### Work coordination meeting on more effectively carrying out national and regional development tasks concludes

NAY PYI TAW, 12 May —President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein delivered a concluding address at the work coordination meeting on more effectively carrying out the national and regional development tasks held at the President Office here at 9 am today.

## Myanmar delegation led by Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Speaker pays study visit to Tokyo Stock Exchange, National Diet Library

NAY PYI TAW, 12 May— A Myanmar delegation led by Speaker of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint on 9 May morning visited Tokyo Stock Exchange in Tokyo. They were conducted round by Chairman and CEO Mr Saito and officials.

At the meeting hall, Mr Saito extended greetings and explained the establishment of Tokyo Stock Exchange in 1872, sales of shares in the current stock market and the importance of stock market in a nation for its economic development. The Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Speaker asked questions about stock exchange and stock market.

The Myanmar delegation next visited Keidanren, a Japan business group. All the meeting with Chairman of Asia and Oceania Committee Mr

Kawamura and executive committee members and Japanese businessmen, the Speaker explained Myanmar's reform measures for its politics and economy, invitation of local and foreign investments, drafting of foreign direct investment law and special economic zone law and establishment of special economic zones.

On arrival at National Diet Library, the Speaker and delegation members were briefed by Chairman Mr Otaki and Head of Research Department Mr Yamaguchi on keeping of publications, records on parliamentary meetings, records on statements and laws issued by the nation, providing of documents and books necessary for the parliament, visits of MPs and people to the state-owned library, measures being taken to let the people know about the

parliamentary functions, keeping of records on MPs' discussions during parliamentary session, installation of electronic system with the library so

that documents can be read at the touch of a button and maintenance of the library.

After raising some questions, the Speaker of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw said

libraries play an important role in human resource development, adding that they were on a visit to the library as they wanted to study procedures and methods of Japan's parliamentary library. Myanmar has its national library for public study.

He went on to say that Myanmar is also planning to establish a parliamentary library. So, Myanmar wants to cooperate with Japan in building a network between the parliaments of the two nations, in exchanging publications and online study.

Then, the Speaker and party signed in the visitors' book and look round in the library. The National Diet Library was opened in 1948 and it is one of the largest libraries in the world. It keeps 37 million books published both internally and externally, documents on parliamentary sessions, documents on State announcements and laws. It has also kept records on discussions of MPs made beginning the first parliamentary meeting in 1942.

Secretary General of House of Councilors of Japan Mr Ha Shimoto gave an account of organizational set-up of the house and strength of staff and parliamentary functions. They then exchanged views on parliamentary issues.

In the evening, Japanese Former Prime Minister Mr Tarō Asō and Chairman of Japan-Myanmar Friendship Association Mr Hideo Watanabe hosted a dinner to Speaker U Khin Aung Myint and delegation members.

Myanmar-Japan Friendship Association Chairman Dr Khin Shwe and General Secretary U Ye Htut also attended the dinner and they made cordial discussion on further strengthening of Myanmar-Japan friendship.

Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Deputy Speaker Amyotha Hluttaw Deputy Speaker U Mya Nyein, who was also a delegation member, called on Japanese Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Mr Yukio Edano at the latter's office in the evening. During the meeting, they exchanged views on industrial trade and investment.—MNA

## Nay Pyi Taw Council Area Projects Implementation Committee meets

## NATO Head urges Pakistan to open transit routes

BRUSSELS, 12 May—NATO Secretary General Anders Fogh Rasmussen suggested on Friday that Pakistan could miss out on important talks on the future of Afghanistan if it fails to reopen supply routes in time to secure a place at a NATO summit in Chicago on 20-21 May.

Speaking at a news conference, Rasmussen made no explicit reference to excluding Pakistan—which closed transit routes to Afghanistan after 24 of its soldiers were killed in a NATO cross-border air attack

last November. But he noted that other countries providing supply routes to NATO had been invited to the summit, which will map out a future for Afghanistan after most foreign combat troops are withdrawn at the end of 2014.

“As I mentioned we have actually invited a number of countries from the region, neighbours of Afghanistan, Central Asian countries, Russia, because they provide important transit arrangements to the benefit of our operation,” he said in response to a question.

“But as you also know

our transit routes through Pakistan are currently blocked so we have to continue our dialogue with Pakistan with a view to finding a solution to that because that’s really a matter of concern.”

Pakistan has demanded a formal apology from the United States for the cross-border attack before it reopens the supply routes, and has also called for an end to US drone strikes on its tribal areas bordering Afghanistan.

With neither of those demands likely to be met, the

government faces the choice of making an embarrassing climbdown—politically tricky at time anti-Americanism is running high in Pakistan—or continuing to

hold out. Pakistan boycotted an international conference on Afghanistan in Bonn in December in protest against the NATO air strikes.

## Oil-tanker hijack causes no impact to Indonesia

JAKARTA, 12 May—The hijack of an oil-tanker carrying 950,000 barrels of crude oil for Indonesia in the Arabian Sea off Oman is not going to impact on the production of refinery in Indonesia as the country has more stockpile, official said.

The vessel, *M/T SMYRN*, a Liberian flagged tanker, is operated by a Greek firm. It lost contact on Thursday at 18:15 pm Jakarta Time (1115 GMT). “The hijack of tanker carrying 950,000 barrel crude oil of Azery from Azerbaijan is not going to disturb the production of whole refinery in the country, particularly the refinery in Balikpapan (of East Kalimantan) which is the destination of the crude oil,” Mochamad Harun, spokesman of the state oil-and-gas firm PT Pertamina said in a statement on Saturday. “The Pertamina has had a back up system of crude supply that allowed the Balikpapan refinery continue operation normally,” he added.

