First day's Fourth Regular Session of First Pyidaungsu Hluttaw convened

NAY PYI TAW, 4 July— First day's Fourth Regular Session of First Pyidaungsu Hluttaw was held at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw hall of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 1 pm today, attended by Speaker of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint, Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 626 Pyidaungsu Hluttaw representatives.

At the session, messages were put on record, proposal submitted to approve the announcement of a state of emergency, establishments

Speaker U Khin Aung Myint said that he was glad to see the representatives in good health. Pyidaungsu Hluttaw regular meetings have been held in accord with the Constitution and Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Laws. Today's meeting was the fourth time during its one-and-half-year term.

With respect to diplomatic relations submitting session, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs Dr Myo Myint explained the establishment of diplomatic relations with Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Republic of Melawei, Bhutan, UAE, Luxemburg, the Republic of Latvia, Estonia Republic and Dominican Republic submitted by the President. Representatives who wish to discuss it are to submit their names to the Hluttaw not later than 4 pm on 12 July.

Dark economic clouds gather anew over Obama campaign

WASHINGTON, 4 July— After a month in which his re-election campaign picked up momentum, hard economic realities are about to hit President Barack Obama as he takes to the road on a campaign bus trip through the Rust Belt.

Poor manufacturing data earlier this week followed by a likely weak jobless report on Friday are reminding

Obama that he has a lot of work to do to convince voters he is bringing the economy back to full health.

A Supreme Court victory for Obama on healthcare and a surprise expansion of immigration laws that put Republican opponent Mitt Romney on the defensive on the issue may soon fade from memory. "By Friday, the Supreme Court will be in the rear-view mirror and everybody will be talking about the state of the economy," said Greg Valliere, an analyst for institutional investors at Potomac Research Group. "I think the debate on Friday will be whether the economy is still growing or whether we've hit a brick wall," he said.

US manufacturing activity contracted in June for the first time in nearly three years, data showed on Monday, stark evidence of a slowing economic recovery and that Europe's debt crisis is weighing on the US economy.

And the monthly jobless

figures, the most closely watched economic indicator, are expected to be lackluster. Economists polled by Reuters expect nonfarm payrolls to have risen by only 90,000 jobs in June and the unemployment rate will stay unchanged at 8.2 percent.

Virus attacks computer system at Israel's Defence Ministry

JERUSALEM, 4 July — Israeli Defence Ministry's computer system network has been infected with a virus that breached its strong security defences, though no serious damage was reported, a local TV station reported late Tuesday.

The ministry is investigating the incident in an effort to find out where the virus came from and the extent of damage it has caused, the report said.

Israel's growing dependence on digital networks for daily banking, energy production and military operations has made cyber security a top national security issue, with government and military agencies working to identify vulnerability in the nation's critical systems.

The National Cyber Bureau was established earlier this year to ensure the protection of critical civilian and military networks against cyber threats.

Last month, the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) acknowledged that it uses cyber warfare for offensive military operations.

World's media giants to discuss challenges at Moscow summit

Moscow, 4 July — The world's leading media giants will gather at a summit here later this week to discuss their challenges in the 21st century. With the theme of "Global Media: Meeting the Challenges of the 21st Century," the second World Media Summit, will open on Thursday. Vitaly Ignatenko, director general of Russia's *Izar-Tass* news agency and co-chairman of the summit, told *Xinhua* the summit would offer all participants a rare chance to exchange ideas on media challenges in the young century. The three-day summit will explore the transformation of traditional media under pressure from new media and the Internet, media survival models in the current economic crisis, journalistic ethics in a hyper-dynamic world, and cooperation between media organizations, businesses and governments, Ignatenko said.

The media summit had proved to be the

best platform to tackle the most important issues of the global media environment, and to voice timely responses to the challenges the modern world produced, he said. Russian President Vladimir Putin will also attend the Moscow forum and, as the summit's host, Ignatenko hopes the forum can resume the constructive conversation started at the first summit in Beijing. The summit was initiated in 2009 by nine leading media organizations, including the *Associated Press*, the British Broadcasting Corporation, Google, *Izar-Tass*, *Kyodo News*, News Corporation, *Thomson Reuters*, Turner Broadcasting System and *Xinhua*, and was attended by about 300 representatives from more than 170 international media outlets. Al Jazeera and the *New York Times* joined the summit's presidium in 2010 and 2011, respectively. The summit mechanism has been praised by the United Nations, UNESCO and media leaders around the world.—*Xinhua*

Market bombs kill 44 before Iraqi Shi'ite ritual

BAGHDAD, 4 July— Bombs killed at least 44 people at markets in Iraq on Tuesday, and authorities said they bore the hallmarks of sectarian attacks on Shi'ite Muslims by al-Qaeda Sunni militants. A bomb in a small truck exploded in a market in the city of Diwaniya, killing 40 people, and other blasts killed four more near the city of Kerbala, police and officials said.

The Diwaniya bombing was near a Shi'ite mosque where pilgrims gather on their way to Kerbala to celebrate the birthday of one of their most important imams, al-Mahdi, this week. Police announced a partial curfew and blocked all

entrances to Diwaniya, 150 km (90 miles) south of Baghdad and 130 km southeast of Kerbala. Police sources said 75 people had been wounded. "All of a sudden the explosion happened, I felt the power of the blast, it was so strong, it broke all the glass in my windows," butcher Ahmed Hassan, 23, said in his shop. "I smelled blood and gunpowder." He said a fellow shopkeeper had been taking dead bodies to the hospital morgue. "We even saw body parts on the top of building, we took them down," said Hassan, looking pale and confused as he swept glass from his shop floor.

Shoes, toys and vegetables were scattered across the ground and at least 15 shops were destroyed. Two burnt-out vehicles stood near the site of the explosion.

Witnesses said the bomb appeared to have been planted in a delivery truck. Earlier in the day, two bombs in a vegetable wholesale market killed four people and wounded 29 near the central Iraqi city of Kerbala, hospital and police sources said.

