**Myanmar's anteroom**

With dilapidated infrastructures and poor utility services, nobody won't believe that Yangon was once "the garden city of the East" famed for its spacious parks and leafy avenues. In rainy seasons, Yangon's roads often flood since box culverts of the city's decades old waste disposal system are blocked.

The city with the largest urban population in Myanmar contributed by emerging satellite towns encapsulating the city centre is prone to urbanization issues. The city's service providers found themselves hard to cope with constantly growing consumption.

Following the government's car import policy reforms, luxury vehicle prices, once merely a display of wealth by elites, have come within the reach of upper middle class. Consequently, the moon surface-alike downtown roads of Yangon which hosts a large segment of the middle-class urban population are congested largely.

Yangon is a city with largest number of colonial buildings in Asia. The Yangon regeneration plan should be built around the ancient buildings which could be transformed into luxury hotels and museums while attaching an immense importance on yuppifying the city.

Recent reports suggest that more gas power plants will be built in the outskirts of Yangon to satisfy growing electricity demand of the city. For the long run, the municipal officials of the seat of Yangon region government should pay more attention on renewable energy sources as most of global cities are trying to acclaim themselves as green cities.

As Myanmar has opened up once again to the outside world, world businessmen and tourists are flocking into the country. Yangon has become the anteroom of Myanmar where almost all business deals are done and the famous cordial welcome is first extended. To attract more visitors, we need to rearrange our anteroom.

NAY PYI TAW, 26 July—A ceremony for holding talks with scholars of Myanmar Computer Federation to improve higher education standard of the universities of computer studies was held at the meeting room of Yangon University of Computer Studies under the Ministry of Science and Technology on 22 July, with an attendance of Union Minister for Science and Technology U Aye Myint.

## Iran accuses Israel of plotting Bulgaria bus attack

UNITED NATIONS, 26 July—Iran's UN envoy accused Israel on Wednesday of plotting and carrying out a suicide bomb attack on a bus in Bulgaria a week ago in which five Israeli tourists were killed.

A suicide bomber blew up the bus in a car park at Burgas airport, a popular gateway for tourists visiting Bulgaria's Black Sea coast, killing himself, the Israeli tourists and the Bulgarian bus driver and wounding more than 30 people.

Israel has accused Iran and the Lebanese Islamist group Hezbollah of the bombing. Iran has denied the accusations.

"It's amazing that just a few minutes after the terrorist attack, Israeli officials announced that Iran was behind it,"

Iran's UN Ambassador Mohammad Khazaei told a UN Security Council debate on the Middle East. "We have never and will not engage in such a despicable attempt on ... innocent people."

"Such terrorist operation could only be planned and carried out by the same regime whose short history is full of state terrorism operations and assassinations aimed implicating others for narrow political gains," Khazaei said. "I could provide ... many examples showing that this regime killed its own citizens and innocent Jewish people during the last couple of decades.—Reuters

## At least 5 missing after tanker explosion off Malaysia's east peninsula

KUALA LUMPUR, 26 July—At least five people were missing after a fire broke out on a tanker early Thursday morning near the docking area of the federal territory of Labuan, an island off Malaysia's east peninsula, its operator said.

Malaysia International Shipping Corporation (MISC) said in a statement that a fire broke out onboard its 38,000 DWT IMO II chemical/palm oil tanker, Bunga Alpina.

"The ship has 29 crew members, of which 23 are Malaysians and six Filipinos. At present, 24 have been safely brought ashore whilst five are still unaccounted for," the statement said.

Sources told Xinhua that the fire broke out after an explosion.

Officials at the local fire-fighting department confirmed the accident, which happened around 2:30 am, but declined to provide further details by saying the rescue operation is still underway. The vessel was alongside the Methanol terminal owned by Malaysia's state oil and gas giant, Petronas when the incident took place, MISC said.—Internet

## Fighter scrambled to intercept aircraft ahead of Games

LONDON, 26 July—Britain's controversial Olympic security procedures swung into action on Wednesday when a fighter jet was scrambled to intercept an aircraft that had entered restricted airspace.

The Typhoon jet was ordered to intercept the aircraft after it failed to contact air traffic controllers, the Ministry of Defence said.

Communications were then restored and the fighter jet told to stand down.

Olympic organizers have been criticised for militarising the Games after missile batteries were installed in residential areas around Olympic sites to guard against aerial attacks. Thousands of troops have also been deployed to secure the Games.

"We can confirm that

one Typhoon launched shortly before 1130 today," a defence ministry spokeswoman said. "This was in response to a commercial aircraft that was out of communication with air traffic control services. Communications were quickly restored. No further action was required."

Security officials are on high alert ahead of and throughout the 27 July to 12 August Games. Experts warn that the Olympics are the type of high-profile event that could be targeted by militants. London transport bombings killed 52 people in 2005, a day after Britain found it had won the right to host the Games.

Olympic teams from countries in or near regions of political turmoil, such as the Israel, are particularly

wary. This year is the 40th anniversary of the 1972 Munich Games attack by Palestinian militants that killed 11 Israeli team members.

## Homemade South Korean satellite to go boldly into space

SEOUL, 26 July—Years of rummaging through back-alley electronics stores will pay off later this year for a South Korean artist when he fulfills his dream of launching a homemade, basement-built satellite into space.

"Making a satellite is no more difficult than making a cellphone," said Song Hojun, 34, who said he built the \$500 OpenSat to show people they could achieve their dreams.

"I believe that not just a satellite, but anything can be made with the help of the Internet and social platforms. I chose a satellite to show that symbolically."

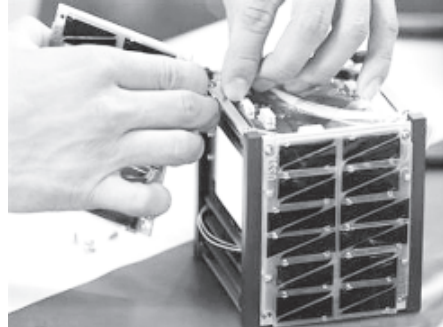
There's a long history of do-it-yourself satellites being launched by universities and scientific groups around the world, as well as amateur radio clubs, but Song said his is the

first truly personal satellite designed and financed by an individual.

An engineering student at university, Song regularly incorporated technology into his art pieces. In a work

called Apple he used light bulbs that would "ripen" — change color from green to red when people take photos of it with flashes.

After working as an intern at a private satellite

company, he came up with the idea for his "Open Satellite Initiative," which in turn led him to contact space professionals from Slovenia to Paris.

"I'm just an individual, not someone working for big universities, corporations or armies, so they open up to me and easily give out information," said Song.

The bespectacled Song spent nearly six years combing through academic papers, shopping online at sites that specialize in components that can be used for space projects, and rummaging through electronic stores hidden in the back alleys of Seoul.

## 168,000 affected by Typhoon Vicente in S China

NANNING, 26 July—Typhoon Vicente has affected 168,000 people in Guangxi Zhuang autonomous region, including 9,900 who were forced to evacuate, local authorities said Wednesday. Vicente, this year's eighth typhoon, made landfall near the city of Taishan in Guangdong province early Tuesday, bringing gales and rainstorms to Guangdong and Guangxi.

Between Tuesday night and Wednesday afternoon, precipitation surpassed 200 mm in several cities in Guangxi, while winds of more than 70 km per hour were recorded in the cities of Nanning, Yulin, Wuzhou and Beihai, according to the region's meteorological centre.

