### University of Nursing (Yangon) gets new lecture hall

NAY PYI TAW, 14 July—The opening ceremony for new lecture hall of University of Nursing (Yangon) under Medical Science Department was held in front of new hall on Bogyoke Aung San Street in Lanmadaw Township of Yangon Region this morning.

At the opening ceremony, Union Minister for Health Dr. Pe Thet Khin and Yangon Region Chief Minister U Myint Swe opened it.

Speaking on the occasion, the Union Minister said that the nursing training school was upgraded to University of Nursing in 1991. Now, the university admits 776 students, he said. The university is conducting

Nursing Science (Normal), Nursing Science (Bridge), Diploma in Special Nursing and Master's course of Nursing Science. The institution is turning out qualified nurses by annually admitting the increased number of students, he noted.

The State has built a new lecture hall that can admit 250 students as it is necessary to extend more lecture halls due to admitting the increasing number of students, he said.

The construction of 250-student-capacity lecture hall of the university built at a cost of K230.615 million by the government started in November 2011 and it was completed in May 2012.

## Afghan police kill 40 militants, detain 28 in 24 hours

KABUL, 14 July—Afghan security forces during series of operations across the country have killed 40 anti-government militants and arrested 28 over the past 24 hours, Interior Ministry said in a statement released here on Saturday.

“During series of operations conducted in Bamyan, Baghlan, Kandahar, Zabul, Logar, Ghazni, Paktiya, Herat and Helmand provinces over the past 24 hours, 40 armed militants have been killed and 28 others arrested by Afghan National Police,” the statement added.

However, it did not say if there were any police casualties. Taliban militants fighting the government have yet to comment.

JOHANNESBURG, 14 July—The BASIC countries on Friday called for developed countries to honor their commitment in reducing carbon emission at the two-day 11th Ministerial meeting on Climate Change in Johannesburg.

The joint statement by the four BASIC countries before the end of the conference challenged developed countries to honor what was agreed on at the conference on Climate Change in South African port city of Durban in 2009 and assist financially in the implementation of reduction

## Ravaged by fires, Western ranchers face “scary” summer

SALMON, 14 July—It took less than an hour last month for a Montana wildfire to reduce Scott McRae’s ranch to thousands of blackened acres devoid of the grasses that were to sustain hundreds of cattle.

“That is 500 mouths to feed with nothing to eat in sight,” said McRae, 53, co-owner of a family ranch founded in the 1880s in southeastern Montana.

McRae is among scores of ranchers across the US West whose grazing lands have been charred by blazes or ravaged by drought amid a regional shortfall of the alfalfa hay that could stave off starvation.

With drought affecting more than half the continental United States and less than a quarter of the nation’s pasture and range rated good to excellent, cattle producers from Montana to Nevada are bracing for a rough season.

While some ranchers like McRae use private lands for grazing, many others pay modest fees to graze herds on acreage managed by the US Bureau of Land Management and the US Forest Service under decades-old laws governing grazing on the West’s vast federal lands.

But recent wildfires in states such as Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Utah and Wyoming have displaced thousands of cows from federal rangelands which may not be fit for grazing for years. Where range has not been destroyed, drought has lessened forage.

“We’re going to run out of grass. It’s shaping up to be scary,” University of Idaho Extension Agent Rauhn Panting said.

The dire situation in the West follows an historic drought in the ranching state of Texas last year that devastated herds and cost the state’s agriculture \$7.6 billion, according to Texas A&M university. The size of the Texas cattle herd fell 11 percent in the last year as ranchers had to sell cattle or move them to other states, the US Agriculture Department said.

While some areas of Texas have improved after receiving rain, the dryness has also spread north to the nation’s breadbasket and threatens the worst drought since 1988 in the US corn and soybean growing belt this summer, according to weather experts.

## Chavez: Venezuela is no threat, Obama is a “good guy”

CARACAS, 14 July—President Hugo Chavez denied on Friday that Venezuela was a threat to anyone, after US presidential

hopeful Mitt Romney criticized Barack Obama for playing down the risk posed by the socialist leader.

Obama told a Spanish-language television station in an interview screened this week that Chavez’s actions over recent years had not had a serious impact on the national security of the United States.

Romney said Obama’s comments were “stunning and shocking” and showed a pattern of weakness in the Democratic president’s foreign policy.

In an interview with a

local Venezuelan television station on Friday, Chavez dismissed the allegations he posed any danger.

“The Venezuela of today is no threat to anyone,” he said.

“It has all been a hoax by the imperialists and global far right: that uranium is being enriched in Venezuela, that we’re resetting up missiles here, that we’re supporting terrorism.”

Whenever there were efforts to improve relations between Washington and Caracas, Chavez said, they were criticized by powerful “snipers” who issued threats in the US media.

Chavez, whose stridently anti-Washington politics are highly popular in his OPEC nation, has

expanded ties with Iran while the United States and other nations have increased their pressure on Teheran over its nuclear programme.

Iran denies Western charges it wants to build nuclear weapons. When Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad visited Caracas in January, he and Chavez lavished praise on each other, mocked US disapproval and joked about having an atomic bomb.

Late last year Obama told a Venezuelan newspaper the United States had no intention of intervening in Venezuela’s foreign relations — but he believed the government’s ties with Iran and Cuba had not benefited the Venezuelan people.

WUHAN, 14 July—A chlorine gas leak occurred in a bio-tech firm in central China’s metropolis of Wuhan on Saturday morning. No information on casualties are immediately available. The municipal fire department has dispatched more than 30 firefighters to

the Wuhan Xingwang Bio-Tech Co Ltd.

The department said the leakage might have been triggered after the company’s chemical stock was soaked by rainwater after heavy downpour battered the city on Friday.

## Afghan lawmaker among 22 killed as suicide blast hits N Afghanistan

AIBAK, 14 July— At least 22 people, including an Afghan parliament member and a head of provincial intelligence agency, were killed and 60 others were injured in a suicide bombing in the northern Afghan province of Samangan on Saturday morning, an official said.

Parliamentarian Ahamd Khan Samangani was killed in the attack which took place at around 8 am local time (0330 GMT) in Qasri-e-Almsas wedding hall in the provincial capital of Aibak city, police spokesman in northern region Lal Mohammad Ahmadzai told Xinhua.

Some provincial officials including the provincial intelligence head were among the dead when a costly wedding party on the upswing for Samangani’s son came under the massive attack, a Province official said.

