## Vice-President Dr Sai Mauk Kham attends inauguration of Shwechaung Bridge No.1

NAY PYI TAW, 9 June—Shwechaung Bridge No.1, located on Pakokku-Monywa Road in Pakokku Township of Magway Region, was inaugurated this morning. Vice-President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Dr Sai Mauk Kham attended the bridge opening ceremony and formally opened the stone inscription of the bridge.

Shwechaung Bridge No.1 is the fifteenth one with over 180 feet in length built in the time of the government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. The bridge links Pakokku and Patheingyi-Monywa Road. And it can also link Pauk and Myaing Townships of Magway Region and Patheingyi of Ayeyawady Region and then Monywa of Sagaing Region.

Present on the occasion were Union ministers, Magway Region Chief Minister U Phone Maw Shwe, deputy ministers, the Region Hluttaw speaker and ministers, departmental officials, members of social organizations, townsenders, local people and students.

Speaking on the occasion, the Vice-President said that the old Shwechaung Bridge was destroyed last October due to storm O2B along with record-high torrents. Therefore, a new bridge was built near the old one.

Torrential rains in Pakokku and Gangaw Districts on 19 and 20 October last year sparked flash floods and erosions in the wards and villages of Pakokku, Pauk, Myaing and Seikpyu townships, causing losses and damages.

Due to the floods, humans and animals were killed and crop plantations, schools, houses and religious buildings as well as roads, railroads, dams, embankments, power lines and phone lines were destroyed or damaged.

However, thanks to concerted rescue efforts of responsible people, local Tatmadaw members, Myanmar Police Force members, service personnel and social organization members, flood victims relieved themselves to a certain degree.

Due to emergency rescue and relief works with the help and guidelines of State leaders, contributions of local and international NGOs and public wellwishers and close supervision of the region government, the situation has almost returned to normalcy. Furthermore, infrastructures such as roads, bridges and dams have been repaired or are under repair.

While the old Shwechaung Bridge was being repaired, measures were taken in order not to cause disconnections in Shwe Creek and a temporary Bailey bridge was built. As a result, vehicles could have run normally soon after the floods.

## UN General Assembly elects Serbian foreign minister president

UNITED NATIONS, 9 June—Serbian Foreign Minister Vuk Jeremic was elected president of the 67th Session of the UN General Assembly here on Friday. He won the backing of 99 of the 185 Assembly members in a secret ballot, ahead of Dalius Cekuolis, the permanent representative of the Republic of Lithuania to the UN. Jeremic will assume office at the start of the 67th Session in September. "I pledge to fulfill my duties as president to the very best of my ability in order to try and justify the confidence you have bestowed upon me," Jeremic said after his election.

The post rotates each year between five UN regional groups, with the 67th session being the turn of the Eastern European Group. Jeremic will succeed Nassir Abdulaziz Al-Nasser of Qatar, who was elected last year after endorsement by the Asian Group. Jeremic has held the post of Minister of Foreign

Affairs of the Republic of Serbia since 15 May, 2007. Al-Nasser congratulated Jeremic on the election victory. "Jeremic brings to this position his extensive experience in multilateralism and international affairs," he said. "I have no doubt that you will lead the Member States of this pre-eminent world body, in a truly able and dedicated manner."

In his speech, Jeremic highlighted the theme that he proposed for the high-level debate at the opening of the 67th session, which is bringing about adjustment or settlement of international disputes or situations by peaceful means. "Given our experience we believe we could facilitate implementation of any resulting proposals including those related specifically to conflict prevention," he said. "In taking up this critical issue in September and beyond, let us not forget that peace is not merely the absence of war."—Xinhua

## Hollande wants to "be helpful" in Middle East peace process

PARIS, 9 June — French President Francois Hollande on Friday said he wanted to "be helpful" to revive the deadlock Israeli-Palestinian peace process, affirming a continuity with his predecessor's diplomacy in the Middle East. "We seek to be helpful, that's the position of France. Be useful to ensure that we can give security, to the ones and to the others," Hollande said at a joint press conference with the Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas.

"We have good relations with the Israelis and the Palestinian Authority, which allows us to pass a number of messages and facilitate the resumption of dialogue," added the president in his first remarks over the Middle East peace issue since his taking office a month ago. Hollande, who has received Abbas at the Elysee Palace on Friday afternoon, expressed his wish to visit Israel and the Palestinian territories without giving an accurate date. The French head of state underlined the need to resume

negotiations "the sooner the better" to find the conditions for peace. "Today we must do everything to facilitate the recognition of a Palestinian state through a process of negotiation," Hollande said.

For his part, the visiting Palestinian leader reiterated his calls on Israel to accept the creation of a Palestinian state based on the territories division in 1967 and said to work further to collect enough support for a seat in the United Nations (UN). "We

will go to UN, if we fail to make progress on the negotiations. The ball is in Netanyahu's camp. We will seek recognition at the UN General Assembly to get the status of non-member state." Direct negotiations between Palestinian and Israeli officials have hit a deadlock since 2008 after an Israeli military raid devastated Gaza strip to halt rocket fires from the enclave ruled by the Hamas movement.

## No progress in nuclear inspection talks with Iran

VIENNA, 9 June — No progress was made in talks with Iran to finalize a deal on allowing greater access to its disputed nuclear programme, the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) said on Friday. "There has been no progress," said Herman Nackaerts, the IAEA Deputy Director General for Safeguards, after talks here with Iran's envoy to the IAEA Ali-Asghar Soltanieh. "This is disappointing," he said. No date for a follow-on meeting on the matter had been fixed, he added. The IAEA had been pressing Iran for a deal that would allow its inspectors immediate access to Iran's Parchin military site southeast of Teheran. Media said the IAEA has received reports that Iran had tested explosives which could be used to set off a nuclear charge. Iran denied such reports, and insisted access to Parchin would only be granted if Iran and the IAEA agree on certain conditions and steps.