"The bombing happened because of sticky bombs attached to two parked cars which went off separately," said Hussein Shadhan, a provincial council member, who was at the hospital. "Four of the wounded people are seriously injured and their medical situation is very critical." *Reuters* pictures showed pulverised vegetables covering the blackened market floor. People picked their way through twisted pieces of metal and smashed wooden crates.

Pakistan reopens NATO supply routes after US apology

ISLAMABAD, 4 July — Pakistan on Tuesday night announced that it is reopening land routes for NATO forces in neighbouring Afghanistan after US Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, apologized over the killing of 24 Pakistani soldiers in last November airstrike, the country's Information Minister, Qamaruz-Zaman Kaira said.

The decision was taken at a meeting of top civilian and military leaders after

series of talks between the American and Pakistani officials, the Information Minister told reporters after the meeting. Prime Minister, Raja Pervez Ashraf, presided over the meeting of the Defence Committee of the Cabinet (DCC), which was called to exclusively discuss the reopening of the supply routes.

Pakistan closed NATO supply line in last November to protest over the killing of its 24 soldiers in a US airstrike on Pakistani border posts.

The DCC meeting welcomed Clinton's apology over the killing of Pakistani soldiers, the Minister said, adding that Pakistan's decision will facilitate the transition process in Afghanistan. Pakistan had been demanding US apology for months but the US had earlier refused to apologize and American officials were saying that only 'regret' was enough.—*Xinhua*

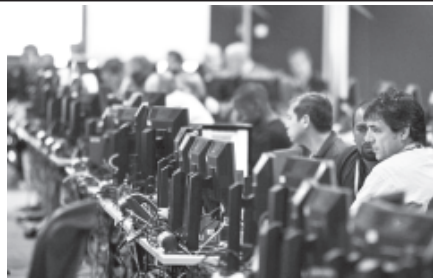

Olympic experts sure they can repel cyber threats

LONDON, 4 July — Vital computer systems for London's 2012 Olympic Games have come under repeated cyber-attacks — but only from hackers who were invited to join in thousands of hours of security tests. Atos, the lead technology company for the Summer and Winter Games since 2002, said Tuesday it had carried out more than 200,000 hours of testing, including mounting simulated attacks. It's all aimed at protecting the systems that will deliver results to Olympic venue scoreboards, event timetables to athletes, and Olympic accreditation information to British border officials.

The company is responsible for about 11,500 computers and servers at locations across Britain. Starting next week, it will run its Olympic Technology Operations Centre — based in Canary Wharf, close to the Olympic stadium — around the clock, monitoring possible cyber threats second by second. Michele Hyron, the company's chief integrator, said to help test its defences Atos had drafted in so-called "ethical hackers" — specialists capable of mounting sophisticated attacks who use their knowledge to test systems rather than disable them.

"We are using ethical hackers for that, we are using external companies, we are using people from our own company who are specialized in that kind of activity," she said. "We are preparing ourselves in terms of testing to cover all the kind of threats to the Olympic Games." She spoke at the technology

centre, where banks of experts were lined up in long rows according to their individual expertise. A quarter of the London Olympic organizing committee's overall budget of \$3.1 billion has been spent on technology. Atos is expecting to handle 2 million pieces of key data throughout the event — 30 percent more than at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. In Beijing, experts encountered about 12 million potential cyber security problems each day. Hyron said Atos expects to see between 12 and 14 million events per day during the London Games, though only about 20 a day will be categorized as formal incidents — actions that require investigation.— *Internet*

This summer is 'what global warming looks like'

WASHINGTON, 4 July — Is it just freakish weather or something more? Climate scientists suggest that if you want a glimpse of some of the worst of global warming, take a look at US weather in recent weeks. Horrendous wildfires. Oppressive heat waves. Devastating droughts. Flooding from giant deluges. And a powerful freak wind storm called a derecho.

These are the kinds of extremes experts have predicted will come with climate change, although it's far too early to say that is the cause. Nor will they say global warming is the reason 3,215 daily high temperature records were set in the month of June. Scientifically linking individual weather events to climate change takes intensive study, complicated mathematics, computer models and lots of time. Sometimes it isn't caused by global warming. Weather is always variable; freak things happen. And this weather has been local. Europe, Asia and Africa aren't having similar disasters now, although they've had their own extreme events in recent years.

But since at least 1988, climate scientists have warned that climate change would bring, in general, increased heat waves, more droughts, more sudden downpours, more widespread wildfires and worsening storms. In the United States, those extremes are happening here and now. So far this year, more than 2.1 million acres have burned in wildfires, more than 113 million people in the US were in areas under extreme heat advisories last Friday, two-thirds of the country is experiencing drought, and earlier in June, deluges flooded Minnesota and Florida. "This is what global warming looks like at the regional or personal level," said Jonathan Overpeck, professor of geosciences and atmospheric sciences at the University of Arizona. "The extra heat increases the odds of worse heat waves, droughts, storms and wildfire. This is certainly what I and many other climate scientists have been warning about." Kevin Trenberth, head of climate analysis at the National Center for Atmospheric Research in fire-charred Colorado, said these are the very record-breaking conditions he has said would happen, but many people wouldn't listen. So it's I told-you-so time, he said.— *Internet*

Galapagos' new star tortoise a prolific dad

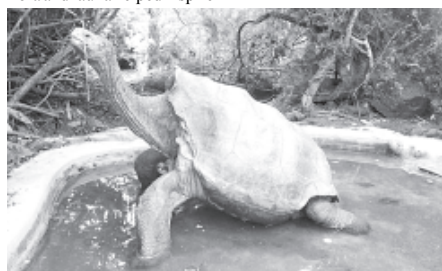
QUITO, 4 July — Lonesome George's inability to reproduce made him a global symbol of efforts to halt the disappearance of species. And while his kind died with him, that doesn't mean the famed giant tortoise leaves no heir apparent. The Galapagos Islands have another centenarian who fills a shell pretty well. He's Diego, a prolific, bossy, macho reptile. Unlike Lonesome George, who died on 24 June, Diego symbolizes not a dying breed but one resurrected. Having sired hundreds of offspring, Diego has been central to bringing the Espanola Island type of tortoise back from near extinction, rangers at Galapagos National Park say. Diego was plucked from Espanola by expeditioners sometime between 1900 and 1930 and wound up in the San Diego Zoo in California, said the head of the park's conservation programme, Washington Tapia.

