NAY PYI TAW, 20 July—Union Minister at the President Office Nay Pyi Taw Council Chairman U Thein Nyunt met members of field survey and implementation team for rural development and poverty alleviation in villages in Nay Pyi Taw Council Area at General Administration Department of Zabuthiri Township here this morning.

Speaking on the occasion, the Union minister said that eight teams of such kind would be established to make field surveys for the third time. The teams are constituted with personnel of the GAD, and graduates in health care, livestock, agriculture and engineering who will carry out relevant tasks. Extra bus fare for front rooms of buses not allowed

YANGON, 20 July—In a meeting with media person, an official of Yangon Region All Private Bus-line Control Committee disclosed that the committee does not allow the buses to separate bus fares for driver room and rare of the bus.

“Some passengers who took seats in the driver room gave bus fare with extra charge for their comforts. However, a complaint was submitted to the committee due to the fact that the bus driver asked K 1000 per seat from the passenger in the driver room of the Hilux bus that ran its route leading to Thanlyin. So, the committee does not limit the bus fare for the buses. All the fares are the same,” he explained.

The extra bus fares are mostly collected on the Hilux bus lines. In addition, some city buses collect extra bus fare.

“Before office hours, the buses carry packed passengers on boards. Due to offer of driver, I came up from the door of the driver room and took a plastic chair beside him. In the rare, I must pay K 100 as bus fare. But, I could take a seat at K 200 per seat in the driver room comfortably. At a time when special buses cannot give such service, K 200 per seat in the driver room is not bad,”

WASHINGTON, 20 July—Senator John McCain publicly supported a senior Obama administration official in denouncing concerns by a group of House Republicans that her family may have connections to the Muslim Brotherhood, which they fear may be trying to gain access to high levels of the US government.

Former Republican presidential candidate

Michele Bachmann and four other lawmakers in the House of Representatives asked the State Department's inspector general's office last month to investigate the possibility that Huma Abedin, a top aide to Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, had family ties to the Islamist political group.

Their 13 June letter asserted that the State Department had recently taken action "enormously

favorable" to the Muslim Brotherhood and that its interests could pose a security risk for the United States.

The letter cited a security study by an outside group alleging that three members of Abedin's family, including her father who died two decades ago, and her mother and brother were linked to operatives or organizations of the Muslim Brotherhood.

"Her position affords her routine access to the secretary and policymaking," the letter said.

A State Department spokesman said Clinton "very much values" Abedin's "wise counsel and support" and called the allegations preposterous.

McCain, the 2008 Republican presidential nominee, took to the Senate floor and called the assertion an "unwarranted and

unfounded attack on an honorable woman" and public servant whose family had never been shown in any way to "harm or threaten" the United States.

Bachmann said in a statement on Wednesday that the letter to the State Department and similar correspondence to inspectors general at the Pentagon, Homeland Security and Justice departments are "unfortunately being distorted."

"The intention of the letters was to outline the serious national security concerns I had and ask for answers to questions regarding the Muslim Brotherhood and other radical groups access to top Obama administration officials," Bachmann said.

She said she would continue to speak out on the issue. —Reuters

Roadside bomb kills five Afghan police

TRINKOT, 20 July—Five police were killed as a roadside bomb struck a police van in Uruzgan province 370 km south of capital Kabul, spokesman for provincial administration Abdullah Humat said on Friday.

"A mine planted by militants on a road in Sarab district struck a police vehicle late Thursday night as a result five policemen including the police chief of Sarab district were martyred," Humat told Xinhua.

He also blamed Taleban militants for planting the mine, saying Taleban insurgents by organizing roadside bombs and other subversive activities want to intimidate both locals and government employees. However, Taleban militants fighting the government are yet to make comment. —Xinhua

Panetta orders Pentagon to monitor media for information leaks

WASHINGTON, 20 July—Defence Secretary Leon Panetta ordered senior Pentagon officials on Thursday to begin monitoring major US news media for disclosures of classified information in an effort to stop the release of government secrets after a series of high-profile leaks.

The announcement came hours after Panetta and other senior defence officials appeared before a closed-door hearing of the House of Representatives Armed Services Committee to discuss recent disclosures of classified security information.

Reports about US cyber warfare against Iran, procedures for targeting militants with drones and a double agent who penetrated a militant group in Yemen have angered US lawmakers. Some have charged the leaks were timed to benefit President Barack Obama's re-election bid.

Representative Buck McKeon, the Republican chairman of the House panel, told a news conference later

that he did not believe the Pentagon was behind the leaks and that Panetta and the other officials were taking the issue seriously.

"Both the chairman and I were very convinced that Secretary Panetta and all of the folks at the Pentagon are taking it seriously, are trying to mitigate the damages and

prevent it in the future," said Adam Smith, the top Democrat on the panel.

Panetta, Army General Martin Dempsey, the top uniformed military officer, and chief Pentagon lawyer Jeh Johnson appeared before the committee to answer questions. McKeon said they

agreed the recent leaks had caused damage, but did not elaborate.

In addition to the media monitoring ordered by Panetta, the Pentagon said it had taken a number of other steps in recent months to improve information security.

The measures included improved training for handling classified information, the publication of a manual with clear instructions on what constitutes an unauthorized disclosure and the creation of an online security incident reporting system.

"The department is continuously improving its security posture and overall capability to prevent unauthorized disclosures," the Pentagon said in a statement disclosing the recent security changes.

McKeon said the House panel was "concerned about the leaks that have come out over the years and accelerated, it seems, over the last few months."

Although he said he did not believe the Pentagon was the source of the most recent

leaks, McKeon declined to comment on speculation the White House was responsible.

Senator John McCain, Obama's Republican opponent in the 2008 presidential election, has suggested some of the leaks may have been calculated to boost the Democratic president's re-election efforts - a charge the White House emphatically denies.

Pentagon Press Secretary George Little told a briefing on Thursday that Panetta, Dempsey and members of the House committee were of one mind about the leaks.

"The unauthorized disclosure of classified information is truly disturbing," he said. "It's of concern to the secretary, and I think members on the Hill express similar concern. And the secretary is clearly prepared to try to address the problem inside the department."

McKeon said the US government was "actually doing pretty good" in handling its secrets, given the fact that 4 million people had some form of classified clearance. (Additional reporting by Phil Stewart; Editing by Peter Cooney) —Reuters

US says Iran ships using foreign flags to evade sanctions

WASHINGTON, 20 July—The United States warned the maritime industry on Thursday that Iranian ships were still using other country's flags in an attempt to evade Western sanctions against the country.