"We are ready to remove all ambiguities and prove to the world that our activities are exclusively for peaceful purposes and none of these allegations (of seeking a bomb) are true," Soltanieh told reporters.—Xinhua

## UN says seven peacekeepers killed in Ivory Coast

ABIDJAN, 9 June—Seven United Nations peacekeepers were killed in an ambush in Ivory Coast on Friday while on patrol near the border with neighbouring Liberia, the world body said. It was not immediately clear who attacked the UN troops or if any Ivorian troops they were patrolling with were harmed. The United Nations said the mission had only recently increased its presence in the area, near the towns of Para and Tai, to boost efforts to

protect civilians. The troops came under attack just a few kilometres from the border with Liberia.

"According to the provisional death toll, seven blue helmets were killed in an ambush... seven blue helmets from Niger," said Sylvie van den Wildenberg, spokeswoman for the mission known by its acronym UNOCI. UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon told reporters in New York that he was "saddened and outraged" by the attack. "I

understand that their colleagues are still in danger. Even tonight, after the attack, more than 40 peacekeepers remain with the villagers in this remote region to protect them from this armed group," he said. The UN Security Council issued a statement saying it also "condemned in the strongest terms the attack." The 15-nation council "expressed their deep concern at the prevailing insecurity in western Cote d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) and the border area, and continued cross-border movements of armed elements, including militias and mercenaries." Speaking on condition of anonymity, a council diplomat said the border was a serious problem that needed to be dealt with. "It's obvious that the ferocity of the Liberian border poses a threat to the stability of the area," the diplomat told Reuters.

## US, Philippine leaders reaffirm commitment to peace, security in Asia

WASHINGTON, 9 June — The leaders of the United States and the Philippines reaffirmed on Friday their commitment to the peace and security in the Asia-Pacific region. US President Barack Obama met with his Philippine counterpart Benigno Aquino III in his Oval Office over bilateral and regional issues of mutual concern. "The Philippines is a close friend and a key economic and security partner for the United States," said a statement released by the White House after the meeting. "The two leaders reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening the bilateral relationship."

Stating the alliance between the two countries "has contributed to the stability and prosperity of the Asia-Pacific region for over 60 years," the statement said. "Both leaders reaffirmed their mutual commitment to the peace and security of the region and to the US-Philippines Mutual Defence Treaty" signed in August 1951.

## Russia, Iran agree diplomacy only way to solve nuclear issue

MOSCOW, 9 June — Leaders from Russia and Iran agreed there was no alternative to a political and diplomatic settlement to the Iranian nuclear issue, Russian presidential aide Yuri Ushakov said on Friday. In a statement summing up President Vladimir Putin's visit to China, Ushakov said Putin and his Iranian counterpart, Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, reached the consensus during their meeting in Beijing.

"Russia, as an active participant in talks between six nations and Iran, calls for the strictest observance of the nonproliferation regime," Ushakov said. "Putin and Ahmadinejad shared the opinion that there is no alternative to the political and diplomatic settlement to the problem. They also stressed the importance of the upcoming meeting of the political mediators in Moscow," he said.

According to Ushakov, Putin and Ahmadinejad also exchanged views on bilateral relations and cooperation on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) summit in Beijing. Iran has maintained its nuclear programme is purely for peaceful purposes, but US-led Western nations suspect it is seeking to develop a nuclear weapon. The latest round of talks between Iran and the six world powers, Russia, China, the United States, Britain, France and Germany, is scheduled to be held in Moscow on 18-19 June.

**US space agency pulls plug on astronomy probe**

CAPE CANAVERAL, 9 June—NASA canceled an X-ray astronomy mission designed to shed light on black holes, saying the project would have exceeded its budget by about 25 percent, officials said on Thursday.

The Gravity and Extreme Magnetism Small explorer, or GEMS, telescope won a NASA competition for a moderately priced space science mission in 2009 and had been scheduled for launch in 2014.

An independent review team estimated GEMS was going to exceed its \$119 million budget by 20 percent to 30 percent, Paul Hertz, NASA's astrophysics division director, told reporters at a conference call on Thursday. "It was clear that they would not be able to complete it within their cost cap," Hertz said. The projected cost overrun was due to technical issues in developing

the telescope's instruments, which delayed the project and increased payroll costs.

The agency already has spent about \$37 million on the project. It will cost about \$13 million more to cancel agreements with telescope builder Orbital Sciences Corp and other contractors.

The US space agency has faced massive budget

overruns in some of its flagship programmes, including the James Webb Space Telescope, the planned successor to the Hubble Space Telescope, that is now estimated to cost almost \$9 billion. GEMS had been designed, but not manufactured. It would have included a pair of X-ray telescopes sensitive to

polarized light. It was intended to allow astronomers to study the extremely powerful magnetic fields surrounding black holes, neutron stars and other dense, high-energy objects. A black hole is a region of space so dense with matter that not even light can escape its gravitational fist. Black holes are studied indirectly by measuring how they disrupt and affect the space around them and any nearby objects.

Neutron stars are the collapsed remains of extremely massive stars. Although NASA has no other observatories in the works that are similar to GEMS, Hertz said some of the mission's science goals can be tackled by alternative approaches and instruments.

These include NuSTAR, a high-energy X-ray telescope scheduled to launch on Wednesday.—Reuters

**Apple eyes new stores in two Chinese cities as iPad suit continues**

SHANGHAI, 9 June—Apple Inc is looking to open flagship stores in the major Chinese cities of Chengdu and Shenzhen, government officials said on Wednesday, while it continues to fight a Chinese company over the use of the iPad trademark.

Opening stores in Shenzhen and Chengdu will be a big boost for Apple's China business, which currently has only five stores on the mainland, three in Shanghai and two in Beijing.

In April, Apple reported quarterly profit that almost doubled after a jump in iPhone sales, particularly for the greater China region.

But the possibility of selling iPads in Shenzhen could lead to more legal action after Roger Xie, a lawyer for Proview Technology (Shenzhen), told Reuters that if Apple tried to sell the popular tablets there, Proview would seek an injunction to stop them.

Apple and Proview are battling it out in the Higher People's Court in Guangzhou over the right to use the iPad trademark, which Proview contends it owns. Xie said both sides are currently undergoing court-mediated negotiations.

Apple's flagship stores are normally packed with people tinkering with the latest iPad or iPhone and its product launches draw huge

crowds. But the company faces the problem of unauthorized re-sellers in less wealthy cities selling smuggled imports of its products.

