Nadal wins record seventh French Open

PARIS, 11 June—Spain's Rafa Nadal sank to his knees in celebration after beating Serbia's Novak Djokovic 6-4 6-3 2-6 7-5 to win a record seventh French Open title on Monday.

The number two seed overtook Sweden's Bjorn Borg, who won six Roland Garros titles, and ended Djokovic's hopes of becoming the third man to win four

consecutive grand slams.

"For me it is a great honour," Nadal said, clutching the Musketeers Cup under his arm, after the presentation ceremony on court.

"This tournament is probably the most special in the world and having this trophy with me I am really emotional. It is probably one of the most special moments in my career."

Play had been suspended on Sunday, because of rain, with the Spaniard a break down in the fourth set, but he broke back in the first game after the resumption, having rediscovered the penetrating fizz that deserted him in the damp conditions of the previous evening.

Then Nadal had moaned vociferously about the wet surface that made conditions underfoot treacherous and the ball hard to see, but he came out refreshed on Monday with the bit between his teeth.

He was back to the player who had raced into a 3-0 lead in the first set on Sunday, managing to generate his vicious top spin on the dry balls. —Reuters

China's submersible reaches Mariana Trench to challenge world's dive record

ABOARD XIANGYANGHONG 09, 11 June — The *Xiangyanghong 09* ship carrying China's manned deep-sea submersible *Jiaolong* arrived at the designated dive area of the Mariana Trench on Monday morning, where it will attempt the world's first 7,000-metre dive. The *Jiaolong*, depending on local weather and sea conditions, will dive six times, deeper and deeper, to try a new dive record.

The first dive will challenge the depth of over 5,000 metres, but less than 6,200 metres. The fifth and sixth dives are scheduled to

challenge the depth of 7,000 metres. The six dives will test various functions and performances of the manned submersible at great depths. Each dive may last for eight to 12 hours. The *Jiaolong* succeeded in diving 5,188 metres in the Pacific Ocean last July, enabling China to conduct scientific surveys in 70 percent of the world's seabed areas.

"Before the formal sea dives, a comprehensive review of the submersible as well as its support system will be taken," on-scene commander Liu Feng told *Xinhua* on the

The letter, whose Farsi translation was made public by several Iranian news agencies, showed the gulf that exists between Iran and the so-called P5+1 group (the United States, Britain, France, Germany, Russia and China) going into the negotiations. Ashton's office represents the P5+1 in dealings with Iran. Bagheri and Schmid are tasked with arranging the talks and have exchanged several letters. The Moscow round follows two earlier meetings since early April, in Istanbul and in Baghdad, that have failed to yield any progress. Bagheri wrote to Schmid: "Your recent letter

surprised me; it tabled issues that were a long way apart from the agreements... of the talks in Baghdad between Iran and the P5+1 as well as those agreed in comprehensive talks between the deputies in Geneva." He said that Schmid had "neither introduced any plans nor responded to the proposals of the Islamic Republic of Iran" that were presented in Baghdad as a counter-offer to a P5+1 package of demands and incentives that Iran rejected.

Bagheri also asked why Ashton's office was refusing an Iranian request that the Moscow round be preceded by a meeting of experts and deputies to define its scope and agenda. — *Internet*

Largest narcotics seized in Nepal

KATHMANDU, 11 June — Nepal Police on Saturday night seized the largest amount of refined hashish from the Capital Kathmandu. An anti-drug operation squad seized 2,640 kgs of hashish, which was the largest amount it ever recovered in its single operation in the country. Police claimed that the seized narcotics were the largest quantity ever confiscated in

the capital. Police have also arrested five traders for their alleged involvement in the illegal drug trading.

Anti-drug squad confiscated the contraband from Chalnakhel Seti Devi Village Development Committee-9 of Kathmandu. The contraband was packed in 88 jute sacks. "This was the first time in the history of Nepal Police that our special

intelligence operation squad involved in anti-drug operation seized the highest quantity of hashish," Sher Bahadur Basnet, Superintendent of Police, told media. Basnet said the amount of the seized contraband was bigger than the total seizure of last year.

Nepal police confiscated only 1,271 kgs of hashish last year. "We have succeeded to

confiscate the amount within two months of the current fiscal year, which proved intense mobilization of our intelligence," Basnet said. The special anti-drug squad led by police inspector Krishna Gopal Paneru of the Narcotic Drug Control and Law Enforcement Unit, Baneswore, seized the contraband. Speaking at a news conference, Basnet said the traders were arrested after long continued efforts and monitoring. — *Xinhua*

France's Hollande in strong parliament position

PARIS, 11 June — French President Francois Hollande is on track to win a solid parliamentary majority after a first-round election that leaves him strengthened heading into a flurry of talks with euro zone leaders that could make or break the currency union.

Sunday's vote left Hollande's Socialist Party bloc likely to win the 289 seats it needs for an outright majority in the 577-seat National Assembly, and almost certain to do so with its Greens Party allies on

board, polling institutes said. The seat projections indicated Hollande may not need to rely on eurosceptic hard leftists to pass legislation, relieving him of a potential headache as Berlin pressures its partners to start moving towards a fiscal union in Europe.

"The realization that the crisis is serious and that the government needs elbow room to get the country back on track is playing in favour of the government winning an absolute majority," said Stephane Rozes at the CAP

political consultancy.

Socialists were muted in their reaction, anxious to keep the pressure on supporters to vote in next Sunday's runoff, but winning power in the lower house for the first time in a decade would be a triumph for the left after it took the Senate in 2011 and won the presidency in May after 17 years on the outside.

"Change is beginning," Prime Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault said, but warned: "Everything hinges on next Sunday."

Japan calls for tougher insider trading rules

TOKYO, 11 June — Japan's securities watchdog flexed its muscles by fining a foreign financial institution for insider trading for the first time, but punishments overall remain modest by global standards, sparking calls for tougher laws to deter a practice that has gone unchecked for years. Since March, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has sought fines against three investment firms in a total of four cases brought so far in its probe into insider trading ahead of public share offerings, a near endemic problem in Japan.

The latest case, unveiled on Friday, showed a more aggressive side of the SEC. The regulator slapped US broker-dealer First New York Securities with a \$185,000 fine, its harshest penalty yet. But

critics say the penalties are still too lax. The first three cases featured very small fines against the asset management firms that traded on inside information and the broker employees that tipped off their clients remained exempt from prosecution under Japanese law.

