SCO says "no" to interventionism

BEIJING, 8 June — When the leaders of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) member states concluded their latest summit on Thursday, they unanimously rejected military intervention as a way to resolve international hotspot issues. According to a statement that came after the summit, all SCO member countries oppose military intervention in Syria and reject the idea of a regime change in the country.

The leaders also rejected the idea of using military means to solve the Iranian nuclear dispute, instead choosing to support dialogue and other diplomatic methods.

These heads of state have ample ground to make

an appeal for peace and stability and to support their request for the peaceful settlement of these problems. Across the world, from the Middle East to north Africa, deadly conflicts and terrorist attacks are still resulting in innocent deaths, as many countries in these regions sunk into chaos last year. Being fully aware that their own countries' security and stability are closely associated with that of these troubled regions, the SCO leaders decided that peace can only be created through peaceful means.

It is a common experience in human history, both recent or remote, that meeting violence with violence can only beget more loss of life and spark hard-to-heal

hatred. More than a year has passed since NATO air forces began to drop bombs on Libya

in order to drive its previous government out of power, but the country is still in chaos. Additionally, over ten years

have passed since the United States and its coalition partners ousted the Taliban regime in Afghanistan, a

country that shares borders with a number of SCO countries.

Slovenia to close embassies in four EU countries

LIUBLJANA, 8 June — Slovenia will close its embassies in Sweden, Finland, Portugal and Ireland as part of its efforts to "reorganize the diplomatic network," said Foreign Minister Karl Erjavec on Thursday. President Danilo Turk has signed decrees to implement the closures, said Erjavec, stressing that such action is "to reorganize the diplomatic network" rather than simply closing the embassies and saving money.

It was reported that the Slovenian Foreign Ministry expected to save some 1.8 million euros (2.27 million dollars) annually with the closure of some of its unnecessary embassies abroad. In addition to the four embassies, the Slovenian government also reportedly decided to close its general consulates in Dusseldorf, Germany, and New York, the United States.

Slovenia, which declared independence from former Yugoslavia in 1991, established current diplomatic network with an aim to facilitate the new-born country in joining the European Union and other international organizations, according to government officials. —Xinhua

US military says no big troop buildup in Asia Pacific

WASHINGTON, 8 June — The United States is not shifting big number of troops into the Asia Pacific region, but will try and upgrade its engagement with limited means and foster allies' participation, said Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Martin Dempsey on Thursday. At a Pentagon Press briefing, Dempsey said repositioning forces to the Asia Pacific is not the "essence of rebalancing" to that region, which the Obama administration is doing as the

wars in Iraq and Afghanistan wind down.

He said the strategy involves "three mores," including more interest, more engagement and more quality, and the US side is eyeing a troops presence there more at a rotational basis, rather than at permanent bases. Fresh off an Asian tour which included stops at Singapore, Thailand and the Philippines, Dempsey said regional countries mostly gave "positive feedback" to that approach, and the US side wants them to take a

bigger share of the burden.

"We're encouraging ASEAN [the Association of Southeast Asian Nations] to take a more active role, to be a unified voice for security issues in that region," he said. Dempsey is part of the Department of Defence delegation to the Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore, and he went solo to Thailand and the Philippines after that, as Defence Secretary went on to visit Vietnam, India and Afghanistan.

China, Afghanistan declaration rejects "three forces"

BEIJING, 8 June — China and Afghanistan expressed "strong rejection" of the "three forces" of terrorism, extremism, separatism and organized crime in a joint declaration released here on Friday after talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and Afghanistan's President Hamid Karzai. The two sides agree to intensify exchanges and cooperation in security by way of jointly combating such transnational threats as terrorism, illegal immigration, illegal arms and drug trafficking, and enhancing intelligence exchanges and border management, said the declaration.

The two sides will also strengthen cooperation in prevention of infectious diseases, disaster prevention and reduction, and other non-traditional security areas, it said. The Chinese side firmly supports Afghanistan's efforts in combating terrorism and drug trafficking and safeguarding national

stability, the declaration added, calling on the international community to support this cause.

The Afghan side reiterated its continued and firm support for China in combating the "three forces" of terrorism, extremism and separatism. It will take tangible measures to enhance the security of Chinese institutions and people in Afghanistan, according to the declaration. —Xinhua

Iran says its "natural" nuclear rights must be recognized by world powers

TEHERAN, 8 June — A senior advisor to Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said the five permanent members of the UN Security Council plus Germany (P5+1) must recognize Iran's "natural right" to develop peaceful nuclear technology, the Press TV reported on Thursday. "Given that the Islamic republic has always proven its goodwill in nuclear talks and its commitment to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), the P5+1 must also recognize Iran's natural right to attain peaceful nuclear energy," Ali-Akbar Velayati was quoted as saying.

Velayati added that Iran's nuclear rights should be recognized also because the Islamic republic is a committed signatory to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), said the report. Iran's chief nuclear negotiator Saeed Jalili wrote a letter to EU foreign policy chief Catherine Ashton over the upcoming nuclear talks to be held in Russia's capital Moscow, said Press TV. In his letter, Jalili "voiced doubts about the six world powers' determination to hold fruitful talks with Iran in

Moscow," according to the report.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran is ready to hold progressive talks for cooperation based on a clear logic and specific initiatives," he said. Jalili, who is also Iran's Supreme National Security Council (SNSC) Secretary, stated that unless the P5+1 gear up for meetings at experts and deputies level, holding further talks merely for the sake of discussions would be of no avail, said Press TV. The Baghdad talks on Iran's nuclear standoff concluded last month with a plan to hold another round of talks in Moscow on 18-19 June.