Sierra Leone is the latest country to revoke its flag for

a vessel controlled by the Islamic Republic of Iran Shipping Lines (IRISL), which is on the US blacklist for its involvement in Iran's weapons programme.

The United States and the European Union have implemented tough sanctions against Iran in an attempt to stop the country from acquiring nuclear weapons.

The US penalties forced Iran's major trading partners to reduce their Iranian crude imports.

The EU enacted a ban from 1 July on insuring ships carrying Iranian oil that has also crimped Teheran's oil exports.

The United States said port authorities had to be on the look out for fabricated vessel registration and phony flags.

Bulgarian bus bomber's video released

BEIJING, 20 July—Bulgarian officials say a lanky, long-haired man with a fake Michigan driver's license carried out the deadly suicide attack on a bus full of Israeli holidaymakers.

Bulgarian television aired security camera footage on Thursday showing the suspected bomber wandering in and out of the terminal shortly before the blast.

He was dressed as a tourist, and carried a large

backpack with wheels, as well as a smaller bag. Bulgaria's foreign minister said the suspect had been in the country for 4 to 7 days and was about 35 years old.

Officials are using DNA samples to establish his identity. Prime Minister Boiko Borisov told reporters that a Michigan driver's license was retrieved, but he said US officials responded "there was no such person in their database."

US Navy helicopter crashes in Oman, fate of crew unknown

WASHINGTON, 20 July—A US Navy helicopter crashed in Oman on Thursday and the fate of its five crew members was unknown, the US military said, even as it ruled out hostile activity. The helicopter, a MH-53E Sea Dragon, manufactured by United Technologies Corp's Sikorsky Aircraft unit, crashed 58 miles southwest of Muscat while flying a heavy load in support of the Omani government.

"The crash was not due to any sort of hostile activity and the status of the five crew members is still being determined," said the statement from US Naval Forces Cent—Reuters

Fibre broadband deal with BT 'puts Wales in fast lane'

LONDON, 20 July — An agreement to provide almost all homes and businesses with quicker broadband speeds will put Wales in the "fast lane". First Minister Carwyn Jones has said. The Welsh government has signed a deal with BT to upgrade the network for 96% of properties by 2015. It hailed the £425m deal as the biggest of its kind in the UK and a boost for the economy. Mr Jones said: "Today is the day that Wales moved into the fast lane." It will mean broadband speeds for Wales around 15 times faster than those available now.

According to a report out this week by the regulator Ofcom, Wales has the lowest

level of super fast broadband in the UK, with 34%. Most of the improvement will be in towns and cities where the density of the population means the private sector can provide the infrastructure at a profit. Coverage in Scotland is 42% and in Northern Ireland, where there has already been a big push, it is 96%. The £425m next generation broadband scheme for Wales, about half of which will be paid for by the public sector, will lay fibre optic cables across tens of thousands of miles.

The announcement on Thursday, made at the first minister's end-of-term news conference, follows an 18-month procurement process.

The Welsh government asked the industry what plans businesses had to invest in the network. Officials say 52% of Wales would not have benefited from next generation broadband without government intervention.

BT was the only company left in the process after the last of the others pulled out earlier this year.

But Mr Jones insisted the deal was good value for the taxpayer, with every £1 of Welsh government investment matched by £6 from other sources.—INTERNET

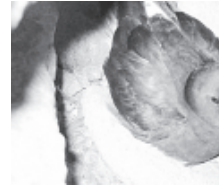
Storm petrel seabirds can smell their relatives

LONDON, 20 July — Seabirds are able to pick out their relatives from smell alone, according to scientists. In a "recognition test", European storm petrels chose to avoid the scent of a relative in favour of approaching the smell of an unrelated bird. The researchers think this

behaviour prevents the birds from "accidentally inbreeding". The study is the first evidence that birds are able to sniff out a suitable mate. It is published in the journal *Animal Behaviour*.

Lead researcher Francesco Bonadonna, from the Centre of Functional and Evolutionary Ecology in Montpellier, France, told BBC Nature that the birds used smell to recognise and communicate their "genetic compatibility". Sniffing out a genetically suitable mate is a well-known phenomenon in mammals. But until recently, scientists thought that birds relied on vision and sound when choosing a partner. According to Dr Bonadonna, the fact that they use odours explains how these birds manage to return to their family colony to breed and avoid mating with a relative.

European storm petrels remain in the colony they are



born in throughout their life, so this site is also home to several of their family members. "These birds are [also] theoretically faithful to one mate for life," the researcher explained to BBC Nature. "So a bad choice may have catastrophic consequences." He said that smell or "chemical communication" was "the most ancient and simplest form of communication" in the animal kingdom, adding, "it makes sense that the birds would use it". —INTERNET

Hacker claims to have accessed 50,000 accounts from Wall Street IT recruiting firm

NEW YORK, 20 July — An Internet hacker belonging to a group called TeamGhostShell broke into recruiting website ITWallStreet.com, Computer World reported.

The information compromised, which includes full names, mailing addresses, email addresses, usernames, hashed passwords and phone numbers, was posted online on Thursday, and thousands of hashed passwords have reportedly already been decrypted.

The leaked data also includes details such as salary and bonus expectations of the potential employees and even feedback on specific candidates.

Another file contained email conversations and thousands of phone call records between recruiters and potential candidates.

The hacker behind the breach, known only as Masakaki, suggested the attack was meant as a sign of support for the Occupy Wall Street movement.

Andiamo Partners, the New York-based recruiting firm that operates the website, did not confirm or deny the breach.—INTERNET

Russia starts building Moon spaceship, eyes Lunar base

MOSCOW, 20 July — Russia has started building a spacecraft for manned Lunar missions with the first test scheduled in 2015, the project developer said on Thursday. "The work has already started. The unmanned tests are scheduled in 2015, the first manned mission is planned in 2018," head of the Central Research Institute of Machine Building Gennady Raikunov told local media. These spaceships are designed to land on and lift off from the Moon, work as space tug boats and service modules for other space vehicles, Raikunov said.

"(Russian federal space agency) Roscosmos has planned the creation of a new manned transportation system to conduct manned flights to the Moon, servicing the vehicles in space," he said. Raikunov linked the Lunar program to the fate of Russian segment of the International Space Station (ISS). Whether Russia will continue the ISS work after 2020 depends on the progress of the Lunar program. "It is necessary to determine the main direction of manned cosmonautics development. Current strategy envisages focusing on the manned flights to the Moon, including the creation of a base on its surface," he said.—Xinhua

Google launch SMS version of Gmail in Africa

NEW YORK, 20 July — Google has launched a text message-based version of its email service targeted at users in Africa. Gmail SMS can run on so-called "dumb phones" which only have very basic features and no access to the Internet. The service has so far been made available in Ghana, Nigeria and Kenya. Gmail SMS is the latest in a line of Google products aimed at the African market — the company is also running educational programmes in the region.

