Assistance. I think you are one of the lowest accepted countries in terms of ODA. In parallel with very positive democratization process, I think, the international community should provide more assistance. United Nations will mobilize and persuade the international community."

As pledged by the chief of the United Nations, the assistance from the UN will flow into the country sooner or later. And many others are eyeing investing in our country. On our part, let's try our best for our nation's prosperity. Let's welcome international cooperation together!

National Environmental Sanitation Activity-2012 opens

NAY PYI TAW, 4 May—"Four sanitation tasks are crucial for health care of the State and contribute to the development of socio-economic status of people", said Union Minister for Health Dr Pe Thet Khin, at the opening ceremony of National Environmental Sanitation Activity-2012, jointly organized by the Ministry of Health and UNICEF, at the Ministry of Health here yesterday morning.

The Ministry of Health is drafting National Five Year Strategic Plan for Water Supply, Sanitation & Hygiene (2012-2017). According to the WHO's annual reports, 1.8 million

people are died of diarrhoea, most of whom are children. According to the research findings, systematic sanitations can reduce the outbreak of diarrhoea.

Afterwards, UNICEF Resident Representative Mr. Ramesh Shrethe delivered an address. And Chief of UNICEF Water, Sanitation & Hygiene Section Dr Dara Johnston explained the findings of Knowledge, Attitude and Practices (KAP) study on water, environment and hygiene in 24 townships in Myanmar. Afterwards, the implementation of Community Led Total Sanitation (CLTS) in Pyay District, Bago Region (West), was shown with

video slides. The ceremony came to an end.

After the ceremony, the Union Minister and guests viewed the National Environmental Sanitation Activities-2012 booths. It was also attended by Deputy Ministers for Health Dr Daw Myat Myat Ohn Khin and Dr Win Myint, directors-general and officials from the ministries related to the Ministry of Health, officials from Myanmar Maternal and Child Welfare Association and Myanmar Women's Affairs Federation, resident representatives from UN agencies and

China-US dialogue highlights will for new ties

BEIJING, 4 May—A new round of China-US Strategic and Economic Dialogue (S&ED) on Thursday highlighted the will of both sides to build new relations in

the era of economic globalization. China and the United States should break the traditional belief that big powers will conflict with each other, and seek new ways to

develop relations between major countries, said Chinese President Hu Jintao when addressing the opening session of the fourth round of the S&ED in Beijing.

To build such a new type of relations between China and the United States, Hu called on the two sides to advance with the times in their thinking, policies and actions. Over the past 30 years and more since its reform and opening-up process started, China has, through the hard work and wisdom of the Chinese people and win-win cooperation with people around the world, pursued peaceful development, he said. "To follow the path of peaceful development is China's strategic choice that will never change, and it is a solemn commitment China has made to the world," according

to Hu. To build a new type of relation between China and the United States, the president also called on the two sides to act in a spirit of equality and mutual understanding. Given different national conditions, it is impossible for China and the United States to see eye to eye on every issue, he admitted, calling on the two sides to expand common ground and properly manage their differences through dialogue and exchanges and by improving mutual understanding. As the world's top two economies were linked by shared global responsibilities, Hu suggested the two countries should step up coordination on regional and international issues, and promote peace and stability in the Asia-Pacific and beyond. — Xinhua

Iran's Bushehr nuke power plant at full capacity from 23 May: Russian contractor

Moscow, 4 May—Iran's Bushehr nuclear power plant will start reaching its full capacity from 23 May as scheduled, the plant's Russian contractor Atomstroyexport said in a statement on Thursday. According to Atomstroyexport, Bushehr, the first nuclear power plant in Iran, has successfully reached 90 percent of its nominal capacity in routine trials in early May.

"Currently, the plant is operating at a lower capacity. The next stage of increasing Bushehr's capacity (from 75 percent to 100 percent) is scheduled for 23 May, 2012," Atomstroyexport said in a statement. Earlier, Russian officials said work at the Bushehr plant was proceeding as scheduled and they expected Bushehr could switch to full power in the first half of 2012.

Construction of the

Bushehr plant was started in 1975 by several German companies. However, the work halted when the United States imposed an embargo on hi-tech supplies to Iran after the 1979 revolution. Russia signed a contract with Iran to complete the construction in 1998. Completion of the plant's construction was postponed several times by mounting technical and financial challenges and pressure from the United States.

Suicide bomber kills 17 in northwest Pakistan

KHAR, 4 May—A suicide bomber killed at least 17 people and wounded 40 on Friday in an attack on a police checkpoint in northwest Pakistan, casting doubt on official assertions that security offensives have weakened militants.

The bomber struck near a crowded market in Bajaur, one of the unruly Pashtun tribal regions near the Afghan border where the military has mounted offensives in recent years against the al-Qaeda-linked Pakistani Taliban, the biggest security threat to the country. Abdul Haseeb, a senior government official in the region, said at least 17 people were killed and 40 wounded. At least three of the dead were policemen, including a senior officer, said another official. Police and security forces sealed off the site of the attack. Pakistan, a strategic US ally, has failed to break the back of the Taliban despite numerous crackdowns. — Reuters

Twin bomb attacks kill up to 20 in Russia's Dagestan

MAKHACHKALA, 4 May—Suicide bombers killed more than 20 people and wounded 110 in attacks on a police post on the outskirts of the capital of Russia's Dagestan Region, local investigators and law enforcement sources said on Friday. The attacks outside Makhachkala late on Thursday were the deadliest in months, undermining efforts by Russian security forces to contain an Islamist insurgency in the North Caucasus near Sochi, where Russia will host the Winter Olympics in 2014. More than a decade after federal troops toppled an Islamist government in Chechnya, also in the North Caucasus, security forces are fighting militants whose ranks are swollen by anger at poverty, clan feuds and pervasive corruption.

The first suicide bomber detonated a bomb when police stopped a vehicle to check documents, a statement by the National Anti-Terrorist Committee said. The second explosion came when fire brigades and ambulances arrived, causing additional casualties. A witness at the scene said a fire truck was reduced to charred wreckage. "After the blast, only the wheels of the truck remained whole," the witness told reporters. Local officials said that in addition to the up to 20 killed in the blast, 90 had been taken to hospital and 20 were treated at the scene. "Fragments of human bodies are scattered at the post," Russia's Interfax news agency quoted a law enforcement official as saying. Local investigators said they had found the remains of a man and a woman suspected of being the suicide bombers. Thursday's blasts were heard by residents far away in the centre of the provincial capital of Makhachkala. The attacks fell just three days before Vladimir Putin, who sent troops 12 years ago to crush rebellion in Chechnya, is to be sworn in as president. The unofficial Islamist website www.kavkazcenter.com said the police post was almost completely destroyed. A nearby gas pipeline also was damaged during the attack. RIA news agency reported. — Reuters

Russia issues threat to NATO missile defence plan

BEIJING, 4 May—Russia's top military officer has threatened a pre-emptive strike on US-led NATO missile defence facilities in Eastern Europe, if Washington goes ahead with its missile defence plan. Chief of General Staff Nikolai Makarov, gave the warning at the start of an international conference on missile defence in Moscow. Russia also said talks between Moscow and Washington on the US-led NATO plan in Europe were deadlocked. It dismissed Washington's claim that the missile defence system is designed solely to deal with a missile threat from Iran, fearing it will undermine Russia's nuclear deterrent.