Meanwhile, China and Russia called for a peaceful resolution to Iran's nuclear issue through dialogue and negotiation, according to a joint statement released on Wednesday. The statement was issued during Russian President Vladimir Putin's three-day state visit to China, where he also attended the 12th Meeting of the Council of Heads of Member States of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization. —Xinhua

Former Tepco chief to be grilled over Fukushima disaster

TOKYO, 8 June — The former president of Fukushima plant operator Tokyo Electric Power Co faces questioning for the first time on Friday by a high profile investigative panel seeking to uncover the causes of the world's worst nuclear disaster since Chernobyl. Members of the panel appointed by parliament will likely grill Masataka Shimizu over whether he planned to abandon the tsunami-devastated Fukushima plant at the height of the crisis in March 2011, as reactors melted down and the situation was in danger of spinning out of control, threatening Tokyo itself.

Then-prime minister Naoto Kan and two other ministers handling the disaster response have told the panel that Shimizu had planned to withdraw all of his utility's workers as explosions rocked the plant and three reactors melted down, spewing radiation across northeast Japan. Shimizu, 67, was also widely criticized for vanishing from public view three days after the disaster struck. He was later hospitalized for dizziness and high blood pressure, leaving the utility's chairman to supervise operations during his absence. —Reuters

Amazon updates low-end Kindle reader

SEATTLE, 8 June—Amazon says an update to its low-end non-touchscreen Kindle reader will improve readers' experience by providing crisper text with higher contrast. The software update for the \$79 Kindle will be delivered automatically to users' devices or they can manually download the update from Amazon's Web

site, CNET.com reported on Tuesday. In addition to the more readable font, the update provides Parental Controls that can restrict access to the Experimental Web Browser, Archived Items and the Kindle Store, Amazon said. Books with complex layouts and formats and comic books using Kindle Panel View will be supported



with the update, and improved table and image viewing, including panning and zooming, will be available on supported titles, Amazon said.—Internet

Facebook to allow kids under 13?

NEW YORK, 8 June—Facebook is said to be developing technology to allow children under age 13 to access the social network, *The Wall Street Journal* reported. Facebook is building mechanisms to connect children's accounts to those of their parents, with the parents retaining the power to decide who their kids can "friend" on the social networking giant and what applications they can use, sources who said they've talked to Facebook executives told the Journal.

A large portion of Facebook's income is derived through games from companies like Zynga, built to run on the Facebook platform, sure to be attractive to younger children should they be allowed to have Facebook accounts. —Internet

Pricing to follow trends in communication

NEW YORK, 8 June—US telephone industry experts say pricing for voice calling is shifting to reflect what phones are less and less apt to do, which is to make phone calls. "The industry's definitely moving towards unlimited [phone calls]," AT&T Mobility Chief Executive Officer Ralph de la Vega said.

Facebook, with about 900 million users worldwide, currently does not allow anyone under age 13 to have an account, although it has no mechanism to identify someone who may be reporting their age, *Wired.com* reported.

"Especially as more people adopt smartphones that have voice capabilities over the Internet, segmented voice plans will become less relevant."

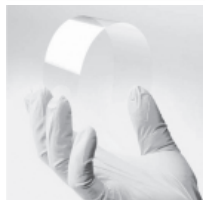

Dipak Chowdhury, Willow Glass programme director, said. Willow Glass is reported to be about 100 microns thick — about the thickness of a sheet of printer paper — as flexible as plastic and scratch-resistant. The glass could also find uses in flexible solar cells and lighting, Corning said. —Internet

Google buys Meebo and Quickoffice

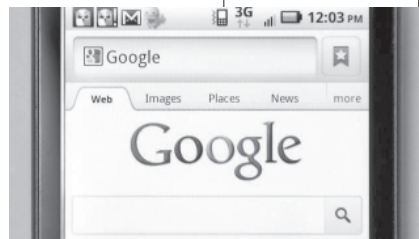
SANTA MONICA, 8 June—US search engine firm Google said it had gone on a small shopping spree on Monday and Tuesday, buying two Silicon Valley companies. ABC News said that Google purchased instant messaging firm Meebo for what All Things D estimated was about \$100 million.

That was Monday. On Tuesday, Google made another purchase, buying Quickoffice, a firm that develops applications for both Android and Apple iOS operating systems.

"With the Meebo team's expertise in social publisher tools, we believe they will be a great fit with the Google+ team.

We look forward to closing the transaction and working with the Meebo team to create more ways for users

to engage online," a Google

spokesman said. In an online posting, Google Engineering Director Alan Warren said, "Today, consumers, businesses and schools use Google Apps to get stuff done from anywhere, with anyone and on any device.

Quickoffice has an established track record of enabling seamless interoperability with popular file formats, and we'll be working

on bringing their powerful technology to our Apps product suite."

Google did not release financial details of the purchases.

Regardless, "the fact that Google realizes they need to buy instead of build is, in a sense, a refreshing sign of business maturity," said Patrick Moorhead, market analyst at Moor Insights & Strategy.—Internet

Migrating hummingbirds losing flowers

WASHINGTON, 8 June—Hummingbirds migrating north from Central America may be finding the flowers they depend on for nectar unavailable because of climate change, scientists say.

The glacier lily that graces mountain meadows throughout western North America flowers early in spring, when the first bumblebees and hummingbirds appear—or it used to, researchers said.

The problem, they said, is that they are blooming earlier with warming temperatures and are no longer synchronized with the arrival of broad-tailed hummingbirds, who are finding many of the flowers withered away and their nectar-laden blooms gone with them.

The first blooms have



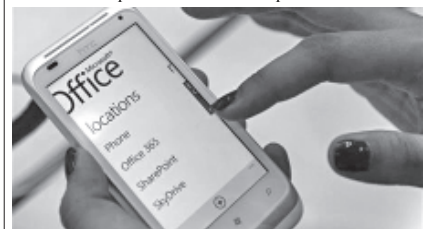

been appearing about 17 days earlier than they did in the 1970s, a release from the National Science Foundation reported.—Internet

HTC says devices in compliance with US ruling

TAIPEI, (China), 8 June—Taipei smartphone maker HTC Corp said on Thursday its new models are in compliance with the International Trade Commission's ruling, in response to Apple Inc's latest patent lawsuit brought against HTC.