The search giant describes its efforts in improving computer science training as "an important goal for Google in 2012". It recently offered grants to 17 universities to expand its Computer Science for High School project. However lack of access to affordable hardware is still seen as a critical barrier to technology adoption across the continent.

Geva Rechav, Google's product manager for emerging markets, explained in a blog post how Gmail SMS was adapted to work by using

simple text commands. "Gmail SMS works on any phone, even the most basic ones which only support voice and SMS," he wrote. "Gmail SMS automatically forwards your emails as SMS text messages to your phone and you can respond by replying directly to the SMS. "You can control the emails received by replying with commands such as MORE, PAUSE and RESUME."

"Additionally, compose a new email as an SMS and send to any email address recipient—who will find your

message in the right email conversation thread!" It will be free to receive messages from the system, but any sent texts will be subject to standard network rates. Across Africa, adoption of mobile services has been swift and widespread. Mobile commerce offerings like microfinancing tool M-Pesa have in excess of 15 million users.—INTERNET

Apple's latest iPad makes low-key debut in China

SHANGHAI, 20 July — Apple Inc staged a low-key launch of its latest iPad in China on Friday, free of the chaotic scenes that plagued the tech darling's previous product debuts in its most promising growth market. The calm, orderly queues in Shanghai and Beijing came as a surprise to many Apple fans in China, who are used to standing overnight in snaking queues with scalpers to get their hands on the latest product. "I'm very surprised that there is no line. I thought there was going to be a long line so I came over a bit earlier to

pick it up," said an IT worker, Sun Xufei, who was the first in line of a small queue of around 20 people waiting outside the Shanghai Lujiazui Apple store.

The launch of the latest iPad, which features a sharper display and better camera than previous versions of the wildly popular tablet, comes weeks after Apple paid \$60 million to settle a trademark lawsuit over the iPad name. Apple adopted an online reservation system that allowed it to control the flow of people to its stores and avoid a repeat of

the riotous iPhone 4S launch in January, when one of its flagship stores in Beijing was pelted with eggs by scalpers who had turned rowdy.

"This method is much better because everyone's time is precious," said a 33-year-old entrepreneur who only give his last name and Zhong. Apple has two retail stores in Beijing, three in Shanghai, one in Hong Kong and a network of authorized resellers. Chinese government officials said the company is looking to open two more in the major cities of Chengdu and Shenzhen.—Reuters

Microsoft makes its first ever loss

WASHINGTON, 20 July — The computing giant Microsoft has made its first-ever quarterly loss after it wrote off some of the value of its online advertising business. The loss came after it wrote down the value of Aquantive by \$6.2bn (£3.94bn, 5bn euros), which failed to bring the profits expected by Microsoft. That led to a \$492m loss in the three months to the end of June, compared with a profit of \$5.9bn a year ago.

The company has not made a loss since it joined the stock market in 1986. It took over Aquantive in 2007 but it struggled to compete with rival

Google. Microsoft paid \$6.3bn for Aquantive. Microsoft is doing well in other areas, despite the decline in popularity of its Windows operating system, which dominated the personal computer market for years. Revenue for the three months to June rose by 4% to \$18.06bn.

Excluding the adjustment for the asset write-down, and the holding back of some income related to the launch of its Windows 8 system, Microsoft profits beat those expected by investors. Shares were up 1.6% after the results were announced. Microsoft says the update of the Windows systems is the most

important redesign in more than 10 years.

Windows 8, which will launch in October, will feature a new look that will present applications in a mosaic of tiles. Importantly, it will also enable the operating system to work on tablet computers, which

along with smartphones are the fastest-growing sector of the computing market. Microsoft is also planning to release its own tablet, the Surface. Earlier this week, Microsoft previewed its next version of the Office system, which is expected to be released next year.—INTERNET

Shares steady, oil ease; euro dips on Spain worries

HONG KONG, 20 July — Asian shares eased on Friday but were poised for their biggest weekly gain since January, as strong US corporate earnings lifted the S&P 500 to a 2-1/2 month high while Spain's fiscal woes kept the euro under pressure. Oil prices eased after hitting an eight-week high overnight as Middle East tension stoked supply concerns, while a rally in soft commodities has seen corn

and soybean prices soar to record highs due to a worsening US farm-belt drought.

The euro fell against the dollar and hovered near a record low versus the Australian dollar on Friday, undermined by worries about Spain's fiscal woes and recent falls in shorter-term euro zone interest rates. The MSCI Asia Pacific ex-Japan index MIAPI0000PUS was little changed by midday.

It is up 2.4 percent so far this week. "We've had a reasonably good week for equities and there's something of a shift in terms of what people are looking at," said Christian Keilland, head of trading at BTIG in Hong Kong. "There's obviously some rotation into the tech sector and everyone's looking at the agriculture space to see how that may affect things." There was evidence suggesting some investors were selling into strength with regional funds seeing net outflows of \$63.3 million compared with the prior week's inflows, according to Citigroup. Cyclical markets such as Korea and Taiwan led the outflows, Citigroup said.

Japan's Nikkei N225 fell more than a percent with pharma and electrical equipment makers the biggest drags as worries about US economic growth soured sentiment. Shrinking factory

activity in the US mid-Atlantic region and more evidence of sluggish job growth has kept investors in export-reliant Japan wary about the impact of soft US data on corporate earnings. Financials were also under pressure with Mitsubishi UFJ (8306.T) down 3.2 percent after shares of Morgan Stanley (MS.N), in which the Japanese bank owns a stake, tumbled as it reported a drop in revenues.

Banks remained under pressure in South Korea in the wake of a domestic rate-fixing probe that follows investigations into the suspected manipulation of the Libor international benchmark in other major economies.

A group of banks being investigated in an interest rate rigging scandal are looking to pursue a group settlement with regulators rather than face a Barclays-style backlash by going it alone, people familiar with the banks' thinking said.

Renault-Samsung Motors in the southern port of Busan will produce an annual 80,000 units of Nissan's crossover Rogue, beginning in 2014, Renault-Nissan said in a statement.

