Directives given to local companies to take leading roles in Dawei Special Economic Zone Myanmar citizens except experts, skilled workers and supervisors must be employed

NAY PYI TAW, 10 Aug—The fourth regular session of Pyithu Hluttaw continued for 24th day at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here this morning, attended by Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw Thura U Shwe Mann and 404 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives.

Deputy Minister for Rail Transportation Thura U Thaung Lwin answered five questions regarding Dawei Deep Sea Port Project raised by U Thein Nyunt of Thingangyun Constituency.

Regarding the question No (1) on which **working group of any ministry or commission take parts and how much stake it holds in Dawei Deep Sea Port Project for which agreement was signed between Thailand-based Italian-Thai Development Company and Myanmar Port Authority of Ministry of Transport of Myanmar**, the deputy minister answered that central committee of Myanmar Special Economic Zone, central working committee and management committees will supervise Dawei region projects under Myanmar Special Economic Zone Law and Dawei Special Economic Zone Law. Dawei SEZ Management Committee was formed to enforce the laws in development of Dawei SEZ and meeting satisfaction of the local people with himself as the chairman.

The State will receive land premium of US\$ 30.675 million in five installments for 204.5 square kilometers of Dawei SEZ at the rate of US\$ 0.15 million per one square kilometer. Apart from the land premium which is only for operation there, the State will also get any percent of the profit from the project in each year.

Regarding the question No (2) on which **Myanmar national company has how much stake and investment in the project**, the deputy minister answered that Max Myanmar Group of Companies owned by a Myanmar national has 25 percent share in the project. The profit will be distributed, depending on the share. Max Myanmar is currently planning to withdraw its investment. Dawei Development Company Limited has been formed with companies that will invest in the project and investments from abroad were invited. About US\$ 8600 million will have to be invested in its infrastructures.

Regarding the question No (3) on **progress of the**

project since the signing of agreement between MPA and Italian-Thai Development Company, the deputy minister answered that as Italian-Thai Development company is implementing the project, alignment of the road linking Thailand has been constructed. Detailed survey and feasibility test for making finishing touches on alignment design is being carried out. Design of the deep sea port has been completed by 80 percent. Feasibility test is being conducted to build breakwater. The construction of 400 MW coal-fired power plant with Clean Coal Technology that has no impact on the environment and the local people is being taken into consideration. Field surveys are being made for supply sufficient water to the special economic zone. Relevant ministry is in negotiation with Dawei

Development Co Ltd to sign sectoral agreement.

Regarding the question No (4) on **measures for prevention of risks to natural environment**, the deputy minister answered that Environmental Management Plan would be drafted according to reports of Social Impact Assessment (SIA), Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Payment for Environmental Services (PES) would be included. Rules, orders, directives, rules and regulations would be issued for waste management abiding by environmental conservation law.

Regarding the question No (5) on **job opportunities for Myanmar citizens in Dawei Deep Sea Port Project**, the deputy minister answered that the investor is required to operate with at least 25 percent of citizen workers at the end of first five years, with at least 50 percent at the end of second five years and with at least 75 percent at the end of third five years. Jones overcomes pain to win gold

LONDON, 10 Aug—Jade Jones fought through the pain barrier to land Britain's first Taekwondo Olympic

gold with a stunning victory over world champion Hou Yuzhou of China in the women's -57kg final at ExCeL.

The Welsh teenager - world silver medallist after being beaten by Hou in Korea last year - had opened her Olympic debut with an impressive 15-1 victory over Serbian Dragana Gladovic and dispatched Japan's Mayu Hamada 13-3 in the last eight, before a late rally of trademark headkicks beat world number one Tseng Li-Cheng of Chinese Taipei.

The 19-year-old showed no fear in the final against the Chinese fighter, closing out a 6-4 victory as South Arena 1 erupted.

Jones was not going to let anything get in the way of her Olympic dream.

'I hurt my foot in the very first fight, it was a kick to the shin, so I had an injection in it,' said Jones.

'At first, I was whinging and feeling sorry for myself, but I just had to deal with it because I wanted to win.'

A test of our democracy

Recent unrests in Rakhine State sparked off debate over religiosity although various political and religious figures including the President have made clear that it had no connection with the religion. Earlier reports from media of the outside world illustrated, albeit wrongly, the incident as a fight between two communities of different faiths while some politicized the issue.

Myanmar is a country where more than 60 million people from various religions have lived in peace and amity. The constitution also guarantees the freedom of religion.

The purpose of every religion is to teach peaceful ways of living in the human community. Actually, it is a tool to get the people together, not to separate them. In whatever religion we believe, we will not be able to live in peace and harmony unless we do not hold each other in respect. Human beings should see each other as equals regardless of race, religion, colour or social status.

Many innocent people in Rakhine State are now suffering substantial losses. All of the sufferers, whether or not the people of the same religion or race, deserve aids on the humanitarian ground.

Regarding arguments over citizenship, the parliaments in session should prescribe comprehensive citizenship legislation urgently. Meanwhile, we should also show to the world that Myanmar is a civilized country which could express generosity towards the persons in trouble. But nothing may block our measures to respond to our enemies who brought the bad to our beloved country even if the person is our own citizen.

We all should aware that the conflict between different religious groups is a traditional tool for political gains. The country's democracy is still in its infancy. It would be better not to talk about the differences.

Little sign of battle in Egypt's Sinai region

SHAIKH ZUWAID, 10 Aug — Egypt poured troops into North Sinai on Thursday in an offensive meant to tackle militants in the Israeli border region, but residents were skeptical, saying they had seen no sign of anyone being killed in what they described as a "haphazard" operation.

The offensive is crucial to maintaining good relations with Israel, which fears Islamist militants based in the increasingly lawless desert region could link up with hardliners in neighbouring Gaza to launch attacks on the Jewish state — potentially threatening a 1979 peace treaty with Egypt. Army commanders said as many as

20 "terrorists" had died in the offensive launched after suspected Islamist militants killed 16 Egyptian border guards on Sunday and drove a stolen armoured car into Israel which was then destroyed by Israeli forces. Hundreds of troops and dozens of military vehicles had reached al-Arish, the main administrative centre in North Sinai, security sources said on Thursday.

Armoured vehicles, some equipped with machineguns, could then be seen driving out of al-Arish towards the border settlement of Sheikh Zuwaid — which had been targeted by aircraft on Wednesday. The troops

saluted passersby and flashed victory signs, or filmed their departure with video cameras. But residents interviewed later in Sheikh Zuwaid and surrounding villages said they had seen



no sign of fighting.

In al Toumah, a village surrounded by olive fields, one witness said he saw troops firing in the air.

"We thought they were chasing someone, but their arms were directed up and we didn't see who they were fighting with," the witness, who declined to be named, said. "We couldn't find any

bodies or signs of battle after they left." In Sheikh Zuwaid, controlled by Bedouin tribal leaders since police deserted the area last year, life continued as normal, its markets bustling. Witnesses reported a military presence on the outskirts, but no fighting since Wednesday's air strikes.

UN, World Bank agree on working together to address global challenges

UNITED NATIONS, 10 Aug — The UN and the World Bank agreed here on Thursday that they will work more closely in addressing global challenges including sustainable development, health and education.

In his meeting with Kim Jim Yong, new president of the World Bank, UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said the two organizations are "strongest partners" in addressing peace and development agenda and are very happy to work together very closely.

"We will work regularly, to raise awareness, as well as to mobilize resources, and mobilize political will to help member states to achieve these goals (Millennium Development Goals)," said Ban.

Ban also discussed with Kim global health issues, saying "Our target is to save 16 million women and children who would be dying needlessly from preventable diseases. I really count on Dr Kim's leadership on that." This is the first time that Kim visited the UN headquarters since he assumed the post on 1 July.

US to boost missile defence in Gulf: spokesman

WASHINGTON, 10 Aug — The United States will continue to work with its allies to boost defence against the growing threat of ballistic missiles in the Persian Gulf, a State Department spokesman said on Thursday.

"What I would say is that the threat from ballistic missiles to our deployed forces, allies and partners in the region is growing, and this threat is likely to increase in both volume and

complexity in the coming years," Patrick Ventrell said at a regular news briefing.

The spokesman was commenting on a report by *The New York Times* saying that Washington and its Arab allies are knitting together a regional missile defence system across the Gulf to protect cities, oil refineries, pipelines and military bases from a possible Iranian attack.

"The US has a robust

security partnership, including missile defence, with our allies and partners in the Gulf and is committed to their security," Ventrell said, adding that Washington "will continue to work with our partners in the Middle East to strengthen missile defence in the Persian Gulf." The United States and its NATO allies are building a missile shield in Europe that they claim targets Iran as well.

Finland's PM proposes bank-funded EU crisis fund

HELSINKI, 10 Aug — Finland's prime minister has proposed a banking sector-funded European crisis fund to recapitalize troubled banks as part of Europe's plans for a banking union to tighten supervision. The premier of triple-A rated Finland, one of only four remaining euro zone members to retain the top credit rating, also said the European Union should fully implement decisions made to establish closer fiscal union. "We should be able to build a system where banks cannot shake up whole

countries. One solution in addition to monitoring could be European banks' crisis fund," Jyrki Katainen was quoted as saying in an interview with economic magazine *Talouselama* published on Friday.

He suggested the fund, which would get its money from European banks, would be used to recapitalize viable parts of troubled banks. The European Central Bank, the European Commission and euro zone member states are working on a proposal for

creating a banking union and are debating what powers the new bank watchdog should get. The plan is expected to be announced in September. While Katainen's government is pro-euro, it has taken a tough stance on bailouts and has demanded collateral in exchange for loans to struggling euro zone countries. It has also opposed measures such as the European bailout fund buying sovereign bonds in the secondary markets to support weak euro zone states.