"The US Customs office has reviewed and approved HTC devices for import into the US, as they are in compliance with the ITC's ruling," HTC said in a statement. Black hole 'evicted' from host galaxy?

CAMBRIDGE, 8 June—US astronomers say they've seen evidence a massive black hole is being ejected from its host galaxy at several million miles per hour.

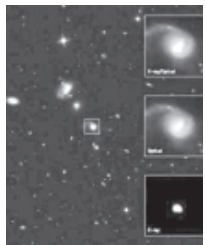
"It's hard to believe that a supermassive black hole weighing millions of times the mass of the sun could be moved at all, let alone kicked out of a galaxy at enormous speed," said Francesca Civano of the Harvard-Smithsonian Centre for Astrophysics, who led the study.

Observations from NASA's Chandra X-ray Observatory suggest the black hole collided and merged with another black hole and received a powerful recoil kick from gravitational wave radiation resulting from the collision sufficient to push the merged black hole out of the galaxy.

"[These] new data support the idea that gravitational waves—ripples in the fabric of space first predicted by Albert Einstein but never detected directly

— can exert an extremely powerful force," Civano said in a release from the Chandra headquarters in Cambridge, Mass. The finding could mean there are giant black holes roaming undetected out in the vast spaces between galaxies, researchers said.

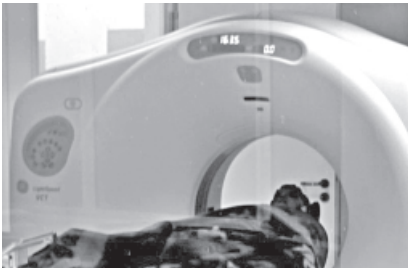
"These black holes would be invisible to us," study co-author Laura Blecha said, "because they have consumed all of the gas surrounding them after being thrown out of their home galaxy."—Internet

CT scans in childhood increase cancer risk: study

LONDON, 8 June—Children exposed to multiple CT scans could be up to three times likelier to contract cancer of the blood, brain or bone marrow later in life, according to research published on Thursday.

Writing in The Lancet medical journal, a team of scientists in Canada, Britain and the United States said the cancer risk, in absolute terms, appears to be small.

But they appealed for radiation doses from CT scans to be kept at a minimum and for alternatives to be used

where appropriate.

The researchers claimed their study was the first to provide direct evidence of a link between exposure from CT radiation in childhood and later cancer risk. "Of utmost importance is that where CT is used, it is only used where fully justified from a clinical perspective," said lead author Mark Pearce of Newcastle University's Institute of Health and Society. As a vital diagnostic technique, use of the CT scan has increased rapidly in the past 10 years, particularly in the United

States, the researchers said. "However, potential cancer risks exist due to the ionising radiation used in CT scans, especially in children who are more radiosensitive than adults." Computerized tomography — commonly known as CT — is an X-ray technique that produces images of the body's internal structures in cross sections.

The researchers studied nearly 180,000 people who underwent a CT scan as children or young adults (under 22) in Britain between 1985 and 2002. Of these, 74 were subsequently diagnosed with leukaemia and 135 with brain cancer according to data for the period 1985 to 2008.

The team calculated that compared to patients who received a radiation dose of less than five milli-Grays (mGy), those who were given a cumulative dose of 30 mGy had about three times the risk of developing leukaemia (cancer of the blood or marrow) later in life. Those who received 50 to 74 mGy had thrice the risk of brain tumours.

The study did not compare children who had been scanned against those

who had not been scanned.

Put into context, this means that among every 10,000 patients who received one CT scan before the age of 10, there would be one extra case of leukaemia and one extra brain tumour per 10 mGy of radiation in the 10 years after exposure. "Further refinements to allow reduction in CT doses should be a priority, not only for the radiology community, but also for manufacturers," said Pearce.

"Alternative diagnostic procedures that do not involve ionising radiation exposure, such as ultrasound and MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) might be appropriate in some clinical settings." Commenting on the study, Andrew Einstein of the Columbia University Medical Centre in New York said Pearce and his colleagues' work confirmed that CT scans "almost certainly produce a small cancer risk". "Use of CT scans continues to rise, generally with good clinical reasons, so we must redouble our efforts to justify and optimise every CT scan."

Labour Department firms labour cost estimate

WASHINGTON, 8 June—Labour productivity in non-farm businesses fell at a 0.9 percent annual rate during the first quarter, the US Bureau of Labour Statistics said on Wednesday. The 0.9 percent drop in the first three months of 2012 is a revision from a month ago, when the decline was estimated at 0.5 percent.

With current data, productivity from the first quarter of 2011 to the first quarter of this year increased

0.4 percent, a revision from the previous estimate of 0.5 percent.

The decline reflects an increase of 3.3 percent in hours worked, up from 2.2 percent in the previous report, and a 2.4 percent increase in output, down from 2.8 percent in the previous estimate, the Labour Department's statistical office said in a release. Bureau data indicated unit labour costs in non-farm businesses rose 1.3 percent in the first quarter

compared with the fourth quarter of last year, down from the 2 percent reported a month earlier. Hourly compensation in the quarter increased 0.4 percent, down from a previous estimate of 1.5 percent.

From the first quarter of 2011, unit labour costs rose 0.9 percent. Manufacturing sector productivity rose by 5.2 percent in the first quarter with output up 10 percent and hours worked up 4.6 percent.