In 1975, the only other known living members of his species were two males and 12 females. *Chelonoidis hoodensis* — some consider it species, some a subspecies — had been all but destroyed, mostly by domestic animals introduced by humans that ate their eggs. So Diego and the others were placed in a corral at the park's breeding center on Santa Cruz, the main island in the isolated archipelago whose unique flora and fauna helped inspire

Charles Darwin's work on evolution. Diego was so dominant and aggressive, bullying other males with bites and shoves, that he had to be moved eight years later to his own pen, with five of the females. The reptiles are not monogamous. "Diego is very territorial, including with humans," said his keeper, Fausto Llerena. "He once bit me, and two weeks ago he tried (again) to bite me. When you enter his pen, Diego comes near and his intentions

aren't friendly.

A US-based herpetologist for the Galapagos Conservancy, Linda Cayot, says Diego is the most sexually active of the bunch because he's the biggest and the oldest of the males. "In tortoises, the biggest dominates. It's not that the others aren't active. It's just that he's dominant," she says. Tapia said it is impossible to know Diego's age, but he is well over 100. He estimates Diego is the father of 40 to 45 percent of the 1,781 tortoises born in the breeding programme and placed on Espanola island. At least 14 species of giant tortoise originally inhabited the islands 620 miles (1,000 kilometers) off Ecuador's Pacific coast and 10 survive, their features developing in sync with their environment, as Darwin observed. Espanola, which encompasses 50 square miles (130 square kilometers), is arid, and in order to reach vegetation high off the ground, the tortoises there developed the longest legs and necks of any other species in the archipelago. — *Internet*

SEOUL, 4 July — Samsung Electronics, the world's largest maker of memory chips, said Tuesday that it introduced 16-gigabyte (GB) double data rate-4 (DDR4) server modules for the first time in the industry. According to an e-mailed statement, Samsung began sampling the industry's first 16GB DDR4 registered dual inline memory modules (RDIMMs) designed for use in enterprise server systems. The company planned to mass produce the modules starting next year.

Based on 30 nanometer-class process technology, the newly introduced server modules doubled the speed of data processing from the current 1,600 megabits per second (Mbps) of DDR3-based modules, while reducing power consumption by around 40 percent compared with its predecessor DDR3 modules.

The server modules were launched to serve for corporate use that needs large data storage. The modules will be provided to major CPU and controller makers, Samsung said. "By launching these new high-density DDR4 modules, Samsung is embracing closer technical cooperation with key CPU and server companies for development of next-generation green IT systems," said Hong Wanhoon, Samsung's executive vice president.— *Xinhua*

Limited policy firepower major challenge for US economic recovery

WASHINGTON, 4 July — A main challenge facing the United States is to effectively use the limited policy firepower to bolster its economic recovery in the near term, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said on Tuesday.

The country should also restore fiscal sustainability with a balanced approach to medium-term consolidation and complete financial sector reforms, the IMF said in a concluding statement released after its 2012 Article IV consultation with the United States. In the annual economic and financial checkup of the world's largest economy, the global lending agency forecast that the US economy would grow around 2 percent in 2012 before picking up pace to 2.3 percent in 2013.

The US economic growth remained "tepid" amid domestic and global economic downside risks, IMF Managing Director Christine Lagarde said on Tuesday at a press conference. US policymakers should take a comprehensive and credible fiscal consolidation plan to improve its fiscal sustainability, but those measures should not be too "extreme" to become a brake on the economic recovery, Lagarde added.— Xinhua

June auto sales point to best year since 2007

DETROIT, 4 July — New auto sales in June raced past expectations on lower gas prices and still-generous incentives, and are on track to score their best year since 2007. The surprisingly strong June in which sales rose 22 percent from a year ago helped ease fears that weaker-than-expected results in May would suggest a slowdown in demand. June's annualized sales rate of 14.1 million vehicles, according to Autodata Corp, beat analysts' average estimate of 13.9 million. Before the

economy sank into recession, annual auto sales tallied 16.1 million in 2007. They plunged to 13.2 million in 2008 and a 27-year low of 10.4 million in 2009, before beginning a slow recovery. Last year, US auto sales totaled 12.8 million. Shares of General Motors Co jumped more than 6 percent on Tuesday as the No 1 US auto maker posted a 16 percent increase in vehicle sales from the previous year and said June was its best performing month since September 2008.

Sales by Ford Motor Co, the second-largest US

automaker, climbed 7 percent and its shares rose 3 percent. Of the major automakers reporting US sales on Tuesday, Toyota Motor Corp posted a 60 percent gain, to 177,795, that still fell short of analysts' expectations. The strong rebound by the third-biggest automaker based on US sales followed a low point after the Japanese earthquake and tsunami last year. Sales of industry No 4 Chrysler rose 20 percent to 144,811 vehicles, slightly topping analyst expectations. It was the 27th consecutive month that Chrysler sales topped those from the previous year, and its best June sales since 2007.

Health Tip: Clean your fruits and veggies

Vegetables and fruits can harbor bacteria that can make you sick. So it's important to wash any produce before you eat it — even fruits or veggies that you peel. Peeling can spread germs from the outer layer to the part you eat.

The Foodsafety.gov website offers this advice about cleaning produce before you eat it:

- * If you see any portions that look damaged or bruised, cut away those areas.
- * Use running water to rinse produce, but don't use any detergent, commercial wash or bleach.
- * Use a produce brush to scrub firm produce, such as cucumbers or melons.
- * Use a clean paper towel to dry these items after they're washed.—Internet

US researchers report success in treating autism spectrum disorder

WASHINGTON, 4 July — Using a mouse model of autism, researchers at the University of Cincinnati (UC) and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Centre have successfully treated an autism spectrum disorder characterized by severe cognitive impairment. The research team, led by Joe Clark, a professor of neurology at UC, reports its findings online Monday in the *Journal of Clinical Investigation*, a publication of the American Society for Clinical Investigation. The disorder, creatine transporter deficiency (CTD) is caused by a mutation in the creatine transporter protein that results in deficient energy metabolism in the brain. Linked to the X chromosome, CTD affects boys most severely; women are carriers and pass it on to their sons.