## Appeals court revives Iraq contractor torture cases

WASHINGTON, 12 May—A US appeals court on Friday revived two lawsuits accusing

employees of two defence contractors of conspiring to torture and abuse Iraqis detained at the Abu Ghraib prison near Baghdad and at other locations.

A 14-judge panel of the US Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit, based in Richmond, Virginia, refused to intervene and dismiss the suits against CACI International Inc and L-3 Communications Holdings Inc, sending the cases back to district courts for further proceedings.

After the military invasion of Iraq in 2003, the United States hired contractors from US-based CACI and L-3 to provide translators and help conduct investigations. In 2004, photographs emerged depicting the abuse of detainees at Abu Ghraib prison. A number of military personnel were disciplined, but no contractors were charged.

In 2008, a number of Iraqis filed suits against CACI and L-3, accusing their employees

of inflicting physical and sexual abuse, electric shocks and mock executions on prisoners.

District courts in Virginia and Maryland rejected the companies’ attempts to dismiss the suits. The companies had filed an interim appeal, before the cases could proceed, asking the 4th Circuit to throw out the claims. They pointed to a 2009 ruling by a federal appeals court in Washington, DC, that had dismissed a similar suit against the companies — a decision the US Supreme Court allowed to stand.

## Two killed, 16 injured in bomb attack in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 12 May— At least two people including one policeman was killed and 16 others injured when a remote-controlled bomb hit a police convoy in Pakistan’s northwest city of Peshawar on Saturday morning, said police and hospital sources.

Javed Khan, Superintendent Police Headquarters of Peshawar, told local media that one policeman was killed and six others were injured when a police convoy carrying four prisoners got hit by a roadside planted bomb on the GT road in the Gulbahar area of Peshawar.

Hospital sources said that 17 injured people including six policemen and 11 civilians had been admitted into hospital following the blast and one of the injured civilians later died at hospital. They said that three of the injured people were still in critical condition, indicating a possible rise in death toll.

Earlier reports said that four people were killed in the blast.

The bomb attack took place at about 9:00 am local time when a police convoy comprising one pickup and a car was hit by a bomb hidden inside a tin container planted by the roadside while on the way sending back the four prisoners to the neighbouring city of Mardan after completing some court procedures in Peshawar.

## Chavez shows strength after Cuba cancer treatment

CARACAS, 12 May— Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez strode, sang and gave a rousing speech on Friday in a careful show of vigor after his latest cancer treatment in Cuba fanned rumours he was dying five months before an election.

The socialist Chavez, who had only been seen live in public once in the previous month, addressed the nation after flying back from Havana where he has completed six rounds of radiation therapy.

With Venezuelans watching on live TV for any sign of his condition,

Chavez walked with relative ease from his plane, hugged ministers, inspected a military guard and improvised a song at the end of a 20-minute speech.

“I can tell you that in the last few days we successfully completed the radiation cycle, as planned by the medical team,” Chavez said in a strong voice.

“I come with great optimism that this treatment will have the effects we hope for, always asking God to help us and give us the miracle of life to keep serving.”

The official line in recent weeks has been that

Chavez was out of the public limelight due to the effects of radiation treatment, but is on the road to recovery and will soon begin his re-election campaign ahead of the 7 October vote.

## Hezbollah says able to strike anywhere in Israel

BEIRUT, 12 May—The leader of Lebanon’s Hezbollah said his militant group was capable of striking any target in neighbouring Israel, saying “the days when we fled and they did not are over”.

“Today we are not only able to hit Tel Aviv as a city but, God willing, we are able to hit specific targets in Tel Aviv and anywhere in occupied Palestine,” Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah said in a televised address.

“For every building destroyed in Dahiya, a building will be destroyed in Tel Aviv,” he said, referring to Hezbollah’s stronghold in a suburb of southern Beirut.

Nasrallah’s comments were some of his harshest words against Israel in several months, and came amid rising tensions between Israel and Hezbollah’s main backer, Iran.

**Hackers take down Kremlin Web site**

Moscow, 12 May—The Russian president's Web site was shut down by a group calling itself Russian Anonymous, officials say. The site, Kremlin.ru, was shut down for nearly an hour at 11 am on Wednesday, shortly after which the group

claimed responsibility for the attack. The group said it was done in solidarity with the Russian political opposition. Interfax reported a spokesperson for the Kremlin's Internet service said other government sites were under attack as well.

On the eve of the inauguration of Vladimir Putin, The Moscow Times reported, Russian Anonymous posted a video threatening to hack government sites, saying it would help protesters break "false government sites."

**Facebook's Zuckerberg says mobile first priority**

PALO ALTO, (California), 12 May—Facebook chief executive officer (CEO) Mark Zuckerberg on Friday laid out his 2012 goals to investors on the Silicon Valley leg of his initial public offering (IPO) roadshow, saying his first priority was improving the social network's mobile application.

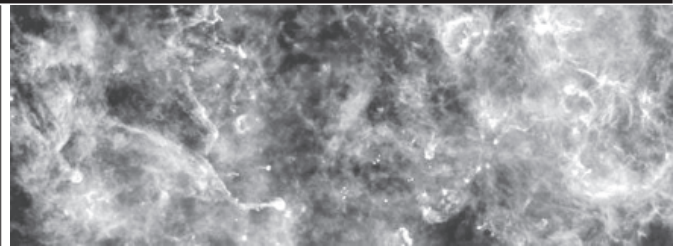
About 200 investors showed up at an IPO presentation in Palo Alto,

California, where they were given the opportunity to quiz Mr Zuckerberg and his lieutenants. Wall Street had been concerned about the company's ability to wring revenue from mobile users, considered crucial for long-term growth.