Apple also faces a huge amount of piracy, a problem so pervasive in China that even entire fake Apple stores have been created where employees thought they actually worked for Apple.

Apple submitted documents on Monday to the Shenzhen government to open a store in Holiday Plaza, an upscale mall in the Nanshan district, according to an official with the Market Supervision Administration who would only give his last name as Ni.

"Apple is in the final stage and only needs to submit an environmental permit in order to gain approval," he said.—Reuters

**Apple may seek to stop US launch of Galaxy phone**

SAN JOSE, 9 June—An Apple Inc (AAPL O) lawyer

said the iPhone and iPad maker may seek a legal order stopping the launch of Samsung Electronics Co Ltd's (005930.KS) Galaxy S III phone in the United States later this month.

At a hearing on Thursday in a San Jose, California federal court, Apple attorney Josh Krevitt said the company could file for a temporary restraining order against Samsung as early as Friday.

"Once sales are made, the harm is irreparable," Krevitt

said. Apple sued Samsung for patent infringement last year, accusing the South Korean electronics maker of "slavishly" copying the iPhone and iPad. Samsung denies the claims and countersued. Apple filed papers on Tuesday seeking to ban Samsung's new Galaxy S III, along with the Galaxy Nexus.

Samsung has already booked over 9 million preorders of the Galaxy S III, which is set to be sold by carriers in the United States on 21 June, Apple said in its court filing. Samsung, however, argued that Apple should not be allowed to seek

such a fast injunction against the Galaxy S III.

US District Judge Lucy Koh said she would not address arguments about the Galaxy S III phone at the hearing on Thursday, and would instead focus on the Nexus. Koh said Apple could file for temporary restraining order on the Galaxy S III, but said it was unclear whether the request could be scheduled and decided before the launch. The case in US District Court, Northern District of California is Apple Inc vs Samsung Electronics Co Ltd. et al., 12-cv-630.

**Google deploying planes over cities for 3D maps**

SAN FRANCISCO, 9 June—Google Inc is deploying a fleet of small, camera-equipped airplanes above several cities, the Internet search company's latest step in its ambitious and sometimes controversial plan to create a digital map of the world.

Google plans to release the first three-dimensional maps for several cities by the end of the year, the company said at a news conference at its San Francisco offices on Wednesday.

Google declined to name the cities, but it showed a demonstration of a 3D map of San Francisco, in which a user can navigate

around an aerial view of the city.

"We're trying to create the illusion that you're just flying over the city, almost as if you were in your own personal helicopter," said Peter Birch, a product manager for Google Earth.

Google's head of engineering for its maps product, Brian McClendon, said the company was using a fleet of airplanes owned and operated by contractors and flying exclusively for Google.

Asked about potential privacy implications, McClendon said the privacy issues were similar to all aerial imagery and that the type of 45-degree-angle pictures that the planes take have been used for a long time.

Google has used airplanes to collect aerial photos in the past, such as following the 2010 San Bruno, Calif gas-line explosion, but the latest effort marks the first time the company will deploy the planes in a systematic manner to build a standard feature in one of its products.

By the end of the year, Google said it expects to have 3D map coverage for metropolitan areas with a combined population of 300 million people. The first 3D cityscape will be available within weeks.

**Samsung to build \$1.9 b logic chip line**

SEOUL, 9 June—Samsung Electronics Co (005930.KS), the world's No 2 chipmaker, said it will spend \$1.9 billion to build a new logic chip line to make processors for mobile devices as demand grows for smartphones and tablets.

Samsung, which makes application processors for Apple's (AAPL O) iPhone and iPad, which rival its own Galaxy and Note devices, said the new line will use 300 mm wafers and 20 nanometer and 14 nanometer processing

technology.

The South Korean firm is aggressively pumping up production of logic chips, as growth in the mobile device market outpaces weak computer sales. Demand for system chips used in smartphones and tablets is set to more than double to \$59 billion in 2016 from \$23 billion last year, according to research firm Gartner.

In a statement, Samsung said the new line, which it hopes to complete by the end of next year, would help meet

growing demand for "smart mobile solutions".

The investment plan follows Samsung's recent decision to build its first chip manufacturing plant in China to make NAND type flash memory chips, which analysts estimate will cost some 4-5 trillion won.

Ahead of the announcement, shares in Asia's biggest technology firm closed up 5.2 percent in a broad market rally that sent the benchmark KOSPI index up 2.6 percent.—Reuters

**Sensex falls; IT hit by global economic fears**

MUMBAI, 9 June—The Sensex and the Nifty fall around 0.5 percent, heading to their first decline in five sessions. Global risk assets hit as Fed Chairman Ben Bernanke comments dim hopes for more US stimulus, while a surprise rate cut from China raise fears of a potentially weak batch of key Chinese data on Saturday.

Falls are led by declines

**UNICEF targets deadly diarrhea, pneumonia in poor kids**

NEW YORK, 9 June—Concerted efforts to control diarrhea and pneumonia, the biggest killers of children under the age of five, could save the lives of up to 2 million of the world's poorest children each year, the United Nations Children's Fund said on Friday. The lives saved would be largely in Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia, according to a new study from the Fund. "Scaling up simple interventions could overcome two of the biggest obstacles to increasing child survival (and) help give every child a fair chance to grow and thrive," said Anthony Lake, executive director of the Fund, known as UNICEF.

The study called for coherent and reliable distribution plans for new vaccines against the major causes of pneumonia and diarrhea — including the influenza virus, rotavirus and pneumococcal bacteria.

It noted that one of the simplest and most effective ways to protect babies from disease is exclusive

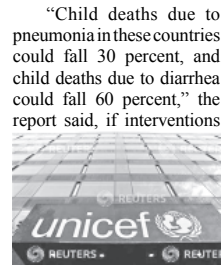
breastfeeding during the first six months of life, although fewer than 40 percent of infants receive such protection.

"Infants not breastfed are 15 times more likely to die due to pneumonia than are exclusively breastfed children," it noted. Pneumonia and diarrhea, which often occur simultaneously, account for 29 percent of deaths among children under five worldwide — or more than 2 million a year.

