## Afghan suicide bombers kill 28 people, wound more than 70

KABUL, 14 Aug—Three suicide bombers killed at least 28 people and wounded more than 70 when they blew themselves up in a busy market in southwestern Afghanistan in one of the worst such attacks this year, provincial officials said on Tuesday.

Eighteen civilians including several children and at least three members of the Afghan security forces were among the dead in the town of Zaranj, the provincial capital of Nimroz province next to the border with Iran.

The toll is expected to rise, provincial governor Abdul Karim Barahawi told Reuters. "The attackers blew themselves up in crowded markets to target civilians, there was no government installation nearby," Barahawi

said. Mohd Musa Rasooli, the Nimroz Police Chief, said three police were among the 28 dead and said the bombers had attacked not only a bazaar, but also the entrance to the local hospital.

Noor Ahmad Sherzad, a health official and hospital doctor, said as many as 100 wounded had been hospitalized. The attack was the worst in the normally peaceful province since 2001 and comes during a surge in fighting this summer ahead of a withdrawal by most Western combat troops and handover to Afghan forces to be completed by the end of 2014.

Despite a decline in civilian casualties in the first half of this year compared to 2011, the United Nations last week said civilians were still

bearing the brunt of fighting between insurgents and the foreign-Afghan coalition.

A half-yearly report by the United Nations last week



said 1,145 civilians have been killed between 1 January and 30 June this year as well as 1,954 wounded, representing a 15 percent decrease on last year due to a severe winter hampering fighting.

Homemade bombs and suicide attacks remain the biggest killers of Afghan

civilians and Afghan and foreign troops.

Violence is at its worst despite the presence of thousands of foreign and Afghan troops fighting Taliban-led insurgency in Afghanistan plagued by three decades of conflict.

## 37 NATO soldiers killed in insider attacks in Afghanistan this year

KABUL, 14 Aug—Thirty seven soldiers with the NATO-led coalition have been killed in the so-called green-on-blue attacks since beginning this year across the post-Taliban Afghanistan, a coalition spokesman said on Monday. "So when we talk about insider raid some call green-on-blue incidence, we talk about 27 incidents so far in this year and we had 37 people killed in those incidents," a spokesman with the coalition or International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Brigadier General Gunter Katz told reporters in a regular Press briefing here.

However, he said the ISAF and Afghan army and police officials have been working to check such

incidents. In the latest so-called green-on-blue attacks, a total of six NATO-led ISAF soldiers lost their lives in a single day Friday in the country's southern province of Helmand.

The Taliban insurgents, who have been waging more than a decade-long insurgency and launched spring offensive from 3 May this year to target security forces, have regularly claimed responsibility for the insider attacks or green-on-blue offensives.

The ISAF spokesman said that the Afghan army and police continue to stick in the "eight-point vetting system" which was set up in 2009 for vetting recruits to the rank of national police and the army as a bid to prevent any possible Taliban infiltration into the security entities.—Xinhua

## World powers eye emergency food meeting; action doubted

PARIS, 14 Aug—Leading members of the Group of 20 nations are prepared to trigger an emergency meeting to address soaring grain prices caused by the worst US drought in more than half a century and poor crops from the Black Sea bread basket.

France, the United States and G20 president Mexico will hold a conference call at the end of August to consider whether an emergency international meeting is required, aiming to avoid a repetition of the food price spike that triggered riots in poorer countries in 2008.

Yet even as the third grain surge in four years stirs new fears about food supply and inflation, many say the world's powers are no better prepared to rein in runaway prices. Apart from a global grain database, which has yet to be launched, and the Rapid Response Forum that authorities are considering convening for the first time, the G20 has few tools.

Instead, it must intervene through influence, perhaps urging the United States to relax its ethanol policy in response to the crisis — difficult only months before a presidential election that may

be won or lost in Midwest farm states—urging Russia not to impose an export ban, as it did two years ago.

"Beyond words, expect little from the G20 on rising food prices," said Simon Evenett, a former World Bank official who is now professor of international trade and economic development, University of St Gallen, Switzerland. He described the G20's record on trade as "feeble."—Reuters

## New campaigner Ryan under fire from hecklers and Obama

DES MOINES, 14 Aug—Republican Paul Ryan got a taste of the rough side of a presidential campaign on Monday when protesters heckled him and President Barack Obama accused him of blocking emergency aid to drought-hit farmers.

The new vice presidential hopeful from Wisconsin, who brings Midwestern credibility to White House hopeful Mitt Romney's campaign, mingled with locals at the Iowa State Fair, a popular spot for politicians keen to show their common touch in a state where Obama and Romney will be in tight competition.

Dressed in a checked shirt, Ryan bantered with fairgoers but his first solo campaign speech was interrupted by a small group of demonstrators.

In chaotic scenes, hecklers standing at the front of a large pro-Ryan crowd shouted "Stop the war against the common good," prompting Republicans to shout back and swear at them.

One of the protesters rushed onto the small stage where Ryan was speaking. She was grabbed by three state troopers. Police said one of the protesters punched a volunteer fair worker.

"It's funny because Iowans and Wisconsinites, we like to be respectful of one

another, and peaceful of one another and listen to one another," Ryan said. "These ladies must not be from Iowa or Wisconsin."

A hero to conservatives, Ryan has given Romney's campaign a jolt of energy after several difficult weeks marked by gaffes and persistent questions about his personal finances.

But the Republican effort to win back the White House received no immediate poll boost from Saturday's announcement of Ryan as the vice presidential running mate, according to a Reuters/Ipsos online survey.—Reuters

## BAA July traffic down as Britons stay home for Olympics

Ferrovial, on Tuesday said 9.6 million passengers passed through its five UK airports last month, compared to about 9.2 million in July 2011.

London Heathrow, Europe's busiest airport, handled 6.6 million passengers, down 4.4 percent year-on-year.

"The drop was more pronounced in the second half of the month and it is likely that the Olympics played a part, with UK passengers staying at home as well as non-Olympic visitors from overseas choosing to defer their journeys," said BAA's

chief executive Colin Matthews.

BAA, which has been criticised in the past for its handling of snow and volcanic ash related disruptions, said years of planning helped it cope well with the influx of passengers flying into London for the Games.

"Seven years of hard work and planning, the warmth and enthusiasm of more than a thousand volunteers and additional Border Force staff produced our strongest ever passenger satisfaction scores," added Matthews.—Reuters

## Two killed, two injured in Iraq's violence

BAGHDAD, 14 Aug—Two people were killed and two others injured on Monday in separate gunfire and bomb attacks in central and eastern Iraq, the police said.

Near Baghdad, gunmen stormed the house of an army Lieutenant Colonel in Abu-Ghraib area, some 20 km west of Baghdad, and shot him dead before they fled the scene, a local police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

In Iraq's eastern province of Diyala, a policeman was killed when gunmen using assault rifles attacked him near the town of Khalis, near the provincial capital city of Baquba, some 65 km northeast of Baghdad, a provincial police source anonymously told Xinhua.

In a separate incident, a roadside bomb detonated inside an orchard in al-Hadid area, some 10 km northwest of Baquba, killing two farmers, the source said.

Also in the province, Iraqi security forces carried out search operations across the province during the past 24 hours and arrested seven suspects, including four wanted individuals, the source said.

Violence is still common in the Iraqi cities despite the dramatic decrease since its peak in 2006 and 2007 when the country was engulfed in sectarian killings.

overwintering as larvae. By comparing mutations found on the butterflies collected from the different sites, the team found that areas with greater amounts of radiation in the environment were home to butterflies with much smaller wings and irregularly developed eyes. “It has been believed that insects are very resistant to radiation,” said lead researcher Joji Otaki from the University of the Ryukyus, Okinawa. “In that sense, our results were unexpected,” he told BBC News.

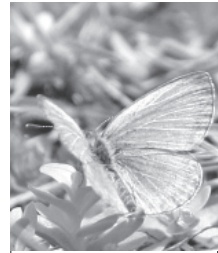
Prof Otaki’s team then bred these butterflies within labs 1,750km (1,090 miles) away from the accident, where artificial radiation could hardly be detected. It was by breeding these butterflies that they began noticing a suite of abnormalities that hadn’t been seen in the previous generation — that collected from Fukushima — such as malformed antennae, which the insects use to explore their environment and seek out mates. Six months later, they again collected adults from the 10 sites and found that butterflies from the Fukushima area showed a mutation rate more than double that of those found sooner after the accident. The team concluded

that this higher rate of mutation came from eating contaminated food, but also from mutations of the parents’ genetic material that was passed on to the next generation, even though these mutations were not evident in the previous generations’ adult butterflies.

