Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker meets Vice-President of German Parliament

NAY PYI TAW, 30 May—Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann received Vice-President of German Parliament Dr Otto Solms and party at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here this morning.

During the meeting, the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker said democratic reforms were already taking place in Myanmar. However, democratic transition could not be successful unless combined with economic reforms. Germany was the leading global economy pioneering in the field of science and technology. The Speaker requested the Vice-President to participate in the reform process of Myanmar, proposing for close cooperation between the two parliaments.

The Vice-President of the German Parliament praised the democratic reforms of Myanmar, saying that Germany was willing to take part in economic reforms of Myanmar. Businesses in Germany were independent ones without the government's involvement. There must be reliable and safe investment laws to make investments in Myanmar. There must also be laws deterring the undesirable intervention as businessmen from Germany were just waiting the emergence of such laws to make investments in Myanmar especially in small and medium enterprises.

The German Parliament usually enacted laws with special focus on rule of law, market economy and human rights. It viewed democracy as the process of endless reforms and it could adopt appropriate programmes at an opportune time.

In Germany, people's representatives conveyed the rights of the people to the parliament which elected the

government and the government in turn took care of the public wishes. Thus, democracy was going from strength to strength, noted the Vice-President.

Make ongoing reforms more transparent and visionary

Changes take time and need patience. Changes need to be well embedded and guaranteed so that people can feel confident in their own future. Everyone has the right to fulfill their dreams but not at the expense of others. Do not forget that Rome wasn't built in a day.

Soon after its inception, the new government has embarked on a series of political, economic and administrative reforms in the process of transition to democracy. The reform process has come as a surprise to many in the international community who are waiting any subsequent policy changes to make a better assessment.

There will be no turning back in the process of democratic reforms of Myanmar. The reform strategy the new government initiates is irreversible and there will be no backsliding or derailment in the road to democracy.

Our transition to democracy is indeed not without challenges. We are prepared and resolute to overcome all these challenges and continue our endeavours until we achieve our stated goal. China sacks official over dam accident amid flood concerns

CHANGSHA, 30 May—A township official in central China's Hunan Province has been removed from his post after the provincial flood control headquarters decided to hold local authorities responsible for a dam breach that occurred on Friday. The headquarters issued a circular on Wednesday stating that precautionary measures and warnings were not implemented before the collapse of a dam on the Badoucun Reservoir on 25 May.

Although no casualties occurred, a resulting flood inundated several houses and farms. Liu Xiaoyang, the Communist Party of China (CPC) chief of Majitang

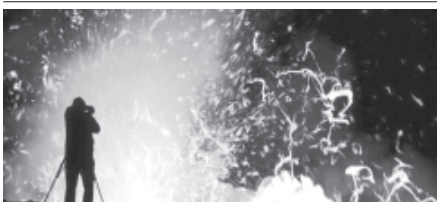
township, has been removed from his post. Other officials involved are being investigated for their role in the incident, according to the circular. The provincial flood control authority said on Wednesday that the province is dealing with severe flooding following torrential downpours earlier this month. Most of the province's 13,000-plus reservoirs are nearing 80 to 90 percent of their maximum water storage capacity, the authority said. The authority has asked governments at multiple levels to organize round-the-clock patrols along river embankments and dams during rainstorms. Xinhua

Indonesian, US navies commence joint military drill

JAKARTA, 30 May— Indonesian navy and US navy commenced a joint military drill programme held in Indonesia's East Java Province, aimed at improving ties and military operation professionalism between the two navies, local media reported on Wednesday. The 8-day joint drill operation, called "Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training 2012" (CARAT), beginning from Wednesday is held on waters off East Java Province's coast cities of Surabaya and Situbondo.

US navy dispatched 830 mariners and three navy vessels called *USS Germantown* (LSD-42), *USS Vandegrift* (FFG-48) and *USCGC Waesche* in the annual programme. Meanwhile Indonesian navy engaged three vessels *KRI Diponegoro-365*, *KRI Banjarmasin-592* and *KRI Sutedi Senoputra-378*, several helicopters and navy surveillance planes. The navy also deployed some 1,244 mariners in the programme, the *Antara* news service reported.

According to Indonesian Navy's Eastern Fleet Commander, Rear Admiral Agung Pramono, this year the mariners and navy ship crews will undertake several exercises, among others Medical Subject Matter Expert Exchange (SMEE), SMEE intelligence operation, SMEE Engineering and symposium aimed at honing up the navy's operational skills. — Xinhua

New deadly quake shakes northern Italy

CAVEZZO, 30 May— An earthquake killed 17 people and injured about 350 in northern Italy on Tuesday, spreading fear among thousands of residents living in tents after a similarly strong tremor in the same region flattened their homes nine days ago. Rescuers were searching through the rubble of houses and warehouses in the Emilia-Romagna region, where several building sites had just reopened after the previous quake on 20 May. Officials said 17 people were confirmed dead, more than twice the number killed in the 20 May quake that, like Tuesday's, had its epicenter near the city of Modena. The number of those forced to leave their homes doubled to 14,000.

Many residents ran out

of buildings when they felt the 5.8-magnitude tremor, which hit shortly after 3 am EDT just as operations to rebuild the quake-struck region were under way.

"As we were coming down the stairs, we heard the sound of crumbling houses around us. There was a big cloud of dust," said 72-year-old Giulio in Cavezzo, a badly damaged village about 30 km (20 miles) from Modena where three died. Rescuers searched tirelessly for survivors despite initial operations being hampered by disruption to the mobile phone network and to the railway network around Bologna.

A woman was pulled alive from the debris of her house in Cavezzo after 12 hours searching, according

to Sky Italia. The quake was the most deadly to strike Italy since 2009 when a tremor partially destroyed the central city of L'Aquila, killing about 300 people and leaving thousands homeless. With its streets deserted, Cavezzo looked like a ghost

town. A shop in the centre still had fruit displayed on stalls outside in the street. In a nearby empty coffee shop a

half-eaten croissant was left on a plate on the bar and an apron lay on the floor. Reuters

Romney clinches Republican 2012 nomination in Texas

WASHINGTON, 30 May— Mitt Romney clinched the Republican presidential nomination on Tuesday with a resounding victory in Texas

and now faces a five-month sprint to convince voters to trust him over Democratic President Barack Obama in the 6 November election. Although the race has been essentially over for weeks, Romney finally cleared the benchmark of 1,144 delegates needed to become the Republicans' presidential candidate after a long, bitter primary battle with a host of conservative rivals. He will be formally nominated at the Republicans' convention in Florida in late August. In a statement, Romney said he was humbled to win enough

of Texas' 155 delegates to secure the nomination. "Our party has come together with the goal of putting the failures of the last three and a half years behind us. I have no illusions about the difficulties of the task before us. But whatever challenges lie ahead, we will settle for nothing less than getting America back on the path to full employment and prosperity," he said.

