Fifth day Pyidaungsu Hluttaw regular session held Two reports submitted, one proposal discussed

NAY PYI TAW, 24 July—The fifth day regular session of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw took place at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here this afternoon, with attendance

of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Aung Myint, Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 609 Pyidaungsu Hluttaw representatives.

Union Minister for Finance and Revenue U Hla Tun submitted a report and Chairman of Joint Bill Committee U Mya Nyein, report of findings and comments on JICA credit (former OECF credit).

As the Hluttaw agreed on bridge loan from Japanese Commerce Bank and ODA loan from JICA proposed by the Union government, they were approved.

U Hmat Gyi of Mandalay Region Constituency No (9), U Aung Zin of Pazundaung Constituency, U Sai Thant Zin of Shan State Constituency No (4), Daw Mi Myint Than of Ye Constituency, U Ba Shein of Kyaukpyu Constituency, Daw Khin Than Myint of Ngapudaw Constituency, Daw Su Su Hlaing of Dagon Myothit (South) Constituency, U Soe Aung of Thegon Constituency, U Kyaw Myint (a) U Po Toke of Momeik Constituency and U Tin Win of Kawlin Constituency discussed the proposal on **doing justice in confiscation of farmlands not to harm farmers**. They discussed farmlands were confiscated for urbanization, establishing industrial zones and extension of base of battalions of Tatmadaw. Farmlands in operation of the farmers were confiscated in extension of railroads, motor roads and airports, establishing state-owned factories and workshops and allotting lands to private companies for farming purposes.

The farmers are traditionally engaging in the farming on the lands with no knowledge on legal status of the lands. Village land committee was found to be failing to register the lands in accordance with the law.

The farmers, who had not applied for permission or had no knowledge to do so to do farming on the lands of their ancestors, were labeled encroachers citing lack of documents. The farmers in each corner of the country are victimized by the individuals who allegedly

US in global AIDS fight to win, Clinton vows

Clinton said on Monday. "I am here to make it absolutely clear: The United States is committed and will

remain committed to achieving an AIDS-free generation," Clinton told the international AIDS conference in Washington. "We will not back off, we will not back down, we will fight for the resources to achieve this historic

milestone." Clinton's keynote speech sought to underscore Washington's dedication to the global AIDS fight amid fears that US leadership might suffer as spending cuts and budget woes threaten a range of government programmes. Clinton announced more than \$150 million in new US spending initiatives geared toward leveraging progress against AIDS already achieved through new drug treatments, programs to stop mother-to-child transmission of HIV and the preventive effect of expanded voluntary male circumcision.

"This is a fight we can win. We've already come so far, too far to stop now," Clinton said. "HIV may be with us into the future until we finally achieve a cure, a vaccine. But the disease that HIV causes need not be with

us." The United Nations estimates that about 34 million people are living with the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) that causes AIDS. But UN figures show that the number of worldwide AIDS-related deaths fell to 1.7 million last year from some 1.8 million in 2010, after peaking at 2.3 million in 2005.

An estimated 8 million people in lower-income countries are receiving antiretroviral drugs, and the United Nations has set a target to raise that to 15 million by 2015.

Funding for HIV prevention and treatment totaled \$16.8 billion last year. Of that amount, \$8.2 billion came from international sources including the United States, which donated 48 percent of it.

Heatwave claims 13 lives in Japan last week

TOKYO, 24 July—A total of 13 people died due to heatstroke last week in Japan, while 5,467 people were sent to hospital, Japan's Fire and Disaster Management Agency said on Tuesday.

Strong heatwaves scorched wide parts of Japan last week, with record high temperatures for July observed in several parts of the country.

On last Wednesday

alone, the temperature jumped to over 35 degrees Celsius in 77 of Japan's 927 observation points, with 10 observation sites logging record highs for July, according to the Japan

Meteorological Agency.

The number of people hospitalized across Japan last week through Sunday was 2.1 times more than the previous week as Japan experienced intense heat, according to reports.

Iraq death toll from wave of violence rises to 115

BAGHDAD, 24 July—Officials say the death toll from Iraq's deadliest day in more than two years has risen to 115.

Police and hospital officials said on Tuesday that five more people died from injuries sustained in a late-night car bombing on Monday near a cafe in a Shiite neighbourhood in eastern Baghdad.

All officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to talk to the media.

Initial casualty figures often change in the immediate hours following attacks.

Monday's death toll was the worst for a single day in Iraq since 10 May, 2010, when a string of nationwide attacks killed at least 119 people.

The attacks came days after the leader of al-Qaeda in Iraq warned that the militant group is regrouping.—INTERNET

US Osprey aircraft arrive in Japan

TOKYO, 24 July—A ship carrying the US military's latest transport aircraft Osprey arrived in Japan on Monday morning amid protests over safety issues.

Workers began unloading and assembling the 12 MV-22 Osprey aircraft in the city of Iwakuni soon after the ship arrived, according to reports. The US plans to deploy the newer tilt-rotor aircraft to Okinawa to replace CH-46 helicopters.

Iwakuni Mayor Yoshihiko Fukuda told reporters after the ship's arrival that he will lodge a protest with the central government. "We have been urging that it not be allowed into the port until safety is confirmed," he said. "We feel distrust and indignation that (our message) did not reach the state."

Though the Ospreys will only be in Iwakuni shortly, its deployment plan has become the latest uniting point for US base opponents. Both the mayor of Iwakuni and the governor of Okinawa said that they do not support even temporarily hosting the aircraft. Protesters on Monday held a sit-in outside the base where the Ospreys are to be transported to, according to local media.—Reuters

The international sports event is being held in London for the 3rd time. Queen Elizabeth will declare the opening on 27th July.

The queen said that preparations for the games have helped regenerate east London and create world-class sporting facilities at the Olympic Park.

She expressed hope that the Games will leave behind a legacy for future generations.

Thais warned of heavy rain, flash floods

BANGKOK, 24 July—Thailand's Meteorological Department on Tuesday issued a warning for people in the North, Northeast, East and the South to prepare for widespread scattered rain with heavy falls in some areas, the danger of floods and forest-runoff today and over the next few days, Bangkok Post

online reported.