The team of researchers have been studying that particular species butterfly for more than 10 years. They were considering using the species as an “environmental indicator” before the Fukushima accident, as previous work had shown it is very sensitive to environmental changes. “We had reported the real-time field evolution of colour patterns of this butterfly in response to global warming before, and [because] this butterfly is found in artificial environments — such as gardens and public parks — this butterfly can monitor human environments,” Prof Otaki said. But the findings from their new research show that the radionuclides released from the accident were still affecting the development of the animals, even after the residual radiation in the environment had decayed.

“This study is important and overwhelming in its implications for both the

human and biological communities living in Fukushima,” explained University of South Carolina biologist Tim Mousseau, who studies the impacts of radiation on animals and plants in Chernobyl and Fukushima, but was not involved in this research. “These observations of mutations and morphological abnormalities can only be explained as having resulted from exposure to radioactive contaminants,” Dr Mousseau told BBC News. The findings from the Japanese team are consistent with previous studies that have indicated birds and butterflies are important tools to investigate the long-term impacts of radioactive contaminants in the environment.— Internet

LG’s Optimus Vu ‘phablet’ coming to US by the end of September

SEOUL, 14 Aug — Verizon (VZ) customers who have been looking on in envy at AT&T customers’ gigantic Samsung Galaxy Notes can rest easy because they will soon have a “phablet” to call their own. Unwired View points to an LG Press release stating that the five-inch Optimus Vu will be released in the United States by the end of September, meaning Samsung’s popular Galaxy

Note will finally get some competition in the supersized smartphone space.

Although no carrier has been officially named yet, all signs point to Verizon supporting the Optimus Vu on its LTE network when it launches. In addition to its large 5-inch screen, the Optimus Vu will feature a 1.5GHz dual-core processor and an 8-megapixel camera. Internet

TOKYO, 14 Aug — Exposure to radioactive material released into the environment has caused mutations in butterflies found in Japan, a study suggests. Scientists found an increase in leg, antennae and wing shape mutations among butterflies collected following the 2011 Fukushima accident. The link between the mutations and the radioactive material was shown by laboratory experiments, they report. The work has been published in the journal *Scientific Reports*.

Two months after the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant accident in March 2011, a team of Japanese researchers collected 144 adult pale grass blue (*Zizeeria maha*) butterflies from 10 locations in Japan, including the Fukushima area. When the accident occurred, the adult butterflies would have been

Arctic sea ice ‘melting faster’

LONDON, 14 Aug — Arctic sea ice is vanishing much faster than generally expected, according to preliminary data from European Space Agency satellite *Cryosat*. UK scientists combined results from *Cryosat*, which uses radar to measure ice thickness, with data from NASA’s *IceSat*, which uses lasers. Their preliminary analysis suggests an annual ice loss of up to 900 cubic km a year from 2004. Projections of Arctic ice melt vary widely. But the new results are some 50% higher than projected in most scenarios. The ice loss

sending sonar signals to measure ice thickness. Dr Laxon said the results were thought to be accurate within 10cm (3.5in).

“We have to be cautious until our data has been properly analysed as part of a climate model, but this does suggest that the Arctic might be ice-free in summer for a day at least by the end of the decade,” he told BBC News. “But the past is not always a guide to the future.” The Arctic is warming much faster than the rest of the planet and the loss of sea ice affects populations. The light-coloured sea ice bounces

Tiny transmitters that cost a penny to print unveiled

LONDON, 14 Aug — Researchers in Korea have devised a cheap way of transmitting data from objects to mobile phones when swiped. They have printed small “rectennas”, a cross between an antenna and an AC/DC current converter, onto plastic foils using electronic inks.

The rectenna uses radio waves emitted from a smartphone to transmit data to it from a tiny chip. The printed rectennas cost less than one penny per unit to produce and could be used as an alternative to QR codes. The technology behind them, Near Field Communication (NFC), is already used in devices that enable shoppers to make card payments by touch.

They make their debut in

the journal *Nanotechnology*, published by the Institute of Physics (IoP) this month. Researchers from Suncheon National University and the Paru Printed Electronics Research Institute spent four years developing the printed rectenna. “What is great about this technique is that we can also print the digital information onto the rectenna, meaning that everything you need for wireless communication is in one place,” co-author of the study Gyoujin Cho told the IoP. “Our advantage over

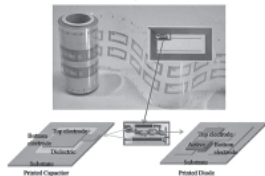
current technology is lower cost, since we can produce a roll-to-roll printing process with high throughput in an environmentally friendly manner. “Furthermore, we can integrate many extra functions without huge extra cost in the printing process.”

Augmented reality platforms are also providing alternatives to QR codes, although management consultancy firm Greenwich Consulting says that in America QR code usage has increased by 40% year on year. Marketing company Adido says it is now using Aurasma, an augmented reality application based on visual recognition, rather than QR codes in its campaigns. “There are quite a lot of limitations as to what a QR code can do — you can

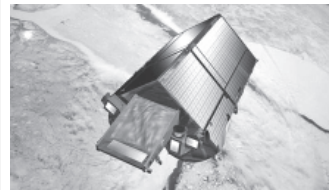
only make it do one thing at a time, it can only contain so much data,” said Andrew Moore, business development co-ordinator. He admitted that when presented with an augmented reality logo, people did not necessarily know what to do with it.

“With QR codes this has also been an issue but now there is a much more clear course of action. As the AR industry ages that call to action will also appear.” “What I’ve found is that people who do download the Augmented Reality app are proactively active in finding content that is AR-able,” he said.

Fred Huet from Greenwich Consulting UK also believes that QR codes may have a shelf life. “The QR scanning process is inherently inconvenient for the user, compared to other technologies such as Near Field Communication (NFCs),” he said. “There is a risk of being replaced in the future by more accessible alternatives.” — Internet

is pronounced in areas to the north of Greenland where thickness has fallen from 5-6m a decade ago to around 3m last year.

The analysis was done by Dr Seymour Laxon, reader in climate physics at the Centre for Polar Observation and Modelling.

He said the figures might change slightly when all the data had been analysed but that the broad thrust of the research showed a clear and dramatic thinning of the sea ice. At the end of last summer 7,000 cubic km of ice remained. The satellite figures were cross-checked against data from planes over-flying the Arctic and submerged buoys

back warmth into space. If it disappears, the Arctic Ocean will absorb more heat. That will cause more warming which will in turn contribute to sea level rise. It may also affect Europe’s weather because of the link between sea ice and the jet stream which dominates some of our weather patterns.

There are many uncertainties. Scientists cannot be sure how much of the Arctic warming is natural and how much it is being driven by manmade climate change. Last month a NASA news release headlined news of an “unprecedented Greenland Ice Sheet Surface melt”. — Internet

### HTC sees China as key factor in ending sales slump

NEW YORK, 14 Aug — As HTC continues to lose market share to Apple and Samsung, the troubled manufacturer is looking toward China to help stabilize the its plummeting sales. HTC is expanding both its engineering team and sales channels in China, and hopes to become one of the top two smartphone brands in the country by 2015, Ray Yam, head of HTC's China

operations, told the *Wall Street Journal*.

In the first quarter of 2012, HTC was No 9 in China in terms of market share at 2.6%, compared to Samsung's 24.9% share. In the second quarter, however, the company tripled its market share from 2.6% to more than 6%, and is hoping to gain another 6% or 8% during the next two quarters.

In China, HTC will follow a similar sales model as it has done in Europe and the US, offering devices "around the same price as Samsung's Galaxy and Apple's iPhone," rather than low-end handsets. "I do believe HTC has all the elements for success...but we need to be cautious and we need to make every step right, if we make one wrong step,

### Kodak extends patent auction deadline as talks continue

NEW YORK, 14 Aug — Eastman Kodak extended its patent auction on Monday, saying it would not announce a winner as planned because it was still in discussions with bidders. Kodak, which filed for bankruptcy in January, said in a statement that the auction was ongoing. It declined to comment further, citing confidentiality agreements. A spokeswoman for the company declined to comment on the length of the extension. The company said it expected later on Monday to submit regulatory filings revealing more information about its business, including financial projections.

Kodak, which has lost more than \$600 million so far this year, began an auction of 1,100 digital patents last Wednesday. It had been scheduled to designate a winner on Monday ahead

pay back investors. It has borrowed nearly \$700 million in bankruptcy financing.

