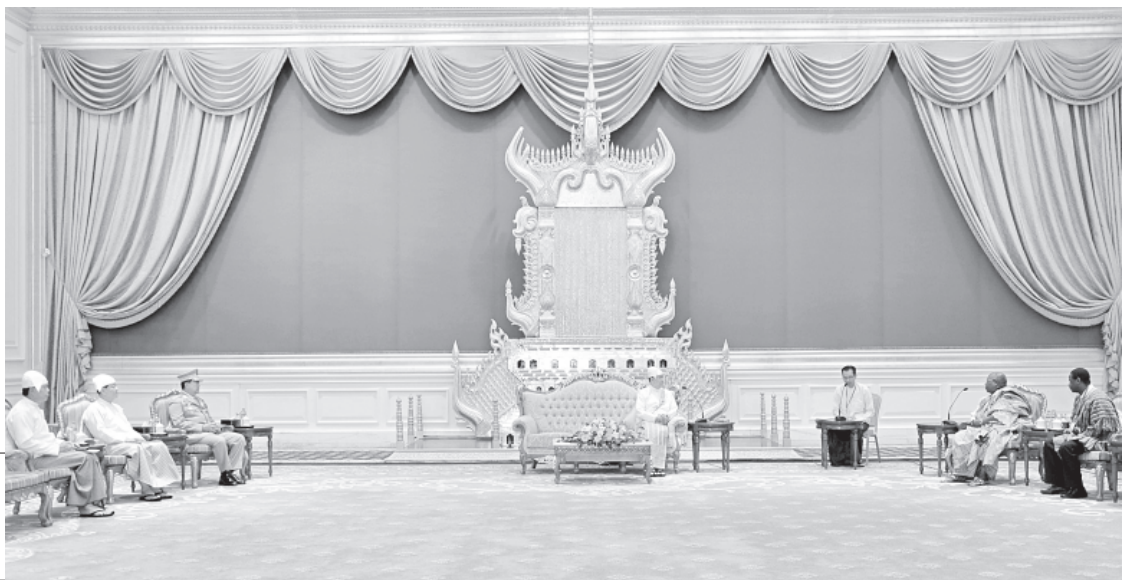

Self-reliant concrete steel trust bridge in Mohnyin to open soon

MOHNYIN, 23 May—The wooden bridges crossing over Nanyin Creek that runs in the centre of Mohnyin in Kachin has frequently lost on account of river flooding. With the assistance of Kachin State government, the local people have constructed the concrete steel trust bridge in November, 2011 by themselves. Now the bridge is finished with the length of 150 feet, 14 feet wide and it can withstand 13 tons of loads. It costs K130 million and the Kachin State Chief Minister will attend the opening ceremony of the bridge, said Bridge Construction Committee Chairman U Thein Maung to The New Light of Myanmar Mohnyin correspondent.—NLM(001)

Around 100 participants comprising officials from the Myanmar education and research institutions and ICT experts attended the workshop.

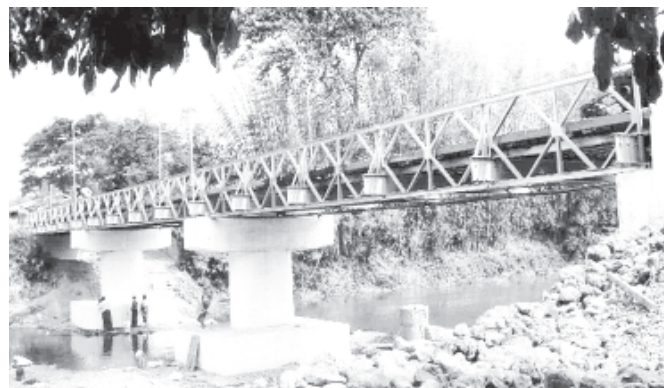

Afghans back Chicago deal, warn West to keep promises

KABUL, 23 May—People in Afghanistan were surprisingly optimistic on Tuesday about NATO’s plan to pull combat troops out of their war-ravaged nation by the end of 2014, but warned Western leaders to stick to aid and security promises.

A Chicago summit meeting of the 28-member bloc, attended also by Afghan President Hamid Karzai and other world leaders, endorsed an exit strategy on Monday that calls for handing control of Afghanistan to its own security forces by the middle of next year.

But it left unanswered questions about how to prevent a slide into chaos and a Taliban resurgence after the pullout. Despite the sense of combat fatigue in Chicago and frustration that nearly 11 years of military engagement had failed to defeat Taliban Islamists, Afghans were

surprisingly upbeat. They said the agreement showed Western nations would not abandon their nation after a decade-long war and a massive aid and reconstruction effort.

“I don’t think foreign nations will leave us as easily as they say. The international community has spent billions of dollars here now,” said university student Tawab, speaking to Reuters at a park near a mosque in central Kabul.

“The conference has decided that some foreign forces will stay in Afghanistan, so it’s like back-up support.”

Housing prices in Kabul have jumped 15 percent since US President Barack Obama, who declared on Monday that the 10-year war was “effectively over”, visited Kabul to sign a long-term security deal with Karzai on 2 May.

UN chief called for greater access to medicines for women, children

UNITED NATIONS, 23 May— UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon on Tuesday praised the work of a United Nations commission on improving access to life-saving medicines for women and children, while stressing that much remains to be done.

“Last week, the UN issued an important report indicating that, over the past 20 years, the number of women who die from complications during pregnancy has decreased by nearly half,” Ban said in remarks at the opening of the UN Commission on Life-Saving Commodities for Women and Children. “This is cause for celebration — it is a tribute to the hard work of so many people and

partners.” Thereport, “Trends in Maternal Mortality: 1990 to 2010,” reflects that the annual number of women dying from birth related complications dropped from more than 543,000 to 287,000, a 47 percent decline.

However, the UN chief pointed out that every day, 800 women, and more than 20,000 children die from preventable causes; every two minutes, a woman dies at what should have been a joyful moment. “And millions of women are unable to choose if, when and how many children they would like to have because they lack access to modern contraception — this tells me we are still not doing enough,” he added.

Azerbaijan not to join any military coalition including NATO

BAKU, 23 May—Azerbaijan is not going to join any military coalition for the time being, spokesman for the country’s Foreign Ministry Elman Abdullayev told local media here on Tuesday.