The department said storm "Vicente" is expected to arrive in the upper parts of Vietnam on Wednesday. This will cause widespread scattered rain in the mentioned Thailand's four regions.

People living near hillsides and waterways

should prepare for heavy rain, possible flash floods and forest-runoff from Tuesday to 27 July and from tomorrow to 27 July.

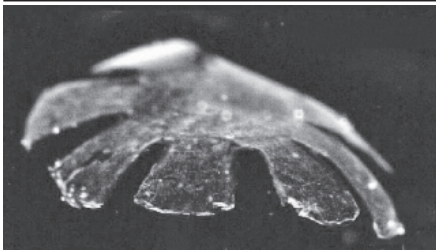
Due to the prevailing southwest monsoon over the Andaman Sea and the Gulf of Thailand, there will also be strong wind-generated 2 to 3-metre-high waves in the Andaman Sea.

All shipping should proceed with caution and small boats should keep ashore today and the next few days, the department said.—Xinhua

WASHINGTON, 24 July — Scientists in the US have created a free swimming artificial jellyfish. The team members built the replica using silicone as a base on which to grow heart muscle cells that were harvested from rats. They used an electric current to shock the Medusoid into swimming with synchronised contractions that mimic those of real jellyfish. The advance, by researchers at Caltech and Harvard University, is reported in the journal *Nature Biotechnology*. The finding serves as a proof of concept for reverse engineering a variety of muscular organs and simple life forms.

Because jellyfish use a muscle to pump their way through the water, the way they function—on a very basic level—is similar to that of a human heart. “I started looking at marine organisms that pump to survive,” said Kevin Kit Parker, a professor of bioengineering and applied physics at Harvard. “Then I saw a jellyfish at the New England Aquarium, and I

immediately noted both similarities and differences between how the jellyfish pumps and the human heart. “The similarities help reveal what you need to do to design a bio-inspired pump.”

The work also points to a broader definition of “synthetic life” in an emerging field of science that has until now focused on replicating life’s building blocks, say the researchers. Prof Parker said he wanted to challenge the traditional view of synthetic biology which is “focused on genetic manipulations of cells”. Instead of building just a cell, he sought to “build a beast”. The two groups at Caltech and Harvard worked for years to understand the key factors that contribute to jellyfish propulsion, including the arrangement of their muscles, how their bodies contract and recoil, and how fluid dynamics helps or hinders their movements.

Once these functions were well understood, the researchers began to reverse engineer them. They used

Artificial jellyfish created from heart cells

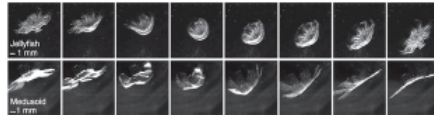
silicone to fashion a jellyfish-shaped body with eight arm-like appendages. Next, they printed a pattern made of protein onto the “body” that resembled the muscle architecture of the real animal. They grew the heart muscle cells on top, with the protein pattern serving as a road map for the growth and organization of the rat tissue. This allowed them to turn the cells into a coherent swimming muscle. When the researchers set the Medusoid free in a container of electrically conducting fluid, they shocked the Medusoid into swimming with synchronised contractions. The muscle cells even started to contract a bit on their own before the electrical current was applied.

“I was surprised that with relatively few components—a silicone base and cells that we arranged—we were able to reproduce some pretty complex swimming and feeding behaviours that you see in biological jellyfish,” said John Dabiri, professor of aeronautics and bioengineering at Caltech. “I’m pleasantly surprised at how close we are getting to

matching the natural biological performance, but also that we’re seeing ways in which we can probably improve on that natural performance. The process of evolution missed a lot of good solutions.” Lead author Janna Nawroth from the California Institute of Technology (Caltech) in Pasadena commented that the field of tissue engineering was “still a very qualitative art”.

She said researchers tried to copy a tissue or organ “based on what they think is important or what they see as the major components without necessarily understanding if those components are relevant to the desired function or without analysing first how different materials could be used”. The team aims to carry out further work on the artificial jellyfish. They want to make adjustments that will allow it to turn and move in a particular direction. They also plan to incorporate a simple “brain” so it can respond to its environment and replicate more advanced behaviours like moving towards a light source and seeking energy or food.

Amazon to open major London hub

LONDON, 24 July — Internet retail giant Amazon is to open a new creative centre in London which will house hundreds of software developers and engineers. The centre, based near London’s “Silicon Roundabout” area, will focus on producing the “next generation of TV and film services”, the company said. Mayor of London Boris Johnson said Amazon’s decision was a “splendid feather in our cap”. “We thank them for their vote of confidence,” he added.

“We know we have the talent, the space and infrastructure to make the most of the digital economy - this will be my prime message during Games-time, as I seek to woo even more companies to the capital, delivering jobs and growth for Londoners.”

The Silicon Roundabout area, situated in the Old Street

area of London, is at the centre of the government’s Tech City project, designed to attract big technology names to the capital. Amazon, the world’s largest retailer, said it intended to use the centre to develop interactive services for a range of platforms such as games consoles and smartphones.

When it opens, the eight-floor centre will house existing staff—although Amazon said it could recruit more workers in the future. Teams working at Amazon—owned companies Pushbutton and Lovefilm will be based at the site which is set to open in the “coming months”. Amazon spokeswoman Paula Byrne said: “London is a hotbed of tech talent and testament to that fact is Amazon choosing the capital as the location for the new global digital media development centre.”

Science graduates ‘lack skills needed by business’

LONDON, 24 July — Universities are not producing enough science graduates with the skills needed by UK industry, a report says.

The Lords Science and Technology Committee calls for immediate action to boost student numbers in science, technology, engineering and maths at undergraduate and postgraduate level. Too many students start science courses with weak maths skills, it says. Report chairman Lord Willis said he was “gobsmacked” by figures which showed few who had studied maths beyond GCSE. The report notes that the government’s Plan for

Growth attached great importance to education and the hi-tech industry to create jobs and prosperity.