H5N1 bird flu reported in NW China

BEIJING, 8 June — China's northwestern Gansu Province has reported an outbreak of the highly epidemic H5N1 bird flu virus in poultry, the Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) announced on Wednesday. More than 6,200 chickens at a farm in a village in Luyang, a town in Jingtai county, showed symptoms of suspected avian flu on Friday, and 260 of them have died,

according to the MOA. The National Avian Influenza Reference Laboratory on Tuesday confirmed the epidemic was H5N1 bird flu after testing samples collected at the farm, the MOA said. Local authorities have sealed off and sterilized the infected area, where a total of 18,460 chickens have been culled and safely disposed of in order to prevent the disease from

spreading since the case was confirmed, according to the MOA. A team was dispatched by the ministry to the quarantined area to guide epidemic prevention and monitoring. Bird flu, or avian influenza, is a contagious disease of animal origin caused by viruses that normally infect only birds and, less commonly, pigs. It can be fatal to humans.—Xinhua

Battery fluid leak may be a factor in China car fire

BEIJING, 8 June—Flammable fluids leaking from a BYD electric car battery might have contributed to a fire following a high-speed fatal crash in China last month, a BYD executive told Reuters. However, Stella Li, senior vice president of Warren Buffett-backed Chinese battery and car producer BYD Co, defended the safety of electric cars the company designs and sells in China. Police are still investigating the crash, which occurred in Shenzhen, China, early on the morning of 26 May when a Nissan GT-R sports car travelling at least 180 kilometres per hour (110 mph) crashed into the BYD e6 taxi which later caught fire, according to BYD. The taxi driver and two passengers died.

“No car company could design an electric car or a gasoline-fueled car that could withstand a 180-kph crash, especially from being slammed from the backside,” Li said in an interview this week. The BYD executive said it will likely be weeks, if not months, before police can say anything conclusive, if at all, on the cause of the fire. But she said there is “a big chance” that liquid electrolyte — one of the three primary functional components in a battery — may have leaked after the crash. Those liquids may have caught fire, ignited by sparks from high-voltage cables or screeching wheels, said Li, who runs BYD’s US operations in Los Angeles. BYD has sold about 500 e6 cars in China since last year, with at least half of them sold to taxi operators and other

fleet customers. The accident has triggered fears among some investors that automakers were overconfident about the safety of energy-packed batteries powering electric cars, and could be a talking point at BYD’s annual shareholders’ meeting on Friday in Shenzhen. News reports and photos of the crash were widely circulated in China, and BYD’s shares fell to a seven-month low on 28 May, the first trading day after the crash. Some industry insiders worry the Shenzhen accident may impact more than just BYD’s electric car future. Photos of the burned e6 taxi are “so sensational,” said a chief engineer at Toyota, which uses a different type of battery in its hybrid electric vehicles.—Reuters

Police seize 20 kg of heroin, arrest 5 after smashing Sydney-based heroin syndicate

SYDNEY, 8 June — Five people have been arrested after police smashed a Sydney-based heroin syndicate, the New South Wales Police said on Thursday. About 20 kilograms of heroin were seized after Australian Customs and Border Protection and the Australian Federal Police intercepted a shipping container from Thailand, police said.

In side the container, Customs officers found the heroin wrapped in newspaper inside sports bags that had been concealed in two separate boxes. Police searched seven properties at Sydney’s west and southwest and arrested five alleged members of the drug syndicate in Sydney on Wednesday. During the raids police seized prohibited firearms, drugs, ammunition and cash.—Xinhua

DEA makes smuggling arrests in Puerto Rico airport

SAN JUAN, (Puerto Rico), 8 June — US federal agents swept through Puerto Rico’s largest airport and other areas early on Wednesday, arresting dozens of baggage handlers, airline workers and others suspected of smuggling millions of dollars’ worth of cocaine aboard commercial flights for at least a decade. Tourists gawked when agents with the US Drug Enforcement Administration arrested one suspect as he arrived to work at the Luis Munoz Marin airport in San Juan. At least 33 people were arrested in Puerto Rico, along with two workers at Miami’s international airport and another at the Dallas-Fort Worth airport, the DEA said.

Puerto Rico-based drug trafficking organizations that worked with each other, including one that was run by a woman, officials said. “We have dismantled the two most significant drug operations at the airport,” said Pedro Janer, acting special agent in charge of the DEA’s Caribbean division. The suspects are accused of helping move some 14 tons (13 metric tons) of cocaine and several pounds (kilogrammes) of heroin from Puerto Rico to several US cities including Miami, New York, Boston and Newark, New Jersey, according to the DEA. One group operated from 1999 to 2009 and the other from 2010 to 2012, the DEA said.

Nine paratroopers killed combating wildfire in Siberia

IRKUTSK, (Russia), 8 June — Nine firefighting paratroopers were killed on Wednesday while trying to put out a wildfire in Russia’s Siberia, federal authorities said. Thirteen smokejumpers from the Russian Airborne Troops were dispatched to help extinguish the blaze, which erupted on a 500-hectare area in the Bairun-Khemchinsky forest district in Tuva republic, the Interfax news agency quoted the Russian Federal Forestry Agency as saying.

Four people came back from the scene, while the rest were killed, said the agency, adding that an investigation has been launched into the tragedy. All of them had undergone training and had professional skills and experience, according to the federal body.

The wildfire poses no immediate threat to the Kara-Khol populated area, which is located 20 km away from the forest district, said the forestry agency. A severe wildfire situation has developed in Tuva. The republic has been under a state of emergency since 5 June, and federal authorities have sent about 100 firefighting paratroopers to help.—Xinhua

South Africa to open breast milk bank for premature babies

JOHANNESBURG, 8 June — A breast milk bank will be opened to the prematurely-born babies in South Africa, the newspaper *New Age* reported on Wednesday. “The breast milk bank will improve the health and future of the premature babies,” the paper reported, citing a dean in North West University in the northern province of the North West. The bank is newly

founded at Potchefstroom Hospital in the North West, jointly sponsored by North West University and the provincial government.

Dr Welma Lubba at the hospital. The doctor said the breast milk is not just food and contains the best and most nutritional value with an additional function of medicine.

The bank will store the breast milk in plastic bottles and freeze it following collecting from women that have the breast milk in excess, and the milk will be donated to premature babies who have no access to breast milk, said

The breast milk could act as a lubricant that will keep toxins out by sealing the stomach wall due to the premature babies intestines are easy to be perforated, the

baby expert said. The breast milk could even save the lives of babies, because some mothers of premature babies could not breast feed immediately, according to the doctor.

