NAY PYI TAW, 7 Aug—President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein received a delegation led by Director-General of UNESCO Ms Irina Bokova at the Credentials Hall of the Presidential Palace here at 2 pm today.

Also present on the occasion together with the President were Union Minister for Foreign Affairs U Wunna Maung Lwin, Union Minister at the President Office U Soe Maung, Union Minister for Science and Technology U Aye Myint, Union Minister for Education Dr Mya Aye and heads of department.

At the meeting, President U Thein Sein extended greetings, saying that he and his party extended a warm welcome to the delegation led by Her Excellency; that Her Excellency while in Myanmar would be able to observe Myanmar culture and traditions to a certain extent.

Nowadays, Myanmar is walking on the democratic path towards a new era through peaceful transition till reaching a new system. In fact, the country has already expected a lot of difficulties and hindrances in her democratization process, and until now, it is braving all kinds of challenges with firm resolve to reach the public aspired goal and to achieve greater regional and global recognition and respect as a democratic state, come hell or high water.

The President went on to say that the government elected by people is committed to closely cooperating with UN agencies and is trying its utmost for flourishing of democracy in the nation; that in the process the government is giving priority to peace and stability of the State, and in an effort to bring an end the armed conflicts that were rife since 1948, it is now keeping in touch with ten ethnic armed groups out of 11 and signed some peace agreements with them; that as those armed groups are in border areas, continued efforts are to be made for development of education and health sectors in the regions when peace prevails; and that in this context, the country is to enlist the strength of UN agencies.

The President said that all-out efforts have been made for creating job opportunities for the people, adding that due to economic sanctions imposed against the country for over two decades the country has seen rare job opportunities; that at present, as the Western countries relaxed economic sanctions to a certain degree, unemployment will decrease all the more if there are foreign investments; that at that time, there will require skilled workers and the country expects vocational training from UNESCO since it is providing such kind of training.

Since time immemorial, literature and culture have been flourishing in the country, and over 100 national races have been able to safeguard their literature and culture up to date, the President disclosed. He said that Myanmar has been able to continue safeguarding the Shwedagon Pagoda dating back to 2600 years in Yangon and cultural heritage dating back to over 1000 years in Bagan; that the country is hoping to gain technical assistance and cooperation from the UNESCO in order to preserve excavated cultural heritages of Pyu period in the nation; and that Myanmar would like to express thanks to the UNESCO for its assistance providing in Nargis storm in 2008 and disaster mitigation training.

## Hiroshima marks anniversary of atomic bombing

B-29 bomber named Enola Gay dropped an atomic bomb on 6 Aug. 1945, turning the city into a nuclear inferno and killing an estimated 140,000 in the final chapter of World War II.

At 8:15 am (2315 GMT), the time of detonation, the toll of a bell set off a moment of silence. Pedestrians came to a standstill and bowed slightly, joining their hands in prayer under scorching sunshine. "On this day, in this city, let me proclaim again: there must never be another nuclear attack—never," said Angela Kane, UN high representative for disarmament affairs, reading a message from Secretary General Ban Ki-moon.

"Such weapons have no legitimate place in our world. Their elimination is both

morally right and a practical necessity in protecting humanity." Some 50,000 people attended the official ceremony, while thousands of others joined demonstrations, marches, forums, and concerts held across the city, a long-time focal point for the global movement against nuclear weapons.

Among the attendees was Clifton Truman Daniel, 55, grandson of former US president Harry Truman, who authorised the bombing of Hiroshima and the port city of Nagasaki three days later.

The Allied powers have long argued that the bombings brought a quick end to the war by speeding up Japan's surrender, preventing millions more casualties from a land invasion planned for later in the year. Daniel is the

first Truman relative to attend the anniversary event in Japan. Around 700 people including atomic bomb survivors and evacuees from the Fukushima area also staged an anti-nuclear rally, the latest in a series of protests triggered by last year's atomic crisis.

## Chinese diplomat inaugurated as UN under-secretary-general

UNITED NATIONS, 7 Aug—Wu Hongbo, a senior Chinese diplomat, has been officially sworn in as UN under-secretary-general for economic and social affairs here on Monday. The inauguration ceremony, hosted by the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, was held at the UN headquarters. Wu Hongbo, 60, who used to serve as Chinese ambassador to Germany since 2009, was appointed by Ban in May as the under-secretary-general for the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs.

He is successor to Sha Zukang, also a seasoned Chinese diplomat to the UN who held this position since 2007. It is a very important issue how to coordinate social and economic development in order to make a better world for generations to come, which will also be one of his work priorities, Wu told *Xinhua* after the ceremony.

"My team and I will work hard within the UN framework, cooperate with member states and other international

organizations with a view to implementing objectives of "Rio+20" summit and make relevant proposals and arrangements for the development strategy of post-2015 period," said Wu.

As for the objectives for sustainable development, the main theme of the UN Rio+20 summit, Wu said the Millennium Development Goals is mainly focused on some developing and poor countries, but the sustainable development goals involve social, economic and environmental areas, which are believed to have a wider range than the Millennium Development Goals.

It is necessary to explain to the developing countries that sustainable development objectives will not lead to reduction of help and assistance for them, said Wu, who added that it is also important to pay attention to protecting the interests of developing and the least developed countries in practical work.

## Israel returns bodies of Egypt attackers

JERUSALEM, 7 Aug—Israel has returned the bodies of six gunmen, involved in the killing of 16 Egyptian troops during a raid on both sides of the border, to its Arab neighbour, Israeli military sources told AFP on Tuesday. The six were sent back overnight Monday, they said.

The Israeli army said in a statement that the Kerem Shalom border crossing between Israel, Egypt and Gaza, which the attackers breached in Sunday's raid, was reopened on Tuesday morning. In Sunday's attack, 35 gunmen in Bedouin clothing opened fire on Egyptian troops before

crossing into the Jewish state in an armoured vehicle, Egyptian officials said.

Israel said five gunmen were killed on its side, adding that the armoured vehicle was destroyed by helicopter fire. Israeli media said that the remains of a sixth man was recovered from an explosive-laden pickup truck which

blew up as it tried to negotiate barriers at the border crossing. The Egyptian army vowed on Monday to "avenge" the killings. Egypt also closed until further notice its Rafah crossing with the Gaza Strip, the only crossing to and from the territory not controlled by Israel.—Internet

## Volcano eruption in New Zealand's central North Island causes road closures and flight cancellations

WELLINGTON, 7 Aug—Hundreds of travelers have been left stranded after the eruption of Mt Tongariro caused road closures and flight cancellations in New Zealand's North Island.

The volcano erupted about 11:50 pm local time on Monday—its first eruption for more than a century, spewing ash from the Te Maari craters on the northern side of the mountain and prompting a threat warning for the central North Island. Several Air New Zealand flights to airports east of Mt Tongariro, including Gisborne, Rotorua, Taupo and Napier, along with Palmerston North, were delayed or canceled following the eruption, affecting flights to and from

Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch.

Air New Zealand general manager of airline operations and safety David Morgan said on Tuesday the airline is working with the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), MetService and other authorities to make adjustments to its flight routes and altitudes to ensure its aircraft remain clear of ash and keep travelers flying safely.

The Desert Road (State Highway 1) and SH46 west of Rangipo have reopened after being closed early on Tuesday, while ash has also been reported on SH5 near Te Haroto. Moteliers in nearby Waiouru, Turangi and Tokaanu told NZ NewsWire they had not been affected by

ash, but there was a sulphur-like smell in the air and dark clouds near Mt Tongariro.