The storm has toppled more than 1,200 farm houses and damaged 8,490 hectares of crops. Direct economic losses totaled 46.6 million yuan (\$7.3 million), the region's civil affairs department said. In Guangdong, three people died and six others were reported missing due to disasters caused by the typhoon, which also caused temporary blackouts and traffic disruptions. Local meteorological authorities in Guangxi said heavy downpours could continue into Friday.

## Seven soldiers killed in S Philippine clash

ZAMBOANGA CITY, 26 July—Seven soldiers died and five others were wounded in Thursday's clash between military and suspected Abu Sayyaf militants in the southern Philippine province of Basilan.

Lt Col Randolph Cabangbang, spokesman of Western Mindanao Command, said the Abu Sayyaf militants initially

harassed the military detachment in Upper Cabangbang, Sumisip town at about 7:30 am local time.

The soldiers were pursuing the first group that initially harassed the army detachment when they bumped into the bigger enemy group. The fighting continued as the troops pursue the militants. Those killed and wounded were retrieved and airlifted to the military base in the city.

According to Cabangbang, the ground troops believed that the group it encountered was the same group responsible in an attack early this month against rubber plantation workers which left six people killed.—Xinhua

**Skydiver Fearless Felix jumps from 18 miles up**

SANTA FE, 26 July — Felix Baumgartner has done it again. On Wednesday, Baumgartner took another stratospheric leap, this time from an altitude of more than 18 miles — an estimated 96,640 feet, nearly three times higher than cruising jetliners. He landed safely near Roswell, NM. His top speed was an estimated 536 mph, said Brian Utley, an official observer on site. It's the second test jump for Baumgartner from such extreme heights and a personal best. He's aiming for a record-breaking jump from 125,000 feet, or 23 miles, in another month. He hopes to go supersonic then, breaking the speed of sound with just his body.

"It has always been a dream of mine," Baumgartner said in a statement following Wednesday's feat. "Only one more step to go." Longtime record-holder Joe Kittinger jumped from 102,800 feet — 19.5 miles — in 1960 for the Air Force. Kittinger monitored on Wednesday's

dry run from a mini Mission Control in Roswell. As he did in March, the 43-year-old Austrian ascended alone in an enclosed capsule lifted by

a giant helium balloon that took off from Roswell. He wore a full-pressure suit equipped with parachutes and an oxygen supply — there's virtually no atmosphere that far up.

It took about 1½ hours to reach his target altitude. He was in free fall for an estimated three minutes and 48 seconds before opening his parachutes. "It felt completely different at 90,000 feet," Baumgartner noted. "There is no control when you exit the capsule. There is no way to get stable." In March, Baumgartner jumped from 71,581 feet, more than 13 miles, saluting before stepping from the capsule. Bad weather earlier this week delayed the second test jump until Wednesday. NASA is paying close attention to this Red Bull-funded project dubbed Stratos, short for stratosphere. The space agency wants to learn all it can about potential escape systems for future rockets.

**Wireless electric-car charging tech to be tested in London**

LONDON, 26 July — Wireless electric-vehicle charging technology is to be tested in London. Chip developer Qualcomm says plug-in charging is too "cumbersome" and its tech could lead to batteries being topped up while cars are being driven. Trials involving an adapted version of Formula 1 car designer Delta Motorsport's E4 coupe electric car will take place before the end of the year. Further tests involving vehicles made by the French manufacturer Renault will follow in 2013.

Inductive charging — which involves using an electromagnetic field to transfer energy between two objects — is less power-efficient than alternatives such as charging posts or battery-swapping stations, but Qualcomm says the difference is only "marginal." The adoption of WECV [wireless electric vehicle charging] technology will lead to a shift in charging behaviour," said Qualcomm.

"Drivers will charge their electric vehicle little and often and potentially use dynamic charging to complement local stationary charging, removing range anxiety. This means that batteries could be smaller with the resulting reduction in electric vehicle cost and weight." The firm added that its technology — dubbed Qualcomm Halo — could be used to keep vehicles' battery charges at between 40-80%, thereby maximising the life expectancy of the equipment. For the moment, it will only work when a vehicle is

stationary. Delta said it had become involved to help it learn more about the innovation. The firm said it expected it to take a day's worth of mechanical modifications to add the new kit to its test vehicles. "It's very straightforward to add the technology," said Delta's technical director Nick Carpenter. "We add a vehicle mounted pad which is connected to a Qualcomm controlled unit which in turn is connected directly to the battery."

**Apple says Samsung patent royalty demands unfair**

SAN FRANCISCO, 26 July — Apple Inc said Samsung Electronics Co Ltd is demanding from the iPhone maker a far higher patent royalty than Apple pays to other companies, at a rate the South Korean company has never sought from any other licensee. The information was contained in portions of an Apple legal brief freshly unsealed in US court on Wednesday, and provides more detail about each side's negotiating position in the run-up to a high stakes trial set to begin next week. In a separate filing, Samsung contended that its royalty demands are consistent with industry norms.

Also on Wednesday, a US magistrate in San Jose, California, ruled that Samsung wrongly let employees delete emails that could have helped Apple pursue its \$2.53 billion lawsuit over disputed patents. The magistrate, Judge Paul Grewal, also said that a jury may hold this matter against the South Korean company. "We intend to appeal Judge Grewal's decision to the trial judge, and if necessary, to the Court of Appeals," Samsung said in a statement. "Samsung remains committed to complying with all information requests from the court." A trial is scheduled to start in the San Jose federal court on 30 July. Apple and Samsung, the world's largest consumer electronics corporations, are waging legal war around the world, accusing each other of patent violations as they vie for supremacy in a fast-growing market for mobile devices. — Internet

**Microsoft reportedly won't let Dell build a tablet for Windows RT launch**

WASHINGTON, 26 July — It's no secret that Microsoft is being much more careful than usual when it comes to which vendors it will let make tablets based on its Windows RT operating system for its initial Windows 8 launch this fall. And according to Unwired View, only four of Microsoft's (MSFT) original equipment manufacturers have been given the green light to make Windows RT tablets so far: Asus, Toshiba, Samsung and Lenovo.

Hewlett-Packard had originally been asked to make a Windows RT tablet, but the company declined the offer last month, thus opening up speculation that Dell might take its place. However, Business Insider's Julie Bort reached out to see whether Dell is actively involved in making a Windows RT tablet this year and has received a rather cagey answer, as Dell would only confirm that it's working on a Windows-based tablet for release at some point in the future and wouldn't go into specifics about specs or release dates.

Bort also mentions that "since Microsoft announced it would be competing with its OEM partners making tablets, Dell has released a bunch of new high-end ultrabooks that can run Linux," meaning relations between Microsoft and Dell might not be the warmest at the moment. — Internet

**Alpha Magnetic Spectrometer claims huge cosmic ray haul**

Geneva, 26 July — The largest-ever experiment in space has reported the collection of some 18 billion "cosmic ray" events that may help unravel the Universe's mysteries. The data haul is far greater than the total number of cosmic rays recorded in a full century of looking to date. Run from a centre at Cern, the Alpha Magnetic Spectrometer (AMS) aims to spot dark matter and exotic antimatter. The astronauts who installed it on the space station in 2011 are in Geneva to see an update on

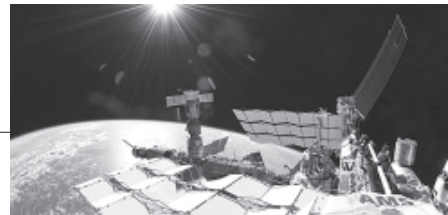
how it is performing. Mission commander Mark Kelly told reporters that AMS was "the pinnacle of the science that the ISS will do". The huge number of events seen by the experiment includes some of the highest-energy particles from the cosmos that we have ever seen. Kelly's flight - the STS-134 mission — was the

last for the shuttle Endeavour before it was retired from the NASA fleet. The crew visited the Payload and Operations Control Centre at Cern on Wednesday, where a shift of six scientists is watching what is whizzing through the AMS 24 hours a day.

