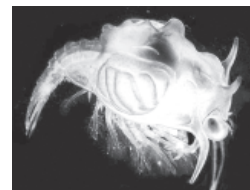

Latest poll shows most Americans still expect Obama to win reelection

TAMPA, 28 Aug—As the Republican National Convention (RNC), which will nominate Mitt Romney as the party's presidential nominee, opened in a low-key ceremony on Monday, a latest poll showed that most Americans still predict that President Barack Obama will win the race in November. Fifty-eight Americans expect Obama to win the reelection on 6 November, up 2 percent from last survey in May, while 36 percent say Romney will win, unchanged from May, according to the *USA Today*/Gallup poll conducted on 20-22 August.

This reflects that, despite the past three-month hard campaigning, Romney, the former Massachusetts governor, has generally failed to increase his support among American voters. Obama's supporters are much

more optimistic than Romney's. Eighty-six percent of Obama supporters say he will win the race, compared to 9 percent who think he will lose. Meanwhile, 65 percent of Romney supporters think he will win the election, compared to 28 percent who predict that he will lose. Democrats are also more optimistic than Republicans about their candidate's chances, with 80 percent of Democrats predicting an Obama win, compared to 60 percent of Republicans expecting Romney to win.

Although the presidential race between Obama and Romney has generally been a tight one, Americans by a fairly wide margin expect Obama to win, probably because he is the incumbent, the Gallup said. As to the implications of this poll, Gallup said that it can go

either way for both candidates. For the Republicans, the thought that their candidate is the underdog could motivate them to campaign for Romney and get out and vote, or could be discouraging and end up suppressing their vote. Similarly, Democrats' confidence that their candidate will win could encourage them to get out and vote to make sure that is a reality, or could cause complacency and lower their turnout percentage, the Gallup said.

The Republican Party

officially kicked off the RNC in Tampa, Florida, on Monday, in a low-key short ceremony, as the first-day agenda has been canceled due to the threat of Tropical Storm Isaac. Romney, together with his running mate House Representative Paul Ryan, is expected to be officially nominated as the Republican presidential nominee on Tuesday night by about 5,000 RNC delegates, formally setting up a close race with the Democratic Party's Obama/Biden ticket.—Xinhua

ASEAN wants more investment, tourists from China

SIEM REAP, (Cambodia), 28 Aug — The bilateral relationship between the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and China is very good and the regional bloc wants to see more investment and tourists from China, ASEAN Secretary-General Surin Pitsuwan said here on Monday. "The ASEAN relation with China has been very productive and both sides certainly take the relationship very seriously," he said in an exclusive interview with *Xinhua* on the sidelines of the 44th ASEAN Economic Ministers Meeting.

He said that the bilateral trade between ASEAN and China is growing very fast and the trade balance has been in China's favor. "Certainly, we are hoping that there will be more investment coming from China in order to sustain this growth and to make the relationship more balance," he said. Asked about China's role in helping ASEAN realize the Economic Community by 2015, Surin said China is the largest market for ASEAN and the country is certainly a growth engine for ASEAN as it has been the growth engine for the rest of the world.

He added that China has helped ASEAN a lot in infrastructure development. In ASEAN's process to build an economic community by 2015, Surin said that ASEAN has done well in terms of soft infrastructure such as agreements, protocols, and various elements of cooperation and coordination

among member states. "To date, we have ratified about 73 percent of all the major instruments of cooperation among ASEAN," he said. "We have less than 30 percent to go, and our challenge is how to implement every of them, and how to translate the regional ASEAN commitments into the national agenda implementation, rules, laws and regulations."

"We will accelerate our efforts in order to make sure that all these agreements are not only ratified, but also implemented," he said. He expressed confidence that ASEAN will be able to achieve the Economic Community by 2015 thanks to ASEAN's joint commitment and help from dialogue partners. He said the upcoming ASEAN Economic Community would be a market of 600 million people and would be more attractive to the world in terms of trade and investment.—Xinhua

Sydney to host G20 finance meeting in 2014

SYDNEY, 28 Aug — Sydney will host a G20 Finance Ministers' and Central Bank Governors' meeting in 2014, Australian Prime Minister Julia Gillard and Treasurer Wayne Swan announced on Tuesday. In a joint media release with the prime minister, Swan says as an iconic Australian city and a dynamic business and financial centre, Sydney is an ideal host city for the meeting.

Swan says the meeting will attract up to 2000 delegates and support staff,

including international media, putting Sydney in the international spotlight. "Along with the G20 Finance Ministers' meeting that will take place in Cairns, this meeting will do important preparatory work for the G20 Leaders' Meeting to be held in Brisbane," Swan said. "This will be a complex event to organize and the commonwealth will be working closely with the NSW (New South Wales) Government to deliver a

successful meeting."

According to the Treasurer, members of the G20 account for 85 percent of global GDP, 80 percent of global trade, and most of Australia's major trading and investment partners. The G20 brings together leaders, finance ministers and central bank governors from major developing and advanced economies to address critical economic and financial challenges facing the world.

Pirates kidnap 24 in gunfight off Togo coast

LAGOS, 28 Aug—Pirates attacked an oil tanker Tuesday off the coast of Togo, taking control of its bridge and kidnapping 24 sailors before escaping amid an exchange of gunfire with a naval patrol boat, an anti-piracy organization said.

It wasn't immediately clear if anyone was injured in the attack on the Greek-owned oil tanker, which had been anchored about 17 nautical miles (19 miles) away from Lome, Togo's capital. The pirates took control of the vessel quickly, though an alarm from the ship alerted the Togolese navy, said Noel Choong, an official with the International Maritime Bureau.

The navy boat trailed the tanker and sailors exchanged gunfire with the pirates before the tanker escaped, Choong said.

A naval spokesman could not be immediately reached for comment Tuesday.

Tuesday's attack is just the latest to target West Africa's Gulf of Guinea, which follows the continent's southward curve from Liberia to Gabon. Over the last year, piracy there has escalated from low-level armed robberies to hijackings and cargo thefts. Last year, London-based Lloyd's Market Association — an umbrella group of insurers — listed Nigeria, neighboring Benin and nearby waters in the same risk category as Somalia, where two decades of war and anarchy have allowed piracy to flourish.

Colombian president confirms contact with Rebel FARC

BOGOTA, 28 Aug—Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos confirmed on Monday that his government has contacted in Cuba with leaders of the rebel Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) as a first step to start peace talks.

In a televised address, Santos said government and rebel representatives have conducted "exploratory talks" in Havana and signed an agreement to initiate peace talks on 5 October in Oslo, Norway, hoping to end the decade-long conflict between the two sides.

Santos said more details of the contact would be released later, adding that military operations against the FARC would continue

"on every single centimeter of national territory" even in the peace process. Later on Monday, Santos met with former President Cesar Gaviria, who media outlets predict would be named as a government negotiator in the dialogue with the FARC.