Mr Zuckerberg and Ms Sheryl Sandberg, Facebook's chief operating officer (COO), said the

company's overall advertising business was gaining steam, with most marketers increasing their spending with Facebook. The two executives, who appeared on stage alongside finance chief David Ebersman, highlighted social ads as an important tool for Facebook to tackle its mobile challenge.

**Image captured of 'stellar nursery'**

PARIS, 12 May—A European space observatory has imaged a star "nursery" and its network of dust and gas, which is creating a new generation of massive stars, scientists say.

The European Space Agency's Herschel space observatory took the infrared image of Cygnus-X, an extremely active region of star birth about 4,500 light years

from Earth in the constellation of Cygnus, the Swan. In the image, astronomers can see regions where dust has been gently heated by stars, and dense clumps of gas where new generations of stars are forming, the ESA reported from its Paris headquarters Thursday.

Bright white areas highlight zones where large stars have recently formed

out of turbulent clouds of dust and gas, carving out bubble-like structures with their immense radiation, astronomers said.

Herschel's infrared capability can probe the birth of large stars and their influence on the surrounding interstellar material with a level of detail never before available, astronomers said.

**Biodiversity loss hits environment**

SANT BARBARA, (Calif), 12 May—Biodiversity loss has as much negative impact on the environment as climate change and pollution, scientists at a California university say. An international research team working at the University of California, Santa Barbara, examined the effects of various environmental stressors on plant growth and decomposition, crucial maintenance processes in any ecosystem, and found the greater the plant species loss the higher the negative impact on plant growth.

"For the past 15 years, ecologists have built a rich understanding of the consequences of humans driving species extinct," researcher Jarrett Byrnes said in a UCSB release.

"What we didn't know

before this paper is whether those impacts of species loss rank up there with those from the environment as climate change and pollution," he said. The effects of biodiversity loss were similar to the effects from other environmental stressors including global warming and pollution, he said.

Biodiversity should be considered alongside the more prominent forms of environmental impacts, he said.

"One thing this study opens up is the need to better understand the interactions between environmental change and species loss. They're not independent, and may interact in some particularly unexpected ways," said Byrnes.

**River helped keep oil spill from coast**

PHILADELPHIA, 12 May—Environmental damage to coastal Louisiana following the 2010 Gulf of Mexico oil spill was less than expected thanks to the Mississippi River, researchers say. Geoscientists say a study reveals the force of the Mississippi River emptying into the Gulf of Mexico created mounds of freshwater that pushed back against much of the oil slick from the leaking Deepwater Horizon drilling rig offshore.

"The idea is that, if the water surface is tilting a little bit, then maybe the oil will move downhill, sort of like a ball on a plate. If you tilt the plate, the ball will roll one way and then another," University of Pennsylvania researcher Douglas Jerolmack said. "Surprisingly no one had really investigated the effect that the tilting of the water surface can have on the migration of oil," he said in a university release on Thursday. While many wetland habitats and wildlife were oiled during the three-month leak, a great part of the spreading slick never made it

to the coast, the researchers said.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration used information from satellite data to issue daily forecasts of where the oil slick might travel, using computer models based on ocean currents.

"We noticed that there was a big disconnect between the forecasts of where the oil was going to be the next day and where the oil actually was the next day," Jerolmack said. The researchers analyzed sea level data from

the period and confirmed the existence of several mounds and troughs in the Gulf.

"We recognized that there was a very persistent mound, a bump or a bulge, in the elevation of the sea surface in the vicinity of the Mississippi Delta," Jerolmack said, noting the oil spill coincided with the typical spring flood on the Mississippi that pushed a larger-than-normal flow of water into the Delta.

A mathematical model confirmed the slope of the mound was sufficient to direct the oil's movement, he said.

**NASA in test of rover for Mars mission**

DUMONT DUNES, (Calif), 12 May— NASA scientists say they have completed mobility tests on California sand dunes in preparation for operating the Curiosity rover currently on its way to Mars.

Researchers with the agency's Mars Science Laboratory mission took a test rover to Dumont Dunes in the Mojave Desert this week to improve knowledge of the best way to operate Curiosity, which is heading to Mars for an August landing at the Red Planet's Gale Crater, NASA reported on Friday.

The test rover utilized a full-scale version of Curiosity's mobility system but was stripped down so it weighs about the same on Earth as Curiosity will weigh in the lesser gravity of Mars, the researchers said.

Tests on windward and downwind portions of dunes will help the rover team make decisions about driving Curiosity on dunes near a mountain in the centre of Gale Crater, they said.

Curiosity is on track for landing 5 Aug to begin a two-year prime mission to investigate whether the area around its landing site has ever offered an environment favorable for microbial life.—Internet



**World's most expensive USD 1.9m bicycle unveiled**

MELBOURNE, 12 May—The world's most expensive and eco-friendly push bike has been made public and is on display at the Lentos Museum of Art in Linz, Austria.

The 1.9-million-dollar 'Fahrradi Farfall FFX' with a top speed of 16 km per hour, is the brainchild of Austrian artist Hannes Langerer, News.com.au reported. But rather than using V12 horse power, the 'car' operates with pedals where the accelerator and brake would be in a normal car.

Langerer built the car as part of an art project that anticipates a 'future top model of an actually existing automobile brand'.

The two-seat 'super bike-car' is aerodynamically designed, contains 11 gears, skinny wheels that work in tandem and two 'gullwing' doors that open upwards.

The car's name comes from the German word for bicycle - fahrrad, which stems from the Italian word for butterfly 'farfalla'.