Romney's big day was overshadowed by his appearance with real estate tycoon and reality TV star Donald Trump, who organized a major fund-raiser for Romney in Las Vegas. A famous self-promoter, Trump has been loudly fixated over whether Obama was born in the United States despite clear evidence that he was born in Hawaii, and Romney did nothing to publicly rein him in. — Reuters

Pakistani doctor in bin Laden hunt rejected US escape

WASHINGTON, 30 May— US authorities said a Pakistani doctor who helped the CIA track down Osama bin Laden turned down an opportunity to leave his country and resettle overseas with his family, two US officials told Reuters on Tuesday. Dr Shakil Afridi was jailed last week in Pakistan for 33 years for treason and the Obama administration has come under steady criticism for its handling of his case.

The US officials said the resettlement offer for Afridi came about the time of the 1 May, 2011, raid in which US Navy SEAL commandos killed the al-Qaeda leader at his complex in Abbottabad, Pakistan. They indicated that Afridi's family would have been welcome to leave Pakistan with him as part of the resettlement plan. The officials said he rejected the offer for reasons that are

unclear. Afridi was accused of running a fake vaccination campaign in Abbottabad and used cheek swabs to try to gather DNA from bin Laden's children to confirm the identity of those living in the compound.

The DNA effort ultimately did not succeed but US sources have told Reuters he helped American operatives locate and follow the bin Laden courier who led them to the Abbottabad hideout.

The offer for Afridi to leave Pakistan was confirmed independently by two US officials. The White House and State Department declined comment on the matter. Afridi's case has damaged US-Pakistan relations with outraged US senators voting last week to cut aid to Pakistan by \$33 million — \$1 million for each year of the doctor's

prison sentence. Pakistan has said Washington should respect its court's decision.

Pakistani authorities arrested Afridi several weeks after the bin Laden raid. In the intervening period, US authorities believed they would have had ample time to get him out of the country if he had wanted to leave. "Before he was arrested, Doctor Afridi was offered opportunities to leave Pakistan with his family but he turned those down," one of the US officials said. — Reuters

Chinese man pleads guilty to NY Fed cyber theft

NEW YORK, 30 May—A Chinese computer programmer on Tuesday pleaded guilty to stealing software code from the Federal Reserve Bank of New York in a case that raised cyber-security concerns when he was arrested five months ago. Bo Zhang, 33, admitted last August that he illegally copied the software code to an external hard drive and took it home. The FBI questioned him when he admitted the theft but did not arrest him until January. Congressional

investigators became concerned that the New York Fed was vulnerable to cyber attacks after the arrest. Zhang has been cooperating and has been free on bail and prosecutors have recommended that he be sentenced to no more than 1-to-1-1/2 years in prison. He faces deportation after he serves his prison sentence. Instead of prosecuting Zhang under trade secrets or computer fraud and abuse statutes, US authorities charged him with theft of

government property. The New York Federal Reserve was given the task of moving the Government Wide Accounting program, developed to help track the billions of dollars the United States government transfers daily, from an antiquated IBM mainframe computer to the Internet, according to a person familiar with the project. Zhang was hired in May 2011 as a contractor to help with the project. Reuters

Facebook may launch smart phone next year

WASHINGTON, 30 May—Facebook may launch its first-ever smartphone by next year, a new report has revealed. According to Stuff.co.nz, Facebook has sought engineers to work on building hardware for a Facebook smartphone, which would mark the social network's third attempt to develop a smartphone, the report cited.

The news comes as search engine giant Google completed the acquisition of Motorola Mobility for 12.5 billion dollars earlier this week, a move that could help Facebook counter that with its own foray into the smartphone hardware business. Rumours have been rife about a Facebook phone for the past few years. Although Facebook was

reportedly first working on a smartphone in 2010, sources said the initiative stopped due to development complications. Meanwhile, it has also emerged that Facebook and manufacturer HTC were working together to develop a mobile device under the code name "Buffy", which is still under development. Internet

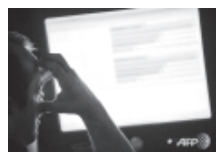
Smallest ever five-ringed structure created and imaged

WASHINGTON, 30 May—A team of European scientists has created and imaged the smallest possible five-ringed structure—about 100,000 times thinner than a human hair. A combination of clever synthetic chemistry and state-of-the-art imaging techniques allowed the Scientists at the Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC), the University of Warwick and IBM Research—Zurich to bring a single molecule to life in a picture.

The scientists decided to make and visualise olympicene whose five-ringed structure was entered on ChemSpider, the RSC's free online chemical database of over 26 million records two years ago. "When doodling in a planning meeting, it occurred to me that a molecular structure with three hexagonal rings above two others would make for an interesting synthetic challenge," said Professor Graham Richards CBE, RSC Council member. "I wondered: could someone actually make it, and produce an image of the actual molecule?" he noted.

Chemists at the University of Warwick, Dr David Fox and Anish Mistry, used some clever synthetic organic chemistry — the modern molecule designer's toolbox — to build olympicene. "Alongside the scientific challenge involved

in creating olympicene in a laboratory, there's some serious practical reasons for working with molecules like this," said Dr Fox. "The compound is related to single-layer graphite, also known as graphene, and is one of a number of related compounds which potentially have interesting electronic and optical properties. "For example these types of molecules may offer great potential for the next generation of solar cells and high-tech lighting sources such as LEDs," he stated. A first glimpse of the molecule's structure was obtained by Dr Giovanni Costantini and Ben Moreton at Warwick using scanning tunnelling microscopy. A higher resolution technique was however needed to unravel its atomic-level anatomy. To truly bring olympicene to life, the Physics of Nanoscale Systems Group at IBM Research – Zurich in Switzerland analysed the chemical structure of olympicene with unprecedented resolution using a complex technique known as noncontact atomic force microscopy. Using the technique IBM scientists imaged a single olympicene molecule just 1.2 nanometres in width, about 100,000 times thinner than a human hair.—Internet

China's Huawei and ZTE deny getting illegal subsidy

HONG KONG, 30 May—China's top telecoms gear makers Huawei and ZTE denied receiving illegal government subsidies that helped them undercut rivals in recent years, after media reported the European Union planned to take action over unfair trade practices. Action by the EU could spark a trade war, analysts warned. Cheap prices have allowed Huawei HWT UL and ZTE Corp to grab a big share

of the global network gear market in recent years, pushing firms such as Nokia Siemens Networks NOKI UL and Alcatel Lucent (ALUA PA) to the brink of extinction. The Financial Times quoted unidentified EU officials and executives as saying the Commission had been gathering evidence to show Huawei and ZTE had used subsidies to allow them to sell goods below cost in the EU. A spokesman for EU trade chief Karel De Gucht said he could not confirm the contents of the FT report.