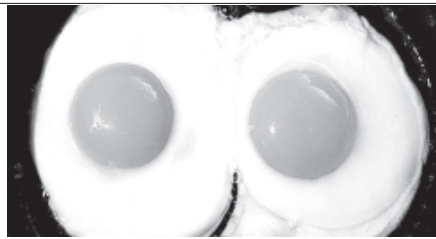
"Adding production in Korea shows a commitment across the alliance to helping Renault-Samsung Motors achieve its targets for cost competitiveness and growth," said Renault-Nissan Alliance chairman and CEO Carlos Ghosn.

The new investment plan comes at a time when Renault-Samsung has been suffering from plunging sales. In the first six months to June this year it sold 83,062 units, down 33 percent from a year earlier.

The only option for patients is to completely avoid foods containing egg. A study on 55 children showed some were able to eat egg after minuscule amounts were gradually added to their diets. However, the treatment is still experimental and doctors say it should not be tried at home. Egg allergies are one of the most common allergies and are thought to affect up to 2.5% of children.

Gradually introducing the food which causes an allergic reaction has been successful in other foods such as such as peanuts. Parents were given powdered egg to mix into their

Google reports sales and profits jump

LONDON, 20 July — Internet giant Google has reported a jump in sales and profits for the three months to the end of June in its first results statement since taking over Motorola Mobility Holdings (MMH). Net income for the quarter was \$2.79bn (£1.77bn), up 11% compared to \$2.51bn a year earlier.

Google said revenue rose 35% to \$12.21bn for the period after a \$1.25bn boost following the acquisition of MMH. Revenue at its core internet business rose 21%. Shares in Google rose about 3% in after-hours trading following the results.

As well as generating money through advertising based on searches, Google also makes the popular Android mobile phone operating system. During the period, the company also launched its Nexus 7 tablet computer. The company's chief executive, Larry Page, said the Nexus had received "rave reviews." —INTERNET

children's food, building up to about a third of an egg every day. The findings, presented in the New England Journal of Medicine, report that after 22 months of egg therapy, 75% of the children were able to eat the equivalent of two eggs without reacting. The children were tested again after at least a month of no longer having the daily egg treatment. Of these, 28% could still eat egg without reacting and were considered allergy-free.

One of the researchers Dr Wesley Burks, from the University of North Carolina School of Medicine, said: "This study gives us hope that we're closer to developing a treatment." Almost a third of the children had a permanent change and were no longer egg-allergic." Dr Stacie Jones, from University of Arkansas, said: "Reducing these kids' allergic response to egg also lessened parental anxiety over how their children might react if accidentally exposed to egg at school or at someone else's house." However, about 15% of children did not finish the treatment, mostly due to allergic reactions.

Lindsey McManus, from the charity Allergy UK, said: "This is a very exciting development into immunotherapy for food allergy. "Similar to recent trials being carried out into immunotherapy for peanut allergy at Addenbrookes hospital, the results are very promising. "It is however very early days and more research will be needed before this is used as a regular form of treatment. We would echo the warning in the report that this should never be tried at home due to the risk of serious allergic reactions." —INTERNET

China reprimands Russia for alleged attack on Chinese fishing boats

BEIJING, 20 July — China's Vice Foreign Minister Cheng Guoping on Thursday expressed strong dissatisfaction with Russia over an alleged attack on a Chinese fishing vessel, which has left a fisherman missing.

China is very dissatisfied with Russia's actions to detain the Chinese fishing boat and crew after opening fire on the boat, Cheng said in a statement when summoning a Russian diplomat.

China demands Russia to thoroughly investigate the incident and inform China of the results in a timely manner, Cheng said. Russia should make sure that the detained sailors are safe, their legitimate rights are guaranteed and they are granted with humanitarian treatment, Cheng said.

Earlier media reports said Russia also detained another Chinese fishing boat one day before the attack which occurred on Monday.

Cheng also demanded

Russia to release the boats and let the fishermen go quickly and make all-out efforts to search for the missing sailor.

The Russian diplomat said Russia is investigating the incident, and will notify China as early as possible. He said he will report China's stance back to Russia.

According to the Chinese Consulate in Vladivostok, Russia's Far-East region, two Chinese fishing ships from China's eastern Shandong province were seized by Russia—one on Sunday and the other, on Monday. One ship carried 19 fishermen while the other had 17 on board. One ship was detained at the port of Nakhodka, while the other was heading there.

The local coastal service notified the consulate on Tuesday that the two ships were detained because they entered Russia's exclusive economic zone. According to the RIA Novosti news agency,

a Russian coast guard vessel, the Dzerzhinsky, fired warning shots and then opened targeted fire to stop a Chinese fishing ship that had been fishing for squid.—Xinhua

NASA completes another Orion parachute test

HOUSTON, 20 July — NASA completed another successful test on Wednesday of the Orion crew vehicle's parachutes high above the Arizona desert in preparation for the spacecraft's orbital flight test in 2014. Orion will carry astronauts deeper into space than ever before, provide emergency abort capability, sustain the crew during space travel and ensure a safe re-entry and landing.

A C-17 plane dropped a test version of Orion from an altitude of 25,000 feet above the US Army Yuma Proving Ground in southwestern Arizona. This test was the second to use an Orion craft that mimics the full size and shape of the spacecraft.

Orion's drogue chutes were deployed between 15,000 feet and 20,000 feet, followed by the pilot parachutes, which deployed the main landing parachutes. Orion descended about 25 feet per second, well below its maximum designed touchdown speed, when it landed on the desert floor.

"Across the country,

NASA and industry are moving forward on the most advanced spacecraft ever designed, conducting drop and splashdown tests, preparing ground systems, designing software and computers and paving the way for the future of exploration," said William Gerstenmaier, associate administrator for the Human Exploration and Operations Mission Directorate at NASA

Orion parachutes have so-called reefing lines, which when cut by a pyrotechnic device, allow the parachute to open gradually, managing the initial amount of drag and force on the parachute.

The main objective of the latest drop test was to determine how the entire system would respond if one of the reefing lines was cut prematurely, causing the three main parachutes to inflate too

quickly. Since 2007, the Orion programme has conducted a vigorous parachute air and ground test program and provided the chutes for NASA's successful pad abort test in 2010. All of the tests build an understanding of the chutes' technical performance

for eventual human-rated certification. In 2014, an uncrewed Orion spacecraft will launch from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida on Exploration Flight Test-1. The spacecraft will travel 3,600 miles above Earth's surface.

This is 15 times farther than the International Space Station's orbit and farther than any spacecraft designed to carry humans has gone in more than 40 years. The main flight objective is to understand Orion's heat shield performance at speeds generated during a return from deep space.

In 2017, Orion will be launched by NASA's Space Launch System (SLS), a heavy-lift rocket that will provide an entirely new capability for human exploration beyond low Earth orbit.