The brains of boys with CTD do not function normally, resulting in severe speech deficits, developmental delay, seizures and profound mental retardation. CTD is estimated to currently affect about 50,000 boys in the United States and is the second-most common cause of X-linked mental retardation after Fragile X syndrome. In the study, researchers discovered a method to treat it with cyclocreatine — also known as CincY, a creatine analogue originally developed as an adjunct to cancer treatment. They then treated genetically engineered mice as an animal model of the human disease.

"CincY successfully entered the brain and reversed the mental retardation-like symptoms in the mice, with benefits seen in nine weeks of treatment," says Clark, adding that no harmful effects to the mice were observed in the study.

FDA approves first rapid, take-home HIV test

WASHINGTON, 4 July — Americans will soon be able to test themselves in the privacy of their own homes for the virus that causes AIDS, now that the Food and Drug Administration has approved the first rapid, over-the-counter HIV test. The OraQuick test detects the presence of HIV antibodies using a mouth swab and returns a result in 20 to 40 minutes. Government officials estimate that about 240,000 people, or one-fifth of the roughly 1.2 million people carrying HIV in the US, don't know they are infected. Testing is a chief means of slowing new infections, which have held steady at about 50,000 per year for two decades. FDA officials said the test is designed for people who might not otherwise get tested. The availability of a home-use HIV test kit provides another option for individuals to get tested so that they can seek medical care, if appropriate," said Dr Karen Midthun, director of the FDA's Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research. Orasure plans to start selling the test in October, both online and through retailers like Walgreens, CVS and Walmart.

It hasn't set a price yet but expects the consumer version to cost less than \$60 but more than the one marketed to health professionals, which costs about \$17.50. CEO Doug Michels said the price increase will help pay for a toll-free call center to provide counseling and medical referrals to test users. Each of the call-center operators is bilingual in English and Spanish, they've gone through 160 hours of training on HIV counseling and testing," Michels said in an interview with the *Associated Press*. "So they are highly trained professionals and they'll

be there to support the consumer." Michels said the company's marketing efforts will focus on populations at greatest risk of being infected with HIV, including gay and bisexual men, African Americans and Hispanics. FDA stressed in its approval announcement that the test is not 100 percent accurate in identifying people with the virus. A trial conducted by test maker Orasure showed OraQuick detected HIV in those carrying the virus only 92 percent of the time, though it was 99.9 percent accurate in ruling out HIV in patients not carrying the virus.—Internet

confidence they can be salvaged or dismantled without taxpayer bailouts if they became insolvent, as

documents, required by the 2010 Dodd-Frank financial reform law, aim to end too-big-to-fail bailouts by mapping out ways that, in theory, mortally-wounded banks could go out of business without wrecking the financial system. If regulators find that the resolution plans are not credible, they could force the banks to sell off business lines and restructure to become less complex.

But some experts doubt how hard regulators will push the banks for changes or how useful hypothetical resolution plans will be in

major financial crisis.

The public portions released on Tuesday and are a few dozen pages per bank summarizing thousands of pages submitted confidentially to regulators. The banks argued in the public documents that their resolution plans will work, with no cost to taxpayers or great consequence to the financial system.

They used technical generalities in their conclusions without specifically addressing the unpredictable and vicious nature of a credit crisis.

Heathrow Airport admits queues 'unacceptable'

LONDON, 4 July—British airport operator BAA admitted on Monday that immigration queues at Heathrow Airport, the main gateway for the London Olympics, have been "unacceptably long" in

recent days.

Some passengers were forced to wait for two and a half hours last week for passport checks at the west London airport, which will welcome around 80 percent of the athletes, officials, fans

and media coming for the Games.

"Immigration waiting times for passengers during peak periods at Heathrow in the last few days have been unacceptably long," a BAA spokesman said.

Hours-long immigration queues at the airport, the world's busiest in terms of international passenger traffic, caused major embarrassment to the British government in May, just weeks before the Olympic opening ceremony on 27 July.

With thousands of athletes due to land at Heathrow over the next three weeks, there are fears that the Home Office, or interior ministry — which is responsible for immigration — will not be able to cope

with the traffic.

The *Daily Telegraph* newspaper reported half-mile queues at Heathrow's Terminal 4 on Friday.

A Border Force spokeswoman said the recent "queue breaches" at Heathrow had been "less than an hour" and that extra staff had been sent to immigration desks to deal with them.

"We are fully prepared for the busy Olympic period and will be implementing our well-rehearsed plans," she said. "This includes staffing all immigration desks at key ports whenever necessary during the peak Olympic and Paralympic arrivals period."

BAA said the Home Office had promised that all of its Border Force desks at Heathrow would be manned during the busiest Olympics arrival times.—*Internet*

Florida man sees "cruel" face of US justice

MIAMI, 4 July—Quartavious Davis is still shocked by what happened to him in federal court two months ago.

"My first offense, and they gave me all this time," said Davis, a pudgy African American with dreadlocks who spoke with *Reuters* at the Federal Detention Centre in Miami. "Might just as well say I'm dead."

Davis was convicted of participating in a string of armed robberies in the Miami area in 2010. His accomplices testified against him, saying he carried a gun during their crimes and discharged it at a dog that chased them after one of their burglaries. But Davis was not convicted of hurting anyone physically, including the dog.

Davis would occupy no place at all in the annals of crime if not for his sentence. Now 20 years old, he was sentenced to 1,941 months - almost 162 years - in prison without the possibility of parole.

On the day of Davis's interview with *Reuters*, the US Supreme Court decided that life sentences without parole for defendants under the age of 18 constituted "cruel and unusual punishment" even in cases of murder.—*Reuters*

Blast at Bangkok oil refinery triggers huge blaze

BANGKOK, 4 July—An explosion at an oil refinery in an industrial area of Bangkok sparked a massive fire early Wednesday, sending a thick column of smoke into the air that could be seen across the Thai capital.