Gaviria, a veteran diplomat, also served as secretary general of the Organization of American States from 1994 to 2004. The FARC is Colombia's largest rebel group with about 9,000 members. Although it suffered serious defeats in fightings with government troops from 2000 to 2010, it has recently increased hit-and-run attacks, especially on oil and mining facilities.

China's ZTE aims to double smartphone, tablet shipments

HONG KONG, 28 Aug—ZTE Corp, the world's fourth-biggest mobile phone vendor, said on Tuesday it aims to more than double smartphone and tablet computer shipments in 2012 as it targets booming global demand.

ZTE, which is also the fifth-ranked telecommu-

nications gear maker globally, said it aimed to ship 40 million smartphones this year, up from 15 million in 2011, and expected to sell about 1 million tablet computers, more than double the 2011 figure.

Of the 40 million smartphones, more than half would be sold in China, the company said.

"Our smartphones are selling quite well in certain mature markets such as Japan, the US, Europe, Australia and in certain emerging countries," Senior Vice President Zhang Renjun told Reuters on the sidelines of a company event.

The company's target of 40 million smartphones is higher than an estimate of 30 million it provided to analysts last week after it announced

its earnings. ZTE posted an 85 percent drop in second-quarter profit, as its margins were squeezed by sluggish equipment sales and fierce competition in handsets.

The Shenzhen-based company, which launched its first basic mobile phone in Africa little more than 10 years ago, said in April it could be shipping 100 million smartphones a year by 2015.

ZTE, with phone models such as Blade, Skate, Era and Windows-based Tania, has diversified into consumer gadgets, selling dongles, smartphones and tablets.

In February, it launched its first tablet in the United States with partner Sprint Nextel.

SEOUL, 28 Aug—While Apple gets ready to ban Samsung's Galaxy S II smartphone, rumour has it the company plans to launch a new member of the Galaxy line this week: a digital camera.

Samsung will be debuting its new Android-powered smart camera at IFA, an electronics trade show in Berlin, according to website GSM Arena.

The camera is rumored to come with a 16-megapixel sensor, and run on Android 4.0 (Ice Cream Sandwich). It's also expected to sport a 4.8-inch screen, borrowing from another popular member of

the Galaxy line of devices: the Galaxy SIII.

The camera is also tapped to have an integrated cellular connection for uploading pictures to networks like Facebook and Instagram while you're on the go, but won't likely be voice-capable.

Samsung isn't the only company to launch a smart camera. Nikon recently announced its own Android-powered camera: the Coolpix S800c. While it runs the much older Android 2.3, Nikon's camera has full access to the

Google Play marketplace, so you can run any apps that are compatible with the older OS. It will be available in September.

Polaroid also unveiled an Android-powered camera at the Consumer Electronics Show in January; but it has yet to get an official release date.

200-year-old 'monster larva' mystery solved

WASHINGTON, 28 Aug—For nearly two centuries, scientists have pulled so-called "monster larva" from the guts of fish and wondered what these thick-bodied creatures looked like as grown-ups. Now one biologist believes he has finally matched the larva with its adult counterpart.

"It's very exciting to have solved a nearly 200-year-old conundrum," Keith Crandall, a biology professor at George Washington University, said in a statement.

Drawing from genetic evidence, Crandall reported in the journal Ecology and Evolution this month that the larva, *Cerataspis monstrosa*, is actually a baby version of the deep-water aristeid shrimp known as *Plesiopenaeus armatus*.

Making this match-up between the baby and adult forms was not as easy as finding a larger version of the larva. In fact, the two couldn't look more different, the researchers said. *C. monstrosa* has a thick body covered in armor with "exceptional horn ornamentation," the

researchers write. Yellowfin and blackfin tuna and dolphins prefer this "monstrous and misshapen animal," as the larva was called, for prey—and it was in these predators' gut contents that scientists had encountered the monster larvae.

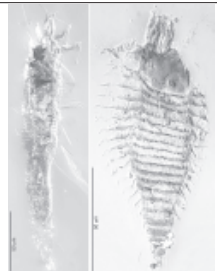
Its adult form, *Plesiopenaeus*, which calls the deep waters of the Atlantic Ocean home, looks more like a lobster.

Scientists began to suspect a link between the two in the 19th century.

"Because previous studies suggested an affinity between *Cerataspis* and penaeoid shrimp, and more specifically the family Aristeidae, we sampled heavily within these groups," Crandall explained.

His lab had been collecting crustacean DNA information for several years, providing a database to compare the *Cerataspis* DNA and make the link. They found a 99.96 percent match between the sequences of five genes for both organisms.

Prehistoric tiny bugs found trapped in amber

WASHINGTON, 28 Aug—Scientists have found three well-preserved ancient insects frozen in amber—and time—in what is Earth's oldest bug trap.

The discoveries of amber-encased insects in Italy may sound like something out of "Jurassic Park" but these bugs are even older than that. They are about 230 million years old, which puts them in the Triassic time period, and about 100 million years older than what had been the previously known oldest critters trapped in fossilized tree resin, or amber.

Goopy tree resin is like sap but without water and can't be diluted.

Researchers painstakingly examined 70,000 droplets of amber found in northeastern Italy. Stuck in them were two microscopic

mites and much of one fly. The mites are too small to be seen with the naked eye and the fly is a tad tinier than a fruit fly, researchers say.

The discovery was reported on Monday in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

While older insects have been found in rock fossils, these are different because they are not compressed and better preserved, said study lead author David Grimaldi, curator of the American Museum of Natural History in New York. And you can see more detail, he said.

"That's the great thing about amber. You can make this incredible detailed comparison with living species," Grimaldi said.

And when Grimaldi compared the ancient mites to their modern day

descendants, he was surprised about how similar they are. Except for difference in the mouth and fewer legs, "they're dead ringers for (modern) gall mites," he said. The modern ones can be found in bubbles or galls on plant leaves.

And that's surprising because the world itself has changed a lot from when these bugs were alive.

Back then, there was only one giant continent, some early primitive dinosaurs and no flower plants. Mites now live on flowering plants, but their ancient relatives must have stayed on trees, Grimaldi said.

Derek Briggs, director of the Yale Peabody Museum of Natural History and who wasn't part of the research, called the bugs' discovery tantalizing, adding that it could

IBM to roll out new mainframes despite shrinking market

BOSTON, 28 Aug—IBM will unveil a new version of its iconic mainframe computer on Tuesday, adding new security and data analytics features as it struggles to stem declines in the sluggish market for high-end business

computers. International Business Machines Corp is the dominant provider of mainframe computers, selling machines that run on powerful microprocessors of its own design and priced starting at about \$1 million. Its chief competitors are high-end servers from Hewlett-Packard Co and Oracle Corp.

IBM said it spent more than \$1 billion developing the updated machines, focusing on efforts to boost their computing performance, capacity and features.