Designed to be flexible for launching spacecraft for crew and cargo missions, SLS will enable new missions of exploration and expand human presence across the solar system.—Internet

Eight mn worldwide receiving HIV treatment

WASHINGTON, 20 July— Over eight million people worldwide had access to life-saving treatment in low- and middle-income countries last year, an increase of 1.4 million over 2010, the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) said in a report. The report—Together We Will End AIDS—said that despite the substantial numbers of people newly starting treatment, it is only just over half (54 percent) of the 14.8 million people eligible, Xinhua reported.

According to the report, some 34.2 million people are living with the AIDS virus globally, including 2.5 million who became infected last year. And 1.7 million died in 2011.

New infections and deaths dropped slightly last year.

The report also outlined the significant progress that has been made in reducing new HIV infections in children. Since 2009, new infections in children have fallen by an estimated 24 percent. Some 330,000 children were newly infected in 2011, almost half that at the peak of the epidemic in 2003 (570,000).

The report says domestic funding for HIV has exceeded international investments. Low- and middle-income countries invested \$8.6 billion for the response in 2011, an increase of 11 percent over 2010. International funding however remained flat at 2008

levels (\$8.2 billion).

The report points to a \$7.2 billion funding gap, which it says the world must address by 2015 to treat everyone in need and to offer effective prevention interventions more widely.

"This is an era of global solidarity and mutual accountability," said Michel Sidibe, executive director of UNAIDS.

"Countries most affected by the epidemic are taking ownership and demonstrating leadership in responding to HIV. However, it is not enough for international assistance to remain stable — it has to increase if we are to meet the 2015 goals."—Internet

FBI seeks public help to track AK-47 Bandit

LOS ANGELES, 20 July—The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and law enforcement officials spanning three separate regions in the western United States said they continue to seek public assistance relative to an unidentified armed bank robber now linked to three bank robberies, the most recent of which occurred in the Seattle area on 6 July.

Following the initial robbery that occurred in Chino, California, on February 29, the suspect shot a police officer with the Chino Police Department, seriously wounding him.

In each robbery, the suspect brandishes an AK-47—style assault rifle with a drum magazine.

The suspect is seen in bank surveillance video and photographs dressed in tactical gear over a dark-coloured, short-sleeved collared shirt and blue pants.

He also wears a black full-face ski mask, a blue ballistic vest, and/or a green mesh vest marked "Sheriff."

"The suspect is known to law enforcement as the AK-47 Bandit. A reward of up to \$20,000 is being offered in exchange for information leading to the arrest of the suspect known as the AK-47 Bandit," said the FBI in a statement.—Internet

Gunmen in Pakistan wound WHO workers, agency says

GENEVA, 20 July—Gunmen in Pakistan shot and wounded a staff member of the World Health Organization (WHO) and an expatriate consultant working for the United Nations health agency on Tuesday, the WHO said. The two men, who were working on a polio immunisation campaign, were in stable condition in hospital after their vehicle was fired on in Gadap Town, Karachi, it said.

The agency said its staff member was a Pakistani national, while police in Pakistan said the wounded consultant was Ghanaian. "One WHO staff member and one international consultant were injured, when their vehicle was shot at by armed men," the Geneva-based agency said in a statement.

"At this point, there is no evidence to suggest that this was a deliberate or targeted attack against polio eradication efforts or WHO. WHO is grateful to the Pakistani authorities for launching an investigation into this event," the WHO said.

On 16 June, a Pakistani militant group threatened action against anyone conducting polio vaccinations in the region where it is based, saying the health care drive was a cover for US spies. The group, based in North Waziristan and led by Hafiz Gul Bahadur, said it had banned vaccinations for as long as US drone aircraft continued to fire missiles in Pakistan.

The WHO and its partner agencies are working to wipe out the crippling disease, which remains endemic in just three countries—Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan.

Some 200,000 mainly Pakistan volunteers are deployed in

the vaccination campaign in the country, which some clerics have condemned. "This incident will not distract from the progress Pakistan is making this year, as the country is closer than ever to eradication," the WHO said.

The country has recorded just 22 cases of polio so far this year through 10 July, against 59 during the same period last year, WHO spokesman Oliver Rosenbauer said.

Pakistan is an increasingly dangerous environment for aid workers. In May, the International Committee of the Red Cross stopped most of its work in Pakistan following the murder of a staff doctor in Quetta, pending a risk assessment of its operations in the country.—Reuters

48 charged in US Medicaid fraud probe

NEW YORK, 20 July—Four dozen people were charged on Tuesday with cheating the government-run Medicaid health insurance plan for the poor out of millions of dollars through a scheme to resell expensive HIV medications and other drugs that programme recipients had received at heavy discounts.

Medicaid recipients, some of them AIDS patients, would fill their prescriptions at little or no cost monthly and sell the drugs for cash to aggregators, according to documents unsealed in Manhattan federal court.

The aggregators then altered the drug containers to make them appear new and sell the medicines through a national underground market to unsuspecting pharmacists, who would buy them at discounts, the court papers said. Some of the drugs illegally resold included HIV medications such as Gilead Sciences Inc and Bristol-Myers Squibb's Atripla, which Medicaid prices at \$1,635 per bottle. Other drugs included asthma medication and pain killers.

Charges were brought against 48 people across the United States. FBI spokesman Peter Donald said that 35 people were in custody, including 16 in the New York area, 13 in Florida and two in Pennsylvania. The charges included conspiracy to commit wire fraud, mail fraud and healthcare fraud, as well as conspiracy to commit money laundering and prescription drug fraud. The Manhattan US Attorney's office, which is prosecuting the case, said law enforcement authorities would hold a news conference on the charges later on Tuesday.—Reuters

Singapore Exchange to launch higher mainboard admission standards

SINGAPORE, 20 July—Singapore Exchange (SGX) announced Thursday its higher mainboard admission standards, aiming at ensuring its position as a competitive and relevant global exchange and attracting larger companies seeking to list here.

Effective from August 10th, companies intending to join SGX's mainboard must have a market capitalization at Initial Public Offerings (IPO) of not less than 150 million Singapore dollars (1 US dollar equals 1.25 Singapore dollars) if they are profitable in the last financial year and have an operating track record of at least three years.

Otherwise the com-

panies need to have a market capitalization at IPO of not less than 300 million Singapore dollars if they only have operating revenue in the latest completed financial year.

The bourse currently requires a minimum market capitalization of 80 million Singapore dollars based on the issue price for mainboard listings.

In addition, companies with minimum consolidated pre-tax profit of at least 30 million Singapore dollars for the latest financial year and has an operating track record of at least three years can also be listed on the mainboard.