China urged to guard against El Nino

BEIJING, 10 Aug — A top meteorological official has urged authorities to guard against extreme weather in China during the coming months, as unusually warm ocean temperatures caused by El Nino will impact seasonal weather patterns, state media reported on Friday. China has been under the influence of El Nino since July and will continue to feel its effects into the fall, China National Radio quoted Zheng Guoguang, director of the China Meteorological Administration, as saying.

Under El Nino, heavy rains are likely to hit the middle and eastern parts of China this August, according to Zheng, who called for strengthened flood control efforts in the Haihe River Basin in north China and along the middle and lower reaches of the Yellow and Yangtze rivers. Local authorities in areas south of the Yangtze River should also take precautions against summer droughts and arid weather, Zheng said.

Lower-than-average rainfall and higher temperatures will appear in the fall, except in the northern parts of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region and the northeastern provinces, said Zheng. Zheng said El Nino is not to blame for the recent typhoons and will actually lead to weaker typhoon activity after the autumn season. Typhoon Haikui, which made landfall in the coastal province of Zhejiang at 3:20 am on Wednesday, has brought heavy downpours to east China and left three people dead as of Thursday.

It was the third typhoon to wallop China's eastern coast in a week, after storms Saola and Dmrey hit the region over last weekend. El Nino, characterized by an abnormal warming of the sea surface in the Equatorial Pacific, can cause exceptionally heavy rainfall in some parts of the globe and extreme droughts in others. —Xinhua

Chavez says US citizen arrested for entering Venezuela illegally

CARCAS, 10 Aug — Venezuelan security forces have arrested an American citizen who entered the nation illegally with geographical coordinates in a notebook, President Hugo Chavez said on Thursday. In the tense run-up to an 7 October presidential election, the socialist leader has frequently mentioned the possibility of violence by opponents with US backing.

Foes say that is typical grandstanding nonsense from Chavez, intended to curry support with the masses for his re-election bid by presenting himself as a victim of "imperial" plots. At a campaign rally in the coastal town of Catia La Mar, Chavez said the man, of Latin American origin, was arrested four or five days ago crossing into Venezuela from Colombia.

"He has the look of a mercenary. We are interrogating him," Chavez

said, adding that the man had stamps in his passport from visits to Iraq, Afghanistan and Libya. When he was detained, the man tried to destroy a notebook full of coordinates, Chavez said in the middle of a speech carried live on state TV, implying a plot was afoot. "We have reconstructed the pages," he said.

"He says he was fleeing from someone ... It's a powerful sign. This citizen wanted to enter the country illegally, for who knows what reason. He cannot say where he was going, or who was waiting for him." Chavez, who says he is completely cured after three cancer operations in the last year, has a healthy two-digit lead in most polls ahead of the presidential election. He gave no more details of the case and US Embassy officials could not immediately be reached for comment. —Reuters

Pentagon helps build Meshworm reconnaissance robot

WASHINGTON, 10 Aug—Engineers have created a robot that mimics a worm’s movements—crawling along surfaces by contracting segments of its body. The technique allows the machine to be made of soft materials so it can squeeze through tight spaces and mould its shape to rough terrain. It can also absorb heavy blows without sustaining damage. The Pentagon’s Darpa research unit supported the Meshworm project,

suggesting a potential military use.

Work on the machine was carried out by researchers at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Harvard University in the US, and Seoul National University in South Korea. Details are published in the journal *IEEE/ASE Transactions on Mechatronics*. “[The] soft body, which is essentially compliant, exhibits large strains and enables the robot to traverse small openings and reconstitute shape, and

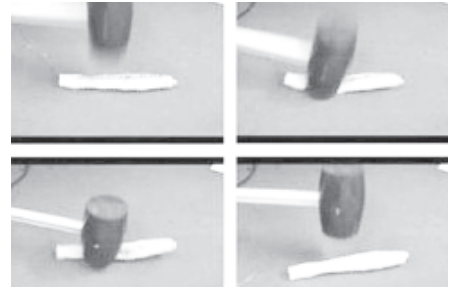
survives from large impact force on falling,” the engineers wrote. They added that using a worm-like motion helped reduce the noise such machines produce, making them suitable “for reconnaissance purposes”.

Previous attempts to create such a robot have used gears and air-powered or pneumatic pumps. But these added to the bulk of the machines making them less practical for real-world uses. The Darpa-supported team instead moved their machine by using an “artificial muscle” made out of nickel and titanium wire designed to stretch and contract with heat. The Meshworm is made out of a tube created from polymer mesh around which a metal wire is wrapped to create an “artificial muscle.”

By wrapping this wire around a mesh-like tube the

engineers replicated the circular muscle fibres of an earthworm, creating different segments in the process. When a current was applied to part of the wire it contracted, squeezing the tube. The team created algorithm to send a contraction wave across each of the machine’s five segments in turn, squeezing the tube and propelling it forward. This mimics the movement of its biological counterpart. They were able to make the robot move at a rate of about 5mm per second (0.2 inches/sec). Two additional “muscles” were added to the sides of the machine to pull it left and right, allowing its direction to be controlled.

The researchers said that the soft nature of the robot’s body allowed it to be subjected to hammer blows

and be trod on without sustaining any damage because its shape changed to help absorb the blows. “You can throw it, and it won’t collapse,” said Sangbae Kim, assistant professor in mechanical engineering at MIT. “Parts in Meshworms are all fibrous and flexible. The muscles are soft and the body is soft... [and] we’re starting to show some body-morphing capability.” The

Meshworm is just one of several animal-inspired projects being funded by Darpa.

Other examples include a robotic “cheetah” that can run at speeds of 18mph (29km/h), a micro-aircraft equipped with a camera that looks like a hummingbird, and AlphaDog—a four-legged robot designed to carry soldiers’ gear.

Stressed men drawn to heavy women

LONDON, 10 Aug—When placed under stressful situations, men rate larger women as more attractive, new research has shown. British researchers found that men exposed to tasks that were designed to put them under pressure preferred a wider range of female body sizes. They conclude that stress can act to alter judgments of potential partners.

The work by a team from London and Newcastle is published in the open access journal *PloS One*. “There’s a lot of literature suggesting that our BMI (body mass index) preferences are hard-wired, but that’s probably not true,” co-author Dr Martin Tovee, from Newcastle University, told BBC News.

Dr Tovee and his colleague, Dr Viren Swami, have previously researched what factors could alter BMI

preferences, including publishing a paper in the *British Journal of Psychology* on the effect of hunger, and the influence of the media. But through this new work they aimed to investigate whether known cross-cultural differences in body size preferences linked to stress were also mirrored in short-term stressful situations.

“If you look at environments where food is scarce, people’s preferences for body size in a potential partner are shifted. [The preference] appears to be much heavier compared to environments where there’s plenty of food

and a much more relaxed atmosphere,” he explained.

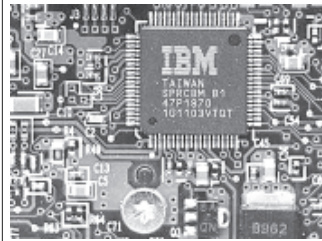
“If you’re living a far more stressful, subsistence lifestyle, you’re going to have higher stress levels.” To simulate heightened stress, a test group of men were placed in interview and public speaking scenarios and their BMI preferences compared against a control group of non-stressed men. The results indicated that the change in “environmental conditions” led to a shift of weight preference towards heavier women with the men considering a wider range of body sizes attractive.

IBM made “informal approach” for RIM’S enterprise business

LONDON, 10 Aug — International Business Machines Corp has considered buying Research In Motion’s enterprise division, Bloomberg reported on Friday, citing two unnamed sources.

IBM made an informal approach for the enterprise business that operates the servers used for supporting BlackBerry email and messaging services, one of the sources said, according

to Bloomberg. The reports said no talks were currently underway.

Under the leadership of new chief executive, Thorsten Heins, RIM has hired bankers for a strategic review that could include a potential sale and partnerships for its technology.

The Bloomberg report said the BlackBerry maker has not yet received any offers for its phone business or for the whole company.

RIM virtually invented

mobile email with its first BlackBerry devices more than a decade ago, but its market share has evaporated as consumers have flocked to Apple Inc’s iPhone and devices based on Google Inc’s Android system. RIM has lost over 70 percent in market capitalization in the last year alone.

RIM officials declined to comment to Reuters while IBM officials were not immediately available.

On Thursday, South Korea’s Samsung Electronics Co said it has not considered acquiring RIM or licensing the embattled BlackBerry phone maker’s new mobile operating system, despite an earlier report from an influential analyst floating the idea.

Russia says derailed satellites no threat to ISS

MOSCOW, 10 Aug — The two satellites that failed to reach the designed orbits posed no threat to the International Space Station (ISS), the Russian Defence Ministry said on Thursday. Experts from the Russian Air and Space Defence Troops are closely monitoring the *Telkom 3* and *Express MD2* telecommunications satellites that didn’t enter their orbits on 7 August, *Interfax* news agency quoted Defence Ministry spokesman Alexei Zolotukhin as saying.

“Currently these satellites pose no threat to the International Space Station and space vehicles of the Russian orbit group,” Zolotukhin said. Experts received information on changes of the space vehicle’s orbits from the Russian space control system, the spokesman said, adding that they were analyzing data and adjusting forecast of possible approaches of dangerous objects to the ISS. Russia on Monday night launched *Telkom 3* and *Express MD2* aboard the Proton-M rocket from the Baikonur space centre in Kazakhstan. The carrier rocket failed to orbit the two satellites on Tuesday due to problems in the rocket’s boost stage, federal space agency Roscosmos said.—Xinhua

US space agency to begin new mission for study on Earth’s radiation belts

WASHINGTON, 10 Aug — The American space agency NASA announced on Thursday that it would send two spacecraft into the harsh environment of the earth’s radiation belts from the Space Coast in the US state of Florida on 23 August.