It is unclear how much the patent sale will raise. The *Wall Street Journal* reported on Friday that Apple Inc, Google Inc and Microsoft Corp made bids, but they were significantly below Kodak's estimates for the patents' value. Kodak said earlier in 2012 that an outside firm had estimated the value of the portfolio at \$2.2 billion to \$2.6 billion. Kodak's digital patents were grouped into two lots — one of 700 patents and another of 400. They have been for sale for more than a year, but the sale was complicated by the bankruptcy and lawsuits over the ownership and authenticity of the patents. It is in the midst of litigation with several companies, including Apple, Samsung and Research in Motion Ltd.

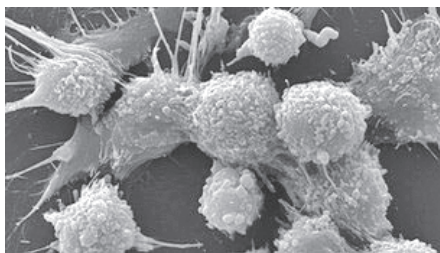

### Prostate cancer drug abiraterone approved by Scottish Medicines Consortium

LONDON, 14 Aug — A drug which can extend the lives of men with incurable prostate cancer has been approved for use in Scotland. Scotland was the only part of the UK where abiraterone was not yet available on the NHS. But the Scottish Medicines Consortium (SMC) has now given doctors the green light to prescribe it.

The drug was one of several said to have helped keep Lockerbie bomber Abdelbaset al-Megrahi alive after he returned to Libya. The SMC had previously rejected a submission to allow the drug to be used in Scotland on the grounds that the cost — some £3,000 a month — did not justify the health benefits. But manufacturer Janssen resubmitted its application and the SMC has now reversed its initial

decision. It said abiraterone use will be restricted to patients who have received only one prior chemotherapy regimen.

The SMC's website said: "This SMC advice takes account of the benefits of a Patient Access Scheme (PAS) that improves the cost-effectiveness of abiraterone. This SMC advice is contingent upon the

continuing availability of the patient access scheme in NHS Scotland." Martin Price, external affairs director at Janssen UK, said: "We have gone to significant lengths to find a solution that allows eligible patients to be treated routinely on the NHS with this innovative, UK-discovered medicine." Janssen are pleased that the SMC has accepted Zytiga (trade name

of abiraterone) for restricted use within NHS Scotland.

The decision to allow doctors to prescribe the drug was welcomed by cancer charities.

Prostate Cancer UK chief executive Owen Sharp said: "Today brings a victory for both decency and common sense. Abiraterone has now been approved for use on the NHS UK-wide and I thank and congratulate everyone who backed us and helped us achieve this result." Now that the correct decision has been made, health boards must waste no time in ensuring that men who need abiraterone can access it as soon as possible. "Men with incurable prostate cancer should not be subjected to any further delays at a stage in their life when time is at an absolute premium."

### Hearing test benefits unknown in older adults: panel

NEW YORK, 14 Aug — There's not enough evidence to say whether older adults should be screened for hearing loss if they don't have any symptoms, according to a new statement from a government-backed panel. The recommendation, released on Monday, should not stop people over 50 years old from telling their doctor about hearing problems, according to the US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF).

It also shouldn't stop doctors from screening patients with symptoms of hearing loss. "If you have a hearing problem, you should absolutely bring it up with your doctor," said Dr Albert Siu, of the Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York and co-vice chair of the USPSTF.

"This is not about fancy audiometric screenings," he told *Reuters Health*. "This is just about simple screenings that doctors and clinicians can do in the office." Those office-based screenings can be as simple as asking whether a person is having trouble hearing or testing whether the patient can hear a whisper or the tick of a watch from a specific distance. They can also involve longer questionnaires or handheld testing devices. Despite the lack of a recommendation from the USPSTF, Dr Ronald A. Hoffman, medical director of the New York Eye and Ear Infirmary's Ear Institute, said he thinks doctors should still ask whether patients are having trouble hearing, ringing in their ears or trouble balancing.

"If you don't ask, you won't find out," he said. It's estimated that hearing loss affects between 20 percent to 40 percent of people 50 years old and older, and almost 80 percent of people over 80 years old.

One of the problems with screening older adults, however, is that there's no guarantee they'd wear hearing aids or seek treatment for hearing loss they didn't know they had — especially since hearing aids can be costly and are often not covered by insurance. "Ask them how they're doing. If they say they're fine, just leave it there," said Ellen O'Neil, associate director of audiology at the Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary in Boston.— *Reuters*

### Motorola Mobility to cut 4,000 jobs

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 Aug — Google on Monday confirmed that Motorola Mobility, now a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Internet search giant, will cut about 4,000 jobs or 20 percent of its workforce. Two-thirds of the reduction is set to occur outside of the United States, Google said in a regulatory filing with the US Securities and Exchange Commission.

According to the filing, Motorola Mobility also plans to close or consolidate about one-third of its 90 facilities worldwide, and will simplify its mobile products offering by shifting the emphasis from low-end phones to more innovative and profitable devices. The layoffs are expected to cost Google nearly 275 million US dollars as the process incurs severance-related and other charges, which the company said will be largely recognized in the third quarter of this year.

Google closed the acquisition of Motorola Mobility in May 2012 with a hefty price tag of 12.5 billion dollars, in a bold move to beef up its strength in mobile computing. Since the completion of the purchase, Google has taken a series of measures to turn around the money-losing cellphone maker. The new changes including the layoff are designed to return Motorola Mobility's mobile devices unit to profitability, after it lost money in 14 of the last 16 quarters, Google noted in its filing.— *Xinhua*

### Roche 'gets US green light to sell diabetes eye drug'

GENEVA, 14 Aug — Swiss pharma giant Roche said on Monday it will sell in the United States a drug that treats a diabetes-related illness linked to blindness after getting the regulatory green light. The US Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) decision means that Roche can take Lucentis to the US to treat diabetic macular oedema (DME), a condition that causes swelling, blurred vision and blindness in people with diabetes.

In a statement Roche called the development the "first major treatment advance in more than 25 years for (the) sight-threatening condition." "For the first time, Americans with diabetic macular oedema will have access to an FDA-approved medicine shown to help many patients rapidly regain substantial amounts of lost vision," said Hal Barron, global product development director at Roche.

Lucentis is described by Roche as the "first and only FDA-approved medicine" to help those with the condition, which is otherwise treated with limited success by laser surgery. Nearly 26 million Americans have diabetes which is the principal cause of blindness in America, Roche said in a statement.— *Internet*

## All threats "dwarfed" by Iran nuclear work: Israel PM

JERUSALEM, 14 Aug—Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said on Sunday that most threats to Israel's security were "dwarfed" by the prospect of Iran obtaining nuclear weaponry, which local media reports charged Tehran had stepped up its efforts to achieve.

The comments at a weekly cabinet meeting and the front-page reports in the liberal Haaretz, a frequent Netanyahu critic, and in the conservative, pro-

government Israel Hayom came as Israeli debate intensified about whether to go to war against Iran—and soon—over its disputed atomic projects.

The debate seemed to defy appeals by US President Barack Obama, seeking reelection in November, to allow more time for international diplomacy. Tehran says its nuclear ambitions are peaceful and has threatened wide-ranging reprisals if attacked.

In comments also

broadcast live by Israeli media, Netanyahu said that "all the threats currently being directed against the Israeli home front are dwarfed by another threat, different in scope, different in substance."

"Therefore I say again, that Iran must not be permitted to obtain nuclear weapons," Netanyahu said. Netanyahu also said Israel was "investing billions in home-front defence," and holding emergency drills, alluding to

## 10 killed, almost 100 injured in Brazilian highway accident

RIO DE JANEIRO, 14 Aug—At least 10 people were killed and 99 others were injured in a highway accident in Brazil's southeastern state of Parana on Saturday night, a local fire brigade said on Sunday.

The accident occurred on the PR-323 highway, between Paicandu and Doutor Camargo, in northern Parana, when two buses collided before a van, a car and a motorcycle crashed into them. One of the buses was rented by a religious group traveling to Maringa, 115 kilometers from the accident site, while the other was from a tourism company which travelled from Umuarama-Maringa.

The fire brigade said that 99 people, of whom six were seriously injured, were taken to three local hospitals.

## Four killed, 17 trapped in NE China coal mine accident

CHANGCHUN, 14 Aug—Four people were killed and 17 others trapped in a coal mine accident in northeast China's Jilin Province on Monday, local authorities said.

The accident, believed to be triggered by gas, happened around 6 am at Jisheng Coal Mine in the city of Baishan, according to the authorities.

