Safe and effective payment system plays a leading role in production and service sectors of the country, and central banks of every nation are responsible for development of payment system and the Central Bank of Myanmar is no exception, he said.

17 banks.

As MPU or Local IT provider has been cooperating with foreign organizations, IPU cards will be used in Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon and Mandalay after producing it in home. Arrangements are being made to use international cards VISA, Master, American Express, China Union Pay and JCB in Myanmar, he added.

Chairman of MPU U Maung Maung Win extended greetings and Secretary of MPU U Ye Min Oo explained completion of the tasks, future programmes and knowledge for MPU cards.

MPU cards will be available in 8 banks out of 17 MPU members till now. Everybody can draw cash from the ATM machines and carry out payment at the place where point of sale machine is being installed.

#### Relief camps fumigated in Sittway Township

**Weeks before US election, Mideast gives Obama perfect storm**

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept — An eruption of violent unrest across the Middle East is confronting President Barack Obama with the most serious challenge yet to his efforts to keep the Arab Spring from morphing into a new wave of anti-Americanism - and he has few good options to prevent it.

Less than two months before the US presidential election, a spate of attacks on embassies in Libya, Egypt and Yemen poses a huge dilemma for a US leader who took office promising a “new beginning” with the Muslim world but has struggled to manage the transformation that has swept away many of the region’s long-ruling dictators.

On top of that, even as he tries to fend off foreign policy criticism from Republican rival Mitt Romney, Obama is grappling with an escalating crisis in US-Israeli relations over Iran’s nuclear programme and increased bloodshed in Syria, where President Bashar al-Assad has defied international calls to step aside.

Obama’s Middle East woes deepened this week with a series of mob attacks on US diplomatic compounds

and the killing of America’s ambassador to Libya. Demonstrators were incensed by a US-made film they consider blasphemous to Islam.

With the White House fearing further violence in the region after Muslim prayers on Friday, Obama and his aides were scrambling to re-calibrate their approach to the problem. Warnings were issued to Muslim governments around the world that they would be expected to help protect US interests.

All of this may simply point to a larger challenge that will endure well beyond November’s US vote — an apparently growing gulf between the United States and increasingly assertive Islamist forces within the Middle East. The irony is clear.

With his vaunted 2009 speech in Cairo, Obama had

hoped to “reset” relations with the region and ease some of the ill feeling stoked by the 2003 US-led invasion of Iraq and “war on terror” rhetoric of Obama’s Republican predecessor, George W Bush. The Obama administration was caught flat-footed by a wave of pro-democracy revolts last year that toppled autocratic leaders — some, like Egypt’s Hosni Mubarak, a longtime US ally.

But Washington gradually gave cautious backing to the goals of the Arab Spring movement. Now, with much of the US optimism that accompanied the Arab world’s uprisings seemingly gone for good, Washington faces an apparent rise in Islamic activism and declining influence over countries it once counted as allies.

**UN Security Council condemns suicide bombing in Yemen**

UNITED NATIONS, 14 Sept — The UN Security Council strongly condemned on Thursday a recent terrorist attack that occurred in Sanaa, the capital of Yemen, and caused many deaths and injuries.

In a Press statement issued here, the members of the Security Council expressed their deep sympathy and sincere condolences to the victims of the attack and their families, as well as the people and the government of the Republic of Yemen.

A car bomb attack targeting the motorcade of

the Yemeni defence minister took place in central Sanaa on Tuesday, killing 12 people including seven bodyguards of the minister. The minister, Mohammed Nasser Ahmed, survived the attack, but was critically injured in his chest.

“The members of the Security Council reaffirmed that terrorism in all its forms and manifestations constitutes one of the most serious threats to international peace and security, and that any acts of terrorism are criminal and unjustifiable, regardless of their motivation, wherever, whenever and by whomsoever committed,” said the

statement.

The Council members reiterated their determination to combat all forms of terrorism, in accordance with their responsibilities under the Charter of the United Nations, according to the statement.

The Council also reminded states that they must ensure that measures taken to combat terrorism comply with all their obligations under international law, in particular international human rights, refugee and humanitarian law, the statement added.

**RMS sees insured losses from Hurricane Isaac up to \$2 billion**

LONDON, 14 Sept — Hurricane Isaac caused wind damage that could reach \$1-2 billion, disaster modeler RMS said in an update on the 2012 Atlantic hurricane season.

This season is proving the second most active since records began in 1851, with only 2005 and 2011 having more named storms as of 13 September, the San Francisco-based RMS said.

The first hurricane to hit

the United States this year, Isaac struck New Orleans last month, almost exactly seven years after Hurricane Katrina devastated the city, but it proved to be a much less damaging storm.

RMS’ estimate excludes all losses caused by flooding and all losses from the National Flood Insurance Programme.

The latter, a state-run entity, was wiped out by Katrina in 2005, requiring a bailout that has left the

programme with a debt load it may never shift. The programme still has 193,000 policies in force in Louisiana alone.

Eqecat, another catastrophe modeling firm whose software is used by the insurance industry, said Isaac caused up to \$1 billion in economic losses for offshore energy properties and up to \$1.5 billion in insured losses onshore in Louisiana and neighboring states.—Reuters

**Libya arrests four over deadly Benghazi attack**

TRIPOLI, 14 Sept — Libyan authorities have made four arrests in the investigation into the attack on the US consulate in Benghazi in which the US ambassador and three embassy staff were killed, the deputy interior minister said on Thursday. “Four men are in custody and we are interrogating them because they are suspected of helping instigate the events at the US consulate,” Wanis Sharif told Reuters. He gave no more details.

US ambassador to Libya Christopher Stevens and three other Americans died after the gunmen attacked the US consulate and a safe house refuge in the eastern city of Benghazi on Tuesday night.

Demonstrators attacked the US embassies in Yemen and Egypt on Thursday, and American warships were moved closer to Libya. President Barack Obama has vowed to bring to justice those responsible for the Benghazi attack, which US officials said may have been planned in advance.— Reuters

**Japan set to win extended waiver of US sanctions on Iran oil**

SINGAPORE, 14 Sept — Japan has made deeper cuts in crude oil purchases from Iran since it secured an exemption from US sanctions in March, putting the country in a strong position to obtain a renewal when the United States reviews the six-month waiver. Japan was the first of Asia’s top four buyers of Iranian crude to receive a waiver from the United States of tough new sanctions aimed at reducing Iran’s oil income and

persuading it to halt a nuclear program the West suspects is meant to build weapons. Tehran denies its nuclear work has a military purpose.

The exemptions were granted to buyers of oil from Iran on condition that they reduced their purchases.

The combination of tight US and European sanctions has forced Iran to cut its oil output and almost halve exports from around 2 million barrels per day last year as Asian customers

struggled to pay for the crude and ship it. Japanese and US officials have already held meetings on the renewal, with Tokyo presenting trade data to demonstrate it is reducing Iranian imports, a Japanese government official said, declining to be identified as he is not authorized to talk to the media.

“We expect to be informed of their decision in coming days,” the official said, referring to a decision by the United States on extending a waiver on Japan.

## 3D printers bring hi-tech manufacturing to the home

NEW YORK, 14 Sept — Not so long ago, harried moms and dads would brave the holiday season crowds at the mall to buy those Lego accessories or that Star Wars battle cruiser. Now, with increasingly cheap and easy-to-use three-dimensional printers, they can turn out such gifts in the comfort of the family living room or garage. 3D printers — which use a process called additive manufacturing to make objects from a digital model by laying down layers of material — aren't new.

They've been used to make manufacturing and engineering prototypes for more than 25 years.

But printer makers are now turning their attention to the consumer market, and have been rewarded with soaring sales and stock prices — as well as the prospect of

lucrative buyouts. Some printers capable of churning out simple items such as keychains, wine bottle holders and missing board game pieces are already selling for as little as \$350.

That's cheaper than a high-end version of Microsoft's Xbox 360 with Kinect. "The consumer segment in the next few years will potentially devour everything else that we do," said Abe Reichental, chief executive of 3D Systems Corp, the biggest listed US 3D printer maker.

