## Flood warning for Sittoung, Shwegyin rivers

NAY PYI TAW, 19 Aug—According to the 12.30 hr M.S.T observations today, the water level of the Sittoung River at Madauk 1190 cm has exceeded by 120 cm (about 4 feet) above its danger level. It may remain above its danger level 1070 cm during the next three days.

The water level of the Shwegyin River at Shwegyin 710 cm has exceeded by 10 cm (about 0.3 foot) above its danger level. It may continue to rise 30 cm (about 1 foot) during the next 48 hours commencing this noon and may remain above its danger level 700 cm, announced by Meteorology and Hydrology Department.—MNA

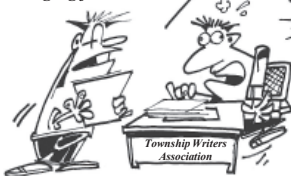

## Ryan puts personal spin on Medicare debate

THE VILLAGES, 19 Aug—Republican vice presidential candidate Paul Ryan on Saturday put a personal spin on the debate over Medicare, bringing his 78-year-old mother on stage at a speech to seniors in Florida where he vowed to safeguard the health insurance programme for the elderly.

Under attack by Democrats for his budget cost-cutting plan that proposes a major transformation in how Medicare works, Ryan has gone on the offensive, charging that President Barack Obama would take billions from Medicare to pay for his 2010 health care reform law.

With that, he has also begun to align himself with presidential candidate Mitt Romney's approach to Medicare, one that would spend \$716 billion more than either Obama's or Ryan's over the next 10 years. Ryan personalized the issue at The Villages, the world's biggest retirement community and a bastion of Republican support in a key swing state.

"When I think of Medicare, it's not just a programme, it's not just a bunch of numbers, it's what my mom relies on, it's what my grandma had," Ryan, 42, said. Standing in front of a banner that read "Protect And Strengthen Medicare," Ryan hugged his mother Betty Douglas, who lives part-time in Florida. The short-haired, diminutive Douglas waved to the crowd.

Romney's choice of Ryan as his running mate has put a spotlight on the Wisconsin congressman's best-known

achievement—a budget plan that would slash Medicare's projected costs by converting it to a programme that provides limited subsidies to buy coverage.

But on the campaign trail, Ryan has emphasized less contentious proposals offered by Romney.

Talk of shrinking the health programme for the elderly could lose votes in the 6 November election in the hotly contested state of Florida, home to the highest concentration of retirees in the country. "Their plan would put Medicare on track to be ended as we know it," President Barack Obama said to a crowd of about 2,300 at a campaign event on Saturday in Windham, New Hampshire.—Reuters

The United States has been pouring aid into Yemen to stem the threat of attacks from al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) and to try to prevent any spillover of violence into neighboring Saudi Arabia, the world's top oil exporter.

Last year, a U.S.-backed offensive drove al-Qaeda offshoot Ansar-al-Sharia from cities it had seized in an uprising against former president Ali Abdullah Saleh.

But militants have carried out a number of suicide bombings on high-profile military and security targets since June, exposing the

government's vulnerability.

On Saturday, witnesses said militants drove up to a building owned by Yemen's state television broadcaster and blew up a military vehicle guarding it outside.

They then moved on to the three-storey intelligence base nearby and opened fire with automatic weapons and rocket-propelled grenades.

The attackers also detonated a car bomb next to the building, destroying part of it, said the defence ministry.

The ministry said the attack killed 14 people and wounded seven—all of them members of the intelligence service and the Central Security forces. A security source and medics said 18 people died.—Reuters

## Serial attacks kill seven, wound 5 in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 19 Aug—Seven people were killed and five others injured on Saturday in separate gunfire and bomb attacks in Iraq, the police said.

In central Iraq, gunmen stormed the house of a police traffic officer in Swaeb district in southwestern Baghdad, and shot him, his wife, his sister and his daughter dead, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

The attackers robbed about 75,000 US dollars and fled the scene, the source said, adding that Iraqi security forces launched an investigation into the incident.

In Iraq's northern province of Nineveh, gunmen with assault rifles broke into a civilian house in al-Rashediyah area in the provincial capital city of

Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad, killing two brothers and injuring their guest inside, a provincial police source anonymously told *Xinhua*.

In a separate incident, a woman was gunned down by gunmen near her house in Al-Methaq area, in eastern Mosul, the source said.

In Iraq's western province of Anbar, a roadside bomb hidden in a garbage container detonated near a police patrol in eastern the city of Fallujah, some 50 km west of Baghdad, wounding two policemen, a local police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In addition, police arrested a woman suicide bomber wearing an explosive vest in the provincial capital city of Ramadi, some 110 km west of Baghdad, the source said.

In Iraq's eastern

province of Diyala, a roadside bomb went off in an area located just west of the provincial capital city of Baquba, some 65 km northeast of Baghdad, injuring a woman, a provincial police source anonymously told *Xinhua*.—*Xinhua*

## Wildfires strain outdoor tourism business in western US

SALMON, 19 Aug—Wildfires sweeping across the western United States are straining communities that depend upon the summer tourism season, as recreation sites catch fire, campgrounds close and outdoor activities such as river rafting are disrupted.

In the mountains of central Idaho, where whitewater rafting has replaced logging as an economic mainstay, blazes are curtailing trips on rivers whose world-class rapids draw an international crowd of thousands from June through August.

Tourists who booked rafting trips months in advance have been canceling their reservations, spooked by fast-changing blazes that have produced a smoky haze and led to road blockages.

"We've had nothing but cancellations," said Lorali Simmons, owner of River Shuttles, a business in Salmon, Idaho, that shuttles vehicles for boaters on the Middle Fork and the Salmon River's wild and scenic corridor.

The wildfires that have scorched 80,000 acres of mountain pine forests in east central Idaho stranded 300 Middle Fork rafters northwest of Salmon this week after falling rock closed the only road to the site.

Dozens of fires are burning out of control across parched Western states, including California, where blazes have encroached on national parks.

A survey released this week by the US government shows the number of Americans engaging in outdoor recreation rose last year for the first time in three decades. At the same time, remote, sparsely populated communities in western states have tried to remake themselves as gateways to natural resources that attract visitors.

In recent years, fires, floods and heat waves have taken a toll on a tourism industry that the Outdoor Industry Association says generates more than \$35 billion combined for Idaho, Colorado and California annually.—Reuters

## Hurricane Gordon heads toward eastern Azores

MIAMI, 19 Aug—Hurricane Gordon sped across the Atlantic on early Sunday toward the eastern Azores islands, where a hurricane warning is in effect, US forecasters in Miami said.

The US National Hurricane Centre in Miami

said Gordon was centered about 395 miles (635 kms) west-southwest of the Azores at 2 am EDT (0600 GMT) Sunday. It added that Gordon was a Category 2 hurricane with top sustained winds of 110 mph (175 kph) and higher gusts. The hurricane, which formed on Saturday, was moving toward the east at 22 mph (35 kph).