Nearly 90 percent of the children who die from the two diseases live in sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia, the report said. It noted that about half of those deaths occur in just five mostly poor and populous countries: India, Nigeria, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Pakistan and Ethiopia. Current care for children with pneumonia is haphazard in the 75 countries with the highest mortality rate, it added, with fewer than one-third of affected children receiving antibiotics.

Likewise, the study said inexpensive but potentially life-saving oral rehydration salts are used by only one third of the children with diarrhea in developing countries.

among poor children were raised to the level seen in the richest 20 percent of households in the same countries.

In that event, deaths of children from all causes could be reduced about 13 percent in those 75 countries by 2015,

it said. Adequate nutrition, hand washing with soap, safe drinking water and basic sanitation are also deemed vital safeguards against pneumonia and diarrhea, but are largely absent in impoverished regions.

"This report is a call to action" against the two childhood scourges, UNICEF said, adding that a global action plan will be released next year and set out a "clear and integrated vision" of how to proceed.

The UNICEF report was issued ahead of a planned meeting next week in Washington convened by the governments of Ethiopia, India and the United States on child-survival objectives. Some 700 experts from government and the private sector are expected to attend.

UNICEF, a UN agency, works for children's rights, their health, development and protection from violence, exploitation and abuse, according to the www.unicef.org Web site.

**Japan team create liver from stem cells**

TOKYO, 9 June—Japanese researchers have created a functioning human liver from stem cells, a report said on Friday, raising hopes for the manufacture of artificial organs for those in need of transplants. A team of scientists transplanted induced pluripotent stem (iPS) cells into the body of a mouse,

where it grew into a small, but working, human liver, the Yomiuri Shimbun said.

Stem cells are frequently harvested from embryos, which are then discarded, a practice some people find morally objectionable. But iPS cells — which have the potential to develop into any body tissue — can be taken from adults.

A team led by professor Hideki Taniguchi at Yokohama City University developed human iPS cells into "precursor cells", which they then transplanted into a mouse's head to take advantage of increased blood flow.

The cells grew into a human liver 5 millimetres (0.2 inches) in size that was capable of generating human proteins and breaking down drugs, the

Yomiuri reported.

The breakthrough opens the door to the artificial creation of human organs, a key battleground for doctors who constantly face a shortage of transplant donors.

Taniguchi's research could be "an important bridge between basic research and clinical application" but faces various challenges before it can be put into medical practice, the Yomiuri said.

An abstract of Taniguchi's research was delivered to regenerative medicine researchers ahead of an academic conference next week, but Taniguchi declined to comment to AFP before the meeting.

**Long-term loan rates sink further**

WASHINGTON, 9 June—Average mortgage rates for 30-year, fixed-rate loans fell to record lows for the sixth consecutive week, the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp said on Thursday. Average rates for 30-year contracts dropped from 3.75 percent to 3.67 percent with 0.7 points, a record low. Thirty-year mortgage rates averaged 4.49 percent the same week of 2011.

Average rates on 15-year contracts hit a record low of 2.94 percent with 0.7 points, down from 2.97 percent a week ago, Freddie Mac said.

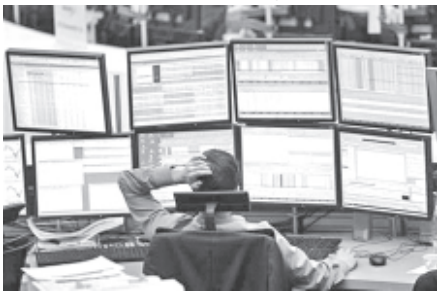
A year earlier, rates on 15-year contracts stood at 3.68 percent. Five-year adjustable rate mortgages averaged 2.84

percent in the week with an average 0.7 points, unchanged from the previous week. Five-year adjustable rate loans averaged 3.28 percent a year earlier. Average rates on one-year treasury-indexed adjustable mortgages rose from 2.75 percent to 2.79 percent with 0.4 points. A year ago, rates for these loans averaged 2.95 percent.

A sluggish recovery is keeping interest rates low, said Freddie Mac Vice President and Chief Economist Frank Nothaft. "Long-term Treasury bond yields declined further following downwardly revised economic growth and job creation data," he said.

### Tornado touches down in Wyo; at least one injured

DENVER, 9 June — Storms brought a tornado and golf-ball-sized hail to Wyoming that downed power lines, damaged homes and pushed some empty train cars on their sides on Thursday, a day after thunderstorms pummeled parts of Wyoming and Colorado with 2-inch hail and heavy rain. Five structures were heavily damaged by the tornado on Thursday, and 10 to 12 other structures also have damage, said Kelly Ruiz of the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security.

One person was treated at a hospital for a cut on the head, said local radio station owner Kent Smith, speaking for the Platte County Sheriff's Office. A Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad crew reported the tornado struck a train that had stopped in the Wheatland area due to 55 mph winds and a tornado warning, BNSF spokesman Gus Melonas said. Five empty train cars derailed onto their sides, and another was leaning over, he said. No injuries were reported. Some power lines also were downed, Ruiz said.

The tornado touched down briefly near Wheatland, north of Cheyenne, in a sparsely populated area, officials said. One of the destroyed homes was vacant, Smith said. Hail was reported in the Wheatland area and Laramie, National Weather Service meteorologist Tim Trudel said.—*Internet*

### City kids more likely to have food allergies than rural ones

WASHINGTON, 9 June — Children living in urban centers have a much higher prevalence of food allergies than those living in rural areas, according to a new study to be published in the July issue of *Clinical Pediatrics*. In particular, kids in big cities are more than twice as likely to have peanut and shellfish allergies compared to rural communities. The study included 38,465 children, 18 years and under, who comprised a representative sample of US households. Their food allergies were mapped by ZIP code.

The findings include: In urban centres, 9.8 percent of children have food allergies, compared to 6.2 percent in rural communities, almost a 3.5-percent difference; Peanut allergies are twice as prevalent in urban centers as in rural communities,

with 2.8 percent of children having the allergy in urban centres compared to 1.3 percent in rural communities; Shellfish allergies are more than double the prevalence in urban versus rural areas; 2.4 percent of children have shellfish allergies in urban centres compared to 0.8 percent in rural communities. Food allergies are equally severe regardless of where a child lives, the study found. Nearly 40 percent of food-allergic children in the study had already experienced a severe, life-threatening reaction to food.