But it highlights a lack of key skills which extends from too few young people studying maths beyond GCSE to too few students taking postgraduate degrees in science, technology, engineering and maths (Stem) subjects. The sub-committee that produced the report said they were shocked that so many Stem undergraduates did not have A-level mathematics.

The figures showed that around 70% of biology undergraduates, 38% of chemistry and economics undergraduates and 10% of engineering students did not

have A-level maths. The report team even found evidence that even an A* in A-level mathematics was no guarantee that students would be able to cope with a university science course.

Lord Willis said: “When you have a university like Cambridge saying that even with an A* in mathematics we are having to give remedial maths in order to study engineering there is something not quite right if we are going to produce the very best to compete with the world.”

In reality the quality of the Stem graduates coming out of universities does not meet the requirements of industry and in fact is ultimately not even likely to meet the requirements of academia.” The report says that, without action, the government risks failing to meet its objective of driving economic growth through education and hi-tech industries.—INTERNET

What’s up dock? Apple to shrink connector for iPhone 5

TAIPEI/HONG KONG, 24 July — Apple Inc’s new iPhone will drop the wide dock connector used in the company’s gadgets for the best part of a decade in favor of a smaller one, a change likely to annoy the Apple faithful but which could be a boon for accessory makers. The iPhone 5, Apple’s next generation iPhone expected to go on sale around October, will come with a 19-pin connector port at the bottom instead of the proprietary 30-pin port “to make room for the earphone moving to the bottom”, two sources familiar with the matter told Reuters.

That would mean the new phone would not connect with the myriad of accessories such as speakers and power chargers that form part of the ecosystem around iPods, iPads and iPhones, without an adaptor. That means new business, analysts say. “It represents an opportunity for

accessory vendors,” said Pete Cunningham, London-based analyst at technology research firm Canalys. “The iPhone connector has been a standard for a long time now and I would expect the same to be true for a new connector, should Apple change it as expected.” Apple did not immediately reply to an emailed request for comment.

Tech blogs have long speculated on the demise of the 30-pin connector, which at 21 mm wide takes up a chunk of space, especially as the latest technologies such as microUSB offer more power in less space. They say that a smaller connector would give Apple more scope for new product designs or a bigger battery, or simply to make ever smaller products. Switzerland’s Logitech, one of the biggest makers of Apple speakers, declined to comment. But some enterprising vendors in China have already begun

offering cases for the new phone, complete with earphone socket on the bottom and a “guarantee” the dimensions are correct.

For some in the peripherals industry, the change could open doors to new business. “iPod docking speaker sales have been declining for one or two years,” said an employee of a Hong Kong-based company that designs speakers especially for Apple products.

Health Tip: Buying shoes for your child

The American Podiatric Medical Association offers these additional shoe-shopping suggestions:

- * Measure your child's feet before every new shoe purchase, no matter how recently the feet were last measured.
- * Make sure the child is wearing typical socks as he or she is trying on shoes.
- * Inspect the child's feet for any signs of irritation after trying on new shoes.
- * Avoid buying secondhand shoes, which could spread a fungal infection.
- * Inspect the heels of your child's existing shoes to look for signs of uneven wear. If found, it could indicate a foot problem that should be checked.
- * Let your child participate in the shoe-shopping experience.
- * Choose the size that accommodates the child's largest foot.

Cisco to cut about 1,300 jobs

SHANGHAI, 24 July—Network equipment maker Cisco Systems said on Monday that it plans to cut about 1,300 jobs as part of ongoing efforts to restructure the company.

"We are performing a focused set of limited restructurings that will collectively impact approximately 2 percent of our global employee population," the company said in an emailed statement.

These actions are part of a continuous process to simplify the company and assess the economic environment in certain parts of the world, it said. Cisco had 65,223 employees at the end of its fiscal third quarter, according to its website.

Cisco last year started a plan to cut expenses by \$1 billion in an effort to make the company leaner and more efficient. At the time, it said it planned to cut 15 percent of its workforce. Cisco is due to report on its fourth quarter on 15 August.—Reuters

Global shares inch up after China PMI, Spain drags on euro

TOKYO, 24 July — Asian shares inched higher on Tuesday, helped by improving Chinese manufacturing data, but the euro remained under pressure as surging Spanish borrowing costs stoked fears that the euro zone's fourth-largest economy will be forced to seek a bailout. The HSBC flash China manufacturing purchasing managers index rose to a five-month high in July, driven up by a jump in the output sub-index and signs of an improvement in new export orders that offered some relief to fragile markets.

Asian shares erased earlier losses while oil and copper rose after the Chinese data, pushing the commodity-linked Australian dollar up to \$1.0288 from around \$1.0265. The euro also received a temporary boost before retreating to stand not far from a two-year low against the dollar and a near 12-year low against the yen. The single currency was undermined by Moody's Investors Service changing its ratings outlook to negative for Aaa-rated Germany, the Netherlands and Luxembourg amid Europe's ongoing debt crisis.

"China's PMI data beat market expectations and gave shorts a reason to cover today," said Orient Futures derivatives

Cancer-causing toxin found in Chinese baby formula

SHANGHAI, 24 July — A Chinese dairy has been ordered to suspend production after a cancer-causing toxin was found in its infant formula, China's quality watchdog said on Monday, in the country's latest milk scare. Ava Dairy Co Ltd has started a recall after high levels of aflatoxin, which is caused by mould, was found in products made between July and December, the watchdog said, according to the official Xinhua news agency.

The affected formula was mainly sold to supermarkets in Hunan and Guangdong, said Li Yuanping, spokesman for China's General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine. China is trying to crack down on product safety violations to reassure citizens and restore faith in the government after a series of high-profile scandals.

The latest case comes just a month after dairy maker Yili began recalling batches of baby formula when authorities found they contained high levels of mercury. And in December, aflatoxin was found in milk produced by another leading dairy company, Mengniu Dairy Group.