Shares of Rock Hill, South Carolina-based 3D Systems, now trading around \$38, have more than doubled since it launched its first printer for home use, the Cube 3D, in January. Demand is three times more than expected, Reichental said, although he declined to give

exact numbers. Shares of Stratasy Inc, the other major listed 3D printer maker, have more than doubled since the start of the year, to around \$65 as investors sense the next big thing. Privately held MakerBot, which released its first plug-and-play 3D printer,

## Apple snubs emerging mobile payment standard

SAN FRANCISCO/NEW YORK, 14 Sept — EBay Inc Chief Executive John Donahoe often quotes a merchant saying NFC stands for "Not For Commerce" — and dismisses the prospects of Near Field Communication technology used to turn cellphones into mobile wallets. He got some support this week from Apple Inc, which did not embed NFC chips into the iPhone 5. NFC proponents had hoped Apple would endorse the technology, which passes encrypted data between devices at close range without contact. So instead of swiping a credit card, shoppers can simply wave their phones at a checkout terminal to pay for their goods.

The technology is backed by the largest US carriers and credit card companies, but has failed to

take off in America because merchants have been reluctant to spend money to upgrade their checkout terminals until NFC is more widely adopted. "Anyone hoping NFC would be a reality soon is disappointed," said Sanjay Sakhrani, an analyst at Keefe, Bruyette & Woods. "Many in the industry were hoping inclusion in the iPhone would be a springboard for more adoption. This takes the impetus away."

NFC technology, which has uses beyond mobile payments, is backed by Isis, a mobile wallet joint venture between Verizon Wireless, AT&T Inc and T-Mobile USA. Isis' financial services partners include American Express, JPMorgan Chase and Capital One Financial.

## ALICE scientists enter primeval plasma wonderland

GENEVA, 14 Sept — Scientists at CERN have smashed together various particles for the first time, moving closer to learning what was in the super-hot plasma wonderland that formed right after the primeval Big Bang, the European physics research centre said

on Thursday.

The announcement followed another boost for physicists at CERN near Geneva with the effective endorsement by independent experts in a key journal of their claimed discovery of a new particle, the Higgs Boson.

CERN's ALICE experiment, one of six grouped around its underground Large Hadron Collider (LHC), has been analyzing particles that emerged from the overnight smashing together of tiny hydrogen-derived protons and much larger lead nuclei.

It was really a pilot run to see if the LHC can produce these asymmetric collision systems. It showed that it can, and it worked like a charm," Johannes Wessels, an ALICE scientist, told Reuters. "We are very excited about the results." The function of ALICE — acronym for A Large Ion Collider Experiment — is to probe what happens to matter when it is heated to 250,000 times the temperature at the centre of the sun — as in the "quark-gluon plasma" at the birth of the cosmos.

## Russia will not cut emissions under extended Kyoto climate pact

MOSCOW, 14 Sept — Russia confirmed on Thursday it would not make cuts in greenhouse gas emissions from 2013 under the UN's Kyoto Protocol, joining Canada and Japan in rejecting an extension of the plan for fighting climate change.

The foreign ministry said Moscow would not join industrialized nations led by the European Union in signing up for cuts beyond a first round of commitments ending on 31 Dec, 2012.

Earlier this month,

Deputy Prime Minister Arkady Dvorkovich said on Twitter that a decision "had not been made" on new obligations, suggesting the government was still mulling participation. Russia said on Thursday it would now focus on a UN plan, agreed last year, to come up with a new international deal by 2015 obliging both developed and developing countries to limit gas emissions that would enter into force from 2020.

"The Russian Federation finds the extension of the Kyoto protocol in its current

state ineffective and does not intend to take on obligations to lower greenhouse gas emissions as part of the so-called second round of liabilities," Foreign Ministry spokesman Alexander Lukashevich said in a statement.

"The content of the climate obligations and actions may be different for developed and developing countries, but they must be reflected in a single document. Without that, it will be useless," he added.

## Drought hurt world crops less than many had feared: USDA

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept — Searing droughts in the United States and Russia will deplete harvests of wheat, corn and soybeans, the US government said on Wednesday, but global food supplies were not hurt as badly as many had feared. With the US harvest off to a fast start, the Agriculture Department said the country's corn crop would be the smallest in six years and the soybean crop would be the smallest in nine years. But even though USDA lowered its crop estimates for the United States and Russia, they are bigger than expected.

USDA's estimates of the corn and soybean stockpiles at the end of this marketing year were also larger than traders expected. One factor: high corn prices have prompted cutbacks in livestock production, reducing demand for feed and keeping more corn in stockpiles. The USDA's World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates report will guide the Group of 20 wealthiest nations as it decides whether joint action is needed to prevent a repeat of the 2008 food price spike that left tens of millions of people hungry and sparked food riots in some countries.

The report eased worries about severe shortages and brought down prices of some US agricultural futures. Corn futures on the Chicago Board of Trade fell to a seven-week low and wheat fell too on the prospect of larger supplies. "Corn prices likely have peaked," said agricultural economist Darrel Good at the University of Illinois, unless a quarterly report due 28 Sept, shows the corn stockpile is too small. — Reuters

## Nintendo Wii U adds TV, video for November launch

NEW YORK/TOKYO, 14 Sept — Nintendo Co's "Wii U", packed with innovative TV and video features, will hit US store shelves on November 18 as it plays catch-up with Microsoft and Sony and aims to lure gamers back from the Internet and mobile devices.

The first Nintendo home console in six years will allow users to make personal TV and video programming lists and record shows through TiVo and other digital recording services. "It should be the entertainment hub in the center of the house," said Scott Moffitt, Nintendo of America's executive vice president of sales and marketing.

The machine, starting at just under \$300, will also come with a dedicated "Super Mario" game title. For Nintendo, known for its

game-centric approach, adding an entertainment component is a positive step, said Billy Pidgeon, an analyst at M2 Research. "It's a must-have right now and with this, they can catch up somewhat to Microsoft's Xbox offerings."

The Wii U is the first console machine to be sold by a major gaming industry company in more than six years. With a new Microsoft Corp Xbox and updated Sony Corp Playstation expected in 2013, sales will offer clues as to whether more advanced, next-generation game hardware can boost the ailing video game console and packaged games market.

Gamers have migrated steadily online or to mobile devices such as Apple Inc's iPad and this shift has weakened video game hardware and software sales. The Wii has been a bonanza

## Ireland eyes renewable power exports to UK by 2017 Business

LONDON, 14 Sept — Power grid operators signed a deal on Thursday to develop a 5,000 megawatt electricity transportation system which could export wind power from Ireland to the UK within five years. The UK's National Grid and Portugal's grid operator REN are working on a feasibility study for the project alongside Dublin-based renewable energy generator Mainstream Renewable Power. REN is 25 percent owned by China's dominant utility firm State Grid Corp.

"REN believes this memorandum of understanding sets the ground for the study of a potentially groundbreaking infrastructure for the future of European energy highways," REN Chief Executive Rui Cartaxo said in a statement. Mainstream Renewable Power aims to supply 1.2 GW

of power to the UK by 2017. Ireland is expected to produce more wind power than it needs, leaving room for exports to Britain, which has a target to generate 15 percent of its energy consumption from renewable sources by 2020, compared with around 9 percent last year.

Mainstream said it has already secured an offer for 5,000 MW of grid connection to the UK which is independent of Ireland's existing grid structure. A spokeswoman for the project was unable to confirm whether the Chinese firm would have any direct involvement in the scheme. Chinese firms are also bidding to build nuclear power stations in Britain, with two Chinese firms teaming up to take part in the UK's 6-gigawatt Horizon project.

## Smokers may have more sleep problems: study

BERLIN, 14 Sept — Smokers may get fewer hours of sleep and have less restful slumber than non-smokers, according to a German study that looked at more than two thousand people. Researchers whose work appeared in the journal *Addiction Biology* found that of nearly 1,100 smokers surveyed, 17 percent got fewer than six hours of sleep each night and 28 percent reported "disturbed" sleep quality.

That compared with rates of seven percent and 19 percent respectively among more than 1,200 non-smokers who were also surveyed, said lead researcher Stefan Cohrs, of Charite Berlin medical school in Germany. "This study demonstrates for the first time an elevated prevalence of sleep disturbance in smokers compared with non-smokers in a population without lifetime history of psychiatric disorders even after

controlling for potentially relevant risk factors," Cohrs and his colleagues wrote. The findings cannot prove that smoking directly impairs sleep, since smokers may have other habits that could affect their shut-eye such as staying up late to watch TV or getting little exercise, Cohrs told *Reuters Health* in an email.