AMS deputy spokesman Roberto Battiston told BBC

News that seeing the astronauts back in town was "a great joy". "We are really thankful of these astronauts because we should never forget they put their lives at stake to do something that for us is pure fun — that is our interest, our curiosity," he said. "They have high expectations that the AMS will find something interesting, because they put a lot of effort into it. They feel part of the family." At the heart of the seven-tonne, \$2bn machine is a giant, specially designed magnet which bends the paths of extraordinarily high-energy charged particles called cosmic rays onto a series of detectors, giving hints of what the particles are.

**LG Electronics' profit falls as mobile loses money**

SEOUL, 26 July — LG Electronics reported a lower quarterly profit as its mobile phone division sank to a loss and forecast its earnings to deteriorate further, underlining the challenges for its smartphone business as it struggles with competition from Apple and Samsung. The South Korean company said Wednesday its April-June net income totaled 159 billion won (\$138 million) on revenue of 12.9 trillion won. Quarterly income was up nearly 50 percent from a year earlier but fell 35 percent from the previous three months.

The quarter-on-quarter drop was a source of concern for investors as sales of

consumer electronics are usually stronger in the second quarter. Shares of LG Electronics Inc fell 2.1 percent in Seoul, compared with the benchmark Kospi's 1.4 percent decline. LG, which was unseated by Apple Inc in 2011 as the world's No. 3 mobile phone maker by sales, blamed its lower profit on the mobile division's 57 billion won quarterly operating loss. That partly offset profit from LG's TV business. Basic handset sales declined while expenses to promote its new smartphones went up, LG said.

The mobile business of LG Electronics is being squeezed in both the premium

and low-end markets. Chinese handset makers ZTE and Huawei are aggressively increasing low-cost smartphone sales while Apple and Samsung Electronics Co leave little room for a third player in the top-end market. The second-quarter mobile loss comes after the division briefly enjoyed two consecutive quarters of profit. LG's mobile division lost nearly 1 trillion won in 2010 and 2011 combined as its Optimus smartphone series failed to compete with Samsung's Galaxy phone and Apple's iPhone.

LG said its third-quarter operating profit will moderately decrease from the second quarter, even as sales go up by a small margin. Seasonal demand for home appliances and air conditioners goes down in the third quarter, while sales of TVs and smartphones are expected to rise, David Jung, LG's chief financial officer, told investors. Jung said profitability at the mobile communication business will not be too bad for the rest of the year with new high-end mobile device launches due in North America and Japan.

But he stopped short of guiding investors on when the company can fully turn around

its mobile business, which contributed about half of the company's profit during its heyday. Even as LG plans to expand its mobile market share with its Android-powered smartphones running on a fourth-generation wireless service, analysts are skeptical about its outlook. Sales could falter if mobile chip shortages continue and the launch of the new iPhone, expected in the third quarter, could steal the spotlight from LG's new handset release.

"It is tough to be sure about the recovery in LG's mobile phone business," said Eugene Kim, an analyst at Taurus Securities who has a hold rating on shares of LG Electronics.

Quarterly operating profit from LG's TV business more than doubled from the previous year to 216 billion won. But the amount changed little from the previous quarter. LG is betting on the release of a high-end television that uses an advanced display panel to boost TV profit. The company said TV markets in advanced countries will expand in the second half of this year despite a weak outlook for the global economy. —Internet

**Logitech posts wider Q1 loss as weak demand bites**

LONDON, 26 July — Logitech, the world's biggest computer mouse maker, fell to a deeper first-quarter net loss, missing analyst forecasts, as the company struggles with weak demand amid worries about the global economy. The Swiss-listed firm said it booked a first-quarter net loss of \$52 million, or 32 cents per share, wider than a year earlier net loss of \$30 million, or 17 cents per share.

The company was expected to post a first-quarter loss of \$24.7 million, or 14 cents a share, according to a Reuters Poll. Quarterly sales were \$469 million, down 2 percent from \$480 million a year ago. Excluding the

unfavorable impact of exchange rates, sales were flat compared with the prior year, Logitech said. The Swiss-listed firm has been grappling with weak demand as concerns about the global economy keep shoppers from buying new webcams, speakers and keyboards.

The euro's weakness against the dollar and the fact that computer systems are becoming less dependent on peripheral components hit its figures earlier this year. Logitech has implemented a restructuring plan, and said it continues to expect to benefit from the organizational streamlining and cost savings. Reuters

**Cancer drug flushes out lurking AIDS virus**

WASHINGTON, 26 July — Scientists in the United States said on Wednesday they had used a cancer drug to flush out the AIDS virus lurking dormant in trial patients' white blood cells — a tentative step towards a cure. The ability of the HIV genome, or reproductive code, to hide out in cells and be revived after decades poses a major obstacle in the quest for a cure. Being able to expose the virus in its hiding place would allow scientists to target the host white blood cells in a killing blitz. "It is the beginning of work toward a cure for AIDS," David Margolis, co-author of the study published in the journal Nature, told AFP as the International AIDS Conference was under way in Washington.

HIV is a retrovirus, inserting its DNA into the genome of host white blood cells, CD4+T cells in this case, and turning them into virus factories. Sometimes it goes into hiding in some cells even as others keep on producing. Some 34 million people around the world are living with HIV, which destroys the immune system and has caused about 30 million AIDS-related deaths since the disease first emerged

in the early 1980s. In the latest study, researchers in the United States used the chemotherapy drug vorinostat to revive and so unmask latent HIV in the CD4+T cells of eight trial patients.

The patients were also on antiretroviral drugs, which stops HIV from multiplying but have to be taken for life because they do not kill the virus hidden away in reservoirs. "After a single dose of the drug, at least for a moment in time, (vorinostat) is flushing the virus out of hiding," Margolis said of the trial results — the first drug ever shown to do so. "This is proof of the concept, of the idea that the virus can be specifically

targeted in a patient by a drug, and essentially opens up the way for this class of drugs to be studied for use in this way." The drug targets an enzyme that allows the virus to lie latent.

The researchers cautioned that vorinostat may have some toxic effects and stressed this was merely an early indication of feasibility that had to be explored further. Exactly what would happen after the virus was unveiled in reservoir cells was also not certain, said Margolis. "We know many cells that produce HIV die in the process. We know many cells that produce HIV can be identified and killed by the immune system. As far as we can tell, all

the viruses floating around while patients are taking therapy don't get into cells because they are blocked by the therapy," he said.

Without a host cell, the virus would die within a few minutes. "There is a possibility that this could work. But ... if it is only 99 percent true and one percent of the virus escapes, it won't succeed. That is why we have to be careful about our work and what we claim about it." In a comment published with the study, HIV researcher Steven Deeks said the research provided "the first evidence that ... a cure might one day be feasible". But, as is common with early clinical trials, the study raised more questions than answers — including ethical concerns about giving potentially toxic drugs to HIV-infected people who are otherwise healthy, he said.

"These data from the lab of David Margolis are genuinely exciting for those exploring pathways to achieving a cure for AIDS," Oxford University HIV researcher John Frater told AFP, calling for investment in further research. Internet

**Mexico to vaccinate 10 million birds in flu outbreak**

MEXICO CITY, 26 July — Mexico will start vaccinating some 10 million poultry on Thursday against the highly contagious bird flu strain that has already led to the deaths of five million birds which either fell ill or were slaughtered. "Starting Soon, we are going to vaccinate hens and chicks across the country to put an end to this bird flu epidemic," Mexican President Felipe Calderon said.