Researchers are expected to be able to develop an understanding of the invisible Van Allen radiation belts, named after James Van Allen, the discoverer of the radiation belts, based on data collected by the spacecraft, which will be sent by a mission dubbed as “Radiation Belt Storm Probes (RBSP).”

The spacecraft are

designed to fly and operate in the heart of the most hazardous regions of near-earth space, according to the NASA announcement. “At the end of this month we will turn our attention from planet Mars to planet Earth, both immersed in the atmosphere of our sun,” said Barbara Giles, director of NASA’s Heliophysics Division. “RBSP will further explore the connection of solar variability and its impacts on Earth’s radiation belts.”

The Van Allen radiation belts are a torus of energetic charged particles (plasma) around Earth, which is held in place by Earth’s magnetic

field. It is believed most of the particles that form the belts come from solar wind, and other particles by cosmic rays.

Located in the inner region of the Earth’s magnetosphere, the belts are split into two distinct ones, with energetic electrons forming the outer belt and a combination of protons and electrons forming the inner one.

RBSP will also help scientists understand how the Van Allen radiation belts behave and react to changes in the sun, thereby contributing to Earth’s space weather, which is caused in great part by the sun’s influence on Earth and near-Earth space, including solar events such as giant eruptions of solar material called coronal mass ejections.—Xinhua

China export and import growth slows sharply in July

BEIJING, 10 Aug — China's export and import growth slowed for the second straight month in July, raising fears about the strength of the world's second-largest economy.

Exports rose by 1% from a year earlier, down from 11.3% growth in June, amid slowing demand from key markets. Meanwhile, imports rose by 4.7% compared with 6.3% in June, indicating that domestic demand was also slowing. Analysts said the data was weaker than expected and may see Beijing introduce stimulus measures to spur growth.

"Trade data has come in dramatically below expectations—the worst export growth number (excluding Chinese New Year) since November 2009 - highlighting the risk that the external environment poses to an economy in the midst of a rapid internal slowdown," said Alistair Thornton of IHS Global Insight in Beijing. "The government is likely to respond by ramping-up its stimulus efforts, with both monetary and fiscal guns firing."

The data comes just a day after China reported that growth in industrial output

fell to a three-year low in July. Industrial production rose by 9.2% during the month, from a year earlier, down from 9.5% increase in June. At the same time, growth in retail sales during the month also fell short of forecasts.

Analysts said that the weak data had raised concerns that the economy may be slowing faster than previously thought.

"Things really aren't going China's way," said IHS Global Insight's Mr Thornton. "Those looking for signs of resilience in China's economic data were merely disappointed yesterday, but they are going to be distraught today." — *Internet*

Jaguar boosts profits at Tata Motors parent company

MUMBAI, 10 Aug — A 34% rise in sales by luxury carmaker Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) boosted Indian parent company Tata Motors' profits during the April to June quarter.

Net profits came in at 22.45bn rupees (\$405m; £260m), up 12% when compared with the same period a year earlier.

The UK subsidiary's strong performance helped offset weak car, truck and bus sales in India, but failed to mollify investors. Shares fell because investors had expected profits of 27.61bn rupees. Tata failed to meet those expectations as passenger car sales in India

fell 10% during the period, while commercial vehicles sales rose 1.3%.

By contrast, JLR sales rose 34.4% to, bolstered by strong demand in Russia and China. Foreign exchange

losses, resulting from a depreciating rupee, also curbed the carmaker's profit growth. Revenues fell 8.9% to 105.9bn rupees, with JLR accounting for about 40% of the earnings. — *Internet*

US FDA approves new medication to treat rare type of leukemia

WASHINGTON, 10 Aug — The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Thursday approved Marqibo to treat adults with a rare type of leukemia called Philadelphia chromosome negative acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL).

Marqibo, marketed by California-based Talon Therapeutics Inc, is approved for patients whose leukemia has returned (relapsed) two or more times, or whose leukemia has progressed following two or more regimens of anti-leukemia therapy.

The medication contains vincristine, a commonly used anti-cancer drug, encased within a liposome, a drug delivery vehicle composed of

material similar to that of cell membranes. It is an injection administered once a week by a health care professional.

According to the FDA, the most common side effects of Marqibo observed during clinical studies include constipation, nausea, low blood cell counts, fever, nerve damage, fatigue, diarrhea, decreased appetite, and insomnia.

ALL is a rapidly progressing form of blood and bone marrow cancer that is more commonly diagnosed in children than adults. According to the US National Cancer Institute, an estimated 6,050 men and women will be diagnosed with ALL and 1,440 will die from the disease this year.

Study finds there may be an "obesity paradox" in diabetes

NEW YORK, 10 Aug — Obesity and diabetes may not be the double whammy people expect, with an analysis of previous studies surprisingly finding that overweight and obese people who get diagnosed with the blood sugar disorder tend to live longer than leaner peers. The findings, which appeared in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*, were based on data from five earlier studies that tracked people over time to identify risk factors for heart disease.

Study leader Mercedes Carnethon of the Feinberg School of Medicine at Northwestern University in Chicago said this sort of "obesity paradox" had been observed before in chronic diseases such as heart and kidney failure—but it doesn't mean gaining weight is a good way to improve your prognosis if you get the disease. In fact, it's probably not that extra pounds are protective, but that lean people who get diabetes are

somehow predisposed to worse health. "Perhaps those individuals are somehow genetically loaded to develop diabetes and have higher mortality," she said. "A normal-weight person who has diabetes has an extremely high mortality rate."

More than 2,600 participants developed type 2 diabetes during the studies, and 12 percent of them had a normal weight when they got the diagnosis. The death rate was 1.5 percent per year

among overweight and obese people, compared to 2.8 percent per year among their trimmer peers. After accounting for several risk factors for heart disease, including age, blood pressure, high cholesterol and smoking, lean people were more than twice as likely to die at any given point as heavier people. The same held true for deaths caused by heart disease, which is linked to obesity.

"It was a little bit

unexpected to see that," said Carnethon. One potential limitation of the study is that the researchers couldn't always account for how much people smoked, which might explain part of the results. It's also possible that a few people might have been diagnosed with diabetes outside of the studies and been told to slim down by their own doctor before they were seen by the study researchers. That could also have contributed to the findings, although Carnethon said the effect would be small.

She added that it's not clear how to best treat normal-weight people with type 2 diabetes, although weight training seems preferable over cardio exercise. Older people and people of Asian descent are more likely to be normal-weight when diagnosed, and Carnethon stressed that doctors need to take the disorder extra seriously when it's not accompanied by obesity. "These findings do apply to a growing segment of the population," she added. — *Reuters*

Google to pay hefty fine for violating Apple users' privacy

SAN FRANCISCO, 10 Aug — Google has agreed to pay a record 22.5-million-US-dollar civil penalty to settle charges that it bypassed Apple users' privacy settings to track their online activities, the US Federal Trade Commission (FTC) announced on Thursday.

The settlement is part of the FTC's ongoing efforts to make sure companies live up to the privacy promises they make to consumers, and is the largest penalty the government agency has ever

obtained for a violation of a Commission order, the FTC said in a statement.

The FTC also requires Google to disable all the tracking software it had said it would not place on consumers' computers. The charges and the fine by the FTC came after reports in February that Google made an end run around a privacy setting in Apple's Safari browser, the default browser for iPhone, iPad, iPod and Macintosh users, in order to track users' online activities.

It was found by a graduate student at Stanford University and first reported by *The Wall Street Journal*.

Google has said the tracking was inadvertent and caused no harm to Safari users. But the FTC believed that the Internet search giant violated a deal it reached with federal regulators last October, in which the FTC "bars the company from future privacy misrepresentations." "The record setting penalty in this matter sends a clear message to all companies under an FTC

privacy order," said Jon Leibowitz, Chairman of the FTC, in a statement.

"No matter how big or small, all companies must abide by FTC orders against them and keep their privacy promises to consumers, or they will end up paying many times what it would have cost to comply in the first place."

US firms waking up to Africa investment

JOHANNESBURG, 10 Aug—American companies are starting to wake up to huge investment opportunities in Africa, the chairman of the US Export Import bank, Fred Hochberg said here on Wednesday. Hochberg, in South African as part of a business delegation alongside US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, said more US companies must invest in the “rich and deep market” in Africa.

“Many US companies didn’t see the need to have an ambitious export profile for many years, but I think there’s more of a waking up (to) opportunities here in sub-Saharan Africa,” he told reporters. Hochberg identified potential sectors of investment as energy, aircraft, mining, medical and small businesses. This week, ExIm Bank unveiled a loan worth \$2.0

billion to finance clean energy in South Africa.

South Africa is the leading US export market on the continent, taking in more than \$7.0 billion worth of goods and services in 2011, 30 percent more than the previous year. Hochberg said that last year the ExIm Bank signed a memorandum of understanding for the expansion of the energy and agriculture sectors in power-starved Nigeria. “There has been some interest that is beginning to take some hold... high levels of interest there” in Nigeria, he told reporters.—*Internet*

Tsunami debris latest addition to ocean pollution

VANCOUVER, 10 Aug — A US environmental group tracking the debris from last year’s Japan tsunami said the floating garbage only highlights the increasing severity of ocean pollution. A California-based Ocean Voyages Institute said they spotted a large quantity of debris off the coasts of Oregon and Washington State while sailing up from San Francisco in their research vessel *Kaisai*, which dropped anchor in the Vancouver suburb city of Richmond on Wednesday.