Moscow has also offered to jointly run the missile shield with NATO. Though NATO has said it wants to cooperate with Russia, the alliance has rejected Moscow's proposal. The conference is the last major Russia-US meeting about military issues, before a NATO summit in Chicago later this

month. Moscow has long opposed the deployment of the US-led NATO missile defence facilities near its borders. It has demanded legally binding guarantees from the US and NATO that the missile defence shield does not target Russia.

Three agents shot, injured in SF Bay area incident

SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO, 4 May—Three Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents were shot and injured on Thursday while serving "high-risk" warrants during an early morning sweep of San Francisco Bay area gang members, authorities said. The agents suffered non-life-threatening injuries after being shot with an assault rifle and were hospitalized in stable condition following the incident in Petaluma that was in connection with the investigation of a 2010 gang-related triple homicide in South San Francisco.

"We owe them a debt of gratitude," US Attorney Melinda Haag said at a Thursday news conference in nearby South San Francisco. "My office is proud to be associated with professionals who put their lives on the line to protect others." Thirteen men were arrested—many members of the 500 Block/C Street gang—during Thursday's sweep that also included two other cities. They are among 19 who were indicted last week on charges including racketeering and murder. Four of the men charged with murder in the triple homicide could potentially face the death penalty, if convicted. Fifteen of the 19 are expected to make their first appearance in Federal court on Friday.

LONDON, 4 May—Plants are flowering faster than scientists predicted in response to climate change, research in the United States showed on Wednesday, which could have devastating knock-on effects for food chains and ecosystems.

Global warming is having a significant impact on hundreds of plant and animal species around the world,

Plant study flags dangers of warming world

changing some breeding, migration and feeding patterns, scientists say.

Increased carbon dioxide concentration in the atmosphere from burning fossil fuels can affect how plants produce oxygen, while higher temperatures and variable rainfall patterns can change their behavior.

“Predicting species’ response to climate change is a major challenge in ecology,” said researchers at the University of California San Diego and several other US

institutions. They said plants had been the focus of study because their response to climate change could affect food chains and ecosystem services such as pollination, nutrient cycles and water supply.

The study, published on the *Nature* website, draws on evidence from plant life cycle studies and experiments across four continents and 1,634 species. It found that some experiments had underestimated the speed of flowering by 8.5 times and growing leaves by 4 times.

“Across all species, the experiments under-predicted the magnitude of the advance—for both leafing and flowering—that results from temperature increases,” the study said.

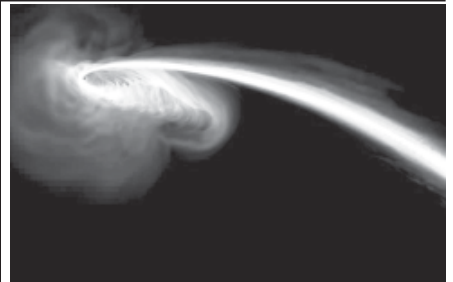
The design of future experiments may need to be improved to better predict

how plants will react to climate change, it said.

Plants are essential to life on Earth. They are the base of the food chain, using photosynthesis to produce sugar from carbon dioxide and water. They expel oxygen which is needed by nearly every organism which inhabits the planet.

Scientists estimate the world’s average temperature has risen by about 0.8 degrees Celsius since 1900, and nearly 0.2 degrees per decade since 1979.

So far, efforts to cut emissions of planet-warming greenhouse gases are not seen as sufficient to prevent the Earth heating up beyond 2 degrees C this century—a threshold scientists say risks an unstable climate in which weather extremes are common, leading to drought, floods, crop failures and rising sea levels.—*Reuters*

Black hole observed destroying star

BALTIMORE, 4 May—US astronomers say they’ve identified the “victim” of a massive black hole that tore a star apart when it approached too close to the gravitational behemoth. In 2010, scientists observed the flare that is the signature of a galaxy’s central black hole shredding a star that wandered too close, and have identified both the black hole responsible and the “identity” of its unfortunate victim—a star rich in helium gas. “This is the first time we’ve actually been able to pinpoint what kind of star was disrupted,” study lead author Suvi Gezari, an astronomer at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, told SPACE.com.

Such an event is rare, astronomers said, occurring just once every 10,000 years per galaxy. Gezari and her colleagues monitored hundreds of thousands of galaxies in ultraviolet light

and in June 2010 spotted a bright flare from a previously dormant black hole at the center of a galaxy about 2.7 billion light-years away.

“When the star is ripped apart by the gravitational forces of the black hole, some part of the star’s remains falls into the black hole while the rest is ejected at high speeds,” Gezari said.

“We are seeing the glow from the stellar gas falling into the black hole over time.”

The researchers analyzed the spectrum of the ejected gas, which revealed it was mostly helium.

“This is the first time where we have so many pieces of evidence, and now we can put them all together to weigh the perpetrator—the black hole—and determine the identity of the unlucky star that fell victim to it,” Gezari said.

US student engineers in mileage quest

ANN ARBOR, 4 May—Student engineers at the University of Michigan say the lawnmower engine-powered car they’re designing should get pretty good mileage—about 3,300 mpg.

The University Supermileage Team will compete in the SAE International Supermileage Challenge, in Marshall, Mich, this summer, the university reported on Tuesday.

The competition challenges student teams to design and construct a single-person, fuel-efficient vehicle with a small four-stroke engine.

The Michigan team says a humble lawnmower engine can do the deed.

“We are taking something that is in your backyard and turning it into

something that’s sleek, modern and high-performance,” said mechanical engineering senior Laura Pillari, project manager and co-founder of the team.

The goal this year is to beat the North American record of 3,169 miles per gallon, team members said, and to better it by reaching 3,300 mpg.

“Fuel efficiency is one of those issues prevalent in society today,” said chief engineer and team co-founder Brett Merkel, a senior in mechanical engineering. “The technology we’re coming up with can have far-reaching effects, and be implemented in just a few years.”