Police were alerted to the eruption shortly before midnight by a member of the public who reported seeing "flame-like explosions" and a cloud of ash coming from "a new hole in the side of the mountain".—Internet

There have been no reports of injuries or damage. Civil Defense said the eruption could pose a threat to Waikato, Hawke's Bay, Gisborne, Manawatu, Wanganui, Bay of Plenty and Taranaki. Michael Rosenberg, a volcanologist from New Zealand government geological agency, GNS Science, told Radio New Zealand the situation at the mountain was

not yet clear. "For the moment, things are quiet [but that] doesn't necessarily mean that the eruption is over and done with - it could reactivate at any time so we're watching pretty closely," he said. "It's possible that this could be the start of a much longer episode, or alternatively it could be the end. We just don't know," Xinhua

Lenovo unveils lighter, quicker ThinkPad laptop

BEIJING, 7 Aug — Lenovo has unveiled a lighter, quicker ThinkPad notebook computer inspired by the convenience of tablets and smartphones. The Chinese computer maker displayed the new ThinkPad X1 Carbon on Monday and said it would go on sale later this month. A Lenovo vice president, Dilip Bhatia, said it will have a longer battery life and lighter weight. He said that was in response to demands by customers who want a tablet's convenience but need a notebook's wider range of functions. Lenovo acquired the ThinkPad brand with IBM Corp's personal computer unit in 2005. Lenovo passed Dell Inc last year to become the second-largest PC manufacturer after Hewlett-Packard Co. INTERNET

Apple Senior VP: Steve Jobs considered building an iCar

NEW YORK, 7 Aug — Apple has made some pretty revolutionary new products over the last decade. It absolutely owned the MP3 player market with the release of the iPod. Then, it dominated the phone market with its incredibly popular iPhone. Soon after, Apple won the tablet wars with its iPad. 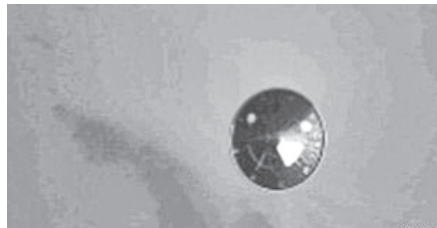

Rover shoots movie during descent

PASADENA, 7 Aug — Images that the Curiosity rover took of the surface of Mars as it made its historic descent on Monday (GMT) have now been released. NASA has provided almost 300 thumbnails from a sequence of pictures that will eventually be run together as a colour hi-def movie. Visible in the timelapse is the heatshield discarded by the vehicle as it neared the ground. So too is the dust kicked up by the rover's rocket-powered crane. It was the crane that finally settled the robot on to the surface. A signal confirming the Curiosity rover had landed on Mars was received here at mission control at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory at 05:32 GMT; 06:32 BST on Monday (22:32 PDT Sunday). The vehicle — also known as the Mars Science Laboratory (MSL) — put down in a deep equatorial depression known as Gale Crater. Pictures from the Mars Descent Imager (Mardi), even in their thumbnail form, have now allowed engineers to work out Curiosity's precise position on the planet — a latitude of -4.5895 and a longitude of 137.4417. The full set of high-resolution pictures from Mardi will take some weeks to download. The mission team has also got its best view yet of Mount Sharp, the 5.5km-high peak sitting in the middle of Gale. This

angle in view and therefore distorted, but image processing software has been used to correct the geometry. The mountain is the ultimate destination for this \$2.5bn (£1.6bn) mission. Satellite data has indicated that sediments at the base of Mount Sharp were laid down in the presence of abundant water. Curiosity, with its sophisticated suite of 10 instruments, will study those rocks to try to determine if ancient environments on Mars were ever favourable for life. Released earlier on Monday was a spectacular shot acquired not by the rover but of the rover. This came from one of the US space agency's satellites at the Red Planet — the Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter. MRO played a key role in Monday's landing by recording telemetry from the robot as it approached the ground. But NASA also tasked it with trying to get a picture of the new arrival. The rover is seen when still inside its protective shell. Moments after this image was acquired, the vehicle would have dropped out of the capsule to ride its rocket-powered crane to the base of the crater. The resolution in the picture is such that it is even possible to pick out the discarded heatshield. The mission team is now in its first full day of Martian operations (Sol 1). One of the key activities will be to deploy Curiosity's high-gain antenna. This unit will allow the vehicle to talk direct to Earth, in addition to relaying data via satellites like MRO. INTERNET

High flying technology to map Peru ruins

LONDON, 7 Aug — Archaeologists in Peru are getting ready to fly an unmanned craft that could radically speed up data gathering at historical sites. Usually, "mapping" is an extremely time consuming process and can take several years to complete. New technology developed by archaeologists and engineers from Vanderbilt University, in the US, should accelerate this process. The device will be tested later this month at the Mawchu Llacta site. By including cameras, Geographic Information System (GIS) technologies and programming specific flight algorithms to an unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) developed by Aurora Flight Sciences, Professors Julie Adams and Steven Wernke hope to three-dimensionally map the archaeological site. "To say anything about past societies—past social dynamics—we need to be able to place the material traces of past peoples in their fullest context possible. Mapping is therefore at the core of archaeological research," Prof Wernke told BBC News. Mapping areas is often labour intensive and the site where the system will be tested would usually take about six months over several years to document. The new UAV should enable the team to map the area in minutes, once the system is perfected. The site will be a test of the UAV's flight capabilities. "Mawchu Llacta is located at [a] high altitude of 4,100m (13,450ft), [making it] a good site for testing the upper altitude limits of current UAV technology," Prof Wernke said. Archaeologically, mapping the area will help researchers understand the area, which was once the site of one of the largest forced resettlement programmes in world history, as Spanish colonials moved 1.5 million native Andeans into planned towns in the 1570s. "[The] urban and architectural planning were at the core of what the Spanish thought they were doing to 'civilize', convert, and subjugate the native Andean populace," he said. In addition to enabling the researchers to quickly detail ancient landscape features, such as canals and roads, it will also allow 3D digital versions of the sites to be created. These, aside from assisting the process of discovery, would enable the team to "virtually" preserve the site. INTERNET

US scientists trying to produce green power from ocean wave energy

HOUSTON, 7 Aug — Although ocean wave technology still has a long way to go, US scientists are now seeking ways to make ocean wave energy the nation's newest source of green power, local media reported on Sunday. US aerospace engineers are using Texas A&M University's wave tank to test the idea of applying the physics of wind turbines to the sea as they believe that if air can produce affordable electricity, so can ocean water, according to reports posted on the website of local newspaper The Houston Chronicle. Stefan Siegel, who led the testing at the university, said that ocean wave energy is decades behind wind, but with all the resource in the ocean, it's much more attractive. "The wind doesn't always blow. The sun doesn't always shine. But ocean waves, they are always there," said Siegel, whose Colorado-based startup Atargis Energy Corp developed a device using components similar to airplane wings or wind turbine blades. According to the reports, incoming waves rotate the two wings around a central axis, and the movement activates generators connected to the device, transforming the mechanical energy into electricity. The prototype, about one-tenth the size of a full-scale device, produced 370 watts during testing at the university, and with design improvements, a full-scale version will churn out 5 megawatts in the ocean, enough to power 3,000 to 4,000 homes in the country. The rotating blades now can capture about 95 percent of a wave's energy, and the device operates just below the water's surface, partially shielding it from violent storms, the reports said.—Xinhua

NEW YORK, 7 Aug — Stocks closed at three-month highs for the second day in a row on Monday, extending last week's rally on the hope for more assistance for the troubled euro zone. The S&P 500 rose to its highest point since early May, but pared its gains going into the close. The benchmark index also failed to breach 1,400, a level that could spur further buying if convincingly broken. The S&P 500 hasn't closed above

But it comes at a huge cost to investors. The stock fell 24.2 percent to \$3.07. The Dow Jones industrial average (^DJI) rose 21.34 points, or 0.16 percent, to 13,117.51 at the close. The

Standard & Poor's 500 Index (^GSPC) gained 3.24 points, or 0.23 percent, to 1,394.23. The Nasdaq Composite Index (^IXIC) advanced 22.01 points, or 0.74 percent, to end at 2,989.91. Material shares were the strongest for the day, with an S&P materials index (.GSPM) climbing 1.1 percent on the improved sentiment regarding Europe.