"We have to consider harsher punishments. The current penalties are way too light," said Shinsuke Amiya, a lawmaker in the ruling Democratic Party and member of a working group formed to look at strengthening insider trading regulations. Amiya, a former vice chairman of Merrill Lynch in Japan, said he wants to consider rules that would strip offenders of their operating licenses and the establishment of a new fining system to complement to the modest one already in place.

Malaysia Airlines, Japan Airlines to start code share on 1 July

KUALA LUMPUR, 11 June — Malaysia Airlines (MAS) announced on Monday it would commence a code share cooperation with Japan Airlines (JAL) come on 1 July in a move to expand its network as the national carrier sets to become a full member of the 13-year-old Oneworld airline alliance before the end of this year. The code share agreement, signed on Monday in Beijing, covers up to 347 weekly domestic and international flights,

including those on the Malaysia-Japan trunk routes operated by both carriers, the national carrier said in a statement. "The code share between Malaysia Airlines and Japan Airlines is an important first step towards strengthening our relations with partner airlines in the oneworld alliance.

We hope to enter more code share relationships with other oneworld partners progressively in the coming months," MAS Group CEO, Ahmad Jauhari Yahya said.

"These efforts will also contribute towards greater connectivity options for our oneworld alliance partners," he added. Sales for the code share begins on 12 June.

MAS currently has code share arrangements with Cathay Pacific Airways and Royal Jordanian Airlines.

It said discussions are on-going to expand code share with those two airlines and other oneworld alliance members. — *Xinhua*

Hybrid “ultrabooks” blur line between tablets, laptops

differentiate a tablet from notebook or an ultrabook.

Microsoft Corp (MSFT O), which has long been the dominant force in PCs but has fallen far behind in the tablet race, is set to unveil its Windows 8 operating system later this year, designed to run on super-thin laptops called ultrabooks and tablets powered by Intel Corp’s (INTCO) chips.

The impending launch has prompted PC vendors to come up with a rash of hybrid designs, featuring touch screens and myriad configurations of moving or detachable keyboards.

“In future, it’ll be a blur in the definition of an ultrabook

and a tablet because of convertibles with either detachable or sliding keyboards,” said Tracy Tsai, a Taipei-based analyst at research firm Gartner. At Computex Taipei, the world’s second largest computer show, visitors flocked to the booths trying out every twist and turn that converts an ultrabook into a tablet.

Lenovo Group Ltd’s (0992.HK) IdeaPad Yoga and Asustek Computer Inc’s (2357.TW) Taichi have screens that bend all the way back. Samsung Electronics’ (005930.KS) Hybrid becomes an ultrabook when the tablet clips onto a keyboard with magnetic hinges.

One tablet-ultrabook convertible that garnered attention was Asustek’s (2357.TW) Taichi, whose dual-sided screens can run different applications at the same time.

“There’s a lot of use cases on tablets and tablet convertibles that people might approach with lots of fun, content consumption type of activity, but want to pop into it and use a productivity application and a desktop mode,” said Chris Walker, Intel’s director of microprocessor product marketing.

“The great thing is people don’t have to make that choice.” —Reuters

Web site follows Egyptian excavations

BALTIMORE, 11 June— Armchair archaeologists can follow an excavation in Egypt courtesy of a Web site set up by Johns Hopkins University researchers, school officials said.

A Johns Hopkins Egyptologist and her team will share the progress of their excavation of the Temple of Mut precinct in Luxor at <http://www.jhu.edu/egypttoday/index.html>.

A blog by Egyptologist Betsy Bryan and a daily photo journal will give virtual visitors a taste of what life is like for the graduate students, undergraduates, artists, conservators and photographers working on a site yielding important finds from ancient Egypt’s New Kingdom, a university release

said. A myriad of discoveries have been made by Hopkins researchers in Egypt over the past decade, including a major find in 2006: a 3,400-year-old nearly intact statue of Queen Tiy, one of the queens of the powerful king Amenhotep III. The statue is “one of the true masterpieces of Egyptian art,” Bryan said.

The “Hopkins in Egypt Today” Web site can bring ancient Egypt to any smartphone, iPad or Internet-ready device around the world, the university said.

The site will be updated daily through June and the posts will remain online as part of the archives of digs dating back to 2001, the school said.

Fusion power said one step closer

KNOXVILLE, 11 June — US researchers say they’ve completed an important step in developing a key technology that could lead to clean nuclear fusion power.

Researchers at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, are part of an international effort to develop an experimental reactor that can demonstrate the feasibility of fusion energy for the power grid.

The project, known as ITER, is building a fusion reactor near Cadarache, France, that aims to produce 10 times as much energy as it uses. The Tennessee researchers have successfully tested a technology that will insulate and provide structural integrity to the 1,000-ton central solenoid, the reactor’s

“backbone.”

A fusion reactor uses magnetic fields to confine the plasma within it, and the central solenoid, which consists of six giant coils stacked on top of one another, plays a vital role by both igniting and steering the plasma current.

Researchers had to find the right material—a glass fiber and epoxy chemical mixture that is liquid at high temperatures and turns hard when cured—and the right process of inserting this material into all of the necessary spaces inside the central solenoid.

The UT team has tested the technology inside its mockup of the central solenoid conductor, a university release reported on Friday.

It took two years to develop the technology and more than two days to impregnate the central solenoid mockup, researchers said.

Shrimp’s weapon could inspire better armour

RIVERSIDE, (Calif), 11 June—The unique structure of a club-like arm of a crustacean could inspire changes in military body armour and vehicle and aircraft frames, US scientists say.

The bright orange fist-like club of the mantis shrimp, a 4-inch-long crustacean found in tropical waters, accelerates underwater faster than a .22-caliber bullet and can smash through mollusk shells and crab exoskeletons, researchers at the University of California, Riverside, said.

Engineering Professor David Kisailus set out to find what enabled the club to withstand 50,000 high-velocity strikes on prey during its lifespan.

The shrimp’s club is a highly complex structure, he found, composed of three specialized regions that work together to create a structure tougher than many engineered ceramics.

The surface of the club is similar to human bone and supports the impact when the mantis shrimp strikes prey.

Under the surface, highly

organized and rotated layers of chitin fibers dispersed in mineral act as a shock absorber, absorbing energy as stress waves pass through the club.

Finally, oriented chitin fibers wrap around the sides of the club, keeping it intact during high-velocity impacts.

“This club is stiff, yet it’s light-weight and tough, making it incredibly impact tolerant and interestingly, shock-resistant,” Kisailus said in a UCR Riverside release

on Thursday. “That’s the holy grail for materials engineers.”