According to Abdullayev, Azerbaijan has joined the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) and will not join any military block.

“Currently Azerbaijan is loyal to its independent policy and it is not going to join any military block, including NATO. At the same time Azerbaijan pursues the course of integration into the Euro-Atlantic Institutions. Membership and integration are rather different things,” he explained.

Last year, commenting on Azerbaijan’s integration into NAM, the country’s Foreign Ministry spokesman Elxan Poluxov said that the decision to join NAM does not contradict Baku’s European integration ambitions, which have always been limited in scope.

Addressing the meeting of heads of state and government on Afghanistan on Monday in Chicago, Azeri President Ilham Aliyev said “Azerbaijan will continue its peacekeeping mission in Afghanistan until the end of 2014 and beyond, if it’s necessary.” “Since the early years Azerbaijan has made every effort to ensure peace and security in Afghanistan,” said the Azeri leader.—Xinhua

Romney wins Kentucky primary, leads in Arkansas

LITTLE ROCK, 23 May— Republican presidential hopeful Mitt Romney won his party’s primary in Kentucky on Tuesday and took a commanding lead in Arkansas, as he got closer to clinching the GOP nomination, official tallies showed. The largely ceremonial victory by Romney came as the Democratic primaries saw President Barack Obama lose some voters to a mostly unknown candidate in Arkansas and the ballot option “uncommitted” in Kentucky, in an apparent sign of voter dissatisfaction with Obama in those conservative Southern states.

Romney had 69 percent of the vote with 40 of 75 Arkansas counties reporting. He was trailed by Texas congressman Ron Paul and former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum, each with 13

percent, returns from the Secretary of State’s Office showed. In Kentucky, Romney polled 67 percent with all but one of 120 counties reporting. Paul had 13 percent and Santorum 9 percent of the vote, results from the Kentucky State Board of Elections showed.

Paul has stopped actively campaigning. Santorum has suspended his campaign and endorsed Romney. Romney has all but secured the Republican presidential nomination, winning 989 delegates, not including the Arkansas and Kentucky primaries, according to Real Clear Politics. His next closest rival Santorum had 259. A candidate needs 1,144 delegates to win the nomination. There are 45 delegates at stake in Kentucky and 36 in Arkansas, but neither is a winner-take-all state.—Reuters

US Air jet diverts after passenger claims to have “device”

WASHINGTON, 23 May— A passenger who claimed to have a surgically implanted device prompted a US Airways jetliner to divert to Maine on Tuesday in a security scare that followed a recently foiled bomb plot targeting US-bound aircraft, government officials said.

Flight 787, from Paris to Charlotte, North Carolina, with 188 people aboard, landed safely around noon EDT in Bangor trailed by two F-15 fighter escorts that scrambled to intercept the Boeing 767 as it approached the coast, authorities said.

terminal, according to a recording of air traffic control communication with the plane. The woman passenger, described as a

French citizen born in Cameroon, was removed from the aircraft and was questioned by Customs and Border Protection and taken into custody by the FBI, officials said.—Reuters

Small bomb found in Argentina ahead of Uribe visit

BUENOS AIRES, 23 May—Argentine police on Tuesday defused an explosive device hidden in a theater where former Colombian President Alvaro Uribe was scheduled to speak, raising suspicions that left-wing Colombian rebels may have been involved.

Uribe, who cracked down on drug-running guerrillas during his two terms as president, was due to appear at a leadership conference on Wednesday at the Gran Rex theater in downtown Buenos Aires. The bomb would have been detonated at about 4 pm local time on Wednesday, in the area of the theater where Uribe was to attend a reception following his speech.

“It was a simple device but strong enough to cause the death of people nearby,” federal judge Norberto Oyarbide, who is in charge of the investigation, told reporters on Tuesday after the device was found by theater maintenance employees.

He said the conference will go on as scheduled.

The theater was evacuated and surrounded by police while the bomb was deactivated and the building searched.—Reuters

Apple's iPhone powers digital guitar

SAN FRANCISCO, 23 May—A California company says its iPhone-powered digital guitar will make it easy for anybody to play music, regardless of experience.

Users can dock their iPhone to the gTar, made by Incident Technologies, open a song in the gTar phone app, and the appropriate frets on the guitar light up to guide your fingers in playing the song, CNET.com reported on Monday.

Incident Technologies call the gTar "the first guitar that anybody can play."

The guitar offers different modes, including a beginner's setup that requires the user to only pluck the right string to have the right note play without have to press down on the string at the correct fret location, to a medium setting where the user learns to do so.

Both modes utilize a feature called SmartPlay, which automatically mutes incorrect notes the user plays.

Hard mode turns off SmartPlay and only illuminates the frets associated with playing a song, while free play lets the



user play the gTar as a conventional guitar.

"The great thing about the gTar is that it lets people have a hands-on immersive experience in music, even if they've never picked up anything like this before, or never even thought about playing music," Incident Technologies founder Idan Beck said.

Dino fossil sold in controversial auction

NEW YORK, 23 May—A tyrannosaur skeleton has sold for \$1 million despite efforts to halt its auction by Mongolia, which alleges it may have been taken illegally from the country.

Heritage Auctions of Dallas sold the Tyrannosaurus bataar specimen in an auction in New York on Sunday to an anonymous bidder on the condition that the sale receive court approval, Fox News reported.

A temporary restraining order sought to prevent the sale of the skeleton, with court documents contending the specimen originated in Mongolia and that the export of fossils from that country is illegal under the country's law.

During the auction, a handful of Mongolians protested outside the venue.

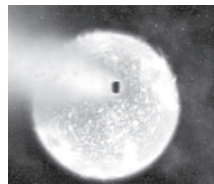
"We want this dinosaur to go back to Mongolia where it belongs, that is the sole purpose of this," said Bolorsetseg Minjin, a



Mongolian paleontologist and director of the Institute for the Study of Mongolian Dinosaurs, who was among those protesting.

Heritage Auctions said specimen entered the United States legally, and that "the consignors warranted in writing to Heritage that they hold clear title to the fossils."

Heritage Auctions has not identified the seller or the buyer.—Internet

CAMBRIDGE, 23 May—US scientists say a possible planet 1,500 light-years from Earth is apparently evaporating from the heat of its star, trailing debris like a comet's tail.