US Steel (X.N) led the sector, surging 5.6 percent to \$22.94. Newmont Mining (NEM.N) added 3.3 percent to \$46.12. Utilities (.GSPU), considered a defensive play, were the day's weakest, with the S&P utilities index down 0.3 percent. Best Buy (BBY) jumped 13.3 percent to \$19.99 after Richard Schulze, the founder and former chairman, offered to buy the shares he does not already own in the electronics retailer for \$24 to \$26 each. Cognizant Technology Solutions Corp (CTSH) rose 11 percent to \$64.21 after the information technology services provider raised its full-year adjusted profit forecast. — Reuters

### Weight training 'reduces diabetes risk'

LONDON, 7 Aug — Weight training helps to prevent type 2 diabetes in men, research suggests. Researchers found regular weights reduced the risk by up to a third, in the study of more than 32,000 men published in the *Archives of Internal Medicine* journal. It is already well known that regular exercise can prevent the disease.

But the report is considered important as weights provides an alternative to aerobic exercises such as running for people who are not so mobile. Researchers from Harvard School of Public Health in the US and the University of Southern Denmark followed the men over an 18-year period, during which time nearly 2,300 developed the condition.

They found 30 minutes of weights a day, five times a week could reduce the risk of diabetes by 34%. But they also reported that even less regular exercise — up to an hour a week — had an impact, cutting the risk by 12%. Nonetheless, aerobic exercise was still found to be slightly better with regular activity halving the risk. — Internet

### Scientists unravel 'other' malaria parasite's DNA code

NEW YORK, 7 Aug — Scientists said on Sunday they had unravelled the genetic codes of parasites responsible for the bulk of malaria cases outside Africa, and found they were scarily diversified and may be harder to kill. In a study published in *Nature Genetics*, researchers said they had sequenced the genomes of four strains of *Plasmodium vivax* — a parasite that infects about 100 million people every year.

With their research, a team from India and the United States say they have tripled the number of genome sequences available for *P. vivax*. They said they observed an "extremely high genomic diversity", suggesting it may be even harder than for *P. falciparum* to develop a single vaccine targeting several different

estimated 655,000 lives — mainly in Africa where a child dies of the disease every minute, says the World Health Organization.

Symptoms include fever, headache, chills and vomiting which if not treated within 24 hours can progress to severe illness and even death. In a second *Nature Genetics* report, scientists in Japan and the United States said they had sequenced the genomes of three strains of *P. cynomolgi* — a sister species to *P. vivax* and a cause of malaria in Asian Old World monkeys. Since it is so closely related, information on the DNA code of *P. cynomolgi* "provides the foundation for further insights into traits... that will enhance prospects for the eventual elimination of vivax-caused malaria and global malaria eradication," they wrote. — Internet

### Samsung, Apple spar over gadgets' specs

SAN JOSE, 7 Aug — Apple Inc trotted out a veteran designer to bolster its claims that Samsung Electronics copied the iPhone, after the smartphone's 2007 launch triggered a "crisis in design" for the South Korean electronics giant. Monday marked the second week of a high-wattage trial between the world's most valuable tech company and rival Samsung, which has edged past Apple in market share and is intent on expanding its American footprint.

The US company accuses Samsung of copying the design and some features of its iPad and iPhone, and is seeking billions of dollars in damages and sales bans. The Korean company says Apple infringed some of its key wireless technology patents. Apple called Peter Bressler, a college professor with electronics design experience and some 70 patents to his name, who analyzed Samsung gadgets and the iPhone and iPad.

But the hearing quickly descended into a laborious

rundown on design differences between the iPhone and Samsung gadgets, as the Korean firm's lawyer — a patient and meticulous Charles Verhoeven — used visuals and real phones to prove his point. The plethora of examples included different curvatures of corners, sides that protrude marginally above the screen, different positions for "lozenge" earpieces, even encircling bezels that are not uniformly thick.

"You're asking me to compare peanut butter and turkey," a slightly exasperated Bressler quipped after about an hour of grilling, and Verhoeven quickly asked which design was which lunch treat. "This is a level of detail that the ordinary observer would never be interested in looking at," Bressler replied. "The overall impression that the ordinary observer would have of that design, is that they're substantially the same," said Bressler, who has worked with Motorola and other technology clients.

"I do not believe they should be investigating teeny little details, one at a time," said Bressler, who lectures at the University of Pennsylvania and founded design firm Bressler Group. Bressler said he read numerous depositions of Apple employees and discovered the company employed special machine processes, for instance.

### AIG: Latest sale of shares raises \$750m for US Treasury

WASHINGTON, 7 Aug — The US government says it expects to receive \$750m (£480m) from the latest sale of shares held in American International Group (AIG).

The sales are part of an effort to recoup taxpayers' money which was used to fund AIG's bailout, the largest of the 2008 financial crisis.

This brings the total from the fourth round of sales in AIG shares to \$5.75bn. Last week, the US Treasury announced it had sold \$5bn

worth of AIG shares. In September 2008, the US

Treasury and the Federal Reserve stepped in with

\$182bn to rescue New York-based AIG from collapse.

AIG, once the world's largest insurance company, has sold off huge assets as it restructured itself in a bid to return to profitability.

Last week, AIG reported that its second-quarter profit surged 27% from the same period last year to \$2.3bn, almost double the expectations. So far, the US Treasury has received \$23.3bn from four sales of AIG shares. — Internet

## Hluttaw representatives urged to discharge duties and exercise rights vested by the committee with a sense of uprightness and benevolence: Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann

NAY PYI TAW, 7 Aug—Fourth regular session of Pyithu Hluttaw continued for 21<sup>st</sup> day, at the hall of Pyithu Hluttaw of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 10 am today, attended by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann, 396 MPs and departmental heads, responsible persons and the economists from the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry (UMFCCI), officials from Promotion of Marine Products Export Association of Myanmar Fishery Federation (MFF), MBA trainees and course instructors of Applied Economics Department of Yangon Institute of Economics as observers.

At the question-and-answer session, U Aung Thein of Ywangan Constituency raised the question on **“whether there is a plan to take stern actions to eliminate gambling”** and U Tun Aung Kyaw of Ponnagun Constituency on **“whether there is a plan to open a police outpost in Alechaung Village in Alechaung island”**.