The hurricane was on a forecast track expected to take it near the eastern Azores on early Monday. Forecasters said that while the Gordon was expected to weaken somewhat during the day Sunday, it still was expected to be a hurricane when it passes near the eastern Azores. Portugal's government, meanwhile, has discontinued a hurricane warning for the central Azores.

Forecasters said Gordon, on an eastward track in the pre-dawn hours, was expected to turn toward the east-northeast later Sunday. Hurricane-force winds extended outward up to 35 miles (55 kms) from the center and tropical storm force winds reached outward up to 125 miles (205 kphs).

Gordon's dangerous surf and ocean swells could reach the central and eastern Azores on Sunday afternoon and heavy rains were expected, the Miami forecasting center said.

Gordon became a hurricane on Saturday even as onetime Tropical Storm Helene swiftly weakened into a tropical depression as it lumbered ashore on Mexico's Gulf Coast and degenerated into a rain storm without reports of significant damage.

**Sharks tracked by surfing robot and free app**

SAN FRANCISCO, 19 Aug — A surfing robot is being used to track great white sharks off the coast of California, US, by marine scientists. The mobile transmitter is the latest addition to an extensive

predators in the Pacific Ocean using electronic tags on creatures ranging from seabirds to turtles. The study revealed that the waters were a hotspot for a variety of species which frequent the area depending on the season

programme of electronic tagging. Researchers aim to fine-tune 12 years of results with the self-propelled craft and raise public awareness of the area's diverse wildlife. Shark fans are able to follow the animals' movements via a free app for smartphones and tablet computers.

The project is led by shark expert Professor Barbara Block from Stanford University, who describes the area off the coast of San Francisco as the "blue Serengeti", comparing its underwater highways to the migratory routes in Africa. Her latest project follows on from a 10-year programme dedicated to tracking

and water temperature, many migrating between Mexico and Canada.

According to Prof Block, the great white sharks in particular demonstrated an "incredible homing ability". But to further investigate their behaviour, she required a "mobile observatory". "Across the planet the goal of oceanographers and biologists alike is to observe the ocean in as much detail as possible," she said, explaining that the key to accurate data. After first hearing about the "environmentally friendly" unmanned technology developed by the Silicon

Valley based company Liquid Robotics, Prof Block said she became "infatuated".

The bright yellow shark-tracking robot designed by the company consists of two parts — a glider that descends 23ft (7m) down into the ocean with a surfboard above. The glider has a special wing system that converts wave energy into forward thrust to keep the robot moving through the water. It also has a receiver that picks up the audio signals from the sharks' electronic tags. The surfboard carries the rest of the scientific instruments, including the satellite link that allows researchers to accurately pinpoint the animals' locations.

When a shark or other tagged animal encounters the robot, their position is recorded and relayed back to the research team.

They have also placed a number of fixed buoys mounted with underwater audio receivers known as hydrophones to form a listening network in known hotspots. In the first week of its release the team report that the robot has picked up five great white sharks. — *Internet*

**Shamoon virus targets energy sector infrastructure**

LONDON, 19 Aug — A new threat targeting infrastructure in the energy industry has been uncovered by security specialists. The attack, known as Shamoon, is said to have hit "at least one organization" in the sector. Shamoon is capable of wiping files and rendering several computers on a network unusable. On Wednesday, Saudi Arabia's national oil company said an attack had led to its own network being taken offline.

Although Saudi Aramco did not link the issue to the Shamoon threat, it did confirm that the company had suffered a "sudden disruption". In a statement, the company said it had now isolated its computer networks as a precautionary measure. The disruptions were "suspected to be the result of a virus that had infected personal workstations without affecting the primary components of the network", a statement read. It said the attack had had "no impact whatsoever" on production operations.

On Thursday, security firms released the first detailed information about Shamoon.

Experts said the threat was known to have had hit "at least one organization" in the energy sector. "It is a destructive malware that corrupts files on a compromised computer and overwrites the MBR (Master Boot Record) in an effort to render a computer unusable," wrote security firm Symantec.

The attack was designed to penetrate a computer through the internet, before targeting other machines on the same network that were not directly connected to the internet. Once infected, the machines' data is wiped. A list of the wiped files then sent back to the initially infected computer, and in turn passed on to the attacker's command-and-control centre. During this process, the attack replaces the deleted files with JPEG images - obstructing any potential file recovery by the

victim. Seculert, an Israel-based security specialist, also analysed the malicious code and concluded that it had unusual characteristics compared with other recent attacks. "The interesting part of this malware is that instead of staying under the radar and collect information, the malware was designed to overwrite and wipe the files," the company said.

"Why would someone wipe files in a targeted attack and make the machine unusable?" Shamoon is the latest in a line of attacks that have targeted infrastructure. One of the most high-profile attacks in recent times was Stuxnet, which was designed to hit nuclear infrastructure in Iran. Others, like Duqu, have sought to infiltrate networks in order to steal data. — *Internet*

**New family of spiders found in Oregon cave**

GRANTS PASS, (Ore), 19 Aug — Amateur cave explorers have found a new family of spiders in the Siskiyou Mountains of Southern Oregon, and scientists have dubbed it Trogloraptor — Latin for cave robber — for their fearsome front claws.

The spelunkers sent specimens to the California Academy of Sciences in San Francisco, which has the West Coast's largest collection of spiders. Entomologists there say the spider — reddish brown and the size of a half dollar — evolved so distinctly that it requires its own taxonomic family — the first new spider family found in North America since the 1870s.

"It took us a long time to figure out what it wasn't," said Charles Griswold, curator of arachnids at the academy. "Even longer to figure out what it is. We used anatomy. We used DNA to understand its evolutionary place. Then we consulted other experts all over the world about what this was. They all concurred with our opinion that this was something completely new to science." "It's a good example of how science works — professional and citizen scientists share information,"

he added. The discovery is described in the Friday online edition of the journal *ZooKeys*.

Jonathan Coddington, curator of arachnids at the Smithsonian Institution and associate director for science at the National Museum of Natural History, agreed that the spiders represent a family never seen before. "This is really a distinct event," he said. "To walk out in the woods and find an example of an ancient lineage that no one has ever seen before is special." — *Internet*

LONDON, 19 Aug — Developers and users of Twitter have reacted angrily to changes made by the social network to restrict creation of third-party applications. Any new app that wants to serve more than 100,000 users must now seek the company's explicit permission. Apps which already have more than 100,000 users are allowed to double their user base before having to get Twitter's go-ahead to grow any further. Critics said it would stifle the development of innovative products.

The changes came as

part of Twitter's overhaul of its Application Programming Interface (API). An API allows different parts of a program to communicate together, as well as letting one application share content with another. In Twitter's case, its API has allowed for the development of extremely popular third-party services like Tweetdeck, Hootsuite and Twitpic. Twitter says the new rules, announced by its director of consumer product Michael Sippey, aim to "deliver a consistent Twitter experience".