**Health Tip: When your knee is unstable**

Your thighbone has a v-shaped notch that accommodates your kneecap. If the groove is too narrow or shallow, the knee cap can become unstable and dislocate. The American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons says symptoms of an unstable kneecap include:

- \* A buckling knee joint that can't support your weight.
- \* A kneecap that seems to slide to the side during movement.
- \* Pain in the front of your knee that worsens when you're removing.
- \* Stiffness, swelling or pain when you sit down.
- \* Cracking or creaking noises in your knee while you move.—Internet

**Tool cuts down on ER CT scan exposure**

CHICAGO, 12 May—A new electronic medical record tool cuts down on unnecessary CT scans in US hospital emergency patients with abdominal pain, researchers say. Dr Angela M Mills, medical director of the emergency department at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, said abdominal pain was the most common reason why people seek care in US emergency rooms, but the symptoms may be caused by myriad problems—simple tummy distress to a life-threatening ectopic pregnancy.

Emergency physicians tend to lean heavily on tests like CT scans, even though they expose patients to radiation. Fourteen percent of emergency room patients get scanned, contributing to ballooning healthcare costs. The researchers investigated a new tool embedded within patients' electronic medical records that walked physicians through a series of questions that served as checks and balances for their decision to order a CT scan to investigate a patient's abdominal pain.

The doctors were queried on what diagnosis they were looking for, from appendicitis to colitis to an ovarian cyst or tumor, and how likely they thought it that a patient had that problem. If a medical resident ordered the test, it had to be approved by an attending physician before the patient could receive the scan.—Internet

**Blood test may help identify kids' smoke exposure**

SAN FRANCISCO, 12 May—More than half of the children who took part in a study on exposure to cigarette smoke tested positive for such exposure, despite only a handful of their parents admitting to lighting up, according to a United States (US) study. Parents may think their children are exposed only if they're around

someone actively smoking a cigarette, or are unaware of where else their children may be breathing in smoke - but a blood test may help identify and reduce smoke exposure, said researchers at the University of California, San Francisco.

Secondhand smoke exposure in children has been tied to sudden infant death syndrome, respiratory problems, ear infections and asthma. "What the test does is allow the doctor, in consultation with the parent, to figure out the source of exposure and then to eliminate it," said Professor Jonathan Winickoff, an associate professor of paediatrics at Massachusetts General Hospital for Children in Boston.—Reuters

**Common household chemicals 'behind cancer and reduced fertility'**

LONDON, 12 May—Common chemicals found in household products may be the reason behind a range of medical problems such as cancer, reduced fertility and obesity, Europe's environmental watchdog has warned.

The European Environment Agency (EEA) has warned that other items such as cosmetics and medicines, which contain endocrine disrupting chemicals (EDCs), could be harmful to humans.

In a study published on Thursday, officials said that there was strong evidence of harm and cautioned against their use but stopped just short of recommending a complete ban.

According to the agency five classes of chemicals need more scrutiny.

These included phthalates, which are often found in pesticides bisphenol A and other PCBs, which are used to make plastics parabens that are increasingly found in sunscreen and chemicals used in contraceptive pills.

It found those chemicals, which disrupt the hormone system 'may be a contributing factor behind the significant increases in cancers, diabetes and obesity, falling fertility and an increased number of neurological development problems in both humans and animals'.

The agency said that in

recent decades, there has been a 'significant growth' in many human diseases and disorders including breast and prostate cancer, male infertility and diabetes.

It added that many scientists believe that the growth was connected to the 'rising levels of exposure to mixtures of some chemicals in widespread use'.

The agency also said that the link between some diseases and these disrupter chemicals was now fully accepted.

The findings, in a report titled 'The impacts of endocrine disrupters on wildlife, people and their environments', were made following a review of scientific studies literature commissioned by agency over the past 15 years.

'Scientific research gathered over the last few decades shows us that endocrine disruption is a real problem, with serious effects on wildlife, and possibly people,' the Telegraph quoted Jacqueline McGlade, the EEA Executive Director, as saying.

'It would be prudent to take a precautionary approach to many of these chemicals until their effects are more fully understood,' McGlade said.

She said the real problem was not a single chemical but the 'cocktail effect' of many of them together.

**Sony shares at near 32-year lows on strategy doubts**

TOKYO, 12 May—Shares in Sony Corp slumped more than 7 percent to near 32-year lows, as investors doubted the Japanese consumer electronics giant has a strategy to fix its loss-making TV business and compete in the smartphone market against Apple Inc and Samsung Electronics.

The last time Sony shares were this low, in the summer of 1980, its first Walkman portable cassette player had just gone on sale in the United States. The maker of Bravia TVs, Vaio laptops and PlayStation games consoles on Thursday posted a record annual loss of \$5.7 billion, but forecast a first profit in five years as it looks to halve losses at its ailing TV business. The profit forecast was below analysts'

expectations.

Japanese firms, which long dominated the global TV industry, have been overtaken by Samsung and LG Electronics (066570.KS), which are rolling out next-generation sets using organic light emitting display (OLED),

in a reshaping of Asia's flat panel sector. A stronger yen, which erodes the value of exports, has also not helped.

"(In the past) if you wanted a top quality TV you had to buy a Sharp, Panasonic or Sony. Those days are gone," Steve Durose, Senior

Director and Head of Asia-Pacific at Fitch Ratings, told Reuters last month.

"I didn't see anything positive in there (Sony's results)," said a trader at a US bank. "There's really nothing in there that can justify buying the stock. You see the loss narrowing in the TV business. That's fine, but I don't see any future in the TV business, so it doesn't matter what they do."

Shares of Panasonic Corp, which makes Viera TVs, also fell, 1.6 percent, to their lowest close in more than three decades. After the market closed, Panasonic also posted a record annual loss, of \$9.7 billion, and predicted a return to profit this year after a heavy bout of cost-cutting and restructuring.—Reuters

## Indonesia jet crash bodies sent for identification

JAKARTA, 12 May—Body bags containing the remains of people aboard a Russian jet that smashed into an Indonesian mountain, arrived in Jakarta on Saturday as Russian investigators landed to join the probe.

