Greek elections loom after leftist rejects coalition talks

ATHENS, 14 May—Greece's radical leftist leader spurned an invitation from the president for a final round of coalition talks on Monday, all but ensuring a new election that he is poised to win.

Greece's political landscape has been in disarray for a week since an inconclusive election left parliament divided between supporters and opponents of the 130 billion euro (\$168.3 billion) EU/IMF bailout, with neither side able to form a government.

Government officials have warned that Greece could run out of cash as early as the end of June if it does not have a government in place to negotiate the next aid tranche with its lenders.

"The country is up in the air," financial daily Imerisia wrote on its front page, warning in an editorial: "The country is moving to the brink of collapse and hopes for restoring the political stability are fading

away." President Karolos Papoulias must call a new election if he cannot persuade leaders to compromise. After a day of fruitless negotiations on Sunday, he invited politicians from the biggest three parties



along with a small leftist group. But an official from the second biggest party, the radical leftist SYRIZA, said its 37-year-old leader Alexis

to return to the presidential mansion at 12:30 pm EDT (1630 GMT) on Monday,

Tsipras would not attend. The anti-bailout vote was divided among small parties but has now rallied behind Tsipras.

Iran says pressures may damage nuclear talks

DUBAI, 14 May—Iran warned Western powers on Sunday that applying pressure on Teheran could jeopardize talks on its nuclear programme, state television reported.

"The era of a pressure strategy is ended. Any strategic miscalculations would endanger success at the Baghdad negotiations," said Saeed Jalili, Iran's chief nuclear negotiator, quoted by state television.

Jalili was speaking with French former Prime Minister Michel Rocard who visited Iran ahead of the talks on 23 May in Baghdad with the United States, Russia, China, France, Britain and Germany.

Jalili called on Western officials to avoid "unconstructive remarks" ahead of the talks, the television said, without elaborating. Catherine Ashton, the European Union's foreign policy chief, said on Friday

she hoped the talks would form the basis for Iran to eventually abandon its "nuclear weapons programme".

The West suspects Iran is seeking to develop nuclear weapons. Teheran says its programme is purely for peaceful purposes such as power generation. Ashton's use of the term "nuclear weapons programme" went beyond the language commonly used by Western officials, who usually describe Iran's efforts as an attempt to move towards a nuclear weapons capability.

In January, US Director of National Intelligence James Clapper said Iran was keeping open the option to develop nuclear weapons, in part by developing various nuclear capabilities. But he said he did not know whether Iran would eventually decide to build nuclear weapons.

As foreign troops leave, Afghan refugees and poverty increase

MAZAR-E-SHARIF, 14 May—Gulam recalls the evening she fled her home in northern Afghanistan on foot, running with her teen daughters under the cloak of darkness to avoid cooking a dinner for 20 Taliban militants.

"This Taleb burst through my door and demanded I cook for them. But I had no money, and I was scared they would take my daughters," Gulam said, pulling a striped shawl tightly around her gaunt and wrinkled face.

That night six months ago, Gulam and her family joined the half a million Afghans who are internally displaced, mostly from conflict but also natural disasters, a number which has been steadily increasing since 2008.

Intensifying violence as NATO combat troops prepare

to leave by end-2014 and a poor economic outlook in the face of shrinking aid could spell a humanitarian disaster for Afghanistan, where a third already live beneath the poverty line.

"Security in the country is terrible. Day by day there are more of us," Gulam told Reuters while visiting the UN compound in Mazar-e-Sharif, the capital of northern Balkh Province.

She left her mountainous village for a district on Afghanistan's border with Uzbekistan, where she now lives in rented accommodation. Unable to find work, the widow receives meagerly handouts from male relatives. She says her husband was killed in an insurgent attack.—Reuters

Five killed in flash flood in Georgian capital

TBILISI, 14 May—An overnight flash-flood caused by a downpour drowned five people including two children early on Sunday in the capital city of Georgia. According to the emergency service and rescuers of the municipality, the flash-flood occurred around the Ortechal district in the city and rescuers had to use boats to evacuate people.

Several others were sent to hospitals where they had been receiving treatment for injuries. Rescuers also reported property damages to houses because of mudslides triggered by the flash-flood.

Tbilisi Mayor Gigi Ugulava said, "The (Tbilisi) City Hall has created a special commission to check upon the flood damage while rescuers and municipal emergency service have been working overnight to clean the flooded district and to restore roads"

"By nine (o'clock) this morning (Sunday) the situation had been brought to normal," said Ugulava.

Forty-nine headless corpses found in northern Mexico

CADEREYTA JIMENEZ, 14 May—Suspected drug cartel killers in Mexico dumped 49 headless bodies on a highway near the northern city of Monterrey, a sickening atrocity that prompted the government to condemn the "inhuman" violence plaguing the country.

The corpses of 43 men and six women, whose hands and feet had also been cut off, were found in a pile on a highway in the municipality of Cadereyta Jimenez early on Sunday, officials from the state of Nuevo Leon said.

The Nuevo Leon government said the notorious Zetas drug gang had claimed responsibility for the bloodbath, one of the worst to hit Mexico during its struggle against the powerful cartels.

The massacre follows several other mass slayings in Mexico. Many have occurred in the north, where

the Zetas have waged a war against rival groups for control of smuggling routes into the United States, the biggest market for illicit drugs.