The president indicated that the ultimate goal is to have a batch of 80 million vaccinations, so that "in the coming weeks, (Mexico) can end this economic impact on poultry producers." The virus responsible for the outbreak, H7N3, has occasionally affected humans in various parts of the world, according to the United Nations, but has not shown itself to be easily transmittable between humans. Internet

The prices of both eggs and chickens have soared in the wake of the outbreak, leading inflation to rise as well. According to Mexico's national statistics agency, the first half of July saw an inflation rate of 4.45 percent, the highest level in 18 months. The agriculture ministry has said poultry farming "contributes up to 40 percent of the total volume" of the country's livestock production, and the "economic loss" from this epidemic "is and will be irreparable."

The outbreak was first detected on 20 June in the western state of Jalisco. A national animal health emergency was declared at the beginning of July. Health officials keep a close watch on such outbreaks since so-called swine flu broke out in Mexico in 2009. The H1N1 virus spread into a global pandemic that claimed the lives of 17,000 people. ## Specific law for protection of rights of national races people in desperate need

NAY PYI TAW, 26 July—The fourth regular session of the Pyithu Hluttaw continued for 15<sup>th</sup> day at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex, here today, attended by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 411 MPs.

Regarding the question of Daw Nan Se Aua about **whether women can be elected to the post of village administrator if qualified, Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Brig-Gen Kyaw Zan Myint replied that any man or woman has the right to be elected in line with provisions and procedures of election by the supervisory team inclusive of five respected and influential community elders.**

Regarding the question of **taking of census nationwide in 2014** by Daw Win Maw Tun of Yenangyoung Constituency, Union Minister for Immigration and Population U Khin Yi replied that the last nationwide census was taken in 1983 and thus preparation must be made due to lack of experiences over 30 years. The nationwide census would be taken in 2014 through four phases—preparation, conducting survey, compiling records, assessing and publicizing the report. The entire project would take 3 years and 10 months and population facts could be publicized within 2015. Some of the preparation works have been completed and some underway. The

Hluttaw Socio Development Committee was formed to cooperate with the ministry for taking census.

U In Phon San (a) U Intu Phon San of Machanbaw Constituency, U Sai Bo Aung of Muse Constituency, U Htan Lein of Mindat Constituency and U Khun Maung Thaug of Pinlaung Constituency discussed the proposal of U T Kun Myat of Kutkai Constituency about enactment of a law for protection of the rights of national races people submitted at 7<sup>th</sup> day session.

U In Phon San of Machanbaw Constituency discussed that the country was home to diverse national races. The 1947 Constitution prescribed equal rights of the citizens including national races, freedoms, religious rights and social and economic rights. However, the constitution failed to bring about development in border regions where the national races resided, widening the rich and poor gap. Committees for development of broader regions and national races were established at different levels in the time of the Tatmadaw government after 1988. Thanks to the efforts of committees, some regions witnessed development to some extent, but remote regions of national races could not see the same results. **In the time of the incumbent government, Ministry of Border Affairs was established imple-**

**menting transportation, education, health and regional development works in the regions of national races.** However, the ministry had to focus on comprehensive development covering the entire nation including urbanized ones and thus effective actions must be taken for less-developed regions of national races. The government must guarantee duties and rights of national races vested by the Constitution and existing laws.

U Sai Bo Aung of Muse Constituency discussed that it was found that there was still no specific duties

and laws, by-laws, procedures, notifications and instructions for elected national race affairs ministers of regions and states to take care of the affairs of national races concerned. So, it needed to

enact a law protecting the rights of national races to guarantee constitutional rights for the minorities, to build suspicion-free unity among national races people, and to set clear duties of national race affairs ministers. In addition, the law must be enforced to letter.

U Htan Lein of Mindat Constituency discussed that the constitution stated that every citizen has the right to enjoy equality, freedom, and social justice. In addition, it is prescribed that the State shall help develop language, literature, arts and culture of national races; help promote national unity, amity and mutual assistance; help develop socio-economic life inclusive of education, health, economy and transportation and so forth of less-developed national races people. Whether the Union government, region/state government, self-administered division/region can exercise as

prescribed in the constitution and whether people can adhere to provisions of the laws would decide the amount of fruits. The law should be enacted for the benefits of over 100 national races residing in the country.

U Khun Maung Thaug of Pinlaung Constituency discussed that the law was in desperate need at a time when the country was building discipline-flourishing, multi-arty democratic nation and was the longed-for law of the national races people. There was no national race that did not love and cherish own language and cultural traditions and each national race was obliged to preserve them. Some national races had witnessed development and some not yet. In the first meeting of the Union level peacemaking committee, the President instructed that the works of the Union level peacemaking committee could be accomplished rapidly if the legislature

would assess the equal rights and other rights of national races people prescribed by the law and enact related laws. The Hluttaw was required to enact a certain law for protection of rights of national race people in order that dissatisfaction and old attitudes of the national race people such as suspicion over the equality, social justice and freedom could be vanished.

U Maung Toe of Minhla Constituency submitted a bill amending the Union Auditor-General Law.

The Hluttaw decided to discuss the bill and would hand it over to Pyithu Hluttaw Bill Committee to handle it.

Two questions were answered, one proposal discussed and one proposal put forward at today's session.

The session came to an end at 12 noon and the 16<sup>th</sup> day session continues at 10 am tomorrow.

conservation of bio-diversity, promotion of forest farming, and capacity building for human resources development.

Furthermore, AFOCo could be signed at ASEAN+3 Summit held in Bali of Indonesia during November, 2010. The adopted framework would help climate curb change problems, facilitate sustainable development of forest and bio-diversity, rural development and poverty alleviation scheme.

Means of development over-dependent on natural resources are not an option for sustainable development. Green strategies with a focus on low-carbon emission and natural resources conservation were in desperate need. In the meeting, he said that the President specified his discussion on protection of the interest of migrant workers at the meetings between the two countries; NGOs are to carry out the issues that the government cannot undertake; emphasis will be placed on the issues submitted by NGOs; and it is necessary to join hands among government service personnel, social organizations and migrant workers. Next, he met the Thai Minister of Interior and held a discussion on issuance of temporary passports for all Myanmar migrant

workers, urging employers not to hold passports of workers, free travelling, issuance of stay permits over C of I for dependents of migrant workers, creation of learning opportunity for children of migrant workers at schools in Thailand and opportunity for learning monastic education at monasteries in Mahachaing and Surat Thani regions.

After viewing issuance of temporary passport at Bangkok Camp in the afternoon, the Union Minister attended to the needs of Myanmar workers.

In meeting with the Thai Immigration Commissioner, the Union Minister discussed issuance of stay permit with new form of temporary Myanmar passports through one stop service, reduction of visa fee in making temporary Myanmar passport in line with the coordination and prevention against human smuggling in resending the Myanmar migrant workers to border areas due to various reasons.

On 23 July, four employee representatives and one employer representative visited RH Textile Co Ltd in Mahachaing Region of Bangkok, the cold storage of Phatthana Seafood Co Ltd where 1915 employees are working and the cold storage of Thai Union Co Ltd where 10000 employees are working. They met employers and employees and discussed peace in worksite relations, enforcement of worksite disciplines, rights of health and matters related to employers and employees.—MNA

## Land Allotment and Utilization Scrutiny Committee formed for ensuring systematic management of land utilization

### Kalewa Coal-fired Power Plant between Kalewa and Tamu regions under feasibility study

NAY PYI TAW, 27 July—The 15<sup>th</sup> day session of Amyotha Hluttaw continued at the Amyotha Hall of the Hluttaw Complex, here, at 10.15 am today, attended by 208 Amyotha Hluttaw representatives including Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint.