Tree pests worse with climate change

NEW YORK, 4 May—Climate change increases the risk to European spruce forests from destructive bark beetles because of rising temperatures and less rainfall, researchers say. Writing in the journal *Climatic Change*, scientists say low rainfall and warmer temperatures weakened the trees’ defences against the bark beetle.

In addition, dry conditions have encouraged the bark beetle to extend its range by moving to higher altitudes, Lorenzo Marini from the University of Padua in Italy said. The low rainfall at those higher altitudes

gave the beetles new opportunities to find suitable, weaker host trees which, under normal rainfall conditions, would have been less susceptible to bark beetle attacks, researchers said. The spruce bark beetle, *Ips typographus*, is one of the most destructive pests of the European forests, and scientists said they expected the insects to quickly respond to climate change.

Forest damage due to this bark beetle has increased markedly during the last decades throughout the whole of Europe, they said.—*Internet*

BlackBerry bets big on apps, touchscreens

SAN FRANCISCO, 4 May—Research In Motion (RIM) on Tuesday unveiled a revamped BlackBerry platform that discards the smartphone’s trademark keyboard to embrace apps, touchscreens and other trendy features.

The long-promised platform was shown to software developers at the Canada-based company’s annual BlackBerry World

conference in Florida.

RIM also released kits for tailoring programmes for the new BlackBerry 10 platform and gave attendees slick prototype touchscreen smartphones on which to dabble with the software.

“BlackBerry 10 builds upon the core values and exceptional user experiences that have attracted more than 77 million BlackBerry customers around the world today,” said RIM vice president of developer relations Alec Saunders.

“Developers building for BlackBerry 10 will be able to easily create the kind of cutting-edge apps that deliver truly engaging experiences and ‘wow’ customers.”

Virtual keyboards in prototypes were seen as a bold move, since physical keyboards have been a strong selling point in the business market that has been RIM’s stronghold.

BlackBerry has seen its share of the overall



smartphone market eroded by iPhones and Android-powered devices that have been hits with consumers, who are increasing using personal devices on the job.

Analysts agree that the success of smartphones is dictated more by the troves of videos, games, music and other digital content available than it is by impressive hardware.

Social game publisher Gameloft announced at the conference that it is working on a lineup of titles for BlackBerry 10 devices including “Shark Dash” and “Ice Age Village.”—*Internet*

NASA Web site wins two Webby awards

WASHINGTON, 4 May—NASA says its Web site has won awards in two categories in the 16th Annual Webby Awards, the leading international honour for the world’s best Web sites. In the category of best government site, www.nasa.gov received its fourth consecutive People’s Voice Award in a popular vote, and for the first time won the judges’ Webby Award in the category, the space agency said on Tuesday.

“We are honoured to once again be recognized for our online communications efforts,” said David Weaver, associate administrator for communications at NASA Headquarters in Washington. “On a daily basis, our extraordinary Web team provides a clear and accessible view into the agency’s missions and milestones, to the benefit of American taxpayers and millions who follow us around the world.”



The NASA site had its busiest day ever with the launch of the final space shuttle mission in July 2011, as more than 560,000 people watched the launch on NASA’s Web cast.

LONDON, 4 May—European shares opened higher and the single currency languished near two-week lows on Thursday as investors waited to see if the European Central Bank will prepare the ground for further stimulus measures at its policy meeting later. The FTSEurofirst 300 index of top European shares was up 0.6 percent at 1,049.52 points after losing ground on Wednesday as weak data on both sides of the Atlantic rekindled concerns about the strength of global growth.

ECB policymakers, who will face demonstrators protesting against Spain's harsh austerity measures when they meet in Barcelona, are widely expected to leave the main interest rate unchanged at a record low of 1 percent.

But expectations have risen that the central bank will point to recent data showing the region's slide into a deepening recession and rising unemployment to hint at a

policy change. "Given the recent weakness in the EMU economy indicators, we suspect the ECB will leave the door open for further action, should the economic scenario deteriorate further," Newedge strategist Annalisa Piazza said.

The euro was virtually unchanged at \$1.3160 after falling as low as \$1.3122 on Wednesday on the depressing economic news. Before the ECB

meeting, recently downgraded Spain will test sentiment for riskier euro zone government debt with a small auction of new three- and five-year bonds. The country's borrowing costs are expected to rise more than a percentage point. Ahead of the sale, June German Bund futures were 11 ticks lower at 141.62, edging back from record highs hit the previous day.

Fish body oil may help dialysis patients

LONDON, 4 May—Fish body oil—omega3—appears to help kidney patients undergoing hemodialysis, researchers in London said.

Dr Louise Moist, a scientist at Lawson Health Research Institute, said hemodialysis can be delivered through arteriovenous grafts—artificial vessels created to join an artery to a vein. However, these grafts are prone to congestion and clotting, causing disruptions to treatment and a need for surgical treatment.

Moist and colleagues followed patients undergoing hemodialysis using new arteriovenous grafts for 12 months after creation. Patients were assigned to daily doses of either four fish oil capsules, or four placebo capsules.

The study published in the *Journal of the American Medical Association* found patients, who took fish oil experienced a lower rate of graft failure, with half as many grafts

lost to clotting.

In addition, the amount of time until clotting occurred increased and fewer corrective interventions were required, the study said.

Those taking fish oil also had lower blood pressure, lower rates of heart attacks, heart failure and other cardiac-

related events, Moist added.

"This study provides very exciting results," Moist said in a statement. "Fish oil did not fix all the problems with grafts but it reduced the number of costly, time-consuming procedures for patients already receiving a very burdensome treatment with dialysis."—Internet

Audi to increase India plant capacity by 50 pct

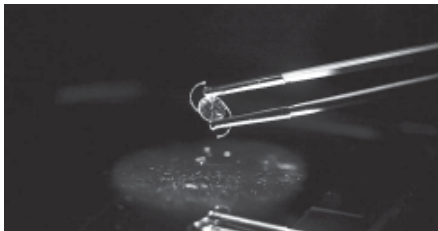
The Volkswagen AG-owned carmaker plans to increase capacity at its Aurangabad plant in Maharashtra to 9,000 vehicles

Nepal's 'magic' surgeon brings light back to poor

KATHMANDU, 4 May—Dressed in his hospital scrubs, Dr Sanduk Ruit looks into the eyes of a patient through a microscope hanging over an operating table.

He makes two tiny holes in one eye, takes out a jelly-like mass of natural lens and replaces it with an artificial one that fits snugly into the patient's eye, all in about five minutes, deftly moving his fingers clad in thin white gloves.

The patient is then moved away swiftly, without

any stitches, and Dr Ruit repeats the process to remove cataracts—a leading cause of blindness in Nepal—from the eyes of another person.