Potential applications in structural materials are widespread because the final product could be lighter weight and more impact-resistant than existing products, he said.

The mantis shrimp’s impact so powerful, Kisailus said, that he needs to keep his test subject in a special aquarium in his lab so it doesn’t break the glass.

Endangered bison moved to Denmark

COPENHAGEN, (Denmark), 11 June—Seven endangered European bison have been sent from Poland to a new home on a Danish island in the Baltic Sea, conservationists say.

The island of Bornholm will be home for one male and six females of the species that was nearly wiped out in the last century.

The 20th century’s two major wars were devastating for Europe’s bison, as they were hunted for meat in countries hit by widespread hunger, leaving just an estimated 800 animals in the wild, mostly in the Bialowieza forest that straddles Belarus and Poland.

The European bison is Europe’s heaviest land mammal, with adults reaching 10 feet in length and weighing as much as 2,000 pounds.

The Bornholm bison will live in a 500-acre enclosure, with the hope in about five years’ time they will be released into the wild. “We need to see how they deal with people walking around and in cars, and see if they do help the environment,” Hansen said.—Internet

They were taken to the island by ferry, officials said. “They look very well,” project manager Tommy Hansen told the BBC. Denmark hopes the bison will improve the island’s biodiversity by conserving meadows, as they like to eat tree bark which keeps the forest back, and that their numbers may grow and increase

Lunch with Warren Buffett: \$3,456,789

NEW YORK, 11 June—An anonymous bidder won lunch with billionaire investor Warren Buffett for a record \$3,456,789, a charity that works to fight poverty said.

Glide, a charity based in San Francisco, said 10 active bidders kept the price of lunch with Buffett rising during an eBay auction that began Sunday. There were more than 110 inquiries before the bidding closed at 10:30 pm on Friday.

"We are shouting, dancing, rejoicing and celebrating," the Rev. Cecil Williams, Glide's founder,

said in a statement. "We have made history, thanks to Warren Buffett."

Last year's winning bid for lunch with Buffett, the chairman and chief executive officer of Berkshire Hathaway, was \$2,626,411 by Ted Weschler, CNNMoney reported. Buffett hired the former managing partner of Peninsula Capital Advisors in September. Weschler had also dined with Buffett in 2010 after winning that auction. This year's lunch will be at the Smith & Wollensky steak-house in New York City.—Internet

IMF prescribes \$46b for Spanish banks

WASHINGTON, 11 June—Banks in Spain require an additional \$46 billion to survive an economic downturn, the International Monetary Fund said.

The number is just the start, but will likely be considered a solid, credible start by leaders in Europe as they formulate a plan to rescue Spain's financial sector, which is reeling from huge losses in the housing market, *The New York Times* reported on Saturday.

Housing market losses hit first. After that, the economic downturn, which is pulling much of Europe down in a double-dip recession, threatened Spain's financial institutions.

The IMF's aid estimate was based on the Spanish economy contracting by 4.1 percent in 2012 and 1.6 percent in 2013.

The audit said Spain's banking system "appears resilient to further shocks," but it also said rescuing banks

required a fast and final solution to reinstate investor confidence.

"In recent years a gradual approach to taking corrective action allowed weak banks to continue to operate to the detriment of financial stability," the report said.

President Barack Obama at a Friday news conference urged "taking clear action as soon as possible to inject capital into weak banks."

In New York, IMF Managing Director Christine Lagarde said the recent financial crisis in Europe is "now threatening the very existence of the European project," referring to the currency region of 17 countries that use the euro.

In May, Spain nationalized its largest mortgage firm Bankia, but has yet to formally ask for help from the international community. While that step is expected soon, the government said it would wait for the IMF report and two private audits before requesting a bank bailout.—Reuters

Summer sale on in global jet industry

BEIJING, 11 June—A summer battle for orders is underway in the global jet industry, which gathers in Beijing on Sunday for the first of two crucial events in two months, pitting the world's largest planemakers against each other in a race for deals worth \$50 billion at catalogue prices.

The potential deals span all continents and every pattern of powered flight from the largest airliners to warplanes and luxury business jets, shielding aerospace workers from the worst effects of a slowdown spreading from Europe's debt crisis.

But analysts say Airbus (EAD PA) and Boeing (BA N) are having to offer sporadically hefty discounts to ride out economic uncertainty, especially for maturing models or early batches of new ones like the 787 Dreamliner.

Boeing is expected to win the fiercely contested annual order race for the first time since 2006 as it catches up

with a decision by Airbus to revamp medium-haul jets, resulting in big fuel savings for airlines on the Airbus A320 and Boeing 737.

The dominant civil planemakers are also positioning themselves early ahead of next month's Farnborough air show, with

profit unchanged at \$3 billion, but unease is growing as Europe discusses a new bailout and China's economy slows.

Major characters in the aerospace industry are in the Chinese capital negotiating on the sidelines of IATA's Beijing summit, which comes

deals worth \$14 billion announced in the past 72 hours.

Both companies have accused each other of waging a price war to win hundreds of orders for the revamped A320neo and 737 MAX respectively, and deny cutting corners themselves. Several industry analysts say pricing is under pressure this year.

"Both sides are heavily discounting," said Richard Aboulafia, aerospace analyst at US-based Teal Group.

Although the makeover medium-haul jets offer airlines a reduction of 15 percent in fuel, the industry's highest cost, most carriers remain under financial pressure and some are delaying deliveries to shore up their cash positions. Airlines meeting in Beijing are expected to hear that their industry body, the International Air Transport Association (IATA), has left its forecast for 2012 sector

weeks before another showcase, the 9 to 15 July Farnborough air show in Britain.

Chicago-based Boeing was relegated to the background during most of last year's equivalent event as Airbus broke records with sales of the A320neo, but later opted for a similar upgrade.

This year will be different. Boeing is preparing to hit back with a spree that could soon include an order from United Continental (UALN) for 100 narrowbody jets plus some 70 options, industry sources said. It will want to persuade the top five aircraft leasing companies led by AIG (AIGN) unit ILFC to put firm signatures on undisclosed draft orders that US aerospace analyst Scott Hamilton estimates at 300-400 jets.

These will include an order from GECAS, whose General Electric GE LN makes 737 engines.—Reuters

Toddler survives 39-minute heart stoppage

YORK, (England), 11 June—A 2-year-old British boy who had a heart attack and was kept alive by CPR has recovered after his heart stopped for 39 minutes, his mother said.