Institute founder Mary Crowley told media the vessel’s crew documented small pieces of a dock and many debris, which are believed to have come from Japan tsunami on 11 March, 2011. The Japanese debris, including four big piers and myriad containers afloat in the Pacific, could take a toll on shipping safety. Over the years, the *Kaisai* crew has documented in regular expeditions the “Great Pacific Garbage Patchin,” where millions of bits of plastic were brought together by winds and currents, forging a roughly 34-million-square-km swirling vortex between Hawaii and California, known as a “gyre.” “Everyday, all over the Pacific basin, debris is going into the ocean,” she said. “We do feel with any kind of emergencies that there should be debris cleanup.”

“I don’t know if it’s possible to clean up all of it... how tragic is it to be destroying our ocean eco-system before we even understand it.” Crowley said the institute is working with US coastguards to study the debris and improve safety measures by informing them of the whereabouts of large debris pieces. Crowley suggests the governments pay fishermen to collect plastic and build a factory ship in the ocean to recycle the plastic into fuel and energy.—*Xinhua*

BOSTON, 10 Aug—Hewlett Packard Co warned of a mammoth quarterly loss after writing down \$8 billion on the value of its services business, most of which it acquired four years ago with its \$14 billion purchase of EDS. The world’s largest computer maker also plans to replace its head of services, a vast but sluggish division that new CEO Meg Whitman wants to reshape into a

stronger competitor to the likes of IBM.

Whitman, the former eBay CEO who took up the computing giant’s helm in 2011 to some skepticism about her technology and hardware credentials, is trying to turn around the company. HP’s stock has lost more than half its value in the two years since CEO Mark Hurd unexpectedly resigned amid a scandal over his relationship with a female marketing contractor.

In a sign that Whitman’s efforts to trim costs and bolster the company’s prospects were succeeding, HP on Wednesday raised its quarterly outlook for profit, after excluding one-time items such as the goodwill writedown. It did not provide reasons.

HP’s stock rose 2.4 percent to end at \$19.41 after the increase in the company’s outlook relieved investors, who had been expecting another bad quarter with global IT spending on the wane. “Everybody was expecting them to miss the quarter. Now they said they are going to beat their forecast. That’s why the stock is up,” said Shaw Wu, an analyst with Sterne Agee. But analysts cautioned that it is premature to say that HP’s darkest days have passed, especially because the company did not explain why it raised its outlook for profit, excluding

items.

“There are a lot of unanswered questions,” said Stifel Nicolaus analyst Aaron Rakers. “It is hard for me to get too terribly positive on it.”

HP said it decided to take the \$8 billion non-cash charge in its fiscal third quarter ended on 31 July following a review prompted by declines in its stock price, changing market conditions and the services division’s financial performance.

“When indicators of potential impairment are identified, companies are required to conduct a review of the carrying amounts of goodwill and other long-lived assets to determine if an impairment exists,” HP said in a statement. Analysts said that charge confirmed what has long been widely known by investors: HP paid too much for EDS, one of the pioneers of the outsourcing of technology services.—*Reuters*

Hong Kong tests babies over Japanese milk formula

HONG KONG, 10 Aug — Hong Kong said on Thursday it will test babies who have consumed Japanese-made infant formulas found to have insufficient levels of iodine, after the products were ordered off the city’s shelves. Officials found the Wakodo and Moringa brands lacked enough iodine, and warned they could have “adverse health effects” on babies’ thyroid glands and brains. “We urge parents to take their babies to the 10 government-designated health centres for blood tests,” a spokesman at the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department told *AFP*, adding that around 2,000 babies could be affected.

The government ordered the two products to be removed from shop shelves, following the findings of a random test on 14 milk brands. The banned products, which are for babies aged up to nine months, were found to contain less than one-third of the World Health Organization’s recommended levels

of iodine, an essential nutrient for infant development. “This may affect the functioning of the thyroid gland,” the Centre for Food Safety said in a statement. “If the thyroid gland’s normal functions are significantly affected, there may be potential impact on the brain development of infants.”

The government said it would continue to test other brands. Japanese-made baby formula accounts for about three percent of the total milk brands distributed in Hong Kong. Their popularity slumped after the nuclear disaster in Japan last year sparked fears of radiation poisoning. The producers of Wakodo and Moringa formula said the products were not intended for sale in Hong Kong, which had different requirements for iodine content than Japan. “We presume that local importers... are marketing it there,” Moringa spokeswoman Natsumi Takahashi told *AFP* in Japan.

Two killed, two missing in S Africa’s heavy snow, rain falls

JOHANNESBURG, 10 Aug—At least two people died and two went missing on Wednesday as heavy snow and rain battered South Africa’s southeast leaving swathes of the country without electricity, media reports said.

A homeless man in his 50s was found dead in a cardboard box near a nature reserve in Westville town, *SAPA* news agency said.

In Eastern Cape a three-year-old girl was killed when the walls of her house crumbled after torrential rains. A man went missing after floodwaters swept his car off a low-lying bridge. A paramedic whose ambulance veered off a bridge into a river on Tuesday, was also still missing a day later.

The snowfall forced the closure of parts of the highway linking Johannesburg and

Durban, Africa’s busiest port, for several hours, while train services in that part of the country were also cancelled. The heavy snow and rain played also havoc with power transmission equipment, plunging parts of the region into the dark.

The country’s meteorological department forecast that the weather would improve for Thursday.—*Internet*

Plane uses ice runway to evacuate American from Antarctic outpost

NEW YORK, 10 Aug—An Australian aircraft has made a rare mid-winter emergency flight to Antarctica involving landing on an ice runway to evacuate a member of a US government expedition in apparent need of urgent surgery, US authorities said on Wednesday.

The US National Science Foundation said the medical evacuation was due to end a little after 2 am EDT (0700 GMT) on Thursday when a

A319 Airbus from Australia’s Antarctic research program was due to land with the American patient in Christchurch, New Zealand.

The Airbus had already completed the most perilous part of its journey when it touched down on an ice runway or landing strip known as Pegasus near McMurdo Station, one of three year-round research outposts the National Science Foundation runs in

Antarctica.

Flights to Antarctica are usually only made in the summer, but the NSF said the patient — an American member of one of its projects “may require immediate corrective surgery.”

Antarctica is currently emerging from its six-month-long night. There is now a period of twilight at midday that may have assisted pilots in landing on the ice runway.

Taking advantages of unrest and violence that was rife in Rakhine State early June, some local and international organizations and individuals extensively made a spate of criticism. Some blamed the incident as violation of human rights while some dubbed the incident as religious persecution and racial oppression. Some also advocated the incident as using excessive forces in the settling of disputes and conflicts. To put it in a nutshell, incidents in Rakhine State were pushed into religious and human rights problems applying different approaches. And it can be assessed that there emerged attempts to create a series of political and international problems should religious and human rights problems be widely accepted.

As it is known to all that **Rakhine incident was a local dispute that stemmed from unlawful acts of mob due to an unjust act of a group of people. The anarchic activities become wider due to instigations putting religion, racism putting rage, hatred and vengeance in the fore.**

The Rakhine unrests left 77 people dead, 109 injured and 4822 houses, 17 mosques, 15 monasteries and three schools were burnt down in Sittway, Maungtaw and Buthidaung Townships. **Killing, arson attacks, retaliations and revenges left both sides to suffer much. The incident had turned out to be a lesson for those who fell victims and a stigma for Rakhine region.**

Despite of a diversity of religious beliefs since year one, we have a very long history of amicable co-existence with reciprocity. **In the time of our new government, we are amending and enacting laws and rules to ensure that all citizens to enjoy such fundamental rights as freedom of expression, freedom of faiths and freedom of association. Nowadays, it can be found that officials at different levels are trying their utmost in settling problems and fulfilling the desires of the people as much as they can.**

Soon after the incidents of Rakhine State happened, officials at different levels have been able to put the situations under control immediately. Likewise, they made necessary preparations to deter the incidents from spreading to other regions and to restore peace soonest. On the other hand, they openly informed the people throughout the nation of latest developments of the incidents in real time. Priority is now being given to public affairs and transparency when compared in the past. This is to be recognized.

A 16-member investigation team was formed with the Deputy Minister for Home Affairs as chairman on 6 June in order to expose anarchic acts committed by mob on 3 and 4 June in Rakhine State and take actions against those who got involved in the atrocities. As violence, arsons against residences, shops, guest houses, mosques and monasteries continued unabated, Maungtaw and Buthidaung Townships were put under curfew with the announcement of Section-144 on 8 June and peace and law and order were restored. Similarly, Sittway, Thandwe, Kyaukpyu and Yanbye were placed under curfew with the announcement of Section-144 and peace and law and order were restored.

However, violence was spread to such a degree that could harm the administrative machinery of Rakhine State. This being the case, the state of emergency was imposed with the announcement of Ordinance No. 1/2012 on 10 June so as to enable local people to live with peace of mind. Shortly after the imposition of the state of emergency, the help of the Tatmadaw was sought to effectively guard against local people. Such efforts reveal that crisis response has been taken in a systematic and timely manner.

Prompt actions were taken to open relief camps for local people who fell victims of violence and necessary assistance was provided to them while striving for ensuring security of lives and property of local people by controlling the situations in time. Local battalions in cooperation with police and local administrative bodies made efforts to restore peace and law and order and guarded against the people. At the same time, they were taking rehabilitation measures with mind and main. Meanwhile, the Tatmadaw (Navy) was on patrol in order to prevent unscrupulous elements from entering the nation through the Myanmar waters west of Maungtaw. Lt-Gen Hla Min of Commander-in-Chief (Army) Office and Chief Minister of Rakhine State U Hla Maung Tin themselves were in Maungtaw and supervised the tasks. All the necessary measures were taken in the fairest way regardless of race and religion.