Both companies said on Tuesday they had not been contacted by the EU. "We deny claims made in the media that Huawei employs dumping practices and has benefited from illegal state subsidies," Huawei said in an emailed statement. ZTE said it "receives no illegal or hidden subsidies, nor does it dump products in any

markets where it operates". EU trade ministers are scheduled to meet in Brussels on Thursday, an EU diplomat said. "We think that though the ministers will have an informal debate over lunch on China, and they might touch on this topic, there will be no formal decision," he said. "It's sensitive because there are some European firms in the Chinese market that might face consequences." A European Commission report in 2011 said China's largest telecom equipment makers benefit from significant government support, including "massive" credit lines from state-owned banks. However, European telecoms firms rely on smaller-scale export credits from government-backed bodies, emphasising the blurred lines marking what is allowed under international rules and what is not.—Reuters

Panasonic mulls halving personnel at headquarters

OSAKA, 30 May — Japanese consumer electronics giant Panasonic Corp is considering cutting 3,000 to 4,000 of the 7,000 personnel who worked at its headquarters within the current financial year in a bid to cut costs, local press reported on Tuesday. The company will cut the number through a series of measures including early retirement and transfers to subsidiaries, according to the report. Panasonic saw a record 772 billion yen (about 9.77 billion US dollars) group net loss in fiscal 2011 which ended on 31 March, this year. Panasonic's reform plan follows similar measures taken by its rival Sony Corp, which announced a plan to cut 10,000 jobs last month.—Xinhua

Intel set to rise on move into mobile-Barrons

PETAH TIKVA, 30 May—Shares of computer chip maker Intel Corp (INTC O) could rise as much as 50 percent over the next two years as the company pushes into smart phones and other wireless mobile devices, according to a report in Barron's financial newspaper. The growth in cloud computing—the storage and transmission of remote data—should also give Intel shares a boost as several major storage providers use Intel processors in their servers, the report in the 28 May edition of the weekly newspaper said. Intel's new lower-power chips will grab a bigger share in smartphones in India, China, France, the UK and the United States over the next several months, the report said. "Intel will be a formidable competitor in the smartphone and tablet markets shortly," Todd Lowenstein, a portfolio manager for HighMark Capital Management, is quoted as saying in the Barron's article, adding that has not yet been factored into the share price. He has a 24-month price target of \$38 to \$40 on Intel shares. They closed at \$25.74 on Nasdaq on Friday.—Reuters

Spanish bond prices fall

TOKYO, 30 May—Spain's bond prices have fallen on growing concerns about the country's fiscal health and its banking sector. Spanish bonds were sold in Europe on Monday, temporarily increasing the yield on the benchmark 10-year government bond to 6.5-percent. Last weekend, the Spanish government decided to effectively nationalize the country's third-largest bank, Bankia, by injecting 19-billion euros, or 24-billion dollars in additional public funds.

This fueled fears about more bank bailouts and a surge in government spending.

Spanish banks are struggling due to the after-effects of the collapsed property bubble.

On the stock exchange in Madrid, Bankia's shares lost nearly 30-percent at one stage. Shares of other major banks were also sold across the board.

Spain's Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy said at an emergency news conference that his government currently does not need to ask for EU assistance in acquiring funds needed to recapitalize banks.

Health Tip: Keep magnets away from children

Small magnets that dislodge from toys or products for adults pose choking and ingestion hazards. If swallowed by young children, they can lead to choking or serious injury to the stomach and digestive tract.

The American Academy of Pediatrics mentions these guidelines for parents to help prevent magnet-related injuries:

- * Never allow very young children to play with or touch objects that contain magnets.
- * Carefully watch older children who play with such toys.
- * Don't purchase large sets of magnets, in groups of more than 100, because it's difficult to keep track of any that are missing.
- * Make sure teens understand the serious dangers of using magnets as fake piercings.

WHO agrees to address research on neglected diseases

GENEVA, 30 May—Campaigners on Saturday welcomed a World Health Organization pledge to tackle research and funding gaps concerning some of the developing world's biggest killer diseases.

Member countries are expected to hold talks later this year on an expert group's recommendations that a globally binding convention is needed to address neglected tropical diseases (NTD), tuberculosis and others currently overlooked by the research industry. It follows a meeting of the WHO's decision-making body, the World Health Assembly, in Geneva where members adopted a resolution calling on director general Margaret Chan to set up the meeting.

The document, the result of three-day negotiations, meanwhile urges governments and the private sector to boost investment in health research for diseases which disproportionately affect the developing world. "These were extremely tough negotiations with the US, the EU—led by France—and Japan making every effort to block progress on what health experts agree should be the way forward to meet the medical needs of people in developing countries," said Michelle Childs from Medecins Sans Frontieres.

"While there's no doubt we are disappointed that there was not an immediate decision to move towards a research and development convention, countries have agreed to a formal process for considering the report's recommendations and will bring these discussions back to the WHO in January," said the policy director for medical charity's access campaign.

The WHO-appointed group said in a report published last month that public investment in health research was currently dominated by

wealthy countries and their own needs. The panel recommended a "global binding instrument" to help developing countries access the drugs and technologies they require and suggested member states commit 0.01 percent of their GDP to fund the work. In a draft resolution submitted to the WHO, Kenya urged the immediate set-up of a negotiating body to develop a convention based on the group's recommendations.

This was countered by a document from the US, Japan and others supporting more informal consultations.

After about 15 hours of talks the agreed resolution requested WHO chief Margaret Chan "hold an open-ended member states meeting in order to analyse the report and the feasibility of the recommendations."

The Drugs for Neglected Diseases initiative (DNDi) said it hopes that national and regional-level talks also requested in the resolution will pave the way for a global response.—Internet

Scientists develop bird flu test kit

SINGAPORE, 30 May—Scientists have developed a H5N1 bird flu test kit that can now rapidly detect all existing strains of the H5N1 viruses in a single test with almost 100 per cent accuracy, within a few hours.

The scientists are from the Experimental Therapeutics Centre under the Agency for Science and Technology Research and clinicians from Tan Tock Seng Hospital.

A joint statement by the various parties including A*STAR said the kit was co-developed by Dr

Masafumi Inoue, a senior project director of research scientist and Technology Development

from ETC and Dr Timothy Barkham, a senior consultant of Laboratory Medicine from TTSH. This newly launched H5N1 test kit has been clinically validated by several hospitals in Southeast Asia.

Local small and medium enterprise, AITbiotech, a regional provider of genomic services and molecular diagnostics kits, has recently signed a licence agreement with Exploit Technologies, the technology transfer arm of A*STAR, to market this H5N1 kit regionally.

Japanese shipbuilders to collaborate

Tokyo, 30 May—Two Japanese shipbuilding companies have formed a technological collaboration to cope with competition from Chinese and South Korean shipyards, and the strong yen.

Mitsubishi Heavy Industries announced on Monday that it has signed an agreement to build container ships with Imabari Shipbuilding. Imabari is the top Japanese shipbuilder while Mitsubishi ranks 4th.

The two companies aim to merge Mitsubishi's advanced technology with Imabari's mass production capability.