Security personnel have cordoned off the area in precautionary measures, while ambulances and civilian cars evacuated the victims to the city’s hospitals, the Province spokesman told Xinhua. Police spokesman Ahmadzai said police has started an investigation and details will be released afterwards.—Xinhua

**Symantec anti-virus update makes some PCs inoperable**

BOSTON, 14 July—A bug in an update of Symantec Corp’s anti-virus software caused some Windows PCs to crash late this week, making machines inoperable until they were serviced in an embarrassing episode that angered some customers. The company disclosed the problem on its website, saying that an update to its widely used Symantec Endpoint Protection 12.1 and Norton anti-virus software for businesses caused some PCs running Microsoft Windows XP software to crash repeatedly, showing what is known as the “blue screen of death.”

The embarrassment comes at a challenging time for Symantec, whose shares have lost about a quarter of their value since it warned of a pending profit decline three months ago. “Enterprise security has continued to be an uphill battle for Symantec,” said Daniel Ives, an analyst with FBR Capital Markets. “There is increasing competition. The company historically has not been consistent around executing.” The company knows so far of about 300 corporate customers that have been affected, and about 60 consumer customers.

Customers reported it

took Symantec hours to identify and fix the bug and that they needed to fix computers broken by the tainted update on their own. Symantec blamed the glitch on software compatibility issues that arose after an update was released late on Wednesday. PCs could be fixed if customers manually removed the software from each disabled computer, it said in an advisory. “Phoning Symantec support this morning was the start of the hell we went through,” one customer said in a support forum on Symantec’s website. “The support is a joke, the quality control is a joke, and the software is not much better.”

Customers complained on a Symantec user forum that the removal process was time consuming, although one said the software maker had offered compensation for the inconvenience. That customer said on the support site that he emailed technical support to ask: “How is Symantec going to compensate customers for the hours of lost worker production and the time and effort taken by IT staffs to rectify this huge error by Symantec?”

**HP’s \$600 million GM services deal at risk**

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 July — General Motors’ decision to bring much of its information technology work in-house threatens an IT service deal worth some \$600 million a year to Hewlett Packard Co, two sources with knowledge of the matter told Reuters. It is unclear how much of the HP agreement would be affected. But the GM contract is one of the bigger contracts at the IT company, one of the sources said, adding that the loss of a significant amount of that business would be a “big deal.” The sources spoke on condition of anonymity because the details of the arrangement are private.

HP and GM both declined to comment. The Detroit carmaker is a major client of HP, which has provided technology services and support to GM for a quarter-century. GM said this week it now plans to handle most of its own IT needs internally, completing the transition within three to five years by hiring thousands of software developers and replacing its outsourced work. HP revealed in July 2010 that it had bagged a multi-year, \$2 billion services agreement with the carmaker, which outsources some 90 percent of its IT needs.

The world’s No 1 PC maker now manages GM’s technology infrastructure including providing applications development and managing services for product development, manufacturing, business services, and supply chain. GM’s automotive division alone accounts for \$350 million annually in IT services business for HP, the source said, adding that HP also sells a lot of its products and other related services to GM.

The \$600 million figure does not include that portion of HP’s work with the company.

The automaker also outsources technology-related work in its OnStar division, a contract that is separate from the IT services deal the two hashed out, and one that GM may find difficult to unravel, the second source said. OnStar is GM’s in-car navigation and communications system. HP has been staving off slowing demand for personal computers by moving aggressively into helping corporations manage hardware, software, and networking and storage. But in these areas it has to cope with stiffening competition from the likes of Dell Inc and IBM.—Reuters

**Research murky on danger of Asian carp invasion**

HAVANA, 14 July—As scientists aboard a research boat activate an electric current, the calm Illinois River transforms into a roiling, silvery mass. Asian carp by the dozen hurtle from the water as if shot from a gun, soaring in graceful arcs before plunging beneath the surface with splashes resembling tiny geysers. Water quality specialist Thad Cook grunts as a whopper belts him in the gut. His colleagues duck and dodge to avoid the missile-like fish that plop onto the deck, writhing madly until someone can grasp the slimy, slithering critters and heave them over the side.

It’s like a scene from a Hitchcock movie — and indeed the flying carp have played villainous roles in many a YouTube video. Biologists, however, fear a different kind of horror story may be taking shape underwater: a war for survival between the aggressive Asian carp newcomers and native species important to people who catch fish for a

living or fun. “We suspect at some point there will be a real crash in the populations of some of these native fishes,” said John Chick, an aquatic ecologist with the National Great Rivers Research and Education Centre on the Mississippi River near St Louis.

While years of study have turned up ominous signs that the carp are capable of crowding out other species and changing ecosystems, the worst-case scenario scientists expect to unfold hasn’t yet been realized. Some scientists say that dire predictions about the damage carp can do may be premature. That makes the research Chick and his colleagues are conducting critical: It likely will influence how the debate over managing waterways made vulnerable by carp plays out in Congress and the courts.

US research so far has focused on rivers, where Asian carp are most plentiful. A common method for determining which fish are in

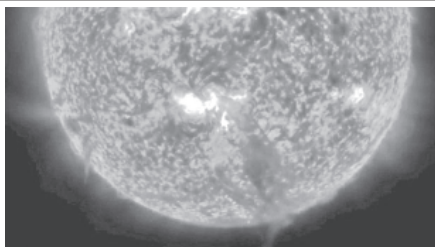
a given location is to shoot an electric charge into the water that temporarily stuns them so crews can scoop them up in nets. Silver carp, an Asian type known for springing from the water when startled, manage to jump first.

Imported decades ago to cleanse algae-choked



aquaculture ponds and sewage treatment lagoons, they escaped during floods and have marched up the Mississippi watershed in more than two dozen states, ranging as far as Kansas and the Dakotas. They’re taking

**Solar storm barreling toward Earth this weekend**

LOS ANGELES, 14 July—The space weather forecast for Earth looks a bit stormy this weekend, but scientists said not to worry. A solar storm was due to arrive on Saturday morning and last through Sunday, slamming into Earth’s magnetic field. Scientists said it will be a minor event and they have notified power grid operators, airlines and other potentially affected parties. “This isn’t the mother of all anything,” said forecaster Joe Kunches at the government’s Space Weather Prediction Center in Boulder, Colo. “We don’t see any ill effects to any systems.”