The Mexican government said in a statement the evidence suggested turf wars between the Zetas and the Sinaloa cartel of Joaquin

"Shorty" Guzman were behind the surge in bloodshed.

Condemning the "inhuman episodes of irrational violence" the warring gangs had caused, the government pledged to uphold justice in Mexico with "all of its force and might."

Coach-truck collision leaves four dead, 36 injured in north China

HOHHOT, 14 May—At least four people were confirmed dead and 36 others were injured after a coach collided with a truck in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region early Monday morning.

The fire department in Huade County said both of the vehicles rolled over after the collision at 1 am on Monday. The truck driver and two passengers on the sleeper coach died on the spot. Rescuers sent 37 injured people to hospital. One of them died in hospital after treatment failed.

There were a total of 39 people on board the sleeper coach, which was en route from Xilinhot City to the regional capital of Hohhot, when the accident happened on a crossing between two highways in Huade County, Ulanqab City.

Canon seeks full automation in camera production

TOKYO, 14 May—Canon Inc is moving toward fully automating digital camera production in an effort to cut costs—a key change being played out across Japan, a world leader in robotics.

If successful, counting on machines can help preserve this nation's

technological power—not the stereotype of machines snatching assembly line jobs from workers, Jun Misumi—company spokesman, said on Monday.

The move toward machine-only production will likely be completed in the next few years, perhaps as soon as 2015, said Misumi, although he declined to give specific dates.

Japanese manufacturers have been moving production abroad recently to offset the earnings damage from the soaring yen.

And fears are growing about a hollowing-out of Japan Inc as jobs move to China, India and the rest of Asia, where labour costs are cheaper. Misumi was adamant that jobs won't be cut at Canon.

"When machines become more sophisticated, human beings can be transferred to do new kinds of

work," he said.

Since the late 1990s, like other manufacturers, Canon began using the "cell" production method, in which a team of workers or one worker puts together a major part, rather than doing a simple task over and over.

In recent years, robots have become so much a part of this cell production, Canon calls it "man-machine cell." Eventually, human involvement will be phased out in making some products, according to Canon. In the US, Amazon.com Inc is buying Kiva Systems, which makes robots and software to help companies fulfill orders, for \$775 million.

Amazon has been using automation at its order fulfillment centres for some time. But Kiva's technology is designed to lower costs and will be used to help workers pick and pack books.

Sano, the academic, stressed the need for a system so workers can communicate with robots. He also stressed that there will always be room for human intelligence, using the Japanese for "craftsmanship," or "takumi." "Human beings are needed to come up with innovations on how to use robots," said Sano. "Going to a no-man operation at that level is still the world of science fiction."

Yahoo CEO out, investor Loeb gets board seats

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 May—Yahoo Inc (YHOO.O) is replacing its CEO for the third time in as many years, and giving three board seats to a hedge fund led by Daniel Loeb, putting him in a strong position to influence strategy at the struggling Internet company.

Chief Executive Scott Thompson stepped down on Sunday, 10 days after Loeb accused him of padding his biography by faking a computer science degree. Loeb's Third Point LLC is one of Yahoo's largest shareholders with a 5.8 percent stake.

Yahoo did not give a reason for Thompson's exit but said the company's global media head, Ross Levinsohn, will be interim CEO. It also said it had settled a proxy battle with Third Point and will nominate three of the fund's slate of four candidates to the board, including Loeb.

Separately, the Wall Street Journal reported on Monday that before resigning as chief executive of Yahoo over the weekend, Thompson disclosed to the company's board of directors and several colleagues that he has been diagnosed with thyroid cancer. The paper had sourced the report to people familiar with the matter.

The decision to step down from Yahoo was in part influenced by Thompson's cancer diagnosis, a person told the Journal.

The diagnosis had occurred in recent days while the board was investigating why the executive's academic record had erroneously included a computer science degree, according to the newspaper.

Thompson's departure after just four months on the job throws into question the future of Yahoo as it struggles to revive growth amid fierce competition from the likes of Google Inc (GOOG.O) and Facebook Inc, and produce a long-term strategy to convince investors to reverse its share slide.

Yahoo recently resumed negotiations to sell all or part of its more than 40 percent stake in Chinese Internet and e-commerce company Alibaba back to the Chinese company, after torpedoing a previous plan to do a complex tax-free transaction.

"This is a big victory for Third Point. It strengthens their argument that this board was dysfunctional, and it's going to increase Third Point's ability to shape the direction of the company," BGC analyst Colin Gillis said.

Leica camera auctioned in Austria for record \$2.8 mln

VIENNA, 14 May—A rare 1923 Leica went for 2.16 million euros at an auction in Vienna at the weekend, making it the most expensive camera ever sold, the auctioneer said.

An anonymous buyer won the bidding battle for the German camera, which still works and is one of around 25 test versions of Leica 0-Series cameras produced in 1923, two years before the start of serial production. Only half of them have been preserved.

Including the buyer's premium, the price paid at the WestLicht auction on Saturday was more than seven times the starting price of 300,000 euros, WestLicht said. It did not identify the previous owner, who it said was a private collector in Europe.

A different Leica 0-series sold in November 2007 for 336,000 euros at auction, and then again in May 2011 for 1.32 million euros including the buyer's premium, WestLicht said.—Reuters

Ancient Peruvian find turns up in Florida

ORLANDO, 14 May—Experts are trying to determine how two ancient skulls and centuries-old Peruvian artifacts came to be buried in a former Florida migrant worker camp.