Mitsubishi will supply technology for liquefied natural gas fuel systems to cut emissions. The company will also provide an energy-saving system that uses air bubbles to reduce drag on the ship's hull. The firms hope to recover market share in the lucrative container ship industry.—NHK

Service industry trade fair opens in Beijing

TOKYO, 30 May—A trade fair focusing on the service industry has opened in Beijing to boost domestic consumption and maintain economic growth. Companies from 82 countries, including Japan, are participating in the first fair of its kind to be held in China. In the opening ceremony, Premier Wen Jiabao said China's service industry has potential for high growth. He expressed hope that foreign companies will expand their business in China.

Japanese companies have set up a huge booth to market their products and show their know-how to improve the quality of services.

One of the products attracting lots of attention was a customer data system that uses facial recognition technology. The system processes data including age and gender of customers. It's designed to help people like waiters at restaurants and salespeople to maximize their services. Visitors said Japanese companies are known for their courteous client services and have a good chance to succeed in China. The Chinese government is sponsoring the fair. It believes that the development of the service industry is necessary to increase jobs.

The country is struggling with a business slowdown triggered by the European financial crisis.—NHK

World No Tobacco Day 2012

World No Tobacco Day is celebrated around the world every year on May 31. This yearly celebration informs the public on the dangers of using tobacco, the business practices of tobacco companies, what WHO is doing to fight the tobacco epidemic, and what people around the world can do to claim their right to health and healthy living and to protect future generations. The theme for 2012 is “**Tobacco Industry Interference**”. The campaign will focus on the need to expose and counter the tobacco industry’s brazen and increasingly aggressive attempts to undermine global tobacco control efforts.

The Tobacco Epidemic

Total consumption of tobacco products is increasing globally, though it is decreasing in some high-income and upper middle-income countries. More than 80% of the one billion smokers worldwide live in low- and middle-income countries, where the burden of tobacco-related illness and death is heaviest.

Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of death. This year, more than 5 million people will die from a tobacco-related heart attack, stroke, cancer, lung ailment or other disease. That does not include the more than 600,000 people—more than a quarter of them children—who will die from exposure to second-hand smoke. The annual death toll from the global epidemic of tobacco use could rise to 8 million by 2030. Having killed 100 million people during the 20th century, tobacco use could kill 1 billion during the 21st century. Tobacco users who die prematurely deprive their families of income, raise the cost of health care and hinder economic development.

Tobacco is grown in 124 countries, occupying 3.8 million hectares of agricultural land. World tobacco production peaked in 1997 at over 9 million tones and has since declined by almost a quarter to 7.1 million tones in 2009.

Tobacco is primarily grown in low and middle-income countries, where it is a contribution to undernourishment, because the land is used to grow tobacco rather than food. IN 2009, SIX OF THE TOP TEN TOBACCO-PRODUCING COUNTRIES HAD UNDERNOURISHMENT RATES BETWEEN 5% AND 27%. Tobacco farming negatively affects the environment. Deforestation results from wood being needed for the curing process and for hanging leaves to dry. Each year, 20,000 hectares of forests are cleared to cure tobacco. Tobacco leaches the soil of many nutrients, so fertilizers and pesticides are heavily used in tobacco production. These chemicals endanger workers and create runoff that pollutes the environment.

There are well over 500 cigarette factories spread around the globe, each responsible for thousands of premature deaths and massive, avoidable costs to society. THESE FACTORIES COLLECTIVELY PRODUCE NEARLY 6 TRILLION CIGARETTES EVERY YEAR, ROUGHLY 13% MORE THAN A DECADE AGO. In 2010, cigarettes were produced in the majority of countries worldwide, and about a million cigarettes were manufactured every five seconds.

Estimates of revenues from the global tobacco industry vary widely but are likely approaching half a trillion dollars annually. Although tobacco is ultimately a financial burden on the government and health-care systems of countries, it is also a source of government revenue, though tobacco companies. Illicit trade in tobacco products has serious health, economic, and social implications. Circumventing tobacco taxes undermines tax and price policies, which are among the most effective mechanisms to control tobacco use, as well as other tobacco control measures, such as youth access laws or mandatory health-warning labels. Tobacco smuggling can also lead to higher levels of corruption. Illicit cigarette trade is highly profitable for the transnational tobacco companies, allowing them to circumvent tobacco taxation.

The WHO committee of experts on tobacco industry documents

In 2000, the WHO committee of experts on tobacco industry documents published *Tobacco industry strategies to undermine tobacco control activities at the World Health Organization*. This report summarizes evidence obtained from internal tobacco industry

documents of actions taken to influence and undermine WHO tobacco control policies and programmes. The committee found that the industry used a range of strategies to weaken or prevent advances in tobacco control.

The committee also found that “the evidence shows that tobacco companies have operated for many years with the deliberate purpose of subverting the efforts of WHO to address tobacco issues. The attempted subversion has been elaborate, well financed, sophisticated and usually invisible. That tobacco companies resist proposals for tobacco control comes as no surprise, but what is now clear is the scale, intensity and most importantly, the tactics, of their campaigns. To many in the international community, tobacco prevention may be seen today as a struggle against chemical addition, cancers, cardiovascular diseases and other health consequences of smoking. This inquiry adds to the mounting evidence that it is also a struggle against an active, organized and calculating industry.”

Eight domains of tobacco industry interference

There are many strategies used by the industry and its allies to monitor and undermine advances in tobacco control. The diversity of these strategies demonstrates that the mission to thwart tobacco control is global and based on the broad objective of establishing the industry as ‘socially responsible’ and a ‘partner’ with government in tobacco control. There is also evidence of the objective of stopping or weakening policies known to affect sales. The industry cannot only manipulate the media by raising doubt about scientific research, it can also attack public media campaigns by requesting information, pursuing litigation or attempting to limit the audience and restrict the message of the campaign.

Eight domains of tobacco industry interference can be identified as follows:

1. Attempts to undermine science and legitimate messages from scientific quarters
2. Manipulation of the media
3. Public relations
4. Tactics designed to gain control of the public agenda
5. Lobbying
6. Use of front groups and artificially created grassroots movements
7. Intimidation
8. Harassment of tobacco control professionals

WHO FCTC and Tobacco Industry

The illicit tobacco trade is addressed by Article 15 of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC). Parties to the Convention are negotiating a protocol that builds upon the original treaty and aims to strengthen international cooperation in fighting the illicit tobacco trade. Despite the irreconcilable conflicts of interest between the tobacco industry and the public health community, the industry is seeking to enter WHO FCTC illicit trade protocol negotiations and national-level illicit trade control activities. In many parts of the world, the tobacco industry works closely with governments to combat illicit trade. This collaboration involves many risks and conflicts with Article 5.3 of the WHO FCTC.

Article 5.3 of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control requires that ‘In setting and implementing their public health policies with respect to tobacco control, Parties shall act to protect these policies from commercial and other vested interests of the tobacco industry in accordance with national law’.

