## Personal Profile of Prime Minister of India Dr Manmohan Singh

India's fourteenth Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh is rightly acclaimed as a thinker and a scholar.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh was born on 26 September, 1932, in a village in the Punjab province of undivided India. Dr Singh completed his Matriculation examinations from the Punjab University in 1948. His academic career took him from Punjab to the University of Cambridge, UK, where he earned a First Class Honours degree in Economics in 1957. Dr Singh followed this with a D. Phil in Economics from Nuffield College at Oxford University in 1962.

Dr Singh's academic credentials were burnished by the years he spent on the faculty of Punjab University and the prestigious Delhi School of Economics. He had a brief stint at the UNCTAD Secretariat as well, during these years. This presaged a subsequent appointment as Secretary-General of the South Commission in Geneva between 1987 and 1990.

In 1971, Dr Singh joined the Government of India as Economic Advisor in the Commerce Ministry. This was soon followed by his appointment as Chief Economic Advisor in the Ministry of Finance in 1972. Among the many Governmental positions that Dr Singh has occupied are Secretary in the Ministry of Finance; Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission; Governor of the Reserve Bank of India; Advisor to the Prime Minister; and Chairman of the University Grants Commission.

Dr Singh served five years between 1991 and 1996 as India's Finance Minister. His role in ushering in a comprehensive policy of economic reforms is now recognized worldwide.

Among the many awards and honours conferred upon Dr Singh in his public career, the most prominent are India's second highest civilian honour, the Padma Vibhushan (1987); the Jawaharlal Nehru Birth Centenary Award of the Indian Science Congress (1995); the Asia Money Award for Finance Minister of the Year (1993 and 1994); the Euro Money Award for Finance Minister of the Year (1993); the Adam Smith Prize of the University of Cambridge (1956); and the Wright's Prize for Distinguished Performance at St. John's College in Cambridge (1995). Dr Singh has also been honoured by a number of other associations including the Japanese Nihon Keizai Shimbun. Dr Singh is a recipient of honorary degrees from many universities including the Universities of Cambridge and Oxford.

In his political career, Dr Singh has been a Member of India's Upper House of Parliament (the Rajya Sabha) since 1991, where he was leader of the Opposition between 1998 and 2004. Dr Manmohan Singh was sworn in as Prime Minister on 22 May after the 2004 general elections and took the oath of office for a second term on 22 May, 2009.

Dr Singh and his wife Shrimati Gursharan Kaur have three daughters.

## Canadian arrested for incident at Miami airport

MIAMI, 26 May — A Canadian man was arrested at Miami International Airport on Friday for rushing to the front of an American Airlines flight from Jamaica after it had landed, authorities said.

The FBI said 24-year-old Ryan Snider caused no injuries or damage to the plane and his behaviour did not appear to be terrorism related.

But a statement from the agency said he was taken into federal custody and "expected to face federal charges which may include interference with a flight crew."

An initial court

appearance for Snider was expected to be scheduled for Tuesday, the statement said. A spokesman for American Airlines' parent AMR Corp said earlier that Snider appeared "disoriented" after he stood up and refused to sit as the plane taxied to its airport gate.

"We had what appeared to be a 'disoriented' male passenger who stood up at his seat in the main cabin after landing in Miami as the flight was taxiing in," AMR spokesman Tim Smith said.

"He did not obey crew member instructions to sit down and then moved toward the front of the aircraft where

he was subdued," Smith said. The Boeing Co 757 with 120 passengers was concluding a flight from Montego Bay, Jamaica, to Miami.

On Tuesday, a US Airways flight was diverted after a passenger said she had a surgically-implanted device in her body and the flight was disrupted. In a separate incident the same day, the crew on a US Airways commuter flight operated by the carrier's Piedmont subsidiary, reported a "possible flare" when the plane was approaching the Philadelphia airport.

## US criticism of China's human rights "biased"

BEIJING, 26 May—A Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman on Friday described a recent US government report on China's human rights practices as "biased." The spokesman urged the United States to stop interfering in the internal affairs of other nations. "It's a solid fact that remarkable, well-recognized progress has been achieved in China's field of human rights over the past 30 years and more," spokesman Hong Lei said in response to the "Country Reports on Human Rights for 2011," which was issued by the US State Department on Thursday.

Hong said the report's criticism of China is biased and baseless. "There is always room for improvement on human rights for any country," the spokesman said, adding that all the countries in the world can deepen mutual understanding for common improvement through equal dialogue. But no single country should use human rights as a tool to interfere with another's internal affairs, he said. "We sincerely advise the US side to do more self-examination and stop its wrong thinking and doings on the issue," he added. — Xinhua

## Finn dies in ski accident on Alaska's Mount McKinley

ANCHORAGE, 26 May—A Finnish climber has died after falling some 2,000 feet while attempting to ski down a notoriously steep chute on Mount McKinley in Alaska, the National Park Service said on Thursday.

Ilkka Uusitalo, 36, fell from an elevation of 17,800 feet through snow, ice and rocks on Wednesday, before coming to rest 60 feet down a glacial crevasse, the Park Service said.

One of Uusitalo's expedition partners rappelled into the crevasse but found that he was likely dead, the Park Service said.

The second expedition partner summoned Denali National Park mountaineering rangers for help.

Rangers found Uusitalo's

body, retrieved it from the crevasse and flew it off the mountain, the Park Service said.

Uusitalo's death is the second this year on McKinley, North America's tallest peak. A German climber died in a 1,100-foot (335-metre) fall last Friday.

The long chute that Uusitalo was attempting to ski, as steep as 45 degrees in some spots, is an alternative to the easier West Buttress route that most climbers use on 20,320-foot (6,194-metre) McKinley.

Only a small percentage of McKinley climbers use the chute and most of those who do climb with crampons and traditional mountaineering gear, said Maureen McLaughlin, a spokes-

woman for Denali National Park. Descending the route on skis is less common, but is done by a few climbers each year, McLaughlin said.

"This team in particular had a lot of ski experience," she said. Uusitalo, of Oulu, Finland, was the 16th person since 1972 to perish while descending that route, the Park Service said.

Park records suggest that he is the first person to die while skiing down the chute, McLaughlin said. But there have been other serious skiing and snowboarding accidents there in the past, she said.