Mr Sippey wrote: "If you are building a Twitter client application that is accessing the home timeline, account settings or direct messages API endpoints (typically used by traditional client applications) or are using our

User Streams product, you will need our permission if your application will require more than 100,000 individual user tokens." In this context, "tokens" are individual users. The guidelines also covered how tweets are displayed within apps. "If your application displays Tweets to users, and it doesn't adhere to our Display Requirements, we reserve the right to revoke your application key," Mr Sippey explained.

The changes are not expected to have an immediate impact on users. However, the announcement was heavily criticised by developers. Marco Arment, creator of popular reading service Instapaper, advised developers who were building on Twitter to "start working on another product". "Twitter

has left themselves a lot of wiggle room with the rules," he wrote in a blog post.

"Effectively, Twitter can decide your app is breaking a (potentially vague) rule at any time, or they can add a new rule that your app inadvertently breaks, and revoke your API access at any time." "Of course, they've always had this power. But now we know that they'll use it in ways that we really don't agree with." "I sure as hell wouldn't build a business on Twitter, and I don't think I'll even build any nontrivial features on it anymore." Twitter is not the only service to put such restrictions in place. Last year, Google announced that it would begin charging companies that made heavy use of its Maps product. — *Internet*

**Next-generation ASUS Transformer tablet revealed ahead of launch**

NEW YORK, 19 Aug — An upcoming tablet from ASUS recently passed through the Federal Communications Commission's testing facility equipped with the model number TF500T. Few details are revealed in the resulting documentation, however the model number suggests the tablet could fall between the budget-friendly Transformer Pad TF300 and the high-end Transformer Pad Infinity TF700. The Taiwanese manufacturer's upcoming tablet will be Wi-Fi only and will feature an HDMI port and a microphone. We can also safely assume that the TF500T will have the ability to transform into a laptop with the help of ASUS's keyboard dock. — *Internet*

### Hacker claims to have found new security flaw with Apple's iPhone

SAN FRANCISCO, 19 Aug — A hacker on Friday revealed a security flaw that he claimed could make Apple's iPhone particularly vulnerable to text message cheating. The flaw has existed since iPhone was first launched in 2007, and is still not solved in the beta version of iOS 6, the next operating system for iPhone, the hacker under the name "Pod2g" said in a blog post.

Under the protocols handling the exchange of SMS (Short Message Service) text between mobile phones, the sender of a message can technically change the reply-to phone number to something different from the original number, Pod2g explained. In a good implementation, the receiver of the message would see both the original phone number and the reply-

to one.

But using iPhone's SMS feature, when receivers see the message, it seems to come from the reply-to number, while the original phone number of the sender is hidden. The loophole means that someone could send iPhone users messages pretending to be from the receivers' banks or other trusted sources, asking for some private information, or cheating them to go to a dedicated website to obtain users' information.

Pod2g called the security flaw "severe" and urged Apple to fix it before the final release of the iOS 6 software. "Now you are alerted. Never trust any SMS you received on your iPhone at first sight," Pod2g wrote in the blog post. Apple Inc could not be reached for comments. — *Xinhua*

### China eyes African Barrick Gold stake

LONDON, 19 Aug — China's state-owned miner, China National Gold, has held preliminary talks to buy a stake in African Barrick Gold (ABG), one of Africa's largest gold miners. Demand for gold in China has surged and it is expected to become the world's biggest market for the metal this year. African Barrick has large reserves but has struggled to meet production targets. Barrick Gold, the parent of ABG, said the talks were at an "early stage". "There can be no certainty that these discussions will result in the

acquisition of all or part of Barrick's holding in ABG," Barrick Gold said in a statement.

ABG's production levels have been falling in recent years. Last year, the company produced almost 688,000 ounces of gold. That was down from 701,000 ounces in 2010 and 716,000 ounces the year before. At the same time, its cost of production has gone up. According to the firm, it cost it \$692 (£440) to produce an ounce of gold last year, a jump of more than 20% from 2010.

The firm has also been

hurt by issues such as power cuts as well as theft of fuel. As a result, its shares have taken a hit, falling almost 30% in the past one year. Analysts said that given these issues, the miner was a risky bet for potential suitors. "African Barrick has always looked like it offered good value albeit at a high risk, and if the potential acquirer can get the asset and is comfortable with the risk, you will be able to get a reasonable set of assets for a good price," said Hunter Hillcoat an analyst with Investec. — *Internet*

### Australian scientists in research into spider venom for breast cancer cure

BRISBANE, 19 Aug — Australian scientists are undertaking groundbreaking research into spider venom for use in medicine to fight breast cancer, Queensland Science Minister Ros Bates said on Friday.

Scientists at James Cook University in Cairns in Far North Queensland will determine if venom from funnel web spiders and tarantulas can kill breast cancer cells through the research, the minister said. Bates said the research was on the back of international studies that suggested certain toxins in spider venom could offer an untapped suite of natural molecules to kill breast cancer cells.

"With more than 40,000 species of spiders, it's estimated there are more than four million different toxins in spider venom," Bates said in a statement. "Those toxins will now be screened, to look at their potential to treat cancer in humans." The minister said the work being done by James Cook University researchers had cemented Queensland's place as a global scientific leader. — *Xinhua*

### Eat walnuts a day keep the doctor away



Could two handfuls of walnuts a day keep the fertility doctor away? — INTERNET

WASHINGTON, 19 Aug — Eating around two handfuls of walnuts a day improves sperm health in young men, a study in the journal *Biology of Reproduction* suggests. Sperm shape, movement and vitality improved in men who added walnuts to their diet over 12 weeks.

The fatty acids found in these nuts are thought to have helped sperm development. It is not known if this would help improve male fertility. About one in six couples are infertile, with 40% of these due to a male factor.

Dr Allan Pacey, senior lecturer in andrology at the University of Sheffield said: "It would be relatively easy to poke fun at studies like this, but there is increasing evidence to show that aspects of a man's diet can affect the number and quality of sperm produced by his

testicles." The researchers say the next step is to work with couples who are attending infertility clinics to determine if placing sub-fertile men, with poor semen quality, on a walnut diet results in better success conceiving. It is thought that infertility in men may be a result of too few sperm being made, or that the sperm have poor swimming ability, size or shape.

This study involved 117 men between the ages of 21 and 35, who were divided into two groups. One group added 2.6 ounces (75 grams) of whole-shelled walnuts to their daily diet. The other group continued their usual diet but avoided eating tree nuts. Both groups ate a typical Western-style diet.

Lead author, Prof Wendie Robbins from UCLA's Fielding School of Public Health said: "We found a significant improvement in

sperm parameters in the group that consumed the walnuts. "The men who ate no tree nuts saw no change." Sperm quality improved in terms of concentration, vitality, movement, shape and chromosome abnormalities.

Dr Pacey said: "The study has been well executed and my only criticism would be that the men in the walnut-eating arm of the trial could have altered other aspects of their behaviour to give the results shown in the paper. "A better trial would be to produce tablets of walnut extract that looked identical to a placebo so that the study was completely blind. In spite of this, the results of the study show a small but statistically significant improvement in sperm health."