Myanmar and the WHO FCTC

In May 1999, the World Health Assembly the governing body of the World Health Organization adopted a resolution (WHA 52.18) which paved the way for starting multi-lateral negotiations on the WHO FCTC and possible related protocols. Myanmar along with fellow Member status actively participated in the negotiating process of the WHO FCTC and strongly supported the convention. Myanmar delegates expressed their strong commitment towards comprehensive tobacco control measures and voiced for the need of a comprehensive ban on all forms of tobacco advertisement including cross-border advertising. Myanmar proudly hosted the 4th Inter-country Consultation Meeting of Framework Convention on Tobacco Control in August

2002, where the countries of South-East Asia Region issues the “Yangon Declaration”. Myanmar became a signatory to the FCTC on the 23rd of October 2003 and became a Party to the Convention on the 20th of April, 2004; it was the 11th country to become Party to the Convention.

Tobacco Control in Myanmar

The National Programme on Tobacco Control was officially launched in January 2000 with the drafting and approval of the National Policy on Tobacco Control and Plan of action. In collaboration with Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health has launched the Tobacco Free School Programme in 2003. The Tobacco Free Youth Programme was also implemented by School and Youth Health Project since 2009.

The Myanmar Tobacco Control Programme has been implementing its activities in line with the six MPOWER policies recommended in the “WHO Report on the Global Tobacco Epidemic 2008”.

1. Monitor tobacco use and prevention policies: The National Tobacco Control Programme has been monitoring tobacco use through conducting of sentinel prevalence studies and global tobacco surveillance system, i.e. by conducting Global Health Professions Students Surveys, Global School Personnel Surveys and Global Youth Tobacco Surveys periodically. The recent studies done in 2011 showed an increasing trend in both smoking and smokeless tobacco use, especially among male. The highlights of the 2011 GYTS are as follows:

- 18.6% of students currently use any form of tobacco; 6.8% currently smoke cigarettes; 17.4% currently use other tobacco products other than cigarettes or cheroot.
- SHS exposure—one-third of the students live in homes where others smoke, and one-third of the students are exposed to smoke around others in outdoor public places; close to half the students have at least one parent who smokes.
- Over half the students think smoke from others is harmful to them.
- Nine in 10 students think smoking in public places should be banned.
- Nine in 10 current smokers want to stop smoking.
- 8.8% of students have an object with cigarette brand logo on it.
- More than nine in 10 students saw anti-smoking media messages in the past 30 days; seven in 10 students saw pro-cigarette ads on billboards and nearly 3 in 5 saw pro-cigarette ads in newspapers or magazines in the past 30 days.

2. Protect people from tobacco smoke: In line with the Myanmar Tobacco Control Policy and Plan of Action, all the health facilities had been established as smoke-free since 2001; education department started to establish tobacco-free schools in 2002 and sports grounds were declared smoke-free in 2002. The National legislation prohibits smoking at public places, public transport and in enclosed public places. However, it is a challenging issue to be aware of and follow the regulations accordingly.

3. Offer help to quit tobacco: Community-based cessation programmes are being implemented in project townships where community facilitators were trained to provide support and counseling for tobacco users to quit. Basic health personnel are also trained for health education on dangers of tobacco and on cessation. Clinical support for Nicotine Replacement Therapy and establishment of quit lines are yet to be implemented.

4. Warn about the dangers of tobacco: National legislation requires cigarette, cheroot and cigar packages to display health warnings in local language. Measures are underway to enforce regulations for health warnings to be rotating, pictorial as well as textual and to be displayed taking at least 30% of the front of cigarette packages.

5. Enforce bans on tobacco advertising, promotion and sponsorship: The 2006 Control of Smoking and Consumption of Tobacco Product Law prohibits all forms of direct and indirect advertising, promotion and sponsorship of tobacco. Even before the Law was enacted,

DON'T SMOKE!**Maung Hlaing**

Sometimes, I come across the warning 'Don't smoke' in the esteemed daily. Although the warning is unable to organize nonsmokers, it can attract so many readers to know the dangers of tobacco.

Once, I happened to meet a late prolific writer who had written so many articles on anti-smoking. Amazingly, there was a cheroot or cigarette in his hand while he was writing anti-tobacco articles. What was more, he used to say that he had given up smoking so many times. Believe it or not!

I remember him when I have to write the articles on anti-smoking.

When I learned to smoke, I was only ten years old. I did so simply because I saw my parents and some elders smoke cheroots. I thought it was a youthful or grownup style. I bought cigarettes with my pocket-money and smoked on the sly. I started smoking a little at a time and soon I was used to it. To be frank, I fell prey to tobacco. At that time, we came to be addicted to the bad habit because of lack of knowledge.

Although the elderly people urged us not to smoke, saying that tobacco could affect our health, we did not obey them. Why? It was because they themselves passionately smoked.

Later, people come to know dangers of tobacco—cardiovascular disease, heart failure, and respiratory illnesses.

In spite of dangers, more and more people become

smokers. Many young people begin smoking as an act of independence. Most adults smoke to reduce their craving for nicotine. The effects of nicotine help make smoking pleasurable. Actually, nicotine stimulates the nervous system and the heart and other organs. However, its effect on the nervous system also causes many people to become addicted to it.

Such an addiction makes it hard for people to give up smoking.

Since doctors and governments first warned about the health hazards of cigarette smoking in 1960's, millions of people have stopped smoking. Most of them have been able to stop on their own although some made several attempts before they were able to stop completely. Many smokers attend special clinics set up to help them overcome their addiction.

Some of my friends tried to give up tobacco by substituting it with chewing betel quids. However, they became addicted to these two bad habits. As for me, I had to substitute smoking with other activities such as physical exercises. Only when I became father of a child, could I stop smoking. It gets easier addicted than wiped out!

We do not know the exact period when the bad habit of smoking emerged. According to the records, American Indians smoked tobacco in pipes long before Christopher Columbus sailed to the New World in 1492. Columbus brought some tobacco seeds back to Europe, where farmers

began to grow the plant for use as a medicine that helped relax. Spaniards and some other Europeans began to smoke hand-rolled cigarettes in the 1600's. The use of tobacco products has been a controversial issue for many years. During the 1500's, European doctors declared that tobacco should be used only for medicinal purposes. During the 1960's, scientists established that smoking tobacco products—especially cigarettes—could increase the risk of lung cancer, heart disease, and other illnesses.

The first study on the effects of smoking showed that men who were lifelong smokers died almost 18 years earlier than men who had never smoked. According to the report, a 30-year-old man who smoked can expect to die at the age of 64.

To make matters worse, increasing evidence indicates that cigarette smoke also harms nonsmokers.

In a new study, a team from Duke University Medical Centre reviewed the cases of 845 patients who had had surgery for kidney cancer or renal cell carcinoma between 2000 and 2009. They found that current and former smokers were 1.5 to 1.6 times more likely to have advanced cancer than nonsmokers.

Heavy smoking (smoking for a longer period of time and smoking more) was associated with advanced renal cell carcinoma.