Milk was at the centre of China's biggest food safety scandal in 2008 when the industrial chemical melamine was found to have been illegally added to dairy products to give the appearance of higher protein content. At least six babies

died and another 300,000 became ill after drinking milk tainted with melamine. Aflatoxins can be found in milk after cows consume feed contaminated by mould and can increase the risk of cancer, including liver cancer, according to the World Health Organization.—Internet

UN, OIE call for more controls on rinderpest virus

WASHINGTON, 24 July — The UN's food agency and the OIE called on countries on Monday to comply with a 2011 global moratorium and destroy potentially dangerous rinderpest virus samples or put them into safe storage. The deadly animal virus, which caused cattle plague, was the second viral disease in history to be wiped out after smallpox more than 30 years ago. It was officially declared eradicated in 2011, but some of the samples still stored worldwide are being kept in unsafe conditions, the organizations said.

"The process of cataloguing the still existing virus-containing materials worldwide found that some were being kept under insufficient levels of biosecurity," the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in Rome and Paris-based World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) said. In

two international resolutions passed in last year, OIE and FAO member countries agreed either to destroy remaining stocks of rinderpest virus or store them in a limited number of safe, high containment laboratories.

"The moratorium is pivotal to managing biological risks until an oversight mechanism is established," Kazuaki Miyagishima, head of the OIE Scientific and Technical Department, said in a joint statement released by the organizations. "While rinderpest virus remains present in a large number of laboratories across the world, we cannot say that there is zero risk of a reoccurrence." Priority must be given to destroying remaining non-secured stocks of the virus and maintaining vigilance until this is accomplished," he said.

The OIE and FAO said

some reserves of the virus should be kept "to produce vaccines and for research in case the disease emerges again or is released as a result of an accidental or deliberate

act". The virus, which caused respiratory disease, diarrhoea and death in the majority of cattle infected, devastated livestock and led to widespread hunger. "While rinderpest has been successfully eradicated, there may be some virus material that would be useful for research or vaccine

development," said Juan Lubroth, the food agency's chief veterinary officer. "We must remain vigilant so that rinderpest remains a disease of the past, consigned to history and the textbooks of veterinarians to benefit from the lessons we've learned," he said.—Internet

signalled that pro-growth government policies may be gaining traction in the world's second-largest economy. MSCI's broadest index of Asia-Pacific shares outside Japan edged up 0.2 percent, after spending most of the session in negative territory. It tumbled 2.4 percent on Monday for its biggest one-day drop in about two months.

Japan's Nikkei stock average also steadied after earlier slipping to a six-week low. Brent crude rose 0.8 percent to \$104.03 a barrel and US crude added 0.8 percent to \$88.81, while copper jumped 1.1 percent to \$7,485 per metric ton (1.1023 tons) on China's PMI. "The data gave a slight boost to markets, but whether such effects are sustainable are doubtful as Europe struggles with its problems," said Hiroyuki Kikukawa, general manager at trading company Nihon Unicom.

"Government policies will underpin the Chinese economy over the longer term, but in the short-term, instability in the European situation will keep a drag, especially as Europe is a big export market for China," he said. European stocks were seen mixed and US stock futures were barely changed. Financial spreadbetters called the main indexes in London (FTSE), Paris (FHC) and Frankfurt (GDAXI) to open between a 0.4 percent fall and a 0.3 percent gain. (EU)(L)(N) Hong Kong's stock market (HSI) opened up 0.1 percent after the morning session was cancelled due to Typhoon Vicente.—Reuters

Deputy Minister for Electric Power No. (1) U Myint Zaw replied to question of U Aye Mauk of Mahlaing Constituency about resources for electricity generation and question of U Ye Tun of Thandwe Constituency about what measures would be taken to displace people due to Thahay Hydropower Project.

Regarding the first question, the deputy minister replied that there are 19 hydropower plants, 1 coal-fired power plant under the Ministry of Electric Power No. (1) and 15 natural gas and boiler power plants, installed with total capacity of 3494.9 megawatts and generated

10338.08 kilowatt hours in 201-2012 fiscal year and distributed to the national grid. Upon completion of ongoing projects namely Chipwenge, Phyu Creek, Thaukyekhak (2) Bilu Creek (3), Upper Bilu Creek (2) and Upper Paunglaung from 2012-2013 fiscal year to 2014-2015 fiscal year, 2383.7 kilowatt hours electricity could be produced, installed with 520 megawatts capacity in total.

The deputy minister continued to say that Anchaung, Thahay, Upper Kengtawng, Upper Yeywa and Shweli-3 projects would produce 1502 megawatt and 5527 KWH upon completion from 2016-2017 to 2020-2021.

To fulfill electricity demand on a temporary basis, six gas power plants in Yangon will be upgraded. Major repair will be carried out at Ywama gas power plant. Upon completion of repair, it would produce more 110 megawatt.

The ministry is in negotiation with China-based Hydrolancang Co Ltd to establish 543-megawatt gas power plant, with Korea-based Busan Korea Biotechnology to establish 500-megawatt gas power plant, with Thailand-based Toyo Thai Co to built 100-megawatt gas power plant in Insein, and with Thai EGAT Co to urgently built

one 110-megawatt gas power plant. Regarding the second question, the deputy minister said village relocation plan was drafted by district and township authorities and departmental personnel under leadership of Thandwe District Peace and Development Council in April, 2009. Reclamation of farmlands, electrification and repair of village roads will be carried out coming open season in coordination with project and local authorities. School bus will ply daily for school children.

Daw Dwe Bu of N'Jiangyan Constituency, Daw Zatalan of Thantlang Constituency, U Aye of Homalin Constituency and U Shi Thee of Leshi Constituency discussed the proposal for prescribing legislation safeguarding rights of ethnic people submitted by U T Khun Myat of Kutkai Constituency. In so doing, there does not need to enact a particular law as it is the special invitation of the President, but related works are in systematic operation in line with rules and procedures of the entrance visa.

So, it will not need to promulgate a law as such works are being carried out in line with accurate and firm principles enabling Myanmar expats come back home at the invitation of the President without delay. Myanmar expats only need to follow the procedures if wishing to come back home.