There is one clue that showed the burial occurred in comparatively recent times—pieces of a newspaper dated 16 March, 1978, the Orlando (Fla.) Sentinel reported.

"This is definitely a secondary burial site," said Dr. Jan Garavaglia, medical examiner for Orange and Osceola counties.

The migrant worker camp in Winter Garden, about 30 miles west of Orlando, shut down in the 1980s and the area is now being developed. A swimming pool contractor found the skulls and artifacts.

John Schultz, an anthropologist at the University of Central Florida, said the skulls are typical of Inca remains from Peru. A woven purse, carrying bag and sling and pieces of pottery found with the bones appear to be from the Chanay culture of Peru, which flourished for more than 200 years before 1470 A.D.

Trading in archaeological finds has been illegal under a UNESCO convention since 1970. Before that tourists could often buy them in local markets, although many countries had laws protecting antiquities.

Another possibility is that the remains were brought to Florida by migrant workers, possibly for use in religious rituals.—Internet

Scientists track manta rays by satellite

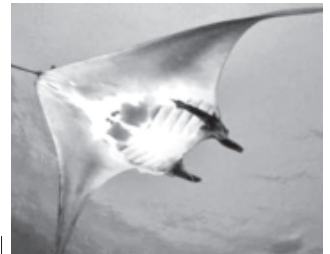
NEW YORK, 14 May—US, British and Mexican researchers say satellite tracking technology has uncovered feeding habitats and threats to a mysterious ocean giant, the manta ray. Conservationists from the Wildlife Conservation Society of New York, the University of Exeter in Britain and the government of Mexico have completed a ground-breaking study using satellite telemetry to track the open-ocean journeys of the world's largest ray, which can grow up to 25 feet in width, the WCS reported on Friday.

The manta ray, listed as "vulnerable" by the International Union for Conservation of Nature, has become increasingly threatened by fishing and accidental capture and now needs more protection, the researchers said.

"Almost nothing is known about the movements and ecological needs of the manta ray, one of the ocean's largest and least-known species," said Rachel Graham, director of WCS's Gulf and Caribbean Sharks and Rays Programme. "Our real-time data illuminate the previously unseen world of this mythic fish and will help to shape management and conservation strategies for this species."

The research team attached satellite transmitters to six manta rays off the coast of Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula. "The satellite tag data revealed that some of the rays travelled more than 1,100 kilometers (680 miles) during the study period," Matthew Witt of the University of Exeter's Environment and Sustainability Institute said.

"The rays spent most of their time traversing coastal areas plentiful in zooplankton and fish eggs from spawning events." Manta rays are declining in the Caribbean and in other tropical regions of the world's oceans because they are captured for shark bait or for use in the traditional Chinese medicinal trade, researchers said.—Internet

Riskier assets hit as Euro zone worries grow

LONDON, 14 May—The euro hit four month lows and shares fell on Monday as the increasing likelihood of a new election in Greece worsened the sense of crisis in the euro zone and China's latest move to loosen monetary policy only added to investor risk aversion.

The refusal of a major leftist party to join a new Greek government has brought the prospect of its exit from the euro a step closer. The region's finance ministers, gathering in Brussels, also

face a worsening fiscal position in Spain.

Adding to the negative tone for the higher risk sector, German Chancellor Angela Merkel's conservatives suffered a crushing defeat on Sunday in an election in Germany's most populous state.

"Selling rallies in risk assets seems the best way to make money in most asset classes given the event risk is still very real this week," said Chris Weston, an institutional dealer at IG Markets.

Safe haven German bonds and the US dollar gained from the drive for safety with the June German Bund future setting a record high of 143.17, up 40 ticks, in early trade.

The dollar rose 0.2 percent against a basket of major currencies to 80.45.DXY, helping send the euro to its lowest in nearly four months at \$1.2878.

China's cut in the amount of cash banks must hold as reserves only served to fuel fears the European crisis was

hurting global growth, leaving the MSCI's broad world equity index. MIWD00000 PUS down 0.2 percent after it fell two percent last week. The key FTSE Eurofirst .FTEU3

index of top European shares opened down 1.1 percent at 1,011.48.

Oil and copper also eased on concerns over the demand outlook.—Reuters

Health Tip: Having an allergy to medication

If you're allergic to a medication, you can take steps to reduce your risk of a reaction, which could be life-threatening.

The University of Michigan Health System offers these suggestions:

- * Make sure you write down the names of any medications to which you are allergic.
- * Talk to your doctor or pharmacist about any newly prescribed medication to be sure it is not similar to another drug to which you are allergic.
- * Never share your medication with someone else or take someone else's medication yourself.

Yamaha India to build new \$280 mln two-wheeler plant

NEW DELHI, 14 May—Yamaha Motor Co will spend 15 billion rupees over the next five years on a new two-wheeler factory in India, the Japanese automaker's Indian unit said, as the company ramps up capacity in the world's second-largest motorcycle market.

The new factory, to be built outside Chennai, will begin production in January 2014 with capacity of 400,000 vehicles, rising to 1.8 million vehicles by 2018, India Yamaha Motor said in a statement on Monday.

Yamaha currently has two plants in India and a total capacity of 1 million two wheelers.