Analysts said existing customers are likely to

appreciate the new bells and whistles. But they cautioned it will be tough for IBM to win new clients as most businesses are already enamored of cheaper technology that is widely considered "good enough" for all but the most mission-critical tasks.

"It's going to be harder and harder for IBM to find new customers and new opportunities for the mainframe," said Charles King, an analyst with technology research firm Pund-IT.

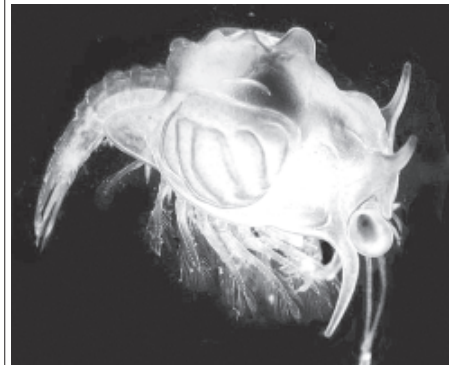
Officials with IBM said the company has

"thousands" of mainframe customers around the globe but declined to be more specific.

Gartner estimates that annual global sales of mainframes will fall this year and each year through 2016, declining a total of 14 percent over the five years to nearly \$4.7 billion.

Shipments of the new product begin next month. Mainframe sales typically pick up for several quarters after a product launch due to pent up demand from customers waiting for the newest technology.

Circumcision pluses outweigh risks: Pediatricians

CHICAGO, 28 Aug—The nation's most influential pediatricians group says the health benefits of circumcision in newborn boys outweigh any risks and insurance companies should pay for it. In its latest policy statement on circumcision, a procedure that has been declining nationwide, the American Academy of Pediatrics moves closer to an endorsement but says the decision should be up to parents.

"It's not a verdict from on high," said policy co-author Dr Andrew Freedman. "There's not a one-size-fits-all answer." But from a medical standpoint, circumcision's benefits in reducing risk of disease outweigh its small risks, said Freedman, a pediatric urologist in Los

Angeles. Recent research bolstering evidence that circumcision reduces chances of infection with HIV and other sexually spread diseases, urinary tract infections and penis cancer influenced the academy to update their 13-year-old policy.

Their old stance said potential medical benefits were not sufficient to warrant recommending routinely circumcising newborn boys. The new one says, "The benefits of newborn male circumcision justify access to this procedure for those families who choose it." The academy also says pain relief stronger than a sugar-coated pacifier is essential, usually an injection to numb the area.

The federal Centers for Disease Control and

Convention has estimated circumcision costs range from about \$200 to \$600 nationwide. Coverage varies among insurers and several states have stopped Medicaid funding for circumcisions.

CAG pulls up ONGC for not placing emphasis on exploration activity

NEW DELHI, 28 Aug—The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) has pulled up the State-owned Oil & Natural Gas Corp (ONGC) for not placing desired emphasis on discovering oil and gas and being tardy in monetising its discoveries.

CAG's report on Hydrocarbon Exploration Efforts of ONGC, which was tabled in Parliament on Tuesday, expressed concern at the company's lack of adequate efforts and results in new fields and wanted the Oil Ministry to reset annual targets set out in MoU that the firm signs with the Government.

"ONGC did not place the desired emphasis on its core exploration activity. Coupled with low priority on exploration are the anomalies

in MoU target-setting and reporting as well as performance measurement which can potentially mislead the stakeholder," it said. CAG said ONGC showcases a healthy reserve replacement ratio while production continues to remain static.

"ONGC was also tardy in monetising its

discoveries which contributed to low production," CAG said. "While external benchmarking of performance was not done, nationally ONGC had among the lowest efficiency in drilling compared to private as well as central public sector enterprise (Oil India Ltd) which led to non-achievement of work commitments and payment of liquidated damages," it said.—Internet



"There was a shortfall of 332,855 metres and 109 wells in ONGC's exploration performance. Except Western Offshore Basin, none of the other Basins could drill the targeted exploratory wells," it said.—INTERNET



Dormant virus might make you diabetic

BERLIN, 28 Aug—Most people infected with cytomegalovirus (CMV) carry it for a lifetime without any ill effects, but should the dormant virus become active, because of a weakened immune system, it could make you a diabetic.

New research by Leiden University Medical Centre and University of Tubingen Medical Schools in Germany shows that CMV infection is a significant risk factor for the type 2 diabetes in the elderly.

Obesity, inactivity and aging are known to be tied to insulin resistance, one of the first signs of diabetes.

However, only a third of those with insulin resistance go on the develop type 2 diabetes, according to a Leiden and Tubingen statement.

So what marks these people as different? Why do their pancreas fail? Genetic and environmental factors are thought to play a part but so also does inflammation.

People with type 2 diabetes usually have raised levels of biological markers for inflammation such as elevated C reactive protein (CRP) and larger numbers of active white blood cells.

CRP, synthesised by the

liver, is used mainly as a marker of inflammation, which shows the immune system respond to an infection or a disease.

Chronic infections, including CMV, can "stress" the immune system and when researchers from Leiden Tubingen Universities compared glucose regulation with antibodies to CMV in over 500 participants of the Leiden 85-plus Study, they found that having CMV was associated with type 2 diabetes.—Internet

Why today's kids don't get good night's sleep

LONDON, 28 Aug—Too many fizzy drinks and not enough bedtime stories are reasons why younger generation does not sleep as well as their grandparents, according to a new study.

Research by the Sleep Council found that today's seven to 14-year-old children go to bed almost 40 minutes later than their grandparents.

They are also much more likely to snack on crisps and fizzy drinks before bedtime while their grandparents enjoyed cocoa or hot milky drinks.

Around 54 per cent of the older generation either had a story read to them or had a quiet time to read independently—whereas only 27 per cent of today's youngsters read before bedtime and 58 per cent watch television.

If parents ditched the bad

habits, bedtime would be less stressful and their offspring would sleep better, experts claimed.

According to the survey—which asked 1,006 grandparents with grandchildren aged seven to 14, to compare their early lifestyle with that of their grandchildren—21 per cent spent more than three hours each day playing outside.

That compares to the 28 per cent who said their grandchildren now spend less

Japan cuts economic assessment as global slowdown bites

TOKYO, 28 Aug—Japan's government cut its assessment for the export-reliant economy for the first time in nearly a year as slowing global growth weighed on exports, clouding recovery prospects and adding pressure on the central bank for further stimulus.

Deceleration in the United States and China, on top of Europe's debt crisis, caused the downgrade, the government said on Tuesday, warning that further global slowdown and sharp market swings posed risks to the world's third-largest

economy. The first downgrade since October 2011 matches the assessment of private-sector analysts, but is somewhat bleaker than the view of the Bank of Japan (BOJ), which has said the economy is starting to pick up moderately.