The simple operation pioneered by Dr Ruit, a Nepali national, at the Tilganga Eye Centre in Kathmandu has benefited tens of thousands of people in Nepal and other countries in Asia and Africa, where surgical teams from the centre provide much needed care in field camps.

Lack of sleep hurts handling of unexpected

UNIVERSITY PARK, 4 May—Surgeons who are sleep-deprived can perform a learned task or learn a new task, but have trouble dealing with the unexpected, US researchers say. Dr Jonathan Tomsk, a research fellow involved in surgical resident training at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine, and colleagues tested two groups of medical students—one sleep deprived and the other rested—over two days.

All study participants were shown how to use a virtual reality simulator on the first three levels of difficulty. The study subjects practiced for no more than 45 minutes a day. Researchers instructed study participants to get a full night's rest and then tested the subjects

on the first three levels of the simulator. The study participants returned for a second day of testing either fully rested—no less than 6 hours sleep—or sleep deprived—less than 2 hours of sleep. The study published in *American Journal of Surgery* demonstrated no difference in ability to perform a previously learned simulated surgical task or to learn a new simulated surgical task while moderately sleep deprived, but in order to achieve the same level of performance, sleep-deprived subjects demonstrated increased cognitive workload—load related to the executive control of working memory—compared to their rested counterparts.

Reducing calories may preserve memory

SCOTTSDALE, 4 May—Cutting back on calories is a good idea to protect the heart, and US researchers say eating less also may reduce a person's risk of memory loss. Yonas Geda of the Mayo Clinic in Scottsdale, Ariz, and colleagues looked at the association between eating and those with mild cognitive impairment.

The researchers compared eating habits and diagnosis of memory loss in 1,000 participants, ages 70 and older. "Caloric consumption of more than 2,143 calories per day is associated with twice [the] increased risk of having mild cognitive impairment," Geda said in a statement. "It's important to see your doctor regularly to

check for signs of serious memory loss."

The findings were presented at the annual meeting of the American Academy of Neurology.

Woman who lost Ark lotto ticket entitled to \$1m

SEARCY, 4 May — An Arkansas woman who cashed a \$1 million lottery ticket may have to give up the winnings to a woman who threw away the ticket after she bought it, according to a judge's ruling on Tuesday.

The judge decided that Sharon Duncan was entitled to the prize money, not Sharon Jones, who claimed the prize money after she took the ticket from a trash can of discarded lottery

tickets at a convenience store in Beebe, a city about 40 miles northeast of Little Rock. Jones' attorney, James Simpson, said he plans to appeal.

Jones had testified that she already spent some of the money on a new truck and cash gifts to her children.

Simpson noted that Duncan testified she threw away the ticket after the read-out on a ticket scanner said, "Sorry. Not a winner."

The attorney argued that people shouldn't be allowed to throw items away and then say, "ooh, I want to un-abandon it." "We'd have garage-sale law all over the place," he said.

"It became trash when someone threw it away." White County judge Thomas Hughes, however, said Jones never met the burden of proof that Duncan abandoned her right to claim \$1 million.

"The \$1 million was never found money," Hughes said. Earlier Tuesday, Jones testified that she gathered a handful of discarded tickets from the trash can — as she had done many times before — and said there was no sign alerting customers not to take

tickets.

That contradicted Super 1 Stop store manager Lisa Petriches' earlier testimony that she had taped a sign that read "Do not take" on the can.

But a former store clerk testified that Petriches posted the sign only after Jones claimed the prize.

Petriches brought the lawsuit against Jones, and Duncan joined it after the judge said at a January hearing that she may be the true owner of the ticket. Hughes ruled that Petriches and the store's owner, Louie Dajani — whose corporation, SummerOne LLC, joined the suit — weren't entitled to anything.

The judge instructed the winning side to write the judgment for his signature, and it will become official once Hughes signs it. Jones' attorneys will then have 30 days to file an appeal.

Hughes found that the evidence weighed in Duncan's favor that she bought the winning ticket, even though lottery records and store security video didn't synch up to the precise timing of the purchase.

Arkansas Lottery Security Chief Lance Huey testified that he investigated the circumstances of the ticket falling into Jones' hands. He said the lottery was satisfied with the investigation and awarded the prize.

Duncan's attorney, James "Red" Morgan, argued that she simply made a mistake by throwing away a \$1 million ticket and that the only right she willingly parted with was to enter the ticket for the possibility of a secondary prize.

'Bullied' dolphin hiding from pushy pod, officials say

LOS ANGELES, 4 May — A lone dolphin has spent the past several days residing in a California coastal bay after several reports suggest it was "bullied" by a pod of fellow dolphins that were blocking its return to the open sea. "He was scared, he was intimidated, he was bullied," Peter Wallerstein of the Marine Animal Rescue told the *Los Angeles Times*. At first, wildlife officials tried encouraging "Bolsa Chica Bob" to return to sea. But when the dolphin, who is nicknamed after the section of wetlands he has been taking shelter in, tried returning to the ocean he was met by two other dolphins who blocked his path.

"There could be tension among the dolphin pod, and dolphins can be very aggressive, even among themselves," Wallerstein said. Now, Wallerstein says officials are no longer pressuring the 7-foot dolphin to leave the bay, saying there is an ample supply of fish available should he choose to make the area his permanent home.

"We're being very cautious about forcing it into harm's way," he said. However, not everyone is convinced that the dolphin is actually being bullied. "Maybe the others are angry," Dennis Kelly, chairman of the Marine Science department at Orange Coast College, told the Orange County Register. "'You're lagging behind, you moron.' Maybe they were going whack it. 'You're not paying attention. Slap! OK, we're leaving.'"—Internet



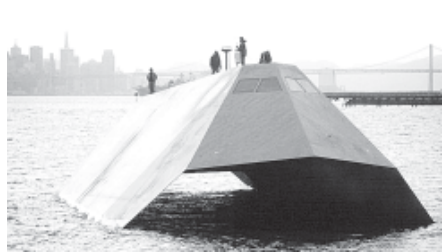

\$195 million Sea Shadow stealth ship for sale, only \$10,000 deposit required

NEW YORK, 4 May — The US Department of Defence's Defence Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) has placed its famous Sea Shadow stealth ship up for auction. And while the high-tech military sea vessel cost more than \$195 million to develop, its opening bid was for the relatively tiny sum of \$50,000, with only a \$10,000 deposit required. *The Courier Mail* reports that the ship was made famous to a broader audience when it served as the inspiration for the home of James Bond's villainous foil in the film "Tomorrow Never Dies."

The General Services Administration auction for the ship is scheduled to end this Thursday, with the current bid at the time of publishing up to just over \$100,000. However, before you begin finalizing your plans for global dominance, there is one major catch to the auction: The ship will be dismantled and reduced to scrap before being handed out to the auction's eventual winner.