Asthma triggered by more than pollen

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, 14 May—People with asthma have to watch out for more than pollen—fruit, campfires, weather changes or insect bites can all trigger attacks, US allergists warn.

Dr James Sublett, chairman of the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology Public Relations Committee, said by planning ahead, seeing an allergist and knowing the causes of allergy and asthma, even those with the most sensitive noses and lungs can enjoy summer fun.

"Although symptoms may not always be severe, summertime allergies and asthma are serious and, in some cases, deadly," Sublett said in a statement.

Sublett said some surprising asthma triggers include:

— An otherwise healthy snack can mean an oral allergy syndrome for people whose

lips begin to tingle after sinking their teeth into a peach, melon, apple, celery, and other fresh fruits and vegetables.

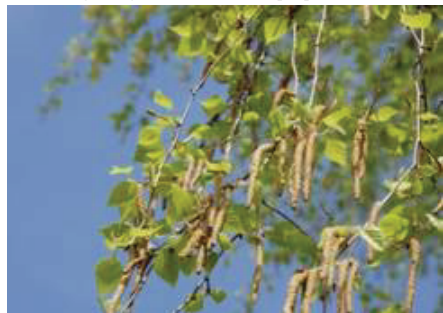
— Sudden changes in the weather can trigger an asthma attack.

— Smoke is a common asthma trigger. Sit upwind of the smoke and avoid getting too close.

— Stinging insects. It is possible to develop a life-threatening allergic reaction

to the sting of yellow jackets, honey bees, wasps, hornets and fire ants. Cover up when outdoors, avoid brightly colored clothing, forget perfume and take caution when eating or drinking anything sweet.

— Although not an allergen, the smell of chlorine from pools or hot tubs can be an irritant and cause flare-ups of either allergy-like eye and nose symptoms or asthma in some people.—Internet

Measles kills 12 children in Pakistan tribal area

MIRANSHAH, 14 May—An outbreak of measles in part of Pakistan's lawless tribal northwest has killed 12 children in three weeks and is spreading due to a shortage of medicines, according to doctors.

Doctor Mohammad Ali Shah, chief of the main hospital in Miranshah, the biggest town in North Waziristan, told AFP that military operations, power cuts and curfews meant there was a shortage of medicines. The restive and

impoverished district bordering Afghanistan is Pakistan's most notorious Taliban and al-Qaeda stronghold, and hit frequently by US drone strikes targeting Islamist militants.

"For the past three weeks we are daily receiving five to 10 children suffering from measles," Shah said, adding that he would normally see only one or two deaths from the disease in a year.

"We do not have proper storage for measles vaccination because of long power outages and curfews and

most of our stock expires due to these reasons."

He urged the government to send mobile vaccination teams to the area and warned of a possible typhoid outbreak if action was not taken promptly.

"Inoculation teams have not visited the area for a long time and that is the reason for the spread of such diseases," he said.

Measles is highly contagious and spread by a virus that is easily prevented by proper immunisation but can be fatal.

It caused nearly 140,000 deaths worldwide in 2010, according to the World Health Organization — 95 percent in low income countries with poor health infrastructure.

Another doctor, Mohammad Sadiq, said 12 children and a man had died from measles, and that there were up to 70 confirmed cases in hospital.

Local government officials were not available to comment.

Broad-based sell-off drags Britain's FTSE lower

LONDON, 14 May—A broad-based sell-off headed by heavyweight banks and commodity stocks dragged Britain's top share index lower on Monday, as twin fears over the euro zone crisis and the global growth outlook killed any recent underlying enthusiasm.

Talks to form a new government in Greece looked to have failed, deepening the euro zone crisis, and China cut its bank reserve requirement ratio for a third time in six months in further efforts to boost its slowing economy, underlining global growth concerns.

At 03:13 am EDT (0713 GMT), the FTSE 100 FTSE index was down 70.92 points, or 1.3 percent at 5,504.60, just clinging on to the psychologically important 5,500 level, having rallied 0.6 percent higher on Friday.—Reuters

Babies benefit from music lessons

HAMILTON, 14 May—One-year-old babies exposed to music lessons demonstrated better communication and more sophisticated brain responses to music, Canadian researchers say.

Laurel Trainor, director of the McMaster University's Institute for Music and the Mind in Ontario, and David Gerry, a music educator and graduate student, said the study involved groups of babies and their parents who spent six months participat-

ing in one of two types of weekly music instruction.

All the babies had shown similar communication and social development and none had previously participated in other baby music classes.

One music class involved interactive music-making and learning a small set of lullabies, nursery rhymes and songs with actions. Parents and infants worked together to learn to play percussion instruments, take turns and sing specific songs. In the other music class,

infants and parents played at various toy stations while recordings from the popular Baby Einstein series played in the background. "Babies who participated in the interactive music classes with their parents showed earlier sensitivity to the pitch structure in music," Trainor said in a statement.

"Specifically, they preferred to listen to a version of a piano piece that stayed in key, versus a version that included out-of-key notes, while the passive listening infants did not show the same preferences."

Iraq bomb attacks against security kill five

BAGHDAD, 14 May—A series of bomb attacks mostly targeting security forces, including a suicide car bombing, killed five people across Iraq and wounded several more on Sunday, security and medical officials said.

Two people, including an Iraqi army first lieutenant, were killed when a suicide car bomber attacked an Iraqi army checkpoint in Fallujah, west of Baghdad in Sunni Anbar Province, a police captain who spoke on condition of

anonymity said.

