Effective land use and management

We have difficulties in land management as squatters on forest land and vacant, virgin and fallow land are acting as if they are original lawful owners of the plot they illegally occupied, thus generating problems everywhere around the country and hindering the government's large-scale land allotment and management plans for multiple development projects.

In this context, we need a land use policy as a measure for settling the problem through legal means and enforcement of rules and regulations fair enough for everyone. Now the government has founded the Land Allocation and Utilization Scrutiny Committee for Urban Development Projects and Investment Projects responsible for adopting the said policy.

Here we also should have a reliable and exact list of city projects, village areas, housing estates, farming plots and industrial zones we can collect through field tours and cooperative land survey.

Committees at different levels are now in the process of formulating regional, city, township and village development plans and taking appropriate measures for effective land use method and land use management that actually care for the people of all walks of life engaging in fish or livestock farming, seasonal or perennial crop cultivation, industry, forest conservation, plantation or regeneration, environment development, clean water or construction or for the sectors such as electricity supply and generation, energy, mining, communications, education, health or trade.

These plans will also help us provide basic needs and job opportunities in every township according to the ratio between its area and population.

Generally, land reform and regional development, job opportunity, economic growth and higher living standard have close relations. So, the bottom-line here is the imposition of practical laws and procedures and taxation system which really fulfill the domestic requirements and meet the international norms as they are essentials for effective land use and land management.

JERUSALEM, 26 June — Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Monday said that both Israel and Russia agree that “nuclear weapons in Iranian hands pose a danger to Israel and the entire world.” Netanyahu, speaking at a joint

Netanyahu to Putin: Iranian nukes pose “grave danger”

Press conference with visiting Russian President Vladimir Putin in Jerusalem, reiterated his oft-stated demand that Iran halt its uranium enrichment programme, transfer all enriched uranium out of the country, and disassemble its underground nuclear facilities. “I believe that we should be doing two things now: boosting the sanctions and also boosting the demands,” Netanyahu said, referring to a series of commerce, banking and oil restrictions against the Iranian government.

Putin, who is visiting the region on a one-day visit

and who spoke before Netanyahu, said they “spoke in detail about the Syria issue and about the Iranian nuclear programme.” After a meeting between the two leaders which ran on, Putin said that he felt he was “among friends,” adding that the ties between Israel and Russia were ones of “deep friendship, not something that will pass, and that will endure in the future.”

“We held a thorough discussion of the issue of Iran’s nuclear programme, and, even in the current situation, I estimate that we will continue to consult and

work together, and that these issues will be resolved peacefully for the good of all sides,” Putin added.

“I’m convinced that the cooperation between Russia and Israel will develop later as well, and this matter certainly meets the demands and interests of both states, in the region and in the world at large,” the Russian leader said.

Putin later thanked Israel for inviting him to visit. “My visit here reinforced the assumption that we have friendly relations, and these are not just friendly relations,” Putin said.

UK hackers admit plotting attacks on CIA, firms

LONDON, 26 June — Two British hackers pleaded guilty in a London court on Monday to plotting attacks against computers of international firms, law enforcement bodies and government agencies including the CIA, in a cyber crime spree that gained global attention. Ryan Cleary, 20, of southeast England, and Jake Davis, 19, of Scotland, both members of the hacking group LulzSec, pleaded guilty at London’s Southwark Crown Court to charges they conspired with others to hack websites last year, Britain’s Press Association reported.

Targets included the CIA, Britain’s Serious

Organized Crime Agency and National Health Service, the Arizona State Police, Nintendo, Sony and Rupert Murdoch’s British newspaper group News International and 20th Century Fox film studio. Targeted websites were hit by so-called distributed denial of service (DDoS) attacks, flooding them with traffic until they crashed. Cleary, who has been diagnosed with Asperger’s syndrome and is also wanted in the United States, also admitted four additional charges including an attack on Pentagon computers.

Egypt’s army chief says to cooperate with new president

CAIRO, 26 June — Egypt’s ruling military chief Hussein Tantawi pledged on Monday to cooperate with the elected president to achieve stability in the country. “The armed force supports the legitimate president who was elected by the people’s will, and will cooperate with him to achieve stability, the rule of law,” said Tantawi in his first meeting with president-elect Mohamed Morsi. During the meeting, Morsi extended deep thanks to the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces’ (SCAF) management of the country during the transition period, according to official MENA news agency.

Morsi praised them for respecting the popular will of the Egyptians who carried out revolution seeking freedom and social justice. Morsi also hailed the armed forces for managing the electoral process with integrity and democracy, which brought the first civilian president of the country over the past six decades. Meanwhile, caretaker Prime Minister Kamal el-Ganzouri resigned after seven months in office, according to the constitutional rules, which stipulated the government should resign after the election of a new president, MENA reported. However, local websites said Ganzouri submitted the resignation to Tantawi, who asked him to stay until the new president takes oath and assigns a new cabinet. Ganzouri met Morsi on Monday in the presidential headquarters to inform him of the latest security and economic developments. This was the first time since a year and a half to reuse the presidency palace, after it was deserted by ousted former president Hosni Mubarak.—Xinhua

Obama urges Greece to work with “Troika” on economic reform

WASHINGTON, 26 June — The US President Barack Obama spoke with newly-elected Greek Prime Minister on Monday in a phone call and urged him to work with the European Union and other European bodies to implement reform programme, the White House said in a statement.

“President Obama spoke with Greek Prime Minister Antonis Samaras earlier today. The President congratulated Prime Minister Samaras on his election and on the formation of his coalition government,” the statement noted.

Obama welcomed Samaras’s commitment to address Greece’s economic situation and urged the Prime Minister to work closely with the European Union, the International Monetary Fund and the European Central Bank in the implementation of Greece’s reform programme.

Greek designated FinMin resigns for health problem

ATHENS, 26 June — Greece’s newly nominated Finance Minister Vassilis Rapanos resigned from the post on Monday due to his ill health condition, according to an official announcement. Prime Minister Antonis Samaras has accepted the resignation, wishing Rapanos speedy recovery and thanking him for his “willingness to offer his services to the country,” a Press release from the prime minister’s office said.

The 65-year-old National Bank of Greece chairman was named on Thursday as incoming finance minister in the new coalition government formed after the 17 June national polls. Rapanos was

transferred to an Athens hospital on Friday afternoon, shortly before his scheduled swearing-in ceremony, after a faint spell with abdominal pains. He is still hospitalized.