The storm began on Thursday when the sun unleashed a massive flare that hurled a cloud of highly charged particles racing toward Earth at 3 million mph. It was the sixth time this year that such a powerful solar outburst has occurred; none of the previous storms caused major problems. In severe cases, solar storms can cause power blackouts, damage satellites and disrupt GPS signals and high-frequency radio communications. Airlines are sometimes forced to reroute flights to avoid the extra radiation around the north and south poles brought on by solar storms. In 1989, a strong solar storm knocked out the power grid in Quebec, causing 6 million people to lose electricity. Juha-Pekka Luntama, a space weather expert at the European Space Agency, said utility and navigation operators “will certainly see something but they will probably find ways to deal with any problems” from the incoming storm.—Internet

**Could Wii nunchuks make screen time healthier?**

NEW YORK, 14 July — Active video games might help people burn more calories than couch-based screen time, but those who play active games tend to undo most of the difference if there's junk food available, says a new study. Those active gamers tended to eat more calories than they spent dancing, playing hockey, and drumming. They took in an average of 376 more calories than they burned, compared to about a 650-calorie surplus among the inactive groups.

Although small, these differences can mean a lot in terms of energy balance when they are multiplied over days, weeks and years, Dr Scott Leatherdale at the University of Waterloo in Canada who has studied the effects of video games on energy use but was not involved in the study, told Reuters Health in an email. "There have been a couple of studies that have shown that TV watching and video playing increase eating, and they increase eating when compared to doing nothing," said Dr Elizabeth Lyons, who led the study at the University of Texas Medical Branch.

For the new study, Lyons and her team assigned 120 experienced gamers aged 18 to 35, randomly, to watch TV,

or to play sedentary or active video games. They asked them not to eat for 2 hours before the mealtime-scheduled appointments, recorded their appetite level before each session began, and then observed them playing games or watching TV for an hour. Subjects could watch shows including 30 Rock and The Office, or play games such as Street Fighter IV to Dance Dance Revolution: Universe 2. Chocolate, chips, dried fruits and nuts and sodas were within easy reach.

There was reason to believe that people would eat less if they were playing active games, said Lyons, "because it's physically difficult to eat while you're holding things, and while you're busier." Yet when Lyons and her team looked at the difference between the groups, they found that while sedentary video gamers ate the most, averaging more than 747 calories during the hour long session, active gamers ate only slightly less, eating 553 calories on average. The findings, reported in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, surprised researchers.—Reuters

**Health Tip: Use caution before giving cough medicine to kids**

Most anyone can buy cough medicine at the local drug store, but that doesn't mean it's harmless, especially to youngsters.

The American Academy of Family Physicians offers this advice when giving cough medicine to children:

- \* Never give cough medicine to a child younger than age 4 unless the pediatrician approves it.
- \* Never give a child a cough medicine for adults, or any medication that contains aspirin.
- \* Don't give your child both a prescription and OTC medication at the same time, or multiple OTC cough medicines unless the pediatrician says it's OK.
- \* Don't give your child cough medicine that has expired.
- \* If your child doesn't get better quickly, see the pediatrician before continuing an OTC medication.
- \* Never give your child a cough medicine just to help the child sleep.

**Google's Nexus tablet selling fast across retail chains**

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 July — Google Inc's "Nexus 7" tablet is off to an encouraging start, with major retailers running out of the gadgets as the Internet company's first entry in an increasingly crowded market showed up in US stores on Friday. GameStop said on Friday it had already run through its first two allocations of the tablet, co-developed by Google and Taiwan's Asustek that starts at \$199 and has drawn glowing reviews from major gadget reviewers. Sam's Club, the warehouse chain owned by Wal-Mart Stores Inc, and Staples listed the device as being out of stock on their websites as of Friday. Office Depot's website continued to offer the device for sale as of the afternoon. Google unveiled the 7-inch tablet, which the company hopes will allow it to better compete against Apple Inc and Amazon.com Inc and funnel more people into its trove of online content, at its annual developer conference in San Francisco

at the end of June. Consumers have been able to pre-order the tablet from Google and several retailers in past weeks, and Google said it began shipping devices to consumers on Friday. "We blew through the first two allotments," a GameStop spokesperson said. A third allotment of preorders will be available in August. The game retailer declined to share exact number of preorders.

The Nexus 7 uses Google's Android mobile software, which has become the most prevalent operating system for smartphones globally, but has so far failed to make a big splash in the tablet market. By taking a greater role in the tablet arena, Google hopes to ensure that its online services remain front-and-centre to consumers, as tablets by Apple and Amazon are increasingly becoming gateways to the Web and Web-based content such as movies and music.

**Early diagnosis, treatment of stroke patients could still be improved**

VANCOUVER, 14 July — A new Canadian study has found that although the number of stroke deaths is declining in the country, early diagnosis and treatment of stroke patients could still be improved. The study, released on Thursday by the Canadian Institute for Health Information, examined more than 62,000 stroke cases that occurred in the Province of Ontario between 2006-2007 and 2009-2010.

It found that despite best practice recommendations, more than one in three Ontario stroke patients did not arrive at the hospital by ambulance. Quick diagnosis and treatment are critical in stroke care, because in some cases there is a short window to limit or reduce brain damage for patients, the study said. However, a national audit conducted by the Canadian Stroke Network showed that only about one-third of patients with stroke across Canada arrived at the hospital within 3.5 hours of the onset of their symptoms.

There is room for improvement in the ability of the population to recognize and respond most appropriately to the first symptoms of stroke, the study suggested. Warning signs and symptoms of stroke include weakness, such as sudden loss of strength or sudden numbness in the face, arm or leg, trouble speaking, vision problems, headache and dizziness, it said.

**Nokia shuts down two China-based offices as troubles persist**

NEW YORK, 14 July — Being a struggling company means layoffs and office closures, and Nokia is sadly no exception. The *Wall Street Journal* reports that Nokia is shutting down two of its regional sales offices in China as part of broader reorganization efforts aimed

at keeping the company afloat while it scrambles to regain market share lost to the iPhone and Android devices. *WSJ* says that Nokia didn't immediately disclose how many workers would be let go as a result of its reorganization efforts in China.— *Internet*



**Visa, MasterCard, banks in \$7.25 billion retail settlement**

NEW YORK, 14 July — Visa Inc, MasterCard Inc and banks that issue their credit cards have agreed to a \$7.25 billion settlement with US retailers in a lawsuit over the fixing of credit and debit card fees in what could be the largest antitrust settlement in US history. The settlement, if approved by a judge, would resolve dozens of lawsuits filed by retailers in 2005. The card companies and banks would also allow stores to start charging customers extra for using certain credit cards in an effort to steer them toward cheaper forms of payment. The settlement papers were filed on Friday in Brooklyn federal court.