Furthermore, the President made a request concerning the incident in Rakhine State to the public through Myanmar Radio and Television on 10 June, saying that **we are in the condition that all of us including religious organizations, religious leaders and political parties have to take control of the situation carefully in unison.** It is noted to all that the President pointed out the situation from all angles with vision.

He said, **"The situation could deteriorate and could be extended beyond the Rakhine State if we are terrorizing and killing each other with such sectarianism, endless hatred, the desire of vengeance and anarchy.**

There are also possibilities of other stimulations. I would like you all to realize how seriously it would damage stability, democratization process and national development of our country in transition period," the President sincerely appealed to the people to consider what is right and what is wrong rationally, revealing his concern over the future of the country and the people.

The President went into to details saying, **"Our government would take legal actions against the cases which have already happened. At the same time, we would take systematic measures under existing laws and rules and regulations to make sure such phenomena and incidents do not happen again. I would like to request all to realize every aspect of the situation with considerable magnanimity as we would focus on bringing back justice for the sufferers in the incidents. I promise our government would attach great importance to the rule of law."** The President himself made necessary requests, guidance and criticisms as regards Rakhine incident with great seriousness and right timing.

Everyone will be well aware that stability was restored in Rakhine State in next to no time thanks to the President's

appeal to the people, highlighting that the good environment of stability and the rule of law is a sine qua none for success of longed-for democratization and the country's bids for development.

While the President was addressing the country, respective ministers and officials were making field trips to and undertaking in Rakhine State without delay. **They took urgent rescue measures and started plans for long-term recovery of the local people at the relief camps. The news reports generated a clear picture that they also reached out the Bengali community as well as to the local Rakhine nationals. I firmly believed the amount of aids would go to both Rakhine people and Bengalis equally.**

Donations of wellwishers, civil societies, NGOs and INGOs as well as the government for survival and recovery of people in Rakhine State facing troubles were encouraging. Donations in Yangon, in Sittway and at Region/State governments have totalled more than K 30 billion. Seeing transportation of aids by ships, cars and even Tatmadaw aircrafts and choppers, I realized that the whole nation acknowledged responsibility for the people in Rakhine State.

Medical staff from both the Defence Services and the Ministry of Health provided healthcare to local people in relief camps. The extent of the seriousness of the State for the region and its people could be seen in transportation of emergency patients by the Tatmadaw choppers.

The Minister for Border Affairs led a group of officials of UN agencies, religious leaders of Islam and departmental heads who visited Maungtaw on 14 June. Providing aids and comforting the sufferers at the relief camps, the minister expressed his sympathy for them and promised a return to normalcy with reconstruction of housings, peaceful livings and reestablishment of their safe villages. He also guaranteed that the victims would be taken in care of both the government and the people regardless of race or religion. He also assured the legal actions against terrorists, calling for patience and compassion. The minister cordially discussed matters for recovery in the long run as well as urgent requirements of food and shelter. I felt the goodwill, equality and the humanitarian that the government and officials at various levels ensured as equal as the sufferers.

Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General Mr Vijay Nambiar, UN Resident Representative Mr Ashok Nigam and UNHCR Resident Representative Mr Johannes Ten Feld also comforted the victims. Religious leaders of Islam from Yangon met townsenders and religious leaders of Islam in Maungtaw and called for peaceful living in line with the teachings of the religion as well. **No religion encourages violence, revenge, killing and arson attacks. Every religion has teachings to treat others with kindness, compassion, tolerance and patience and not to take vengeance. Though, human beings could not suppress anger, ignorance and hatred and are repeating cycles of sufferings. But their anger, ignorance and hatred has ended up in sufferings.**

prescribes that the investor must hire national entrepreneurs or company or organizations for the tasks that need no specific skills. It is directed to give local companies the leading roles in Dawei Special Economic Zone and Myanmar citizens must be employed in the posts, except that of scholars, skilled workers and supervisors. Upto 14-6-2012, six local contractors are operating in the zone with 1039 Myanmar workers.

U Thein Nyunt asked how the fund for environmental conservation in Dawei Deep Sea Port is managed. The deputy minister answered that the Italian-Thai Company is required to establish environmental conservation fund and to fund Payment for Environmental Services.

Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann asked whether

the withdrawal of Max Myanmar Company could impact on the interest of the country and the people and whether any Myanmar company will replace it. As the Taninthayi Region government demanded some land to establish industrial zone for local people, the Italian-Thai Company agreed to return 50 square kilometers from 204.5 square kilometers after negotiations in Thailand. Italian-Thai Company has been invited to continue discussing it.

There is plan to amend Framework Agreement for

more profit of Myanmar side. The involvement of local companies is currently suspended. It would be resumed after Italian-Thai agreed the signing of new Framework Agreement.

The Speaker said the Dawei Deep Sea Port is an important project. He tasked the Economic and Investment Committee to take necessary measures in cooperation with respective commission upon explanation of the deputy minister.

Daw Le Le Win Swe of Tamway Constituency asked social protection for women as Myanmar has signed UN Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (UNCEDAW) and Dr Daw Aye Myint of Shwedaung Constituency on measures for minor care. Deputy Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement U Phone Swe answered that, regarding the first question, Myanmar signed UNCEDAW on 22-7-1997. Myanmar National Committee for Women's Affairs was formed for women empowerment, Myanmar Women's Affairs Federation for wider women empowerment measures, Myanmar Maternal and Child Welfare Association for care of mothers and children and Women's Entrepreneurs Association for boosting economic capacity of women.

In accordance with the UN's Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, programs on promoting equal rights for men and women have been conducted in states and region for four times.

To prevent trafficking in person, the Anti-trafficking in Persons Law was enacted on 13, September, 2005. Besides, national-level guides for reunification of trafficked persons and their families have been drawn and plans have been made to distribute the guide books to the people.

Regarding the second question, Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement signed the The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) on 16, July, 1991 and has been implementing the provisions included in the convention. In accordance

with the provisions of the convention, the national committee, the work committee on rights of children and region/state/district/township CRC committees have been established. Besides, in 1993, the Child Law was enacted and the Rules and Regulations related to the Child Law was adopted in 2000. The Child Law is being re-drawn to meet international standards. As from June, 2012, the departments, INGOs and experts are working to re-write the law which includes the education, health and nutrition of the under-8 children and socio-economy, environmental conservation and poverty alleviation.

At the discussion session, U Aung Thein Lin of South Okkalapa constituency, U Pike Htwe of Kanma Constituency and U Win Than of Thabaung constituency discussed the proposal submitted by U Htay Oo of Hinthada constituency during the 18-day session on adoption of the migration policy for the life security of Myanmar migrant workers in foreign countries.

Their discussion called on the authorities concerned for adopting the migration policy to be able to give guarantee of social security to the migrant workers.

While the country is going to be a member of the ASEAN Community, priority should be placed on the issue of migrant workers in the ASEAN region. They also called for adoption of migrant workers issue as a regional issue when Myanmar has to consider the ASEAN migrant workers issue during the time of the country's 2014 ASEAN chairmanship. They also urged the Hluttaw to adopt the Migration Policy as soon as possible due to the current situation.

Regarding the proposal, Deputy Minister for Labour U Myint Thein said the Union Government has set up the Foreign Employment Supervisory Committee and the management work committee, the work committee ensuring workers' benefits and the work committee for protecting rights of labourers were also established under the supervisory committee. The supervisory committee is drawing the Overseas Employment Policy. It is difficult for Myanmar to implement currently the

Labour Migration Policy in conformity with international standards. However, in an attempt to adopt the firm and definite migration policy, the ministry would work for adoption of the policy in accordance with the discussion of representatives, ILO's conventions and international standards.

Afterwards, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs U Maung Myint said the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has to work for the safe and security of Myanmar migrant workers during the time of successive governments. However, there happened some hindrances due to some reasons. There is no Myanmar embassy in some countries where Myanmar migrant workers are working. The ministry has ordered Myanmar embassies to work for the safe and security of Myanmar migrant workers.

Afterwards, Deputy Minister for Finance and Revenue U Win Shein said that Ministry of Finance and Revenue is working together with private banks to help Myanmar migrant workers to safely transfer their money to the homeland.

Afterwards, Deputy Attorney-General U Tun Tun Oo said the Union Attorney-General's Office is implementing the conventions and treaties.

U Htay Oo who proposed the proposal said migrant workers issues depend on the conditions of a country which sends the workers and a country which accepts the workers. Myanmar is currently a country which sends workers. What Myanmar migrant workers are demanding is the rights they considered what they deserve and the expectation of their families. Therefore, it is suitable that the issue should be discussed at the

Hluttaw where representatives of the people are gathered than outside the Hluttaw. He believed that his discussion would be helpful for drawing the Labour Migration Policy which is necessary for Myanmar which has migrant workers in foreign countries.

Taninthayi Region. Its lower structure is RC post and upper structure, Bailey type. It was commissioned into service on 12 November, 2000. It can withstand 23 tons of loads. At present, there is no plan to upgrade it. It will be upgraded, based on allotted State's fund.

Steering clear of the Thamot River on Yangon-Dawei-Myeik Union Road, 25-mile-long Bod-Daw-Kabin Road has been put into service. Besides, the three bridges—Pabyin Bridges with 180-foot length, Alechaung Bridge with 80-foot length and Daw Bridge with 50-foot length—in lower maintenance on Bod-Daw-Kabin Road are under transition into concrete ones and whose ten miles and six furlongs under upgrading with the fund of 2012-2013 fiscal year. Upon completion, road passers would have easy access to Myeik without using the route cross the Thamot River. Therefore, there was no plan to construct the Thamot River crossing Bridge yet.