The states with the highest overall prevalence of food allergies are Nevada, Florida, Georgia, Alaska, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland and the District of Columbia.

### Kansas family killed in plane crash in Fla swamp

JUNCTION CITY, 9 June — A Kansas businessman, his wife and their four children were killed on Thursday when their small plane crashed into a swampy area of central Florida, and word quickly spread to their hometown where the family was known for their charitable work and always having a house full of neighbourhood kids. The single-turboprop, fixed-wing plane was heading home to Junction City from the Bahamas when it broke apart and went down about 12:30 pm in the Tiger Creek Preserve, according to the Polk County Sheriff's Office in Florida.

Deputies reached the area by helicopters, but it was clear there were no survivors,

the sheriff's office said. The cause of the crash wasn't immediately known, and parts of the plane were found nearly 3 1/2 miles away, investigators said. Ron Bramlage, a prominent businessman in Junction City who owned Roadside Ventures LLC, was piloting the 2006 *Pilatus Pc-12/47*. The 45-year-old, his wife, Rebecca, 43, and the couple's children — Brandon, 15; Boston, 13; Beau, 11; and 8-year-old Roxanne — were killed.

"It's just a horrific loss," Junction City Mayor Pat Landes said, adding that the couple supported many local projects and provided college scholarships. The family was well known in town and at Kansas State University, where

the basketball arena is named for Ron Bramlage's grandfather. At least two dozen bouquets of flowers lined the black wrought-iron fence surrounding the family's ranch-style home by Thursday evening.—*Internet*

### Mexican man gets double arm transplant

MEXICO CITY, 9 June — A Mexican man whose arms were severely burned by electricity became the first patient in Latin America to receive a double arm transplant, doctors said on Thursday. Gabriel Granados, a 52-year-old father of two whose arms were amputated just below the elbow, received the arms of a 34-year-old shooting victim, said Dr Martin Iglesias, head of the surgical team that performed the operation. Granados told a news conference that the transplant was "terrific" and that he has begun to feel his new hands.

"This is wonderful that after being without hands for some time, all of a sudden I see new hands," said Granados, who is an agent in the financial unit of Mexico City's prosecutors' office. The surgery was in early May, but Granados was discharged from the hospital on Thursday. Doctors said he has recovered well. Granados' arms were amputated after they were badly burned in January 2011, when he received an electrical shock while giving instructions to a group of construction workers building a fence.

Before the surgery, doctors say they practiced the procedure on corpses. "This is a very special day for Mexico from a scientific point of view," said Dr Fernando Gabilondo, director of Mexico City's National Institute of Medical Science and Nutrition Salvador Zubiran, where the surgery was performed. Mexican doctors say there are other 23 patients waiting for arms transplant although only six could be successfully done.— *Internet*

### Three French tourists killed in Dominican bus crash

SANTO DOMINGO, 9 June — A bus packed with French tourists plowed into a freight train in the Dominican Republic on Thursday, killing at least three French nationals and injuring 15 others, authorities said.

Civil defence officials said the accident occurred near the city of Higuey, about 100 miles east of the Caribbean nation's capital, Santo Domingo, when the bus slammed into the train loaded with sugar cane at a railway crossing.

The fatalities, described as two men and a woman, were not identified by name, but Civil Defence spokesman Amado Avila said they were all French citizens.

The injured were being treated in area hospitals, including one medical facility in Romana, a popular tourist resort, Avila said. National Police officials said information about the cause of the accident and other details were not immediately available.

### Qatar Airways starts flights to Baghdad

DOHA, 9 June — Qatar Airways on Thursday completed its first flight to Baghdad since Saddam Hussein's 1990 invasion of Kuwait, a month after launching services to Iraq's autonomous Kurdish Region, an official said. Qatar Airways flight QR 442 landed in the Iraqi capital at around 3:40 pm (1240 GMT), an adviser to Iraq's transport minister Karim al-Nuri told AFP. "This flight is the first flight between Doha and Baghdad since the invasion of Kuwait, 22 years ago," Nuri said. The airline began services to Arbil, the capital

of Iraqi Kurdistan, last month, and there will now be four flights per week between Doha and Baghdad, and a similar number between the Qatari Capital and the holy Shiite city of Najaf, Nuri said. Iraq became a regional and international pariah following its invasion of the neighbouring emirate of Kuwait, and was hit by waves of violence in the years after the 2003 US-led invasion of the country. But with improvements in the security situation, various airlines from the Arab world and elsewhere are now flying to Iraq.

## IMF adjusts China growth forecast to 8 pct this year

BEIJING, 9 June—China's economic growth will likely moderate to around 8 percent this year amid downward risks caused by the ongoing crisis in Europe, an official from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said on Friday. In April, the IMF predicted an annual growth of 8.2 percent for China. David Lipton, First Deputy Managing Director of the IMF, who is in Beijing for annual policy dialogue with China, told *Xinhua* that the latest revision is still a comfortable growth for China under the current circumstances.

He said though it's hard to tell the impact that the European crisis will have on other countries, it's important that China and other countries be ready and attentive to the possible outcomes. He said China has the space for a forceful response if the world economy further slows and then affects the Chinese economy, stressing that the stimulus measures, if necessary, should align with the goal of quality growth that relies less on investment, more on consumption, and is environmentally friendly.