He said six others, including four soldiers, were also wounded in the attack. Omar Dalli from Fallujah general hospital confirmed receiving two bodies and treating six people.

In Ramadi, the provincial capital of Anbar, a parked car bomb that detonated as a police patrol was passing wounded at least six people, including four policemen, a police major and a medic said.

Two people were also killed when a magnetic "sticky

bomb" attached to their car detonated in Iskandariyah, south of Baghdad, police said. A medical official in Mussayib general hospital, the nearest medical facility, confirmed the toll.

In another attack, a bomb blast outside a soldier's house in the town of Himreen, in Diyala Province, killed the soldier's mother and left his sister wounded.

The casualties were confirmed by doctor Ahmed Ibrahim from the main hospital in Diyala's provincial capital

likely only receive an invitation if it ends its nearly six-month blockade of NATO supplies.

A team of US negotiators has been in the country for several weeks working out the nuts and bolts of a potential agreement to reopen the supply line, said a US official, speaking on condition of anonymity because of the sensitivity of the issue. The Americans met with their Pakistani counterparts all day on Sunday and were scheduled to resume discussions on Monday, the official said.

Pakistan closed its Afghan border crossings to the US-led coalition at the end of November, in retaliation for American

airstrikes that killed 24 Pakistani soldiers at two small outposts in the northwest. The US expressed its condolences, but that wasn't enough for Pakistan.

Pakistan's government then threw the issue to parliament, which used the opportunity to try to renegotiate the country's relationship with the US, a popular move in a country where anti-American sentiment is rampant despite billions of dollars in annual US aid. Passing the gauntlet to parliament was likely meant to provide the government political cover, but the lawmakers' stark demands have made it more difficult for Pakistani officials to maneuver.—INTERNET

Bomb kills nine at market in northern Afghanistan

KABUL, 14 May—Authorities say a bomb has exploded at a market in northern Afghanistan, killing nine people, including a local official.

The Ministry of Interior says the bomb went off on Monday morning inside a shop in a market in Faryab Province's Ghormuch District. The ministry's statement says the nine dead included a council member from a neighbouring province. The ministry says it has no other details.

In a separate statement Monday, the ministry said police killed 18 militants in operations across the country over the past 24 hours.—INTERNET

Nepal plane crash kills 15

KATHMANDU, 14 May—Fifteen passengers died on Monday when a plane carrying Indian pilgrims crashed near a treacherous high-altitude airport in northern Nepal, while six made a miraculous escape, police said.

The Agni Air plane plunged into a hill close to Jomsom near the Annapurna mountain range, police spokesman Binod Singh told AFP. "The plane was about to land at Jomsom airport. It hit a muddy slope and the plane is now buried in the side of the hill," he said.

"Fifteen people have been killed. Thirteen of them were Indian tourists and the other two were Nepali pilots.

"There are six survivors, among them one Nepali air hostess," he added.

The passengers had chartered the flight to take them from the central tourist hub of Pokhara to Muktinath, a sacred place for Hindus and Buddhists at the foot of the Thorong La Himalayan mountain pass, said Rajendra Singh Bhandari, Nepal police regional spokesman.

"A Nepal army barracks

was near the accident site which made the rescue of survivors easier," he added.

Agni Air marketing manager Pramod Pandey said two Danish nationals were among the passengers, although their condition was not known.

The crash was the second deadly air accident for Agni Air in less than two years. In August 2010 one of the private carrier's Everest-bound planes crashed in bad weather near Kathmandu, killing all 14 people on board, including four Americans, a Japanese and a British national.

Qaeda suspects blow up Yemen gas pipeline

SANAA, 14 May—Suspected al-Qaeda militants blew up a gas pipeline supplying Yemen's Balhaf export terminal in the Gulf of Aden, the second such attack in a month, a government official said on Monday.

"A gas pipeline was blown up near Mayfaa" in Shabwa Province in southeast Yemen late on Sunday, the official said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

"Al-Qaeda blew up the pipeline in response to the raids that targeted it" over the past week, the official said.

Witnesses told AFP that flames were seen flaring into the sky from the site of the explosion that took place around midnight, some 30 minutes after soldiers guarding the pipeline clashed with a group of gunmen.

The amount of damage to the pipeline was not immediately clear and it was not known to what extent supplies of gas, from a field in Marib Province, were affected.

On Saturday, Yemeni forces launched a multi-pronged assault aimed at recapturing the southern city

of Zinjibar, held by the jihadists for a year.

Earlier last week, air strikes by US drones in eastern Yemen killed jihadist network leader Fahd al-Quso, wanted by Washington in connection with the 2000 bombing of the USS Cole in Aden harbour.

Quso's name figured on an FBI list of most wanted terrorists, along with a reward of up to \$5 million for

information leading to his arrest. Further air strikes were launched by US drones against al-Qaeda targets on Saturday, in which according to a tribal chief and witnesses 12 militants were killed.

The 320-kilometre (200-mile) pipeline linking Marib Province to Balhaf, in Yemen's mostly lawless south, has been repeatedly sabotaged by al-Qaeda.

Leftist Mexican presidential candidate rises in poll

MEXICO CITY, 14 May—Leftist Mexican presidential candidate Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador has moved up into a second-place tie in the latest voter survey by pollster BGC, but front-runner Enrique Pena Nieto maintains a large lead.