U Swe Aung of Yangon Region Constituency (12) asked **whether there is a plan to consider benefit of farmers who really cultivate and produce crops in forest land.** Union Minister for Environmental Conservation and Forestry U Win Tun replied that although the country has 57 per cent of forest coverage around 1980, it declines to 46.96 per cent based on the calculation in 2011. Thus, emphasis is being placed on designation of forest reserves and protected forests for effectively conserving the forests and for realizing State forest policies to extend 30 per cent land of State as forest reserves.

Since their establishment, the forest lands had not caused losses of houses and property of local people. The present situations are based on squatter activities after designating the forest lands.

With regard to squatter activities as residence, cultivation and slash-and-burn farming in the forest lands, action should be taken against those offenders under the existing forest laws. However, they are local people residing near the forest reserves and they are working their tasks as their owned lands for cultivation. Therefore, the ministry considers in all aspects not to occur unacceptable problems. Thus, the ministry does not take action against the local people for their activities of

entering the forest lands and organizes the local people to establish community forestry through crops plus forest patterns and private forests. Arrangements are being made for applying effective plans not to occur extension of more squatters in the forest land. Action was taken against the persons in some cases under forest law, forest rules and Flora and Fauna Conservation and Environmental Conservation Law.

Okkan, Magari, Thabyu, North Hline Yoma, Hline Yoma hilly forest reserves and South Hline Yoma forest reserves adjacent to Mingala Ward, Chingon, Thanatchaung, Uppon, Phalon Station, Kinpati, Yedwingon, Tabu Yaythoe, Kywebok, Sanywa, Chaungsauk and Hsinsakhan village-tracts of Taikkyi Township were established on 159394 acres of total lands between 1875 and 1880 years.

According to the statistics, a total of 305 acres of squatter, farmland, cropland and others are located in the above-mentioned forest reserves. A total of 5992 acres of private teak and hardwood forest plantations and 37225 acres of other crops are allowed on the forest reserves. The **Land Allotment and Utilization Scrutiny Committee** was formed for ensuring systematic management of land utilization in the nation by implementing land utilization policies and land utilization plans. On completion, land utilization tasks can be undertaken systematically for fulfilling the requirement of agricultural lands of local people and development of the State.

The officials from local

authorities, Forest Department and related departments made field trip inspections, designation of borders for farmlands and putting records on map references in six forest reserves to inspect cultivation of farmlands of local people from village-tracts of Taikkyi Township. The team of authorities allows them to utilize the lands as farmlands only and does not allow them to utilize the lands through other ways and means. Not to extend squatter activity, they will give educative talks to the local people and supervise their tasks.

U Thein Win of Sagaing Region Constituency No 9 asked **whether there is a plan to establish coal-fired power plant in suitable place in coal-produced Kalewa-Tamu region.** Deputy Minister for Electric Power No 1 U Myint Zaw replied that a study on deposit of coal was conducted to implement a 600-megawatt Coal-fired Power Plant Project in the place, seven miles north to Kalewa of Kalay District of Sagaing Region. The study showed that from 1.35 million tons to 1.89 million tons of coal must be used annually for operation of the plant and the adequate coal can be extracted from Paluzawa Coal Mine for the plant. The necessary survey has been conducted by the Ministry of Mines. Paluzawa Mine is one of two coal deposits in Kalay Township where Ministry of Mines has conducted surveys. The deposit has 55.6455 million tons of coal and there remains 55.4466 million tons of coal at the mine by June 2012.

As such, the ministry holds several meetings for ensuring least degradation of environment and for

emphasizing technological issues so as to implement Kalewa Coal-fired Power Plant to be installed with 600-megawatt generating capacity between Kalewa and Tamu regions. Moreover, feasibility study are being conducted. In case, construction of the power plant will be undertaken under procedures.

U Sai Tin Aung of Kachin State Constituency No 5 asked **whether there is a plan to fully disburse agricultural loans to farmers who cultivate above 10 acres of paddy.** Deputy Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation U Khin Zaw replied that the government gives priority to disbursement of agricultural loans to the farmers who work under 10 acres of farmlands because they may face difficulty to spend money on agricultural tasks and increases disbursement of loans year after year. This year, K 50,000 per acre of loans is being disbursed to the farmers.

The government has no plan to disburse loans to farmers who own above 10 acres of farmlands, the farmers who own above 10 acres of farmlands can seek the investment by pawning the whole area of farmland or parts of it in accord with Section 9 (B) of Chapter III of the Farmland Law approved Hluttaws.

Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko submitted a proposal on the **Bill Revoking Public Welfare Services Protection Act** to be considered by the Amyotha Hluttaw. U Mya Ohn of Kachin State Constituency No 8 seconded the proposal. The Hluttaw approved to consider the bill. The representatives wishing to participate in discussions may enlist, not later than 31 July.

Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko submitted a proposal on the

**Bill Revoking the Law Protecting the Peaceful and Systematic Transfer of State Responsibility and the Successful Performance of the Functions of the National Convention against Disturbances and Oppositions** to be considered by the Amyotha Hluttaw. U Thein Hlaing of Sagaing Region Constituency No 8 seconded the proposal. The Hluttaw approved to consider the bill. The representatives wishing to participate in discussions may enlist, not later than 31 July.

Dr Khin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency No 9, U Ohn Tin of Rakhine State Constituency No 10 and U Maung Aye Tun of Rakhine State Constituency No 9 With discussed the proposal on **drawing new law for development of civil tenancy and revocation of 1960 Civil Tenancy Supervisory Act** submitted by U Phone Myint Aung of Yangon Region Constituency No 3.

With regard to the proposal, Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko said that a large number of houses were destroyed in major cities of Myanmar the war time of Second World War. Due to internal insurgencies after regaining Independence, the people from rural areas resettled in urban areas. In consequence, rents of tenancy hiked excessively due to shortage of housings. Therefore, the Civil Tenancy Supervisory Act was promulgated as temporary act in 1946. The temporary act was amended in 1948 and then it was substituted with the 1960 Civil Tenancy Supervisory Act.

The act was not prescribed with equal terms of provisions for problems between landlords and tenancy. The provision that states it shall not collect deposit in addition to rent or the deposit more than one-month rent is not conformity with the present time. As the

provision was a hinderance to expell the tenants, the landlords lose the rights. That is why the act is not conformity with the present system.

In sending a message by the Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw to the President on 2 May 2012, the Ministry of Home Affairs is to seek approval from the Hluttaw, to amend or to substitute nines laws with new ones in line with the rules and regulations. The 1960 Civil Tenancy Supervisory Act is one of these acts. Thus, the 1960 Civil Tenancy Supervisory Act was revoked in accord with the guidance of the President and the ministry coordinates with the Office of Attorney-General of the Union to be able to submit the **Land Tenancy Law (Bill)** in line with Section 156 of the Constitution, and he noted that the proposal should be withdrawn.

Proposer Hluttaw representative U Phone Myint Aung submitted his opinion to put the proposal on record, and the Hluttaw decided to record it.

The Hluttaw session came to an end at 11.35 am and the 16<sup>th</sup> day session will be held at 10 am tomorrow.

At the today's session, three questionnaires were answered, two bills submitted, one bill discussed and recorded.—MNA

## Britain awards 4.5 billion pound trains deal to Hitachi

LONDON/TOKYO, 26 July—Britain has approved a 4.5 billion pound (\$7 billion) contract with a consortium led by Japan's Hitachi (6501.T) to build 92 intercity trains at a newly-built factory in northern England, in a deal which will create more than 900 UK jobs.