But there is also reason to believe the stimulating effects of nicotine may be to blame. "If you smoke and you do suffer from sleep problems, it is another good

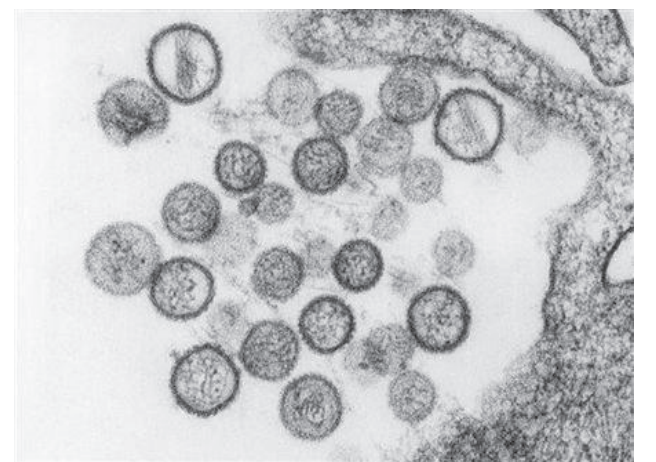
reason to quit smoking," Cohrs said. Poor sleep quality may not only make your waking hours tougher. Some studies have also linked habitually poor sleep to health problems like obesity, diabetes and heart disease. The study included 1,071 smokers and 1,243 non-smokers who were free of mental health disorders, since those conditions may make a person both more likely to smoke and more vulnerable to sleep problems.

The researchers used a questionnaire that gauges sleep quality. Overall, more than one-quarter of smokers had a score that landed them in the category of "disturbed" sleep, meaning they had a high probability of insomnia. Many things can affect sleep quality, and Cohrs's team was able to account for factors such as age, weight, and alcohol abuse. — Reuters

## Yosemite extends hantavirus warning; 9th infection confirmed

SAN FRANCISCO, 14 Sept — Yosemite National Park expanded a warning about the deadly hantavirus to 230,000 more recent visitors and confirmed on Thursday that a ninth person had contracted the virus, which has already killed three people. The Californian, the latest person confirmed to have been infected with hantavirus, had stayed in Yosemite in July and has already recovered, National Park Service spokesman John Quinley said.

Yosemite said it had previously alerted 30,000 visitors, who slept in two locations where officials believe the nine visitors were infected, but expanded the warning by sending emails to 230,000 more who stayed elsewhere out of an abundance of caution, Quinley said. "Because we have heard from concerned guests who stayed throughout the park, today

we are reaching out to additional overnight visitors to raise awareness about this rare disease and to ensure they know where to find information regarding hantavirus," the statement said.

"Public health officials have no evidence at this time to indicate that persons who stayed elsewhere in the park this summer were at increased

risk of exposure to hantavirus," it said. Although there is no cure for hantavirus pulmonary syndrome, which kills more than a third of those infected, early detection through blood tests and supportive hospital care increases the chances of survival. Deer mice carry the virus in their urine and feces.

## Stressed at work? Look out for your heart

LONDON, 14 Sept — People who have highly demanding jobs and little freedom to make decisions are 23 percent more likely to have a heart attack compared with their less stressed out colleagues, according to research published on Friday. But lighting up a cigarette or remaining chained to your desk rather than getting out to do some exercise is far more damaging for your heart health, researchers said.

A study of nearly 200,000 people from seven European

countries found around 3.4 percent of heart attacks can be attributed to job strain — a significant proportion, but far less than the 36 percent attributable to smoking and 12 percent put down to lack of exercise. For the study, which was published online in *The Lancet* medical journal, researchers analyzed job strain in employees who had no previous coronary heart disease (CHD). Participants completed questionnaires about their job demands, workload, the level of time-

pressure demands, and their freedom to make decisions.

"Our findings indicate that job strain is associated with a small, but consistent, increased risk of experiencing a first CHD event such as a heart attack," said Mika Kivimaki from University College London, who led the research. Peter Weissberg, medical director at the British Heart Foundation, said the findings confirmed that being under stress at work and being unable to change the situation could increase the risk of

developing heart disease.

But he noted they also showed the negative effects of workplace strain are much smaller than the damage caused by smoking or lack of exercise. "Though stresses at work may be unavoidable, how you deal with these pressures is important, and lighting up a cigarette is bad news for your heart," he said in an emailed comment. "Eating a balanced diet, taking regular exercise and quitting smoking will more than offset any risk associated with your job." — Reuters

## No progress in talks to sell stake to Hon Hai: Sharp

OSAKA, 14 Sept — Sharp Corp said no progress has been made in the past week in talks to sell a stake to Hon Hai Precision Industry that would make the Taiwanese company its biggest shareholder. "There has been no development regarding capital from their side," a Sharp executive said at a briefing on Friday in Osaka on condition he was not identified.

The two companies had been expected to conclude an agreement for Hon Hai to buy a 9.9 percent stake in Sharp during a visit to Japan by Hon Hai's chairman, Terry Gou, in August. Gou left Japan early without meeting Sharp executives and the meeting has yet to be rescheduled. — Reuters

## Netanyahu deputy disagrees on setting Iran "red line" ISRAEL

JERUSALEM, 14 Sept — Benjamin Netanyahu's deputy for intelligence and atomic affairs on Thursday broke with the Israeli prime minister's call for Iran to be confronted with a "red line" beyond which its disputed nuclear programme would face military attack. In a broadcast interview, Deputy Prime Minister Dan Meridor appeared to side with the United States in balking at Netanyahu's repeated demand that it set Iran an ultimatum or risk seeing Israel launch region-rattling unilateral strikes.

Meridor's remarks also underscored debate within the leader's inner circle about potentially exacerbating the rift with Washington with a war that polls show most Israelis, including several senior security figures, would oppose. "I don't want to set red lines or deadlines for

myself," Meridor, one of several Netanyahu deputies who form the core of his security cabinet, told Israel's Army Radio when asked how much time remained before force against Iran should be used. He called for international sanctions against Teheran to be intensified "so it understands that the price it is paying is mounting and that the only way to be rid of it is to stop the (nuclear) race, to arrive at an agreement, or an international understanding, that it is calling it quits." "You always consider other options, for when everything else is exhausted.

And I think that, for now, we have to continue with the pressure." That echoed US President Barack Obama, who seeks reelection in November and has tried to champion continued carrot-and-stick diplomacy with Iran while fending off charges

by Republican rival Mitt Romney that he is soft on the Jewish state's security. Iran denies seeking nuclear weapons.

Obama, in an interview broadcast on Thursday with the US Spanish-language network Telemundo, insisted he had set a red line for Iran, but offered no new specifics that would come close to meeting Netanyahu's demands for a tougher US

stance."

I've stated repeatedly, publically, that red line, and that is we're not going to accept Iran having a nuclear weapon — not only because it threatens Israel, not only because it could potentially threaten the United States," he said. "It could also fall into the hands of terrorists and it would trigger a nuclear arms race in the region."

## In largely symbolic move, US sanctions Hezbollah's Nasrallah

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept — The US Treasury sanctioned the leader of the Lebanese militant group and political movement Hezbollah on Thursday for helping Syria crush anti-government

protests, as well as two other members for the group's "terrorist activities" in general. Sanctions experts described the move against Hezbollah Secretary-General Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah as

largely symbolic because the penalties — freezing any assets he holds in US banks — had been imposed under earlier US sanctions.

The Treasury said it had "designated" Nasrallah under US Executive Order 13582, signed by President Barack Obama in August 2011 in part to crack down on those helping Syria repress the uprising against President Bashar al-Assad's rule. More than 27,000 people are believed to have died in the 17-month-old conflict. The Treasury also said it sanctioned two other Hezbollah members: Mustafa Amine Badreddine, who has been accused by a UN tribunal in the 2005 killing of former Lebanese Prime Minister Rafik al-Hariri, and a man it identified as Talal Hamiya,

the head of Hezbollah's external security organization.

Those two were targeted under Executive Order 13224 "for providing support to Hezbollah's terrorist activities in the Middle East and around the world," the Treasury Department said in a written statement.—Reuters

## UN General Assembly convenes meeting on mediation UNGA

UNITED NATIONS, 14 Sept — President of the UN General Assembly Nassir Abdulaziz Al-Nasser said on Thursday that mediation in settling international disputes or situations requires seamless cooperation among different partners. Regional organizations and civil society are playing an "important role" in mediation, in addition to that of the United Nations and its member states, Al-Nasser told a meeting of the UN General Assembly on mediation held in UN Headquarters in New York City.