These benefits may be down to the fatty acids in the nuts. Co-author Catherine Carpenter, from the UCLA Centre for Human Nutrition said: "Walnuts provide a particularly rich source of alpha-linolenic acid, a natural plant source of omega-3, which we suspect may have been responsible for the improvements we observed." The walnuts for the study were supplied by the California Walnut Commission and the study was funded by the UCLA Fielding School of Public Health's Centre for Occupational and Environmental Health.

### Eurozone trade surplus rises to record high in June

LONDON, 19 Aug — The eurozone's trade surplus hit 14.9bn euros (\$18.3bn; £11.7bn) in June up from 200m euros a year ago. The surplus was the highest since the European Union's statistics agency began collecting data in 1999.

Germany, the Netherlands and Republic of Ireland recorded the biggest surplus among the 17-member euro area and the wider 27-member EU, said Eurostat. The EU's trade surplus was 400m euros, compared with a 15.3bn-euro deficit a year earlier. The switch to a surplus was helped by increased exports to Asia and emerging markets including Russia, Japan, Brazil and South Korea.

The data underlined the region's dependence on external sources of growth as austerity measures in core eurozone countries have damaged household spending and business confidence.

"Companies have to look for foreign buyers to replace austerity-hit domestic demand and wage restraint and leaner production improve competitiveness," said Berenberg Bank analyst Christian Schulz.

"Germany is still playing a big part. Although it has recently started losing competitiveness vis-a-vis its eurozone partners, the German economy continues to enjoy a high and still improving level of competitiveness at the global level," he added.

Earlier this week, Eurostat said the eurozone economy had shrunk by 0.2% in the April-to-June period from flat growth in the previous first quarter. Capital Economics warned: "With global growth slowing, we don't expect the resilience of the core's exports to last much longer." "We still see both Germany and France slipping into recession in 2013." — *Internet*

### Hospira recalls pain injection on overdose risk

WASHINGTON, 19 Aug — The US Food and Drug Administration said Hospira Inc is voluntarily recalling one lot of its hydromorphone pain relieving injection as it may contain more than the intended fill volume, posing a risk of drug overdose.

Overdose of opioid pain medications such as hydromorphone may lead to life-threatening consequences, including slowed breathing, low blood pressure and reduced heart rate, the FDA said.

Hospira began the recall on Thursday after a complaint that one Carpuject — the drug delivery system — contained more than the intended 1ml labeled fill volume.

The company said it has not received any reports of adverse events related to the affected lot.

The number of the affected lot is 12720LL and it was distributed between March and May 2012. — *Reuters*

## Typhoon Kai-Tak kills nine in Vietnam

HANOI, 19 Aug—At least nine people were killed, thousands of homes damaged and swathes of farmland flooded as Typhoon Kai-Tak swept across northern Vietnam, authorities said on Sunday.

The storm, which made landfall late Friday, brought strong winds and heavy rains that inundated several densely populated communities including part of the capital Hanoi.

Five people were swept away by floodwaters while one woman died when a landslide buried her house while she was sleeping in Bac Giang Province, according to the government's central committee on flood and storm control.

A taxi driver was killed by a toppled tree while two people were electrocuted by a falling electricity cable, it said.

Nearly 12,000 houses were damaged and 23,000 hectares (56,800 acres) of cropland were flooded, according to the committee.

In Hanoi, about 200 large trees were uprooted and part of the city remained under water on early Sunday.

The Vietnamese army had put 20,000 soldiers backed by helicopters, rescue boats and canoes on standby for rescue operations, but only a small number of them were deployed.

More than 11,000 boats, including several hundred used by tourists at the UNESCO world heritage site Halong Bay, were ordered to stay close to the shore.

The storm, which earlier killed four people in the Philippines, was packing winds of about 100 kilometres (62 miles) per hour when it slammed into Vietnam, but it was downgraded to a tropical depression on Saturday.—INTERNET

## Miss China crowned Miss World 2012, in China

ORDOS, 19 Aug—Miss China won the coveted title of Miss World on Saturday, triumphing on home soil during a glitzy final held in a mining city on the edge of the Gobi desert.

The mostly Chinese audience erupted in cheers, and fireworks lit up the sky, when it was announced that the home candidate, Yu Wenxia, had been awarded the coveted title.

"When I was young I felt very lucky because so many people helped me, and I hope in the future I can help more children to feel lucky," Yu, a 23-year-old aspiring music teacher said when asked why she should be crowned.

Yu, who became China's second Miss World winner, appeared on stage in a dazzling array of ballgowns during the two-hour final and serenaded the audience with a piercing rendition of a popular Chinese song.

Last year's Miss World, Ivian Sarcos of Venezuela, handed over her crown to Yu, who wore a sparkling blue dress, in the futuristic Dongsheng stadium in the

northeastern city of Ordos.

Miss Mexico, Mariana Reynoso, had been the bookmakers' favourite for the title, but failed to make the last seven candidates despite a strong showing in the early rounds of the pageant. Miss Wales, Sophie Moulds, came in second, while Miss Australia, Jessica Kahawaty, finished third.

The final, watched by a worldwide TV audience of an estimated one billion viewers, included a nod to the culture of Inner Mongolia, with a

## Outbreak of Ebola virus strikes DR Congo town of Isiro

ISIRO, 19 Aug—At least one person has died after an outbreak of the deadly Ebola virus in the north-east of the Democratic Republic of Congo, officials say.

The death is one of two cases of the virus discovered in the town of Isiro. Medical charity workers say they are attempting to find and isolate anyone who has been in contact with those infected by the virus.

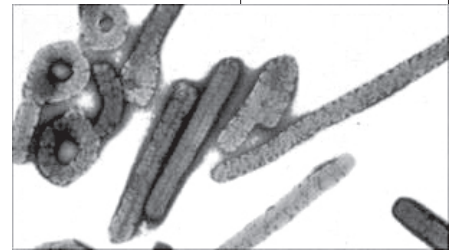
Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF) says the strain is not the same as the kind found recently in neighbouring Uganda.

At least 16 people died during an outbreak there last month. The DR Congo outbreak occurred in Oriental Province, which shares a border with Uganda.

"There is no link between both epidemics at this moment," Anja de Weggheleire, of MSF, told the BBC.

She added that there may be more cases that have yet to be detected. "Not every person who develops the disease will develop clear symptoms that are recognised as Ebola. For the moment it seems that there are not that many cases but the exact number of cases is unknown."

Experts fear that the town's position as a transit point

could make an outbreak more challenging to control.

The virus, which is transmitted to humans from both monkeys and birds, causes massive internal bleeding and has a very high mortality rate. It is one of the most virulent diseases in the world and is spread by close personal contact.