With seven weeks to go until the 1 July election,

Lopez Obrador, the 2006 runner-up, rose 3 percentage points to 26 percent, according to the poll for Monday's edition of newspaper *Excelsior*, which BGC published on its website on Sunday.

The first survey by BGC since last Sunday's televised debate between the

presidential contenders showed Josefina Vazquez Mota, of President Felipe Calderon's National Action Party (PAN), slipping 2 points to 26 percent.

Both remained far behind hot favourite Pena Nieto, candidate of the opposition Institutional Revolutionary Party or PRI, who dipped 2 points to 45 percent, BGC said.

Pena Nieto's debating skills had been seen as a potential liability ahead of the debate, but analysts said he held his own.

Initial opinion polls after the showdown suggested Lopez Obrador had performed better than Vazquez Mota in the exchanges.

BGC interviewed 1,200 eligible voters between 7 and 9 May for the survey. The margin of error was 2.9 percentage points, it said.

Spain faces corrosion not collapse from euro crisis

BARCELONA, (Spain), 14 May—Students are protesting on Barcelona's elegant boulevards, public-sector wages are being cut for the second time in three years and resentment is growing against the central government and beneficiaries of bank bailouts.

Such is the daily fallout from the euro zone's debt crisis. Like the rest of Spain, Barcelona is looking at several years of hard graft as the country adjusts to living within its means after the collapse of a debt-financed housing bubble that has brought much of the banking sector to its knees.

Yet unless the most pessimistic projections of the cost of rescuing the banks prove right, the signs are that Spain faces corrosion not collapse.

Greecrisks suddenly not being able to pay for vital imports if it cannot form a new government that sticks to the terms of an international bailout. But Spain is more representative of the generally insidious, demoralizing nature of the crisis: austerity is sapping trust in politicians across the euro zone and fraying the social fabric as the bills for years of economic mismanagement are shared out.

"The problem is social. What are we going to do when we have 25 percent unemployment? It's dramatic," said Joan Ramon Rovira, head of economic studies at the Barcelona chamber of commerce.

Even though every fourth Spaniard is unemployed, job protection is being eroded. In Barcelona, capital of the northeastern region of Catalonia, hospital wards are being closed, class sizes are growing and university fees are rising.

The result is a hardening of attitudes as various groups campaign to preserve their entitlements. The crisis has also ratcheted up political tensions with Madrid as supporters of Catalan independence increasingly begudge helping to bankroll the central government, which they feel treats them with disdain.

"Spain is a backpack that is too heavy for us to keep carrying. It's costing us our development," said the spokesman for Catalan President Artur Mas, Joan Maria Pique.—Reuters

UK's Royal Mail eyes London property cash boost

LONDON, 14 May—Britain's Royal Mail said plans to turn over half of its main London sorting office—Mount Pleasant—into a prime residential hub will be submitted next spring, as the group tries to boost its value ahead of a 2014 privatization.

The 12-acre former prison site in north London is undergoing a 32 million pound (\$51.72 million) facelift to increase production, move operations and parking into the building from elsewhere and free up as much as 6.5 acres of land for housing.

Royal Mail, working with architects Farrells, said local councils Islington and Camden had backed the planned 1 million square foot development, which would see as much as 85 percent of the project turned into housing next to its sorting office.

"We have a strong track record in using the proceeds from disposal of surplus property to invest in the mail operation ... This is vital in

Four pupils dead after Hunan wall collapse

CHANGSHA, 14 May—Four pupils have been confirmed dead after a section of a middle school's wall collapsed on them in central China's Hunan Province on Monday due to persistent heavy rain.

Six students from Miaowan Primary school in Hengyang county in the city of Hengyang were buried by the collapsed wall of Huihui Middle School at about 7:30 am, when they were en route to school, the city's publicity department said.

Two of the pupils were killed on the spot, one died on the way to hospital and another died in hospital. The remaining two students are still being treated in hospital. Further investigation into the cause of the accident is under way.

Torrential rain battered Hunan over the weekend, leaving 1.09 million people affected, 80,400 hectares of cropland damaged and 1,568 houses toppled with direct economic losses of 840 million yuan (133 million US dollars).—Xinhua

75 percent of Olympics tickets bought by Brits

LONDON, 14 May—Seb Coe, the chairman of London Olympic Games organizing committee, said that 75 percent of available tickets for the Olympics have gone to British fans.

Coe told the BBC that as a sports fan himself, he "accepts" that some people have been left "disappointed" after their applications for tickets to this summer's Olympic Games, but that 75 percent of available tickets have gone to British fans.

He said there has "never been a ticket in the history of sports tickets" that has provoked "such an extraordinary demand".

The chairman also said he felt the committee was fulfilling their main aims—to have full venues, affordable tickets and to hit revenue targets.—Xinhua

Hollande's DS ride foreshadows auto industry test

PARIS, 14 May—Francois Hollande will arrive at his first appearance as French President in one of Citroen's flagship cars, handing the struggling company some welcome television exposure. Hollande has picked out a hybrid from PSA Peugeot Citroen's upscale DS line for the ride to his inauguration on Tuesday - a seemingly auspicious start to relations between France's biggest automaker and its new Socialist head of state.