"Since every situation is unique, we should benefit as much as possible from the comparative advantages of different actors," he said. "This requires seamless cooperation among all." The GA president pointed out that some past and current crises have shown that if mediation and other peaceful means are used at a timely and early stage, it would be cost-effective, leading to saving of innocent lives and alleviating the suffering of civilians, particularly women and children.—Xinhua

## Talisman Energy leaving Peru as it continues to shed assets PERU

LIMA, 14 Sept — Canada's Talisman Energy Inc is giving up its eight-year-long effort to produce oil in Peru, the company said on Thursday, as it continues to shed assets in a bid to boost its share price. The energy producer, which replaced its CEO on Monday after an eight-month review of strategy and operations, said it could not afford to chase expensive long-term prospects in Peru. The company, with operations in North America, the North Sea and Southeast Asia, has been

discussed as the next big takeover target in the Canadian oil patch following Nexen Inc, which has agreed to be acquired by Chinese state-owned CNOOC Ltd in a \$15.1 billion deal that is not finalized.

Talisman's withdrawal from Peru will open its concessions in the Maranon Basin in the north of the country, including the 40,000 barrels of light oil it discovered in block 64, to new operators. "We haven't been able to generate a substantial production potential in the

blocks we control in Peru, despite our discovery in block 64," spokeswoman Veronica Bonifaz said. "After reviewing our global portfolio we've decided to focus on near-term liquid hydrocarbons." Talisman said it will work with government regulator Perupetro on the transition of its holdings as it wraps up commercial transactions.

The company currently operates blocks 64 and 103, and has non-operated interests in blocks 123 and 129 in Peru.

**British insurers set up fraud register as bogus claims rise**

LONDON, 14 Sept — British insurers on Thursday launched a register of insurance fraudsters after calculating that bogus claims rose 5 percent last year, adding 50 pounds to the average policyholder's bill. The register is designed to help insurers identify fraudulent claims, easing a

financial burden that has weighed on the industry's profits, the Association of British Insurers said.

"The register will make it easier for insurers to prevent fraud by making details of known fraudsters available to insurers through a secure protocol," said Richard Davies of the ABI's Financial

Crime Committee. "Those that defraud insurers and their honest customers face real and tangible consequences for their actions."

Insurers detected 139,000 bogus claims in 2011, saving themselves almost 1 billion pounds of payouts, according to the ABI. Fraudulent motor insurance claims were the most costly, accounting for more than half the savings. British motor insurers say a steady rise in spurious or fraudulent claims has been a factor behind their suffering an underwriting loss every year since 1994.

**British engineers develop ultra-cheap ultrasound**

LONDON, 14 Sept — Engineers in Britain have developed an ultrasound scanner that costs under 40 pounds to make and could improve prenatal care in parts of the developing world where this technology is out of reach. The device, if it gets commercial backing, would enter a market where hospital-based ultrasound scanners cost anything between 20,000 pounds and 100,000 pounds and low-cost, portable devices sell for around 4,500 pounds each.

"You could be looking at something certainly less than 200 pounds (to buy)," said Jeff

Neasham, the sonar technology specialist at Newcastle University who developed the device with his colleague Dave Graham. "Things are at a very early stage," Neasham said. "We have talked to a couple of interested companies and have had contact with a couple of charities, but we are still looking for partners." Around 250,000 women die each year from complications in pregnancy and childbirth, 99 percent of them in developing countries, according to the United Nations.

Some of the world's biggest healthcare equipment

companies like General Electric and Siemens are pouring resources into developing low-cost devices for emerging markets. GE has developed a handheld ultrasound scanner called Vscan with an integrated screen and Seattle-based start-up firm Mobisante has a device that can link to a smartphone for viewing. The Newcastle University scanner is about the size of a computer mouse and can be used via a USB plug with any PC or laptop built in the last 10 years, which the developers hope will make it accessible.

**Home Depot's do-it-yourself model fails in China's do-it-for-me market**

HONG KONG, 14 Sept — Home Depot Inc, the world's largest home improvement chain, will close all seven of its big box stores and cut 850 jobs in China as the retailer changes its focus in the Chinese market to online and specialty stores and becomes the latest retailer to feel the chill from China's slowing economy. Earlier this week, British fashion house Burberry Group Plc warned a slowdown in China could hit earnings. The profit warning came as recent Chinese data signaled a further slowing of the world's second-largest economy.

Home Depot spokeswoman Paula Drake told Reuters late on Thursday. The company made its first foray into the rapidly-growing Chinese market in late 2006 through its acquisition of a 12-store Chinese chain called The Home Way. However, it has struggled to expand ever since as it was a relatively late entrant into the market behind other international chains such as Britain's Kingfisher Plc which ventured into the world's most populous country in the late 1990s.

**BAE's British roots sprout trusted American faces in US defence landscape**

WASHINGTON, 14 Sept — Around the United States, Britain's BAE Systems is widely seen as just another powerful US defence contractor, unlike European aerospace group EADS, which is always firmly identified by its French, German and Spanish roots. With nearly 40,000 employees in states like Virginia, Texas, Pennsylvania and New Hampshire; outreach programmes at myriad US universities, and its own savvy lobbyists, BAE's British origins

seldom merits a mention.

Now that the two companies want to tie the knot, the question is, whether BAE will be able to extend its hard-earned reputation to EADS, or whether the relationship with EADS could complicate its own business relationships in the United States.

Analysts and industry executives said BAE, which announced on Wednesday that it was in advanced merger talks with EADS, has firmly

established itself in the US defence industry landscape over the past decade through a series of strategic acquisitions and rigid adherence to tough security procedures.

Thousands of its employees hold government security clearances and BAE is a member of the Aerospace Industries Association, the US aerospace and defense industry's largest trade group, which has steadfastly refused to admit EADS because its shareholders include foreign governments.

Linda Hudson, chief executive of BAE's US unit and a member of the parent company's board, said her company had a unique special security agreement that allowed the US unit to work on the highest level US national security programmes.

**Brazil witnesses 73 percent down in child mortality in last two decades: UNICEF BRAZIL**

RIO DE JANEIRO, 14 Sept — The mortality rate of children under five years old in Brazil fell by 73 percent in the last 21 years, said a UN report released on Thursday. The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) said that Brazil's child mortality rate fell from 58 deaths for every 1,000 children in 1990 to 16 deaths for every 1,000 children in 2011, adding Brazil registered the world's fourth biggest advancement in this issue, after Turkey, Peru and El Salvador.

There were improvements in the access to health services in Brazil, with the establishment of community health programmes and family health strategies in the 1990s, which "helped reduce inequities in coverage and cut child mortality," UNICEF report said. Other important factors contributing to this included improvements in sanitation, maternal education, breastfeeding and immunization coverage, and growth in vulnerable families' incomes, UNICEF stated.

The fund qualified Brazil's progress as "impressive," but stressed that a lot of children still die from neo-natal diseases and post-partum complications in the country.

According to UNICEF, most countries registered have made improvement in reducing child mortality rates in the past two decades, and fighting disease is largely credited for this achievement. The global figures dropped from almost 12 million deaths of children aged five in 1990 to 6.9 million in 2011. — Xinhua

### Democracy Education

What is democracy? Is democracy a word only to find in the rhetorical speeches of politicians? Does it really guarantee people better life, social justice, freedom and equality before the law?

While democracies share common features, there is no single model of democracy. Democracy is a universal value based on the freely-expressed will of people to determine their own political, economic, social and cultural systems, and their full participation in all aspects of life, defined the United Nations General Assembly.

Democracy has been popularly said over one year in the country, bringing about dramatic changes especially in political dimension. Everyone is looking forward to the brighter future. But then, can democracy make our dreams come true?

The subject of this year's theme of International Day of Democracy—Democracy education—is essential for long-term success of democracy. All the citizens in all nations need to fully understand their rights and responsibilities for the level of participation and education of citizens has decisive effect on promotion of democracy.

Nearly 70 per cent of the country's population resides in rural areas with little or no political awareness. The country cannot see economic prosperity without their participation. It needs to educate the rural population to understand their constitutional and legal rights as well as responsibilities. Otherwise, it would only contribute to widen the gap between the rich and poor.