Trudy Hilary said she found her toddler Zach collapsed on the floor on 26 Jan and performed mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on him for 10 minutes until the paramedics arrived. They continued CPR until they reached the hospital where the boy was given adrenaline to start his heart again, *The Daily Telegraph* reported on Friday.

Doctors at York Hospital were told the parents the boy had swelling on his brain and he was put into a medically

induced coma. However, there were concerns he suffered brain damage, his mother said.

However, Trudy Hilary said her son is back to where he was before the heart attack — but it took him several months to relearn how to eat, hold a cup, walk and talk all over again.

When Zach Hilary was taken off a ventilator while in the hospital, a brain scan showed he had brain damage, but he was given physiotherapy and speech therapy and on 27 Feb he was sent home, his mother said.

Doctors said the cause of the heart attack remained a mystery.—Internet

Venezuela's Chavez says tests show him in good health

CARACAS, 11 June—Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez said on Saturday medical tests following his cancer treatment show he is in good health, but provided few additional details about an illness that has become an obsession in the OPEC nation. The former soldier's health is seen a key factor in his re-election bid because a serious relapse of his cancer could limit his ability to campaign ahead of the October 7 vote and potentially tip the balance toward opposition challenger Henrique Capriles.

Chavez, who has undergone three operations for cancer in the pelvic region, said he had taken exams

including a CAT scan and a magnetic resonance imaging scan as part of scheduled checks. "This was a few hours ago. Everything turned out absolutely fine," Chavez said in a chat with reporters at the presidential palace in which he appeared healthy and in

good spirits. "After the operation and the radiotherapy, I feel very good." He did not comment on whether he would need more treatment or if he planned to return to Cuba, where he has received the bulk of his medical treatment over the

past year. Chavez has steadily increased his public appearances after weeks of keeping a low profile and communicating mostly via Twitter or phone calls to state television as he recovered from grueling radiotherapy. But this has done little to quell constant speculation about his health among Venezuelans, many of whom believe his self-styled revolution would struggle to survive in its current form without his charismatic leadership. On Monday, he will officially register his candidacy amid a rally of supporters that is likely to be his biggest since he announced his cancer diagnosis almost a year ago.—Reuters

Toxic mushroom kills Chinese woman in Australia

MELBOURNE, 11 June—A woman reported to be visiting Australia from China has died after eating a toxic Death Cap mushroom—the third such fatality in the southern nation this year. The woman, aged in her 50s, died on Friday at the Austin Hospital in Melbourne, two days after being admitted with severe poisoning due to ingestion of the fungi, which resembles the Paddy Straw mushroom, a popular delicacy in Asia.

Doctors at the hospital said the woman, who was of Chinese descent, fell ill after eating a meal containing mushrooms picked in a local park. She is the third person to die in Australia from eating the silky, white-green tipped Death Cap mushroom this year, after a Chinese chef and his kitchen-hand died in January after mistakenly eating the toxic fungi.

All parts of the Death Cap mushroom are poisonous and eating just one can be fatal. About half of all people who eat them die of organ failure. The Death Cap is native to Europe, where it is widespread, and it can also be found as an introduced species across North and South America, in Australia and in parts of Africa.

Putin congratulates Sharapova on French Open victory

MOSCOW, 11 June—Russian President Vladimir Putin Saturday congratulated Maria Sharapova on winning the French Open tournament. In his telegram message, Putin praised the Russian-born tennis player for her "talent, great skill and incredible commitment," the Kremlin Press service reported. "You have conquered a peak that has been mastered only by the strongest, the most legendary tennis players in the world: winning all four Grand Slam titles," Putin wrote.

Sharapova won the French Open women's title by beating up Italian player Sara Errani 6-3, 6-2. It was Sharapova's fourth Grand Slam victory, following the Wimbledon Open in 2004, the US open in 2006 and the Australian open in 2008. The world second seed said during the award ceremony it was a "tough game" for her. She thanked everyone who backed her and paved the way for his final victory. She also thanked

her parents and said "I love you very much" in Russian.

The Russian player told local media previously that she's happy about her small-town-girl background and proud to be a Russian. The 25-year-old blond, born in the Siberian town of Nyagan, moved to the United States when she was a little girl. Every time winning a game, hearing the broadcaster announcing her place of birth, she was happy to see people "surprised" and felt so proud of "coming from there and getting to the position I am in today," Sharapova said.

Czech doctors perform unique heart replacement surgery

PRAGUE, 11 June—Doctors from Prague's Institute of Clinical and Experimental Medicine (IKEM) have performed a unique heart replacing operation on a young man, with his heart replaced by two mechanical pumps, said Czech media reports. "The man without a heart" is currently at IKEM's resuscitation ward. He is 37 years old and his heart had a malignant tumour.

The Czech team led by Professor Jan Pirk performed the eight-hour operation on 3 April. The man is the first patient in the world living with the help of two HeartMate II pumps. At present he can do everything except sport. The same operation was previously conducted by heart surgeons in Texas, United States, but the patient died one week later.

Heavy rains to hit S China

BEIJING, 11 June—China's meteorological authority on Sunday forecast heavy rain in the nation's southern regions over the next three days as well as thundershowers for northern areas. Most regions south of the Yangtze River, south China and Guizhou Province will see heavy rain from Sunday to Tuesday, according to a statement posted on the National Meteorological Centre's website.

Some of these areas will experience thunderstorms, gales and rainstorms, with precipitation reaching up to 150 millimetres, the centre warned. Five dead as van carrying Fukushima evacuees crashes

TOKYO, 11 June—Five people were killed when a van carrying elderly evacuees from Japan's Fukushima nuclear accident collided head-on with a truck on Saturday, local police and a report said. The van's passengers were elderly evacuees in their 70s and 80s from Fukushima, where last year's tsunami triggered a serious nuclear accident, *Jiji Press* said.

The van driver and four passengers were killed in the collision, *Jiji* said. The passengers were on the way back from hospital to their temporary homes. A local police spokesman said the van and truck collided head-on in the city of Nihonmatsu, just outside of the no-go zone, but did not confirm further details. A couple in their 30s who were in the truck and were also Fukushima evacuees suffered minor injuries, *Jiji* said.—Internet

Small Calif town shocked by family murder-suicide

SELMA, 11 June—Neighbours of an Indian family killed in a murder-suicide grappled with allegations on Sunday that the man accused in the shooting in a small California agricultural town was a former Indian army officer wanted for years for murder in his homeland. News of Saturday's shooting boomeranged through the area's close-knit Indian community, which numbers 15,500 in Fresno County, including about 750 in Selma, a small town surrounded by vineyards and peach orchards and known as the "Raisin Capital of the World." The majority of Indians in the area are Punjabi Sikhs, like the family.