Doctors have not made public their diagnosis, but the banker submitted his resignation to Samaras, noting that for the time being he can not take office. According to local media reports, among likely candidates for the key post in debt-burdened Greece are former interim Prime Minister Lucas Papademos, former Interior Minister Tassos Yannitsis and Yorgos Zannias, finance minister in the caretaker government that led Greece to the second round

Steel skeleton completed at 4 World Trade Centre

NEW YORK, 26 June — Construction workers at 4 World Trade Centre in New York hoisted and placed the final beam for the building’s steel skeleton on Monday, keeping the structure on track to be the first to open at the site since the 11 September

attacks brought down the twin towers.

The final steel beam of the 977-foot (298-metre) skyscraper, weighing eight tons (7.25 tons) and adorned with an American flag, was signed by a group including construction workers and developers. It was then lifted by crane and placed atop the 72-story building in a “topping out” ceremony attended by about 1,000 people.

Four World Trade Centre is scheduled to open in the fall of 2013. Construction began in 2008. “The topping out of 4 World Trade Centre represents another milestone

in the effort to create a new, dynamic World Trade Centre at the heart of a resurgent Downtown,” said Larry Silverstein, the developer of the World Trade Centre.

Port Authority of New York and New Jersey officials said workers at the site’s flagship structure, 1 World Trade Centre, also known as the Freedom Tower, should complete steel construction soon and that building is scheduled to open in late 2013 or early 2014. Upon its completion, the Freedom Tower will become the tallest building in New York City at 1,776 feet.—Reuters

Seagrass could help cut acidity level in water surrounding coral reefs

LONDON, 26 June—Seagrass could help reduce the acidity of water surrounding coral reefs, protecting them from erosion, scientists have found. Research headed by a Swansea University marine biologist has offered potential solution to endangered coral reefs around the world's oceans.

Dr Richard Unsworth's team included scientists from Oxford University and James Cook University in Australia.

Coral reefs are worm-like creatures of around a centimetre length which live in colonies numbering millions. Calcium carbonate released by the corals forms a protective reef around the entire group.

The survival of these corals has been threatened

by carbon dioxide in the atmosphere over the last 40 years, as it has raised the acidity of the oceans, rotting the reefs in the same way as fruit and fizzy drinks can erode tooth enamel.

But now Dr Unsworth believes he has found varieties of seagrass which can photosynthesise carbon dioxide so quickly and efficiently that they actually turn the surrounding water more alkaline.

"Highly productive tropical seagrasses often live adjacent to or among coral reefs and photosynthesise at such rates you can see the oxygen they produce practically bubbling away," the BBC quoted him as saying. "We wanted to understand whether this

could be a major local influence on seawater and the problems of ocean acidification."

"Rising atmospheric carbon dioxide in the air, primarily from human fossil fuel combustion, reduces ocean pH and causes wholesale shifts in seawater carbonate chemistry.

"Over long term time scales, this change in seawater carbonate chemistry is likely to cause coral reefs to start to disappear as the rate of erosion starts to exceed growth rates," he said.

Unsworth said not only are coral reefs intrinsically valuable in their own right, but they provide natural fishing lagoons and sea defences for millions of people, mostly living on small islands in the South Pacific. He warned that unless action is taken to protect them, then seagrass itself could be under threat from human activity such as over-fishing, chemical pollution and climate-change.

The findings are published in the science journal, 'Open Access Environmental Research Letters.' —Internet

Built-in dengue virus killer found in humans

SINGAPORE, 26 June—Scientists may have hit gold in their fight against dengue. They have located a human antibody that can neutralise and kill its virus within two hours.

Significantly, they have also identified a way to reproduce this antibody in large quantities, potentially opening the door to a cure for dengue infected patients.

The symptoms of dengue are sudden-onset fever, headache (located behind the eyes), muscle and joint pains, and a rash. The alternative name for dengue, 'break-bone fever,' which comes from the associated muscle and joint pains.

This discovery was made by a combined team from the National University of Singapore (NUS) Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School and the Defence Medical and Environmental Research Institute, all based in Singapore.

By studying a group of cell lines from recovered dengue-infected patients over two years, the team identified the antibody, could attach itself strongly to a

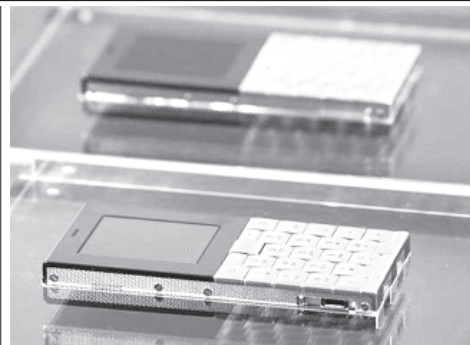
specific part of the dengue virus and inhibit it from attacking other cells.

The antibody eventually destroys the virus and at a much faster speed compared to existing anti-dengue compounds. It has been proven to increase the survival in a mouse model infected with the dengue virus, according to a NUS statement.

The World Health Organization estimates there may be 50-100 million dengue infections worldwide every year. With no approved vaccines or specific treatment available, dengue continues to be a public health concern.

This newly discovered antibody specifically treats DENV1, one of the four dengue serotypes, which accounts for up to 50 percent of the dengue cases in Southeast Asian countries.

The research team tested this new antibody with DENV1 types from these countries — with equally promising results, said Paul Macary, associate professor of microbiology at NUS Yong Loo Lin School, who as the principal investigator, led the research team.—Internet

Birds recognize human faces, voices

These experimental pigeons, along with a group of untrained counterparts, were then shown photographs of pairs of human faces. One face was of a person familiar to the birds whilst the other was of someone they had not seen before, said a university statement.

The first group was able to recognise and classify familiar people using only their faces, whereas the birds without prior training failed. The results show that pigeons can discriminate between the familiar and unfamiliar people and can do this on solely using facial characteristics.

Lincoln's lead researcher Anna Wilkinson, from its School of Life Sciences, said: "Such advanced cognitive processes have rarely been observed in pigeons and suggest that they not only recognise individual humans but also know who they know — something which could be very important for survival."

In a separate study, the team investigated the ability of carrion crows to differentiate between the voices and calls of familiar and unfamiliar humans and jackdaws, or 'heterospecific individuals' or those outside of their own species, the journal *Animal Cognition* reported.



Previous research has focused on crows' ability to recognise and communicate with their own species. The crows responded significantly more often to unfamiliar than familiar human voices and, conversely, responded more to familiar than unfamiliar jackdaw calls.