The education standard of the citizens is as crucial as the rule of law and discipline in a democracy. The rise or fall of a democracy largely depends on citizens because of the popular sovereignty of the citizens and thereby government by consent of the governed in polity. They need to make their voice heard through civic institutions and the free press to promote and consolidate democracy.

Democracy is a practice rather than a political system. Democracy is not a magic wand but it depends on how we practise. It is only with educated citizens that a sustainable culture of democracy can emerge.

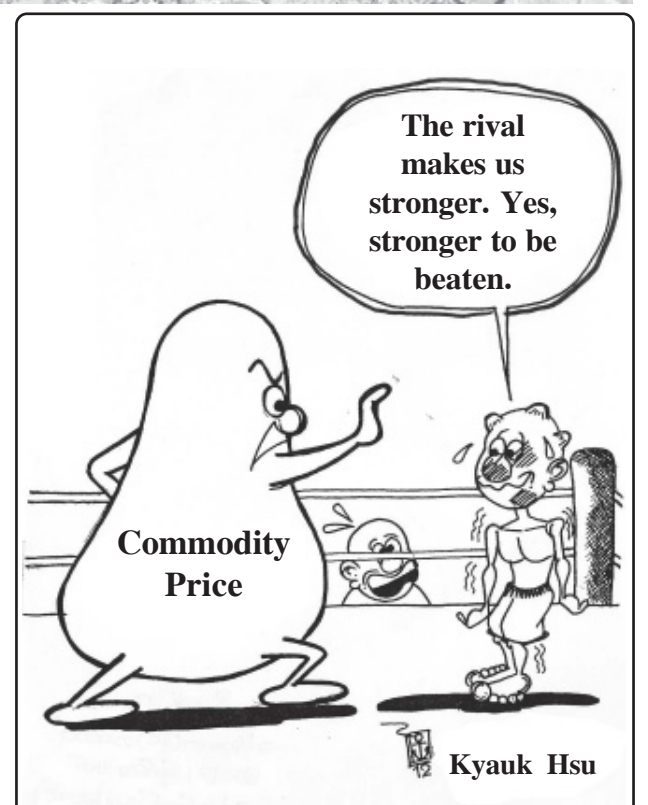

## Myanmar to take steps to promulgate intellectual property laws

The Union Minister said that firm laws that can protect the direct foreign investment in the country are essential as foreign investors attach importance to protective power of intellectual property laws in making decision to invest in a country. The country needs to enact intellectual property laws to be able to define and protect patent rights at a time it is striving for economic performance with might and main. The Ministry of Science and Technology is taking a leading role in drafting patent law, industrial design law, trademarks and service marks law and copyright law.

Next, personnel of the ministry explained feedback of respective ministries, representatives of region and state governments and organizations on drafts of those laws, followed by queries of those present.

The Union Minister called for enactment of laws in line with international practice without harming the interests of citizens. The meeting was attended by deputy

19 years after Oslo treaties**

RAMALLAH, 14 Sept — Nineteen years after the signing of the interim peace treaties, better known as Oslo accords, chances of reaching a permanent deal between Israel and the Palestinians became slim once again as their peace talks have been stalled since October 2010. Observers said that the Israeli policies and practices on the ground over the past 19 years after the deal, which was based on the principle of a two-state solution, had complicated the accurate and full implementation of the interim deal thus hinder the achievement of a permanent one.

The Oslo peace accords was signed between Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organization in the White House in Washington on 13 Sept, 1993 to end decades of bloody conflicts. The aim of the negotiations at that time was to form a transitional Palestinian authority in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, after which the two sides should start talks on permanent status issues, such as Jerusalem, refugees, settlement, water and security. Oslo deal had

guaranteed the establishment of a transitional self-rule authority for the Palestinians. However, no Palestinian state has been established yet and Palestinian officials hold Israel responsible for the stalemate in the peace process.

Chief Palestinian negotiator Saeb Erekat told *Xinhua* that all the governments of Israel “did their best to waste every possible opportunity that Oslo accords brought about to achieve permanent peace.” The Palestinians alleged that Israel is still controlling 60 percent of the West Bank territory and at the same time keeps escalating its settlement construction, which ruins all the chances of establishing a Palestinian state in the future beside the state of Israel. Israel, meanwhile, pulled out from the Gaza Strip in 2005 and evacuated its settlement there. In June 2007, the Islamic Hamas movement, which opposes Oslo accords, violently seized control of it after weeks of infighting with the forces of Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas.

Khalil Shahin, a political analyst from the West bank city of Ramallah,

told *Xinhua* that “Oslo agreements divided the Palestinian people into Palestinians of Gaza, Palestinians of West Bank and Palestinians in the Diaspora.” The Palestinians want Israel to completely halt all settlement activities in the West Bank and east Jerusalem and want to start talks on permanent status issues to establish an independent Palestinian state on the territories Israel occupied in 1967 with east Jerusalem as its capital. Salah al-Bardaweel, a senior Hamas leader based in Gaza, told *Xinhua* that his movement believes that toppling Oslo accords 19 years after it was signed is a Palestinian national need, adding “Oslo was illusive and didn’t bring the Palestinians anything fruitful except disasters and tragedies.”

In addition to the stalled peace process, the Palestinians are complaining about the high cost of living partly caused by the Paris economy agreement signed between Israel and the Palestinians in 1995, soon after the two sides began to implement Oslo accords.

Following a violent wave of protests in the West bank against the hard living conditions, the Palestinian National Authority called on Israel to reconsider amending the Paris protocol. Samer Anabtawi, a Palestinian commentator, told *Xinhua* that Oslo accords had yielded a Palestinian economy completely linked to the Israeli economy. “This reality kept the Palestinian economy linked to the world donations and the Israeli blackmail,” said Anabtawi, adding that Israel considers the Palestinian territories a good consuming market.

Erekat said that the Palestinian choice is still based on the two-state solution, adding that the Palestinian leadership is counting on the international law and the international resolutions to give the Palestinian people the right to establish their state on the territories occupied by Israel in 1967. However, Hani al-Masri, another West Bank-based political analyst, cautioned that “nothing will change on the ground amid the ongoing difficult situation.” —*Xinhua*

**Britain considers early withdrawal from Afghanistan—paper****UK**

LONDON, 14 Sept — Britain could withdraw its troops from Afghanistan faster than expected next year, as military commanders reassess how many troops they need to help local forces fight the Taliban, Britain’s defence secretary said in an interview.

Britain is due to withdraw 500 soldiers by the end of this year, leaving 9,000 soldiers to help Afghan National Security Forces, but Philip Hammond said there was potential to further “draw down troops in 2013.”

“Six months ago the message coming from them was that we really need to hold on to everything we have got for as long as we possibly can. I think they are seeing potentially more flexibility in the situation,” Hammond told Friday’s *Guardian* newspaper.

He did not go into details and said no decisions had been taken on an accelerated withdrawal of troops, with the

bulk of Britain’s soldiers planned to return home by the end of 2014.

“I think there is a bit of a rethinking going on about how many troops we do actually need,” said Hammond. “There may be some scope for a little bit more flexibility on the way we draw down, and that is something commanders on the ground are looking at very actively.”

He said British military thinking was evolving because commanders had been “surprised by the extent to which they have been able to draw back and leave the Afghans to take the lion’s share of the combat role”. Hammond said the security situation was improving in Helmand province in Afghanistan’s southwest, where British troops have mainly been based, after some of the bloodiest fighting in the Afghan conflict and the deaths of more than 20 British troops in recent months.

**Canada’s Harper seeks budget balance but top priority is growth****CANADA**

OTTAWA, 14 Sept — Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper said on Thursday he hoped to balance the federal budget before the next election in October 2015 but his top priority was to make sure the economy continued to grow. “We have to go on financial circumstances. Look, I want the budget to be balanced and that’s a goal in this Parliament. But our first objective is not balancing the budget, our first objective is to make sure the Canadian economy keeps growing,” he said in an interview on Sun News Network’s “Byline with Brian Lilley” programme.

“In my judgment, a gradual reduction in the deficit is the way to go if that can be managed, and I think it can be managed, so that’s the route that we’ll continue on.” The most recent federal budget set a target to bring the budget into surplus in the fiscal year that starts on 1 April, 2015. He estimated that the deficit is currently C\$24 billion to C\$25 billion (\$24.7 billion to \$25.8 billion), which is relatively tiny by comparison with the

US federal deficit but still quite large by fiscally conservative Canadian standards.