The tiny exoplanet, not

Distant planet may be vanishing into dust

much larger than Mercury, may completely disintegrate within 100 million years, a blink of an eye in cosmic terms, researchers at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and NASA said.

The researchers found the dusty planet circles its parent star every 15 hours — one of the shortest planet orbits ever observed — and said such a short orbit must be very close to the star, suggesting the planet could be heated to a temperature of about 3,600 degrees Fahrenheit. Rocky material at the surface of the planet could

melt and evaporate at such high temperatures, giving off both gas and dust into space to form the cloud trailing the planet.

"We think this dust is made up of submicron-sized particles," physics Professor Saul Rappaport said on Friday in an MIT release.

"It would be like looking through a Los Angeles smog." Astronomers using the Kepler satellite typically identify exoplanets by looking for regular dips in a star's brightness as a planet crosses in front of it, but in the case of the star dubbed KIC

12557548, they found its light dropped by different intensities every 15 hours.

That suggested something was blocking the star regularly but by varying degrees, they said, and theorized the varying intensities of light were caused by a somewhat amorphous, shape-shifting body. "I'm not sure how we came to this epiphany," Rappaport said. "But it had to be something that was fundamentally changing. It was not a solid body, but rather, dust coming off the planet."—Internet

Astronomers find galactic 'supercluster'

MONTREAL, 23 May—Astronomers using a European space observatory say they've discovered a giant, galaxy-packed cosmic filament ablaze with billions of new stars.

The filament imaged by the European Space Agency's Herschel Space Observatory connects two clusters of galaxies that, along with a third, will eventually come together as one of the largest galaxy superclusters in the universe, the astronomers said.

The glowing galactic

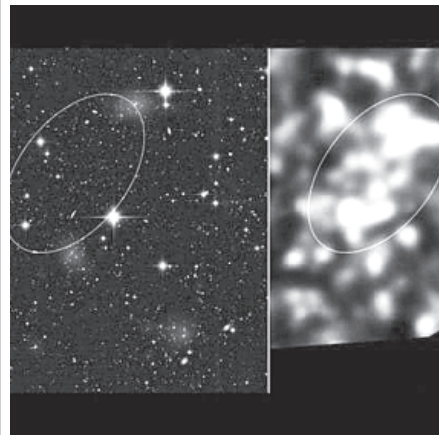
filament offers a unique opportunity to explore how galaxies evolve and merge to form superclusters, they said.

"We are excited about this filament, because we think the intense star formation we see in its galaxies is related to the consolidation of the surrounding supercluster," astrophysicist Kristen Coppin at McGill University in Canada said.

The intergalactic filament, containing hundreds of galaxies, spans 8 million light-years and links two of the three clusters that make up a supercluster known as RCS2319, a distant object whose light has taken more than seven billion years to reach us.

"This luminous bridge of star formation gives us a snapshot of how the evolution of cosmic structure on very large scales affects the evolution of the individual galaxies trapped within it," study co-author Jim Geach said in a McGill release.

Galaxies in the filament are cranking out the equivalent of about 1,000 solar masses (the mass of our sun) of new stars per year, astronomers said, whereas our Milky Way galaxy is producing about one solar mass-worth of new stars per year.—Internet

Mystery behind rising sea levels unlocked

LONDON, 23 May—Researchers have identified the gap, which could be an important missing piece of the puzzle in estimates for past and current sea-level changes and for projections of future rises. Global sea levels rose by an average of 1.8mm per year from 1961-2003, according to data from tide gauges.

But the main question is how much of this can be pinned to global warming.

In its landmark 2007 report, the UN's Nobel-winning Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) ascribed 1.1mm per year to thermal expansion of the oceans—water expands when it is heated—and to melt water from glaciers, icecaps and the Greenland and Antarctica icecaps.

That left 0.7mm per year unaccounted for, a mystery that left a number of scientists wondering if the data were correct or if there were some source that had eluded everyone.

A team led by Yadu Pokhrel of the University of Tokyo insist that the answer lies in water that is extracted from underground aquifers,

and rivers and lakes for human development but is never replenished.

The water ultimately makes it to the ocean through rivers and evaporation in the soil, they note.

Groundwater extraction is the main constituent of additions that account for the mystery gap, according to their paper, which is based on computer modelling.

"Together, unsustainable groundwater use, artificial reservoir water impounding, climate-driven change in terrestrial water storage and the loss of water from closed basins have contributed a sea-level rise of 0.77mm per year between 1961 and 2003, about 42pc of the observed sea-level rise," it said. The probe seeks to fill one of the knowledge gaps in the complex science of climate change.

Researchers admitted to many unknowns about how the oceans respond to warming, and one of them is sea-level rise, an important question for hundreds of millions of coastal dwellers.

Just a tiny rise, if repeated year on year, can eventually have a dramatic impact in

locations that are vulnerable to storm surges or the influx of salt water into aquifers or coastal fields. In its 2007 Fourth Assessment Report, the IPCC said the oceans would rise by between 18 and 59cm by the century's end. But this estimate did not factor in melt water from the mighty Greenland and Antarctic ice sheets.

A study published last year by the Oslo-based Arctic Monitoring and Assessment Project (AMAP) said sea levels would rise, on current melting trends, by 90cm to 1.6m by 2100. The study has been published in the journal *Nature Geoscience*.

New packaging makes edible flowers easier

CHICAGO, 23 May—A new storage technique makes it possible for edible flowers to maintain a higher quality, making them available to more cooks, US researchers said.

Flowers have a large surface-area-to-volume ratio and many delicately attached parts making them susceptible to petal loosening, discoloration and wilting, the

researchers said. Compared with other kinds of flowers, edible flowers are even more vulnerable to post-harvest quality loss than cut flowers, because their stems are cut very short and they are stored without additional water supply.

Currently, edible flowers are often packed in clam shell containers and must be used

within two to five days of harvest, which requires air transportation to reach most regions. The study, published in the *Journal of Food Science*, compared a new controlled release technology along with modified atmosphere packaging to the packing technique that is currently being used. For example, freshly harvested

carrots and snapdragons were packaged in trays with a 1-MVP strip — a synthetic plant growth regulator — sealed with a gas permeable film and stored at 41 degrees Fahrenheit had significantly reduced dehydration and maintained higher overall quality compared to flowers packaged commercially in plastic clam shell containers, the researchers said.