These results provide the first evidence that birds can discriminate between familiar and unfamiliar heterospecific individuals using auditory stimuli.—Internet

LONDON, 26 June—Some birds are able to identify their human friends by recognizing their faces and voices, which is the key to their ability to survive, says a new study.

Animal behaviour experts from the Universities of Lincoln (Britain) and Vienna (Austria) who worked with pigeons and crows in two separate studies, show that pigeons can tell familiar and unfamiliar humans apart, by reading their facial features.

The team trained a group of pigeons to recognise the difference between photographs of familiar and unfamiliar objects, the journal *Avian Biology*

US cyber weapon Stuxnet set to shut down

WASHINGTON, 26 June—The United States' most powerful known cyber

weapon, Stuxnet, which was created to infiltrate into Iran's nuclear fuel enrichment programme, will shut down just after midnight on Sunday.

According to Christian Science Monitor, Stuxnet infected some 130,000 computers worldwide, most of them related to Iran's nuclear fuel enrichment programme.

At present, the programme is still active and is going through various check functions and looking for a target to destroy. But deep inside Stuxnet's

labyrinth of software code are a few lines that will soon order the programme to stop working altogether in a pre-programmed, belated and ultimately unsuccessful bid to prevent it from being detected and deciphered, computer forensic experts who have examined the programme's code, said.

"Whoever was running this operation needed these programmes to conduct a large number of highly targeted and clandestine operations against Iran and its allies," says John

Bungamer, a former Army intelligence officer and now research director for the US Cyber Consequences Unit, a nonprofit security think tank.

Congress lawmakers now are calling for an investigation into the leaking of the top-secret US operation code-named "Olympic Games" in which Stuxnet, a name that was given "the bug" by anti-virus firms that found it spreading on networks in 2010. There's no relief either for worried cyber security experts, some of whom have called Stuxnet the digital equivalent of the first nuclear attack on Hiroshima.—Internet

Smoking fathers pass on damaged genes to kids

LONDON, 26 June— British researchers have found the men quite fond of smoking actually go on to pass damaged DNA to their children as fathers while raising risk of cancer among them.

Researchers at the University of Bradford found in their study that smoking harms the father's DNA, and these damaged genes can be inherited by his children.

This raises the risk of youngsters developing childhood cancers, particularly leukaemia, *Daily Mail* reported.

Because a fertile sperm cell takes three months to fully develop, fathers should kick the habit 12 weeks ahead of conceiving to avoid the risk, said Diana Anderson of the university of Bradford.

"Smoking by fathers at the time around conception can lead to genetic changes in their children. These changes may raise the risk of developing cancer," she added.

Meanwhile, scientists at the University of Glasgow have found that the men drinking lots of tea are far more likely to develop

prostate cancer. They found that those who drank seven or more cups a day had a 50 percent higher risk of contracting the disease than men who had three or fewer cups.

The warning comes after researchers tracked the health of over 6,000 men for over four decades.

The latest findings contradict a previous research, which suggested that drinking tea lowers the risk of cancer, as well as heart disease, diabetes and Parkinson's disease.

Neurons controlling hunger also drive drug addiction

WASHINGTON, 26 June— Researchers have zeroed in on a set of nerve cells (neurons) in the brain's hypothalamus that is not only linked with hunger and overeating, but also drives drug addiction.

Researchers focused attention on the brain's reward circuits located in the midbrain to develop treatments for metabolic disorders such as obesity and diabetes.

"Using genetic approaches, we found that increased appetite for food can actually be associated with decreased interest in novelty as well as in cocaine, and on the other hand, less interest in food can predict increased interest in cocaine," said Marcelo O Dietrich, postdoctoral associate at the Yale School of Medicine.

Dietrich conducted the research with Tamas L Horvath, professor of biomedical research at the Yale School and his team, studying two sets of transgenic mice, the journal *Nature Neuroscience* reports.

In one set, they knocked

out a signalling molecule that controls hunger-promoting neurons in the hypothalamus, which regulates vital functions such as body temperature, hunger, thirst fatigue and sleep, according to an *Yale* statement.

In the other set, they interfered with the same neurons by eliminating them selectively during development using diphtheria toxin. The mice were given various non-invasive tests that measured how they respond to novelty, and anxiety, and how they react to cocaine.

"We found that animals

increased drive of the reward circuitry, but who are still lean." "This is a complex trait that arises from the activity of the basic feeding circuits during development, which then impacts the adult response to drugs and novelty in the environment," added Horvath.

Horvath and his team argue that the hypothalamus, is key to the development of higher brain functions.

"These hunger-promoting neurons are critically important during development to establish the set point of higher brain



that have less interest in food are more interested in novelty-seeking behaviours and drugs like cocaine," said Horvath. "This suggests that there may be individuals with

functions, and their impaired function may be the underlying cause for altered motivated and cognitive behaviours," he said.

Ablynx says top drug shows benefit over rival

BRUSSELS, 26 June— Belgian drug developer Ablynx said on Monday its top drug, arthritis treatment ozoralizumab, had shown a benefit over its biggest rival in the \$24 billion market for this class of treatment.

The company, which makes ultra-small antibodies derived from llamas, said data showed few patients developed immunity to the drug, a problem which can affect its biggest rival Humira, produced by US based Abbott Laboratories.

"We believe that we now have the components of a much stronger and differentiating licensing package than we had previously," Ablynx Chief Executive Edwin Moses said in a statement. It said the study, an expansion to a previous phase II trial, showed that less than 1 percent of patients had antibodies at the end of the treatment period.

Abbott Laboratories has said antibodies developed in about 5 percent of adult rheumatoid arthritis patients who take Humira.

Ablynx is in partnership discussions for ozoralizumab, which it said it hopes to conclude at the end of this year. "If your question is 'does this have impact on partnering discussions', yes, because they come with a stronger data package and there is some potential for differentiation," says KBC Securities analyst Jan De Kerpel.

It's previous partner, US based Pfizer, handed back rights to the drug last year, sending Ablynx's shares down as much as 21 percent.—*Reuters*

European shares, euro spooked by Europe worries

LONDON, 26 June— European shares and the euro fell on Monday as persistent fears about Europe's debt crisis and fresh concerns about global economic growth soured investors' appetite for risk.

Investors were skeptical that a 28 to 29 June European Union summit would make any substantial progress towards tackling the debt crisis, now in its third year and buffeting Spain, the region's fourth largest economy.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel agreed on

Friday with leaders of France, Italy and Spain on a 130 billion euros (\$156 billion) package

to revive growth but resisted pressure for common euro zone bonds or a more flexible

use of Europe's rescue funds.