No one appeared to have been injured in the blaze, which began after a loud blast at around 7.30 am local time (0030 GMT), according to a

spokeswoman for the refinery firm. "We are investigating the cause of fire and will inform the public immediately," said Chavee-wan Kiatchokchaikul of Bangchak Petroleum, who said the fire had been brought under control. Emergency services deployed to the scene said there had been no casualties reported so far.

"There is not much oil so

people should not panic," said a local Bangkok fire fighter on Thai television.

The Bangchak oil refinery, which employs around 600 people, is located in a large industrial estate in a sprawling suburb. It is among the country's biggest refineries and 120,000 barrels of oil are processed at the site every day, a company official told *AFP*.—*Internet*

Turkish warplanes bomb Kurdish hideouts in northern Iraq

ISTANBUL, 4 July—Turkish warplanes have struck several locations in northern Iraq believed to be Kurdish rebel hideouts, the army said Monday.

The strikes follow a 19 June rebel attack on an army outpost near the Iraqi border that killed eight Turkish soldiers and wounded another 19.

The army command said in a statement that it hit "three targets belonging to the separatist terrorist organization," referring to the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) rebels, after exploratory flights located their suspected hideouts.

The jets safely returned to their bases in Turkey, the statement added, without specifying when the air strikes had taken place. In a subsequent statement, the army said it had also bombed PKK hideouts on 24 June,

when 25 rebels were killed and another 23 injured. Another 30 or so rebels were killed during the 19 June clash, according to the army.

The bombings of rebel bases come amid government efforts to soften tensions with the Kurdish minority, but a recent spike in PKK violence in the southeast may force the government to keep up military action, according to analysts. The PKK, listed as a terrorist organization by Turkey and

much of the international community, took up arms in the Kurdish-majority southeast Turkey in 1984, sparking a conflict that has claimed some 45,000 lives.

The army statement came as an Istanbul court on Monday began a high-profile trial of some 200 suspects alleged to be linked to the Union of Kurdistan Communities, a which authorities say is a wing of the PKK.—*Internet*

Freeport Indonesia considers IPO

JAKARTA, 4 July—The Indonesian subsidiary of US mining giant Freeport-McMoRan is considering launching an initial public offering (IPO), its head said in comments published on Wednesday.

"We are considering several options, including an IPO," Freeport Indonesia president Rozik Soetjipto was quoted as telling the *Jakarta Globe* newspaper.

"The IPO would be good for Freeport Indonesia," he said, adding that it would make the company "more accountable and transparent." He did not specify details such as the timeframe or size of the sale.

US-based Freeport-McMoran Copper & Gold, which owns a 90.64 percent stake in the Indonesian subsidiary, would still have the final say on the matter, he added.

Soetjipto said Freeport, whose huge Grasberg mine in restive Papua Province was hit by a violent strike last year, was focused on renegotiating its contracts ending in 2021 with the government, the report said.

Freeport Indonesia was not immediately available for comment about the report.

Indonesia in March

announced a new law limiting foreign ownership in the mining sector from 80 percent to less than 50 percent, in a bid to protect abundant natural resources and keep a larger portion of revenues.

The regulation, which applies to new contracts only, obliges foreigners to divest at least 51 percent of their shares to Indonesians over a 10-year period.

It is not clear how the law may affect Freeport's Indonesian operation.

Indonesia, Southeast Asia's largest economy, has some of the world's biggest untapped mineral reserves, including tin, nickel, copper and gold.

Foreign direct investment in Indonesia hit a record \$20 billion last year, with \$3.6 billion attributed to the mining sector.

Freeport says it is the single biggest taxpayer to the Indonesian government.

Grasberg, the world's biggest gold and second-biggest copper mine, is Freeport Indonesia's only mine, employing more than 20,000 people.

A three-month strike over wages and work conditions last year turned violent, with at least eight people killed in ambush attacks and clashes with police. The strike ended in December.

scholarship, K 15000 per month, will be provided to outstanding students in each township starting from this fiscal year.

The President has allowed opening of new schools, upgrading and recruiting necessary teachers and education staff during the four-year period from 2012-2016 academic year to 2015-2016 fiscal year. A total of 314 high schools (branch) and affiliated high schools have been upgraded to the high school level; 450 affiliated high schools and middle schools to the high school (branch) level; 380 middle school (branch) and affiliated middle schools to the middle school level; 438 affiliated middle schools and post-primary schools to the middle school (branch) level; 1373 primary schools to post-primary school level; 1014 primary schools (branch) and affiliated primary schools to the primary school level; and 326 primary schools (branch) to the primary school (branch) level. A total of 4295 schools have been upgraded.

The improvement of education standard of the country will be achieved earlier if Region/State governments, townsenders and local people fulfill to the needs of schools upgraded by the State.

For the upgraded schools, the government has to recruit 695 teachers and officers, 19770 personnel, and 4422 staff totally 24887 yearly. It will cost more 16089.144 million each year at the rate of 1340.762 million a month.

The pay scale of headmaster of the middle school will be increased from (59000-1000-64000) to (100000-2000-110000) and that of the headmaster of the primary school from (53000-1000-58000) to (59000-1000-64000). A total of 60000 junior assistant teachers will be promoted to assistant teachers. Region/State education officers will be promoted from deputy director/assistant director to director level. District education offices under control of a deputy director will be opened. There will not be district education offices in all 68 districts. The district education officers will be tasked to perform duties in nearby districts. The President has allowed the promotion of township education officers to assistant directors. Only well-behaved, disciplined and dutiful staff will be promoted through scrutiny of the Union minister, the deputy ministers and officials.

He also said that sufficient staff will be appointed in basic education high schools of Regions and States. There will be 420 officers and 2467 staff totally 2887 in region/state education offices, district education offices and township education offices. According to new organizational set-up of education

offices, there will be 2531 officers and 11229 staff totally 13760.

Mexico's Slim not eyeing more Europe buys for now

MEXICO CITY, 4 July— Mexican tycoon Carlos Slim said on Tuesday he has no immediate plans for further telecommunications purchases in Europe after buying into Dutch firm KPN and Telekom Austria.