There is no vaccine for the virus and symptoms of infection include a sudden onset of fever, weakness, headache, vomiting and kidney problems.—INTERNET

## Three dead in Indonesian quake

JAKARTA, 19 Aug—A powerful 6.3-magnitude earthquake that shook the eastern Indonesian island of Sulawesi has killed at least three people and seriously injured a dozen others, according to an official.

The quake struck on Saturday evening near the mountainous districts of Parigi Moutong and Sigi in Central Sulawesi Province, where panicked residents ran from their homes into the streets as the ground shook violently for around 15 seconds.

"We've received reports from the ground that three people have died, including a nine-year-old boy," National Disaster

Mitigation Agency spokesman Sutopo Purwo Nugroho told AFP.

"Twelve others have been seriously injured and 40 homes are damaged."

The US Geological Survey said the quake struck at a depth of around 20 kilometres (12 miles), 56

kilometres southeast of the provincial capital Palu, where residents also felt the tremor and ran from their homes.

Indonesia sits on the Pacific "Ring of Fire" where continental plates collide, causing frequent seismic and volcanic activity.

## Bomb hidden in cemetery kills two in Afghanistan

KANDAHAR, 19 Aug—A bomb hidden in a cemetery in a southern Afghan city exploded on Sunday as a police official and his family were visiting the grave of a relative, police said.

The official and his brother were killed and seven other family members were wounded.

No one immediately claimed responsibility for the attack in Lashkar Gah, the capital of Helmand Province, but it matched the declared strategy of the Taliban to target government officials and others who align themselves with the government or international forces.

A lawmaker for Helmand Province, Abdulwadood Popal, is a brother of the two men killed in the explosion,

but he was not there at the time of the blast. The family was visiting the grave of their relative after morning prayers marking the Eid al-Fitr holiday.

The bomb was buried near the grave, said Helmand Deputy Police Chief Ghulam Rabbani. He said one of the men killed was the police chief for Nawa district, just west of Lashkar Gah. Rabbani did not provide the man's name.

Rabbani said he believed the bomber had directly targeted this family, but did not say if it had been remotely detonated or had been triggered by the visitors.

Afghans commonly visit the graves of relatives on holy days to pay their respects. The Eid al-Fitr holiday marks the end of the holy month of Ramadan, during which people abstain from food and

drink during the daylight hours.

In a message ahead of Eid al-Fitr, Taleban leader Mullah Mohammad Omar instructed his fighters once again to avoid killing or wounding Afghan civilians.

"Employ tactics that do not cause harm to the life and property of the common countrymen," he said in an eight-page message released to news organizations last week. The Taleban have said previously, however, that they do not consider those who collaborate with the government to be civilians.

A UN report issued earlier this month said 1,145 civilians were killed and 1,954 injured during the first half of the year, most of them by militants.

## New role for drones - wildlife, eco conservation

PRANBURI, 19 Aug—They're better known as stealthy killing machines to take out suspected terrorists with pinpoint accuracy. But drones are also being put to more benign use in skies across several continents to track endangered wildlife, spot poachers and chart forest loss. Although it's still the "dawn of drone ecology," as one innovator calls it, these unmanned aerial vehicles are already skimming over Indonesia's jungle canopy to

photograph orangutans, protecting rhinos in Nepal and studying invasive aquatic plants in Florida. Activists launched a long-range drone in December to locate and photograph a Japanese whaling ship as the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society attempted to block Japan's annual whale hunt in Antarctic waters. Relatively cheap, portable and earth-hugging, they fill a gap between satellite and manned aircraft imagery and

on-the-ground observations, says Percival Franklin at the University of Florida, which has been developing such drones for more than a decade. "The potential uses are almost unlimited," says Ian Singleton, director of the Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Programme, testing drones this year over Indonesia's Tripa peat forest where fires set by palm oil growers are threatening the world's highest density habitat of the great apes. Conservation is one of the latest roles for these multi-taskers, either autonomously controlled by on-board computers or under remote guidance of a navigator. Ranging in size from less than half a kilogram (pound) to more than 18 metric tons (20 tons), drones have been used for firefighting, road patrols, hurricane tracking and other jobs too dull, dirty or dangerous for piloted craft. Most prominently, they have been harnessed by the US military in recent years, often to detect and kill

opponents in America's "war on terror" in Afghanistan, Pakistan and elsewhere. A conservation drone pioneer, Lian Pin Koh of the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology, says the idea came to him after another sweaty, jungle slog in Sabah, Malaysia, hauling heavy equipment for his field work. "I told my assistant, who happened to be my wife, 'How wonderful it would be if we could fly over that area rather than walk there again tomorrow,'" recalled the Singaporean expert on tropical deforestation, and a model plane hobbyist. Unlike eco-drones in the United States, mostly custom-built or commercial models, Koh last year cobbled together a far cheaper, off-the-shelf version that poorer organizations and governments in the developing world can better afford. He and partner Serge Wich bought a model plane—some are available in China for as little as \$100—added an autopilot system, open source software to programme missions, and still and video cameras.—INTERNET

## Rescuers search for Philippine minister, two pilots

MANILA, 19 Aug—More than 200 rescuers were searching on Sunday for Interior Secretary Jesse Robredo and his two pilots after their small plane crashed into the sea while attempting an emergency landing. An aide of Robredo made a dramatic escape from the doomed plane and was helping in the search, officials said. The four-seat Piper Seneca took off on Saturday from central Cebu city, where Robredo had met local officials, and was 30 minutes into the flight to his hometown of Naga city when one of two engines failed and the plane began to wobble. The Filipino pilot and Nepali student co-pilot scrambled to land in Masbate Province but missed the runway by about half a kilometer (half a mile), Transport Secretary Mar Roxas said. President Benigno Aquino III flew on Sunday with his defence chief and the heads of the national police and the

military to Masbate, about 380 kilometers (235 miles) southeast of Manila, to oversee the US military-backed search. Only the tip of the right wing has been found so far, Defence Secretary Voltaire Gazmin told *The Associated Press*. Dozens of divers scoured the sea while helicopters and ships criss-crossed overhead. Troops and police searched along the coast and a US Navy plane flew over the area to help look for the wreckage.—INTERNET

## World must brace for higher food prices, experts say

NEW YORK, 19 Aug—With drought parching farms in the United States and near the Black Sea, weak monsoon rains in India and insidious hunger in Africa's Sahel region, the world could be headed towards another food crisis, experts say. Asia should keep a catastrophe at bay with a strong rice harvest while the G20 group of industrialized and emerging economies tries to parry the main threat, soaring food prices. "We have had quite a few climate events this year that will lead to very poor harvests, notably in the United States with corn or in Russia with soja," warned Philippe Pinta of the French farmers federation FNSEA.

Standard Chartered Bank was quoted by Dow Jones Newswires as saying. Monsoon rains were 15.2 percent below average in mid-August, according to latest data from India weather bureau, and Asian rice prices are forecast to rise by as much as 10 percent in the coming months as supplies tighten. India and Thailand are two of Asia's leading rice exporters. Indian Food Minister Kuruppassery Varkey Thomas told parliament this month that prevailing conditions "could affect the crop prospects and may have an impact on prices of essential commodities."