Regarding the third question, the deputy minister replied that out of the three border gates to neighbor Thailand, only Kawthoung-Ranong gate is open under the cross-border agreement of the two countries. Agreements have not been reached for opening of other two gates—Mawtaung and Htikhi. It will need the coordination between the two countries to open border trade camp and border gate in Mawtaung as it is not in the agreement.

If the two countries reach an agreement, the Ministry of

Immigration and Population would assign its staff there to handle related works, to issue border pass and temporary border pass.

To undertake roadworks on Myeik-Mawtaung road with BOT system, Yuzana Co has signed agreement with the Public Works to carry out roadworks on 50 miles and five furlongs long Myeik-Taninthayi road section and 69 miles long Taninthayi-Thaebyu-Mawtaung road section. Roadworks on those road sections are planned to start in open season this year.

Taninthayi Region government has made field trip to Mawtaung to check its requirements for opening of Mawtaung border gate and ensure long-term smooth transportation. It would put the works into operation after the monsoon.

Double-decker London bus reborn as athletic Czech art

PRAGUE, 24 July—A Czech artist has re-modelled a traditional London double-decker bus into a mechanical sculpture of an athlete doing push-ups to celebrate the Olympic Games opening in the British capital on Friday.

David Cerny, whose past works have enraged European politicians and sought to poke fun at rival artists, has installed the bus outside the Czech Olympic House in London's Islington neighbourhood.

Cerny bought the 1957 bus from an owner in the Netherlands, attached two huge arms, an electrical engine and a lot of wiring and suspension tools to make it into a piece of art named

"London Boosted".

The mechanisms inside make the 6-tonne bus move up and down on bright red arms, raising the chassis into various angles, accompanied by recordings of a groaning voice and video projections in the windows.

"There is one common exercise for every sportsman in the world, and that is push-ups," Cerny said.

"It is training for sport activities but at the same time it is also punishment in armies and prisons. So the push-ups are a very universal physical activity...It is in a way very ironic."

In 2009, Cerny revealed a huge puzzle-like object, called "Entropa", in an EU building

in Brussels that pictured European countries in unflattering ways, making a dramatic start to the Czech Republic's EU presidency.

Bulgaria protested for being shown as a squat toilet, Germany was a Swastika-like web of highways, including moving cars, France was covered by an "On Strike" banner and Britain was missing altogether.

In the Czech Republic, he once painted pink a Soviet tank, which was serving as a monument of the 1945 liberation of Prague. His "Shark", was a statue of former Iraqi President Saddam Hussein floating in formaldehyde. It was meant to poke fun at British artist

Damien Hirst's embalmed shark, and was banned from exhibitions in Belgium and Poland.

Cerny once also put up large replicas of guns and posters in London back in the 1990s, calling on people to observe a "Day of Killing" to control population growth, as

part of an art fair.

In that context, the London bus seems uncontroversial.

"We will see how long the athlete can work out for," Cerny said. "Let's hope he will exercise for the full three weeks. He will be the biggest sportsman there." —Reuters

Shark kills surfer off France's Reunion island

SAINT-DENIS EN REUNION, 24 July—A shark mauled a surfer to death on Monday in an attack off the coast of France's Indian Ocean island of Reunion, emergency services said.

The 21-year-old surfer, a resident of Reunion, died after the shark bit through his leg some 100 m (330 feet) from shore at one of the island's most popular surfing spots.

Fellow surfers hauled the victim to the beach and emergency services unsuccessfully tried to revive him for more than an hour, according to witnesses speaking on local radio station Freedom.

Two other fatal shark attacks off the island killed surfers in June and September of 2011, prompting local authorities to step up monitoring. Monday's attack occurred an hour after monitoring at the beach in question had ended, officials said.

Shark attacks have been on the rise in the Indian Ocean, especially in Australia. Surfers are frequently the victims.

Telling tales in Tate Modern's huge Turbine Hall

LONDON, 24 July—Visitors to London's Tate Modern gallery this Summer may find themselves holding a conversation with a complete stranger in a cavernous hall as part of a piece of art. They could perhaps be invited to listen to someone's holiday experiences or be encouraged to join in a running or singing game.

By doing so, the visitors will become part of the gallery's live art exhibition "These Associations" by British-German artist Tino Sehgal.

The exhibition, which runs until 28 October, is part of the Unilever Series hosted at the Tate Modern each year which has seen artists like Olafur Eliasson, Rachel Whiteread and Carsten Holler create huge pieces of art that have filled the Turbine Hall and drawn millions of visitors to the gallery each year. Sehgal said the idea for this work was influenced by the vast space at the Tate Modern and the idea of being an individual in a collective.

"It's a place that is made for visitors or audiences to gather which is very unusual, for a museum space," he told Reuters. "Normally, you're supposed to not gather but walk around and look at the art politely."

The 70 or so participants engage in a variety of sequences to create movement, sound and conversation including singing, or running full speed down the hall, as well as speaking to the public. Curator Jessica Morgan said the public response has been positive so far.

"I think they are completely fascinated," she said. "I think many people come to the Tate, expecting this type of experience. They're looking for an encounter that perhaps is quite different to the encounter that they might have at the National Gallery." "Many people are joining in... there's quite a movement around the space and many of the people who encounter it are completely taken over with this type of almost 'ebb and flow' in the gallery space and join in."

The commission follows the Tate Modern's opening of its first dedicated space to live art and installations, The Tanks, which it hopes will allow the gallery to expand its programming. —Reuters

Man jumps off Tower Bridge in Olympic taxi protest

LONDON, 24 July—A man jumped off London's historic Tower Bridge into the River Thames on Monday during a protest by taxi drivers over their exclusion from part of a special Olympic Games road network in the capital and survived.

Police pulled him from the water under the landmark bridge, from which Olympic

rings were suspended to celebrate the 2012 London Games, and arrested him on a public order offence.

The man, who has not been named, had been taking part in a protest by London taxi drivers over a decision to keep them off part of a road network reserved for Olympic athletes.

The drivers are worried

that they will be stuck in congestion and will lose money during the Games.

Tower Bridge, which was opened by the Prince of Wales in 1894, is a suspension and bascule bridge designed to allow tall ships to sail through. It is next to the Tower of London from which it takes its name.