Swipe fees — charges to cover processing credit and debit payments — are set by the card companies and deducted from the transaction by the banks that issue the cards, essentially passing on the cost to merchants, the lawsuits said. The proposed settlement involves a payment to a class of stores of \$6 billion from Visa, MasterCard and more than a dozen of the country's largest banks who issue the companies' cards. The card companies have also agreed to reduce swipe fees by the equivalent of 10 basis points for eight months for a total consideration to stores valued at about \$1.2 billion, according to lawyers for the plaintiffs.

The deal calls for merchants to be allowed to negotiate collectively over the swipe fees, also known as interchange fees. Merchants would also be required to disclose information about card fees to customers, and credit card surcharges would be subject to a cap, according to the settlement papers. Surcharges would not affect the 10 states that currently prohibit that practice, which include California, New York and Texas. An additional \$525 million will be paid to stores suing individually, according to the documents.

democratic reforms process that are being undertaken in Myanmar.

Myanmar regained her independence in 1948 and today, at this very moment, we have reached a turning point in our history. Our country is resided by over 60 million of population with over 100 ethnic nationalities with their own languages and cultures. Geographically, we are situated between two major nations—China and India. In addition, Myanmar is located at a strategic location in Southeast Asia Region with abundant untapped natural resources, however, our country has lagged behind in development compared to other countries in the world.

Today, after nearly half a century, Myanmar has embarked on democratic path in building a new nation through peaceful transition. Myanmar is at a crucial juncture, where she has evolved from the military administration putting an end to armed conflict to achieve sustainable peace and moving toward a new democratic era while endeavouring for the development of the country.

The Government has already anticipated to encounter many difficulties and obstacles in building a new democratic society and a new nation for our people. As such, we are still facing numerous challenges. When the new government started to assume state responsibilities, many have looked upon us with suspicion and uncertainties. But with the passage of time and because of our transparency and genuine goodwill efforts, we have started to enjoy the support of many nations.

At the same time, there are still others who wish to observe our situation and maintain pressure on our country. But there are also many nations that understand our true situation and actual difficulties and challenges that our government is encountering.

With the establishment of a new government in Myanmar, the people of Myanmar wish to see true changes in the country. The government is striving to fulfill the wishes of our people. Therefore, the government has been simultaneously implementing the three reform measures.

The first reform measure is to walk out from a centralized system that the country had practiced for half a century and eventually build a mature democratic State. Democratic practice has been vanished from our country for many years and building a democratic State will be the biggest challenge for our people and our country. To be able to build a strong democratic foundation, there will be a need to take necessary reform measures in Executive, Legislative and Judiciary bodies. At the same time we are also taking necessary measures to review or revoke existing laws that no longer attend to our new system and this new era. Furthermore, we must also reform the bureaucratic system and the mindset of the government officials.

As you are well aware of the fact that we have also met with Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, the leader of the National League for Democracy (NLD) and have invited her to hold discussions openly so that we could set aside our differences and worked together based on common grounds. Today, she is a parliamentarian and she is at the Hluttaw. At the same time, we were able to engage also with leaders of ethnic nationalities,

political parties, entrepreneurs, civil society and foreign and domestic intelligentsia and those from all walks of life.

With the aim of achieving national reconsolidation, we have granted amnesty to many prisoners. We have also taken necessary measures to relax regulations on media and telecommunications so that our people may have better access and enjoy the facilities openly. We have also invited our expatriates to return to their homeland. We have eased our printing and censorship procedures on a step-by-step basis. We have already committed ourselves to enact a Media Law for media freedom and transparency in the near future.

We have also permitted the formation of political parties, civil societies in accord with the existing laws. We have already enacted necessary laws that would protect the fundamental rights of our citizens such as formation of labour union and to enjoy freedom of assembly and freedom of speech.

The second reform measure that we are undertaking is to achieve a long lasting peace in the country. It has been over 60 years that the conflicts have emerged in our country since Myanmar's independence. And last year, we launched a new mode of operandi and coordination through a new dialogue enabling to sign ceasefire agreements with the ten ethnic armed groups. With the intention of achieving peace, we have made necessary engagement with the KIO/KIA group from Kachin State as well.

The third reform measure that we are undertaking is to transform the centralized economy into a market-oriented economy. As part of micro-economy exertion we are implementing rural areas development and poverty alleviation. We have also enacted Micro-finance Act. We have sought necessary assistance from domestic and foreign intelligentsia and experts from international organizations for sustainable micro-economic policy. We have also adopted the managed float exchange rate system in our country.

While implementing these three reform measures in

parallel we face numerous challenges like the recent situation in Rakhine State which we were able to successfully calm down and bring to normalcy.

It is regrettable that we do not receive any assistance from international monetary institutions and organizations such as World Bank, IMF, ADB and UNDP in our democratic nation building endeavours due to sanctions imposed on Myanmar. And to best serve the interest of our people and our country, we have the fervent desire to seek technical know-how and to set up economic engagement with other countries but the challenge is that sanctions are still restricting us from doing so.

Myanmar is inviting foreign investors to invest in our country. In this context, the Myanmar Investment Commission has also laid down the four principles with regard to foreign investments—namely (a) to protect the interest of Myanmar citizens; (b) to protect the dignity of the State; (c) to protect national sovereignty; and (d) to allow environmental friendly investment. We are preparing to enact Myanmar Foreign Investment Law that will be of international standard. In doing so we are also seeking the advice from international experts. With the enactment of Myanmar Foreign Investment Law, we are hoping to attract more investments that will both serve the interest of our nation and investors.

## With ego too big to fail, Iowa broker admits 20-year fraud

CEDAR RAPIDS, 14 July—Russell Wasendorf Sr, arrested on Friday, confessed to a 20-year fraud at his now-bankrupt Iowa brokerage, saying business troubles and his “big” ego left him no choice: “So I cheated.” In the dramatic conclusion to a week-long saga that has shaken trader confidence in the trillion-dollar US futures markets, authorities released parts of a detailed statement in which one of the industry’s best-known veterans explained how he used little more than a rented PO Box, Photoshop and inkjet printers to dupe regulators in a more than \$100 million scheme.

FBI agents arrested Wasendorf, 64, at the Iowa City hospital where he has been since trying to commit suicide on Monday. He was charged with making false

statements to regulators, but prosecutors said they would seek more charges. He faces “decades in prison”, Assistant US Attorney Peter Deegan said.