Weather conditions at the time of the accident were considered good, but the snow at the high elevations had not yet started the softening that normally occurs later in the climbing season, McLaughlin said.

## Dam bursts in Hunan but no casualties

CHANGSHA, 26 May—A dam burst on Friday evening in the central province of Hunan but no casualties had been reported as scores of villagers downstream had been relocated, according to the provincial authorities on Saturday.

The Badoucn reservoir dam burst around 6 pm on

Friday and water had flooded Xintang village of Taojiang county, said the Hunan provincial flood control and drought relief headquarters.

Heavy rain since Tuesday had increased water levels, putting pressure on the dam.

The ensuing flood damaged 10 hectares of crops.

The local government has started the emergency response plan to repair the dam. The Badoucn reservoir was constructed in 1973. It has been listed on the provincial reservoir reinforcement plan, as it was known to have safety risks.

## Jail for two blamed for New Zealand cargo ship spill

WELLINGTON, 26 May—The captain and the navigating officer of a ship that ran aground on a New Zealand reef have each been sentenced to seven months in jail.

Authorities have described the 5 Oct grounding of the cargo ship *Rena* as New Zealand's worst maritime environmental disaster. About 400 tons of fuel oil spilled on Astrolabe Reef near Tauranga and at least 2,000 sea birds died.

Capt Mauro Balomaga and officer Leonil Relon, both of the Philippines, had earlier pleaded guilty to operating the ship dangerously and altering documents after the crash.

The *New Zealand Herald* reported the men appeared solemn when sentenced on Friday at a court in Rotorua.

A preliminary report by transport investigators found the *Rena* took short cuts to try to reach port by a deadline. — Reuters

## China adds Georgia as travel destination

BEIJING, 26 May—Georgia has officially become a new travel destination for Chinese citizens, according to an agreement reached between tourism authorities of the two countries. The decision was announced on Friday after officials of the two countries signed an Approved Destination Status (ADS) Memorandum of Understanding on Friday in Beijing.

Zhu Shanzhong, vice director of the National Tourism Administration, said the signing and implementation of the MoU is expected to bring a new wave of Chinese tourists to the country. He also suggested Georgian tourism authorities to focus on promotion in China and develop more tourism products that are particularly tailored for Chinese tourists. Tourists have flocked to Georgia in recent years to bath in hot springs in the capital Tbilisi or relax on the country's Black Sea coast beaches. — Xinhua

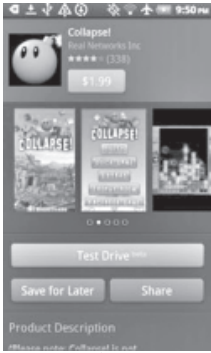

**Amazon offers ‘test drives’ of phone apps**

SEATTLE, 26 May—Amazon says Android device owners unsure if they want to buy an application will be able to “test drive” it in its App store before they buy.

To test drive an app, users can click the “Test Drive” button on the app’s product

page and the app will run virtually, to let users experience what it would be like to have the app on their device, CNET.com reported on Tuesday.

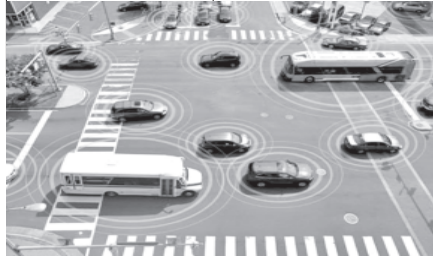
Test Drive is available on more than 5,000 applications offered through its App store and more programmes will be added over time, Amazon said.

However, the feature is currently available in a beta version and only supports apps that use the touch screen and accelerometer features of smartphones, Amazon said.

Apps that require the keyboard, multitouch or the camera are not currently supported, it said. Amazon had launched its Test Drive service last year but users could only try out apps from their browser, not directly in the App store.—Internet

Nearly 3,000 cars, trucks and buses will be equipped with the technology while similar devices will be located at intersections, curve locations, and freeway sites throughout the test area, researchers said.

“We are equipping vehicles that spend time driving in the 48105 ZIP code — northeast Ann Arbor and the surrounding area,” Jim Sayer, an UMTRI researcher, said.

“We are working closely with the university community, but also with the Ann Arbor Public Schools, to identify individuals who want to know more about this technology and might consider having it installed on their personal vehicle.”

**Computer malware threats still rising**

SANTA CLARA, 26 May—Malware threats against PCs are at the highest levels in four years and are on the increase on Macs and Android devices, computer security firm McAfee says. In the past quarter McAfee collected 83 million pieces of PC malware samples, up from 75 million samples collected by the end of last year, CNET.com reported on Wednesday.

McAfee also reported a significant increase in malicious software targeting the Android platform and Mac computers.

A total of 8,000 mobile malware samples were collected this quarter, of which nearly 7,000 were Android threats, mainly from third-party app markets, it said. With the United States being the primary source of cyberattacks, malware threats could reach the 100 million mark this year, a release from McAfee said. E-mail continued to be a medium for targeted attacks along with an increase of so-called rootkits, a form of “stealth” malware, it said.—Internet

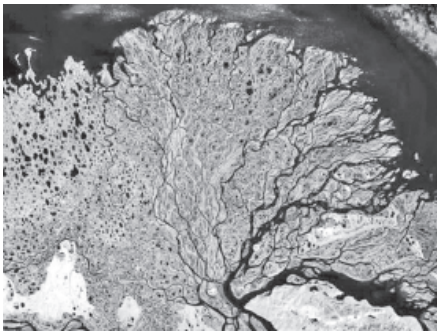
**Surprising source of Arctic mercury seen**

CAMBRIDGE, 26 May—Toxic mercury in the Arctic, long thought to be coming primarily from atmospheric sources, is also being carried into the region by rivers, US scientists say.

While the atmospheric

source has long been studied, new research suggests twice as much mercury actually comes from the flow of circumpolar rivers that carry the element north into the Arctic Ocean, Harvard University researchers reported on Monday.

“The Arctic is a unique environment because it’s so remote from most anthropogenic (human-influenced) sources of mercury, yet we know that the concentrations of mercury in Arctic marine mammals are among the highest in the world,” Harvard scientist Jenny A Fisher said.