European stocks. FTSE3 fell 0.6 percent, retreating for a third successive session after Friday's meeting cooled expectations for a breakthrough in the debt crisis.

"It's difficult to see too big a jump forward from these meetings because we have had so many until now. The past experience tells us not to expect a significant amount of news," Keith Bowman, equity analyst at Hargreaves Lansdown, said.

"It's a very much politically-oriented market and that makes it very difficult

for investors. Investors are also nervous ahead of the second quarter earnings season."

The downbeat tone in equities spurred demand for low risk assets, helping German bonds to snap three weeks of losses. Bund futures were last up 39 ticks at 141.26 while US bond prices also rose in Europe, pushing their yields lower.

The euro fell broadly, extending last week's losses. The single currency slid 1 percent against the safe-haven yen to a day's low of 100.05 yen and was last 0.5 percent lower against the dollar at \$1.2506.—*Reuters*

Runaway penguin 'No 337' to be named in Japan

TOKYO, 26 June — A penguin whose break-out from an aquarium in Japan gave him a following around the world is to be formally named after months of being known just by his number, an official said on Monday. Humboldt penguin No 337 spent 82 days at large in and around Tokyo Bay after bolting his enclosure, evading aquarium staff, an army of public onlookers and even Japan's well-equipped coastguard. But until his recapture last month and subsequent thorough medical

check-up, keepers did not even know what gender the plucky escapee was, and had insisted he did not have a name. Now officials at Tokyo Sea Life Park have launched a competition asking visitors to think of what the bird should be called. "We decided to give him a pet name by soliciting ideas and their reasons from visitors," said aquarium official Takashi Sugino.

"This is a special treatment to express our gratitude to the public for providing information on the

bird, and also for cooperating with us by listening to our call not to try to capture him," he said. Visitors are being asked to watch the creature — now safely back in his enclosure — before putting their suggestion in a box, Sugino said, admitting the aquarium was expecting a spike in numbers. Nominations opened on 15 June and will end on 1 July, said Sugino, adding "a naming committee comprising the aquarium director, the vice director and keepers will pick the most appropriate name." — *Internet*

Iran to transfer Tajik electricity to Turkey, Europe

TEHERAN, 26 June — Iran's Energy Minister said that his country is in talks with Tajikistan to transfer electricity from the central Asian state to Turkey and other European countries, the Press TV reported on Sunday.

"By importing inexpensive electricity from some neighbouring countries, it is possible to transfer electrical energy to countries demanding it," Majid Namjou was quoted as saying.

To connect Iran's power grid to that of Tajikistan, a new power transfer line must be built through Afghanistan, he said, adding that "therefore, a common power line among the three countries will be built after a final agreement is reached."

Earlier this month, the Iranian Energy Ministry official in charge of foreign exchanges, Abdolhamid Farzam, said the country is planning to connect its electricity network to six countries in Central Asia and the Caucasus, according to Press TV. — *Xinhua*

China to send foreign astronauts to space with its spacecraft someday

BEIJING, 26 June — It is believed that China will be able to train foreign astronauts with its own space technology and send them to space by Shenzhou spacecraft someday, the spokeswoman of China's manned space programme said on Sunday. Wu Ping told a Press conference in Beijing that she believed China's aerospace technology will become more and more mature along with the development of its manned space technology.

China has completed limited number of space missions and will continue to conduct numerous manned space technological tests, she said. According to the plan of China's manned space programme, the country is still at the stage of making breakthroughs in fundamental manned space technologies, Wu said. "China has undertaken active and pragmatic cooperation with Pakistan in the aerospace field," Wu said while answering a question from a

Pakistan journalist.

The outer space is the common wealth of mankind, and it is the relentless pursuit of mankind to explore, develop and utilize the outer space, said Wu. She said that China would like to cooperate and make exchanges with different nations around the world on the principles of mutual respect, equality and mutual benefits to push forward the further development of manned space undertakings.

Sea environment worsening: data

BEIJING, 26 June — Increasing discharge of pollutants and booming offshore human activity, such as oil exploration, are worsening China's fragile marine environment, according to an annual report released by the country's ocean watchdog.

The severely polluted sea area surged to 44,000 square kilometres in China in 2011 from 25,000 sq km in 2003, according to China's 2011 marine environment report released on Monday by the State Oceanic Administration.

Li Xiaoming, director of the department of marine environment protection at

the administration, blamed overdevelopment in the coastal area for the country's worsening water quality. "Just one number can tell you how serious this is. More than 80 percent of the coastline in Bohai Bay has been crowded by factories and buildings," Li said. The construction of offshore projects across the country represented about 110 billion yuan (\$17.46 billion) in 2011, approximately 15 percent year-on-year increase, according to the data.

As coastal development has become a new growth area in China's economy, offshore development and

coastal construction are threatening the country's marine environment. A Bohai Bay oil spill in June 2011 polluted a 6,200-sq-km water area, about nine times the size of Singapore.

The report said that a year after the oil spill, the environmental impact of the incident still exists. Some marine experts warned that it will take about 30 years for the bay to recover. Many scholars and experts have also expressed concern over the worsening marine environment and the new round of marine exploration and development during the country's 12th Five-Year

Plan (2011-15).

Ma Chaode, project manager of the United National Development Programme, said that local governments must find an effective way of balancing economic development and environment protection. Feng Jinan, chief engineer of the Guangdong Administration of Ocean and Fisheries, said that methods for protecting marine ecosystems are still under study. He believes that a way to both protect the environment and guarantee economic development will be worked out. But before that, slowing down development is needed, he added.

Japan begins new visa incentive plan for Chinese tourists

BEIJING, 26 June — Japan will grant three-year multiple-entry visas to Chinese tourists visiting earthquake-hit areas from 1 July, China National Radio reported on Sunday, citing the Japan National Tourism Organization. Industry experts told the *Global Times* on Sunday that such a move is aimed at helping Japan revive its tourism industry following the catastrophic earthquake last March. According to the programme, Chinese tourists can get three-year multiple-entry visas to Japan, on the condition that they spend one night or more in one of the three earthquake-hit prefectures — Fukushima, Iwate and Miyagi.

They can stay up to 90 days per visit and are allowed to go to other places in Japan on their second and subsequent visits. It is good news for Chinese tourists because it offers easier access to visas to Japan and it will boost travel to the country, Hou Tao, director of Qunar Tourism Research College, told the *Global Times* on Sunday. China ranked

second behind South Korea in terms of the number of tourists visiting Japan in 2011, but they spent the most money, at 196.4 billion yen (\$2.44 billion), among foreign tourists, Japan's tourism agency said in early May.