A total of 116 miners were working underground when the accident occurred, and 95 of them were lifted out of the mine safely.

Rescue work for the trapped miners is underway.

The Jilin provincial government has ordered a thorough work safety check in the province.—Xinhua

## Two badly injured in paramotor crash in Sweden

STOCKHOLM, 14 Aug—A paramotor crashed on Sunday after takeoff in eastern Sweden, leaving two people on board badly injured.

The paramotor crashed on ground of the airfield after flying into the ridge of a hangar building due to a gust of wind, according to the Swedish media.

The witnesses started the rescue immediately afterwards and the two people had been sent to the hospital. One of them was in critical conditions.—Xinhua

## Northeast apple growers optimistic about crop

MONTPELIER, 14 Aug—At the mercy of Mother Nature, apple growers in northern New England are often pessimistic at the start of the season. So when an early spring was followed by a frost, they watched closely in the coming months for signs of damage.

Instead, they have been

pleasantly surprised.

Turns out, not only was the damage not nearly as bad as in some big apple states like Michigan, but this year's apples are expected to have more intense flavor, said Terry Bradshaw, president of Vermont Tree Fruit Growers Association.

"By all the textbooks, we shouldn't have any apples in the state," he said.

The news hasn't been all good—the yield is expected to be down about 10 to 20 percent. Still, Bradshaw said, "people are fairly optimistic about the season."

Low-lying areas in Vermont, Maine, New Hampshire and northern New York or orchards surrounded by dense stands of trees were more susceptible to the frost

that hit in March and then at the end of April, killing some flower buds, including a number at Highmoor Farms, the University of Maine's agricultural experiment station in Monmouth.

"Everyone was (affected) to some extent, but where an orchard only lost 10 percent of their flowers, they're not likely to notice," said Renae Moran, tree fruit specialist for the University of Maine.

Around the region, damage was scattered. It depended on where the apple trees were in their development at the time of the cold weather.

Everyone has apples. I haven't heard of anybody that's been wiped out.

## More rhinos killed in South Africa

JOHANNESBURG, 14 Aug—Seven rhino carcasses have been found at a private park and a game reserve in North West Province, raising to more than 300 the total number of rhinos poached this year in South Africa, authorities said on Sunday.

Five were found in Zeerust at Borakalalo and in another incident at Marikana, two rhino were killed after being dehorned, said Vishnu Naidoo, spokesman for the special anti-crime unit Hawks.

The Hawks are searching for those who are behind the poaching which all took place in the last three weeks.

All of the scenes has been visited with as much evidence collected as possible, Naidoo said. "We hope this can assist us in establishing those responsible for the killing of the seven rhinos."

Since the beginning of this year, a total of 312 rhinos have been lost to illegal killings in South Africa,

according to the latest official figures.

The continued efforts by the South African government to curb rhino poaching have resulted in a total of 187 arrests for 2012 thus far, 164 of the arrested suspects being poachers, 10 receivers or couriers, six couriers or buyers and seven exporters.

South Africa is home to approximately 22,000 white and black rhinoceros of which 12,000 are found in the Kruger National Park. This represents 93 percent of the world's total rhino population.

The South African rhino population is one of the last viable rhino populations in the world which makes it vulnerable.

South Africa is the remaining hope for the rhino conservation globally and recognizes that the global community support and cooperation must be enlisted to address the scourge, the government said.

## Three dead in shooting near Texas A&M University

SAN ANTONIO, 14 Aug—A man killed two people, including a law enforcement officer who was serving him an eviction notice at a home near Texas A&M University, on Monday before police fatally shot the suspect in a gun battle that lasted half an hour, officials said.

Four people also were injured, police and city officials in College Station said. The shooting comes at a time of national concern over gun violence after two recent mass shootings.

The dead officer was

identified as Brazos County Constable Brian Bachmann, said Scott McCollum, assistant chief of the police department in College Station.

McCollum said Bachmann, 41, was shot in front of the house, about two blocks from the Texas A&M campus, and was pronounced dead at a hospital.

Police identified the gunman as Thomas Caffall, 35, and the bystander killed as Chris Northcliff, 43, of College Station.

College Station city spokesman Jay Socol said

authorities were still investigating Caffall's background. It was unclear whether Caffall was renting the home or was being evicted for nonpayment of a mortgage, he said.

Officials said the wounded included a 55-year-old woman, who underwent surgery, and College Station police officer Justin Oehlke, who was in stable condition after being shot in the leg.

Officers Brad Smith and Phil Dorsett were injured by what police called gun shrapnel. Smith was treated

at a hospital and released and Dorsett was treated at the scene.

"We had officers respond to a 'shots fired' call," McCollum said at a news conference. "Once the officers arrived, they began to trade fire. The officers defended themselves and called in additional officers."

College Station police officers shot and killed the gunman, said Jason James, a sergeant with the police department in nearby Bryan, Texas.

After that, U Hla Swe of Magway Region Constituency No.12 submitted the proposal on "urging the Union Government to enable staff to enjoy their rights according to their levels for ensuring Clean Government" U Saw Tun Mya Aung of Kayin State Constituency No.5 discussed it. Hluttaw decided to discuss it and announced that representatives who want to discuss it are to register their names after the meeting. The meeting came to an end at 3 pm, and the 27<sup>th</sup> session will go on at 11 pm tomorrow. At today's session, four questions were raised and replied, two bills approved, one report submitted, one report discussed and two new proposals submitted.—MNA

AEC emerge, Myanmar is conducting researches and holding discussions in cooperation with regional research departments, at opportune times.

Ministry of National Planning and Economic Development is making coordination with Yangon Institutes of Economics, Japan Overseas Development Corporation, Japan Overseas Trade Board, Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) to hold discussions on ASEAN Economic Community and Free Trade Area, in Nay Pyi Taw and Mandalay in coming October.

With respect to the U Tin Shan of Taninthayi Constituency No.6 on "there is a plan to install sport gears for health exercises at suitable places on 3.5 km long concrete platform on Strand road in Myeik", Deputy Minister for Sports U Aye Myint Kyu said: there is the limitation to enjoy fresh sea wind as Strand road in Myeik of Taninthayi Region is adjacent to jetties. Regarding the question of Dr Tin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency No.6 on "when the remaining rail road section of Pathein (Begarat)-Einme-Nyaungdon-Yangon (Hlinethaya) will be opened as Pathein (Begarat)-Einme rail road section have been put into service", Deputy Minister for Rail Transportation U Chan Maung replied: Pathein (Begarat)-Einme rail road section (20.75 miles) of Pathein (Begarat)-Einme-Nyaungdon-Yangon (Hlinethaya) (96.51 miles) was commissioned into service on 20-3-2011.

The remaining Einme-Nyaungdon-Yangon (Hlinethaya) (75.76 miles) rail road is being implemented simultaneously by dividing it into four sections. Earth work (167355 suds), construction of 27 bridges and 23 buildings and laying 61.45 miles of rail road will be finished by April 2013.

Design for 427-ft-long Thonegwa creek bridge between Einme-Kyonedaingyi is in progress. It will be implemented during the above-mentioned period, inviting tender. Pathein-

He urged the representatives to show their benevolence and sympathy. The tribunal informed the Pyithu Hluttaw on 3 February of the submission made by the President. Deputy Speaker U Nanda Kyaw Swa, vested with authority by the Pyithu Hluttaw, made a clarification over the President's submission at the tribunal on 17 February. On 28 March, the tribunal passed the resolution that **defining committees, commissions and organizations formed by respective Hluttaws as Union level organizations is not appropriate with provisions under the constitution.**

According to findings and comments of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Joint Bill Committee and discussions of 10 Pyidaungsu Hluttaw representatives at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw session, the attitude of the MPs suggests that the tribunal has no authority to make such resolution on provisions under existing Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Law, Pyithu Hluttaw Law and Amyotha Hluttaw Law which was also made mistakenly beyond the legal framework. The mistake harmed the reputation of Hluttaws and Hluttaws representatives, causing limitations, difficulties and impact on duties of Hluttaws and Hluttaw representatives.

On 26 April, the Hluttaw Rights Committee informed him of the potential submission of the impeachment proposal signed by 191 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives at third regular session of Pyithu Hluttaw, the Speaker said. He suspended the submission and met and urged chairpersons of Pyithu Hluttaw and officials of Union Solidarity and Development Party to make presentation to the President who later informed that the coordination would be made to settle the issue and the submission would be withdrawn if necessary. The impeachment was suspended for that message. The Speaker said, he made negotiations with President and other officials to avoid impeachment. Since 9 August, the attitude of the Hluttaw representatives had been made clear to the President and he was requested to seek the best possible way, except the impeachment, to settle the issue.