With respect to the first question, Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Brig-Gen Kyaw Zan Myint replied: The government is making strenuous efforts to ensure rule of law, security, rural development and poverty alleviation across the country. Effective plans are being drawn to eliminate two and three digits lottery gambling nationwide, which is a major disturbance to these measures. Gambling is a basic cause of big criminal cases like theft and robbery. In addition, it begets poverty. So, Ministry of Home Affairs is taking control of gambling so as to prevent the aftermath of gambling. Although the Ministry is unable to get rid of gambling at present, Anti-Gambling Supervisory Committee and Gambling Educative Team are giving talks, erect signboards that read the sentences for those who commit the gambling cases and distribute pamphlets.

Regarding the second question, at present, there is no plan to open police outpost in Alechaung Village. Conditions in districts and townships of Rakhine State are being studied. And plans are under way to open police stations and police outposts, based on the conditions of security needs.

Deputy Minister for Health Dr Daw Myat Myat Ohn Khin replied to the question of Dr Maung Maung Wint of Bahan Constituency on **“Sufficient availability of qualified teachers to lecture the theory and practical lessons of medical subjects”**. She said: Appointment of experienced scholars as experts is being carried out to avoid teacher gaps after experienced scholars have received old-age pensions. And, officials at different level are making coordination over difficulties at the work. Filling of vacant posts of teachers and promotions are being undertaken under the leadership of Management Committee of the Ministry of Health.

At the session of the extended formation of one committee, Daw Aung San Suu Kyi of Kawhmu Constituency was appointed as chairman of Committee for Rule of Law and Peace and Stability and U Win Myint of Patheingyi Constituency, Secretary. Duties are assigned to members of former committee and commission.

The paragraph saying that “if existing laws and orders and directives issued by respective organizations occasionally are in conformity with the current conditions, enforcement of orders and directives are to be monitored and controlled, which includes under the section of former committee’s duties,” is to be excluded. And it is substituted with the paragraph saying that bylaws, regulations, disciplines, announcements, directives and procedures are to be adjusted in conformity with the existing laws and Union Hluttaw’s laws and enforcement are to be monitored and controlled if they have conformity.

Hluttaw sought the approval regarding extended formation of a new Pyithu Hluttaw Committee, duty assignment of new committee members and revocation and substitution of committee’s duties, and decided to approve it.

After that, on behalf of the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker, Deputy Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw U Nanda Kyaw Swa submitted name lists of members and duties, rights and term of newly-formed committee and commission.

That bill is crucial for the State and people. Thus, it needs to hold discussions with Hluttaw committee extensively and scholars in private before the facts are discussed separately.

As a Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw, he warned the discussion of some representatives to be in conformity with the rules and regulations recently and he expected that that would not harm the active and open discussion of representatives and but would pave the way for active and open discussion in the interests of the country and the people, Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann said.

He clarified that he had no option but to warn some representatives who took part in the discussion to be in conformity the rules and regulations and that did not mean to prohibit the open and active discussion. He also urged the Pyithu Hluttaw and the representatives to participate in the discussion openly and actively and in conformity with the rules and regulations in order to promote interests of the country and the people.

As he assumed that the Foreign Investment Law is important for the country and the people and Citizens and the Investment Law which is needed and also important for the country, he said. As a Speaker, he accepted the point presented by a Union level committee on half of the Union

Government that the representatives and committees of Hluttaw are to discuss at large and to listen the discussion as part of efforts for enacting the Foreign investment law and the Citizens Investment Law.

Also present at the today meeting were trainees from the MBA course, personnel from commissions, some businessmen who participated in the foreign direct investment meeting in Yangon, experts and some businessmen, he said.

He continued to say that generally, the main duty of the Hluttaw is to make laws and the Hluttaw had to evaluate whether the laws it made would benefit the citizens, give protection to the interests of the citizens, work well practically in the country and be in conformity with the international treaties and conventions.

The Hluttaw must listen to the voice of a citizen and the people to make a law and representatives were to bring the voice to the Hluttaw and to discuss it openly and actively if the voice was reasonable and would benefit the people and the citizens, he added.

If a suggestion proposed by a representative was reasonable and would benefit the country and the people, the suggestion would be translated to action by other representatives, he said.

Similarly, when a voice of the people was brought to the Hluttaw by a representative, other representatives were responsible to discuss it and to make decision. A voice of the people can be brought to the Hluttaw as a question, a proposal and a bill by representatives, he said. The Hluttaw listened to the voices of the people and if the Hluttaw committees assumed that a voice was not brought to the Hluttaw, they went to places where they could hear the voices, he said. He recounted his meeting with the people including traders, farmers, labours and governmental employees at the MICC Hall in Yangon on 30 June, saying that he could also hear the voices of the people along with the Hluttaw committees. After the voices of the people were discussed at the Hluttaw, he decided to submit a proposal to the Hluttaw to make a law which would work to the advantage of the country, he said.

The Pyithu Hluttaw brought back the Foreign investment bill that it sent to Amyotha Hluttaw and was discussing it and those personnel who love the country and the people gave suggestion to the bill, he said. He urged responsible committees to listen to the discussion of the representatives when they met with Hluttaw committees.

Those who are not representatives are not allowed to take part in the discussion at the Hluttaw. Similarly, the rules and regulations of the Hluttaw allows only the Union level representatives to make discussion with the permission of the Speaker, he said. Therefore, the Hluttaw accepted the proposal of the Union-level committees as it can work to the advantage of the country and urged the Hluttaw committees

NAY PYI TAW, 7 Aug—A coordination meeting on foreign investment law by Pyithu Hluttaw Committee, Commission, entrepreneurs and scholars, was held at Zabuthiri meeting hall of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 2.15 pm today, with an address by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann.

It was attended by Deputy Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw U Nanda Kyaw Swa, Chairmen and secretaries from Pyithu Hluttaw Committee and Commission, Pyithu Hluttaw representatives, deputy ministers, responsible persons from Myanmar Investment Commission, economists and scholars.

At the meeting, the Speaker said that Foreign Investment Law was a crucial one for the country. There would be a

flood of investment opportunities. So, those present were to discuss it openly in the interest of the State and people.

After that, Deputy Minister for Rail Transportation Thura U Thaug Lwin, Director-General U Aung Naing Oo of Directorate of Investment and Companies Administration, Economic advisor to the President U Set Aung, Dr Khin Maung Lwin, Daw Khaing Khaing Nwe, Dr Tin Aung Shwe, U Ko Ko Htway, U Tun Aye, U Than Myint, Dr Tin Latt, U Than Maung and Dr Daw Tin May Tun gave advise on drawing complete Foreign Investment Law for the benefit of the State and people.

With respect to the discussions, the Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw said that Pyithu Hluttaw is making efforts for the emergence of complete Foreign Investment Law in leaps

and bounds. Each para and subpara of it is ready to be discussed at Pyithu Hluttaw. Hluttaw representatives were placing special emphasis on it. He urged respective committee, representatives, respective ministries and experts to complete it in leaps and bounds on consideration of himself as a citizen and a representative as well as a speaker. It would be sent to Amyotha Hluttaw after being discussed at Pyithu Hluttaw. It would be assumed that the law has been approved by Pyidaungsu Hluttaw if there was no amendment made by Amyotha Hluttaw. From there, it would be sent to the President. It could be approved in 15 days if there was no any comment on it by the President. When there was comment, it was to be discussed at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw. After those processes, a law would emerge. Efforts were being made by Hluttaw for emergence of law that can protect the interests of the State and people and is a useful one in actual practice and is in accord with the Constitution. In so doings, it needed to be in conformity with Convention and treaties exercised by the country. Commission at Hluttaw was formed with those who are engaging in the law fields, scholars and experts from all sectors. Coordination was to be made based on today's meeting suggestions in order that it could include necessary facts in it. To become a complete and qualified one, all were urged to take time that is no more than seven days.