In the signed statement, left along with a suicide note and released as part of the criminal complaint, Wasendorf said he began forging bank documents after the business he built from his basement risked failing without additional capital. The timeline suggests his deceit lasted almost the entire life of his brokerage. “I was forced into a difficult decision: Should I go out of business or cheat?” he wrote.

“I guess my ego was too big to admit failure. So I cheated,” the note said. It was discovered on Monday in his car outside the company’s new Iowa headquarters, where Wasendorf had tried to kill

himself by funneling in tailpipe exhaust. The arrest ends much of the mystery that has enveloped the futures industry this week. But it will not ease the pain of betrayal in the small Iowa town that Wasendorf made his corporate home in 2009, nor the anger of a financial industry still smarting from the failure of rival brokerage MF Global. “I have committed fraud,” Wasendorf wrote in the note, the contents of which

he later told authorities were true. “I feel constant and intense guilt.”

Yet he also wrote in almost boastful detail about the “blunt authority” that allowed him to control the flow of documents into the company; how he used a simple post office box to trick “unquestioning” regulators; and his skill in turning out forged bank statements within hours that “no one suspected.”

## US investigates whether JPMorgan traders hid losses

NEW YORK, 14 July—US federal investigators are looking at whether JPMorgan Chase & Co traders hid trading losses that have since grown to \$5.8 billion, according to a person familiar with the matter, after the bank said its own probe found reason for suspicion.

JPMorgan, the largest US bank, said it believes it will lose at most another \$1.7 billion from the bad credit trades. Problems at the group that made the bets, the Chief Investment Office, have been fixed, said Chief Executive Jamie Dimon. CIO traders had

its strong performance in areas such as mortgage lending.

The trading losses may be mostly over, but with the disclosure that traders may have lied about their losses, regulatory and legal consequences will linger for some time. Blame for the problems at the CIO office may go further up the management chain to some of the most senior executives at the firm, lawyers said.

The source said that federal criminal investigators are looking at people at JPMorgan in London, where the CIO’s risky bets

## Cuba, India seek expanded cooperation in energy, telecom, tourism

HAVANA, 14 July—India has expressed interest in expanding cooperation with Cuba in the sectors of energy, telecommunications and tourism, media reports said here on Friday.

Indian Commerce and Industry Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia said during his ongoing visit here that his country was also interested in working together with Cuba in the

areas of pharmaceuticals, petrochemicals, sugar, agriculture, agrochemicals, mining and services, according to Cuba’s official daily *Granma*.

Scindia, head of a visiting Indian business delegation, said India has extensive experience in developing information and communications technologies, and is keen to cooperate with Cuba in that area.

India had launched a global push to promote tourism over the past years, Scindia said. The industry is “very important, not only as a source of foreign revenue, but also for employment,” he said.

Scindia arrived in Havana on Tuesday, where he met with several top government officials and business leaders, including Cuba’s First Deputy Foreign

Trade and Investment Minister Orlando Hernandez.

On Thursday, Scindia inaugurated a bilateral business forum which was attended by 25 Indian entrepreneurs led by Inderdeep Singh, president of the Indian Confederation of Industries.

During his meeting with Scindia, Hernandez said Cuba had prepared an offer of seven joint venture projects with Asian entrepreneurs in the fields of renewable energy, oil, paper, chemicals and tourism. —Internet

## 5.3-magnitude quake hits New Zealand North Island

WELLINGTON, 14 July—An earthquake measuring 5.3 struck New Zealand North Island’s Bay of Plenty early on Saturday morning, and there were no reports of damage.

The quake hit at 2 am (14:00 GMT Friday) and was centred 30 km east of Murupara at a depth of 60 km, according to New Zealand government geological

agency’s GeoNet Data Center.

It was felt across central-eastern areas of the North Island.

A small earthquake, measuring 4.2 magnitude, also rattled North Island’s eastern cape, some 20 km north-west of Gisborne on Saturday morning, at a depth of 30 km.

## Russian state commission approves new ISS crew

MOSCOW, 14 July—A Russia state commission on Friday approved three new crew members for the *International Space Station (ISS)* ahead of their Sunday takeoff.

The crew, comprising Russian cosmonaut Yuri Malenchenko, NASA astronaut Sunita Williams and Japanese astronaut Akihito Hoshide, is scheduled to lift with the *Soyuz* spacecraft from Baikonur Space Centre in Kazakhstan on Sunday morning, Russia’s Federal Space Agency Roscosmos said. The State Commission meeting also approved a backup team that consists of Russian cosmonaut Roman Romanenko, NASA astronaut Thomas Marshburn and Canadian astronaut Chris Hadfield, local media reported.

Russia’s Gagarin Cosmonaut Training Centre said previously that the new crew members have passed all exams at the training centre.

Vitaly Lopota, president of Russia’s Rocket and Space Corporation Energia, told local media the company was ready for the launch. “All systems are in order, there are no problems with the equipment. We are ready for the launch,” *Interfax* news agency quoted Lopota as saying.

Energia, the largest company of Russian space industry, is a lead developer of the *Soyuz* and *Progress* spacecraft and is in charge of all operations involving manned space flight. The *Soyuz* carrier rocket is scheduled to blast off from Baikonur at 6:40 Moscow time (0240 GMT) on 15 July, according to Roscosmos.

After the capsule’s docking with the orbital station on 17 July, the trio will join the current ISS crew, which includes Russian cosmonauts Gennady Padalka and Sergei Revin and NASA astronaut Joe Acaba, who have been in orbit since mid-May. —Xinhua

## Families of Concordia dead come to shipwreck site

GIGLIO, 14 July—Relatives of the 32 people killed in the *Costa Concordia* shipwreck have sailed to the Italian island where the cruise ship struck a reef six months ago to remember their loved ones.

The *Concordia* capsized near Giglio, an island off the

Tuscan coast, on 13 Jan. On Friday, many family members came to Giglio for a memorial that was to begin at 9:42 pm, the time when the collision occurred.

Among them was Elio Vincenzi, an Italian whose wife is one of two victims whose bodies were never

found. Vincenzi said “human stupidity” took his wife from him. He was apparently referring to the *Concordia* captain who allegedly caused the wreck by steering the ship too close to the reef and then abandoning it while passengers were still aboard.

## Colorado says dentist put thousands at HIV risk from reused syringes

DENVER, 14 July—A suspended Colorado dentist reused syringes and needles in his now-shuttered practice, potentially exposing thousands of patients to HIV and hepatitis infection, health officials warned on Friday. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment sent letters to 8,000 patients of dentist Stephen Stein, urging them to seek tests for the diseases after learning of “unsafe injection practices” at two Denver-area clinics he owned between September 1999 and June 2011. Investigators found that Stein reused needles and syringes in several patients’ intravenous lines at his oral surgery and dental implant clinics, in violation of standard medical protocol, the department said in a statement.