Concerning with the query on there is any plan to construct Nansan-Mongsit motor road that would be long 19 miles and 4 furlongs in Nansan Township in

Loilem District, presented by U Sai Kyaw Zaw Than from No. 2 Constituency in Shan State, the deputy minister answered that the road with 19 miles and 4 furlongs long is on a list to maintain for withstand, which is to be implemented by Shan State government. Therefore, the road work would be carried out with the funds K 543.155 million of the 2012-2013 fiscal year.

According to the plan of the 2012-2013 fiscal year, four miles and four furlongs length earth road session of the road would be upgraded to be hard one, and two miles of four-mile and four-furlong gravel road session would be done tar-marking work. The rest of the road depends on the amount of funds to be allocated.

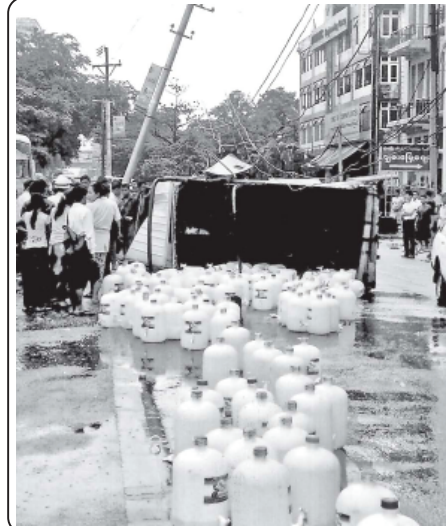
Accident on the road Reckless driving causes car upside down

Libyan assembly votes Mohammed Magarief as president

a new constitution is drafted next year.

Magarief, seen as a moderate Islamist, is effectively Libya's acting head of state, but the true extent of his powers is yet to be determined. A former diplomat who had lived in exile since the 1980s, Magarief was a leading figure in Libya's oldest opposition movement — the National Front for the Salvation of Libya — which made several attempts to end the late Muammar Gaddafi's rule.

Magarief's National Front Party is an offshoot of the old opposition movement and it won three seats in the 7 July poll for the national assembly — Libya's first free vote in a generation. "I am very very happy. This is

a big responsibility," he told Reuters. Magarief won 113 votes versus independent Ali Zidan who secured 85 votes. Voting went to a second round after no one managed to win an outright majority in the first round.

"This is democracy, this is what we have dreamt of," Zidan told Reuters, congratulating Magarief. The assembly was also set to pick two deputies for Magarief, who had been seen as a leading contender for the top job. "He is a political personality and everybody knows him," said Othman Sassi, a former official of the National Transitional Council. "He has very good experience to lead congress and the Libyan democratic state." — Reuters

US consumers ate fewer Big Macs at McDonald's Corp, skipped some caffeine runs to Starbucks Corp and passed on the occasional burrito at Chipotle Mexican Grill Inc — sending a shiver through the investment community that has grown used to those chains posting strong growth in the face of the nation's lackluster economic recovery.

McDonald's on Wednesday vowed to focus more on value after reporting flat sales at established restaurants around the world in July — its worst showing in more than nine years. Starbucks and Chipotle's industry-leading same-restaurant sales growth decelerated last quarter, forcing both chains to make adjustments to reinforce their positions. The world's biggest coffee chain last week brought back its morning "treat receipts" that give discounts to customers who return in the afternoon and is offering coupons for some products. Chipotle said it would put the brakes on menu price hikes, even though its food costs are more vulnerable to volatility because its ability to lock in costs is hampered by its use of organic produce and antibiotic-free meats. An early sign of the shift to keep customers coming back came in June, when Darden Restaurants Inc vowed to step up value-priced promotions aimed at boosting traffic to its Olive Garden and Red Lobster chains. — Reuters

Tropical Storm Ernesto weakens over land, kills three

MEXICO CITY, 10 Aug — Tropical Storm Ernesto weakened as it traveled inland from the Gulf of Mexico on Thursday, but it sent wind gusts and showers across the state of Veracruz, home to some of Mexico's busiest ports and oil installations.

The storm, with maximum sustained winds of 40 mph, made landfall in the early afternoon close to the port city of Coatzacoalcas. Ernesto was heading west over southern Mexico at a speed of about 14 mph, the US National Hurricane Centre in Miami said in its 11 pm EDT (0300

GMT) advisory. The hurricane centre said it expects further weakening as Ernesto moves over mountainous terrain on Friday. However, torrential rain and flooding was expected and authorities reported three deaths.

Officials from state-run oil company Pemex said there

were no reports of disruptions to facilities in the region, which include the Minatitlan refinery, producing 185,000 barrels of crude per day. The eye of the storm passed the oilfields of Cantarell and Ku Maloob Zaap, which account for just over half of Mexico's oil production of about 2.5 million bpd. — Reuters

Typhoon Haihui affects 130,000 in E China province

NANCHANG, 10 Aug — More than 130,000 people have been affected and about 10,000 residents have been relocated in east China's Jiangxi Province as a result

of typhoon Haihui, local authorities said on Friday. Typhoon-triggered torrential rainstorms have battered the province, forcing the relocation of 13,359 people

after the typhoon made landfall early Wednesday morning in east China's Zhejiang Province, according to the provincial flood control and drought relief headquarters.

The city of Jingdezhen, which was hit hard by the heavy rains, received 220 mm of rain, the headquarters said.

The provincial meteorological station issued an orange alert for the storm at 8:40 am, as more rains will pelt the province on Friday.

NASA's Morpheus lander in fiery crash at Cape Canaveral

CAPE CANAVERAL, 10 Aug — A small NASA lander being tested for missions to the moon and other destinations beyond Earth crashed and burned after veering off course during a trial run at the Kennedy Space Centre on Thursday, officials with the US space agency said. There were no injuries after the prototype, known as Morpheus, burst into flames near the runway formerly used by NASA's space shuttles. The insect-like vehicle, designed and built by engineers at NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston, had made several flights attached to a crane before Thursday's attempted free-flight.

Morpheus' engines, which burn liquid oxygen and methane, appeared to ignite as planned, lifting the 1,750-pound (794 kg) vehicle into the air. But a few seconds later, Morpheus rolled over on its side and plummeted to the ground. NASA video showed the vehicle engulfed in flames and then rocked by a spectacular explosion, presumably due to the fuel tanks rupturing. "Failures such as these were anticipated prior to the test, and are part of the development process for any complex spaceflight hardware," NASA said in a statement.

An investigation is under way, the statement added. Project Morpheus began in partnership with privately owned Armadillo Aerospace, which is developing re-usable, suborbital vehicles that take off and land vertically. NASA, which has spent about \$7 million on the project over the past 2-1/2 years, is interested in developing technologies that could be used to fly cargo to the moon and other future missions beyond Earth orbit. Project Morpheus was an example of what the former project manager called "Home Depot

engineering" — low-budget projects that use existing resources and partner with non-traditional aerospace companies.

"The Morpheus lander is kind of our poster child. It's one of our first attempts to do these kinds of projects," former project manager Matt Ondler said in an interview with Reuters last year. "Instead of building some elaborate test structure, you go to Home Depot and build something very quickly that gets you 80 percent

of the answer and allows you to keep moving forward," he said. Morpheus arrived at Florida's seaside space center in July for three months of increasingly rigorous test flights, including automated landings in a mock moonscape, complete with craters and boulders.

The lander was designed to deliver about 1,100 pounds (500 kg) of cargo to the moon, NASA said on its Project Morpheus website. Technologies being developed include a propulsion system that uses liquid oxygen and methane — green fuels that could be manufactured on other planetary bodies, NASA said. — Reuters

NICE seeks more info on Roche cancer pill

LONDON, 10 Aug — Britain's healthcare cost agency said on Friday it needed more information from Roche before it could decide whether to recommend the Swiss group's new melanoma pill Zelboraf for use on the state health service.

The National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE) previously rejected the drug in a preliminary ruling in June. While Roche has submitted additional analysis on the cost effectiveness of the drug since then, NICE said it needed further clarification.

Zelboraf, also known as vemurafenib, was approved in Europe in February and has been hailed as a prime

example of personalised medicine since it is designed to treat melanoma patients with a particular genetic mutation. It costs 1,750 pounds for a week's supply, although Roche has offered a discount, details of which are commercially confidential.

The snub for Zelboraf marks the latest in a series of clashes between Roche and NICE over cancer medicines, including a rejection of its \$6 billion-per-year seller Avastin. NICE, whose decisions are closely watched in other countries, has also angered other drugmakers, although it has many supporters among medics who say a central body is needed to make rational decisions on how to spend scarce resources. — Reuters

NEW YORK, 10 Aug — Threatened shark species are being used to make shark fin soup, a delicacy in Chinese cuisine, in several US cities, according to an unprecedented study based on DNA

testing. Thirty-three different species of sharks turned up in samples collected in 14 cities and analyzed at Stony Brook University's Institute for Ocean Conservation Science in New York. "US consumers of shark fin soup cannot be certain of what's in their soup," said Demian Chap-man, who co-led the DNA testing, in a statement on Wednesday. "They could be eating a species that is in serious trouble."

Scalloped hammerhead sharks, listed as endangered by the International Union for Conservation of Nature, was among the species found on

the menus of US restaurants where shark fin soup can sell for as much as \$100 per bowl. Others included smooth hammerheads, school sharks and spiny dogfish, all listed as vulnerable to extinction, as well as a variety of near-threatened species such as bull and copper sharks. "This is further proof that shark fin soup here in the United States, not just in Asia, is contributing to the global decline in sharks," said Liz Karan, of the Pew Environment Group, a foundation that supported the study.