"Looking at both domestic demand and overseas economies, I don't expect the economy to slide back into a recession but I cannot say it will stage a recovery either," said Yasuo Yamamoto, senior economist at Mizuo Research Institute in Tokyo, adding that Japan may

enter a soft-patch in the third quarter. The government assessment underscores policymakers' concern that fresh stimulus measures could be needed, as exports may struggle to recover before the effect on the economy of spending on rebuilding from last year's earthquake begins to fade. "The economy is moderately recovering helped by reconstruction demand, while some weak movements were seen recently," the Cabinet Office said in its monthly report. In the previous month's report, the government also said the

economy was recovering moderately on reconstruction demand but merely noted that there were difficulties.—Internet

Two traffic accidents leave 47 dead in China

BEIJING, 28 Aug — A double-decker bus rammed into a tanker loaded with highly flammable methanol on a northern Chinese highway, causing both vehicles to burst into flames in one of two serious accidents that left 47 dead over the weekend. The official *Xinhua News Agency* said 39 people were on the long-distance sleeper bus when it crashed and only three survived. It said the survivors were hospitalized, but didn't describe their condition.

The tanker had just returned to the highway after a rest stop when it was apparently rear-ended by the bus at around 2:40 am close to the city of Yan'an in Shaanxi Province, the official China News website said. The bus had left Hohhot in Inner Mongolia and was headed south to Xi'an city, it said. *Xinhua* photos showed the charred metal skeleton of the bus rammed up against the back of the tanker.

An official with the local Communist Party propaganda bureau in Yan'an confirmed that the crash occurred but was unable to give details and was unsure of the death toll. In the second accident, 11 people were killed and another was seriously hurt when a van crashed into a truck on Sunday afternoon in southwest China's Sichuan Province, *Xinhua* reported. Road safety is a serious problem in China. According to *Xinhua*, poorly maintained roads and bad driving habits result in about 70,000 deaths and 300,000 injuries a year.— *Internet*

Over 1 million vie for 20,000 car plates in Beijing

BEIJING, 28 Aug — Winning rate for Beijing's car registration lottery has dropped to less than 2 percent in August, marking the lowest rate since the car plate lottery scheme was launched last year, local authorities said on Sunday.

Among the accumulated 1.05 million private car applicants, only 19,926 were given the right for car registration on Sunday when the city's 20th license plate lottery was held, a spokesman with the Beijing car registration lottery office said.

The Beijing municipal government ushered in the car plates lottery scheme in January last year to limit the number of vehicles on the road. Under the scheme, only 240,000 new private car plates are issued every year, and 20,000 every month.

About 200,000 people applied for car registration in January last year when the first license plate lottery was held in the city. But the winning rate has been shrinking with the growing number of applicants.

Beijing now reports more than 5 million vehicles, statistics with the Beijing Municipal Traffic Management Bureau show. *Xinhua*

Three children die, father missing in loch tragedy

GAIRLOCH, 28 Aug—A search is continuing on Tuesday for the body of a father believed to have died when his canoe capsized in a sea loch, in an accident that claimed the lives of his two young sons and a girl aged five. Ewen Beaton, 32, was one of two adults in the boat with four children when it overturned in Loch Gairloch, near Ullapool in the Scottish Highlands on Sunday.

His sons Jamie, two, and Ewen, five, were rescued by

helicopter and airlifted to hospital, but died on Sunday night.

On Monday, a third child, Gracie Mackay, died in the Royal Hospital for Sick Children in Glasgow. Her father, 35, and sister, 8, had managed to swim to shore and raise the alarm.

Beaton's family issued a statement through police, saying: "We are utterly devastated by what has happened and the loss of our beautiful little boys. We

appreciate all that has and is being done by emergency services to find their adoring father, Ewen.

"It is too difficult to say anything more at this time and we would appreciate our family being left in peace to grieve our terrible loss."

Stornoway Coastguard was alerted to the incident at around 4.15pm on Sunday after Gracie's father and her sister, named locally as Garry Mackay and Callie, made it to the shoreline.— *Internet*

Iranians overjoyed by hosting NAM summit

TEHERAN, 28 Aug — "Welcome to Teheran for the 16th NAM summit..." Banners and posters are hanging along the streets across Iran's capital of Teheran, reminding passers-by that a big event is going on in one of the largest cities in the region. Iran will host the 16th summit of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) this week. With local TV channel circulating the developments of this event, which is divided into three stages — senior officials meeting on 26-27 August, ministerial level meeting on 28-29 August, and the summit from 30 to 31 August — even teenagers playing in the streets of Teheran know something special is taking place here.

The Iranian government has geared up security in the capital, especially around the convention centres and hotels where foreign guests stay, with the number of checkpoints increased and policemen

patrolling along major roads in downtown area. But for most residents in Teheran, the summit is something which makes them proud and overjoyed. A 61-year-old retired man even mistook the crowds around the Teheran Grand Hotel, where many foreign journalists covering the summit are staying, for the celebration of a big "holiday."

"There is a five-day holiday here, I think," the man said merrily to *Xinhua*, pointing to a grocery run by his younger friend. "But don't worry, all shops will still be opening. You can buy things as you want," he said.

Realizing that most representatives to this summit come from developing countries, some Iranian citizens said they hoped the meeting would help resolve or alleviate major problems the world is facing, such as the Syrian crisis and the Iranian nuclear issue.— *Xinhua*

China adds 76 m mobile phone users in first seven months

BEIJING, 28 Aug— China added 75.78 million mobile phone users during the first seven months of 2012, including 55.34 million 3G subscribers, official data showed on Monday. However, the number of fixed-line users fell 1.91 million during the same period, according to a statement by the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology.

The telecommunication industry reported 610.67 billion yuan (96.93 billion US

dollars) in primary business revenues in the January-July period, up 9.2 percent from a year earlier, the statement said.

Revenues from mobile telecommunication rose 11.3 percent year on year during the first seven months, accounting for 73.04 percent of the total, up 1.4 percentage points from a year earlier, while the rest of revenues came from fixed-line businesses, according to the statement.— *Xinhua*

NATO: 202 Afghan bases closed, more to come

KABUL, 28 Aug — NATO has closed more than 200 bases in Afghanistan and transferred nearly 300 others to local forces, a concrete step toward its 2014 target of handing over security responsibility, NATO officers said on Sunday. All 202 closed facilities were small, ranging from isolated checkpoints to bases of a dozen to 300 soldiers, said Lt Col David Olson, a NATO forces spokesman. Most of the closures have been along the country's main highways, spread across nearly every province, Olson said.

Another 282 bases of the same size have been handed over to the Afghan government, he said. That means international forces now operate about half as many bases in Afghanistan as in October of 2011, when they ran about 800 bases. The closures are part of the large-scale drawdown over this year and next as international forces prepare to transfer security tasks to the Afghan government at the end of 2014. Most of the troops that are leaving are American, and therefore most of the closures are US bases.