“This is dangerous to

Mercury emission from gold, silver, and mercury mines in Siberia may be polluting those rivers, researcher said.

The Arctic Ocean is shallow, which increases its sensitivity to input from rivers, they said. “The environmental implications of this finding are huge. It means, for example, that climate change could have a very large impact on arctic mercury, larger than the impact of controlling emissions to the atmosphere,” Fisher said.

“More work is needed now to measure the mercury discharged by rivers and to determine its origin.”

**New ideas about Saturn’s ‘oddball’ moon**

ITHACA, 26 May—A moon of Saturn that looks like a cosmic wet sponge is in fact covered in ices, both of water and carbon dioxide, images from a NASA spacecraft show.

Hyperion, with an irregular potato-like shape and honeycomb surface, is the subject of a new analysis of images taken by NASA’s Cassini spacecraft in September 2005, ScienceNews.org reported on Wednesday.

Hydrocarbons and iron-containing compounds mixed in with the ice give the moon a reddish appearance, researchers said.

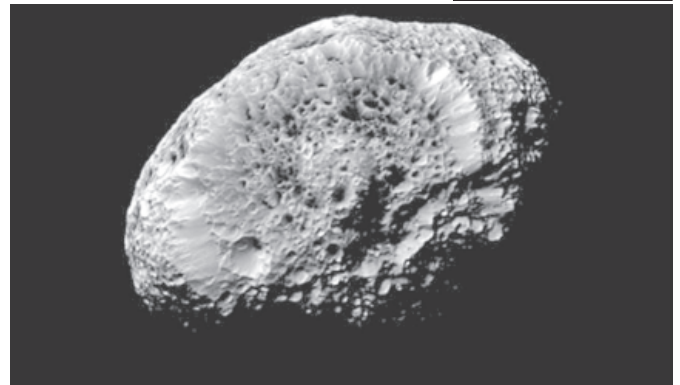
Writing in the planetary science journal *Icarus*, scientists say Hyperion shows similarities to some comets, suggesting the possibility the moon formed

elsewhere before being captured by Saturn.

A separate team of researchers reporting in the same issue of *Icarus* says Hyperion’s strange, sponge-like surface is likely the result of a number of processes,

including impacts blasting debris into space, eroding crater walls and melting of ice, all contributing to creating one of the solar system’s most strangely-shaped inhabitants.

**Coyote-sized raptor dinosaur fossil found**

SALT LAKE CITY, 26 May—US paleontologists say they’ve discovered the fossil of a 130 million-year-old raptor dinosaur no bigger than a modern coyote in a national park in Utah.

The new raptor, called *Yurgovuchia doellingi*, was discovered in Utah’s Arches National Park in an area dubbed Doelling’s Bowl Bone Bed, named after paleontologist Helmut Doelling of the Utah Geological Survey, who first discovered the bone-rich site.

The new raptor is a member of the family of

dinosaurs known as Dromaeosauridae, who all sported a large curved claw on the second toe that may have served as a weapon for killing prey, a climbing aid, or digging tool.

The sharp-toothed, clawed carnivores roamed the Earth during the Cretaceous period, preying on smaller creatures.

The name of the raptor is derived from the Ute word *yurgovuch*, or coyote, and *doellingi* to honor Helmut Doelling, the *Los Angeles Times* reported.

### Breast milk antibodies help neutralize HIV

WASHINGTON, 26 May—Antibodies isolated from infected mothers' breast milk can inhibit the virus that causes AIDS, says a new discovery. HIV-1 can be transmitted from mother to child via breastfeeding, posing a challenge for safe infant feeding practices in areas of high HIV-1 prevalence. But only one in 10 HIV-infected nursing mothers is known to pass the virus to their infants.

"That is remarkable, because nursing children are exposed multiple times each day during their first year of life," said senior author Sallie Permar, assistant professor of paediatrics and infectious diseases at Duke University Medical Centre (DUMC). "We are asking if there is an immune response that protects 90 percent of infants, and could we harness that response to develop immune system prophylaxis (protection) during breastfeeding for mothers infected with HIV-1," Permar, who led the study, was quoted as saying in the journal *Public Library of Science*.

"Our work helped establish that these B-cells in breast milk can produce HIV-neutralizing antibodies, so enhancing the response or getting more mucosal B-cells to produce those helpful antibodies would be useful, and this is a possible route to explore for HIV-1 vaccine development," Permar said, according to a university statement.

"This is important work that seeks to understand what a vaccine must do to protect babies from mucosal transmission during breastfeeding," said Barton Haynes, MD, study co-author and a national leader in AIDS/HIV research who is also director of the Centre for HIV/AIDS Vaccine Immunology (CHAVI), as well as director of the Duke Human Vaccine Institute (DHVI). ### China urged to act on growth as exports show spark

BEIJING, 26 May—China should step up efforts to spur economic growth, including cutting the amount of cash that banks must hold as reserves, a central bank adviser said on Friday, even as the government saw tentative signs of a recovery in exports.

Recent comments by Premier Wen Jiabao and other leaders have fuelled market expectations that the government could roll out more stimulus measures to combat an economic slowdown.

Wen said this week the

government would step up policy fine-tuning to give more attention to supporting growth and existing government spending plans on key projects should be brought forward. "The government intends to stimulate the economy, but the intensity is probably not enough," Song Guoqing, an academic adviser to the People's Bank of China, told Reuters in an interview.

"There are some downward pressures (on the economy). Banks' reserve requirement ratio (RRR) could

### Jet likely to order 100 planes for \$3.75 b

NEW DELHI, 26 May—Jet Airways (JET NS) is expected to order more than 100 narrow-body aircraft for up to \$3.75 billion in 2012/13 as the largest Indian carrier grabs market share from its troubled rivals, a leading consultancy said.

The airline is understood to be actively evaluating Airbus's (EAD PA) narrow-body A320 aircraft, and is likely to lease up to 10 A330s to support expansion of its European network, the Centre

for Asia Pacific Aviation (CAPA) said in a report.

"In my estimate, at the current price and without taking into account the list price, the actual price for the order could be \$3.5 billion to \$3.75 billion," Kapil Kaul, regional head of CAPA, told Reuters.

A Jet spokeswoman was not immediately available for comment.