As well as the three prefectures, the economy of the whole country would be enhanced by increased tourism, with benefits to air travel, accommodation and shopping, said Hou, who believes that more areas of Japan will offer such trial programmes. This is the second time that Japan has offered multiple-entry visas for Chinese tourists.

Last July, Okinawa Prefecture started a similar programme. The number of Chinese tourists travelling to Okinawa surged by 87 percent in 2011 over the previous year, according to data from the Japanese authorities. Meanwhile, the number of Chinese tourists to Japan dropped to 1.04 million in 2011 from 1.41 million in 2010 due to the earthquake and tsunami that hit northeast Japan. — *Xinhua*

China rainstorms leave eight dead, affect millions

NANNING, 26 June — Eight people in southern China's Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region have been killed by rainstorms that have wrought havoc in many parts of the country over the last few days, authorities said on Monday. As of Monday evening, over 843,500 people and 35,530 hectares of farmland in Guangxi have been affected by downpours since Thursday, according to the regional civil affairs bureau. Over 2,300 houses collapsed due to the heavy rain.

And direct economic

losses are estimated to stand at about 310 million yuan (48.7 million US dollars). Local governments have relocated 23,300 people. Rainstorms and gales have hit the southern coastal city of Beihai in the region over the past few days.

The local meteorological observatory in Beihai gave a blue-colour-coded warning signal at 4 pm on Monday, predicting gales will rage over Beihai and the Beibu Gulf in the following 24 hours. Shipping routes from Beihai to Weizhou Island and from Beihai to

Haikou, capital of the southern Hainan Province, have been suspended as of 8 am on Sunday, according to the local maritime department. Torrential rain also swept east China's Jiangxi Province during the recent three-day Dragon Boat Festival holidays.

A total of 93,366 people have been affected in the province, which was evacuated of over 32,400 people and saw 2,364 houses toppled by floods, as of Sunday evening, according to the provincial flood prevention and control headquarters. Direct economic losses of about 1.28 billion yuan (201 million US dollars) have been incurred. Persistent storms have swollen three major Jiangxi rivers — Ganjiang, Fuhe and Xinjiang, the water levels of which have risen above warning levels as of Monday morning. — *Xinhua*

One killed in blast in Kenyan port of Mombasa

MOMBASA, 26 June — A blast hit a night club in Kenya's port of Mombasa on Sunday, killing a man, police said, a day after the US embassy in the East African country warned of an imminent attack on the city. Police said the cause of the explosion was not immediately clear but Mombasa, a popular holiday destination for Kenyans and foreigners, has been struck by a series of blasts since Kenya sent troops into Somalia in October to crush Islamist militants.

"I am seeing one body. We are trying to seal off the area as we wait for officers to establish what kind of an explosion it was," said Ambrose Munyasia, the coast region's top criminal investigation officer who was at the scene, told *Reuters*.

Local media said three people had been killed in the blast at the night club, which is situated in a residential area. Eight people were seriously wounded in the explosion and taken to hospital, said police. "I have no idea what it was. I just heard several blasts ... something threw me and I fell on my back. Then I noticed I was bleeding from my neck and head," said Richard Mutiso, lying on a hospital bed receiving treatment for his wounds. One of the wounded was a nine-year-old boy who had shrapnel lodged in his chest and thigh.

A witness, Esther Muthoni, said she heard three explosions at the club where a crowd had gathered to watch the Euro 2012 quarter-final between England and Italy. "I had

just arrived and was having a drink as I waited for the football match to begin, then I heard an explosion, and another and another. I went down on my belly. Then I saw a car speed off and bodies lying all over," said Muthoni. On 15 May, gunmen detonated three grenades outside a night

Chinese astronauts, in space, cheer China's success in deep ocean

BEIJING, 26 June — Three Chinese astronauts succeeding in China's first manual space docking mission on Sunday congratulated over a new dive record set by the country's manned submer-

sible in its exploration in deep ocean.

We wish China's manned submersible cause greater achievement! May our motherland prosper!" three Chinese astronauts said

in a video message sent back to Earth from the Tiangong-1 space lab module.

Chinese astronauts and oceanauts separately made landmark achievements in the country's exploration of space and the deep ocean. The astronauts — veteran astronaut and mission commander Jing Haipeng, crew mate Liu Wang and China's first woman astronaut Liu Yang — successfully docked manually the spaceship Shenzhou-9 with Tiangong-1 on Sunday afternoon.

Meanwhile, three Chinese oceanauts, Ye Cong, Liu Kaizhou and Yang Bo, on Sunday refreshed the country's dive record in a manned submersible Jiaolong by reaching 7,020 meters beneath the sea in a successful test dive in the Pacific Ocean. — *Xinhua*

"Adopted quake panda" to return home

CHENGDU, 26 June — More than 60 giant pandas that were "adopted" by different zoos after a devastating earthquake destroyed their Wolong-reserve home in southwest China four years ago are expected to start returning home in September this year.

"The construction of a new panda breeding center will be completed in September. Then, those pandas living in other places will be able to come back home in batches," Zhang Hemin, director of the China Conservation and Research Center for the Giant Panda in Wolong, told *Xinhua* on Sunday.

The 8.0-magnitude quake struck Sichuan Province, where Wolong

reserve is located, and neighboring areas on May 12, 2008, leaving more than 80,000 people dead or missing.

Wolong reserve, the world's largest giant panda breeding centre that is some 30 km away from the quake epicenter, was severely damaged in the disaster, with panda pens flattened and infrastructure ruined.

The quake left one panda dead, one injured and another missing. More than 60 pandas were left homeless. In August 2008, half of the homeless pandas were sent to different zoos in Guangzhou, Shanghai, Wuhan and other cities, and the other half were transferred to a breeding base in Ya'an, also in Sichuan.

South Africa strives to become one of top 20 travel destinations

CAPE TOWN, 26 June — South Africa is striving to become one of the top 20 destinations in the world by 2020 through developing "responsible tourism," a senior government official has said. To achieved this goal, the tourism industry should shift from focusing only on numbers of tourists and money spent by the tourists, Tourism Deputy Minister Tokozile Xasa said in remarks published on Sunday by the Government Communication and Information System (GCIS). "Responsible tourism" was defined as an approach to the management of tourism, aimed at maximizing economic, social and environmental

benefits and minimizing costs to destinations, with a focus on creating "better places for people to live in, and better places to visit," according to the just concluded International Responsible Tourism Conference held in London.