"As our Afghan security force partners take more responsibility for their own security, more bases will be closing and transitioning," said Brig Gen Steven Shapiro, who is heading up the operation to return or hand over US equipment. He said that so far the US government has given about 20,000 pieces of equipment worth about \$3 million to the Afghan government, ranging from chairs to large generators.

"Our footprint here will continue to shrink," Shapiro told reporters at a briefing about how non-military equipment is being processed as numbers of American forces decrease. The US started drawing down forces from a peak of nearly 103,000 last year and plans to have 68,000 troops in Afghanistan by October.— *Internet*

False alarm triggers Australia's Brisbane Airport evacuation

BRISBANE, 27 Aug — Flights at Brisbane Airport in Australia's Queensland are expected to be delayed after a false alarm sparked a mass evacuation at the airport, local media reported on Monday.

The fire alarms at the airport went off before 8:30 am local time on Monday and all passengers and staff at the airport were evacuated, the *Australian Associated Press (AAP)* reported.

A spokeswoman for Brisbane Airport Corporation told *AAP* that it was a false alarm. "We are having to rescreen everyone," she said. "It's not clear at this stage but there may be flight delays." The company is investigating the cause of the false alarm, the spokeswoman said.— *Xinhua*

UN chief urges continued action to control illegal small arms trade

UNITED NATIONS, 28 Aug — UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon on Monday called for a sustained commitment to control the illicit trade in small arms and light weapons worldwide, emphasizing their devastating effects and the high cost of human lives. In a statement delivered by UN Deputy Secretary-General Jan Eliasson at a UN meeting to review the action to curb the illegal trade of small arms and light weapons, Ban noted: "Illicit small arms remain the weapons of choice for those who seek to challenge legitimate State power, to spread fear and insecurity, or to pursue criminal goals."

The UN meeting, known as the Second Review Conference of the UN

Programme of Action on Small Arms and Light Weapons, opened here on Monday morning, and it will run through 7 September. Over half a million people are killed each year from these weapons, with civilians and impoverished people disproportionately affected, the secretary-general said. According to the Small Arms Survey, there are an estimated 875 million small arms in circulation worldwide, produced by more than 1,000 companies from nearly 100 countries. Ongoing, coordinated efforts are key, Ban said. "There are no quick solutions — it will take a sustained process that requires the commitment of all."



"The full implementation of the Programme of Action is both an urgent priority and a long-term project that will demand perseverance and resolve," he said. The Programme of Action was adopted by consensus in 2001 after attention to the wide spread availability of small

arms and light weapons, and their predominate role in present day conflicts. The programme details recommendations for member states to control the illicit flow of such arms through national legislation, regional cooperation and international assistance.—Xinhua

Venezuela's refinery accused of negligence

CARACAS, 28 Aug — Neighbours of Amuay refinery and members of the Falcon's oil workers' union accused Petroleo De Venezuela SA (PDVSA), the Venezuelan state-owned oil company, of negligence in the wake of a deadly blast, which killed 48 people and injured 84 others on Saturday morning. The company was blamed for not looking after a gas leak alert, according to local Press on Sunday. The blast, which occurred on Saturday early morning at 1:11 am (0541 GMT) and the fires later due to the gas leak in Amuay refinery, razed 209 homes and 11 nearby shops, plus a Bolivarian National Guard facility.

Amuay in northeast Venezuelan state of Falcon is one of the three crude oil refineries of the Paraguana Refinery Complex, the second largest in the world. Venezuelan Energy Minister Rafael Ramirez said on Sunday in a television broadcast, "We are currently in the cooling and quenching works. Our processing areas are normal. We have made a programmed stop. Our effort now is to quench the fire in two tanks." Venezuelan officials said the blast affected nine fuel deposits but thanks to the fire fighters work, the fire was quickly controlled in seven of them.

Ramirez also said the domestic market's fuel supply is guaranteed, and "we have 10 days of stocktaking products such as fuel and diesel. There are 4 million fuel barrels stocked and we have a full production in the rest of the country's refineries." The Venezuelan government has deployed a contingency operation immediately after the blast, including the evacuation of several families to safer places. President Hugo Chavez, who arrived Sunday afternoon at Amuay refinery, expressed his government's mourning for the tragedy and called on the people to stay calm and help the affected people in Falcon state.—Xinhua

Israeli war jets strike on Gaza in response to rocket attacks

GAZA, 28 Aug — Israeli war jets struck several targets in northern Gaza Strip on Monday night in response to earlier rocket attacks carried out by Gaza militants on southern Israel, witnesses and security sources said.

The witnesses and sources said Israeli F-16 warplanes fired at least seven bombs at two sites belonging to militants in northern and southern Gaza Strip, adding that several powerful explosions were heard all over the area. Ambulances and rescue teams rushed to the targeted area, but no injuries were reported so far.

The witnesses said the targeted places in northern Gaza are former security posts currently used by Hamas militants.

The security sources said one security post in northern Gaza city was targeted, as well as one military training post of Hamas' armed wing in southern Gaza city.

BEIJING, 28 Aug — Beijing was listed No 1 in a ranking of the most philanthropic Chinese Mainland cities unveiled on Monday. The capital city ranked first among 321 cities on the Chinese Mainland with a score of 94 out of a possible 100 points, according to a report based on the China City Philanthropy Indexes 2012. Shanghai

ranked second, while Shenzhen tied with Wuxi in East China's Jiangsu Province for third place. The indexes, designed by the China Charity and Donation Information Centre, which is affiliated with the Ministry of Civil Affairs, measured cities' philanthropic performances in six areas.

They are charitable donations, accounting for 20 points; charitable organizations, 20 points; charitable projects, 16 points; voluntary service, 20 points; government support, 12 points; and the culture of philanthropy, 12 points.

The Beijing government was the most supportive of philanthropy among all surveyed cities, as it scored 11.5 points while the average for other cities polled was 5.76 points. Government support for philanthropy was

Slovenian accordionist sets new Guinness world record

LJUBLJANA, 28 Aug — Slovenian accordionist Zoran Zorko has set a new Guinness world record for his recent marathon accordion performances that lasted 35 hours and 32 minutes.

Zorko's record was set during his performances in, among others, Ljubljana's Congress Square, the lake-side resort of Bled, and an accordion festival in a border town of Brezice between Thursday and Sunday. Finland's Anssi Laitinen held the previous record by continuously playing for 31 hours and 25 minutes in 2010.

Under Guinness world records rules, Zorko had to

play the accordion continuously with a maximum of 30-second breaks between songs. He could not improvise and all his songs needed to be by recognized authors.

A song could only be played once within a four-hour period.

Every full hour of playing earned Zorko a five-minute break. "During these five minutes, I go to eat, go to the toilet and do everything else necessary for my daily life," Zorko told Xinhua in Brezice on Sunday. The self-taught accordionist cannot read notes, making his record all the more remarkable.