India's aviation sector has been beset by high costs of fuel and airport charges

and heavy debt, with all carriers except unlisted Indigo Airlines posting losses in the fiscal year that ended in March.

With two debt-ridden carriers, Kingfisher Airlines (KING NS) and Air India AINUL, curtailing most of their flights Jet stands to benefit the most, CAPA said.

Kingfisher, owned by flamboyant liquor baron Vijay Mallya, has been struggling to pay off \$1.3 billion loan and has slashed the number of its daily flights.

State-owned Air India, which survives on government bailout, has cancelled most of its international flights because of an ongoing strike by its pilots.

"Kingfisher's dramatic contraction from 66 to 16 operational aircraft, of which half are regional ATR aircraft, has left the domestic business

market open for Jet Airways," CAPA said.

ATR, which makes small haul planes, is an equal partnership between two major European aeronautics players, Alenia Aermacchi, a Finmeccanica (SIFI MI) company, and EADS (EAD PA).

The disruption at Air India's longhaul routes has driven North American and UK traffic to Jet, it said.

Jet and other private carriers such as SpiceJet (SPJT BO) and unlisted Go Air and Indigo are likely to post a combined profit of \$200 million in the fiscal year ending next March, the consultancy said.

However, losses at Kingfisher and Air India will keep the industry in the red to the tune of \$1.3 billion to \$1.4 billion in 2012/13, compared with a total industry loss of \$2 billion in the previous year, CAPA said.—Reuters

### Samsung S3 named bestseller pre-ordered phone of the year

LONDON, 26 May—Samsung's new Galaxy S3 phone has become the fastest selling pre-order phone of the year, according to Europe's largest independent mobile phone retailer Carphone Warehouse.

The retailer confirmed that thousands of customers have pre-ordered the new flagship Google Android device, *The Telegraph* reports.

Over 800 Carphone shops will stock the phone during its launch, which will go on sale on 29 May to

those who have pre-ordered it.

Graham Stapleton, Chief Commercial Officer at Carphone Warehouse, claimed, "Pre-order demand for the new Galaxy S3 has surpassed expectations since the handset was first unveiled two weeks ago.

The first 24 hours alone saw thousands placing their pre-order at Carphone Warehouse."

Earlier this week, it was reported that nine million S3s had been pre-ordered by more than 100 carriers.

Korean Samsung is the biggest mobile phone company in the world, ahead of long-time number one Nokia, and also the biggest maker of smartphones ahead of Apple.

The Galaxy S3 that was unveiled at an international launch held at London have innovative new features such as eye tracking so that the screen stays on while a user is looking at it.

The S3 also has a 4.8" display, one of the largest in the market, and the ability to automatically initiate a call

### Now a portable tool to detect dengue mosquitoes!

SYDNEY, 26 May—A new portable tool will now help doctors detect dengue virus-carrying mosquitoes and help reduce the likelihood of human infections around the world.

Every year, almost one million people, a large proportion of whom are children, require hospitalisation for severe dengue. Besides, over a 100 million people being infected globally can result in mild debilitation through to the life-threatening complications of dengue haemorrhagic fever.

The simple diagnostic tool, developed by David Muller and colleagues from the University of Queensland and research groups in Melbourne and South America, can be used in the field to detect dengue infection in large numbers of mosquitoes.



"Unlike other approaches to mosquito surveillance, this new tool provides information on whether mosquitoes are carrying dengue," Muller was quoted as saying in the *Journal of Virological Methods*.

"It is rapid, specific, and does not require specialised equipment or personnel. This means it will be viable for use in developing regions of the world where dengue is a significant health and economic burden," Muller said, according to a university statement.

Almost half of the world's population is at risk of contracting the virus which is transmitted to humans by the bite of an infectious female mosquito.

Paul Young, professor leader of Muller's team at the Australian Infectious Diseases Research Centre, said that rigorous field testing was still being conducted.

"The goal of this work is to provide the tools to not only assess mosquito numbers in the field but also their infection status," Young said.

"This information could then be directly uploaded with GPS information via mobile devices to coordinating centres," Young added.—Internet

## Afghan parliament approves US-Afghan security pact

KABUL, 26 May — Afghanistan's parliament approved on Saturday a strategic pact between Kabul and Washington, clearing the way for a US presence in the country for at least a decade after most foreign combat troops leave in 2014. "This was done for the interest of Afghanistan," said Daoud Kalakani, an MP from Kabul. Around 180 MPs were present and only four voted against, Kalakani said.

The deal, signed by US President Barack Obama and Afghanistan's Hamid Karzai in Kabul on 2 May, sets out a long-term US role in Afghanistan, including aid and advisers. Most of the contentious parts of the pact, which could have seen the obstructive parliament reject the deal, had earlier been removed and dealt with separately, including giving Afghans control of controversial night raids on homes and prisons used to detain insurgents. — Reuters

## Suspect in Kosovo organ trafficking arrested

PRISTINA, 26 May — A suspect in a human organ trafficking scandal that came to light in Kosovo in 2008 has been arrested in Israel, the European Union's police and justice mission in the Balkan country said on Friday. Moshe Harel was arrested along with several other people in connection with a parallel investigation in Israel, said the mission, known as EULEX.

Police in Kosovo accuse Israeli Harel of seeking out people in need of kidney transplants and luring donors to Kosovo from Turkey and the poorer countries of the former Soviet Union with the promise of 15,000 euros (20,000 US dollars) in payment. It is not known whether they received the money. The organs were then sold on for between 80,000 and 100,000 euros (100,000 US dollars-125,000 US dollars).

## UN inspectors find high-grade uranium traces in Iran

VIENNA, 26 May — United Nations nuclear inspectors have found uranium particles refined to a higher-than-expected level at an underground site where Iran has installed more than 50 percent more enrichment centrifuges, a UN watchdog report said on Friday. It said Teheran had told the UN agency that the presence of traces of highly refined uranium — still well below potential nuclear weapons-grade material — may happen for technical reasons beyond the operator's control.

The United States — which like its Western allies and Israel accuse Iran of seeking to develop atomic bomb capability — said the Iranian explanation could be correct and a leading US expert said he saw nothing "nefarious" in the discovery. The International Atomic Energy Agency report came a day after six world powers — the United States, Russia, Britain, Germany, China and France — failed to convince Iran to halt its most sensitive nuclear work during 23-24 May talks in Baghdad.