As the issue is unsettled till now, the lawmakers face difficulties in discharging duties. Their annoyance became aroused and submitted the proposal signed by 301 representatives to impeach the chairperson and members of the tribunal.

The Hluttaw representatives were urged to wait for the actions of the President in a time limit upon the message. He requested patience of the representatives to do impeachment only if the case is not settled in the time limit.

Deputy Speaker U Nanda Kyaw Swa said in his discussion that Bill Committee, Public Accounts Committee, Hluttaw Rights Committee and Government's Guarantees, Pledges and Undertakings Vetting Committee were formed in the first regular session of the Hluttaw and 19 other committees and Legal Affairs and Special Cases Assessment Commission in the second regular session. The Pyithu Hluttaw Law Section 2 (h) defines these committees and commissions as Union level organizations.

The Union Attorney-General Law and the Union Auditor-General Law also prescribes the same provision. The Chairman of State Peace and Development Council signed and enacted those Union Attorney-General Law and the Union Auditor-General Law. The duties, authorities and rights of all committees are the same with four original Hluttaw committees. The deputy speaker elected under the constitution is the chairman of the Hluttaw Rights Committee, the Pyithu Hluttaw Law suggests. The organization led by the deputy speaker, the Union level official, is the Union level organization and the committees and commissions which have the same status with it are inarguably the Union level organizations.

These are inarguably Union level organizations according to both the law and the fact. But, the Union Attorney-General on behalf of the President put forward a submission at the tribunal whether the definition of the Union level organization in Hluttaw Laws is in accord with the constitution. As the tribunal informed the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker of the submission, the deputy speaker made presentation on the fixed date. Another clarification was made by the deputy speaker, on behalf of the Speaker, on 24 March.

The deputy speaker said he, representing the Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker and 440 Hluttaw representatives, had to stand for about an hour to hear the declaration of the resolution at the tribunal on 28 March.

He had to stand for one hour listening the wrong decision that said that the definition of the Union-level organization prescribed in the laws of the Hluttaws is not in conformity with the State Constitution. He continued to say that it was know to all that the wrong decision is the hindrance to amending the Pyithu Hluttaw Law, the Deputy Speaker said.

On 26 April, about 200 representatives sought approval from the Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw through the Chairman of Pyithu Hluttaw Rights Committee to submit a proposal to the Hluttaw to impeach the Constitutional Tribunal of the Union for not dutiful to the tasks assigned to the committee by the State Constitution and for not abiding by the Transitory Provisions of the Chapter-14 of the Constitution.

The Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw requested for the patience and the representatives listened to the Speaker. However, news journals wrongly criticized the Union-level organizations, and some online news attacked the designating the Rule of Law and Tranquility Committee led by Daw Aung San Suu Kyi as a Union-level organization saying that the designation was not in conformity with the State Constitution. Therefore, over 300 representatives sent the petition to the Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw through the Chairman of Pyithu Hluttaw Rights Committee for impeaching the Chairman and members of the Constitutional Tribunal of the Union under Section 136 of the Pyithu Hluttaw Law and under section 334 (d) (2) of the Constitution. The Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw requested the representatives to wait and he would settle the issue at the best of his ability, the Deputy Speaker said.

The Deputy Speaker thanked the representatives for their understanding for two times while waiting until the Speaker would negotiate with the Constitutional Tribunal of the Union.

On behalf of the representatives, the Deputy Speaker reiterated what the Speaker told was the best way was to settle the issue through negotiation first before impeachment and requested the Speaker to translate his words into action.

Afterwards, the Speaker replied that he would send a letter to the President in an attempt to settle the issue and discussed what messages should be written in the letter.

During the question and answer session, Daw Su Su

Hlaing of Dagon Myothit (South) constituency asked if **there is a plan to help those who are still waiting to install electric meters at their homes due to transitory period from the self-reliance system to the Ministry concerned.**

Deputy Minister of Electric Power No. 2 U Aung Than Oo replied that Yangon City Electricity Supply Board has given permission to organize a self-reliance committee in villages and wards which need power supply and to install electric meters at homes with the use of fund contributed by the residents. Self-reliance power supply programme has been finished but still, the committee has to carry out maintenance works as the Ministry has not yet taken back the work for the self-reliance power supply tasks.

As the power supply system in wards close to Yangon City meet set standards, Yangon City Electricity Supply Board has installed electric meters at homes after the consumers have paid the cost, without raising fund by the self-reliance power supply committees of wards. If a power supply system does not meet set standards, a ward or village self-reliance power supply committee concerned has to repair the system until it meets set standard.

U Hsar Mu of Lahe Constituency asked **whether there is a plan to provide surgical equipment to people's hospitals in Layshe and Lahe, Nanyun townships in the Naga Self-administered Zone.**

Deputy Minister for Health Dr Win Myint replied that Ministry of Health has already provided one X-Ray Machine-100mA, one X-Ray Machine-35mA (Portable), one set of Obsteric Set and one Patient Trolley to Lashe Township People's Hospital, one Labour Bed and one set of Major Surgical Set (Emergency) to Hsonmara Station Hospital, one Suction Machine, one Generator and one Mobile Lamp to Lahe Township People's Hospital, one X-Ray Machine-35mA, one X-Ray Machine-200mA, one Dental Chair, one set of Major Surgical, four Medicine Trolleys, three Instrument Trolleys and five Drip Stands to Nanyun Township People's Hospital, two medicine trolleys, two instrument trolleys and two patient trolleys to Panshaung Station Hospital. To fulfill the necessary medical equipment to the hospitals, respective township health departments would proceed the work in accordance with rules and regulations and the Ministry will assist in the hospitals.

rights to ask the question again according to the law, rules and regulations when he don't clearly understand or he want to ask matters related to the question. Therefore, respective members of the Union-level organizations are to understand the rights of representatives and to answer the questions. It is the rights of the Hluttaw and representatives and the rights is lawful. Representatives on their part are to use their rights correctly, effectively and without errors.

At the proposal submission session, Daw Nann Wah Nu of Kunhein Constitution submitted a proposal to urge the Union Government to define duties, rights and entitlement of the chief ministers and ministers of regions and states as prescribed in Section 264 (d) of the Constitution and to introduce that bill to the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw as soon as possible.

The Hluttaw invited those representatives who want to discuss the proposal to enlist not later than 1 pm, 15 August.

At the Bill discussion session, the Bill Committee, and Economic and Trade Development Committee, U Thar Win of Yankin constituency, U Soe Tha of Twantay constituency, U Win Oo of Yebyu constituency, Defence Service personnel representative Col Myint Ko Ko, U Win Htein of Meiktila

constituency, U Aung Thein Lin of South Okkalapa constituency, Daw Tin Nwe Oo of Dagon Myothit (North) constituency, U Win Than of Thabaung constituency, U Kyi Tha of Gwa constituency and U Win Myint of Myingyan constituency who submitted a proposal to amend the Foreign Investment Bill discussed paragraphs and sub-paragraphs and Thura U Thauang Lwin, Joint Secretary of Myanmar Investment Commission, Deputy Minister for Rail Transportation also discussed the bill. The Hluttaw decided to approve the Bill and amendments to it.

## Denmark provides over US\$ 8 million to improve livelihoods and health in Myanmar

YANGON, 14 Aug—Denmark signed two agreements with UNOPS of more than \$8 million dollars today to boost livelihoods of the poor and to improve the health of mothers and young children in Myanmar.

HE Mikael Hemniti Winther, Denmark's Ambassador to Thailand, Myanmar and Cambodia and Sanjay Mathur, Director & Representative of UNOPS in Myanmar, signed the agreements. More than \$4.1 million will be channeled through the multi-donor Livelihoods and Food Security Trust (LIFT) fund managed by UNOPS for livelihood projects. LIFT was set up to work towards the eradication of extreme poverty and hunger in

Myanmar, one of the Millennium Development Goals. Denmark along with Governments of Australia, the EC, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Sweden, Switzerland and the UK are working together through LIFT to increase food availability, income generation opportunities and food use for up to 2 million people.

Denmark's support to LIFT has ensured that between 2010-11 more than 1.1 million people directly benefitted. An independent evaluation of LIFT's funded projects in the Delta highlights that an overwhelming majority of beneficiaries were of the opinion that incomes had increased substantially

after the Nargis collapse. During the time LIFT was in operation, incomes were perceived to have increased by a further third, bringing rice farmers to a level above that of 'self-sufficiency' and casual labourers close to pre-Nargis levels.