Before the distribution to other hospitals, the breast milk in the bank should meet a series of requirements, including sterilizing it and conducting necessary tests with an aim of having no HIV/AIDS or tuberculosis bacteria or virus.

Higher price of onion save farmers from loss

YESAGYO, 8 June—In early period of sales of cold season onion in Yesagyo Township in Magway Region, the local farmers sold it at K 250 or K 300 per viss with slowing loss.

China needs time, room to improve air quality

BEIJING, 8 June—Disputes regarding the quality of Beijing's air have sparked criticism against the Chinese government for allegedly dismissing its responsibility to provide a better environment. The US embassy in China releases hourly air quality data, describing the air in Beijing and other major cities as unhealthy or worse. In fact, the data collected by the US Embassy and Chinese government are not too different. It is the judgments made by both sides that have misled the public on the issue. Those who are skeptical should realize that no matter how badly the data embarrasses China, releasing such information will not

help resolve the problem. The Chinese government has announced that it will adopt an average daily standard of 75 micrograms of particulate matter less than 2.5 micrometres in size, or PM2.5, per cubic meter of air, as well as an average yearly standard of 35 micrograms. The Chinese national standards for PM2.5 conform with the minimum requirements set by the World Health Organization for developing countries, according to Minister of Environmental Protection Zhou Shengxian. As the largest developing country in terms of population and economy, China has had to face a variety of problems, including severe and

widespread environmental pollution, as a result of its rapid industrialization. The international community should give China enough time and room to gradually improve its air quality, which is sometimes a dilemma for developing countries as they make efforts to compromise between maintaining economic growth and protecting the environment. Xinhua

Fourteen dismembered bodies dumped in northern Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 8 June—Fourteen dismembered bodies were found in a truck in the centre of a town in northern Mexico on Thursday in what appeared to be the latest atrocity committed by rival gangs battling over drug-smuggling routes, local media said. The bodies of 11 men and three women were discovered in the sugar-cane farming town of Ciudad Mante in the south of Tamaulipas state, which borders on Texas, daily Milenio reported on its website.

The election on 1 July, due partly to rising frustration with the violence. The government has blamed the turf wars between the brutal Zetas gang, founded by army deserters, and the Sinaloa cartel of Mexico's most-wanted man, Joaquin "Shorty" Guzman, for an escalation of killings in recent weeks. Suspected drug cartel killers dumped 49 decapitated and dismembered bodies on a highway near the affluent northern city of Monterrey in May. Days before, 18 mutilated bodies were found near Mexico's second-largest city, Guadalajara. Reuters

Officials at the state attorney general's office could not immediately confirm the report. Tamaulipas has been one of the bloodiest battlegrounds in Mexico's drug war. More than 55,000 people have been killed in the conflict since President Felipe Calderon sent in the army to fight drug gangs shortly after he took office in December 2006. Calderon's conservative National Action Party, or PAN, looks likely to lose power in the presidential

More US waivers to Iran sanctions likely next week

SINGAPORE, 8 June—The United States will announce a new list of countries that will receive exceptions to financial sanctions on oil trade with Iran as soon as early next week, a government official said on Thursday. Not all of Iran's oil buyers are likely to get the waivers, said the source, who declined to elaborate. Around two thirds of Iran's crude exports flow to Asia, where the biggest buyers are China, Japan, India and South Korea. The United States granted Japan an exception in March and has signaled it has had good talks with South Korea about reducing oil purchases. Refiners in South Korea will switch to other sources on 1 July, industry sources have said.

But the US may withhold waivers for China and Singapore, according to an advocate of tougher sanctions on Iran, stepping up pressure on Iran's biggest crude oil buyer and a major destination for its fuel oil exports. Mark Dubowitz, the advocate and head of the Foundation for Defence of

Democracies, said he expected all of Iran's other oil buyers would eventually get the exceptions. He believes China has received some clandestine cargoes from Iran. Teheran has withheld the destination of some oil shipments by disabling tracking systems on its tanker fleet, according to shipping and trading sources.

The United States would be better off delaying a decision on China, he said, than to grant an exception now and be forced not to renew it later when more evidence of the shipments could come to light. Singapore is not a big consumer of oil, but it is a major blender of fuel, including some from Iran. The latest round of US sanctions come into effect on 28 June and aim to cut Iran's oil revenue to pressure Teheran into halting its nuclear programme. Western powers suspect Iran is aiming to develop nuclear arms, but Teheran says the programme is for civilian purposes only.— Reuters

WASHINGTON, 8 June—Researchers at Columbia University Medical Centre (CUMC) have identified a brain receptor that appears to play a central role in regulating appetite. The findings, published on Thursday in the online

Singapore central bank says global economy set to slow in near term

SINGAPORE, 8 June—The global economy is set to slow in the near term amid renewed uncertainty stemming from the eurozone debt crisis, weak recovery in the United States and slowdown in large emerging economies, the Monetary Authority of Singapore said on Thursday. "The trade-oriented Asian economies are likely to see activity moderating for the rest of the year, although resilient domestic demand will provide some support," it said in a report.

Underpinned by strong gains in the manufacturing sector, especially the normalization of computer disk-drive production following the disruption caused by the Thai floods at the end of 2011, the Singapore economy grew by 10 percent quarter on quarter on a seasonally adjusted annualized basis in the first three months of the year. The Singapore economy is expected to remain restrained for the rest of the year against the backdrop of subdued global growth, it said, projecting the gross domestic product to grow by 1-3 percent.

The inflation forecast also remained unchanged at 3.5-4.5 percent. The Monetary Authority said the G3 economies on average grew by a mild 1.6 percent quarter on quarter on a seasonally adjusted annualized basis in the first three months of the year. The United States economy grew by 1.9 percent, lower than the growth of 3 percent for the previous quarter. "The main drag on growth ... came from continued cutbacks in federal defense spending as well as smaller state and local government budgets," it said.—Xinhua

edition of Cell, could lead to new drugs for preventing or treating obesity. In their search for new targets for obesity therapies, scientists have focused on the hypothalamus, a tiny brain structure that regulates appetite. Numerous studies suggest that the regulatory mechanism is concentrated in neurons that express a neuropeptide, or brain modulator, called AgRP. But the specific factors that influence AgRP expression are not known.