"The ex-Sea Shadow shall be disposed of by completely dismantling and scrapping within the USA," reads the item's description on the GSA website. "Dismantling is defined as reducing the property such as

it has no value except for its basic material content." The 164-foot experimental craft was first constructed in 1983 by Lockheed for the US Navy and contains the same stealth technology used by its more famous aerial counterparts.

Although it appears almost flimsy on the surface, it actually contains two submerged twin hulls and is specifically designed to withstand very rough ocean waves of up to 18 feet.

Stricken Texas "bucket list" baby dies, father says

WASHINGTON, 4 May — A Texas baby born with an incurable disease whose parents created an online "bucket list" for their daughter that became an Internet sensation has died, her father said on Tuesday. Michael Canahuati said in a blog posting that five-and-a-half-month-old Avery died on Monday afternoon after going into cardiac arrest. The little girl was born in November with spinal muscular atrophy, a rare genetic disorder that doctors predicted would kill her before she turned 2.

"Avery's passing this quickly came as a complete shock to all of us, as she had just been given a thumbs up at her last doctor's appointment only three days ago," Canahuati wrote on Tuesday. He made the announcement on the website — <http://www.averycan.blogspot.com/> — where over the past month he and his wife have been posting fanciful light-hearted blogs written as if penned by Avery herself.

Among the postings was a so-called "bucket list" of things Avery hoped to do before she died. The list included a number of goals — to swim with dolphins, to get a manicure and pedicure and a tattoo — that expressed an optimism the little girl would prove the doctors wrong and live a long, rich life. Avery did many of the things mentioned on the list including moving her legs, tasting solid foods and visiting relatives. The "Baby Avery" blogs have attracted more than 3 million page views since April, when they first began being posted, according to a counter on the website.—Reuters

Drunken Brits fined for kidnapping penguin 'Dirk'

CANBERRA, 4 May — Two drunken Welshmen on Wednesday escaped with a fine after being convicted of stealing a penguin called Dirk from an Australian theme park after consuming large amounts of vodka. Former Royal Marine Rhys Owen Jones, 21, and his bricklayer friend Keri Mules, 20, broke into Sea World on Queensland's Gold Coast last month and swam with the dolphins and let off a fire extinguisher in a shark enclosure. The pair, in Australia on a working holiday, then stole Dirk, Southport Magistrates Court heard.

Their lawyer Bill Potts, who *Australian Associated Press* reported was wearing a penguin tie in court, said his clients meant no harm. He said after they awoke the next day with hangovers and found the bird in their room they tried to care for it by feeding it bread and putting it in the shower. "They tried their incompetent best to care for the penguin," Potts said. The little bird was eventually found, exhausted but otherwise well, after a couple spotted it in a nearby shallow estuary when they had released it. The couple said they saw the captive-bred penguin get chased out of the water by another animal — possibly a shark — before it was then herded back in by a

dog. Sea World workers eventually came to retrieve it.

Potts said the men, who pleaded guilty to trespassing, stealing, and keeping a protected animal, regretted their actions and were deeply embarrassed by the international media coverage of their exploits. Magistrate Brian Kucks fined them Aus\$1,000 (\$1,034) each and said they were lucky not to have drunkenly stumbled into the polar bear enclosure. "You could have found yourselves in a morgue if you'd gone into the wrong enclosure. Perhaps next time you are at a party you will consider drinking a little less vodka," he said, AAP reported from the court.

Sacred Tipitakadhara Tipitakakovida Selection Examination, most difficult of all religious examinations yearly held in the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, leading Theravada Buddhist Nation of Buddhist World

Bagan region was included in the list of global heritage in 1995. Since 2009, measures have been taken to put three ancient Pyu cities out of the eight on the list of global heritage. Moreover, capacity building for safeguarding cultural heritage in Myanmar project started with the assistance of Italian government. In February 2012, international assistance and Italy project assistance were received. She then called for efforts for putting Myanmar's cultural heritages on the list of global heritage as a national duty.

Then, Director-General U Kyaw Oo Lwin of Archaeology, National

Museum and Library Department reported on work progress and retired Director-General U San Win on compilation and submission of draft. The deputy minister made a remark and presented gifts to scholars.

Since February 2012, implementation of capacity building for safeguarding cultural heritage in Myanmar projects has started in categories.

To implement the tasks, steering committee, expert team and drafting team have been formed and nomination dossier is being drafted. Measures are being taken to submit the draft to World Heritage Centre in September 2012 in collaboration with scholars from various departments.—MNA

97-year-old Australian man becomes world's oldest university graduate

SYDNEY, 4 May — A 97-year-old Australian man will set another world record for being the oldest university graduate in the world, local media reported on Friday. Allan Stewart, from Tea Gardens on the New South Wales (NSW) North Coast, will become the world's oldest university graduate on Friday afternoon when he graduates with a Master of Clinical Science (Complementary Medicine) from Southern Cross University in Lismore in NSW, according to the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) reports.

His fourth university degree will surpass the Guinness World Record that Stewart set in 2006 when he completed a law degree at the University of New England at age 91. Stewart completed his first degree with a Bachelor of Dentistry from the University of Sydney in 1936. He later completed a Doctor of Dental Surgery degree at Northwestern University in Chicago, and practiced as a dentist in London, Sydney and the rural areas of northern NSW. Stewart said that the fourth university degree may be his last.

"I can hang up my mortar board and academic robes after this one, although I said that after my last degree and then I got bored," he said in a statement. "People should never use the excuse that 'I am too old to study' or 'I have left my run too late'," Stewart said. "It is never too late to expand your mind, make new friends and challenge yourself to achieve something worthwhile." His lecturer Sonia Brownie at Southern Cross University said Stewart had studied mostly by correspondence online with good time management skills. — Xinhua

Japan switches off last nuclear power plant; will it cope?

TOKYO, 4 May — Japan shuts down its last working nuclear power reactor this weekend just over a year after a tsunami scarred the nation and if it survives the summer without major electricity shortages, producers fear the plants will stay offline for good. The shutdown leaves Japan without nuclear power for the first time since 1970 and has put electricity producers on the defensive. Public opposition to nuclear power could become more deeply entrenched if non-nuclear generation proves enough to meet Japan's needs in the peak-demand summer months.

"Can it be the end of nuclear power? It could be," said Andrew DeWit, a professor at Rikkyo University in Tokyo who studies energy policy. "That's one reason why people are fighting it to the death." Japan managed to get through the summer last year without any blackouts by imposing curbs on use in the immediate aftermath of the earthquake and tsunami. Factories operated at night and during weekends to avoid putting too much stress on the country's power grids. A similar success this year would weaken the argument of proponents of nuclear power.