At the heart of the dispute is Iran's insistence on a right to enrich uranium and that economic sanctions should be lifted before it shelves activities that could lead to its achieving the ability to assemble nuclear weapons. Western powers insist Teheran must first shut down higher-grade enrichment before sanctions could be eased. Iran started enriching to a fissile concentration of 20 percent in 2010 and has since sharply expanded the activity, saying the material will serve as fuel for a medical reactor.

But a suspicious West is alarmed since such enhanced enrichment accomplishes much of the technical leap towards 90 percent — or weapons-grade — uranium. The IAEA report said environmental samples taken in February at Iran's Fordow facility — buried deep beneath rock and soil to protect it from air strikes — showed the presence of particles with enrichment levels of up to 27 percent. That is above the 20 percent enrichment level Iran has declared at the site, and takes it across the line from low-enriched to high-enriched uranium. "The Agency is assessing Iran's explanation and has requested further details," the IAEA report said.

## Qaeda-linked suicide bomber kills 12 in Yemen

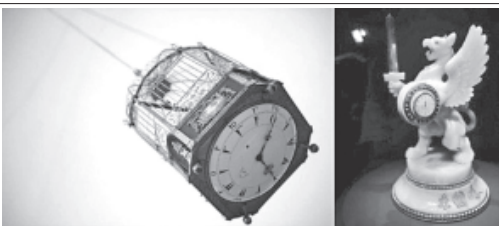
SANAA, 26 May — Two al Qaeda-linked suicide bombers targeting Shi'ite Muslims blew themselves up at a school and a protest march in northern Yemen on Friday killing at least 12 people, the defence ministry said. The attacks came less than a week after a suicide bomber in army uniform detonated an explosive belt at a military parade rehearsal in Sanaa, killing more than 90 soldiers and wounding at least 200 more. The United States and its Gulf Arab allies have watched with mounting alarm as al Qaeda-linked militants, emboldened by political instability in Yemen, have launched a series of audacious attacks in the impoverished state.

A militant Sunni Islamist

group affiliated to al Qaeda said it had carried out both attacks in revenge for the killing of fellow Sunni Muslims in Yemen's north, a Shi'ite rebel stronghold bordering Saudi Arabia. Sunni Muslim militants affiliated to al Qaeda view Shi'ite Muslims as heretics. One attack occurred in the northern al-Jawf province, where a suicide bomber drove into a school in which members of a Shi'ite rebel group, also known as Houthi, had gathered to pray, killing 12 people, a local official said. An offshoot of Ansar al-Sharia (Partisans of Islamic Law), itself an affiliate of al Qaeda's Yemen-based wing, said more than 20 Houthi "apostates" had been killed, in a statement claiming responsibility for the attack.

Earlier on Friday, another suicide bomber targeted a Houthi protest march in the rugged northern province of Saada, where the rebels have effectively carved out their own state within a state. There were no casualties in the attack, the Houthis said in a statement. "As the march was taking its first steps, the suicide bomber, who was wearing an explosive belt, tried to breach the security barriers and enter the square," read a statement from the Houthis' media office. "But those responsible for protecting the protest stopped and searched him, which made him nervous and he lost control, blowing himself up erroneously..." The al Qaeda-linked group put the death toll at more than 20. — Reuters

## Ontario forest fire halts gold projects

TORONTO, 26 May — Two more Canadian companies — Brigus Gold Corp and Lake Shore Gold Corp — have joined the list of miners halting operations in northern Ontario as dozens of forest fires caused power outages and forced evacuations in the region.

Brigus suspended gold production at its Black Fox mill near Timmins, about 700 kilometres (450 miles) north of Toronto, because of a power outage. The company expects electricity to be restored early next week, it said on Friday.

Its Black Fox mine, some 30 km away, is still operating, and the company is stockpiling ore to be

processed once power comes back online, the company said in a statement. Smoke from a forest fire about 15 km southwest of Lake Shore Gold's Timmins West project forced it to halt operations there on Thursday. The underground mine remains temporarily closed. "We canceled the day and night shift for tomorrow, and then it's just day to day after that," company spokesman Mark Utting said. Lake Shore sees no impact from the fire on its production forecast right now, as it has large stockpiles of ore available at both its Bell Creek mill and Timmins West mine. Operations at Bell Creek, east of Timmins, have not been affected by the fire.

There are now 45 fires active in the province, 43 of which are in the northeast region, according to the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources website. The blaze near Timmins has led the city to declare a state of emergency. About 120 people have been evacuated in the area. Dry conditions and strong winds have set off the fires, which have also threatened areas near Kirkland Lake, east of Timmins. Shares of Brigus closed down 1.2 percent at 84 Canadian cents on Friday on the Toronto Stock Exchange, while Lake Shore's stock slid 2.2 percent to 88 Canadian cents.

The governor of the Central Bank of Myanmar explained that opening of foreign currency accounts had been allowed on 17 May, 2012 under instruction No. 12/2012 so as to deal with foreign currency brought at money changer counters of authorized dealer license holder banks, held with FED form and earned as income.

The feasibility committee for opening of joint venture bank was formed on 21 May, 2012 and the committee would study the rules and regulations and procedures necessary, and the risks. The governor then explained the capacity, competitiveness of private banks and further requirements for working as joint-venture.

### Cold storage factories in Yangon faces power shortage

## 14-year-old Texan wins National Geographic Bee

WASHINGTON, 26 May — In the end, it came down to an educated guess as to which Bavarian city located on the Danube River was a legislative seat of the Holy Roman Empire from 1663 to 1806. Answer: The German City of Regensburg.

And with that, 14-year-old Rahul Nagvekar took the top prize on Thursday at the National Geographic Bee. It was a close victory. He and runner-up Vansh Jain had finished the championship round tied after five questions. Next, they were asked a series of tiebreakers in a sudden death round. For the first three, both wrote down the correct answer. On the fourth, only Nagvekar was correct. "It was a guess,

a 50-50 chance," said the eighth-grader from Sugar Land, Texas. "It just happened to be a good guess."