31 Chinese fishermen missing in S Korea due to typhoon

SEOUL, 28 Aug — Two Chinese fishing boats with 34 crew members aboard capsized on Tuesday in waters about 1.8 kilometers from South Korea's port of Hwasun in Jeju's Seogwipo, an official from the Chinese Consulate stationed on Jeju has confirmed.

Three crew members have been rescued and 31 others went missing, the official said. The two fishing boats, "Yuejiangchengyu" No 91104 and No 91105, both from Weihai city of East China's Shandong Province, capsized around 2:40 am local time due to gale-force winds and high waves caused by Typhoon Bolaven, the official said.

According to report of Yonhap, South Korea's official news agency, two crew members reported the accident to South Korean authorities after coming ashore. They were taken to a hospital for treatment as one of them sustained serious injuries and the other complained of difficulty breathing.

A third crew member was rescued later. Currently, the Chinese Consulate is maintaining close contact with local police in regards of search and rescue effort.—Xinhua

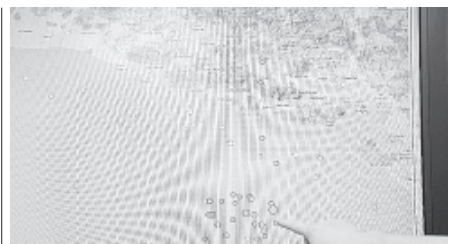

7.3-magnitude quake hits off El Salvador coast, no damage reported

WASHINGTON, 28 Aug — A 7.3-magnitude earthquake jolted off the coast of El Salvador late on Sunday, triggering a brief tsunami warning along central American coast but causing no major damage or casualties. The tremor, which struck at 22:37 local time (0437 GMT Monday), was centred at 120 km south of Usulután, El Salvador, with a depth of 54 km, the US Geological Survey said. The Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre (PTWC) put into effect a tsunami warning for Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala, Panama and Mexico. A small, 10-cm tsunami has been observed at the El Salvador port of Acajutla following the quake, the PTWC said. The warning was canceled later. Indian Tata Steel to mine iron ore in Arctic Canada

KOLKATA, 28 Aug — India's Tata Steel will mine iron ore in Arctic Canada, a top company official said on Tuesday. Tata Steel managing director HM Nerurkar said the feasibility study for the iron ore projects in Arctic Canada would be ready by October and it would be prepared in the next couple of months. The two projects — LabMag and Kemag — are crucial for Tata Steel Europe's raw material security. At present, Tata Steel's European operations do not enjoy the benefit of a captive iron ore source. The Canadian taconite (a form of magnetite ore) projects are being developed by Tata Steel Minerals

Canada Ltd (TSMC). It is a 80:20 joint venture between Tata Steel and Canada-listed New Millennium Iron Corporation (NML). TSMC, which is developing iron ore deposits in Quebec and Newfoundland and Labrador in Canada, has undertaken the feasibility study, in collaboration with NML. The LabMag and Kemag iron ore deposits form a part of the 150-km long Millennium Iron Range in northern Canada. Nerurkar said beneficiation of the taconite deposits in the proposed projects would not be a problem, but the logistics of bringing the beneficiated ore to the designated eastern Canadian port was an issue of

fiscal and infrastructural importance. The proven and probable estimated reserve of the LabMag and Kemag projects put together is 5.6 billion tonnes. TSMC is also pursuing another iron ore project, aimed to feed Tata Steel, in Canada. Called the direct shipping ore (DSO) project, it involves mining, crushing, washing, screening and shipping the sinter fines and pellet fines to Tata Steel's European steel-making facilities. —Xinhua

Two charged in death of NY girl, 5, found in trash

NIAGARA FALLS, 28 Aug — Two teenagers were arrested on Monday in connection with the death of a 5-year-old girl who vanished from her great-grandmother's house and whose body was found dumped in a garbage can, authorities said. The arrests came after one of the teens went to police on Monday morning and led them to a garbage can containing a trash bag holding the body of Isabella Tenant, authorities said. He told them he had helped a friend dispose of it after the friend had killed her, they said. Isabella's family had

called police earlier Monday to say she was missing from her great-grandmother's home in Niagara Falls, where she'd been staying overnight. Isabella's great-grandmother said she had last seen her on Sunday night with 16-year-old neighbour and family friend John Freeman. Authorities said it was Freeman's friend, 18-year-old Tyler Best, who led them to her body, which he said he helped Freeman hide. Authorities said it appeared Isabella had been killed without weapons being involved. Police on Monday said they had charged Freeman as

an adult and he faced a murder charge. They said Best was charged with tampering with evidence. Freeman and Best were in custody and couldn't be reached for comment on Monday. There was no listed home phone number for them, and no information about attorneys was available. Freeman and Best were scheduled to be arraigned on Tuesday. At a news conference on Monday afternoon, police Chief Detective William Thompson said there were signs of injuries but no indication of sexual abuse. "It's a terrible crime," he said. —Internet

Chinese troupe crowned at int'l circus gala in Cuba

HAVANA, 28 Aug — A Chinese acrobatic troupe has won for the second consecutive year the top prize at Cuba's International Circus Festival, dazzling both audience and jury with their skill and creativity. In addition to the Grand Prix, the Fuyong Acrobatic Art Troupe also garnered a gold star, the event's equivalent to an Olympic gold medal, local media reported on Monday. Cuban acrobatic troupe Los Ovalerys also won a gold star at the festival, the 14th edition of the annual gathering of circus performers from around the world. Silver and bronze stars went to Brazilian, Cuban, Belorussian and Swedish performers, while the Popularity Prix was won by the Gauchos from Argentina for their performance using hunting bolas. The Best Male Performance Award was won by Mexican juggler Christopher Atayde, and the female award by Belorussian gymnast Alena Kulikova. The festival, titled Circuba 2012, kicked off last Wednesday with performers from 20 countries. After presenting 29 performances in Havana, the festival will for the first time travel to other provinces across the country. *Xinhua*

Toddler almost crushed by car

A young girl has escaped serious injury after she fell off the back of a motorbike and narrowly missed being hit by a moving car in east China. The moment was captured by traffic surveillance cameras in Jinhua in Zhejiang Province, according to state television CCTV.

Shanghai could lose Drogha, Anelka

SHANGHAI, 28 Aug—Former Chelsea strikers Didier Drogha and Nicolas Anelka could be sold by China's Shanghai Shenhua due to an escalating equity stake row among shareholders, local media reported.

Chairman Zhu Jun, who holds a 28.5 percent stake, would only pay his share of the club's daily costs if his demands for greater control were not met, according to the *China Daily*.

Zhu currently controls the Chinese Super League club along with five state-

owned enterprises after becoming a shareholder in 2007. The agreement was that if he invested \$23.6 million over two years, his stake would increase to more than 70 percent, the newspaper reported.