"They don't have the polls on their side," said DeWit. "Once they go through the summer without reactors, how will they fire them up? They know that, so they will try their damndest but I don't see how." Japan has 54 nuclear power reactors, including the four at Tokyo Electric's Daiichi plant in Fukushima that were damaged in the earthquake and tsunami, culminating in three meltdowns and radiation leaks for the worst civilian nuclear disaster since Chernobyl in 1986.

One by one the country's nuclear plants have been shut for scheduled maintenance and prevented from restarting because of public concern about their safety. The last one running, the No3 Tomari reactor of Hokkaido Electric Power Co in northern Japan, is scheduled to shut down early on Sunday. Anti-nuclear activists will celebrate with demonstrations over the weekend. — Reuters

China April HSBC services PMI rises to 6-month high

BEIJING, 4 May — China's services sector enjoyed its busiest month in half a year in April, with business expectations at their highest level in 12 months, a private sector survey of purchasing managers showed on Friday.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC China Services Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) rose to 54.1 in April from 53.3 in March, its strongest reading since October 2011, and followed an uptick in HSBC's manufacturing PMI released earlier this week.

The rise in the HSBC services PMI was in contrast to a retreat in China's official services PMI - albeit from a higher level after revision to its methodology in March - which was weighed down mainly by a continuing

downturn in the real estate sector.

Markit Economics, which compiles the HSBC-sponsored survey, detected a broad-based rise in key service sector indicators. "April data signaled a further rise in new orders placed at Chinese service providers.

Although below the long-run trend for the survey, the rate of new order growth was solid, and the sharpest in 10 months," Markit said in a statement of survey findings. "Companies commented on better demand conditions, new product launches and the success of promotional campaigns."

Staff numbers in the services sector rose for a 39th consecutive month. April's rate of job creation was the sharpest since November

2011 and survey respondents typically attributed hiring to a rise in new business.

The robust showing for the services sector signals both a further incremental reorientation of the economy away from its reliance on investment-led factory output and that domestic demand may be stabilizing after a period of weakness.

Cuba to start clinical trials of new pneumonia vaccine

HAVANA, 4 May — Cuba will this year begin clinical trials of a new pneumococcal vaccine developed by the island nation's biotech industry, the official daily Granma said on Thursday. The vaccine was developed by scientists at Havana's Finlay Institute and the Centre for Biomolecular Chemistry, Finlay Director Concepcion Campa was quoted as saying by Granma. As one of the most deadly diseases, the bacteria leads to pneumonia and other afflictions such as meningitis and sinusitis, mainly among the elderly, children and those with weakened immune systems.

Campa is participating in the 16th International Seminar of the Caribbean Medical Association (AMECA), which began Wednesday in Havana and gathered 200 specialists from various countries. Campa gave a lecture on the impact on national public health of the more than 10 vaccines manufactured on the island. She headed the scientific team that created the "first and only effective vaccine in the world against meningococcal group B" (vaccine VA-MENGOC-BC), according to the Cuban medical authorities. — Xinhua



China, Asia at centre of Auckland Airport expansion targets

WELLINGTON, 4 May — Auckland Airport, the main international gateway to New Zealand, is aiming to triple the number of services flying to China by 2020 as part of an ambitious plan to expand New Zealand's tourism industry.

The airport management on Friday released the Ambition 2020 growth plan, saying there was potential to grow the number of international visitor arrivals from 2.6 million last year to more than 3.5 million in 2020.

"Asia, especially China, will provide the largest growth potential both in visitor arrivals and in the amount they will spend when they're here," said Glenn Wedlock, Auckland Airport general manager aeronautical commercial. "China is a vital growth market for New Zealand and we see the market developing from 160,000 today to over

430,000 arrivals by 2020.

More importantly, we need to target more direct flights, longer stay visitors and FIT (free independent travelers)/semi FIT visitors," said Wedlock in a statement. Airport management believed the number of direct flight visitors could grow from 50,000 a year to 170,000 by 2020, he said.

"To achieve these results, and to achieve other ambitious trade targets outlined by the government, we will need to see air services between New Zealand and China reach around three times the number of direct flights today." The airport would also be targeting Southeast Asian markets, such as Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Singapore, which could "easily each develop into 100 million NZ dollars plus (80.02 million US dollars) visitor spend markets." — Xinhua

Police hold seven over qat "terrorism funding"

LONDON, 4 May—Police said on Tuesday they had arrested seven people on suspicion of financing terrorism overseas and money laundering through the illegal export of the narcotic qat to north America. Six men and one woman were held in early morning raids in London, the Welsh capital Cardiff and in Coventry in the English midlands, police said. The raids were part of an investigation run in parallel with the US Homeland Security Investigations directorate into a network suspected of exporting qat to the US and Canada.

"The arrests were a part of a pre-planned, intelligence-led operation into suspected fund-raising for terrorism overseas," London's Metropolitan Police said. Qat is grown and widely chewed in the Horn of Africa and in Yemen. It is habit-forming and excessive use can cause insomnia, stress, depression and apathy. The plant, whose leaves must be consumed fresh, is legal in Britain but is a controlled substance in the United States and Canada.

Police did not disclose the origin of the smuggled qat or where they believed the funding was targeted, but

international authorities have previously said profits from the qat trade are used to finance militant groups like al Shabaab in Somalia. A UN Monitoring Group report last year estimated qat traders using one Mogadishu airfield in an area controlled by al Shabaab would have paid the militant group around \$500,000 in taxes over a 10-month period in 2010. Police were also searching seven other residential properties in London, Coventry and Worthing on England's southern coast and business premises in Coventry.

Inquiry defends Israeli fatal airstrike in Gaza

JERUSALEM, 4 May—A probe into the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) airstrike that killed 21 members of a family in Gaza during Operation Cast Lead claimed on Tuesday that the bombing was not intentional and that civilians were not targeted during the operation.

The inquiry into whether the IDF committed criminal negligence and intentional targeting of civilians during the bombing that destroyed the building in which the Samouri family lived in January 2009, resulted in the acquittance of those involved, according to a press release from the Israeli rights group B' Tselem.

Military prosecutors responded in a letter to claims made by B' Tselem, saying that, during the probe, they had not found any evidence of negligence on the IDF's part. "It is unacceptable that no one is found responsible for an action of the army that led to the killing of 21 uninvolved civilians, inside the building they were in under soldiers' orders, even if not deliberately," B' Tselem's head of research, attorney Yael Stein said.—Xinhua

Pentagon report paints mixed picture of Afghanistan war

WASHINGTON, 4 May—Citing limited gains, a US Defence Department report on Tuesday painted a mixed picture of the war in Afghanistan, with an insurgency that's capable of withstanding losses and launching high-profile attacks even as it faces mounting pressure from US forces. The report, mandated by Congress, said the Taliban has been unable to reclaim territory taken by foreign and Afghan forces in Kandahar

and Helmand Provinces, as the Afghan security forces makes significant improvement during the past months.