Asked if he was looking to expand further in Europe after the two recent deals, Slim told *Reuters*: "No, no. We're not looking for nothing now. We are going to consolidate what we've got."

Slim's America Movil, which is present in roughly a dozen Latin American countries, is establishing a beachhead in Europe where a combination of tough competition, regulatory pressure and recession in many markets has beaten down some company valuations to near decade lows.

Unlike his expansion in

Latin America, where the 72-year-old entrepreneur has purchased much bigger stakes or whole companies, he has taken a more cautious approach in Europe.

Slim recently increased his stake in KPN to 27.7 percent and boosted his stake in Austria Telekom to 23 percent, his biggest foray yet into the European market.

His arrival in Europe touched off a period of turbulence in the telecoms sector, with industry executives and analysts questioning if it would lead to a long-awaited consolidation in some markets like Germany or Spain.

With an empire stretching from banking to hotels to mining, the world's richest man said he remained open to opportunities.

"We're always open in

S Korea's imported car sales jump 20.5% in H1

SEOUL, 4 July— Imported car sales in South Korea jumped 20.5 percent in the first half of this year due to persistent demand for foreign luxury models, a local trade association said on Wednesday.

Sales of imported cars reached 62,239 vehicles for the first six months of 2012, up 20.5 percent from the same period of last year, according to the Korea Automobile Importers and Distributors Association (KAIDA).

In June, imported auto sales expanded 18.0 percent on-year to 10,578 units, but on an on-month basis, car sales declined 9.7 percent last month. "The June sales contracted on an on-month basis due to supply shortage of some models, but the imported car sales showed a growth rate of over 20 percent in the first half," said Yoon Dae-sung, executive director of KAIDA. German automaker BMW ranked first in terms of best-selling brand in June with 2,136 vehicles

sold. It was followed by Mercedes-Benz with 1,878 units and Audi with 1,385 units. Volkswagen ranked fourth with 1,276 units sold and Toyota came next with 753 units.

The most popular model was BMW's 520d with 558 units sold last month to beat E300 manufactured by Mercedes-Benz with 503 units sold. It was followed by BMW's 320d with 342 units sold.

Indonesia sees growing export in second half

JAKARTA, 4 July— The Indonesian government forecasts higher export growth in the second semester due to surging prices for several key export commodities and products, the *Jakarta Post* quoting official reported here on Wednesday.

Deputy Trade Minister Bayu Krisnamurthi said on Tuesday that the rise of shipping of the commodities and products, such as palm oil, vehicles, automotive components, electronics and footwear, was going to make up decline of exports at the first six months that the export target of 203 billion US dollar could be achieved this year. "Exports depend heavily on global economic growth, which has been highly affected by conditions in the eurozone. However, considering that our main export commodities are growing positively, this optimism makes sense," Bayu said.

According to a trade report released by the Central Statistics Agency (BPS) on Monday, the nation's exports have been under heavy pressure due to weaker overseas demand. Imports, however grew, resulting in a 1.13 billion US dollar deficit in the nation's balance of trade over April and May. During the first five months of the year, the nation exported 8.81 billion US dollar in palm oil, up 8.93 percent from the same period last year.

Meanwhile exports of vehicles and components totalled 1.92 billion US dollar, up 51.95 percent, and exports of machines and mechanical equipment totalled 2.52 billion US dollar, up by 22.3 percent.

In the first five months, the nation's total exports grew 1.48 percent to 81.42 billion US dollar, with non-oil and gas exports up 0.04 percent to 64.26 billion US dollar.

Unlike the slow upward movement in exports, imports climbed by 16.09 percent to 79.90 billion US dollar, with non-oil and gas imports rising 17.39 percent to 61.65 billion US dollar.

Vietnam, European Free Trade Association start talks on FTA

HANOI, 4 July— Vietnamese Minister of Industry and Trade Vu Huy Hoang and Norwegian Ambassador to Vietnam Stale Torstein Risa officially launched negotiations on a free trade agreement (FTA) between Vietnam and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) countries on Tuesday.

At the launching ceremony, the two sides signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on EFTA's recognition of Vietnam as a market economy.

The EFTA and 30 other countries in the world which recognized Vietnam as a market economy, shows the international community's acknowledgement of the country's efforts to renovate its economy and integrate into the international economy. It will help other countries gain a fair evaluation of Vietnam's economy, Hoang said.

The MoU between Vietnam and the EFTA will create a foundation for promoting bilateral trade and economic ties. It will be a comprehensive FTA in line with World Trade Organization regulations for trade, services, investment and other fields of mutual interest, Hoang added.

The EFTA comprises of Norway, Switzerland, Iceland and Liechtenstein.—*Xinhua*

Strong quake rattles New Zealand's North Island, no reports of injury

WELLINGTON, 4 July— A strong earthquake struck off the west coast of New Zealand's North Island on Tuesday, shaking residents across a wide area and toppling goods from shelves but there were no immediate reports of major damage or injury. The 7.0 magnitude quake was centred 170 km northwest of the capital Wellington at a depth of 230 km (147 miles), the national GeoNet website reported. The US Geological Service earlier reported the tremor at a 6.2 magnitude. There was no tsunami warning issued. The quake was felt throughout central New Zealand, sparking a flurry of

activity on social network sites, but local media reported only minor damage. "It was a good shake but we see no damage. I felt the whole building shake," a spokeswoman at the Opuake police station told *Reuters*. The quake was centred 60 km from Opuake.

The New Zealand dollar dipped to a session low near 80 US cents following the tremor. Christchurch, the New Zealand's second-largest city, is still recovering from a shallow quake measuring 6.3 which killed 182 people in February 2011 and caused some NZ\$20 billion (\$15.5 billion) in damage.—*Reuters*

First Italian woman astronaut to be launched into space in 2014

ROME, 4 July— An Italian woman astronaut has been assigned for the first time for a long-duration mission aboard the *International Space Station (ISS)*, local media reported on Tuesday. In 2014, the European Space Agency (ESA) astronaut Samantha Cristoforetti will be launched into space on a *Soyuz* spacecraft from Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan, the Italian Space Agency (ASI) announced in Rome.