The occasion was to honour the intellectuals, literati and artists from the world of letters; from entertainment world of movies, videos, classical dramas and plays, songs and singers who had contributed voluntarily towards the ongoing multi-faceted functions, activities and entertainment of the Information Ministry in the years 2010 and 2011.

The ceremony was attended by the Honourable Union Minister for Information U Kyaw Hsan, Chief Minister for Yangon Region U Myint Swe, dignitaries, the intellectuals, artistes, specially invited guests and senior officials from the Departments and Enterprises under the Ministry. In delivering felicitations for the gathering the Honourable Minister spoke most glowingly of the contributions extended by these intellectuals for furtherance of the cultural and literary heritage and in doing so had sustained and nurtured their blossoming in full stature to the pinnacles of achievement. These voluntary endeavours were borne out selflessly and in zest by one and all, some oldies, in spite of creeping old age, doddering, feeble in body but still virile in mind, exchanging each other's shortcomings (pains in back, knees and joints, hard of hearing, dimming eye sights, forgetfulness) with mirth and laughter, joining the fun of the moment. Tokens in remembrance, gratitude and respect were presented to 152 doyen personalities, followed by sumptuous buffet dinner and entertainment by the artistes of the Fine Arts bevy of lithe and comely dancers.

After enjoying good food, I took a stroll outside the Karaweik Hall along the corridor as the beautiful night scene captivated me. The concrete golden mythical bird was perched on the bank, with the dark water of the Lake reflecting the glitter of night lights. Light breeze ruffled my hair. In such contemplative mood my memory raced

back a thousand years along heritage trajectory to the Bagan Era bloom of literature, culture, fine arts etc. It was said that the Baganites talked in verses and riddles manifested in high literacy. Most literary works: prose, drama, and verse were based in the Buddhist teachings, scriptures and jatakas, and also touched on nature and social environment, sights and scenes. Such high literacy was propagated by monastic training and instruction through many significant dynasties witnessing literary talent of unmatched quality both among the scholar monks and laymen. I had taken Optional Myanmar in my inter combination for two years at Mandalay University (1947-49), and was enthralled by such gems of Myanmar literary contributions equal to none. Famous names magnificently decked the heritage halls of fame where modern puny replicas could never be matched. Ashin Maha Silavumsa, Ashin Maha Rathasara, the famous four scholar monks prophesized by the growth of four pay trees, Wungyi Padetharaja the rural Myanmar poet as Wordsworth was an English one. Then comes versatile dramatist U Ponnya, Myanmar Shakespeare, Myanmar soldier poet Myawady Mingyi U Sa, Prince poet Nat Shin Naung and forlorn princess Hlaing Hteik Khaung Tin. These accomplished scholars shone with infinite dedication to their selfless literary endeavours to leave fitting legacies for future generations yet unborn. Successive powerful and benevolent Myanmar kings rendered royal patronage, fitting honours and citations that a hundred flowers may bloom.

The momentum of literary mainstream continued but with dimmed luster during the British Occupation Period. However there was a fresh literary wind with the introduction of Myanmar translation of epic English classics and the famous Arabian Nights among many others. And there was the new literary movement Khitsan Sarpay pioneered by the new elite University Graduates, with enduring fame.

The first formally designated Writer's Day Sarsotaw Nay was held on 1st Waxing Day of Nattaw 1306 (15th

November 1944). It will now be 69 years since its inception this Sarsotaw Day—2013. After Independence, Sarpay Beikman was formed with the slogan 'to dispel darkness and bring light.' Literary competitions were organized to nurture new talent. Aspiring writers and poets endeavoured to sharpen their talents by competing and prizes were given as incentive. Following that came the need to read and select the most deserving, selflessly, competently, with righteous dedication without bias or favour. Thus the role of the scholars, intellectuals rendering their wealth of experience voluntarily in the selection process were mobilized and respectfully honoured.

Such voluntary dedication was not confined to scrutiny and selection of published books and manuscripts. More in-depth works of research, collections and compilations were undertaken by these doyen scholars. The wide range of such tasks included compilation of literary references, compilation of dictionaries, research into documents of archival and heritage value, research paper presentation on forums and conferences, preparation of fact books, books on the state of the nation, annual literary and position reports etc.

The present occasion was one of such felicitations. It was indeed the heritage of our forefathers and it is the bounden duty of the successors all those concerned that be, to propagate and perpetuate this hallowed literary and cultural tradition deservingly. Maybe just a few were honoured with respect and gratitude. And there remains many, yet unknown, unacknowledged, unhonoured and unsung. But these intellectuals rendered their accumulative knowledge, experience expertise not for favour or pelf, but for the joy of doing so. And by itself they already had their rewards, the piti of contributing to society. What I have written now as a memorable contribution is just brushing the tip of the iceberg or the hydrofoil approach. There are many who can do much more and I encourage them to do so.

Distribution of electricity with new generators

The distribution of electricity is being carried out with 11 generators (3895 KVA) in Yangon; 20 generators (6315 KVA) in Mandalay; five generators (735 KVA) in Pyay and two generators (200 KVA) in Monywa. In addition, six (2 MW) generators from Caterpillar Co., Ltd are in order and they will arrive within one week.

Arrangements are being made for arrival of six diesel-fired generators (1 MW) from Singapore within one week and two gas turbines (25 MW) from General Electric Co., Ltd as quickly as possible.—MNA

Iran to keep lower grade uranium enrichment, says expert

TEHERAN, 23 May—Iran will maintain lower grade enrichment activities though it is likely to agree to suspend its 20-percent uranium enrichment during Wednesday's nuclear talks with the world's major powers, an Iranian expert has said.

If the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) and P5+1 countries, namely, the five permanent members of the UN security Council plus Germany, agree that Iran has the right to enrich uranium up to 3.5 percent for

civilian use, Iran will likely give up production of 20 percent enriched uranium.

"That is a kind of solution (to Iran's nuclear programme)," Dr Sadeq Zibakalam, a professor of political science with Teheran University, said in an interview with Xinhua on Tuesday.

If Iran agrees to suspend production of 20 percent enriched uranium, it will definitely ask for lifting some Western sanctions in return, Zibakalam said. "Of course,

Iran would say what about the sanctions? Now what about something in return?" said the Iranian scholar.