The former regulations

required companies only a cumulative pre-tax profit of at least 7.5 million Singapore dollars over the last three years, or 10 millions over the latest one or two years.

The IPO shares issued must be at least 0.5 Singapore dollar each, up from 0.2 Singapore dollar in the past.

The SGX also announced their intention to increase the proportion of IPO tranches allocated to retail investors, particularly for listings which draw high retail subscription, aiming at encouraging more retail participation. They schedule to cover the consultation in 2012 and implement the measures in 2013.—Xinhua

Thai tourism industry grows 7.6 pct in first half 2012

BANGKOK, 20 July—The Thai tourism industry continued its strong performance in the first six months of 2012, with total arrivals of 10,496,789, up 7.60 percent over the same period of last year, the country's tourism authority said on Wednesday.

The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) said in a report that the most important contributor to the growth was arrivals from China which, for

the first time, crossed the one million arrivals mark in the six-month period to record a total of 1,124,234, up by a robust 28.87 percent over the same period in 2011.

China was followed by Malaysia, Russia and Japan. East Asia recorded 5,486,941 arrivals to Thailand, accounting for 52.27 percent of total arrivals. For 2012, TAT has set a "Conservative" target of 20.5 million total international visitors, which

will be exceeded if the international economic and geopolitical situation remains stable, it said.

Despite last year's flood crisis, Thailand's tourism business registered a record-high revenue of 734.59 billion baht, up 23.92 percent over 2010. The largest number of foreign tourists were from Malaysia, at 2.47 million, followed by China, 1.76 million.

Indonesia aims to boost rubber plantation productivity

JAKARTA, 20 July—The Indonesian government revitalized state-owned rubber plantations with a target to increase productivity by 44.5 percent to an annual average of 1,300 kilograms per hectare by 2015, local media quoting official reported here on Wednesday.

The revitalization programme would cover 350,000 hectares of plantation area and around 300,000 hectares of the area needed total rejuvenation, while the remaining area would require land intensification methods, said Rismansyah Danasa-putra, Agriculture Ministry perennial crop director.

To support the plan, the government set aside 5 trillion rupiah (some 530 million US dollars) funds, said Rismansyah.

"Within the next three years, we will provide fertilizers for 50,000 hectares and seeds for the rest," he was quoted by the Jakarta Post as saying.

Productivity is the main problem for local rubber

producers, as their annual rubber output per hectare is still far lower than other rubber producers in Southeast Asia, such as Thailand and Malaysia.

Thailand, for example, can produce more than 1,500 kilograms per hectare. About 95 percent of the country's rubber plantations in Indonesia, the world's second largest rubber producer, are located in Sumatra and

Kalimantan. Last year, the overall rubber plantation areas totaled 3.45 million hectares, with the majority being held by smallholders (85 percent), followed by private companies (8 percent) and state-owned enterprises (7 percent).

Rubber is one of the key contributors to Indonesia's overall exports. Last year, 2.6 million tons of rubber was exported, with a value of 12.43 billion US dollars.—Xinhua

Malaysia eyes mercantile exchange to provide more investment opportunities

KUALA LUMPUR, 20 July—Malaysian government is planning to set up a mercantile exchange to provide extra investment opportunities, local media reported on Thursday.

The country's Securities Commission is drawing up plan to introduce a mercantile exchange to facilitate investment in gold futures and other precious metals, as part of new initiatives for the capital market announced by the government.

There was strong interest among Malaysians to look at additional asset classes for investment purposes, Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak said while announcing the initiatives.

The Securities Commission would present a comprehensive proposal to the government after looking into the domestic landscape and experiences of similar markets around the world, he was quoted as saying by local media on Thursday.

Securities Commission Chairman Ranjit Singh Ajit Singh told reporters that a comprehensive proposal on the Mercantile Exchange implementation would be ready within a year.

He admitted that the new exchange might face fierce competition from mercantile exchanges which had already established in the region. "However, that doesn't mean that we don't embark on it. Domestic demand is very strong," he said.—Xinhua

Video games aid stroke patients in rehabilitation in Australia

SYDNEY, 20 July — Video games are an effective rehabilitation tool for stroke patients, an Australian neurophysiologist said on Thursday. Dr Penelope McNulty at Neuroscience Research Australia in Sydney leads a team that has developed a new stroke rehabilitation therapy which uses the Nintendo Wii to help their patients.

McNulty's team has found that an intensive two-week training program based on the Wii could result in significant improvements in the strengthening of muscles and nerves in patients' arms and hands, even for people that had a stroke many years ago. "It was previously thought that the movement

and function stroke patients had at the time they left hospital was the only recovery they would make," McNulty said in a statement.

"But we have worked with people who have had strokes one month to 21 years ago, and excitingly, they all improve," she added. McNulty said the Wii was fun and inexpensive to use. "This type of rehabilitation motivates participants to actually complete their therapy, which is essential for maximum recovery," she said. Neuroscience Research Australia is working on ways to make the therapy available across the country as there are over 60,000 strokes in the nation each year.

Defence guideline targets private investment

BEIJING, 20 July — Defence-related industries will open more to private investors in a "fair and safe manner", according to an investment guideline unveiled on Thursday.

Investors and State-owned defense technology enterprises will be treated equally across the board, including licensing and tax, said the guideline, jointly crafted by the State Administration of Science, Technology and Industry for National Defence and the General Armament Department of the People's Liberation Army.

The guideline, however, only applies to private investors on the mainland.

Investors are encouraged to get involved in weapon development and production, the restructuring of State-owned enterprises as well as developing technology for both military and civilian use.

A catalog detailing the

weapons private companies can develop and produce is being revised and will be released later.

The guideline aims to boost competition in military procurement and some projects will be submitted for open tender. The military budget for 2012 is 670 billion yuan (\$105 billion).

The defence industry is potentially lucrative for investors, especially during a period of modernization, insiders said.

Zhang Hanya, chairman of the Investment Association of China, said that private companies have already been involved in certain defense sectors, including the production of dynamite, clothing and machinery. But private companies face limitations, especially financial, compared with State-owned enterprise, he said.

"These limitations restrict the role of private companies in the defence

New tri-layered tablet to prevent heart attack, stroke among aged

LONDON, 20 July — A four-component polypill could bring substantial health benefits to people aged 50 and over, giving them an average of 11 years of life without a heart attack or stroke, a new British clinic trial showed. Queen Mary University of London on Thursday issued a statement saying its researchers invented a polypill — a tri-layered tablet — containing three blood pressure lowering medicines and a statin for lowering cholesterol. Blood cholesterol and blood pressure are main causes of heart attack and stroke.