Cristoforetti, 35, a captain in the Italian Air Force, is now trained on the Russian *Soyuz* spacecraft, Station systems, robotics and spacewalks.

"The past three years as a European astronaut have been an amazing time of personal and professional growth," she was quoted as saying by ANSA news agency after receiving the news of her assignment.

"I am now excited to continue this journey with the objective of serving Italy and Europe as a crewmember of the *International Space Station*," she added.—*Xinhua*

Indian debt fund buys \$72 m of Kingfisher airline debt

KOLKATA,4July—Adebt fund managed by India's finance firm SREI Infrastructure Finance has bought \$72 million worth of debt of the beleaguered Kingfisher Airlines, its officials said on Monday.

The Kolkata-based SREI Infra Finance group chief financial officer Sanjeev Sancheti told the *Press Trust of India* it was "a good buy as it is a fully secured debt". The debt was bought from lender ICICI Bank.

Private carrier Kingfisher, controlled by liquor baron Vijay Mallya, reported a net loss of 11.52 billion rupees (\$208 million) in the three months to March, a tripling of losses, and has a total debt of at least \$1.4 billion. The airline has never posted a profit since its launch in 2005 and scaled down its operations in recent months, including shutting down overseas operations.

Guinness says Philippine croc world's largest

A saltwater crocodile weighing more than a tonne and suspected of killing two people in the Philippines has been declared the largest such reptile in captivity by the Guinness Book of World Records.

The 6.17-metre (20.24-foot) male, nicknamed "Lolong", was captured in the Agusan marsh on the southern island of Mindanao last September after a two-year search following the killing of a girl and the disappearance of a fisherman.

"The largest crocodile in captivity is Lolong, a saltwater crocodile (*Crocodylus porosus*), who measured 6.17 m," Guinness said on its website.

"Lolong's weight was also measured at a nearby

truck weigh-bridge and verified as approximately 1,075 kg (2,370 lbs)."

Welinda Asis Elorde, media affairs coordinator for the town of Bunawan, which has custody of the new record-holder, said on 2 July the local government had received an official certification from Guinness.

"He's doing well. I think he has already adapted to his new environment," Elorde told *AFP* by telephone.

At first, Lolong was fed the equivalent of 10 percent of his body weight in beef, pork and poultry every month, but an expert put him on a diet of eight to 10 kilograms a week to get him to be more active, she added.

The expert also recommended that the meat be given with skin and

feathers attached, to help digestion.

"I was there (at the crocodile park where Lolong is kept) yesterday and he remains a big tourist attraction. Hundreds of people visit him in a day," Elorde added.

a tonne. Cassius has been kept at a crocodile park at an island off Queensland since his capture in the Northern Territory in 1984.

Seagulls attack Scottish mail carrier

The British Royal Mail said deliveries to more than 20 residents of a Scottish town have been suspended after a letter carrier was attacked by seagulls.

The Royal Mail said the "swooping attacks" by seagulls in Elgin led the service to suspend deliveries until the end of the nesting season, *The Daily Telegraph* reported.

"The safety of our people is paramount to Royal Mail and these swooping attacks have made it difficult for her to continue to do her job," a spokesman said. "Unfortunately, these frightening attacks have meant that this week we have temporarily suspended deliveries to

some addresses in Muirfield Road. These kinds of attacks do occur at this time of year across the country as gulls are nesting."

The spokesman said the affected residents can pick up their mail at the High Street Post Office.

Resident George McPhee, 66, said he does not agree with the Royal Mail's decision. "The seagulls are a bloody pest, but I have been 41 years in the same house and they have never hurt anybody — and that's including kiddies, dogs and cats," he said. "Even during the Blitz everybody was getting their post. If they have to issue them hard hats then so be it."

NEW YORK, 4 July—He's been in comics, cartoons, on TV and in movies, but when Spider-Man swings into theaters next week for new film "The Amazing Spider-Man," its makers bring out a more brooding and human web-slinger than fans have seen before.

Director Marc Webb, known for low-budget film romance "500 Days of Summer," explores not just the origin of how Peter Parker becomes crime-fighting superhero Spider-Man. He and the writers craft a tale that is as much about Parker—a 17-year-

old filled with angst, independence and desire for love—as it is about action, adventure and catching crooks.

"I am a huge Spider-Man

fan and I am an even bigger fan of Peter Parker, and I love this idea that there is this kid that has the same problems we do," Webb said.

Spider-Man's famous blue-and-red suit doesn't even appear for much of the first half of the big-budget 3D movie, which debuts in theaters in most of the world on 3 July after a Thursday red carpet premiere in Los Angeles.

The new tale reboots the modern film series that began with 2002's "Spider-Man" starring Tobey McGuire as the comic book crime fighter over three movies.—*Reuters*

Actor upset by BBC dropping Dirk Gently

LONDON, 4 July—British actor Stephen Mangan said he is "bitterly upset" about the BBC's decision to cut the drama series "Dirk Gently," in which he starred as a detective. The 5-foot-5 Thomas, of Alexandria, Va, said she aims to beat her own record — 41 hot dogs and buns in 10 minutes — by devouring 45 in this year's competition. "I know my stomach can handle it," she said. "The only thing that needs work is your state

The women's relay includes, besides Cuba, Jamaica, Brazil, the United States, Germany, Belarus,

France, Italy, Ireland, Poland, Czech Republic, Russia, Turkey, Ukraine, Nigeria and Britain. The men's 4X100m relay teams include Brazil, Jamaica, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Trinidad and Tobago, the United States, Canada, Germany, France, Holland, Britain, Hong Kong of China, Italy, Poland, China, Japan and Australia. — Xinhua

Tour de France: Sagan nails second victory

BOULOGNE SUR MER, 4 July — Cycling prodigy Peter Sagan surged in the last turn of a hilly, crash-ridden third stage of the Tour de France to outclass the rest of the bunch and nail his second stage win on Tuesday. The 197 kms ride to Boulogne sur Mer was as hard fought as expected but, as in Liege two days earlier, the 22-year-old Slovak was again too strong for the opposition. Timing his move to perfection, he left no chance to Norway's Edvald Boasson-Hagen and fellow-Slovak Peter Velits, who had to be content with the podium spots.