In LIFT's programme country wide including the Delta, in the agricultural sector alone, more than 53,000 households were supported. Almost 6,800 small and micro businesses were established and more than 8,700 households were provided credit for both agricultural and income generating activities.

"Denmark contribution will enable farmers to cultivate larger areas and yield better harvests,

resulting in increased income for many households and villages across the country," said HE Mikael Hemniti Winther.

Another \$4.1 million contribution to 3MDG Fund will be part of the basis for a programme to offer health services to populations in Myanmar with the greatest need. It will focus on

improving the health of mothers and young children, one of the country's most pressing priorities. Furthermore, it will include components to supplement the Global Fund programme on HIV/AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis, in areas, which it is currently unable to support, as well as to assist the government in streng-

thening the health systems and capacity to deliver quality basic health to the people of Myanmar. HE Mikael Hemniti Winther concluded "Denmark's contribution will provide a substantial contribution to assist long-term development for livelihoods and health in the poorest areas of Myanmar."—NLM

### Somali pirate negotiator receives 12 life sentences in US court

NORFOLK, 14 Aug—A Somali man who acted as a ransom negotiator for pirates who seized an American yacht last year and killed four American hostages was sentenced on Monday by a US federal judge to serve 12 life sentences.

Mohammad Shihin was convicted in April on 15 charges including piracy, hostage taking, kidnapping and conspiracy. He was paid \$30,000 to \$50,000 in cash for his negotiating services, according to a federal indictment.

In a courtroom in Norfolk, Virginia, US District Judge Robert Doumar sentenced Shihin to serve 10 concurrent life sentences, two consecutive life sentences and two 20-year sentences and ordered him to pay \$5.4 million in restitution.

“Mohammad Shihin was a key participant in two of the most heinous acts of piracy in modern memory,” US Attorney Neil MacBride said in a statement. Pirates commandeered an American yacht carrying Jean and Scott Adam of California and Phyllis Macay and Bob Riggle from Seattle in February 2011 off the coast of Somalia. All four hostages were killed despite attempts by the US military to negotiate their release.

Prosecutors said Shihin was among an elite group whose skills were needed to negotiate ransoms. According to evidence presented at trial, Shihin researched the background of the hostages over the Internet to determine how much ransom to demand and to find family members to contact for the payments, prosecutors said.—Reuters

### Mobile customer uncovers premium rate ‘bug’

LONDON, 14 Aug — An unexplained charge on a phone bill has led a mobile user to uncover a loophole in the sign-up system for some premium rate services. Consultant Mark Hole found he could sign up anyone for some premium rate services from content maker Buongiorno. All he needed to know was a potential victim’s mobile number and whether they used the Orange network. Buongiorno said it quickly closed the loophole once it was discovered and had no evidence it had been exploited.

Mr Hole’s suspicions were aroused when charges for a premium rate fortune-telling service turned up on the bill for the mobile phones linked to his computer consultancy business. “I went online, got the bill up and there were weekly charges coming up on it,” he said. He complained to operator Orange about the charge but it

said he must have signed up for it despite his insistence that he was “scrupulous” about keeping the numbers private and that they were only used for business calls. Mr Hole also contacted mobile content firm Buongiorno which ran the iFortune service he was being billed for. It asked him to send details of the disputed charge.

At the same time Mr Hole looked for ways that the phantom charge could have

### Drought to lift food prices, inflation impact modest: KC Fed

WASHINGTON, 14 Aug—Americans will face higher food prices at the supermarket next year because of the worst drought in half a century, but the impact on overall inflation will be modest, the Kansas City Federal Reserve Bank said in a report.

It said the drought, which has cut corn and soy bean yields and sent their prices on the futures market soaring, could add 4 percent more to annual food prices over the next year, drawing parallels with a similar situation in 1988.

“Based on the relationships between the consumer price index for food and farm-level prices for crop and livestock, July’s crop price increases and declines in livestock prices could lead

to a 4 percent increase in the CPI for food from September 2011 to September 2012,” the Kansas City Fed said.

The US Department of Agriculture said on Friday this year’s corn crop would fall below 11.0 billion bushels for the first time in six years and the number of bushels yielded per acre was a 17-year low. Soybean production was forecast at a five year low and soy yield per acre nearly a 10-year low.

The drought will also affect meat and dairy prices as more than 70 percent of the beef herd is in states where pastures are rated as poor to very poor.

Heat stress has lowered milk production and rising feed costs are also pressuring

hog and poultry producers, the Kansas City Fed said.

The initial effect will be

low meat prices as farmers bring their animals to the market a bit early to cut losses from the high cost of feeds. In the long-term, however, a shortage of animals for slaughter will push up prices.

“A second wave of higher food prices tends to

emerge from rising meat prices. Historically, within a year of a drought, the initial influx of meat supplies disappears and smaller breeding herds produce fewer slaughter animals and meat supplies shrink,” the Kansas City Fed said.—Reuters

operations had finished and all survivors had been freed from the rubble, some locals expressed disbelief that authorities could have reached the most remote villages so soon.

“I know the area well. There are some regions where there are villages that you can’t even reach by car,” one doctor in the city of Tabriz told Reuters by telephone on Monday, declining to give his name because of the sensitivity of the issue. “It’s not possible for them to have finished so soon.”

The doctor said he had worked for 24 hours non-stop, treating patients from villages rushed to Tabriz.

“In the first hours after the quake, it was ordinary people and volunteers in their own cars going to the affected areas,” the doctor said. “It was more ordinary people helping out than official crisis staff.”

Members of parliament representing the affected areas complained about a shortage of tents, parliamentary news agency ICANA

said. “The crisis management headquarters must take broader steps to alleviate these concerns,” said speaker Ali Larijani, a frequent critic of Ahmadinejad and possible candidate to succeed him in elections next year.

Vice-President Mohammad Reza Rahimi said after a visit to the quake-hit areas on Monday that Iran was ready to accept international aid.

“In different situations, our country has helped those in need in other countries and under the current conditions, is ready to receive aid... from different countries,” he said, according to IRNA, without giving further details.

In the aftermath of the quake, the United States, Russia, Turkey and a host of other nations offered their condolences and said they were ready to offer assistance.

The moderate conservative newspaper *Asr-e Iran* reported that a full 24 hours after the earthquake, some villages had not yet been visited by relief teams.

### Strong earthquake hits Sea of Okhotsk, no damage reported

BEIJING, 14 Aug—A strong earthquake jolted Sea of Okhotsk on Tuesday, and no tsunami alert has been issued and no damage reported so far.

The tremor, which struck at 0259 GMT on Tuesday with an epicenter 158 km northeast of the Russian town of Poronaysk and 625.9 km deep, measured 7.7 magnitude, according to the latest update by the US Geological Survey (USGS). Meanwhile, the Japan Meteorological Agency placed the magnitude at 7.3, while the China Earthquake Network Center put it at 7.2.

Russian media quoted emergency authorities as saying that the quake was felt by Okhotsk islanders, but no casualties or damage were reported and no tsunami alert was issued.

The Japanese side also said it has not received any reports of damage or casualties and no tsunami alert has been issued.—Xinhua

**Uganda military helicopters missing en route to Somalia**

KAMPALA, 14 Aug— A number of Ugandan military helicopters went missing in Kenyan airspace on Sunday on their way to Somalia to reinforce African Union peace-keeping forces battling al Shabaab rebels, the Ugandan military said.

The military said a team of helicopters had left a base in the Ugandan city of Entebbe but that only one had landed in the Kenyan town of Wajir, where they were scheduled to refuel before flying on to Somalia.

The Uganda People's Defence Forces (UPDF) did not say how many helicopters were missing or how many people were on board.

"The search is going on, we don't know what exactly happened but we are investigating it and we will let you know when I get adequate information," UPDF spokesman Felix Kulayigye told Reuters.

Ugandan troops form the backbone of the African Union peace-keeping force (AMISOM) in Somalia.

The air force said on 7 August that it was deploying transport and combat helicopters to Somalia to beef up the force.

Al Shabaab struck the Ugandan capital Kampala in mid-2010 when suicide bombers from the al-Qaeda-linked group killed more than 70 people who were watching soccer on television, in revenge for the presence of Ugandan troops in Somalia.

**Israel tests SMS missile alerts as Iran chatter grows**

JERUSALEM, 14 Aug— Israel on Sunday began testing an SMS system for warning the public of an imminent missile attack as chatter over a possible strike on Iran dominated the Israeli Press headlines.