After that, Chairman of Economy and Trade Development Committee U Maung Maung Thein discussed foreign investment law.

Deputy Minister Thura U Thaug Lwin and Director-General U Aung Naing Oo submitted amendments to the bill. The meeting came to an end after concluding speech by the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker.—MNA

## Marine Police Force is under constitution for prevention against the acts jeopardizing the interest of State and people and sovereignty of nation, combating crimes and attempts to commit crimes and discharging of duties for security of coasts and water courses

NAY PYI TAW, 7 Aug—The Amyotha Hluttaw session continued for the 21<sup>st</sup> day at the Amyotha Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 10 am today, attended by 203 Amyotha Hluttaw representatives including Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint.

Deputy Minister for Border Affairs Maj-Gen Zaw Win replied to questions on roads and bridges raised by four Hluttaw representatives.

With regard to the question asking **whether there is a plan to upgrade Maungmagan-Hmyawit road section in Launglon Township** by U Tin Maung Myint of Taninthayi Region Constituency No. 3, the deputy minister replied that the Ministry of Border Affairs plans to spend K 88.25 million on repaving one mile and two furlongs long section in 2012-2013 supplementary fund and K 88.25 million on repaving of one mile and two furlongs long section in 2013-2014 financial year.

U Paul Hlyan Lwin of Chin State Constituency No. 9 asked **whether there is a plan to expand the width of 51 miles long road from Rezwa Sub-Township to Lailinpi Village and construct a new 40-mile road from Lailinpi Village to Shinletwa Village.** The deputy minister replied that about K 156.18 million will be spent on expanding 12 feet wide facility to 18 feet wide one of 51 miles long Rezwa-Lailinpi Road and K 55.2 million on 34 miles long and 12 feet wide earth road from Lailinpi Village to Shinletwa Village. The funds will be allotted in 2013-2014 fiscal year and 2014-2015 fiscal year.

Along the road, 300 feet long and 14 feet wide Hteinhsi Creek Bridge will be improved as steel frame facility in 2012-2013 fiscal year spending K 1575 million, and it will be the first priority. In 2013-2014 fiscal year, estimated cost of K 1050.5 million will be spent on construction of 200 feet long and 14 feet wide steel frame bridge across Vahar Creek with the financial assistance of India.

U Htay Maung of Mandalay Region Constituency No. 12 asked **whether there is a plan to upgrade Tamagon-Shwehlan-Nyaunggaing-Buyon rural road to gravel road in Thazi Township.** The deputy minister replied that a plan has been set to upgrade the said rural road to the 12 feet wide road in 2013-2014 fiscal year. Likewise, five miles long Kanthitgon-Ywapalegyi-Kyitaingkon-Thazi inter-village road will be improved in 2014-2015 fiscal year to be 12 feet wide gravel road.

With regard to the question asking **whether there is a plan to construct an earthen road linking Yesagyo and Pakhanng Village by passing through Nyaungzauk, Megon, Tawya, Thanmatapoh, Singaing and Chitthu villages** by U Aung Than of Magway Region Constituency No. 10, the deputy minister replied that plans are under way to expand the said road to five miles and two furlongs long and 16 feet wide earthen road and three wooden bridges on Nyaungzauk-Thanmatapoh Road Section in 2013-2014 fiscal year and three wooden bridge on Singaing-Chitthu road in 2014-2015 fiscal year.

After that, Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko replied to questions on home affairs raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

U Khin Maung Yi of Ayeyawady Region Constituency No. 6 asked that **as some organizations under various names in addition to non-governmental organizations (NGOs) commit problems among the people, administrative bodies/departments, he would like to know how the organizations will be supervised to take registration and to do allowed tasks under the law.** The Union Minister replied that NGOs are to submit applications for registrations with the endorsements of respective township, district and state/region General Administration Departments in line with the law, procedures and directives. Depending on vision and mission of the NGOs, remarks are to be sought from the respective ministries, and executive committee members of the organizations are to be scrutinized whether they are related to political parties and they are

cleared in crimes step by step. Next, the Association and Supervision Central Committee headed by the Union Minister for Home Affairs scrutinizes the applications of associations and organizations again and decides to allow them. The decisions are to be submitted the Cabinet Meeting of the Union Government and sought the approval. Then, five-year term permits are issued to the organizations under disciplines.

Departments concerned are supervising the constitution of the associations and tasks of NGOs for ensuring systematic measures under procedures and directives under the guidance of the Union government. However, if the activities of organizations are not in conformity with the principle of the association constitution law and harm the stability and prevalence of law and order of the State, action will be taken against them.

U Khin Maung Latt of Rakhine State Constituency No. 6 asked **whether there is a plan to constitute marine police force or coast guard with the use of speed boats for security of western coasts and water courses of developing Myanmar in the future.** The Union Minister replied that Myanmar Police Force has issued an order to formation of the Marine Police Force on 9 July 2012. The Marine Police Force will be headquartered in Nay Pyi Taw and it will control three branches in Yangon, Kyaaukpyu and Dawei ports and eight sections in Patheingyi, Mawlamyine, Sittway, Thandwe, Myeik, Kawthoung, Mandalay and Wampon (Mekong). The Marine Police Force is under constitution for prevention against the acts jeopardizing the interest of the State and the people and sovereignty of the nation, combating the committing of crimes and attempts to commit crimes and discharging of duties for security of coasts and water courses.

Member of Amyotha Hluttaw Bill Committee U Than Myint read the reports of the committee on **Bill Revoking Public Welfare Services Protection Act.** Union Minister Lt-Gen Ko Ko submitted a proposal to the Hluttaw for seeking the approval of the bill, and a Hluttaw representative seconded it.

Member of Amyotha Hluttaw Bill Committee U Sun Dok Ciint read the report of the committee on **Law Protecting the Peaceful and Systematic Transfer of State Responsibility and the Successful Performance of the Functions of the National Convention Disturbances and Oppositions.** Union Minister Lt-Gen Ko Ko submitted the proposal to be approved and a Hluttaw representative seconded it.

The Hluttaw approved the bill.

Union Minister Lt-Gen Ko Ko submitted a proposal on **bill revoking Land Confiscation (Mines) Act** to be considered by the Amyotha Hluttaw and a Hluttaw representative seconded it.

The Hluttaw decided to accept the proposal to be discussed and the Hluttaw representatives wishing to participate in discussions may enlist their nominations, not later than 9-8-2012.

Union Minister for Finance and Revenue U Hla Tun submitted the **Securities Exchange Bill** to be discussed by the Amyotha Hluttaw and a representative seconded it.

The Hluttaw decided to accept the proposal to be discussed and the Hluttaw representatives wishing to participate in discussions may enlist their nominations, not later than 9-8-2012.

Secretary of Local and Foreign Non-governmental Organization Committee U Swe Aung read out the report of the committee to the Amyotha Hluttaw.

The representatives willing to discuss the report are to submit their name list not later than 4 pm on 9-8-2012.