Why shouldn't give up such a bad habit once and for all? The earlier, the better! Don't smoke!!

tobacco advertisement on TV and Radio was prohibited in 2000-2001 in collaboration with Ministry of Information. Tobacco billboards had been totally banned since 2002 in collaboration with City Development Committees and Department of Development Affairs. Tobacco advertisement via print media was prohibited in 2002 in collaboration with the General Administration Department.

6. Raise taxes on tobacco: In 2012 Cigarette taxes in Myanmar are levied at 100% (commercial tax) of taxable turnover; Myanmar is among a few countries in the world which levied cigarette taxes higher than 70%. Commercial taxes for other tobacco products such as cheroots, pipes,

cigars were also increased harmoniously at 50%.

Myanmar has been participating in the World Conferences on Tobacco or Health. Union Minister for Health Dr Pe Thet Khin attended the 15th World Conference on Tobacco or Health, 20-24 March 2012, Singapore. A research paper, "Prevalence and determinants of smoking among students aged 13-15 years in Myanmar: Results from the Myanmar Global School-based Student Health Survey (Myanmar GSHS)" was presented in the Conference. The abstract poster was chosen as one of best poster awards Nominees.

To fight against tobacco industry interference

The Control of Smoking and Consumption of Tobacco Product Law was adopted on 4 May, 2006. The

adoption of the law was a very significant milestone in the history of public health of Myanmar and was highly appreciated by the World Health Organization and anti-tobacco advocates.

However, enforcement of the national legislation on tobacco control needs to be strengthened, and the National Tobacco Control Programme needs to be more comprehensive incorporating measures to reduce smokeless tobacco use and other non-cigarette tobacco products, and economic consequences of tobacco consumption and exposure to tobacco smoke.

On World No Tobacco Day 2012, and throughout the following year, we would like to urge the related ministries and sectors, international and local NGOs and the community as a whole to put the fight against tobacco industry interference at the heart of their efforts to control the global tobacco epidemic.

Myanmar, Germany to cooperate in parliamentary functions

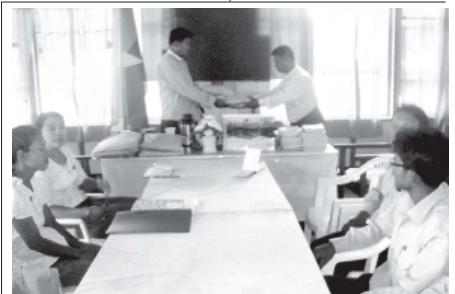

Malaysian, Canadian oil firms team up for exploitation

KUALA LUMPUR, 30 May— Malaysia's state-owned oil giant, Petrolia Nasional Berhad or Petronas said on Monday that it has awarded a production sharing contract to Canada-based energy company Talisman Malaysia Limited to further develop and recover crude oil from the Kinabalu fields off Malaysia's east peninsula Sabah state.

"Petronas recognizes the need to continuously explore for innovative ways to unlock hydrocarbon resource potential in matured fields. Concerted efforts to further develop these more challenging fields are necessary so that Malaysia will not only be able to sustain but also increase oil production in the face of dwindling reserves," Vice president of Petronas' petroleum management, Ramlan Abdul Malek said in a statement.

Talisman Malaysia and Petronas will invest over 1 billion US dollars under the contract to achieve early production gains, improve operational efficiency and maximize oil recovery from the Kinabalu Fields, which composed of several matured reservoirs off Sabah. Talisman Malaysia holds 60 percent participating interest in the contract area.

The contract, Petronas said, was signed on 23 May, with Talisman Malaysia represented by its country manager Ron Aston, Petronas Carigali president Abdullah Karim and Ramlan. *MNA/Xinhua*

Bus crash kills five, injures 87 in South Africa

JOHANNESBURG, 30 May — At least five people were killed and 87 others were hurt as the bus they were travelling in crashed in eastern South Africa on Saturday afternoon, local media reported. The crowded bus crashed outside the port city of Durban in the eastern province of KwaZulu-Natal, the South African Press Association (SAPA) reported, citing local paramedics on Saturday evening.

Among the injured, 20 are in critical condition, and the death toll might continue to rise, the SAPA reported. The bus was suddenly out of control as it was travelling down a windy road, and rolled over before impacting a house beside the road, local paramedics said. Police was investigating the cause of the fatal accident. In recent years, the deadly road traffic accidents have become one of the biggest killers in South Africa. — *Xinhua*

One dead, ten missing in boat accident on central China river

CHANGSHA, 30 May — Investigators on Monday updated the number of people missing in a passenger boat accident to 10, up from the previously reported eight, on a river in central China's Hunan Province. Shi Zelong, deputy Communist Party chief of Luxi County, said 25 passengers fell into the Yuanjiang River after their runaway boat hit a freighter and capsized.

He said rescuers saved 14 of the passengers and found one person dead. There are still 10 people missing. Shi, the leader of the rescue operation, said he has sent people to comb the river bank in search of the missing. He has also dispatched divers to salvage the sunken vessel. Investigators said the boat experienced engine failure while travelling from Luxi to neighbouring Chenxi County and went adrift.

The accident occurred at about 10 am on Sunday in the Yuanjiang River, a tributary of China's longest river, the Yangtze. The passengers were all from Dawan village in Chenxi County. More than 500 rescuers are working to locate the missing passengers with the help of 22 boats. *Xinhua*

Vatican faces widening of leaks scandal

VATICAN CITY, 30 May — The Vatican faces a widening scandal that in one short week has seen Pope Benedict's butler arrested, the president of its bank unceremoniously dismissed and the publication of a new book alleging conspiracies among cardinals. It was a poisonous Pentecost Sunday for the pope, who likely had the tumultuous events of the past week on his mind as he celebrated a mass in St Peter's Basilica on the day regarded as the birthday of the Church.

On Saturday his personal butler, Paolo Gabriele, 46, was formally charged with stealing confidential papal documents in the scandal that has come to be known as "Vatileaks". Some of the documents allege

cronyism and corruption in contracts with Italian companies. One prominent cardinal, illustrating the growing emotion of the debate in Vatican circles, wrote in an Italian newspaper that the pope had been betrayed just as Jesus was betrayed 2,000 years ago. The scandal, which has been brewing for months, has hit the very heart of the Roman Catholic Church.

Gabriele — now known in Vatican statements as "the defendant" — was until Wednesday night the quiet man who served the pope's meals, helped him dress and held his umbrella on rainy days. The pope made no reference during his two public appearances on Sunday to the scandal or the arrest, which

aides said had "saddened and pained" him. "I feel very sad for the pope. This whole thing is such a disservice to the Church," Carl Anderson, head

of the Knights of Columbus charity group who is also a member of the board of the Vatican bank, told *Reuters*. *Reuters*

China eyes developing deep-sea mining tech by 2030

BEIJING, 30 May — Commercial deep-sea mining by China of polymetallic nodules that contain copper, nickel and cobalt among other key minerals, can begin as early as 2030, according to the former head of the State Oceanic Administration.