Rescuers said the bodies of those who perished when Sukhoi's new *Superjet 100*

hit Mount Salak in western Java on Wednesday, killing all on board, were badly dismembered.

Officials said the remains of the victims found so far had been placed in 16 body bags. Two had already arrived at a Jakarta hospital for identification with four more on the way.

"This morning we have 16 body bags. On Friday, there were 12, and four more were filled today (Saturday). No body was found in its whole form," West Java provincial military chief Sonny Widjaja said.

Each bag could contain the remains of more than one victim, he said. Officials said on Friday that 12 bodies had been found. A woman at Jakarta's Halim Perdanakusuma military airport, where the doomed flight took off, fainted as she watched men unload the first two body bags from a helicopter. The remains were taken by road to the Kramat Jati Police Hospital in east Jakarta for DNA identification. Relatives, told to wait at the hospital, wailed as they watched the bags arrive before being taken to the forensics division.

## Japan faces 'extinction' in 1,000 years

TOKYO, 12 May—Japanese researchers on Friday unveiled a population clock that showed the nation's people could theoretically become extinct in 1,000 years because of declining birth rates.

Academics in the northern city of Sendai said that Japan's population of children aged up to 14, which

now stands at 16.6 million, is shrinking at the rate of one every 100 seconds. Their extrapolations pointed to a Japan with no children left within a millennium.

"If the rate of decline continues, we will be able to celebrate the Children's Day public holiday on 5 May, 3011 as there will be one child," said Hiroshi Yoshida,

an economics professor at Tohoku University.

"But 100 seconds later there will be no children left," he said. "The overall trend is towards extinction, which started in 1975 when Japan's fertility rate fell below two."

Yoshida said he created the population clock to encourage "urgent" discussion of the issue. Another study released earlier this year showed Japan's population is expected to shrink to a third of its current 127.7 million over the next century.

Government projections show the birth rate will hit just 1.35 children per woman within 50 years, well below the replacement rate.

Meanwhile, life expectancy — already one of the

highest in the world — is expected to rise from 86.39 years in 2010 to 90.93 years in 2060 for women and from 79.64 years to 84.19 years for men. More than 20 percent of Japan's people are aged 65 or over, one of the highest proportions of elderly in the world.

Japan has very little immigration and any suggestion of opening the borders to young workers who could help plug the population gap provokes strong reactions among the public. The greying population is a headache for policymakers who are faced with trying to ensure an ever-dwindling pool of workers can pay for a growing number of pensioners.—INTERNET

## Two arrested after five children die in British house fire

LONDON, 12 May—British police arrested two people on suspicion of murder after five children died in a house fire on Friday in the central English city of Derby.

"Sadly I can now confirm that five children have died, and their ages range from five to 10 years," said Assistant Chief Constable Steve Cotterill of Derbyshire Police.

Detectives are keeping an open mind about what caused the fire, he told a news conference. A 28-year-old woman and a 38-year-old man were arrested separately on suspicion of murder. Cotterill said two adults and a sixth child, aged 13, were being treated in hospital, after emergency services were called to the semi-detached house early Friday. The teenager remains in a critical condition.

The children's father was named in media reports as 57-year-old Mick Philpott, a father of 17 who made headlines in 2007 when he appeared in a television documentary about welfare made by 1990s prisons minister Ann Widdecombe.—INTERNET

## Three Boston U students killed in New Zealand crash

WELLINGTON, (New Zealand), 12 May—Three Boston University students who were studying in New Zealand were killed on Saturday when their minivan crashed. At least five other students from the university were injured in the accident, including one who was in critical condition.

The students were travelling in a minivan at about 7:30 am on Saturday near the North Island vacation town of Taupo when the vehicle drifted to the side of the road and then rolled when the driver tried to correct course, New Zealand police said.

Three of the students died at the scene, police said. Another woman was in critical condition at an area hospital, while at least four other students suffered moderate injuries.

Joseph Bergen, the US vice consul in Auckland, New Zealand, identified the deceased students as Daniela Lekhno, Roch Jauberty and Austin Brashears, according to the Boston University website. New Zealand police confirmed their identities.

Another BU student, Margaret Theriault, was airlifted from the crash site to a hospital in Taupo and was in critical condition, the university said.

## Horrific child murder case ends with guilty verdict

TORONTO, 12 May—A Canadian man was found guilty of the murder, assault and kidnapping of an 8-year-old girl on Friday, after a gruesome two-month court case that horrified the country.

A jury in London, Ontario, found Michael Rafferty, 31, guilty of first degree murder, kidnapping and sexual assault, dismissing his girlfriend's testimony that she alone was responsible for killing Tori Stafford.

"We got him. We got justice," Tori's father Rodney Stafford told reporters outside the courtroom, showing the waiting TV cameras a picture of Tori. "It was for every little girl in Canada. Nobody deserves what happened to her."

In graphic testimony during the trial,

Terri-Lynne McClintic admitted she had kidnapped Tori from outside her school in April, 2009 and delivered her to Rafferty, who raped the child.

McClintic, who had already pleaded guilty to murder, said she then battered the girl to death with a claw hammer, a version of events that the jury dismissed with their verdict.

It was three months before anyone found Tori's badly decomposed body and forensic experts said they could not determine if the child had been sexually assaulted.

But in evidence never presented to the jury, prosecutors said a computer found in Rafferty's car included searches for topics including "underage rape," "real underage rape pictures" and "nude preteen."—Reuters

## Attacker in Afghan uniform kills US soldier

KABUL, 12 May—A man wearing an Afghan army uniform shot dead a US soldier in the east of the country, one of two NATO troops killed on Friday, military officials said. The Taliban claimed responsibility for the attack.