"Sharks must be protected from overfishing," said Karan, manager of Pew's global shark

conservation program, "and any international trade in these vulnerable and endangered species must be tightly regulated." The study marks the first time that DNA testing has been used to ascertain the different kinds of sharks used to make shark fin soup in the United States on a large nationwide scale.

Samples were collected in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Atlanta, Georgia; Boston; Chicago; Denver, Colorado; Fort Lauderdale, Florida; Houston; Las Vegas; Los Angeles; New York; Orlando, Florida; San Francisco; Seattle and Washington.—Internet

Japan McDonald's recalls flawed giveaway glasses

TOKYO, 10 Aug — McDonald's in Japan said on Wednesday it was recalling giveaway glass tumblers after 78 people reported being injured by the Olympic-themed freebies. The fast food giant said it had received 130 complaints after handing out the tumblers to purchasers of "Value Sets", which included fries and a soft drink, during their "Olympic Cheer Coke Glass Campaign" in June and July.

McDonald's said they gave away six million tumblers in Japan, some of which had "glass protrusions" on their edges or insides because of a manufacturing error. "We received 130 complaints from our customers by 7 August, of which 78 customers said they suffered cuts, although injuries were not serious enough to warrant their going to hospital," company spokesman Kazuyuki Hagiwara told AFP.

He said flawed metallic moulds used by the producer of the glasses were to blame. The company said customers who return their glasses between now and the end of October will be given replacements.—Internet

American Airlines pilots reject tentative contract

WASHINGTON, 10 Aug — Pilots at AMR Corp's American Airlines rejected a tentative contract from the carrier by a wide margin on Wednesday, leaving a major issue unresolved with the bankrupt airline's most powerful employee group. Failure to reach a consensual labour deal is a blow to American's efforts to develop a stand-alone reorganization plan, which relies on slashing debt and labour costs to return

to profitability. The development comes as the third-largest US carrier has begun to review potential mergers, including a deal with US Airways Group, to determine whether merging with a rival will generate more recoveries for American's creditors than going it alone.

American's pilots and two other key labour groups have already declared their support for US Airways' proposal to merge with the larger rival. The

groups each have a seat on American's nine-member unsecured creditors committee and have a say in how American restructures in bankruptcy. Pilots could face stricter terms should the judge overseeing American's bankruptcy case now allow the carrier to end its current contract with the pilots union. "We are disappointed with the outcome of today's voting results, as ratification of the pilot tentative agreement

would have been an important step forward in our restructuring," American Airlines spokesman Bruce Hicks said in a statement.

He added the company must now await a ruling that will let it "implement the changes necessary to move forward with our restructuring." Bankruptcy rules give companies the right to abandon collective bargaining agreements and impose their own terms unilaterally.—Reuters

Oil flow from Iraq-Turkey oil pipeline to resume: minister

ISTANBUL, 10 Aug — The oil flow from the Turkish-Iraqi pipeline will resume on Wednesday following a blast that damaged the pipeline, Turkey's energy minister said.

"In addition to security measures, the maintenance (of the damaged pipeline) will continue but the flow of crude oil will hopefully resume today," Taner Yildiz was quoted as saying by the Anatolia news agency on Wednesday. A blast Monday hit the Kirkuk-Ceyhan pipeline in Mardin province close to Turkey's border with Syria, with Kurdish rebels suspected of being behind the attack.

Yildiz blamed "terrorists" for the attack, a term often used by Turkish officials to refer to militants from the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK).

The PKK, listed as a terrorist group by Turkey and much of the international community, have sabotaged the pipeline several times in the past as part of an armed campaign against the Ankara government.

The 970-kilometre (600-mile) pipeline runs from Iraq's northern oil hub of Kirkuk to the port of Ceyhan on Turkey's Mediterranean coast, pumping 450,000 to 500,000 barrels of crude oil per day. Iraq depends on oil sales for the vast majority of government income. The oil-rich nation exported some 2.515 million barrels per day in July, earning about \$7.535 billion in revenues.—Internet

Woman swallows butter knife

A 30-year-old Atlanta woman is OK after accidentally swallowing a butter knife, doctors said. The woman was apparently demonstrating to a friend that she no longer had a gag reflex because of her history with bulimia, the *New York Daily News* reported.

During her exhibition, she laughed and accidentally swallowed the knife, *New England Journal of Medicine* said. She was rushed to the hospital where doctors performed a surgery to remove the knife from her body.

Drs Aida Venado and Sarah Prebil said doctors were able to remove the knife

without damaging the woman's throat or stomach.

However, her husband later revealed the woman had swallowed a knife four years ago and she was then transferred to a psychiatric unit, the doctors said.

The *Los Angeles Times* reported that most instances of people swallowing foreign objects are not life-threatening, citing an *Emedicine.com* article.

"After reaching the stomach, a foreign body has greater than a 90 percent chance of passage," the article states.

Although, the article said there are about 1,500 deaths a year from ingesting foreign bodies.

Cow goes to new heights to flee bull's advances

A cow which was not in the mood ambled to the top storey of a Siberian apartment building to escape a bull which was, and had to be led back down by firefighters, authorities said.

The cow was discovered bellowing on the top of a stairwell in the five-storey building in the village of

Lesogorsk last month, with the probable cause of the cow's distress an amorous bull at the bottom.

"The bull was very loving and had paid excessive attention to the cow during the summer grazing," the Irkutsk regional branch of Russia's Emergency Situations Ministry said in a

statement.

"Trying to escape from him, the cow ran into the building and climbed up to the fifth storey," it said.

It took firefighters about three minutes to get the cow downstairs by roping its horns and pulling, according to the statement, which suggested members of the

crowd that gathered should have done the job themselves.

"When we arrived there were dozens of people outside the building. There were members of the local administration, police and many bystanders," it quoted fire station shift chief Yevgeny Smirnov as saying.

"In principle, they could have done without us."

UK's BSKyB to launch 24-hour James Bond TV channel

British pay television broadcaster BSKyB will launch a new 24-hour channel dedicated to showing James Bond films on repeat in October to mark the 50th anniversary of the Bond franchise, the company said on 7 August.

The channel, to be called Sky Movies 007, will show 22 original Bond films in high

definition from 5 October for a month, beginning with the 1962 Bond film, 'Dr No', it said.

It added that it will also screen independent titles 'Never Say Never Again' and 'Casino Royale.'

The launch comes after Sky bought the rights to the British film franchise from Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer

Studios in April, ending rival ITV's 38-year stronghold on the films' rights.

"I was playing really consistently with a lot of slice — and she doesn't like my slice. I think that was the key. I've played against her a lot of times, and it was strange to play her when she was playing like this." In other matches, Serb Jelena Jankovic fell

Soccer: Japan's "steel carnations" win hearts in defeat

TOKYO, 10 Aug — Japanese soccer fans began their Friday bleary-eyed, many having shed tears but most philosophical, after the world champions were beaten 2-1 by the United States in the women's Olympic soccer final in London. As hundreds of supporters wearing Japan soccer shirts, faces still painted in national red and white, rolled out of bars around 6 am local time, an impromptu party broke out on Tokyo's iconic Shibuya "scramble" crossroads.

"Gold, silver - it doesn't matter. Japan were the best team," 32-year-old chef Kensuke Arai told Reuters as revelers danced in front of police and early commuters. Japan's "Nadeshiko" team, named after a frilly pink carnation, embodied the iron-willed spirit of fanatics battling to recover from disaster as they won last year's World Cup. Having shocked the mighty US on penalties in the Frankfurt final, they were unlucky not to topple their powerful opponents again in Thursday's Olympic showdown.

Twice rattling the crossbar and also having a strong penalty claimed waved away, Japan were even described by US coach Pia Sundhage as the better team. Japan's media, yet to reach print but crackling online, praised their pint-sized warriors for their heart. "Stand tall, silver medallists!" blazed the Nikkan Sports newspaper, while the Sankei Sports ran the headline "Fierce Fight", referring to Japan's refusal to accept defeat. Tears of joy shed for their astonishing World Cup win in July last year were tinged with sadness as Japan confronted the aftermath of the deadly tsunami and a raging nuclear crisis.

There was no fairytale repeat, but Japan's players took defeat on the chin as the Americans claimed a third successive Olympic title. "We wanted the gold, but no regrets," said Japan's world player of the year Homare Sawa before the Olympic medal ceremony, repeated on morning television shows. Japanese fans, many setting off for work after a quick

shower and change of clothes, refused to blame the referee or make excuses, and had nothing but praise for their beaten heroines. "You can't help but love them," 21-year-old student Yuria Sato, who had almost screamed herself hoarse. "They never give up. I was crying after the game but just so proud."

Succinctly summing up the mood of the Japan players, the Mainichi newspaper said: "Every ounce spent: Tears and smiles." Japan's petite musketeers, at an average

height of 1.62m standing seven cm shorter than the muscular Americans, at least look set to fly home in style. Japanese Olympic officials were accused of sex discrimination before the Games for allowing the men's team to fly in business class while the women had to make do with premium economy. "It was a fantastic game," said coach Norio Sasaki after what could be his last game in charge. "It was not the result we wanted but it's been an incredible four years." — Reuters

Agassi selected for US Open Court of Champions

NEW YORK, 10 Aug — Andre Agassi will be the 2012 inductee into the US Open Court of Champions.

Agassi will be inducted in Arthur Ashe Stadium before the men's final on 9 September.