After the previous round of nuclear talks between Iran and the P5+1 in Istanbul of Turkey on 14 April, with both sides describing the talks as positive, Iranian officials have incessantly urged Western countries to lift some sanctions against Teheran before or during the following round of nuclear talks on Wednesday.

220 endangered rhinos killed in South Africa since beginning of 2012

JOHANNESBURG, 23 May—At least 220 endangered rhinos have been lost to the poachers for their horns in South Africa since the beginning of this year, a government department said on Tuesday. Among the slaughtered rhinos, 207 were killed in the famous Kruger National Park in the northeastern province of Limpopo, and the reserves in the central northern province

of the North West and the southeastern province of KwaZulu-Natal, said the Department of Environmental Affairs.

In 2011, a total of 448 rhinos were killed in South Africa, compared to 333 in 2010.

Conservationists have warned the rhino in South Africa is facing their worst poaching crisis in decades. If the killing trend continues at

this rate, it is expected that at least 500 rhinos will be illegally slaughtered by the end of 2012. "The department, our provinces and public entities view this illegal killing of our national treasure in a very serious light, and will continue to prioritize our fight against this crime with other law enforcement agencies," said the department spokesperson Albi Modise.—Xinhua

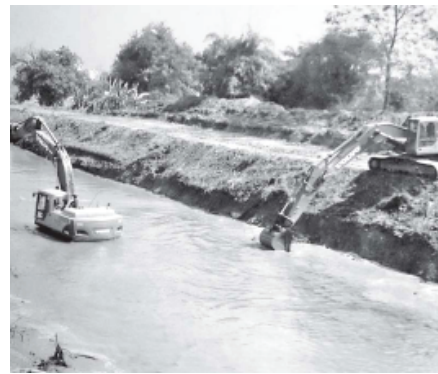

Cuba's tourist arrivals hit record high

HAVANA, 23 May—Tourist arrivals in Cuba hit an unexpected record in the first four months this year, the Cuban National Statistic Bureau (NBS) said on Tuesday.

The number of visitors to the Caribbean island country reached 1.24 million in the first four months of this year, up 5.2 percent over the same period in 2011, the bureau said, adding that the record figure produced a 12-percent increase in revenue.

In April alone, Cuba received 288,523 tourists, 13,122 more than the same month in 2011, the NBS said.

Canada remains the biggest source of tourists, followed by France, Argentina, Germany, Russia and Mexico.

Expecting tourism to serve as an engine of growth to help the development of other social and economic projects, the Cuban government aims at receiving 3 million tourists in 2012.

Japan's April trade deficit expands to 6.5 b USD

TOKYO, 23 May—Japan's trade deficit in April hit 520 billion yen (about 6.5 billion US dollars) amid expanding demand for oil and gas imports, a government report said on Wednesday.

The deficit figure was the biggest for the recording month since the government data was collected in 1979. The value of imports for April surged 8.0 percent from a year earlier to 6,087 billion yen, while exports climbed 7.9 percent to 5,567 billion yen, according to the report released by the Finance Ministry.

The world's third largest economy had recorded the worst trade deficit in the fiscal year 2011 which ended in March due to rising imports of oil and gas after the 11 March disasters last year.

The devastating earthquake and tsunami that hit northeastern Japan last year not only caused disruptions in the supply chain of auto parts but also triggered a nuclear crisis that led to suspension of reactors. Currently, all of the nation's 50 commercial reactors are off-line, leading to a power shortage across the country.

The appreciation of the yen was also cited by the government as a factor for the rising deficit.

While Japan's imports grew, its exports also showed strong momentum. The nation's exports marked the second straight month of climb thanks to the shipments to the United States and the Middle East, the ministry said.

Exports to the United States surged 42.9 percent to 959 billion yen, while the figure for China, Japan's biggest trading partner, contracted 7.1 percent to 995 billion yen.

Supply bottlenecks: in India, they're no small potatoes

NEW DELHI, 23 May—Buried in recent monthly data for wholesale prices in India, the wild gyrations of a humble vegetable tell the tale of an economy trapped in inflation by its own rigidities.

Back in December, after a bumper harvest of potatoes, furious farmers dumped tonnes of their crop on roads in protest over a crash in prices: four months later, the annual wholesale inflation rate of the potato is galloping at 53 percent.

In street markets and on the handcarts of vegetable hawkers, the rise has been even steeper, a shock for millions of Indians who lay their tables each day with curries made of onions,

tomatoes, lentils and "aloo", or potatoes.

"We used to buy whatever vegetables we liked, but now we always have to check the prices," says Maninder Kaur, shopping with her family at a market in Jalandhar, in the northwestern state of Punjab, where a kilogramme (2.2 lb) of potatoes that cost 4-5 rupees (8-10 US cents) at the beginning of the year is now up to four times more expensive.

Meanwhile, onions are selling for about a fifth of the price they were at the end of last year and the price of tomatoes rose 33 percent in April alone.

Such erratic prices for

perishable goods are routine in India, partly because the majority of farms depend on the variable monsoon for rains. However, they are also due to inadequate cold storage facilities and transport bottlenecks — that together cause up to 40 percent of the country's food

harvests to rot before they get to market — and a primitive distribution network in which many layers of middlemen take cuts, forcing prices higher.—Reuters

Home resales rise, boding well for economy

WASHINGTON, 23 May—The pace of sales for existing homes in April rose to its fastest in nearly two years

of 4.62 million units last month, the National Association of Realtors said on Tuesday.

Housing has been one of the economy's weakest links as it recovers from the 2007-09 recession, but many economists think the sector will actually add to economic growth in 2012 for the first time since 2005.

The report on April resales supports that view and helps to dampen fears the recovery was stagnating after a report earlier this month showed tepid job growth in April.

"We're still a ways from looking at an encouraging picture of the US economy, though when it comes to housing, every little bit helps," said Camilla Sutton, a currency strategist at Scotia Capital in Toronto.

US officials hail launch of first commercial spacecraft to space station

WASHINGTON, 23 May—High-ranking US officials on Tuesday hailed the launch of the unmanned Dragon capsule to the International Space Station, which initiated the first flight of a commercial spacecraft to the orbiting outpost.

Atop California-based company SpaceX' own Falcon 9 rocket, the Dragon capsule rocketed into the sky from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida.