The prime minister, interviewed in his office, said that while he had expected the recovery would be slow, he had not seen the high level of uncertainty, stemming largely from Europe’s intractable economic difficulties and the US “fiscal cliff” approaching at the end of this year. The fiscal cliff refers to tough legislative decisions that must be made in Washington on whether to extend expiring low tax rates

or make deep spending reductions that could pinch economic growth.

“I’m sort of coming, and I think many Canadians are coming, to see a lot of this uncertainty as the new norm,” he said, adding that Canadians should not fret too much about week-to-week uncertainties in other countries over which Canada had limited control. “We have to make sure that we just look past and beyond these troubles and position Canada well for the very radically changed economy we see emerging in the future.” —*Reuters*

**50 arrested in Texas in operation against convicted sex offenders**

HOUSTON, 14 Sept — US federal immigration agents and state police have arrested 50 immigrants across the state of Texas as part of an operation to remove convicted sex offender and other criminals from the US and other countries, officials said on Thursday.

The US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) said the five-day operation was aimed to arrest people who have convictions for sex crimes and other felony convictions. The initiative, called Sex Offender Alien Removal or SOAR, targeted immigrants who have committed sex crimes, particularly against children. Federal authorities call it the first statewide operation of its kind, according to local media website.

The operation began on Saturday and ended on Wednesday. About half of the 50 people arrested were from North Texas. —*Xinhua*

**Hepatitis outbreak kills 16 in South Sudan refugee camps****SUDAN**

JUBA, 14 Sept — An outbreak of the Hepatitis E virus has killed 16 people in three South Sudanese refugee camps near the volatile border with Sudan, authorities and the United Nations said on Thursday. South Sudan’s border region has been flooded with hundreds of thousands of refugees fleeing fighting in Sudan’s South Kordofan and Blue Nile states. South Sudan’s Ministry of Health has reported almost 400 cases of the virus since the outbreak was identified in July.

“Cases are rising day by day, thus placing immense pressure on the available health services and resources. This is of grave humanitarian concern,” the ministry said in a joint statement with UN agencies. In Maban county, the area affected, 108,000 Sudanese refugees live in camps in dire conditions, aid officials say. Hepatitis E causes liver infections and is spread by drinking water contaminated with faeces. John Lagu, director of preparedness and response at the Ministry of Health, said the virus thrived in camps that are overcrowded and flooded.

“The good thing is that the virus is not very aggressive ... and that cases of mortality are low. Few people die from it,” Lagu told *Reuters* by telephone. However, he warned that there was a risk the virus could spread to local people, who have less access to healthcare than those in the camps.

“It’s just another indication of the very bad conditions that are there,” said Stefano Zannini at medical aid group Medecins Sans Frontieres. —*Reuters*

China surveillance ships near islands disputed with Japan

TOKYO/BEIJING, 14 Sept— Six Chinese surveillance ships entered waters near disputed islands claimed by Tokyo and Beijing on Friday, raising tensions between Asia's two biggest economies to their highest level since 2010 over a long-running territorial row. China's foreign ministry said that the ships entered the disputed waters to conduct maritime surveillance and that for the first time China was carrying out a mission of "law enforcement over its maritime rights".

"It reflects our government's jurisdiction over the Diaoyu islands," it said in a statement. The ministry has used similar language in the past. The islands, known as Senkaku in

Japanese and Diaoyu in Chinese, are near potentially huge maritime gas and oil fields. The Japanese coast guard said it ordered the ships to leave Japan's territorial waters, but only three complied, leaving three vessels still in the disputed area. No force had been used to remove the Chinese ships, a coast guard official said.

"We'll do our utmost in vigilance and surveillance," said Prime Minister Yoshihiko Noda when asked about Japan's responses. Diplomats say Tokyo and Beijing would prefer to keep the row from spiraling out of control and harming deep economic ties. But with China facing a once-in-a-decade leadership change and an election

looming in Japan that the ruling party looks set to lose, managing the row could be harder than in the past.

"The dangers of miscalculation are real," said Brad Glosserman, executive director at Honolulu's Pacific Forum CSIS.

The uninhabited islets were at the centre of a chill between Beijing and Tokyo in 2010, after Japan arrested a Chinese trawler captain whose boat collided with Japanese Coast Guard vessels near the area. Sino-Japanese relations have long been plagued by China's bitter memories of Japan's military aggression in the 1930s and 1940s and present rivalry over resources and regional clout.

Japan seen exiting nuclear power by 2030s

TOKYO, 14 Sept— Japan is expected on Friday to propose abandoning nuclear power by the 2030s, a major shift from policy goals set before last year's Fukushima disaster that aimed to increase the share of atomic energy to more than half of electricity supply. But Prime Minister Yoshihiko Noda's unpopular government, which could face an election this year, also looks set to call in the meantime for the restart of reactors idled after the 2011 disaster if they are deemed safe by a new atomic regulator.

Japan's growing anti-nuclear movement, which wants an immediate end to atomic power, is certain to oppose any such proposal to secure electricity supplies. A shift from nuclear means Japan should seal its position as the world's biggest importer of liquefied natural gas (LNG)

and third-largest purchaser of oil to feed its power stations. The government estimated last week it will need to spend about 3.1 trillion yen (\$40.03 billion) more on fuel imports a year if it abandons nuclear power immediately.

Japan's hunger for

energy has helped sustain an investment boom in gas projects from Australia to the United States, where a shale gas revolution is in full swing. LNG prices also soared earlier this year as Japan scoured the world for supplies. Japanese

NPA's kill two former comrades in S Philippines

DAVAO CITY, (Philippines), 14 Sept— Guerrillas of the leftist group New People's Army (NPA) have shot and killed two of their former comrades in southern Philippines, police said on Friday. Caraga regional police office spokesperson Superintendent Martin Gamba identified the fatalities as Alfredo Antong, 57 and his son, 37-year-old Mario.

Gamba said the two died of multiple gunshot wounds after they were attacked by guerrillas of the NPA in Mahaba village, Cabadbaran City in the southern Philippine province of Agusan del Norte at around 11 am on Thursday. "The victims who were former rebels were hauling falcata logs at the hinterland village when they were fired upon by NPA gunmen using assault rifles, killing them instantly," Gamba told Xinhua in a statement.

He said the NPAs may have been angered by the decision of the victims to leave the leftist group and become small-time loggers. Gamba said government security forces are now pursuing the suspects. The 4,000-strong NPA, armed wing of the Communist Party of the Philippines, is fighting a 43-year leftist insurgency in 60 provinces. The rebel group has been known to target former members suspected of helping in the government's counter-insurgency operations.— Xinhua

Death toll from DPRK floods rises to 300, with 600 still missing

PYONGYANG, 14 Sept— The death toll from recent floods in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) has risen to 300, while 600 others remain missing, the official KCNA news agency reported on Friday.

The floods between mid-June and late August destroyed 87,280 houses and affected roughly 298,050 residents, damaging farmland and social infrastructure such as electric cables, coal mines and railways, according to the KCNA.

Typhoon Bolaven, which pounded most of the country in late August, inflicted the largest damage, leaving 59 people dead and 50 others missing, it added.

The DPRK said on Wednesday that it would not accept a "negligible" amount of aid from South Korea, accusing the southern neighbour of lacking sincerity, the KCNA reported on Thursday.— Xinhua

ministers were due to meet on Friday afternoon and media said a decision was expected then with the cabinet likely to sign off on the new energy policy as early as next week.

A new policy would come 18 months after a March 2011 earthquake and tsunami devastated Tokyo Electric Power Co's Fukushima Daiichi plant, triggering meltdowns, spewing radiation and forcing some 160,000 people to flee.

The new strategy, which would strictly apply a rule limiting the operation of reactors to 40 years, will also call for a push to reduce energy consumption by raising efficiency but leaves unclear the fate of Japan's troubled programme to reprocess nuclear waste, according to a source familiar with a draft.

S Korea's import prices rebound for 1st time in 5 months

SEOUL, 14 Sept— South Korea's import prices rebounded for the first time in five months due mainly to a jump in farm goods and mining product prices, data by the central bank showed on Friday. In local currency terms, import prices advanced 1.7 percent in August from a month earlier, a turnaround from a 0.8 percent on-month decline tallied in the previous month, according to the Bank of Korea (BOK). From a year before, the prices rose 0.3 percent.