U Khin Maung Latt of Rakhine State Constituency (6), Dr Tin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency (6), Dr Aye Maung of Rakhine State Constituency (1), U Zon Hlal Htan of Chin State Constituency (2), U Ha Shein Bwe of Chin State Constituency (8), U Boe Yal of Kayah State Constituency (3), U Ohn Tin of Rakhine State Constituency (10), Dr Banyar Aung Moe of Mon State Constituency (7) and U Nay Win Tun of Shan State Constituency (9) discussed the proposal **“urging the Union government to pursue development plans for less developed ethnic people”** submitted by Dr Myint Kyi of Yangon Region Constituency (8). They said the government should invite foreign investments in agricultural for development of the states. Development plans for coastal region should be pursued. The policy of “the poor takes more” from Union development fund should be adopted in least developed regions.

Comprehensive management schemes based on natural resources of each state are needed. Natural resources, human resources, geopolitical advantages, energy and technical resources, monetary policy, financial resources and market should be considered at planning stage. Each region or state should be entitled to claim at least 10-25 percent of tapped natural resources. The role of the State Hluttaws must be improved and the State governments must operate effectively.

Road transportation is a sine qua none for development of states. Accessibility of electricity and water, manufacturing industries, regional products, border gates and border trade camps, technical know-how of nationals and regional peace are key to development.

Deputy Minister for Border Affairs Maj-Gen Zaw Win said in his discussion a fund of 496.63 billion—178.49 billion from border area development fund and 318.13 billion from other ministerial funds—was used for border

area development tasks in yearly National Plans from 1989-1990 fiscal year to May 2012. The tasks include construction of 5718 miles and six furlongs long earth roads, 4388 miles and three furlongs long gravel roads and 2647 miles and seven furlongs long tarred roads; maintenance of 3967 miles and five furlongs long roads, construction of 202 huge bridges, 1655 small bridges, 86 suspension bridges, 107 BEHSs, 91 BEMSs, 928 BEPSs, 100 hospitals, 99 dispensaries, 123 public health centres, 291 rural health centres, 31 agricultural offices, 118 agricultural stations, 81 dams, five canals, 11 tractor stations, four breeding farms and 41 veterinary offices; electrification of 207 towns with 276 generators; electrification of 51 towns/villages with hydropower and 114 retransmission stations; 54 post offices, 47 telegraph offices and 86 telephone booths.

The ministry has planned to request K 121778.548 million yearly for border region development tasks from the third year 2013-2014 FY to fifth year 2015-2016 FY of five-year National Plan.

Since 1992, the Border Affairs Ministry cooperated

with four UN agencies, five nations and 14 NGOs for ensuring more incomes, infrastructural development, health and sanitation in Kachin State, Kayah State, Kayin State, Chin State, Mon State, Rakhine State, Shan State, Taninthayi Region and Sagaing Region up to 30-6-2012 with US\$ 377.928 million.

**Iraq attacks kill five**

BAGHDAD, 7 Aug — Attacks mainly targeting Iraqi security forces killed five people, among them four policemen, and wounded 16 on Sunday, security and medical officials said. So far this month, attacks have killed 55 people, 42 of them members of the security forces, according to an AFP tally based on security and medical sources. In the deadliest attack, gunmen shot dead three police at a checkpoint in a market in Mosul in northern Iraq, police First Lieutenant Khalaf al-Juburi said, a toll confirmed by a doctor from Mosul General Hospital.

In Kirkuk, two roadside bombs killed one policeman and wounded seven others, a security official and a doctor from a hospital in the northern city said. In Baghdad, a car bomb in the Qahira area targeted the convoy of Brigadier General Mohammed Ghazi, the head of the personal protection

directorate in the interior ministry, wounding him, two guards and three civilians, a ministry official said. A medical official at Al-Kindi hospital, meanwhile, said the facility had received one body and six wounded people, among them three police, including the brigadier general.

The interior ministry official and a medical source also said a sticky bomb wounded a tribal leader in north Baghdad. And gunmen attacked a checkpoint in the southwestern province of Salaheddin, wounding two police, police and a medic said. While violence has decreased compared with its peak in 2006 and 2007, attacks remain common across Iraq.

There were attacks on 27 of the 31 days in July. Official figures put the number of people killed in attacks in July at 325, the highest monthly death toll since August 2010.

**Israeli drone kills Gazan**

GAZA CITY, 7 Aug — A Palestinian man was killed and another wounded in an Israeli drone strike on Rafah in the Gaza Strip on Sunday, medics and witnesses said. Palestinian sources named the victim as Eid Hijazi, 23, a member of the radical Popular Resistance Committees. The men were riding a motorcycle at the time.

The Israeli army in a statement confirmed the strike, naming the wounded man as Ahmed Said Ismail, who "was among those responsible for the execution of the terror attack adjacent to the Israel-Egypt border, in which an Israeli civilian was killed, on 18 June, 2012."

That attack led to the latest major flare-up around Gaza, with Palestinians firing dozens of rockets into the Jewish state which responded with multiple air raids on the territory that killed 15 Palestinians.

The army statement said Said, Hijazi and "several other Global Jihad members were operating in order to execute a terror attack against Israeli civilians via the Israel-Egypt border." Following the attack, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu praised the army and Israel's Shin Bet internal security agency for the

"precision action carried out in the Gaza Strip."

"Anyone intending to harm us ought to know that our long arm will reach him," he said in a statement.

Later on Sunday, two rockets fired from Gaza exploded in the Shaar Hanegev region of southern Israel.

A military spokesman told AFP the rockets wounded no one and caused no damage.

**Red Cross attacked with rockets, grenades in Libya**

GENEVA, 7 Aug — Unknown assailants attacked a compound of the International Committee of the Red Cross in the Libyan port of Misrata on Sunday with grenades and rockets, forcing it to suspend its work there and in the eastern city of Benghazi, the agency said. The ICRC said seven of its aid workers were inside their residence when it came under attack.

No one was hurt, but damage to the building was extensive. It was the fifth time in less than three months that violence was directed against the independent aid agency in Libya, the ICRC said in a statement, which stressed its

neutrality.

"Given the circumstances, we are forced to announce, with considerable regret, that we will be suspending all our activities in Misrata and Benghazi and that our delegates in those cities will be temporarily relocated," said Ishfaq Muhamed Khan, the head of the ICRC's delegation in Libya. Several violent incidents have rocked Libya in recent days and included the kidnapping on Tuesday in Benghazi of seven Iranians relief workers who were official guests of the Libyan Red Crescent Association.

Also on Sunday, security forces killed three armed men

who were suspected of being behind seven failed bomb plots, said Saleh Darhoub, a spokesman for the National Transitional Council. It was the first deadly clash since the fall of Muammar Gaddafi in October.

Darhoub promised to bring the attackers to court and condemned their act against what he described as "hosts" of Libyans "who did great things for the revolution including in Misrata".

In Geneva, ICRC spokesman Jean-Yves Clemenzo said that the seven staff had withdrawn to its delegation in the capital Tripoli.

OSAKA, 7 Aug — At least eight people were injured early Monday in an accident involving four vehicles in the western Japanese prefecture of Shiga, local Press reported.

The accident occurred at around 3:30 a.m. local time when a heavy lorry and a passenger car ran into other two lorries, both of which were already stopping due to their collision, on the Shin-Meishin Expressway in Otsu City of the prefecture, the press said.