Few doubt they are bound to degenerate fast. Restructuring by Peugeot will test Hollande's determination to avoid factory closures and layoffs, and the company's smaller domestic rival Renault may follow suit. "The honeymoon will be very short if there is one at all," said economist Denis Ferrand, managing director of Paris think tank COE-Rexecode.

"The decline in France's industrial competitiveness is the fundamental issue facing Hollande, and it's particularly impressive in the auto sector." The week before his 6 May victory over centre-right incumbent Nicolas

Sarkozy, Hollande said companies that had postponed job cuts until after the election should think again. "We're not going to let our arrival be the trigger for redundancies," he told French daily *Le Parisien*. "We won't accept them without reacting."

In a document leaked last June, Peugeot executives had outlined plans to close the Aulnay plant near Paris - and warned that an announcement would be impossible before the election due to political sensitivities.

Chief Executive Philippe Varin later acknowledged that Aulnay's future was in doubt beyond 2014, while insisting no decision had been made. "There's a European problem with overcapacity," Peugeot spokesman Jonathan Goodman said, declining to comment on individual sites. "We and other manufacturers have to look at the various options." As soon as one major European automaker announces closures, others including Renault are likely to be forced to follow, the car maker's chief Carlos Ghosn said in March.—Reuters

Indonesia airline boom raises new safety questions

JAKARTA, 14 May—Dozens of fledgling airlines that have sprung up to serve Indonesia's island-hopping new middle class could jeopardize the archipelago's recently improved safety reputation, aviation experts say.

The trend threatens to erode higher standards established during what one analyst called a "tremendous amount of soul searching" by major carriers and the government after 2007, when frequent crashes prompted the European Union to ban all Indonesian airlines from landing on its runways for two years.

With growth rates of nearly 20 percent per year, Indonesia is one of Asia's most rapidly expanding airline markets, but

the country is struggling to provide qualified pilots, mechanics, air traffic controllers and updated airport technology to ensure safety. And with so many new, small carriers, it's hard to monitor all their standards.

"We are not ready for this boom," said Ruth Sima-tupang, an Indonesian aviation consultant and former safety investigator. —Internet

Four killed, one injured in Kansas plane crash

Lincoln's sword replaced with replica

A Chicago sculptor created a replacement for a copper sword that was stolen and broken from Abraham Lincoln's tomb, officials said. The 3-foot sword was stolen from Lincoln's tomb last fall by a teenager, the *Chicago Tribune* reported. However, when police caught up to the thief, the sword was broken in two. Marshall Svendsen, director of an art production house, volunteered to create

a new sword from the pieces. The entire process for Svendsen and colleague Loc Hong about 40 hours. Svendsen and Hong installed the finished product Friday. "The whole experience was a real pleasure," Svendsen, 32, said Saturday. "I feel I've been compensated in how much attention the project has received and to be part of such an important historical monument."

The windshield of Michelle Higgins' car was smashed and the roof was ripped open by the collision, which occurred while she was on her way to work in Gander Monday, the Canadian Broadcasting Corp reported. "I can remember pulling into the

driveway and my co-workers came out and asked me if I was OK and I said 'Why?' and they said 'Well Michelle you're bleeding and look at your car. I looked at my car and I was devastated,' Michelle Higgins told the CBC Friday. "The roof was like a sardine can. I thought, 'this is impossible.'"

"I know my head did take a good impact and my forehead has a scuff mark that we are thinking may have been caused by the moose's hoof."

She said Sunday not only doesn't she remember the episode, she's surprised no one reported seeing her severely damaged car as she toolled along the Trans-Canada highway.

She wonders if she was driving "like some sort of lunatic." The Norris Arm, central Newfoundland, resident was badly bruised and fractured two neck bones. The moose died.

British rugby player to swim Atlantic

British rugby player Dan Martin says he put on 56 pounds in preparation for reaching his goal of being the first person to swim across the Atlantic Ocean. Martin, 30, has been training for more than three years to swim 3,500 miles from New York to Brest in France, *The Daily Telegraph* reported.

he reaches France, he plans to bike across Europe and through Siberia. Finally, he will run across North America and Canada, back to New York. Martin said he put on the extra weight while training to help defend himself against the Atlantic's cold temperatures. He said he has been eating four meals a day with 3,500-calorie energy drinks. While in the water, Martin will be accompanied by the Ice Maiden, a 50-foot research yacht, with a five-

person team to supply him with fluids and snacks. He will swim for about 8 hours a day and sleep aboard the yacht. The only other person to successfully swim across the Atlantic was Benoit Lecomte, a Frenchman, in 1998, which he accomplished in 73 days. However, Lecomte slept on a drifting boat each night, which helped him cover more distance. Martin said he plans to use a GPS device each morning to return to where he finished the previous night.

Bronze Age boat replica sinks

A replica of a Bronze Age boat created by British craftsmen and archaeologists failed to float when it was launched, officials said. Crowds gathered in Dover Saturday to watch the launching of the replica boat, Kent Online reported. The team that built the boat worked on it for several months using the same tools and methods employed during the Bronze Age 3,500 years ago. However, before a team of rowers boarded the vessel,

it began to sink. The boat started listing minutes after it was lowered into the Dover Marina and had to be hoisted back out. Archaeologist Peter Clark, who has led the project, said the team will continue its efforts to come up with a usable boat. "We are hopeful that we can think again and make the boat good," he said. "We have come an awfully long way in the past three and a half months and we think we are nearly there."