Despite that warning however, the UN Food and Agricultural Organization expects rice output to slightly surpass "excellent results" recorded last year, though the FAO cut its global forecast for production of unmilled rice to about 725 million tons from its previous figure of 732 million. The world is feeling the onset of the El Nino weather phenomenon, which has a natural warming effect, is active in the western Pacific and expected to last until winter in the northern hemisphere, according to Japanese meteorologists. ## Chicago Air and Water Show kicks off

CHICAGO, 19 Aug— Hundreds of thousands of people in the US metropolis of Chicago gathered on Saturday along the lakefront for the 54th annual Air and Water Show, featuring daring performances from a variety of planes and parachuters. The perfect 70-degree-Fahrenheit temperatures and sunny skies brought a huge crowd out to a two-mile section of the nearby Lake Michigan beaches, as families camped

out in lawn chairs to see the 26 aviation performances scheduled for the day.

Headlining this year's Chicago Air and Water Show was an appearance by the US Navy Blue Angels, the pilots of F/A-18 Hornets that thrilled audiences with their tight group formations and acrobatic aerial maneuvers.

Flying at supersonic speeds, the Blue Angels zoomed over Lake Michigan and performed loop-de-loops

and barrel rolls, with the sound of their engine roars echoing all the way into downtown Chicago.

Another favourite for the audience was the US Army Golden Knights, an elite group of army soldiers that specializes in parachuting.

At 12,500 feet above sea level, the Golden Knights jumped out of the military planes carrying them and fell to the earth at more than 120 miles an hour, deploying parachutes just above North Avenue Beach to gracefully land at a precise target near the crowds.

The air show has become an annual tradition for many Chicagoans, who enjoy the mix of family atmosphere and aviation excellence. The show is also free, which adds to the appeal for many attendees.

## Soft drinks provide relief to low industrial growth in India

KOLKATA, 19 Aug—Aerated water and soft drinks provided the otherwise disappointing industrial growth numbers in June in India, while sugar production fell sharply due to low output in the western state of Maharashtra, the country's largest producer. The heat in June, coupled with humid conditions, led to a 58.3 percent rise in the sale of aerated waters and soft drinks in the month year-on-year, while larger category of this segment, consumer non-durable, declined 1 percent.

The June figure for aerated water and soft drinks was even higher than the previous month, when production rose 25.1 percent, even as industrial growth was lower in June compared to May, though sugar production declined 66.1 percent in June. Abinash Verma, director general of the Indian Sugar Mills

Association, said the crushing of sugarcane in Maharashtra continued till June last year, but this year the mills improved their capacities, due to which they could crush the same amount of cane by the middle of May. Crushing season starts from November every year.

He said, "This has brought down the overall sugar production in India in June compared with the same period last year." Maharashtra produced 0.13 million tonnes of sugar in June last year, while this year it fell to 0.01 million tonnes. Some of the other important products which indicated high negative growth in June included cable and rubber insulated products, which fell 82 percent, colour television picture tubes fell 79.7 percent, di-ammonium phosphate by 54.1 percent, cement machinery by 40 percent and three-wheelers by 29.4 percent.—Xinhua

## Flight returns to airport in New Jersey after engine problem

WASHINGTON, 19 Aug—A United Airlines flight returned to the Newark Liberty International Airport in New Jersey on Saturday after an engine problem erupted during its takeoff, media reports said.

An FBI official said a tire of the passenger plane blew during takeoff and flew into an engine, according to the reports by CNN.

The Berlin-bound flight then circled the airport and landed at around 8:05 pm local time after burning fuel for more than an hour, said the Federal Aviation Administration.

An eyewitness, who was driving on a road near the airport, said she saw fireballs near a wing shortly after the plane took off, according to the reports.

The Newark Airport, located about 24 km southwest of Midtown Manhattan in New York, is a major airport in the New York-New Jersey metropolitan area.—Xinhua

## Cuba plans to expand ostrich farming

HAVANA, 19 Aug—The Cuban government plans to expand ostrich farming across the country to boost local economy and exports.

Ostrich is considered the latest livestock introduced into the island country, with farms now existing in the provinces of Havana and Granma. The Ministry of Agriculture is planning to establish six more farms in other provinces, with the goal to supply the domestic and international markets, the state news agency Prensa Latina reported.

The first flock of ostriches were imported to Cuba from Mexico by CENPALAB (the National Centre for Laboratory Animal Production) in 1997 as part of a programme designed "to diversify the production of healthy foods and create new export items."

The first commercial farm was established in 2007,

when the experimental farm La Esperanza, in the outskirts of Havana, received 36 ostriches from the CENPALAB.

Compared to other cattle breeding, ostrich farming carries more economic benefits since ostrich has high reproduction rate and commercial value. Its skin can be used for clothes, footwear and fashion jewelry of high quality. Its meat is highly nutritious, which is sold at high prices at the international markets. Its egg has a protein power equivalent to about 23 chicken eggs and the shells, an excellent source for calcium, are widely used in crafts and decorations.

Oil obtained from the ostrich's abdominal fat is rich in essential fatty acids (EFAs), which is good for human health and can be utilized by cosmetic and perfume industry.—Internet

## Greece needs 2.5 billion extra spending cuts over two years

BERLIN, 19 Aug—Greece will likely need to cut an additional 2.5 billion euros in spending over the next two years to meet demands made by its international lenders in return for financial aid, Germany's Der Spiegel magazine reported on Saturday.

Citing an interim report by the troika of European Commission, European Central Bank and

International Monetary Fund, Der Spiegel said Greece would likely need 14 billion euros over the next two years to get its deficit below 3 percent by the end of 2014, up from a previously expected 11.5 billion.

The country's budget deficit stood at 9.3 percent in 2011. The increased financing gap was due to setbacks to privatization plans and as the

economy, in its fifth year of recession, was faring worse than expected, the magazine said.

International creditors, who have bailed out Greece twice, have set those targets in return for financial aid. A positive verdict from the troika is key for lenders to decide whether they will keep funds flowing to the austerity-bound country.

The troika representatives wrote the report after their last trip to Athens and would determine the exact amount needed when they next visit Greece in early September, the magazine reported.

"The delegation also criticized in its interim report that Prime Minister Antonis Samaras' government had already been unable to explain how the savings of 11.5 billion euros should be reached," Der Spiegel reported. "Roughly a third is uncovered."—Reuters

## Nigerian government ready to have dialogue with militant group: minister

ABUJA, 19 Aug—The Nigerian government announced on Saturday that it is ready to hold peace talks with the Boko Haram sect in a bid to stop violence in the west African country.

Minister of Information Labaran Maku disclosed this in a statement made available to Xinhua, saying the olive branch extended to the militant group by the government followed recent comments credited to Boko Haram members in the media, in which they signaled readiness to hold dialogue with government representatives.