The Press cited as local police as saying the eight people, aged between 12 and 48, were sent to nearby hospitals, adding that two of them are in serious conditions. After the crash, the motorway was partly closed in the morning hours. The cause of the accident is under investigation.—Xinhua

City spokeswoman Jackie DeSouza said on 3 Aug officials are looking into the picture, which shows a technical services survey crew member asleep in the back of an open van with the doors open while two other

crew members sit in the front seats, the *Toronto Sun* reported. "The city will be meeting with the employees involved, and will take any disciplinary action it deems appropriate," DeSouza said.

The spokeswoman said city workers have previously been warned about sleeping in city vehicles.

"(Survey and mapping staff in technical services) have been previously advised

that sleeping in a city vehicle is not acceptable at any time," she said.

## British explorer sets out on treasure hunt

A British fortune hunter is heading to a Pacific island in search of more than \$250 million worth of treasure supposedly buried there by 19th century pirates.

Shaun Whitehead is leading an expedition to Cocos Island in hopes of discovering treasure allegedly buried there by a British trader, Capt William Thompson, in 1820, *The Daily Telegraph* reported on 5 Aug.

The British newspaper

said as the story goes, Thompson stole gold, silver and jewelry amassed by Spanish authorities in Lima, Peru, that he was entrusted to transport to Mexico. Thompson and his crew allegedly killed Spanish sailors on their ship and headed for Cocos Island, off the coast of Costa Rica, to bury their loot, which included 113 gold religious statues, 200 chests of jewels, 273 swords with jeweled hilts, 1,000 diamonds, solid gold crowns,

150 chalices, and hundreds of gold and silver bars.

Whitehead and a team of about 15 will scour the island over the 10-day expedition using non-invasive technology not used in previous expeditions to the island. "This is a scientific survey, including archaeological, geological and biodiversity aspects," Whitehead said. "Unlike previous trips, we are not going to dig vast holes or do anything destructive at all.

A Canadian woman called police when she found an online ad offering her baby for sale based on photos she'd posted on Facebook.

The unidentified woman in the central British Columbia town of Fort St John called the Royal Canadian Mounted Police when she spotted the ad in an online buy-and-sell site, the Canadian Broadcasting Corp reported.

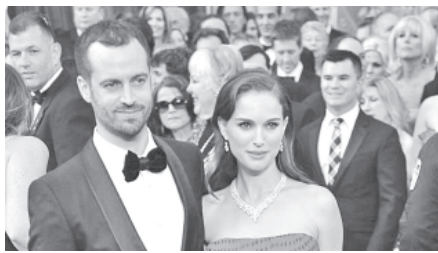
RCMP Sgt Steve Perret told the broadcaster the ad had been removed this week and electronic forensic investigators had a suspect.

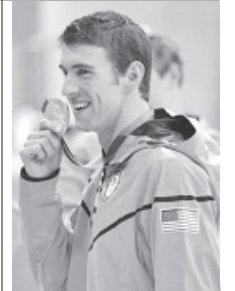

"But I try to live my life with a lot of integrity, and, hopefully, that sends a message," she added. *Internet*

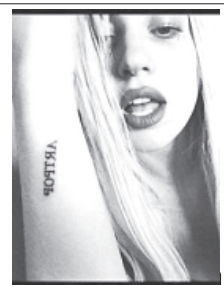

With the players on both sides exhausted, penalties looming and the referee looking at her watch, Morgan powered home a header to put the US in front for the first time after Canada had led three times in a pulsating game at Old Trafford. The winner came with 122 minutes and 25 seconds on the clock. Sixty

seconds later, the match was over.

"I'm still in shock thinking of what just happened," Morgan told reporters. "I don't care who scores as long as we score and that's all that matters. I didn't even see it go in. I just try and be in the right position." It was a crazy battle. Coming back and back and back. After we scored they scored, it was amazing." The US, who have now reached all five women's Olympic finals, taking gold in 1996, 2004 and 2008, will meet Japan in Thursday's gold medal decider at Wembley

## Soccer: US grab extra-time winner to reach final

Stadium seeking their third successive gold and their fourth in total. Japan, who overcame France 2-1 earlier on Monday, beat the US on penalties in last year's World Cup final.

Canada's stunned players were in tears at the end and Christine Sinclair, whose hat-trick looked as though it would prove enough for victory, was especially distraught. Tancredi. The US equalized with a rare goal scored direct from an inswinging corner by Megan Rapinoe that beat goalkeeper Erin McLeod and two defenders at the near post. Sinclair put Canada back in front after 67 minutes with a firm header to start a wild scoring spree of four goals in 12 minutes - two from each side.

Rapinoe equalized again three minutes later with a fierce angled drive from the

edge of the box that went in off the far post before Sinclair got her hat-trick to put Canada 3-2 up with another header after 73 minutes, her 143rd goal for her country.

But in the 80th minute the US equalized for the third time when Wambach scored her 143rd international goal with a penalty after Marie-Eve Nault was harshly judged to have handled in the area by Norwegian referee Christiana Pedersen when a freekick struck her elbow as she was turning away from the ball. Extra time looked set to end without a goal after Wambach's header hit the bar in the 119th minute but that was not the last of the drama and deep into added time Morgan headed in a right-wing cross for the dramatic winner. "The heart we showed today was absolutely huge," said Rapinoe. "It's a little bit of a trademark of our team. We came back three times today and scored four goals. We showed great heart." — Reuters

## Tomic snaps skid, sets up Toronto tilt with Djokovic

TORONTO, 7 Aug — Bernard Tomic may be the youngest player at the Toronto Masters but after ending a six-match losing streak on Monday the 19-year-old Australian is oozing confidence for his second-round tilt with top-seed Novak Djokovic. Tomic, who opened his hard court season with a 6-3 3-6 6-3 victory over Germany's Michael Berrer, has never beaten Djokovic but looks forward to playing the tournament's defending champion on Wednesday after recording his first win since May.

"It's a really good feeling. ... Seven weeks in a row I've been losing, and I think the opportunity here to play and play well is good, and confidence that I need," Tomic told reporters. "I am just happy that I won my match finally, and I've got confidence leading into the next important match." With world number one Roger Federer skipping the tournament to rest, Rafa Nadal opting out because of injury and several top players still arriving from the London Olympics, the Toronto Masters offers a chance for an unseeded player to make a move.

But while Tomic is aware of the opportunity that presents itself with top players either absent or fatigued, he refuses to look any further than his match against Djokovic. In their two previous meetings, Tomic lost to Djokovic at last year's Wimbledon and at the Rome Masters in May. "It's a good chance for me playing him for the first time on hard court where I think I move the best out of all surfaces," Tomic told reporters. "My game suits more grass, but I think I move and play better in a way on hard court." — Reuters

## Athletics: Bolt returns, Pearson eyes hurdles gold

LONDON, 7 Aug — Fresh from 100 meters glory Jamaica's Usain Bolt begins a highly anticipated 200m title defense at the London Olympics on Tuesday, while women's 100m hurdles world champion Sally Pearson is

favorite to go one better than her silver in Beijing. Australia's Pearson, who holds the event's fastest performance since 1992 (12.28 seconds), is likely to face competition from American duo Lolo Jones, best remembered for stumbling in the final as favorite in Beijing, and defending Olympic champion Dawn Harper.

The semi-finals start at 1915 local time with the final at 2100. Bolt, who wowed the crowd on Sunday night by becoming the only man to cross the line first in two 100m finals, returns to the Olympic stadium bidding to become the first man to win two 200m golds and cement himself as unquestionably the greatest

sprinter in history.