Federer, Serena hammer out French Open threat

MADRID, 14 May—Roger Federer and Serena Williams took home trophies on Sunday from the Madrid Masters, with the pair of veteran champions hoping to channel their clay success into more glory at Roland Garros.

With the French Open starting in a fortnight, both

the Swiss, who put his best tennis on display to beat Tomas Berdych 3-6, 7-5, 7-5, and Williams, who crushed world number one Victoria Azarenka of Belarus 6-1, 6-3, are confident of their form.

"There are exciting times ahead for me," said Federer, who will fly to Italy on Monday but will decide only before his opening match on Wednesday whether his body feels fit enough to compete at the Rome Masters.

"I'm winning so many events and playing so well. I believe that I can win the slams."

"I know the difficulty of the French, the focus will be on Novak (Djokovic) who is going for four slams in a row and on Rafa (Nadal) because he's the defending champion."

"It's an exciting event and I'm playing well, let's see how it plays out."

Williams, who won Roland Garros a decade ago, is also feeling good about her game and has a misconception to correct. "I love the clay, I have won the

French Open," said the 30-year-old.

"It's a myth about me not liking the clay - I like it more than grass. Hopefully I can start doing better.

"Roland Garros conditions are much different from here. Conditions are different every week on clay. Definitely my goal is to do well in Paris."

Federer, with 16 Grand Slam titles, will now stand behind Djokovic on Monday on the ATP list after sending Nadal back to third on the rankings with his winning performance on the controversial blue clay laid down at the Caja Magica.

Playing in his first event after six weeks off, the Swiss star surprised even himself.

"It's surprising to come back and win a title right away," said Federer.

"I was worried about getting through the first round, I was very realistic coming in. I guess I forgot that I had such a great record (now three titles) in Madrid, I was able to draw from that.

Japan pins judo hopes on young blood

TOKYO, 14 May—Japanese judo has been in a state of decline in recent years but the country is pinning its hopes on an infusion of new blood at the London Olympics. Japan tops the Olympic medal table for judo since the martial art was introduced at the 1964 Games with 35 golds, compared to 10 for France in second place.

Japanese competitors won eight out of 14 judo gold medals at the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens but four years later that figure fell to four in Beijing.

Tomoko Fukumi, who won the women's 48 kilogramme class at the final qualifier at the weekend, said on Monday that making the cut had triggered an instant bout of Olympic nerves.

"It has a sobering effect, more than feeling elated," the 26-year-old told a news conference in Fukuoka, southern Japan, after bagging

her first title in two years.

"The London Olympics are just around the corner so I can't afford to waste a single day," added Fukumi, one of seven women judoka headed for the Games in July and August. "Everything was on the line and I was so charged up for it." Twelve of the 14 judoka who qualified to represent Japan will be making their Olympic debut following a spate of upset results during the course of the two-day meet. Two-times world champion Haruna Asami left the arena in tears after a shock first-round loss. "I was over-confident," sobbed Asami. "My world title is meaningless."

World champion Misato Nakamura, who beat world number one Yuka Nishida to win the 52kg title, was in a buoyant mood and vowed to improve on her bronze medal at the 2008 Beijing Games.

Kuchar holds steady to clinch Players title

PONTE VEDRA BEACH, 14 May—American Matt Kuchar won the Players Championship on Sunday by two shots to secure the biggest win of his career and a \$1.71 million pay check.

To the delight of his watching family, Kuchar shot a final round two-under 70 to finish 13-under for the tournament, two clear of Briton Martin Laird (67) and Americans Zach Johnson (68), Rickie Fowler (70) and Ben Curtis (68).

Overnight leader Kevin Nahada a disappointing finish, making six bogeys in a 76 that saw him slip back into a

tie for seventh, a day after being heckled by spectators for his slow play and constant practice shots.

Tiger Woods ended well down the field at joint 40th after shooting a 73 to finish one-under.

England's Luke Donald finished strongly with a 66 that elevated him to sixth, four strokes behind Kuchar, but not enough for him to regain top place in the world rankings from Northern Irishman Rory McIlroy, who missed the cut.

Kuchar, who tied for third at the Masters, consistently avoided trouble on the final

day on a course that severely punishes inaccuracy.

While his challengers stumbled at various hurdles, the American kept out of water and greenside sand throughout a confident 18 holes.

"You think of this as one of the strongest fields in golf and to come out as champion is an amazing feeling," the 33-year-old told reporters.

Kuchar, who found 10 of 14 fairways and struck 15 greens in regulation, wrapped up the tournament when he coolly sunk a 15-foot birdie putt on the 16th to surge three strokes clear.—*Reuters*

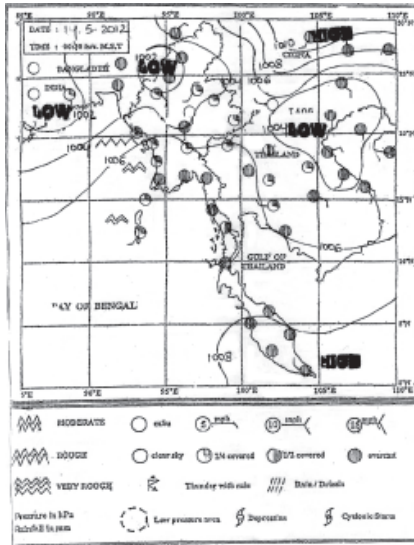