The *Oriental Sports Daily* reported that Zhu had ploughed more than \$94 million into the club in the past five-and-a-half years, while the state-owned companies had spent nothing. The transfer of shares stalled in 2009 and again last year, a source told the *Oriental*.

"It is annoying and has had a bad effect on many of our tasks," a club official said. "The biggest problem is that the operation and financing work of the club cannot be carried out normally."

"The equity stakes issue has become the biggest bottleneck for the development of Shenhua."

If unresolved, Zhu, who has been signing all the cheques, could decide to cough up just 28.5 percent of the club's expenditure, potentially affecting player salaries.—Reuters

Poulter and Colsaerts get Ryder Cup wildcard picks

LONDON, 28 Aug—England's Ian Poulter and Nicolas Colsaerts of Belgium were named by captain Jose Maria Olazabal on Monday as Europe's two wildcard picks for next month's Ryder Cup.

World number 26 Poulter and 35th-ranked Colsaerts join 10 automatic selections in the 12-man team for holders Europe for the 28-30 September match against the United States at the Medinah Country Club in Illinois.

"Every one of you pretty much guessed Ian was going to be there. That was not a difficult pick because he has a great Ryder Cup record and he's playing well," Olazabal told a news conference at Gleneagles, Scotland.

"He had some issues earlier this season when he got ill and couldn't play as much as he wanted. But his attitude and his spirit in the Ryder Cup has always been great and he is a player that likes to be in that environment."

"It gets the best out of him. At Valhalla in 2008 and at Celtic Manor in 2010 you didn't need to motivate him. Just by looking into his eyes you could tell he was going to give everything he had," added Olazabal, an assistant captain in the last two editions of the biennial team event.

The 29-year-old Colsaerts, one of the longest hitters on the tour, will become the first Belgian to play in the Ryder Cup.—Reuters

Murray, Stosur, Sharapova cruise at US Open

NEW YORK, 28 Aug—Andy Murray's serve was anything but golden on the opening day of the US Open but the Olympic champion still had too much firepower for Alex Bogomolov Jr and led a parade of favorites into the second round on Monday.

The top guns had little trouble making it through their first-round encounters, with world number one Roger Federer, three-times champion Kim Clijsters, and top-seeded Victoria Azarenka hardly breaking sweat.

Murray was at his best when it mattered most, recording a service break in a healthy nine of 19 chances

against the 29-year-old Russian to win 6-2, 6-4, 6-1 in two hours, 15 minutes.

However, the Scotsman, who beat Roger Federer to win the gold medal at the London Games in what he called his best career victory, successfully landed only 49 percent of his first serves in humid, windy conditions against Bogomolov.

Not to be outdone, Azarenka, seeking her second major title after winning this year's Australian Open, blew past Russian Alexandra Panova 6-0, 6-1 in just 50 minutes.

Defending champion Samantha Stosur needed only

51 minutes to blitz Croatia's Petra Martic 6-1, 6-1, while 2006 US Open winner Maria Sharapova blew by Hungary's Melinda Czik 6-2, 6-2. Stosur lost in the first round of the Australian Open and the Olympics and was beaten in round two at Wimbledon but her rout of Martic suggested she will not relinquish her US Open crown without a fight.

Abraham crowned new world super middleweight champion

BERLIN, 28 Aug—Germany's Arthur Abraham is the new world WBO super middleweight champion after his unanimous win over compatriot Robert Stieglitz.

Abraham, 32, who defended his IBF middleweight title 10 times between 2005 and 2009, is now the world champion at the heavier weight after the judges scored the fight 116-112, 116-112, 115-113 on Saturday.

"This is an emotional moment for me and it's hard to describe how I feel," said Abraham.

"I always wanted to be

the middleweight world champion and now I am the super middleweight champion too.

"I trained hard for this and I had to box cleverly against such a good champion."

Having held the title for three years, Stieglitz was well beaten with heavy bruising and cuts around both eyes at the end of the punishing title bout, while Abraham was left relatively unmarked.

Abraham lived up to his "King Arthur" moniker and the new champion now has a record of 27 knock-outs in 35 wins and three defeats.

Having laboured to a points win over Piotr Wilczewski to defend his European WBO title in March, Abraham was back to the best fighting for the world title.

Patchy putting underpins Tiger's puzzling year

NEW YORK, 28 Aug—In many ways, Tiger Woods' 2012 PGA Tour campaign is the most perplexing of his entire career.

While the former world number one has triumphed three times on the US circuit this season — more than anyone else — he has often faded over the weekend after being in prime position to push on for victory.

In his latest slide, Woods trailed by just three shots after two rounds at last week's Barclays tournament in Farmingdale, New York, before struggling with his putter as he closed with scores of 72 and 76.

He was so frustrated by his final-round performance at Bethpage Black, where he won the 2002 US Open, that he left the course without speaking to any media outlet.

The Tiger Woods of old, especially when in his regal pomp of the late 1990s and early 2000s, was considered a

supreme closer and arguably the best pressure putter of all time from inside 15 feet.

He relentlessly piled up 14 major titles and, in part because of his unprecedented aura of dominance, he frequently benefited in final rounds as his closest rivals wilted under the spotlight.

However the 2012 Tiger model is a surprisingly unpredictable one. Having ended a two-and-a-half-year title drought on the PGA Tour with a five-shot win at the Arnold Palmer Invitational in March, it seemed the floodgates would once again open for the greatest player of his generation.—Reuters

Federer stunning in first round at US Open

NEW YORK, 28 Aug—World number one Roger Federer produced a stunning opening performance at the US Open on Monday, but then said Novak Djokovic deserved to be the favourite for the title.

Five-times champion Federer ran through his full array of shot-making as he dismissed American Donald Young 6-3, 6-2, 6-4 to reach the second round.

Having won his 17th grand slam title with his victory at Wimbledon last month, Federer is many people's pick to add a sixth US Open crown to his ever-

growing resume.

But the Swiss said the efforts of Serbia's Djokovic in recent times gave him the edge.

"I still think Novak is the favourite for the title coming in here," Federer told reporters after his one hour, 34-minute victory under the lights.