"With the improvement in deep-sea technology, metal resources under the ocean can be explored and mined within 20 years," said Sun Zhihui.

Last year, China was among the first group of countries approved by the International Seabed Authority to look for polymetallic sulphide deposits, a recently discovered mineral source, in the Southwest Indian Ridge, a tectonic plate boundary on the bed of the Indian Ocean, he said, adding the country is applying to explore for cobalt in a new

area in the Pacific Ocean.

Sun said many countries are developing technologies for commercial mining, but a low-cost method of mining polymetallic nodules has not been found yet. China has explored more than 80,000 square kilometres of the floor of the Pacific and Indian oceans, Sun said. Xiang Jianhai, researcher at the Institute of Oceanology under the Chinese Academy of Sciences, said: "When we can carry out commercial mining depends on technological development, financial support and the price of key minerals on the market."

Xiang added that current exploration, such as that carried out by China's manned deep-sea vessel *Jiaolong*, will provide the technology and geological information for future mining. — *Xinhua*

Rescuers recover 10 more bodies from diamond mine in S Africa

CAPE TOWN, 30 May — After several days of hard work, rescuers have recovered the bodies of ten illegal miners at a disused diamond mine near Kleinzee in the Northern Cape Province, announced diamond company De Beers on Sunday. "Ten deceased diggers had been recovered from the collapsed tunnels (by Saturday evening)," said the company. It had brought to 17 the total number of bodies recovered since a disused tunnel collapsed on Tuesday. A total of 19 miners were trapped in the mine where they were digging illegally for diamonds, authorities said. One miner was freed from the rubble

alive with minor injuries earlier this week.

On Wednesday, two bodies were recovered and two days later, five other bodies were retrieved. When the tunnel collapsed, 11 miners managed to escape and alerted police on the accident, said authorities. "The coordinated rescue and recovery operation is continuing. The operation will progress until all illegally excavated tunnels are found and searched for survivors or deceased diggers," De Beers said in a statement. The company said the collapsed tunnel that was discovered by the rescue team was cleared on Saturday. *Xinhua*

Fukushima radiation seen in tuna off California

WASHINGTON, 30 May— Low levels of nuclear radiation from the tsunami-damaged Fukushima power plant have turned up in bluefin tuna off the California coast, suggesting that these fish carried radioactive compounds across the Pacific Ocean faster than wind or water can. Small amounts of cesium-137 and cesium-134 were detected in 15 tuna caught near San Diego in August 2011, about four months after these chemicals were released into the water off Japan's east coast, scientists reported on Monday.

That is months earlier than wind and water currents brought debris from the plant to waters off Alaska and the US Pacific Northwest.

The amount of radioactive cesium in the fish is not thought to be damaging to people if consumed, the researchers said in a study published in the journal *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*. Without making a definitive judgment on the safety of the fish, lead author Daniel Madigan of Stanford University's Hopkins Marine Station noted that

Denmark details attack plot suspects

COPENHAGEN, 30 May— Danish police have detained two brothers from Somalia on suspicion of plotting an attack, the state security police said on Tuesday.

The Danish Security and Intelligence Service (PET) said in a statement the arrests late on Monday had thwarted a "concrete act of terror," but did not elaborate.

The brothers, aged 18 and 23, are Danish citizens and have lived in Denmark for 16 years, the PET said.

"The detainees are suspected of being in the process of preparing an act of terror, among other things, through conversations about methods, targets and use of weapon types," the PET said. It said one of the brothers was suspected of being trained at a camp of the militant group al Shabaab in Somalia.

One of the men was detained at his residence in the Danish town of Aarhus and the other was stopped when he arrived by plane at Copenhagen airport, the PET said. The two men will appear before a court later Tuesday.— Reuters

the amount of radioactive material detected was far less than the Japanese safety limit.

"I wouldn't tell anyone what's safe to eat or what's not safe to eat," Madigan said in a telephone interview.

"It's become clear that some people feel that any amount of radioactivity, in their minds, is bad and they'd like to avoid it.

But compared to what's there naturally... and what's established as safety limits, it's not a large amount at all." He said the scientists found elevated levels of two radioactive isotopes of the element cesium: cesium 137, which was present in the eastern Pacific before the Fukushima Daiichi disaster in the spring of 2011; and cesium 134, which is produced only by human activities and was not present before the earthquake and tsunami hit the Japanese plant.

Because cesium 134 is generated only by human activities - nuclear power plants and weapons - and there was none in the Pacific for several years before the Fukushima accident, they reckoned that any cesium 134 they found in tuna off California had to come from Fukushima.— Reuters

Malaysian license plate sells for \$165K

Malaysia's Sultan of Johor placed the high bid of \$165,261 to obtain a "WWW 1" license plate for his vehicle.

Transport Minister Datuk Seri Kongsom Has said the sum paid by Sultan Ibrahim Ismail Sultan Iskandar, who outbid 9,999 other interested parties, was

the highest price ever paid for a license plate in the country, the *Malaysia Star* reported.

Transport officials said the bidding, which began on 30 April and ended on 14 May, reached such high levels due to "WWW" being an abbreviation for the World Wide Web.

Chicago police said they arrested a woman accused of stealing an ambulance and crashing it into two parked vehicles.

Investigators said Cassie Weathersby, 30, allegedly took the

ambulance around 10:45 pm on 27 May from outside Saint Bernard Hospital and she soon crashed the vehicle into two parked vehicles in the 6700 block of South Indiana, the *Chicago Sun-Times* reported.

The *Chicago Tribune* reported Weathersby, who was not injured, was charged with the theft of the ambulance, driving on a suspended license and driving under the influence of alcohol.

Elvis' original crypt headed for auction

A California auction house said Elvis Presley's original crypt in Tennessee, where the King was entombed for two months, is going up for auction.

Darren Julien of Julien's Auctions said the crypt, at the Forest Hill Cemetery in

Memphis, will be sold as part of the "Music Icons" auction on 23 June, *TMZ* reported. Julien said Elvis was entombed in the crypt, which also held his mother, Gladys, for two months following his 17 Aug. 1977, death.

The singer and his mother

were both later reburied at his Graceland home. The auction includes opening and closing of the vault for burial, a memorial inscription and use of the chapel for a committal service.

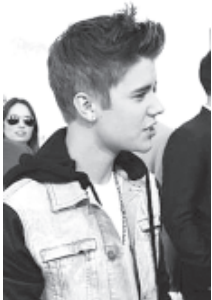
reported. Police said Bieber and his girlfriend Selena Gomez were leaving the mall when a photographer, whose name was not reported, attempted to take Bieber's picture.

Williams out of French Open

PARIS, 30 May — Serena Williams was bundled out of the French Open after she suffered the worst Grand Slam defeat of her career on Tuesday. The favourite for the women's singles title slumped to a dramatic and thrilling 4-6, 7-6 (5), 6-3 loss to France's world 111 Virginie Razzano in the first round. It was the 13-time Grand Slam winner's first ever exit at the opening round stage of her 47-event Grand Slam career and her earliest loss at a major since she was knocked out of the Australian Open second round by sister Venus in 1998.