"Responsible tourism" means that there should be a more "rigorous" focus on sustainability, said Xasa, who attended the conference. "The world is starting to realize that responsible tourism is the way as it focuses on sustainable development and it is people orientated. People are looking for authentic experiences when they travel and that is what South Africa presents and

we based our case on practical examples," Xasa said. "Tourism is one of the six sectors that have been identified as part of the new growth path and we identified areas within tourism with a special focus on domestic tourism ahead of everything else, so we think by 2020 we should be in a position to have created about 225,000 sustainable jobs within that period," added Xasa.

The South African government, in cooperation with the tourism industry, has worked out the National Tourism Sector Strategy (NTSS) which is to make the country one of the top 20 destinations by 2020.

US crackdown on child prostitution leads to 104 arrests, 79 children rescued

WASHINGTON, 26 June — Seventy-nine children were rescued and 104 pimps arrested in a crackdown on child prostitution by the US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the FBI said on Monday.

The crackdown, code-named Operation Cross Country, was carried out from Friday to Sunday by 8,500 federal, state and local enforcement personnel in 57 cities, said Kevin Perkins, acting executive assistant director of the FBI's Criminal, Cyber, Response and Services Branch.

"Child prostitution remains a major threat to children across America," Perkins said. "It is a violent and deplorable crime, and we are working with our partners to disrupt and put behind bars individuals and members of criminal enterprises who would sexually exploit children."

Operation Cross Country, the sixth this year, is part of the Innocence Lost National Initiative that was created in 2003 by the FBI,

in partnership with the Department of Justice and National Centre for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC), to address the growing problem of child sex trafficking in the country. So far, the operations have rescued more than 2,200 children from the streets. — *Xinhua*

Vicious wildfires spread to Colo tourist centres

COLORADO SPRINGS, 26 June — Wildfires moved in on some of Colorado's most popular summer tourist destinations over the weekend, destroying nearly two dozen homes near Rocky Mountain National Park and emptying hotels and campgrounds at the base of Pikes Peak. A wildfire near Colorado Springs erupted Saturday and grew out of control to more than 3 square miles early Sunday, prompting the evacuation of more than 11,000 residents and an unknown number of tourists. Authorities said on Sunday that they were allowing about 5,000 of those residents to return.

On Saturday, a blaze destroyed structures near the mountain community of Estes Park, where many visitors stay while visiting the park. The Larimer County Sheriff's Office said on Sunday that 22 homes and 2 outbuildings had been burned. The two fires are among eight burning in Colorado a week before the Fourth of July, a key time for family vacations to national parks and other destinations. A statewide ban on open campfires and private fireworks has been in place for more than a week. "We're used to flooding and tornadoes, nothing like this," said Amanda Rice, who recently moved to the area from Rock Falls, Ill. Rice, her husband, four children and dog left a Manitou Springs hotel late Saturday.

Rice, scared when she saw flames, took her family to the evacuation centre before she was told to go. "It was just this God-awful orange glow. It was surreal. It honestly looked like hell was opening up," Rice said on Sunday. With Colorado midway through its worst wildfire season in a decade, travellers have seen some of their favorite sites closed to the public, obscured by smoke and haze. Some travelers were awoken with evacuation orders. Plumes of gray and white smoke poured from the mountains Sunday, obscuring at times Pikes Peak, the most-summited high-elevation mountain in the nation and inspiration for the song "America The Beautiful."

TEGUCIGALPA, 26 June— A US Drug Enforcement Administration agent shot and killed a suspected trafficker during a sting operation in northeastern Honduras, a US embassy spokesman in the central American nation said on Sunday.

During the operation, a DEA agent fired on a suspected drug dealer when he tried to use his weapon.

The agent protected his own life and his team's. The alleged dealer died," embassy spokesman Stephen Posivak said.

A group of around 40 people allegedly were unloading drugs from a small aircraft when the operation and killing occurred. The incident, which occurred on Saturday, was the second recent intervention by DEA agents in Honduras.

The nationality of the victim was not disclosed. Officials said about 360 kilos of cocaine were seized during the operation, which followed another raid in mid-May that involved DEA agents and Honduran security forces. Four Hondurans were killed during that incident.

Honduras often serves as a stop over for drugs being trafficked, mostly by Mexican cartels, from South America into the United States. It has the highest murder rate in the world, according to UN data.

DEA agents assist police, military and army forces from Honduras in the area as they hunt for traffickers. Local authorities have estimated that more than 22 tonnes of cocaine were seized in 2011 in Honduras.

Hong Kong ship suspected in Philippine sinking

MANILA, 26 June — The Philippines said on Monday they believed a Hong Kong vessel may have rammed a Filipino fishing boat, leaving one person dead and four missing, after initially suspecting China over the accident.

In a statement the country's coast guard said, the fishing boat "was accidentally hit by a Hong Kong-registered bulk vessel, the *MV Peach Mountain* which was passing the area... with some of the fishermen falling overboard".

Coast guard spokesman Lieutenant Commander Armand Balilo added that three of the survivors of the collision in the South China Sea on 20 June had said that the vessel that struck them had the words "Hong Kong" painted on it.

Balilo described the incident as a "hit-and-run", saying that the ship hit the fishing vessel and then left without trying to help the Filipinos.

The coast guard said it was contacting the Hong Kong Maritime Rescue Coordinating Centre for information on the vessel which was initially suspected to be a Chinese ship.

One feared dead in Canada roof collapse

ELLIOT LAKE, 26 June — At least one person was feared dead and another trapped inside the rubble of a roof collapse at mall in northern Ontario, authorities said on Sunday. More than 24 hours after the collapse, rescue workers were unable to reach the victims because the structure was too unstable. They said it would take until early Monday morning before the structure was deemed safe enough for search and rescue teams to go back in. Images taken with the camera show a hand and foot in the dusty debris, said Ontario Provincial Police Insp Percy Jollymore.

Fire officials heard tapping on Sunday morning in another part of the rubble, but nothing had been heard

for hours. They said they also tried to reach that person by drilling through a wall, but found the structure too unsafe to risk entering far enough inside. "Some of our search members this morning heard a couple of taps," said Bill Needles, a spokesman from the Heavy Urban Search and Rescue team which travelled from Toronto. "They called for a quick silence on the site and there was a couple more taps. That was an indication to us that we were dealing with a rescue." He said the operation was still a rescue mission and they were still hoping to find people alive. Police compiled a list of nine people missing since the collapse on Saturday, but the names were being crossed off as members of the community

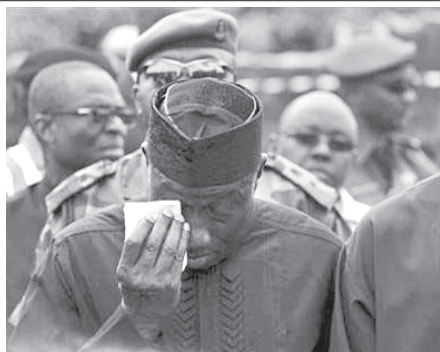
accounted for their loved ones. At least 22 people suffered minor injuries in the roof collapse Saturday afternoon at the Algo Centre Mall in Elliot Lake. A special emergency crew was working to stabilize the scene, but authorities said the process could take another 12 hours.