"The government welcomes any initiative that will usher in peace, security and tranquility, in the light of security challenges we have faced in the last two years," said the minister, adding that the government wishes to reiterate its willingness to listen to the grievances of the sect.

Although President Goodluck Jonathan has openly expressed worry over the activities of Boko Haram and has devised several schemes to tackle the menace, critics blame him for the inability of his government to stop the violence.

According to Maku, the government hopes that the dialogue would lead to the restoration of peace, security and tranquility to northern Nigeria.—Xinhua

**Wave of attacks that killed 82  
overshadow Eid in Iraq**

BAGHDAD, 19 Aug—A spate of attacks that killed 82 people in Iraq overshadowed preparations on Friday to mark the end of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan, amid warnings insurgents would look to carry out deadly strikes.

The violence, the worst in more than three weeks, hit 15 cities across the country and left 270 people wounded on Thursday, just days before the Eid festival that is set to begin on Sunday.

The attacks brought the number of dead nationwide over the course of Ramadan, which began on 18 July, to 404, according to an AFP tally. There has been at least one

bombing or shooting on every day of the holy month but one.

Thursday's deadliest violence struck in and around Baghdad, where at least 54 people were killed in a series of attacks throughout the day, security and medical officials said. Bombs and shootings also took place in the south, west and north of Iraq.

In the east Baghdad neighbourhood of Zafraniyah, a roadside bomb went off outside an ice cream parlour late on Thursday evening, killing four people and wounding 11. A subsequent car bomb nearby killed 22 more and left 30 wounded.—INTERNET

**Navy to repair nuke sub that  
caught fire in Maine**

PORTLAND, 19 Aug—The Navy says a nuclear-powered attack submarine severely damaged by a fire at a naval shipyard in Portsmouth, Maine, is going to be repaired.

Navy spokeswoman Li Courtney Hillson told *The Associated Press* on Friday engineering assessments are ongoing but the Navy has made the decision to repair the *USS Miami*, which is based in Groton (GRAH'-tuhn), Conn.

A former shipyard worker from Portsmouth, NH, is charged with setting the fire while the sub was in dry dock on 23 May.

There had been lingering questions over whether it would make financial sense to repair the 22-year-old submarine. Early estimates put the damage at \$400 million.—INTERNET

The attacks in the country's far west and south brought to seven the number of times that a member of the Afghan security forces—or someone wearing their uniform—has opened fire on international forces in the past two weeks.

Such assaults by allies, virtually unheard of just a few years ago, have recently escalated, killing at least 36 foreign troops so far this year. They also raise questions about the strategy to train Afghan national police and soldiers to take over security and fight insurgents after most foreign troops leave the country by the end of 2014.

The NATO-led coalition has said such attacks are anomalies stemming from personal disputes, but the

supreme leader of the Taliban boasted on Thursday night that the insurgents are infiltrating the quickly expanding Afghan forces.

Friday's deadly attacker in the far western province of Farah was identified as Mohammad Ismail, a man in his 30s who had joined the Afghan Local Police just five days ago.

He opened fire during an inauguration ceremony attended by American and Afghan forces in the Kinisk village, the Farah provincial police chief Agha Noor Kemtoz said.

"As soon as they gave the weapon to Ismail to begin training, suddenly he took the gun and opened fire toward the US soldiers," Kemtoz said.

Ismail was shot and killed as the coalition and Afghan forces returned fire, the police chief said.—INTERNET

**Bomb blast wounds one,  
damages police station in Nigeria**

JOS, 19 Aug—A bomb blast in the volatile central Nigerian city of Jos has injured a civilian and damaged a police station as well as nearby houses, an army spokesman said on Friday.

"The police post, three other houses and a vehicle were affected by the blast. One person by the name Alhaji Abubakar Adam was injured," Special Task Force spokesman in the city, Captain Salisu Mustapha, said in a statement.

The bomb exploded late Thursday between the police station and a residential building in the Rikkos district of Jos, capital of Plateau state.

Plateau has seen violent clashes between Christian and Muslim ethnic groups as well as attacks blamed on Islamist militants Boko Haram. It lies in the middle belt region between the mainly Christian south and majority Muslim north.

"It is clear that the police station was the target of the attack," Mustapha told AFP.

Nigeria has tightened security ahead of this weekend's Eid celebrations, and two main prayer grounds in Jos where violence has previously occurred have been put off-limits, with alternative areas provided.—INTERNET

**Five killed in Pakistan suicide bombing**

QUETTA, 19 Aug—A suicide bomber blew up his explosive-laden car at a check post in southwestern Pakistan overnight killing five people including three soldiers, according to an official.

Troops from the paramilitary Frontier Corps (FC) stopped a Toyota car for a security check in Quetta, the capital of the insurgency hit Baluchistan Province when it entered the city late Friday, FC spokesman Murtaza Baig said.

"They were questioning the driver when he detonated himself, killing three FC

soldiers and two officials of the military intelligence," Baig told AFP. The bomber was also blown into pieces, the official said.

He said the alleged terrorist may have planned to target some military installation or a public place during the Muslim festival of Eid ul-Fitr starting this weekend. "The soldiers sacrificed their lives to foil a major terror attack," he added. There was no claim of responsibility for the latest incident but the province which borders Iran and Afghanistan suffers from Taliban attacks.

It is also a flashpoint for sectarian violence involving Sunni and Shiite Muslims that has left thousands of people dead since the late 1980s.

Baluch rebels rose up in 2004, demanding political autonomy and a greater share of profits from the oil, gas and mineral resources in the region. Bomb blasts and attacks on police and security forces are frequent in insurgency-plagued Baluchistan, which is one of the most deprived areas of Pakistan.—INTERNET

**Seven charged in shootings that killed Louisiana  
police officers**

NEW ORLEANS, 19 Aug—Louisiana police have charged seven people in connection with shootings near New Orleans on Thursday that killed two sheriff's deputies at a trailer park and wounded two others, authorities said. Brian Lyn Smith, 24, of LaPlace was charged with attempted first-degree murder while six others also face charges linked to the violence, St John Parish Sheriff's Office spokesman Dane Clement said on Friday.

The charges stem from a pair of related shootings early on Thursday in and around LaPlace, about 25 miles west of New Orleans, in which a gunman shot and wounded St John Parish Deputy Michael Scott Boyington, 33, as he performed off-duty work directing traffic at a parking lot for Valero Energy Corp's St Charles refinery, St John Parish Sheriff Mike Tregre said.

The gunman fled, and officers investigating the incident ended up at a trailer park in LaPlace. As they were interviewing two suspects, someone came out of a trailer with an assault weapon and shot dead the two officers and wounded another, Tregre said.—Reuters



## Conn town settles dispute over girl's pet bunny

Officials in a Connecticut town have settled a zoning dispute over a local girl's 20-pound pet bunny after receiving calls and emails from across the country demanding that the rabbit be allowed to stay.