Noting China's recent announcement of an interest rate cut, he said the move reflected the authorities' commitment to achieving their macroeconomic objectives in the face of slowing growth and increased downside risks, especially from Europe. "We also welcome China's step toward the liberalization of interest rate margins, which will lower the cost of financial intermediation and allow market forces a greater role in pricing loans," said Lipton. He added that to realize balanced growth, China should also step up reforms to raise household income, liberalize the financial system, strengthen the social security system. "These priorities also feature in the 12th Five-year Plan, but timely implementation will be the key," he said.— *Xinhua*

## Bus bomb kills 19 in northwest Pakistan

PESHAWAR, 9 June — A bomb exploded on a bus on the outskirts of the northwestern Pakistani city of Peshawar on Friday, killing 19 people and wounding several, police officials said. There have been numerous bombings in Peshawar, capital of the Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa Province, since the Pakistani military stepped up operations against militant groups in 2007. "The bus was carrying around 40 people, most of them

government employees, when there was a huge blast," police official Merah Khan told *Reuters*. Police said the bus was travelling from Peshawar to the nearby town of Charsadda. Peshawar borders Pakistan's semi-autonomous ethnic Pashtun regions along the Afghanistan border where Islamist militants have found refuge despite a series of military offensives over the past few years.

The Pakistani Taliban, the Afghan Taliban, al-Qaeda and affiliated militant groups are entrenched in the tribal regions, and take advantage of the porous border to launch attacks against NATO and Afghan forces in Afghanistan.— *Reuters*

## Certain cancers to be included in 9/11 compensation fund

NEW YORK, 9 June — A top US health official approved a recommendation on Friday to include certain cancers among health conditions covered by a 4.3-billion-US-dollar compensation fund to help with treatment costs of people exposed to toxic material after September 11 attacks in 2001.

The decision by Dr John Howard, director of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health and administrator of the World Trade Center Health Programme, approved all of the 14 cancers recommended by the programme's advisory committee.

"We recognize how personal the issue of cancer and all of the health conditions related to the World Trade Center tragedy are to 9/11 responders, survivors and their loved ones," he said in a statement. The decision comes as welcome news for members of the emergency

services and people who lived or worked in downtown Manhattan and developed cancers after September 11 but were previously ineligible for compensation from the fund. It also covers those affected in the 11 September attack on the Pentagon and in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, where hijacked United Flight No. 93 crashed.

Thousands of firefighters, police officers, construction workers and other rescue and recovery workers spent months at the site of the World Trade Center towers that were felled by two hijacked jets.

## Colombia seizes nearly 1 ton of cocaine

BOGOTA, 9 June — Colombia seized nearly a ton of cocaine bound for the United States at its northern resort of Baru on Friday, the navy said. The 937-kg cache discovered at a private residence is worth a street value of about 23 million US dollars and belongs to a drug-trafficking group known as Los Paisas, according to the navy.

Naval commander Cesar Narvaez, whose jurisdiction is in Colombia's Caribbean waters, said the operation was carried out on Friday with the aid of an investigation team from the public prosecutor's office. No further details were provided.

Los Paisas mainly operates in the Colombian Caribbean, from where they ship drugs abroad, mostly to the United States, said Narvaez, adding the group is originally from the northwestern city of Medellin.

Like most organized crime groups in Colombia, Los Paisas is composed mainly of former members of the country's disbanded paramilitaries. Since this year, Colombia's navy have seized nearly 35 tons of cocaine, including Friday's cache.

## Husband of Nigeria air crash victim sues Boeing

LAGOS, 9 June — The husband of a woman killed in last Sunday's plane crash in Nigeria is suing the plane's manufacturer, Boeing, and engine maker United Technologies, saying her death was caused by a "dangerous and defective" aircraft. David Chukwunonso Allison, who lives in Lagos, is also suing the estate of the American pilot, Peter Waxtan, according to the lawsuit filed on Thursday in the US District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division.

Allison's wife, Joy, was among the 153 people on board who died in the crash in Lagos, Nigeria's worst in two decades. Waxtan was also killed.

The Boeing McDonnell

Douglas MD-83, operated by privately owned domestic airline Dana Air, hit an apartment block as it was coming in to land in Lagos on Sunday, killing all on board and probably six people on the ground.

Dana and Nigerian Aviation Minister Stella Oduah have said the pilot radioed a distress signal to report engine failure minutes before the airliner crashed. "There was a mayday call for engine failure at 1442 hours (1342 GMT). We don't know if it was one or two," Oscar Wilson, Dana's director of flight operations told a news conference on Thursday. He said all the planes used by Dana have been tested to ensure they can fly on just one engine, in

accordance with international norms. The lawsuit said that "As a direct ... result of defendants' design, manufacture, sale, shipment, distribution, maintenance, service, operation, ownership, leasing, and transfer of the subject aircraft and its component parts in a dangerous and defective condition ... Joy Chiedozie Allison was killed."

It blamed the pilot for failing to "properly execute landing of the subject aircraft", which it said was the result of "negligence and carelessness." Boeing spokesman Doug Alder Jr said it was standard practice for the company not to comment on pending litigation.

## 12 killed in passenger vans collision in central Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 9 June — At least 12 people were killed and over 40 others were injured in a head-on collision between two passenger vans in Pakistan's central city of Bhakkar on Saturday morning, reported local Urdu TV channel Express.

The report said that the incident happened on early Saturday morning when a passenger van heading from port city of Karachi to northern city of Rawalpindi rammed into a Bhakkar-bound bus coming from opposite direction at the main highway in Bhakkar, a city in the country's eastern province of Punjab.

Six people died right on the spot while six others succumbed to injuries later at a hospital in Bhakkar where local people and rescued

workers shifted the injured.

The hospital sources said that there are three women and a kid among the dead people adding that the death toll may further rise as several among the injured are in a critical condition.

According to initial investigations by the police, the accident took place due to over speeding. Road accidents frequently happen in Pakistan due to poor driving skills and violation of traffic rules.

Traffic police officials say that 90% of the accidents in the country take place due to human error.

During the present week, over one hundred people were killed in three major and five minor road accidents across the country.

## Italian police arrest suspect for school bombing

ROME, 9 June — Italian police detained on Wednesday a man suspected of being the author of the school bombing that killed one girl and injured others last May. According to local media, police detained a 68-year-old petrol station attendant near Lecce, a city in southern Italy close to Brindisi where the school is located.

Giovanni Vantaggiato, who is father of two daughters and has reportedly confessed his crime, is thought to have wanted to privately revenge against the school for a suffered injustice. Some 1,400 people have been checked by

police or questioned in the past days after the images taken from video surveillance of the probable killer were released.

The bombing outside the vocational school "Francesca Laura Morvillo Falcone" occurred on 19 May as a group of students were entering the building.