As testing began, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Israel had chalked up "a significant improvement" in its home front defence capabilities, mentioning its highly-vaunted anti-missile systems such as *Iron Dome* and *Arrow 2*.

"There has been a significant improvement in our level of defence capacity on the home front: with Iron Dome, with the Arrow, in terms of protection and shelters, in advanced warning systems and in other areas," he said at the start of the weekly cabinet meeting.

"But all the threats which are directed towards the Israeli home front are dwarfed by another threat — different in both its scope and its essence. And so I repeat: Iran must never be allowed to get

nuclear weapons."

With front page stories in two papers suggesting Teheran had made progress towards the manufacture and assembly of a nuclear warhead, Israel's Home Front Command began final tests of the SMS warning system which is expected to be operational by September.

"The Home Front Command will today start conducting nationwide testing of the 'Personal Message' alert system, which will end on Thursday," said a



statement indicating that SMS texts in Hebrew, Arabic, English and Russian would be sent to subscribers on

Israel's three main networks: Cellcom, Pele-phone and Orange.

**Two missing after torrential rain hits Japan's Kansai**

OSAKA, 14 Aug— Two went missing on Tuesday as torrential rain hit several prefectures of the western Japanese region of Kansai where more than 1,000 people are advised to evacuate from homes, local Press reported.

At least two went missing on Tuesday morning after a landslide caused by the heavy rain hit a house in Uji City of Kyoto Prefecture and its surrounding Kansai region which saw hourly

rainfall of about 100 mm on Tuesday morning, according to Japan's public broadcaster Nippon Hoso Kyokai (NHK).

The report said more than 1,000 people living in three residential zones of Otsu City in Shiga Prefecture have been advised to evacuate since the morning hours due to threats of landslide caused by the continuous rainfall.

In Nara Prefecture, meanwhile, local police started its rescue operation

on Tuesday morning after a group of junior students could not move forward in the Kii Mountains, a famous trekking zone in the prefecture, due to bad weather.

Weather authorities warned that heavy rainfall may trigger further floods and landslides in a wide area of Kansai, parts of which may see hourly rainfall of about 80 mm by Wednesday morning.

**Family murdered in central Mexico, three children among the dead**

MEXICO CITY, 14 Aug— A family of seven, including three young children, were found murdered with their throats slit in a ranch outside the Gulfport city of Veracruz, a local official said on Sunday.

The bodies were discovered after neighbours noted an awful smell coming from the home outside the town of Manlio Fabio Altamirano, the Veracruz state attorney general's office said in a statement. The state of

decomposition suggested they had been murdered at least 72 hours before they were found.

Three children aged 9, 7 and 3 were among the victims, said a government official who requested anonymity.

It was the second time in less than a week that a family was attacked by suspected organized crime gangs. On 8 August, gunmen killed a family of five in the Pacific coastal resort of Acapulco.

More than 55,000

gangland murders and execution-style hits have occurred since Calderon took power in December 2006 and declared a national crackdown on drug gangs. Veracruz has experienced increasing violence over the last year.

There has been a rash of deaths and violence since last week in central Mexico, a battleground between rival gangs for control over lucrative smuggling routes to the United States.

McAfee posted the pictures on Facebook and

then submitted a copy to the local newspaper. The photo was such a hit that he's started selling prints for \$15 on Etsy.com.

The corpse has since been removed from the road but a gap in the paint remains, ABCNews.com said.

NEW YORK, 14 Aug—Ang Lee's big-screen adaptation of Yann Martel's best-selling novel "Life of Pi" is to open the New York Film Festival next month, organizers said on Monday.

Lee is a member of a small group of filmmakers — including Robert Altman, Pedro Almodovar and Francois Truffaut — who have had more than one movie open the festival, the festival Web site noted. Lee's "The Ice Storm" kicked off the event in 1997 and "Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon" closed the festival in 2000.

"Life of Pi" is a perfect combination of technological innovation and a strong artistic vision," Richard Pena, Film Society programme director and chairman of the NYFF selection committee, said in a statement on Monday. "Ang Lee has managed to make a deeply moving, engrossing work that will delight audiences as much as it will astonish them. ## Brazil plans big spending to improve medal haul in 2016

RIODEJANEIRO, 14 Aug — The host nation of the next Olympics had a mixed outing in London and is hoping that a surge in spending on athletes and facilities will ensure it makes the top 10 medals table in 2016 on home soil in Rio de Janeiro. Brazil won 17 medals in London, two more than its previous best in Beijing, finishing 22nd in the overall

count.

However, officials were frustrated after Brazil managed only three golds and at the general shortage of medals in the swimming pool and on the athletic track. The 2016 hosts have decided to focus more on individual events in a bid to win more medals in front of their own fans. "Our goal is to get in the top 10 medals table

and to do that we need to keep winning medals in the disciplines we've already won at and also win medals in new areas," said Marcos Vinicius Freire of the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB).

"When you look at the top 10 countries, one of the things they all have in common is that they all win medals in at least 13 disciplines. We need

## Olympic flag arrives in Rio, marking race to 2016

RIODEJANEIRO, 14 Aug — The Olympic flag touched down on Brazilian soil on Monday, marking the start of four years of preparations ahead of the 2016 games in Rio de Janeiro.

Rio Mayor Eduardo Paes waved the five-ringed flag as he and other top officials disembarked from the flight that brought them back from London, where they attended the games' closing ceremony on Sunday.

Speaking at a packed news conference at Rio's Tom Jobim international airport, Paes called it an "important moment" for Rio and for Brazil at large.

He pledged the games will leave a vast legacy for Rio, the beachside metropolis that suffered from decades of neglect after it lost national capital status to Brasilia in 1960.

"I see the arrival of this Olympic flag as not the start, but the consolidation of an important process of transformation for the city of Rio de Janeiro," he said. "Rio is a city that spent

LONDON, 14 Aug — Ireland goalkeeper Shay Given is retiring from international football after winning a record 125 caps for his country, he said on Monday. "After a lot of thought and consideration, I have made the most difficult decision to retire from international football," the Aston Villa player said on his personal Twitter account. "It's been a great honour and privilege to play and on occasion captain the team," added the 36-year-old. "I wish to thank all the players, managers, staff and most importantly the most wonderful fans in the world."

The Football Association of Ireland confirmed Given's decision on its website (fai.ie), explaining that Given had informed Irish coach Giovanni Trapattoni of his decision. The Italian paid tribute to the former Newcastle United and

Manchester City player's 16-year international career. "I understand the difficult decision that Shay had to make, and appreciate all of his efforts during his international career," Trapattoni said. "He is a strong player, with a great character and his love of playing for his country always shone through." It has been a pleasure to work with

him during my time with the team. I wish him the very best in his future. Given made his international debut under coach Mick McCarthy in 1996 against Russia and quickly established himself as Ireland's first-choice keeper.

He played in all his country's games at the 2002 World Cup, when Ireland progressed from a tough group before losing to Spain in the first knockout round. Given's other major tournament appearance was at the 2012 European Championship, part of an Irish side that lost all three group games. Trapattoni, keen to try out younger players as he looks towards the 2014 World Cup qualifying campaign, did not pick Given for this week's friendly against Serbia. According to the website, Given has informed the FAI that he would "happily return to assist with goalkeeping duties" should there ever be any squad emergency. Sunderland's Keiren Westwood, who has 10 international appearances to his name, is widely expected to be Given's successor as the Irish number one. — *Reuters*

### Federer will be ready for cement

CINCINNATI, 14 Aug — Roger Federer would have hoped for more than just the few days of pause he managed after the London Olympic final, but will take what he can get as the world number one prepares for his start on Wednesday at the Cincinnati Masters. The top seed said even his few days away to celebrate his 31st birthday with his wife and twin daughters was worthwhile for recuperation as he lays the groundwork for his final sprint of the abbreviated summer hardcourt season going into the US Open.

"The last few years we always had at least a two, three-week preparation for the hard courts," said the seven-time Wimbledon winner and Olympic silver medalist behind Andy Murray. "But this time we've just had two and a half weeks more on grass, so obviously I don't think the preparation is as good as it's been in the previous years.