The Agility consortium, made up by Hitachi and British construction company John Laing, has long been the preferred bidder for the contract, which the Japanese firm had originally hoped to seal by December 2009.

Hitachi will assemble 596 railway carriages at the factory to be sited in County Durham in north east England, Britain's Department for

Transport said on Wednesday.

The deal will create 730 skilled jobs at the factory, with a further 200 jobs during the site's construction, said British Transport Secretary Justine Greening.

The company will also locate its European rail research and development facilities at the site, a move which would enhance the factory's ability to win further rail contracts across Europe, Britain's Department for Transport said.

The contract has been seen as key to Hitachi's ability to break the dominance of Germany's Siemens, Canada's Bombardier and France's Alstom in the

global railway market.

Hitachi said it aimed to begin production as early as 2016 at a rate of 35 rail cars per month.

The trains will replace existing diesel-powered trains

dating back to the 1970s and 1980s.

The new rolling stock will be a mixture of all-electric and "bi-mode" diesel-electric trains.

## Ocean waves could supply 10 pct of Australia's electricity by 2050

SYDNEY, 26 July—The waves in the ocean could supply about 10 percent of Australia's electricity by 2050, a new study released on Wednesday by the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organization (CSIRO) found.

The national science agency's study found that Australia's ocean energy resources could power a city the size of Melbourne by 2050. Ian Cresswell, director CSIRO Wealth from Oceans Flagship, said CSIRO wanted to understand the potential of the clean and sustainable energy source. "Assessing the opportunities and challenges from resource to the market is a first for ocean renewable

energy in Australia," he said in a media release.

The report of CSIRO found that although wave energy could possibly provide 10 percent of Australia's electricity needs by 2050, there were many economic, technological, environmental and societal challenges that would determine its place in Australia's future energy mix.

The report also found the areas that could benefit from wave energy technology include Perth, the southern coastline and to a lesser extent the east coast of Australia, while tidal technology could supply niche areas such as northeast Tasmania and the Kimberley region in Western Australia.—Xinhua

## UK to rule in October on Pentagon hacker US extradition

LONDON, 26 July—A British computer hacker accused by the United States of breaking into top secret military and space agency networks will learn the result of his six-year fight against extradition within three months, a court heard on Tuesday.

Gary McKinnon faces up to 60 years in jail if convicted in American courts for what one US prosecutor has described as the "biggest military computer hack of all time".

US officials say he knocked out hundreds of military computers in the months after the September 11, 2001 attacks, undermining security and causing damage worth nearly \$1 million.

McKinnon, 46, admits hacking into Pentagon and NASA computers from his bedroom in London, but

says he was only looking for evidence of aliens and UFOs.

He suffers from Asperger's syndrome, a form of autism, and his lawyers say he is too ill to be sent for trial in the United States.

British Home Secretary (interior minister) Theresa May will announce her decision on whether

McKinnon should be sent to the United States for trial by mid-October, a lawyer representing the British government told the High Court in London.

May has been studying medical reports before making up her mind and has been busy supervising the security for the Olympic Games, which open in London on Friday. Her spokesman had no immediate comment on the case.

McKinnon's mother Janis Sharp said the further delay was unacceptable.

"If Theresa May had got an ounce of compassion she would make her decision now, before the Olympics, because she has any number of medical reports - these delays are destroying my son's life," she told reporters outside court.

## Toshiba to cut memory chip production by 30 percent

TOKYO, 26 July — Japan's Toshiba Corp, the standout performer among the country's battered chip-makers, plans to cut production of flash memory chips by 30 percent after being caught by oversupply and tumbling prices. Toshiba's NAND flash memory has been a rare bright spot among Japan's fading chip industry, which has struggled to upgrade old plants and make the big investments needed to compete with aggressive overseas rivals.

Japan's last remaining player in the dynamic random memory (DRAM) market, Elpida Memory Inc, filed for bankruptcy in February, while Renesas Electronics Corp is scrambling to avoid the same fate by cutting its workforce and closing half of its domestic plants. Toshiba, the world's No. 2 maker of NAND

flash memory chips after Samsung Electronics, said on Tuesday it will slash production at its Yokkaichi plant in western Japan due an oversupply of chips for USB drives and memory cards.

"I'm a little surprised that they're cutting that much. Everyone knows that demand has not been as strong as expected," said David Motozo Rubenstein, senior

technology analyst at Religare Global Asset Management in Tokyo. "Apple's their biggest customer, with the new iPhone likely to come out later this year you would think they would build a little inventory for that," he added. Analysts estimate that more than half of Toshiba's NAND chip output ends up in Apple's blockbuster iPhones.—Reuters

## Sweden's anti-immigrant sniper guilty of two murders

STOCKHOLM, 26 July—A Swedish man who fired sniper shots at foreign-looking people was found guilty of two counts of murder on Tuesday, highlighting racial tensions in the Nordic region traumatized by Norwegian mass killer Anders Behring Breivik. Peter Mangs was arrested in 2010 after a 12-month shooting spree in the southern Swedish city of Malmo.

The court found the 40-year-old Mangs guilty of the 2009 murder of a Swedish-born woman who was sitting next to an immigrant friend in a car when Mangs fired multiple shots.

He was also convicted of murdering an Iranian-born

man by shooting him in the chest in his apartment in 2003.

Mangs was also found guilty of four attempted murders during 2009 and 2010.

The court heard how one victim was shot through a window while working out in a gym and another while waiting for a bus. Some of the shootings were in broad daylight.

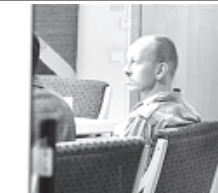
Mangs will be sentenced, probably in September, after a psychiatric evaluation determines whether he should be committed to a psychiatric institution or jail.

He had pleaded not guilty to all the serious charges, but guilty to two counts of causing property damage and he faces a possible life term.

Prosecutors said Mangs was obsessed with guns, hostile to immigrants and had an interest in Sweden's "Laser man", a racist gunman called John Aunonius who used a rifle equipped with a laser sight to shoot immigrants in the early 1990s. He was convicted of murder and nine attempted murders in 1994.

Like the July 2011 rampage by Breivik who killed 77 people in what he said was a stand against Muslim immigration, the Malmo attacks expose a vein of racist extremism in a region which prides itself on tolerance.

Roughly 40 percent of the population of Malmo, Sweden's third-largest city,

are first or second-generation immigrants and one in three is unemployed, compared with a national jobless rate just over 8 percent.

The sniper attacks have added to the city's reputation for crime, alongside a spate of shootings police have attributed to gang crime.

## US sanctions target Mexican drug lord's wives, business network

WASHINGTON, 26 July—The United States targeted Mexican drug lord Juan Jose Esparragoza Moreno on Tuesday by freezing the US assets of his two wives and other family members as well as those of his shopping mall, gas stations and other businesses.

A statement from the US Treasury said it was blacklisting 10 people linked to Moreno, a leader of Mexico's Sinaloa drug cartel, prohibiting Americans and US companies from doing business with them.

The department targeted

businesses in Mexico Moreno operates with one of his wives and her four children, including a residential community, a shopping mall and an industrial park.

It also blacklisted seven gas-station firms controlled by one of Moreno's other wives.

Moreno, also known as El Azul, was indicted on drug-trafficking charges by a Texas court in 2003 and is wanted in both the United States and Mexico. Both countries offer monetary rewards for information leading to his arrest.—Reuters

**Seven coal miners dead after explosion in northern Mexico**

MEXICO CITY, 27 July—An explosion on Wednesday in a coal mine in northern Mexico killed seven miners, officials said, highlighting lax safety conditions in small mines that are often poorly regulated.