“This practice has been shown to transmit infections,” the statement said. It added that there had been no confirmed cases of anyone contracting the viral infections through Stein’s clinics.

In the letters sent to Stein’s former patients, the health department urged them to be tested for HIV, hepatitis B and hepatitis C, said Jan Stapleman, a department spokeswoman. Stein’s records were incomplete, so it is likely more people were possibly exposed than those already identified, she said. A hot line established for Stein’s patients to call was “very busy” all day on Friday, Stapleman said. —Reuters

LE CASTELLET, 14 July—A French official says a private plane has caught fire and crashed on landing at Le Castellet airport in southern France, killing the three Americans on board.

Paul Mourier, prefect of the Var region where Le Castellet is located, said two men, aged 60 and 24, and a 30-year-old woman died in the

Friday afternoon crash of the Gulfstream F4 from Nice. The victims, all burned, weren't identified. Some 60 firefighters doused the flaming aircraft, which lost a wing on its landing approach. Five divers searched a nearby swamp to ensure there were no other victims. An investigation into the cause of the crash on a windless day has been opened. —Internet

## 240,000 ordered to evacuate in Japan deluge

TOKYO, 14 July—Almost a quarter of a million people were ordered to leave their homes in southwest Japan on Saturday as heavy rain pounded the area for the third day, with 20 already dead, officials and reports said.

The Japan Meteorological Agency warned of more landslides and floods on the main southern island of Kyushu as rainfall of up to 11 centimetres (4.3 inches) per hour was recorded on early Saturday.

Evacuation orders had been issued to about 240,000 people in the north of Kyushu where more rivers burst their banks, public broadcaster NHK and Jiji Press news agency reported, compiling figures from various authorities.

They were told to go to designated shelters such as

schools and other public facilities, while more people were advised to leave their homes.

Television footage showed torrents of muddy, debris-strewn water and flooded houses following what officials described as "unprecedented" downpours from a weather front on Thursday.

Along the Yamakuni river in Oita prefecture, water was seen reaching the roof of a riverside drive-in restaurant.

More than 75 centimetres of rain fell in 72 hours in the inland city of Aso, the meteorological agency said.

The death toll remained at 20 overnight and seven missing, with 19 of the fatalities from landslides and house collapses in and near Aso.

## Survivors: Avalanche hit with no warning, no sound

CHAMONIX, 14 July—Climbers who survived the massive avalanche in the French Alps that killed nine of their colleagues said on Friday they were tossed around by a wave of snow that hit without a sound. Local officials, meanwhile, insisted it would have been impossible to foresee Thursday's deadly avalanche.

One survivor, Danish climber Thomas Dybro, 30, told *The Associated Press* that he was deeply shaken by what happened and wouldn't be returning anytime soon to Mont Blanc.

"All of a sudden big pieces of ice fell down right next to us. ... And then a split second after that it all came down and hit us and blew us

away," he recalled. "I feel like I've been hit by a truck and did ten rounds (of boxing)."

Three Britons, three Germans, two Spaniards and a Swiss climber were killed and 14 people were injured in the avalanche on one of the most popular routes to the summit of Mont Blanc, western Europe's highest peak at 15,782 feet (4,810 meters).

Daniel Rossetto, a 63-year-old mountain guide, said the avalanche hit silently as he led two Danish climbers up the mountain, tossing them around like a washing machine. Luckily they were on the edge of the massive slide and all three survived.

"Big chunks of snow fell onto us so we were swept. We all fell together. And that's it. It's quick but it's always too long," he told AP. "It's a lot of impact. It's a 40-degree slope, and we fell about 200 to 250 metres (650 to 820 feet)."

Early summer storms had left behind heavy snow but the weather had cleared enough in the past several days to encourage many guided and independent teams of climbers to set out. The avalanche on the north face of Mont Maudit hit two hours after 28 climbers had left a high-altitude climbing hut.

Britain's ambassador to France, Sir Peter Ricketts, said the climbers "were doing nothing imprudent" and there were "no indications of an avalanche" ahead of time.

The area where the wind-slab avalanche occurred typically sees between four and 10 accidents per day this time of year, but rarely something so serious, said Jean-Louis Verdier, the deputy mayor of Chamonix and a mountain guide himself. On busy days, up to 80 people a day can be on that route.

## Hospitals struggle to save victims of Nigeria oil fire

LAGOS, 14 July—Medical workers on Friday struggled to save the survivors of a massive petrol fire in southern Nigeria, as the death toll, previously put at roughly 100, rose by at least four. Relatives of those who were engulfed in flames while scooping fuel from an overturned tanker flocked to area hospitals and found family members who were hardly recognisable.

Sade Orisola said she received a call to say that her brother was among those burned on early Thursday in the inferno on a major highway in Rivers state.

"When I got to the hospital I met a different person wrapped under a huge bandage," she told AFP as she sobbed outside the Federal Medical Centre in Yenagoa, capital of neighbouring Bayelsa state. "Can that be my

brother?" is what I asked."

Rivers officials said more than 100 people were killed and 50 others injured in the fire. The severely burned survivors were rushed to several hospitals and medical workers were struggling to assess the full loss of life.

"What I can tell you is that we are still losing people," Rivers information commissioner Ibim Semenitari said. "In one of the hospitals where we had 13 wounded, four people have died," she added. More fatalities were feared at two other hospitals and the state plans to release a final toll on Monday, Semenitari explained.

Medical workers at the hospital in Yenagoa who requested anonymity said they were not equipped to care for victims with such high degree burns, a common problem in Nigeria, where

many hospitals lack the most basic facilities. The tragedy happened after the tanker swerved to avoid three oncoming vehicles in Rivers' Ahoada area, a key trading hub in the oil-rich Niger Delta region. Semenitari said that the toll could have been much higher had the fire occurred closer to the town of Ahoada, as even more people may have rushed to the scene to collect the fuel spilling out of the toppled truck. —Internet

## Tata chief keeps high hopes for Nano

MUMBAI, 14 July—The head of India's vehicle-to-steel conglomerate Tata Group says he still has high hopes for the Nano, billed as the world's cheapest car, despite a slow sales start.

"The fundamental economies of the Nano... will continue to establish itself in the Indian market with a wider sales and service network," Tata chairman Ratan Tata said in the firm's annual report released on Friday.