UN staff killed in southern Somalia

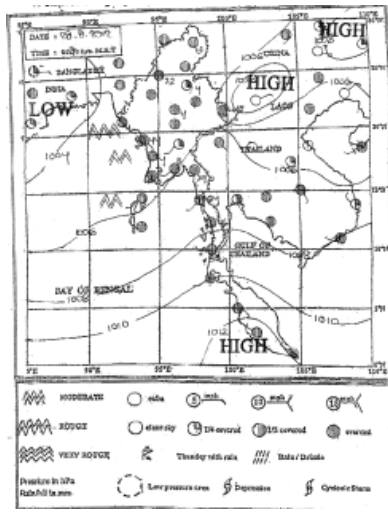

US southern coast on high alert as Tropical Storm Issac approaches

TAMPA, (Florida), 28 Aug—The southern US states of Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama are on high alert on Monday against the threat of the approaching Tropical Storm Issac, which has already curtailed the 2012 Republican National Convention (RNC) that just began in Tampa, Florida. Issac, which was about 600 kilometers southeast of the mouth of the Mississippi River on Monday morning, was expected to become a hurricane in about one day, according to the forecasts by the US National Hurricane Centre. It has caused heavy rains and strong gust of winds in Key West, Florida, from

Sunday, but inflicted no major damage. It was heading along the Gulf of Mexico to the coasts of Louisiana and Alabama, wheeling off the western coast of Florida, including Tampa which only experienced occasional strong winds and rains on Monday morning. Issac is expected to land in the coastal areas of the Gulf of Mexico late Tuesday or Wednesday. The states of Florida, Louisiana and Alabama have all declared a state of emergency to prepare for the threat of Issac, for fear that it might repeat the disaster that Hurricane Katrina brought to the Gulf coast just seven years ago. Thousands of residents living in Louisiana, Mississippi

and Alabama on Monday were told to evacuate their coastal homes, US media reported. Alabama Governor Robert Bentley on Sunday issued an order for mandatory evacuations of residents living both along the Gulf coast and in low-lying inland areas that were facing dangers of flooding. "I am urging everyone to take precautions now, monitor weather warnings, and be prepared for whatever Isaac may bring," Bentley said. Residents in Jefferson Parish, St Charles Parish and parts of Plaquemines Parish in Louisiana were ordered to evacuate as of Monday morning, while Governor Bobby Jindal also called on

residents in the coastal areas prone to flooding to voluntarily evacuate. Along its way, Issac has already killed at least six people in Haiti before hitting southern Florida on Sunday and then continuing its violent thrust to the US Gulf coast. For fears of a massive disruption of transportation, power supply and communications, the 2012 Republican National Convention, scheduled to be held in Tampa from Monday to Thursday, was forced to cancel all planned activities on its first day. The convention went immediately to recess after a brief opening ceremony on Monday afternoon, and will reconvene on Tuesday.—Xinhua

US flags to fly at half-staff to honour astronaut Armstrong

WASHINGTON, 28 Aug—US President Barack Obama on Monday directed that US flags be flown at half-staff for the funeral of astronaut Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon. According to a proclamation issued by the White House, Obama ordered that US flags shall be flown at half-staff at the White House, and all public buildings and grounds, as well as all military posts, naval stations and vessels throughout the

day when the legendary astronaut is buried. The arrangement was "a mark of respect for the memory of Neil Armstrong," said Obama in the proclamation. The order came two days after the former astronaut's family announced last Saturday that he died at age 82. Obama on Saturday lamented the death of Armstrong, calling him a man "among the greatest of American heroes — not just

of his time, but of all time." Armstrong, an iconic space explorer, commanded the Apollo 11 spacecraft that landed on the moon on 20 July, 1969 and has been best remembered by saying "That's one small step for (a) man, one giant leap for mankind." Armstrong and his fellow astronaut Buzz Aldrin spent two and a half hours walking on the moon, collecting samples, conducting experiments and

Six questions were raised and answered, a

whether there is a plan to increase agricultural loans for winter crops to a reasonable amount. The deputy minister answered that, as the budget for all agricultural loans for 2012-2013 fiscal year had been fixed, there is no plan to increase the amount of agricultural loans for winter crops.

U Aung Thein Lin of South Okkalapa Constituency asked **whether there is fee for transferring saving account of a farmer at Myanma Agricultural Development Bank and which action would be taken if any.** The deputy minister answered that the original banking account could not

be transferred to any family members or fellow villagers. If any complaint, mentioning the names of the township bank branch and involved staff, is lodged, serious actions would be taken against them.

Union Minister for Electric Power No (2) U Khin Maung Soe answered queries raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

U Lun Thi of Kungyangon Constituency asked about **condition of nationwide electricity supply, pragmatic measures for supply of more electricity, and plans for satisfying electricity demand of developing enterprises and domestic and foreign investments.** The Union minister answered that 30 power plants are in operation on the power grid. Short-term and long-term plans would be implemented for generating more electricity. The ministry is in negotiation to establish one

gas-fired power plant each in Hlawga, Thakayta and Ywama of Yangon and five hydropower plants would be completed by 2030-2031.

Feasibility studies are being conducted in Mon, Kayin, Kayah, Chin, Shan and Rakhine States and Taninthayi, Ayeyawady and Yangon Regions to generate wind power. Plans are under way to invite public partnership, various private investments and to adopt sustainable plans.

U Soe Soe of Htigyaing Constituency asked **whether there is a plan to supply electricity round the clock in Maunggon village and Myataung village-tract in the township.** The Union minister answered that the electricity would be distributed if the company which owns the ferronickel factory near the villages and local authorities agreed to supply electricity through the factory.

Income tax levy aimed at scrutinizing the source of income

NAY PYI TAW, 28 Aug—Amyotha Hluttaw Session continued for 34th day, at Amyotha Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Complex, here, at 10.05 am today, attended by Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint and 216 MPs.

At the session, with respect to the question of U Zone Hle Htan of Chin State Constituency No. 2 on **“to exempt income tax levied on the capital for the construction of houses and buildings and investments”**, Deputy Minister for Finance and Revenue Dr Lin Aung replied: income tax levy is aimed at scrutinizing the

source of income. If they can state the source of income, they do not need to pay taxes for it. If not, they will not get income tax exemption.

The Section 2 of Income Tax Law states that “This law shall come in effect across the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. In addition, the enforcement of the law shall be on Myanmar citizens who are living outside the country.” All citizens are to pay the similar tax rates in accord with the Taxes Law. LONDON, 28 Aug—Eriksson, who has been unemployed since leaving Leicester City last year, warned the 32-year-old that he must act as quickly as possible if he is to lift the

Premier League trophy before the end of his career. “Steven Gerrard is Mr Liverpool and has won the Champions League, Super Cup, FA Cup and League Cup with them,” said Eriksson.

“But the question is whether he will ever win a Premier League title. As things look now, absolutely not.

“A lot of things have to

change at Liverpool for that to happen.

“The owners have to pump in money and buy the right players. Andy Carroll and Stewart Downing have been such expensive signings, but they’ve not been a success in the red shirt.

“When I look at their team today I see just three world-class players: Pepe Reina, Gerrard and Luis Suarez.

“Without them a Champions League place is very far away. I don’t begrudge a good guy like Steven winning the league. But maybe he needs to change clubs if he wants to have that title.”

Eriksson added that his advice for Gerrard has nothing to do with any animosity towards the Anfield club. “Both my dad and I have been Liverpool fans since the club’s heyday in the 1980s,” he said, “but the Liverpool we see today are far from the top level.”