Authorities have said the former officer, Avtar Singh, shot his wife and two children and gravely wounded a third child early Saturday before turning the gun on himself. Investigators were still trying to determine a motive. "Our community is completely shocked," said Rajbir Singh Pannu, president of the town's Sikh temple. "It's a really bad misfortune, especially for the children who died. Anybody who takes somebody's life, in our religion that's cowardice."

It was just more than a year ago that Singh was arrested after his wife said he had choked her. That set off a process that prompted the Indian government to seek his extradition days later in the 1996 death of a prominent lawyer and human rights activist in Kashmir, a disputed region in the Himalayas. Singh, who in recent years operated a small trucking business in Selma, was released on bail after last year's arrest. It remained unclear Sunday why he was never extradited.—Internet

Zawgyi Dam under maintenance for preventing floods against Kyaukse

KYAUKSE, 11 June—Zawgyi River that originates in Shan State crosses Kyaukse and flows into Myingte River.

In 2003, Zawgyi Dam was built with the aim of supplying drinking water to local people of Kyaukse and keeping the town clean and pleasant.

In its long time period,

Zawgyi River becomes silting, narrowing and piling sandbanks. In consequence, the river occurs improper of flow. Thus, overflow of river broke Kyetmintun and Tadale embankments in 2011.

With the view to preventing the floods of Zawgyi River in Kyaukse Township, the spillway of Naungkham earthen

embankment was completely repaired by Irrigation Department. As silt was piled upstream of Zawgyi Dam, silt in 5500 feet long area was dredged from the upstream Zawgyi Dam to Zidaw Dam.

Moreover, 40 excavators and five bulldozers were used in cleaning the 21 miles long water course of the river and expanding the water course and upgrading the banks.

The hydraulic shutters have been installed at four valves measuring 134 feet by 20 feet at the sand gate of Zawgyi Dam. As a result, the concerted efforts of upgrading Zawgyi River will prevent overflow at Kyaukse.—*Kyemon*



Plan to establish public bus company

YANGON, 11 June—With the aim of effectively undertaking secure and smooth transport in Yangon Region, Yangon Region Supervisory Committee for Ensuring Secure and Smooth Transport is

scrutinizing the necessary documents and helping the vehicle owners for handing over cars to the Yangon Region Transport Ministry and import of new vehicles so as to establish the public bus company, according to the press meeting of the Yangon Region All Private Bus-line Control Committee held on 6 June.

A single spark may well set the whole hillside on fire

I am a Myanmar citizen. I am a Bamar. I value Bamar being of the same race. But, it does not mean I do not value other races and am unwilling to acknowledge their existence. I mean it is human nature to love more of his own race than others. Bamar love Bamar. Bamar value Bamar. Kachin love Kachin and value Kachin. All nationalities such as Kayah, Kayin, Chin, Mon, Rakhine and Shan love and value their own race.

But, not Bamar are the only people in the Union in which we are residing nor it is the soil of Kachin, Kayah, Kayin, Chin, Mon, Rakhine and Shan nationals alone. As it is home to over 100 races, it cannot be called either Bamar or Kachin. It is not the country of a particular race. Many a year has elapsed since the country adopted the collective noun "Myanmar" belonging to all the nationalities as it is a Union.

Myanmar has a rich and colourful history of the First Myanmar Empire under the rule of Bagan King Anawrahta, the Second Empire under the reign of King Baynitaung, and the Third Myanmar Empire with King Alungmindaya on the throne. The usage of the word "Myanmar" disappeared in late-Konbaung Period during the reign of King Thibaw when Myanmar fell under the yoke of colonialists. The imperialists who colonized Myanmar into slavery that time called the country and the people Burma with British accent in connection with Bamar people of the mainland to whom they had most contact with.

(Remark: Studying the concerted efforts under the leadership of General Aung San in Myanmar's history of independence struggle to claim independence back from the colonialists both for the mainland and highland regions through Panglong Agreement as the British had planned to grant the mainland alone independence, it can be concluded that the British intentionally used the term Burma instead of Myanmar having plotted to create racial tensions.)

As I have mentioned, the country constantly called as Myanmar along the course of history was renamed as Burma in colonial period, which resulted in racial chauvinism leading to disunity among national brethren, ending up with civil war whose legacy drags on till now.

Studying the previous constitutions of Myanmar, the name of the 1947 Constitution formulated in pre-

independence period (under the British's rule) was written as "The Constitution of the Union of Myanmar" in Myanmar version. But, in English version, it was written as "The Constitution of the UNION OF BURMA." The Article 1 of the constitution stated as Burma is Sovereign Independent Republic to be known as "The Union of Burma."

However, the 1974 Constitution adopted after the independence was named as "The Constitution of the Socialist Republic of the Union of Myanmar" whose Article 1 prescribed "The State shall be known as Socialist Republic of the Union of Myanmar."

Likewise, the constitution enacted in 2008 was described as "The Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar." It was stated in Section 2 of the constitution that "The State shall be known as the Republic of the Union of Myanmar."

I have certain reason to present the excerpts of the some prescriptions of the constitutions ever emerged along the course of Myanmar's history for I reckon some youth politicians and those who have lived abroad long may have lost track of the evolutionary development of the constitution of the country. Particularly, those are the prescriptions which those engaged in three powers of the State namely legislature (the Parliament), executive (governments at different level), and the judiciary (Supreme Court of the Union and courts at different levels) and those who are preparing themselves to run for a seat in respective parliaments as MP (people's representative) have to give special attention to.

It must be aware that Section 9 of the Hluttaw Laws regarding the responsibilities of a MP prescribes that the responsibilities of the MPs are (a) to safeguard the constitution and the existing laws and Section 11 regarding the ethics and conducts of a MP, prescribes as (b) uphold the constitution, this law and existing laws. Furthermore, as MPs have to take oath according to the Schedule Four of the constitution under Section 125 of the constitution, Section 8 of the Hluttaw Laws and Section 5 (c) of the Hluttaw Bylaws to be appointed to the parliament, it should not be forgotten that it was promised as "I...do solemnly and sincerely promise as an elected representative of.....Hluttaw, I will uphold and abide by the Constitution of the Union" in taking the oath. (Here,

the prescriptions of the constitution must be adhered to whether it is said "to uphold and abide by the Constitution of the Union" or "to respect and observe the Constitution of the Union" as some politicians are arguing.