The CUMC researchers found new clues to appetite control by tracing the actions of insulin and leptin. Both hormones are involved in maintaining the body's energy balance, and both are known to inhibit AgRP. "Surprisingly, blocking either the insulin or leptin signaling pathway has little effect on appetite," says study leader Domenico Accili, professor of medicine at CUMC. "We hypothesized that both pathways have to be blocked simultaneously in order to influence feeding behaviour."

To test their hypothesis, the researchers created a strain of mice whose AgRP neurons lack a protein that is integral to both insulin and leptin signaling. As the researchers hypothesized, removing this protein — FoxO1 — had a profound effect on the animals' appetite. Xinhua

Mini-tornado hits Perth suburbs in Western Australia

SYDNEY, 8 June—Western Australia's emergency crews have spent the night cleaning up after a mini-tornado ripped through north-eastern suburbs of Perth, local media reported on Friday. The tornado ripped down trees and power lines and lifted roofs from buildings in the suburbs of Dianella and Morley on Thursday, the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) reported.

The tornado lasted only about 10 minutes but the destructive winds caused damage worth millions of dollars, the ABC said. Thousands of homes were left without electricity and Western Power was trying to restore their power as soon as possible. The town of York, east of Perth, was also hit by a powerful storm. Xinhua

**Dengue vaccine in sight,
after 70 years**

LONDON, 8 June—One of the grimmest legacies of the war in the Pacific is still being fought 70 years on, but a victory over dengue, the intensely painful "break-bone fever" which that conflict helped spread around the world, may be in sight. The US Army, which like its Japanese enemy lost thousands of men to the mosquito-borne disease in the 1940s, has piled resources into defeating the tropical killer. But it may be about to see the battle to develop the first vaccine won not in the United States but by French drug company Sanofi.

The Paris-based firm hopes for positive results in September from a key trial among children in Thailand that would set it on course to market a shot in 2015 which would prevent an estimated 100 million cases of dengue infection each year. Of 20,000 annual deaths, many are of children. For Sanofi, which has invested 350 million euros (\$440 million) in a new French factory to make the three-dose vaccine, it could mean a billion euros in yearly sales as half the world is exposed to the disease, notably in fast-expanding tropical cities from Rio and Mexico to Manila and Mumbai.

But like British rival GlaxoSmithKline, whose new malaria shot has shown promise against another mosquito-

**Iran accuses IAEA of secretive
intelligence activities**

VIENNA, 8 June—Iran has accused the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) of conducting secretive intelligence activities, the *Austrian Press Agency* reported on Wednesday. The accusations were made by Iranian ambassador Ali Asghar Soltanieh on the sidelines of the IAEA Governors conference in Vienna, where he accused the IAEA of using secretive means to obtain information on Iranian facilities.

"Unfortunately the Agency (IAEA), who should be playing the role of an international technical organization, is to an extent also playing the role of an intelligence agency," he told reporters. Soltanieh criticized in particular Western councillors and media for speculation about a possible secret atomic weapons programme. He reaffirmed the "solely peaceful" aims of Iran's nuclear programme. On Friday a bilateral meeting is planned in which access for IAEA experts to Iran's facilities, documents, and nuclear experts will be discussed.—*Xinhua*

Identified in local outbreaks in the Americas, Africa and Asia since the 18th century — and noted as a serious military hindrance by US generals in their 1898 war against Spain in Cuba and the Philippines — dengue was spread to global pandemic proportions in part due to the massive movements of armies through the Pacific theatre in World War Two.—*Reuters*

**Troops kill
26 Taliban
insurgents
within
24 hours**

KABUL, 8 June—Afghan army and police, backed by the NATO-led coalition forces, have eliminated 26 Taliban insurgents during cleanup operations within the past 24 hours, the Afghan Interior Ministry said on Thursday morning. "The joint forces conducted nine cleanup operations in Laghman, Takhar, Kandahar, Helmand, Logar and Herat Provinces, killing 26 armed Taliban insurgents over the past 24 hours," the ministry said in a statement.

One other insurgent was injured and eight other suspects have been detained by joint forces, the statement said. They also found and seized weapons, the statement said, without saying if there were any casualties on the side of security forces. Afghan police also found and defused 25 rounds of mines and Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) over the same period of time. The Taliban insurgent group, which announced the launching of a spring offensive from 3 May against Afghan and NATO forces, has not to make comments yet.—*Xinhua*

**FBI probes White House officials'
leaking information about cyberattacks
against Iran**

WASHINGTON, 8 June—The Federal Bureau of Intelligence has opened an investigation into possible White House officials' leaks of classified information to the *New York Times* about US cyberattacks against Iran, CNN reported on Wednesday.

US Republican Senator Saxby Chambliss, vice chairman of Senate Intelligence Committee said he was informed that an FBI inquiry was under-way. Chambliss also called for appointment of a special counsel to investigate leaks of recent stories in the *New York Times* that detailed US cyberattacks on Iran.

"Any suggestion that this administration has authorized intentional leaks of classified information for political gain is grossly irresponsible," the White House spokesman Jay Carney said in a briefing aboard Air Force One en route California.

He stressed that the Obama administration takes all appropriate and necessary steps to prevent leaks of classified information or sensitive information that could risk ongoing counterterrorism or intelligence operations.—*Xinhua*

**London hotels "pricing
themselves out of market" for
Olympics**

LONDON, 8 June—Bookings at London hotels for the Olympic period are down by around a third on last summer, with travellers being put off by high prices, a British travel agent said on Wednesday, dampening hopes that the Games will help to revive Britain's economy. Credit ratings agency Moody's said last month that the Olympics would provide only a temporary boost to corporate earnings but said hotels would be a clear beneficiary. However, past Games have shown evidence of a displacement effect — with regular tourists put off by fears of overcrowding and high prices during an Olympics. Hotel wholesaler JacTravel is forecasting visitor arrivals to London in July to be more than 35 percent down

on 2011, and August to be almost 30 percent down. JacTravel's chief executive Mario Bodini said that Olympics expectations had been overly optimistic.