North Haven First Selectman Michael Freda said on 17 August that the town will allow 7-year-old Kayden Lidsky and her family to keep the Flemish giant named Sandy and change the zoning rule that led to a cease-and-desist order three weeks ago. The rule bars anyone from keeping rabbits and other livestock on properties smaller than 2 acres.

The town's zoning enforcement officer issued the cease-and-desist order while investigating a neighbour's

blight complaint against the Lidsky family, whose property is less than 2 acres.

"All along I've said that little girl is not losing that rabbit," Freda said. "We have a ridiculous ordinance... and we're going to change it."

The Lidsky family, however, interpreted the cease-and-desist order to mean that they had to get rid of Sandy. Josh Lidsky, Kayden's dad, had planned to appeal the order to a town board.

"I'm happy it's over," Josh Lidsky said. "I'm saddened that it had to go as far as it did. It's very tough for a 7-year-old to understand why people would do something like that. She's cried nightly."

Kayden tells the New Haven Register she's

"excited" that she can keep it.

Since the dispute hit the news last week, nearly 4,400 people have signed an online petition on change.org urging the town to not force the family to give up the rabbit.

Freda said he's also spoken to and exchanged emails with about 1,000 people nationwide.

The ordinance was put in place about 50 years ago when North Haven was a large farming community, and it was designed to prevent people from raising and selling rabbits and other livestock on less than 2 acres in competition with farmers, Freda said.

Freda said the new ordinance will allow rabbits to be kept as pets.

Presley, 44, discussed her

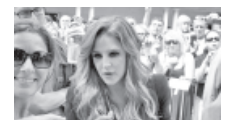

## Djokovic to face Federer in Cincinnati final

MASON, (Ohio), 19 Aug — Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic, the top two players in the world, set up a showdown for the Cincinnati Masters title after cruising to semi-final victories on Saturday.

The gap between the leading four, which also contains Rafa Nadal and Andy Murray, and the chasing pack was again evident as Djokovic beat Argentine Juan Martin del Potro 6-3, 6-2 before Federer saw off fellow Swiss Stanislas Wawrinka 7-6, 6-3.

World number one Federer is chasing a fifth title in Cincinnati while Djokovic is hoping to claim his first at the Ohio venue.

The Serb has lost in the final three times including last year when he retired injured in the second set against Murray and in 2009 when he was beaten by Federer.

Djokovic avenged his defeat by Del Potro in the bronze-medal match at the London Olympics earlier this month when he powered into his 22nd Masters 1000 final.

A tight first set turned in Djokovic's favor when sixth seed Del Potro, who was unable to capitalize on

any of the six break points he had in the match, double-faulted to let his opponent go 4-2 ahead.

It was relatively straightforward in the second set after Djokovic, who won last week's Toronto Masters crown, took advantage of some loose returns to break for a 2-1 lead.

Federer has a 15-12 advantage in matches with Djokovic and won their last meeting in the Wimbledon semi-finals last month. "We all know how good he is, especially in the later stages of events, and here conditions are quite fast so I think it's suited to his style," the Serb told reporters.

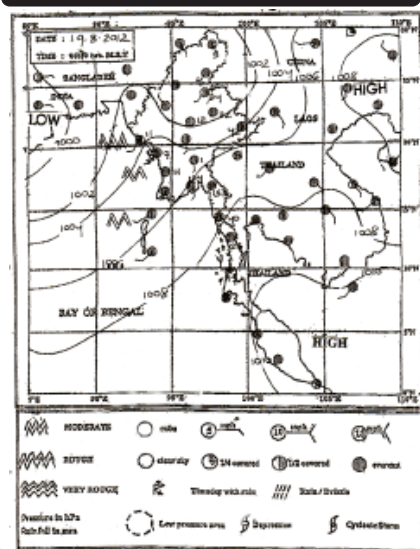

MAN CITY, 19 Aug—Silva stepped up, but his spot kick was poor and Manchester City have got comfortably saved by their Premier League title defence off to a winning start by beating Southampton 3-2 this afternoon.

The hosts should have taken the lead within 20 minutes when Carlos Tevez was brought down inside the penalty area. David Tevez came close again

before the break, and City picked up where they left off earlier in the second half when Samir Nasri found Edin Dzeko, who could only fire straight at Davis.

The hosts continued to pour forward and squandered good chances through Gael Clichy and Silva, the latter of whom hit the crossbar with his effort.

Then, against the run of play, Southampton grabbed an equaliser through Rickie Lambert's low strike. Things got even better for the Saints with just over 20 minutes left as they took the lead through debutant Steven Davis.

City responded as only champions can, however, and pulled level through Dzeko with 15 minutes left on the clock and almost took the lead a minute later through Tevez.

Dzeko came close again before the hosts got the winner ten minutes from time through Nasri's strike after poor defending from Southampton.

**Li defeats Venus to meet Kerber in final**

MASON, (Ohio), 19 Aug — China's Li Na defeated an injured Venus Williams 7-5, 3-6, 6-1 to reach the final of the Cincinnati Open on Saturday and set up a meeting with German Angelique Kerber. Wimbledon semi-finalist Kerber came through a gruelling 6-1, 2-6, 6-4 win over Czech Petra Kvitova to reach her fourth final of the year and her biggest yet. Earlier, Williams, playing in her first semi-final since the 2010 US Open, was limited in her serve speed which was hovering around a slow 75 mph mark after picking up a back strain shortly before the match began.

"Just in my warmup it was bothering me. I was like 'Oh, no'. I tried to fix it between the warmup and the match, but it didn't work," Williams told reporters. "Right now I don't know why my back hurts, I just know it hurts. After this I'm going to get an evaluation and see what exactly is happening," said Williams, who will be keen to regain full fitness for the U.S. Open later this month. The American, who has come back from illness this year, double-faulted on break point to go 3-2 down in the first set but, relying on her return

game, she battled back to 5-5. But another crucial double-fault on game point allowed Li to sneak back ahead 6-5 and then wrap up the set. After receiving an on-court massage to her back, Williams roared back in the second set to win five consecutive games en route to taking it 6-3 to level the match. But the exertion of her comeback cost her in the third set where she ran out of energy and was convincingly beaten 6-1 as Li went in for the kill. Li, the ninth seed, is now a perfect 4-0 in her semi-final matches this year but has yet to win a final. Li's most recent loss coming at Montreal last week at the hands of Kvitova. "It's amazing this year, because in the last two years I hardly got a point in North America. So I'm happy I can

be in the final again," the 2011 French Open champion told reporters. Kerber's rise to seventh in the rankings this year has included wins at the Paris indoors and Copenhagen events but her test against Li Na will be the perfect preparation for Flushing Meadows.

The German dominated the opening set with Kvitova making a series of unforced errors but the gritty Czech dug deep to take the contest to a third, making full use of her powerful serve. Kerber, though, swiftly regained her rhythm to race into a 5-2 lead in the decider against an exhausted looking Kvitova. The German was then broken as she served for the match before sealing the contest just before it reached the two hour mark on her next service game.—Reuters