Melissa Bassi, a 16-year-old student, was killed in the explosion while another seven girls were rushed to hospital. One of them was in very serious conditions, and has gone through three delicate operations, local doctors said. — *Xinhua*

## Dozens injured when tour bus overturns in Ky

MUNFORDVILLE, 9 June— Officials say dozens have been taken to hospitals after a tour bus carrying students and parents to Washington, DC, overturned in south-central Kentucky. Kentucky State Police Trooper Jonathan Biven says 55 people, including 34 students, were aboard when the bus crashed on Wednesday evening on Kentucky Route 728 in Hart County, about 70 miles south of Louisville.

He says the injuries include minor scrapes and bruises. The injured were being transported by ambulance or private vehicle to area hospitals to be checked out. Hardin Memorial Hospital house manager Jerry Taylor said about seven people were being brought there by ambulance with injuries that were not life-threatening. Biven says the private bus carrying Cub Run students and adults had traveled just a few miles before the wreck. The trip was not school-related.

## Nigerian raid kills 16 suspected militants

LAGOS, 9 June — Nigerian soldiers have killed at least 16 militants, the army said on Wednesday, after gunfire and blasts rocked an area of the country's northeast where Islamists were believed to be hiding. "It's confirmed," Colonel Victor Ebhaleme told AFP when asked about reports of 16 Boko Haram members being killed in the city of Maiduguri. "They came to attack part of the city," he

said, declining to provide details. Gunfire and explosions erupted in Maiduguri on Tuesday as soldiers moved into the area where Boko Haram members were believed to be hiding, residents said.

"There have been at least eight explosions in these neighbourhoods and soldiers have moved in with tanks and have taken over the whole area," one resident said on Tuesday.

Another said the area was largely deserted of residents after earlier signs that soldiers were preparing a crackdown. Alleyways had been sealed off ahead of Tuesday evening's violence, they said. The explosions and gunfire began rocking the city at around 4:30 pm and stopped at around 9:00 pm.

Maiduguri is at the centre of Boko Haram's insurgency, which has claimed more than 1,000 lives since mid-2009. The group's mosque and headquarters were located there until they were destroyed in a 2009 military assault. Nigerian troops have also been accused of abuses in Maiduguri, including burning homes and killing civilians in the wake of bomb attacks.

Thousands of residents have fled the city amid the spiralling violence. Also on Tuesday in the northern city of Kano, gunmen shot dead a former deputy Nigerian police chief, his driver and a bodyguard, police said.

## Biodiversity loss poses growing threat to human life: ecologists

VANCOUVER, 9 June— Biodiversity loss is increasingly threatening the planet's ability to provide humans with life's essentials, says a team of international ecologists. In a consensus statement published on Wednesday in the journal *Nature*, the 17 researchers also called for more actions to prevent further losses of species. The team reached its conclusion after combing more than 1,000 ecological studies conducted since the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de

Janeiro, in which the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) was opened for signature.

"We've reached a point where efforts to preserve species and biological diversity might no longer be an act of altruism," said Diane Srivastava, one of the authors of the paper and also a professor from University of British Columbia. Biodiversity is of great significance in that it helps, among many others, increase the production of commercial

crops and resist invasion by exotic plants and plant pathogens, according to the study. Experts agree that the loss of such diversity would be harmful to the world's ecosystems, said Bradley Cardinale, leader of the research and an associate professor at University of Michigan.

It might also harm mankind by reducing ecosystem services that are essential to human health and prosperity, he added. "We need to take biodiversity loss

far more seriously — from individuals to international governing bodies — and take greater action to prevent further losses of species," Cardinale stressed. The appeal was published as international leaders are preparing to gather in Rio de Janeiro on 20 June for the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development, also known as the Rio+20 Conference. Till now the CBD has been endorsed by 193 signatory parties.

## Death toll in NW China's avalanche rises to four, six still missing

LANZHOU, 9 June—The death toll in Tuesday's avalanche in northwest China's Gansu Province has risen to four. Rescuers are still searching in snow-packed debris for six other missing prospecting workers on Thursday morning. The avalanche occurred late Tuesday night in a remote part of Subei County, burying the campsite of the Heicigou Antimony Ore Prospecting Station.

Hu Jianzhong, head of the station, said there were a total of 21 people at the campsite at the time of the avalanche. Ten people were buried, and 11 others managed to escape. Rescuers have sent one severely injured survivor to hospital, Hu said. Rescuers are still double-checking the number of workers who may have stayed at the campsite.

Heicigou, situated over 4,300 metres above sea level, is located 180 km away from the county seat of Subei, which is a dense Mongolian ethnic area.

Since Monday, the area had been hit by heavy rainstorms rarely seen in the local history, and the local observatory said precipitation exceeded 500 millimeters in the 23 hours prior to 3 pm on Tuesday. A heavy snowfall hit the mountainous region on Wednesday, which further aggravated the condition of the rescue work. By Thursday, snow on ground reached 60 cm deep. Rescuers could only reach the avalanche site on foot. The prospecting team is owned by Subei Jinze Mining Co Ltd. The share-holding company has prospecting rights on a 1,600-square-km area in Subei. — *Xinhua*

## Colombian forces kill seven guerrillas

BOGOTA, 9 June— Seven members of Colombian guerrilla group National Liberation Army (ELN) were killed on Thursday during a joint military operation, said the country's air force. The early morning raid, carried out by army and air force troops, "neutralized" a riverbank ELN camp in a rural zone in the northwestern department of Choco, according to an air force statement.

"The death in combat of seven narco-terrorists has been confirmed," and another one was captured, said the statement, without identifying the killed and detained. The statement termed the operation as a "strong hit" against the ELN, which emerged in 1964 and is now estimated to have about 4,000 members.— *Xinhua*



## Climber BASE jumps from Himalayan peak



A Russian man who spent six days climbing a mountain in the Indian part of the Himalayas became the first to BASE jump from the peak in a wing suit.