Emergency services brought the bodies of the men, aged between 20 and 39 years old, to the surface after an hours-long rescue effort, said Juan Antonio Ibarra, a emergency services official in the coal-mining state of Coahuila.

"Sometimes these mines don't have the appropriate security measures," said Ibarra. Ibarra said a pocket of

gas likely caused the explosion that occurred 246 feet (75 meters) underground.

The rescue operation, which involved up to 50 people, had moved slowly because of the need to ventilate the mine to prevent another explosion, Ibarra said.

The "pozito," or little hole, coal mine, which is privately operated by the El Progreso mining company, faced fines and sanctions in past, the Mexico's labour ministry said in a statement.

The mine had been inspected 16 times since 2009 and access restrictions were enacted as recently as June after inspectors found it lacked emergency exits, the labour ministry added.

"The government pledges to continue inspections of high-risk mines across the country," the statement said.

The company could not immediately be reached for comment.

Men have mined the largely unregulated pozito mines that dot Coahuila for more than a century.

A 2006 methane explosion at the much larger Piedras Negras mine, owned by Grupo Mexico (GMEXICO:BMX), killed 65 miners.—Reuters

**Dozens stranded over Thames as cable car breaks down**

LONDON, 26 July—Dozens of travellers were left stranded high above the River Thames after London's newly unveiled cable car broke down in sweltering heat on Wednesday.

The 45 million pound system that links two Olympic venues ground to a halt for over 30 minutes.

"All passengers were safely back in the terminal by 12:18 pm and water and first aid were made available to them. We would like to apologize to anyone affected."

The cable car, which connects the O2 Arena in Greenwich with the ExCel exhibition centre at the Royal Docks in east London, was launched to great fanfare by London mayor Boris Johnson last month.

Some passengers took to social media site Twitter to vent their frustration.

One, Alastair Owens, posted a photo of the stationary cable cars and tweeted: "London Emirates cable car has broken down and we're dangling mid air over the docks — seem to be evacuating..." "Can see cable cars closest to ground have been evacuated, but we in mid air are being told nothing."

**7 people killed in blast in NW Pakistan**

ISLAMABAD, 26 July—At least eight people including two children were killed and 20 others got injured on Thursday in a bomb blast in Pakistan's northwestern tribal region of Bajaur, local media reported.

According to local media, the blast took place in the main market of the Salarzai area of Bajaur Agency, Pakistan's northwestern restive region bordering Afghanistan.

In the blast, one person was killed on the spot while over two dozen others were injured who were quickly shifted to the Pusht Headquarters Hospital where seven of them succumbed to their injuries.

People were busy with shopping when the blast hit the market with a big bang.

The nature of the blast and its intensity were unknown yet but officials speculated that it was either an improvised explosive device (IED) or a remote-controlled blast.

At least six shops and a couple of vehicles were also destroyed due to the impact of the blast.

Soon after the blast security forces cordoned off the area and started a search operation in the nearby areas to arrest the suspects.

No militant group or organization had claimed responsibility for the blast yet.

**Chinese city in \$130 billion economy stimulus plan**

BEIJING, 26 July—The government of Changsha, the capital of central China's Hunan Province, has launched an 829 billion yuan (\$130 billion) investment stimulus programme to bolster the local economy, state media has reported.

The money would be spent on 195 projects, including airport, subway and urban infrastructure facilities, as well as developing energy efficient industries, said a report by the official China News Service on Wednesday.

The government of Changsha, a city known for its machine-making and non-ferrous metal industries, would also speed up financial reform and innovations, said the report, which provided no details about how the program would be financed. The China News Service paraphrased Chen Runer, the Communist Party secretary of Changsha, saying that economic pressure on the city could not be ignored, despite relatively stable growth in the face of global headwinds, and it was time for initiative.

There was no reference to the programme's existence on the government of Changsha's website on Thursday.

Zhang Zhiwei, chief China economist at Nomura in Hong Kong, calculates that the headline number on the stimulus plan is worth 147 percent of Changsha's nominal GDP in 2011, or 1.8 percent of China's national economic output.

Even if spread over five years, Zhang says the implied investment would be equivalent to 46 percent of total annual

fixed asset investment in Changsha.

Skeptics say a programme on that scale is implausible and could not be properly financed with China's banks still nursing bad loans worth an estimated 2-3 trillion yuan after local governments racked up debts of 10.7 trillion yuan in the wake of Beijing's nationwide stimulus program unveiled in 2008.—Reuters





### Tote bags express Olympic dissatisfaction

A British designer says his line of sarcastic tote bags for London residents annoyed by the Olympic Games is proving popular.

Toby Leigh said he took great care not to violate any Olympic copyrights when he created the totes, which are modeled on the London 2012 logo but do not contain the word "Olympics" or any associated symbols, *The Sun* reported on 24 July.

"You can't use the words London 2012 or the Olympic rings, but they can't copyright the word London," Leigh said. "The typeface isn't the same typeface either."

The bag slogans include "They're all on steroids," "I'm renting my flat to a fat American family" and "It only took me three hours to get to work this morning."

Leigh said sales have been so brisk the bags have temporarily sold out.

### Magazine compiles exam answer mistakes

A London-based higher education magazine has released the entries in this year's "exam howlers" contest, which seeks to find the funniest test mistakes.

*Times Higher Education* said the entries in this year's contest, which are submitted by professors, include a sentence about the time "Stalin began to build a buffet zone in Eastern Europe," rather than a "buffer zone," and a student's statement that

during the Middle Ages, "most books were written on valium," rather than vellum.

"Spain was a very Catholic country, since Christianity had been taken there in the third century BC," wrote one student, while another, submitted by the same professor, spoke of "Pope Paul V, himself a Catholic." The winner of the contest is scheduled to be announced in next week's issue of *Times Higher Education*.

"It would be highly unlikely that JK Rowling will not get permission for these tree houses," a council source said, "They are only for her children to play in, she's not seeking permission for residential permission for them."

Liverpool. "We did some good things," Roma coach Zdenek Zeman said through a translator. "We were well-placed, but we still lack 90 minutes." Liverpool was without captain Steven Gerrard because rules require rest following international tournaments. Luis Suarez (Uruguay) is scheduled to play at the London Olympics and also isn't on the North American tour for Liverpool.

The match was played in the home of the Boston Red Sox, owned by Fenway Sports Group—also the owner of Liverpool. There was a sea of red in the recently turned 100-year-old ballpark, but it wasn't red for the Red Sox. For one night, Fenway was transformed into the home of Liverpool's fans. The usual Red Sox jerseys worn by fans with the names and numbers on the backs reading: "Ortiz 34" and "Pedroia 15" were missing and a number of "Gerrard 8" and "Suarez 7" jerseys filled the park.

"It was incredible. I told them before, 'You'll be able to tell your grandkids you played football at Fenway Park,'" Liverpool coach Brendan Rodgers said. The match was dubbed "Football at Fenway 2012" and it had the flavor of one at Anfield. The media meal also was accordingly "fish and chips"—an English staple.— Internet

## Japan off to winning start in Olympic women's soccer

COVENTRY, 26 July — World champions Japan got off to a winning start at the London Olympic Games women's soccer tournament when they beat Canada 2-1 on Wednesday. Japan dominated throughout the match with better individual skills and more fluent teamwork. Winger Nahomi Kawasumi and playmaker Aya Miyama scored in the first half. Melissa Tancredi pulled one back for Canada after the interval, but they could make no more troubles for the confident Japanese girls. Britain's women's team began their campaign in Cardiff with a 1-0 win over New Zealand.