A portion of the roof that serves as a parking area crumbled down two floors into an area near the food court, leaving behind a gaping hole which was 12 metres (39 feet) by 24 metres (79 feet). It also downed hydro lines and triggered a gas leak. Emergency officials quickly cleared out the mall and closed surrounding roads. Mayor Rick Hamilton declared a state of emergency.

Nigeria says it needs new anti-terrorism tactics

ABUJA, 26 June — Nigerian President Goodluck Jonathan said on Sunday he sacked his defence minister and national security adviser last week because the government needed new anti-terrorism tactics.

Militant Islamist sect Boko Haram has been fighting an insurgency against Jonathan's government since he entered office over a year ago. Several military crackdowns and a state of emergency have failed to stem the violence. The presidency issued a statement on Friday saying

Jonathan's two top security chiefs had been dismissed but did not give a reason why.

"We think some new persons have to come in to change tactics in our fight against terrorism.... It's not that they were not working but just that we need to change tactics," Jonathan said in a meeting with reporters aired on state television on Sunday. Boko Haram, which is based in the remote northeast, has rapidly overtaken militants in the oil-producing southern Niger Delta as the country's biggest security threat. Niger Delta

militants gave up arms in return for training and stipends in a 2009 amnesty but brief efforts to hold a dialogue with Boko Haram earlier this year failed.

"Boko Haram has no face and government will not dialogue with a faceless people. They must come out and tell us why they are doing what they are doing," said Jonathan. Gun and bomb attacks blamed on Boko Haram have killed hundreds since the movement started its uprising more than two years ago.

Four skyscrapers named among world's best tall buildings

Skyscrapers in Canada, Qatar, Australia and Italy have been named the best tall buildings in the world for 2012 by the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat.

The four regional winners include the Absolute Towers in Mississauga, Canada (Americas), 1 Bligh Street, Sydney (Asia and Australia), Palazzo Lombardia, Milan (Europe), and Doha Tower/Burj Qatar, Doha (Middle East and Africa).

The Al Bahar Towers in Abu Dhabi won the CTBUH's first Innovation award for the project's remarkable computer-controlled sun-screen, the *Daily Mail* reported.

The Absolute Towers are

set to be completed in August 2012, and will reach a height of 179.5 meters (589 ft) and 158 meters (518 ft)

While Palazzo Lombardia is the first tall building in Italy to earn CTBUH recognition and 1 Bligh is the first building in Australia to be honoured.

A record number of towers taller than 200 metres were completed in 2011 - 88 compared to 32 in 2005. Another 96 are due to be completed this year.

An overall winner for the 'Best Tall Building Worldwide' will be named at the CTBUH 11th Annual Awards Ceremony and Dinner at the Illinois Institute of Technology, on 18 October. The CTBUH

Best Tall Building Awards are an independent review of new projects, judged by a panel of industry executives.

Projects are recognised for making an extraordinary contribution to the advancement of tall buildings and the urban environment, and for achieving sustainability at the broadest level.

The Council received 78 entries from around the world for the Best Tall Building awards. The majority of the entries were from Asia, followed by the Middle East.

The number of entries from the Americas continued to decline, reflecting the impact of the recent global recession.

Kagawa, the first Japanese footballer to play for Manchester United, joined Dortmund in 2010 from Cerezo Osaka.

He had a glittering two years in Germany, winning two Bundesliga titles as well as the league and cup double in 2011/12. And Kagawa says he is determined to continue that success in the Barclays Premier League.

"Having completed the transfer, I can't think anything negative any more," he added. "I feel positive. I would like to achieve big things with such a big, historical club. I know there's a tough challenge ahead of me but I am excited to have the chance to take it."

GNIEWINO, (Poland), 26 June — Spain captain Iker Casillas can become the first player to notch up 100 victories in international football if his team beat Portugal in Wednesday's Euro 2012 semi-final. To do so, on his 136th appearance for his country, the Real Madrid goalkeeper will have to thwart his club team mate and Portugal captain Cristiano Ronaldo, who has three goals at the tournament and has been on scintillating form.

Eliminating the Por-

tuguese, who have only beaten their Iberian neighbours once in seven competitive games, would give Spain a chance to become the first nation to win back-to-back continental titles with a World Cup in between. Casillas believes former World Player of the Year Ronaldo has still not quite reproduced the form that helped Real win La Liga for the first time in four years last season.

"His season at Madrid was incredible in terms of the way he played, the goals and the records," the 31-year-old, known in Spain as "Saint Iker" thanks to his miraculous saves, was quoted as saying in Monday's *Marca* sports daily. "I don't think that right now he is at his best level," he added. A fired-up Ronaldo has been peppering opposition goals with shots in Portugal's four Euro 2012 outings and Casillas said he will have to be wary of any deviation in the air due to the peculiar way Ronaldo strikes the ball. —Reuters

Forget practising penalties, says Germany's Kopke

WARSAW, 26 June — Ahead of Thursday's Euro 2012 semi-final against Italy, goalkeeping coach Andreas Kopke has said Germany will not be taking too many spot-kicks to prepare for a dreaded penalty shoot-out. Germany face the Azzurri in Warsaw on Thursday for a place in Sunday's final, but after Italy needed a penalty shoot-out to beat England in their quarter-final, Kopke insisted the Germans will not become spot-kick obsessed.

Although there is a clear

argument for preparing players to deal with the nerve-shredding tension of the dreaded spot-kicks, Kopke insists it is impossible to replicate the same fraught environment exhausted players face. "It is nearly impossible to "practise" penalty shoot-outs in training, it doesn't yield much in terms of results, because you can't really simulate the psychological pressure goalkeepers and players will be under," said Kopke.