The report, which covers the situation of the past six months, said that attacks on US and Afghan forces declined in 2011 for the first time in five years and that the positive trend appeared to be continuing into 2012. However, the report said Taliban remains "resilient and determined," and will attempt to regain lost ground

and influence in the coming months.

It noted the insurgents still have safe havens in Pakistan, posing biggest threat to the long-term success of the war. It also asked the question if the Afghans could hold on to the security gains made in the past years following a withdrawal of forces in the coming years. Foreign troops will be out of Afghanistan by the end of 2014.

Vodafone hands over satellite station to Ghana's new space centre

ACCRA, 4 May — The management of Vodafone Ghana Limited, a subsidiary of Vodafone plc UK, handed over on Wednesday its Satellite Earth Station at Kuntunse, about 20 km west of the capital, to the government of Ghana for use by the new Space Science and Technology Centre.

This was contained in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed by Minister for Environment, Science and Technology (MEST) Sherry Ayittey and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Vodafone Ghana Kyle Whitehill at the official opening of the Centre.

The MOU indicated that the redundant Vodafone earth satellite station would be converted into a telescope for research and development in the field of astronomy.

"The Small Satellite Development Programme (SSDP) where the centre is collaborating with Surrey Satellite Technology Ltd to develop small satellites in the country is also part of the new programme," the minister said. On the new center, Ayittey said the vision was to uncover

and exploit the capabilities of space science and technology for national socio-economic and technological development through education and cutting edge research.

She added that the center would coordinate the implementation of national space science and technology programmes in the four main focal areas of Remote Sensing and Geographic Information Systems (GIS), Communication, Meteorology as well as Astronomy and Astrophysics.

The minister was also hopeful that the technology would be used to monitor crops in continental climates through assimilation of satellite information.

"The journey to space science and technology development is long and there is no short cut to arrive at the destination," Ayittey warned, adding, "We need to invest in infrastructure and human capacity development to meet the goals and objectives we have set for ourselves."

Ghana officially opened its Space Science and

Technology Centre (SSTC) here on Wednesday to harness the potentials of science and technology for accelerated socio-economic development.

In his letter, Hu also extended greetings to Chinese and US scientists dedicated to promoting Sino-US scientific and technological cooperation and expressed thanks to all those who have contributed to promoting the development of Sino-US relations. The Sino-US Joint Commission on Science and Technology Cooperation is an organization established between the governments of China and the US.—Xinhua

FBI: Five men charged in Ohio bridge bomb plot

CLEVELAND, 4 May — Five men described by federal authorities as anarchists angry with corporate America and the government were charged Tuesday with plotting to bomb an Ohio bridge linking two wealthy Cleveland suburbs. The men were arrested on

Monday night after unknowingly working with an FBI informant for months, a strategy that federal investigators have used repeatedly in recent years to nab alleged terrorists. "They talked about making a statement against corporate America and the government as some of the motivations for their actions," US Attorney Steven Dettelbach said in announcing the arrests with the head of the FBI in Cleveland, Stephen Anthony.

The alleged plotters researched explosives and obtained what they thought was C-4 explosives. The material, in fact, was harmless

and the public was never at risk, because the men got it from the informant, officials said. The men planted the fake explosives at the base of the bridge, armed them, went to a remote spot and "entered the codes that they thought would blow up the bridge with innocent people traveling over it," Dettelbach said.

The men were charged with conspiracy and trying to bomb property used in interstate commerce. All five appeared on Tuesday in US District Court, where Magistrate Judge Greg White ordered them jailed without bond pending a hearing on Monday.—Internet

**“Supermoon” to shine
on Sunday**

TIANJIN, 4 May — A “supermoon” will appear in the sky on Sunday, when the natural satellite will be at its biggest and brightest this year. “If the weather is good, the Chinese public can enjoy seeing a much bigger and brighter moon than usual,” said Zhao Zhiheng, a member of the Tianjin Astronomy Society, on Thursday. The moon's distance from Earth varies between approximately 350,000 km and 400,000 km due to its oval orbit, meaning it appears to be various sizes when seen from our planet.

At 11:35 am on Sunday Beijing time, the moon will be the brightest of this year as it will “directly face” the sun and reflect all sunlight to the earth; at noon, the moon will be the biggest of this year as it will arrive at its perigee, or

the closest point to Earth in its orbit, Zhao explained. As it appears in the Beijing daytime, residents of the Chinese capital may need a telescope or other astronomical viewing apparatus to observe the phenomenon, however.

The supermoon tends to bring high and low tides, but claims that it is linked to natural disasters like earthquakes or volcanic eruptions have been denied by experts.

“The supermoon is neither mysterious nor strange. It is a normal celestial phenomenon and will not affect people's lives,” Zhao said. Last year's supermoon appeared on 19 March, when it was also the biggest and brightest in 18 years. The supermoon will shine again on 23 June next year.

Rooney beat off competition from the other nine nominated goals, gaining 26% of the vote to finish ahead of his rivals. Dennis

Bergkamp's impudent flick and spin goal for Arsenal against Newcastle in March 2002 received 19% of the votes, with Thierry Henry's flicked volley for the Gunners against Manchester United in September 2000 taking 15%.

"I grew up watching the Premier League so to be voted the Best Goal in the history of the Premier League is a great feeling," said Rooney upon receiving the award. "There's so many good goals in that shortlist, goals that I watched in my living room as a kid:

Alan Shearer's goal, Paulo Di Canio's, Tony Yeboah's, David Beckham's. "To be competing with them and winning is a great honour for me and something I'm very proud of. I'd like to say a big thank you to all the fans that voted for me."

The Goal of the 20 Seasons is the first Award to be announced as part of the Premier League's 20 Seasons celebrations, which are designed to honour the players, managers and football that has taken place over the two decades of the world's most watched and supported football league. There were 300,000 fans who voted in the Premier League 20 Seasons Awards casting over 4.2m votes in five categories: Goal, Match, Save, Goal Celebration and Fantasy Team of the 20 Seasons.

In addition, there are also six panel categories: Player, Manager, Team, Season, Most Memorable Quote and Fantasy Team of the 20 Seasons.

But it was Cisse's second that grabbed the headlines.