The on-month figure for August made its first rebound in five months, and the on-year reading logged the first rise in three months. The rebound was attributable to jumping agricultural product prices and global crude prices. Dubai crude, South Korea's benchmark, averaged 108.6 US dollars a barrel in August, up 9.6 percent from the previous month.

Prices in raw materials imported from overseas climbed 4.6 percent in August from a month before. Farm goods price growth rebounded from a 0.8 percent decline in July to a 1.7 percent gain in August, with mining product prices jumping 4.9 percent last month, up from a 0.9 percent rise in July.

Intermediate goods prices fell 0.3 percent on-month in August, up from a 1.7 percent retreat a month earlier. Oil product price gain accelerated to 11.7 percent in August from 5.0 percent in July, while chemical product prices rose 0.4 percent last month, a turnaround from a 2.6 percent decline in the previous month.— Xinhua

CANBERRA, 14 Sept—The first transfer of asylum seekers by aircraft from Christmas Island to Nauru under Australian government's new offshore processing regime had gone "smoothly and without incident", Immigration Minister Chris Bowen confirmed at a media conference on Friday.

An aircraft has landed at the Nauru airport with a number passengers, apparently Sri Lankans, who were then loaded onto a pair of mini buses for the trip to the newly completed camp. More transfers would occur next week and in the weeks to come. "Implementing all of them is key to breaking the people-smugglers' business model," he said. Bowen signed the legislative instrument designating Nauru as a regional processing country under the Migration Act of Australia on Monday.

**Matchbox Twenty get to No 1 at last with "North"**

LOS ANGELES, 14 Sept—Pop-rock band Matchbox Twenty scored their first No. 1 album with their long-awaited "North" release, selling 95,000 records to top the Billboard 200 chart, according to Nielsen SoundScan figures on Wednesday.

"North" is the first full-length studio album since 2002 for the four-piece band from Florida, which formed in 1995 and had big hits with singles "Unwell," and "3 AM".

Sales for "North" were powered by the new album's first single "She's So Mean," released in June.

Matchbox Twenty have not played a major tour since 2008 and started work on "North" about two years ago. Band members have said the disc was delayed because they wanted to get the album right after such a long absence.

"North" was one of four new

arrivals on the Billboard 200. Rock band Imagine Dragons came in at No. 2 with their first full-length effort "Night Visions," and Christian hip-hop artist Lecrae debuted at No. 3 with "Gravity."

It was the highest Billboard entry ever for Lecrae, and came just a week after fellow Christian singer TobyMac debuted at No. 1 with "Eye On It" in what was the first Christian act to reach the top Billboard 200 spot since 1997. TobyMac slipped to No. 8 in this week's chart.

On the digital songs chart, country pop artist Taylor Swift topped the list for the fourth consecutive week with her infectious hit single "We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together," while her new cancer charity single "Ronan," entered at No. 2.

**Why Nemo, T-Rex and Indiana Jones are returning in Imax**

NEW YORK, 14 Sept—Hollywood is not doing so hot with its new releases, but it's hoping to find gold elsewhere: in its vaults, and in today's higher-ticket-price formats.

Last weekend, five months after Paramount's 3D Imax re-release of "Titanic," the studio re-released "Indiana Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Ark" for a one-week Imax run (Fox handled international).

On Friday, Disney rolls out its thirdtoon adapted for 3D, following "Beauty and the Beast" and "The Lion King": the less-than-a-decade-old "Finding Nemo."

More are in the offing from the Mouse House, which has had a long history with regular-format re-releases. It will bring back a 3D "Monsters, Inc" in the winter, seven months before the release of its prequel "Monsters University," and has others in the pipeline but is not yet willing to say which ones.

"We're fortunate at Disney to have the power of the brand," Dave Hollis, EVP of theatrical exhibition and sales at Disney, told TheWrap. "Relative to other studios, we find ourselves in a fortunate position to have a treasure trove of opportunity because of our vault."

Though some may begrudge the studios for this unabashed pursuit of profits at a time when

most fans and critics crave original material, the decision is rooted in simple economics. "It's an obvious thing for studios to do, given that they have these classic movies that are sitting on the shelves that they can relatively easily turn into a 3D version," Bruce Nash, founder of the box-office statistics site The Numbers, told TheWrap. "There's a very small incremental cost in doing the conversion—and a proven market for the films."

Hollis said it cost Disney less than \$10 million to convert each of

the animated films. Nash noted that converting animated films is much easier because they begin life as a computer file, anyway.

The low cost of conversion makes this a win-win situation for studios, which can use these beloved films to boost quarterly grosses.

All of the films released so far, "The Lion King," "Beauty & the Beast," "Star Wars: Episode I—the Phantom Menace" and "Titanic," surpassed \$40 million at the domestic box office.—Reuters

**Led Zeppelin to release reunion concert film**

LONDON, 14 Sept—British rockers Led Zeppelin will release a concert film based on their 2007 charity performance in London that hits cinemas on 17 October, the band said on Thursday.

The film, called "Celebration Day" and directed by Dick Carruthers, was taken from the long-awaited reunion of one of rock's most successful acts.

The theatrical release will be across 1,500 screens in more than 40 territories, followed by an audio and video release on 19 November.

There will be premieres in London, Los Angeles, New York and other major cities before the theatrical release, raising the possibility of seeing the three surviving band members on the same red carpet, if not the same stage.

The band broke up in 1980 after the death of their drummer John Bonham, but despite repeated calls from millions of fans to get back together to tour and record,

reunions have been fleeting and, by their own admission, unsatisfactory.

But in 2007, singer Robert Plant, guitarist Jimmy Page and bass player John Paul Jones, along with Bonham's son and drummer Jason, took the stage at London's O2 Arena for a tribute gig to Atlantic Records' founder Ahmet Ertegun.

It was the first headline show by the band in 27 years, and according to Cineworld, the cinema chain which will screen the movie in Britain, it was the most over-subscribed gig in history after more than 20 million people applied for 18,000 tickets.

"It's a unique opportunity to savor what is likely to be Led Zeppelin's final performance," Cineworld said.

The band, one of rock's biggest acts with global album sales estimated at up to 300 million, played 16 songs on the night including hits like "Whole Lotta Love," "Kashmir" and "Stairway to Heaven".

The poster promoting the film

features a cartoon of a zepplin airship against a red sky above London's Houses of Parliament, reminiscent of the artwork on the band's 2007 compilation album "Mothership".

### Cameroon suspend French coach Lavagne



YAOUNDE, 14 Sept— Cameroon have suspended French coach Denis Lavagne, less than a year after he took the helm of the national soccer team, following an embarrassing defeat to lowly-ranked Cape Verde, Cameroon's state television said on Thursday.

Cameroon, four-times winners of the African Nations Cup, are in danger of missing out on a place at the next finals in South Africa after losing 2-0 to the tiny Atlantic archipelago nation in Praia on Saturday, in the first leg of

the final round of qualifiers. Lavagne had been suspended with full pay until the end of his contract in October, the television said.

Jean Paul Akono, who led Cameroon's squad to Olympic gold in Sydney 2000, has been appointed as interim coach, with Martin Ntougou Mpile as assistant. The appointment is Akono's second stint as head coach of the team after briefly holding the position from 2000 to 2001.

Cameroon, who host the Cape Verdians on October

13 and have long been one of the dominant forces in African football, missed out on the last Nations Cup.

They were the first African country to reach the World Cup quarter-finals and won Olympic gold in Sydney in 2000.

However, instability at the helm of the team - 11 different coaches have been in charge since Akono was removed in 2001 - has been accompanied by a long stretch of poor form.

Administrative bungles have prompted players to

### Boxing great Ali honoured for fights outside the ring

PHILADELPHIA, 14 Sept— Heavyweight boxing legend Muhammad Ali was honored on Thursday for his humanitarian efforts and civil rights work at an awards ceremony in Philadelphia.

The \$100,000 award called the Liberty Medal, sponsored by the nonprofit National Constitution Centre, was presented to Ali by his daughter, Laila Ali, a former boxer herself. Ali, 70, who has been silenced by a long battle with Parkinson's disease, was honored as an icon of constitutional ideals and the American dream, the center said. He "has been an outspoken fighter for religious and civil rights; a conscientious objector who took his battle to the Supreme Court and won; an ambassador for peace and justice

worldwide, and a tireless humanitarian and philanthropist," the center said in a statement.

"Muhammad Ali continues to this day to inspire young people throughout the world," Philadelphia Mayor Michael Nutter told the ceremony.