Again, members of political parties must be aware of the prescription in Section 405 (b) of the constitution that a political party shall abide by and respect this Constitution and the existing laws. So it is prescribed as well that political parties, in applying to the Union Election Commission for registration as political party, have to promise to uphold and abide by the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar under Section 6 (c) of Political Parties Registration Law. As every political party (party member) has taken oath to observe the Section 6 of the Party Law, no party should use law-breaking verbal or written expression misusing the significant prescription of the constitution.

As a saying goes, "Ignorance of law is no excuse," using "ignorance" as an excuse is unacceptable. The law would not forgive the ignorance as the excuse for breaching the law. If so, it is questionable whether the commitment is of deliberate one.

No matter what, our people being the Buddhists have a heart filled with patience and forbearance. We tend to forgive giving ourselves such excuses as it is because of ignorance or because it is just used to be called like this. However, if it is done intentionally, a spark may well lead to big trouble. It is not a mistake party members should make. It can affect national unity. It would be implied as neglecting other nationalities such as Kachin, Kayah, Kayin, Chin, Mon, Rakhine and Shan in Myanmar.

As I am a Bamar, I prefer the term "Bamar" which represents Bamar people. But, I cannot be egocentric. I cannot have racist attitude. However, if it is associated with the State representing the entire Union, only the term "Myanmar" is appropriate and correct. We have to discard the thought of the colonial period. At present, "The Republic of the Union of Myanmar" is the most correct and official usage prescribed in the constitution as the sign of unity of national brethren of the Union.

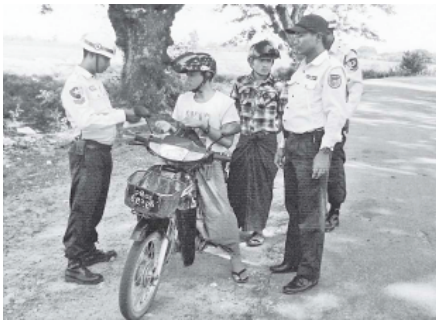

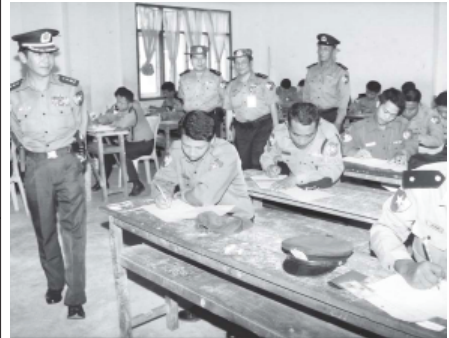

Structures destroyed, people missing in Colorado wildfire

DENVER, 11 June — An out-of control Colorado wildfire fueled by high winds and hot temperatures left an unknown number of people missing, destroyed 10 structures and prompted evacuations on Saturday, fire officials said.

By nightfall the so-called High Park Fire had blackened some 5,000 acres in an area northwest of Fort Collins on Saturday and was zero percent contained, said fire spokeswoman Jennifer Hillman.

She said authorities have been unable to locate or make contact with an unknown number of people who live in the area.

Authorities ordered the evacuations as winds fanned

the flames late in the afternoon. Deputies and firefighters went door-to-door telling residents to flee before flames forced them to leave the area, Larimer County Sheriff Justin Smith told reporters at an evening briefing. One firefighter was hospitalized for heat exhaustion earlier in the day, he said. Plumes of smoke could be seen from the Denver metropolitan area.

“There is a lot of beetle-killed trees up there and it’s been a very hot and dry day,” Hillman said.

Because of a low winter snowpack and a dry spring, most of Colorado is experiencing tinder-dry conditions, the National Weather Service said in an

advisory on Saturday. “The combination of sunny skies ... low humidities and gusty winds will cause critical fire weather conditions,” the advisory said.

The High Park blaze was reported about dawn Saturday and is believed to have started on private land and quickly spread into the Roosevelt National Forest, the forest service said.

It is the third major wildfire to hit Larimer County this spring in what has already been an active early wildfire season.

Crews were attacking the blaze with air tankers and helicopter water drops, and 200 firefighters are battling the blaze from the ground, the forest service said.—Reuters

Rainstorm-triggered mudslides kill three, injure six in SW China

GUIYANG, 11 June — Three people were killed and another six were injured in rainstorm-triggered mudslides on Saturday night to Sunday morning in Kaili, a city in southwest China’s Guizhou Province, said local authorities. From 11 pm

Saturday to early Sunday morning, heavy downpours hit Zhouxi township in Kaili, triggering mudslides, according to the publicity department of Kaili City.

As of 10 am on Sunday, three residents of Zhouxi had been found dead and the six

injured people had been sent to hospital. At least 81 houses in Zhouxi have been damaged. Local governments have relocated residents from low-lying areas at risk for flash floods and other geological disasters.—Xinhua

Historic battleship makes last, brief voyage

LOS ANGELES, 11 June — The battleship USS Iowa, a storied vessel that served during World War Two and the Cold War,

made a brief final voyage on Saturday to its permanent berth at the Port of Los Angeles, where it will open as a naval museum next

month.

Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa and US Navy veterans who served on the 175-foot-tall (53-metre) ship, which was decommissioned in 1990, were among the hundreds of invited celebrants along for the ride.

The USS Iowa was commissioned in 1943. It carried President Franklin Roosevelt across the Atlantic to a meeting with British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Soviet leader Joseph Stalin during World War Two.

Later in the war, the Iowa pounded beachheads in the Pacific with its 16-inch guns ahead of Allied landings and took part in the Japanese surrender in Tokyo Bay in

1945. During the Korean War in the 1950s, it conducted gun strikes and bombardments.

After being decommissioned in 1958, it returned to service in 1984 during the latter years of the Cold War. On Saturday, it was towed from a temporary anchorage in the outer harbour through the port’s main channel.

As onlookers cheered and a high school band played, the ship arrived at its permanent spot at Berth 87.

It will open as a naval museum on 7 July. “The USS Iowa, ‘The Battleship of Presidents,’ is a symbol of American ingenuity and common purpose,” Villaraigosa said onboard the ship shortly after it docked.

Three Gorges sees stable, improving water quality

CHONGQING, 11 June — China’s Three Gorges Project, the world’s largest hydropower project, has seen water quality either remain stable or improve in the section located in the country’s southwestern Chongqing municipality.

The water quality of the Yangtze River in the Chongqing section of the Three Gorges reservoir tops that of all China’s seven major river systems, according to the Chongqing Municipal Environmental Protection Bureau.