Betty and Buz Carbone of Hempfield said their son bought the locket, which bears the letters "AMA" or "AWA" in intricate script, from an antiques dealer about

15 years ago and they now believe the item originally belonged to Annie Moore Ward of Philadelphia, who served as a maid for a first-class passenger on the Titanic in April 1912 and survived the sinking of the ship, the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review* reported.

Ward, who was 38 at the time of the passenger liner's sinking, died in 1955.

The Carbones' daughter, Beth Evangeliste of Jeannette, said Ward is "the only one that came close" to fitting the initials on the locket, which contained a slip of paper reading, "Wreck of the Titanic, 15th April, 1912. Loss of life 1645."

Starbucks makes Jubilee gaffe in Ireland

Coffee giant Starbucks has apologized for tweeting 2,000 Irish followers, asking them to "show us what makes you proud to be British." The tweet sent was part of a promotion tied to Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee and aimed primarily at the United Kingdom, not the Republic of Ireland, *The Guardian* reported. It appeared to show ignorance of the complicated history of Britain and its neighbor in the British Isles. Starbucks tweeted two apologies. "We apologize to all our customers and followers on Twitter in Ireland and hope that they will forgive our mistake," the second one ended.

LONDON, 8 June — The footballing world turns its attention to Poland and Ukraine on Friday as the UEFA Euro 2012 football tournament gets under way. The Barclays Premier League will have a significant representation at the European Championship, with 70 players from 15 clubs representing 14 of the 16 nations at the tournament. Co-hosts Poland take on Greece at 5pm UK time on Friday 8th June to get the tournament under way.

England begin their campaign in Donetsk on Monday 11th June with a tough contest against a formidable France outfit which is unbeaten in 21 matches. Holders Spain take on Italy in their opener on Sunday 10th June in a mouth-watering encounter in Gdansk. Many pundits believe it will be an open tournament, although a survey of Barclays Premier League managers, conducted by Barclays, title sponsor of the League Managers Association (LMA), points to one winner.

A huge 73% of those polled tipped Germany to win, with the same percentage predicting a quarter-final

appearance for England. UEFA Euro 2012 is the 14th time the European Championship has been held. Germany have won it three times (twice as West Germany), with France and Spain both having two titles to their name.

The teams

WHAT THEY SAY

Croatia
Everton striker Nikica Jelavic: "We have a good team, good players and a good manager so hopefully we can reach a high level in the Euros because the people in Croatia expect a lot from us. I am so happy to go, it is my first big tournament and hopefully we can do some good things there."

Czech Republic
Chelsea goalkeeper Petr Cech: "I think it's very even and anything can happen, which makes [our] group very interesting. I don't think that

one team will win every match and another loses each of their games. I think there will be draws, and every goal and point will count."

Denmark

Arsenal striker Nicklas Bendtner: "There are a lot of players who can take charge in midfield, and provide both goals and assists. It's looking good, we've been practising well and intensely. We just need the last technical and tactical details and we'll be on our way."

England

Liverpool and England captain Steven Gerrard: "The expectations this time will be less. But that could suit us and turn into a positive."

"By the same token there will be a certain amount of pressure and expectation because we are England... Of course, everyone's dream is to win a tournament but it would be stupid to set that as a target."

"There have been teams in the past that have won this tournament who haven't necessarily been favourites, so we have to go there and do as well as we can. If we click and gel, if we get that bit of luck, we can get over that hurdle of the last eight."

France

Manchester United defender Patrice Evra: "Our priority at this stage is to ensure we reach the quarter-finals and then take it from there... There is no point having a negative attitude. All you can do is play to the best of your ability and if that isn't good enough it's hard to be held accountable if

you don't win."

Germany

Arsenal defender Per Mertesacker: "We have learned a lot from our disappointments - we have always reached second or third place but we want to win trophies. There is a lack of this, but with a young generation [coming through] that is very good, we will try to reach our target now."

Greece

Former Manchester City striker Georgios Samaras: "We want to win games for our people. Maybe their lives are not so good just now but football can let them put the misery to one side for a few hours."

Italy

Goalkeeper Gianluigi Buffon on Manchester City's Mario Balotelli: "It will definitely be Balotelli's tournament. Mario is a winner; he was great in the epic final game in this year's Premier League and he matured a lot over this last year. He has all our support. If he starts behaving like the leader he can be, he will carry the team and make the difference."

Netherlands

Tottenham midfielder Rafael van der Vaart: "The Euros will be a success for us when we win it. And you have to say that out loud as well, because saying things like 'a semi-final isn't... No, we were finalists in the World Cup, so we also need to have the highest ambition now."

Poland

Arsenal goalkeeper Wojciech Szczesny: "It's all

there for us to go and have a successful tournament - I think it's the strongest Poland team the fans have seen for years so hopefully we won't let them down. I think Poland have a chance of doing well. The atmosphere around the national team has changed a bit and people have realised that we actually have world-class players."

Portugal

Manchester United forward Nani: "Even though many people do not accept it, Portugal do not depend on Cristiano Ronaldo. He is a great player, for me the number one, but he does not win the games on his own. Our opponents will be more attentive with Cristiano and that could help the rest of us, because it could allow more spaces to open up and create danger for our rivals."

Republic of Ireland

Stoke City striker Jonathan Walters: "These are the moments you have got to enjoy. There are some top players who never get the chance to be in a major tournament, so to be here, I feel very blessed and very privileged."