Also Friday, the US-led military coalition offered condolences to the families of Afghan civilians who were killed in airstrikes earlier this month.

The shooting was the 15th incident this year in which Afghan soldiers or insurgents disguised in military uniforms have turned their weapons on foreign troops. The killings have increased the level of mistrust between the US-led

coalition and its Afghan partners and raised questions about the readiness of local forces to take over from NATO ahead of a 2014 deadline for the withdrawal of foreign combat troops.

An Afghan defence official said the incident took place in Kunar Province in northeast Afghanistan. The official spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to brief the media.

NATO did not disclose the nationality of the trooper killed, but a Pentagon spokesman, Navy Capt. John Kirby, said the service member was an American.

## JPMorgan \$2 billion loss hits shares, credit, image

NEW YORK/LONDON, 12 May—JPMorgan Chase & Co lost \$15 billion in market value and a notch in its credit ratings on Friday while a chorus of regulators and politicians reacted to its surprise \$2 billion trading loss by demanding stiffer oversight for the banking industry.

The loss by one of Wall Street's most respected banks embarrassed chief executive Jamie Dimon, a leader lauded for steering his bank through the fallout from the 2008 financial crisis without reporting a loss.

"We know we were sloppy. We know we were stupid. We know there was bad judgment," Dimon said in an interview with NBC television to be broadcast on "Meet the Press" on Sunday. He said it wasn't clear whether the bank had broken any laws or violated any rules. "We've had audit, legal, risk, compliance, some of our best people looking at all of that."

The loss also invited regulatory scrutiny for a man who had all but led the charge to limit it, criticizing the so-called Volcker rule to ban proprietary trading by big banks.

The *New York Times* reported that the Securities and Exchange Commission has opened a preliminary investigation into JPMorgan's accounting practices and public disclosures

about the trading loss.

On Friday, Securities and Exchange Commission Chairman Mary Schapiro told reporters: "It's safe to say that all the regulators are focused on this."

The debacle sparked new fears about big banks and prompted Dallas Federal Reserve Bank President Richard Fisher, who has called for the breakup of the top five US banks, to say he is worried the biggest banks do not have adequate risk management.—Reuters

## Cuba to invest 450 m USD to promote rice production

HAVANA, 12 May—Cuba plans to invest 450 million US dollars to raise rice production, a major grain on the island, an official from the Ministry of Agriculture said on Friday. Lazaro Diaz, general director of the state-run Agro industrial Grain Group under the Ministry, said that 108 million dollars of the investment programme had already been raised with the aim of modernizing the agricultural machinery. He said the investment programme was based on the support and advice of the experts and technicians from Cuba, Vietnam, Japan and China and was aimed at gradually reducing rice imports.

Cuba spends about 2 billion dollars every year in importing food. The Cuban authorities have realized the importance of raising the national rice production to meet the domestic demands. Since taking office in 2008, Cuban leader Raul Castro has repeatedly warned that the country, suffering a serious economic crisis, cannot afford the expensive imported food. The Cuban government has adopted several measures to promote food production, including the delivery of over a million hectares of idle lands to farmers and the granting of bank loans for farmers to buy agricultural machinery.

## Ashton hopes new talks to end Iran nuke programme

BRUSSEL, 12 May—The European Union's foreign policy chief said on Friday she hoped upcoming talks with Iran would form the basis for Teheran to eventually abandon its alleged nuclear weapons project.

Speaking ahead of talks scheduled for 23 May in Baghdad, Catherine Ashton — who has been representing the major powers at talks about Iran's nuclear activity — said she had high hopes for the new round of negotiations.

"My ambition is that we come away with the beginning of the end of the nuclear weapons programme in Iran," she told reporters in Brussels. "I hope we'll see the beginnings of success." The West suspects Iran is seeking to develop nuclear weapons, but Iran says its programme is purely for peaceful purposes such as power production.

Negotiations over its alleged military programme resumed in Turkey in April after a 15-month hiatus, and are due to resume on 23 May in Baghdad.

Ashton said she would approach the talks as a "serious set of discussions that can lead to concrete results".

Iran has said it wants sanctions introduced by the United States and the EU to dissuade it from pushing ahead with its nuclear ambitions to be scaled back.

But Western diplomats say Iran must first take concrete steps to ease their concerns. The sanctions have targeted Iran's energy and banking sectors since the beginning of this year, and the EU is preparing for a total embargo on the purchase of Iranian crude oil in July.—Reuters

## Britons get gloomier — long, hard revival to come

LONDON, 13 May—Britons turned gloomier last month as a slump in construction pointed to an even deeper recession and producers ramped up prices, highlighting the long and difficult road back to economic health.

The economy has not fully recovered from the downturn caused by the 2007-2009 financial crisis, with many Britons left poorer as meagre wage growth has been eaten up by rising prices and government tax hikes.

Central bankers and politicians have only limited options to support the economy.

The Bank of England decided on Thursday not to give the struggling economy another cash boost, as its concerns over stubbornly high inflation outweighed worries of a prolonged recession and dangers from the euro zone crisis.

Nor can consumers and businesses rely on much help from the government, after Prime Minister David Cameron reaffirmed his commitment to cutting a huge budget deficit, defying criticism over a lack of bold steps to kick-start growth.

Consumer morale worsened last month as Britons became more worried about jobs, lender Nationwide said on Friday,

and the mood may darken even further as news that the economy slipped into recession came out after its poll was conducted.

"It's all a bit grim - it's stagflation Britain," said RBS economist Ross Walker, referring to a 1970s term combining economic growth stagnation with inflation.