The water quality of the Yangtze River’s leave-boundary river section in Chongqing has maintained

the level-II national water quality standard, which is second-highest ranking in the five-grade standard.

To maintain and improve the area’s water environment, Chongqing has worked to clean up its 21 secondary rivers and set up waste and sewage treatment plants in all of its counties and major townships in the past 15 years.

Located on the middle reaches of the Yangtze River, China’s longest waterway, the Three Gorges Project consists of a 185-metre-high dam, a five-tier ship lock, a reservoir and 32 hydropower generators.

33 militants killed in Afghanistan within 24 hours

KABUL, 11 June — Upto 33 Taleban militants have been killed in military operations carried out by the Afghan force and NATO-led coalition troops within the past 24 hours, the Afghan Interior Ministry said on Sunday morning.

“Afghan police, army and coalition forces launched 10 joint cleanup operations in Kabul, Laghman, Parwan, Helmand, Uruzgan and Farah provinces, killing 33 armed Taleban militants over the past 24 hours,” the ministry said in a statement. Six other militants were injured and nine suspects were captured by joint forces during the raids, the statement added.

The joint forces also found and seized weapons, the statement said, without saying if there were any casualties on the side of

security forces. In another development, eight Taleban militants were killed when a unit of special operation force of army and coalition troop launched an operation in Bati Kot District of eastern Nangarhar Province on Saturday night, a spokesman for provincial government, Ahmad Zia Abdulzai, told Xinhua on Sunday.

Four other militants were killed when their anti-tank mine went off prematurely in Jani Khil District of neighbouring Pakitka Province, the ministry’s statement said.

Afghan forces and some 130,000 NATO-led coalition troops have intensified cleanup operations against militants recently. Records kept by Xinhua, based on figures released by Interior Ministry, reveal that around 430 militants have been

killed, 130 wounded and over 450 others detained since 1 May by joint forces. However, the militants in retaliation responded by carrying out suicide attacks and roadside bombings. Taleban carried out a suicide bombing in eastern Kapisa Province, killing four French soldiers with the NATO-led coalition and injuring eight others including three Afghan civilians on Saturday morning.—Xinhua

India to buy eight warships from S Korea

NEW DELHI, 11 June — India is to acquire at least eight warships from South Korea in a bid to bolster its maritime defence, under a proposed defence deal likely to be inked soon, local media reported. As part of a growing “strategic partnership” with South Korea, India will buy

at least eight advanced minesweeping and hunting warships—it will get two of the vessels from South Korean firm Kongsang Corporation, while the other six will be manufactured by Goa Shipyard in western India after transfer of technology, ‘The Times of

India’ newspaper reported.

“The contract is now being finalized after the conclusion of the commercial negotiations,” an unnamed source was quoted as saying. India will use these warships to detect and destroy underwater mines, often planted by both state as well

as non-state actors, the report said. “Underwater mines are cheap weapons that can be used for high-impact incidents. It’s relatively easy for someone to lay mines at the harbor approach or departure routes. There is need to step up the protection of our harbors and offshore installations,” an official said.—Xinhua

Va historic area opens new quilt exhibit

WILLIAMSBURG, 11 June — Dozens of quilts produced around the middle of the 19th century are going on display at Colonial Williamsburg.

Officials say the exhibit at the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum features works influenced by quilting in Baltimore, which was the nation's third largest city of the time. It runs through April 2014.

The co-curator of the exhibition says "Quilts in the Baltimore Manner" reflects the strong textile industry and innovative quilting styles of America's largest seaport of the period 1845 to 1855.

Most of the quilts are made in a style known as album quilts made of blocks decorated with intricate designs.

Album quilts were usually a cooperative effort composed of individual signed and inscribed blocks. They were often intended for an honoured recipient within a community.

Karzai: US failed to consult Afghans on airstrike

KABUL, 11 June — Afghanistan's president said on Saturday that the United States has put the two countries' security pact at risk with a unilateral airstrike that killed 18 civilians, while a Taleban suicide bomber killed four French soldiers responding to a tipoff about a bomb hidden under a bridge.

The violence and the dispute highlight the muddled nature of the international mission in Afghanistan as NATO coalition countries try to shift to a training role in a country that is still very much at war. The majority of NATO and US forces are scheduled to leave the country by the end of 2014, but the exit is looking far from neat at the beginning of the hot summer months when fighting typically surges.

France is already rushing to get its combat forces out by the end of this year, and four deaths in one bombing could precipitate that pullout.

The US, meanwhile, has tried to create an orderly transition through a series of agreements covering detentions, village raids and its long-term commitment to Afghanistan. But the Wednesday airstrike by US forces showed how quickly those deals divorce from the reality on the ground.

Dorothy Green, president of the Central Village Block Association, said she estimates she has to listen to about 700 hours of doo-wop a year.

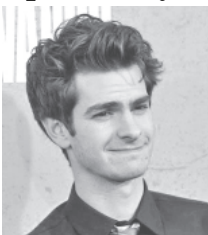

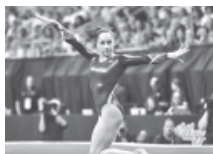
Wieber at her steady best in winning 2nd US title

They are world champions. It is not easy for us to beat them in ball possession. But we can beat them in other areas. The 1-1 draw today is fair."

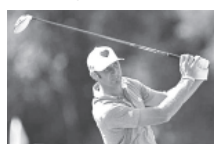

Pacquiao is a social phenomenon in the Philippines, where his status as one of the greatest boxers ever has propelled him to huge riches, a movie career and election to parliament. He has won world titles in an unprecedented eight weight divisions, but suffered his first defeat since 2005 and slipped to 54-4-2 when Bradley took his World Boxing Organization welterweight belt in a split decision.

Even the fight's Las Vegas promoter Bob Arum questioned the scoring, describing the result as "nuts", and many in the Philippines insisted their hero was robbed.

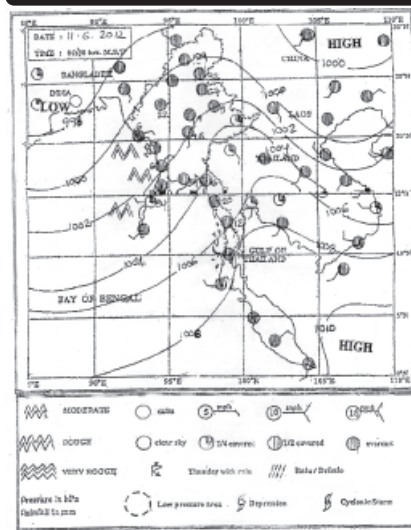

New flood warnings in sodden south

LONDON, 11 June—Severe weather warnings were issued Monday for waterlogged southern England including London as hundreds of Welsh residents evacuated in weekend flooding began a muddy clean-up.