Kenya's Asbel Kiprop, the world's fastest man this year, will have one thing on his mind in London - to win the 1500m properly. The world champion has often expressed his dissatisfaction at taking Olympic gold in Beijing after Rashid Ramzi was stripped of his title for a doping offence. A Kenyan clean sweep could be on the cards, with Commonwealth champion Silas Kiplagat and youngster Nixon Chebseba both in with a chance of a podium finish. Gold medals will also be up for grabs in the men's high jump and discus finals, as well as final berths in the men's 800 meters and women's 200 meters. — Reuters

## Basketball: Tempers flare as US sweep past Argentina

LONDON, 7 Aug — A nasty, bad-tempered joust with Argentina's basketball team woke up the sleeping giants from the US on Monday, spurring them to a 126-97 victory that earned a top-seeded berth in the quarter-finals. Players from both sides were knocked down in a closely-fought first half and they often glowered at each other as the contest turned into a rout for the Americans who had narrowly beaten Lithuania in their previous game.

"Tonight's game was so much fun," US point guard Chris Paul told reporters. "I give Argentina a lot of credit. "Those guys pushed us, they made us compete. I loved it. When it gets a little chippy here and there, it gets you excited," he said after the players frequently collided going for rebounds. The muscular LeBron James threw an arm out at one point to

sweep experienced Argentine Manu Ginobili off his feet. After going to intermission locked in a 60-59 struggle, Argentina were buried under a flurry of three-pointers from Kevin Durant.

Durant, who made 8-of-10 three-pointers in the game, nailed four from beyond the arc in a third-quarter stretch that took the US lead from 12 points to 24. The quarter ended with more physical combat as Carmelo Anthony hit the floor doubled up in pain after making a three-pointer to send the Americans into the fourth session with a 102-76 advantage. "He got hit in the groin. That's why he buckled. He wasn't celebrating his shot," said coach Mike Krzyzewski. It seemed a fight might break out at that point as several players from both teams approached each other near mid-court before being separated. — Reuters

## Equestrian: Saudi show jumpers buy horse power for Games

LONDON, 7 Aug — Saudi Arabia's surprise bronze in Olympic team show jumping means a slightly mysterious organization called Saudi Equestrian has achieved a goal set in 2009 — to buy great horses and succeed in London. Saudi Equestrian has bought top jumpers from the United States, Great Britain and continental Europe in the past two years — the horse power that helped propel Prince Abdullah al Saud, the king's grandson, and his team mates to Games success.

The Saudi team were in front after Sunday's first round when even reigning world champions Germany failed to make the cut. Then they defeated reigning Olympic champions the

United States and stalwarts such as Sweden and Switzerland in the second to win their first-ever team equestrian medal. Their best prior Olympic result in horse sports came when rider Khaled Al Eid won individual

jumping bronze at the Sydney Olympics in 2000, something the team described as inspirational.

Chef d'equipe Rogier van Iersel, a former international judge from the Netherlands who has been working with the Saudis since 2006, said his goal was just to get to the second round. What happened was well beyond expectations. "I had seen for a long time that we had top-level riders but we lacked the horse power," he said. "And horse power comes with finding the right resources to buy these horses." It was to bring these resources to bear that Saudi Equestrian was formed with King Abdullah as its patron. — Reuters

**Sanchez recaptures crown but Isinbayeva fades**

LONDON, 7 Aug—Felix Sanchez of the Dominican Republic recaptured the Olympic 400 metres hurdles title at the age of 34, eight years after he first won it, on a second successive golden night for Caribbean runners at the London Games. Sanchez was convulsed with sobs and tears streamed down his face as he stood on the victor's podium after holding off Michael Tinsley of the United States. "No one expected this. A lot of people said I should retire but I stuck with it. They'll all be celebrating now," said Sanchez. After finishing, he took out and kissed a picture of his grandmother Lillian, who died during the Beijing Olympics. On a tough night for defending Olympic champions, 33-year-old American Angelo Taylor

came fifth, failing in his attempt to become the first man to win three titles in the event after gold in 2000 and 2008. Yelena Isinbayeva of Russia, bidding for a third successive gold medal in the women's pole vault, could only manage bronze behind Jennifer Suhr of the United States who went one better than her silver medal in Beijing, and Yarisleys Silva of Cuba. Isinbayeva never looked comfortable on a chilly, rainy evening. After missing at 4.55 metres, she cleared the next two notches at 4.65 and 4.70 but could not improve on that mark, ending 5 cm short of her rivals. Valerie Adams of New Zealand, also a victor in 2008, was pushed into second place in the women's shot put by Nadzeya Ostapchuk of Belarus, the 2005 world champion. Russian world champion Yuliya Zaripova won the women's 3,000 metres steeplechase, leading from the start and storming across the line well clear of Tunisia's Habiba Ghribi and Ethiopia's Sofia Assefa. "It was easy to win this gold, I was very confident about winning. I'm very good at steeplechase," she told reporters, grinning from ear to ear. "Towards the end I saw the scoreboard, I could hear the roar in the stadium but I kept my concentration to the very end." Two 19-year-olds took gold and silver in the men's 400 metres, with Kirani James of Grenada powering through ahead of Luguelin Santos of the Dominican Republic. Javier Culson took bronze in the hurdles to become the first Puerto Rican to win an Olympic athletics medal.—Reuters

**Weightlifting: Injury denied me chance at gold — Akkaev**

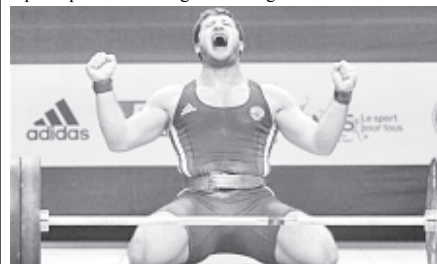
LONDON, 7 Aug—A last minute back injury that required emergency surgery cost weightlifter Khadzhimurat Akkaev an Olympic gold medal and a clean sweep of world records, the Russian said on Monday. World champion Akkaev was due to compete in the 105-kilogram category but said he was unable to take to the platform after suffering a herniated disc in his back last week — an injury that meant he was unable to walk until Sunday. Oleksiy Torokhtiy of Ukraine capitalized on the absence of Akkaev and other top competitors to take gold.

But Akkaev, who took the unusual step of calling an impromptu news conference following the medal ceremony to discuss his injury, said he could have beaten Torokhtiy's 412 kg winning total and had been targeting world records. "You have to understand this is not the biggest total in weight," Akkaev said of Torokhtiy's performance while offering his congratulations to the Ukrainian. "It was in our plans to set at least three world records. If we talk about my personal results (in training), the total weight is 455 kilogrammes." The Russian

weightlifting federation had said on Saturday Akkaev would not compete. "(The decision) was taken after the surgery, and the surgery was a very difficult and complicated surgery. More than three hours," Akkaev said.

Akkaev stood, baring his back to reporters and displaying a bandaged surgery wound. But Akkaev's name, alongside that of compatriot Dmitry Klokov who also withdrew late through injury, remained on the start list until 90 minutes before the event started. Klokov had failed to recover from a knee injury that also required surgery and had not flown to London, said Davyd Rigert, head coach of the Russian weightlifting team. He added that the decision to withdraw both athletes had been delayed to give them every chance to recover, but that eventually he had to inform the organizers that he would not be fit to compete. "Believe me, it was not an easy decision to make," he said. "It was really a very dramatic decision for me."