The first-time contender in the national competition will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship along with a trip to the Galapagos Islands. It was the third time a student from Texas has won the bee in the past four years. Nagvekar's mother, Urmila Sabnis, said that helping her son train required her to do a lot of research with her husband. "I have been

reading and reading and reading...just to be able to make it tough," said the software engineer who's originally from India. "He wouldn't take a question if it was easy."

Nagvekar said maps have fascinated him for years, but he's not sure what he'll study when he gets to college in a few years. He started preparing for the geography bee in fourth grade and has gone to the state bee every year, placing higher each time. This year's bee began with local competitions among 4

million students in schools across the country. "I think it's very important for people to know more about the world," Nagvekar said. "That helps with world conflict. It helps people understand others better. It helps people understand why problems happen and how to solve those problems." The bee tested the 10 finalists' knowledge of history, world cultures, landmarks and climates.

In one round, students were shown a graph with rainfall and temperature averages and asked to pick which City it depicted. Another round used Google Earth to zoom in on a museum, memorial or church, and the students guessed where it was located. President Barack Obama asked a question this year by video, quizzing the young contenders on their knowledge of recent events. Obama asked what Asian capital city on the Han River hosted a gathering of world leaders in March for a Nuclear Security Summit. — *Internet*

## S Korea's Incheon Airport named world's best for seventh straight year

SEOUL, 26 May — South Korea's Incheon International Airport has been named the world's best airport for the seventh consecutive year, the airport's operator said on Friday. South Korea's main gateway received the award for "Best Airport Worldwide" of 2011 by Airports Council International (ACI) at a ceremony held in Singapore on Thursday, according to Incheon International Airport Corporation.

The rating is the result of interviews ACI conducted with 350,000 passengers using airports worldwide. The Incheon Airport is the only airport in the world to have garnered the top spot seven times in a row since the industry's top honor was introduced in 1993, the operator said. Dubai International Airport won the award three times from 1993 to 1995. Singapore's Changi Airport came in second and Beijing Capital International Airport took third.

## US drone 'kills four militants' in NW Pakistan

PESHAWAR, 26 May — A US drone attack has killed at least four militants in a northwestern Pakistani tribal district bordering Afghanistan, according to security officials. The attack took place early Saturday, at a house near Miranshah, the main town of North Waziristan tribal district, a known hideout of Taleban and al-Qaeda linked militants, the Pakistani officials said. "A US drone fired two missiles at a house

and at least four militants were killed," a senior security official told AFP. "The identities of the militants killed in the drone strike were not immediately known," he said.

Two other officials confirmed the attack. Residents said they were woken up by the sound of low flying aircraft and the noise of the missile strike. "The house caught fire after missiles hit it and militants immediately cordoned off the area and

were searching in the rubble," a local tribesman told AFP, asking not to be named. Washington considers Pakistan's semi-autonomous northwestern tribal belt the main hub of Taleban and al-Qaeda militants plotting attacks on the West and in Afghanistan.

North Waziristan is a stronghold of the Haqqani network — Afghan insurgents blamed for a series of spectacular attacks on Western targets in Kabul — and Pakistani Taleban chief Hakimullah Mehsud. Islamabad has been resisting US pressure to launch a sweeping offensive against militants in the area. Pakistan says the missile attacks are counter-productive, violate its sovereignty, kill civilians and fuel anti-US sentiment. It was the fifth US drone strike reported in Pakistan since parliament in March demanded an end to such attacks. — *Internet*

## C-sections may raise childhood obesity risk

WASHINGTON, 26 May — Babies born by Caesarean section are twice as likely to be obese by age three as infants delivered vaginally, according to a new study published on Thursday in the *Archives of Disease in Childhood* journal. The study included more than 1,250 mother-child pairs admitted to Massachusetts hospitals between 1999 and 2002. All of the mothers joined the study before 22 weeks into their

pregnancy, and 25 percent of babies were delivered by C-section. The rest were delivered vaginally. Babies were measured and weighed at birth, at 6 months and again at age three.

Average birth weight was not statistically higher for babies born by C-section. But nearly 16 percent of children delivered via C-section were obese by the age of three, compared with 7.5 percent of those born vaginally. Also,

about 19 percent of the C-section kids were overweight compared to just less than 17 percent of the others. Those children delivered by C-section also had higher skinfold thickness (a measure of body fat) at age 3, the study showed. The researchers said their findings held even after they compensated for factors known to increase the risk of childhood obesity, including overweight mothers and high birth weight. — *Xinhua*

## Tornado doesn't stop Kansas couple's wedding day

KANSAS CITY, 26 May — In the plains of central Kansas, tornadoes are so unremarkable that guests barely flinched as a barrel-racing bride wed her bull-riding groom with a twister dropping from the sky just miles away. But for people living outside Tornado Alley, Caleb and Candra Pence's wedding last Saturday is generating the kind of buzz usually reserved for celebrity nuptials. The video of the service has gone viral, garnering more than 20,000 views on YouTube and a flurry of media coverage.

"It is amazing how fast it has taken off," said the groom's uncle, Lee Pence,

who shot the video. After Saturday's outdoor service on the groom's family farm near the small south-central Kansas town of Harper, the couple posed for photos with the twister visible behind them. The pictures capture them smiling serenely — the 21-year-old bride in a white gown and the 22-year-old groom in a cowboy hat and jeans. About eight to 10 miles away, the twister was damaging a farm and wind turbines. The National Weather Service has classified it as an EF-3 storm, packing winds of 138 to 167 miles per hour.

## Portugal to hold world's largest music festival

LISBON, 26 May — For the fifth time, Rock in Rio, the world's largest music festival, will kick off here on Friday, with 250,000 people expected during the five-day event. Smashing Pumpkins, Metallica, Stevie Wonder, Lenny Kravitz, Bruce Springsteen and Bryan Adams are among the singers and bands who will take part in the performances of the 2012 edition of Rock in Rio Lisbon.

Other than music, the festival offers entertainment. "We want (the festival) to be a Disneyland of music," festival director and founder Roberto Medina said.

Though Portugal is still struggling with the effects of the eurozone debt crisis, the

organizers want people to pay more to visit the festival. In 2010, the price of a one-day ticket was 58 euros (72.5 US dollars), and now it is 63 euros (78.7 US dollars).