Charles Bolden, administrator of US space agency NASA, told reporters at Cape Canaveral that Tuesday's launch ushers in a new era of space flight for both the space agency and the United States.

"We're now back on the brink of a new future, a future that embraces the innovation the private sector brings to the table," Bolden said. "The significance of this day cannot be overstated."

The launch is an important step for NASA and the United States, which currently has no means of independently reaching space. NASA relies on the Russian space agency to ferry US astronauts to orbit.

"What's really important is not control, as much as it is the fact that the United States will once again be in the lead, will be providing our own vehicles to take our own astronauts and cargo to the International Space Station," Bolden said. "It's fine to rely on partners, but that's not where the greatest nation in the world wants to be."

Venezuela's Chavez reappears, leads cabinet meeting

CARACAS, 23 May—Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez reappeared on Tuesday in a live television broadcast, the first time he has been seen in public view since returning from cancer treatment in Cuba almost two weeks ago.

Chavez spoke in a strong

voice and did not appear tired during the broadcast, which lasted more than two hours. He made no reference to his health, of which few details are known.

The socialist leader's uncharacteristic disappearances have become longer and more frequent this year. They have fueled speculation his condition has worsened and may complicate a re-election bid in October.

Chavez, 57, cracked jokes with government ministers during Tuesday's broadcast and repeated his plans to register his candidacy for the 7 October election next month as set out by the country's electoral commission.

"The defeat that we're going to deal to the opposition

will be unprecedented," Chavez said.

"It's part of our challenge to move to a new phase," he said, adding that his government would strive for annual economic growth of 8 percent and single-digit inflation if elected for another six-year term.

Consumer prices rose 27.6 percent in the South American country last year, one of the world's highest rates.

It was only Chavez's third appearance in public since mid-April. He called state television twice in recent days but Tuesday's speech was his first in public since he returned from Cuba after completing radiotherapy sessions on 11 May.

Zardari may face friction over supply routes at NATO summit

CHICAGO, 23 May— Pakistani President Asif Ali Zardari arrived in Chicago on Saturday for a NATO summit to what could be a chilly reception if a hoped-for deal allowing trucks to again supply alliance troops in Afghanistan fails to

materialize. While Western officials sought to portray Zardari's presence as a sign of improving NATO-Pakistan ties, possible friction at the meeting underscores the challenges NATO countries face as they struggle to ensure a stable future for Afghanistan after Western troops withdraw. Obama warns of euro zone threat, welcomes growth focus

CAMP DAVID, 23 May— President Barack Obama, wrapping up the G8 summit he hosted at Camp David, welcomed Europe's focus on rekindling growth and warned the crisis in the euro zone was dangerous for the world.

Obama, whose re-election chances in November depend heavily on the US economy continuing to shake off recession, said there was now "an emerging consensus" that Europe ought to invest in job-creating infrastructure and other programmes at the same time as it tackles its deficits and debt.

"As all the leaders here today agreed, growth and jobs must be our top priority. A stable, growing European economy is in everybody's best interests, including

America's," he said. "Put simply, if a company is forced to cut back in Paris and Madrid, that might mean less business for manufacturers in Pittsburgh or Milwaukee." Obama said his fellow G8 leaders from Britain, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Russia and Canada recognized the painful sacrifices that people in Greece were enduring as a result of that country's economic pressures.

While acknowledging there was still "a lot of work to do," he said the United States remained confident that Europe has the capacity to meet its economic challenges.

"The direction the debate has taken recently should give us confidence," Obama said.

Passenger traffic at Singapore airport in April up 12.7 pct

SINGAPORE, 23 May— The passenger traffic at Singapore's Changi Airport, one of the world's busiest airports, grew by 12.7 percent year on year in April to 4.21 million, Changi Airport Group said on Tuesday.

The aircraft movements grew by 8.8 percent to 26,400 movements. The passenger traffic improved year on year across all regions. Among its key markets, China, India and Japan registered the strongest growth. It is now the most connected airport to China and India from Southeast Asia.

The cargo volumes fell by 4.9 percent year on year to 148,200 tons, reflecting the current downturn faced by most export markets.

Mukesh Ambani, who Forbes magazine estimates is worth more than \$22 billion, released details about the interior of the home which includes marble floors, a multi-story garage, a large library, helipads, a spa and a Hindu temple, CNN reported.

Ambani's wife, Nita, told Vanity Fair magazine for a June issue her family decided to release details about the home because "there have been exaggerated reports in the media about it."

The Mumbai home, dubbed Antilia after a mythical island, also includes a ballroom, a theater and

several terraced gardens.

"We made our home right at the top because we wanted the sunlight ... so it's an elevated house on top of a garden," Nita Ambani said.

She said the family moved into the home in September.

The rocks caught fire in the pocket of a 43-year-old San Clemente woman after they were found on San Onofre State Beach by her children during the weekend.

She remained hospitalized Friday with second-

and third-degree burns.

"It's pretty implausible," Overman said.

"I can't think of a scenario of chemicals on the beach that would have the properties that are described."

Tricia Landquist, a spokeswoman for the healthcare agency, said the rocks have been sent to a state lab for further testing.

Man pulls woman from subway tracks

A New York man who jumped onto the subway tracks to rescue an unconscious woman said he hopes his children remember their lessons about train safety.

Greg Wetzel, 40, who jumped onto the tracks at 12:45 pm on 19 May at the West 72nd Street subway station and hoisted a woman back up to the platform about 60 seconds before a train arrived, said he hopes his children, boys ages 6 and 7 and a 4-year-old girl, didn't get the wrong idea from his actions, the *New York Daily News* reported.

"I guess it's mildly ironic — to do the exact opposite of what I'm preaching," said Wetzel, who said he has repeatedly spoken to his kids about subway safety.

"The lesson, I guess, is they saw first-hand what happened," he said. "That should give them a healthy fear of the platform."

Wetzel brushed aside any allegations of heroism on his part.

"It was just the right thing to do," he said. "If you see someone on the tracks, it's hard not to do something."

Florida TV host Frank Cairo charged with grand theft

A Spanish-language television anchor in Florida was charged with grand theft for allegedly stealing a set of chairs and a carpet from a neighbour.

TV Azteca host Frank Cairo, 48, whose real name is Ivan Valdes, was charged with grand theft in Doral alongside friend Jorge Acuna Arias, 47, The *Miami Herald* reported.