Valery Rozov, 47, a veteran jumper, spent 30 days on the 21,466-foot mountain with climbing partners Alexander Ruchkin and

Victor Volodin before jumping on 25 May in his wing suit and spending 90 seconds in the air, Red Bull, Rozov's sponsor, reported on its Web site. "This was my first project in the Himalayas," Rozov said. "We had a few difficulties along the way, so I am really pleased that we were able to complete the jump successfully."

Rozov said it took his climbing partners three days to climb back down the mountain. BASE jumping is named for the four categories of fixed objects participants can jump from, buildings, antennas, spans and earth.

Agency worked overnight to clean up the mess and were finished by 2:45 am on Friday.

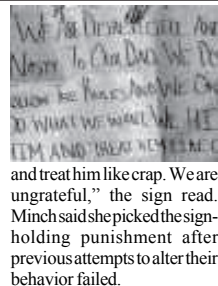

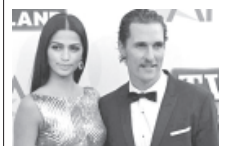

But the Russians kept on attacking. In the 79th minute, Pavlyuchenko found Dzagoev with a clever pass and he hammered the ball past Cech from 18 yards out. In the 82nd minute, Pavlyuchenko tried for an angle to working a shooting opportunity and once he did, he thumped it past Cech from the edge of the box to seal the 4-1 win. With the victory, Russia are topping Group A as co-hosts Poland tied Greece 1-1 in the tournament's opener hours earlier. — Xinhua

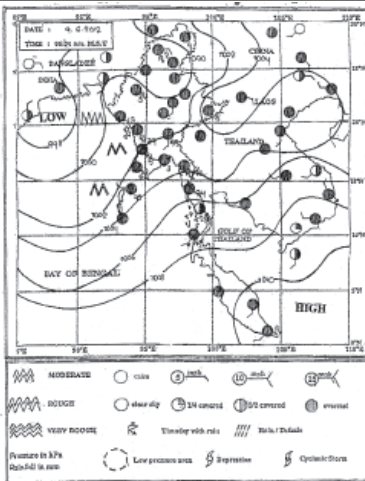
**Plane crashes in southern Russia, one killed**

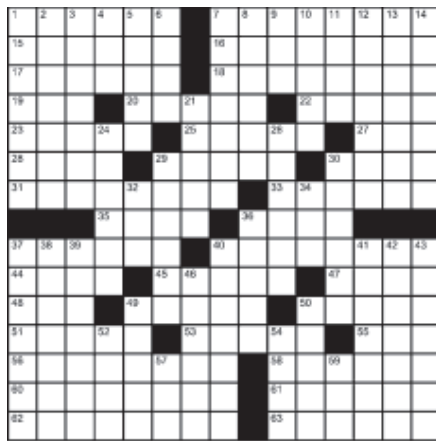

**Sharapova downs Errani to claim Roland Garros crown**

PARIS, 9 June—Maria Sharapova kept her poise to outwit and overpower diminutive Italian Sara Errani and win her first French Open with a 6-3, 6-2 victory on Saturday.

Despite the one-sided scoreline, Italian Errani troubled Sharapova with some cute volleys, sliced forehands, daring dropshots but still found the Russian to be an insurmountable

obstacle. With Errani standing at just 1.64 metres, the statuesque Russian used her 24 cms advantage and wider wingspan to great effect as she chased down everything the Italian could throw at her.

She wrapped up victory when Errani ended a prolonged rally by dumping a backhand into the net, allowing Sharapova to become the 10th woman

### Situations in Maungtaw and Buthidaung townships have returned to normal, peace restored Authorities have called for public cooperation in maintaining peace, stability and rule of law

NAY PYI TAW, 9 June—As unrests and violence that broke out in Maungtaw of Rakhine State were detrimental to stability of the State and the rule of law, action was taken to control all the situations in time and a curfew has been imposed under section 144 in order to ensure community peace and tranquility in Maungtaw and Buthidaung Townships.

Members of local police battalion and police force are taking measures such as stopping riots with intimidation, controlling the situation, putting out arsons and protecting the local people for their security.

According to the incidents that happened yesterday evening and night, the rioters set fire to Tharaykonbaung Village of Wawduthara Village-tract, about 12 miles from Maungtaw, and robbed property. In that incident, three people including teacher U Chan Tha were killed and one other injured. Similarly, the mobs set fire to Shweyinyay

Village of Nyaungchaung Village-tract and robbed property. Moreover, the villages of Bawdhikon, Kingchaung, Kanthaya, Kanpyintha, Waithali and Mawrawady were burned.

In addition, local security force members foiled the rioters' arson attempts in Ward-4, Ward-5 and Aungbala, U-daung and Pyatha villages of Maungtaw and in Ward-5 and Ywama Village of Buthidaung.

As authorities concerned were able to control systematically and protect the local people, the situations have returned to normalcy since this morning and peace has been restored.

In yesterday's incidents, seven people were killed, 17 were injured and 494 houses, 19 shops and one guesthouse were destroyed.

Authorities have called on all the people to cooperate in maintaining peace and stability and the rule of law taking lesson from the casualties, losses and damages.—MNA

### Three rescue camps for local people opened in Maungtaw Medical staff arrive in Maungtaw, start providing medical treatments

NAY PYI TAW, 9 June—Situations in Maungtaw of Rakhine State have returned to normality since this morning as riots that broke out yesterday were systematically contained.

Three rescue camps which were opened in the philanthropic school, Aung Myay Bodhi Monastery and Baho Monastery in Maungtaw for helping local people who saw their homes burnt down in the riots. Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement provided 3.3 tons of assistances and Office of Commander-in-Chief (Army), over 2 tons of 50 bales of clothes. More aids will be sent to the camps.

A team of 32 medics from the Office of C-in-C (Army) and one medical team including 10 members of Ministry of Health arrived at Maungtaw today and started to provide medical treatment to the injured.

Lt-Gen Hla Min from the Office of C-in-C (Army), Rakhine State Chief Minister U Hla Maung Tin, Commander of Western Command Brig-Gen Ko Ko Naing, Deputy SWRR Minister U Phone Swe were in Maungtaw to keep favourable conditions for the stability and the rule of law and to coordinate assistances to the local people.—MNA

### Tatmadaw military columns help local administrative teams, police forces to restore stability, rule of law