Bill Gates says much more work needed to turn tide of AIDS

WASHINGTON, 24 July—Philanthropist and AIDS prevention advocate Bill Gates said on Monday there had been significant advances in the fight against HIV/AIDS, but he was not ready to say the world was "turning the tide" on the disease, the theme of this week's International AIDS Conference.

Gates said the trajectory of the disease had certainly improved, noting figures the United Nations released last week showing global AIDS deaths last year fell to 1.7 million, down from 1.8 million

in 2010.

But that still means far too many people are dying from AIDS, the multibillionaire co-founder of Microsoft Corp (MSFT O) told Reuters in an interview at his offices in Washington, the host city of this year's AIDS conference.

"Is the end clearly in sight? No. Do we have the tools that will bring about the end? No," said Gates.

He said wealthy nations, which have been the primary engine for funding the research and the delivery of

life-saving drugs to 8 million poor people, faced financial challenges that threatened AIDS funding.

If anything, now is the time to make sure AIDS remains a funding priority "despite the toughness that is out there," he said.

According to the UN report, funding for HIV prevention and treatment totaled \$16.8 billion last year, with \$8.2 billion coming from wealthy international sources, including the United States, which donated nearly half of it.

WASHINGTON, 24 July—A new combination of three drugs killed 99 percent of patients' tuberculosis bacteria in two weeks, raising hope for a new weapon against increasingly resistant forms

Study raises hope for new drugs for resistant TB

of TB. The midstage study, presented on Monday at the International AIDS Conference in Washington, needs to be confirmed in larger and longer trials. Scientists say the drug cocktail could speed treatment and help reduce the emergence of resistant forms of tuberculosis.

"TB is the largest killer of AIDS patients, and so in order to contain the AIDS epidemic, we have to contain TB to a much greater extent," said Dr Mel Spiegelman, chief executive officer of the TB Alliance, a non-profit research group that conducted the

study, which was published in the *Lancet*.

The combination of drugs includes one existing TB drug, pyrazinamide, a repurposed antibiotic from Bayer AG called moxifloxacin that is now used off-label for patients with drug-resistant TB, and a new drug called PA-824 being developed by the New York-based TB Alliance.

What the combination lacks are any drugs in the class called rifamycins, which pose the greatest threat of side effects for patients who also are being treated for

infections with HIV, the human immunodeficiency virus that causes AIDS. "The results of this clinical trial give us the first indication that a new TB drug regimen — a combination of drugs — could be more effective than any of the existing TB drug regimens," Spiegelman said.

He said the combination is especially promising because it could be used to treat patients with both treatment-sensitive TB and TB strains that are resistant to two or more of the common drugs, known as multiple-drug resistant TB. —Reuters

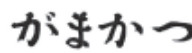

Severe typhoon hits Hong Kong and south China

HONG KONG, 25 July— Hong Kong raised its highest tropical cyclone warning on Tuesday as an intensifying severe typhoon edged closer towards the financial hub, grounding flights and forcing the port to close.

Financial markets, schools, businesses and non-essential government services close when any No 8 or above signal is hoisted, posing a disruption to business in the capitalist hub and former British colony that returned to Chinese rule in 1997.

The Hong Kong Observatory said it expected the No 10 signal to remain in force overnight, meaning markets could be shut down in the morning.

Separately, China's National Meteorological Center issued an orange alert for Typhoon Vicente, the second highest warning level in China's four-tier typhoon warning system, state media reported.

Strengthening gale force winds overturned trees, churned up huge waves in Hong Kong's Victoria Harbour and sent debris flying, injuring some 30 people as Vicente edged closer to the city and the western reaches of China's Guangdong Province.

Twelve flights were cancelled and over 200 delayed late on Monday evening in Hong Kong, aviation authorities said.

"Vicente has intensified abruptly into a severe typhoon," said Wong Wing-tak, a senior Hong Kong observatory official.

John Goetz, 40, of Teaneck, an employee at the Spotless Auto Laundry in Hackensack, said the elderly woman apparently hit the accelerator pedal when her wash was completed on 22 July and her car drove into the Hackensack River, *The Record*, Hackensack,

reported on Monday.

Goez and a customer, Jay Orsino of River Edge, jumped into the water and rescued the woman from her car.

"I kept telling her, 'Don't worry, we're going to get you out of here,'" Goez said. "We couldn't open the door because of the water pressure," Goez said. "Thank God, the window was half open. We got her through the window."

Navy blamed for garage door problems

A spokesman for a Connecticut Naval base said a communication system may be behind malfunctioning garage doors in nearby neighbourhoods.

Sondra Tuchman, who said her garage door opener recently stopped working consistently, said she spoke with about 50 neighbours in Montville and they all had similar complaints about their garage doors, *The Day of New London*, Conn, reported on Monday.

Tuchman said a salesman for Overhead Door Company told her similar complaints had been received from customers in Groton, New London, Waterford, Montville and Gales Ferry. He said the company investigated and found the equipment was not defective.

Chris Zendan, a spokesman for the Naval Submarine Base in Groton, said a radio communications system installed in July 2011 may be to blame for the garage

door problems. He said radio frequencies between 380 and 399.9 megahertz are reserved for the Department of Defence, but some garage door openers legally operate on low power at the same frequencies.

"In response to the increased needs of homeland security, the Department of Defence now must make more use of these frequencies to deploy new mobile radio systems on and around certain military bases," the Federal Communications Commission

said in a public notice. "Some consumers near these bases may experience interference to their garage door openers that can reduce operating range or cause the remote control to cease functioning."

Officials said they can't alter the system to fix the problem and a manager at Overhead Door Company said the firm is not responsible for fixing the problem because "it all has to do with homeland security." Tuchman said the company told her it would cost about \$300 to change the frequency of her door opener.

Wedding moved to hospital

A Tennessee woman who had to be hospitalized prior to her wedding said the ceremony was only delayed an hour when she moved the nuptials to the hospital.