Issuing an amber alert meaning "be prepared", the Met Office warned people along the south coast and north as far as the capital to be ready for flooding from surface water and rivers, as well as "very difficult" driving conditions.

"Rain, heavy at times, will persist well into Monday, before gradually easing away westwards during the afternoon. Further

thundery downpours are possible in the southeast later," the government forecasters said. The Environment Agency said some parts of the affected area, including Littlehampton in West Sussex, had been drenched in three to five centimetres (1.2 to two inches) of rain overnight.

"The public is strongly advised to stay away from swollen rivers and not to drive through floodwater," the agency said.

Hundreds of residents were meanwhile returning to homes and caravans in the coastal Welsh county of Ceredigion after they were flooded with up to 1.5 metres of water, facing the prospect of a watery cleanup.

Welsh first minister Carwyn Jones said Sunday he was shocked by the damage after over eight centimetres of rain fell in 24 hours to 7am Saturday.

"Having spent a number of years living and studying in Aberystwyth, I was deeply shocked to see the extent of the damage caused by the flooding in an area I know so well," he said. At the peak of the flooding, 1,000 people had been evacuated from their homes, he said.—*Internet*

US students survive 9 days in New Zealand bush

WELLINGTON, 11 June—Two US students trapped in the New Zealand wilderness by a snowstorm trekked back out to safety after surviving their nine-day ordeal by rationing their meager supplies of trail mix and warming themselves in hot springs.

Alec Brown and Erica Klintworth, both 21, returned to the city of Christchurch on Monday after meeting up with members of a search team—famished but otherwise in good shape, police said.

The two students, on a foreign study programme in

New Zealand with University of Wisconsin Stevens Point, had planned to hike and camp for a few days at some hot springs on the country's South Island. But heavy rains and a snowstorm during the Southern Hemisphere winter prevented the couple from being able to cross a river and return. "Unfortunately it rained and rained, day after day, and snowed," Alec Brown wrote in an email to *The Associated Press* on Monday.

He said the nights were tough to take because the rain and sleet pounded down on the tarpaulin covering their sleeping hammock and the river roared—reminding them all the time of their predicament. When they realized they were going to be stuck they started rationing: "a biscuit and jelly one day," Brown wrote "and even less another."

S African platinum mine closed due to low prices

RUSTENBURG, 11 June—A South Africa platinum mine owned by global giant Anglo American will temporarily halt operations after low prices made operations unviable, the co-owner said on Monday.

Partners in the Marikana mine "have agreed in principle to place the ... operations on care and maintenance, due to the enduring low platinum group metals basket price

environment," Aquarius Platinum said on its website.

"Trading conditions in the platinum industry are expected to remain difficult in the short- to medium-term and these conditions have rendered the operations at the (mine) uneconomic."

Aquarius owns 50 percent of the venture in northwestern town Rustenburg.

The company did not say how many jobs would be affected, estimated at 1,500

by *Business Day* newspaper.

The announcement follows a decision by another mining group, Eastern Platinum, to halt a new platinum project at Steelport in the north of the country, for similar reasons, the newspaper said.

South Africa has around 87 percent of the world's platinum resources and is the largest producer of the metal, mostly used in vehicle catalytic converters to cut pollution.—*Internet*

Brown's mother Lisa, of Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota, said she panicked when she first found out her son was missing. "It's too much for a mom," she told the AP. "Especially when they're that far away. I just felt so helpless." She had faith that Alec, an environmental science major, knew the outdoors well enough to survive, she said, adding that Erica, who is studying graphic design, is a strong woman.

SCIENCE DAILY, 11 June — Why do some groups of species diversify — in just a few thousand years — to the point of forming a wide variety of new species, while others remain essentially unchanged for millions of years? This is one of the key questions for scientists investigating the emergence and decline of biodiversity. From various studies, it is known that speciation is influenced both by environmental factors (e.g. habitat diversity, climate) and by species-specific traits (e.g. coloration, behaviour patterns). However, little is known about how the extrinsic and intrinsic

factors interact.

These interactions have now been explored in more detail by a team of researchers led by Ewag and the University of Bern. In a study published in the latest issue of *Nature*, they demonstrate for cichlids from 46 African lakes that the probability of diversification, or “adaptive radiation,” depends on a combination of environmental factors and sexual selection. African cichlids are particularly suitable for this type of study because of the extremely high species richness that developed over time from what was originally a small number of species in large African lakes. For Lakes Victoria and Malawi alone, more than 800 endemic cichlid species have been recorded.

According to the study, diversification is more likely to occur in deep lakes and in areas with relatively high solar radiation. By contrast, lake size has practically no influence on the likelihood of speciation—which is surprising, as speciation in terrestrial species is known to depend in part on the available habitat area. Among the species-specific traits, the intensity of sexual selection (mate choice) was shown to be a key factor, as indicated by the association between sexual dichromatism (distinctive coloration of males and females) and diversification.

England thwart France in 1-1 stalemate

DONETSK, 11 June—France and England battled to a 1-1 stalemate in their opening Euro 2012 Group D match on Monday after Joleon Lescott’s opener for England was cancelled out by Samir Nasri.

The match, played in warm humid conditions at a less than full Donbass Arena, saw England defend resolutely against a more inventive French side who are now unbeaten in 22 matches.

England made the breakthrough after 30 minutes when Lescott scored his first goal for his country, powerfully heading home a whipped Steven Gerrard free kick that left France goalkeeper Hugo Lloris floundering.

England only stayed ahead for nine minutes, though, before Lescott’s Manchester City team mate Nasri fired

France’s equaliser past another club colleague in England goalkeeper Joe Hart. Nasri beat Hart at the near post with a superbly struck shot from outside the penalty area, shortly after the keeper had made a brilliant reflex save from Alou Diarra’s thundering header.

England manager Roy Hodgson, in charge for only six weeks, gambled on a bold line-up with teenager Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain called up for only his third appearance, and although he made some surging runs, his lack of a final product was noticeable compared to a succession of French attempts on goal.

England should have taken the lead in the 15th minute when James Milner rounded Lloris after a neat through ball from Ashley Young, but he fired into the side netting.

France dominated possession and looked sharper in attack than the English who defended well but far too deeply, allowing the French lots of room to manoeuvre.

Yohan Cabaye, Franck Ribery and Benzema all went close for France but could not find a second goal.—Internet