Since he retired from boxing in 1981, Ali has worked on philanthropic and social causes around the world. He has made goodwill missions to Afghanistan and North Korea, delivered medical aid to Cuba, travelled to Iraq to secure release of 15 US hostages during the first Gulf War, and most recently, worked for the eventual release of the three American hikers held captive in Iran, the center said in its statement.—Reuters

### "Messi and Higuain are little girls", says defender

RIO DE JANEIRO, 14 Sept— Peru defender Carlos Zambrano has labelled Argentina stars Lionel Messi and Gonzalo Higuain "little girls" following the teams' 1-1 draw in Tuesday's World Cup qualifier in Lima.

In an interview published on Peruvian sports website Depor.pe on Thursday, Zambrano also accused Messi of being "scared" by the occasion.

"He didn't do much. Maybe he was scared, I don't know," Zambrano said. "We deserved to win. We were the better team and I'm angry that we only managed to get one point from the match."

"They complained about everything. They are little girls. Higuain tried to

provoke me the entire match but I didn't get sucked in."

Zambrano gave Peru the lead with an early strike before Real Madrid forward Higuain equalized at the Estadio Nacional.

Peru had the best of the second half chances while Argentina struggled to maintain possession in the opposition half.

"They were impotent and frustrated. They didn't know how to stop us and couldn't win possession of the ball," Zambrano added.

"They tried to unsettle me with insults but when they were tackled they complained and went to ground. They think they are untouchable but football is a game for men."—Xinhua

### Pacquiao set for 8 December bout with Marquez

LON ANGELES, 14 Sept—Filipino southpaw Manny Pacquiao is expected to return to the ring on 8 December for a fourth fight against long-time rival Juan Manuel Marquez of Mexico, according to several media reports.

Promoter Bob Arum told Reuters on Thursday that fight negotiations were being hammered out this week with a decision likely in "a couple of days."

Arum was not prepared to give any further details, though some media have reported that a formal news conference promoting the fight will take place on Tuesday in Los Angeles.

Pacquiao beat Marquez with a controversial majority decision when they met in Las Vegas in November, and said afterwards he would be happy to take on the Mexican again "any time."

The Filipino has fought just once since then, surrendering his WBO welterweight title on a hotly disputed split decision to American Timothy Bradley in Las Vegas in June.

That stunning result ended a run of 15 consecutive wins by Pacquiao, who has won world titles in an unprecedented eight weight divisions.—Reuters

MADRID, 14 Sept—FC Barcelona confirmed on Thursday that Chilean winger Alexis Sanchez will miss this Saturday's La Liga game away to Getafe.

Alexis returned from playing two World Cup qualifying matches for his country with what the club describes as a slight muscle tear on the left side of his groin which means he will definitely not be available at the weekend and is doubtful for next week's Champions League debut against Spartak Moscow.

The loss of Alexis, who suffered several muscle injuries last season comes just a day after it was confirmed influential midfielder Andres Iniesta will also be sidelined for the next two weeks.

Iniesta also suffered his injury while on international duty while playing for Spain away to Georgia on Tuesday night.

The news is a blow for

Iniesta, who like Alexis has suffered a lot of muscle injuries in recent seasons and who just two weeks ago was named as UEFA player of the year.

However, the injuries to Alexis and Iniesta could open the door for Cesc Fabrigas or David Villa to return to the starting 11 in Getafe. Villa scored a penalty for Spain against Saudi Arabia last Friday, while Fabrigas, whose early season form has been questioned by some, helped set Roberto Soldado up for Spain's winning goal in Georgia after coming on as a substitute in the game.

Winger Christian Tello, who has been in coach Tito Vilanova's plans in this early part of the campaign could also be given his chance. Fortunately for Barca, Leo Messi and Javier Mascherano both returned unscathed from Argentina's 1-1 draw in Peru.

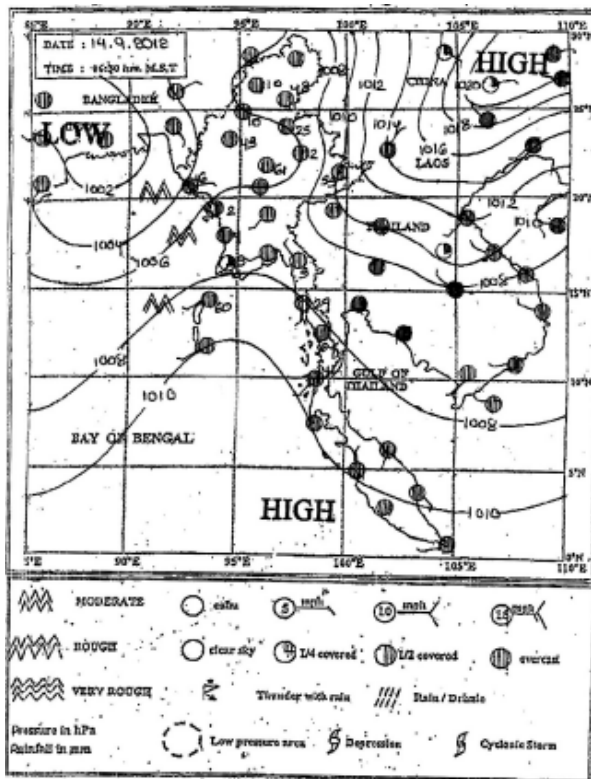

**American imprisoned in Nicaragua freed after appeals court decision**

MANAGUA, 14 Sept— A US citizen sentenced to 22 years in prison in Nicaragua on drug-trafficking charges walked out of jail a free man on Thursday after his conviction was thrown out by an appeals court in a case that rallied international rights activists. Jason Puracal, 35, left La Modelo prison in Tipitapa, just east of the capital, Managua, on

Thursday afternoon after the appeals court that heard his case last month ordered he be set free.

Puracal was found guilty of drug trafficking and money laundering by a Nicaraguan trial judge last year, along with 10 Nicaraguan co-defendants, after being detained in 2010. He has maintained his innocence. The appeals court ordered that the trial be annulled because the judge did not substantiate the reasons for his ruling, and excluded evidence defence attorneys wanted to present. Puracal's immediate fate was unclear. A person familiar with the case told Reuters that Puracal was restricted from leaving Managua. The source voiced concern that Puracal would be rearrested by Nicaraguan authorities.

Before Puracal was released, Nicaraguan Attorney General Julio Centeno told a

local television station that his office was considering whether to appeal the decision to the Supreme Court, the nation's highest judicial body. "We have been fighting for this moment for two years, and it is an amazing feeling to know that the appellate court has recognized what the rest of the world recognized a long time ago, and that is that Jason is innocent," Puracal's sister,

Janis Puracal, said by telephone.

Puracal emerged from the prison behind his co-defendants, who were also released under the court order. He was then taken in a motorcade to Managua, although his exact destination was unknown. Members of the media were not allowed to approach Puracal as he left.

**US defence secretary's visit signals warming relationship with New Zealand**

WELLINGTON, 14 Sept— United States Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta will be the first US defense secretary to visit New Zealand in 30 years when he arrives this week, the New Zealand government announced on Friday. Panetta, who will arrive in New Zealand after visiting Japan and China, would hold bilateral talks with Defence Minister Jonathan Coleman and Foreign Affairs Minister Murray McCully, said a statement from Coleman.

"The New Zealand

government is looking forward to hosting Secretary Panetta. His visit is a reflection of the excellent state of the relationship between our two countries," said Coleman. The trip followed the signing of the Washington Declaration at the Pentagon in June between Panetta and Coleman. During his visit, Panetta would also lay a wreath at the Auckland World War II Hall of Memories to honor fallen New Zealand troops in that war and more recently in Afghanistan.

Declaration, a companion document to the Wellington Declaration, has two key elements: regular high level dialogue and enhanced cooperation within the Asia-Pacific region. It aims to enhance cooperation in key areas that New Zealand and the US had been working on closely together over the past two years: maritime security, including counter-proliferation, counter-terrorism and anti-piracy. It also sets out cooperation for humanitarian assistance and disaster relief in the region, and promotes peace-keeping and peace-support initiatives.

Military links between New Zealand and the US have been warming since November 2010, when US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and New Zealand Foreign Minister Murray McCully signed the Wellington Declaration, which outlines fields of cooperation between the two nations, including climate change, renewable energy, trade, security and economic development. — Xinhua