Kristine Nepomuceno, who received a kidney transplant in 2009, said she went to the emergency room at St Thomas Hospital in Nashville for health problems on Friday night and hoped she would be out in time for her 3 pm wedding the following day, WSMV-TV, Nashville, reported on Friday.

"I couldn't get up out of bed and walk by myself so I wanted to go to the ER to see what they could do," she said.

Nepomuceno said she was heartbroken when doctors told her she wouldn't be out in time, but she perked up at the suggestion of moving the wedding.

"The people at St Thomas

told me there was a chapel on-site and that I would be more than welcome to use it," she explained. "So we just moved everyone from the church across the street to the hospital."

Nepomuceno said she rolled down the aisle in a wheelchair only about an hour behind schedule.

"I just came here as a regular patient, and I'm walking out as a princess," she said. "I'm having my fairy-tale wedding even though I'm in a wheelchair."

The bride said she was further delighted to share the day with her maid of honour, who donated her kidney to her in 2009.

"She's one of my best friends and she donated her kidney to me," Nepomuceno said. "If it weren't for her selfless act I wouldn't be here today."

Villas-Boas blasts 'unprofessional' Modric

LONDON, 24 July — Andre Villas-Boas has launched a fresh attack on Luka Modric after branding the Tottenham midfielder as unprofessional following his summer revolt. Modric, a target for Real Madrid, is desperate to force through a summer move and has angered Spurs by going on strike. The Croatian has been hit with an £80,000 (\$124,000) fine for refusing to train and missing the club's pre-season tour of America, where they play a friendly against LA Galaxy on Tuesday and the New York Red Bulls on 31 July. And with Spurs refusing to move on their £40 million (\$62 million) asking price, new Tottenham boss Villas-Boas has condemned Modric's stance.

"We understand this

type of player revolt is nothing new," said the Portuguese coach. "But the club has to protect themselves. We have to hold onto our values and rights. Last year he behaved unprofessionally. Unfortunately this is the first time Luka has taken these actions, he is in under club discipline for not being present. We don't know what advice he is receiving. As far as I know he is back in London." "There is a sense of respect for what he has done, but the chairman feels that the fact he is not present is not common professional behaviour. Obviously this situation will be solved in two ways — that the clubs interested meet the demands of Tottenham regarding his value or the player continues to club duty. Hopefully this

won't drag on too long as it doesn't help Luka or us." Meanwhile, Tottenham have been dealt a further blow after it emerged Scott Parker is set to miss the start of the new season.

Parker is poised to undergo an Achilles injury that will him out for six weeks. He will miss England's friendly with Italy next month and is a major doubt for opening two World Cup qualifiers against Moldova and Ukraine in September. We think there might be a small tear on his Achilles," said Villas-Boas. We are evaluating the situation at the moment — with regards to an operation, which would take four to six weeks to heal. It is a situation that also depends on our ability to have the player in surgery as quickly as possible. That's what we are trying to work on." It's a difficult one because players react differently to different types of surgeon. Scotty prefers to be seen by a Professor Harrison, so we have to wait to see whether we can all get it together as quickly as possible. If that's the case hopefully we will be able to get the Achilles open and see the extent of the injury." — *Internet*

Mourinho to receive career award from Portuguese reporters

Ferguson, speaking in Shanghai ahead of a friendly against Drogba's new team on Wednesday, said he may have pursued the 34-year-old if he had decided against going overseas. Asked if he was ever interested in Drogba joining the Red Devils, Ferguson said: "I think that the decision was his anyway because he said he was going to leave Chelsea and not play in the English league — that eliminated everyone. I could have been."

Drogba decided to join his old Chelsea team-mate Nicolas Anelka at Shanghai, saying he wanted a "new challenge" outside of England's top flight. He made an instant impact on his debut in the Chinese Super League,

setting up his team's equaliser in a 1-1 draw away to Guangzhou R&F on Sunday. United and former England defender Rio Ferdinand said Shanghai will face a test of how much they have developed with their new signings when the teams meet.

"I'm looking forward to it. Obviously there's been a lot of excitement and press coverage about Didier and Anelka coming to Shanghai so it's a great game for both clubs," Ferdinand said. "Shanghai gets to see where they are at, and obviously at this stage it's our pre-season and the main focus for us is to get to another stage of fitness and get through the game unscathed by injuries." — *Internet*

Forlan set for Internacional debut

RIO DE JANEIRO, 24 July — Uruguay international striker Diego Forlan is set to make his debut for Brazilian club Internacional against Vasco da Gama on Saturday.

"Tim will move to the Red Bulls for a nominal fee, subject to agreeing personal terms and passing a medical.

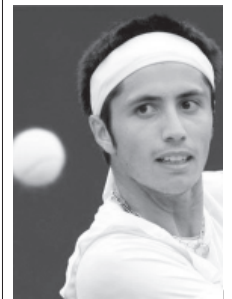
He will travel to the US in the next few days," Everton said on their website

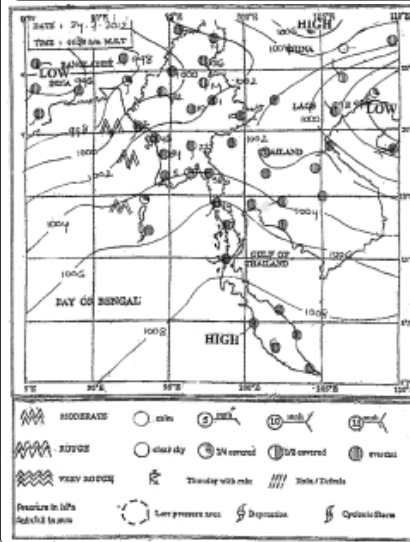

Moscow, 24 July — Russia's new national football coach Fabio Capello received advice on life in Russia from compatriot Luciano Spalletti, who coaches Russia's reigning champions Zenit St Petersburg, local media reported on Monday. Spalletti, "Fabio (Capello) is a great figure and a coach with a tremendous experience," Spalletti was quoted as saying. "He will never develop his outlook relying only on somebody's opinion as his own experience is the most important thing for him." "In general only few Italians have a clear view of the situation in Russia. That's why I told Fabio some things about life in Russia. I hope our conversation

will be helpful for him." Spalletti added that he also introduced some of Zenit players to Capello. "I introduced (Vladimir) Bystrov, who missed Euro 2012 because of an injury and (Alexander) Bukharov, who was also playing for the Russian national squad, to Capello," Spalletti said. "But first of all he was interested in our video footage. Fabio is also going to travel a lot across Russia watching the league's matches to collect his own impressions about the candidates for the national side." "I have a similar approach when I start working in a new team. I believe that only what you see with your eyes is really true information." Russia earlier this month announced it had hired Capello as the new national coach after the squad's bitterly disappointing first round exit from Euro 2012. He is due to sign his contract on Wednesday, officials have said.