Doral police said surveillance video depicts Valdes and Arias taking a set of chairs and a carpet from the apartment and Police Chief Rick Gomez said Valdes "admitted" to the April incident, saying Arias entered the apartment and took the items because he thought it had been abandoned.

Police said the owners of the apartment, located in the Captiva complex in Doral, live in Mexico and only use the apartment part-time.

Valdes said the surveillance video does not show the whole truth of the incident.

"I make half-a-million dollars and don't need to be stealing," he said.

Bayern beat Dutch in badly-timed friendly

BERLIN, 23 May— Stricken Bayern Munich managed to beat Netherlands 3-2 in an badly-timed friendly on Tuesday, played less than 72 hours after their traumatic Champions League final defeat at the hands of Chelsea.

A 33,000 crowd watched the match at the Allianz Arena, where Bayern suffered their penalty shootout defeat against the English Premier League side on Saturday.

Both teams fielded mainly second-string line-ups while goalkeeper Joerg Butt,

defender Breno and forward Ivica Olic all made their final appearances for Bayern.

The match was organized to compensate the Bavarians after their Dutch winger Arjen Robben aggravated an injury playing for the Netherlands at the 2010 World Cup.

Bayern complained angrily at the time that Robben should not have played and he missed several months of the following season.

But the timing of the match could not have turned out worse for Bayern, coming hot on the heels of Saturday's defeat. Robben, who missed a penalty in extra-time on Saturday, came on as a second-half substitute for the Dutch and some boos were aimed at him from the Bayern fans.—Reuters

Spain arrives in Austria for pre-Euro training

SCHRUNS, 23 May— World and European champions Spain arrived late Tuesday in Schruns, western Austria, for a week-long training camp ahead of next month's defence of their European title in Poland and Ukraine.

The team around coach Vicente Del Bosque was greeted by a dozen fans under drizzling rain as it arrived at its hotel in the mountain resort, where it will stay until 29 May.

During this time, the reigning European and world champions will play a friendly match against Serbia on 26 May in St Gallen, Switzerland, with another following on 30 May in Bern against South Korea.

Several training sessions in Austria will meanwhile be open to the public.

La Roja, which already trained in Schruns ahead of its World Cup triumph in 2010, is seen as one of the favourites at Euro 2012 which runs from 8 June to 1 July.

Currently ranked number one in the world by FIFA, it will be hoping to become the first nation to win three

international competitions in a row if it can lift the European trophy again after winning in Vienna in 2008.

Spain will face Italy, Ireland and Croatia in group C, with its first match against the Azzurri on 10 June in Gdansk, Poland.

Drogba's China talks on track: report

SHANGHAI, 23 May— Shanghai Shenhua's talks with Didier Drogba are continuing "just as planned", a report said Wednesday, raising expectations the striker will move to China after announcing his departure from Chelsea.

Shenhua, bankrolled by colourful video-game mogul Zhu Jun, signed Drogba's ex-Chelsea team-mate Nicolas Anelka in December and they have been in talks with the Ivory Coast international since at least January.

"As of now, Shenhua's negotiations with Drogba are continuing just as planned," Zhu told the *Oriental Sports Daily*. Drogba, 34, revealed he was quitting English Premiership giants Chelsea on Tuesday, just days after his match-winning performance in the Champions League final against Bayern Munich.

Drogba scored a late equaliser as well as the

decisive spot-kick in the penalty shoot-out. Since joining Chelsea from Marseille in 2004, he has tallied 157 goals in 341 appearances, helping the club win 10 trophies.

"It has been a very difficult decision for me to make and I am very proud of what we have achieved, but the time is right for a new

challenge for me," he told Chelsea's website.

Drogba would be the latest star signing for China's increasingly big-spending Super League, after World Cup-winning coach Marcello Lippi joined Guangzhou Evergrande last week.

But Anelka's move has not been without its problems.

Last week he threatened to quit Shenhua over the club's plans to hire a new head coach, according to local media.

"If there is still no one to support me and (they) continue to play little tricks behind my back... then I will quickly decide whether or not to retire," the Frenchman told the *Xinmin Evening News*.

Club owner Zhu has written to Anelka's agent and lawyer asking for an explanation, the *Oriental Sports Daily* said.

In April, Shenhua sacked French coach Jean Tigana, then the highest profile manager to work in China, after just a handful of games and replaced him with a makeshift set-up including Anelka as player-coach.

They are now tipped to be targeting Sergio Daniel Batista, who led Argentina to Olympic gold in 2008, as their new manager.

Pistorius, Dibaba enter New York meet

NEW YORK, 23 May— South African Oscar Pistorius, trying to become the first double amputee to compete in the Olympics, and reigning 5,000m Olympic women's champion Tirunesh Dibaba of Ethiopia will race in the Diamond League meet next month in New York, organizers announced on Tuesday. Pistorius, the 25-year-old "Blade Runner" who uses carbon fibre prosthetic running blades, bettered the Olympics qualifying mark of 45.30 seconds this year with a time of 45.20 at a meet in Pretoria.

He must run 45.25 again at an international event before 30 June to realize his

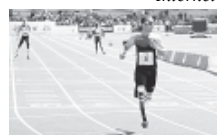
dream of becoming the first amputee to compete against able-bodied athletes at the quadrennial multi-sport showcase.

Pistorius hopes to make it happen at the Adidas Grand Prix on 9 June. "Last year at the Adidas Grand Prix, I had a great experience on the way to my first World Championships," Pistorius said. "This year, I know the Icahn Stadium fans will put everything they've got behind my quest to compete in the Olympics."

Dibaba, who also won 10,000m Olympic gold at Beijing, is a seven time world champion and the 5,000m world record holder.

But Dibaba, 26, missed all of last year with an injury. She has won her two prior starts this year but needs to impress her homeland's Olympic selectors.

Jose Mourinho extends contract with Real Madrid

MADRID, 23 May— Real Madrid announced this Tuesday that they have extended the contract of coach Jose Mourinho by a further two years. The news will end rumors about Mourinho's future after he had been linked with possible moves to Manchester City and even a return to his former club, Chelsea, in recent weeks.