Russia

Fulham striker Pavel Pogrebnyak: "Four years ago in Austria and Switzerland, we achieved unbelievable things. We reached the semi-final and played some fantastic football. It was an amazing achievement. To miss out was very difficult, but this is my chance to make up for that and it is a real

honour to be part of the squad for Euro 2012. I would love to show my strengths on the highest stage and enjoy one of the top international tournaments."

Spain

Chelsea forward Juan Mata: "For Spain, this European Championship will be very difficult, because every other team in the tournament wants to beat us. It will not be easy to retain the title, but that is the challenge in front of us. Every time it gets harder. We've got a very difficult group. It's not comfortable. We've got Italy and we know that there is a lot of rivalry and history."

Sweden

Sunderland midfielder Sebastian Larsson on facing England and Steven Gerrard: "I supported Liverpool as a boy - like my dad and brother. My favourite player when I was younger was Gerrard. He was amazing when he broke into the team - and he is still a top player. Stevie has got it all - he can attack, defend, tackle. In fact, he is the perfect all-round player."

Ukraine

Former Chelsea striker Andriy Shevchenko: "For the past five years I've hardly thought about anything but the European Championship. It's fair to say this has extended my career. It's my dream... We have a young team with potential. A lot will depend on how the young players deal with the psychological factor."

At a Press conference at Carrow Road on Thursday, Hughton said: "This is something that I've been very excited about."

"It has been done very speedily, which I've been delighted with, and I'm looking forward to the challenge in front of me." Hughton said he was hoping to build on the Canaries' impressive return to the Barclays Premier League, which saw them finish in a

creditable 12th place. "[It's] not just a finishing position, it's financial position, aspects of the club where you feel it can grow, — and I've been very impressed with where the club is and how they want to move forward," he added.

Hughton admitted he faced a challenge in succeeding the successful Lambert, who oversaw two successive promotions.

"It's a wonderful achievement to rise from League One to the Premier League, and it's a hard act to follow," he said. "It's about making progress and with every new manager and player comes a new challenge."

Hughton is being joined by assistant manager Colin Calderwood, first-team coach Paul Trollope and chief scout Ewan Chester. A compensation package has been agreed with Birmingham. The Midlands club's acting chairman Peter Pannu said: "Chris is a great

It was a fitting way to close out a 6-3, 6-3 victory over No 4-seeded Petra Kvitova of the Czech Republic in the semifinals at Roland Garros on Thursday, a fitting way to announce that Sharapova is once again at

the height of her powers and at the top of her sport.

"It's a long road back; it's a long process. It's a lot of days of frustration and uncertainty, not knowing if you'll ever get there, not knowing how much you want it, not knowing whether (there) would be a moment like that for you again," Sharapova said at her news conference, the WTA's glass vase signifying her No 1 status sitting inches away. "So there's definitely a lot of tough things you have to go through to get to this point. But when you get here, and you look back at the things that you did, and the work that you put in, and the toughest days that

"UEFA has now become aware that there were some isolated incidents of racist chanting that occurred at the open training session of the Dutch team in Krakow," UEFA said in a statement on Friday. "Should such behavior happen at further training sessions UEFA would evaluate the operational measures to be taken to protect the players. UEFA has a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to discriminatory behavior and has given the power to referees to stop matches in case of any repeated racist behavior.—Reuters

Riots occur in Maungtaw of Rakhine State

Curfew imposed to restore peace and tranquility of community after controlling all situations

NAY PYI TAW, 8 June—The government is building the country to be a peaceful, modern and developed one in line with the democratic practices, while placing more emphasis on ensuring peace and stability and the rule of law.

At present, there occur unrests in Rakhine State that can harm peace and stability. As of this afternoon, rioters have destroyed houses, shops and guest houses and committed killings. Due to the violent acts and riots, Section (144) has been issued in Maungtaw and Buthidaung townships for ensuring peace and stability and prevalence of law and order.

At about 1pm, over 1000 rioters destroyed roof of penthouse of Kanbawza Bank and threw stones at United guest house and a house.

At about 2 pm, they also set fire to six shops in Thazin guest house and restaurants in the front of Thirimingalar Hall. After that, the fire spread to ward-4 between clock tower and hospital and destroyed 15 houses. In addition, they also set fire to two houses in MyoU ward and Khayaymyaing village in Duchiyardan village-tract on Maungtaw-Alethankyaw motor road.

In the evening, about 20 rioters stormed Maungtaw People's Hospital and disrupted people in the hospital. So, health staff went into hiding. They continued to destroy two houses in Myoma east ward in front of the hospital, and people had to go into hiding.

Due to the attacks of the rioters, Dr Khin Maung Lat aged 63; Daw Than Yi aged 57; U Kyaw Hla, 78 and U Thein Zaw, 36 got injured. And U Hla Maung, aged 65 was dead. During the violent attacks, local police battalion and police force tried to control the situation, putting out fires and safeguarding the security of local people.

Head of border area immigration inspection headquarters is keeping close supervision on the case. Section-144 is issued in Maungtaw and Buthidaung Township to control the situations and restore peace and stability as these riots can harm peace and stability and prevalence of law and order.

Curfew Order No.1/2012

8 June, 2012

(4th Waning of Nayon, 1374 ME)

General Penal Code No. 1/2012

1. It is hereby announced for the public knowledge on 8 June, 2012. During riots in Maungtaw on 8 June, 2012, houses in wards in Maungtaw were set fire, people were beaten and houses were looted. I believe that gathering of five or more than five people at streets, roads, the main road, lanes, garden (or) public places which are built for the people in Maungtaw to live in peace can cause arson attacks, clashes and lootings again.
2. Therefore, curfew is imposed under Section 144 of Code of Criminal Procedure and five or more than five people shall not gather at roads, streets, the main road, lanes, garden (or) mosques and public schools in municipal area of Maungtaw and not to go outside from 6 pm to 6 am.
3. This order shall take effect until any other order is issued.
4. I sealed and signed and issued this order on 8 June, 2012.

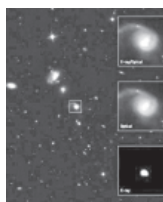