"We believe that people will be more choosy regarding how they are going to spend their money, and we make an effort to offer quality, so we will be one choice of the Portuguese," Medina said. Rock in Rio originated in Brazil in 1985.

After its third edition in Rio de Janeiro, the festival expanded in 2004 to Lisbon, where it has an edition every two years. Since 2008, two editions have also been held in Madrid.

**Spain to inject 19 bil euros into Bankia**

TOKYO, 26 May—The Spanish government is preparing to inject 19 billion euros worth of public funds, or about 24 billion dollars, into the country's third largest bank.

The troubled Bankia group requested the additional bailout from the state's bank rescue fund on Friday.

Bankia's financial conditions have deteriorated due to an increase in real-estate related bad loans. It was partially nationalized earlier this month after the government converted 4.5 billion-euros worth of capital it had injected into common shares. Attention is focused on whether the move will help to dispel market concerns about Spain's fiscal conditions as well as its banks.

**Strong rains force evacuation of thousands in Cuba**

HAVANA, 26 May—Thousands of inhabitants in Cuba's central province Sancti Spiritus have been evacuated by Cuba's Civil Defence (CD) after strong rains causing landslides and flooding, local authorities said on Friday.

CD's chief of staff general Ramon Pardo Guerra said about 6,500 people living near the Zaza dam had been evacuated. Zaza is the largest dam in Cuba and has almost reached its maximum capacity of about one billion cubic metres.

CD also said that two people including a French citizen, were reported missing when trying to cross a river in Sancti Spiritus Province, about 400 kilometres east of Havana.

**Tsunami-carried motorbike to be shown in US**



TOKYO, 26 May—A motorcycle that was carried away by last year's tsunami and washed ashore on the western coast of Canada will be shown to the public at a museum in the United States. The Harley-Davidson motorcycle was found by Canadian Peter Mark last month on a beach on Queen Charlotte Island, about 6,500 kilometers from Japan.

The vehicle's license plate helped to identify the owner, 29-year-old Ikuo

Yokoyama. He lives in a coastal area of Miyagi Prefecture that was devastated by the 11<sup>th</sup> March earthquake and tsunami.

The US manufacturer of the bike had said it will restore the vehicle free of charge and send it back to its Japanese owner. But the company decided to preserve the bike as it is after the owner expressed the wish that his vehicle will be used to help remind people of the disaster.

The bike will be transferred from the Canadian city of Vancouver to the Harley-Davidson Museum in the US city of Milwaukee. The company says it will invite the finder of the bike and its owner when it displays the vehicle in the museum.

The Canadian finder told NHK that he understands what the owner wants to do and that showing the bike to many people is a good idea.

**Bodies of two missing British boaters found**

BANGALORE, 26 May—The bodies of two missing British expatriates have been found in a river in India, police said Friday. Ian Turton, 45, and Michael Easton, 57, who both lived in Bangalore, were reported missing when they failed to return from a weekend trip to the Cauvery River, *The Times of India* reported. Police told *The Hindu* the two might have drowned after hitting their heads on the rocks when their boat capsized.

The British newspaper, *The Independent*, said one Indian report suggested a canoe found on the river showed signs of a crocodile attack. Superintendent Kaushlendra Kumar, the police officer leading the search for the bodies, said investigators were able to pinpoint the time when the two men got into trouble because a cellphone stopped sending signals at 4:15 pm on 19 May. Turton, who was originally from York, worked for a US company, Tenneco Automotive, in Bangalore. Easton was from London.—*Internet*

**Rooftop gunman kills two in Finland**

HELSINKI, 26 May—A gunman opened fire from a rooftop in a Finnish town centre in the early hours of Saturday, killing two people and wounding several others, police said.

An 18-year-old man wearing camouflage clothing was arrested after the shooting in Hyvinkaa, a small town 56 km (34 miles) north of the capital Helsinki.

The motive for the shooting was unclear. It followed a series of shooting sprees in Finland in recent years and came less than a year after anti-immigrant gunman Anders Behring Breivik killed 77 people in a rampage in neighbouring Norway.

The suspect had no criminal background and police said he likely acted alone.

Police could not comment on whether he knew his victims. Both of the dead were 18-years old. One was male and one female. Seven others were wounded. One, a policewoman, was in critical condition.

Media reports said some of the victims, including one of the dead, were members of a Finnish baseball team, Hyvinkaan Tahko, which had won a game on Friday.

The police's regional chief inspector, Timo Leppala, said the shootings were first reported before 2 am (2300 GMT). The fled but was detained a few hours later, and police said they found two rifles afterwards.

Finland has one of the highest gun ownership rates in the world and a series of mass shootings prompted the government to toughen its gun laws last June. The suspect in Saturday's case did not have a license, police said.

In November 2007, an 18-year-old student killed eight people at a high school near Helsinki before turning the weapon on himself. The following September, a 22-year-old killed 10 people in a small western town of Kauhajokki before shooting himself.

In December 2009, a man shot four people dead in a shopping mall in Espoo after knifing his ex-girlfriend to death. The man later killed himself.—*Reuters*

## Hot dogs fall from the sky in Detroit

To celebrate a Detroit restaurant's 95th anniversary, 955 raw hot dogs were dropped from a hovering helicopter onto a soccer field. The stunt, arranged by WKQI-FM, Detroit, honoured the American Coney Island restaurant, whose third-generation owner, Grace Keros, noted the famed eatery has "been at the same location for the past 95 years."

The hot dogs, referred to at the restaurant as "coney dogs," were dumped from a helicopter several hundred feet off the ground, and fell from the sky before 25 contestants, chosen by the radio station, swarmed the field to see who could collect the most. *The Detroit News* reported.

Sylvia Lopez, 37, of Imlay City, Mich., was declared the winner, with 76 hot dogs stuffed into her shirt, and later admitted, "I love hot dogs, but I have to admit that right now my hands smell kind of frank." She will receive, for her efforts, \$1,000 in "gas money" from the radio station, and a year's supply of coney dogs from American Coney Island, the newspaper said.

## Teen solves centuries-old math problem

A 16-year-old in Germany who solved a centuries-old math problem credited his accomplishment to "schoolboy naivety." Shouryya Ray, whose family moved from India to Dresden when he was 12, solved a pair of fundamental particle dynamics problems posed by Isaac Newton more than 350 years ago to make it possible to calculate the flight path of a ball and predict how it will hit and bounce off a wall, *The Local.de* reported.