Four-time Olympian Venus eyes Rio 2016

LONDON, 24 July—Venus Williams may be about to become the first American tennis star to feature in four Olympics, but she intends to keep playing until the 2016 Rio Games when she will be 36. Williams, the singles gold medallist at Sydney in 2000, and doubles winner with sister Serena in 2000 and 2008 in Beijing, has no intention of calling it quits despite her world ranking having slumped to 69. "I'm aiming for 2016. Serena and I both want to play there. I have played a lot of Olympics and to keep adding to them is amazing," said Venus after her first hit at Wimbledon on Monday. Five-time Wimbledon champion Venus was a first round casualty at the Grand Slam event earlier this month, her worst defeat in south-west London since her 1997 debut. But she and Serena then went on to win their fifth

doubles title at the venue where the London Olympics tennis tournament is taking place. "I had a great Wimbledon. I was very happy with the results and getting the doubles title. You can't win every one in singles," said Venus, whose build-up to Wimbledon had been hit by Sjogren's syndrome, an auto-immune disease, which left her lacking energy.

"Thankfully I have been able to be a champion here, so I am grateful for that and if I could triumph in the Olympics, that would be even more amazing." Venus, 32, said that after her battle to regain her fitness and recover her ranking to boost her Olympic qualification hopes, she rated the London Games as the most important in her career.—Internet

NAY PYI TAW, 24 July—The fourth regular session of the First Pyithu Hluttaw continued for 13th day at Pyithu Hluttaw in Hluttaw Complex, here, today, attended by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 405 MPs.

Regarding the question of U Thein Yi of Htantabin Constituency about **if there is any plan for stability of rice market, keeping fertilizer price down and investigation into proportion of propositions of fertilizer**, Deputy Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation

U Ohn Than replied that rice dealing companies have been formed and are growing quality paddy strains on trial for fetching good price of exported items and increased export revenues. Republic of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry has been taking measures to introduce rice importing technologies from abroad with a view to penetrating international rice market. Currently, Myanmar rice is paid lower than rice from other countries due to its inferior quality. So, it has been focused on cultivation of quality strains competitive with others to be able to fetch same price.

Rice is exported to neighbouring countries through respective border trade camps. Higher price than conventional exportation and ability to transport the commodity into the hands of purchaser in the other countries in time are advantages of exportation through border trade camps, benefitting both farmers and exporters of the country. A total of 30 billion kyats has been funded—10 billion from the State, 10 billion from Central Cooperative Union and 10 billion from Myanmar Rice Industry Association—to form State Rice Reserve Supervisory Committee to purchase rice reserve at a set price, enabling farmers gain reasonable price for their rice. The committee has purchased

100 baskets of monsoon paddy for K 330,000 and 100 baskets of summer paddy for 320,000 and has purchased 13.3267 million baskets of monsoon paddy 1.5455 million baskets of summer paddy, stabilizing the domestic rice market to some extent.

In addition, measures are being taken for easy importation of modern rice milling equipment to be able to produce high-quality rice. Production of rice with the use of modern milling machine would contribute to increased price and competitiveness. The Ministry of Commerce together with rice associations and traders would tour ASEAN countries, African countries and European countries very soon to market Myanmar rice penetrating new markets.

The government has planned to loan fertilizers to farmers through rice dealing companies to ensure farmers have easy access to fertilizer at reasonable price.

Regarding the investigation into composition of nitrogen, phosphorous and potash in fertilizer, the Agriculture Department of the Agriculture and Irrigation Ministry scrutinize the fertilizer to be imported into the country in line with fertilization importation procedures and issue import permits for fertilizers.

Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Brig-Gen Kyaw Zan Myint replied to the question of U Hla Swe of Magway Region Constituency (12) about **if there is any plan to form highway traffic rules enforcement forces to constantly monitor and take actions against recklessly-moving vehicles, humans and animals on Yangon-Mandalay Highway**, the question of U San

Tun of Kachin State Constituency (11) about **if there is any plan to enact certain provision or specific law for enabling Myanmar migrants come back to motherland**, the question of U Than Myint of Taninthayi Region Constituency about **if there is any plan to fulfill the requirements of Mawtaung in Taninthayi Region**.

Regarding the first question, the deputy minister replied that the Construction Ministry is erecting and repairing notice signboards and road signs to enforce traffic rules along Yangon-Mandalay highway. Yangon-Mandalay highway maintenance team comprising 25 superintending engineers (civil) led by the chief engineer (road) under which there is a team consisted of a senior assistant engineer for every 12 miles of the highway to help curb road accidents and to enforce highway rules issued by the Ministry.

Plans are under way to establish new (A) level police station on No. 3 Highway in Hlegu Township, Yangon North District another one in Bayataung Village, Tatkon Township, Nay Pyi Taw Council Area to accelerate measures for security and the rule of law and traffic rules enforcement works and to help reduce road accident death along Yangon-Mandalay Highway. Police station along the highway and the Public Works are increasingly enforcing traffic rules and tightening security along the highway.

Regarding the second question, the deputy minister replied that Myanmar expats in foreign countries for various reasons apply visa for short visit, social visit and for

resettlement in Myanmar.

Those wishing to come back firstly have to contact the Myanmar embassy concerned and fill the application form first which is then submitted to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Ministry of Home Affairs,

Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Immigration and Population are working in coordination enabling Myanmar experts come back home at the invitation of the President.