Team GB played better in the first half after a shaky start and midfielder Anita Asante went close three times. Controlling the pace of the game, Britain broke the deadlock in the second half as defender Stephanie Houghton netted a fine free-

kick from just outside the area in the 64th minute. A horrible defensive mix-up gave New Zealand a great chance to level the scores less than ten minutes later as two defenders collided to put Sarah Gregorius through on goal, but her tame shot was easily saved by Karen Bardsley.

The United States staged

a spectacular comeback as they beat France 4-2 after lagging 2-0 behind. Alex Morgan scored twice. The reigning Olympic champions looked in trouble at Glasgow's Hampden Park when Gaetane Thiney and Marie-Laure Delie handed France a 2-0 lead after 13 minutes. However, Abby Wambach's header and a

cool finish from Morgan brought the score level before half-time and further goals from Carli Lloyd and Morgan early in the second half gave the Americans a deserved victory. Later, Brazil went top of Group E as they opened their Olympic campaign in style with a comfortable 5-0 victory over tournament newcomers Cameroon at the Millennium Stadium.

Early goals from Francielle and Renato Costa put Brazil in control, before captain Marta with a brace and substitute Cristiane sealed victory. Sweden beat South Africa 4-1 after a first-half scoring spree in their Olympic Games Group F clash at the City of Coventry Stadium. The DPR Korean team took the field an hour late - after a protest over the use of the ROK flag by mistake in a pre-match presentation - to beat Colombia 2-0 with two goals from Kim Song-Hui.

## Fearsome Amanar may hold key to women's gold

LONDON, 26 July — It sounds like an ancient civilization, or perhaps a villain from the Indiana Jones films, but the Amanar could hold the key to glory in the women's gymnastics at the London Olympics. One of the most fiendish vaults in the women's event, the Amanar requires gymnasts to perform two and a half twists in mid-air after producing a back handspring onto the vault. The more orthodox double-twisting Yurchenko vault—named after Soviet gymnast Natalia Yurchenko—requires only two twists to be completed, and the extra half twist in the Amanar makes all the difference.

With the vault 10cm lower for the women than it is for the men, female competitors are not as high in the air when they spring into their salto, giving them less time to introduce twists and tucks to their routine. The Amanar also necessitates a blind landing, as the final half twist obscures the gymnasts' view of the floor and means that they finish their vault facing away from the apparatus. "A lot of people don't think that a half twist is that much, but it's a lot harder," said Jordyn Wieber of the United States, the reigning women's all-around world champion, in a *New York Times* interview earlier this month.

"It takes a while to master it." It is not a vault for the faint-hearted. Quite apart from the terror of not being able to see the floor until the

very last moment, the final twist exerts extreme pressure on the knee and ankle joints of the gymnast. Russia's Aliya Mustafina can testify to the Amanar's menace, having torn the anterior cruciate ligament in her left knee when attempting the vault at last year's European Championships. It remains to be seen whether she will attempt the Amanar in London, but Wieber certainly will. Only the Americans boast a team of five female gymnasts who can all perform the Amanar, with the graceful McKayla Maroney—who took gold on the vault at last year's World Championships—arguably

the finest exponent.

The Amanar is named after Romanian gymnast Simona Amanar, the three-time Olympic champion, who unveiled a rusty version of it to the world at the 2000 Games in Sydney. It has a 6.5 difficulty rating—0.7 points higher than the double-twisting Yurchenko—which means it is a vault that confers a serious advantage upon any gymnast brave enough to pull it off. With the vault a feature of the all-around competitions for both teams and individuals, as well as an event in its own right, the Amanar looks set to deliver a decisive twist in the tale at the O2 Arena.— Internet

## Roddick up for Olympic glory on his favorite surface

LONDON, 26 July — Andy Roddick from the United States is eagerly awaiting the London 2012 Olympic Games tennis tournament which will be played at Wimbledon on grass, one of his favorite surfaces. It's the first time since tennis was reintroduced to the Games as a medal sport (at Seoul 1988) that it will be played on grass. Roddick reached the men's singles final at the Wimbledon Championships three times during his career—in 2004, 2005 and 2009.

"I'm excited the Olympics are on grass as it's a surface that I favor," he said. "I've been looking forward to it." "I'm curious to see what it will feel like. It's two-out-of-three sets until the final. Two-out-of-three sets on grass is a crapshoot, so I'm excited. Anything goes there."

Roddick, who last competed in the Games at Athens 2004, added: "You are playing for something different. Normally we deal in very selfish terms as a tennis player, especially as a singles player.— Internet

**North Korea incident overshadows action**

CARDIFF, 26 July — A major diplomatic incident marred the first day of competition at the London Olympics on Wednesday when the North Korea women's soccer team walked off after the South Korea flag was mistakenly displayed before their match against Colombia. The error occurred in Scotland at Glasgow's Hampden Park stadium which was hosting one of the day's six matches kicking off the women's tournament and led to a lengthy delay before the game eventually started.

defeated Canada 2-1 and hosts Britain overcame New Zealand 1-0. Brazil, among the favorites for gold, thrashed Cameroon 5-0 and Sweden, another possible medalist, thumped South Africa 4-1.

But the drama in Glasgow marked a day in which sporting action began around Britain two days before the official opening ceremony in London on Friday. The trouble started when the South Korea flag was shown on a giant screen before the kickoff of the Group G match at Hampden Park, one of five venues hosting games outside London, and Olympic organizers had to issue an apology.

"The South Korean flag was shown in the video package on the screen before the kickoff and the North Koreans were naturally very upset about that," Hampden Park media manager Andy Mitchell told Reuters. "We

have made a full apology to the team and the North Korean NOC (National Olympic Committee). A genuine mistake was made for which we apologize. Steps will be taken to ensure it does not happen again." When asked if he thought it was an accident, North Korea coach Sin U-gun was not so sure and said he would ask the organizers the same question.

"We were angry because our players were introduced as if they were from South

Korea, which may affect us greatly as you may know," he said. "Our team was not going to participate unless the problem was solved perfectly and fortunately some time later, the broadcasting was corrected and shown again live so we made up our mind to participate and go on with the match," he added. "If this matter cannot be solved, we thought going on was nonsense. Winning the game cannot compensate for that thing." — Reuters

**Stimulant tablets worth K 900 million seized in Myitkyina**

MYITKYINA, 26 July—Supervisor Police Captain Sai Thein Zaw and party of Myitkyina Special Anti-Drug Squad managed purchase of large amount of narcotic drugs. Of them, Police WO Khin Zaw took the appearance of drug buyer.

At about 7.30 pm on 21 July, they received call of traffickers to inform them to wait on Mandalay-Myitkyina Union Highway beyond the Akye checkpoint in Akye Village of Myitkyina Township. Together with witnesses, the authorities seized the traffickers and searched them under the law.

The authorities seized 300,000 stimulant tablets weighing 30 kilos worth K 900 million and K 900,000 in cash of proceeds from selling narcotic drugs, one China-made ZTE mobile phone with number of 09-49215905 in the rare trunk of driver Thuang Myint (a) Meliho, citizenship scrutiny card with U Meholi, one green Mazda jeep and wheel tax.

Thuang Myint (a) Meliho confessed that the stimulant tablets were trusted by U Yan Hson (a) Yan Saw of Chanmyathazi Township of Mandalay Region.

At present, action was taken against Thuang Myint (a) Meholi, 54 at Myitkyina No 1 Police Station under Maya (1) 65/2012 and 15/19(a)/20(a)/21 of narcotic drug and psychotropic substances law. Investigation is in process to arrest Yan Son (a) Yan Saw.