On the line, Sagan crossed himself and made a bizarre celebration gesture he said was an imitation of Tom Hanks's stride in Forrest Gump. "I'm like Forrest Gump. When they told him to run, he ran. Today, my team mates told me to win. And I won," he said. The Slovak explained he was a fan of motorcycling champion Valentino Rossi, also prone to spectacular

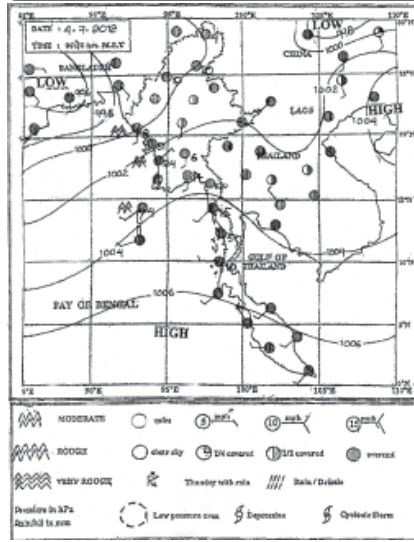

Australia Pacific LNG project gets final investment approval

SYDNEY, 4 July—Origin Energy, Australia's energy company, on Wednesday announced that the Board of Australia Pacific LNG Pty Ltd had approved a final investment decision on the second train of its two-train project in Queensland. The 20 billion US dollar project consists of coal seam gas (CSG) fields in Queensland's Surat and Bowen basins, and a pipeline to a liquefied natural gas (LNG) plant on Curtis Island off the coast of Gladstone.

According to Origin, the two-train project is on track to deliver LNG from its first train in mid 2015 and first LNG from the second train is expected in early 2016.

"As one of Australia's largest LNG export projects, the Australia Pacific LNG project stands to deliver significant value to Origin shareholders and to Australia, as well as jobs for the Australian community," Origin Managing Director Grant King said in a statement. The final investments by the joint venture partners will result in Origin's stake in Australia Pacific LNG reducing from 42.5 percent to 37.5 percent.

ConocoPhillips's interest in Australia Pacific LNG will be diluted to 37.5 percent, while Sinopec will increase its stake from 15 percent to 25 percent.—Xinhua

Bolt, Blake fuel Jamaican Olympic dreams

KINGSTON, 4 July—Glen Mills, coach of reigning 100- and 200-metre Olympic champion and world record-holder Usain Bolt and world 100m champion Yohan Blake, sees future champions as a heritage of the Olympics.

Bolt's heroics, expected to continue in August at the sprint events, and the excitement stirred by Blake, who won the world title last year after Bolt was

disqualified, is already inspiring a new Jamaican generation.

"In Jamaica, track and field is almost a way of life. It's a strong passion in our deep rich heritage," Mills said.

"With that kind of early development, and the icons we have in the sport, athletes are more highly motivated. These are their heroes. They want to achieve what they have achieved.

"It has been the tonic that has kept our athletes performing at a high level year after year."

Blake, who stunned Bolt over the 100m and 200m at the Jamaica trials, sees the chance to escape from poverty as more motivation for Jamaican youth to seek a sprint career.

"It's the poor background we come from," Blake said when asked about the secret to Jamaican sprint success.

"We always want something and we go for it." At the trials, two world leading times, including a stunning 9.75sec in the 100m and 19.80sec in the 200m, rocketed Blake into the spotlight and relegated Bolt to second billing.

Jamaicans have won 53 Olympic medals since first participating at the 1948 London Games, all but one of those medals coming in athletics and most of that haul coming in sprint events.

At Beijing, Veronica Campbell-Brown won her second consecutive 200m Olympic gold, helping a total Jamaican medal haul of a record 11 medals, a record six of them gold, including world record turns by Bolt at 100, 200 and in the 4x100 relay.

Bolt, Blake and veteran Asafa Powell are among the stars who give the Jamaicans potential to sweep the 100m podium at London.

Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Aung Myint extended greetings. Respective Hluttaw representatives questions which were answered members of relevant Union-level organizations. U Maung Aye Tun of Rakhine State Constituency No (9) asked "whether there is plan to open a basic education primary school equipped with teachers in Awrama village-tract in Buthidaung Township of Rakhine State" and U Kyaw

Tun Aung of Rakhine State Constituency No (5), "whether there is plan to erect an extended school building in Myintga village in Pauktaw Township in Rakhine State"

and "whether there is a plan to upgrade BEPS in Kyauktaung village in Pauktaw Township to BEMS". Deputy Minister for Education U Aye Kyu answered that, as there are 59 primary education students in Letpan village Affiliated Basic Education Primary School in Awrama village-tract in Saitin area of Buthidaung Township, it will be upgraded to BEPS (branch) if the proposal is made to Basic Education Department No (1) through relevant township and state education officers.

There are 518 students and eight classrooms currently at Basic Education High School (branch) in Myintga village in Pauktaw Township. Plans have been made to allow surplus fund in 2012-2013 fiscal year and in 2013-2014 fiscal year to build one-storey brick building with 180-foot height, 30-foot width, corrugated iron sheet roof.

Kyauktaung village BEPS in Kyauktaung village-tract in Pauktaw Township have been upgraded to BEMS (branch) since 2011-2012 academic year,

providing middle school education.

The deputy minister then explained plans to improve capacity and socio-economic status of basic education service personnel, and accessibility of basic education. He said that the government provided all text books and six exercise books to provide 5.5 million students of primary schools including monastic ones at the cost of more than K 8000 million in 2012-2013 academic year.

The government has been provided all text books to the primary school students of the whole nation since 2010-2012 academic year at the cost of over K 1835 million. For ensuring all the children join the school and they all complete primary education, Compulsory Primary Education Law is being drafted.

As guided by the President, middle school scholarship, K 10000 per month for the whole academic year, and high school (See page 9)

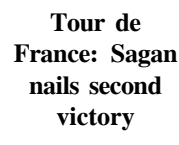