The fifth-seeded Williams was two points from victory nine times in the second set, including leading 5-1 in the tiebreaker. But Razzano won six straight

points to force a third set, and then took control of the match. "I made so many errors today, which isn't the game I was playing in the past," Williams said. "That's life." Williams entered the day with a 46-0 record in first-round matches at Grand Slam tournaments. She had been looking for her 14th major title, and second at Roland Garros.

Men's second seed Rafael Nadal, in pursuit of a record seventh crown at French Open, powered into the second round with a 6-2, 6-2, 6-1 win over Italian journeyman Simone Bolelli. Despite dropping his service once midway through the second set on the Philippe Chatrier showcourt, Nadal won comfortably in one hour and 58 minutes to book a

Sharapova made her professional breakthrough in 2004, when she defeated two-time defending champion and top seed Serena Williams in the Wimbledon final for her first Grand Slam title at the age of 17. In the 2006 US Open, she defeated world No 2 Justine Henin to reach the top. Her third Grand Slam came in 2008 at the Australian Open. Sharapova said she felt herself "better prepared" for the French Open after dispatching Romanian Alexandra Cadantu 6-0, 6-0 in the first round on Tuesday.

The world second seed crushed the world No 78 in 48 minutes with a flurry of blistering winners. After winning two claycourt

tournaments leading to the French Open, Sharapova said she is now in a better form. "I'm really happy with the way my preparation has been coming into this tournament. I feel like with every year I have improved and I enjoy it much more," she said. The Russian, who needs the French crown to complete her grand slam title collection, will next face Japan's Ayumi Morita.

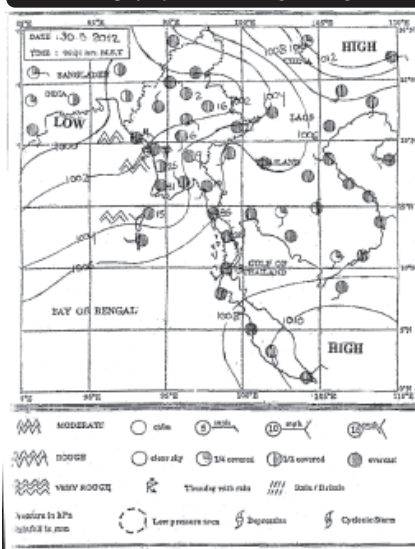

Belgian Hazard opts to sign for Chelsea

PARIS, 30 May—Lille's Belgian international playmaker Eden Hazard announced late Monday he had signed for Champions League winners Chelsea in preference to Premier League champions Manchester City and runners-up Manchester United. The fee is reported to be 40 million euros with Hazard signing a five year contract and breaks the record for a Belgian footballer's transfer with Marouane Fellaini's to Everton of 20 million in 2008 being the previous mark. He will also earn a reported 550,000 euros a month. The 21-year-old—who was voted Ligue 1 Players' Player of the Year for the second successive year recently—had previously said he would definitely sign for one of the Manchester clubs without specifying which one. However, Chelsea's penalty shootout win over Bayern Munich in the Champions League had he admitted at the time made him hesitate as to his choice—speculation he ended on Monday even though the transfer window doesn't officially open till 13 June.—*Internet*

Chess kings in 'Armageddon' battle for world crown

MOSCOW, 30 May — India's world chess champion Viswanathan Anand and his Israeli challenger Boris Gelfand on Wednesday clashed in a rapid fire battle of nerves to decide the biggest prize in the sport. After drawing on Monday the final regular match in their 12-game Moscow series to leave the world championships level, the two grandmasters were forced into the chess equivalent of a football penalty shoot.

Dubbed the "Battle of the Armageddon" in chess circles, Wednesday's match sees two of the finest players the world has ever seen lock horns in up to 15 thrilling speed chess games to determine the world champion. Gelfand and Anand played out the first game of the tie-break amid huge tension at the host venue of the Tretyakov art gallery, with each player knowing that one mistake could cost them the championships.

Anand, dressed in his usual blue shirt, sat rooted to his chair as the more expressive Gelfand ran his hands through his hair and took long walks away from the board to think out his positions.

Wednesday's series will initially feature four short 25-minute speed chess games. If this produces no winner then up to 10 more "blitz" 5-minute games can be played with even shorter time restrictions of just five minutes each.

If the scores are still equal after all that, the match would go to a sudden death single game "golden goal" decider in which black would get four minutes and white five.

In a final game whose tension would be almost unbearable for the players, black would be declared winner in case of a draw because of the shorter time in which it can make moves.

Internet organizers needed "a kick up the backside."

Valcke and FIFA President Sepp Blatter had to apologize for the remarks, which triggered fury from the host country. Rebelo then said Valcke would no longer be welcome as a FIFA spokesman. FIFA has expressed varying degrees of concern about whether preparations—renovation or construction of stadiums as well as infrastructure projects—are on track for the first World Cup in Brazil since 1950.—*Internet*

a colourful and vibrant celebration set to a uniquely Brazilian rhythm," said Valcke. Brazil's Sports Minister, Aldo Rebelo, said the slogan was an invitation to citizens and visitors "to join together and celebrate the immense sense of pride" in the country's role as hosts.

It was Valcke's first trip to Brazil since he caused an uproar in March with his criticism of the country's 2014 preparations, saying

PARIS, 30 May—Roger Federer dropped a set before earning his record-

breaking 234th Grand Slam match victory to reach the French Open's third round.

Federer eliminated 92nd-ranked Adrian Ungur of Romania 6-3, 6-2, 6-7 (6), 6-3 on Wednesday to break a tie with Jimmy Connors for most career wins at major tournaments in the Open era, which began in 1968.

The 16-time Grand Slam champion is now 234-35 in tennis' top four tournaments, an .870 winning percentage.

Ungur, meanwhile, is 1-1; the French Open was his Grand Slam debut.

Seeded third this year at Roland Garros, where he won the 2009 title, Federer is on course for a semifinal showdown against No 1 Novak Djokovic, who won in straight sets on Wednesday.—Internet

Djokovic into French Open third round

PARIS, 30 May—Novak Djokovic edged closer to Grand Slam history with a 6-0, 6-4, 6-4 win over Slovenia's Blaz Kavcic in the French Open second round on Wednesday.

The top seed and world number one, bidding to become only the third man after Don Budge and Rod Laver to hold all four Grand Slam titles at the same time, put down a gutsy challenge from world number 99 Kavcic. Djokovic fired 41 winners past the Slovenian, who had knocked out Australian veteran Lleyton Hewitt in the first round, and took victory on a fourth match point. The Serb will face either France's Nicolas Pietrangeli or Germany's Michael Berrer for a place in the last 16.—Internet