Ray said he learned about the problems when his school, which specializes in science, sent his 11th grade class to the Technical University in Dresden. The teenager said his "schoolboy naivety" would not allow him to accept that the problems couldn't be solved. "I asked myself: why can't it work?" he told the *Die Welt* newspaper. Ray said he is currently deciding whether to study math or physics when he moves on to college.

## Beijing: Only two flies per toilet

City officials in Beijing said they are suggesting new standards for public toilets to allow only two flies per facility.

The Beijing Municipal Commission of City Administration and Environment released new policies asking workers in parks, tourist areas, transport stations, hospitals, shopping centres and supermarkets to ensure toilets have no more than two flies buzzing around and no more than two pieces of discarded trash to be picked up each half hour, *China Daily* reported. Xie Guomin, head of the sanitation management division, told the *Beijing Evening News* the new rules, which also ask workers to ensure facilities are equipped to cater to the elderly and disabled, are optional and aim to improve the cleanliness of the city's public bathrooms.

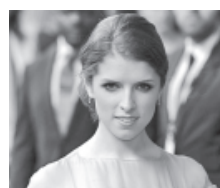

McIlroy's hopes had evaporated by the midway

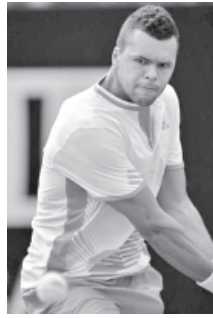

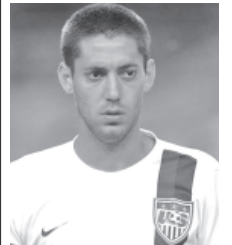

### Japan's swimmer Terakawa lays down Olympic marker

TOKYO, 26 May — Japan's Aya Terakawa clocked the world's second fastest time of the season to win the women's 100 metres backstroke at the Japan Open swimming championships, laying down a marker ahead of the Olympics.

The world 50m silver medalist, who set a new Japanese record at the national championships in April to qualify for the Olympics, improved on it with a time of 59.08 seconds on Friday, beating Shiho Sakai into second place.

"I'm happy, because I hadn't expected to swim a

personal best," said Terakawa, who was 0.09 seconds faster than the current world record pace at the 50m mark in 28.62.

"It was really tough at the last moment. I'm determined to swim 58.00s at the Olympics. You are not sure of the colour of the medal if you swim 58.90. I'll try to aim at clocking a better time," she added.

Japanese team head coach Norimasa Hirai said: "She showed she has the right attitude needed for the Olympics. She can now compete against Anastasia Zueva of Russia and Gao Chang of China."

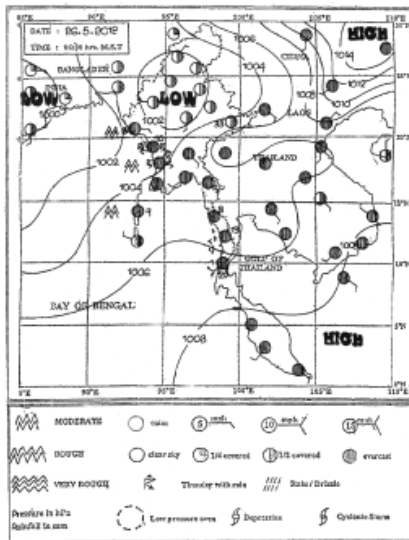

**Thailand's 15 provinces warned of flash floods**

BANGKOK, 26 May—The Meteorological Department of Thailand on Saturday issued warning for people in 15 provinces to prepare for possible heavy falls and the danger of floods, the *Bangkok Post* online reported.

The department warned people in 15 provinces across the country to prepare for widespread scattered rain with heavy falls in some areas and the danger of floods from Saturday to 29 May.

The 15 provinces are the northern provinces of Chiang Rai, Chiang Mai, Phayao, Nan, Lamphun, Lampang, Phrae, Uttaradit, Pitsanulok, the central provinces of Petchabun, Chanthaburi, Trat, and the southern province of Ranong, Phang Nga and Satun.

There will also be strong wind-generated 2- to 3-metre-high waves in the Andaman Sea. All shipping operations should proceed with caution and small boats should keep ashore during the period, the department said.—Xinhua

**About 30 tourists trapped in cable cars in Guangxi**

NANNING, 26 May—About 30 tourists were trapped on Saturday afternoon in cable cars suspended mid air at a mountain scenic resort in Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region.

Around 11 am Saturday, the local fire brigade received a report that about 60 tourists, including some foreigners, were trapped in the Yaoshan mountain scenic spot in the city of Guilin, said local rescuers.

Rescuers had rescued 30 of the trapped as of 2 pm. Rescue work is still under way but is hampered by the steep mountainous terrain.

The accident was probably caused by power failure, said rescuers.

**US reporter detained in Ethiopia 'to be released'**

ADDIS ABABA, 26 May—A Voice of America (VOA) reporter detained while covering a protest in the Ethiopian capital will be released from jail Saturday, a government spokesperson said.

"We decided to secure his release," Shimeles Kemal told AFP, adding that he is expected to be released "soon."

VOA said reporter Peter Heinlein was arrested Friday while trying to interview members of Ethiopia's Muslim minority, who have been protesting alleged government interference in their affairs.

Shimeles said Heinlein was detained because he failed to produce his identity card when approached by police.

"He refused to explain his identity or to explain that he was a journalist, then they

took him to the police station," said Shimeles.

Shimeles had initially said Heinlein could face deportation for failing to "abide by the rules of the land," but later told AFP the reporter will be permitted to stay in the country.

"I thought he might be deported, but this is not the case," he said.

Several journalists have been detained and charged in Ethiopia in recent months, including two Swedish journalists sentenced to 11 years in prison in December under the country's anti-terrorism law.

The press watchdog Committee to Protect Journalists says Ethiopia's media is one of the most restricted in the world.

## French Open champion Li Na wants to "remain the same"

PARIS, 26 May — French Open winner Li Na on Friday said she was focusing on the preparation for the first round's games, reiterating her willingness to keep a normal life after winning the French title last season.