The 49-year-old's previous deal was due to expire at the end of June 2014 and he will now remain at Real Madrid until the end of June 2016. Mourinho joined Real Madrid in the summer of 2010, shortly after leading Inter Milan to the Champions League title. He

took Madrid to the Copa del Rey in 2011, defeating bitter rivals FC Barcelona in the final and this season his side won the BBVA Primera Liga title, amassing 100 points in the process. So far Madrid's main objective of lifting a 10th Champions League title has evaded Mourinho and that will almost certainly be the club's main objective for the 2012-13 season.

Meanwhile next season will see Madrid's main rivals, FC Barcelona, perhaps suffer a period of adjustment as Tito Vilanova takes on the difficult task of replacing Pep Guardiola, who is leaving after four seasons in charge.—Xinhua

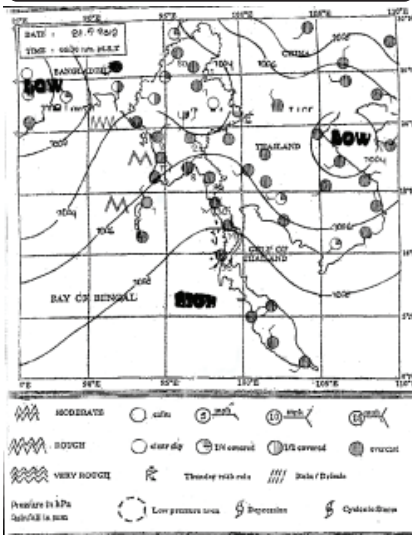

First cut awaits 2020 Olympic host hopefuls

GENEVA, 23 May—The choice of host city for the 2020 Olympics is still 15 months away, but a shortlist is due to be announced on Wednesday from declared candidates Baku, Doha, Istanbul, Tokyo and Madrid. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) at this early stage in the competition only looks at the cities' abilities to host a major sporting event, ranking their transportation and other infrastructure and the challenges they face to ramp up in time for the event.

Tokyo are the only one of the candidates to have hosted the event and seen widely as the early front runners, while Istanbul were seen as the dark horses until a spanner was thrown into the works when Turkey also announced they were bidding for the 2020 European football championship. IOC President Jacques Rogge told AFP in an interview earlier this month that IOC rules state that a Games host country cannot hold another major sports event in the same year. "Initially they will be judged on their technical capacity on 23 May in Quebec City," said the 70-year-old Belgian. "In other words their potential to host the Games. "On 7 September next year in Buenos Aires, if Istanbul is elected we will respectfully ask them not to host the European Championships. "Ultimately, it will be for the government (in Ankara) to make their mind up but I would say the election would be conditional on not organizing another competition."

Of the other candidates Doha failed to even make the short list last time and the subsequent furore after Qatar was awarded the 2022 World Cup has according to some made IOC members reluctant to suffer the same Press as FIFA did. Baku also failed to

make the short list last time but say they have learnt from their mistakes this time round. "This is an excellent bid, really carefully prepared to avoid the mistakes on the previous bid," Sports Minister Azad Rahimov told AFP on Tuesday.—INTERNET

Ukraine plans Euro crowd control, prostitution a problem

KIEV, 23 May—Ukraine will use fighters and helicopters to guard its air space and put security and health services on full alert during the European soccer championship, but officials said on Tuesday they could do little to stem a likely flood of prostitutes. The country's top security and defence official, Andriy Klyuev, told security chiefs that the world would judge Ukraine by how it dealt with the security challenges posed by the month-long Euro-2012 tournament in June. The leadership of President Viktor Yanukovich is under fire over the

jailing of former prime minister Yulia Tymoshenko for abuse of office in what Western governments say is a politically-motivated prosecution. Several Western politicians have said they will stay away from Euro-2012 matches in protest. The former Soviet republic, co-host of Euro-2012 with Poland, expects about one million fans for the 16 matches to be played in four Ukrainian cities - the biggest single influx of foreign visitors since it became independent 20 years ago. Ukraine says it will have about 23,000 police on duty for the tournament which

opens in Poland on 8 June and climaxes with the final in the Ukrainian capital of Kiev on 1 July. Anti-terrorism measures include having 10 surface-to-air missile units on standby. Four air fighters and two military helicopters will be deployed to protect air space over the host cities, the Defence Ministry said. "We will be permanently monitoring the air space of the match cities. All security and emergency institutions and services will be on 24-hour duty from the beginning of June. Medical services and the emergencies ministry will be on heightened alert," said Klyuev, who is secretary of Ukraine's security and defence council.—Reuters

Two Nigerian women arrested for drug trafficking

LAGOS, 23 May—Two Nigerian women suspected to be drug traffickers were arrested in southwestern Lagos State, the West African country's anti-drug police, National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), said on Tuesday. Spokesperson of the agency Mitchell Ofoyeju told reporters that the suspects ages 24 and 25 were arrested at the Murtala Muhammed International Airport (MMIA), Lagos. It said one of the suspects, who claimed to be a hairstylist, was caught with 1 kg of methamphetamine hidden in her inner wear. The other suspect, according to the spokesperson, is a London-based fashion designer, who was found in possession of 3 kg of cocaine concealed inside chocolate packs. "One of the suspects was detected with the support and cooperation of the

Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FAAN) personnel," he said, adding that she was trying to take a local flight to Abuja to connect another flight to Malaysia. He said the lady packed 750 grams of methamphetamine in her inner wear, while 250 grams were also ingested by her. According to him, the suspects claimed during interrogation that they were lured into the drug deal, with the promise of a mouth-watering sum of money. Methamphetamine, a very addictive stimulant that is closely related to amphetamine, is long lasting and toxic to dopamine nerve terminals in the central nervous system. It is a white, odorless, bitter-tasting powder taken orally or by snorting or injecting. Xinhua

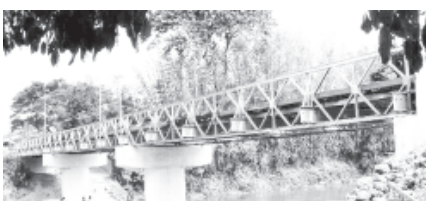

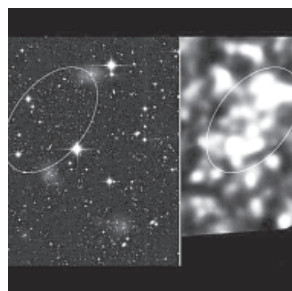