Britain's manufacturers raised prices more than expected in April despite lower input costs, official data showed, increasing the risk that consumer price inflation may not fall as fast as the central bank hopes.—Reuters

## Lack of new cash disappoints in Spain bank reform

MADRID, 12 May—Spain's government tried to plug a gaping hole in the country's banking system on Friday, but the fourth such attempt to tackle the fallout from a property crash fell short of expectations.

The centre-right government offered high-interest loans to banks on the brink in a crisis which is shaking the euro zone, and ordered an independent audit of lending across the entire banking sector, as the European Union had asked.

"This is not the definitive clean-up framework that the market is clamoring for," said Nicholas Spiro from Spiro Sovereign Strategy. "Spanish bank restructuring is a moving

target: the deeper the economic downturn, the greater the uncertainty about the size of the sector's provisioning needs."

Spain's troubled banks, with more than 184 billion euros (\$238 billion) in problem loans and assets after the property bubble burst four years ago, lie at the core of the euro zone debt crisis due to fears that a massive rescue could push Spanish public finances to breaking point.

The immediate market reaction to Friday's government announcements was negative. But later the gap between yields on Spanish and German benchmark government bonds — a measure of how risky investors

judge lending to Spain to be — narrowed somewhat to 450 basis points and Spanish bluechip shares moderated their fall to 0.76 percent.

Banks have until the end of the year to move their holdings of repossessed property into asset management firms for a fire sale, Economy Minister Luis de Guindos told a news conference. All banks must do this, he said.

A Spanish government source, however, later said that banks able to cover by themselves losses on their toxic property assets will not be forced to remove them from their books while it will be compulsory for those receiving public help.—Reuters

## China, Switzerland make further progress in FTA talks

BEIJING, 12 May—China and Switzerland have made "great progress" in the fifth round of bilateral talks on a possible Free Trade Agreement (FTA), the Ministry of Commerce said Friday.

During the 8-10 May talk, the two countries exchanged views on topics of tax cuts, service trade, rules of origin, sanitary and phytosanitary measures, technical trade barriers and intellectual property rights, reaching a series of agreements on the issues, the ministry said.

China and Switzerland formally launched bilateral FTA talks in January, with the aim of promoting economic development and closer ties between the two countries. Trade between the two countries totaled 30.9 billion US dollars in 2011, up 54 percent from a year earlier.

**China says inflation eases slightly in April**

SHANGHAI, 12 May—China said on Friday that inflation slowed in April, easing worries of resurgent prices and giving room to loosen monetary policy to boost slowing growth in the world's second largest economy. The country's consumer price index (CPI) rose by 3.4 percent year on year in April compared with 3.6 percent in March, the National Bureau of Statistics said, a slowdown analysts said was driven by moderating food prices.

now. So overall, we can say that inflationary pressure this year is not big," she said.

The April figure was exactly in line with market expectations, according to a poll of 15 economists by Dow Jones Newswires. The key food component of CPI rose 7.0 percent year on year in April — contributing more than two percentage points to overall inflation — but eased from 7.5 percent rise in March, the bureau said.

China has set itself the target of keeping annual

to ease monetary policy, including cuts in reserves for banks, to combat slower economic growth.

"The top issue for China's economy is not inflation, but rather how to maintain economic growth," Liao Qun, China economist for Citic Bank International in Hong Kong, told AFP. "If economic data... turn out to be weaker than expected, it will likely prompt China to take further easing measures through cuts in banks' reserve requirements," he said. China's economy grew 8.1 percent in the first quarter of 2012, its slowest pace in nearly three years.

ABUJA, 12 May—International medical aid group Doctors Without Borders said on Thursday that 1,500 children in a mining village in northwest Nigeria have suffered lead-poisoning and are not receiving care.

"1,500 children are currently lead-poisoned but are not receiving treatment because it is impossible to deliver effective treatment while they still live in contaminated homes," the group's head of mission in Nigeria, Ivan Gayton, said.

Those children that need treatment are mostly in Bajega Village in Zamfara State, he said. "There are 4,000 children who have been exposed. 2,500

are under treatment because their villages have been remediated," he told reporters in Abuja at the end of a two-day international conference on ending the lead poisoning epidemic.

Geneva-based Doctors Without Borders (Medecins Sans Frontieres) spends over \$5 million yearly to treat people affected by lead poisoning which has killed more than 400 children in northern Nigeria since 2010, Gayton earlier told AFP.

The Abuja conference was jointly organised by the medical aid group, the Nigerian Centre for Disease Control and Prevention and the health ministry.

"The expertise that is here today has shown that it is possible to do the medical treatment. It is possible to do the environmental remediation and it is possible to do safer mining," said Gayton, a Canadian. "We need not die in search of livelihood. It can be done safely." Human Rights Watch (HRW) said in a statement that lead poisoning in Zamfara was one of the "worst such crises in modern history." The deaths, affecting children working in artisanal gold mines and those living in surrounding communities, arose from an unusually high concentration of lead in the region's soil, HRW said.—Internet

**Germany approves expansion of EU anti-piracy mission**

BERLIN, 12 May—The German parliament on Thursday gave final approval to an extension of the European Union's anti-piracy operation off the Horn of Africa to include targeting equipment stored on Somali beaches.

Lawmakers gave the green light to the expanded mission, with a majority from the ruling centre-right coalition parties carrying the vote against strong resistance from the opposition Social Democrats and the Greens after a heated debate.

The EU's Operation Atalanta has deployed between five and 10 warships

off the Somali coasts since 2008 to escort humanitarian aid shipments and thwart pirate raids on commercial vessels using vital shipping lanes. EU

foreign ministers in March agreed to extend the mission until December 2014 and expand "the force's area of operations to include Somali

coastal territory as well as its territorial and internal waters".