It was given to people without a history of cardiovascular disease aged 50 or more. They experienced a 12 percent reduction in blood pressure and a 39 percent reduction in harmful cholesterol, according to the study published in the journal *PLoS One*. "The health implications of our results are large. If people took the polypill from age 50, an estimated 28 percent would benefit by avoiding or delaying a heart attack or stroke during their lifetime," said Dr David Wald, principle investigator of the trial at Queen Mary.

"On average, those who benefit would gain 11 years of life without a heart attack or stroke." The study was a randomized placebo-controlled trial, whose design could produce highly accurate and reliable results. The researchers are now calling for regulatory support to make the polypill available to the public, saying that even if only 50 percent of people aged 50 or more took the pill, about 94,000 heart attacks and strokes would be prevented each year in Britain. —Xinhua

Seven injured in 8-vehicle collision in western Japan

OSAKA, 20 July — At least seven people were injured Friday in an accident involving eight vehicles in Okayama Prefecture in western Japan. According to the country's public broadcaster Nippon Hoso Kyokai (NHK), the accident occurred at around 9 am local time on the Sanyo Expressway in Kasaoka City of the prefecture.

The broadcaster said a truck slammed into other seven vehicles that had stopped on the motorway due to traffic congestion and those injured were carried to hospitals. The motorway was temporarily closed after the crash but reopened by noon. The cause of the accident is under investigation. —Xinhua

Toward a cure for AIDS : Scientist set research agenda

CHICAGO, 20 July — A team of global scientists has devised a strategy to find a cure for AIDS, an effort inspired by the remarkable

story of a single US patient named Timothy Ray Brown who was cured from the disease.

Brown's treatment in Berlin involved the destruction of his immune system and a stem cell transplant from a donor with a rare genetic mutation that resists HIV infection.

The procedure is too costly and too difficult to replicate on a large scale. But in the years since his successful treatment in 2007, Brown's story has become a rallying point for scientists who believe the time is now right to seek a cure for AIDS.

NZ scientists raise alert on central North Island volcano

WELLINGTON, 20 July — New Zealand scientists have raised their alert status on a large volcano in the centre of the North Island after it was shaken by a series of small earthquakes. The government's GeoNet seismic monitoring agency on Friday raised its six-level volcanic alert around Mount Tongariro

from Level 0 to Level 1, meaning the volcano has gone from dormant to showing signs of volcanic unrest.

"Small volcanic earthquakes have been recorded beneath Mount Tongariro. The sequence started on 13 July, but soon declined, restarting on 18 July and increasing in number on 19 and 20 July," said a statement from GeoNet.

The earthquakes were small, below magnitude 2.5, and about 2 to 7 kilometres below Tongariro's craters.

GeoNet scientists were planning to deploy portable seismic recorders around the epicenters of the quakes, and take samples of selected hot springs, crater lakes and fumaroles in the area, in order to better understand the significance of the quakes.

"Our historic seismic data has shown that these small volcanic earthquakes are common at Tongariro, but usually only occur at an average rate of two per year. We have recorded more than 20 since 13 July," said the statement.

Seismic activity indicating unrest was last detected at Tongariro in 2001.

"Our routine volcano monitoring also includes the chemistry of the lakes, springs and fumaroles on Tongariro. These were last sampled in May 2012. The samples collected in May show no anomalies." Mount Tongariro is a volcanic complex comprising numerous craters and vents.

Ash eruptions were recorded from Tongariro from 1855 to 1897, as well as unconfirmed activity in 1926 to 1927. Also Friday, Civil Defence Minister Chris Tremain warned New Zealanders against complacency when it comes to natural hazards.

He said a survey of national levels of preparedness showed 88 percent of New Zealanders had done something or thought about doing something to prepare for an emergency, while 55 percent said they had taken steps to prepare themselves or their household in the last 12 months. —Xinhua

Indian scientists try to crack monsoon source code

NEW DELHI, 20 July — Scientists aided by supercomputers are trying to unravel one of Mother Nature's biggest mysteries — the vagaries of the summer monsoon rains that bring life, and sometimes death, to India every year. In a first-of-its-kind project, Indian scientists aim to build computer models that would allow them to make a quantum leap in predicting the erratic movements of the monsoon. If successful, the impact would be life-changing in a country where 600 million people depend on farming for their livelihoods and where agriculture contributes 15 percent to the economy. The monsoon has been dubbed by some as India's "real finance minister". "Ultimately it's all about water. Everybody needs water and whatever amount of water you get here is mainly through rainfall," said Shailesh Nayak, secretary of the Earth Sciences Ministry.

India typically receives 75 percent of its annual rain from the June-September monsoon as moisture-laden winds sweep in from the southwest of the peninsula. The importance of the recently launched five-year "monsoon mission" has been underscored by this summer's patchy and below-average rains, which have provoked much anxious sky-

watching and fears of drought in India's northwest, even as floods in the northeast displaced 2 million people and killed more than 100. Agriculture Minister Sharad Pawar cautioned this week that there was no need for alarm just yet, although he fretted that the monsoon was "playing hide-and-seek".

Working with counterparts in the United States and Britain, Indian scientists are trying to crack the monsoon's "source code" using super-fast computers to build the world's first short-range and long-range computer models that can give much more granular information about the monsoon's movements. —Reuters

**US House passes Pentagon
budget**

WASHINGTON, 20 July—The US House of Representatives on Thursday evening passed next year's defence budget in a massive 607-billion-US-dollar bill that would fund the Pentagon and pay war costs from October, 2012, to September, 2013. The Republican-controlled House approved the measure in a 326-90 vote, after two days of debate and several amendments. The bill increases Pentagon base funding by about 1 billion dollars over the 2012 levels, to 519 billion dollars, but cut war funding by 27 billion dollars, to about 88.5 billion dollars.

The House version of the Pentagon budget has to be reconciled with the Senate version before it could be presented to President Barack Obama for his signature.

The Democratic-controlled Senate has made clear its opposition to the House bill, saying it broke a spending deal reached last year. The House bill is 3 billion dollars above the Pentagon's request, and 8 billion dollars above the spending caps in last year's Budget Control Act. The Senate is unlikely to take up the bill until August.—Xinhua

Driving tax considered in California

A California transportation agency said it is considering a tax on motorists for each mile they drive in their cars.

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission, the San Francisco Bay area agency leading the discussions on the possible tax, said the plan would likely involve GPS-like devices installed in cars to keep track of the miles traveled by motorists, with low-income drivers excepted, the *San Jose Mercury News* reported on Wednesday.