Ratan Tata's desire to create a safer, cheap vehicle for families travelling on scooters on India's dangerous roads inspired the creation of the four-door hatchback known as the "people's car".

"The potential market for such an affordable car is enormous throughout the developing world," said the 74-year-old Tata, one of India's most respected businessmen, who retires at

the end of the year.

During the last fiscal year, Nano sales rose 10.73 percent to 77,989 units from a year earlier. But the number is still a far cry from Tata's hopes, voiced at the car's unveiling in 2008, of eventually selling a million cars a year.

Tata started working on the snubbed car when he saw families riding scooters — "the father riding with his young kid standing in front of him, his wife seated behind him holding a baby" — and being told the death rate for two-wheel riders on India's busy roads was three times that of those in cars.

But after the car received global acclaim at its unveiling, the Nano was plagued with start-up problems. A land acquisition row forced Tata to abandon a nearly completed plant and build another, badly delaying production.

Tata has insisted the

concept of the low-cost Nano, whose base model sells for 154,540 rupees or \$2,800, is solid.

"The launches of similar small cars (in the Indian market) by others vindicate our belief that this segment was missing in the product line." —Internet

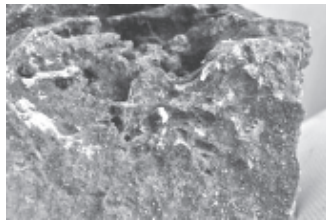
## S African scientists find most complete pre-human skeleton

South African scientists said on 12 July they had uncovered the most complete skeleton yet of an ancient relative of man, hidden in a rock excavated from an archaeological site three years ago.

The remains of a juvenile hominid skeleton, of the Australopithecus (southern ape) sediba species, constitute the "most complete early human ancestor skeleton ever discovered," according to University of Witwatersrand palaeontologist Lee Berger.

"We have discovered parts of a jaw and critical aspects of the body including what appear to be a complete femur (thigh bone), ribs, vertebrae and other important limb elements, some never before seen in such completeness in the human fossil record," said Berger, a lead professor in the finding.

The latest discovery of what is thought to be around two million years old, was made

in a one-metre (three-foot) wide rock that lay unnoticed for years in a laboratory until a technician noticed a tooth sticking out of the black stone last month.

## Third Friday the 13th of the year

A Delaware mathematician said 13 July's Friday the 13th is the third this year, which is the maximum number of times the date can occur in a single year.

Tom Fernsler, a mathematician at the University of Delaware, said 2012's three Friday the 13th, 13 Jan, 13 April and 13 July, are all exactly 13 weeks apart, the first time that has happened since 1984, *USA Today* reported on Friday.

Fernsler said 13 is historically seen as unlucky, as is Friday. He said Jesus was crucified on a Friday and Judas, the apostle who betrayed him, was the 13th guest at the Last Supper.

the Fox show, which has struggled notably against new NBC rival "The Voice."

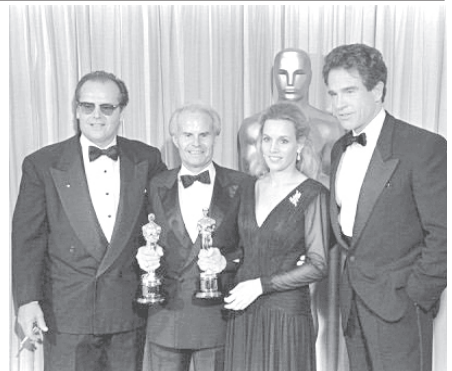

## Hollywood producer Richard Zanuck dies, aged 77

LOS ANGELES, 14 July—Oscar-winning US film producer Richard Zanuck, famous for films including "Jaws," "Driving Miss Daisy" and a string of Tim Burton movies, died on Friday aged 77, his publicist said.

The Hollywood veteran, son of Twentieth Century Fox mogul Darryl F. Zanuck, worked with Burton on films from 2001's "Planet of the Apes" remake to 2010's "Alice in Wonderland," as well as his latest film, "Dark Shadows."

He won an Oscar in 1990 for "Driving Miss Daisy," and another prize from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, the Irving G. Thalberg Memorial Award, the following year.

Zanuck died of a heart attack in Los Angeles, his publicist said in a statement.

Hollywood icon Steven Spielberg, director of 1975 classic "Jaws," once described Zanuck as "a director's producer," according to industry daily *Variety*.

"He always feels his job is to protect the director. Having run a studio for many years, he understood the corporate pressure put on filmmakers and yet he still turned out to be the filmmaker's best friend," Spielberg said.

The daily cited Burton as having praised Zanuck's "calming influence" while making 2005's "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory." "I've worked with a lot of people who like to create chaos so they can solve the chaos," he said.

"He's not one of those people. It's amazing that someone who's been through as much as he's been through remains as passionate and optimistic about the whole thing," he added.

Zanuck is survived by his wife Lili Fini Zanuck, sons Harrison and Dean and nine grandchildren, his publicist said.

## Chelsea top UEFA revenue list

**Blues earn almost 60m euros from winning the Champions League last season**

LONDON, 14 July — Chelsea made nearly €60m from winning UEFA Champions League campaign last season. The Premier League club finished top of UEFA's revenue list for teams competing in European competition in the 2011/2012 season. Chelsea, who beat Bayern Munich to win the competition on a dramatic penalty shoot-out, received €59.935m from the European competition organizer.

This sum consisted of €29.9m for participation, match and performance bonuses, and €30.035m from the television market pool. Bayern received the second biggest share, earning €41.730m for finishing as runners-up. Chelsea's revenue from their participation in Europe was

an increase of €15m more than they received in the 2010/11 season when they reached the quarter-finals. Premier League clubs occupied three of the top eight places in the revenue list, with Manchester United earning €35.182m despite going out in the group stages.

Arsenal earned €28.221m, while Manchester City made €26.525m — an increase in over €20m from the previous season when they played in the UEFA Europa League. UEFA distributed €754.1m in prize money to the 32 teams who figured from the group stage onwards, which consisted of €413m in fixed amounts plus €341.1m from the market pool. Every club received a minimum of €7.2m, comprising a participation bonus of €3.9m

and €3.3m from the six €550,000 match bonuses given per group game. Clubs that took part in the UEFA Champions League qualifying rounds also received solidarity payments. The gap between the money received for participation in the two European competitions is illustrated by Atletico Madrid receiving €10.518m for winning the Europa League. UEFA distributed €150.36m to the 48 clubs that played in the Europa League and the eight teams that joined the knockout stages from the UEFA Champions League.