Warships or helicopters would be permitted to fire at fuel barrels, boats, trucks or other equipment stowed away on beaches.

The German mandate, which runs until 31 May, 2013, limits such strikes to an area two kilometres (1.2 miles) in from the coastline and says German troops will only be permitted to go on land in cases of emergency.

Opposition parties voted against the bill, saying it amounted to irresponsible overreach for German forces.

MUNICH, 12 May—Bayern Munich are out to break their losing streak to German champions Borussia Dortmund in Saturday's domestic cup final as their Champions League showdown with Chelsea looms.

Dortmund have beaten Bayern both home and away for the last two seasons on their way to claiming back-to-back league titles and Borussia

are bidding to win the league and cup double for the first time in their 103-year history.

The last of Dortmund's two previous German cups wins was back in 1989, while Bayern come to Berlin's Olympic Stadium chasing their 16th cup title.

The Bavarians host the Champions League final against Chelsea at their own Allianz Arena stadium on Saturday 19 May and while

they could be forgiven for being distracted, goalkeeper Manuel Neuer insists all eyes are on Berlin.

"All we're thinking about is this final. We've forgotten the other matches," he insisted. "Obviously, there are a lot of reports about the Champions League final, but everyone saw how overjoyed we were in Moenchengladbach when we made it to the cup final. "We're fired up for the match and want to win the trophy." Neuer played a key role in the cup semi-final victory at Gladbach in March with a crucial save in the penalty shoot-out and is determined to hoist the golden trophy again having captained Schalke to their 2011 cup victory.

Lifting the German cup would also be a perfect foundation for the Champions League final the week after, says Germany's first-choice goalkeeper. "We've had a good season as a team, but it'll only be a superb season if we win trophies," said Neuer.

## End of an era at AC Milan as veterans move on

MILAN, 12 May—Filippo Inzaghi, Gennaro Gattuso and Alessandro Nesta will end their AC Milan careers against Novara on Sunday as the end of an era is all but completed at the San Siro. After those three are gone, only Clarence Seedorf and Massimo Ambrosini will remain from the last great Milan side that lifted the Champions League in 2007.

Inzaghi is particularly

loved because he scored a brace in that final in Athens as Milan defeated Liverpool 2-1 to avenge their penalty shoot-out final defeat by the same opponents two years before. Already, there was a feeling that the side were coming to the end of their powers but certain figures held on.

Club captain Ambrosini, 34, is staying on for another year but the fate of 36-year-old Seedorf has yet to be confirmed. It is the departure of iconic figure Inzaghi that will truly drill home the reality that Milan have moved on from that era. They won the Champions League in 2003 and 2007, while reaching the final in 2005, as well as winning the league title in 2004.

"The reality surpassed our most beautiful dreams," said Inzaghi in a parting note to Milan's fans. "Two goals against Liverpool, two years after Istanbul (where they lost the final), the seventh Champions League. Destiny gave us something we didn't even dare hope for."

It was one of the great Milan teams but all good things must come to an end.

Already the likes of defenders Cafu and Paolo Maldini, as well as coach Carlo Ancelotti, had gone, while Andrea Pirlo left last summer.

## Chelsea pushing defensive pair hard to be fit for final

The London club, who are certain to finish sixth in the Premier League, also have midfielders Raul Meireles and Ramires suspended for the

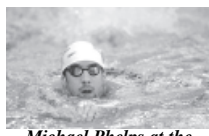
### Phelps fall to hometown hero at Charlotte UltraSwim

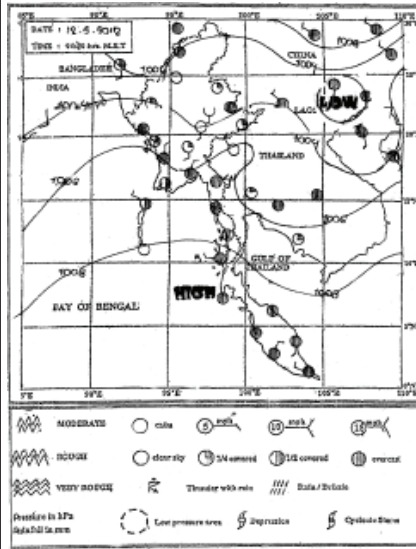

**Azarenka to meet Serena in Madrid Open final**

MADRID, 12 May—Victoria Azarenka and Serena Williams will square off for the Madrid Open title after the current and former world number ones swept into the final with a minimum of fuss on Saturday.

Australian Open champion Azarenka took a step closer to a fifth title of 2012 when she dispatched Agnieszka Radwanska 6-2 6-4, before Williams, seeded ninth at the premier event in the Spanish capital, crushed Czech qualifier Lucie Hradecka 7-6-6-0.

Belarusian Azarenka has now beaten third-ranked Pole Radwanska six times in six meetings this year and rarely looked troubled as she seeks to improve on her runners-up finish last year to Petra Kvitova. She battered 29 winners on the blue clay of the Manolo Santana show court, each accompanied by a trademark shriek of effort, before reflecting on her 6-1 losing record against Williams, who last topped the rankings in October 2010. "I was much younger and just coming on the tour (for many of our matches) but I have always been competitive against her and she is one of the toughest opponents to play against," Azarenka told a news conference.

"It's going to be a different story this time," the 22-year-old, who was beaten 6-1 7-6 by Williams in the U.S. Open third round last year, added. Mexico host Guyana on June 8 and visit El Salvador four days later in the third phase of the Concacaf qualifiers for the 2014 World Cup finals in Brazil. Costa Rica make up Group B.

Mexico will play warm-up friendlies against Wales on 27 May, Bosnia on 31 May and Brazil on 3 June.