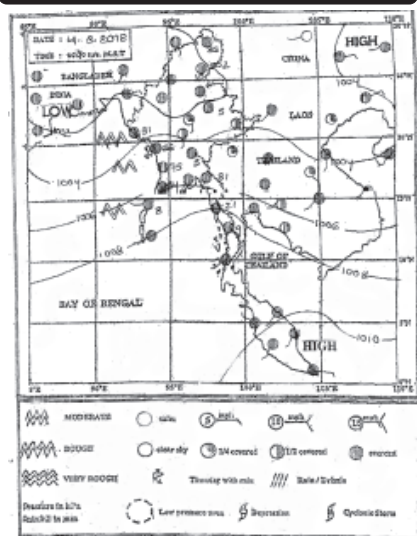

**McIlroy's runaway PGA win ramps up Tiger comparisons**

CHARLESTON, South Carolina, 14 Aug — The superlatives are once again being heaped upon Rory McIlroy after the Northern Irishman, for the second time in 15 months, blew away the world's best to win his second major crown. While Tiger Woods failed to add to his career haul of 14 major titles, McIlroy underlined his burgeoning status as the game's most exciting young talent as he romped to victory by a record eight shots in the PGA Championship at Kiawah Island.

Oozing confidence all week, the 23-year-old from Hollywood in Northern Ireland reminded golf fans across the globe, as well as his peers, that he is both a man of the people and a player of rare skill. Ever humble with a down-to-earth, almost boyish, approach when dealing with spectators, the

media and his rivals on tour, McIlroy is now seen by many as the 'Tiger' of the future. Of course, he and Woods are very different characters. The Northern Irishman is a perpetually smiling golfer who strides the fairways with a swagger and his shoulders back, always completely at home in his environment.

In stark contrast, American Woods has always competed in a cocoon of concentration, never really engaging with fans as he goes about his business with a brooding, steely focus. Already the comparisons are flying but McIlroy's compatriot, 2010 US Open champion Graeme McDowell, believes this is unfair. "It's tough to say that Rory is a Tiger Woods-type player," McDowell said after McIlroy stormed to victory at Kiawah Island on Sunday with a closing six-under-par

66 on the longest layout to stage a major championship. "Tiger Woods is a 'once-in-a-lifetime' type player, and Rory McIlroy is at least a 'once-in-a-decade' type player. "He's that good. I've been saying it for years how good he is. "He showed us at Congressional how good he is, by getting to No 1 in the world this year at the Honda Classic, how good he is, and here we go again." McIlroy clinched his maiden major title by a staggering eight shots in last year's US Open at Congressional and held off a last-day charge by Woods to become world number one for the first time with a two-shot victory at the Honda Classic in March.

"He's going to be the player that kids look up to, that kids measure their own 'wannabe' games by," said McDowell. "Ten years ago it was Tiger Woods. It still is

**Kvitova defeats Li Na for title**

MONTREAL, 14 Aug — Winning the women's Rogers Cup was a breakthrough for Petra Kvitova. Not only was it the 22-year-old Czech's first WTA Tour victory of the year, it was also the first of her eight career titles that was won in North America. "I hope it will continue," said Kvitova, who said this week she has had trouble winning in North America because the high humidity affects her asthma. "North America is always tough for me and I'm so glad how I played here this week." Kvitova defeated China's Li Na 7-5, 2-6, 6-3 in a 2-hour, 17-minute final on Monday night.

The tournament is also at the start of the hard-court season leading into the US Open at the end of the month. "It's great," said Kvitova, who won six titles last year, including Wimbledon. "I finally won a title this year. It was a good final, a good fight from both sides." The win avenged a loss to Li at Sydney

this year and evened their all-time matchup at two victories. "It was a tough match, this was a tennis war," Li said. "Both players played good. "She's very tough.

She felt the ball so deep. I felt I was always on defense. The last two matches I felt I could be aggressive on the court, but this one I felt I was 70 percent of the time on defense."

The match pitted two Grand Slam champions from 2011, as Li took the French Open, Li is 0-3 in tournament finals this year. Kvitova, seeded fifth, struggled at the start, hitting several balls long. She fell behind 3-1 before she found the range with her forehand and charged back to take the lead. Even then, she needed to save three break points to take a 6-5 lead, then won the set on her fifth break point against the 10th-seeded Li. Li took the first 16 points of the second set to grab a 4-0 lead before Kvitova finally held serve. —*Internet*

**Four killed, four injured in central China pileup**

YICHANG, (Hubei), 14 Aug—Four people died and four others were injured in a road accident on an expressway in central China's Hubei Province Tuesday morning, local authorities said.

## Speaker requests patience of parliamentarian; row over Union level organization definition to be sent to President

NAY PYI TAW, 14 Aug—Pyithu Hluttaw regular session continued for 26<sup>th</sup> day at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here at 10.10 am today, attended by Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw Thura U Shwe Mann, 399 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives, and members of Pyithu Hluttaw Legal Affairs and Special Cases Assessment Commission, and the speakers of Bago Region Hluttaw and Rakhine State Hluttaw as observers.

At today's session, clarification regarding the parliamentary affairs was made, two questions answered, one new proposal submitted and one bill discussed and reported to the Hluttaw.

The Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker said he received the proposal to impeach the Chairperson and Members of the Constitutional Tribunal of the Union on breach of any of the provisions under the constitution as prescribed in Section 334, Sub-section (a) (i) of the constitution and inefficient discharge of duties assigned by law as prescribed in Sub-section (v) of the same section, signed by 301 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives from the Hluttaw Rights Committee for the second time.

Despite reluctance to make such impeachment, the Hluttaw speaker would handle requests and duties assigned fairly by the Hluttaw representatives. The Hluttaw representatives would also have the goodwill not lesser than the Speaker. While alternatives, except the impeachment, are being sought, the Hluttaw representatives should exercise patience.

The Speaker said that after informing the attitude of the

Hluttaw representatives to the President, he would take action to prevent defamation of the country, the Hluttaw, the impeached person, and the related organizations and persons. His will is to let the President know of the desire and attitude of the Hluttaw representatives and make appropriate actions.

The message would be sent to the President to withdraw

a submission, which provoked the case, to the tribunal by the Union Attorney-General on behalf of the President made on 2 February, to urge the chairperson and members of the tribunal to resign at their own wish, and to complete these actions by 21 August. The Speaker informed the Hluttaw of his attitude.

## Miners have no rights to enjoy fixed pension rates like Tatmadawmen as they are not Tatmadawmen

NAY PYI TAW, 14 Aug—Amyotha Hluttaw Session continued for 26<sup>th</sup> day, at Amyotha Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Complex, at 10 am today, attended by Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Aung Myint and 209 MPs.

With respect to the question of U Sai San Min of Shan State Constituency No.3 on **“whether or not retired staff**

**from Namtu Bawdwin who live in Lashio can take out their monthly pensions at Myanma Economic Bank (MEB) in Lashio”** and **“there is a plan to pay fixed salary rates to those staff like those of Tatmadawmen as they have to discharge State’s duties like Tatmadawmen”**, Union Minister for Mines U Thein Htaik replied:

Retired staff from Namtu Bawdwin under No.1 Mining Enterprise could not take out their salaries at MEB (Lashio) as No.1 Mining Enterprise is a State’s enterprise. But, account department of No.1 Mining Enterprise transfer pensions for retired staff who apply for taking out their pensions in Lashio to MEB (Lashio) as of July, 2012.

With respect to the second question, all miners have rights to enjoy their salaries in accord with Civil Pension Law and provisions. The miners have no rights to enjoy fixed pension rates like Tatmadawmen as they are not Tatmadawmen.

Regarding the question of Dr Tin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency No.6 on **“whether there is forum with foreign countries that have experience to solve difficulties or challenges that might be faced due to the establishment of ASEAN Free Trade Area in 2015”**, Deputy Minister for National Planning and Economic Development Dr Kan Zaw replied:

In its bid to implement the emergence of AEC and the establishment of free trade area, Myanmar is holding meetings and discussions in cooperation with the ministries and private organizations.

Promotion of Production and Market competition projects in ASEAN region was drafted in March, 2012. The 15-member work committee led by deputy ministers from respective ministries was formed. To deal with difficulties and challenges that might be faced at a time when AFTA and

The water level of Sittoung River at Toungoo 634 cm has exceeded by 34 cm (about 1.1 ft) above its danger level. It may remain above its danger level 600 cm during the next three days, Department of Meteorology and Hydrology announced.—MNA

### Precautionary measures for swollen river

- Pay attention to weather forecasts and warning of flood broadcast daily through TV, radio and FMs. Don't believe rumours.
- Observe locations of buildings free from floods and life-saving hills and high grounds.
- Search the route that quickly reaches safe place.
- Make arrangements for taking indispensable equipment.
- Keep radio, torch light, drinking water, preserved foods and medicines.
- Repair houses to be in a proper structure.

- Note down telephone numbers and addresses for emergency communication with rescue teams and information teams.
- Attend educative courses on danger of floods.
- Participate in rehearsal of precautionary measures for swollen rivers.