## Wickmayer ousts error-prone Bartoli

STANFORD, 14 July — Yanina Wickmayer pounced on nine double-faults from Marion Bartoli to knock the French second seed out of the quarter-finals of the WTA hardcourt tournament in Stanford. Belgium's Wickmayer, seeded fifth, ousted Bartoli 6-3, 6-2 to advance to a semi-final clash with American Coco Vandeweghe. Vandeweghe reached the first WTA-level semi-final of her career with a 6-4, 6-4 victory over Poland's Urszula Radwanska. Top seed and defending champion Serena Williams, playing the week after capturing her fifth Wimbledon title, was due on court later against South African Chanelle Scheepers.

Waiting for the winner of that contest will be Sorana Cirstea after the Romanian roared back to upset Slovak third seed Dominika Cibulkova 6-7 (5/7), 6-2, 6-0. Cirstea coped with a bevy of incorrect line calls, but won six Hawk-eye challenges confirmed by the electronic line calling system. "After that many, I didn't trust anyone anymore," she said. "I felt like someone was playing a joke on me. There were too many mistakes, I've never

experienced this."

hope of striking an agreement.

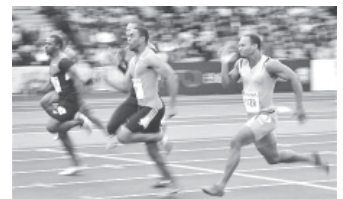

## Gay warms up with chilly 100 victory

LONDON, 14 July — Tyson Gay got a taste of the tough conditions the world's best sprinters may face at the Olympics next month while winning the 100 meters in 10.03 seconds at the London Diamond League meeting on Friday. The American's planned showdown with former world record holder Asafa Powell failed to materialize when the Jamaican decided not to risk aggravating a groin injury. With the rain lashing the track during the evening and the temperature plummeting to almost winter levels, it began to look a sensible move with the Olympic 100 meters heats only three weeks and a day away.

So Gay, whose 9.69 seconds personal best makes him the second-fastest man ever over the distance behind Usain Bolt had to content himself with beating a field still packed with American and Jamaican sub-10 second talent and gaining some more experience of racing in a London "summer" in his heat Gay was sluggish out of the blocks and had to work hard to force his way into second place in a blanket finish, his 10.15 the same as heat winner Michael Frater of Jamaica. It was a similar story in the final as Frater made the early running.

Gay was a little clumsy out of the blocks again but smoother into his pickup. He had to work hard on his concentration running in the shadow of giant compatriot Ryan Bailey, who will also run in the Olympic 100 along with US trials winner and 2004 Olympic champion Justin Gatlin. Gay, easy to spot in his bright orange vest, maintained his form well though and forced his way through to record a satisfying victory into a 1.3 meters headwind ahead of Bailey (10.09) and Jamaican Nesta Carter (10.13), who just edged Frater. — Reuters

## Isner, Harrison advance to ATP Newport semis

NEWPORT, 14 July — Defending champion John Isner hammered 12 aces to defeat Izak van der Merwe 6-4, 7-6 (7/2) and reach the semi-finals of the ATP Tour's Hall of Fame Tennis Championships. Top seeded Isner will square off against fellow American Ryan Harrison who was leading 6-4, 3-0 in his quarter-final when Benjamin Becker, of Germany, retired with an injury. "He mixed up the serve and volleys more than I anticipated. I thought he was going to do it every time, so that threw me off a little bit," said Isner, after his Friday win.

"When good servers meet on a court like that, it's not necessarily going to be so pretty. It was the sort of match I expected. I'm sure I could have played better, and more aggressive, but all in all I'm very happy with the result." The 26-year-old Isner is seeking to reach his third final of the year and defend a title for the first time in his career. He finished runner up earlier this year to Roger Federer at Indian Wells. Isner, who beat Belgian Olivier Rochus in last year's final,

won 85 percent of his first-serve points against the South African qualifier on the grass courts.

German Becker retired from his match after 57 minutes with a left hamstring injury. "It was unfortunate that he had to retire," Harrison said. "You never want to have anything bad like that happen to another guy. 'I felt I was playing and serving well and was in a good position there. I hope he has a speedy recovery.'" Isner and Harrison have met once before with Isner taking the first-round contest in Memphis two years ago. Harrison is chasing his first ATP Tour title.

**PSG negotiating with Ibrahimovic but still no agreement, says Leonardo**

PARIS, 14 June — Leonardo has met Zlatan Ibrahimovic's agent Mino Raiola, as the two parties attempt to thrash out a deal that will give the green light to the French side's 65m euros double swoop for the AC Milan striker and his teammate Thiago Silva. According to Sky Sport 24, the Brazil defender has already agreed terms with the Parisians and all that remains for the move to go ahead is for the forward to do the same.

However, the PSG sporting director brushed off claims that Ibrahimovic was already in Paris today for his medical, telling the channel: "We're dealing with him, I am neither optimistic nor pessimistic, we will continue to go forward in search of a

deal." He continued to explain, "We are not currently there yet. When will Ibra arrive in Paris? When we close the deal."

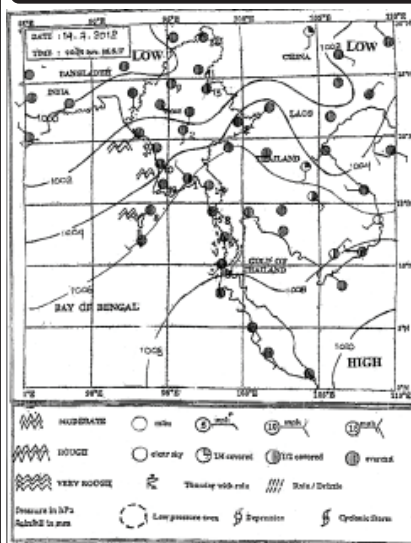
Raiola met Leonardo for a duration of four hours on Friday afternoon at the Parc des Princes to resume negotiations that started between the pair the night before, and both sides are reportedly confident that an agreement is close to being reached.

Ibrahimovic is claimed to be holding out for 14m euros per year, while PSG initially offered him 9m euros. Nonetheless, a three-year contract worth 12m euros per year should be enough for the 30-year-old Swede.

Meanwhile, Milan is said to be already lining up replacements for Ibrahimovic and Thiago Silva, and have been linked with moves for Manchester City striker Edin Dzeko and Schalke's young centre-back Kyriakos Papadopoulos.