The 42-year-old Agassi won the US Open twice. In 1994, he became the first unseeded player in the Open era to capture the title. He won again in 1999, part of his eight career Grand Slam championships.

Agassi competed in the tournament a men's Open-era record 21 consecutive times, from 1986 through 2006. He was elected to the International Tennis Hall of Fame last year.

Sizzling Swede Pettersson takes command at Kiawah

KIAWAH ISLAND, (South Carolina), 10 Aug — Swede Carl Pettersson flawlessly put himself in position to improve a mediocre record in the majors, spearheading a glut of low scoring to surge into a one-shot lead in the PGA Championship opening round on Thursday. The 34-year-old, who became a US citizen in January, fired a sizzling six-under-par 66 in relatively calm, sunny conditions at the Kiawah Island Golf Resort to take control of the season's final major.

Former US Open winner Rory McIlroy, long-hitting American Gary Woodland, Spaniard Gonzalo Fernandez-

Castano and Swede Alex Noren charged into contention with 67s while four-times champion Tiger Woods was happy after opening with a six-birdie 69. Defending champion Keegan Bradley,

1991 winner John Daly and Dutchman Joost Luiten, who briefly led at eight under before bogeying his last four holes, were among a group of eight players who carded 68s at Kiawah, where ocean breezes strengthened later in the day.

Forty-four players broke par on the longest layout to stage a major championship, making the most of conditions softened by heavy rain earlier in the week. The average score was 73.42. "I played really good," Pettersson told reporters after breaking 70 for the first time in 21 rounds at the PGA Championship with an nerveless six-birdie display on a hot and humid day.

Rudisha wins Olympic 800 in world record time

LONDON, 10 Aug — David Rudisha did what no one else, Usain Bolt included, has been able to: set a world record on the London Olympic track. Rudisha had told his rivals in the 800 metres to be ready for a world record, and he delivered on his word, winning Thursday's final in 1 minute, 40.91 seconds, one-tenth of a second off the mark he set in 2010. After crossing the finish, he flung up both arms to celebrate, then draped himself in a Kenyan flag and posed for photographs near the timing clock with "NEW WR" on it. He has been the dominant 800-metre runner for

the last three years, setting the world record three times and losing just once since 2009. This, though, topped all that. "It's something special to break the world record at the Olympics," Rudisha said. Sebastian Coe, a middle-distance running great and head of the London organizing committee, wasn't in much doubt. "That was simply an unbelievable performance," Coe said. "David Rudisha showed supreme physical and mental confidence to run like that in an Olympic final. Instead of just doing enough to win the race, he wanted to do something extraordinary

and go for the world record as well. Rudisha's run will go down in history as one of the greatest Olympic victories."

Brilliant Bolt completes sprint double

LONDON, 10 Aug—Usain Bolt tonight secured the legendary status he craved by becoming the first man ever to win the Olympic Games sprint double twice in succession.

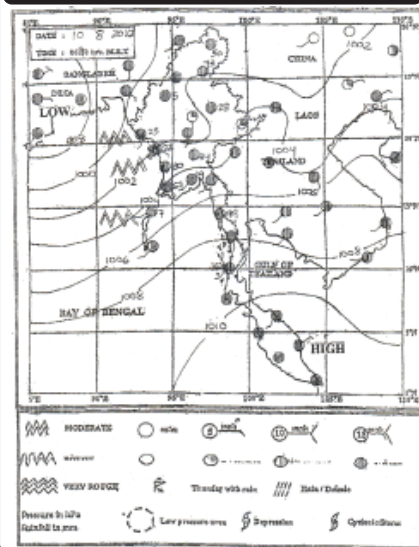
While millions would already consider Bolt a legend for winning triple gold in Beijing and defending his 100m title at London 2012 last Sunday, the Jamaican insisted he also had to retain his 200m title to achieve such status.

And the 25-year-old did precisely that with another imperious performance, leading a Jamaican clean-sweep ahead of 100m silver medallist Yohan Blake and Warren Weir, both of whom are just 22. Bolt's winning time of 19.32 was outside his own world record of 19.19 which he felt might be a possibility, but the 80,000 crowd had already witnessed one such feat as Kenya's David Rudisha stormed to 800m gold in 1:40.91, taking 0.10 off his own record.

Bolt had lost to Blake over 100 and 200m at the Jamaican trials - and later underwent treatment on a stiff back which was causing hamstring problems - but gained sweet revenge over both distances in London. Asked about lowering the world record he set when winning the world title in Berlin in 2009, Bolt said: "I think it was possible...but I guess I wasn't fit enough. I was fast but I wasn't fit enough."

"I came off the corner, I could feel the strain on my back a little bit so I was trying to keep my form, but I stopped running because I knew it wasn't going to be a world record. When I came off the corner I could feel it. 'It was hard. I really dedicated [myself] to my work, I know what London meant to me. I came here and I gave it my all and I'm proud of myself. I didn't get a world record - I really wanted to do it in the 200m - but I'm happy.' —London 2012 Olympic

Coe salutes record breaker Rudisha

LONDON, 10 Aug—Seb Coe tonight hailed a "simply unbelievable" display from Kenya's David Rudisha who broke his own world record to claim Olympic gold in the 800 metres. Rudisha, 23, stormed through the first lap in 49.28 seconds and powered to a stunning victory in one minute 40.91secs, taking 0.10s off his previous record as all eight finalists set record times.

Eighteen-year-old Nijel Amos of Botswana claimed silver in a world junior record of 1:41.73, ahead of 17-year-old Kenyan Timothy Kitum, with Britain's Andrew Osagie taking 0.71 off his personal best despite finishing eighth.

Amazingly, Osagie's time of 1:43.77 would have won gold at the last three Olympic Games, while it also took him fourth on the British all-time list behind Coe, Steve Cram and Peter Elliott. "That was simply an unbelievable performance," London 2012 chairman and former Olympic 800m silver medallist Lord Coe said. "David Rudisha

showed supreme physical and mental confidence to run like that in an Olympic final.

"Instead of just doing enough to win the race he wanted to do something extraordinary and go for the world record as well. Rudisha's run will go down in history as one of the greatest Olympic victories. I feel privileged to have witnessed it in London." Rudisha, who has spoken of his desire to race Usain Bolt in the 4x400m relay, said: "It was something special. A world record in the Olympics is something fantastic. I believe I'm going to maintain for a couple of years. I want to become a legend in the 800m."

"I was expecting this year to run a 1:40 and already I've done it here so I still want to see how I am going to feel in a few weeks before my last race, whether I can still push it or chase for the world record. If I get (good) weather I can try to do it again. "Nobody has ever done the world record in the 800m without a pace-setter and I thought it was going to be difficult. I knew I could run 1:41, but breaking the world record was a different story."

"But I was very determined and I knew that I'm in good shape this year. When we started in the heats on Monday I felt the track was fast and I was just praying we would get perfect weather for a fast race. "To break the world record here is something special and I couldn't believe it myself."

Roads and bridges of Ministry of Construction have yet to meet ASEAN standards**

NAY PYI TAW, 10 Aug—Amyohta Hluttaw Session continued for 24th day, at Amyohta Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 10.10 am today, attended by Speaker of Amyohta Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint and 201 MPs.

At the session, Deputy Minister for Construction U Soe Tint replied to the questions on construction sector raised by six representatives.

With respect to the question of U Nu of Yangon Region Constituency No.10 on **“there is a plan to upgrade No.3 Highway in Mingaladon Township into four-lane one”**, the deputy minister replied:

Max Myanmar Construction Co is implementing No.2 Highway (9 miles and 2 furlongs long) through the B.O.T system. Width of the road is designated based on Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT). AADT of the road is 2800. So, Ministry of Construction has informed the company to construct 48-ft-wide tarred road. Expansion of road bank will be carried out in open season. It will be implemented as tarred road in 2013-2014 financial year.

Regarding the question of U Thaw Zin Oo of Magway Region Constituency No.9 on **“there is a plan to construct RC bridge or gravel-filled culvert crossing the Kyit Creek on Pakokku-Seikhyu road section”**, the deputy minister said: The 900-ft-wide Kyit Creek is located between Mile post Nos.12/2 and 12/4. In the rainy season, it can be crossed only when water level decreases. Hninthazin Co has been carrying Pakokku-Seikhyu road through B.O.T system. At present, there is no plan to construct RC bridge or gravel-

filled culvert crossing Kyit Creek.

Regarding the question of U Thein Hlaing of Sagaing Region Constituency No.8 on **“the matter on disturbance to smooth commodity flow due to poor quality standard**

scales”, the deputy minister replied:

There will be slight variances of scales due to weather condition and different commodities etc. The variance range can be 0.50 tons. Ministry of Construction has exempted that variance. Directives to avoid the scale errors have been given. The best way to save scale measurement time is that car owners and drivers on their parts are to avoid over-load.

Bridge crossing fees are collected based on the length of the bridges, not on withstand load and bridge types. And it is classified into four. Fee is not charged for under-180-ft bridges. It is fee, but not tax. Collecting of fees is aimed at covering capital expenses and carrying out maintenances, repairs and upgrade of roads and bridges by using collected fees.

ASEAN standard is that with the aim of trading between countries by roads by means of economic integration in ASEAN countries by 2015, roads and bridges are being upgraded, drivers are educated to follow traffic rules. Roads and bridges of the Ministry of Construction have yet to meet ASEAN standards. 10 tons per axis is maximum weight in ASEAN countries. Although it is not suitable, Myanmar has allowed it.

Myanmar's toll fees are the cheapest, compared with other ASEAN countries. According to the survey conducted on 23 toll gates on 19-6-2012, it was found that there were 32530 cars or 98.71 percent that follow the rules and 387 cars (See page 9)