The 26-year-old was on goal when he thumped a volley with the outside of his right boot over Petr Cech and into the far top corner of the net. "It was an astonishing goal," said Pardew. "We were seeing the game out at 1-0. "Cisse took a chance and you can see he meant it. He's hit it true. It is one of the great goals."

"There's nothing you can do about that. As soon as he hit it Petr Cech was struggling and it nestled in the far corner. "The fans who paid their money to come here,

it will live long in their memories." The brace continues Cisse's superb goal-scoring form since his transfer from German Bundesliga side Freiburg in the January transfer window. He has scored 13 goals in 12 League matches to help give the Magpies a real chance of qualifying for next season's UEFA Champions League. And Pardew says he is delighted with how well the Senegalese striker has settled in at the club. "You can't say that we could predict the impact and the goals that he has scored but we knew that he was a good player," Pardew told

BBC Sport.

"The Bundesliga is one of the best leagues in the world. He gets more chances at this club and he has taken them and whenever he is near the goal, he is going to hit the target. "He has been brilliant and he has bought into everything that we do here." The win, Newcastle's first at Chelsea since 1986, was the ideal response after they were beaten 4-0 by relegation battlers Wigan Athletic at the weekend. And it is the perfect preparation for Sunday's crunch clash at home to title-chasing Manchester City.

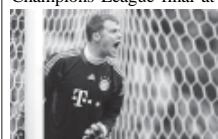
Bayern victory would boost Euro 2012 chances: Neuer

MUNICH, 4 May — Bayern Munich can lift Germany's hopes of winning Euro 2012 by beating Chelsea in this month's Champions League final, the Bavarian club's goalkeeper Manuel Neuer said on Thursday. "I was angry in 2010 when (Bayern) lost the Madrid final to Inter Milan," said German international Neuer who was then with Schalke 04.

"The atmosphere in the national team was not good at the beginning of the 2010 World Cup but if you have eight players who join the team after winning the Champions League then that gives every team member a push." Neuer is among eight Bayern players due to join up with Germany's Euro 2012 squad after the Champions League final at

their own Allianz Arena in Munich on 19 May. Germany, without a major trophy since 1996, reached the Euro 2008 final only to lose to Spain who also beat them in the semi-finals on the way to landing the 2010 World Cup.

Spain are favourites to win the European Championship again in the tournament in Ukraine and Poland that starts in June. "They will do everything to win the title. They are the favourites again," Neuer told a small group of reporters at Bayern's training centre in a leafy Munich suburb. The Bayern keeper saved two penalties in the spot-kick victory over Real Madrid in the Champions League semi-finals last month. Germany are in the same Euro 2012 groups as Portugal, Netherlands and Denmark.—Reuters

LISLE, 4 May—Hollywood actor Gary Sinise (suh-NEES') is helping promote a summer concert in suburban Chicago that will benefit veterans.

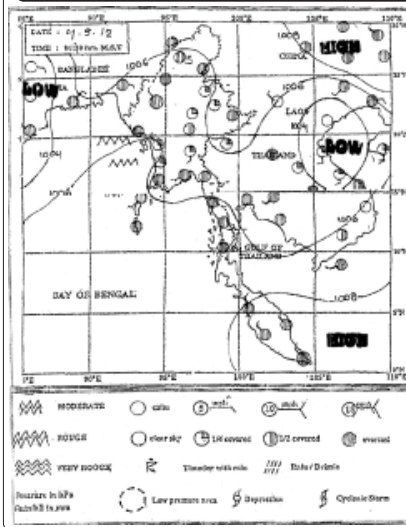
The "Forrest Gump" star helped kickoff ticket sales for "Rockin' for the Troops" on Thursday at the Navistar headquarters in Lisle.

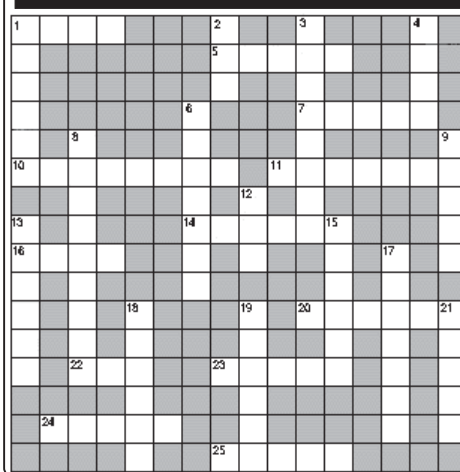

No Shanghai move for Drogba, Anelka hints

SHANGHAI, 4 May—French striker Nicolas Anelka on Friday hinted that his former Chelsea teammate Didier Drogba would not be joining him at the Chinese club Shanghai Shenhua.

Anelka, player-coach of Shenhua, previously expressed hopes that the 34-year-old forward could join him in a lucrative move to Shanghai.

Anelka confirmed he had spoken to Drogba and the Ivory Coast international had reached a decision over his future, but Anelka said it was "inconvenient" to tell people what that might be. "Even if Drogba finally chooses to stay with Chelsea, that can only prove Drogba himself wanted to stay and Chelsea also wanted to keep him," Anelka said, as quoted by

Shanghai Internet portal www.online.sh.cn. "If Drogba



cannot come to Shanghai, then there are no regrets because the world still has many other fine players," said Anelka, 33, according to a transcript of a news conference. The former French international joined the Chinese Super League side in January and was named player-coach shortly before Shenhua sacked French head coach Jean Tigana last month, after a poor start to the season.—*Internet*

Di Matteo agonising over Chelsea's FA Cup final lineup

LONDON, 4 May—Chelsea's interim manager Roberto Di Matteo is agonising over his team selection for Saturday's FA Cup final against Liverpool (16:15 GMT) and has not ruled out playing Didier Drogba and Fernando Torres together in attack. The Champions League finalists are bidding to win the FA Cup for the fourth time in six years and have all their players available for the trip to Wembley apart from injured central defenders David Luiz and Gary Cahill, who have hamstring problems.

"It is always a difficult decision when I have to leave players out, not just the two strikers, especially as we have so much competition for places at this club," Di Matteo said on Friday.

"I think we all have to be happy we have two strikers who are both in good form at the moment and I will make a final decision tonight." Chelsea have been playing a 4-2-3-1 formation since Di Matteo took over from the

sacked Andre Villas-Boas in March and the Italian said he had not ruled out a change in the system for the game at Wembley. One thing for sure is that John Terry, who led Chelsea to FA Cup glory in 2007, 2009 and 2010, will again skipper the side against Liverpool. If the Londoners triumph, the central defender will become the first captain to win the FA Cup four times with one club. Chelsea are desperate for the pair to recover quickly, with Terry and fellow defender Branislav Ivanovic suspended for the Champions League final against Bayern Munich at the German club's stadium on 19 May.—Reuters