Randy Rentschler, a

spokesman for the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, said the plan for a vehicle miles traveled tax, or VMT, could take up to a decade to implement if it is embraced by the public.

"I don't want to say it's pie in the sky. A VMT charge is really an option for the future to be looked at and considered," Rentschler said.

The Association of Bay Area Governments, which includes city councilors and county supervisors, is scheduled to analyze a study of the proposal on Thursday.

Woman purged from voter rolls is not dead

A Florida woman said a letter saying she has been removed from voter rolls due to her death is the second such letter she has received.

Constance Smith, 61, of College Park, said she received a letter from the Orange County Supervisor of Elections office Friday, the same day her absentee ballot arrived in the mail, the *Orlando (Fla.) Sentinel* reported Wednesday.

"This letter is to inform you that the person named above has been removed from the Orange County vote rolls after we received

notification of their death," the notice read.

Smith said she received a similar letter in 2008, which officials attributed to the death of a woman with a similar name who had the same birth date. She said it took her six months to clear up the mistake in 2008 and it involved her obtaining a "non-death" certificate from the Florida Department of Health.

Linda Tanko, deputy supervisor of elections for Orange County, said the error may have been the result of the Social Security Administration sharing

erroneous information with the Florida Division of Elections.

"We certainly apologize. I've already taken the

steps to get her straight on the books," Tanko said. "But I'm only as good as the next death list that comes down" from the capital.

during difficult periods. Sadly my injuries and inability to train have now finally brought an end to my career."

Chairman Daniel Levy said: "It will undoubtedly be a special night at the Lane, the chance for fans and teammates to pay tribute to our longest-serving, not to mention one of the most gifted players in the history of the club." He added: "Ledley has made a magnificent contribution to this club—as a wonderful player, captain and ambassador." "It is great to have a day off, that's for sure. But I will have to figure out why my serve is not on right now."

McHale showed her fighting qualities as she recovered to beat Doi after nearly three hours, with the 27th-ranked winner reprising a victory over her opponent from Stanford two years ago. Japan's Doi put McHale under pressure on serve, but the American saved 16 of a massive 19 break chances to reach her second quarter-final

of the season after Doha. "I have to give credit to Misaki because she played really, really well," said the winner. "She made it hard for me. In the third set I started finding my rhythm more on my serve, which made it easier then for me to hold." — *Internet*

Motta leaves Juventus for Bologna

ROME, 20 July — Bologna has completed the loan signing of Juventus defender Marco Motta, with the option of acquiring a 50 percent stake in the defender next summer.

The Italy international spent the second half of last season at Catania, but had been heavily linked with the Rossoblu in recent weeks and his move to the Dall'Ara was finally confirmed on Thursday evening. "Bologna FC 1909 announces that it has reached an agreement with Juventus for the transfer of defender Marco Motta on a temporary basis, with a right to redeem half of the player's registration," a statement on the club's website read.

Motta initially arrived in Turin on loan from Udinese in 2010 before sealing a permanent transfer the following summer. — *Internet*

My ball striking is good. I think I can get it around no matter what the conditions are." The proof was in limp flags and red numbers on the scoreboards.

Scott was among three dozen players with rounds in the 60s, a group that included Tiger Woods. Trying to end a four-year drought in the majors, Woods raced out to four birdies in seven holes to take the early lead, only to settle into a series of pars and one adventure through grass up to his knees for a lone bogey that gave him a 67. In his third Open at Lytham, Woods said it was as easy as he had ever seen it play. — *Internet*

Nadal out of London Games with injury

MADRID, 20 July — Olympic champion Rafa Nadal's withdrawal from the London Games because of injury deprived the tournament of one of its biggest attractions and left Spain reeling on Thursday. The gold-medal winner in Beijing four years ago has failed to recover from a knee problem, and so will also miss out on the honor of carrying his nation's flag at the opening ceremony. The



Rafael Nadal of Spain Spanish tennis federation (RFET) said Feliciano Lopez would be his replacement in the singles, while Marc Lopez would step in to partner Marcel Granollers in the doubles.

The country's Olympic

committee (COE) said a meeting on Friday would decide on a replacement flag bearer for the 27 July parade. "I'm not in a condition to be able to compete," Nadal, 26, said in a statement. "It's one of the saddest moments of my career." Nadal won a record seventh French Open title in June but crashed out in the second round at Wimbledon in a big upset against lowly ranked Czech Lukas Rosol. Earlier this

month, he pulled out of a charity match against Novak Djokovic at Real Madrid's Bernabeu stadium saying he was suffering from tendonitis and needed to rest.

Nadal had hoped to return to Wimbledon this month to defend his Olympic title and his withdrawal echoes his plight of 2009 when a similar knee problem meant he had to withdraw from the grass court grand slam, a year after winning it for the first time in an epic final against Roger Federer. — *Reuters*

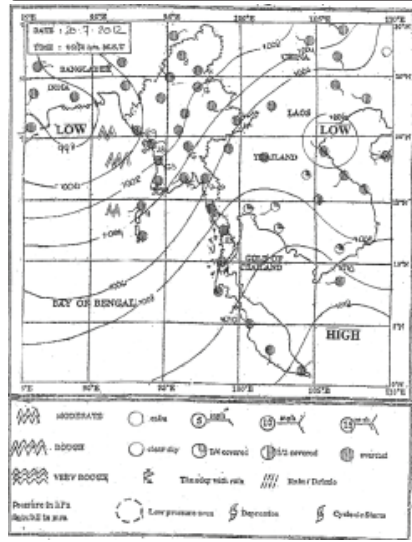

Wimbledon to move back a week from 2015

LONDON, 20 July — Wimbledon organizers have bowed to players' wishes by announcing a later start date from 2015, extending the tennis grass-court season and increasing the gap with the French Open, they said in a statement on Thursday. The grand slam will be pushed back a week, giving players three weeks to adjust from the slower French Open clay courts.

"The best interests of tennis will be served by allowing the players more time to recuperate and to adjust from the clay of Roland Garros to the grass at Wimbledon," said Philip Brook, chairman of the All England Club. "All our research indicates that there is

widespread support within the game for extending the gap between the French Open and Wimbledon and, importantly, we think most players will welcome the prospect of a longer grass court season and spending more time on the softer surface of grass.

"In making this change from 2015 we recognize that there will be some important consequences for the overall tennis calendar and enough time needs to be given to allow us all to plan accordingly." Players have long complained that the two-week gap between the clay and grass seasons is insufficient. Wimbledon 2015 will run from 29 June to 12 July.— Reuters