"The players just whack

it in when it comes to training and you can't really recreate that pressure, so it makes little sense to practise penalties." As far as I am concerned, I hated (penalties) when I was a player. Kopke did reveal Germany's goalkeeper Manuel Neuer will be fully briefed about what to expect against the Italians should Thursday's game come down to penalties and the Germans

By the sametoken, the German goalkeeping staff will know, and have passed on to their players, all of the habits and preferences Italy shot-stopper Gianluigi Buffon favours between the posts by Thursday. After Italy's 33-year-old man-of-the-match Andrea Pirlo converted their second spot-kick with an audacious kick past England goalkeeper Joe Hart on Sunday, Kopke said the cheeky chip showed the Italian midfielder's class.

Djokovic swings into action, Venus star wanes

LONDON, 26 June — Men's champion Novak Djokovic arrived on court with a golf club, Roger Federer with his own unique brand of magic and Maria Sharapova basking in a Parisian glow as Wimbledon's headline acts shone in the opening day sunshine on Monday. While that trio claimed routine victories to launch the 126th edition of the grasscourt grand slam, five-times women's winner Venus Williams had a forgettable day, ditching out in the first round after losing 6-1, 6-3 to Russian doubles specialist Elena Vesnina.

The 32-year-old, who has been beset by health problems, was one of 11 grand slam champions in the women's draw, including current US Open champion Samantha Stosur and 2011 French Open winner Li Na, both of whom had comfortable wins. World number one Djokovic was in a playful mood after a clinical 6-3, 6-3, 6-1 defeat of Spain's Juan Carlos Ferrero. "I mixed

it up with a tennis racket," the amiable Serb told reporters of the stunt where he pulled out a junior club from his racket bag just moments after walking onto a packed Centre Court. "It was a little funny thing. Fans corrected me straight away, saying 'this is not a golf club'."

Djokovic could probably have used the club to beat former French Open champion Ferrero, such was his dominance of a contest that

barely got a mention in the post-match conference which ended with the Serb discussing his pet poodle.

"It's four years old and cute as candy," he said. Federer, eyeing a record-equaling seventh Wimbledon title, limbered up with a tasty 6-1, 6-1, 6-1 defeat of Spain's Albert Ramos, a player without a single win on grass. Federer's 106th on the surface—a record among active players — was never in doubt.

Not even being overlooked for a Centre Court slot ruffled the majestic Swiss who needs one more title here to equal the seven of Pete Sampras. "Absolutely special, because you do realize the moment you walk on to the court that it is a different place here than any other," the 30-year-old told reporters. "Just the respectful clap, no music. The whole thing is very much focused on the players and on the sport, which is beautiful. We had a great atmosphere on Court One."

Sharapova, fresh from winning the French Open and reclaiming the world No.1 ranking, dropped only one point in the opening four games against Australia's Anastasia Rodionova although she was eventually forced to engage second gear in 6-2, 6-3 victory. The Russian will face Bulgarian Tsvetana Pironkova in the second round — a dangerous opponent who reached the quarter-finals last year.

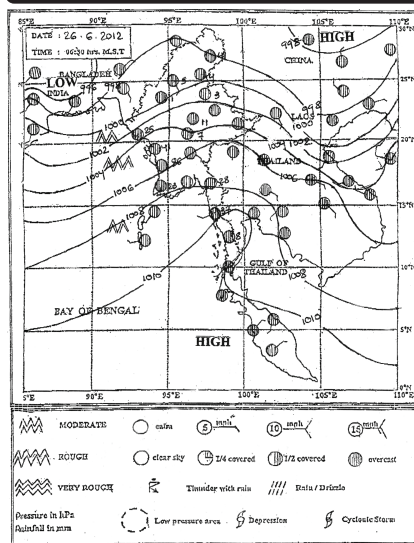

Rooney running out of time to shine

LONDON, 26 June—Another major tournament, and another major disappointment for Wayne Rooney.

The man regarded as the most gifted English footballer of his generation is running out of opportunities to prove that his dazzling debut at Euro 2004 was anything more than a teenage flash in the pan.

Suspended for the first two matches of England's Euro 2012 campaign, Rooney made a goalscoring return in the 1-0 victory against Ukraine, a win which helped his side finish top of Group D.

Although the Manchester United striker looked some distance off his best form, England's management remained optimistic that Rooney would turn in an improved showing in the quarter-finals against Italy.

However that optimism proved to be ill-founded on Sunday as the 26-year-old failed once again to stamp his authority on a major tournament after disappointments at the 2006 and 2010 World Cups. Looking alarmingly short of match fitness, Rooney was also guilty

of ceding possession all too frequently—completing just 27 of 50 passes attempted, a completion rate of 54 percent. Only James Milner, with 48 percent, was lower.

Rooney's disappointing performances means that he will have to wait another two years until the 2014 World Cup in Brazil before he has another chance to prove he deserves to be bracketed with the world's best footballers.

Rooney's displays have focused attention on his physical conditioning. His decision to take a pre-tournament holiday in Las Vegas, where he was photographed visiting the gaming tables and nightclubs of Sin City, looks even more ill-advised.

However England manager Roy Hodgson has insisted his coaching staff were happy with the striker's fitness when he joined up with the squad last month.

"We've monitored his fitness levels and in training he has looked very fit," Hodgson said on Monday shortly before England left their Krakow base.

Decapitated Belgian trekker found in Nepal

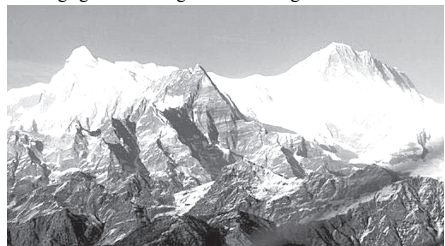
KATHMANDU, 26 June—Nepalese police on Tuesday launched a murder investigation after the body of a Belgian woman was found decapitated in a popular trekking spot in the Himalayas. Debbie Maveau, 23, had been missing for 10 days before her badly decomposed body was found on 14 June beneath a hiking trail in the Langtang National Park, on the Tibetan border, police said.

"Her head was around 13 inches from the rest of her body," local inspector Bhakta Sunuwar told AFP, adding police had no leads on the culprit and were trying to establish if she had been killed by someone she met before the trek.

Sunuwar said robbery and rape were unlikely motives since her underwear had not been removed and her camera and 8,000 rupees (\$93) in cash were not taken.

"People are not cooperating with the investigation. Everyone in the area says they have not seen her," he added.

"We found that she had travelled to Dhunche from Kathmandu by bus but none of the drivers in the area confirmed that they had seen her." A growing number of assaults in Nepal's Himalayan national parks have led to a US Embassy warning against trekking alone in the region.—Internet
